The tiny cannon that SPARKED a REVOLUTION

It's time again for "Come and Take It" in Gonzales County, when we celebrate the first shot fired in the Texas Revolution for independence from the Republic of Mexico. The date of the battle was Oct. 2, 1835. The fighting was sparked by the request of the Mexican government for the return of a cannon previously loaned to the citizens of Gonzales for protection from hostile Indians.

So how did Gonzales obtain the cannon in the first place? The Bexar Archives has a copy of the letter sent by Green DeWitt to the Mexican government in 1831 requesting the frontier firepower to protect the settlement from Indian incursions. The letter was written in Spanish, for which all official correspondence was required to be. Such were the times.

By 1835, the climate had changed in the relations between the Texians and the Mexican government. Sacrifices had been made by the settlers, and the colonization terms previously set by the government had been changed. Emotions were frayed, and tensions were high. The time was ripe for revolution.

The Texians could no longer be tethered in their quest for liberty and independence. They could no longer submit to the tyrannical acts of Antonio de Padua María Severino López de Santa Anna y Pérez de Lebrón, who you may have heard of by the shortened version: Santa Anna, the "Napoleon of the West."

The hearts of the citizens of the would explode in concert with the roar of the cannon: Freedom is ours! Freedom has come! Freedom is our destiny! Come and Take It! And that is part of our history, the history of Gonzales, the birthplace of Texas independence.

This year's parade marshal is Ret. Lt. Col. Kenneth McGinty, a 1962 Gonzales High School graduate. McGinty served nearly 22 years in the military, receiving two Legions of Merits, two Bronze Stars with "V" device for valor and heroism, two Purple Hearts for wounds in action and a Vietnam Cross for valiance.

2017.





Shiner Hobo Band 1-5 p.m.

Sunday concludes the festival with traditional favorites the Shiner Hobo Band. They will play from 1-5 p.m. The Shiner Hobo Band gained fame in 1936 under the direction of Emmett Busch, with a toilet plunger as his baton. The Hobos marched and played in Shiner and surrounding towns, displaying a Hobo banner. They entertained crowds everywhere they went. Mr. Spoetzl would accompany the band during local parades and went from saloons to bars treating everyone to Shiner Beer. The band played continuously until the untimely death of the beloved director, Joe Panus, on June 30, 1996. The band continues to entertain without a director. Various members serve as Master of jokes, and pick the next tune to be played. One of the classic features of the Hobo's is playing each polka and waltz from memory, with some tunes played from beginning to end as it was originally written. A new bus was purchased in 1999. The Shiner Hobo Band is a non-profit organization operating with elected officers and is sponsored by the Spoetzl Brewery in Shiner, Texas.





DRT sponsoring memorial service

In Gonzales at the turn of the century, there was much interest in preserving the legacy of the forefathers who had fought for Texas independence. In 1903 Mrs. J. B. Wells Sr. and her daughter Effie Wells Bright were among the 44 charter members that formed the Gonzales Chapter of the Daughters of the Republic of Texas. Each year since the first Come and Take It celebration in 1961, the Gonzales Chapter has held a memorial service in honor of "Gonzales Day" one of the Official Honor Days of the Daughters of the Republic of Texas. The Gonzales Chapter invites everyone to attend this year's 59th Annual Memorial Service to be held at the Gonzales Memorial Museum, 414 Smith Street at 12:30 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 6. Mrs. J. B. "Josephine Henry" Wells' accomplishments will be honored in this year's Gonzales Honor Day Service.

Mrs. Wells celebrated the many contributions of her maternal Grandfather, James Hodges, who was an independent settler purchasing the 17,000-acre Jose Maria Salinas grant adjacent to Green DeWitt's Colony. He then moved his family of seven children to this area in the late 1820's by wagon train bringing livestock, furnishings, plants and seeds to start their new life. She was proud of his settling in this area, his participation in the fight for independence, his part in establishing the Republic, and in the growth of the State of Texas. She accu-

mulated family treasures such as a dresser brought by ox cart when the family moved to their new land. When asked by her grandfather what she wanted for a wedding gift, her request was a simple pottery sugar bowl that was buried by her family during The Runaway Scrape.

Mr. and Mrs. Wells both worked very hard for the fortune they created, but their treasures were the family keepsakes collected over the years. The stories of these accomplishments were told every Sunday during lunch with the sugar bowl proudly displayed in its place of honor on the table. Following a living estate, her beloved home, furnishings and collections were gifted to the Daughters of the Republic of Texas and to the Gonzales Chapter as custodians. In order to continue to share Mrs. Wells stories, the T. N. Matthews-J. B. Wells House is opened to the public by special appointments, on the first Saturday of each month, and for Historic Homes Association tours. Some 195 years of history can be seen and the family stories about these collections are told with each tour, keeping alive the history Mrs. Wells loved so dearly.

Plan to join with the community at 12:30 p.m. on Sunday, Oct. 6 at the Memorial Museum to celebrate the true meaning of Come & Take It, to



hear about the many accomplishments through the years that have honored those who fought for the freedom we celebrate today. All members of the Hodges, Henry, and Wells descendants will be asked to join in laying a wreath at the Immortal 32 Monument. Tournament honors fallen servicemen

The class of 1964, in memory of the Gonzales County servicemen who were killed in Vietnam, has created a scholarship fund to graduating students and faculty members in pursuit of advanced education in the educational system. This fund was started some three years ago and has provided several opportunities for those who wish to continue their education. Thus far there have been three awardees who have taken advantage of the scholarship opportunities.

The scholarship fund was originally named after Thomas D. Chennault, as there were seven Gonzales County servicemen killed during the Vietnam conflict, his name was chosen to represent all seven County servicemen killed in action. The scholarship fund was initially funded by several classes from Gonzales High School. It was decided in meetings this summer that the scholarship fund should be opened up to all the school districts of Gonzales County. With this in mind there needed to be some avenues to increase the funds of the scholarship opportunity by holding numerous events that could add to the benefit funds and ensure continuation of the scholarship opportunities. The class members have decided that one of the first opportunities to grow the benefit fund would be to hold a Memorial Golf Tournament during the Come and Take it Celebration on the Oct. 5 and will be held at the Gonzales In-

dependence Golf Course. It will be called the Inaugural Come and Take It First Memorial Tournament, in remembrance of the county's "fallen but not forgotten" soldiers of the Vietnam era war. Our hope is that this Inaugural Come and Take It Memorial Tournament would provide a basis for enhancing scholarship opportunities all across the Gonzales County area and provide continued funds growth and sustainment in memory of our fallen heroes.

The tournament will be a one day event and be limited to the first 54 two-man teams signing up. It will be played at the Gonzales Independence Golf Course and the proceeds will go to the benefit fund which is officially termed "The Community Foundation of the Gonzales Area, (CFGA)."

This 501-C3 organization is intended to provide sponsors and contributors with tax deductions when supporting the Gonzales County, student and faculty educational scholarship opportunities.

There will be flyers out in the county area requesting sponsors and donors to support this worthwhile endeavor.


