its most recent work session.

Phelps discussed how part of the goals of Vision 2025, presented in 2014, was to look at the economy and become more seasonally diversified from the tourism base.

In the years since, the city has seen significant growth in what were previously known as "shoulder seasons." From fiscal year 2014 to fiscal year 2018, the month of December saw a 162.9% increase in lodging tax revenue. November saw a 74.8% increase, while October has received a 52.1% bump.

Phelps said the city has focused on the community in a more holistic way.

"We certainly don't want to detract from tourism which is the primary driver of the economy," Phelps said. "We did, however, want to place a bigger focus on growing the community in a more well-rounded way to attract more full-time residents."

Once again, the City of Orange Beach is putting its money where its mouth is to help ensure the quality of its schools.

The city council heard a proposal that would have the city give money to the Orange Beach Educational Foundation every year.

Mayor Tony Kennon specified the difference between this group and the Makos Academics, Arts and Athletics Club (MAAAC).

Gulf Shores recognized for eco-minded initiatives

Gulf Shores' efforts to maintain an environmentally-friendly mindset earned it the status of Greenest City in Alabama in an Insurify index of Greenest Cities in America

Award recipients were evaluated on environmentally-friendly living and driving behaviors.

Mayor Robert Craft said being a green city is a top priority for the City of Gulf Shores.

'It is proven in several of our initiatives, including Green Up Gulf Shores, Leave Only Footprints and the upcoming Gulf Coast Center for Ecotourism and Sustainability," Craft said. "We live in a beautiful community, and it is our job to nurture it and care for it to the best of our ability.'



Cities won higher scores for having ecoconscious driving practices, green vehicle features, low urban sprawl, healthy air quality, dedicated park space and renewable electricity programs. The community with the highest

score from each state was identified to form the winner's roster.

"Our natural environment is a finite and precious resource," said Insurify CEO, Snejina Zacharia. "Appreciating and protecting it is a virtue, and those who

practice it should be recognized."

To find the most environmentally-conscious cities by state, data scientists at Insurify, an auto insurance quotes comparison website, used a combination of proprietary automotive data and external sources. To begin, Insurify analyzed its database of over 1.6 million car insurance applications to rank each state's cities by their collective vehicular carbon footprint. States with insufficient city data were omitted from the analysis. The scoring algorithm factored in fuel-efficiency, engine displacement, drivetrain, annual mileage, and vehicles per household to identify the top five cities per state for greenest drivers. Following this, the data team added scoring boosts

in accordance with statistics on citywide renewable electricity programs, park quality, urban sprawl and air quality index to determine the number one most eco-friendly city in each state. The relative weight of each environmental impact in the algorithm was informed in part by Drawdown Solution's ranking of various green reforms.

Mark Acreman, Public Works Director, said many years ago Assistant Public Works Director Noel Hand took it upon himself to address an issue the city was having with trash on the beaches.

"His initial vision of how to address those problems and those concerns we were facing has grown into a comprehensive and city-wide recycling program,' Acreman said. "It's

through Noel's vision and Joe Tabor's hard work with his crews that we've been able to achieve that goal. We're very proud of that."

The City of Gulf Shores operates a recycling center that serves as a drop-off location for the following items to be recycled: glass, aluminum, plastic, mixed paper, metal, cardboard, electronics and tin cans. All recycling and waste bins are hand-sorted at the facility. In 2018 alone, Gulf Shores recycled 243 tons of cardboard, 58 tons of mixed paper, 17 tons of aluminum, 31 tons of plastic, 63 tons of glass and 34 tons of metal.

per capita income also increased.

Since 2010, Gulf Shores is the fourthfastest growing city in the state of Alabama as well as being the fourth-fastest growing city in the county. The city has seen

more than double new housing starts in 2018 from 2014.

Total local revenue is up 31.3% in the same time period.

One of the most interesting bits of data was in the segmentation of the population of the

city. While most people think of Gulf Shores as being predominantly retirees, more than 42% of the population were aged 37 or younger.

Mayor Robert Craft said a goal of the city's was to grow families in the community and


Girl Scouts learn to be their own kind of beautiful



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Amendment 50 gives Gulf states stable snapper season

After a three-year struggle, saltwater anglers are on the cusp of a stable red snapper season with the approval of Amendment 50 by the Gulf of Mexico Fishery Management Council.

Amendment 50, which goes into effect in 2020 with the approval of the Secretary of Commerce, gives the five Gulf states control over each state's snapper season, and it allows leeway in size and bag limits within certain federal guidelines.

"All of the Gulf states are excited to finally have this solidified and move forward with the management plans for the individual states," said Scott Bannon, Alabama's Marine Resources Director. "It's a win for the red snapper stock and a win for the states."

Bannon said state control of the snapper fishery was brought before the Council in 2016 to manage the recreational sector, which would have included the private recreational sector and the federal for-hire (charter) sector.

The 2016 and 2017 snapper seasons were painfully short under federal control. As a way to alleviate the impact on anglers and the Gulf Coast economies, the Gulf states were issued an exempted fishing permit (EFP) for the 2018 and 2019 seasons, and states were able to set their seasons under a total allowable catch for each state.

Alabama originally set its 2018 season at 47 days, but near-perfect weather and an increased enthusiasm for catching the state's signature saltwater species forced Marine Resources to reduce the season to 28 days, which ended in an almost perfect catch-to-allocation result. The way Alabama was able to ensure there was no significant overrun on the quota was through the Red Snapper Reporting System, more commonly known as Snapper Check. The mandatory reporting system allowed Marine Resources to monitor the catch and close the season in response to the larger-than-expected harvest numbers.

The success of the Snapper Check monitoring paved the way for the Council to approve Amendment 50.

"I think the fishery benefits from Amendment 50 because we have the ability, as individual states, of not exceeding our allocation of the quota," Bannon said. "If you look at it from a stock perspective for the Gulf of Mexico and you were managing it as a whole and you had a perfect season, like last year, you had no way to put the season in check. Alabama alone would have consumed nearly half of the entire Gulf allocation if we had fished the whole 47 days. We would have fished it really, really hard, and the amount of fish we would have caught would have been tremendous. As it was, we closed it when we met the number of pounds and showed that we were responsible. I think this is much better for the anglers and the snapper stock. I think the EFP showed the states could come to some decisions about allocations, and that the states could manage seasons within pretty close tolerances."

Bannon said the Gulf Council faced two challenges with state management of red snapper. First, where do the federal for-hire boats fit into the program? The Council decided to not include the federal for-hire in Amendment 50 and consider other options in the future if conditions change for the federal for-hire boats. Second, what allocations could the five Gulf states live with?

"These allocations were based on different factors like biomass and historical landings," Bannon said. "So, the state directors used the EFP allocations as a starting point for Amendment 50.

"The EFP only allowed us to set the season within our allocation. Under Amendment 50, we received an increase in allocation from 25% to 26.298%, and that increase will be permanent. We also have in Amendment 50 the ability to set size and bag limits within certain parameters. Those are management tools to maximize the benefit for Alabama."

When the initial EFP allocations were proposed, the totals did not equal 100% of the total allowable catch. Bannon said Florida was given the extra 3.78% because they were the final state to apply.

"They amended their EFP to get that extra allocation," Bannon said. "We felt like that extra allocation should be negotiated. In the end, Alabama and Florida split that 3.78% under Amendment 50 because we're the two largest consumers of red snapper. The other states were comfortable with that. It seems to be fair and equitable."

Under the new amendment, each state creates their own plan. Alabama's plan includes a 10% buffer as opposed to the 20% buffer under the federal system. The federal for-hire sector has not exceeded its quota for several years, and its buffer was reduced to 9%.

Alabama's allocation of red snapper for the 2019 private recreational season under the EFP is 1,079,765 pounds. Ala-

bama's allocation for the 2020 season increases to 1,122,661 pounds if the private recreational sector doesn't exceed its quota this year.

Bannon said most red snapper anglers are happy with the upcoming season, and he anticipates there could be some season adjustments when Amendment 50 goes into effect.

"Most of the responses I've received for the 2019 season is they were happy to get the June and July seasons and that the season was spread out enough that if the weather was bad they could go another weekend," he said. "We know we still have concerns from the public that they would like more fishing time during the week. As we move forward in state management, that is always a possibility because we now have the flexibility to set the seasons."

The 2019 season length is tentatively set for 27 days, starting June 1 with three-day weekends (Friday-Sunday) except opening weekend (two days) and July 4 week, which will be four days (Thursday-Sunday). The size limit and bag limit remain the same at two fish per person with a minimum size of 16 inches total length.

Bannon is planning to ask snapper anglers for assistance to keep Alabama's unparalleled artificial reef program at the top. The loss of fund-

ing for research in those reef zones will prompt him to ask the Conservation Advisory Board to implement a reef fish endorsement beginning in 2020.

"The reef fish endorsement is set up to help fund some of the research conducted in the reef zones, because we're losing some of the funding used for that research," he said. "The research needs to continue, and we also need funds to support programs like Snapper Check, which we hope to expand into a better program.

"It's designed as a user-based system that applies to the people who are participating in that fishery, including private recreational, charter for-hire and commercial fishermen. Another aspect of it is it defines the user group. It gives us a better idea, especially among private anglers, of how many people are fishing for reef fish off Alabama. That way we can have better directed surveys, which are

targeted at people who participate in the fishery instead of just people who have saltwater fishing licenses."

The endorsement fees would be \$10 for private recreational anglers and \$250 for commercial fishermen. The charter forhire fees would depend on the size of the boat and number of passengers the vessel can carry.

As for Amendment 50, Bannon said Alabama has already shown state management will work. The public is supportive, and he thinks that Secretary Wilbur Ross will quickly approve.

"As I said on the radio the other day, Alabama has 3% of the Gulf coastline and will receive 26.298% of the total allowable catch for the 2020 season and beyond," Bannon said. "I think Amendment 50 is a success for the fishery, and I think it's a success for the states because the states can now manage the seasons, size limits and bag limits that best suit their anglers."



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







2010. Afterward, he was hired for the same position for the Cleveland Cavaliers from 2010-17 He helped draft Kyrie Irving (Duke) and Tristian Thompson (Texas) in 2011. He also built an incredible team in the 2014 NBA offseason including LeBron James, Kevin Love and helped get J.R. Smith. This team would appear in four straight NBA Finals and won an NBA Championship in 2015. Griffin left the Cavaliers in the 2017 offseason after continuing disagreements with

owner Dan Gilbert.

Griffin waited for the job of his choosing including passing up the position of general manager of the Los Angeles Lakers where he would have reunited with James. He seems confident to create a Pelicans roster and staff that can contend for the NBA playoffs every year.

Expanding the staff is his first step with the Pelicans franchise to make them more efficient. The next step may be one of his biggest challenges yet as a

GM. Griffin will have to figure out how he deals with Anthony Davis, who isn't set to be an unrestricted free agent until 2021. Griffin has stated he wants Davis to stay and continue playing in his max contract with New Orleans. If Davis is persistent of his trade demands, Griffin can create a great deal to teams like Boston or Golden State to acquire a star player of their own. Boston Celtics shooting guard Jayson Tatum keeps getting brought up in rumors in a trade

for Anthony Davis. Davis would go to a highmarket team and Tatum would be the franchise leader of an undervalued Pelicans team.

Whether or not Davis is with the Pelicans for 2019, Griffin is confident of his underrated Pelicans players. This includes the ability of point guard Jrue Holiday, who had 21.2 points per game last season. A big surprise last year was former Laker Julius Randle, who had 21.4 points per game and 8.7 rebounds per game.



Pancreatic cancer hard to detect

When Jeopardy host Alex Trebek announced last month he was suffering from Stage 4 Pancreatic cancer, fans were stunned.

Doctors, however, knew the late diagnosis was common for a disease that is both uncommon and difficult to detect.

Dr. Moh'd Khushman, Assistant Professor of Interdisciplinary Clini-

cal Oncology at The University of South Alabama, Mitchell Cancer Institute says currently screenings for this type of cancer are not cost effective and may not

even detect existing cancerous cells.

"The screening tests we have for some other cancers, to become recognized and used regularly, they must be inexpensive and be relatively good in detecting cancer. They also have to have a role in preventing cancer," Khushman said.

Currently, no such tests exists for pancreatic cancer meaning when symptoms finally emerge, often patients are already in the advanced stages of the disease, much like Trebek.

Treatment depends on how and where the cancer has spread. A handful of patients can be fully cured. In others, if the cancer is limited to one side of the pancreas, surgery is possible. For those in which the cancer is buried near the top of the pancreas, surgery is complex and could be as deadly as the cancer the surgeons are trying to treat.

Khushman said the

pancreas cannot simply be removed. The organ secretes digestive juices into the small intestine to help break down food. It also makes insulin and helps to regulate the body's sugar level. Removing it automatically causes patients to become diabetic and puts the individual at risk for a host of other serious health issues.

While recent studies have led to advances in pancreatic cancer treatment, Khushman said treating the disease is about expectations. "If a patient comes to me with stage 4 like Alex Trebek, I tell them we will get disappointed if we aim for a cure," Khushman said. "Instead, we should think about how to learn how to live with the disease and what we do have for treatment to help you to live as long as possible with cancer in your body."

Trebek released a video last week saying he is continuing therapy and is still healthy enough to host the popular game show next season, his 36th year of hosting. Khushman said

setting realistic expectations can help patients manage the disease with success.

Another way to successfully fight the disease is to know if you are at high risk.

If you have a family history of pancreatic cancer, or suffer from Peutz-Jeghers Syndrome, a genetic condition that predisposes a person to an increased risk of developing cancer, you should discuss undergoing cancer screening with your doctor.

Symptoms of pancre-

atic cancer include: long lasting, persistent abdominal pain, jaundice, significant weight loss, a change in how food tastes, and lower back pain.

The bottom line, Khushman said, is to know your family health history and discuss it with your doctor.

"If you know you have a genetic syndrome that predisposes you to any cancer, or you have a parent or grandparent with this cancer, please discuss this with your doctor," Khushman said.

Why nothing permanently sticks to Teflon Donald

Stop looking at Trump and look where Trump is looking: It's all about the 'flair'

When it comes to Trump, it's all about Flair.

For several years, the media and the Washington establishment have railed against Donald Trump with little success. Porn stars, special counsel, duplicitous lawyers, celebrities they've all taken him on to no avail. It appears they really don't grasp the nature of Donald Trump.

If you want to understand Donald Trump, you don't have to look much further than professional wrestling superstar, Ric Flair. Flamboyant, even by professional wrestling standards, Ric Flair maintained an astonishing career and achieved a lengthy list of championships and successes. Adopting the nickname, "Nature Boy," Ric Flair emerged in the 1970s as a fan favorite. With flowing blonde hair and swagger, he paraded in front of thousands wearing only an industrial speedo, boots, and often a floor-length feather boa robe.

When a man dresses like that in public, he's taken shame and embarrassment off the table. Brushing off insults about his crude or low-brow behavior like crumbs from a biscuit, he reveled in the drama of the wrestling world and adoring fans. Ric Flair understood that the real contest was not in the ring, but with the audience. He won by winning their love — or their hatred. To a professional wrestler, the only kryptonite is indifference.

Such is the case with Donald Trump. In fact, he even participated in the professional wrestling world, often entering the ring to join the antics.

No other politician could withstand a fraction of the relentless onslaught Trump daily faces. Yet, none of it sticks. Each assault makes him stronger. Hillary Clinton learned the hard way that insulting Trump's supporters was equally futile. With one contemptuous comment, she launched an entire cottage industry of clothing, bumper stickers, coffee mugs, greeting cards, and other items bearing the infamous moniker, "Deplorable."

When "elites" look down their noses at the crude or "common" behavior, Trump surges, his crowds grow, and his detractors are silenced. In Trump's world, even the term "elite" has been turned on its head.

The key to understanding Trump is not to look at him, but rather see where Trump him-

self is looking. Like Ric Flair. Trump's point of view faces the audience. He has an uncanny bond with his audience that only he can break. If he loses a battle, he — and his audience — will blame it on outside sources. For Flair, the referees or out of the ring interference became his nemesis. For Trump, it's the media and politicians who refuse to be winners with him.

The 2020 candidates have already set up themselves for failure because their playbook fails to include a counter to the Teflon Trump phenom. The key is not pandering to your audiences but genuinely loving them. Trump not only sees his audience but is willing to embrace them and affirm their heartaches, fears, dreams, and love of country.

In exchange, they don't care what he says or what he wears or if his hair is red or blonde or how orange his skin may be on any given day — and they viscerally despise those who deride their champion.

As the media and those inside the Beltway wrangle over the Mueller report and Attorney General Barr's redactions of it, while looking at Trump with loathing, they entirely miss where Trump is looking. Even the "Game of Thrones" parody tweet reveals that he is turning his back on them and facing the audience.

In countless arenas, Ric Flair paraded about to both the screams and adulation of the crowd. Neither his despisers nor his loyal fans could convince each other to switch sides. Regardless of whether he was loved or hated, no one ignored him.

Through the bareknuckle brawls of business, beauty pageants, and a successful fake reality television show, Trump hammered out an extreme understanding of who, what, when, where, why, and how. Instead of boots and a floor-length robe. he struts out in an expensive suit, extra-long tie, a silhouette-worthy hairstyle, and uses an intentionally-reduced vocabulary.

Like Ric Flair, Donald Trump doesn't care what critics think of him. He wins BECAUSE they think of him.



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when the only way to get partner to do the right thing is to tell a little white lie. This type of falsecard is eminently forgivable.

Today's deal provides a case in point. South arrives at four hearts after East has overcalled in spades, and West leads the spade six. After dummy is tabled, East reviews the prospects of defeating the contract.

He concludes first that if declarer has the A-K-Q of trumps, the defense has no hope. Indeed, if South's trumps are solid, he will probably finish with an overtrick with the help of dummy's diamonds. East therefore credits West with a trump trick, giving the defense four potential winners: one spade, one heart and two clubs.

spade is returned. East will be unable to score the setting trick with the queen of clubs.

So to steer West in the right direction, East tells a little fib at trick one. Instead of making the normal play of the spade queen, he puts up the king! South takes the ace, leaving West with the indelible impression that declarer holds the A-Q of spades.

When West subsequently wins the king of hearts, he will therefore look elsewhere for additional tricks, and most likely shift to a club. East then scores the A-Q, and, much to West's surprise, the queen of spades puts the contract down one.
