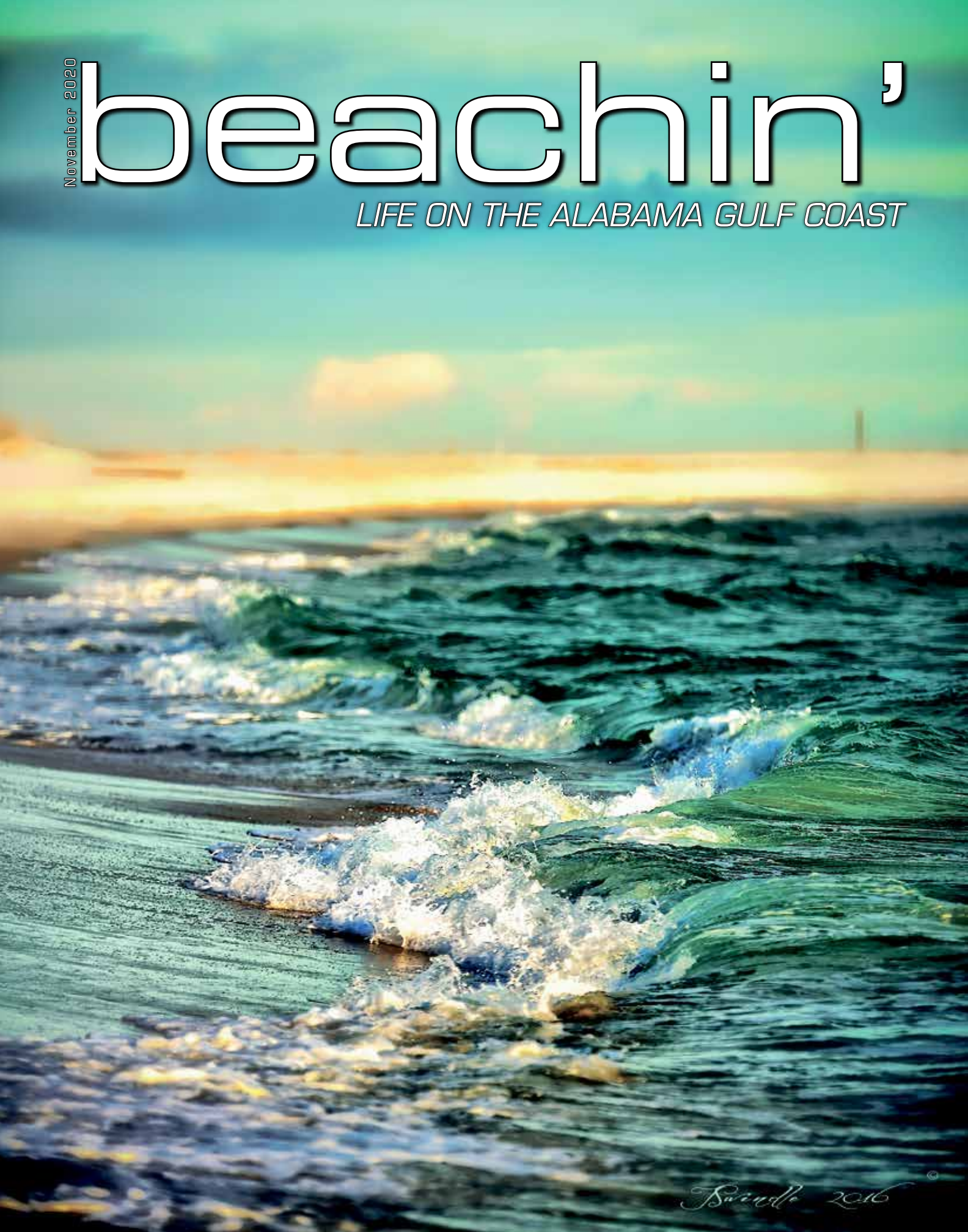

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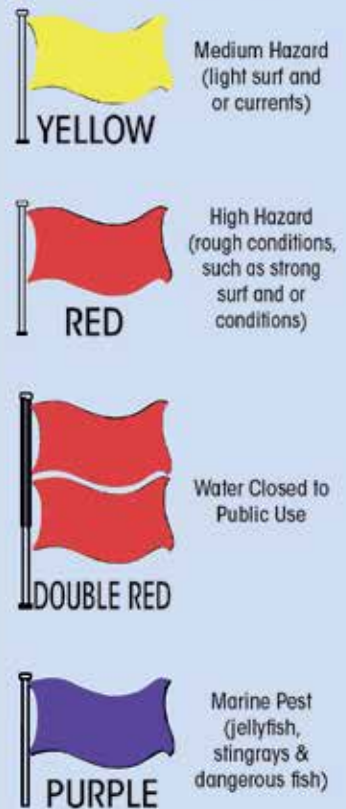
Welcome to the Beach

Please practice social distancing while enjoying our beautiful beaches!

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. Tents (no larger than a 10x10 ft.) are allowed on the beach, but they have to be placed behind (North of) the designated sign marker post and should be removed before night. Tents cannot be placed between the sign post and the Gulf of Mexico. This is for designated emergency and safety access.
2. Pets are not allowed on the beach on the Gulf of Mexico or surrounding islands (Robinson, Bird, Walker). However they are allowed at the designated city Dog Park on Canal Rd. (Hwy 180) next to Sportsman Marina. All dogs should remain on a leash within the city limits.
3. Glass in any form (bottle, cup, container, etc.) is strictly prohibited on our beaches and islands.
4. A yellow flag posted along gulf beaches means to use caution while swimming in the gulf waters and is permitted.
 - A red flag means danger and one should not swim in the waters.
 - Double red flags mean that swimming in the waters is prohibited by law.
 - Purple means WARNING! A jellyfish or other marine threat.
5. All trails and parks are free and open from daylight to dusk 7 days a week.
6. Fires or flames are strictly prohibited on the beach. This includes grills, tiki-torches, lanterns, open fire pits, candles, fireworks, etc.
7. Jet skis, boats, and any other motorized vessels, are prohibited from launching along the gulf front beaches.

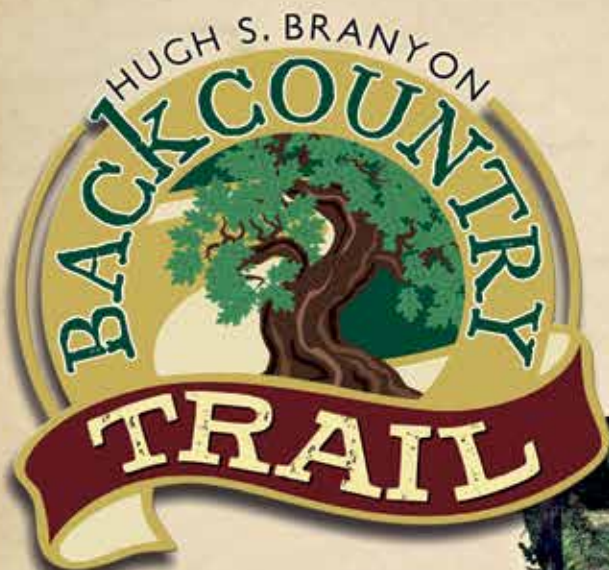

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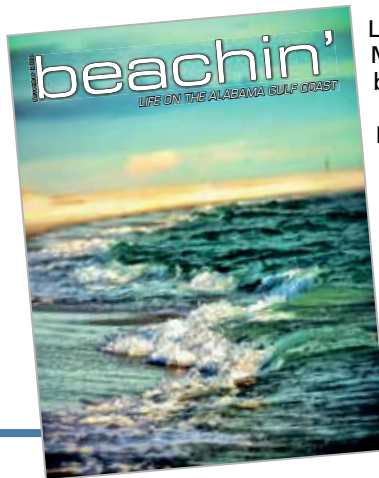

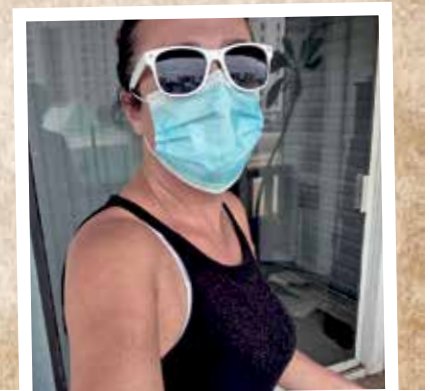
Uncertainty is definitely one of the words I would use to

Meteorologists say Hurricane Sally rumbled across Baldwin County as a solid Category 2 hurricane, demonstrating how powerful a Category 2 storm can be.

“I think people get fixated on how much damage a 3, 4 or 5 can do and don’t really comprehend the power of a Category 2 storm,” said Cody Lindsey, National Weather Service meteorologist in Mobile. “These lower end storms can do significant damage.”

Hurricane Sally registered sustained winds at 105 mph and gusted above 100 miles per hour, a speed that gave the storm destructive force. Thick, giant trees were downed in every community across the county. Telephone poles were snapped in half. Buildings and homes were destroyed or even blown away in some of the county’s most southern neighborhoods.

Though many residents assumed tornadoes spun out by the storm caused the majority of damage, Lindsey said hurricane winds caused the bulk of the damage.

“We had four hours of the hurricane eye wall coming into Baldwin County with wind gusts over 100 mph. It was a very large area of winds moving very

slowly,” he said. “All that wind damage is associated with the eye wall.”

The storm’s surge was highest in Pensacola at 5.60 feet. It is the third highest surge on record, behind levels brought by Hurricane Ivan and the hurricane of 1926.

Extreme amounts of rain, measuring nearly 30 inches in Orange Beach, also caused massive flash flooding.

2020 now marks one of the most active hurricane seasons on record, matching the number of storms seen in 2005 when Hurricane Katrina devastated New Orleans. Several converging factors such as warm ocean temperatures, favorable upper level winds and an active monsoon season on the African coast have led to the uptick in storms.

Hurricane season ends Nov. 30 and Lindsey said officials urge residents to prepare for more potential storms.

“We’re always encouraging folks to be ready ahead of time. It’s been so long since we’ve been through one and this was our first direct impact since Ivan,” Lindsey said. “So our constant message is to be prepared ahead of time.”

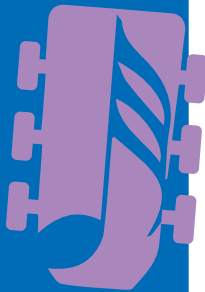
36TH ANNUAL FRANK BROWN INTERNATIONAL SONGWriters' FESTIVAL

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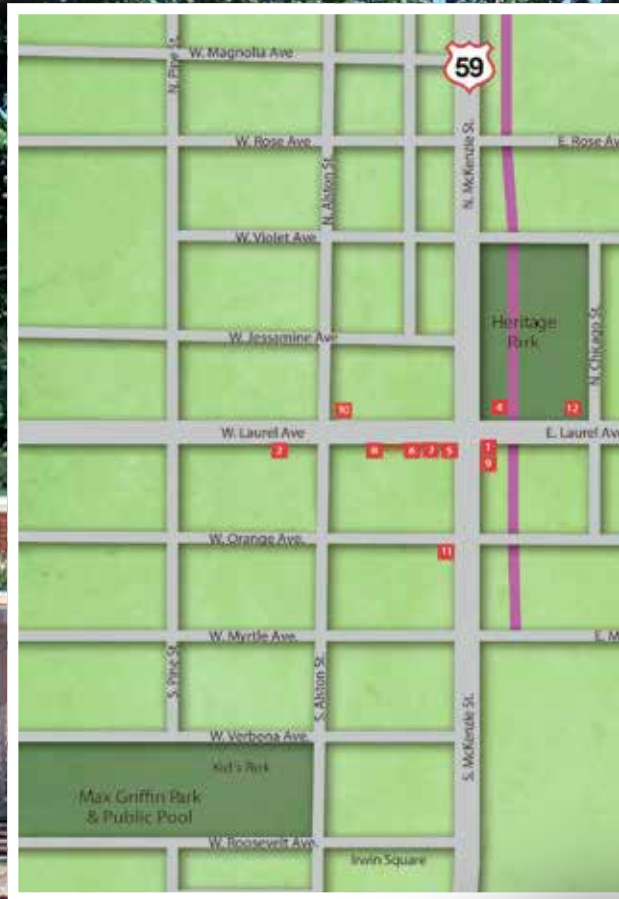

When hurricane season closes at the end of November, we can think of no better way to celebrate than with a handcrafted New Orleans style Hurricane from Gulf Shores' very own Lucy Buffett. Mix it with flair and enjoy this tasty concoction with the knowledge that this year, we've earned it.

NoLa Style Hurricane

Makes 1 drink

Ingredients

- 1 ounce Southern Comfort
- 1 ounce light rum
- ½ ounce Chambord raspberry liqueur
- 3 ounces orange juice
- 3 ounces unsweetened pineapple juice
- ½ ounce grenadine
- Splash of Bacardi 151 rum, optional
- Orange slice, pineapple wedge and cherry to garnish

Directions:

1. Fill a hurricane glass with ice.
2. Add Southern Comfort, light rum and raspberry liqueur.
3. Fill glass with equal parts orange juice and pineapple juice.
4. Add grenadine.
5. Shake vigorously ... shake it like a hurricane.
6. Top off drink with a splash of Bacardi 151.
7. Garnish with your choice of tropical fruits and a cherry.
