Projects in works to fill rest of commerce park

The COVID-19 pandemic has not stopped companies from wanting to bring jobs to Crawfordsville.

Despite the economic concerns caused by the coronavirus, the city was on the radar of dozens of companies looking to expand their operations and officials are actively working on a “handful” of solid projects for the Crawfordsville Commerce Park.

If the city attracts the companies the park will be full, Mayor Todd Barton said Tuesday during his State of the City address.

“It seems almost surreal to say that as the development was slow to get started, but once we found our formula for success we have been able to locate some very good projects in the park,” Barton said.

The park was declared “shovel-ready” for projects more than a decade ago, but the city struggled for years to attract companies. Economic development specialists were brought in to market the sites and the city sought advice from site selectors and commercial real

estate brokers.

In recent years, companies including Autism therapy services provider K1ds Count and the American Flow Control Center for Innovative Excellence have opened facilities in the park. Ivy Tech Community College came in 2013.

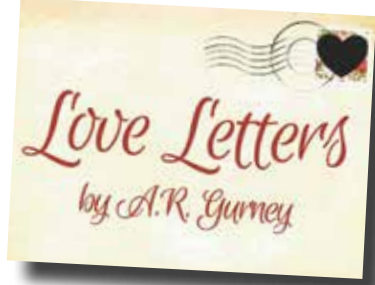
The latest projects in the works are mostly in the light manufacturing sector, said Cheryl Morphew, the city and county’s economic development consultant.

Two remaining smaller parcels near the park’s northern entrance would be ideal for professional services, Morphew added.

While filling the commerce park would achieve a longtime goal of the city, there remains a lack of industry-ready existing buildings.

Of the more than 50 leads received in 2020 — consistent with previous years despite the pandemic — the city could only meet the specifications for nine companies, Barton said in the address.

Morphew said officials will be looking at other land opportunities for new and existing companies.

Lunch with the League set to go live

Montgomery County’s public monthly forum, Lunch with the League, is set to go live on Monday.

Lunch with the League is presented by the League of Women Voters of Montgomery County on the first Monday of each month. All community members are invited to “tune in” to LWVMC’s Facebook page on that day to be part of the launch of the first live Virtual Lunch with the League.

Monday’s program introduces new Lunch with the League coordinator Shelbi Hoover to the community. Hoover will introduce the audience to the new format as well as to herself as its producer.

Hoover, who is adept at digital communication, is excited about her new role as coordinator and implementer of this broader reach into the community via social media. In the very month that the League of Women Voters

begins its second century of work, this Lunch with the League launches a “21st Century League” here in Montgomery County.

“My primary goal as coordinator of Lunch with the League is to explore issues that will attract the interest of a new generation of individuals, people who haven’t known about League but are interested in how government and related public service in our community work,” Hoover said. “We want to help people recognize that opportunities to have a seat at the civics table have historically been limited — even within the League itself. We hope to foster a welcoming and diverse environment to increase all those civic seats at the table. Ideally, this mission will reach a group of people diverse in age, race, gender, class and so forth. And,

in the 21st Century, that happens online.”

Viewers will be able to suggest topics for future programs and are invited to ask questions about getting involved in public life. LWVMC encourages informed and active participation in government.

The first Monday of each month during 2020, after three in-person Lunch with the League sessions in January, February and March, Lunch with the League, under the direction of Marco Dees, produced virtual sessions on topics ranging from COVID in our community (with Dr. Scott Douglas) to redistricting (with Common Cause’s Julia Vaughn) to men of color experiencing Crawfordsville as Wabash students (with Coach Clyde Morgan and a panel of 2020 seniors) to voting safely (with County Clerk, Karyn Douglas). Two environmental programs dealt with Indiana’s Forest Farming (with Raoul Moore) and Crawfordsville’s Urban Forest (With Main

Street’s Sue Lucas). In November, LaToshia Everson discussed the origins and the mission of the Black Lives Matter movement. All of these programs are accessible on YouTube. Just type “League of Women Voters of Montgomery County Indiana” into the YouTube search for free public access.

The League of Women Voters, a non-partisan, multi-issue organization, encourages informed and active participation in government, works to increase public understanding of major policy issues and influences public policy through education and advocacy. In League, hands-on work helps safeguard democracy and leads to civic improvement.

“We hope you will join us Monday at noon on Facebook Live for Lunch with the League,” Hoover said.

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Betty Jane ‘Janey’
Fordice Rice

Nov. 24, 1930-Jan. 26, 2021

Betty J. “Janey” Fordice Rice, 90, founding First Lady of the University of Southern Indiana, died Jan. 26, 2021. She was born Nov. 24, 1930, in Putnam

County, Indiana, near Russellville, to Rudolph Guiliams Fordice and Mary Ann Smiley Fordice.

Mrs. Rice was a home economics graduate of Purdue University, holding both bachelor’s and master’s degrees, and was an educator and a respected leader in civic affairs. In recognition of her accomplishments, Purdue University honored her with its Service to Others Award in 1981, the highest honor accorded graduates.

At Purdue, she met her husband, David L. Rice. They were married Sept. 10, 1950, as they were completing undergraduate degrees. Mrs. Rice faithfully supported her husband’s university teaching, administration and research career at Ball State University, for the U.S. Department of Education in Washington, D.C. and at Indiana State University in Evansville, now University of Southern Indiana, where he was the founding president. Dr. Rice equally supported her educational and business endeavors. They were married for 69 years until his death, Jan. 15, 2020.

The Rices, with children Denise and Mike, first came to Evansville in 1967, two years after the founding of public higher education in southwestern Indiana. Mrs. Rice was a full partner in building community involvement in the University of Southern Indiana. They served together in leadership for 27 years. In recognition of her singular role, the University awarded her an honorary Doctor of Laws degree in May of 2000, citing her “vision and boundless energy” in building community support for the University.

When the University of Southern Indiana Foundation built and donated the University Home in 1983 as

the official residence of the first family, Mrs. Rice was instrumental in the planning, design and decorating of the home. She never forgot that community donations provided the home, and she graciously and generously opened it to many community organizations while the first family lived there.

An avid gardener, Mrs. Rice was owner of Peckenaugh’s Garden Center in Evansville for several years. Through her involvement in the Westwood Garden Club, she helped to create the 25-acre Bent Twig Outdoor Learning Environment on the USI campus, which won a national Sears Environmental Award.

Mrs. Rice helped establish and sustain, through her personal involvement and fundraising, many programs to support learning and student life at the University, including women’s athletics, religious life, Greek-letter organizations and the well-known Madrigal dinners, for which she and other volunteers cooked in the early years. The Epicurean Society of America cited the USI Madrigals as one of 200 festival dinners to attend during the 1986 USA Bicentennial Celebration.

She served dozens of Evansville organizations, as a board member and frequently as board president, including Girl Scouts of Raintree Council, American Association of University Women, United Way, YWCA, Evansville Home Economists, Extension Homemakers, Evansville Philharmonic Orchestra, Keep Evansville Beautiful and Westwood Garden Club. In retirement, she served the USI-New Harmony Foundation and the Posey County Community Foundation. She was instrumental in many New Harmony fundraising efforts, including the restoration of the Helen Elliott Home, now the office for Historic New Harmony, and the Rapp-Owen Granary. She was a member of Pi Lambda Theta honorary society for women in education, Delta Kappa Gamma education society and Indiana and American Home Economics Association. She won the Jane Award of the Extension Homemakers.

Upon retirement as the First Family, the Rices

moved to New Harmony, Indiana, where they became active in historic preservation and community restoration. They restored a historic home built after the Civil War by Julian Owen, son of community founder Robert Dale Owen, and added a one-room schoolhouse saved from central Indiana. Mrs. Rice furnished the handsome home in family antiques and period décor and it became a center for their hospitality there, bringing friends to the historic community. In 2014, the Rices moved to York, Pennsylvania, to be closer to daughter Denise, but they maintained a New Harmony residence until 2017.

Mrs. Rice was a member of Howell United Methodist Church in Evansville and Johnson United Methodist Church in New Harmony.

Mrs. Rice is survived by her children, Denise Rice Dawson (Greg) of York, Pennsylvania; and Dr. Michael A. Rice (Mary) of Indianapolis. She also is survived by six grandchildren, Clinton Dawson Ph.D. (Lindsay), Kaitlin Rice Prinsen M.D. (Andrew), Abigail Rice Haste M.D. (Paul), Jill M. Rice (Matt), Mitchell A. Rice and Anna A. Rice. She also is survived by great-grandchildren, Carter G. Haste, Adalai J. Prinsen, Eleanor J. Haste, Bennett A. Prinsen, and Emerson L. Haste. Great-grandchild Dawson is expected in March.

She also is survived by her brothers, Maurice Smiley Fordice, Richard Dean Fordice and Jacob Carroll Fordice. She was preceded in death by her sisters, Carolyn Sue Fordice and Nancy Lou Fordice Harbison.

Mrs. Rice will be buried beside her husband. Because of the pandemic, she will be laid to rest privately by her family.

Jones nearing breakthrough success

Trent Jones has been so close to big wins many times in his young athletic career at Southmont.

The junior emerged onto the scene in both swimming and track and field as a freshman, improved in swimming as a sophomore, and then lost his sophomore track season due to COVID-19.

And this year he's inching even closer to a breakthrough of success.

"It's definitely been how I'm working at practice," Jones said of his bump in success. "Difference between last year and this year is just solid effort honestly. This year I'm mainly working on my sprints to improve technique and form and therefore drop time."

Jones has settled into the 50 freestyle and 100 butterfly. He was second in both events at the county and Sagamore Conference meets.

"It's felt great," he said. "And what I've tried to do at meets is work on my nerves. I've always been the nervous type and this

year I've just tried to focus on not necessarily what the outcome could be, but just racing the clock. And that's helped me do better in the pool as far as speed."

Part of the nerves has come in his tandem of events. Jones swims the 50 freestyle, the last event before diving, and the 100 butterfly, the first swimming event to follow diving. In a year like 2020-21, sometimes it's been a short diving session or only a 10-15 minute break between events — but Jones has remained dialed in.

"It's nerveracking," he said. "I've always had a little more nerve for the 100 fly. It's a longer event and more tiring, but in my head it's my last individual event, my last effort to do well individually, so I've got to get that last 25 as fast possible and focus on that last 25."

Jones hopes drop his fly time heading into the sectional in mid February, and also compete in the 50 freestyle. Much like at the county and conference, his top competitors will be an Athenian. And whether it's seasoned veterans like

Thristan Callejas or Jack Pendleton, or one of the Horton brothers — Jones knows all the pressure is on them, and he can just swim his race.

"I've always been second or third," Jones said. "All I have to worry about is beating the person beside me. I've never been in the position where I have to worry about messing up or something. I've always been behind them. So when I'm right beside them all I have to focus is inching closer, and when I see them beside me it helps me go faster."

Pendleton is the defending sectional champion in the 50 freestyle with a time of 22.51 seconds, while Callejas won the 100 butterfly in 2020 with a time of 54.08. Both Marshall Horton and his younger brother and freshman, Whitman Horton, have emerged as sprinters and versatile swimmers for the Athenians this season.

At the county meet, Jones swam a 22.63 in the 50 freestyle and a 56.37 in the 100 butterfly. He swam times of 22.86 and 55.1 seconds respectively at the conference meet.

Mounties in the hunt for first title since 2016

Make no mistakes about it, the IHSAA wrestling sectional at Crawfordsville will come down to Southmont and Zionsville. Each team is loaded with talent and had nothing but success in the regular season.

The Mounties are looking to dethrone the Eagles and win their first sectional title since 2016.

"Each guy will have to just focus on their own matches each round and deal with a win or loss when they come," Southmont coach Jamie Welliever said. "If each guy can do the best they can do and trust all of his teammates to do the same it should be a great day."

Southmont has four top seeded wrestlers heading into the tournament. Maddox Cade (15-1) is the No. 1 seed at 113, Riley Woodall (15-1) at 182, Wyatt Woodall (16-0) at 195, and Zayden Dunn (13-3) at heavyweight. Zionsville has four top seeded wrestlers. The top four wrestlers from each weight class will advance to the regional round at Frankfort.

The Mounties have five freshmen in the lineup, including Cade and Wyatt Woodall, but Welliever knows they are prepared for the challenge of competing in the state series.

"The freshmen were very good coming in, but I think their biggest improvement along with the rest of the team is their ability to adapt to different situations during a match," he said. "Sometimes things don't go exactly how you planned, and then you have to just figure it out."

Brier Riggie (106), Noah Bengie (120), Marlin Williams (126), Gerald Hutson (132), Dillan Laury (138), Trip Ward (145), Justin Emerson (152), Evan Francis (160), Isaiah McMasters (170), and Collin Martin (220) will fill out the rest of Southmont's lineup.

North Montgomery enters the state series with eight wrestlers, including Cailin Campbell (120), James McClerkin (145), and Todd Laffoon (195). who are

all seeded No. 2.

"I feel like we have consistently gotten better as the season has went on," North Montgomery coach Bryce McCoy said. "We are doing the little things better and it has shown. Hopefully they will be ready to go Saturday and show how much they have improved since our first competition."

Christian Hall (138), Lane Dildine (160), Jacob Rice (170), Dakota Punke (182), and Cale Anderson (220) round out the Chargers' lineup.

"I have just been telling the kids that they have nothing to lose," McCoy said. "That they should go out there relaxed and confident and take it one match at a time. No matter what tournament it is, I tell them that their goal should be to finish higher than they are seeded in the bracket."

Crawfordsville has had its fair share of trouble related to COVID-19 this winter, and the wrestling team has not been spared from that. First-year coach Dave Cutchin is still pleased with the work ethic put forth by his team.

"It has been great to see young athletes take the precautions and exhibit the desire to succeed in the face of this pandemic," he said. "The loss of mat time has definitely made an impact with the betterment of their skills. The old adage 'practice makes perfect,' is unfortunately true."

The Athenians will have just four wrestlers competing on Saturday. Keegan Alsmann (113), Ashton Wilson (132), Calvin Dittmar (152), and Joshua Dixon at 170.

Fountain Central will have seven wrestlers competing, including Waylon Frazee (18-2), who is the No. 1 seed at 120. Jason Matthews (132), Michael Strawhorn (138), Willie Frazee (152), Jordan Melvin (160), Steven Romero (195), and Matthew Alexander (220) will also compete for the Mustangs.

LEBANON — Aggression was the key for the Lady Tigers on Thursday night. After a slow start to the game which saw them fall behind 10-1, Lebanon dug in defensively to top Southmont 64-36.

Much of the credit goes to Southmont for their quick start.

The Mounties never trailed in the first quarter, jumping out to 10-1 lead with 1:47 left in the frame on a free throw from Natalie Manion.

Lebanon missed its first 12 shots from the field and didn't make a field goal until 47 seconds remained in the first quarter.

"We have been really stressing getting the ball out and going," Southmont head coach Daniel Burkman said. "We have really been struggling in our half-court offense. What I saw tonight was improvement, just in that initial outlet. That initial pass makes a big difference - getting people in the right spots, making the pass, then running the court. We did a good job of that."

But while the Mounties controlled

the first quarter, the final minute of the frame set the tone for the rest of the game.

Lebanon went on a 7-0 run in the final 47 seconds, cutting its deficit to 10-8.

The run increased to 11-0 at the start of the fourth quarter, and after Southmont briefly took the lead at 13-12 and 15-14, the Tigers took the lead for good with a 15-2 run that saw them go up 12 and they led by 10 at the break.

After scoring 10 points in the first 6:13, Southmont scored nine in the final 9:47 of the half and just four in the final 4:35.

They shot 8 of 21 (38 %) from the field, but turned it over 20 times. Lebanon got 18 more shots in the half and shot six more free throws.

The end of the quarter haunted the Mounties again in the third.

Lebanon led 33-23 just a minute into the quarter, but out-scored the visitors 13-4 in the final seven minutes and led by 19 after three.

Southmont got no closer than 17 in the fourth.

Sidney Veatch led the Mounties with 13 points and 12 rebounds.

Addison Charles added 10 points.

Christmas play problem answer

Phillip Alder

Here is the answer to the first question in my Christmas competition. (The others will be in tomorrow's column.) How should South play in four spades after West leads a trump, and East follows suit?

South starts with nine top tricks: seven spades and two diamonds. Obviously, if West has the diamond queen, life will be easy. So declarer just knows that that card will be offside. In addition, if East takes a trick with the diamond queen and gives his partner the lead in hearts, a low-club shift through dummy's king could give South a nasty guess. (Since East is a passed hand, he is unlikely to have the diamond queen and club ace-queen, because West's lead marks East with a high heart, probably the king.) But declarer can avoid those problems. He draws the remaining trump, plays a diamond to the king and exits with a heart, taken by West. What can he do?

If West plays a second heart, South ruffs and leads a diamond. If West shows out (see the diagram), declarer ducks the trick to East, who

is endplayed. He must lead a club around to the king, or play a diamond from the queen, or return a heart, conceding a ruff-and-sluff. (Declarer ruffs on the board to gain an eighth trump trick.)

If West leads a second diamond, South tries dummy's jack. If it loses, the suit must be 3-2, and the contract is guaranteed. If East fails to follow suit, the diamond jack is declarer's 10th trick.

If West leads a club, South plays low from the board and can build up a club trick. He loses at most one heart and two clubs.
