Friday- Orange Out (everyone wears orange to show spirit)







1968 HISTORY SNAPSHOT

- Politics: Violence erupted between Vietnam War protesters and police at Democratic National Convention in Chicago
- The Top Song was Hey Jude by The Beatles
- The Big Movies included Funny Girl, 2001: A Space Odyssey and The Love Bug
- Minimum Wage in 1968: \$1.60 per hour
- A Borg-Warner Eight track stereo: \$99.88
- McDonald's Big Mac: 49 cents
- The World Population was ~ 3,526,000,000
- US Life Expectancy: Males: 66.6 years, Females: 74.0 years
- Don't Break the Ice and Score Fore games were introduced in 1968.
- The US Patent for Lava Lamps was permitted in 1968.

• And... Mattel made a toy called the Toot Sweet that shaped Tootsie Rolls candy into actual working whistles.

- Science: The Navstar Global Positioning System (GPS) was launched. President Clinton granted nonmilitary users access to the unscrambled GPS signal in 2000.
- The Top Song was Night Fever by The Bee Gees
- The Big Movies included Grease, National Lampoon's Animal House and Jaws 2
- The peak year for vinyl sales was 1978. #disco
- Pentax K2, SLR Camera: \$300.00
- Bing Cherries: 69 cents/pound
- Minimum Wage in 1978: \$2.65
- The World Population was ~ 4,223,000,000
- The first Star Wars action figures were released in 1978.
- And... he legendary dance floor scene in "Saturday Night Fever" used Boz Scaggs Lowdown, but Columbia Records refused to grant clearance for the song. The studio rushed to replace the music with the Bee Gees' Stayin' Alive.



- Politics: Texas's Lloyd Bentsen famously said to Bush VP pick Dan Quayle, "Senator, you are no Jack Kennedy."
- The Top Song was Roll With It by Steve Winwood
- The Big Movies included Rain Man, Who Framed Roger Rabbit and Coming To America
- Price of a postage stamp in 1988: 25 cents
- Sony "Disk Jockey" 10 CD disc player/ changer \$399.99

- The World Population was - 5,070,000,000
- US Life Expectancy: Males: 71.4 years, Females: 78.3 years
- On November 2, 1988, the Morris worm was one of the first computer worms distributed via the Internet.
- And... Animated film The Land Before Time was executive produced by the legendary Steven Spielberg and George Lucas.



1998 HISTORY SNAPSHOT

- The Internet: One of the first recognized instances of internet democracy was seen when Hank the Angry Drunken Dwarf, a regular on Howard Stern, was voted #1 as a write in for People's "50 Most Beautiful People." He beat out Leonardo Dicaprio by over 215,000 votes.
- The Top Song was Iris by Goo Goo Dolls
- The Big Movies included Saving Private Ryan, Armageddon and There's Something About Mary
- Price of Coca-Cola, 2 liter bottle in 1998: 89 cents
- GE Air conditioner 8,000 BTU: \$319.00
- The World Population was - 5,912,000,000
- US Life Expectancy: Males: 73.8 years, Females: 79.5 years

- Sports: Serena and Venus Williams said they could beat any man ranked 200 or lower in a game of tennis. Karsten Braasch, ranked 203, accepted the challenge and easily beat them, 6-1, 6-2.
- The Research Paper: In 1996 and 1997, Emily Rosa, 9, tested 21 therapeutic touch practitioners whether their claims to detect "human energy fields" were true. Finding they were right only 44% of the time, she published the results on 1998, becoming the youngest person ever to have a research paper published.
- And... Ricky Gutierrez set the Major League Baseball record for seeing the most pitches in a single at-bat (20) in 1998 against pitcher Bartolo Colon.

- Chevrolet Trailblazer: \$25,705.00



- Minimum Wage in 2008: \$6.55 *some states higher
