Four killed when high-speed chase leads to head-on collision

BCSO RELEASE

WILCOX — A high-speed chase along Interstate 10 Monday afternoon ended in a head-on collision which resulted in the deaths of four individuals.

At approximately 1:30 p.m. Monday, a deputy with the Baldwin County Sheriff's

Office attempted to stop a vehicle traveling east bound on I-10 at the 49-mile marker, approximately four miles west of the Wilcox exit. The stop was for a moving violation the deputy witnessed, according to a BCSO release issued Monday.

The suspect vehicle accelerated attempting to out run the deputy. The vehicle exited I-10 at the Wilcox exit and reentered the interstate west bound. The vehicle then exited the interstate and went south bound on the Baldwin Beach Express. The vehicle did a U-turn on the Baldwin Beach Express and reentered the interstate west bound.

The deputy continued to try

and stop the vehicle as it continued west bound. The suspect vehicle did a U-turn on the interstate and drove east bound in the west bound lane at a high rate of speed.

The deputy lost sight of the suspect vehicle as it continued to drive into oncoming traffic.

Fort Bowyer — the little fort that saved America



Today, if you visit Fort Morgan and stand on the far western wall, beneath your feet and many tons of brick, concrete and mortar is whatever is left of an earlier installation - one that is largely unremembered but was of extreme importance to the United States.

When West Florida was

under their occupation, the Spanish, realizing the importance of Mobile Bay, built Fort Condi to guard the City of Mobile. They also saw the need to guard the entrance to Mobile Bay. In those days, the only pass for large ships to enter the Bay circled between a sand bar and Mobile Point on the eastern side of the Bay. Therefore, they began construction of a fort at what



is now the extreme end of Mobile Point.

Commission approves land purchase for **Little River** S.A.I.L. center

The Little River community in far north Baldwin is now closer to having its own S.A.I.L. center in their community, as the Baldwin County Commission voted unanimously Tuesday to purchase land for the project.

County Attorney David Conner told the commissioners that a deal had been reached to purchase the property for \$20,000 from a local resident.

"This is the first step in a long-going effort between the Baldwin **County Commission** and the members of that community for a center in that area," Conner said.

According to members of the Little River community, they have had no firm location for a center and had requested the county's help in making their center a reality.

Baldwin County Commissioner Jeb Ball said he was glad to see the county moving forward on the project.

"This has been something that we've discussed for a while, so it's nice to see us moving forward on a project that helps create an even better sense of community for the people up in Little River," Ball said. "This project

The suspect impacted a vehicle head-on that was traveling west bound. The impact killed a passenger and severely injured the driver of the west bound vehicle.

The suspect vehicle rolled over the guard rail and caught fire in the outside median of the interstate. Three subjects inside the fleeing vehicle were also killed.

The driver of the west bound vehicle was air lifted to University Hospital in Mobile. The driver's condition is unknown.

The identity of all those was unknown at the time of the initial release, and no further information has been made available. According to the release, the Alabama Law Enforcement Agency is the primary investigative police agency and working the case as a traffic homicide.

1813, the United States took over West Florida, including Mobile and the unfinished fort on the peninsula. The War of 1812 was in full swing and the United States full realized the value of having a fort to guard Mobile Bay.

Work on the old Spanish fort was quickly resumed under the supervision of Colonel John Bowyer of the U.S. Army.

While this was happening, the war was doing great damage to the United States. Our ports were blockaded and commerce with Europe almost totally ceased. Our shipbuilding and repair business basically ended. The government's chief source of income, the tariff, dried up and the national government was mostly without funding. The British burned the White House in August 1814 and the New England states were planning to secede and start a new country.

Meanwhile, the fort was enlarged from the original plans. It was fan shaped with the wide side of the fan facing the main pass into the bay. At the narrow rear end was a bastion flanked

with two semi-bastions. The fort was constructed with logs and sand and mounted fourteen guns of various sizes. Most of the guns faced the pass but two were mounted in the bastion. The fort enclosed 22,000 square feet and was named for Colonel Bowyer.

Most of the timber was cut and shaped at Kennedy's Mill south of Stockton near current day Bicentennial Park.

In August 1814, the fort was garrisoned by 160 men of the 2nd U.S. Infantry under the command of Major William Lawrence. They wasted no time in getting the fort well provisioned and ready for action.

The British were massing land and sea forces in Pensacola and making plans to hold and capture New Orleans. With New Orleans under their control, they could cut off the U.S. western territory and stop all commerce up and down the Mississippi River. They could also use the river system to attack the United States from the west.

They had an excellent plan to accomplish that goal. First, capture and hold Mobile. Once the British Navy had Mobile bay, they could pound Fort Charlotte, the former Fort Condi, into submission and assume

control over the city. Mobile would then become a staging area for the capture of New Orleans.

A large army could be quartered in Mobile and quickly dispatched over land by the good roads to New Orleans. That would also create a direct supply line from Mobile to New Orleans . With its excellent harbor, a large war fleet could be assembled in Mobile Bay and quickly sent to bombard New Orleans from the river while the British Army attacked by land.

The only thing standing in their way was that little flyspeck of a log and sand fort and its few annoying little guns. With a strong fleet of four warships and a ground force of nearly 200 Royal Marines and Indian allies with their own artillery, it would only be a matter of minutes to remove that minor obstacle.

The British planned a simultaneous attack by land and by sea. A force of Royal Marines and trained Indians under the command of Colonel William Nichols was put ashore nine miles east of the fort with one field howitzer. They would attack from the land side. Meanwhile, the four warships under command of Captain William Percy with a

combined total of 78 guns would bombard the fort from the pass. The plan was good, but the British underestimated the fighting spirit of the American defenders and, as luck would have it, everything that could go wrong for the British did.

On Sept. 14, Nichols began moving his forces westward to attack by land. He became ill and had to return to the ship for treatment, leaving the attack to be managed by his second in command. Later, he would suffer a head wound upon the ship. The going was harder for the British troops than anticipated due to having to drag the cannon through sand and having no cover but sand dunes and, to their surprise, having to face two American cannons. An unexpectedly fierce American defense also halted the attack.

On Sept. 14, the winds and tides were not favorable to the British ships so after some exchange of fire, they were forced to retreat. There was some damage to the ships but little or no damage to the fort.

On Sept. 15, the battle began in earnest. The British ground force launched its attack but lost its only cannon early and suffered very heavy losses. They were forced to retreat back to the ships having lost over 30 of their men. The ships and the fort commenced their heaviest bombardments around four o'clock.

The tides and winds were favorable on the morning of Sept. 15 so two of the British ships, the HMS Sophia and HMS Hermes, began maneuvering to get into more favorable firing positions. In doing so, the Hermes managed to run aground on a sand bar only 150 yards from the fort's guns. While the riflemen in the fort kept the Hermes' men off the open deck and unable to man their guns, the fort's guns first destroyed the Hermes' sails and then concentrated on systematically destroying the ship. The other British ships sent rescue boats to take off the Hermes' crew. The Americans withheld fire on the rescuers but the Hermes suffered extremely heavy casualties.

Captain Percy of the Hermes, realizing that his ship was doomed, saw to the evacuation of his crew and then set his ship ablaze. Later in the day, the fire reached the magazine and the ship went up in a tremendous explosion to the cheers of the American defend-

ers. The British fleet had lost over a fourth of its firepower, its ground forces had been soundly defeated and its three remaining ships had their sails so shredded that they could barely make headway. The fort suffered little damage and only moderate casualties.

Captain Percy was forced to limp back to Pensacola having lost one-fourth of his fleet, with 162 men wounded and 70 dead. The Americans, by contrast, suffered light to moderate damage with only four wounded and four killed.

Thus, the first battle of Fort Bowyer quite possibly saved the United States. What those few men in a tiny fort did stopped the British from taking New Orleans and thereby effectively cutting the United States in two. Had the British been able to dislodge those valiant men in Fort Bowver, it is highly unlikely that General Andrew Jackson could have saved New Orleans as he would not have had time to gather his forces and set up his defenses. The news of the battle found its way to newspapers all across the country and it resulted in a swelling of pride in the population

thing quirky about us. That something is what makes us special and unique."





and a renewed determination to win the war.

The British again attempted to capture New Orleans on Jan. 8, 1815, but did not have Mobile as a staging and resupply base. They were met by a largely thrown together force of American soldiers commanded by General Jackson consisting of U.S. soldiers, frontiersmen, Indians, French citizens and even pirate crew, and by Jan. 18, the British were totally defeated. Not having Mobile to use for resupplying and reinforcing their forces, the British had no choice but to once again retreat

to Pensacola. they decided to attack Fort Bowyer again. They might have had thoughts of making another over land attack on New Orleans or perhaps they just wanted revenge. Whatever the case, this time they were much better prepared with over 1,300 soldiers reinforced by 11 guns and 100 rockets with three launchers under the command of General John Lambert. They also had a much more powerful fleet consisting of 38 heavily armed warships commanded by T.R. Ricketts. Colonel Lawrence and the Americans only had 370 men and about 22 guns.

The British soldiers tunneled through the sand to get close to the fort and the warships aligned themselves to lay a siege on the fort. On Feb. 8, the siege began and continued almost without stopping until Feb. 11. On that day, General Lambert demanded that the American surrender. Colonel Lawrence, believing no help was forthcoming and correctly believing that his tiny command could not win this time, agreed to surrender. On Feb. 12, the Americans surrendered the fort.

The British losses included 13 killed and 18 wounded. One American was killed, 10 were wounded and 374 were taken prisoner. The British then started making plans to take Fort Charlotte and occupy Mobile.

Pensacola. Colonel Lawrence As they passed Mobile, may have seen no help

coming to rescue his command, but it did come (and from a totally unexpected source) - the British Navy. The British warship Brazen met Ricketts' fleet in the bay and informed him that the Treaty of Ghent had been signed on Dec. 24, 1814 and that the war was over. The British had no choice but to return the fort to the Americans and release the prisoners.

Today, nothing remains of Fort Bowyer. It was abandoned shortly after the second battle and Fort Morgan was built on top of it.


But, if you take that walk along the western wall to that point that is nearest the pass into the bay, you will be standing above one of the most important military sites in the United States. There, some 200 years ago, less than 200 Ameri-

can heroes withstood all that the mightiest military in the world threw at them and, in so doing, quite possibly saved the United States.

John D.Alms A Life Well Lived

In 1949, Baldwin County farmers started pooling their resources to buy chicken feed by the boxcar load. They began storing feed and fertilizer in an old potato warehouse and soon outgrew the facility. Elberta Farmers Cooperative has come a long way since its beginning and much of the growth and success is attributed to John Alms and his dedication to the farmers and community of Elberta.

John Alms was hired as manager of Elberta Farmers Cooperative on March 17, 1958. He operated the Co-op by himself for a year with the help of several part time employees. The Co-op took off with gross receipts totaling slightly less than \$300,000 in 1958. John continued to grow the business, assembled a



team and a few years later the Co-op reported up to \$4 million in revenue. John believed that the Co-op customer came first. Fair prices and personal customer service were his business philosophy.

There were many successes in John's 35-year career as manager of the Co-op but the pinnacle was the addition of bulk fertilizer. Going from bag to bulk fertilizer was a highly significant accomplishment and 11,000 tons of bulk fertilizer was sold in the first year.

John Alms provided outstanding leadership serving on the manager's Chemical Advisory Committee, serving as chairman of the Trade Fair Advisory Committee, and as a member of the general manager's Leadership Council. He was chosen Manager of the Year in 1974.

John Alms was also active with the Elberta Volunteer Fire Department for 30 years, serving as secretary for 25 years.

John Donald Alms, a lifetime resident of Elberta, passed away on March 29, 2019. He will be remembered as a loving husband, wonderful father and grandfather, and a hardworking business icon in the Elberta Community dedicated to serving the farmers of Baldwin County.



The last rumbles between the North and South

Reenactors will remember the Battle of Blakeley tomorrow

Tomorrow when the canons rumble at Blakeley State Park to celebrate the 154th anniversary of the battle there, reenactors will be joined by a gun that witnessed the end of America's darkest days.

Researchers believe that the cannon not only was captured on that battlefield, but that it may have fired the last shot on the Eastern Shore of Mobile Bay.

Also on Saturday, the grandson of the man who ordered that shot to be fired will be there to welcome the cannon home.

Kerry Gossett, a Civil War enthusiast, said after months of tracing shells, paperwork and stories, he and the gun's owner, Ken Knoll, were able to track the gun's path through the war as well as find the descendants of the man who commanded its unit.

Edward Tarrant, leader of Tarrant's Artillery Battery, was captured at Blakeley and after his death was buried in his hometown of Tuscaloosa. Gossett found his descendants, who still live in Tuscaloosa.

The call to Tarrant's modern-day family was an emotional one.

Gossett said, the man asked, 'I'm going to be able to touch the gun my great grandfather actually served with?'

After the call Knoll, said, "We are bringing these people back to life. It is just amazing."

The cannon's journey back to Blakeley happened by accident when Gossett met Knoll at a Civil War collectors show in Tennessee.

Knoll was searching for information about a rifled canon with 15 grooves that he had purchased. He wanted to know where the gun was captured and thought Blakeley might be the place. Gossett was intrigued and offered to

help in the search.

Gossett knew shells had been discovered at Blakeley that had 15 grooves. The detail was significant and unusual. But, it didn't prove that this exact gun had served at Blakeley.

The men also had a second clue, the trunnion, on the side of the cannon, was stamped with the name of the foundry where it was cast: Skates & Company, 1861. The stamp also indicated the gun's serial number: 1.

Skates & Company, also known as Mobile Foundry, was one of only a few foundries in the south that was casting cannons shortly after war erupted.

"Early in the war the south had captured a couple arsenals but they weren't up and running and most arsenals were for storage, not producing arms," Gossett said. "So the South was scrambling to find foundries that would cast cannons."

Skates & Company usually produced steam boat river parts, boilers and artillery shells. The company, did however, cast four cannons, two

from brass and two from iron. Most guns were made with five to nine lands and grooves inside the barrel. Knoll's gun, however, had 15 grooves, making it distinctive. The grooves were etched into artillery shells as they fired from the cannon, and can still be found at battlefields today, making it slightly easier to track where the gun had been fired. The grooves also make the artillery shell spin, making it more accurate.

In its last heaves of fire, Tarrant's Batterv unleashed a devastating volley of gunfire upon the Union, using eight heavy pieces to defend their position. The men surrendered on April 9, 1865. They were exchanged at Vicksburg, Miss., on April 28, 1865 and were surrendered finally with the Dept. of Alabama, Mississippi and East Louisiana at Citronelle, Alabama on May 4, 1865.

Luckily for Gossett and Knoll, the armies kept precise records. Though many have been lost to time, they were able to find a list of guns captured at Blakeley. Only one gun could possibly fit the description, but it was the wrong caliber and the Union description didn't match the gun.

match the gun.
But still, the federal report listed the position of the guns at Blakeley and the men knew where the shells with 15 grooves had been found. They even checked where on the battlefield units had been captured. Every detail pointed to the same place. Every detail suggested that Knoll's cannon was captured at Blakeley.

Still, they couldn't confirm it.

The men searched records for other battles the gun may have served in. They searched for shells found buried in the aftermath. They could find none, except for at

Blakeley.

"We we're pretty sure the gun was captured at Blakeley. Now we were trying to prove it," Gossett said. "It was like searching for the Holy Grail. We enjoyed doing this. It was a blast."

Then, they found it. The men came across an article in Confederate Veteran Magazine. published from the end of the war through the early 20th century. Edward Tarrant, the son of the commander of Tarrant's Artillery Battery, who had also served in the unit, wrote about their capture at Blakeley. The Union, he wrote, broke through Redoubt Number 4. The sergeant turned their James Rifle toward the line and fired at the North. This, Gossett said, was probably the last shot on the Eastern Shore.

Knoll knew immediately, that was his gun.

Another detail that left historians scratching their heads was the caliber listed for the gun. When it was cast, the gun fired a 6-pound shell. But at some point it was refiled because bronze is a softer metal and would have needed to be worked on. When the men refiled it, the caliber became larger, making it a 12-pound caliber, and altering any future written records of its whereabouts.

"Not only did it have distinctive grooves but it was an odd caliber for the Confederates to have. That makes it a very distinctive gun," Gossett

Despite the unusual details, the men's search was a shot in the dark.

"This is incredible. It is very unusual to be able to track down a specific gun to a specific unit. It was really a shot in the dark when we started," he said.

The men wrote a full history of their search that will be published in an upcoming edition of North South Trader's Civil War magazine.





Auburn faces Virginia in men's NCAA basketball showdown

A long season for the

Auburn Tigers men's college basketball team might be a few days longer after this Saturday when they will play in their first ever NCAA Tournament Final Four.

The fifth-seeded Mid-

west regional champs will take on the Virginia Cavaliers, the only No. 1 seeded team left in the 2019 NCAA Tournament and the South regional champs. The Tigers have

a reputation of being a team-orientated, highintensity offense and mentally tough enough to make late game pushes.

The Tigers are led by a pair two outstanding guards, shooting guard Bryce Brown and point guard Jared Harper. Brown leads the team in points per game with 16

while shooting 44 percent from the field and 41 percent from 3-point range. Harper has accounted for 15.4 points per game and 5.8 assists per game.

The Tigers took out the 12th seeded New Mexico State Aggies with a tight 78-77 score. The next three wins they accounted for were against historically huge basketball programs. In the round of 32, the Tigers completely dismantled a struggling fourth-seeded Kansas Jayhawks with an 89-75 score. The Tigers then shocked the sports world with a 97-80 victory over the first-seeded North Carolina Tarheels in the Sweet 16. Finally, in the Elite 8, the Tigers were able to hang on to defeat the second-seeded Kentucky Wildcats with a 77-71 score in overtime. The Tigers beat Kentucky without their power forward Chuma Okeke, who tore his ACL

in the win over North Carolina in the Sweet 16.

Losing a big, versatile player like Okeke puts a lot of pressure on Auburn and specifically for center Austin Wiley. He will need to step up more to create a bigger presence in the paint with Okeke now gone.

Virginia has the topranked defense throughout the regular season by allowing only 55.4 points per game from their opponents. The Cavaliers have only encountered three losses in this 2018-2019 College Basketball season with two of them coming from Duke and then from the Florida State Seminoles in the semifinals of the ACC Conference Championship Tournament.

The Cavaliers are a team that thrives offensively by being patient and slowing the tempo down while playing lockdown defense. Their

guards Kyle Guy (15.2 points per game on a 44.6 field-goal percentage) and De'Andre Hunter (14.9 points per game on a 51.8 field goal percentage) are very efficient in their shot selections and slowing down the tempo.

That 69-59 loss to Florida State might be a good indication of how the Tigers can beat the Cavaliers by moving the ball with high-intensity throughout the court. Auburn can mismatch the Cavaliers through chaos and turnovers while playing smart on both offense and defense.

The Cavaliers are only a 5.5-point favorite as Auburn is bound to keep up the scoring tempo despite the heavy defensive presence of Virginia. Michigan State will take on Texas Tech in the other semi-final game as the final matchup will be decided this Saturday night.



State budgets: Priority number one

After their successful special five-day Special Session, the Legislature has been in their Regular

Session for a few weeks now. The Session will end in June so it is about one-fourth over. Almost one-third of the members are new, freshmen if you will. Even though they are,

for the most part a bright and talented group, they are still wet behind the ears when it comes to legislative ways.

Most are still striving to find their way to the bathrooms. Most major issues, especially revenue enhancement measures, are addressed in the first year of a fouryear quadrennium. Bless their hearts, right off the bat they were hit with a major vote to increase the gas tax to support an infrastructure plan. That will make the rest of their first year a downhill slide.

There are indeed other issues that need addressing in the good old Heart of Dixie. Most Alabamians want the right to vote for a lottery, which they would vote for in a New York minute. Most folks think it is ludicrous that we simply give our money to our sister states. It is not a popular subject, but our prison overcrowding problem has to be addressed. Democratic members are vitally interested in expanding Medicaid to improve and meet the state healthcare needs. Rural hospitals need help.

There is also a lot of interest in reforming our criminal justice system.

Even though these above mentioned problems and priorities need to be addressed, there

is one Constitutional certainty that the two state budgets must be crafted and put to bed. Our state constitution also mandates that they must be balanced.

The Education Trust Fund budget is in good shape. Tax revenues that support education grew tremendously last year. Lawmakers will have more money to appropriate for schools. In fact, this will more than likely be the largest education budget in state history.

The Education coffers will also be enhanced by the Supreme Court ruling that allows the state to collect online sales taxes. In Alabama state and local sales taxes are the cornerstone of support for basic services

port for basic services.

The state's growth
taxes, income and sales,
are earmarked for education. This lack of growth
in the dollars that support the General Fund
has caused headaches
for the legislative leaders
who write these budgets.
However, these budget
leaders have done a

good job. In this current year's General Fund budget, they were able to increase funding for state prisons. They also added extra dollars for mental health and law enforcement, as well as the state court system. In addition, the State Budget gave state employees their first cost-of-living raise in decades.

The \$2.04 billion General Fund budget passed easily in the 2018 election year session. It was a different scenario in 2015 and 2016 when lawmakers took multiple special sessions to pass the budgets and reject an array of tax increases and lottery bills to close a large funding gap.

A bill passed in 2016 during a Special Session created a salvation for the General Fund – a plan to allocate most of the one-million BP oil spill settlement monies. It allowed legislators to carry over \$93 million from the 2018 budget to this year.

In actuality, the state legislative leadership has very little discretion in budgeting. The vast majority of our state dollars directed to our state General Fund needs are earmarked. The General Fund Budget accounts for only 13 percent of Alabama's total spending of \$15.6 billion. For example our states gasoline tax is earmarked for roads and bridges and goes into the Road and Bridge Fund, which currently totals \$492 million in this year's budget. Of course that will be increased beginning in September.

Most folks are not really cognizant of the fact that most legislators do not really have a lot of input into the state budgets. The chairmen of the Budget Committees of each body, Ways and Means in the House and Finance and Taxation in the Senate, do the work and hold the power.

The chairmen of these prestigious and powerful committees are Rep. Bill Poole (R-Tuscaloosa), who chairs the House **Education Budget Com**mittee, and Rep. Steve Clouse (R-Ozark), who heads the General Fund. Sen. Greg Albritton (R-Escambia), chairs the Senate General Fund committee and veteran Senator Arthur Orr (R-Decatur) heads the **Education Finance Com**mittee

As legislators grapple with all of the issues on their plate, one thing remains the same, the State Budgets are Priority number one!

On giving up breadsticks

I got home a few weeks ago to face awful criticism. My wife said, "You reek of garlic!" It's true I'd been to an Italian restaurant for lunch and had a breadstick or two, but the garlic in the bread was something I didn't detect. As Robert Burns wrote, "Would some Power give us the gift to see ourselves as others see us." Burns wrote his poem after he saw a louse on a lady's bonnet at church and thought how horrified she'd be if she knew the parasite was crawling on her. All in all, it's much better to smell of garlic than to host a parasite.

Nevertheless, I had a decision to make—either enjoy my wife's company or give up breadsticks. I really love breadsticks, but the choice wasn't hard to make.

I told this story at church lately and we all had a good laugh. But I shared it in the context of a message on worthy goals. For a worthy family goal, I asked the women to tune out for a minute while I spoke to the men.

The Apostle Paul gave two straightforward words to men in the book of Ephesians. "Fathers, bring up your children in the discipline and instruction of the Lord" he wrote in chapter six. It's always been God's intention that the man be spiritual priest of the household. It's the man's job to be sure children receive religious instruction. Of course, countless women have taken up the slack when men haven't lived up to this ideal, but the ideal is real, nonetheless.

Many men in my age group look back with regret to the time our children were young. We were so busy with work responsibilities that we didn't give enough time to our children who now are grown and away. We wished we'd done better. But we "seasoned citizens" also know our gracious God has given us another chance with grandchildren. We can tell them they're special, love them and pray for them. We can be their parents' best partners in raising their children.

Paul also instructed husbands to "love your wives as Christ loved the church" (Ephesians 5:25). This exhortation is in the context of the wife being in submission to the husband—a passage of some interpretive difficulty. But I can't autocratically instruct my wife to submit if I ignore my part of the contract. To me is given he seemingly-impossible task of loving her just like Jesus loved his church. He loved his church enough to die for her.

Giving up breadsticks is probably one-one hundredth of one percent of my duty to love my wife as Christ loved his church. But it is that
