Foley woman charged with felony torture of child

FOLEY — A Foley woman was arrested Tuesday night, September 12, on charges of abuse of her 6-year-old son, police officials say.

Foley Police responded to a call from Foley Elementary staff, who were concerned by the absence of one of their young students who had previously known issues at home. Upon investigation, police arrested 26-year-old Maria Cortes, who had willingly abused her child for lying.


Deputy Chief Thurston Bullock says Cortes became upset after her son lied to her, and she proceeded to punish him by heating up a spoon on the stove in her home before pressing it to the child's lips. The incident occurred on Friday, September 8, and the child suffered 3rd degree burns.

Cortes neglected to take her son to the hospital and then kept him home from school come Monday morning, out of fear of drawing attention to the injury by school workers.

Cortes

"She kept the child home and didn't get him medical attention, because she knew she would be in some trouble," said Bullock.

When the child did not show



probable cause to arrest Cortes, say police.

The investigation further uncovered that Cortes is an undocumented immigrant.

"Immigration and Custom's Enforcement has a plan in place in case she bonds out," Bullock



slinger wrote. "I am also very privileged to work side by side with people of such integrity and generosity, and in addition I have been impressed with the devotion and what seems to be limitless expertise from town clerk Karen (Biel). May your work continue and Magnolia Springs go forward to the benefit of

all concerned."

"We hope for the best for Donna, and certainly thank her for the work she has done as a councilperson," said Holk.

Following the resignation letter, the town council declared a special meeting to be held on Thursday, Sept. 14 at noon, during which the Place 2 seat was declared vacant. The public was notified of the special meeting 24 hours prior to its occurrence, and was

made aware of Esslinger's resignation.

Now that the vacancy has been declared, the council has begun the search for the next councilmember. The unexpired term runs until November 2020, and the council asks any Magnolia Springs residents who are interested to inform them through a letter of intent. Anyone considering is required to both be a resident within the municipal limits and be a

qualified elector.

The deadline to submit a letter is Monday, Sept. 25 at noon. The council will then vote to appoint the new council member at the September council meeting, which will be held on Tuesday, Sept. 26 at 5 p.m. Those interested can submit their letters to the Town Clerk, Karen Biel, either in person at Town Hall (12191 Magnolia Springs Highway) or through email to clerkms@gulftel.com.

"We're cleaning things up a lot," said Rouzie. "Plus, we'll have additional shops, we can go here locally instead of driving to the Eastern Shore which is obviously a good thing."

South Baldwin Regional

The hospital has been a large topic lately, after being named one of the top hospitals in the country. Rouzie took some questions about the possibility of new locations being added on the Beach Express, an idea that was introduced by Mayor John Koniar previously.

"We have three possible locations," said Rouzie.
"There's a north location, which would be a new extension that has yet to be built that would extend Fern Ave out to the Foley Beach Express. The middle location is just south of Highway 98 and the Foley Beach Express, and then at County Road 20 and the Foley Beach Express is the south location."

Rouzie states that with additional hospitals, the quality of jobs within Foley will increase as the population grows.

"Just think about this," Rouzie said. "We've got the only hospital in South Baldwin County. That hospital is vital for our future growth of high pay-

ing jobs. If the hospital goes to a city property on the Foley Beach Express, then suddenly you've got other's moving in. You've got doctors, you've got nurses, you've got surgeons. And we really think that's where our potential is, it's in medical."

Future housing planned

"The future for Foley looks very bright," Rouzie said. "It's a great town, it's growing, and one area we really need to focus on is residential and single-family housing."

The City of Foley is in the process of working with Truman Homes to plan their first big housing project to come, which will be built across from Graham Creek's Park.

"One thing that is interesting is that when you start looking at Tanger, you start looking at numbers, is you know Foley is an amazing place," Rouzie said. "Ninety-five percent of the dollars spent in Tanger come from outside the City of Foley."

Rouzie states that in Alabama sales tax is key, and it helps to keep the other taxes in the state lower. It's this reason that Rouzie is hoping to see Foley grow in the future, to make the city even more prosperous.

"We have a lot of people who come and work in Foley during the day, but they're leaving by sundown," Rouzie said. "Part of that is because we have

so many nice places to live around us, outside the city."

According to Rouzie, it's Foley's proximity to places such as the gulf that make it imperative that Foley build nice residential areas, which will keep people not only shopping and working in Foley, but living in the city as well. He states that grocery sales are one of the biggest factors for any city, and that often, people will shop where it's most convenient, which is normally closer to their homes.

"In 2011 we did a little study on inflow and outflow," Rouzie said. "We had about 15,000 people with jobs who came into Foley during the day, and then out of that, a great number of them left. Whereas people leaving Foley for jobs outside the city was only 4,000. So there's a big difference, during the day we have a lot bigger population than we do in the evenings."

To bring more people to Foley, Rouzie says that exposure for the city is key. Rouzie stated that the new Sports Tourism Complex will be a huge factor to bringing lifelong residents to the city.

"We're bringing in literally thousands of youth soccer, lacrosse, baseball, gymnastics," said Rouzie. "These people are coming from all over, not only the southeast but all over the country. A lot

of doctors and owners of companies are coming to Foley and seeing our facilities. So we're recruiting. They see this place for the first time and say, 'Man, they have all these amenities here. Why isn't my company here, taxes in Alabama aren't near what they are in Illinois!' I mean, that's all part of getting us exposed."

Another place with major exposure for the city is Graham Creek, which hosts tournaments year-round that draw in thousands of competitors and enthusiasts.

One of the main concerns from the audience was the infostructures in the area, and if they would be able to accommodate such an influx of people. As one concerned audience member who lives near Graham Creek stated, when events are going on the roads in the area are almost impossible to navigate.

"We've got a situation where we've got country and city," said Rouzie.
"We've got some that are maintained by county, some that are maintained by city. We do have a lot more money now to put towards improving roads, so that is going to happen."

Whatever the future of Foley, Rouzie predicts that the growth will continue, and hopes to see many new businesses and residents calling Foley home in the near-future.

FOREWARNED IS FOREARMED

Bridge is a competitive game in which each side tries to outscore the other. In a great many deals, the two sides achieve par that is, they each obtain the best result the cards entitle them to obtain. In some deals, though, the outcome is uncertain and depends on how well or how poorly one side or the other bids or plays.

For example, take this case where South got to five spades doubled as shown. Had West led the king of hearts, a lead most players would select, declarer would have made the contract easily. But West's mind was clicking on all cylinders, and he decided to lead his singleton

South won East's jack with the ace and led the nine of spades at trick two. Continuing his inspired defense, West went right up with the ace and returned the three of hearts! East took dummy's eight with the nine and returned a club for West to ruff, and South went down one.

West's defense was certainly of the highest order, but South could and should have overcome it. West's opening lead was clearly a singleton — no other club holding could possibly justify it — so declarer should have directed all his thoughts toward stopping the imperioring

Since the ruff could occur only if East gained the lead for a club return, and since East's only possible entry had to be in hearts, South should have tried to neutralize that entry.

Accordingly, declarer should have won the opening club lead with dummy's king and returned the king of diamonds at trick two, discarding the heart deuce after East followed low.

West would have won the king with the ace, but with no way to put East on lead for the killing club ruff, he would have found himself a loser in the battle of wits.

"If either one of us was not willing to cooperate with the other, we probably would never have




to fill the seat left vacant when Jeff Sessions became U.S. Attorney General.

Moore garnered 39 percent, Strange had 33 percent, and Mo Brooks received a respectable 18 percent.

The early polling and constant polling revealed that Roy Moore had a hard-core 30 percent of the electorate. It was and still is a solid block of voters that are going to vote for Moore come hell or high water.

Those of us that know politics knew that Moore's 30 percent would become accentuated and would grow to 40 percent with a low voter turnout. That is exactly what happened. The final poll and the only one that counts is the count of those that show up to vote. Older people

Although, unlike Wallace, who was a professional politician and demagogue in the classic Southern stereotypical style, Moore is a true believer. He has put his money where his mouth is. He has lost his job, not once but twice, for his stands for the Ten Commandments and against gay marriage. I doubt George Wallace would have given up his job as governor if a federal judge told him to get out of the school house door in the 1960's.

However, Moore's support is deeper than just an evangelical base. He is a true populist in the mold of a George Wallace or even Huey Long. This job of U.S. Senator actually fits him better in voters' minds than governor. He could have and probably should have dug up and recycled an old Wallace slogan used by the fighting little judge from Barbour County in his presidential forays,

'The Roy Moore popularity and hardcore support is a phenomenon and anomaly in this day and time in politics. It is very similar to George Wallace's appeal in his hey day.'

"Send them a message."

Moore amazingly carried 60 out of 67 counties on August 15. It was not just rural counties either. He won Mobile and Montgomery. Strange carried Imperial Jefferson and Brook's carried his home bailiwick of Madison.

Luther Strange had all of the money. The Washington super PAC's let it be known early that they were going to load him up and treat him as an incumbent. They were not just whistling Dixie. In the first primary, they spent over \$5 million. Moore spent \$400,000. Folks that is a 15 to 1 advantage. They have outspent Moore 10 to 1 in the runoff.

With the Washington money also comes the Washington gurus - the best pollsters and media experts in America. They polled Alabama Republican voters early and late and found Donald Trump's agenda was very popular in the Heart of Dixie. They gave Luther Strange the pro-Trump script and he stuck to it perfectly. They hammered the Trump/ Strange message repeatedly. They have stuck to the script in the runoff. Luther's 33 percent vote on August 15 puts him within striking distance of Moore

in the runoff.

Luther was bolstered by both the Trump endorsement and also the Alabama Farmers Federation endorsement. This conservative group's support is vital in a statewide race.

The former State Attorney General did well as expected among upscale urbane voters in Jefferson and Shelby counties. He also did surprisingly well in some of the more populous counties of North Alabama, especially Tuscaloosa, Talladega, Cullman, DeKalb, Jackson and Walker counties. Walker County had a large turnout due to a local issue on the ballot.

Getting nostalgic from animal crackers

It is three o'clock in the afternoon. I am hungry. I open the door of my freezer. What? No little chocolate and vanilla ice cream cups sitting on a

certain shelf? I turn to my pantry, hunting for some kind of chocolate candy. No luck. I crave something sweet. Wait, I see something behind a box of cake mix. Yes! Animal

crackers. I had forgotten I bought them. They are not chocolate, but they are sweet.

As I rip into the box, I wonder which animal I will eat first. A lion? A tiger? An elephant? Or maybe a koala bear? Whatever I choose, they all taste the same, crisp, mild, and scrumptious. The product evolved from animal

shaped crackers baked in England in the 1800s and eventually found the way to America.

No matter your age, it is just about certain that

the mention or the sight of animal crackers remind you of your childhood. We never get too old for animal crackers or the fun of pulling out that first animal from the package. I

remember reading somewhere that the original animal crackers were not sweet.

Animal crackers became such favorites through the years that even poetry and songs have been written about them. The dimpled darling, actress Shirley Temple, sang "Crackers in my Soup" in one of her movies. In the song and dance, she declared that

she had fun "swallowing animals one by one." A prolific American poet, Christopher Morley, mentioned them in a children's poem relating that even when the child grows up, he "shall always insist" upon animal crackers and cocoa for supper.

In 1902, the circus box container was designed for the Christmas season. The company included a little string on the box to hang it on the Christmas tree. All the time I thought it was intended as a carrying strap. When you think about a little string dangling from each box that is sold, it seems pretty certain the company uses thousands of miles of string every year.

During the product's 100th anniversary celebration in 2002, the Nabisco Company invited consumers to choose a new animal to include in the box. I had to laugh when I read the choices to choose from: the penguin, the walrus, the cobra and the koala bear. We know the koala bear received the most votes. In my opinion, there was no doubt the cobra came in last. Would you want to stuff a cracker shaped like a cobra in your mouth?

The name of Barnum's Animals was changed in 1948 to Barnum's Animal Crackers. Although named for circus owner, P.T. Barnum, he had nothing to do with the product and never received any royalties. The price, which was originally five cents, has changed through the years, just like the name.

Well, despite their originating across the sea, I'm claiming animal crackers as one of the best examples of Americana I can think of. Wouldn't you agree?

Storm lore flourishes as tales of survival and death during hurricanes are told on Baldwin County porches. Everyone can tell a story about someone who survived by hanging onto a tree or a power pole. Many photos of listing buildings after the 1906 Hurricane show how people tried to save them, only to be again blown to pieces ten years later.

Some tell the tale of the Catman of Orange Beach, a baby who survived the 1916 hurricane and was then raised by a panther. The 1926 storm spurred many immigrants to pack up and return to the Midwest after the loss of their crops. Camille, 1969, hit the Gulf Coast trying to erase the historic homes. True tales of folks who were swept away while hosting hurricane parties in Biloxi have a way of

sticking around. Old folks remember a hurricane dancing off shore for two weeks before heading right up Mobile Bay — so don't ever get cocky about

> predictions of the path. Frederic was historic, changing Baldwin County forever. People will show you the high watermark of Ivan's storm surge and the Grand Hotel

tales about Katrina are part of her history.

A storm becomes a landmark in life. After a hurricane, all events are referenced to 'before' or 'after' the storm. For now, 1979 Frederic is the storm of reference for Baldwin County time, for things were never the same after he hit the Gulf Coast. The devastation was heartbreaking, but afterwards, the area took on new life and has developed into the top attraction it is today. Some younger folks now use Katrina as the timeline - and Texans will alwavs remember Harvev as the most traumatic event in their lives. And now, Irma...

Most people laugh when I say that my bones know when a storm's a comin', but I've had that phenomenon confirmed by others who feel the same thing and by my doctor who

says that barometric pressure does indeed cause body responses. Folklore always includes tales of those who could predict storms before radio and television. One of my favorite stories is about Susan Swift.

Storms caught many by surprise in the olden days, but Susan had that sixth sense of impending danger. Maybe it was because she was in tune with nature, or maybe her motherly instincts gave her abnormal powers. Nonetheless, her intuition and determination saved the lives of her children.

Each year at the end of the summer before school began in October, the Swift children were allowed to go to the shores of the Gulf of Mexico for a camping excursion. Usually, Mother Susan went along, but in 1906, she needed to stav home with two small children. So Augusta Martin, the school teacher, chaperoned the children and their friends, about 16 in all. Mr. Swift let his lumber tug boat captain take the party across Bon Secour Bay to Shell Banks. Then the group carried the camping gear across the peninsula to the sandy white beaches, where they set up their campsite. The tug captain then returned home.



Late that same night, Susan suddenly woke up with a jolt. She insisted that her husband go and bring the campers back right away. He tried to assure her all was fine, but by daybreak he relented and sent his boat for the children and Augusta. However, the captain had no luck in convincing the camping party to return. Miss Augusta declared that the weather was beautiful and they were having a great time. They all said they would stay and told him to go back and tell Mama that all was fine.

When the boat landed back at Swift Landing that evening, Susan was fit to be tied. All night she fretted and finally convinced her husband there was impending danger. At dawn, several other parents joined Charles and Susan boarding the boat. When they arrived at the beach, all still seemed well weatherwise, but Mama's conniption fit threw them into a frenzy of breaking camp and loading the tug boat with their gear.

By the time they reached home about dusk, the weather had rapidly changed. The wind started to howl, the rain pelted down and the waves were record height. Everyone sprang into hurricane readiness mode tying down everything that might wash away. Sure enough, all night the

hurricane dealt its fury on everything in its path through Baldwin and Mobile Counties. The Hurricane of 1906 was one for the history books.

The story of Mama's Intuition has been told over and over again, as are all good stories. I hope you take time to tell those stories that you have heard. Don't wait until there is power outage due to a hurricane. Do it tonight on your porch. If you don't have a porch come sit on ours and tell us your story — unless there is a storm brewing off shore.

Lodging tax and the building boom

Houses and condos are being built in Orange Beach at an incredible rate. Biking down the beach road always turns up signs of new construction, but there is a cost.

A Lodging Tax increase is proposed, raising the rate from 11 percent to 13 percent, financing the infrastructure needed to create more building. "We have five or six condominiums coming online in the near future and we have a record number of building permits being filed for," said Mayor Tony Kennon in a Facebook video. "The added growth cannot handle the infrastructure needed for the traffic that we have."

Let's look at this lodging-tax increase from another perspective. An increase from 11 percent to 13 percent is 2 percent in real terms, but relative to 11 percent it is an increase of 18 percent. Illustrating the point,

11 percent lodgings tax times 0.18(18 percent) = 1.98 percent or a 2 percent increase.

Thinking of it as an 18 percent increase will not change the mindset of the people affected by the tax. Europe has an 18 percent tax in real terms and people still go to St. Tropez on vacation, but it makes one pause and reflect, considering this type of tax increase is a trend across Alabama, according to John Sharp of AL.com.

Lodgings tax is not the critical-decision point for vacationers, because people are going to go on vacation no matter what the lodgings tax is, provided they have room on their cards. Too much building is a critical-decision point for local residents.

The overview is about understanding 40 percent of private sector jobs were created in the housingconstruction industry from 2001 - 2005 (pre-recession), according to John Richmond of the Federal Reserve in Richmond.

We now have a glimpse

of just how vital construction jobs are to economic growth, evidenced in 2016 by the number of building permits issued in Orange Beach: 2011 - 745; 2012 -910; 2013 - 1129; 2014 - 1283; 2015 - 1312; 2016 - 1599, according to Community

Development. Revenue from permits mirrors the number of permits issued: 2011 - \$200,245; 2012 - \$215,207; 2013 - \$541,710; 2014 - \$592,402; 2015 -\$1,603,006; 2016 - \$1,704,583.

The data supports Mayor Kennon's claim of record increases in residential and business construction, perhaps even a bellwether of confidence in the local economy, as if one feeds off of the other.

If economic prosperity feeds off of new construction, planning the lodging tax expenditure is crucial. "The City is proposing a 2 percent lodging tax increase resulting in an estimated \$5,000,000 per year. These additional funds will help with the maintenance of the beaches, maintaining and investing in new infrastructure,

and addressing traffic issues," said Ford Handley, Finance Director for the City of Orange Beach.

"Moving the intersection of Alabama 180 or Canal Road, and Alabama 161 a few hundred yards south (by McDonald's) is a remedy officials here believe will improve traffic — and cost a bundle," wrote John Mullen in the Lagniappe.

I submitted a Public Records Request for a copy of any Master-Plan Documents, detailing how the new lodging-tax revenue would be spent. Renee Eberly, Orange Beach City Clerk responded, "No internal 'draft master plan' has been created as the issue is still being publicly discussed."

One assumes the additional tax dollars will be used to support co-pays for infrastructure grants. "Federal and State monies (Grants) are getting harder to come by and they require matching funds," said Mayor Kennon in a Facebook video.

The key issue is we, the

people, do not know what the master plan is for spending the additional \$5 Million in tax revenue generated each year. Having a grasp of the balance between costs, efficiencies and investing for growth is a technique espoused by the Harvard Business Review, but can only be achieved by working with constituents, discussing parameters of the plan like we did with Horizon 20/20 (2006). Otherwise we are going to have to trust our elected officials, letting them make the right decision at the right time.

Not everyone agrees with the tenant of trusting government officials with minimal oversight. Unrestricted development is not what local residents want, trusting elected officials to modify zoning laws to respect their wishes for less development has not happened.

Some argue zoningregulation amendments are the only way to control growth in Orange Beach. Less growth means less demand for more growth,

meaning less demand for more taxes. Limiting growth also puts upward supply-and-demand pressure on property values, being a positive result, generating wealth for resi-

Others hold that wealth and happiness are two different things. It would make the locals happy if the City of Orange Beach spent this revenue to finance a public beach for residents, accessed with a card like the Recreation Center, used by families, children and grandchildren, as opposed to being seen to be chasing the creation of wealth.

Lodgings Tax as a function of infrastructure spending, including beach renourishment and traffic solutions is supportable, solving our traffic problems today, but we cannot seem to balance this equation with the please-restrict-development desire of our residents. This is the cost.

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

The defense for the Toros shut out the Golden Bears until the last drive. Robertsdale running back Nathan Lewis scored the Bears' only touchdown of five yards with 1:32 left in the game. Robertsdale QB Tristian Stevens passed for 26 yards on five completions and two interceptions. Robertsdale had

BCHS Fishing Team hooked on the sport

BAY MINETTE — Hayden Peacock has spent most of his young life on the water fishing. It was something he and his dad, Jessie, enjoyed doing together. Now it's a sport that he can share with his classmates at Baldwin County High School.

The school formed a fishing team two years ago and Hayden was eager to join. "I have dreamed of a fishing team at BCHS and when the opportunity came my way I didn't hesitate to be the first one on the sign-up sheet," he said.

Through relatively new to Baldwin County, Fishing Teams can be found at numerous high schools across the state and in most colleges. It came to BCHS thanks to a father who wanted to help his son pursue the sport.

John Black first learned about the benefits that a high school fishing team while helping his niece on her team at a Mobile school. With a son in middle school, Black said he decided to approach BCHS Principal Craig Smith about helping to form a team here.

Smith connected him with BCHS teacher David Garrett, who signed on as the team sponsor. Black serves as the team coach, top fundraiser and team motivator. As soon as they got the go-ahead, Black and the team members hit the ground running to find sponsors to fund jerseys, hotel stays for tournaments and tournament fees.

A fishing team consists of two student fishermen and an adult boat captain. In its first year, BCHS had just three teams and has now grown to included 14 members divided into seven 2-man teams.

Team members include Austin Hadley, Hunter Black, Hayden Peacock, Chandler Peacock, Garrett McMillan, Charlie Gantt, T.J. Bracken, Bryce Epperson, Brenton Godwin, Bryant Hicks, Cagan Crysell, Jacob Cox, Nathan Rider and Curtis Pritchett.

"We are now starting

our second year, after learning the ins and outs from the previous year, we are working hard to build the best fishing team that will make BCHS proud," Black said. "Our goals for this year are to help our senior team members earn scholarships to further their education and to help other members to become better fishermen so they

can earn scholarships

As part of the Wire **Grass Student Anglers** Trail, sanctioned by Bass Nation, Black said the team will be competing in the largest-ever high school fishing tournament in the state. The Trail will include a Sept. 23 tournament at Live Oak Landing in north Baldwin County, as well as an Oct. 21 tourney at Lake Jordan in Wetumpka and a Nov. 18 competition at Lake Eufala.

Black is hoping the local tournament will draw out fishing fans and BCHS supporters. "We want to have as much support as possible from the community, to show we can support tournaments here," Black said of the Sept. 23 competition.

The team will also be fishing in the Alabama Bass Nation high school tournament trail and those dates include: Oct. 28 at Lake Tuscaloosa, Feb. 3 at Lake Martin in Alexander City, March 17 at Lay Lake in Calera; and April 14 at Lake Eufala. The team hopes to advance to the state tournament at Lake Neely Henry in Gadsden.

Peacock said he's thankful to be part of the BCHS Fishing Team and hopes that others can pursue this opportunity too. Currently only three high schools in Baldwin County have fishing teams: BCHS, Robertsdale and Fairhope.

"I do appreciate everyone who has had a part in making a team at BCHS, especially our sponsors who have contributed to establishing the team," Peacock said. "Other schools should do the same, in my opinion, because there are so many young anglers who do not get the same opportunity that we do here at BCHS."

For those who are considering it, Peacock cautions that it's a lot of early mornings, long days and hard work. "Well the team isn't just a group of guys with some boats that go out and compete against each other, there is more to it than that. Us anglers take pride in what we do," he said.

Typically, he said, the anglers travel great distances to compete and then must wake up as early as 2 a.m. to get register for the tournament, launch boats and wait for safe light. Tournament length can vary depending on flights and weigh-in times, but anglers could spend up to 12 hours on the water.

"Once we are out on

the water we try different strategies, techniques and lures to catch a five-bass minimum. Once your time is up you are back at the ramp and you weigh your fish in," Peacock said.

Though the sport consumes the day, Peacock would not have it any other way. "What I really like best about the team is that it's a good time to get together with other anglers," he said, and getting to "fish different lake and waterways, which is a great opportunity for training and experience."

Peacock is serious about the sport and wants others to get hooked on it too. "I think my job as an angler is to interest others in the sport of bass fishing," he said. "So, I encourage anglers across the states to get out there and get fishin'."

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'Young Sheldon' gets his own 'Big Bang Theory' spinoff

How would "The Big Bang Theory's" Sheldon Cooper have been as a child?

As its title suggests, the prequel series "Young Sheldon" answers that question more than sufficiently. Debuting Monday, Sept. 25 — right after the 11th-season premiere of the parent show, and before it starts its regular Thursday run in November — the CBS comedy introduces Iain Armitage as the younger incarnation of the brainy, fussy Sheldon, who's expectedly way wiser than his years. The show also retains the voice, literally, of "Big Bang" Emmy winner Jim Parsons in the title role: An executive producer of "Young Sheldon," he also narrates it.

"When we shot the pilot," Parsons recalls, "I was able to interact with Iain a lot, and kind of discuss certain things that are peculiar to this character. Whether it was just lines or moments in general or Sheldon's take on the world, it's interesting for us to go over together. I have to tell you that, in the same way that we're mining the writing for what they've been putting in for 10 years, it was very moving for me to see this 'machine' take off that's related

"My mom was actually holding the phone," he reports, and the result won over the show's makers. Executive producer Chuck Lorre remembers Parsons' initial reaction being, "I think we just got extremely lucky," though Armitage hadn't seen much of "The Big Bang Theory." The 9-year-old actor reasons, "It is aimed at a different audience than me. Also, I don't watch a lot of TV, but I saw a couple of appropriate clips."

Annie Potts will play
Sheldon's grandmother, or
"Meemaw," and another intriguing piece of "Young Sheldon"
casting is that of the character's
mother. Laurie Metcalf has
appeared as Mary Cooper on
"The Big Bang Theory"; on the
spinoff, the role is assumed by
Potts' own daughter, Zoe Perry
(who has acted opposite her

father, Jeff Perry, on ABC's "Scandal").

"Genetics do a lot for me." Perry says of following her mother in the part. "Certain mannerisms just come with the territory. Upon knowing I was going to audition for this, I rewatched all the ('Big Bang') episodes that she was in, because I just wanted to be sure that I was in the same ballpark as her. I think what's so wonderful and a privilege to play Mary Cooper at this age is that we don't know her at that stage of her life vet, so I think it provides me a little bit of flexibility."

Unlike "The Big Bang Theory" and his other comedies ("Mom," "Two and a Half Men," etc.), "Young Sheldon" is the first of Lorre's shows not to be filmed in front of a studio audience.

"It's more intimate," the producer notes. "The pacing, obviously, is very different. The actors aren't having to 'hold' for laughs; they're not playing to the proscenium. Also, we knew going in that we were going to be working with a cast of young children, and it seemed like the more appropriate way for them to get the best work — in a closed setting where they had the time to develop these characters."

Baiting deer remains illegal in Alabama

Contrary to what your buddies at the hunting camp have said or what you've read on social media, it is still illegal to bait deer in Alabama.

Similar to previous years, the so-called "corn" bill that was introduced in the Alabama Legislature this year did not become law. Yes, the bill passed the House of Representatives, but that's as far as it went.

"A lot of folks still think it's going to be legal to hunt over corn this year," said Chuck Sykes, director of the Alabama Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries (WFF) Division. "There was a buzz around Facebook and on social media that the House passed the baiting bill.

"But it takes confirmation by the Alabama Senate and then the signature of the governor to become law. So it missed two of the three, and it takes all three. There are a lot of folks who are going to be disappointed on opening

However, that doesn't mean Alabama landowners and hunters can't proceed with their supplemental feeding plans for wildlife.

"Feeding is fine as long as you stay within the area definition," Sykes said.

The area definition was refined several years ago to give hunters and landowners a better understanding of what is deemed supplemental feeding and what constitutes baiting.

The regulation states: "As it applies to the hunting of deer and feral swine, there shall be a rebuttable presumption that any bait or feed . . . located beyond 100 yards from the hunter and not within the line of sight of the hunter is not a lure, attraction or enticement to, on or over the area which the hunter is attempting to kill or take the deer or feral swine. This regulation does not apply to public land. Out of line of sight means obscured from view by natural vegetation or naturally occurring terrain features."

"Out of sight doesn't mean putting up a piece a piece of tin in the edge of the food plot where you can't see the feeder," Sykes said. "Nor does it mean throwing corn in tall grass. That's not the essence of the regulation. It has to be natural vegetation or natural terrain."

Unfortunately, the regulation clarification has not affected the number of tickets that are written annually for baiting.

"Some people are still putting out corn 50 yards from their stand in the wide open," Sykes said. "They're just basically ignoring the regulation.'

Another "huge" misconception that Sykes has encountered during interaction with the public at deer shows and other public events is WFF's ability to change the baiting regulations. He said baiting made up 99 percent of the questions WFF fielded at the public events.

"People are coming up to me and asking when we are going to change the baiting laws," he said. "Well, we can't. That's a legislative matter. The members of the Legislature are the ones who have the power to change the law. We can't do anything about it.

"The Alabama law says you cannot hunt deer in the area of bait. The only thing we could do at the Alabama Department of

Conservation and Natural Resources was define what that area was. That area is within 100 yards and/or line of sight. If you're outside of 100 yards, and the feed is out of sight because of natural vegetation or terrain, you're okay. That's as far as the Department could take it with a regulation."

As he did last year, Sykes is touring the state to give hunters and landowners updates on the mandatory Game Check system that is used to report the harvest of whitetailed deer and turkeys.

Another misconception is this year's seminars are repeats of last year's. Sykes, who has held six seminars so far this year, said a great deal of new information is included in this year's seminars.


"Participation in the seminars is about half what it was last year," he said. "People think it's the same seminar they heard last year, and it's not. We're going over the Game Check results from last year, and some of the tweaks we're making to the system and additional programs we're offering this year, so it's not the same seminar.'

Those at this year's seminars who used Game Check last year reported it was an easy process and didn't have any complaints, Sykes said.

According to the analysis of data, Sykes said about 35 percent of deer hunters reported their harvest through Game Check, while about 40 percent of turkey hunters used Game Check. According to Game Check data, 45,561 bucks and 36,867 does were taken, while 9,174 turkeys were harvested. With other information factored in, the total estimate of deer harvested was 130,000 bucks and 105,000 does. Turkey harvest was estimated at 23,000.

"Deer numbers were down a little, but we're attributing that to the drought," Sykes said. "It's not that it negatively impacted the deer herd, but it negatively impacted people's deer hunting."

One of the tweaks WFF made for this year's Game Check adds another definition in the possibilities



Deer season dates are basically unchanged from last year with the exception of calendar dates. Bag limits remain the same at three bucks per season. One of those three bucks must have at least four points (1 inch or longer) on one side. Barbour County has a special antler restriction in force in that each buck of the three-buck limit must have at least three points

on one side. A special WMA (Wildlife Management Area) Bonus Buck Program will be in effect this season on specific public land - Lauderdale WMA, William R. Ireland-Cahaba WMA, Lowndes WMA, Barbour WMA, Geneva State Forest WMA and Perdido River WMA.

On those specific WMAs, hunters will have the opportunity to harvest an additional buck on the specific Bonus Buck day. This additional buck will not count against the three-buck limit. To qualify, hunters must obtain a daily permit from the check station at the participating WMA on the Bonus Buck day. Following the harvest, the hunter must bring the

animal to the check station for WMA personnel to collect data from the buck and validate the animal. Only WMA personnel can validate the bonus bucks.

The other big addition for the upcoming seasons is the advent of Special Opportunity Areas (SOAs) that offer a different experience for public-land hunters. The new SOAs available are the 6,500acre Cedar Creek SOA in Dallas County, the 4,500acre Uchee Creek SOA in Russell County and the 400-acre Crow Creek SOA in Jackson County. The Fred T. Stimpson SOA, a 5,400-acre tract in Clarke County that had been open for youth hunts and limited adult archery deer hunts has transitioned to this hunting mode to assist in reducing deer densities on the area.

Visit https://publichunts.dcnr.alabama.gov/ Public/AvailableHunts to register for the limited draw hunts. The computer-controlled, random drawing will occur on October 3.

"The SOA hunts are going to be a big deal," Sykes said. "Everybody I've talked to thinks it's outstanding. Of course, we're not going to make everybody happy, but this is a unique opportunity for folks."

Gym empowers women to lift weights, support each other

Several years ago Matt Bishop says he lived a fairly unhealthy life alcohol, junk food, cigarettes, late nights.

"I was really just wasting time," he said. "Like most people I realized that I would keep doing the same thing over and over again, expecting a different result. But that is insanity."

women in Fairhope. The gym, located on Morphy Avenue, is fueled mostly by weight training, rather than machines that allow people to move without using their minds. Bishop said that link between thought of what you are doing, and progress in what you are doing, was missing at many gyms.

"It's not as effective," he said.

Barbella's caters to women who not only want to exercise but also, Bishop said, come together as a community.

"A lot of times when it comes to physical strength women are underdogs which is certainly a ridiculous thing to assume," Bishop said. "This is a gym exclusively for women who can come together as a community not just to lift weights but to attend seminars and workshops and support each other."

Bishop hopes to use what he learned on his own fitness journey to inspire the women at Barbella's.

"Once I felt my body change, the way I felt changed and the way I acted changed," he said. "Your attitude and the choices you make are going to determine the outcome."

Use weights to see results faster

There's no doubt that any activity is better than none, especially for those who have been sitting on the couch for the last year.

There are fitness trends today that have wildly captured the attention of many fitness enthusiast and average Joe's alike. But these trends are for the people who want to get really sore, really sweaty, and perhaps one day be sponsored by Reebok. When sore and sweaty are the goals, that's called working out. Training, on the other hand, is when you set a goal and create a plan with which you will eventually achieve that goal.

Most people enjoy working out because after they leave the gym, they are hurting, but they feel good from all the endorphins pumping through their bodies. Unfortunately, as I mentioned before, unless an individual hasn't been training for the last several years, doing random workouts instead of training, will not bring the results all of us folks are looking for.

While there are many ways to get fit, there is one type of training that trumps them all: loaded, normal, safe, sensible everyday movements we do as humans, under a load (barbell). I can attest to this claim as I went from 135 pounds to 170, with little gain in body fat over an 18-month period, using only a barbell. Had I been more consistent and slept better, this progress could have been made quicker. But not only has barbell training been beneficial for me, it's been wonderful for my clients as well.

One of my trainees recently divulged that in our 11 weeks of training together, that she has made more progress through her strength training program than she ever did by doing long-distance, slow cardio and random workouts — which was the plan her other trainer provided her last year. They trained for entire year, by the way.

One woman I've been training is a mother of three small children and a business owner. Within an hour of our first training session, she deadlifted 175 pounds off the ground. There aren't many guys out there who could do this (with safe and proper technique). The video we posted got over 2,400 views on Facebook.

I truly hope this "viral" video we published got the attention of the many women out there who think barbell training is unsafe and makes them bigger. Not only is free-weight training great for building a stronger, more appealing physique, but it's also incredibly empowering.

Now that the philosophy is over and you've heard a couple great success stories, let's get to facts of the matter and dive in to how strength training

Naloxone kits to be made available to first responders statewide

To address the opioid epidemic within the state of Alabama and to help prevent opioid overdose deaths, first responders throughout the state will have access to 600 kits of the lifesaving antidote naloxone.

This distribution will be made possible through a collaborative effort with Kaléo Pharma, the Alabama District Attorneys Association, the Office of Prosecution Services, a partnership between Air University and Harvard University, and the Alabama Department of Public Health.

More than 700 people died in Alabama due to drug overdoses in 2015. Naloxone is an easy-to-use antidote for an overdose from heroin or other opioid drugs. When law enforcement personnel arrive on a scene and suspect a person has overdosed, the officer can administer the injection which will cause the temporary reversal of an opioid overdose, allowing

enough time for emergency medical personnel to arrive.

"We are fortunate that through a special allocation in a grant these lifesaving medications are made available at no cost to the state. We are taking a step in the right direction to address the opioid epidemic in Alabama," Acting State Health Officer Dr. Scott Harris said. "Increased availability of naloxone for first responders will address the opioid problem in the state."

Alabama Emergency Management Agency Director Col. Brian Hastings, U.S. Air Force (Ret.), said, "I am so proud that Alabama has very progressive laws allowing first responders to provide lifesaving aid to those in need. This program not only provides the antidote to overdose, but also essential training for first responders. The distribution will begin next week.

The two-dose kits were provided via a grant through Kaléo Pharma. The kits are intended for first responder organizations to use in the field and were provided by the EVZIO® Naloxone HCI Injection product donation program.

with barbells is so effective, and why you should start lifting them too.

1) As you get stronger physically, so does your mental and emotional fortitude. Once you're lifting 100 pounds off the floor like it's nothing, you start to realize you are a much more capable person than you thought — in and outside the gym.

2) Barbell training is "loaded" normal human movement. In everyday life we are constantly squatting to pick up trash from the ground, we are lifting our kids off the floor and into our arms, we are pushing our cars off to the side of the road if we break down, etc. Running long distances and doing box jumps will only get

you better at running long distances and doing box jumps. Barbell training gets you better at doing things that require real world strength.

3) When we load as many muscle groups as possible under challenging amounts of weight, our bodies release chemicals that makes us happy (like dopamine and endorphins) and others like human growth hormone that keep us looking and feeling young.

4) There are many ladies who fear that lifting heavy weights will turn them into giants. It just doesn't happen. Barbell training will not make you big and bulky unless you are eating 4,000-5,000 calories per day and taking illegal drugs. What it will do for you though, as a woman, is lean out your upper body, shape up your legs, and


make your backside perkier and more firm. Who wouldn't want that?

5) You can train many of those little aches away that most people tend to have in the knees and lower back. Through barbell training, we strengthen not only our muscles, but our bones and all the connective tissue that hold this miraculous human body of ours together.

Annual flu shots recommended for those 6 months of age and older, including pregnant women

The Alabama Department of Public Health (ADPH) encourages annual vaccination of all people 6 months of age and older against influenza. A seasonal flu vaccine is the best way to reduce the chances of getting flu and transmitting it to others.

Vaccination can reduce the risk of influenza-associated hospitalization for children and adults. It is also associated with a lowered risk of hospitalization for people with chronic health conditions including heart disease, diabetes and chronic lung disease.

Vaccination also helps protect women during and after pregnancy. Influenza poses a danger to women and their developing babies. Flu is more likely to cause severe illness in pregnant women than in women who are not pregnant. Changes in the immune system, heart and lungs during pregnancy make pregnant women (and women up to two

weeks after birth) more prone to severe illness from flu, including illness resulting in hospitaliza-

Flu also may be harmful for a pregnant woman's developing baby. A common flu symptom is fever, which may be associated with neural tube defects and other adverse outcomes for a developing baby. Vaccination during pregnancy is the most effective way to protect newborns because the flu vaccine is not approved

for use in infants younger than 6 months.

"The recommendation for vaccination of pregnant women against influenza has not changed," Chief Medical Officer Dr. Mary McIntyre said. "The American College of Obstetrics and Gynecology and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention continue to recommend vaccination against the flu."

In addition to influenza immunization, the public is reminded to follow basic

infection control measures to help prevent the spread of the flu. These include covering the mouth and nose with a tissue or cloth when coughing and sneezing, washing hands frequently, and staying at home when sick.

The Dogma Lives Loudly...

Earlier this month, in a judicial confirmation hearing for Amy Coney Barrett; a devout Catholic, Senator Dianne Feinstein, a well-known liberal, expressed concern that Barrett's religious commitments would negatively influence her ability to execute her duties fairly, saying, "the dogma lives loudly within you." Such statements ought to deeply trouble every American, not just devout Christians. It is nothing short of applying religious tests for service in public office, the very thing for which the First Amendment was written to prevent. Moreover, it demonstrates the blatantly anti-Christian impulse of the Left. If Feinstein had said something like that to a Muslim or atheist candidate, she would have been burned in effigy by day's end. The fact that this sort of thing goes on with barely a whimper in American culture troubles me deeply. Moreover, it shows the profound anti-intellectual impulse within contemporary progressivism. The fact is, an elementary understanding of philosophy makes clear that "the dogma lives (just as) loudly" in Feinstein as it does in Barrett. Feinstein's faith

commitments (and liberal commitments are as "scientifically unprovable" as orthodox Catholic ones) are just as loud (and probably more so) in Feinstein as anyone else. What Feinstein is really saying is that her faith commitments are better, more important, and more appropriate for the public square than Barrett's. That is definitely what the First Amendment was written to prevent. It is the same epistemologically vacuous worldview as the black clad, rock throwing "Antifa" thugs in Berkley who think that every idea but their own is dangerous and should be shouted down or worse. What's more fascist than that?

Loxley Council approves annual utility rate increase

LOXLEY—The Loxley Town Council approved its annual 2 percent rate increase at its regular monthly council meeting on Sept. 11.

In December of 2013, after considering a 6 percent increase in utility rates, which would have brought the town up-to-date on its utility rates, the council voted on a 4 percent rate increase after it was discovered that rates had not been increased since before 2010, despite increasing costs.

In 2010, the council adopted an ordinance requiring rates to be raised based on the Consumer Price Index, but officials discovered in 2013 that the rates had not increased since the ordinance was adopted.

In 2015, the council adopted a proposal to increase the town's rates to the nearest dollar amount. An amendment was also placed in the town's ordinance to automatically increase the rates 2 percent each year.

Rate increases for 2017 include:

Water

- First 2,000 gallons or less, increase from \$24.48 to \$24.97 minimum monthly.
- First 2,000 gallons or less where the head of household is 65 or older, increase from \$19.38 to \$19.77 minimum monthly.
- Next 8,000 gallons, increase from \$5.10 per 1,000 gallons to \$5.20 per 1,000 gallons.
- Over 10,000 gallons, increase from \$3.85 per

1,000 gallons to \$3.91 per 1,000 gallons.

Sewer

- Residential: increase from \$26.52 to \$27.05 per month.
- Residential where head of household is 65 or older: Increase from \$19.38 to \$19.77 per month.
- Commercial or Industrial: 80 percent of monthly water bill, increase from a minimum of \$27.54 to \$28.09 per month.

Garbage

- Residential, singlefamily dwelling unit, limited to two garbage cans not to exceed 50 gallons or 50 pounds capacity each: Increase from \$17.34 to \$17.69 per month.
- Residential, singlefamily dwelling where

head of household is 65 or older: Increase from \$14.28 to \$14.57 per month.

 Businesses: Limited to four garbage cans not to exceed 50 gallons capacity each. Increase from \$20.40 to \$20.81 per month. All businesses requiring more than four garbage cans shall retain the services of a private garbage service for all its garbage needs.

Electrical service for the town is provided in some areas by Riviera Utilities and in other areas by Baldwin EMC, who sets the rates for their customers, Mayor Billy Middleton said.

In other business Sept. 11, the council approved a proclamation declaring Loxley as a Purple Heart Town in the State of Alabama.

Several members of the Military Order of the Purple Heart in Baldwin County, as well as Purple Heart recipients were present for the declaration.

"Particularly on Sept.
11, when we remember
those who lost their lives
on that day 16 years ago,
we need to remember the
sacrifices of all of those

country," Middleton said,
"and all those who continue to serve."

- Approved its annual contract for services

- with the Central Baldwin Chamber of Commerce at a cost of \$4,200.
- Approved pro rata dues for the South Alabama Regional Planning Commission at a cost of \$1,881.
- Approved a contract with "Keeping It Clean" cleaning service for the Loxley Library, \$30 per cleaning; Loxley Utility Building, total cost of \$210; Loxley Police Department, \$85, two days per week; Dispatch Building, \$30 per cleaning; Magistrate Building, \$35 per cleaning.
- Approved roof replacement for Loxley
 Utilities Department
 mechanics shop at a
 cost of \$5,400.
- Approved replacement of electric door for mechanics shop at a cost of \$5,750.

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


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
