Domino's hosts neighborhood party after racial profiling accusation

FOLEY — Last weekend at the Beulah Heights neighborhood park, children played with beach balls. They dangled triangular slices of pizza above their mouths and giggled as the cheese slid down onto their noses.

It was a fun, typical neighborhood party in a typical neighborhood park.

The reason for the celebration, attendees said, has also

grown all too typical across the United States.

Residents here say the assistant manager of a local Domino's Pizza racially profiled the neighborhood when she refused to send a delivery driver there after nightfall.

On June 30 Beulah Heights resident Debbie Smith logged on to the Domino's Pizza website to place an order. When the website showed an error, Smith called the store

When the shout was reciprocated by many of the Auburn faithful in attendance, Tigers men's basketball coach Bruce Pearl responded, "I don't have a speech. That was it."

But he didn't stop there, talking, of course, about the Tigers' historic Final Four run, which ended in a 63-62 loss to Virginia when Cavalier senior Kyle Guy sank three free throws with under one second to play.

But Pearl also talked about his faith in God, how that has been an integral part of shaping the lives of young men, and making a dif-

Governor removes Sen. Chris Elliott from ATRIP-II committee

On Sept. 9, Gov. Kay Ivey removed Baldwin County Sen. Chris Elliott (R - Daphne) from the ATRIP-II committee she had appointed him to earlier this year, a move Elliott said he believes was politically motivated due to his opposition to the Mobile River Bridge tolling project.

Elliott first learned of his removal from the committee from a post from the Alabama Political Reporter blog.

"I was disappointed to initially learn through a single online blog of the Governor's decision to remove me from the ATRIP II Committee," Elliott said. "Unfortunately, this action did not

Portion of County Road 9 to close for bridge replacement

MARLOW — A portion of County Road 9 between County Road 28 and Underwood Road will close on Monday, Sept. 23 and remain closed for more than 5 months to replace the bridge over Barner Branch.

The project, which will cost just under \$1 million, has been in the works for more than a year, said Tyler Mitchell, construction manager with the Baldwin County Highway Department. Newell and Bush Construction of Montgomery will be in charge

of the project, Mitchell said.

According to an advisory issued Thursday, Sept. 5 by the Highway Department, the road will be closed beginning Monday, Sept. 23 and remain closed until Friday, March 6.

The Highway Department also issued a revised travel advisory on Monday, Sept. 9 stating that a bridge project over Bushy Creek on Hoyle Bryars Road between County Road 61 and Dyas Road will remain closed until Thursday, Oct. 31.

A third bridge construction project, on County Road 9 over Polecat Creek is near

completion, Mitchell said, and is now open to traffic.

Bridge replacement is done for a variety of reasons, Mitchell said.

"The state will road-rate a bridge, meaning that certain vehicles over a certain weight

are unable to cross the bridge," he said, stating that the Barner Branch bridge had been road-rated by the Alabama Department of Transportation for well over a year. "That is one of the criteria, along with age and condition."



OUTDOOR CONDITIONS: With the autumnal equinox happening on Monday September 23, chances are by the time you read this the calendar will say it's now officially fall. However, living along the Gulf Coast we know the seasons are a little "off" from the rest of the country. The same can be said for our fishing seasons.

The water is still warm and the fish are slow to come out of their summertime lethargy. When it's hot outside who wants to run around and work up a sweat all day long? Fish are the same way and as soon as the water cools into their comfort zone (generally in the lower 70s, depending upon species) they will really turn on.

Another factor to pay attention to is the tide. Look for periods of good tidal movement, between the high and low tide, to kick up the smaller fish and shrimp and stir larger fish into a feeding mood.

And of course there is the weather. A prolonged period of wind (such as with a hurricane or tropical storm) can really "muddy up" the coastal waters. More rain inland can do the same thing to Mobile Bay, Fish River, etc. Water clarity and salinity can affect the bite, so look for a day or two of stable, steady conditions for the best results. If you are heading out there, good luck and be safe!

Baldwin County awarded Federal funds

Baldwin County has been awarded Federal funds made available through the Department of Homeland Security (DHS)/Federal Emergency Management Agency under the Emergency Food and Shelter National Board Program (Phase 36).

Baldwin County has been chosen to receive \$2,800 to supplement emergency food and shelter programs in the

county. The selection was made by a National Board that is chaired by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency and consists of representatives from American Red Cross; Catholic Charities, USA; National Council of the Churches of Christ in the USA; The Jewish Federations of North America; The Salvation Army; and, United Way Worldwide. The Local

Board was charged to distribute funds appropriated by Congress to help expand the capacity of food and shelter programs in high-need areas around the country.

A Local Board made up of representation for the public sector, representation for private organizations, and a representative for the homeless will determine how the funds awarded to Baldwin County are to be distrib-

uted among the emergency food and shelter programs run by local service organizations in the area. The Local Board is responsible for recommending agencies to receive these funds and any additional funds made available under this phase of the program.

Under the terms of the grant from the National Board, local agencies chosen to receive funds must: 1) be a private voluntary non-

profit or unit of government, 2) be eligible to receive Federal funds, 3) have an accounting system, 4) practice nondiscrimination, 5) have demonstrated the capability to deliver emergency food and/or shelter programs, and 6) if they are a private voluntary organization, have a voluntary board. Qualifying agencies are urged to apply.

Public or private voluntary agencies interested in applying for

Emergency Food and Shelter Program funds must contact Lana Mummah at United Way of Baldwin County, P.O. Box 244, Foley, AL 36536, 251-943-2110 for an application. The deadline for applications to be received is Friday, September 20, 2019. Community Action Agency of South Alabama is an equal opportunity employer and administers the emergency, food and shelter funds.

ference in the community, which is what the United Way — and its 31 member agencies — is all about.

"I was asked to speak here today because I am the men's basketball coach at Auburn University," he said. "I agreed to speak here today because I am a father."

As a father and as a coach, Pearl said, part of his responsibility is to build a bridge to give those young people an opportunity to have success, not only on the basketball court, but also in life.

"I consider myself to be a conservative," he said, "but I also believe that everyone deserves the opportunity to better themselves. Our responsibility as coaches is to build that bridge, but what if that bridge wasn't there? A huge part of what United Way does is to build that bridge so those young people have those opportunities that would otherwise not be afforded to them."

Pearl said he welcomed the opportunity to serve as a motivational speaker.

"We use motivational speakers for our team on occasion, but I must confess that we don't use them as often as some other coaches," he said. "We have the FCA in our locker room and a big part of what we do for motivation is that we ask our players one simple question, 'What would God want you to do in this situa-

tion?'

"God would want you to work hard and give your best effort, on the court and in the classroom. For me, that's motivation enough."

That question was never more at the forefront than following that final contest of the 2018-19 campaign.

"People have asked me all the time, 'How do you deal with that type of loss?'" Pearl said. Not only did the Tigers lose on a last-second foul beyond the arc, many commentators would also pick up on a double-dribble no-call that would have effectively ended the game without that final shot.

"It was tough, let me tell you. There were a lot of tears in that locker room," he said. "And I'm not going to lie, I may have had a few choice words for the referees after the game. But fortunately for me, it's a long walk from the court to the locker room and I'm here to tell you, God was talking to me the entire way."

"He was telling me, 'You're a leader and you have to lead by example.' We dealt with it the same way we dealt with everything else that came our way last season. We dealt with it as a team. We won as a team and we accepted defeat as a team. That's what it's all about."

Pearl said, the team concept applies to organizations like the United Way and all of its supporters.

"I admit that I'm preaching to the choir here," he said. "All you have to do is to keep doing what you're

doing."

Pearl also said he enjoyed coming to the Gulf Coast, a trip he and his family have made close to a dozen times since coming to Auburn in 2014.

"I don't think I have to tell you, but you have

a jewel right here in Baldwin County," he said. "When I came to Auburn it didn't take us long to figure out how close we are to the beaches. We've been to 30A, Gulf Shores and Orange Beach, and let me tell you, you can

keep 30A, Gulf Shores and Orange Beach have some of the best beaches around and we'll be back, you can guarantee it."

Pearl said he will be back in the Mobile-area when his team plays the University of South

Alabama Nov. 12 at the Mitchell Center on the USA campus.

"If I am called, I am always willing to serve," he said. "If you call me, I will be here."

County budget includes major projects

BAY MINETTE — Baldwin County commissioners will vote Sept. 20 on a budget for the upcoming fiscal year that includes several major new projects.

The total budget will be almost \$226 million, Ron Cink, county budget director, said at a work session of the Baldwin County Commission on Tuesday.

“The big difference on this year’s budget versus last year’s is

you’ve got about \$41 million more this year than last year,” Cink said. “There’s a couple of pretty big items in there.”

One item is a new jail building in Bay Minette. The Baldwin County Sheriff’s Office plans to build a new jail tower that will add 300 to 400 beds, depending on the final design approved, according to Sheriff Huey “Hoss” Mack. Plans also call for the remodeling of two other areas of the facility.

“This will meet the

needs of the center for the next 15 to 20 years,” Mack said.

The sheriff said the last expansion of the Baldwin County Corrections Center was in 1995.

He said the tower will cost \$32 million with other renovations costing about \$7 million.

The overall cost of the project will be spread out over the next 20 to 30 years.

Also in the budget are two new Highway Department barns for central and north Baldwin

at a cost of about \$1.5 million each.

The total General Fund budget for the fiscal year that starts Oct. 1 is \$149.2 million, up from about \$89.7 million in the 2018-19 fiscal year budget, according to county reports.

The total upcoming budget is almost \$225.76 million.

Commission Chairman Charles “Skip” Gruber praised county employees for their work in preparing the budget.

“It’s been very trying,

but y’all pulled it off,” he said. “We can have a balanced budget come October.”

Gruber said that while the commission is scheduled to vote on the budget on Friday, the spending plan will continue to be adjusted during the year based on income and needs.

The commission rescheduled its regular meeting, which is usually held on the third Tuesday, to Friday due to scheduling conflicts.

County spending plans also include sev-

eral projects budgeted this year, but carried over to the 2020, Cink said.

The county plans to expand the Fairhope Satellite Courthouse completing the unfinished second floor at a cost of \$1.2 million and plumbing improvements at the jail at a cost of \$2.48 million, according to county budget reports.

Also still to be appropriated is \$2.8 million for projects under the Gulf of Mexico Energy Security Act, Cink said.

“This program offers a way to get parents into the school to see the great things that we’re doing, to get them involved with the school, and to have an extra set of eyes and ears on campus for security,” said Dr. Shannon McCurdy, principal. “It offers a great mentoring opportunity. A lot of kids do not have dads or father figures in their lives, or if they do they’re not always positive role models. Part of this program is to get those positive role models in the schools so kids can see them working, helping, being involved, and give them somebody to go to.”

The program isn’t just for dads, either. Any father figure is welcome to sign up, from fathers, stepfathers, grandfathers, and uncles, as well as any moms who wish to become a Watchdog. Though the program began as a way to get dads involved in schools, everyone is welcome to

participate.

When you sign up with Watch D.O.G.S., the program asks that one day of the school year be spent in school from start to finish. Before becoming a Watchdog, a background check is required by the Board of Education, and costs \$17.50. Once complete, the school must be contacted to set up which date you will be coming for the program. On that date, the program begins with the Watchdog reporting to the office to get a brief orientation on what will be happening throughout the day and to receive a detailed schedule of what they’ll be doing. The day begins in class with your student, but afterwards Watchdogs go to other classrooms as well as spend time patrolling the hallways. Lunch is eaten in the cafeteria engaging with the students, and at least one PE class is attended to assist the coaches. While in the classroom, the Watchdogs are asked to help students with projects and homework, read to the class, and help the teacher with daily activities. Finally, the day ends at carline, followed by a survey on how the pro-



gram went.

But why join the Watch D.O.G.S. program?

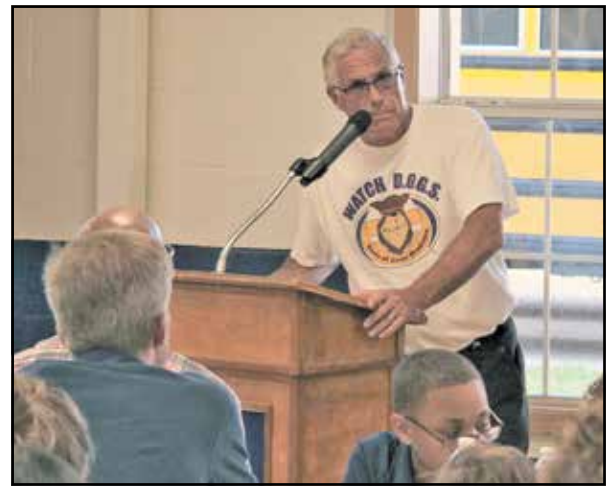
“The rate of fatherless children ranges between 35 and 75 percent of the student population,” said school bus driver Dean Rick at the signup event. “A divorced dad does not mean a bad dad, nor does a married dad mean a good dad. There are two kinds of fatherlessness: there’s the physical and the emotional. The physical is where the dad is not there at all for the child, and emotional is where the father is living in the same house but is not emotionally engaged in the life of that child.”

Rick states that studies from the US Department

of Education have shown that by having a positive male role model actively engaged in the lives of students each and every day, the child develops more fully socially, academically, emotionally and spiritually. Some major social and economic categories that are affected by the presence of a positive male role model are: poverty, crime, teen pregnancy, health, and education, Dean said.

During the second year of the program, 190 people signed up, and the FIS staff is hoping the program continues to grow both in their own school as well as throughout the area.

“School staff members have been given the awesome responsibility for caring for your children, and we embrace it everyday and hope to embrace the parents into our Foley Intermediate family as well,” said McCurdy. “We hope to have them here on campus as an extra set of eyes to help watch the kids, because it takes a village to raise a child, and everyone is part of that village. We’re a community, we’re a family, and we have to come together as a community and as a family to help raise our children together. We’re not going to ask anyone for money or for anything monetary, we are just asking for your

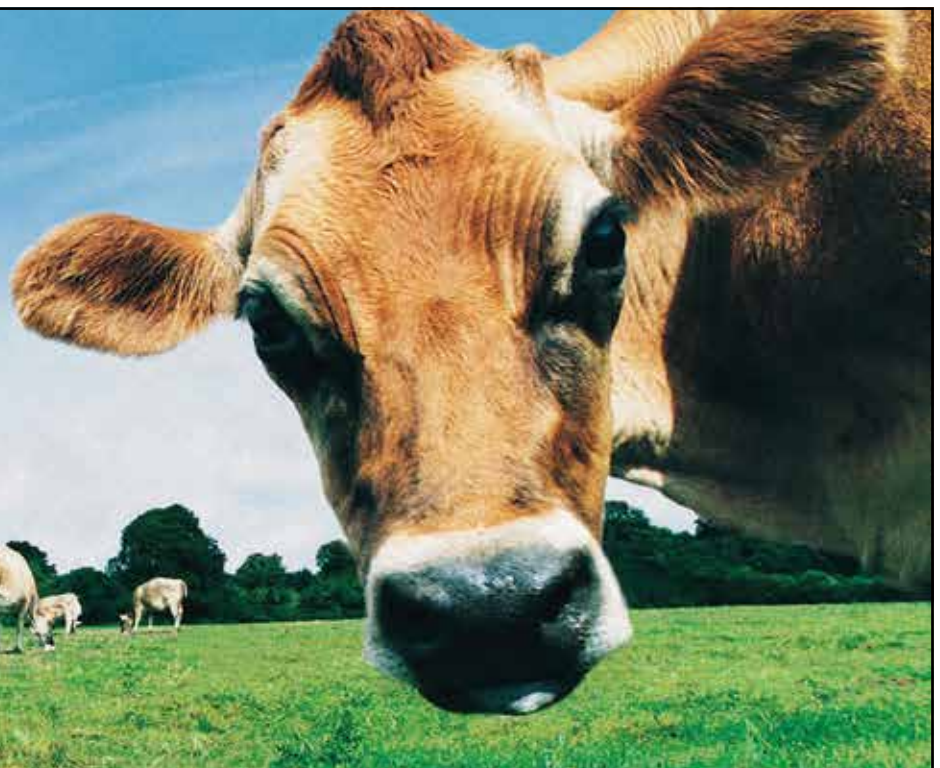
time.”

come as a surprise. It's clear that the Governor's office is disappointed with my decision to withdraw my support from her flawed I-10 Mobile River Bridge and Bayway proposal."

Elliott said while he was initially supportive of the bridge project, he felt the project eventually presented by ALDOT did not fit within the needs for local residents, especially given the onerous toll being floated.

"I have long been and remain a supporter of a solution for the I-10 cor-

ridor, but as details of the scheme proposed by ALDOT were made available, it was clear that this was a bad deal for my constituents and bad deal for Coastal Alabama," Elliott said. "Despite this action, I remain committed to work with the Governor's office on a realistic solution for this critical

infrastructure need."

To replace Elliott on the ATRIP-II committee, Ivey tapped longtime Mobile Democratic Senator Vivian Figures.

In a statement, Ivey said "Serving on ATRIP II is a privilege, not an entitlement."

"It also carries with it significant responsibili-

ties and as such, I have asked Senator Vivian Davis Figures, the most senior senator from the Mobile/Baldwin County Delegation, to take my appointment to this committee," Ivey said. "Senator Figures has a proven track-record of seeking progress and finding ways to bring people to-

gether who are seeking common ground."

The committee is now comprised of Figures, ALDOT Director John Cooper, State Senators Arthur Orr and Garlan Gudger, Representatives Bill Poole, Debbie Wood and Steve Clouse and Choctaw County Commissioner Tony Cherry.

in Foley. An employee there told her the shop wouldn't deliver "to that neighborhood after a certain time." Smith asked to speak to a manager and the manager, Smith said, claimed there had been a kidnapping and that Domino's deemed the area unsafe.

The pair exchanged words. And then Smith said the Domino's manager hung up the phone.

Smith said she was stunned. She drove to the store to speak with the manager and videotaped their encounter.

When Smith entered the store, she said, "Which one of you beautiful people is the manager?"

The manager came to the front counter but as soon as Smith asked for an explanation, the manager walked away and refused to speak with her. Smith did ask for her name and the manager spelled it as she walked away.

After Smith posted the encounter online, the manager called the police.

A patrol car stopped Smith as she drove home.

Chief Thurston Bull-

ock, Foley deputy chief of police, said in an email, "We did receive a call of a disturbance at Domino's and responded. Mrs. Smith had already left but was stopped as part of the investigation and to be identified and to obtain her side of the story. Our investigation found this was a civil issue between the two parties."

The Beulah Heights neighborhood, located just 1.2 miles from the Domino's, is not one of the new, sparkling housing expanses that investors are raising at record pace across the county. Instead this is a six to eight city block area of simple, one-story brick houses. Time has settled upon their trusses and weathered some of those once brightly painted shutters.

Southside Baptist Church Cemetery sits around the corner. Nearly every grave is decorated with brightly colored flowers.

The cars in the driveways are not new. The lawns are mowed but not sculpted. And the residents are predominantly African-American.

"Geographical profiling is a thing. Yes, there was a carjacking in this neighborhood. It was horrible it occurred.

But it was an isolated incident," Smith said, who lives there with her husband, a Foley Police officer. "This isn't some drive by area, this isn't a thug area, this is the center of Foley."

The next day, Smith said the pizza chain's regional manager was on the phone, with an apology. Smith said she told him, "You need to do better."

Gulf Coast Media reached out to that regional manager, Greg Schiek, who declined to comment on the incident. Gulf Coast Media also left messages for the franchise owner. He did not respond.

Saturday's neighborhood pizza party, Smith said, was part of the manager's promise to do better.

During a conversation Smith said she had with the regional manager, he promised the store would include more diversity and inclusion training for their employees.

Smith said she never considered requesting monetary compensation for the slight.

"I want our community to be treated better, to be respected. This was a slap in the face to our community," she said.

Smith also asked for

the manager who hung up on her and refused service to her neighborhood to be transferred. Schiek told Gulf Coast Media that request was honored.

"I'm happy that Greg took the time to listen and take action in representation of Domino's. I only wish that the owner would have shown up or responded. At the end of the day, each restaurant is owned by an individual. His silence doesn't send the right message to the heart of this community. Others have taken note of that," Smith said.

At Saturday's picnic Domino's served over 40 pizzas to community members. The Foley Police also donated three coolers of water.

"We are here to support our community," Schiek said. "If we could do this more we would love to."

Community members

said the pizza party was "a nice gesture" but added that many area restaurants regularly refuse delivery service to the area.

"This is a start. Don't let reputation of a neighborhood mess up your customer service," said resident Demetrius Walker.

Smith added, "this event was a great start, but there is much more work to be done in bridg-

ing the gap between communities and the businesses who thrive because of the people in those communities. I shop locally. I support locally, first and foremost. Situations like this are what deter members of the community from taking pride in their city. Foley deserves better. Beulah Heights deserves better. This is only the beginning."

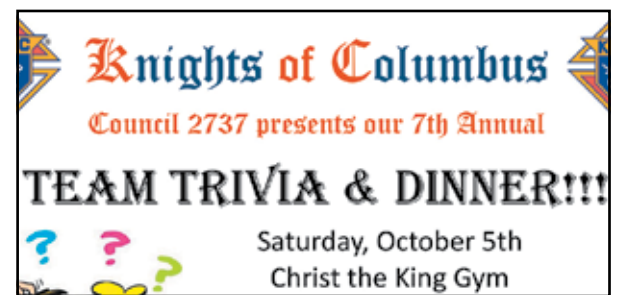

ROBERTSDALE — “From Farm to Fair” the Baldwin County Fair will celebrate its 69th year while also celebrating the state’s bicentennial when festivities kick off Tuesday, Sept 18 at the Baldwin County Fairgrounds, 19477 Fairground Road, behind Robertsdale High School.

Established in 1948, the Baldwin County Fair is the longest running county fair in the state. The fair draws thousands of residents from throughout Baldwin County and the surrounding area each year.

This year’s fair kicks off at 9 a.m. on Tuesday, Sept. 17 with an FFA Agriculture Education Day with education workshops held throughout the day for Baldwin County agriculture students.

Judging for the exhibits both inside the Coliseum and outside at the entrance to the arena also begins on Tuesday.

Each year, the fair features more than 1,000 competitive exhibits, including antiques, art, crafts and hobbies, en-



vironmental art, scrapbooking, sewing, food preparation and preservation, horticulture and agronomy, photography and livestock exhibits, along with environmental exhibits, featuring schools and civic organizations.

The midway, run again this year by Arnold Amusement, opens at 5 p.m. Tuesday through Friday, and at 1 p.m. on Saturday.

In addition to numerous exhibits inside the coliseum, there will also be Baldwin County museum exhibit, as well as livestock exhibits, a duck

pond and baby chick exhibit, petting zoo, the Teeny Weeny Circus and South Alabama Antique Tractor & Engine Club exhibit outside.

An FCCLA Sweet Potato Contest begins at 4:30 p.m. on Wednesday, and the annual Bo Campbell Rodeo beginning at 7 p.m. Friday and Saturday in the arena. This year’s Rodeo will feature rodeo clown T.J. Williams and there will be a calf scramble each day at 8:30 p.m.

On Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, for \$15 admission, all rides and entertainment are

offered free of charge for all over 36 inches tall. Discounts are also available on Thursday, for all seniors, military personnel and veterans. General admission on Friday and Saturday is \$8 for adults. Admission is free every day for children under 12.

Friday night is mid-night madness with \$20 arm bands for unlimited midway rides from 10

p.m. to 1 a.m. Rides from 5 to 10 p.m. are with tickets only. Saturday features \$15 arm bands for unlimited rides from 1 to 5 p.m. and rides with tickets only from 5 p.m. to closing at 1 a.m.

Youth livestock shows begin at 9 a.m. Saturday in the arena, featuring poultry, goats and livestock and a pee wee goat show for children under 6.

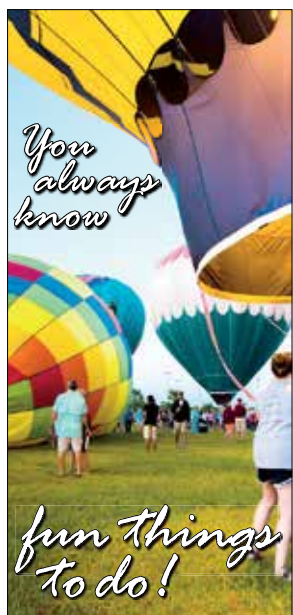

Attorney General Steve Marshall announces Inaugural Membership in American Consumer Financial Innovation Network

Attorney General Steve Marshall announced today that the Alabama Attorney General's Office has become an inaugural member of the American Consumer Financial Innovation Network (ACFIN). ACFIN, a new initiative of the federal Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB), is designed to "facilitate innovation that benefits consumers

through greater competition, consumer access, or financial inclusion in markets for consumer financial products and services." The inaugural members of ACFIN include the attorneys general of Alabama, Arizona, Georgia, Indiana, South Carolina, Tennessee and Utah. The overall goal of ACFIN is to promote regulatory certainty for innovators, to the benefit

of consumers. Specifically, members of ACFIN will seek to accomplish the following objectives:

1. Establish coordination between members to benefit consumers by facilitating innovation that enhances competition, consumer access, or financial inclusion.
2. Minimize unnecessary regulatory burdens and bolster regulatory certainty for innovative consumer financial products and services.

3. Keep pace with the evolution of technology in markets for consumer financial products and services in order to help ensure those markets are free from fraud, discrimination, and deceptive practices. "We live in a time of tremendous technological change," said Attorney General Marshall. "We, as regulators, cannot afford to fall behind. The combination of countless state and fed-

eral laws and regulations governing consumer financial products and services — with many of these laws and regulations overlapping — combined with a lack of state and federal coordination, is a burden to innovation in the United States. Through state and federal coordination, we can alleviate that burden and benefit consumers." Attorney General Marshall added, "Here in Alabama, we are especially

fortunate to have the Alabama Securities Commission, which will be a critical partner for us in this initiative." To accomplish ACFIN's objectives, members will seek to cooperate with each other through the coordination of innovation-related policies, procedures, and activities, and the sharing of information related to innovation in markets for consumer financial products and services.

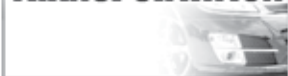

Vote yes on school tax

On Tuesday, voters in Fairhope and Spanish Fort will make a decision that will affect the future of their children and their community for years to come.

The decision is whether to increase property taxes by three mills to provide more local funding for local schools. This modest increase would make a huge difference not only to our schools and children, but to the community at large.

The tax would increase the rates on a \$300,000 home by \$90 a year. For \$7.50 a month, residents

can make a decision that will invest millions of dollars in their community over the life of the tax. The tax would raise almost \$1 million a year in Spanish Fort and about \$2 million in Fairhope.

All of this money will stay in local schools to be used for programs that our children need – early intervention, STEM training, tutoring, reading coaching, advance placement training, professional development for teachers and many other programs.

Local residents will have the final say about

how the money is to be spent, not administrators in Bay Minette, Montgomery or Washington.

The contracts between the Baldwin County Board of Education, Spanish Fort and Fairhope also specifically require that the board continue to provide the same level of per-pupil funding to the Eastern Shore communities in the future if the tax passes. Money intended for Spanish Fort and Fairhope cannot be diverted to other areas of the county if local residents provide additional

funding.

Voting yes will benefit not just the children now in our schools and their families. A study by the National Business for Economic Research that showed for every dollar increase in pupil aide, housing values increased by \$20.

Baldwin County has many attractions that bring new residents to Alabama's fastest growing county. One of the main reasons that people come here, and property values continue to increase, is the quality of our schools.

In 2015, Saraland resi-

dents in Mobile County voted to increase their property tax rates by 7.5 mills to support their local schools. Property values in Saraland are now 20 to 25 percent higher than those in surrounding communities. Saraland Mayor Howard Rubinstein said last week that those values are a direct result of community support for Saraland schools.

The work force that will build the Eastern Shore, Baldwin County and Alabama in the future is now sitting at desks at Rockwell, J. Larry Newton,

Fairhope Elementary and the other schools in Fairhope and Spanish Fort.

Supporting this tax is a wise investment not just for them, but for us all.

It's the people (not the food) that have defined my career

Hello dear readers. As many of you may know, I have received the John Stephenson Distinguished Alabama Community Journalist Award.

So, on Friday, Sept. 13 (yeah, I know), in front of a few family, friends and a whole lot of people I don't know, I will have to stand up and give a speech.

If you know me, you know that this is probably one of my least favorite activities, but I when I stand up, it is with the knowledge that as a community journalist, the biggest reason I am receiving such an award is because of you, the reader.

I would love to be able to take you all with me, but instead, here is my speech. Enjoy.

I would first like to take the opportunity to thank the Auburn University Journalism Advisory Council for this award. It means a lot to me to be getting this award from the University that has been the source of so much joy through the years, along with the anguish and anxiety that comes from being a fan. And let's face it, I experienced all three of those emotions just two weeks ago, all within a matter of seconds.

And a special thanks to Cliff McCollum, our adopted son and former coworker. I could think of nobody better to introduce me. I often think of Cliff as a younger, much cooler version of me.

Cliff and I once had a conversation in which I told him if I was ever fortunate enough to receive an award I would stand up and say, "You know

what the best part of this job is. It's the food."

Someone once asked me if I just showed up where there's food. I

started to protest, but then I realized that we were both members of the local Rotary Club, which meets once a week ... where there's food. And we both regularly

attended Chamber of Commerce functions, oftentimes where there would be food, including what in my opinion is the best event ever, Flavors of the South, a food tasting which for me basically means 5 minutes of walking around taking pictures, followed by 35 minutes of sampling everything I can get my hands on until I can barely walk out the door.

Full disclosure, the person who asked me that question is a Methodist minister, so I'm pretty sure he is no stranger to his profession requiring him to show up where there's food, although I'm pretty sure that's not what defines who he is, and neither does it define me.

First and foremost, I believe I am defined by the people who have influenced my life through the years.

First by family, teachers and adults who taught me to respect others, to those who have served as mentors and peers throughout my 30-year career.

I wish I had time to mention all of them, but I cannot leave here without mentioning a few, beginning with two of my mentors.

First, Paul Keane. When I came back to Alabama from North Carolina in 1997 he was

the sports coordinator for Gulf Coast Newspapers. We had a long conversation, sitting in his car after a softball tournament, about me wanting to work sports full time and without him, that never would have happened. It was a job I did for more than 7 years, the last three as sports coordinator myself.

In our short time working together, just three years, it never ceased to amaze me how he always had my back.

He once told me that there are no bad experiences, just good stories to tell later. He told me this while sitting in a hotel room after a state softball tournament in Montgomery. Hours earlier, he had totaled his car by running into the back of an 18-wheeler. When we got back to the hotel, we had to track down my luggage, that I had dropped off earlier that day, because of a mix-up with the room. We ordered pizza that was cold when it arrived two hours later, and "mild" hot wings that were hot enough to melt the rust off a car bumper. Not to mention the fact that both of our teams had made early exits from the tournament.

I looked at him and said, "man this has been a crappy weekend," to which he responded, "there are no bad experiences, just good stories to tell later," which I suppose is true because you have to admit, even in condensed form, it's a pretty good story.

The other is Sherri Killam-Albee, a former co-worker, editor and executive editor. While her contributions to my journalism career are many, her biggest contribution to my life was setting me up on a date to a Mardi Gras ball with a

co-worker, on Valentine's Day no less. But it worked out. We've been together now for 21 years, married for the last 18.

My wife Linda is my best friend and biggest champion and none of that would have been possible without Sherri.

And yes, Paul and Sherri were my best man and her matron of honor, respectively.

In my life, I have, seemingly all too many, guardian angels. Again, while there are too many to mention, I have to talk about three.

First is my dad's mother, Emma Margarethe Bauer Underwood.

She outlived her husband and all three of her sons, but she had a spirit that was undeniable. I was born on her 60th birthday. The story I've heard is that she was visiting her sister in Chicago when she got the news.

For 28 years, we shared a birthday. When I started working for The Independent, grandma, who was already a subscriber to The Onlooker, got an extra subscription just so she could keep up with me (I think her daughter, my dad's sister Fran, has taken up this mantle, because every time something is in the newspaper about me, including winning an award from Auburn University, I get an email from her). The first thing grandma would always do when I walked through the door of her house is to tell me how many stories I had in the paper that week.

Next, my mother's father, the Rev. Albert Willis "A.W." Saffold. He was more than my grandfather. Growing up, he was my best friend. A Southern Baptist minister, he retired from preaching when I was 9 years old

and they moved back to Baldwin County.

Not long after, my grandmother had to be moved to a nursing home for health reasons and my grandfather moved in with us. He went to see her every day and took her a Tab (she was a diabetic) and Graham crackers.

Since all my brothers had pretty much moved out by that time, my grandfather and I shared the downstairs of our house, staying up late (which for him meant after 8 p.m.) watching Monday Night Baseball, and I got an earful every time one of those preachers came on TV.

In his retirement, grandpa accepted a position as "interim" pastor of Shellbanks Baptist Church on Fort Morgan Road, a 45-minute drive one way. It was a position he would hold for more than a decade.

He also had a huge garden behind our house and sold vegetables out of his 1966 Chevy pickup truck along Highway 59 in Summerdale. And he was a master carpenter, making some of the best furniture ever, in my humble opinion.

He had a shop set up in our barn. One day, I decided to go to town (which was about 10 miles away) so I went to tell him. He said, "well you better keep your eyes open."

"Why do I need to keep my eyes open Grandpa?" "If you don't, you won't be able to see where you're going."

I have used that many times in my writing. In its own way it says a lot about the philosophy I've developed throughout my career.

Finally, there's my mom, Mary Frances Saffold Underwood. When

I was 14, my father died, making my mom a single parent.

It wasn't always easy, but we did the best we could.

While grandma may have been my biggest fan, my mom was my biggest supporter in my early career. When I got my first job at the newspaper, she took me to Gayfer's and bought my entire wardrobe, about 10 sportscoats, 15 shirts and dress pants, and somewhere in the neighborhood of 30 ties.

She not only bought all of it, but she had me try everything on, asking me what I thought of it before we decided together what to get.

While the sportscoats, pants, and shirts haven't fit for quite some time and are all long gone, I still have most of the ties. I'm wearing one of them.

I know I've been up here way too long, but I have to say one last thing. The best advice I've ever received wasn't given to me. It was given to a group of fifth graders attending a drug education program.

He said, "the best thing you can ever do for somebody is to simply show up for them. Not show up with an attitude that you have some kind of obligation and have to be there, but show up with an attitude that you will always be there for them, no matter what."

I realized in that moment that he had summed up who I had always strived to be in my career. I may not be the best writer or the best investigative reporter around, but what I can do is always show up with an attitude that I care for people and want to do my best to help them.

That to me is what it's all about. Thank you.

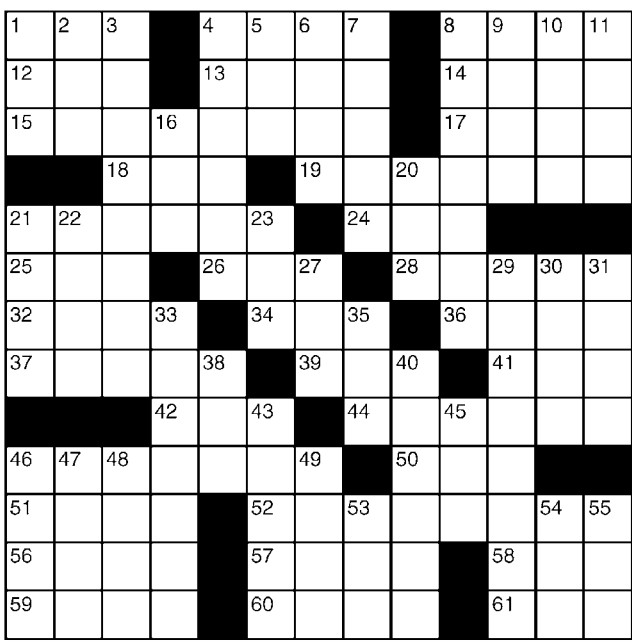

Tom Snyder The famously brash ex-newsman opened up a network programming daypart with "Tomorrow," on which a darkened background and the lack of a studio audience gave a real sense of intimacy between him and his interviewees. He eventually took his technique from NBC to CBS as the first host of "The Late Late Show."

David Letterman His offbeat style might have been an odd match for the daytime slot he initially occupied, but gap-toothed comic Letterman found his place in the late-late night hours ... and made so many segments part of mainstream humor, he carried them with him an hour earlier when he moved from NBC to CBS.

Bob Costas Moving from a sports-oriented space into more general interviewing, Costas applied his vast pop-culture knowledge to inaugurating NBC's "Later," steering single-guest programs that sometimes ran so long during the taping that they were turned into multiple episodes.

Greg Kinnear Now a movie star (and an Oscar-nominated one at that), Kinnear got the call to bring his sly wit to "Later" after Bob Costas' departure, hosting the show while also continuing to send up the genre by still presiding over E! Entertainment Television's satirical "Talk Soup."

Conan O'Brien The former "Simpsons" writer could (and frequently did) credit David Letterman with creating a taste for off-the-beaten-path comedy in the wee hours, setting up O'Brien to be able to follow in those footsteps when he succeeded Letterman on NBC's "Late Night."

Carson Daly While his apparent mantra was to make introductions and then get out of the way as host of NBC's long-running "Last Call," Daly had success in showcasing actors and (using his savvy from his years at MTV) music acts who often might not have been household names, but had stories to tell and songs to sing.

Craig Ferguson Ferguson's trademark

stream-of-consciousness left audiences (and CBS executives) constantly unsure of what to expect from his years on "The Late Late Show," and while some of the results were head-scratching, others were deeply compelling — such as the conversation he had with Archbishop Desmond Tutu.

Jimmy Fallon "Saturday Night Live" alum Fallon followed Conan O'Brien into the "Late Night" hosting seat, relying heavily on comedy segments with guests — as he still does, now that he's hosting "The Tonight Show" — to make his mark as someone who was, and still is, eager to please his audience.

Seth Meyers A different kind of "Saturday Night Live" humor — call it "smart snark" — is marking Meyers' tenure as the current keeper of "Late Night," since the "Weekend Update" veteran typically uses cerebral one-liners to raise the level of conversation (and, on occasion, to decimate a guest with a quip and a smile).

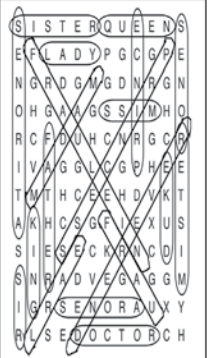

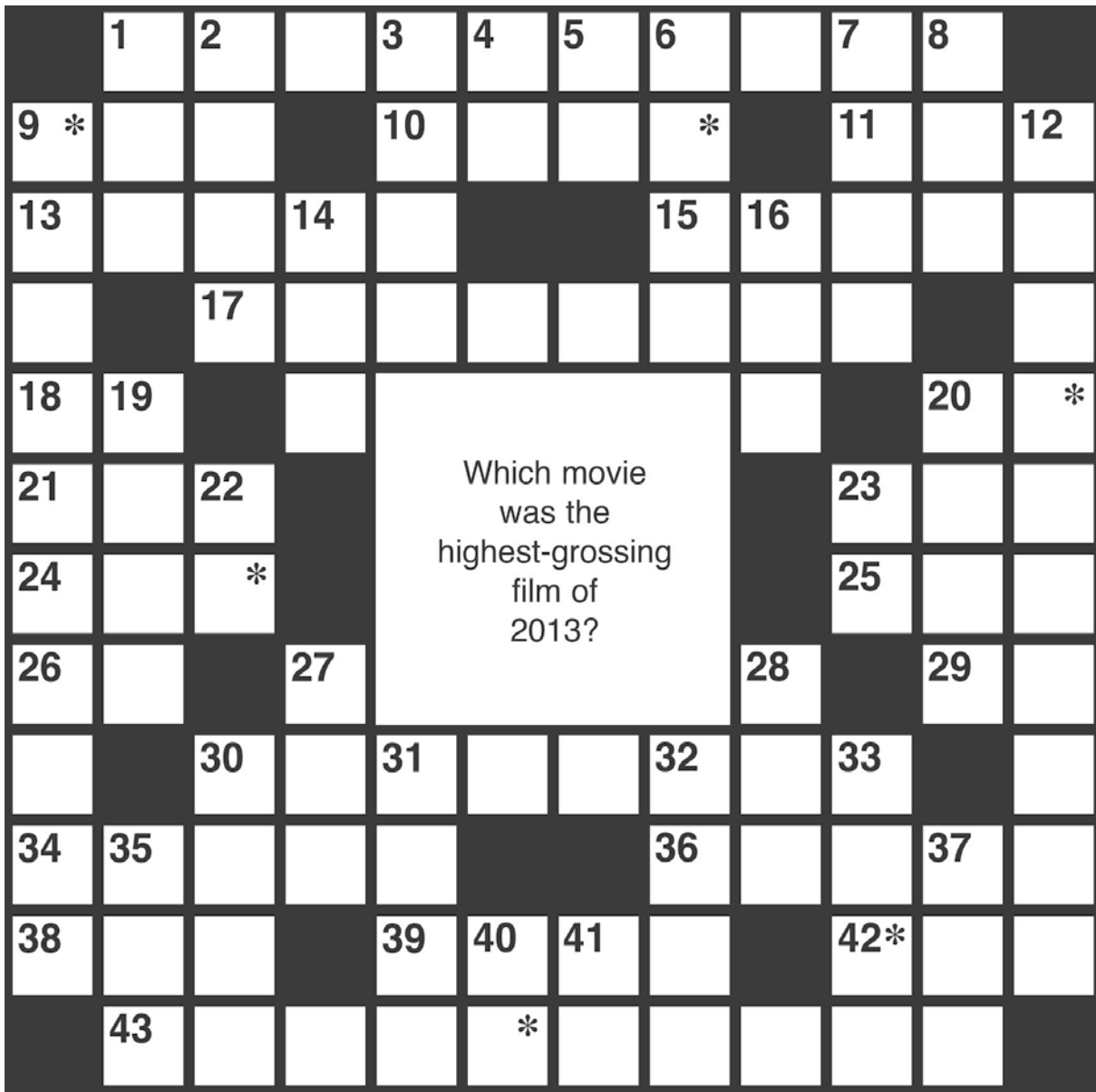
