Sheriff's deputy resigns during internal review

Abuse of overtime, falsification of time records cited; DA, Regional Highway Safety Office involved in investigation

BAY MINETTE — A 22-year veteran of the Baldwin County Sheriff's Office has resigned over allegations of abuse of overtime and falsification of time records.

According to a release issued Monday by the Baldwin County Sheriff's Office of Civil Affairs, Sgt. Carl Griffith, who was assigned to the BCSO Civil Division, resigned his position, effective Nov. 20, amid an administrative review and internal investigation that has been conducted over the past several weeks.

The Baldwin County Sheriff's Office gave notice to the Baldwin County District Attorney's Office of the investigation. Since some of the hours worked involved overtime which was reimbursed by federal and state funds set aside for special traffic enforcement notice was also given to the Southwest Regional Highway Safety Office in Mobile.

All alleged violations occurred in 2017. The Sheriff's Office also conducted an inquiry to determine if any other individuals were involved or associated with the allegations. At this time there is no evidence to suggest that any other deputy sheriff was involved in such activity.

From garbage to gas: county looks at selling biogas produced by landfill

Baldwin County could be turning garbage into cash, as several businesses are seeking to partner with the county to use the gas created by the county's landfill. Solid Waste Director Terri Graham told the commissioners she had several conversations with companies who were interested in purchasing the landfill gas. Biogas is created by the land-

fill as organic waste decomposes. The county currently controls the gas emissions by flaring it off. "I'd like to see if we can get some scopes of work from some engineering firms to see if this is something we might be interested in," Graham said. Graham said the companies looking to partner with the county have varied potential uses for the gas, including creating jet fuel, biodiesel and potentially helping to power an industrial plant.

The commissioners seemed interested in the potential for a partnership. "We've been trying to do something with that gas a long time," Commission Chairman Frank Burt said. Commissioner Skip Gruber agreed. "If there's any way we can utilize it, it would be a good resource," Gruber said. "There's plenty of it." Commissioner Tucker Dorsey had several questions about how the county would work

with a potential partner to monetize the gas and what, if any, improvements or accommodations the county would have to make at the landfill or nearby sites. Graham said she was not at the stage yet to be able to answer all of the questions, but wanted the commission's approval to create a request for proposals to do more research on possible uses. Graham said she did not want

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Commission hosts Day of Thanks celebration

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ROBERTSDALE — The Baldwin County Commission, in conjunction with Baldwin County United and the city of Robertsdale, hosted the annual Day of Thanks Celebration on Tuesday, Nov. 21 at the Baldwin County Central Annex, 22251 Palmer St., Robertsdale.

BCU President Warren Hopper and Robertsdale Mayor Charles Murphy welcomed guests, along with the Presentation of Colors and Pledge of Allegiance by the Robertsdale High School Junior ROTC, blessing by Col. Sidney Leak, retired U.S. Army chaplain.

Following breakfast, Commissioners Frank Burt Jr., chairman; Tucker Dorsey, Charles F. "Skip" Gruber and Chris Elliott presented messages of thanks before event organizers, Robertsdale City Council member and BCU member Ruthie

Campbell, introduced guest speaker, retired Lt. Col. Collins Wynn.

Wynn presented a talk on veterans in the work place and urged employers to dig deeper when considering hiring a veteran.

"When you see that box marked 'veteran' checked on an application, I urge you to dig a little deeper," he said. "You'll find that it means more than just someone who served our country. I think you'll find that it means this is someone who will be a valuable asset to your company."

Wynn explained that "as a general rule" veterans can be placed in two categories, enlisted personnel and officers.

Enlisted personnel, "as a general rule" are usually young, in their early to mid-20s, Wynn said, who have served their country at least four years and are ready to get out into the workplace.

"These are what you

would call doers," Wynn said. "They have all gone through some form of basic training and some even have a college education, but they have also been taught a practical skill and how to apply that education in the real world."

Officers, he said, are "as a general rule," a little older, early to mid-30s. While they have gone through basic training and the same skill training as an enlisted man,

they all have college degrees and leadership training as well.

"These are the people you need to consider, if you need somebody to take a leadership role, someone who knows how to take responsibility and get things done," he said.

"As a general rule," Wynn said, if you as an employer are looking for someone who is a doer, a leader and who can get things done, you should consider hiring a veteran.

Outdoor Conditions Report: Now that we are in the "holiday season" it doesn't necessarily mean the fishing season is over and done with. On the contrary! Even with a real taste of Gulf Coast fall weather, conditions still look good for a fairly consistent inshore bite.

From the reports I have seen, there is no shortage of speckled trout in our inshore waters. The trick is finding the right area, as some spots are dead while others not too far away can offer red hot action. With live shrimp in short supply (or virtually non-existent) try any number of shrimp imitation lures when fishing the "skinny water." Also, don't be surprised if you find a hungry redfish at the end of your line. Reds have been showing regularly in the past month or two along the eastern shore of Mobile Bay.

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Father accidentally shoots son during hunting trip in North Baldwin

STOCKTON — A father accidentally shot his son after slipping during a hunting trip in North Baldwin over the Thanksgiving weekend. According to a press release issued Saturday by the Baldwin County Sheriff’s office, deputies responded to a call at approximately 9:30 a.m. Saturday to the Upper Delta Wildlife Management Area in the Stockton

community. “Once on scene, deputies learned that Thomas Catrett accidentally shot his son, Adam Catrett, in the leg during a hunting trip,” according to the release. “This incident occurred when Thomas Catrett lost his footing while crossing a creek.” Adam Catrett sustained a significant injury to his lower right leg as a result of the shooting. Adam was stabilized by a friend who

was hunting with him until medical personnel and deputies arrived. Adam was carried to a clear area before being transported by helicopter to a nearby hospital. His current condition is unknown. Investigators with the Baldwin County Sheriff’s Office are investigating the incident along with Officers of the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources.

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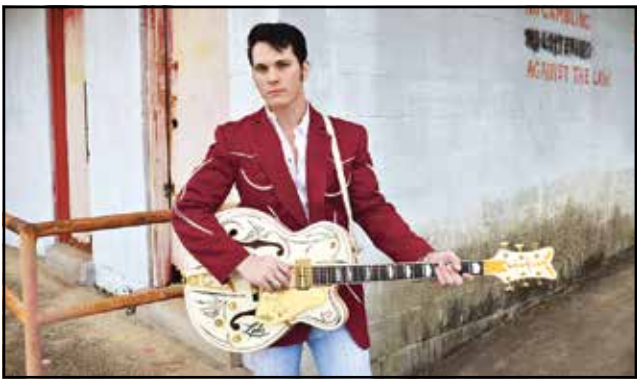

to guarantee a set amount of gas per month to the companies as the amount

fluctuates, though she added the volume of gas was likely due to increase in the coming year.

“We’re looking at about a possible \$10,000 to \$12,000 a month in

revenue with the existing volumes,” Graham said. “And that would likely increase next year.”

The commissioners asked Graham to move forward with the project.

Two big things you may have missed

I understand why people are so frustrated with politics these days. The American people want action, and it may not seem like much is actually getting accomplished. I share those concerns, but my frustration is not connected to my work in the House of Representatives. Despite the media's infatuation with relitigating the 2016 election, there are very substantive bills that pass out of the House almost every week.

In fact, two very important bills passed out of the House the week before Thanksgiving,

and the national news media did not give either the attention they deserved. I want to quickly bring you up to speed.

First, the House passed the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) by a strong bipartisan vote of 356 to 70. The same bill then passed out of the Senate on a unanimous voice vote.

As some of you may remember, the NDAA is the bill Congress must pass each year to set policy and authorize funding for the entire U.S. military. It almost always earns bipartisan support because, believe it or not, there is strong bipartisan support

in Congress for a strong national defense.

This year's NDAA makes important progress toward rebuilding our military by calling for more service members, better equipment, and additional resources. The bill also authorizes the largest pay raise for our troops in eight years and includes a number of important provisions related to our nuclear weapon program in light of continued threats from North Korea.

The NDAA is important to Southwest Alabama because it authorizes the construction of three additional Littoral Combat Ships (LCS). These are the Navy ships that are built by Austal USA in

Mobile. I pushed hard to ensure adequate support for the LCS program in an effort to make our Navy stronger and to protect thousands of jobs at the Mobile shipyard.

Second, on November 16th, the House passed landmark tax reform legislation that will cut taxes and help grow the American economy. The bill, known as the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act, is a key part of President Trump's agenda.

The benefits of this bill aren't abstract. Just consider the median family of four in Southwest Alabama. That family earns a little over \$77,000 a year. If that family takes the standard deduction, as most do, they will see a

tax cut of \$1,739.16. That comes out to almost \$150 extra dollars a month.

That's just as it relates to the individual tax code. When you add in additional reforms to the business and corporate code, studies have shown that the American economy will really take off, resulting in more jobs and higher wages. President Trump has predicted a "Middle Class Miracle."

These are just two of the most recent examples of the over 350 bills that have passed out of the House this year. The vast majority of those bills passed with bipartisan support, much like the NDAA. Despite roadblocks in the Senate, the House is doing our job

and actively working to follow through on the agenda we all ran on in 2016.

At the end of the day, I am going to keep doing the job you elected me to do: fighting each and every day for our shared values and for the hard-working people in Mobile, Baldwin, Clarke, Monroe, Escambia, and Washington counties.

Extending sick leave for Elberta police chief the right call

Last week, the Elberta Town Council voted unanimously to extend six more weeks of sick leave to the town's Police Chief Stan DeVane as he continues to recover from a horseback riding accident earlier this year.

DeVane has been hospitalized and in recovery since July, but he has contributed to the running of the city's department throughout that time even though he has not been able to be in the office - and was appropriately not charged sick time during this period.

He's helped developed a budget, consulted on cases and worked on firing and hiring employees, all while continuing to mend and get back to full health.

We applaud the Elberta Town Council for making this move to allow DeVane until January to try to get back into the office.

While there are rules and regulations in place regarding sick leave, there are also extenuating circumstances that can call for those rules to be put aside.

Stan DeVane has been the model for what a police chief should be during his tenure in Elberta.

Not content to stay behind a desk and

do paperwork, DeVane has been out in the community, building relationships with residents and patrolling his town.

He's gone above and beyond the call of duty time and time again, and now it's the town's turn to respond in kind.

When you've got a person like DeVane helping your town, you do whatever you can to help him.

Given DeVane's injuries, he may not be back to 100 percent by January 2018, but he has the strength and resolve to do what he can to try to be back.

We join with many Elberta residents in wishing DeVane a speedy recovery and hope to see him back at the police station as soon as he is able.

Come on back, Chief. Elberta needs you.

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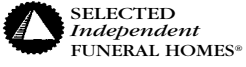

History Blakeley State Park will conduct two guided tours of the nationally famous Bottle Creek Indian Mound Complex in December. On Dec. 2 and Dec. 16 the park will take passengers to the remote upper Mobile-Tensaw Delta site

aboard its pontoon boat, the Delta Explorer. Both tours depart at 9:30 a.m. from Lower Bryant Landing and return about 12:30 p.m. The 800-year old mound complex was at one time home to one of the largest Native American communities in the Southeast. Today its 18 mounds, the

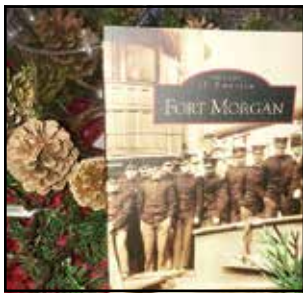

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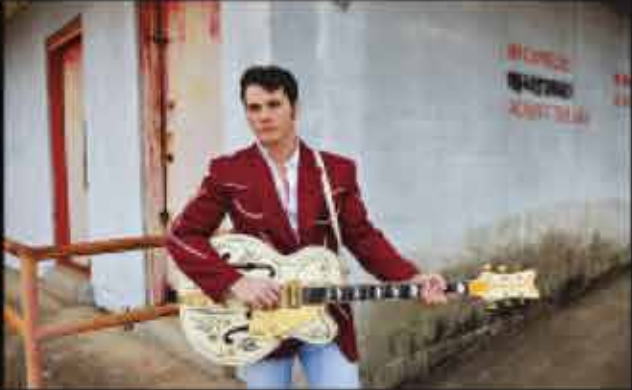
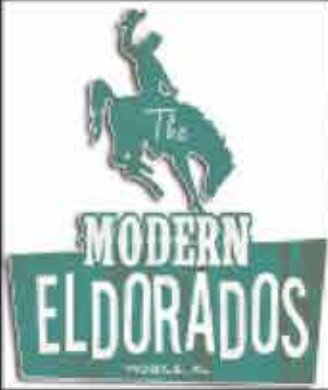

Auburn, Georgia meet for SEC title

After a crazy weekend last Saturday with No. 1 Alabama, No. 2 Miami and No. 8 Notre Dame losing, chaos reigns going into conference championships. After winning against the Crimson Tide 26-14, the Auburn Tigers (now second in the College Football Playoff rankings) will take their winning streak to the SEC Championship against the No. 6 Georgia Bulldogs (11-1).

Despite Auburn (10-2) having two losses, they had a most impressive schedule with victories against two No. 1 teams. Georgia was that other team demolished by Auburn 40-17 Nov. 11.

Even though No. 2 Auburn will be a clear favorite against No. 6 Georgia, they have to be wary of a team out for revenge and a playoff spot.

The last time they met with the Tigers, the Bull-

dogs run-game had only 46 yards. Coach Kirby Smart says the offensive line will need to improve their play against arguably one of the best front (defensive line and line-backers).

The Tigers defense accounted for four sacks and five tackles for loss against Georgia that made the run-game nonexistent and also forced Bulldogs freshman Jake Fromm into bad passes.

Kerryon Johnson has been a solid force for the Tigers' highly efficient offense. Johnson rushed

for 167 yards on 32 carries (average of 5.2 yards per rush) and caught a reception touchdown in the win against Georgia. Johnson also rushed for 104 yards on 30 carries and a touchdown but did suffer a slight injury against No. 1 Alabama.

Auburn will need to make sure they don't overwork Johnson to cause further damage. This will be a game where Jarrett Stidham may need be the star of the game like he was against Alabama.

The offensive line

will need to be focused against this Georgia defense especially from Roquan Smith, who accounted for 12 total tackles in the loss to Auburn. Georgia's defense is currently ranked fifth in points allowed per game (13.8), third in passing per game (159.4), and 12th in rushing yards allowed per game (112.5).

Alabama's outlook

For what seems like the first time, the No. 5 Alabama Crimson Tide (11-1) are on the outside looking to get into the playoffs

after their loss with Auburn last week. Alabama needs a loss from No. 3 Oklahoma (11-1) from No. 11 TCU (10-2) and No. 4 Wisconsin (12-0) to No. 8 Ohio State (10-2). Alabama has the edge with three top 25 wins, a good loss, a statistically efficient overall team, and more teams played currently in the top 25 over Ohio State. The Buckeyes could have a conference championship but two losses including a 31-point beat down from an unranked Iowa Hawkeyes (now 7-5).

Academy enhances education efforts through presidential tour of nations

DAPHNE — The United States Sports Academy recently expanded its commitment to global sport education through a successful tour of nations by President and CEO Dr. T.J. Rosandich that included meetings and new cooperative agreements with international sport leaders.

Rosandich, who has been central to the Academy's international programs for more than 30 years, made a month-long journey that included discussions with key leaders in sport, education and government in China, Malaysia, the Philippines, Switzerland and the United Arab Emirates.

Republic of the Philippines

The Academy's long history of supporting sport development in the Philippines took a major step forward as Rosandich signed a sports Protocol of Cooperation with Philippine Sports Commission (PSC) Chair William "Butch" Ramirez through which the Academy will work with the country to strengthen its sports programs at all levels, from youth and grassroots sports programs to the elite sport level. Under the agreement signed in Davao City, the Academy will work with governmental agencies and other organizations endorsed by the PSC to contribute to the national sports development program.

"The signing of this protocol is of particular significance to the United States Sports Academy as we have had a long his-

tory with the Philippines," Rosandich said.

"We taught our international certification programs in sports management and sports coaching in the island nation in the early 1980s, so to return today for this program is meaningful indeed.

"The Academy is looking forward to playing a role in the development of the national sport effort in the Philippines through our programs in education, research and service. Having taught sports education programs to over 65 countries, this partnership with the Philippines is a continuation of our mission."

"We when we came to the Philippine Sports Commission we launched the Philippine Sports Institute (PSI) with the hope of establishing and strengthening elite sports and grassroots sports programs," Ramirez told the Davao City Sun-Star newspaper.

"This partnership with the United States Sports Academy is hoped to achieve that."

The Academy will provide a wide range of services including an assessment of sport education and staffing in the country, as well as educational services to train coaches and sports administrators to achieve the nation's sport goals. The Academy will work with the Southeast Asian nation on such topics as human performance research, sports medicine, and the development of international caliber athletes.

The agreement will also involve collaboration on

sports cultural exchanges including Olympism, youth activities, sport art, literature, history, and many others.

The agreement came as Rosandich was in Davao City as keynote speaker for the 2017 International Conference on Physical Education, Recreation, Fitness and Sports Science, where he discussed the role of education in sports development with an international audience of leaders in sport.

United Arab Emirates

The Academy president visited the United Arab Emirates (UAE), where the Academy continues to play a key role in the enhancement of football (soccer) under a cooperative effort to train football administrators through a Football Club Operators License Program with the UAE Football Association (UAEFA).

Rosandich gave a presentation entitled "A Role for Sports Education in National Football Programs" at the Conference on Innovation in Football, Education and Governance organized by the UAEFA. The talk stressed the importance of academic licensing programs and accreditation in sports education to improve the quality of coaching and administration in sports. He also met with officials in the program on topics including enhancements of the training program.

The collaboration between the Academy and UAEFA led to the development of the Football Association Academy for Sports Management (FAASM), known as the

Football Association Academy (FAA), which began operations in 2016. This effort includes football certification programs that offer professional preparation and training designed to meet the needs of coaches, athletes, administrators and operatives at all levels in the UAE football club system.

The Academy is providing the faculty and instruction for the program. The curriculum includes subjects such as sports administration, sports marketing, sports media, and facility and event management. Each subject has three levels of instruction through which successful students receive in succession a "C", "B" and "A" level license.

The ultimate objective of the program is to enhance football in the UAE by improving the quality of the sport's management.

People's Republic of China

In the People's Republic of China, the Academy president met with sports leaders in Beijing and Shanghai, where key discussion themes included possible new initiatives to improve the physical fitness and social development of China's youth, and how the Academy might be involved in those efforts. These included an agreement in principle for the Academy to be involved in development of sports camps based on its experience in this field.

Discussion also focused on China's possible development of a school of sport and the role the Academy might play to

assist in its unique role as American's only free-standing sport university.

In Shanghai, discussions focused on the 2018 rendition of the International Diploma in Sports Coaching (IDSC) program. Conducted by the Academy and the Shanghai Administration of Sports (SAS), the program provides classroom instruction, experiential learning, and educational travel to the United States for former elite athletes in the Shanghai area to prepare them for careers in coaching and athletic related fields.

Malaysia

Discussions in the Southeast Asian country of Malaysia focused on the recent Academy program that is contributing to the training of the people responsible for improving the health and life skills of youth of the nation.

Launched in 2012, The Academy's International Diploma in Physical Education and Sports Coaching (IDPESC) program has trained thousands of teachers in critical physical education and coaching skills. The latest edition of this program will commence in Malaysia on 13 November. Concurrently, the Academy's "Train the Trainers" (TOT) program assists the Malaysian government in its National Service Training Program (NSTP) is being staged there. The Academy's instructors are responsible for training the instructors who in turn teach sport and physical fitness skills to more than 250,000 Malaysian youth each year as part of the country's NSTP cur-

riculum.

The partnership is one of many collaborations between the Academy and Malaysia dating back to the early 1980s. The Academy is exploring additional initiatives with the country, including a program to contribute to the physical fitness of the nation's police force.

Switzerland

The Academy president met with several key international sport and education leaders in Switzerland to discuss sport education initiatives. The Academy continued talks with the European University Business School regarding sport education collaborations. Discussions also continued with the International Labor Organization (ILO), whose interest in sport lies in its potential to elevate humanity through helping the United Nations achieve its Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The Academy will continue to build on both of these cooperative educational efforts.

Thailand

Though not a part of the current trip, the Academy's longtime relationship with Thailand to educate sports leaders in that country is continuing this coming year as the Academy is conducting its International Certification in Sports Coaching (ICSC) and International Certification in Sports Management (ICSM) programs in Bangkok, programs that have been in place for more than a decade.

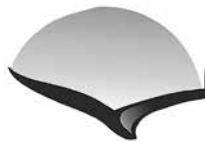

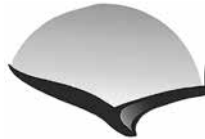

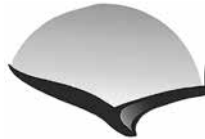

Irwin happy with return to National Finals Rodeo

ROBERTSDALE — Kyle Irwin has an infectious smile the shines brightly under the cowboy hat he wears.

He loves to laugh and share that smile with just about anyone. He's had plenty of opportunities in 2017, both at home and on the rodeo trail. He's hoping it all pays off over 10 December nights in Las Vegas, where he will compete at the National Finals Rodeo for the third time.

"I love to smile, and I love to have fun," said Irwin of Robertsdale, now living in Westville, Florida, with his wife, Randa, and their 10-month-old son, Tripp. "When you smile, something comes over you. I enjoy that, and it makes me enjoy the whole day."

He has plenty of reasons to smile. He and Randa just celebrated their two-year anniversary. They kicked off the new year with Tripp, who was born Jan. 17. In business, he was toward the top of his game, earning just shy of \$80,000 and finishing the regular season 11th in the world standings. That's not too bad from the Alabama-raised steer wrestler who attended

both Western Oklahoma State College and Northwestern Oklahoma State University on rodeo scholarships. "I really believe consistency was the key for me this year," said Irwin, 27. "Even though my year was sporadic, it was pretty consistent. I didn't win a whole lot early but stayed in the hunt. Over the Fourth (of July), I won \$24,000 and was the highest steer wrestling earner. I jumped from 36th to 11th in the standings."

That was a pivotal time. Cowboy Christmas is based on a number of lucrative rodeos around the July 4 holiday. Irwin won in both Cody, Wyoming, and St. Paul, Oregon; those two rodeos earned the Alabama cowboy more than \$16,000. He also placed well in Prescott, Arizona; Livingston, Montana; and Ponoka, Alberta.

"It was one of those weeks where I could do no wrong," he said. "I believe it gave me the momentum to finish out."

Besides momentum, Irwin had a couple other things going for him with traveling partner Tyler Pearson of Louisville, Mississippi, and Scooter, the bulldogging horse they

co-own. Pearson is also heading to the NFR, going in No. 3 in the world standings; it's his second qualification. This will be Scooter's first trip to Las Vegas with the tandem, but they expect big things.

How vital was the 12-year-old sorrel gelding? Pearson picked up at least a share of the victory at eight rodeos, and Irwin had 12 titles. Scooter was the driving force behind the duo's \$190,000 in combined earnings. For that, the steer wrestlers voted him as the 2017 Steer Wrestling Horse of the Year.

"I actually think it was both horses," Irwin said, referring also to Pearson's hazing horse, Metallica. "He can literally fly. The hazing horse has to run just as hard, if not harder, than the bulldogging horse. That horse is very athletic, and he makes my job easier, funner."

"It doesn't matter what that steer does, we have the horses that can catch him."

That type of confidence goes a long way; Pearson and Irwin now have the opportunity to showcase their horsepower at Pro Rodeo's grand finale, set

for Dec. 7-16. It's important for their business as bulldoggers, because they will be battling for their share of the \$8 million purse — go-round winners will earn more than \$26,000 a night for 10 rounds.

Irwin knows all the possibilities that await him in the Nevada desert. In his first NFR adventure, he earned \$88,000 over 10 nights and finished as the 2014 reserve world champion. A year later, he placed in just three rounds and pocketed \$34,000. He's excited to see what 2017 offers.

"I think the biggest thing I've learned since my first NFR was patience," he said. "I think it comes with age and maturing some. Things are going to happen that are sometimes out of my control. When things are in my control, I need to grab them and take advantage of them."

He's found great benefit in his team of sponsors — CINCH, RCI Oilfield Services, Zesterra, Seminole Feed, Resistol, Foy Reynolds Cattle Co., Best Ever Saddle Pads and Coats Saddlery — that help him get up and down the road. They all are a major part of the team returning to Las Vegas.

Family is his priority, as it should be. He and Randa were newlyweds the last time he rode in Sin City, and now they've added

Tripp to the family. It has worked all season long, so he has good reason to be excited when he lands in Las Vegas.
