The first inhabitants to Baldwin County's rich Delta region can be traced back approximately 10,000 years to pre-Mississippian Native American cultures, who are often referred to as "mound-builders." Even today, a variety of burial, ceremonial and residential mounds can be found along the county's waterways.

The Spanish arrived in the area in 1519 when Alonzo Alvarez De Pineda sailed into Mobile Bay and named it Espiritu Santo; in 1540, Hernando de Soto traveled through a portion of the county — the town of Spanish Fort being the site of the Spanish occupation.

Over the years, both the French and English would also occupy the county, offering a variety of contributions to its

rich history and heritage.

Baldwin County has also been the site of many historical battles. Andrew Jackson and his Volunteers fought the Indians in 1813 at Fort Mims, and Jackson also crossed the county to cause the surrender of the Spanish commandant at Pensacola.

During the War of 1812, at Fort Bowyer (now Fort Morgan), the British attacked the fort prior to the infamous Battle of New Orleans, losing the HMS Hermes in the process.

During the Civil War, Fort Morgan was once again the site of a fierce battle, when, in 1864, Union Adm. David Farragut entered Baldwin-Mobile Bay to seal off Confederate shipping. During the fighting, the Tecumseh, a Federal Ironclad, sank in a narrow inlet, where it still lies with its entombed crew near the fort.

Numerous skirmishes also occurred in the northern part of the county. Fort McDermott in the Spanish Fort region received 48 hours of constant bombardment, and in April 1865, Union forces mounted an assault on Fort Blakeley, with an estimated 4,475 soldiers killed or wounded in the attack on the earthwork fortress.

Baldwin County was not only a place where battles were fought, but a land where futures were built by embracing diversity and with a neighborly helping hand — France, Greece, Yugoslavia, Germany, Russia, Sweden, Czechoslovakia, countless African nations and dozens of other sources have contributed to the area's rich cultural history.

This melting pot of people built the county's agricultural, commercial, manufacturing, tourism and fishing industries and made the county prosper and persevere during even severe economic depressions.

Today, Baldwin County remains one of the fastest growing counties in Alabama, with 182,265 citizens according to the 2010 census, and growing by estimated by 12 new residents per day, making the current population over 210,000. Baldwin County is a place welcome to all — a land of abundant natural resources, a healthy economy and beautiful beaches, as well as a people who have carved out a place to live, prosper and continually grow.







#### TENSAW-STOCKTON

Where Alabama Highway 225 and 59 meet, sits the community of Stockton. One of the northernmost points in the county is home to several historic homes and sites. Bicentennial Park is dedicated to preserving the rich heritage and history of this unique spot. It includes a walking trail, historical exhibits and a working farm. 

# eastern SHORE

Whether you enjoy the outdoors, shopping, sports, dining, the arts or family friendly events, there is something for everyone in Baldwin County's Eastern Shore cities — Spanish Fort, Fairhope and Daphne.

#### **DAPHNE**

Daphne is home to some of the Eastern Shore's best spots to watch for wildlife. At Bayfront Park at Village Point, visitors can watch for alligators, snakes and other animals in their natural habitat.

Jackson Oak, a historic oak tree that dates back to before the War of 1812, is also located on one of the nature trails at Village Point. Also in Daphne is Gator Alley, a city-maintained boardwalk that passes under U.S. 98, where guests can spot alligators at any time between sunrise and sunset. Daphne's historic Main Street has local restaurants and stores, a youth baseball





park and Centennial Park, a great park for kids.

#### **FAIRHOPE**

A short drive under moss-covered oaks will lead you to a flower-filled clock face — the city of Fairhope awaits. Downtown Fairhope retains its small-town sense with locally owned clothing stores, coffee shops, bookstores and art galleries. End your day with a stroll down Fairhope Avenue and view a breathtaking sunset on Fairhope Pier. A common gathering place for all ages throughout the year, near the pier there is a rose garden, marina, beach and playground area. This area is host to many class field trips to discover the creatures that call the bay home. Continue south along scenic 98 through Point Clear and relish the beauty of the Eastern Shore and Mobile Bay.


#### SPANISH FORT

The Eastern Shore Centre, an outdoor mall in Spanish Fort, contains favorites like Barnes & Noble, Belk, Build-A-Bear Workshop, Best Buy and World Market. There's also a state-of-the-art bowling alley and arcade, a 14-screen movie theater, a Publix supermarket and many restaurants to satisfy any craving.

The 5 Rivers Delta Resource Center is one of Spanish Fort's best places to catch a close-up glimpse of local wildlife with walking tours and river boat cruises.







The central area of the county offers fun events

throughout the year such as the Silverhill Memorial Car Show and the Robertsdale Rotary Rodeo.

#### **LOXLEY**

The town of Loxley begins where Interstate 10 meets Highway 59. Many activities in town center around the Loxley Municipal Park and Loxley Civic Center, which is home each year to the Baldwin County Strawberry Festival and the City Rhythm Big Band.

#### **ROBERTSDALE**

The "Hub of Baldwin County" is a short drive down Highway 59 between Loxley and Summerdale. Robertsdale is home to many parks including Honeybee Park, home to the Honeybee Festival and Garrett Park, which boasts the city's splash pad and numerous baseball and softball fields.

The Baldwin County Fair, one of the state's longest running county fairs, calls Robertsdale's Baldwin County Coliseum home. In September, view art, livestock and hobby exhibitions, including canning, baked goods, scrapbooking and more.

#### **SILVERHILL**

The only town of Central Baldwin County that does not contain a portion of Highway 59, Silverhill is the area's smallest and oldest municipality. Silverhill celebrates the heritage of its four flags (Sweden, Czechoslovakia, Norway

and Finland) every year with the annual Silverhill Heritage Day Festival.


This town is also home to Wales West RV Park, featuring the Wales West Light Railway and nightly activities like bluegrass and potluck dinners. Guests can ride the train year-round, or come for a special event during Easter, Halloween or Christmas.

#### **SUMMERDALE**

A rural town in south-central Baldwin County, Summerdale is the last stop of this area before entering the white sands and salty waters of the county. Looking for adventure?


Visit the alligator farm Alligator Alley or the Spear Hunting Museum, home of the "World's Greatest Living Spear Hunter" Gene Morris. Although Morris died in 2011, the museum remains open to share his tales with visitors.











Whether you visit once a year or live in a condo on the beach, South Baldwin County is a destination for all. From shopping at small surf shops and The Wharf to parasailing or ziplining, or just relaxing in your chair listening to the waves crash into the shore, each day is different from the last.

#### **ELBERTA**

Home to the German Sausage Festival, Elberta was founded by German immigrants and celebrates this bi-annual fundraising event with more than 30,000 visitors and 7,000 pounds of sausage served at each occasion. Proceeds go to the volunteer fire department and town. This picturesque little town is also home to Baldwin County's own "Bamahenge" and four dinosaurs roaming the woods along Fish Trap Road leading to Barber Marina.

#### **FOLEY**

As Foley turned 100 in 2015, city leaders completed the Centennial Plaza and clock tower in Heritage Park and the Pedestrian Bridge. Newly opened OWA allows guests to experience Downtown District with shops, a concert at the amphitheater overlooking the 14-acre lake or take a ride on the Rolling Thunder coaster at the theme park. Adjacent to OWA, the city of Foley will host sports activities from gymnastics to basketball in the new 90,000-square-foot indoor Events Center, or lacrosse, disc golf and soccer on one of the 16 state-of-the-art fields.

The Tanger Outlets in Foley offer shoppers an array of stores at outlet prices. In addition to the outlets, Ross Dress for Less and PetSmart have made their appearance, with more bigbox stores on the way.

Events throughout the year include the colorful Gulf Coast Hot Air Balloon Festival, BBQ & Blues Cook-Off, Art in the

Park and the Jennifer Claire Moore Foundation Professional Rodeo.

#### **GULF SHORES**

Gulf Shores is home to many specialty boutiques and surf shops. There is also a wide variety of restaurant fare to choose from with seafood as the basis, but each eatery has a unique specialty as well. The Waterway Village District along the Intracoastal Waterway is home to the Gulf Coast Arts Alliance Art Market and Gallery.

This and surrounding areas host a staggering number of tourists, while maintaining its hometown, sweet Southern spirit.

#### MAGNOLIA SPRINGS

Nestled along the Magnolia Springs River, the deep-rooted oak trees shelter the historic homes lined with azaleas. Incorporated in 2006, Magnolia Springs is home to the only year-round water postal route in the United States.

#### ORANGE BEACH

Listen to some of the world's famed musicians as they take the stage at The Amphitheater at The Wharf. Walk the streets on Main Street before the concert to take in some local grub, and be sure to stop at some of the retailers nearby. Karaoke, dancing and games can be found at sports bars, eateries and nightlife locations. Orange Beach is also home to the Coastal Arts Center with a glass-blowing hot shop, clay studio and outdoor stage.

# HISTORY

FAIRHOPE MUSEUM OF HISTORY



A full 10 years before Alabama was admitted as the 22nd state in the union, business and life in Baldwin was booming. The county was officially founded on Dec. 21, 1809, forged by a clash of cultures and families who carved a nitch out of the wilderness and made it their home. Their histories became the tales of county lore. Skirmishes between settlers and native tribes, the War of 1812 and the Civil War have left their marks on the area. Famous battles include the Fort Mims Massacre, the Battle of Mobile Bay and the Battle of Fort Blakeley. McIntosh Bluff, Blakeley and Daphne have all served as the seat of county government. Bay Minette became the county seat in 1901 when the county records were spirited away from Daphne in the middle of the night. The county holds a variety of reenactments, festivals, shows and concerts to celebrate elements of the past. From antique cars to bluegrass music, history comes to life throughout the year. Native American artifacts, Civil War weapons, Spanish names, German cuisine, Scandinavian flags, antebellum homes, Depression Era tools, forts, mounds, crops, hurricane devastations ... these remnants of the past are patches in a quilt that covers Alabama's largest county. Last year those early founders were honored in a county-wide ceremony that named them as Baldwin's Founding Families. Their ancestors, still part of the fabric of our community today, were present to honor that past and promise to carry Baldwin County into the future. You can find a list of all of Baldwin County's Founding Families in this section. We think they would be proud to see what their legacy has become.

# HISTORICAL ATTRACTIONS White the second control of the second con

#### **BICENTENNIAL PARK**

Gives visitors the opportunity to enjoy the natural attributes of the Mobile-Tensaw River Delta as they take in the beauty of the two-mile walking trail within the park. The park's displays chronicle Native American culture circa 1780s through the settlement by Europeans in the 19th century.

#### HISTORIC BLAKELEY STATE PARK

Offering opportunities to tour a preserved Civil War battlefield, visit the site of one of the oldest towns in the state and learn about the plants and animals that inhabit Mobile Bay and the Mobile-Tensaw River Delta. Examine more than five miles of Confederate and Union breastworks within the park that marks the site of the last major battle of the American Civil War. One can relive the beginning of Baldwin County's heritage at the Blakeley town site in the park. While there were hotels, stores and churches serving about 4,000 people in the 1820s, the site has since been reclaimed by nature and is home to majestic oaks that line what were once busy streets.

#### FORT MIMS

On Aug. 30, 1813, a band of 700 Red Stick Creek Indians destroyed Fort Mims in northern Baldwin County and

killed about 250 of those defending the stronghold. During the last weekend in August each year, the Fort Mims Restoration Association commemorates the 1813 battle during a weekend-long reenactment.

#### FORT MORGAN

This brick-and-mortar fortress located at the mouth of Mobile Bay served American forces during the Civil War, Spanish-American War and both world wars. The 479-acre site includes concrete artillery batteries and historic buildings dating from 1899 to 1910. Also located onsite is a museum that features a complete history of Fort Morgan.

#### **SWIFT-COLES HISTORIC HOME**

The Swift-Coles Historic Home was originally built around 1882. In 1898, the Charles A. Swift family moved into the home, and as the Swift family grew in size, the home was expanded to its current 6,000 square feet, which includes 16 rooms, 10 fireplaces and 3,500 square feet of porches that look out onto the home's grounds. In the summer of 2009, the home and grounds were opened to the public for tours. In addition, the home is decorated during the Christmas holiday as it would have been in 1900s.

#### **BLACK EDUCATION MUSEUM**

Located on the original site of the Eastern Shore Baptist Academy and later the Baldwin County Training School, the museum chronicles the history of black education in Baldwin County, which began in 1882 when the Eastern Shore Missionary Baptist Association saw a need for educating black children. In 1916, the school was deeded to the Baldwin County Board of Education and became a public high school that provided an education for black students in Baldwin and other surrounding counties until 1970.

#### FOLEY RAILROAD MUSEUM

For 66 years, Baldwin County's agriculture industry relied on a railroad system to transport goods from farms to the rest of the country. In 1971, the Louisville and Nashville Railroad ceased operations at its depot in Foley. Now, it houses the Foley Railroad Museum, offering exhibits about Baldwin County's railroading and agricultural history.



A model railroad layout depicts the evolution of railroading in the 1950s, complete with three operating double-track routes, 12 different railroads and several animated sites, along with representations of a fire station, church, bus station, city park, farm, sawmill, coal company and an oil refinery. The museum also has a train that carries children around Foley's Heritage Park.





Bait your hook or cast your net in more than 660 miles of shoreline from Orange Beach to the south shore of Mobile County and Mobile Bay. Baldwin County offers a multitude of angling opportunities for fishing enthusiasts at every level.

#### KINDS OF FISH

**AMBERJACK** can be found all year, but peak from May until September. Abundant around wrecks, reefs and gas platforms in Gulf waters off Baldwin County's south coast.

**BLACKFIN TUNA** can be found May through December, with a peak in late June through July, by trolling and jigging in offshore Gulf waters.

**FLOUNDER** are abundant on and around structures like piers and drop offs along the Eastern Shore.

**GROUPER** can be found all year in the Gulf of Mexico off Baldwin County's south coast.

**KING MACKEREL** can be found along coastal and offshore Gulf waters, particularly around wrecks, rigs, obstructions, ledges, lumps and other structures from May through October.

**MULLET** can be found near inshore artificial reefs and around oyster reefs and tidal river mouths.

**REDFISH** are abundant around the mouth of Mobile Bay near Fort Morgan.

**RED SNAPPER** season and limits change based on the abundance of the fish. Red snapper can be found offshore around natural structures or artificial reefs.

**SEATROUT** can be caught along Gulf beaches in March and in rivers and above the Mobile Bay Causeway in late fall and

winter.

**SHARKS** are commonly caught from March through November around oyster reefs, bridge pilings, inshore artificial reefs, rock jetties and oyster reef areas during flooding tides.

**SPECKLED TROUT** can be found in the shallows of Mobile Bay. **WAHOO** can be found by trolling in offshore Gulf waters from May through October.

**WHITING** can be found in the Gulf surf zone of coastal waters and off Gulf piers and lower portions of the bays, including lower bay piers.

**YELLOWFIN TUNA** can be found in offshore Gulf waters from April through December with a peak in June and July.

#### **MOBILE BAY JUBILEE**

One of the most exciting fishing events in Baldwin County is the jubilee on the upper Eastern Shore of Mobile Bay from Point Clear to slightly north of Daphne. During this natural phenomenon, many species of aquatic life leave deeper waters and swarm in a specific, shallower coastal area of the bay.


The Mobile Bay jubilee typically takes place every year between the months of June and September. Some years, it occurs several times, usually in the

pre-dawn hours and can cover up to a 15-mile stretch of coast on the Eastern Shore.

A specific set of conditions must be met for a jubilee to occur:

- Previous day's weather conditions must include an overcast or cloudy day, a gentle wind from the east and a calm and slick bay surface.
- Rising tide is necessary; a change to a falling tide will stop the jubilee.

#### **HUGH S. BRANYON BACKCOUNTRY TRAIL**

Nestled among tall pines, scrub oaks and 15 miles of trails is the addition of the new primitive outpost campsite. Reminiscent of a Huck Finn adventure, this amenity hosts three individual sites, constructed with canvas tents supported on rustic hardwood floors and roped together with framed recycled downed trees. 

# DISC GOLF AND SKATE PARKS

#### **DISC GOLF**

Disc golf is played much like traditional golf. Instead of a ball and clubs, however, players use a flying disc or Frisbee. The sport was formalized in the 1970s, and shares with "ball golf" the object of completing each hole in the fewest number of strokes (or in the case of disc golf, fewest number of throws).

A golf disc is thrown from a tee area to a target which is the "hole." The hole can be one of a number of disc golf targets; the most common is called a Pole Hole, an elevated metal basket. As a player progresses down the fairway, he or she must make each consecutive shot from the spot where the previous throw has landed. The trees, shrubs and terrain changes located in and around the fairways provide challenging obstacles for the golfer.

Finally, the "putt" lands in the basket and the hole is completed. Disc golf shares the same joys and frustrations of traditional golf, whether it's sinking a long putt or hitting a tree halfway down the fairway. There are a few differences, though. Disc golf rarely requires a greens fee, you probably won't need to rent a cart and you never get stuck with a bad tee time. It is designed to be enjoyed by people of all ages, male and female, regardless of economic status.



With more than 250,000 acres of waterways, woods and wetlands, 5 Rivers offers visitors opportunities to examine Baldwin County's Delta and wildlife. The large exhibit hall presents information on plant and animal life through an exceptional collection of photographs and taxidermy specimens. The 90-seat Tensaw Theater offers documentaries that focus on the local wildlife. The waterways of the Delta and Bay are accessible to visitors including daily excursions on the "Pelican," bringing the Delta estuary to life.



Baldwin County is home to a wide variety of city, county, state and federal parks, wildlife refuges and hiking, biking and canoe trails. Eclectic bay-front hideaways and charming downtown locals throughout the county host tennis and sports complexes and family-friendly playgrounds. BLACKBURN PARK, Often host to weddings, receptions, picnics and reunions, this park has fountain, picnic tables, water fountain, restrooms and a gazebo. JASMINE PARK, A three-acre park in a residential area with playground equipment suitable for small children. End of Jasmine Street.

**KNOLL PARK**, One of the highest elevations in the area is a wooded park featuring dozens of wildflower species, which is being restored to a longleaf pine forest, with some existing pines more than 130 years old. Left in its natural state, this location is popular for birdwatchers. Fairhope and Magnolia Avenues.

# **BEACH ACCESS**

There are no fees for beach access and parking is free (unless otherwise noted).

ALABAMA POINT EAST-A GULF STATE PARK BEACH AREA is located 0.3 miles east of Perdido Pass Bridge and offers over 6,000 feet of wide beach in addition to sand dunes, boardwalks, picnic areas, restrooms and outdoor showers.

**COTTON BAYOU** is located at the intersection of Highway 182 and Highway 161 between some of the area's most popular condominiums. There are restrooms and showers on site.

**ROMAR BEACH-A GULF STATE PARK BEACH AREA** is located 6.8 miles east of Highway 59 and has a limited amount of free parking (no facilities).

**THE GULF STATE PARK PAVILION** is located six miles east of Highway 59 and offers a new beach pavilion with air-conditioned restrooms, private showers, a snack bar, shady spots to sit and eat, plus a large fireplace for chilly days. There is a \$6 fee to park all day (\$12 for large vans).

**GULF PLACE (GULF SHORES MAIN PUBLIC BEACH)** is located where highway 59 dead-ends. There are beach attendants, three open-air pavilions, a picnic area, plus restrooms and showers onsite. Parking is \$5 for up to four hours or \$10 for all day between March 1 and November 30. Arrive early to get a prime spot in this popular hangout.

**GULF SHORES 2ND STREET PUBLIC** is just two blocks west of Highway 59. Facilities include a handicapped-accessible restroom, outdoor shower and a covered pavilion with picnic tables.

**GULF SHORES 4TH STREET PUBLIC BEACH** offers only pedestrian crossing beach access, perfect for those staying at nearby properties.

**GULF SHORES 5TH STREET PUBLIC BEACH** is located five blocks west of Highway 59 with parking on the north side where the boardwalk leads to the beach. Also, parking is available on the south side beside Bahama Bob's.

**GULF SHORES 6TH STREET PUBLIC BEACH** is located six block west of Highway 59 and you can walk the boardwalk to the beach. An outdoor shower is available as well as a handicapped-accessible restroom.

**GULF SHORES 10TH STREET PUBLIC BEACH** offers beach access only with parking across the street. Restrooms and showers are available.


**GULF SHORES 12TH STREET PUBLIC BEACH** offers beach access but no parking. Restrooms and showers are available.

**GULF SHORES 13TH STREET PUBLIC BEACH** has street-side parking with a dune walkover. Shower and restrooms are available.

LAGOON PASS BEACH is 2.9 miles west of Highway 59 with restrooms, outdoor shower and a water fountain onsite. Parking is \$5 for up to four hours or \$10 for all day and is located on the northeast side of the Lee Callaway Bridge.

BON SECOUR NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE BEACH is located at 12295 State Highway 180 (Fort Morgan Road) in Gulf Shores. You can park along Mobile Street for easy beach access. It is a wildlife refuge and therefore there are no facilities, but please note that the Refuge Office is located nearby.





Parker Kennels started twenty-one years ago in 1998, brought to life by a family with a plan.

"My son worked for one of the vets here in town, and they were always full," said owner Ronnie Parker. "He said to me one day, 'Dad, we need to build a kennel.' So I told him we would go and look to see what we could find out about doing just that. We did that and picked out what we liked, and then we designed it ourselves."

The Parker family built about 80 percent of the original building themselves, taking on the majority of the work. It was a family effort with their daughter, son and grandchildren. For the first four years of business, Ronnie ran the business with his wife, the only two employees onsite.

"You can't just jump in and hire people, not until you get your clientele," Parker said. "So we just built it up together, then finally we hired one employee, then two, and now we're up to seven employees plus two professional groomers."

During the off-season, the kennels are often half-full. Once the summer starts, they will become filled quickly. To offset the demand, a new facility was completed Oct. 22, 2019. The new building has 56 new kennels, adding to the existing building's 44 runs, for a total of 100. It makes Parker Kennels one of the largest, if not the largest, boarding facilities in the county. Parker credits the kennel's success to the employees and the community's support.

"I've got good employees, the girls work hard," said Parker. "They're dedicated, and they love animals. I grew up on a farm myself, so I've always been around animals, and it's an enjoyable job. It's nice to see the different dogs, each with their own personality, and most of the time they love seeing you too. I just enjoy doing this, it's a lot of fun."

The vets in the area send any overflow to Parker Kennels, especially during holidays. Along with the typical boarding, Parker Kennels employs two professional groomers who are onsite Monday through Friday. This, along with the staff's love of animals and the low prices, keeps customers coming back.

"The customers are pleased with our work, and we keep our prices down. We're one of the cheapest places in town," Parker said. "I've always figured it was quantity versus price, because you can price yourself out of business very easily. We've only raised our rates here one time in all of the 21 years we've been in business. Even though our business has almost tripled our pricing remains the same."

The kennels opened at \$12 per night, and now are only \$15 per night. For anyone who brings multiple pets to be boarded together, \$5 will be discounted from their total. Tourists who are staying in hotels that do not allow pets can leave them at Parker Kennels at night and pick them up during the day to take them along to the beach or to the park, and bring them back to the kennel before 5 p.m. Parker Kennels also offers \$8 daycare for pets, so owners don't have to leave dogs in crates throughout the day while they work.

"We try here, we try really hard, and the good Lord has blessed us," Parker said. "If it wasn't for Him we wouldn't be where we're at. It's good, and we love what we do."

Marine Resources Division of the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, who served as the commission's program administrator and is based in Gulf Shores. "When people buy local products, whether it is seafood, produce or other goods, it supports the local economy and keeps the money circulating in the local community.



# MARDI GRAS

It's a common misconception that New Orleans is the home of Mardi Gras, when in fact, it's South Alabama that originally paraded through the streets. The Mobile celebration started in 1719 and partied on to Baldwin County soon after. Today, crowds line both sides of the street to participate in this Gulf Coast tradition. Patrons catch MoonPies, doubloons, cups, beads, stuffed animals and other goodies.

#### **MARDI GRAS LINGO**

**FLOAT BARN:** secret location where Mardi Gras organizations build and keep their floats when it's not parading season.

**THROWS:** items thrown from parade floats, such as doubloons, MoonPies, beads, cups and stuffed animals.

**MOONPIES:** marshmallow cake, usually chocolate, banana or orange flavored. Newer flavors of coconut, vanilla, mint, peanut butter and salted caramel have recently been added.

LAISSEZ LES BON TEMPS ROULER: French for "Let the good times roll!"

**KING CAKE**: usually oval and braided, this cake is iced with traditional Mardi Gras colors. A tiny, plastic baby doll is hidden inside, and according to custom, whoever finds the baby in their piece of cake buys the next King Cake or throws the next party.

**KREWE:** Mardi Gras societies often refer to themselves collectively as a Krewe and often the term is part of the society's official name.

**BALL:** a celebration, usually after a parade, involving food, beverages, call-outs and dancing. Some organizations don't parade and just have Mardi Gras balls. Tickets are sold to some balls, while others require invitations from a society member.

#### **PARADE TIPS**

- » Travel lightly and carry a large bag to carry your throws home.
- » Carry small amounts of cash when possible as vendors and food carts often line the parade routes.
- » Leave purses and valuables at home.
- » Arrive early. Avoid traffic and find a close, well-lit parking spot.
- » Obey barricade ordinances. No jumping the barricades.
- » Check weather/parade route. Know whether to bring a jacket or umbrella, or if your parade time or route has changed.

- » Remember to tie your dog to your chair and not the table.





# Protect yourself from a flood disaster

#### **NATURAL AND BENEFICIAL FUNCTIONS**

The wetlands within Baldwin County are indispensable and fragile natural resources with significant development constraints due to flooding, erosion and soil limitations. In their natural state, wetlands serve man and nature. They provide habitat areas for fish, wildlife and vegetation; water quality maintenance and pollution control; flood control; erosion control; natural resource education; and many other causes. Damaging or destroying wetlands threatens public safety and the general welfare. It is therefore necessary for Baldwin County to ensure maximum protection for wetlands by discouraging development activities that may adversely affect wetlands.

Baldwin County regulates Stormwater Management policies through the Subdivision Regulations for all new developments. Developments which produce an increase in the amount of stormwater runoff are required to construct stormwater management facilities.

Baldwin County has provisions which impose requirements on persons engaged in land disturbing activities which require planning and implementation of effective sedimentation controls for individual lots and subdivision development sites.

#### **FLOOD HAZARD**

Baldwin County is virtually surrounded by water, with the exception of several miles in the extreme northeast bordering Escambia County with numerous bays, rivers, streams and arbitraries within the interior portions of the County.

Baldwin County faces its greatest threat of flooding from hurricanes and tropical storms, but coastal flooding can occur year-round. These storms can destroy many properties and cause damage to countless others. Even though property may have escaped flooding or damage from previous storms, it may not escape flooding or damage from the next storm.

To determine if your property is located in a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) contact the Baldwin County Building Inspection Department at (251) 972-6837.

#### FLOOD PROTECTION MEASURES

Every year, flooding causes more property damage in the

United States than any other type of natural disaster. While recent construction practices and regulations have made new homes less prone to flooding, many existing structures remain susceptible. Throughout the country there is a growing interest from property owners to develop practical and cost-effective methods for reducing or eliminating exposure to flooding.

There are many ways you can help protect your property and your possessions from flood damage. Property protection measures publications and assistance is available to you by contacting the Baldwin County Building Inspection Department at 251.972.6837 or by visiting your local libraries. You may also visit the FEMA website at www.fema.gov/


#### FLOOD SAFETY

Flood safety protection measures that are to be taken in the event of a hurricane or any other major storm event include having your electricity and gas turned off by the Power Company; not driving or walking through flowing water or any flooded area; and staying clear of any unstable stream banks. Be sure and stay tuned to your local television or radio station for weather updates. If you are required to evacuate, try to move to the house of a friend or family member not affected by the impending flood hazard. If you live in a mobile home, plan to evacuate at the first notice. Everyone should rehearse your evacuation plans with all household members and plan to leave early to avoid traffic delays. For additional information regarding Baldwin County's flood warning program, contact Baldwin County Emergency Management Agency at 251,972,6807.

#### FLOOD INSURANCE

Most mortgage lenders require flood insurance based on the location and elevation of the property. Flood damage, unlike wind damage, is not covered by homeowner's policies and must be purchased separately. Since Baldwin County is an NFIP community, federally backed flood insurance is available. There is typically a 30-day waiting period before a new flood insurance policy becomes effective. You are eligible for flood insurance, regardless of whether your property has never flooded, or has flooded several times in the past. All properties secured by a federally backed mortgage must carry flood insurance.

This circuit comprises the geographical limits of Baldwin County and is composed of five circuit court judges, two district court judges, one circuit clerk and one district attorney. The Circuit Court hears all civil matters where the amount in controversy exceeds \$10,000, all criminal prosecutions involving felony offenses and family court matters. The Circuit Court has concurrent jurisdiction with the District Court and in all civil matters where the amount in controversy exceeds \$3,000 but does not exceed \$10,000, exclusive of interest and costs. Additionally, the Circuit Courts exercise appellate jurisdiction over cases appealed from the District Courts, Probate Court, Baldwin County Municipal Courts and certain administrative and municipal boards.



The coroner is responsible for the determination of the cause and manner of death of a person who dies and is not under medical care.

All traumatic deaths, such as murder, suicide, accidental, motor vehicle and drowning are required by law to be reported to the coroner. Any person who may have died of natural causes, but was not under a doctor's care, by law, must also be reported to the coroner's office. It is the final responsibility of the coroner to execute and file a Certificate of Death with the Baldwin County Health Department (251-947-3618). The coroner must also review and certify all persons who desire to be cremated at the time of their death. In order to determine the cause and manner of death, the coroner may request an autopsy be conducted by the Alabama Department of Forensic Sciences located in Mobile; 251-471-7026




