For the third year in a row,
The Baldwin Times won
first place in the Best Editor-
ial category. This year’s
entry, “What will you decide
to do?”, was the result of a
year of reporting on political
happenings in Fairhope and
asked the residents what ac-
tions they were going to take
based on the stories.

Gulf Coast Media Pub-
lisher Parks Rogers, who
brought back editorials to
the Baldwin Times, said he
was pleased by the continued
award wins for the editorials.

“Editorials were some-
thing we wanted to add to
The Baldwin Times as an
addition for our readers
and the community, so it’s
gratifying that we continue
to win awards year after
year for this facet of our
news coverage,” Rogers said.
“We take strong stances on
issues that affect Baldwin
County and will continue to
do so, whether or not we win
awards.”

Islander Editor Crystal
Cole won first place in the
Best Spot News category
for her coverage of the Gulf
Shores Mardi Gras Parade
accident, her second first
place win of her career.

Cole was onsite at the

Main Street Alabama selects Foley for Revitalization Program

Foley, along with Scottsboro
and South Huntsville, has
been selected to join a state-
wide effort to build stronger
communities through effec-
tive downtown revitalization.
Main Street Alabama, a non-
profit organization that uses a
national model with a 40-year
track record of success, desig-
nated the towns after a rigor-
ous application process.

According to Mary Helmer,

State Coordinator for the pro-
gram, Main Street Alabama
will immediately begin pro-
viding each town with inten-
sive board development, goal
setting, work planning, mar-
ket study with implementable
economic development strate-
gies, targeted technical assis-
tance, and training related to
downtown development.

“When a community is
ready for Main Street, as these
three are, the time tested Four
Point Approach® works,”

Helmer said. “It brings jobs,
dollars and people back to
downtowns and neighborhood
commercial districts.”

Helmer added that the inter-
view panel was impressed by
the presentations each appli-
cant made that demonstrated
a love of their downtowns,
a vision for what they could
be, and the drive to make it
happen. She noted that Foley
demonstrated strong com-

Susan Runnels retiring with nearly 35 years as educator

After nearly 35 years

And she is confident

step in and fill those
shoes.

“I’m excited for
these students and I’m
excited for the future
of Elsanor School,”
Runnels said. “This is
such a great school and
such a close-knit com-
munity devoted to their
children’s education
and I’m confident that
Charlotte will be a per-
fect fit in this environ-
ment.”

ment means taking

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Town of Silverhill hires new town clerk Nikki Haigler

SILVERHILL — Assistant clerk Nikki Haigler was confirmed as the new town clerk in Silverhill May 21, replacing longtime clerk Patricia Bankester who resigned last month. Officials announced May 7 that they had received a dozen applications for the position and would pick the top three to be interviewed during a special meeting Monday, May 14. “We had a good meet-

ing with all the candidates,” said Mayor Tim Wilson, “and I would still like to recommend we hire Nikki for the position.” Council members asked legal representative Josh Myrick if they could consider candidates for both the positions of town clerk and assistant clerk, should the council decide to promote current assistant clerk Nikki Haigler to the position of town clerk. Myrick said the council is required to appoint

the position of town clerk, but the position of assistant clerk could be hired by the mayor without the need for council approval. It is unclear at this time if any of those candidates will be considered for the assistant clerk’s position. Bankester, a native of Mobile and a resident of Loxley, was hired as a part-time temporary assistant to Town Clerk Bonnie McNeil in March of 2008 before taking over the position following McNeil’s retirement

in May of 2009. The council also voted Monday to allow Haigler to transfer funds from one account to another at United Bank. Transfers require the signature of either the mayor, mayor pro-tem (Jared Lyles), or town clerk. In other business Monday, the council voted unanimously to update the town’s Police Department Standard Operating Procedure. Silverhill’s Acting Police Chief Michael Taylor addressed council members at the April 2

meeting after town prosecutor Mike Dasinger was supposed to review the SOP and present a report to council members. The item has been on the agenda for the last two meetings, but has been tabled because Dasinger has not been able to attend the meetings. “I have met with Dasinger and gone over all the changes,” Taylor said, “and I think we now have something we can work with.” While he stated at previous meetings that he had no problem with the

S.O.P. as a whole, Taylor said there are some things that simply don’t apply to Silverhill. “What we have now is about half the size of the previous document,” Taylor said. “Every department has to operate with an S.O.P. and essentially, we were violating ours every day because of those items.” Taylor also addressed council members regarding police department uniforms and was authorized to purchase uniforms from a company based in Mobile.

education. A native of Fairhope, she is the daughter of former Baldwin County Assistant School Superintendent Wesley Grant. “Both of my parents

were educators, so it’s something that we grew up with,” Runnels said. And while both of her sisters have had satisfying careers as teachers in the Baldwin County School System, Runnels said, she knew early on that she wanted to devote herself to admin-

istrative work. “When I was in my 20s, I was applying for curriculum jobs, knowing that I wouldn’t get them, but also knowing that’s what I wanted to do with my career,” Runnels said. After graduating from Auburn University, she did spend 20 years in the classroom before getting her first job as an assistant principal, two years at Bay Minette Middle, a year at Perdido and six years in Monroe County before teaching 11 years at Fairhope Elementary. She then served as assistant principal at Fairhope Intermediate, J. Larry Newton (who was her father’s boss as School Superintendent), Daphne Elementary and Daphne Intermediate before landing the job at Elsanor School 13 years ago.

will do a great job, giving up this job feels like giving all of these students up for adoption. Visit the Mobile Delta to see what you’ve been missing

It is one thing to hear about the Mobile-Tensaw River Delta, with its 600 species of animals and dozens upon dozens of swamps, rivers, creeks, bayous, marshes and patches of wetlands. It is another thing entirely to actually see the delta up close – to fish its waters, paddle its streams and tramp through its forests.

That is why individuals, businesses, civic leaders and advocacy groups have joined forces to create the Alabama Delta Alliance: to introduce local residents and travelers alike to the beauty of our delta. Sadly, while some folks in Alabama have grown up living, working and playing in it, far too many people in the

region haven’t been inside the Mobile-Tensaw River Delta.

Our mission is to change that dynamic.

We have begun by creating a website (www.alabamadelta.com) that explains what and where the Mobile-Tensaw River Delta is, describes its rich history and incredible diversity, and tells people how they can experience it. The heart of the website is an interactive map that details the various public access points up and down the delta -- from boat launches and fishing piers to wildlife refuges and historic sites -- with specific details about each, including addresses and descriptions of facilities.

In the short term, we hope the website will spark people’s interest in taking a boat tour,

fishing excursion, kayak trip or hike into the delta, whether individually or with friends. For those who don’t know where to start, we recommend signing up with one of several tour boat companies whose knowledgeable guides regularly take groups into the delta. People can check with Five Rivers Delta Resource Center (251-625-9814) for more information.

From there, people can decide for themselves what’s the next step in getting to know the delta’s beauty, its resources and its surprises. Our long-term goal is for them to understand that this is their delta, that it offers innumerable activities, and that it deserves our respect and our attention.

Also at www.alabamadelta.com, we invite

people to join the Alliance. There are no dues or membership fees to join; all we’re asking is for people to embrace this vast and beautiful natural resource so that it can continue to be available for years to come. We’ll keep Alliance members up-to-date on projects, progress and initiatives that affect the delta.

Additionally, we’ll continue to grow our partnerships with agencies under the umbrella of the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources that oversee many of the delta’s resources (including Five Rivers Delta Resource Center, the Marine Resources Division, State Lands Division and State Parks Division) plus the Coastal Alabama

Partnership, Mobile Bay National Estuary Program, Dauphin Island Sea Lab and other advocacy groups, businesses, individuals and civic leaders who are passionate about promoting and protecting the delta.

In the meantime, we’ll be expanding our website’s map, adding more launches, piers, facilities and public access points. Indeed, we encourage people to visit the site and click on “Get Engaged” to suggest locations they believe should be added to the map.

At the press conference where we revealed the creation of the Alliance, a steering committee member observed that the Mobile-Tensaw River Delta boasts an unusual amount of accessibility. In fact, people in southwest Alabama drive across its

southern entrance daily via Interstate 10, and numerous towns and communities abut its shores.

Through education and old-fashioned word-of-mouth, our goal is to lure people out of their homes, cars and RVs and up into the delta, where they will see what they’ve been missing. In the process, we believe they’ll come to understand the full meaning of our Alliance’s slogan: “See the Delta. Explore the Delta. Know the Delta.”

Huntsville/Madison County and the entire Tennessee Valley are poised to become the envy of the nation in economic growth over the next decade. There should be three gigantic monuments erected in Huntsville and put side by side of Werner Von Braun, John Sparkman and Richard Shelby.

Vanishing property rights in Orange Beach

Power corrupts goes the old saw. Taking away residents’ property rights is the new infatuation, firstly with short-term rentals in residential areas, lastly with property condemnations, acquiring land for the proposed bridge west of the Foley Beach Express.

“Eminent domain is a necessary evil,” said Mayor Tony Kennon, referring to three families who will lose their home-based businesses on property needed for the bridge, quoted in the Islander, April 25, 2018, pg. 29.

The problem is not one single piece of data or traffic study was offered to the public, supporting the necessity of eminent domain condemnations for the \$87 Million second bridge, causing Mr. Jim Ziegler, the State’s Auditor to write a letter to ALDOT’s Director John Cooper, seeking clarification.

“I have more questions than I do answers about the proposed additional bridge. I hope to solve that with my specific requests for public records,” Alabama State Auditor Jim Zeigler explained on Twitter.

Elected Officials acquiescing on the side of property condemnation is like airing a television campaign against property rights, watching our representatives watching a reality show.

In a market system, well-defined property rights are important because they increase economic activity, bolstering standards of living, quality-of-life, and a strong tax base that is inextricably linked to property rights.

Using a hammer instead of a scalpel to regulate short-term rentals, prescribing condemnation and eminent domain instead of negotiation to obtain property for the second bridge is scandalously inconsistent with Alabamians’ hatred of government intervention, rewriting the playbook on property rights.

Local politicians prefer circling the wagons when residents disagree, appearing to have lost the ability to dissent.

Perhaps we should exhale, taking a look at what has grown from the seedling of property rights since Orange Beach was founded in 1984 to the latest Ordinance 2018-1282, limiting vacation rentals.

Mayor Tony Kennon said in a Council Meeting, “I want to know who my neighbors are,” commenting on short-term rentals, giving everyone in the room a glimpse into the plan.

This rental legislation is like gating the residential community by Ordinance instead of by Referendum or HOA vote, wondering how elected officials will explain themselves for not minimizing government’s role in the economy, for not restoring liberty from government interference, essentially abandoning pre-eminent conservative ideals.

VOYAGE OF DISCOVERY

There are some decisions you must make at the bridge table where you can’t be sure you’re right. That is the nature of the game, and all that can be done in these cases is to exercise your best judgment and hope everything turns out all right.

Take this deal where you’re in four hearts and West cashes the K-Q of spades, on which East plays the 4-8. West shifts to the club deuce, and you follow low from dummy, losing to the king. Back comes the nine of spades, which you trump as West follows with the three. The only problem remaining is to avoid a trump loser. Normally you’d play the A-K, hoping to catch the queen on the first or second round.

Granting that that’s what you usually do with nine cards of a suit missing the queen, playing for the drop is something you should always think about twice. Sometimes it is right to abandon the so-called percentage play in favor of

a finesse, and in this case, you should do a bit more investigating before deciding what to do.

Accordingly, after playing a trump to the ace, you cash the A-K of diamonds and ruff a diamond, on which East’s queen falls. When you now lead a second trump and East follows low, you are faced with the crucial decision.

West almost surely started with the A-K-Q-3 of spades, given East’s failure to play high-low on the first two tricks and West’s discontinuing the suit after the second trick. The clubs appear to be divided 4-4, judging from West’s fourth-best lead of the deuce.

Finally, since East seems to have started with three diamonds to the queen, it follows that his original distribution was 3-3-3-4, making the trump finesse likely to win. Maybe you shouldn’t bet the old family homestead on it, but the finesse has now become the percentage play.

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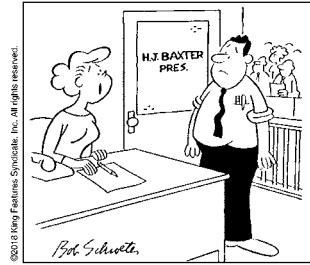

South Alabama Trustees approve steps for stadium on campus

What has seemed like a pipe dream since the founding of the University of South Alabama’s football program in 2009 appears to finally be coming to fruition: the program is (very likely) getting an on-campus stadium.

University president Tony Waldrop has been authorized to start accepting bids for the construction of the stadium following unanimous

approval from the University of South Alabama Board of Trustees Friday afternoon.

The proposed cost estimated for the project is \$73 million with construction aimed at being completed in 2020 if things go according to plan. The proposed location is where the school’s intramural athletic fields currently sit, in close proximity to the football offices and practice facilities.

Seating capacity is aimed at 25,000 initially

with construction allowing for additions to be made down the line to bring that number up to 40,000, according to athletic director Joel Erdmann.

It was made clear by many parties at the meeting that tuition costs will not be affected by the cost of the stadium. The plan is to receive funding from private and corporate donations as well as repurposed athletic funds. The school has also reached out to the

city and county governments for pledges between \$5 million and \$10 million each.

An on-campus stadium has the potential to have a far-reaching and beneficial affect on the University. From campus life, to enrollment numbers, athletic recruiting and much more, the stadium won’t just help the football program; it has the potential to further entrench South Alabama as a leader in higher education.

Since the programs inception, home games have been played at Ladd-Peebles Stadium in downtown Mobile. While the stadium holds a great deal of history, it’s more than 70 years old now and has seen better days. It’s hard to be respected as a program when the visiting teams play in a stadium that is largely behind the times and in need of more renovations than it’s worth.

Along those same lines, USA has laid

groundwork for the city to enter into talks with the Senior Bowl and Dollar General Bowl to play host for their games once the stadium is complete. If either or both partnerships come to pass, the school and community would benefit exponentially.

The community and fan base have been clamoring for this moment for nearly a decade now. While the wait isn’t over, seeing a finish line should definitely lift everyone’s spirits.

Golden State Warriors take 2-0 lead over Cleveland Cavaliers in NBA Finals

This year’s NBA Finals between the Golden State Warriors and the Cleveland Cavaliers is not a surprise to much of the NBA and their fans. The Warriors currently have a 2-0 series lead with the first game coming down to a 124-114 win in overtime and game two being dominated by the Warriors 124-114.

Cleveland Cavaliers forward LeBron James is putting up incred-

ible statistics in the first two games with the majority of the team’s performance. In game one, he accounted for 51 points on 19 field goals (out of 32 attempts) including eight rebounds and eight assists.

In game two, he had 29 points on 10 field goals (out of 20 attempts) including nine rebounds and 13 assists. His 80 points in the first two games in the NBA Finals are the fourth highest any player has

ever scored in the first two games in the NBA Finals.

Although James is an all-around star playmaker for the Cavaliers, they find themselves in rough waters due to the dominance of the Warriors four main superstars. Steph Curry has accounted for 62 total points in the first two games (29 in game one and 33 in game two), especially from the 3-point arc. In this series alone, Curry has completed buzzer beaters, clutch 3-point shots and made buckets while being si-

multaneously fouled. In Sunday’s game, Curry passed former Boston Celtics legend Ray Allen for most threes made in an NBA finals game with nine.

The Warriors Klay Thompson has been very efficient in his shot selection as well as field-goal percentage in both games. In game one, Thompson had 24 points on eight field goals (out of 16 attempts). In game two, he had 20 points, eight field goals (out of 13 attempts). Both Warriors Kevin Durant and Draymond Green

were reliable in their respective areas of impact where Durant is a diverse scorer and Green is a behemoth on defense.

Games three and four of the finals now move to Cleveland. The Warriors will have to initiate a faster pace on offense in an away setting while the Cavaliers need to have an impact

on the offensive side of the ball from players other than James. Kevin Love had 22 points in game two but he didn’t have much of an impact in game one. James will have to trust his teammates to help set up plays and scoring situations instead of trying to do it all. Game three will be held tonight in Cleveland.

By legislating for government restrictions on private property this Council transformed from conservative incumbent right before our eyes. It’s troubling not knowing what other instruments of economic disenfranchisement are on the agenda. What happens east and west of Docs Seafood when the Wolf Bay Bridge is put out for Bid, needing more land for a construction

site, parking and a lay-down yard? One must assume properties will be condemned and then confiscated for pennies on the dollar, imitating the greater vanity of eminent domain. “We have to be able to move traffic. We’ve got to be able to evacuate and we have to be able to grow,” said Mayor Tony Kennon to AL.com. I agree that some short-term rental owners have been naughty, insufficiently policing their renters. Residents should call the authorities when renters mis-

behave, applying laws already on the books, perhaps implementing a three-strikes and you lose your license policy, ensuring Council has the last word. Tarring all residential-rental owners with the same brush is energetic but disillusioned. The Baldwin County Association of REALTORS® (BCAR), representing 2000 Realtors did not endorse candidates who voted for the Orange Beach residential rental ordinance, according to the BCAR web site.

“REALTORS® care about communities and candidates who support private property rights,” said Sheila Dodson, CEO of BCAR. “This is just another platform to show the involvement of REALTORS® in their community.”

A short-term rental ban, and eminent domain sit on the plate before us, cleverly salted to kneecap the opposition. How we chew and digest these morsels is up to us.

Adversity brings out the character of an ‘American Woman’

Bonnie Nolan is a woman in for a rude awakening — and it’s probably the best thing that could happen to her.

As played by Alicia Silverstone (“Clueless”) on the half-hour comedy “American Woman,” premiering Thursday, June 7, on Paramount Network, she’s the 1970s Beverly Hills trophy wife of Steve (James Tupper, “Grey’s Anatomy”), a real estate agent whose substantial commissions have them and their two daughters sitting pretty in their swanky SoCal home.

That is, until she catches him cheating on her, and she shows him the door. Now with a divorce looming, Bonnie is forced to stand on her own two feet for the first time and support the kids, but with no marketable skills that won’t be easy. Fortunately she has two supportive best friends ready to help: Kathleen (Mena Suvari, “American Beauty”), a woman living off Daddy’s

money with the help of closeted gay boyfriend Greg (Cheyenne Jackson, “30 Rock”); and Diana (Jennifer Bartels, “Broken”), a singleton stuck in an unsatisfying life and bank job.

The series is full of the trappings of the ’70s — bell-bottoms, pantsuits and references to Richard Nixon, along with lots of trysts, drug use and cigarette smoking — and is based on the life of Kyle Richards (“Real Housewives of Beverly Hills”), a series co-executive producer on whose late mother the character of Bonnie is modeled.

“It’s a real survival story,” Silverstone explains, “and it’s a real awakening and a liberation story of all three females, finding their voices and being liberated and being brave and taking risks, and Bonnie’s at the center of that. She does it first, like she’s the one who goes and burns the house down. She basically burns the house down and she’s like, ‘Wait a second, I have nothing. How am I going to get back?’ And her friends

are there to help her, but then they have their own very, very deep, interesting stories.”

Indeed, while Bonnie struggles to get on her feet and Diana languishes in frustration, rich girl Kathleen tries to make a go of it by opening her own casting agency with Greg. Her friends warn her he’s interested in her only for her money, but both Kathleen and the actress playing her, Suvari, see a deeper connection there.

“That’s what’s so beautiful,” Suvari says, “is that it really is about a soul connection, people that are attracted to one another and both sort of not living in this honest space within themselves. Because I think with Greg, he’s struggling with his own form of identity. And then with Kathleen, she is to a certain extent so desperate to just be loved and so used to keeping up appearances and everything is OK. ... It’s picture-perfect, but then it’s really not. And then it’s sort of like you get to this place where you can’t ignore it anymore.”

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Gulf State Park Interpretive Center, Pedestrian Bridge open

A glimpse of the rebirth of Gulf State Park’s beachside facilities was revealed by Gov. Kay Ivey recently during an unveiling of the park’s Interpretive Center and East Pedestrian Bridge.

Gov. Ivey, Conservation Commissioner Chris Blankenship and other dignitaries cut the ribbon to the entrance of the Interpretive Center and Pedestrian Bridge, two significant parts of the Gulf State Park Enhancement Project located adjacent to the park’s Beach Pavilion.

As work continues to restore the facilities that were basically wiped out by Hurricane Ivan in 2004, the much-anticipated Lodge and Conference Center are expected to open in late fall of this year.

Blankenship said last week’s dedication was the first of many events that will occur at Gulf State Park to reveal the additions and renovations to this cherished area on the Alabama Gulf Coast.

“I’m sure you have very special memories of your experiences here at Gulf State Park,” Blankenship said. “This is a very special place to me. I’m proud to be the Commissioner of the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and oversee all our great state parks, including Gulf State Park. That’s one of the highlights of my job.

“I’ve been coming here since I was 3 years old, when we moved to Mobile from north Alabama. I have such great memories of the campground, the beach, the old pavilion and the old lodge and conference center. This is a great place. My daughter was married right out here

on the beach. But this park is more than just the beach. At Gulf State Park, we have dunes, lakes, marshes, maritime forests, uplands, pine tree groves, oak bottoms, deer, raccoons, alligators, beach mice, insects like butterflies, and birds of all kinds, including birds of prey.”

In addition to the cabins and cottages, Blankenship listed the activities at Gulf State Park, including camping, hiking, biking, walking, swimming, fishing, boating, crabbing, birding, shelling, golfing, nature education, family gatherings and just relaxing.

For Gov. Ivey, that special status extends the length of the state.

“Alabama is indeed a special place we call home,” Gov. Ivey said. “From the Tennessee Valley, we have the beautiful mountains. In Birmingham, we have world-class food. We see the speed of the race cars at Talladega, and on down to the beautiful waters of the Gulf Coast.

“Let’s be honest. On a day like today, this is where everybody wants to be — in Gulf Shores. There’s no other place on the Gulf Coast that is more perfect and beautiful. That’s the reason we want to protect and continue to grow this part of our state.”

Ivey explained why the Interpretive Center and the East Pedestrian Bridge are crucial parts of the Gulf State Park Enhancement Project.

“Both are important to the public’s access to Gulf State Park and to cementing Gulf State Park as a world-class facility and premiere tourist destination on the Gulf Coast,” Ivey said. “The Interpretive Center will be the launching point for the 28 miles of trails in the park. The Interpretive

Center will have a variety of interactive exhibits telling the story of the natural history of this part of the state and how our ecology has evolved over time.

“The Pedestrian Bridge will be one of two bridges here. Visitors and citizens alike have told us loud and clear that we must make it possible to have a safe passage through this beautiful property. The new bridge will provide safe crossing over the East Beach Boulevard and serve as an entrance for the neighbors in Orange Beach and Gulf Shores.”

Ivey said the environmentally sensitive aspects of the buildings and facilities at Gulf State Park set an example for sustainable tourism throughout the world.

Bill Bennett of Valor Hospitality, which is under contract to operate the new additions at Gulf State Park, said the sustainable aspects of the projects will generate about five percent

more power and water than what the facilities need to operate. The Interpretive Center has been certified as a Living Building, passing the most rigorous certification process in the world.

“The building is made from materials that are safe for the planet, safe for the people and are all sourced here,” Bennett said. “The Living Building designation is very significant. In January of 2018, there were only 16 Living Buildings in the entire world, and we’re lucky to have one here on the Gulf Coast of Alabama.”

Matt Leavell, a member of the Gulf State Park Project Development Team at the University of Alabama, said the team faced two hurdles in designing the Interpretive Center, which will include an open-air porch with interpretive exhibits that outline the nine different ecologies present at the park, a multi-use room for education and community events, restroom facilities, bike parking and amphitheater seating. At ground level, visitors can enjoy a water play exhibit and sky-viewing benches.

“The challenge was how do you make this international benchmark (Living Building) and introduce people to everything, not just the beaches,” Leavell said. “Those two challenges caused us to minimize the footprint. We set the building back as far as we could. We worked with a team of scientists to determine how these dunes move and want to grow. Then we created this multi-use space where the community can come and hold events, and we can show them how they can build in the coastal

environment. They also get to learn about the park through the interpretive exhibits. The entire park is meant to be educational. That’s part of the park’s mission statement.

“The Interpretive Center is a gateway to the entire Park, physically with the bridge and then educationally with the interpretive displays and activities.”

The facilities will also fill a need on the Alabama Gulf Coast that has gone unfulfilled for the past 14 years.

“More than 20 years ago, Mercedes was a game-changer for the auto manufacturing industry in Alabama,” Gov. Ivey said. “These enhancements we’re looking at today to Alabama’s Gulf will be a game-changer for tourism in our state. With Gulf State Park, we’ll keep conferences here in Alabama. Folks won’t have to go to Florida or elsewhere. They’ll stay right here in Alabama. This facility is going to attract

visitors from around the world.”

Gov. Ivey said she joined Lee Sentell, Alabama’s Tourism Director, earlier in the week to talk about the good news in the Alabama tourism industry, which grew by seven percent in 2017. Gov. Ivey said for the first time, Alabama had more than 26 million visitors, an increase of 810,000 over 2016. That translated into an economic boost of \$1 billion for a total economic impact from tourism of \$14.3 billion. That economic expansion included 7,000 new jobs in the travel industry, which now employs 187,000 in Alabama.

“With these improvements, Gulf State Park will truly be a world-class facility and the crown jewel of Alabama’s tourism,” Gov. Ivey said. “I’m proud to lead a state that has so much to offer our visitors. People from around the world want to experience what we have here in Sweet Home Alabama.”

“This award is overshadowed by the sadness that occurred that day,” Cole said. “That day was chaotic, and I was just glad to provide news to a scared community. It’s always nice when work you’re proud of is acknowledged, but I’m more proud to continue to serve these communi-

ties and to be a journalist.” Features Editor Allison Marlow won second place in the Best News Photo category for her “Walk to School Day” photo printed in The Courier. “I was in the right place at the right time, and happened to get a great photo,” Marlow said. “It’s just part of the encompassing coverage we try to bring to communities across the

county.” Managing Editor Cliff McCollum won four first place awards this year, including two wins in categories he won last year — Best News Feature Story and Best Humorous Column. McCollum won first place in Best News Feature Story this year for his coverage of former Elberta Police Chief Stan DeVane’s horseback riding accident that cut

short his career. He won Best Humorous Column for his “Call center crazies” column about odd calls in to 911 centers. McCollum also won first place in two categories in which he had previously won awards. He won Best Editorial Column or Commentary for “Alabama can be better,” written about Alabama’s recent Senate race; he previously won that category in 2013.

He also won for Best In-Depth News Coverage for his series of stories on the alleged assault on Fairhope’s former HR director by Fairhope Mayor Karin Wilson. McCollum previously won the category in 2016. McCollum said he was truly humbled by the wins. “All of our team members hope to provide the communities we cover with the best news and

information we can find,” McCollum said. “While we don’t do this for the awards, it’s certainly nice to be recognized by our peers and colleagues for the work that we do.” The Virginia Press Association served as judges for this year’s competition. Further awards will be announced at the Alabama Press Association convention in July in Orange Beach.

become a second grade teacher. He then became a sixth grade teacher while working on his doctorate at Southern Miss. He served as the vice principal and then principal in Mobile County for 10 years, before getting the chance to move to Foley Elementary School in 1997. “I’ve been an elementary principal for 31 years, and that’s half my life,” said Lawrence. “That’s all I’ve ever wanted to be.” Lawrence was given his first opportunity as assistant principal by J. Larry Newton, who years later was the one who brought him to Baldwin County. “People started talking about the freedom that administrators were given by Mr. Newton, so several principals from Mobile moved over here in the time between ’95 and ’98,” said Lawrence. “As principal of Foley Elementary, I wanted to move into the Foley community. I think it’s important that if you’re going to be a leader in

a school, you need to live in the community in which you’re leading, get to know the families. There’s strength in being able to know the people that are in your school and be able to have that relationship.” Lawrence cherishes being able to see the students not only inside the school, but outside as well. “It’s neat to be in Walmart or a restaurant or a store and kids come running up to you to give you hugs,” said Lawrence. “Or parents seeing you and wanting to talk to you. This makes for stronger relationships, and then as a result, for a stronger school.” With this kind of parent/teacher and student/teacher relationship, Lawrence states it gives the opportunity to contact parents if there’s a problem with the student and work through the problems in the best way for the child. It also leads to community-based trust and the desire to come together. “Anytime we’ve ever had a need, people in Foley have stepped up to help,” Lawrence said.

“Whether we’re finding clothing for children in need, or food, or helping to find a place for people to stay, or backpacks, whatever, folks just get the word out there, and that’s the way it’s been all these years.” During his time at Foley Elementary, Lawrence cites growth and diversity in the school as the biggest changes. When he began, he states the Hispanic population in the school was extremely low, but now he’s retiring with 350 Hispanic students enrolled. “Three weeks ago, we had the scholarship program at Foley High School,” said Lawrence. “There were three children that we gave scholarships to who are going to universities, who when they came here in kindergarten didn’t speak one word of English, and yet have went through school, learned English, and thrived and began taking AP classes. I think we as Foley Elementary, Intermediate, Middle, and High Schools have done a good job, not just with the Hispanic population, but with all the children.

If students are willing to learn, then we’re willing to teach. We’re going to give them a good start so they can have that good finish.” Lawrence firmly believes in giving each student the best start possible and cites both his education and his faith background as inspirations behind his teaching philosophy. Originally going to college to become a minister of music, he realized that his true calling was in education. “The reality is I have been able to minister more being the principal of a school than I ever could working at a church,” said Lawrence. “In school you see immediate need, and you have access to immediate solutions to those needs.” For the past 21 years and backed by the faculty, Foley Elementary has helped with feeding the children in the community and finding them clothes, going so far as to help families who were not able to pay their utility bill get reconnected. They have even helped those who come to town with nowhere to live find permanent residency, working with social services to make sure every child and their family is taken care of. The school has created many programs to reach

that end, from the Turkey Take-Out Program, the Christmas Take-Out Program, and the secret meals program that the school helped to start with a local Alabama Credit Union, which provides meals for less-than-fortunate children on the weekends and during summer. “My philosophy in education is you can’t teach them unless you love them,” Lawrence said. “You really can’t, you can’t teach a child who’s hungry, or who hasn’t slept, there’s no way. You have to take care of those basic needs first, and one of those basic needs is love ... When you walk down the hallways here on any given day, somebody’s going to come out of line and hug you, and so we developed the culture here that that’s cool, that’s good. I can’t be responsible for what happens whenever they leave, but I know for the years that they’re here, our children do love one another. We don’t see race and we don’t see differences in economics or anything, and I think we truly are living the dream that Dr. King had ... While here, we’re playing and learning and loving each other. While they’re here, this is a really neat place to be.” As hard as it is to

leave, Lawrence feels it is time to retire for multiple reasons, the first being family. His daughter will have her first child this year and lives in North Alabama, where she is doing graduate school. Lawrence stated he wants to be there to help her out during her maternity leave while his son-in-law is at work. The second reason for his retirement is the feeling that it’s just time. “I’ve been doing the same thing for 31 years, and this last year was really hard physically, emotionally, and spiritually,” Lawrence said. “There’s been a lot of changes, and you just know when it’s time for someone else to take it over. I’ve taken it this far, now someone needs to take it on in.” The third reason is because Lawrence is ready to do something different, no matter what that may be. “I don’t want to make work, I don’t want to be finding something to do each day, I need to find a purpose for each day, and that’s what I’m going to be looking for,” Lawrence said. Teaching until the end, Lawrence made one last impression on the lives of the students before the school year ended, speaking with them all in turns about three traits he finds important in life: courage, truth, and the value or hard work.

“If you do those things- if you’re always truthful, if you have courage to step out, and you work hard- there’s very little that you can’t accomplish,” said Lawrence. “Our children have been and will continue to be successful by finding something that they want to do in life because they love it, because they’re passionate about it, and then doing the very best that they can while doing that. Whether they love being a plumber or an electrician or a carpenter or working at a store or being a doctor or a lawyer: find something you love and do it. Not for the money, not for the fame, but because you love it, and you’ll have a good life. We give the kids a good beginning, and now they need to finish it.”

“...as it is in Heaven.”

What is heaven like? This is an extremely important question because it ultimately has to do with the whole point of existence. It deals with the question of where all this (history, the universe, and our place within it) is heading. And it deals with the biggest and most obvious barrier to the question of ultimate purpose: all of us (likely) will die before “this world” reaches its conclusion. Is there something beyond our death and “this world”?, if so—what?, and how should our answers to the first two questions affect how we live now? Christians believe there is more to come. We believe that the proof of this rests in the resurrection of Christ from the dead, which reveals the end of all things ahead of time. The resurrection of Jesus also tells us something about the New Creation, when heaven and earth come together. Because Jesus rises bodily, the goodness and “next-worldliness” of God’s good creation is affirmed, and it will be carried forward. So, in a real sense, “heaven” will be like earth—minus sin, evil, death, sickness, brokenness, unquenchable longing, etc. Far from an interminable worship service where we all float on fluffy clouds, dressed in choir robes strumming harps and singing forever and ever and ever, heaven will be life, real, full, exponentially more vivid, relational, creative, true, good, and beautiful than our present shadowy existence. It will be lived in the world

God intended all along, complete and crowned by us with Him as our King. It will certainly be worship but a living, working, playing, talking, learning, doing, being, sharing, singing kind of worship. How does this affect the present? For those who are in Christ, we live as though the coming together of heaven and earth has already happened. As citizens of the world to come, alive in a new way because of the Spirit, we live, work, play, talk, learn, do, be, share, sing “on earth as it is in heaven.” Certainly, we do all this imperfectly, and we do it in constant conflict with the old world and its value system and power structures that are passing away. In the past, there has been a fear of “being so heavenly-minded, we’re no earthly good,” but the truth is, only when heaven becomes our living reality, can we be any good at all to this world.

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City moving forward with park improvement plans

ROBERTSDALE — Officials in Robertsdale are moving forward with plans to make improvements to Honeybee Park. Architects with Adams Stewart in Robertsdale presented conceptual design drawings at the council’s Friday, May 18 meeting for a pavilion to be located in Honeybee Park. Part of the plans for the pavilion will be to close off a portion of Michigan Street east of the park, officials said. Officials hope to let the project out for bids by the end of June with the goal of having the first phase of the Honeybee Park improvements completed by Nov. 1 in time for Christmas festivities, which begin the first Saturday in December. Park improvements also call for the addition of sidewalks, landscap-

ing, additional parking, restroom facilities, and an increase in booth space for the annual Honeybee Festival which is held every year in October. Plans are also underway for the removal and relocation of the city’s Utilities Barn. The area will be used for an amphitheater which will feature local entertainment, with additional parking and restroom facilities surrounding the structure. The full project is scheduled for completion in time for the city’s Bicentennial Celebration, which is slated for 2021. In other business May 18, the council approved a pair of ordinances to rezoning property from RGP to PUD and another from I-1 to B-2. The council suspended the rules by roll-call vote before adopting ordinance No. 002-18 to rezone property from RGP

to PUD along County Road 71 north of County Road 48 North. One adjacent property owner, Rowell Koptis, spoke during the public hearing, asking the council for the definition of a PUD and stating that the development could cause problems with drainage. “That property was divided along the railroad tracks so that property to the east of the track drains east and property to the west of the track drains west,” he said. “I just want to make sure this development does not affect that.” City Engineer Greg Smith said he did not think the development would hinder drainage on the property but city officials would certainly be willing to look into any drainage issues before proceeding with the development. PUD stands for Planned Unit Devel-

opment, said Mayor Charles Murphy, which affects setbacks and density in specialized developments. “With the added greenspace in the property, I’m pretty sure they are actually reducing the number of lots,” Murphy said, “which in my mind would make a positive impact on drainage rather than a negative one.” The council also voted by roll call to suspend the rules and adopt ordinance No. 003-18 rezoning the city’s Daycare Property from I-1 to B-2. Speaking on behalf of the city, Smith said the rezoning was to correct an issue with zoning on the property, which was originally home to the Vanity Fair Mills sewing factory. “It was brought up during the audit process that the property was zoned incorrectly for a daycare,” Smith said,

“and on further research we discovered that to be the case and steps are being made to correct it.” Also on May 18, the council:

- Approved the surplus of three trucks in the Public Works Department.
- Approved the use of two of the city’s dates for the Baldwin County Coliseum for a pair of Robertsdale High School Alumni Association fundraisers.
- Discussed annexation but took no action Key Trust Property.
- Approved a request to renew the city’s contract with Revenue Discovery Systems (RDS). CFO Ann Simpson said during a one-year contract period RDS discovered 253 businesses that did not have a business license and recovered \$55,442.60 which was

split 60-40 resulting in gross revenue for the city of \$33,365.56. Of those businesses operating without a license, 236 were out-of-state. Only five of the remaining businesses were located in Baldwin County, one in Robertsdale. The council voted to renew the contract with RDS for three years under the same terms with the city collecting 60 percent of all revenue collected by RDS.

- Approved write-offs in the amount of \$49,004.99. The city budgets \$50,000 in write-offs each year, Simpson said and is already working on \$50,000 in write-offs for next year.
- Granted a real estate commission to be awarded for the Diamond Foods Property if the property is sold under contract.

Burgers & Bingo big success in Bay Minette

BAY MINETTE — The City of Bay Minette sponsored its second Burgers & Bingo on the Square on April 19, featuring food, fellowship and fun. The free Bingo games, sponsored by the city, included prizes donated by area business

and individuals. The city partnered with local non-profit organizations to offer food and children’s activities for attendees. Food vendors included The Young Professionals of the North Baldwin Chamber of Commerce,

Heritage Junior Women’s Club and the Baldwin County High School Band Boosters. The children’s games were supervised by Chosen Youth Outreach. The Chamber was also on hand to provide special giveaways do-

nated by its membership and Broadband also set up a booth for giveaways. The Bay Minette Police and Fire Departments were on scene as well. The city plans to hold another Burgers & Bingo this summer.

Baldwin County awarded Federal funds made available through Department of Homeland Security

Baldwin County has been chosen to receive \$4,683 to supplement emergency food and shelter programs in the county. The selection was made by a National Board that is chaired by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security’s Federal Emergency Management Agency and consists of representatives from American Red Cross; Catholic Charities, USA; Na-

tional Council of the Churches of Christ in the USA; The Jewish Federations of North America; The Salvation Army; and, United Way Worldwide. The Local Board was charged to distribute funds appropriated by Congress to help expand the capacity of food and shelter programs in high-need areas around the country. A Local Board made

up of representation for the public sector, representation for private organizations, and a representative for the homeless will determine how the funds awarded to Baldwin County are to be distributed among the emergency food and shelter programs run by local service organizations in the area. The Local Board is responsible for recommend-

ing agencies to receive these funds and any additional funds made available under this phase of the program. Under the terms of the grant from the National Board, local agencies chosen to receive funds must: 1) be a private voluntary non-profit or unit of government, 2) be eligible to receive Federal funds, 3) have an accounting system, 4)

practice nondiscrimination, 5) have demonstrated the capability to deliver emergency food and/or shelter programs, and 6) if they are a private voluntary organization, have a voluntary board. Qualifying agencies are urged to apply. Public or private voluntary agencies interested in applying for Emergency Food and Shelter Program

funds must contact Lana Mummah at United Way of Baldwin County, P.O. Box 244, Foley, AL 36536, 251-943-2110 for an application. The deadline for applications to be received is Wednesday, June 13. Community Action Agency of South Alabama is an equal opportunity employer and administers the emergency, food and shelter funds.

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Ten cancer symptoms you might overlook

According to the American Cancer Society, nearly 1 out of 3 people in the United States will have cancer during their lifetimes. With a number that staggering, it's difficult not to wonder whether you or a loved one will be affected by the disease in some way. However, before jumping to conclusions, it's important to remember that not all subtle or common symptoms are a sign of something malignant. Many, in fact, are caused by less serious conditions. When cancer is the

culprit, though, it is key to spot the signs and seek treatment as early as possible, when the disease has more treatment options and better outcomes.

Most of us are aware of common, high-risk lifestyle choices that increase your risk of certain cancers, like using tobacco, poor diet or physical inactivity. While avoiding these risk factors is important, it's equally critical to pay attention to

indicators from your body that may convey potential health issues. As nonthreatening as they may seem on the surface, you should know that symptoms, when prolonged, could be a signal of a serious health problem. Knowing your body, monitoring your health and taking action when known symptoms last longer than two weeks can make a big difference in spotting cancer in its early stages.

In my experience, 10 key symptoms of cancer people often overlook include:

1. Unexplained weight

- loss
2. Fever of unknown origin
3. Night sweats
4. New or unexplained pain
5. Persistent heartburn
6. Mouth or tongue sores that don't heal
7. Bloating
8. Irregular bowel patterns
9. Unexplained lumps
10. Trouble swallowing

These symptoms are often misidentified because they are not specific to just cancer, and therefore can be attributable to other health issues. For example, someone who suffers

from Irritable Bowel Syndrome and regularly experiences an irregular bowel pattern does not necessarily assume his or her symptoms could be a sign of colorectal cancer. In addition, a common symptom of ovarian cancer is bloating and early satiety but many women may attribute fluid buildup or bloating to normal weight gain. For these reasons, it's important to know what symptoms can signal more than one health issue.

Key Takeaway

If you experience any of these symptoms for

more than two weeks, you should make an appointment with your primary care physician to discuss what you're experiencing. This way, they can help make sense of what your symptoms mean, perhaps properly diagnose your symptoms and continue to monitor for issues, or refer you to a specialist. When it comes to cancer prevention, you are your own best advocate.

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ORDINANCE 18-2009-ORD.

AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT REGULATIONS FOR SMALL CELL TECHNOLOGY FACILITIES IN THE CITY OF FOLEY, ALABAMA

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Foley, Alabama, seeks to facilitate the availability of reliable, personal wireless communication services for its citizens and the public by permitting the placement of Small Cell Technology Facilities and associated structures on or along the Right of Way and on private properties in the City; and

WHEREAS, the installation, expansion, and maintenance of Small Cell Technology Facilities and associated structures on or along the Right of Way and on private properties might have significant impact upon: (1) the aesthetic values and historic character of the City; (2) safe use and passage on or along the Rights of Way by the public; and (3) properties and property values in the City in areas where such structures are placed; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Telecommunications Act of 1996 (the “Act”) and regulations promulgated with respect to the Act by the Federal Communications Commission (“FCC”) authorize local governments to enact reasonable regulations for the placement, expansion, height, and maintenance of Small Cell Technologies Facilities and associated structures; and

WHEREAS, as provided in this ordinance and as permitted by Federal and State Law, the City seeks to mandate, where feasible, the collocation of Small Cell Technology Facilities on existing poles and other Support Structures as opposed to installation of new support structures; and

WHEREAS, the above-noted collocation and other provisions of this ordinance are intended to be consistent with the Act and its associated regulations; and

WHEREAS, the adoption of the regulations, procedures and requirements in this ordinance will permit Applicants and Providers to enhance the provision of personal wireless service and protect the public welfare, health, safety and interests of the City’s citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Foley, Alabama, as follows:

A new Chapter _____, which reads as follows, is hereby adopted and shall be inserted in the Foley Municipal Code:

Chapter _____ - Small Cell Technology Facilities

Section 1 - Definitions - The terms below have the following meanings for purposes of this ordinance:

a. “Abandonment” or “Abandon(s)” means that, following the placement of Small Cell Technologies Facilities (and associated Accessory Equipment) or Support Structures in the City pursuant to a permit issued to a Provider or an Applicant, any of the following has occurred:

(a) for any reason, excluding disasters or declared emergencies, the Facilities cease to be used to transmit signals, data or messages or otherwise be used for their intended purposes for a continuous period of ninety (90) days;

(b) the City revokes the permit for placement and use of those Facilities due to nonpayment of applicable fees, the failure of the Provider or Applicant to comply with conditions in the permit or in this ordinance concerning them, or other valid reason; or

(c) the Provider or Applicant fails to perform any of its responsibilities, obligations and requirements in this ordinance or in a permit that relate to the installation, construction, maintenance, use or operation of the Facilities, Accessory Equipment or Support Structures, and that breach remains uncured for a continuous period of sixty (60) days after the City provides written notice of the breach to the Provider or Applicant.

b. “Accessory Equipment” means any equipment other than an antenna that is used in conjunction with Small Cell Technology Facility arrangements. This equipment may be attached to or detached from a Small Cell Technology Wireless Support Structure, and includes, but, is not limited to, cabinets, optical converters, power amplifiers, radios, DWDM and CWDM multiplexers, microcells, radio units, fiber optic and coaxial cables, wires, meters, pedestals, power switches, and related equipment on or in the immediate vicinity of a Support Structure.

c. “Antenna” means communications equipment that transmits and receives electromagnetic radio signals, is attached to a Small Cell Technology Wireless Support Structure and is used to communicate wireless service.

d. “Applicant”, whether singular or plural, means a personal wireless service provider, an entity that is authorized by a personal wireless service provider to apply for or receive a permit to install, construct, modify or maintain a Small Cell Technology Facility and related Accessory Equipment or Support Structure in the City, or an entity certificated by the Alabama Public Service Commission to provide telecommunication service.

e. “Application” means a formal request submitted to the City for a permit to install construct, or modify a Small Cell Technology Facility and related Accessory Equipment or Support Structure.

f. “Approving Authority” means the individual employed by the City and tasked with approving applications submitted to the City pursuant to this Chapter.

g. “City” means the City of Foley, Alabama including, but not limited to, the Board of Adjustments and Appeals for the City, the Zoning Board for the City. For the purposes of this Ordinance, the definition of “City” does not include the Utilities Board (Riviera Utilities).

h. “City Council” means the City Council of the City of Foley, Alabama.

i. “Collocation” means the placement or installation of a new Small Cell Wireless Technology Facility or related Accessory Equipment on an existing pole or other Support Structure that is owned, controlled or leased by a utility, the City, or other person or entity.

j. “Personal Wireless Service Provider” or “Provider” means an entity that provides personal wireless communication services to the public or citizens of the City on a commercial basis and is authorized by the FCC to provide those services.

k. “Private Property” means real property located in the City that does not lie within the Right Of Way.

l. “Right of Way”, whether singular or plural, means the surface and space in, upon, above, along, across, over and below any public streets, avenues, highways, roads, courts, lanes, alleys, boulevards, ways, sidewalks, and bicycle lanes, as the same now or may hereafter exist, that are within the City’s corporate boundaries and under the jurisdiction of the City. This term shall not include county, state or federal rights of way or any property owned by any person or entity other than the City.

m. “Small Cell Technology Facility” or “Facilities”, whether singular or plural, means and includes the following types of structures: (a) antenna; and (b) associated Accessory Equipment.

n. “Small Cell Technology Wireless Support Structure” or “Support Structure”, whether singular or plural, means a freestanding structure designed or used to support, or capable of supporting, Small Cell Technology Facilities, including, but not limited to, utility poles, street light poles, traffic signal structures, rooftops, attics, or other enclosed or open areas of a building or accessory structure, a sign, or a flag pole, located solely in the Right of Way and owned by the City or with the written permission of the support structure owner. These terms do not include the City’s decorative and architecturally significant street light poles as those decorative lights are inappropriate for use as a Support Structure and further do not include any structure located in the Right of Way and owned by an entity other than the City without the written permission of the owner of the structure.

o. “Stealth Technology” means a method(s) of concealing or minimizing the visual impact of a Small Cell Technology Facility (and associated Accessory Equipment) and Support Structure by incorporating features or design elements which either totally or partially conceal such Facilities or equipment. The use of these design elements is intended to produce the result of having said Facilities and associated structures blend into the surrounding environment and/or disguise, shield, hide or create the appearance that the Facilities are an architectural component of the support structure.

Section 2 - Permit Required to Place Small Cell Technology Facilities in Right-of-Way –

a. A Provider or Applicant must obtain a permit from the City before placing, installing, or constructing any Small Cell Technology Facility (and associated Accessory Equipment) on any Support Structure that is located on the Right of Way, or substantially modifying the position or characteristics of any such existing Facility thereon.

b. The Approving Authority will review and administratively process any request for a permit to determine whether, in the exercise of the Approving Authority’s reasonable discretion, it should be issued for the location and in the manner requested by the Applicant. In this process, the burden is on the Provider or Applicant to demonstrate that the placement of the proposed Small Cell Technology Facility and associated Accessory Equipment or Support Structure on the Right of Way is the minimal physical installation which will achieve the goal of enhancing the provision of personal wireless services when considering all pertinent factors discussed in the provision immediately below. Except as set forth in this section, this permitting process will be administrative and not require public hearings or the approval of any City Council or City employee other than the Approving Authority.

c. The factors, requirements and guidelines that the Approving Authority may consider and will apply when determining whether to issue a permit for placement of new Support Structures or Facilities and associated structures on the Right of Way include, but are not limited to, the following:

- i. the demonstrated need for placing the structures at the requested location and geographic area in order to deliver or enhance personal wireless service;
- ii. the visual impact of placing the Support Structures or Facilities in the subject area;
- iii. the character of the area in which the structures are requested, including surrounding buildings, properties and uses;

<div><div><div><div><div>iv.</div><div>whether the appearance and placement of the requested structures is aesthetically consistent with the immediate area;</div></div><div><div>v.</div><div>whether the structures are consistent with the historic nature and characteristics of the requested location;</div></div><div><div>vi.</div><div>the Applicant’s or Provider’s network coverage objective and whether the Applicant or Provider should use available or previously unconsidered alternative locations to place the Support Structures or Facilities;</div></div><div><div>vii.</div><div>whether the proposed installation could cause harm to the public or pose any undue risk to public safety;</div></div><div><div>viii.</div><div>whether the proposed installation may interfere with vehicular traffic, sight distance, passage of pedestrians, or other use of the Right of Way by the public; and</div></div><div><div>ix.</div><div>if the proposed installation will disturb conditions on the Right of Way, whether the Applicant can demonstrate its ability and financial resources to restore the subject area to its pre-existing condition following installation.</div></div></div><div><div>d.</div><div>To the extent practical, all Facilities and associated Accessory Equipment that are placed in the City shall be attached to a pre-existing Support Structure that is owned, controlled or leased by a utility, franchisee, the City or other entity. However, nothing in this Ordinance shall be interpreted to permit the Applicant to locate a Facility or Accessory Equipment on structures owned by entities other than the City without the permission of said owner of the structure. If the Applicant demonstrates that no Colocation opportunities exist in the area where a technologically documented need for a facility exists, the Applicant may request that a new pole or other Support Structure be installed in that area for purposes of constructing the Facilities. Before any new Support Structure is permitted, each of the following must occur:</div></div><div><div>i.</div><div>the Applicant must have provided the City written evidence that no practical Colocation opportunity exists. This evidence shall include, but not be limited to, affidavits, correspondence, or other written information that demonstrates that the Applicant has taken all commercially reasonable actions to achieve colocation in the requested location or area, that the Applicant has pursued but been denied access to all potential collocation sites in the subject area (and the reasons for any such denial(s)), and otherwise show that the Applicant is unable to Collocate on an existing Support Structure;</div></div><div><div>ii.</div><div>the Approving Authority must recommend the placement of a new Support Structure in the Right of Way.</div></div><div><div>e.</div><div>If a Facility is attached to a utility pole or other Support Structure in the Right of Way, no antenna or other part of the Facility shall extend more than five (5) feet above the height of that structure; provided that, in the event that the Applicant demonstrates that National Electric Safety Code regulations or other factors create an undue hardship in complying with this height requirement, the Approving Authority may permit a facility to extend up to ten (10) feet above the height of such Support Structure. The Approving Authority may grant a variance or waiver for good cause shown.</div></div><div><div>f.</div><div>The Accessory Equipment shall, if reasonably possible, be placed at least 10 feet above the ground. The color of the Antenna and Accessory Equipment shall be compatible with that of the Support Structure. The Facility (including the Accessory Equipment) shall not be illuminated.</div></div></div></div>	
<div><div><div><div><div>Section 3 - Application Process</div></div><div><div>a.</div><div>At a minimum, each application for a permit shall contain all of the following:</div></div><div><div>i.</div><div>engineering drawings and photo-sims depicting the type of Facilities, Support Structure, and means and points at which such Facilities and associated Accessory Equipment will be attached to a Support Structure for each individual Facility;</div></div><div><div>ii.</div><div>details of the antenna and radio makes and models as well as frequencies used and the weights of each piece of equipment.</div></div><div><div>ii.</div><div>map(s) designating with specificity the location(s) of the requested Facilities;</div></div><div><div>iii.</div><div>the geographic coordinates of all antenna and other proposed Facilities;</div></div><div><div>iv.</div><div>if the Facilities will be located on a Support Structure on the Right of Way that is owned by any entity other than the City or the Applicant, a copy of any license, lease, agreement or other documentation evidencing that the owner of that Support Structure authorizes the Facilities to be attached thereto or agrees in principle to authorize that attachment; provided that, if a representation is made to the City that the attachment has been authorized in principle by the owner of the Support Structure but the Applicant subsequently fails to furnish the City documentation that finalizes any such agreement, the City may refuse to issue the requested</div></div></div></div></div>	
<div><div><div><div><div>permit until that documentation is provided, or, if the City issues the requested permit before receiving such final documentation, the subject permit may be revoked and any license to use that part of the Right of Way be rescinded;</div></div><div><div>v.</div><div>if the Applicant requests permission to place Facilities on a new Support Structure, the substantiation therefor required by Section 2(d) in this Ordinance;</div></div><div><div>b.</div><div>Each proposed Facility must conform to the following minimum standards:</div></div><div><div>i.</div><div>any cables must be covered by a metal U-Guard painted to match the Support Structure. No exposed cables of any kind are permitted;</div></div><div><div>ii.</div><div>no service loops;</div></div><div><div>iii.</div><div>minimal coax jumpers;</div></div><div><div>iv.</div><div>any service boxes must be accessible from the side of the Facility facing away from any public streets;</div></div><div><div>v.</div><div>for Facilities to be attached to a new Support Structure, any antennas for the Facility may only extend to a maximum point that is 35 feet above ground level;</div></div><div><div>vi.</div><div>for Facilities to be attached to an existing Support Structure, any antennas for the Facility may extend to a maximum point that is 10 feet above the height of the Support Structure to which the Facility is to be affixed;</div></div><div><div>vii.</div><div>must conform generally to the aesthetics and standards of the City.</div></div></div><div><div>The approval or disapproval of any application for a permit for a Facility shall, at all times, be at the sole discretion of the Approving Authority. The Approving Authority shall have the right to disapprove any application for a permit for a Facility that, in its sole discretion, does not conform to the requirements of this Ordinance, or to the requirements of any other Ordinance of the City.</div></div><div><div>c.</div><div>An application shall not be deemed complete until the Applicant has submitted all documents, information, forms and fees specifically enumerated in this Ordinance that pertain to the location, construction, or configuration of the Facilities or Support Structures at the requested location(s).</div></div><div><div>d.</div><div>Within thirty (30) calendar days after an application for permit is submitted, the City shall notify the Applicant in writing, clearly and specifically delineating all missing documents or information, if any additional information is needed to complete that application or supplemental information is required to process the request. Upon supplemental submission, the City shall have ten (10) days to identify in writing anything missing from initial notice. Second or subsequent notices of incomplete information may not specify missing documents or information that were not delineated in the original notice. If the City does not notify the applicant in writing that the application is incomplete within thirty (30) days following its receipt, the application is deemed complete.</div></div><div><div>e.</div><div>Unless another date is specified in a written agreement between the City and the Applicant, the City will have the following time periods to make its final decision to approve or disapprove an application for a permit contemplated in this ordinance and advise the Applicant in writing of that determination:</div></div><div><div>i.</div><div>sixty (60) calendar days from the date an application for a permit is filed with respect to a request to Collocate Facilities on an existing Support Structure; and</div></div><div><div>ii.</div><div>ninety (90) calendar days from the date an application for a permit is filed with respect to a request to attach Facilities to a new Support Structure.</div></div><div><div>f.</div><div>To the extent additional information is required to complete the Application after it is filed, the applicable calendar day review period set forth in Section 3(d) shall be tolled and not continue to run until the Applicant has provided any missing or requested supplemental information; provided that tolling shall not occur if the City does not advise the Applicant in writing of the incompleteness of a submitted application within thirty (30) days after that submission.</div></div><div><div>g.</div><div>An Applicant may, at the Applicant’s discretion, file a consolidated Application and receive a single permit for up to twenty (20) Facilities, provided that all such Facilities are located in the same Zoning classification.</div></div></div></div>	
<div><div><div><div><div>Section 4 - Reconsideration/Appeal</div></div><div><div>a.</div><div>Any Applicant that desires reconsideration of an administrative decision by the Approving Authority to deny a request for a permit to place a Facility or Support Structure on the Right of Way may seek review, modification or reversal of that decision by the City Council by submitting a request for reconsideration with the City Clerk within twenty-one (21) calendar days following the Approving Authority’s decision. That request for reconsideration will be considered by the City Council at a regular Council meeting that will be conducted as soon as practical after the request for reconsideration is made. If no request for reconsideration is submitted, the decision of the Approving Authority will be final.</div></div><div><div>b.</div><div>Additionally, the Applicant, within thirty (30) days following a</div></div></div></div></div>	

decision by the City Council to either (i) deny a request for reconsideration or (ii) to not approve the placement of a new Support Structure on the Right of Way, may appeal either of those decisions by the City Council to the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama or other court with jurisdiction. If no appeal of those decisions of the City Council is made, those will be deemed final.

Section 5 - Additional Requirements - Any Provider or Applicant to whom a permit is issued and that places Facilities and associated Support Structures on the Right of Way also shall comply with the following requirements as long as those Facilities and Support Structures are on or under the Right of Way:

a. Prior to installing the Facilities or Support Structures, the Applicant shall provide the City a certificate(s) of insurance evidencing that it has obtained and will maintain the following types of insurance in connection with its operations on or use of the Right of Way: (1) General Liability coverage insuring the risk of claims for damages to persons or property arising from or related to the installation, construction, maintenance, operation or any use of Facility or Support Structure placed on or along the Right of Way by the Applicant (or any of their contractors) with limits of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence and in the aggregate; and (2) Workers Compensation Insurance as required by Alabama state law. The General Liability coverage shall list the City as an additional insured, and may be provided through a combination of a primary and umbrella policies. All insurance policies shall be furnished by insurers rated at least A-VII by AM Best and eligible to transact business in the State of Alabama. On an annual basis following initial installation, the Applicant also shall furnish the City a Certificate indicating that the above-noted coverage remains and will remain in effect. Alternatively, an Applicant with a net worth of at least two hundred fifty million dollars (\$250,000,000.00), may self-insure any or all of the insurance required in this provision under the same terms and conditions as specified herein.

b. All Facilities and associated Support Structures shall be installed, erected, maintained and operated in compliance with applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations, including, but not limited to, regulations of the FCC.

c. Following the installation of any Facilities and associated Support Structures, the Provider or Applicant, upon reasonable request and for good cause, shall furnish the Approving Authority a written certification from a licensed professional engineer in the State of Alabama stating that those structures have been inspected and are being maintained, operated and used in compliance with all applicable laws and regulations, including those of the FCC that pertain to the transmission of wireless communication signals. For purposes of this provision, “good cause” shall mean circumstances have arisen that indicate the Facilities and associated Support Structures have been damaged, are not functioning in compliance with applicable laws and regulations, or otherwise pose a hazard to the public. If those Support Structures should fail at any time to comply with applicable laws and regulations, the Provider or Applicant, at either of their expense, shall begin to cause those structures to be brought into compliance with said laws and regulations within fifteen (15) days of the date of any written notice to them from the Approving Authority of non-compliance, or cease all personal wireless service operations related to those structures until the Applicant or Provider comes into full compliance with said laws and regulations.

d. The Facilities and associated Support Structures must at all times be maintained in good and safe condition. Not more often than every five (5) years, the Approving Authority may request that the Provider or Applicant, at either of their expense, furnish certification from an engineer that the Facilities and Support Structures are in sound condition. Should that engineer deem those structures unsound, the Provider or Applicant shall furnish to the Approving Authority a plan to remedy any unsafe conditions or structural defect(s) and take that remedial action at the Provider or Applicant's expense, as directed by the Approving Authority.

e. Each Applicant or Provider that applies for a permit to place Facilities (including the Accessory Equipment) and Support Structures on the Right of Way and installs and utilizes those structures shall defend, indemnify and hold the City and its employees or officials, harmless from all demands, losses, expenses (including attorney's fees and court costs), claims for personal injury or property damage, judgments or liabilities of any type that may be asserted or claimed against the City (or its employees or officials) by any third person, firm or entity that arise out of or relate in any manner to the following: (1) the installation, construction, maintenance, use or operation of the permitted Facilities, Accessory Equipment or any Support Structure on or about the Right of Way; and (2) the failure of the Provider or Applicant to perform any of their respective responsibilities, obligations and permit requirements in this ordinance. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Provider or Applicant shall not be obligated to indemnify the City for City claims resulting from the sole negligence or willful acts of the City (or its representatives).

Section 6 - Permit and License Fees - The Applicant for a permit to place Facilities and associated Support Structures on the Right of Way shall pay the following fees:

- a. a permit application and review fee of \$200.00 to be paid when an application is submitted;
- b. a permit issuance fee of \$100.00 per each Support Structure on the Right of Way contemplated for attachment; and
- c. an annual license fee of \$500.00 per each Support Structure on the Right of Way pertaining to the ongoing use of public property.

Section 7 - Franchise Agreements for Other Uses of Right of Way - This Section ____ regulates the placement of Small Cell Technology Facilities (and associated Accessory Equipment) on or in the immediate vicinity of Support Structures that are located or proposed to be located on or along the Right of Way. No provi-

sion in this Section ____ or elsewhere in this Ordinance is intended to permit, regulate or authorize the placement by a Provider or Applicant of fiber optic lines, coaxial cable, switches, pedestals or networking equipment of any type that is used to transport telecommunication signals, data or messages between Support Structures or between any other points on or along the Right of Way. In the event any such Provider or Applicant desires to place telecommunications equipment or Facilities along the Right of Way at points not regulated by this Ordinance, the City may enter into franchise or similar agreement that authorizes, governs and applies to such use of other locations on or along the Right of Way.

Section 8 - Placement of Small Cell Technology Facilities on Private Property

a. A Provider or Applicant must obtain a permit from the City, and any other commission or agency responsible for regulating the placement of structures on private property (such as the Historical Commission or Board of Adjustments and Appeals) before placing, installing, or constructing any Small Cell Technology Facility (and associated Accessory Equipment) on any Support Structure that is located on private property, or substantially modifying the position or characteristics of any such existing facility thereon.

b. The Approving Authority will review and administratively process any request for a permit to determine whether, in the exercise of the Approving Authority's reasonable discretion, it should be issued for the location and in the manner requested. In this process, the burden is on the Applicant to demonstrate that the placement of the proposed Small Cell Technology Facility and associated Accessory Equipment or Support Structure on private property is the minimal physical installation which will achieve the technological goal of enhancing the provision of personal wireless services. Except as set forth in this section, this permitting process will not require the approval of any City Council or City employee other than the Approving Authority.

c. The factors, guidelines and requirements that the Approving Authority may consider and will apply when determining whether to issue a permit for placement of Facilities and any associated Accessory Equipment or Support Structure on private property include, but are not limited the factors and requirements set forth in Section 2.

d. The guidelines in Section 2 to utilize existing poles and Support Structures for the placement of Facilities and Accessory Equipment are also applicable when considering whether to permit the installation of those Facilities and Support Structures on private property, provided that City Council approval is not required before a permit is issued to place a new pole or other Support Structure on private property if that action is appropriate.

e. The Provider or Applicant shall use Stealth Technology when installing the Facilities and associated Accessory Equipment on any building or accessory to that building that is located on private property. Further, Stealth Technology should be used when placing Facilities on other types of Support Structures on private property unless the Applicant can reasonably demonstrate that, given the nature of the requested application, the use of such Technology is (a) unnecessary; or (b) impractical.

f. If Facilities are placed on an existing or new building or accessory to that building, the following dimensional regulations shall apply:

- i. Facade-mounted antennas shall not extend above the face of any wall or exterior surface of the building.
- ii. Roof-mounted antennas and Accessory Equipment may be permitted on buildings in accordance with the following table:

Height of Building	Maximum Height of Facility Above Highest Point of Roof	Required Setback from Edge of Roof of Building
Up to 15 feet	8 feet, including antenna	1 foot for every foot of height of equipment
15-35 feet	10 feet, including antenna	1 foot for every foot of height of equipment
More than 35 feet	12 feet, including antenna	1 foot for every foot of height of equipment

- iii. The antenna component of the Facilities shall be limited to a maximum height of three (3) feet and a maximum width of two (2) feet; provided that authorization to install antenna up to six (6) feet in height may be permitted if a showing of the technological need for such equipment is made and other requirements of this Section are met.

g. Accessory Equipment must be located in an equipment cabinet, equipment room in an existing building or in an unmanned equipment building. If the equipment building is freestanding, it shall conform with respect to building setbacks, size, and location. Further, if an equipment building or cabinet is located in a residential zone, or the nearest adjoining property is in a residential zone, that building or cabinet shall be surrounded by landscaping to provide a screen of the same height as the building or cabinet.

h. Except as provided in subsections (h)(i) and (h)(ii) immediately below, the same application process that is set forth in Section 3 will be utilized when processing any request for a permit to place Facilities or Support Structures on private property, except that:

- i. City Council approval to install a new Support Structure on private property is not a condition for a permit to place Facilities thereon; and

- ii.

if the Facilities are located on private property that is not owned or exclusively used by the Applicant, instead of providing the documentation contemplated in Section 3, the Applicant shall present a license, lease, agreement or other documentation indicating that owner of said property authorizes the Applicant the rights to place the Facilities thereon and access thereto, or that such owner agrees in principle to grant the Applicant those rights; provided that, if a representation is made to the City that the owner of private property has agreed in principle to grant those rights but the Applicant subsequently fails to furnish the City documentation that finalizes any such agreement, the City may refuse to issue the requested permit until that documentation is provided, or, if the City issues the requested permit before receiving such final documentation, the subject permit and license may be revoked.
- i.

All Facilities and Support Structures shall be installed, erected, and maintained in compliance with applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations, including, but not limited to, regulations of the FCC. At least triennially following the installation of the Facilities or associated Support Structures, upon reasonable request and for good cause, the applicant shall furnish the Approving Authority a written certification from a professional engineer licensed in the State of Alabama indicating that those structures have been inspected and are being maintained, operated and used in compliance with all applicable laws and regulations, including those of the FCC that pertain to the transmission of wireless communication signals. For purposes of this provision, “good cause” shall mean circumstances have arisen that indicate the Facilities and associated Support Structures have been damaged, are not functioning in compliance with applicable laws and regulations, or otherwise pose a hazard to the public. If those structures fail at any time to comply with said laws and regulations, the Provider or Applicant shall begin to cause those structures to be brought into compliance with said laws and regulations within fifteen (15) days of the date of any written notice to either of them of such non-compliance, or cease all personal wireless communications operations related to those structures until the Provider or Applicant comes into full compliance with applicable laws and regulations. The Facilities and associated Support Structures on private property must at all times be maintained in good and safe condition.
- j.

Permit and License Fees. The provider or applicant for a permit to place Facilities and associated Support Structures on private property shall pay the following fees:
- i.

a permit application and review fee of \$200.00 to be paid when an application is submitted; and,
- ii.

a permit issuance fee of \$100.00 per each Support Structure on private property contemplated for attachment.

Section 9 - Abandonment of Facilities on Right of Way - If a Provider or Applicant abandons any Facility (including the Accessory Equipment) or an associated Support Structure (collectively “Facilities” for purposes of this Section) that is located on the Right of Way, the following rights and obligations shall exist. The City may require the Provider or Applicant, at their expense, to remove and reclaim the abandoned Facilities within sixty (60) days from the date of written notice of abandonment given by the City to them and to reasonably restore the condition of the property at which the Facilities are located to that existing before they were installed. If the Provider or Applicant fails to remove and reclaim its abandoned Facilities within such 60-day period and the Facilities are located on the Right of Way, the City shall have the rights to (a) remove them and charge its expense of any such removal operation to the account of the Provider or Applicant, (b) purchase all

abandoned Facilities at the subject location from the Provider or Applicant in consideration for \$1.00, (c) at the City’s discretion, either resell the abandoned Facilities to a third party or dispose and salvage them; provided that the proceeds of any resale of abandoned Facilities by the City to a third party shall be credited to the account of the Applicant or Provider that used those Facilities before the abandonment, and (d) charge any expense incurred by the City to restore the Right of Way to the account of the Provider or Applicant.

Section 10 – Collocation - To promote the public interest that is served by collocating Facilities and associated Accessory Equipment on existing Support Structures and thereby mitigating the installation of additional Support Structures throughout the City, no person or entity (including any Provider, Applicant, utility, or franchisee) that utilizes an existing Support Structure that is located on Right of Way or on private property in the City and has space available thereon may deny a Provider or Applicant the right to use or access an existing Support Structure for purposes of attaching Facilities permitted by this ordinance without sound operational, technological or other good reason.

Section 11 - Non-Applicability - The placement of an antenna(s), facilities or equipment related to the following types of wireless communication services are exempt from regulation under this ordinance: (a) amateur radio service that is licensed by the FCC if the facilities related thereto are not used or licensed for any commercial purpose; and (b) facilities used by any federal, state or local government or agency to provide safety or emergency services.

Section 12- Miscellaneous

- a.

All other provisions of the Code of Ordinances shall remain in full force and effect and shall not be affected by this ordinance.
- b.

If any part, provision, or section of this ordinance is declared to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, all other parts, provisions or sections of this ordinance not thereby affected shall remain in full force and effect.
- c.

Nothing in this Ordinance shall be deemed to allow the installation of Facilities in violation of any covenant or other restriction that is the result of the Facility being located in a Historic District within the City. The issuance of a permit under this Ordinance is not a waiver of any requirements that the Facility conform with the covenants or restrictions of any Historic District, and any Facility installed pursuant to the issuance of a permit under this Ordinance must conform to any such requirements.

Section 13 – Effective Date - This ordinance shall become immediately effective upon its adoption by the City Council and approval by the Mayor or as otherwise becoming law.

Perdido Elementary fifth graders visit Alligator Alley

SUMMERDALE — Fifth graders in Jill Jones Craig Cannan’s classes recently visited the famous Baldwin County “Alligator Alley.” This annual trip is one students look forward to from the time they enter kindergarten, as Alligator Alley is one adventure they will never forget. Wes Moore, owner of Alligator Alley, opened the alligator farm in 2004. All the alligators at Alligator Alley are rescued from dangerous places – dangerous to them that is. They transport the animals from unnatural areas to the alligator farm in Summerdale, which is designed to give them a natural environment. The alligators are considered “nuisance animals,” as they have lost their natural fear of humans, which makes them dangerous. Any alligator over 4 feet in length, determined to

be dangerous to humans or their property, must be removed. Students, teachers and parents begin their guided adventure with a walk to the elevated viewing platform, where they saw over 450 alligators from hatchlings to mature adults, relaxing, sunbathing, courting and nesting. After this breathtaking view, they continued their adventure with a nature walk on the elevated boardwalk and see more alligators in their natural habitat along with other natural inhabitants such as; turtles, ospreys, owls and bull frogs only a couple feet away. After the students finished their guided adventure and walking tour along the elevated boardwalk, they had the opportunity to hang out in the “gator station.” This is where everyone’s favorite activity took place; holding a baby alligator – and even take a selfie

with them. The expert staff members were on hand to chat with visitors and answer everything they ever wanted to know about gators. Two of the most amazing facts that students learned were: that celebrity alligator “Crunch,” who is 13 feet, 2 inches long and weighs over 800 pounds, holds the world record for bite strength – 2,982 pounds. This is true pounds, not pounds per square inch. Large alligators can go as long as 18 months with no food! This length of time is rare but not impossible.
