Dunn talks Department of Corrections issues, future plans

FOLEY - Commissioner of Alabama Department of Corrections Jeff Dunn spoke at the South Baldwin Chamber of Commerce's recent Leadership Series, and detailed issues and problems faced by the department, future plans and the department's 2019-2022 Strategic Plan. Dunn, a retired U.S. Air Force colonel, was appointed commissioner in

April 2015, and manages an inmate population of over 20,000 offenders, 26 correctional institutions, over 3,300 correctional officers, supervisors, and support staff, and operates an annual budget exceeding \$500 million. Approximately \$80 million is generated through the department's program to contribute to the cost of incarceration. "The two most important ingredients to success for someone who leaves prison are the opportunities

provided in prison to get skills, an education, and address the issues that brought them to prison, and the support structure outside of prison to be with them while they're there and be there when they get out," Dunn said. "We do all of the things required of a correctional agency, which first and foremost is public safety, keeping those who are supposed to be behind the fence behind

Water woes in Whitehouse Fork?

WHITEHOUSE FORK — For nearly five decades, the White House Water System has provided water service for its customers in the Whitehouse, Crossroads and Bromley communities of North Baldwin County. And while officials with the Water System say they are financially sound and are working to fix what they call minor problems with the system, some of the Water System's member/customers are looking to an alternative to provide service. "I just want people to know that there is an alternative out there," said Jacob Byrd. "I think if people know there is an alternative that will provide better service at a lower rate, they will be on board with us." A lifelong resident of Whitehouse Fork, Byrd currently lives with his parents,

Sam and Susan Byrd, but has purchased property in the Whitehouse Fork community where he has built a barn and plans to build a home. It was there that he began to have problems with his water pressure and discoloration of his water. "They told me it was dirt doobers and that it would clear up on its own," he said. "I just don't believe that." After he says he didn't get the answers he sought from the Water System, Byrd went to North Baldwin General Manager Jason M. Padgett with his concerns and discovered there were others who had similar problems. At the request of the members who share Byrd's concerns, North Baldwin Utilities General Manager Jason M. Padgett wrote a letter last October to then Board President Ruffin Crook, offering the Whitehouse Water

Students threaten violence at three schools in two days

DAPHNE – With the start of the academic year bringing three students arrested for threatening violence in Baldwin schools, education and law enforcement officials are warning students and parents that threats will not be tolerated. Three incidents were reported at Daphne, Spanish Fort and Elberta within two days. In each case, a teen threatened violence and was detained by municipal police. Baldwin County Sheriff Huey "Hoss" Mack said no one was harmed in any of the incidents. "In each case, it was a veiled threat and there was no actual violence," Mack said. The sheriff said parents and students should

Getting married? The process has changed in Alabama

Bells don't have to ring. The sun doesn't have to shine, and you don't even need to go to the chapel to get married in Alabama any more. As of Wednesday, the state requires new forms and a new process for getting hitched. Couples are no longer required to hold a ceremony or visit the probate office together for a 30-minute in-

Couples wanting to marry may access the new marriage certificate form online at the Alabama Department of Public Health's website at <http://www.alabamapublichealth.gov/vitalrecords/marriage-certificates.html>. The department's website will include instructions for completing and filing the new form, as well as answers to some frequently asked questions (FAQs) about the marriage law.

quisition. Instead, becoming blissfully wed is as simple as downloading a form and signing it.

And, you don't even have to sign it at the same time or be in the same room when your everlasting love is officially

recorded. Couples must have the form notarized before bringing it to the probate office. The date it is recorded is the official date of the marriage. The form must be delivered to the probate office within 30 days of the couples' signatures to be valid. "The whole intent of the law is to get the probate office out of the marriage busi-

Board to consider an offer for NBU to acquire the system.

"Over the last three months, North Baldwin Utilities has received more than three dozen calls/visits asking for help with suggestions on rates, service interruptions and dirty water complaints," according to the letter.

In a telephone interview, Padgett stated that the offer to take over the system was first presented to the WHWS Board 10 years ago.

At the time, a meeting was held and the Water System Board decided not to take NBU up on its offer.

Padgett said he decided to update the letter when he began receiving calls, many of which came from employees at NBU.

"They were asking me what we can do about these issues," he said, "and unless NBU has control over the system, there's not much we can do."

In the letter, Padgett spelled out 13 what he called "significant elements" in North Baldwin Utilities offer to acquire White House Water System, including:

Monthly water service usage charged (both minimum billings and unit usage rates) to current White House customers will be immediately reduced by approximately 35 percent, based upon minimum usage, realized from savings due to economics of scale and elimination of operational redundancies. The reduction would be immediate.

Monthly water service charged within the current White House service area will not be increased thereafter for a period of at least two years from transaction date.

Subsequent to the initial two-year period, monthly water service charged within the current White House service area could be subject to adjustment only to the extent and magnitudes as for all comparable customers within the NBU system.

New customer connection charges and service policies will be the same as for a comparable new customer within the NBU system.

All debts and assets of White House will be transferred to NBU.

Any cash balances that may remain in any White House accounts after payment of all White House debts

will be dedicated to funding water system infrastructure improvements (for example replacement of current undersized 6-inch water lines) within the current White House service area. It is estimated that NBU would spend approximately \$1 million upgrading the water lines.

Current White House employees will be provided employment opportunity with NBU.

Fully staff two, three-person crews for distribution needs within the current WHWS territory.

NBU will continue its and White House's tradition of closely cooperating with local volunteer fire departments, community organizations and churches with the communities.

NBU will initiate activities to enhance the reliability and effectiveness of water service within the service area of White House.

NBU will maintain the current business office which will be fully staffed.

NBU will establish an advisory board, to meet monthly, to represent water service interests of the community to the NBU Board of Directors.

NBU will maintain

the "Whitehouse" name on the current water tower.

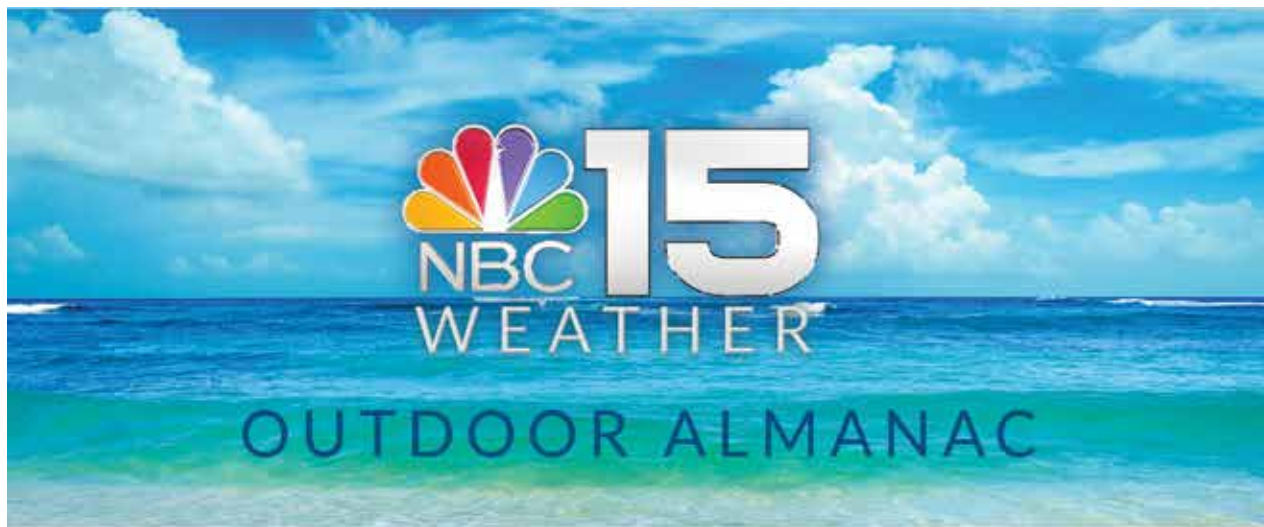
When the Water System was created in the early 1970s, Padgett said, it received all of its water from North Baldwin Utilities. A few years ago the Water Authority dug a well that produces some water for the system (NBU still provides about 80 to 90 percent of the system's water.)

"One of the biggest issues that we have is that the well causes additional water pressure on the lines," Padgett said, "and some of the older lines are unable to withstand the added pressure, which has caused breaks."

There has also been an issue with imbalanced pH levels in the water, causing discoloration in the water called "Blue Water," Padgett said.

At the Water System's membership meeting in April, Byrd and others expressed concerns about customer service and the length of time it takes the Water System to respond to issues in a timely manner. There have also been issues of ADEM violations and the way the day-to-day operations of the System is run.

OUTDOOR CONDITIONS: September in Baldwin County means 3 things: Football is here, cooler weather is near and most of the tourists are clear. That sets us up for some prime fishing opportunities in our inshore and coastal waters. Daytime and night action can be found in the Baldwin County shallows for speckled trout, redfish and flounder. Remember your limits, because when you find a school of willing specks, it can sometimes be easy to land a dozen or more fish on consecutive casts! Speckled trout will now have a slot limit. Trout must measure between 15 and 22 inches with a total possession limit of six per person, per day. One fish within the daily limit may be oversized.

Redfish also have a slot limit. You may keep 3 fish between 16-26 inches total length. One oversized fish is allowed to be part of that 3-fish limit. The minimum size limit for flounder is 14 inches, total length with a daily possession limit of five per person, per day. Recent reports from the Gulf State Pier indicate an off/on bite that is dependent upon the weather, seas, current and clarity of the water. There's only one way to find out if they are biting on any given day: Wet a line! If you're heading out there good luck and be safe!

the fence ... It's also our job to deliver back to society someone who is prepared to be a law-abiding, productive citizen and not a re-offender."

Current Issues

Dunn says many challenges being faced by the department today are results of decisions implemented in the 70s and 80s which are no longer relevant. With new requirements in place, the department is having to adjust accordingly, and, swiftly.

"One of my favorite quotes by Winston Churchill is 'the pessimist sees difficulty in every opportunity, but the optimist sees opportunity in every difficulty,' and we've made the conscious choice as a leadership team in the department to go from being the pessimist that sees difficulty to the optimist that sees opportunity in every difficulty," Dunn said. "By that definition, we have a whole host of opportunities in the Department of Corrections."

The three top issues faced by the department today are overcrowding, understaffing, and violence and contraband, Dunn said.

Statistics show Alabama prisons are currently 150 percent overcapacity, a decrease over the last four years when prisons were 200 percent overcapacity.

Prisons, he said, are understaffed by 50 - 30 percent. These two conditions combined lead to a high rate of violence and contraband, which Dunn says may be the highest in the nation.

Strategic Plan

To combat the current issues found in Alabama prisons, the Alabama Department of Corrections leadership has developed a strategic plan.

"This is our intent to build a roadmap to take the resources that we have and focus them to move towards a new vision for the department," Dunn said. "This new vision is very simple: we want to do our part to make Alabama safe. Our mission is we want to be a team of dedicated professionals that provide public safety, and the way we do that is to safely and securely confine, rehabilitate, and help with reentry of offenders. The nuance there is reentry is a new mission set for us that we've embraced."

Dunn says historically, the department has focused on security and confinement, and rehabilitation was done

only after the resources for security were in place. Until now there was no large emphasis on reentry.

To correct this, the department has begun to backwards engineer from the end results to the beginning planning stages. They have asked questions such as, what the leadership wants the inmates to look like when they leave prison and how they want to assist the inmates for re-entry and for public safety.

The rest of the plan will be built based on the answers to create a department that will drive the actions of every day of an inmate's incarceration, towards the end goal.

Thus the strategic plan was created with large focuses in four areas: staffing, infrastructure, programming, and culture.

Focus

To address staffing issues, the department took a long look at compensation, recruiting, and retention. An academy was created that originally enrolled approximately 40 people, and in less than four months has resulted in over 200 new hires and has trained over 100 individuals.

"We've done that by re-engineering our recruit-

ing efforts, by rebuilding our training pipelines and our training capacity, and then building a compensation package that makes corrections competitive with our other law enforcement brothers and sisters," Dunn said.

An attempt to regionalize the corrections system has begun to help with infrastructure, and will condense the 25 current male facilities spread across the state into regional complexes focused towards the eventual re-entry of inmates into society.

"Part of that infrastructure plan is to redo our work release system to try to address this burgeoning need for workers and to get a strong pipeline in various areas for the 8,000 inmates that are leaving to have them come directly into the workforce with skills and training that they need to become a great benefit to businesses," said Dunn.

Programming refers to: treatment, including medical, mental health, substance abuse, or life skills education; education, with a high focus in literacy, general adult basic education, and GEDs; and vocational certifications to give inmates skills to re-enter society, apply in a competitive market and get a living wage job.

The final focal point is culture, the last piece needed to steer inmates on the right path for re-entry.

"If you neglect anything for 30 years, such as an organization, and don't pay the people, don't invest in their work environment, don't invest in their professional development, don't communicate that you care about who they are and what they do and that they bring value into their environment and into their state, then that situation is going to deteriorate over time, and that's what we've seen in the department," Dunn said. "We've got pockets of culture that are not acceptable, pockets of practices that have grown up over the years that we're trying to do away with."

The leadership staff is working to professionalize the Department of Corrections and hopes to make it into a department that employees are proud to work for that makes a positive impact on the community and the state.

Looking ahead

Dunn said he hopes that to achieve the goal and vision of the Department of Corrections, business leaders in the communities will be open to the idea of hiring a workforce that includes

those with felonies who have re-entered into society.

"I hear from business leaders across the state that employ our inmates that they're no different from the current workforce," Dunn said. "We ask for business leaders to please be open to the idea that there may be opportunity for someone who has a felony record to come into a workspace and deliver value to the company."

Second, he asked that business leaders let the department know what they're looking for within their workforce. Ingram State Technical College is the only community college to Dunn's knowledge that has an inmate population as its sole student body and offers a wide variety of programs for inmates to choose from.

Ingram works with prisons across Alabama to deliver adult basic education and trade certification, and Dunn asked for business leaders to let the department know what programs would be beneficial additions to Ingram's curriculum to provide inmates with skills needed in today's workforce.

realize that even if no violence takes place, any threat could lead to suspension, expulsion and arrest, jeopardizing a student's future in school.

"They have to realize that a veiled threat is still a threat and it will be taken very seriously," Mack said.

Mack said that before the school year began in Baldwin County on Aug. 14, local authorities and school system officials were watching to see if earlier incidents in Mobile County would trigger copycat actions by Baldwin students.

He said the Baldwin threats seem to be isolated incidents not caused by other actions.

On Aug. 20, a 15-year-old Daphne High School

student was arrested after being accused of threatening to use a gun to hurt other students, according to Daphne police. The student was not armed when picked up in the school gymnasium after the incident.

On Aug. 22, an Elberta Middle School student was arrested on a charge of making terroristic threats. School officials said students were not in danger and the incident is under investigation by the Elberta Police Department.

Also on Aug. 22, a 14-year-old Spanish Fort High School student was charged with making a terrorist threat, according to reports.

Spanish Fort Police Chief David Edgar said he could not comment on the details of a case involving a minor, but the suspect was turned over to juvenile authori-

ties. He said the teen is accused of making a threat against the school.

Edgar said that local police are alert for any threats or actions in schools. An angry teen may not mean to carry out a threat, but with the safety of an entire school at stake, authorities must take any threat very seriously, he said.

"Kids being kids, they don't necessarily think about the consequences of what they're saying and how seriously it's going to be taken by law enforcement and the school board and that actions will be taken," Edgar said.

Edgar said school resource officers in Spanish Fort schools have not reported any overall increase in problems with students.

After the two inci-

dents on Aug. 22, Superintendent of Education Eddie Tyler sent a message to Baldwin County parents saying that while students may not be serious when making threats, police will take the issue seriously.

"I am asking you as parents to please have a conversation with your children about the seriousness of words and threats in today's school environment," Tyler said in the statement. "Joking around about having a gun, blowing up a school or shooting students will be met with a swift response by law enforcement and our administration. It is going to result in immediate disciplinary action, if not criminal charges."

He asked parents to stress to their children that students making threats will be arrested.

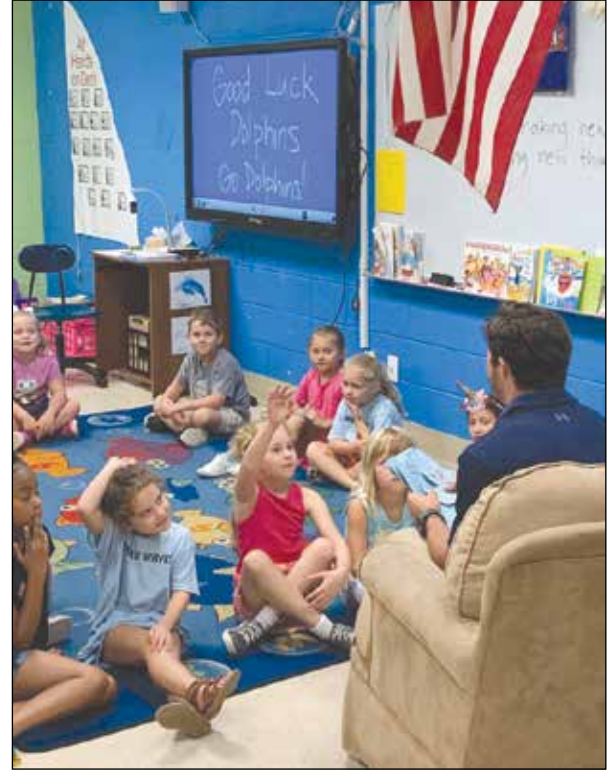

A lot of that, Byrd said, is due in largely to the fact that the Water System has expanded through the years, running lines down Alabama 225 reaching areas as far south as Spanish Fort. Byrd said the system currently has about 2,300 customers.

“I have a lot of respect for those who set up the Water System and what they have been able to accomplish over the years,” Byrd said. “I just think that we have outgrown the system and are in need of help in order to maintain what we have.”

As a follow-up to the letter in October, Byrd set out to hold a meeting of the membership to discuss NBU’s proposal.

According to Article VII, Section 1 of the Water System by-laws, a meeting “must be called whenever a petition requesting such meeting is signed by at least 10 percent of the members.”

“In order to have a petition signed by 10 percent of the membership, I need to know who all the members are so I can contact them,” Byrd

said.

The petition states: “We the undersigned members of the Whitehouse Water System request the Board of Directors of WHWS to notify all members in writing announcing a public meeting between WHWS and NBU to allow both sides the opportunity to discuss the merger proposal sent to the WHWS Board of Directors on Oct. 23, 2018. The public meeting will allow the members of the WHWS to better understand the proposal and ask questions from representatives of both systems.

After a scheduled meeting occurs a vote will be taken within 14 days of the public meeting, allowing the members to vote if they wish to merge WHWS with NBU. Such vote will be handled by a third party to ensure privacy and transparency for the vote.”

According to Article V, Section 1 of the by-laws, “A single membership may be issued to all persons owning or having a substantial possessory interest in the property. Only one membership may be held with respect to property at one time.”

“I can go door-to-door, but unless I know who holds a certificate of membership, I have no way of knowing if the person signing the petition is a member,” Byrd said.

So, he requested a list of the membership, which the Board refused, saying that it was a violation of its members’ privacy.

Byrd then retained Bay Minette attorney Harry Still III seeking a court order to get the list of the members. In November, Still sent a letter to the Water System seeking to obtain the list.

In June, a judge ordered the Water System to hand over the list of members to Byrd. At the same time a letter was sent out to the membership from the Board informing them of the petition, but also encouraging members to stay with the White House Water System.

“If you are approached by anyone representing this movement promising lower rates, please remember that handing over your system to them removes any negotiating power or control Whitehouse/Crossroads/Bromley members have over

their water system. We encourage to let representatives from this movement know that White House Water System will remain property of the Whitehouse/Crossroads/Bromley community.”

In contacting the media, Still said he wanted people to get straight answers of what the petition was about.

“We feel like this letter is misleading at best,” Still said, “and just want people to make an informed decision before anything is done.”

Larry Patton, who serves as the current Board president for the White House Water System, has a different view of the petition and the NBU proposal.

“This is not a merger, it is an outright takeover attempt by NBU,” Patton said.

Patton estimates the Water System’s members at between 2,500 and 3,000 and at the annual meeting in April, only about 100 members showed up.

“Of that only about 10 or 12 had complaints about how their Water System is being handled,” he said, “and most of those are North

Baldwin Utilities employees.”

Patton called the issues with the water lines minor and said they are currently working to get a federal grant to help expand and fix some of the line breaks.

“Our system is in good financial shape,” he said. “We have a good working relationship with North Baldwin Utilities. They are helping us extend some of our lines and have always been there for us over the years when we needed them.

“We are a small system and we are working on solutions, but it’s just going to take time and we’re asking the members to be patient with us while we are going through this process.”

Padgett said he welcomed the opportunity to meet with the White House Water System Board and members, adding that similar proposals had been accepted by several other smaller utilities companies in the area.

“I want to bring some of them in to talk about their experience,” he said. “We are not trying to take over the White House Water System.

We are their neighbors and want to do everything we can to help out.”

Byrd said the bottom line in all this is that he just wants answers, answers he said he is not getting from the White House Water System Board.

“I just don’t think they’re being honest with us,” he said. “I didn’t want to do it this way. All I wanted to do was to sit down and have a conversation and that just didn’t happen.”

Patton said he is serving his second stint as president of the Board and has nothing but the best interest of the customer/members at heart.

If Byrd gets the required amount of signatures, he said, they would have no choice but to have a meeting and discuss NBU’s proposal, but he said, according to the system’s by-laws and the Water System attorney, the decision to accept the proposal would ultimately be up to the Board.

“I have never lied to anybody about anything,” he said. “I have served this Board for a long time and all I want is to do what is best for our customers.”

ness,” said Dean Mott, chief clerk of the Baldwin County Probate office. “Now we’re strictly the conduit to just get the forms recorded.”

The cost to record a marriage is \$73 and includes one certified copy for the couple.

Now that probate officials simply record the marriage, the process may be faster. Though couples may want to be more attentive. The impetus is on them to insure sure all the information on the form is correct.

“It’s still a legal document,” Mott said. “There cannot be any white out or strike through lines. If you make a mistake you have to redo the form.”

Once a mistake is recorded, couples will have to pay a fee and deal with the Alabama Department of Public Health to make the correction.

The form does not have to be filed in the county in which the couple resides.

Couples who sign the form and, have a ceremony and then decide

to part ways before delivering the form to the probate office are off the hook.

“If it does not get recorded, it didn’t happen,” Mott said.

The elimination of marriage licenses will not affect any other aspects of marriage in Alabama, including divorce, spousal support, child support and child custody.

The Alabama Legislature voted earlier this year to end the issuance of marriage licenses to

accommodate conservative probate judges who objected to same-sex marriage. A U.S. Supreme Court ruling allowing for same sex marriages means states must issue marriage licenses or record the marriage of same sex couples as legally binding documents.

Mott said Baldwin County complies with the federal ruling.

“Everybody that wants to get married can, now it’s just a much simpler process,” he said.

Mobile Baykeeper director to speak at Fairhope Unitarian Fellowship

STAFF REPORT

Casi Callaway, Executive Director and Baykeeper of Mobile Baykeeper, will speak at Fairhope Unitarian Fellowship on Sept. 22 about the issues of sewage, coal ash and creating a cleaner Mobile Bay. Despite an 86 percent drop in sewage overflows in Mobile Bay over 2018, sewage remains a major issue in our community. Callaway will discuss what causes these spills and how every citizen plays a role in stopping them.

Callaway will also address what will happen if Alabama Power's coal ash pit on the Mobile River were to spill - which is highly likely in the event of a hurricane or flood - the impact would be 20 times larger than that of Deepwater Horizon. She will explain what Mobile Baykeeper, a 22-year-old environmental nonprofit dedicated to Mobile Bay, is doing and how you can get involved.

Callaway is from Mobile, graduated high school from the last all girls' class of Julius T. Wright and received a degree in Philosophy and Ecology from Emory University in

Atlanta, Georgia. She began working in the environmental field as the Southeastern Regional College Campus Coordinator for Earth Day 1990.

Callaway then began working for Clean Water Action in Washington, D.C. She worked on local, state, and federal campaigns in many areas, including public education, research of political issues, lobbying at every level of government, and fundraising. Before leaving D.C., Callaway attained the positions of the D.C. Field Canvas Director and the D.C. Office's Florida Program Director.

As Executive Director & Baykeeper of Mobile Baykeeper (formerly Mobile Bay Watch, Inc.), Callaway is responsible for coordinating public education; community organizing; research and fundraising. She holds four gubernatorial appointments and serves on the boards of several local, state and regional environmental organizations. Callaway is also active in the Junior League of Mobile and with Government Street Presbyterian Church. She and her husband, Jarrett, have one son, Coleman.

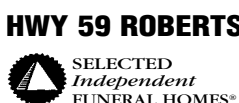

Lightning causes house fire, death in Baldwin County

In August lightning was blamed for a Fairhope house fire and the death of a Gulf Shores man.

As summer storms continue to batter Baldwin County, officials at the Baldwin County Emergency Management Agency are urging residents to be weather aware.

“Because of where we are weather changes so rapidly and thunderstorms seem to crop up out of nowhere,” said Jenni Guerry, the agency’s education outreach coordinator.

When lightning and thunder make an appearance, there is one rule of thumb, she said: go

indoors.

“Most people don’t realize that the most dangerous place you can be is where the water and the land interface,” she said. “Being on the water makes you more vulnerable to being struck.”

Does the lightning look far enough away? Is it just a light in the sky in the distance? Still too close she said.

“Lightning travels beyond just the clouds. Being a certain distance away cannot guarantee you are safe,” she said.

If you do get caught in a storm while at the beach or a sports field, Guerry said it is far safer to get into your vehicle than stand under a tree or remain out in the open.

Once storms have moved through an area it is best to wait 30 minutes before returning to the water or playing field.

So far in 2019, 13 people have been killed by lightning strikes across the United States. In 2016 40 people died when struck by lightning. Florida routinely holds the number one spot for annual lightning deaths because of the amount of water surrounding the state, she said.

To stay weather aware in Baldwin County, download the Baldwin County EMA app for free. It will send weather alerts and warnings to your phone and help you plan appropriately as severe weather develops.

Lightning: What You Need to Know

» NO PLACE outside is safe when thunderstorms are in the area!!

» If you hear thunder, lightning is close enough to strike you.

» When you hear thunder, immediately move to safe shelter: a substantial building with electricity or plumbing or an enclosed, metal-topped vehicle with windows up.

» Stay in safe shelter at least 30 minutes after you hear the last sound of thunder.

Indoor Lightning Safety

» Stay off corded phones, computers and other electrical equipment that put you in direct contact with electricity.

» Avoid plumbing, including sinks, baths and faucets.

» Stay away from windows and doors,

and stay off porches.

» Do not lie on concrete floors, and do not lean against concrete walls.

Last Resort Outdoor Risk Reduction Tips

» If you are caught outside with no safe shelter anywhere nearby the following actions may reduce your risk:

» Immediately get off elevated areas such as hills, mountain ridges or peaks

» Never lie flat on the ground

» Never shelter under an isolated tree

» Never use a cliff or rocky overhang for shelter

» Immediately get out and away from ponds, lakes and other bodies of water

» Stay away from objects that conduct electricity (barbed wire fences, power lines, windmills, etc.)

Regions Bank in Bay Minette hosts fraud seminar for small business

BAY MINETTE — “Protect Your Small Business From Fraud,” was the topic of a lunch-n-learn seminar presented Thursday, Aug. 22 Regions Bank in Bay Minette.

The seminar, part of Regions Next Step for Business, was hosted by Bay Minette Branch Manager Lamar Morris and was presented by Kariene Fortner, vice president relationship manager for Regions Next Step Financial Wellness, based in Mobile.

Also in attendance was Jamie M. Salerno, branch manager and assistant vice president with the Regions Schillinger Road branch in Mobile.

“The biggest thing you can do to protect yourself from fraud is education,” Fortner said. “Our goal is to provide you with the information you need to recognize and prevent fraud

in your small business.”

Fortner touched on a wide variety of topics during the hour-long seminar including bookkeeper fraud, and how to protect your small business from fraud when participating in Internet banking, paper payments and electronic payments.

“Bookkeeper fraud is the No. 1 type of fraud that affects small busi-

ness,” Fortner said. “Oftentimes these are trusted employees that take advantage of close relationships with clients.”

Attendees were given a “Fraud Prevention Checklist,” and a “Preventing Fraud” worksheet, “to provide a 360-degree view for business.”

Items on the checklist for bookkeeper fraud included:

Do you sign blank checks?

Do you maintain dual control for issuing or reconciling checks?

Are employees aware of and adhere to internal controls?

Do you restrict employee access to accounting systems?

Do you have an approval process for new vendors?

The seminar also focused on cybersecurity, preventing hackers through security measures and watching out for fake websites and phishing emails.

“Approximately 91 percent of all cyberattacks begin with a phishing email,” Fortner said. “One of the biggest things to look for are emails that ask you for your personal information. Think about it. When you filled out your application, you provided us with all of your information. Trust me, we don’t need to ask you for your information. We already have it.”

Other warning signs include emails that are addressed to “valued cus-

tomers” or other variations of a generic greeting.

“Almost always if the email does not address you specifically by name, it is not legitimate,” she said.

Also, pay attention to the address that the email is coming from. Chances are if it is not legitimate, it will look official, but the address will be slightly off.

Grammar and spelling mistakes are also a huge red flag, Fortner said.

“We know how to spell,” she said. “When we send something out, we are required to use a standard form and it will go through several checks before it is ever sent out. It is very rare that anything official will have spelling

or grammatical errors in it.”

It is up to us to help stop the madness of gun violence

Just days after 30 people were shot dead in El Paso and Dayton, and dozens more wounded, officials announced that more carnage was planned. In those following days officials in 18 states arrested at least 30 people who have threatened to commit mass killings.

Are they all serious? Do they all have the means to carry out their barbarous plans? It's unknown. But authorities have no choice but to treat each instance as if the danger is grave. There have been 263 mass shootings in the U.S. in 2019. Each resulted in the death or

wounding of four or more people.

Now, the threat has landed squarely in Baldwin County Schools.

Last Tuesday, a student at Daphne High School was arrested for making terroristic threats.

On Thursday, two separate incidents, one at Elberta High School and one at Spanish Fort High School sent two more students to jail, again for making terroristic threats.

That evening Baldwin County Schools Superintendent Eddie Tyler emailed a letter to every parent in the school system in which he implored parents to talk with their

children.

In the letter he said that there have been threats made by students at several schools. He did not specify how many others there were except that they were violent. Terroristic. Hair-raising enough to stop authorities in their tracks.

Are they mutterings of an angry kid who has no intention of following through? Are they a joke made in poor taste? Are they the warnings of a truly disturbed individual who is teetering on the edge of a horrifying decision?

There is no way to know. Each incident, Tyler said, would be

treated as a legitimate threat to the lives of every soul in the building.

Parents, Tyler is right. Talk to your kids. If they are making light of the situation through jokes or empty threats, explain to them that these jokes are not just in bad taste, they are show a lack of empathy or concern for any of the recent victims. The terror, loss, anger and heartbreak that rips through a community after a mass shooting is soul crushing.

Listen to children around you. Parents, friends, neighbors. Notice their behavior. Are they struggling? Has their behavior changed?

If they are allowing their emotions to erupt to the surface through angry words and empty threats let them know they will face the same harsh punishment as if they were caught with a weapon. There are other ways to deal with bubbling emotions than unleashing a series of ugly threats.

Do you think a child is truly struggling? Do you think they may be capable of the type of carnage that has ripped other communities apart? Say something.

This may be the most important conversation you have. Seek help. Contact authorities. Any decision you make that saves

the life of your child or others is the most important decision of your life.

Tell your children the same. Did they hear a classmate make a threat? Did they see a gun in someone's backpack? Did they overhear a conversation? They need to let their teacher know, immediately. Write a note, drop it on the teacher's desk. Go to the office. Whatever they need to do, do it.

Please, parents, grandparents, babysitters, aunts and uncles. Talk to the children in your life tonight.

Their life, and the lives of those around them, may depend on it.

The Summer of 1969

As we say goodbye to the summer of 2019, allow me to reminisce with you and indeed commemorate more than likely a summer exactly 50 years ago that was undoubtedly

the most momentous summer in American history – The Summer of 1969.

It is amazing what all occurred in America during the last six-weeks of the Summer of 1969. Richard Nixon was in his first year as president. He had escalated the never-ending Vietnam War and he had heightened the Tet offensive. The war was finally heading in our direction. A July assault on North Vietnam caused heavy casualties to the Viet Cong. Ho Chi Minh would die in Hanoi on September 2.

The war which had raged for five to six years had caused major upheavals and discord and protests at virtually every college campus in the country. It had spearheaded and somewhat created the hippie culture among a vast throng of young people throughout America.

In the Summer of 1969, every hippie in America gathered in rural New York at an event called Woodstock. Woodstock was a music festival that attracted more than 500,000 people. Movies and songs have been developed over the past 50 years simply entitled Woodstock. The music festival was held from August 15 to 18 in the late Summer of 1969. It probably would be accurate to say that a good many hallucinatory drugs were partaken by the patrons during the four day lovefest.

An unbelievable lineup of musical talent sang and

Joan Baez, Bob Dylan, Santana, The Grateful Dead, Credence Clearwater Revival, Janis Joplin, Sly and the Family Stone, The Who, Jefferson Airplane, Joe Cocker, Sha Na Na, Crosby Stills Nash and Young, and Blood, Sweat and Tears. If that ain't a lineup, you don't know the history of American culture over the last 50 years. Woodstock was an iconic event and it happened in August of 1969.

Woodstock was a cultural storm. However, occurring at the same time, August 15-18 in 1969 was a real storm which hit the gulf coast. Hurricane Camille hit the Mississippi and Louisiana coast as a major Category 5 devastating and deadly hurricane. It was the second most intense tropical storm on record to strike the United States. As it raged toward the coastal borders it intensified to a major category 5. It made landfall in Pass Christian and Waveland, Mississippi early on August 18, 1969. Camille caused tremendous damage. It flattened nearly everything along the coast of Mississippi and Louisiana. Camille killed 259 people and caused \$1.44 billion in damages. That would amount to \$10 billion in damages in today's dollars. It happened exactly 50 years ago. Camille is considered one of the most impactful and devastating hurricanes in U.S. history, only surpassed by one known as the Labor Day hurricane of 1935.

The most momentous event of the Summer of 1969 was the Apollo landing on the moon by American astronauts on July 20, 1969. This event was quite celebrated by our national media commemorating the 50th Anniversary of this summer.

The lunar landing on the moon was watched live on television by a good many Americans with great pride. Most people remember exactly where they were and what they were doing when America put a man on the moon. Most Americans are familiar with the words, "That's one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind." Those were the words spoken by Astronaut Neal Armstrong when he took man's first step on the moon in the Summer of 1969.

Not to be outdone, the Summer of '69 was the mother lode of some of Hollywood's greatest movies. Get this folks, being released and shown that summer was "Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid," starring Paul Newman and Robert Redford, "Easy Rider," with Jack Nicholson, "Midnight Cowboy" and "True Grit," starring John Wayne. He won the Academy Award as Best Actor of 1969 for his performance. "Hello Dolly," took Broadway by storm.

On August 9, the sensational murder of actress, Sharon Tate, at the hands of Charles Manson occurred in Beverly Hills, California.

The Summer of 1969 was truly one for the record books. It was 50 years ago, can you believe it?

Is a Renewable Electric Grid a Mirage?

Reducing greenhouse gas emissions to curb climate change will require enormous sacrifice. The enormity of the required sacrifice suggests that we should have consensus on the goal before acting. Recent discussions of the Green New Deal have highlighted some of the required sacrifices, but I suspect that the full implications of an all renewable power electric grid remain obscure.

The Green New Deal was sponsored by New York Congresswoman Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez and Massachusetts Senator Edward Markey. The proposal highlighted measures like a renewable energy electric grid, eliminating greenhouse gas emissions in transportation (including phasing out air travel), and creating a smart electric grid. Limiting atmospheric carbon dioxide to 440 ppm, the European Union's goal, will require these changes and then some. Assessing whether aggressive mitigation of climate change is worthwhile requires recognizing the full cost.

An all-renewable energy electric grid appears feasible. Over 30 states already require a minimum portion of electricity generation from renewable sources; Hawaii will require 100 percent renewables by 2040. Renewable fuels are certainly costly, but the consequences go way beyond cost.

Wind and solar power and batteries are the components of a zero emissions grid. Yet wind and solar generate power only about 30 percent of the time. Currently utilities rely on fossil-fuel-powered plants to provide backup; a zero emissions grid will require batteries. The Manhattan Institute re-

port, "The 'New Energy Economy': An Exercise in Magical Thinking," demonstrates the flaws of such an approach.

One concern involves simply building enough wind farms and solar panels to meet electricity demand. In 2018, the U.S. had 1.1 million megawatts of electricity generation capacity, 62 percent from natural gas and coal. Due to intermittent production, we would need perhaps 3 million megawatts of wind or solar capacity for the grid. If we used only wind turbines, we would need a wind farm larger than Texas. We would need perhaps 1.5 million turbines, each requiring 150 acres for an undisturbed flow of air, or 350,000 square miles.

Even this is almost surely an underestimate. Wind energy potential maps have already allowed use of the best wind farm sites. Electricity demand has been steadily rising and would jump further to charge the electric cars, trucks, and trains and eliminate gas and diesel-powered vehicles.

The battery numbers are also troubling. One year's production of batteries from Tesla's "Gigafactory" can store enough power for the U.S. grid for three minutes. The "New Energy Economy" report contends that 1,000 years of "Gigafactory" production would be needed to store just two days of power.

Producing such quantities of turbines, solar panels, and batteries will use enormous quantities of fossil fuels. A standard wind turbine requires an estimated 900 tons of materials, including concrete and metal. The lithium, cobalt, nickel, and other needed chemicals

for solar panels and batteries must be mined and transported. In addition, turbines, panels and batteries will need replacing periodically.

The power grid has long operated on adding capacity to meet demand. Millions of decisions have been made based on this principle. We assume we can power our air conditioners, refrigerators, and computers, and soon charge electric cars in a timely fashion. Gas-powered generators provide backup as needed.

A zero emissions grid will not just involve much more expensive electricity. The supply of electricity will be insufficient to meet the demand. "Smart" appliances will ration electricity by running only when electricity is available. After ensuring hospitals and fire stations have power, we may be unable to charge our cell phones and electric cars.

The ripple effects will be enormous. How do we get to work if our electric car didn't charge overnight? How will we heat and cool our homes? Could global supply chains still operate? The Green New Deal has highlighted some of the dramatic changes required to aggressively combat climate change. But I doubt that Americans understand the consequences of ending on-demand electricity.

Working through feelings with food and creativity on Tastemade's 'Just Jen'

Feeling down, worried or in a rut? Jen Phanomrat feels your pain. In fact, she has a recipe for that.

In 'Just Jen,' currently streaming its second season on the foodie/travel digital platform Tastemade, the New York-born lifestyle personality shares her passion for food and design through a variety of bright and eclectic dishes and crafts, believing that creativity — whether it's manifested in cooking, crafting or simply living — should be accessible, enjoyable, inspiring and approached with humor.

'We really wanted a show that wasn't preachy or authoritative,' Phanomrat explains, 'but we wanted it to be really fun. So we use entertainment as a way to explore a lot of real issues like mental health, female empowerment and culture identity on the basis of curiosity and I wanted to do that through food because that's my big love. So by sharing approachable recipes and craft projects, I wanted to encourage viewers to explore these aspects within their own selves and their surroundings.'

Many of the recipes she shares are her own creations and she credits her upbringing in Jackson

Heights in Queens, N.Y., for her eclectic palate. But this season, the Thai-Filipino-American is also bringing in dishes from old family recipes that she says 'are just feel-good ... because that's the main thing. I just want everything to feel good.'

Among the topics broached in Season 2 are fierceness, love, motivation, community, travel and sadness.

'When I'm feeling sad,' she says, 'what do I want to eat? I want to eat something that's junk food but doesn't really make me feel crappy. So we made a banana ice cream that's kind of indulgent but still really healthy for you. But we also don't put labels on things so we want people to embrace their emotions and to figure out really what's going on with them and not be afraid of it.'

As for getting motivated, there's a plan for that, too.

'We have a whole episode dedicated to feeling spicy so that's something I do often at home,' she says with a laugh. 'When I'm just feeling either lethargic or I need something to kick my ass, I'll add a bunch of spice but make it tasty, and it just reinvigorates me.'

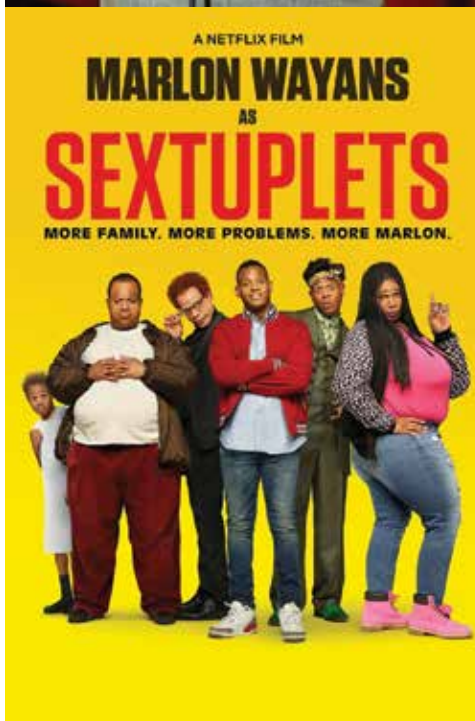

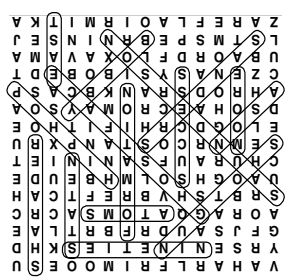

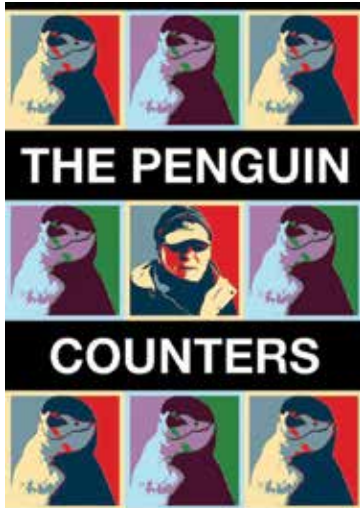

BEST SIDNEY POITIER MOVIES

"A Raisin in the Sun" (1961) Poitier rises to the occasion, as do his co-stars, in the adaptation of Lorraine Hansberry's classic play about a family's sudden windfall.
"Lilies of the Field" (1963): Poitier became the first African-American to win the best actor Oscar for his portrayal of a handyman who reluctantly helps a group of nuns build a chapel.
"The Slender Thread" (1965) Sydney Pollack ("Out of Africa") made his feature-film directing debut with this tense tale of a crisis center worker's (Poitier) attempt to save a suicidal woman (Anne Bancroft) via telephone.
"Duel at Diablo" (1966) Poitier reunited with "Lilies of the Field" director Ralph Nelson on this notably mature and gritty Western, also starring James Garner.

"To Sir, With Love" (1967) Poitier had a hit-after-hit movie year - which TCM will showcase in full on Sept. 17 - that started with his memorable portrayal of a novice teacher dealing with a classroom of London toughs.
"In the Heat of the Night" (1967) The screen truly sizzled from the teaming of Poitier and Rod Steiger as lawmen with very different methodologies in this Oscar-winning Southern crime drama.
"Guess Who's Coming to Dinner" (1967) Capping a year that any performer would cherish, Poitier worked with screen legends Spencer Tracy and Katharine Hepburn in this comedy-drama about an interracial marriage-to-be. Katharine Houghton, Hepburn's niece, played the intended bride.
"For Love of Ivy" (1968) Though it often isn't included on lists of his prime

projects, this comedy-drama features a wonderfully romantic Poitier as a suitor enlisted to help a family keep their highly valued maid (Abbey Lincoln).
"Uptown Saturday Night" (1974) Poitier began a series of successful "buddy comedies" as both director and - with Bill Cosby and Harry Belafonte - star of this high-spirited story of the race to recover a stolen winning lottery ticket.
"Stir Crazy" (1980) If you don't remember Poitier appearing in this prison comedy, he didn't; instead, he put Gene Wilder and Richard Pryor through their paces as the film's director.
"Shoot to Kill" (1988) Drawing on his authority and sheer star power, Poitier is effective as an FBI agent who relies on a tracker (Tom Berenger) to find a lethal villain in the Canadian-American wilderness.

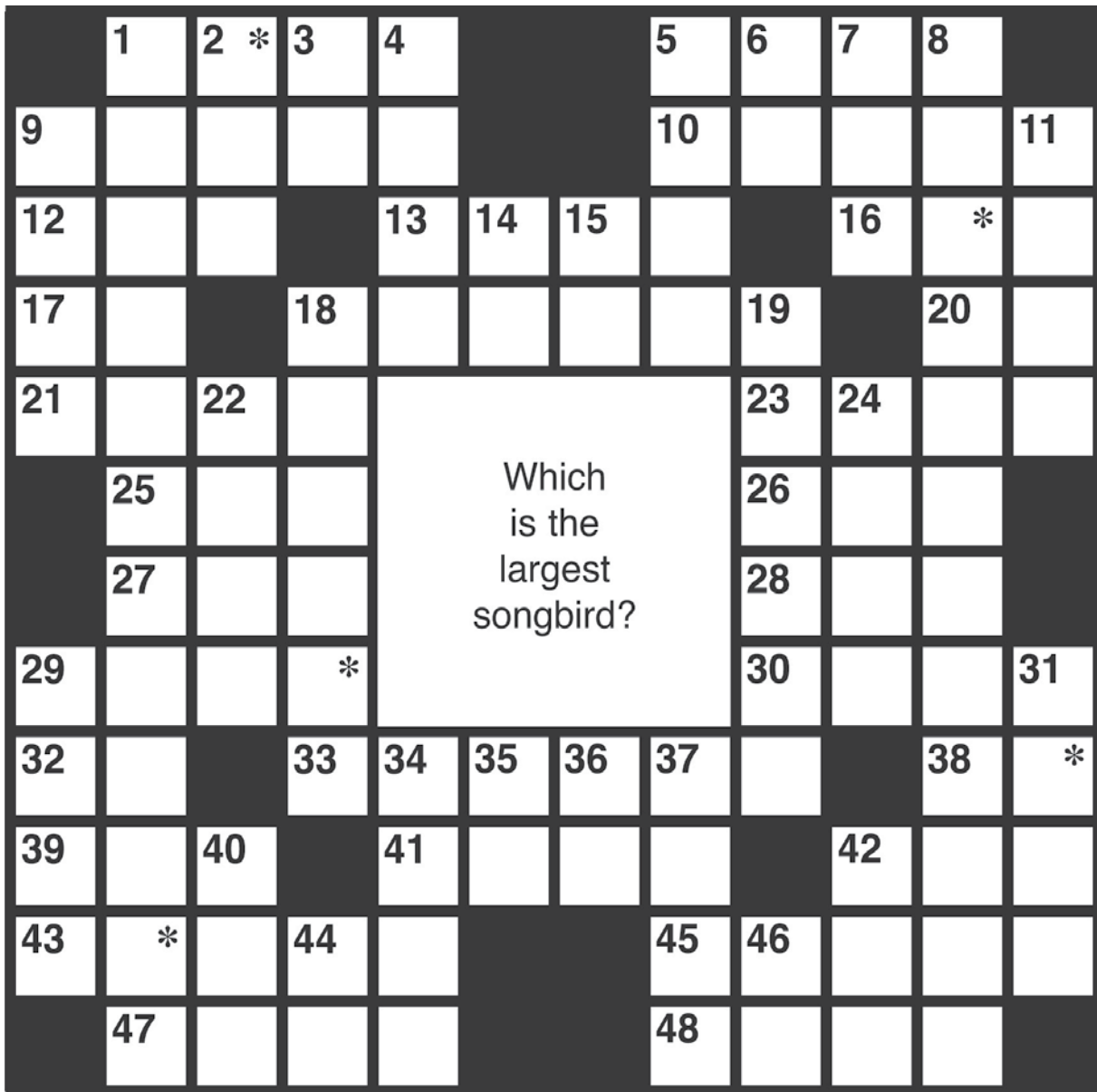
