4 must-have features for the ultimate dream kitchen

Are you updating your kitchen? If so, here are four fabulous features you may want to consider installing.

1. POT FILLER

A pot filler is a swing-out faucet on a long, jointed arm that's generally mounted over the stove. Pot fillers are extremely convenient and prevent you from having to lug heavy, water-filled pots from sink to stove.

2. FARMHOUSE SINK

With their white, fireclay basins and tall, stainless-steel faucets, modern farmhouse sinks aren't only stylish; they're also wider and deeper than standard kitchen sinks. This helps make cooking and cleaning a breeze.

3. DOUBLE OVEN

Double ovens provide extra cooking space, so you have the flexibility to whip up multiple dishes simultaneously. They're especially convenient if you do a lot of entertaining.

4. BUILT-IN REFRIGERATOR

If you want your kitchen to have a streamlined and uniform profile, a built-in refrigerator is the way to go. Built-in refrigerators sit flush with the rest of the kitchen cabinetry in the space and offer an upmarket appearance.

Kitchen lighting 101

TASK LIGHTING

This type of lighting is used to brighten up specific areas. Pendant lights are great to hang over a kitchen island or sink, for example, and they can contribute to the decor. These lights are best paired with recessed lighting to avoid too much visual clutter. As for countertop prep space, under-cabinet lighting is your best bet since it's easy to install, practically invisible and won't create shadows.



5 bathroom storage solutions



Regardless of how large or small your bathroom is, organization is the key to creating a functional, clutter-free space. Here are a few storage ideas.

1. BASKETS

Place wire, wicker or canvas baskets beneath a floating vanity to maintain an airy feel while benefiting from additional storage. Baskets can also greatly reduce clutter on open shelves.

2. COUNTERTOP TRAY

Control the chaos on your countertop by arranging toiletries on a tray alongside a potted plant, scented candle or fake bouquet. Keep small items like cotton swabs and hair clips in glass jars.

3. BAR CART

4. BUILT-INS


Is geothermal energy right for you?

- You live on a large lot with plenty of space



What you should know about paint and wallpaper

Painting and wallpapering are two effective ways to transform the look of a room. Here's some information to help you decide which products to use in your home.

PAINT

The finish of your paint is just as important as its colour. A matte finish is ideal for living rooms, bedrooms and ceilings. However, satin and gloss finishes are stain resistant and easy to clean, making them ideal for kitchens and bathrooms.

WALLPAPER

Choose a wallpaper that's suitable for your space. For exa-



How to design a bedroom your child can grow into

It can be expensive and time-consuming to frequently update your child's bedroom as they get older and their interests change. If you want to create a space they'll feel at home in for years to come, here's some advice to follow.

• Buy a "big kid" bed. A wrought iron or upholstered headboard and matching bed frame will look just as appropriate in a teen's bedroom as it will in a child's. If you have the space, skip straight to a double bed.

- Keep staple items classic. Favour an area rug with a geometric or floral pattern rather than a space- or princess-themed one. Similarly, invest in window coverings that will stand the test of time.
- Personalize the space with accesso-

ries. Use fun blankets, throw pillows and wall hangings to make the space more child friendly. You can even encourage your kids to paint their own frames and choose what photos to display.

Remember to keep your child involved in the process. While you should avoid giving them free rein on the design, don't hesitate to let them select certain items or choose between several options.

4 annuals that will add height to your flowerbeds

Annuals often feature abundant blooms that are positively eye-catching. While it's relatively easy to find low, medium-sized flowers, it can be difficult to get your hands on large, majestic ones. Here are four annuals that stand tall and proud.

- **1. Dahlia.** Some varieties of this beautiful flower can grow up to two metres in height. However, it's best to stick to a single colour and find a type that doesn't grow taller than one-and-ahalf metres.
- **2. Cosmos.** This thin and delicate flower is available in beautiful pastels like white and pink. It'll wow your neighbours and attract butterflies and birds to your yard.
- **3. Cleome.** This beautiful ball-shaped flower is often overlooked at greenhouses and nurseries because it rarely blooms at the start of spring. Give it a chance you won't regret it.
- **4. Canna.** This bulbous plant tends to bloom late in the season. Therefore, it's best to plant it indoors four to six weeks before the last frost. Better yet, you can buy dwarf varieties that fill out quickly.

Horticulturists and landscapers generally recommend limiting yourself to two or three colours and three or four species to maximize their visual impact.



4 ideas for a statement ceiling

When renovating, many people forget to incorporate their ceiling into the overall design. However, this surface shouldn't be ignored. Here are four ceiling updates you may want to consider.

1. EXPOSED BEAMS

A ceiling with exposed beams can add visual intrigue to a modern or traditional home. You can opt for thick, rustic wood beams or thin, low-profile faux beams. To create contrast and draw the eye upward, paint your beams a darker colour than your walls and ceiling.

2. PAINT

To add style to a room, consider pairing a dark ceiling with light-coloured walls. In a large room, this can create definition and make other features, such as artwork and light fixtures, stand out. In a small space, a dark ceiling will lend a cosy, intimate feel.

3. MOULDINGS

There are a variety of decorative features you can install on your ceiling to add character to your space. Emphasize the transition between your walls and ceiling with classic crown mouldings, or add grandeur to any room in your home with egg-and-dart mouldings.

4. WALLPAPER

Applying wallpaper to a ceiling is an easy way to inject personality into a room. If you want to make a statement, opt for wallpaper that has a bold geometric, striped or floral print. If you prefer a look that's a bit more understated, look for a simple design in a neutral or light colour.
