## Fairhope mayor responds to questions on barricade use, debris removal contracts

Writes she will try to remove city legal ads from The Courier

In a blog post on her official blog made Friday, Dec. 23, Fairhope Mayor Karin Wilson responded to questions made about a disaster debris removal contract non-renewal, made comments about the use of the city's barricades at a private event and shared her feelings

about The Courier's coverage of those issues.

Wilson first took aim at Gulf Coast Media managing editor Cliff McCollum's reporting on transcripts received by The Courier regarding Wilson's direction of an investigation by Elias Technologies into former city employees Sherry Sullivan and Jennifer

Fidler, in which Wilson had previously claimed she had no direct involvement.

In the Aug. 30 edition of The Courier, the article "The detail invoice that was sent I think will get me in trouble" contained a sentence on Page 2 that said "On July 7, Wilson writes that 'the police dept has lost trust' in her."

Mayor Karin Wilson's attorney Harry Satterwhite wrote in an August 31 letter to The Courier that, in the article's quoted transcript of instant messages referenced, Wilson was not speaking about the police department losing trust in her but instead that the police department had lost trust in the services

of its IT contractor.

Upon a careful second reading of the transcripts referenced in the Aug. 30 article, it was not clear to whom Wilson is referring when she states "the police dept has lost trust." Therefore the Courier retracted the words "in her."

"The retraction hap-

## City of Fairhope's statement on Roy Moore event security called into question

According to well-placed confidential sources, a statement given to The Courier by the City of Fairhope involving the use of city resources for a Sept. 25 rally for then U.S. Senate candidate Roy Moore at Oak Hollow Farm contained false information.

City-owned barricades and city employees were sent to Oak Hollow Farm prior to the event in a move that may have violated state law and established city protocol

regarding their usage.

### The city's statement

Attached to the documents given to The Courier via a public records request on Dec. 8 was a statement from the mayor's office, which reads as follows:

"The campaign for a candidate for the U.S. Senate seat, Roy Moore, scheduled a political event within the police jurisdiction of the City of Fairhope for September 25, 217 (sic). This event was scheduled without notice or advance consultation with Fairhope's

elected officials or employees.

"Subsequently, the Moore campaign learned that a nationally recognized public figure and former cabinet member (sic), Steve Bannon, intended to attend the event along with television celebrity, Phil Robertson. This turn of events caused the Moore Campaign to reach out to the City for reasons of public safety and security. An event of this magnitude was expected to draw national attention and media coverage. More importantly, such an event also draws

a far larger crowd bringing with it a host of public safety and security concerns.

"For these reasons, City officials and employees, including Chief Petties, worked with the Moore Campaign as well as members of U.S. Secret Service to implement standard safety and security protocols in order to protect the citizens of Fairhope, the attendees of the event within its police jurisdiction and the candidate and officials attending the event. Extraordinary expenditures necessitated by the event were invoiced

by the City and paid for by the Moore Campaign.

"Public safety and security is one of the paramount objectives of the City of Fairhope. When events such as the September 25th One (sic) is scheduled within the police jurisdiction of Fairhope it is incumbent on the City to properly prepare, plan and implement adequate safety procedures to insure the health safety and welfare of its citizens."

## Fairhope council passes resolutions involving signing authority

Mayor Wilson claims move an effort to "undermine" her

In a special called meeting held Dec. 29, the Fairhope City Council unanimously voted on two resolutions involving the ability to sign resolutions for the city, despite protests from Mayor Karin Wilson.

The first resolution

granted Council President Jack Burrell or Council President pro team Jay Robinson the ability to sign a resolution passed at the Dec. 18, 2017 council meeting that appointed Marcus McDowell as the new Fairhope city attorney. Wilson had refused to sign the resolution.

The second resolu-

tion authorized Burrell and Robinson to execute any resolution not of a permanent nature that the mayor refused or was unable to execute within seven calendar days after passage. The resolution would not limit Wilson's ability to veto resolutions or ordinances that were permanent in nature.

Robinson said the city had consulted the Alabama League of Municipalities before pursuing the passage of the second

resolution.

"This is something they recommended we do," Robinson said.

### Mayor Wilson's comments

Prior to the meeting, in a post on her official Facebook page on the night of Dec. 28, Wilson wrote the following:

"Council is calling a special meeting tomorrow morning at 8am. This is not for something pressing like passing

a budget — they've extended this decision to Jan 22nd — for the third time! Rather, it's an attempt to reduce my role as Mayor, once again, since I refused to sign the resolution to appoint Marcus McDowell to replace Tut Wynn as our new part-time City Attorney.

"I explained during the work session on Nov 27th why the City needed

pened, but the damage to the City was done,” Wilson wrote on her blog. “He knew the statement was malicious and Gulf Coast Media knew, or should have known, that this statement was totally false, yet they published it anyway.”

Wilson also posted a screenshot of McCollum and a Facebook post he made about the threat of litigation.

“Attempting to destroy the reputation of a city, stirring up unnecessary drama and spinning the truth is no joking matter,” Wilson wrote. “And it is costing our City greatly.”

### Use of city barricades

Wilson then addressed The Courier’s article about the use of city barricades that may have been improperly used at a Sept. 25 rally for then U.S. Senate candidate Roy Moore at Oak Hollow Farm.

“A few days ago, another hit-piece article by the same person insinuated that the City may have violated state law with the use of our city barricades. If he knew the whole process started with a city councilman reaching out to one of the city employees to help out a fraternity brother whose father worked for the Roy Moore campaign, maybe he wouldn’t have started the ‘investigative’ story,” Wilson wrote.

In The Courier story posted online Dec. 23 before Wilson’s blog post and printed Dec. 27, The Courier did address that Councilman Jimmy Conyers had been involved in the process.

“Councilman Jimmy Conyers said he had been contacted by the Moore

campaign prior to the event and had been asked for the city’s assistance, but Conyers said he gave them (Community Development Director Sherry-Lea Bloodworth) Botop’s contact information and did not have any further involvement with the event or usage of city property,” the article said.

Wilson continued by saying she was unaware of the details about the event until questions were asked.

“The ‘state law’ violated was that council should not direct city employees,” Wilson wrote. “That is the role of the mayor and I was never contacted. In fact, I didn’t know about the details of what happened until the ‘reporter’ started asking questions. Bottom line, barricades were used to protect citizens and all City expenses were reimbursed when the invoice was paid. The probe is simply embarrassing and a waste of time.”

### Disaster debris removal contract

Wilson also addressed at length questions raised about the expiration of a disaster debris removal contract that was held by Pittman Tractor Company that was re-bid and given to another company.

Wilson took issue with the questions asked by The Courier.

“I received the following email yesterday questioning why I misled council and the public about the debris removal contract,” Wilson wrote. “As with most of his negative reporting on my administration, he takes the questions he’s been fed from his secret sources, presumes the questions are fact-based, uses sensationalized headlines, confuses the public and

ultimately further divides the office of the mayor and council. His questions are typical of his reporting – he implies I’m guilty and asks how I wish to respond and invites council to point fingers – which they do. When he finishes his articles, you will also notice there are never any ‘unavailable for comment’ responses from detractors as his articles are intended to be a platform for, and pander to, council, disgruntled city employees and adversaries. Therefore a response from me is not important for these articles. However, I will bring the facts to the citizens as always – the same facts that were shared with council in July so they could make an informed decision.”

On Monday, July 10, 2017, Fairhope Special Assistant Lynn Maser emailed The Courier instructing that questions for Wilson would have to be sent through her.

“This email is to let you know that from now forward requests for comments from the Mayor’s office should be directed to my office,” Maser wrote. “Thank you for your help in this matter.”

The Courier has complied with Wilson’s request to do so. The Courier is able to directly contact each of the council members via phone and email

without going through a second party.

Wilson said she chose to wait to see the article come out rather than responding to The Courier’s questions directly.

“I decided not to answer the questions and instead waited until he posted the article to see what was written, again without facts, and see how the detractors responded,” Wilson wrote. “I had this blog ready to post and everything came out exactly as I predicted.”

Wilson said she had requested then Purchasing Manager Dan Ames rebid all of the city’s contracts in January, but took his advice and did not rebid contracts if there wasn’t “ample time for the RFP process.”

“As a new mayor, it was important for me to not only look at all expenses to ensure the City is receiving the best service and price, but also give opportunity for other qualified businesses to bid,” Wilson wrote. “These RFP (request for proposals) go out to ever (sic) qualified company on our bid list, which included Pittman Tractor.”

Wilson said the city did not receive an RFP from Pittman tractor, as they declined to submit a bid before the deadline. Wilson said she contacted Pittman Tractor owner, State

Senator Trip Pittman, who told her he had received the RFP but chose not to bid due to his campaign for the U.S. Senate seat at that time.

Wilson said she was concerned about the timing of the RFP for this contract.

“The biggest concern I explained to council was the fact that this RFP did not go out until six months after I requested it,” Wilson wrote. “The email referenced was sent to me and council on July 24 at 2:58 p.m. This was the day of the council meeting and the day the contract with Pittman Tractor expired!”

The email referenced in The Courier’s question was actually sent July 20.

According to emails obtained by The Courier between Wilson and Ames, Pittman Tractor’s contract expired before July 24.

“Please bring me a copy of the full bid for Pittman’s old contract which expired today and the winning bid from the new process that was going to be walked on last night,” Wilson wrote in a Jan. 11 email.

Wilson wrote that “she was made aware of the email for the first time when Dan (Ames) presented it to me minutes before the meeting started that day,” which she wrote was July 24.

However, on July 19, Wilson asked Ames via

email if he had received a letter from Pittman stating his company would extend the same contract or if it was just a phone conversation.

Ames replied July 20 that he had received a phone call from Pope July 10 and quoted the same message in sent in a July 10 email.

“I have received a call from John L. Pope, of Pittman Tractor Co., the current contract holder,” Ames wrote. “He said he would be willing to extend the current amount for an additional year, if it is in the best interest of the City to do so.”

Wilson confirmed she received Ames response at 8:45 a.m. on July 20 via email.

Wilson goes on to write in her blog post that the agenda item involving the contract was not voted on at the July 24 meeting.

“A bid like this should have been on a work session to discuss the evaluation in detail,” Wilson wrote. “This agenda item was being walked on to the council meeting expecting an answer. Council President Burrell stated it would have to wait - it was too big of a decision to add that night.”

The council did vote on July 24 to award the bid to D&J Enterprises in a unanimous vote, despite questions and concerns from Burrell.

In the blog post, Wilson wrote she stood by her assertion that Pittman Tractor did not want to extend the contract.

“If Pittman wanted to extend the contract, they would have responded to the bid request before the deadline and that simply did not happen,” Wilson wrote. “To accept Pittman’s bid after the deadline not only taints the bid process it is also unfair to those who took the time to submit bids. It could also have subjected the city to a potential lawsuit and liability.”

Wilson wrote she felt she did not mislead the council about the contract.

“Council was well-informed (including the email sent to them on July 23),” Wilson wrote. “If council had concerns or questions, none responded to this email or asked any questions.”

Wilson sent an email on July 23 to two council members, Jay Robinson and Jimmy Conyers. Burrell and Councilmen Kevin Boone and Robert Brown do not appear on the email received list.

“I wanted to send you the facts about the Debris Removal contract for you to read through,” Wilson wrote. “I want to point out that I did call Tripp Friday and he chose not to rebid and felt timing-wise with campaign not good. Nevertheless, consideration for an extension should have

been considered in May as it was last year. No letter was sent for an extension agreement and Pittman decided not to re-bid which is what I requested the beginning of the year which should make the decision easier to make which is to go with Dan’s recommendation for the lowest responsible bidder D&J.”

Wilson explained the bid process and then said:

“The City is not required to accept the lowest bid,” Wilson wrote. “It must exercise good faith to determine the lowest ‘responsible’ bidder. Many factors can go into that determination. Also, the City is not required to accept any bids, but instead may reject all bids. But doing

so now, in my opinion, would be highly criticized. Ken stated the city could “Possibly, reject all bids and renew the contract with Pitmann. However, I do not recommend this course without doing additional research”

Wilson attached a review from Volkert’s Disaster Services Manager Kirby McCrary dated July 10 in which McCrary lays out a case for not renewing the contract if the city chose to do so.

McCrary wrote that the instructions to bidders stated that the city “will award to the lowest responsible bidder, it goes on to indicate the City has the right to reject all bids if it’s in their best interest to do so.”

After posting links to the email and review she sent Robinson and Conyers, Wilson wrote “As you

can see, council was given all the facts,” though her emails do not show them being sent to Burrell, Brown or Boone.

**Removal of city legal ads from The Courier**

Wilson then wrote the following:

“I hope the editor will begin to recognize that leaked documents and misinformation he’s being fed are coming from politicians and special interests that want to see me fail,” Wilson wrote. “But because I have only one agenda – to make positive changes and enhancements in our great City in a meaningful way – it has been more difficult than they expected.”

“It has gotten a lot easier to ignore the lies and innuendo directed at me, however, when these articles start costing the

City in unnecessary legal fees, disparaging City staff and subjecting the City to unwarranted liability – all at taxpayers expense mind you – I will come back with the same tenacity that got me elected and will continue to give you the facts.”

Wilson said she would research an alternate way to run the city’s required legal ads.

“The Courier is primarily funded by legal ads,” Wilson wrote. “Since the Courier has relinquished its role as a legitimate primary publication of record for the City of Fairhope, I will be seeking an alternate source in which to place our legal ads. You deserve better.”

According to the Code of Alabama, in order to be a newspaper allowed to publish such legals that “All publications required

by any law, mortgage, or other contract to be published in a newspaper must be published in any newspaper printed in the English language which has a general circulation in the county, regardless of where the paper is printed, if the principal editorial office of the newspaper is located within the county and which newspaper shall have been mailed under the publication class mail-

ing privilege of the United States Postal Service from the post office where it is published for at least 51 weeks a year.”

The Courier and Gulf Coast Media are the only newspapers in general circulation in Baldwin County which have their principal editorial office located within the county.

At Diversicare, staff members gave Christian a smaller celebration complete with balloons, cake and a sparkly crown for the birthday girl. Staff struggled with one question. What gift to buy a 100-year-old?

Christian told the staff she wanted nothing except a life she loved and trust in the Lord for those made the best day ever. The party décor, balloons, plates and cups, all gold, sparkly and pink, each bore the phrases "Trust in the Lord," "A life you love" and "Blessed."

"It was just perfect," Chambers said.

### Solving the Traffic Problem in Orange Beach

Roads are the lifeblood of a community, moving prosperity, maintaining economic flow. The ones in Orange Beach do not perform well, especially during the peak-tourist season. We must find a better way to move traffic or we must reduce development, because the countdown is ticking for a summertime solution.

When government pours money into local economies jobs are created, according to a stimulus theory espoused by John Maynard Keynes. In Orange Beach development has outpaced infrastructure, requiring government to come in. They are investing millions-of dollars in the local economy, re-balancing the development-to-infrastructure equation, spurring economic growth, and alleviating congestion on our roads.

Visitors do not care if it's the State's road, it passes through our town and City Council must answer for what is perceived to be poor planning on the part of elected officials. In recent memory, traffic complaints were innumerable, prompting Mayor Kennon to put the Governor's telephone number on the electronic sign in front of City Hall, telling people to call Montgomery.

"All I know is we need a road through the State Park," said Mayor Tony Kennon in an interview with John Mullen of the Lagniappe, putting commerce ahead of environmental impact, supporting development of the natural resource the State Park was created to protect.

The Gulf Restoration Project lawsuit settlement

(\$53 Million) prohibits building a road across the State Park for the next 20 years, according to the Lagniappe. Mayor

Kennon is frustrated that officials from Orange Beach were not consulted prior to the settlement, acknowledging the settlement virtually erased any chance to build a direct route from the Beach Express to the Beach Road for a generation.

"That was part of the settlement that was able to get the lawsuit settled and us moving forward," said Chris Blankenship, Commissioner of Alabama's Department of Conservation and Natural Resources' (DCNR).

We must plan an alternative route, going east from the Beach Express, skirting around the State Park. The city disavows any responsibility for traffic problems on State roads, saying it is not a local issue but one for the State of Alabama, arguing the revenue sent by the beach community is supporting their General Fund, implying the State should repatriate dollars to solve the beach's traffic problem. At some point the beach community will own up to the fact that locally-approved developments fueled this expansion, causing traffic congestion. Once partial guilt is accepted, solving the traffic issue becomes a partnership with the State, letting them provide input on developments with the city supply feedback on infrastructure. Both sides discussing additional-developer fees to pay for road improvements, understanding that fee increases for the developers are not going to go down well.

Funding is always a key issue in Orange Beach because we treasure our reserves.

The new school being built on Canal Road is a good example of the thought process, getting someone else to pony-up \$14.7 million for our children's school was a stroke of negotiated genius, but now that everyone in the county has seen the jet-sweep, evaluating different strategic options is our only choice.

Sain Associates wrote Orange Beach's traffic counts. For a typical summer weekend we had 1796 cars per hour come down the Foley Beach Express, turning onto Canal Road (SR-180). On the Beach Road we had 2436 vehicles per hour down SR-182, according to documents on the city's old website. Obviously the major holidays like Memorial Day, Independence Day and Labor Day generate more traffic, but you get the idea. Development has outgrown capacity, tarnishing Orange Beach's image.

For the best possible traffic flow, making all the arteries five lanes, matching the capacities on every passageway is the common-sense approach. Finding the funds to pay for it is easy, but whose funds will be tapped is another question.

Arguing strongly against a "free bridge" for Orange Beach, because it only benefits a few people in the State is espoused by a couple of political groups. "Ending the push for a \$30 million Government Bridge to the Gulf Coast and allowing a public-private partnership to solve that problem would be a great place to start. As such, there is no justification for shaking more money out of Alabama families and businesses. Alabama's transportation woes can be solved without a net tax increase, encouraging public-private partners rather than com-

peting with them," said Grover Norquist, President of Americans for Tax Reform, a non-profit taxpayer advocacy group, and Marty Connors, Chairman of the Alabama Center Right Coalition.

Mayor Kennon told Fox10 News, "You can't stop the growth. It's coming whether you like it or not." Are the constituents comfortable, knowing their City Council has an insatiable appetite for big developments and the dollars they bring?

In the playbook, Orange Beach officials have eaten up a lot of clock with Town Halls, inviting Montgomery to show its hand, promising a bridge across Wolf Bay to County Road 20, promising a bridge to the west of the Beach Express, promising five lanes down Canal Road, giving residents hope that the traffic nightmare will soon be over.

Not so fast. Environmentalists, Americans for Tax Reform, and Alabama Center Right Coalition will certainly file separate actions in Federal Court, moving to impede the proposed bridges, stating various ideological reasons, possibly taking years to settle.

I suggest an unpopular approach, studying the consequences of local re-zoning, putting a moratorium on development until Council can determine what level of fees are right for infrastructure compensation, leveraging the developers' purse versus the City's ability to assess premium fees for ambitious projects. We must find a better way to move traffic or we must reduce development, because the countdown is ticking for a summertime solution.

# Mountaineers dismantle Rockets

The Dollar General Bowl has often produced some of the season's most highly competitive and closest games. On Dec. 23 however, it wasn't a close endeavor as the Appalachian State Mountaineers (9-4) dismantled the Toledo Rockets (11-3) 34-0.

This bowl game was one of three bowl games to feature a matchup of two conference champions. The Rockets were a huge favorite to beat the Mountaineers as they had one of the most explosive offenses in the nation and ranked eighth in total

offense (510 yards average yards per game).

The defense of Appalachian State had their defensive linemen in the backfield constantly and also had multiple blitz packages to add pressure. The goal of the Mountaineers defense was to pressure one of the best passing quarterbacks in the nation in the Rockets' Logan Woodside. Overall, the Mountaineers' defense held the Rockets offense to 146 total yards and forced five total turnovers including three interceptions from Woodside. Appalachian

State held Woodside to 124 passing yards on 16 completions (out of 29 attempts) and held the run game to 38 rushing yards. The Mountaineers defense accounted for four sacks and seven total tackles against the Rockets offense.

Appalachian State utilized a heavy run-game throughout the entire game. At first, the Mountaineers initiated the triple-option offense to throw off the Rockets defense through the play-decision of their quarterback Taylor Lamb. They used Jalin Moore to run through holes created by the offensive line for longer yards. Moore rushed

for 125 yards on 22 carries (an average of 5.7 yards per rush) and three touchdowns.

Moore was selected as the Dollar General Bowl MVP and Mountaineers Anthony Flory was the defensive MVP. Flory was the team's leading tackler with eight total tackles and an interception.

When asked about how the interception set the tone for the defense, Flory said,

"I think it just gave us that momentum that (we) needed. Our coach always preaches about momentum and keeping the momentum. I feel like that was a good way to get the momentum to our side."

## AHSAA central board approves classification for 2018-19, 2019-20 seasons

**MONTGOMERY** — The Alabama High School Athletic Association Central Board of Control unanimously approved Nov. 30 a seven-classification system for championship play for the 2018-19 and 2019-20 school years. For the first time for classification, non-traditional students were included in the average daily membership figures reported for member public schools by the Alabama State Department of Education and a competitive balance factor was approved for AHSAA member private schools based on the recommendation of the AHSAA Classification Task Force.

The action came during the Central Board's quarterly meeting at the AHSAA Office.

Non-traditional students, which gained eligibility for the first time in the 2016-17 school year, include home-school and virtual school students that enroll in at member public school.

In accordance with the AHSAA constitution and by-laws, the AHSAA Central Board of Control manages championship play and classification. Member schools are reclassified every two years. The high schools are currently divided into seven classifications (1A, 2A, 3A, 4A, 5A, 6A and 7A) for competition in championship programs.

Classification is based

on Average Daily Membership (ADM) figures furnished by the State Department of Education for public schools for the upper three grades plus ninth-grade students that are retained in the ninth grade. Member private schools report that same data directly to the AHSAA. An index of 1.35 is used to determine the enrollment figure for classifying each private school member. Each private school student counts 1.35 for classification purposes.

Alignments are made for each sport in a classification based on the number of schools participating in a sport. Some programs may include two or more classes in a division. The alignments for each sport in a class are published in the AHSAA Sports Book each year.

The AHSAA Classification Task Force, made up of superintendents, principals, athletic directors, administrators and coaches from across the state and chaired by Madison County Schools Superintendent Mark Massey and Montgomery Academy Athletic Director Anthony McCall, addressed many issues concerning the membership including competitive balance between schools in the respective classes.

The committee unanimously recommended adding a competitive balance factor to private

schools by sport. While private schools are classified based on the membership data and 1.35 multiplier, those affected by the competitive balance factor will move up one class or division from where they are this school year for the respective sport but will remain in their respective classification for all other sports.

Reclassification, according to the AHSAA Constitution and By-Laws, is conducted every two years by the AHSAA Central Board of Control.

"I want to thank the Classification Task Force, Central Board and AHSAA staff for the hard work they put in and the recommendations they made," AHSAA Executive Director Steve Savarese said. "It was a difficult job, but everyone worked together to find the best solution as we move forward."

Central Board president John Hardin said he also wanted to thank the Classification Task Force and member schools for their input and patience throughout the reclassification process. "On behalf of the Central Board of Control and our member schools, I want to thank Mr. Savarese and his staff for their hard work. I also want to thank our Central Board for their commitment and dedication to providing a first-class athletic program to all our student-athletes, and for making

decisions that are best for all of our member schools."

This is the earliest classification has been completed for all sports in AHSAA history and couldn't have been accomplished without the tireless passion, dedication and commitment of the AHSAA staff, which is evident by the quality product they produced, said AHSAA Executive Director Steve Savarese.

Reclassification of AHSAA member schools is done every two years in accordance with the constitution and by-laws in an effort to provide fair play among member schools. The constitution states in Article 7, Item 4 (1): The Central Board shall have the power to classify member schools into two or more divisions for the purpose of athletic competition. No school's classification shall be changed during the classification period after the schools have been classified.

## Seth Meyers has a challenging job as first-time Golden Globes host

Debuting as a Golden Globes host for the awards' 75th anniversary, Seth Meyers knows much more is involved than celebrating the past and giving out trophies.

The NBC "Late Night" host and "Saturday Night Live" alum is keenly aware of one of the main subjects that's been on the entertainment world's collective mind in recent weeks and months: harassment. He admits he's figuring out how he'll deal with that in front of a large room of television and movie personalities at the year's first major show-biz-awards event, which his home network will televise Sunday, Jan. 7, from the Beverly Hilton Hotel in Los Angeles.

"I don't know if we'll be the bellwether" for how award hosts address the conversation that has dominated the industry lately, Meyers reflects, "but certainly, we are aware that we are the first to go out. The most important thing for us is striking a balance in talking about what everybody is talking about, away from the Golden Globes,

while also making sure that we use the night to celebrate all the great work that's been done.

"Obviously, this has not been a great year for Hollywood insofar as what we've learned about things that were happening," adds Meyers, "but it also was a great year insofar as the product that came out. I'm sure that's the balance everybody will be trying to strike during the awards season."

The Golden Globe nominations span such 2017 TV offerings as "Big Little Lies," "The Handmaid's Tale" and "The Sinner," plus theatrical releases including "Lady Bird," "The Post" and "I, Tonya." Oprah Winfrey will receive the Cecil B. DeMille Award for what is cited as her "impact on the world of entertainment," and the Golden Globe Ambassador (the title that previously was Mr. or Miss Golden Globe) will be Dwayne Johnson's daughter, Simone Garcia Johnson.

A certain amount of prep was started by Meyers and his staff as soon as the nominees were announced last month, but he allows, "History shows that the closer you get (to the show, in writing material), the

better the jokes are." Meyers notes that his past dealings with the Hollywood Foreign Press Association, the group behind the awards, have been "all very pleasant, so we shall see."

While he's a first-time host of the occasion, Meyers — who soon will be a second-time parent with wife Alexi, and is an executive producer of the upcoming NBC school sitcom "A.P. Bio" — isn't a stranger to the Golden Globes, having been a writer for fellow "SNL" veterans Tina Fey and Amy Poehler when they've hosted the ceremony. He acknowledges that they and Ricky Gervais have put particular stamps on the job: "I feel like Ricky turned it into a night for jokes. I don't know if it was that as much before he showed up, then certainly, Amy and Tina were without peer when they did it.

"What I like about it is that the things they did so well, and that I think made the Globes memorable, are the things I like trying to do the most. On the backs of the jokes that are told, the room feels a little looser and invites you to try to get away with a little bit more. That part of it is the fun challenge."

## Seasonal flu death estimate increases worldwide

According to new estimates published today, between 291,000 and 646,000 people worldwide die from seasonal influenza-related respiratory illnesses each year, higher than a previous estimate of 250,000 to 500,000 and based on a robust, multinational survey.

The new estimate, from a collaborative study by CDC and global health

partners, appears today in *The Lancet*. The estimate excludes deaths during pandemics.

“These findings remind us of the seriousness of flu and that flu prevention should really be a global priority,” says Joe Bresee, M.D., associate director for global health in CDC’s Influenza Division and a study co-author.

The new estimates use more recent data, taken from a larger and more diverse group of countries than previous estimates.

Forty-seven countries contributed to this effort. Researchers calculated annual seasonal influenza-associated respiratory deaths for 33 of those countries (57 percent of the world’s population) that had death records and seasonal influenza surveillance information for a minimum of four years between 1999 and 2015. Statistical modeling with those results was used to generate an

# Alabama experiences significant influenza activity this season

Influenza activity levels are increasing across the State of Alabama. Several positive influenza (flu) specimens in north Alabama have been reported in the previous three weeks.

While the flu season is just getting started in much of the country, activity is already elevated in Alabama with providers reporting 3.59 percent of outpatient visits due to influenza-like illness.

Flu is a very contagious respiratory illness. Some of the symptoms of influenza include fever, cough, sore throat, runny/stuffy nose, headache, muscle aches, and extreme fatigue.

“Providers reporting increased percentages of patients with influenza-like illness and influenza samples sent to public health provide an indication of the geographic spread of influenza in

Alabama,” said Dr. Karen Landers, District Medical Officer. “This is concerning because influenza can be a serious disease for anyone, even children, pregnant women, and previously healthy young adults.”

An annual influenza vaccination is recommended for everyone 6 months and older and is the best prevention against getting the flu. Physicians, pharmacists

and county health departments can provide flu vaccinations for Alabamians. Request the “quadrivalent vaccine,” the one that protects against four influenza strains, because one of the strains in circulation in Alabama (Type B/Yamagata) is only included in the quadrivalent vaccine.

In addition to taking the flu vaccine, other measures can reduce or prevent the spread of

influenza. These include staying at home when sick, covering the mouth and nose with a tissue/cloth when coughing or sneezing, and washing hands or using hand sanitizer frequently.

“Even healthy people can get very sick from the flu and spread it to others. It’s not too late to get a flu shot to protect against this serious disease. People become protected about two weeks after re-

ceiving the vaccine,” said Dr. Landers.

Contact your private provider, pharmacy or local county health department to receive an influenza vaccination.

## Ahn receives Mayer Mitchell Award for Excellence in Cancer Research

MOBILE — Mobile cancer researcher Erin Eun-Young Ahn, Ph.D., has been named the recipient of the 2017 Mayer Mitchell Award for Excellence in Cancer Research.

The award, announced Dec. 7, 2017, is presented annually to a promising scientist at USA Mitchell Cancer Institute upon the recommendation of a faculty committee. It includes a \$10,000 prize. The award was established in 2009 by USA Trustee Arlene Mitchell in memory of her late husband, Mayer Mitchell, a Mobile businessman, longtime USA trustee and formative figure in the establishment of MCI.

Ahn, an associate professor of oncologic sciences at MCI, focuses her

research on the regulation of gene expression in cancer development and progression, with a special interest in leukemia. In 2015, she was awarded a five-year \$1.7 million R01 grant from the National Cancer Institute to study the role of the SON protein in the development of leukemia.

“Dr. Ahn discovered that the SON gene controls the behavior of the genetic material in cells and that the SON protein enables the formation of leukemias and brain tumors. Her work may provide a pathway for new classes of treatment for these cancers,” said Dr. Arthur “Art” Frankel, interim associate director of Basic and Translational Sciences.

Ahn joined MCI in 2012 after working as an assistant project scientist at the Moores Cancer Center at the University of California, San Diego. She received a Ph.D. in Molecular and Cellular Pathology from the University of Alabama at Birmingham and post-doctoral training at the Scripps Research Institute and Moores Cancer Center.

Upon receiving the award Thursday, Ahn spoke directly to young researchers in the crowd. “Think about what you want to achieve after many years, and have a big dream,” she said.

Ahn is the recipient of numerous professional awards, including international awards for

research in leukemia and allied conditions from Lady TATA Memorial Trust, United Kingdom. Her research on the SON gene has been published

in the prestigious journal *Molecular Cell*.

# Sleep Cycle announces 2017 sleep report

It turns out that a good night's sleep doesn't always guarantee a good mood: in 2017, Millennials went to bed the latest, woke up latest and had the best overall sleep quality but woke up in the worst mood compared to all other age groups. # Preventing carbon monoxide poisoning after an emergency

Carbon monoxide (CO) is an odorless, colorless gas that can cause sudden illness and death if inhaled. When power outages occur during natural disasters and other emergencies, the use of alternative sources of fuel or electricity for heating or cooking can cause CO to build up in a home, garage, or camper and to poison the people and animals inside.

During a power outage, never use generators, grills, or other gasoline-, propane-, or charcoal-burning devices inside your home, garage, or carport or near doors, windows, or vents. They produce carbon monoxide, an odorless, colorless gas that kills more than 500 Americans each year.

## Highlights

- Generators, grills, camp stoves, or other gasoline, propane, natural gas, or charcoal-burning devices should never be used inside a home, basement, garage, or camper – or even outside near an open window.
- Every home should have at least one working carbon monoxide detector. The detector's batteries should be checked at least twice annually, at the same time smoke detector batteries are checked.

Carbon monoxide (CO) is an odorless, colorless gas that can cause sudden illness and death if inhaled.

When power outages occur during emergencies such as hurricanes or winter storms, the use

of alternative sources of fuel or electricity for heating, cooling, or cooking can cause CO to build up in a home, garage, or camper and to poison the people and animals inside.

Every year, more than 400 people die in the U. S. from accidental non-fire related CO poisoning.

CO is found in combustion fumes, such as those produced by small gasoline engines, stoves, generators, lanterns, and gas ranges, or by burning charcoal and wood. CO from these sources can build up in enclosed or partially enclosed spaces. People and animals in these spaces can be poisoned and can die from breathing CO.

## How to Recognize CO Poisoning

Exposure to CO can cause loss of conscious-

ness and death. The most common symptoms of CO poisoning are headache, dizziness, weakness, nausea, vomiting, chest pain, and confusion. People who are sleeping or who have been drinking alcohol can die from CO poisoning before ever having symptoms.

## Important CO Poisoning Prevention Tips

- Never use a gas range or oven to heat a home.
- Never leave the motor running in a vehicle parked in an enclosed or partially enclosed space, such as a garage.
- Never use a generator, pressure washer, or any gasoline-powered engine inside your home, basement, or garage or less than 20 feet from any window, door, or vent.
- When using a generator, use a battery-pow-

ered or battery backup CO detector in your home.

- Never run a generator, pressure washer, or any gasoline-powered engine inside a basement, garage, or other enclosed structure, even if the doors or windows are open, unless the equipment is professionally installed and vented. Keep vents and flues free of debris, especially if winds are high. Flying debris can

- block ventilation lines.
- Never use a charcoal grill, hibachi, lantern, or portable camping stove inside a home, tent, or camper.
- If conditions are too hot or too cold, seek shelter with friends or at a community shelter.
- If CO poisoning is suspected, call 911 or your local Poison Control Center at 1-800-222-1222 or consult a health care professional right away.

estimate of the number of flu-associated respiratory deaths for 185 countries across the world. Data from the other 14 countries were used to validate the estimates of seasonal influenza-associated respiratory death from the statistical models.

**Poorest nations, older adults hit hardest by flu**

Researchers calculated region-specific estimates and age-specific mortal-

ity estimates for people younger than 65 years, people 65-74 years, and people 75 years and older. The greatest flu mortality burden was seen in the world's poorest regions and among older adults. People age 75 years and older and people living in sub-Saharan African countries experienced the highest rates of flu-associated respiratory deaths. Eastern Mediterranean and Southeast Asian countries had slightly lower but still high rates of flu-associated respiratory deaths.

Despite World Health Organization recommendations to use flu vaccination to help protect people in high-risk populations, few developing countries have seasonal flu vaccination programs or the capacity to produce and distribute seasonal or pandemic vaccines.

**Global flu surveillance protects all nations, including U.S.**

CDC works with global partners to improve worldwide capacity for influenza prevention and control. CDC has helped

more than 60 countries build surveillance and laboratory capacity to rapidly detect and respond to influenza threats, including viruses with the potential to cause global pandemics. These efforts, along with technical support, has helped some partners generate estimates of influenza-associated deaths, which contributed to this global effort.

Global surveillance also provides the foundation for selecting the viruses used to make seasonal flu vaccines each year. This helps improve the effec-

tiveness of flu vaccines used in the United States. Global surveillance also is crucial to pandemic preparedness by identifying viruses overseas that might pose a human health risk to people in the United States.

"This work adds to a growing global understanding of the burden of influenza and populations at highest risk," says CDC researcher Danielle Luciano, lead author of *The Lancet* study. "It builds the evidence base for influenza vaccination programs in other countries."

The study authors note that these new estimates are limited to flu-associated respiratory deaths and therefore may underestimate the true global impact of seasonal influenza. Influenza infection can create or exacerbate other health factors which are then listed as the cause of death on death certificates, for example cardiovascular disease, diabetes, or related complications. Additional research to estimate non-respiratory causes of flu-associated deaths are ongoing.

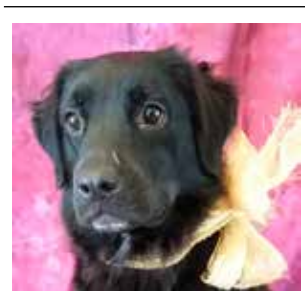

a full-time, experienced municipal attorney. It would not only save our city about \$90k a year (conservative estimate), but would reduce our liability by giving us full-time access to an attorney whose only client is the City of Fairhope.

"I also stated that there were things that have happened in the past (decisions and inactions which have been detrimental to the City) that I believe would not have happened had a full-time attorney been in place. Yet, they ignored all of this and without discussion, appointed him during the Dec 18th meeting.

"Of course, I didn't sign the resolution. I'm never going to sign a resolution I believe is bad for our city. This was a chance for council to make a clear change for the better, but they refused. Tut and Marcus are prosecutors and both relied on outside counsel to answer municipal legal questions. We need a City Attorney experienced in municipal law and planning. So why appoint another prosecutor as our part-time attorney?"

"It's simple. During my term in office, Marcus and Tut have proven to be partial to council and will do whatever council (or President Jack Burrell) asks of them, regardless of what is right for our city. The City Attorney should not work for council or the Mayor, but instead for the CITY. Due to this hastily called meeting, I will discuss the details of the decisions and inactions later.

"None of what I post here will make a difference in tomorrow's outcome, but I do feel it's important for citizens to be informed. I've shared with a few councilmen a very serious issue I uncovered, but apparently neither felt that Tut and Marcus' involvement in breaking a federal law last term was reason enough to not appoint him. "I'm just one vote, one voice" is their mentality. They routinely know how each is going to vote beforehand, which can only mean they deliberate between open meetings. Are they afraid to speak their mind? Unfortunately for all of us, it appears this practice will be what we're stuck with for the next three years.

"I will continue to use my one voice, without fear, in spite of council and the City Attorney's continued efforts to undermine me, because I know I can make a positive difference in Fairhope."

### Council President Burrell's response

Following the mayor's post on her Facebook page, Burrell posted the following later that evening on his official Facebook page.

"I am writing this post in response to posts by the Mayor and news organizations to set the record straight:

"I try to keep this page light and not use it for a soapbox, so indulge me this time.

"The Fairhope City Council is the appointing authority for five City of Fairhope positions: City Treasurer, Police Chief, Municipal Judge, City Attorney, and City Clerk.

These powers are granted by Alabama state statute. The Mayor is not a member of our city council. Our current city attorney announced his retirement two to three months ago effective December 31, 2017.

"At the December 18, 2017, city council meeting, the city council unanimously voted to appoint Marcus McDowell as the new City Attorney. Fairhope's form of government does not allow for the Mayor to vote on this appointment. This appointment was made as a normal course of business. "Mayor Wilson has refused to sign the contract. In order to not have a lapse in the city attorney position, I called a Special Meeting to approve me or Council President Pro Tempore Jay Robinson sign the contract. It is not uncommon to have a Council President sign legal documents for a city, and becomes necessary when a Mayor refuses to perform their duty.

"Refusal of the Mayor to sign the contract, thus, not executing the Council's resolve is not side-stepping the Mayor, but a complete refusal by the Mayor to perform her duties, which includes executing actions taken by the City Council.

"Let's not let the Mayor once again play the victim.

"It is truly sad to see our Mayor claim that this city council does what I tell them to do. That is an insult to their intelligence. These are highly educated people with strong opinions and a strong resolve.

"Each council member has a mind of their own

as demonstrated many times by our debates and split votes. Now the Mayor is judge and jury and is convicting good people in her kangaroo court. It is time to stop this nonsense."

### Following the meeting

After the meeting, The Courier approached Wilson for a comment about the votes, and she responded with the following:

"I think not," Wilson said. "Not with the way you do reporting."

Burrell said Wilson said she was considering vetoing the resolutions passed by the council.

"She said she is," Burrell said. "The first one, she can't. We can authorize anyone we want to negotiate contracts. We are the contracting authority for the city, by state statute. We're not usurping her authority over anything."

With regards to comments made in Wilson's Facebook post about Wynne and McDowell possibly violating federal law, Wynne said he didn't know what she was talking about.

"Without specificity to know what she's talking about, I don't know," Wynne said. "If she's talking about the lift station issue that was raised a few months ago, I al-

ready responded to that with a letter. If she's talking about something else, I don't know what she's talking about so I can't respond to it because there is no specificity."

Wynne also took issue with Wilson's comments that they had always taken the side of the council.

"She also said that we just side with the council and that is not correct," Wynne said. "We look at the separation of powers and the law and try to decide what areas the council has authority over, what areas the

mayor has authority over. Sometimes, we have told the council they can't do what they were looking at doing because it was the mayor's area. We just call it the way the law tells us to call it — we're not taking sides."

Wynne also commented on the claim that decisions made by him and McDowell were not in the best interest of the city.

"She also said we we make decisions that are not in the best interest of the city," Wynne said. "Again, without specificity I don't know what she's talking about."

Let me offer a little post-Christmas challenge: instead of packing up all your Christmas decorations and storing them until next December, leave Baby Jesus out this year. Find a spot in your home where you'll see him every day, and let him remind you that what we celebrate at Christmas is real and primary and worthy of attention all year long.

It has always bothered me that we keep Christmas boxed up most of the time, displaying as long and we can stand it, then get back to "normal" as quickly as possible. Kin Hubbard, a satirist from a previous generation, put it like this: "Next to a circus, there ain't nothing that packs up and tears out faster than the Christmas spirit." January brings a hangover of bills, grumbling, and cynicism that is all too often directed at the holiday itself, as though there is something insipid or even insidious about the celebration of Christ's birth. But the transitory nature of Yuletide "peace" and "goodwill" is not due to any deficiency in Christmas or Christianity or the Christ Child. The problem is what it has always been: us. We are the ones in the box, not Him. The "Christmas spirit" doesn't come to us naturally, and it isn't sustained by our efforts to "be good for goodness sake."

Christmas must be approached and appreciated as it was from the beginning. Like those first shepherds, the good news meets us sitting in the dark, minding our own business. The progression of this encounter is fear, surrender, obedience, worship, and reporting—not about what we have done but what God has done for us. When the babe in the manger becomes the point of reference instead of us, His Spirit in us can be neither contained nor banished. We Christians are fond exclaiming, "Keep Christ in Christmas!" To this, I add, "Keep Christmas in Christians!" Give Baby Jesus His rightful place of preeminence all year, and watch what His Spirit will do!

# Business donates 'Hero Wipes' to Spanish Fort Fire Rescue

The Spanish Fort Fire Rescue Department wants to thank Steve Powell and Unified Investigations & Sciences, Inc. from Spanish Fort for the donation of Hero Wipes. These wipes are used after fires to clean and remove dangerous carcinogens from the skin of firefighters. Cancer has been a growing concern in the fire

service.

In 2010, researchers from the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH), launched a multi-year study to examine whether firefighters have a higher risk of cancer and other causes of death due to job exposures. This study was completed in late 2015.

The study included nearly 30,000 career fire-

fighters from Chicago, Philadelphia, and San Francisco who were employed at any time between 1950 and 2009. NIOSH researchers found that, when compared to the number of cancers expected using U.S. population rates, the firefighters in this study had a modest increase in cancer diagnoses (9 percent increase) and cancer-related deaths (14 percent increase).

# 2018 Alabama Waterfowl Stamp Art Contest open through Feb. 9

## Judging takes place Feb.17 at "Fins, Feathers and Flowers" event

Alabama artists are invited to enter the 2018 Alabama Waterfowl Stamp art contest, which opened

Dec. 11. The winning artwork will be featured as the design of the 2019-20 Alabama Waterfowl

Stamp. The Alabama stamp is required for all licensed hunters when hunting migratory waterfowl in the state. Revenue from the sale of the stamp is used to purchase, establish or improve migratory waterfowl habitat.

The competition is open to resident Alabama artists only. Only original horizontal artworks depicting a species of North American migratory duck or goose will be eligible. The American Wigeon, Canada Goose, and American Green-winged Teal — depicted in the winning artwork of the three previous years' contests — are

not eligible as the subject for the 2019-20 waterfowl stamp. Entries must be postmarked no later than Feb. 9.

The 2018 contest will take place in conjunction with the annual "Fins, Feathers and Flowers" event at Lakepoint Resort State Park in Eufaula, Ala., which runs February 16-18. Similar to Eagle Awareness weekends at Lake Guntersville, Fins, Feathers and Flowers offers a variety of activities for wildlife watchers. The weekend is a cooperative effort of the Alabama State Parks Division and the U.S. Fish & Wildlife

Service.

All eligible entries will be on display at Lakepoint State Park beginning Friday, February 16. Three judges from the fields of art, ornithology and wildlife conservation will select the winning waterfowl art the following day at 1 p.m. The media and public are invited to attend.

The judging criteria will emphasize uncluttered design suitable for printing as a stamp, anatomical accuracy of the illustrated species, and artistic rendering. Close attention must be given to tone and detail, since those aspects are prerequisites

for printing artwork as a stamp. Wing and feather construction must be particularly well defined. Entries may be drawn or painted in any medium. Entries cannot exceed 9 by 12 inches (15 by 18 inches matted).

### coordination

According to well-placed confidential sources that spoke with The Courier, Fairhope Police did not coordinate security with any members of the Secret Service about the Sept. 25 Moore event.

Sources said the Fairhope PD did have conversations with Moore's security team about the event but that the Secret Service was not involved with those conversations.

The city's statement also lists Bannon as a "former cabinet member," but Bannon's position as White House Chief Strategist and Counselor to the President was not a cabinet level position. Bannon also resigned from those positions on Aug. 18, well before the Sept. 25 event.

The Courier has reached out to the Moore campaign for comment and will update this story as needed. The Courier has also

reached out to Fairhope Police Chief Joe Petties for an interview next week after the Christmas holiday.

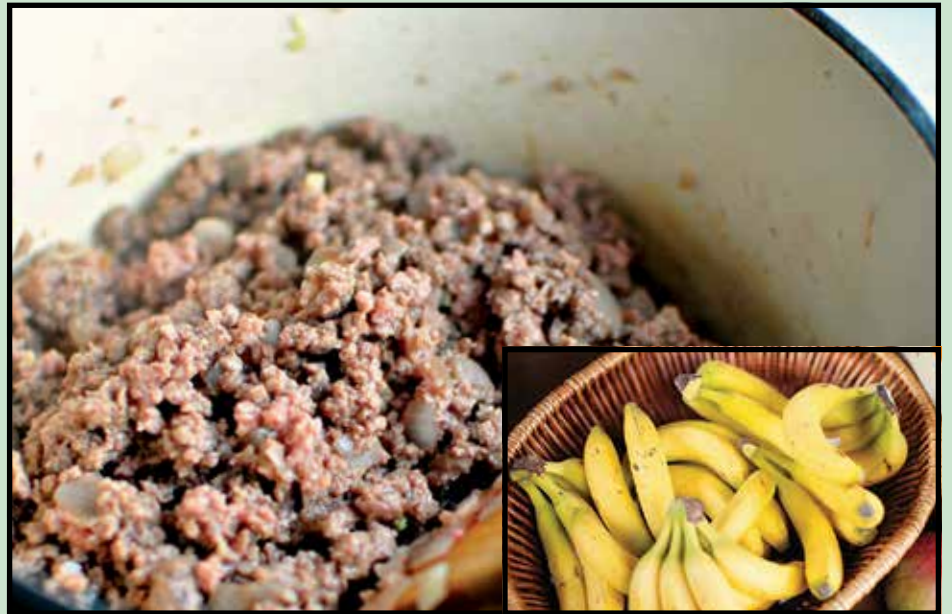
