Robertsdale employees among Coca-Cola workers on strike

ROBERTSDALE — About seven employees from Coca-Cola United stood on the side of the road Monday at Alabama 104 and Sanca Lane, in front of the distributing plant in Robertsdale, holding signs that said “On Strike.”

Other signs read “Union People Organizing With Ef-

fective Results (POWER);” and “Human Need, Not Corporate Greed.” Several passing motorists also responded to signs which read “Honk if you support the working class! Striking against unfair labor practices and corporate greed,” which were placed facing both east- and west-bound on Alabama 104.

Estep arrested for manslaughter

Staff REPORT

Debra Kay Estep was arrested on Aug. 14 for one count



Estep

of manslaughter for her involvement in the traffic fatality on Aug. 5 on the Foley Beach Express.

The accident occurred at approximately 10 p.m., when Estep turned into the wrong lane while entering onto the Foley Beach Express from the intersection at County Road 20.

Estep's car collided with an oncoming vehicle, costing the vehicle's passenger, Josie Jones (20) of Orange Beach, her life, as well as the life of her unborn child. Jones was nearing her 30th week of pregnancy.

Jones was flown to Sacred Heart Hospital, where she and her unborn child later died.

“The investigation is still ongoing and

Illegal immigrant camps not coming to Baldwin County

On Tuesday, Congressman Bradley Byrne's office announced that the federal government has no plans to house illegal immigrants at Naval airfields in Silverhill and Josephine.

“Housing illegal immigrants at ill-equipped airfields along the Gulf Coast

was always a terrible idea, so I appreciate the confirmation that this plan is no longer being considered,” Byrne said. “We had a team effort to push back this flawed idea, and I especially want to thank Baldwin County Commissioners Chris Elliott and Tucker Dorsey and Baldwin County Sheriff Hoss Mack for their advocacy on this issue.”

A letter from the Department of Homeland Security said a facility in Texas would be a better fit for the possible housing of the immigrants.

“DOD (Department of Defense) has offered space at Fort Bliss, Texas, which could accommodate approximately 4,000 beds, and also offered two unspecified sites that could accommodate approxi-

mately 4,000 beds at each site,” the letter said. “At this time, ICE does not have plans to acquire additional bed space in Alabama.”

Byrne hosted Mack, Elliott and Dorsey in Washington earlier this year to speak with federal officials about the potential immigrant relocation,

Birmingham-based Coca-Cola United took over a Mobile production facility from Coca-Cola Consolidated in October, according to published reports, along with several sales and distribution territories, including Mobile, Robertsdale, Leroy and Florence, Alabama; Laurel and Ocean

Springs, Mississippi; Bainbridge, Columbus and Sylvester, Georgia; and Panama City, Florida.

A spokesman for Teamsters Local 991 said the current contract with Coca-Cola United expired on July 15 and its members had been working on a three-week extension. The union began its strike, which affects about 275 members, in the early-morning

hours Thursday, Aug. 9.

While the shop steward was not yet on-site at the Robertsdale facility Monday morning, striking workers that were present cited "unfair labor laws" for the walk-off, including lower wages, higher in-

urance, and a proposed wait-period for benefits of up to two to three years for newer employees.

"This is more about the future of our newer employees," said one striking worker on Monday.

Outdoor Conditions Report:The Atlantic hurricane season 2018 got off to a quick start with tropical storm Alberto in the Gulf of Mexico, affecting the Gulf Coast. That was quickly followed by hurricanes Beryl and Chris the first half of July. Now, a quiet period. That may very well continue as we approach the historical peak of the hurricane season in September.

Not that anyone is complaining, but what's causing the lack of tropical activity this year? Two factors: Saharan dust and wind shear.

Dust from wind storms over the Saharan Desert in Africa is lofted a mile or two into the air and travels west across the Atlantic. That dry, dust layer has a limiting impact on tropical weather in the Atlantic. The surge of wind carrying that dust layer also produces wind shear, further reducing the chances a system will form in the tropical Atlantic. We still need to be on guard and prepare for the next threat, but for now we'll enjoy the lull.

That also gives us plenty of opportunity to get out there on the water and enjoy the great outdoors. If you're heading out there, good luck and be safe! 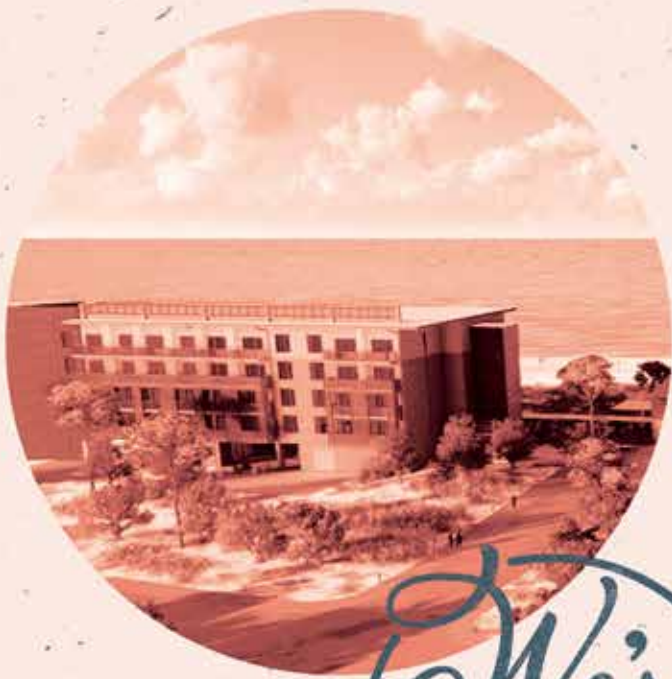
Construction of the 50,000-square foot facility should be complete by the end of 2018. There are also plans to

Create a healthy foundation for Fall plantings

Fall is a great time to start a garden or renovate an existing planting bed. The soil is warm while the air is cool — a perfect combination for establishing new plantings. It is also a great time to prepare gardens for the next planting season. Investing time up front to create a healthy foundation for your plants will pay off with years of beautiful, healthy and productive gardens.

When you read plant tags and seed packets you'll find that the majority of plants prefer moist well-drained soil. Unfortunately, most gardeners aren't growing in plant-friendly soils. Heavy clay, sandy and droughty soils are much more common. Understanding what you have is the best place to start when creating a healthy soil foundation for new and existing gardens.

Start with a soil test.

Contact the local office of your Extension Service or state certified soil testing lab for details. They can direct you on how to take a soil test and where to send the sample. The test results will tell you how much, if any, fertilizer, lime, or sulfur is needed. Following soil test recommendations can save you money spent on and time applying unnecessary soil additives. Plus, following the results will increase your gardening success.

While waiting for the results you can do a bit of analysis yourself. Soils are made of clay, sand, and silt particles. The feel and cohesive nature of this sample will tell you a bit about your soil. Take a handful of

soil and create a ribbon by rubbing it through your thumb and index finger to get a feel for your soil type.

If the soil easily forms a ball or rolls into a sausage shape, feels slippery when wet and smoother when dry, you have a high percent of clay in your soil. Soils with a high percent of the very small clay particles are often called heavy soils. They stay wet longer and hold onto soil nutrients. Clay soils are slow to dry out and warm up in the spring. Avoid working them when wet. This leads to compaction and clods you will be contending with all season long.

Soils with a larger percent of sand particles don't form a ball when moist and feel gritty to the touch. The much larger sand particles create bigger pores in the soil for water and nutrients to move through quickly. They tend to be nutrient deficient, fast

draining and dry. But they warm up and dry quickly in the spring.

Silt feels smooth like flour when dry and soapy slick when wet. They are the middle-sized particles that hold water and nutrients longer than sand, but not as much as clay particles. Silty soils drain slower and stay colder longer than sandy soils in the spring. Overworking soils with a high percent of silt leads to crusting and compaction, decreasing drainage and water infiltration.

Consult your soil test report when preparing your new garden beds. Prior to planting is the easiest time to add organic matter to any of these soil types. It increases the water-holding ability, the infiltration rate so less water runs off the soil surface and builds plant-friendly soil structure. Incorporate several inches of compost, aged manure or other organic mat-

ter into the top eight to twelve inches of soil.

Further improve your soil by using a slow release fertilizer with a high percent of organic matter like Milorganite (milorganite.com). The 85% organic matter feeds the soil microorganisms and your plants as it improves all soil types. You get multiple benefits with this type of fertilizer.

So, as you plan your new landscape additions this fall, include testing and amending the existing soil into your plans. Understanding your soil can help you create a strong foundation important to the health,

longevity and beauty of your gardens and landscapes.

Single-vehicle crash claims life

BAY MINETTE — A single-vehicle crash last week in Bay Minette has claimed the life of a Foley woman.

According to a release issued Tuesday by the Alabama Law Enforcement Agency (ALEA), Jordan Ashley

Guthrie, 24, of Foley, was pronounced dead at the scene after the 1999 Chevrolet Silverado she was driving failed to negotiate a curve, left the roadway, struck and embankment and overturned.

The crash occurred at approximately 12:55 a.m. Tuesday, Aug. 8

on Brady Road, south of Bay Minette. According to the release, Guthrie was not wearing her seatbelt and was partially ejected from the vehicle.

Troopers continue to investigate the crash and no further information is available.

telling those officials the sites were thoroughly unsuitable to house a projected thousands of immigrants that could be coming to the sites. Byrne also joined other members of the Alabama and Florida Congressional delegations in sending a letter to Secretary

of Defense Mattis and Secretary of Homeland Security Nielson outlining concerns with the proposal.

“While I am glad this issue is resolved, we must continue working to secure the border and eliminate the need for additional housing for illegal immigrants altogether,” Byrne said. “I remain 100 percent committed to working with President Trump to

build a border wall, hire additional border patrol officers, and ensure our border security is as strong as possible.”

Elliott said he and other local officials were happy to hear the news out of Washington.

“It's fantastic news,” Elliott said. “I just can't say how thrilled I am with that. It was something that had a lot of our citizens here

in Baldwin County very concerned and with very good reason. The cooperation from Congressman Byrne's office and Senator Shelby's office was amazing on this, and being able to go up there and make the case directly to the Department of Defense as to why this was a bad location, laying out the quantitative reasons why this wasn't the right location - it was

incredibly helpful.”

Elliott said the commission and other local leaders like Orange Beach Mayor Tony Kennon are looking for ways to take those sites out of contention in future discussions by possibly buying the airfields from the Navy.

“We're out of it for now again, but we've seen this before,” Elliott said. “Now, the solution becomes purchasing

those properties. The Navy is not using them, so we're hoping it's time for the Navy to let go of these properties and we're happy to purchase them at fair market value.”

Elliott said the county would try to purchase the Silverhill site and that Kennon and the Orange Beach council had been approached about making an offer on the Josephine site.



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Wonderland Children's Museum opens in Daphne

After Kari Noell's husband left the military it was her turn to focus on her career goals.

She held a degree in environmental biology but turned her sights to education, specifically, to creating a children's museum. It was a goal, she said, she became obsessed with.

Her family traveled the country visiting 30 different children's museums, noting what worked well, what didn't work at all and what visitors' commented most about on social media sites.

After her husband accepted a job in Daphne last year, the family moved to Baldwin County, even though they had never visited the area. She knew immediately that this was the perfect place for her dream to unfold.

This summer she opened Wonderland Children's Museum in Daphne.

The cavernous 8,650 sq. ft. building has been transformed into a Neverland-like setting, anchored in the center by a giant pirate ship. The ship is surrounded by a sea of imaginary play worlds that include a castle, forest tea party, space ship, dinosaurs, and a small town where children can take on the role of police officer, fire fighter, doctor and chef.

The museum also offers more than 20 classes, including yoga, sensory sensitive activities and cooking. The museum hosts birthday parties and school field trips too.

Noell said the number one complaint in other locations was the lack of cleanliness and the number of broken toys.

"Those are two of the biggest things we felt we could fix," Noell said.

To do so the number one rule at Wonderland is no shoes allowed. All visitors, including adults, must remove their shoes and wear socks inside. No bare feet are allowed either.

"A lot of people are not happy with the sock policy but if it was your baby crawling on the floor you would feel differently," she said.

The staff at Wonderland also adheres to a strict cleaning schedule. The floors, walls and toys are bleached every night.

The museum is geared to children ages newborn to 10-years-old. Noell said she has seen the older children naturally take on leadership roles as they play with the younger tots. She said she has also seen the older kids do something many have been told they are too old to do — simply play.

"The idea that they can dress up and play and be a kid again is wonderful and they play really well with the little ones," Noell said.

Wonderland will offer a Moms Morning Out, 4-hour long, preschool class with two, three and four day options.

"When I was looking for something to take my

kids to I found a lot of moms in my position," Noell said. "They didn't want to send them away the whole day but the half-day programs were not up to par."

At Wonderland classes are taught by teachers, not teenagers, she said.

Class sizes are kept small and the museum has contracted with local farms to provide snacks.

Noell said the museum will offer holiday and seasonally themed events, kicking off with Wonderland Boo Bash on Oct. 28.

A rise of YA dystopian novels has swept the world over the last couple of decades, and among those ranks is *The Darkest Minds* (2012) by Alexandra Bracken.

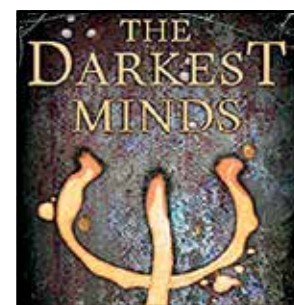

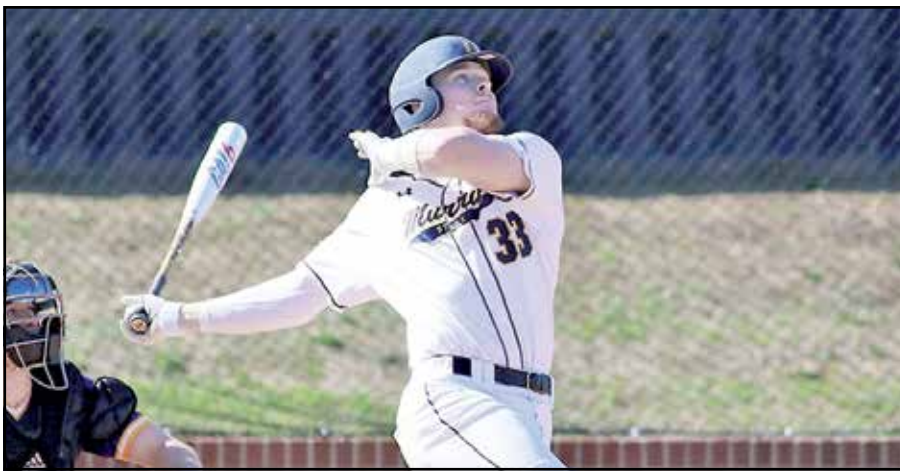
Baseball player Mike Farnell recently was chosen to participate in the Major League Dreams Showcase.

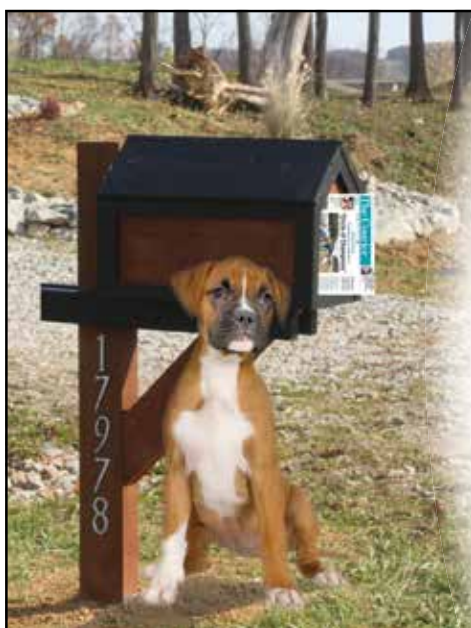

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New Orleans Saints prepping for 2018

Two weeks into the preseason and there are many teams that are eager for the regular season to start. The New Orleans Saints has been prepping for the 2018-2019 NFL season since the unfortunate 29-24 loss at the Minnesota Vikings in the NFC Divisional Round of the NFL playoffs on the last play of the game. Their progress since their NFL training camp has been highly noticeable with their main star players playing like they are in mid-season form and many of their rookies and underutilized players stepping up by looking to make an impact.

Of all the teams in the NFL, the Saints are one of a very few to not have a major position battle going on due to a departure or retiring. The Saints, along with the Minnesota Vikings, New England Patriots, and the reigning Super Bowl champs in the Philadelphia Eagles are the only teams in the NFL that seem complete at every position. This does not mean that those positions have a large amount of talent and depth. This is an area

where the Saints needed to be concerned with the most as last year there were some injuries at linebacker and defensive back that plagued the Saints. Offensively, the Saints did not have too much of a concern with injuries, but the lack of depth was concerning.

The New Orleans Saints had another excellent NFL Draft this past April along with acquiring some great veterans via free agency. This offseason, the Saints added more reliable players at defensive backs to contribute efficiently. New Orleans added former Saint and Philadelphia Eagles cornerback Patrick Robinson to become a key extra defensive back in heavy passing packages. Former Houston Texans quarterback Tom Savage was added by New Orleans for a 1-year deal for insurance purposes for star quarterback Drew Brees.

Throughout this preseason, depth chart contributor Taylor Hill has been impressing the Saints and the Saints nation with his passing ability. Hill

is looking to make his name known when Brees eventually retires from the NFL. In the Saints' first preseason game on August 8 at the Jacksonville Jaguars, Hill threw for 72 yards on 8 completions (out of 9 attempts). He also rushed the ball 7 times for 52 yards and a touchdown. Hill does not possess the speed as many of the dual-threat quarterbacks in the league, but he does have the size and the hard-hitting bulk to push for more yards.

Many of the newcomers of the Saints are making great first impressions with the team and the fans. Former UCF Knights wide receiver Tre'Quan Smith was acquired by the Saints in the third round (91st pick) due to the high amount of great receivers in the 2018 NFL Draft. Smith has already been labeled as a top three receiver for the high-power Saints offense. In the game against Jacksonville, he was the team's leading receiver by accounting for 48 yards on four receptions. His contributions as a mid-range to deep threat receiver will be a huge boost for the Saints offense led by quarterback Drew Brees and wide receiver

Michael Thomas, who is the NFL's most underrated receiver. Undrafted rookie in wide receiver Keith Kirkwood has also been impressing the Saints organization as a reliable playmaker in the short time with the team.

Veteran defensive tackle David Onyemata is currently listed as a backup to former first round pick in Sheldon Rankins according to the Saints' first unofficial

depth chart of the season. Onyemata, though, has been getting a lot of publicity for his increase in contributions for the defense and rise of his efficiency in his performance. Throughout the remainder of this preseason, there could be a switch at the nose tackle position that is held by Tyeler Davison or at the three-technique defensive tackle position held by Rankins if Onyemata continues to impress. At

the least, Onyemata's performance along with the Saints' 2018 NFL Draft first-round pick defensive end Marcus Davenport makes for a potentially dominating slate of defensive linemen for New Orleans.

The Saints next preseason game will be at home against the Arizona Cardinals where they will certainly have to face the Cardinals' first-round rookie quarterback in Josh Rosen.

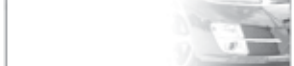

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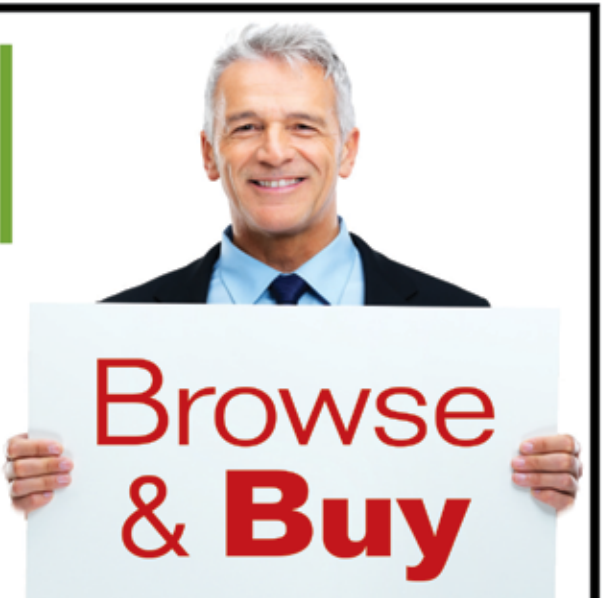

‘Blue wave’ may well come, but will it matter in Alabama?

By now you’ve probably heard talk of the “blue wave” that’s supposed to come this November.

Many political prognosticators say that Democratic voters, energized by their opposition to President Donald Trump, will show up to the polls nationwide in far greater numbers than Republicans this fall. Much like the “red wave” of 2010 that grew out of opposition to President Obama and the Democratic Congress, this “blue wave” could propel Democrats into the House majority and have major implications down ballot as well.

I don’t know whether this wave will impact Alabama’s political shores. This is still a deeply conservative state and, if they can avoid becoming complacent, Republicans should dominate at the polls again this fall.

What I do know is that, if this “blue wave” does come, it won’t

matter unless Alabama Democrats are prepared to catch it and ride it. That means having the organization and infrastructure in place to turn voter enthusiasm into actual votes.

They’ve done it before. In the 2008 elections, Alabama Democrats rode the Obama wave to win two Congressional seats in districts that lean pretty heavily Republican. Sure, Parker Griffith in North Alabama’s 5th District and Bobby Bright in Southeast Alabama’s 2nd District had moderate credentials that helped them with independent voters, but it was the unprecedented turnout among black Democratic voters that put them over the top to win open seats. That wave also helped Lucy Baxley win her race for Public Service Commission that year, the last Democratic statewide election win until Doug Jones last December.

However, that was back when the Alabama Democratic Party still

constituted a legitimate political organization. While their firm grip around Alabama government had slipped somewhat, Democrats still controlled the Legislature and still had a formidable party apparatus that, especially when working with the Alabama Education Association, could deliver votes on Election Day.

Ten years and several election drubbings later, that’s no longer the case. The Alabama Democratic Party is a shell of its former self. And those who are trying to make the party an organized, competitive force once again got a major setback on Saturday when the executive committee met in Montgomery.

Peck Fox, a longtime Democratic politico who worked for party stalwarts like Howell Heflin and Jim Folsom, Jr., lost his bid to become chairman of the Alabama Democratic Party. Fox was seeking to take over for Nancy Worley, who many Democrats

complain has allowed the party infrastructure to crumble under her direction.

In a surprising and significant move, U.S. Sen. Doug Jones publicly supported Fox’s bid and spoke out about the need for change.

“If you are satisfied with the status quo, then we will keep the status quo, which is only one Democrat elected statewide,” Jones said. And he’s right.

Of course, the real reason Fox, Jones, and other reform-minded Democrats came up short in their effort is because Joe Reed still controls Democratic party politics in Alabama. Reed has run the Alabama Democratic Conference, the African American wing of the party, for almost 50 years. In the late 1980s, he and others sued the Alabama Democratic Party and successfully won a consent decree granting party leaders the authority to appoint unelected black members to the executive

committee until they were represented proportional to the minority electorate in the Democratic primary. Who decides what that proportion is and who will be appointed? That would be the Vice Chairman for Minority Affairs, a position held by — you guessed it — Joe Reed.

Before the executive committee voted Saturday, Reed appointed 35 new voting members. Worley, Reed’s hand-picked chairman, won by only 12 votes.

That’s Tammany-style hard knuckle politics right there. And it’s a shame if you’re an Alabama Democrat because it’s a missed opportunity to take advantage of some rare momentum.

Jones’ defeat of Roy Moore energized liberal and progressive Alabamians in a powerful way. And, while unquestionably an outlier election in more ways than one, it showed that with the right candidate, strong funding, and proper organization,

Democrats could at least compete for elections in our deep-red state.

After barely fielding candidates four years ago, Democrats boast an impressive slate of office seekers this year: Walt Maddox for governor, Will Boyd for lieutenant governor, Joseph Siegelman for attorney general, Bob Vance for chief justice, Tabitha Isner and Mallory Hagan for Congress, just to name a few. To a person, they all face steep uphill battles and they’d all benefit from a wave of Democratic voter enthusiasm.

That wave may well come, but with a party stuck in the past and unwilling to change, will it even matter?

Kudos to elected officials for pushing back against immigrant housing proposal

This week, Congressman Bradley Byrne’s office announced that two Baldwin County Naval fields would not be in contention to possibly house thousands of illegal immigrants in tent cities on those sites.

This was not the first time Baldwin County has battled against such proposals.

Just two years ago, Baldwin County elections officials fought a similar plan from the Office of Refugee Relocation to bring 2,000 undocumented minor immigrants to those same sites, NOLF Wolf in Orange Beach and

NOLF Silverhill.

The county was resolute in its opposition to that plan, and that resolve grew stronger in its opposition to the newly proposed plan.

This was not a “not in my backyard” opposition scenario. There were clear, concrete reasons why the Baldwin sites are thoroughly unsuitable.

Regardless of whatever feelings you may have about the nation’s immigration policy, the idea of housing 25,000 people in tents in Baldwin County in the scorching heat of a South Alabama summer

is clearly inhumane.

Those Naval fields currently lack proper infrastructure to provide power, water, sewage and gas service to the fields.

Cramming so many people onto those spaces would also be a humanitarian nightmare for those families who have already endured great hardships and tribulations making it to America.

Our largest municipality, Daphne, has almost 26,000 residents. This move would create an illegal migrant population becoming Baldwin County’s second largest

municipality overnight — all living in tents.

Another possible reason why the federal government sought other locations — hurricane season.

Trying to prepare for a possible hurricane evacuation for Baldwin County’s current residents is already an arduous process. Adding 25,000 more people to that equation would have been a recipe for chaos and possible disaster.

Additionally, Baldwin County has contracted with the Navy to use NOLF Silverhill as a staging area for power companies, the Red

Cross and other emergency management organizations to be used during hurricanes or other severe weather events. Creating a tent city on that site would have complicated those efforts, making disaster recovery even more difficult.

We applaud Byrne and our local officials (Sheriff Hoss Mack and Commissioners Tucker Dorsey and Chris Elliott) for their work in talking with federal officials and helping them to realize Baldwin County was not the right place for these sites.

And we hope the Navy

will allow the sale of those airfields to the county and the City of Orange Beach some time soon, so that we won’t have to have this same conversation all over again.
