Public Input Surveys Available Online for Joint Land Use Study – Camp Grayling & Alpena CRTC
The JLUS Policy Committee, the Northeast Michigan Council of Governments and Tetra Tech (Joint Land Use Study consultants) invite members of the public to fill out an input survey online. The survey is being conducted to give area residents the opportunity to raise issues and share concerns about the impact military training missions at Camp Grayling and Alpena Combat Readiness Training Center may have on local communities. Two public input sessions were held on June 1 and 6, and the surveys are being offered as an additional method for the public to provide their thoughts. The public input surveys are part of an overall Joint Land Use Study process led by NEMCOG through a grant from the US Department of Defense Office of Economic Adjustment and matched by the State of Michigan. A Joint Land Use Study (JLUS) is a community-driven, cooperative, strategic planning process with the goal of ensuring that community development is compatible with military training, testing, and operational missions and to find ways to manage any impacts of these missions on the public health, safety, and welfare of those living, working, and recreating near the installations. The JLUS project area includes the local communities within approximately a 20-mile radius of Camp Grayling and a 15-mile radius of the Alpena Combat Readiness Training Center.
