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## Republicans sweep elections in Baldwin

Strong voter turnout and an even stronger straight party voter number bolstered Republican wins across Baldwin County in Tuesday's election, with every GOP candidate winning their races by wide margins.

For the State Senate 32 race

for Trip Pittman's vacated seat, Baldwin County Commissioner Chris Elliott defeated Democratic challenger Jason Fisher of Orange Beach 45,687 votes to 15,165 votes.

Elliott thanked the voters of Baldwin County for their support and their votes, adding he was ready to go and fight for them in Montgomery.

"We have work to do," El-

liott said. "I'm ready to be able to continue to work for Baldwin County. I absolutely feel like the experience gained as a county commissioner has well positioned me to get to work in Montgomery, understand the issues that are important to people here and give me the skill set necessary to accomplish what needs to get done at the state level

to make sure we get our fair share here."

As a result of his win, Elliott had to resign his seat on the Baldwin County Commission due to taking office as the new state senator for District 32 on Wednesday.

Elliott's seat on the Baldwin County Commission will now

## Fairhope votes 'No'

### Change of government referendum fails

In a double-digit margin, Fairhope voters said 'No' to a ballot choice that would have changed the city's form of government.

Long lines and waits of up to an hour and thirty minutes greeted referendum voters but more than 6,000 of them persevered to make their votes count.

The citizen-driven campaign to move to a council-city manager form of government was defeated with 58 percent of Fairhope voters choosing no change.

Chuck Zunk, spokesperson for the Fresh Start Fairhope campaign that gathered over 800 signatures to trigger the election, said their team was disappointed but would continue to move forward.

"We're disappointed because we thought we could win," Zunk said. "What we're going to do right now is try to understand the reasons why we didn't win and do some analysis to see what we're going to do in the future to do this further. Our view of what happened yesterday us that it's a bump in the road and not a dead end."

Gary Thorson, leader of the Forever Fairhope group that opposed the change in government, said he and others were pleased with the result.

## Kirk Jay advances to Voice live playoffs

Bay Minette native Kirk Jay advanced past the Knockout Round on Season 15 of "The Voice," shown on WPMI NBC 15 on Monday night, Nov. 4.

Jay, who performed Brett Young's "In Case You Didn't Know" was selected by Coach Blake Shelton over Colton Smith, who performed "Lady Marmalade."

Originally part of Jennifer Hudson's team, Smith re-

mains in the competition, stolen back by Hudson following the performance.

The former Bay Minette resident and Baldwin County High student, now a resident of Montgomery, has survived two rounds of elimination after being selected by Shelton following a four-chair turn during the blind audition, and battling it out with fellow country artist Caeland Garner in the battle rounds to Eric Clapton's "Let It Rain."

"I just love Blake. I'm a

huge fan," Jay said in a phone interview following his blind audition. "He's definitely a great guy and has been great to work with. He doesn't just tell me what I want to hear. He tells me what I need to hear."

Jay's journey in music began at a young age, playing drums at church and singing in the choir starting at age 5. In 2014 he met a music manager and in 2015 he started doing open mics, traveling

LOXLEY — Officials broke ground Friday, Nov. 2 on a new 31,500 square-foot Piggly Wiggly Cost Plus facility, scheduled to open next summer at 1078 S. Hickory St., across from Loxley Town Hall.

"It's been a long process," said owner Danny Manning, "and I just want to thank the town of Loxley and all of those involved for sticking

## Baldwin County Board of Education takes no action on Orange Beach High School construction bid

### Board members, staff shocked by bid \$20 million over projected estimates

Last week, the Baldwin County Board of Education took no action to move forward with the bid to build the

new Orange Beach Middle School/High School.

The board voted unanimously to take no action with the bid and to evaluate all rights available to the board in renegotiating the matter

after only one bid came in for the project that was almost \$20 million over expected cost projections.

Thrash Contractors was the only group to submit a bid for the project, coming in at \$42.7 million with its bid. The school system's initial estimates for the project were closer to \$25 million.

Superintendent Eddie Tyler said the system was taking time to reevaluate the project.

"We had one bidder, and right now we're just rethinking the bid process," Tyler said. "We want to make sure we do it right so we're getting our group together, our attor-

## Baldwin County Monthly Housing Report: October 2018

**ROBERTSDALE** — Nationally, the housing market is seeing a bit of a slow-down, compared to months past; however, Baldwin County home prices continue to rise, and the days on the market continue to fall.

The total amount of residential active inventory in October 2018 was 3,112.

595 properties were sold last month, an increase of about 2 percent from October 2017: 581.

Properties are staying the market for less days from 2017: decreasing 8 percent from 96 days last year to 88 days in last month.

October total sales volume increased almost 8% this year, \$174,245,670, from \$161,800,600 in October 2017.

The average sales prices of residential properties in Baldwin County this month increased 5 percent from 2017. Last year, the average sales price was \$278,486, and this year, \$292,849.

**Outdoor Conditions:** You should have been here yesterday! How many times have you heard that? These November days can really bring quite different conditions on a day-by-day basis, so that old adage can really ring true at this time of year. One day the water is clean and the bull reds are biting. The next, a wind shift dirties up the water and the bite (along with the water temperature) turns cold.

In recent weeks there has been steady action on the inshore scene with redfish, speckled trout, white trout and flounder leading the way. The shallows along the eastern shore of Mobile Bay have been producing good catches. Anywhere from the Blakely River south to Daphne, Fairhope, Weeks Bay and Bon Secour Bay are good starting points.

Also don't forget little lagoon in Gulf Shores...a sometimes forgotten fishery with great potential! Live shrimp is a tried and true favorite local bait...but be prepared for shortages. We are getting closer to the "slow season" and I have heard reports of supplies occasionally running low. If you're heading out there, call ahead for bait availability, good luck and be safe.

# Planting blueberries this Fall

Blueberries are a healthy, delicious fruit. They can be baked into muffins and breads, added to cereal or eaten out of hand. They are one of the few plants that offer beauty and taste throughout most of the year. Rabbiteye blueberries are one of the easiest fruit for homeowners to grow.

## Planting Blueberries

Being native to the Southeastern United States, the rabbiteye blueberry is tolerant of the high temperatures of the region. It is found growing wild in southern Georgia, Alabama and the Florida panhandle.

The best time to plant blueberries is in late fall through late winter. Around the time the plant blooms, late-season frost or freeze can occur. The plant should be put

in a place where it will be the least susceptible to frost damage.

Elina Coneva, an Alabama Extension specialist in commercial horticulture, said cross-pollination is needed to produce a good berry crop and takes place when more than one cultivar of blueberries is planted.

“By selecting several cultivars with various period of ripening, you can spread out the length of your harvest season,” Coneva said. “Blueberries on the same bush do not ripen all at once. One cultivar may have berries that mature over a four-to six-week period.”

Coneva said choosing the right site for planting

is important.

“If you want your blueberry plant to produce a lot of fruit, select a site that is in full sun,” Coneva said. “Choose a site with well-aerated, well-drained soil high in organic matter.”

## Spacing

Growers should space plants at least 5 feet apart in a row. This will produce a hedgerow or border as the plants mature. If planting several rows of blueberries, growers should space them at least 10 to 12 feet apart. There are a few important things to remember when planting:

- Plant blueberries at the same depth they were grown in their containers.
- Do not pile soil on the base of the trunk.
- When planting an individual plant, make the hole at least twice as wide as the root ball.
- Add some form of organic matter to the soil



in the planting hole or row. Compost is best, but finely ground pine bark will work, too.

- Thoroughly mix organic matter into the planting hole.

## Soil Requirements

Blueberries need an acidic soil with a pH between 4.5 and 5.2.

“If you are planting blueberries as a landscape shrub, combine them with other plants that thrive in acidic soil,

such as azaleas, rhododendrons and camelias,” Coneva said.

Watering is crucial after planting, especially during the first year of growth.

“Water the plants thoroughly at planting and twice weekly for the first year until they are established. It is better to water the plants for a longer time once or twice per week than for a short time each day,” Coneva said. “Because blueberry

plants have the ability to retract water from berries, adequate moisture, particularly during fruit production, is essential to producing plump, juicy berries.”

with us.”

The Manning family opened their first grocery store in Mobile

County in 1972, then purchased the existing Baldwin County Cain’s Piggly Wiggly stores in 2016. In addition to the Loxley location, the Manning family owns Piggly Wiggly stores

in Foley, Fairhope and Spanish Fort, along with eight locations in Mobile County, five in Mobile, one in Saraland, Chunchula and Mt. Vernon. The new 31,528

square-foot facility in Loxley is being financed by Iberia Bank and will be overseen by Fulcrum Construction Group. The facility will be more than three times larger than the

original 9,000 square-foot store (6,000 square-foot interior space) currently serving Loxley and the surrounding area. Construction should be complete in April,

Manning said, and it will take approximately three months to fully stock and provide additional staff for the new facility with the new store opening its doors in June or July.

be held by Daphne councilman Joe Davis, who defeated Democratic challenger Amber Smith 57,221 votes to 18,856 votes.

In Commission District 3, GOP nominee Billie Jo Underwood bested Democrat Heather Brown 58,841 votes to 17,339 votes.

Jeb Ball in District 1 and sitting commissioner Skip Gruber in District 4 faced no opposition. The new commission will be sworn in on Nov. 13 in Bay Minette.

In the state house races, Republican candidates fared similarly well.

In House District 94, which was expected to be a close race, veteran GOP incumbent Joe Faust bested Democratic newcomer Danielle Mashburn-Myrick 15,291 votes to 6,243 votes.

In House District 96,

former Baldwin County Assistant District Attorney Matt Simpson brought home another win for the GOP, besting Democratic and Libertarian opposition to win the seat.

In Baldwin County, Simpson got 67.5 percent of the vote, Democrat Maurice Horsey got 26.5 percent and Libertarian Matt Shelby got 5.9 percent of the vote.

In House District 64, Republican incumbent Harry Shiver bested Democrat Amber Selman-Lynn - 77.1 percent to 22.7 percent.

In House District 66, incumbent Alan Baker won handily over Atmore Democrat Susan Smith, 88.2 percent to 11.8 percent.

In House District 95, longtime GOP incumbent Steve McMillan had no challenger.

In the two Baldwin County Board of Education races, the Republicans once again came out on top.

For the North Baldwin seat, Michael Johnson bested Democrat Heather Karras - 76 percent to 24 percent.

For the Daphne seat, educator and Republican Andrea Lindsey received 65 percent of the vote to Democrat Clyde Jones' 29 percent and Libertarian Michael Reeves 5 percent.

Congressman Bradley Byrne was also re-elected by a wide margin, winning over Democratic opponent Robert Kennedy Jr. in Baldwin County with 77 percent of the vote to Kennedy's 23 percent.

Byrne thanks voters for their support in a statement Wednesday, where he wrote:

"I am honored by the faith the residents of Southwest Alabama have put in me to continue to serve as their voice in Congress. We had so many great supporters throughout this campaign, and Rebecca and I truly appreciate all

the hard work that went into the victory.

"Following the Senate special election in 2017, some thought Democrats had the opportunity to win throughout our state. What we saw on Tuesday night was pretty clear: Alabamians support commonsense, conservative candidates who stand up for the values and priorities of Alabama. We must continue to elect those kind of individuals to represent our great state.

"At the national level, I was pleased to see Republicans make gains in the Senate, but disappointed in the results on the House side. Some truly outstanding public servants lost Tuesday night, and our country will certainly miss their contribution and service. Despite the results, I promise you two things will not change: I will continue to fight each and every day for Alabama, our values, and our priorities, and

I will continue to stand up to support President Trump and his conservative, pro-growth agenda."

Of the 77,843 voters in Tuesday's election, 51.6 percent voted straight ticket Republican, all but ensuring an election victory for the Baldwin County GOP.

"Our theme for this campaign season was 'Vote Republican - Keep Baldwin County great' and the people have spoken," Baldwin County GOP Chairman Michael Hoyt said. "They are happy with where they live. They see the successes in Baldwin County and they want to keep winning and going forward, and they've done that by

overwhelmingly voting for Republicans up and down the ballot. We're very pleased with the results."

Baldwin County Probate Judge Tim Russell said 50.6 percent of the county's registered voters showed up for Tuesday's elections, one of the larger midterm election turnouts in the county's history.

"We're certainly proud that so many people went out to the polls Tuesday to cast their ballots," Russell said. "Baldwin County traditionally has a large turnout for most elections, and we're glad to be among those leading the state in active, registered voters. It was a great turnout."

"This was the right result for Fairhope at this point in time," Thorson said. "The people have spoken and they want to continue the form of government we have now."

The potential govern-

ment change would have also led to a move into district representation for the city, with three council members elected in districts and one at-large. The change would have also made the mayor the permanent head of the council and give that office a vote as the fifth council member.

## Police and fire crews sink school bus to study underwater rescues

Earlier this month several police and fire personnel from Baldwin County gathered to sink a school bus and develop rescue scenarios for first responders.

Glenn Brown, Baldwin County School's fleet manager, said the bus was drained of chemicals and oils and then dropped slowly into the water behind Saunders Yachtworks in Gulf Shores.

Officials were able to assess how the bus sank and what first responders would need to know in the event of a water rescue.

"We have so many waterways throughout Baldwin County. Even on some of our rural roads there are creeks deep enough to sink a bus in," Brown said. "We want to start having training sessions to teach fire department what they are going to see if this happens and what they need to do to



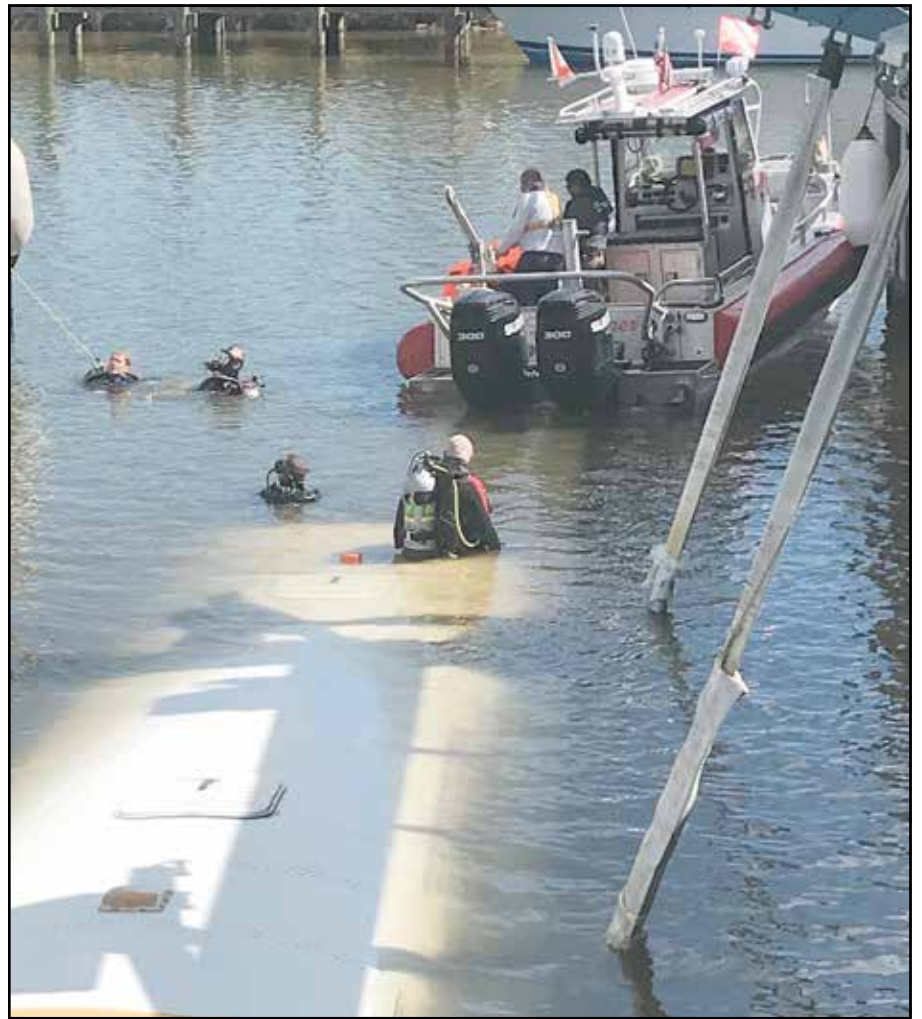
rescue the children."

Brown said the training will include specific instructions such as where emergency exits are located and how first responders need to remove harnesses and booster seats that are attached to the bus for special needs children.

This is the first time Baldwin County has held first responder training in a sunken school bus. Brown said authorities will use what they learned to develop future training opportuni-

ties for all county first responders, beginning, hopefully he said, next summer.

Brown said because they were not sure how the bus would sink, and whether it would tilt or turn, it was dropped slowly and in a controlled manner. In future trainings the bus will be "driven" into the water to make the training as real as possible. The same bus will be used for each training and is towed from the muddy banks and cleaned.



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# St. Patrick's student continues to collect food for Catholic back pack program

**ROBERTSDALE** — Last year, Austin Gontarski, then a sixth grader at St. Patrick School, decided to use his Christmas money to purchase goods for the Backpack Food Program at Catholic Social Services.

"I just didn't want to be selfish," he said. "I just didn't want to keep it all for myself."

The son of Jennifer and Greg Gontarski of Loxley, Austin and his family have participated in the food program as members of St. Patrick's Parish, but Austin decided he wanted to do more.

He took his Christ-

mas money, went and purchased food for the program. Then he went around his neighborhood, going door to door collecting food and more money to purchase food.

In the end, he was able to deliver a truck and a car loaded with several hundred pounds of food, accumulating 1,726 meals and snacks for the backpack program, along with an additional 280 food units for families.

But he didn't stop there. He decided to continue collecting for the program. And he has. In a big way.

As of Friday, Nov. 2, Gontarski, now a 12-year-old seventh grader at St. Patrick, has raised more than \$8,500 for the

program, along with 18,678 food items, including 9,531 dinners and lunches; 4,030 breakfast items, 3,218 snacks and 1,899 fruit items.

He has also inspired classmate Timmy Doerr, who has also collected 864 items for the backpack program.

"We are just so excited that this young man decided to use his resources for good in the community," said Phyllis Beam, director of Catholic Social Services in Baldwin County. "It will certainly be put to good use."

Beam said the items collected, along with other items collected by local civic groups and churches, will be delivered to local schools

where it will be used, and stored for use throughout the year.

"Most of these items have a shelf life of up to a year," she said, "so the items donated today will be able to be used for months to come."

Through its Backpack Food Program, Catholic Social Services helps provide students with the nutrition they need beyond the schoolhouse.

Volunteers fill bags full of non-perishable canned and boxed food goods, along with a meal plan that students and their families can follow.

Gontarski said he will continue to collect money and goods throughout the coming year and beyond.

with his band "Kirk Jay and Kuntry Funk."

His journey on "The Voice" began with an open casting call in Houston, surviving a second round of cuts before getting a chance to perform before the judges in a blind audition, which first aired on Monday, Oct. 8.

Understandably, his

career has taken a huge leap forward since performing on the show.

"We were driving four or five hours doing open mics, not knowing if when we got there, we would be performing in front of two or 2,000," he said. "Now, I'm at the point where people recognize me and want to have their picture taken with me. It's been amazing."

When asked by Clark-son what kind of record

he wanted to make, Jay responded that he was "country until I die," also revealing that the song he performed in the blind audition, the Rascal Flatts ballad "God Bless the Broken Road," is the first country song he ever learned and the reason he wanted to be a country artist.

As an African-American, Jay joins a small but elite group of artists, from country legend Charlie Pride, to former

Hootie and the Blowfish front-man Darius Rucker, and said he welcomed the opportunity to be a role-model to the next generation.

"It is definitely been awesome and I am humbled by the experience," he said. "I appreciate my fans and all the fans of the show that have gotten me to this point."

Jay has also gotten the chance to return home during his journey, participating in a pep rally

and attending a Baldwin County High School football game last month at Lyle Underwood Stadium in Bay Minette.

"It was great to be able to come back and hang out with old friends," he said. "I got to visit with some of my old teachers and they invited me to perform with the band and hang out on the sideline. It was a great experience."


During the battle round, Jay got to work

with Australian country singer Keith Urban and vocal legend Mariah Carey during the knockouts.

After surviving two rounds of eliminations, Jay is now one of 24 artists remaining for the playoff rounds, which begin airing on Monday, Nov. 12 beginning at 7 p.m. (CT), locally on WPMI NBC 15. The first live elimination will take place on Tuesday, Nov. 13.

neys and the architect, and we're going to determine a course of action here immediately."

Tyler said he hoped to have something in front of the board by the November meeting.

BCBE board member David Tarwater said the amount quoted in the bid was unacceptable.

"Coming in \$20 million over the projected estimates for this project is just not something I can support, nor do I think this board could support," Tarwater said.

"We were elected to be good stewards of the taxpayers' money, and that amount is completely unacceptable. We will find a way to make this construction move forward, but not at that price."

Tyler said the delay could affect the possible timeline for having the new school built.

"The timeline is something we're going to rethink and look at," Tyler said. "This came at the eleventh hour. The smart thing to do is to step back and evaluate where we are, make sure we're following Alabama law, and then move forward immediately in the best way we can."

Orange Beach Mayor Tony Kennon said he and other city officials would be working with the school system to address the issue of a possible delay.

"We have to reevaluate how we're going to move forward," Kennon said. "The school is still going to happen. It's just whether we'll have a school year in a new school in 2019 or 2020. We're working with the school board. Next week we're going to lay out all the options then I'm going to call all the parents in for a meeting to present the options, get their input, have an open-floor discussion and take that back to the county. I'm going to have the county there as well."

Kennon said portable

classrooms could be an option up for discussion.

"Those are all the options we're going to look at- whether we're going to have a portable village, whether we're going to have 7th, 8th and 9th or 7th, 8th, 9th and 10th," Kennon said. "I'm sure Gulf Shores is going to work with us and help us every way they possibly can. They're not going to turn our students away if we need them. I feel confident we're going to come up with a plan."

School officials said this setback could affect negotiations regard-

ing the split between Baldwin County and the newly created Gulf

Shores City School System.

## Theatre 98 announces 2019 season

Each year a committee of volunteers at Theatre 98 in Fairhope reads about 20 scripts in search of shows that will wow and inspire their audience.

In 2019, the committee believes theatergoers will be delighted to leave the humdrum of television reality noise behind and be immersed in the power of live performance.

"I think we've pushed the envelope and really challenged ourselves," said Heather Delker, Theatre 98 second vice president who led the search. "If you're going to come on out and go to the theater we want to give you something to chew on."

The players will kick off the season in February with the modern day classic, *A Streetcar*

*Named Desire*. It tells the story of Blanche DeBois, a faded Southern belle, who seeks sanctuary from the harsh realities of her ruined life at the home of her sister in New Orleans.

Open auditions for that show will be held Nov. 12 and 13 at 7 p.m. Director Timothy Guy said he is in search of four powerhouse actors in their mid-20s to 30s to lead the cast. The script won the Pulitzer Prize for Drama in 1948 and was written by Tennessee Williams.

"When I read Williams there is a poetry in what he writes and a fragileness and beauty to it," Guy told the theatre's members at the annual meeting last week. "Even though this is a gut wrenching drama there is a beauty in that play."

In May, Jon Ro-

bitaille will direct *Prelude to a Kiss* written by Craig Lucas. The Tony nominated production was also a movie in the early 90s. During a wedding a mysterious old man insists on kissing the bride, a kiss that causes the bride's soul and the old man's soul to change places.

In addition to actors Robitaille said he will need top notch tech crew volunteers. Theatre 98 is installing \$35,000 worth of LED lighting on the stage in December. The addition will emit less heat and allow crews to create scenes with intimate and stunning effects.

In July, Robin Ann Page will direct *Dead Accounts*, a comedy by Theresa Rebeck. The story tells of a young man's sudden return home to Ohio from

Manhattan and the questions and chaos that come with the move. The contemporary tale tackles timely issues of corporate greed, small town values and whether or not your family will always welcome you back, with no questions asked.

The season will be rounded out in October with a musical, *Godspell 2012* by John Michael Tebelak, directed by Richard Foster. The blend of songs and tales from the Gospel according to St. Matthew includes storytelling and comedy.

Guy encourages anyone interested in the theater to come and audition or volunteer in a plethora of rolls behind the curtain.

"I think this is pretty fun and if you get involved, I think you will think that too," he said.

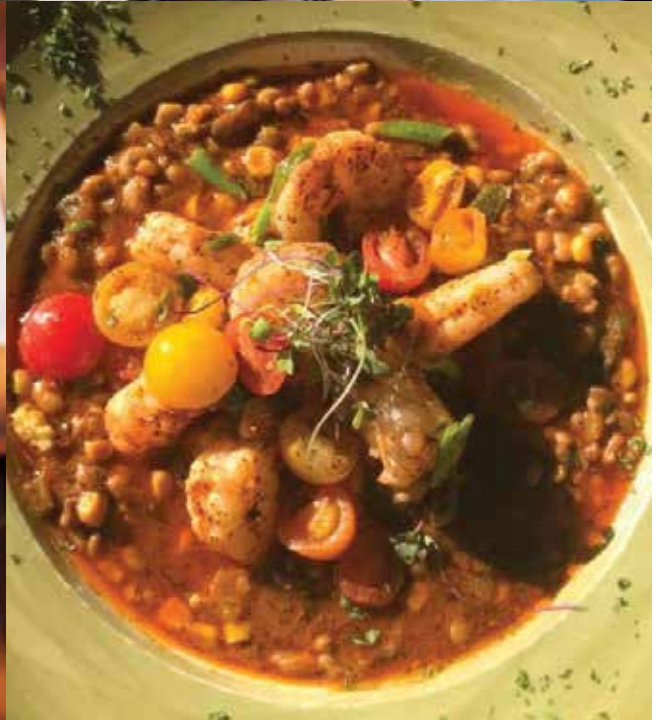

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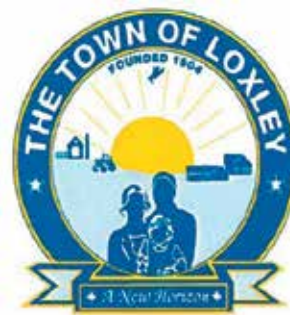

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## No place, no time for hate

At a recent church service, the sermon focused on the 12th chapter of Mark's Gospel, which describes Jesus' answer to a question from a scribe about which Commandment is "first of all." Jesus replies with the Shema: "Hear O Israel, the Lord our God, the Lord is one; and you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength." Even though Jesus was not asked about a "second Commandment", he adds to the Shema, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." In response, for once, a scribe agrees with Jesus.

It seemed timely to hear this verse and to hear a modern-day minister preach on it. Just a few weeks ago, eleven people were tragically killed at a Jewish synagogue near Pittsburgh. These innocent Jews were killed by a man filled with hate, much like the murders of innocent African American Christians in a Charleston church three years ago. These horrific events remind us that evil is not a superstition, but an all too real presence in our society.

The Old Testament and Jesus are crystal clear: the very essence of God is love. Therefore, anyone who hates another person acts against God and his purposes for humankind. Jesus took it another step by joining the Commandment to love one another with the Commandment to love God. Saint John in his first letter is explicit: "Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God. Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love."

Our obligation to love one another applies to everyone. Indeed, the very presence of hate inside us is the work of evil, and we should all strive

against that evil in our own lives. And when a particularly tragic work of evil happens, as happened in Pittsburgh, we need to speak out so that we reinforce our collective resolve against it.

Notes from  
your Congressman

In the heart of election season, it is especially important to remember that more unites us than divides us. As Americans — and as humans — we are united by common bonds of love, faith, and understanding. Far too often we get caught up in the areas of disagreement, instead of realizing that far more brings us together.

We are all imperfect humans made by our Creator. While we are often divided by where we live, our age, our background, our race, or our gender, we are brought together by many important common factors.

My study of U.S. history long ago convinced me that our national principle of the equality of all people, explicit in The Declaration of Independence and reiterated by President Lincoln in the Gettysburg Address, is rooted in our Founders' understanding of the Bible's clear teaching that we are all created and loved by God, and therefore must love and must value one another. So violent attacks on people because of their race or religion are truly un-American as well.

An attack on any human because of their religious beliefs or the color of their skin or their background is an attack on all of us and the values we hold most dear. When we let these actions further divide, we only fuel the fire of hatred. Instead, we should use events like we saw in Pittsburgh to unite us and bring us closer together.

So, please allow me to add my voice with many others against the evil of these and other acts of violence. There is no place, and this is no time, to hate.

## Fake news and the market for idea

Traditional social media have been criticized recently for purveying fake news. California may form a commission to investigate stemming fake news, while Congressional hearings have implored Facebook and Twitter to act. Is the news market failing?

Classical liberals back to John Milton and John Stuart Mill have stressed freedom of speech and expression as crucial in allowing citizens to control government. Free expression is vital for two reasons. The first is the value of free inquiry in discovering the truth. The second is the potential for government power to regulate expression to stifle criticism.

The metaphor of a marketplace of ideas illustrates the truth-seeking argument. Just as competition supplies us with cars, clothes or soft drinks, competition will work for ideas. Let truth and falsehood compete, and truth will win out. This reasoning believes that most citizens can distinguish good from bad arguments.

Yet I find the marketplace of ideas metaphor slightly off. In my research on media bias, I emphasize how our evaluations of public policies draw on our personal values and information about the world. Is the \$15 per hour minimum wage recently enacted by some cities wise policy? The answer depends in part on values — whether one believes that government should try to raise poorer households' income. And also on information — the number of \$9 an hour jobs eliminated by a \$15 minimum wage.

News deals with the information element of policy assessment. Peoples' values differ, but to paraphrase Senator Daniel Patrick Moynihan, we all face the same facts. The news media hopefully provides truthful information for readers or viewers.

Information differs from ideas. Assessing the truth of information requires significant resources and not just common sense; specifically, a news organization's reporters and editors. Ideas combine information and values. Citizens have no capacity to verify a report claiming that the \$15 minimum wage eliminated 10,000 jobs.

Media bias involves deliberate manipulation of information to advance political values, not inevitable reporting errors. A story might deliberately exaggerate the job losses from the \$15 minimum wage to influence people's policy evaluation.

We can only identify some relevant factors about when biased

reporting will advance specific values. For example, the persons we trust most can most easily mislead us. Blatant propaganda is often recognized and consequently ineffective. Information advancing an organization's values may be discounted. And bad news is frequently denied; President Trump dismisses any report suggesting that his policies are not working perfectly as fake news.

President Trump has seemingly used evidence of liberal bias to convince his supporters to dismiss all news from prestigious news organizations as fake. Convincing analyses find that liberal bias is typically nuanced and subtle, involving misleading headlines, a lack of perspective, or perhaps omissions, not outright falsification. Biased news still contains truth.

Charges of liberal bias are decades old, so what has changed? The more explicit branding of outlets as liberal or conservative, I think, encourages wholesale dismissal. Hosts like Sean Hannity or Rachel Maddow with conservative or liberal views organize most cable news content. (This is not necessarily bad; contrasting takes on current events may be a good way to assess the truth.) Editorials set a newspaper's brand, even though the rules of objectivity still apply to the news content. And conservative outlets like Fox News and the *Washington Times* makes liberal branding of CNN and the *Washington Post* more plausible.

The most surprising aspect in our more partisan news market has been the lack of an outlet building an information-only brand trusted across the political spectrum. *The New York Times* and *Washington Post* may think they occupy this space, but conservatives' dismissal demonstrates otherwise.

The marketplace of ideas is a powerful metaphor, but information is not ideas. Common sense cannot substitute for a network of trained, experienced reporters. Is the market for news hopelessly broken? Fortunately, a missing product creates a profit opportunity for a clever entrepreneur. Perhaps trusted news sources are evolving right now, obscured by the noise of current events.
