Gulf Shores to move forward on Auburn University project

During its Jan. 23 work session, the Gulf Shores City Council heard about a proposal from city administrator Steve Griffin involving Auburn University's partnership with the facility in bringing an educational complex here. Griffin told the council he had been working with Auburn University officials to help plan the construction and rollout of the 24,000 square-foot building that will be an almost \$10.5 million project. "In order to get started and know all costs, to get ready for the bond issue that would be issued by the city's public education building authority, they want to basically have bids in hand and know exactly how much the cost of the building is going to be," Griffin said.

Griffin said Auburn requested the city extend the option on the property to begin on Sept. 1 of this year to give more time for the planning phase to both parties. Griffin added the university was asking the city to put up the initial money for costs associated with the pre-development phase, but that the city would be reimbursed for those costs.

"What we need to do and what they're asking us to do is for us to front the money for the architectural services and engineering and project management services that's right at \$817,693, plus the extension option for \$42,500 that in

the reimbursement agreement we're waiting for them to sign," Griffin said. "They will fully reimburse the city for that money we front during that six month time frame." Griffin told city leaders Auburn University would be financially responsible if something went wrong with the development.

"Once the bid is received, they will then go out for the revenue note to finance this and pay the city back," Griffin said. "And with the reimbursement agreement, it says if it all goes south, then Auburn University will reimburse us this full amount."

Councilman Jason Dyken said that deal was what they were expecting all along. "I'm fine with moving forward," Dken said. "We need to secure this agreement, get this deal done and get Auburn here. Let's do it."

The Auburn Education Complex in Gulf Shores, which will be located on County Road 8 and the Foley Beach Express, will house a veterinary teaching hospital, an Auburn aviation center, extension service space, College of Agriculture facilities that promote aquaculture and ornamental horticulture and space for the office of research and economic development to help promote opportunities for aerospace industry.

Original Oyster House joins state's oyster shell recycling program

A large crowd of people gathered together last week at the Original Oyster House in Gulf Shores to celebrate the restaurant's ceremonial ribbon cutting for joining the Alabama Oyster Shell Recycling Program.

The effort is spearheaded by the Alabama Coastal Foundation and made possible through a two-year grant from the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation. The program will recycle oyster shells from restaurants and get them back into Alabama waters, enhancing oyster

production, among other benefits. The NFWF grant pays for oyster shell recycling education and bins, the drop off and pick up of the bins and the cleanup for the bins. That was transition is key for encouraging restaurants to participate, according to Joe Roszkowski, co-

founder of the Original Oyster House restaurants, who was one of the first restauranteurs to sign up for the program. "The program aligns with our core value of stewardship," Roszkowski said. "As sponsors of the Oyster Trail and Mobile's Oyster Gardening Program, we

learned how oysters impact our environment, our economics and our health. For years, these dedicated scientists, environmentalists and educators have worked to get oyster shells back into the water. We were so grateful to have

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Parking agreement with Acme Oyster House

Griffin told the council owners of the Acme Oyster House in Gulf Shores had asked the city to extend a parking agreement with them for use of the public parking facilities located near their business.

Griffin said the city had entered into a parking agreement with the business three years ago for partnership with the public parking lot at Waterway Village, with Acme making months payments to the

city for use of the lot. “When Acme entered into the agreement, they did it at a 15-year term with a balloon payment coming up April of this year,” Griffin said. “What they’ve asked us is to consider continuing the monthly payments. It’s \$1,923 for the full term of that agreement. We looked - they’re doing great. They’re just who we need there. My very strong recommendation with what we decided to do is go ahead and okay this. Instead of having the balloon note do, to extend that another 20 years.” Mayor Robert Craft said the city’s finance

committee would study the proposal and would inform the council on it.

Citizen concerns about bike trails

During the citizen comments portion of the work session, Gulf Shores resident Keith Burroughs questioned whether the city would support declaring May as National Bicycling Month and then told the council some of the city’s bike trails were proving problematic for bike riders.

“I ride my bike out to Fort Morgan some, and I used to use the bikeway,” Burroughs said. “It’s beautiful, but it’s also hazardous riding. I don’t know who does the maintenance on that bikeway, but there’s a major problem with flooding. I would think there might be something that can be done to address that issue so it isn’t a continual concern.”

Mayor Robert Craft told him he was grateful for him voicing that concern and said the city was currently looking for help with a study they were conducting on that subject currently.

“We’re in the process of doing a bikeability and walkability study for our city right now,” Craft said. “We’re looking at volunteers to sit on a committee for that.” Craft said the city was aware of some of the flooding problems and had been proactive in trying to find sources of funding to address the issue.

“We’ve gotten grants over the last three years to help fix some of the issues there,” Craft said. “We’ve got another grant in hand to try to do more toward Calloway Road. We’ll be glad to take a look at it. This is what this mayor and council is all about - looking for alternatives.”

been given an opportunity to pilot Alabama’s first oyster shell recycling program in October at our location on the Mobile Causeway and are proud to continue it here in Gulf Shores. What a blessing it is to live in one of the

most beautiful places and that we can make a difference doing what we love - eating oysters.” Mark Berte, executive director of the Alabama Coastal Foundation, said he was thrilled to have the Original Oyster House join with more with a dozen other local restaurants contributing to the program. “By participating in the Oyster Shell Recycling Program, local restaurants save on waste disposal costs and help support a commercial fishery that is essential to their business and the local economy,” Berte said. “Six restaurants participated in phase one that piloted this program on our Causeway Route. We were so successful that we expanded the route ahead of schedule and added two restaurants in Mobile and one in Fairhope. In addition, we’ve started phase two, the Gulf Shores and Orange Beach route ahead of schedule with the addition of seven more restaurants. To date, we have 16 partners and hope to double that number this summer.” In the 12 weeks since the program began, the ACF has estimated collections of almost 650,000 oyster shells, which equals about 11 dump trucks of oyster shells or 1.5 acres of coverage. The ACF estimates in 2017 the program will collect over 2.7 shells, which is equal to about seven acres or the weight of 60 elephants.

Where You Fit In The Temple

When the Apostle Paul writes about the church, he often turns to metaphors to capture the essence of an entity so complex that it defies prosaic, propositional definition. His favorite word pictures for the church are a body, a temple, and people. Thinking of the church as a body emphasizes unity-in-diversity. The church as temple highlights her call to be a beacon of truth to the wider world, the one place to which the surrounding culture can look to find what is real. As a people, the church is to be a definable, distinctive, and interdependent group, a family always looking for new brothers and sisters to welcome out of the loneliness of sin into the fellowship of saints. When the church functions according to these metaphors, then her calling to be unified, sanctified, and word-wide (long ago, we used to say “one, holy, catholic”) is fulfilled.

The fourth mark of the church is “apostolic,” which means, loosely, that she is founded on the teachings of Christ to his first disciples who have handed them on to us through His Word. It means that our unity, sanctity, and reach are not ends to themselves; we are not a social club committed to mere self-perpetuation. We exist for the glory of God alone; we exist to make that glory known to everyone in all the earth. To each of the images described above, Paul attaches

a descriptive prepositional phrase: the body of Christ, the temple of the Spirit, and the people of God. The Trinity itself, the non-contingent community of Divine Persons in their unified diversity, grounds the existence of the church. The Fatherhood of God makes possible the family of faith, who live distinctly before the world. The Headship of Christ gives connection and direction to all the members of the body who walk as Christ did in the world. The Power of the Spirit holds the bricks of the temple in place; the temple, in turn, is the launch pad for the Power of the Spirit in the world. The Trinity at work in redeeming creation has caused you to be a building stone, a son or daughter, a body part. Do you know who you are? Do you know how you fit? Do you know what you cost?

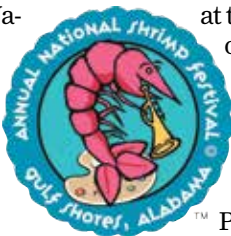

Prescribed burn planned at 2 locations in Gulf State Park

A prescribed burn is planned in two locations within Gulf State Park between Feb. 1 and Mar. 10 – weather permitting. The prescribed burn is part of a forest management plan associated with longleaf pine restoration, wildfire fuel reduction and invasive species control. The burn sites include 84 acres on the park’s east boundary and 40 acres north of the campground. The larger zone is part of an area managed for pitcher plants and remnant longleaf pine. Funding for the prescribed burns is provided

by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service through qualified outer continental shelf oil and gas revenue and the Department of the Interior through the Coastal Impact Assistance Program. The burns enable the Alabama State Parks Division to better manage the park’s forest resources in the future. Every effort will be made to ensure safety and proper smoke management during the burns. This project is in compliance with a permit from the Alabama Forestry Commission.

Prescribed fire is an effective way to reduce wildfire risk, reduce fuel loads, enhance wildlife habitat and maintain a healthy forest ecosystem. On the right track

Addiction battles leads woman, 29, to help others

ELSANOR — Tiffany Grubbs is finally getting her life on track following a decade-long struggle through addiction, recovery, relapse and back again.

“I thank God that I am surrounded by a support system that is allowing me to pay it forward,” she said. After battling with addiction twice, Grubbs, 29, has now been sober for seven months. Last summer, she enrolled in Faulkner State Community College, now Coastal Alabama Community College, in their pre-nursing program with the goal of one day becoming a nurse practitioner. “I want to do something to make a difference in people’s lives,” she said. It’s a far cry from where she was just a few short months ago. A native of Little Rock, Arkansas, Grubbs moved with her family to Fairhope when she was 15. But after her dad passed away, she fell into a world of drinking and drugs.

“I found myself in an abusive relationship,” she said, “and that’s when I really started drinking and experimenting with drugs.”

She first became addicted to prescription medication, then a co-worker at a local fast food restaurant introduced her to methamphetamine.

Several years later, she was in another relationship, she said, which put her on the road to recovery.

“He was in The Shoulder,” she said, which is a substance abuse treatment center located in Spanish Fort. “I began looking around to find a place that would help me.”

She found The Refuge for Women, a 27-acre facility, located in the Elsanor Community east of Robertsdale.

Formerly “Saving Grace Home for Women,” the program was re-tooled and reopened a few years ago with a program, developed by Dr. Nancy Robertson and Verlee Young, a licensed clinical social worker.

The Refuge is a non-profit, 10-bed, 90-day residential recovery program for adult women suffering from alcohol and drug dependency. Depending on the individual’s needs, Robertson said, the program

can extend from 30 to 180 days.

The Christian-based program works with several 12-step programs to provide counseling. The program also includes exercise programs, nutrition classes, help with daily living skills, cooking, garden, health and wellness, and Bible class. The program has also recently added music therapy and equine therapy programs, Robertson said.

But, Grubbs said, she wasn’t able to join the program right away.

“They won’t let you join if you have outstanding warrants,” she said, “so I had to get that taken care of before I could be in the program.”

There was also a matter of cost.

“When she first approached us, we weren’t really sure how she was going to pay for it,” Robertson said. “At the time she was just coming out of prison. She had no money and no job.”

But, Robertson said, they agreed to let Grubbs sign up for the program with hopes that she could get some time of sponsorship.

“That day, I opened an envelope from the Robertsdale United Methodist Church,” Robertson said. There was a check inside that was enough to get Grubbs started in the program.

“I had been to Brother Steve before asking for help,” said Grubbs, referring to the church’s pastor at the time, The Rev. Steve Spining. “There wasn’t a lot they could do at the time, but he promised he would do what he could.”

They didn’t know when they sent that check through the mail – proceeds from the church’s bi-annual quilt show, among other fundraisers put on by the United Methodist Women’s group – that it would be Grubbs who would benefit from it.

“They actually recently sent us another check,” Robertson said, “which will allow us to afford another young woman the same opportunity.”

The remainder of the cost, Robertson said, was in the form of a loan that Grubbs has been paying back a little at a time.

“We have several girls that cannot afford the cost of the treatment,” Robertson said. “They pay what they can when they can. It may not keep us in business, but it’s not about that. It’s about helping people who need help.”

Not only did Grubbs get the counseling she needed to help her get off drugs, she retained a support group that would help her

in the future.

“We provide family counseling, which her mother attended,” Robertson said. “She and her mother have a very co-dependent relationship, which can create difficult situations.”

Through the recovery program, Grubbs began attending church regularly at Coastal Church in Daphne.

“They’ve been good to us and good to our clients,” Robertson said.

She was sober for nine months after leaving the recovery center, but it was a fight with her mother, Grubbs said, that sent her spiraling into relapse.

“It ended up being a lot worse than it was before,” Grubbs said. “It is only by the grace of God that I survived.”

It was actually when Grubbs stopped making payments that Robertson said she knew something was wrong.

“It’s about making an effort. If they’re clean and sober they will at least make an effort, even if it’s just a few dollars,” Robertson said. “We have a saying, ‘If you’re not paying, you’re probably playing.’”

She had also stopped going to church.

“It’s the support system that they have when they

leave here that keeps them on the right path,” Robertson said. “It’s easy to stay sober and make good decisions while you’re here, but it’s a different story on the outside. As long as that support system is in place, we see a lot of success, but it is when they abandon the support system that problems occur.”

So when Grubbs came back to The Refuge, asking to move back in, Robertson said, she suggested a different path.

“It’s a big world out there and we want them to be able to survive in it,” Robertson said. “And part of that is not to just take them back in when they’re having a difficult time. It’s about encouraging to use that support system.”

Getting back into a church environment, Grubbs said, made a world of difference.

“I actually showed up to church high,” she said, “but pastor Chad Stafford greeted me with open arms and no questions. I know he could tell, but he didn’t say anything, he just welcomed me back. So I just kept going.”

She would eventually get involved with a women’s group at the church. She also kept in contact with Robertson, getting advice and the help she needed to get her life on track.

“The way I see it, we’re more than a recovery center, we’re a family,” Robertson said. “Sometimes you have to give a little tough love, but it all comes from the same place.”

After being back on drugs for three months, Grubbs has now been sober for seven. She has a full-time job and is a full-time student, maintaining a 3.79 GPA while at the

same time continuing to pay back The Refuge for her treatment.

“It hasn’t always been easy,” she said, “but I am making it by the grace of God.”

Robertson said she has also been working to help Grubbs with her education through Ecumenical Ministries Director Pam Meredith’s Family Foundation.

“We have connected with them and have already gotten funding for three of our clients,” she said. “We have sent in the paperwork and are hoping that Tiffany will be the fourth.”

Grubbs will also participate in The Refuge for Women’s annual fashion show fundraiser, which is scheduled for April 4 from 11:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the Foley Civic Center.

“It’s through partnerships with people like those at Robertsdale United Methodist and Pam Meredith and through events like the fashion show that allow us to keep operating,” Robertson said.

Last year’s fashion show raised about \$18,000 for the recovery center and Robertson said the goal is to double that figure this year.

“As with last year, many of our clients and past clients participate in the event,” she said, “but we are always looking for volunteers and sponsors to help with the event.”

The mystique of battlefields

There is something mystical about battlefields. I've walked many of them, and they all have something in common. If you stop long enough and clear your mind, you can feel the presence of those who were there.

Thousands visit battle-grounds every year. Is it only for the history, the facts? I think not. Most are drawn there because they want to connect with the past, to be part of it, and battlegrounds let you do that, if you let yourself.

I try to be alone for a few minutes, to stand still, be quiet, and feel. The men and women who fought on these fields are there. They are long past, but they have left a bit of themselves behind, not as haunts, but as reminders; we've been here, we've bled here, some of us died here. I've felt it at Little Big Horn, Vicksburg, Port Gibson, Mississippi, Wilson's Creek, Missouri, Pea Ridge, Arkansas, Fort Morgan, and just up the road in Spanish Fort, at Fort Blakely State Park.

Fort Blakely is the scene of the last full engagement battle of the Civil War. Ulysses Grant referred to it as an "ineffective contribution to the Union war effort" since it was fought only hours after the surrender at Appomattox Court House. Tell that to the 689 Union and 2900 Confederate casualties there. There were 32,000 Union troops in the area, more than Grant had at the siege of Vicksburg, faced by only 4,000 Confederate holdouts.

As I walk through the redoubts, battlements, and rifle pits, especially those undeveloped, I get that feeling of the presence of the soldiers. I can almost smell the cooking fires, the burning gunpowder, hear the songs and laughter of men gathered in a cause, the clash of bayonets on rifles as they massed face-to-face, close enough to smell each other, to see fear. I walk along the redoubts and imagine the earth moving with the firing of artillery, and the impact of the shell some distance away. I feel the shock of those directed at where I stand. I imagine the difficulty of fighting in such conditions having

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little food, wearing heavy wool uniforms and hob-nailed boots, fighting mosquitoes, and lice, hauling drinking water from the bayou, and sleeping in the mud, fighting in the heat, and shivering

at night. It's all there if you allow yourself to feel it.

Why bother, what difference does it make, what's the point? Whether you agree with the politics, or who was victorious or defeated, battlefields are part of each of us who claim allegiance to this country.

Each battlefield represents a part of America. We are who we are, our society is what it is, our country stands free for all of us because of what happened on these fields. Here, the game was played for keeps. The stakes were high, and the cause was worth dying for, put up, or shut up. We all should want to connect with that.

When I walked the battleground at Port Gibson, Mississippi, the place where my great-great-grandfather fought and was captured trying to stop Grant's overwhelming invasion force, the feeling was much more personal. I stood in the house that doubled as a hospital that day, the place where he gave up his freedom after helping a wounded comrade to get medical attention. I could feel his presence, and those of his wounded fellows. I felt of his anguish at giving up the freedom that was so precious to him.

There is mystery on the fields, and stories, and passion, and tears, and if you will let yourself, you can become part of it as you honor those who fought. Their cries echo still, and you can hear them if you listen, "We will be free."

Women in politics

Hillary Clinton's failure to break the proverbial glass ceiling in American politics came up a little short. More than 100 men have been nominated for president by the nation's political parties over the past 220 years. She was the first female to be the nominee of one of the two major parties.

After Hillary became the Democratic nominee last year, former Colorado Congresswoman Patricia Schroeder, who ran for president in 1988, said it best, "It's been the ultimate tree house with a no girls allowed sign posted on it."

Nevertheless, national studies have indicated that women still face a double standard when it comes to political campaigns. These surveys reveal that voters will support a male candidate they do not like if they believe he is qualified. However, they are less likely to support a female candidate they think is qualified unless they also like her. Therefore, it appears that for women candidates likeability is intrinsically linked to electability.

However, when it comes to honesty and trustworthiness women have an enormous advantage. Voters simply trust women more than men. A study done by the respected Pew Research Center Poll revealed that 31 percent said women were more honest and ethical than men. Amazingly only three percent said men were more honest and ethical.

I have observed and stated that same opinion for years. My observation when I was in the Legislature was that women legislators were more honest, forthright and more diligent in their duties. Other political experts have espoused this same belief, especially, when it comes to Alabama's politics.

In the 1990's the nation's business community brought the political guru, Karl Rove, to Alabama to help elect a pro-business state supreme court. He was successful in his endeavor. As he departed the state he left an emphatic statement, "If you want to hold the court in Republican pro-business hands, the best candidate is a conservative female Republican, preferably one who has experience as a Circuit Judge." Voters simply trust women more and especially for judgeships. We now have a record number of women on our State Supreme Court and Courts of Appeals.

There is no question that women in Alabama have an inherent advantage on the ballot in state judicial and secondary statewide races. If you put the name John Doe on a ballot against Jane Doe in Alabama and neither does any advertising and voters simply show up and vote in a secondary statewide race, Jane Doe will win every time.

However, a survey conducted by the Center for Women and Politics at Rutgers University ranks Alabama 46th in the nation for women serving in the legislature. We are indeed inexplicably underrepresented by women in the State House and Senate. Although today we have numerous ladies in statewide office. Kelli Wise and Lyn Stuart are premier justices on the State Supreme Court. Judges Beth Kellum and

Mary Windom serve with distinction on the State Court of Criminal Appeals. Judge Terri Thomas of Cullman is outstanding on the State Court of Civil Appeals. Kay Ivey is our Lieutenant Governor and Twinkle Cavanaugh serves as President of the Public Service Commission.

In the course of history, it has not been that long that women were given the right to vote. The 19th Amendment to the Constitution gave women suffrage. Alabama's legislature voted to ratify the 19th Amendment in 1953. However, Women began to be elected statewide in Alabama long before other so called progressive states. Beginning in the 1950's women dominated the offices of Secretary of State, State Auditor, and State Treasurer to such an extent that they became known as "the ladies offices."

The first woman elected to a statewide office was Sybil Poole who won the Secretary of State office in 1946. She was soon followed by the legendary Agnes Baggett and then Mary Texas Hurt Garner and Melba Till Allen. These women would simply swap the posts of Secretary of State and State Treasurer after their term limits.

By the time Lurleen Wallace became the first female governor in 1967, women held almost half of Alabama's constitutional offices. It may be time for another female governor. Twinkle Cavanaugh or Kay Ivey or someone else may make the leap. We will see.

Pine Needles Retreat, Fairhope

During the darkest hours of the night, people say they have seen a light in the upper floor of the historic American Legion building on Mobile Bay. Let me tell you the story as it was told to me.

Across Mobile Bay in the port city of Mobile, women have always led active roles in society, as well as politics and business. After the Single Tax Colony had founded the lovely city of Fairhope in 1896, it became a destination for outings and retreats for residents of Mobile. Several hotels dotted the bayshore and religious retreats numbered at least four. It became a place of respite from the big city life in Mobile, and represented relaxation and restoration for the soul. A group of Mobile women had formed the Mobile Business Women's Club.

The group decided that they would like to have a retreat they could use as a group and determined that Fairhope would be the ideal location. They were able to obtain a piece of land, but did not have enough funds to build the retreat. After several years of fundraising, they decided to join the ranks of those women who had learned the power of peaceful protests. They made plans to raise canvas tents on the property and camp out there until funds would be garnered. So they stayed away from homes and families until the husbands grew tired of their womanless states and contributed enough money to build the lovely resort. It was completed in 1912, a wooden three story building with porches on all sides to catch the bay breezes. The third floor had dormer windows on all four sides to allow the flow of air through the building. Windows opened upstairs would draw the cool air from downstairs and expel it, keeping the retreat cool even on the hottest of days. They named the well-loved gathering place Pine Needles. The women considered it a female counterpart of the all male Mobile Yacht Club on the western shores of Mobile Bay.

Pine Needles remained in ownership of the Mobile Women's Club for many years, and some women even lived there year round. A housemother was retained and cooked and cleaned to pay for her room and board. As the club's interest in the resort declined, and financing the maintenance of the building became an issue,



rooms were rented out to boarders. Eventually, the Women's Club sold the building and it became rental property. In the 1930s one family to rent it was the Arnold family with their eight children. One of those children has distinct memories of the second floor showers built in the overhang part of the building and the sound of the water falling all the way to the ground. The children learned to swim in the bay and spent hours on the porches of the old place. The fireplace was so large that it would hold immense logs. It is now boarded up, but some say the smell of the smoke from the fireplace is very real at times. The place was used as office space in the 1950s. During this period the third floor was rented out to promoters who held boxing matches there. Seats

were placed around a makeshift ring in the center of the room. Clamoring from the spectators could be heard for miles around until complaints caused the boxing business to fold.

In 1961 the building became the home of the American Legion Post 199. It was the first building in Fairhope to be named on the National Register of Historic Places. However, it was soon enclosed with clapboard siding covering the porches, but making more indoor space. Inside rooms are still very much as they were in the earliest days of Pine Needles. Claw foot bathtubs and unpainted walls take a visitor back 100 years to the days of the 1920s or earlier.

Paranormal investigator Barbara has visited the building to glean information about the spirits that inhabit the place from its one-hundred-year history. It is known that there are waitresses at the club who will not work alone in the building, and many people have heard steps sounds from the second floor where the bedrooms were. Barbara spoke aloud introducing herself and the others with her. She spoke in a calm voice encouraging dialogue. She asked if those present were upset that the place had now become a bar. The answer was distinctly, "No, I love it." When asked if she minded that women also drink at the bar, the answer was a definite, "Yes."

Servers say that when they come in to work as the place opens about three o'clock in the afternoon, they often find glasses turned over on their sides and once they came in to find the water running in the sink. Many say that doors are heard opening and closing on the second floor when no one is upstairs. The inhabitant has come to be known as the housemother, reminiscent of the days when the women came there for a little retreat. Perhaps this is because one resident said they repeatedly heard the sound of a broom swishing across the floor.

The most annoying of all the incidents is very loud thumping and pounding on the third floor – not so different from what would be heard at a boxing match. Most who have heard this, have been fearful and do not want to discuss it. Even though the upstairs does not have electricity, occasionally lights are seen from the upstairs dormers. Several motorists have reported seeing them from their cars as they pass by on Scenic 98. People are probably seeing the reflections of passing car lights – or are they?

LeBron passes 20,000 career points for Cavaliers

Cleveland Cavaliers' star LeBron James reached 20,000 career points with Cleveland Sunday night in a 107-91 win over the Oklahoma City Thunder.

James needed six points to reach the Cavaliers' milestone in player points. With his 25 points against the Thunder, he totals 20,019 points with Cleveland (27,913 overall) as of Sunday. The Cleveland Cavaliers are the 16th team in NBA history to have a player reach 20,000 points with a team.

This season, James has been an all-around player for the Cavaliers.

He has an average of 25.7 points per game, 8.5 assists per game and eight rebounds per game. James has been playing in both a small forward and a power forward setting in the starting lineup because of his bigger frame and strength. Interestingly, James is leading the Cavs in assists per game ahead of teammate point Guard Kyrie Irving. James has the ball more due

spent four of those seasons with Miami from 2010-14.

So far his 27,913 career points make him No. 8 in NBA all-time scoring.

to his consistent play calling on the court.

In January of the 2012-13 NBA season with the Miami Heat, James became the youngest player in NBA history to score 20,000 total career points. In his 14 seasons in the NBA, he

James is the second leading current player in the all-time list behind Dallas' Dirk Nowitzki's 29,757. In his career chasing Chicago's Michael Jordan, James is 12,274 career points away from eclipsing Jordan in all-time scoring. Jordan is fourth on the scoring list while Los Angeles center Kareem Abdul-Jabbar is No. 1 with 38,387 career points.

James is only 32 years old with time to eclipse more milestones and leads Cleveland records in total minutes, field goals, total points, assists, defensive rebounds and steals.

MOBILE — Of all the accomplishments achieved by the University of South Alabama, there’s still one rite of passage the school has yet to achieve: having a player selected in the NFL Draft. The week of practices and time in the limelight will undoubtedly help Everett’s draft stock. With a good performance at the upcoming NFL Scouting Combine, the tight end could possibly even vault himself into the top half of the draft.

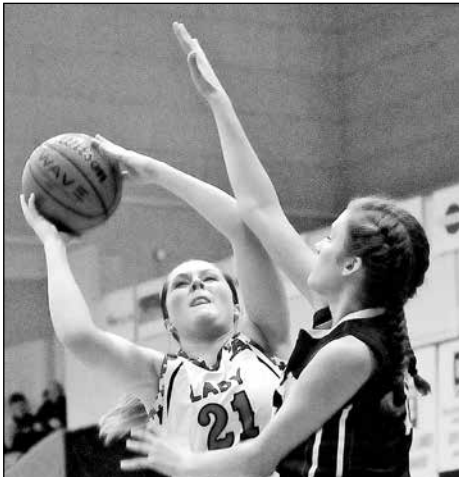

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Red Cross critically needs donors after winter weather adds to severe blood shortage

Precision medicine: UAB study creates ‘mini-lung’ to study effect of pulmonary fibrosis drugs

Pulmospheres, three dimensional multicellular spheroids composed of lung cells from individual patients, were shown to be effective in predicting the efficacy of medications for idiopathic pulmonary fibrosis, according to findings from University of Alabama at Birmingham scientists presented today in JCI Insight, a journal of the American Society for Clinical Investigation. Pulmospheres are tiny spheres — about one millimeter in diameter — which contain all the various cell types found in a human lung and are grown from tissue obtained from a surgical lung biopsy. Pulmospheres give researchers a 3D model to study various aspects of cell biology and disease mechanisms. “Our results suggest that pulmospheres simulate the microenvironment in the lung and serve as a personalized and predictive model for assessing responsiveness to antifibrotic drugs

in patients with IPF,” said Veena Antony, M.D., professor in the Division of Pulmonary, Allergy and Critical Care Medicine within the Department of Medicine, and primary investigator of the study. The UAB research team grew pulmospheres from 20 patients with idiopathic pulmonary fibrosis — a devastating lung disease — and nine control patients. They then examined whether the pulmospheres reacted to one of two commonly used medications for IPF. “There is no cure for IPF, but there are two FDA-approved drugs that can help slow the rate of decline caused by the disease and improve quality of life,” said Antony. “Not all patients respond to both drugs, and some don’t respond to either. Having a reliable clinical test that can predict which drug works best for which patient is urgently needed.” The pulmospheres were grown to useable size in about 24 hours following the biopsy, then exposed to

the two medications, pirfenidone and nintedanib. Within about 16 hours, researchers were able to observe if the spheres responded favorably to one, both or neither of the medications. “This is a wonderful example of precision medicine,” said Victor Thannickal, M.D., professor and director of the Division of Pulmonary, Allergy and Critical Care Medicine and a study co-author. “Using pulmospheres derived from a patient’s own cells may allow clinicians to tailor specific drugs to an individual patient without exposing that patient to potential side-effects or harm from treatments that are unlikely to be effective.” Of the 20 subjects enrolled in this study, three patient’s pulmospheres responded only to nintedanib and the pulmospheres of four patient’s responded only to pirfenidone. Eleven patient’s pulmospheres responded to both drugs and two patient’s pulmospheres did not respond to either drug.

Researchers confirmed the findings by following the patients over time, establishing that the response predicted by the pulmospheres was clinically observed in the patients. Antony says there is a critical need for a better predictive model for IPF. Animal models of the disease are disappointing, and more traditional two dimensional cellular models are insufficient. “The lungs are three dimensional organs and to truly understand the dynamics of IPF medications on the disease we require a 3D model, one that contains all the cell types found in a lung and that is able to function as a microcosm of the lung,” Antony said. “Many drugs have shown promise in pre-clinical studies, only to fail in subsequent clinical trials. Three dimensional modeling might change that.” Antony says pulmospheres were developed in cancer research as a means of targeting potential drugs. A hallmark of IPF is an ag-

gressive invasion by cells known as myofibroblasts, which mirrors the invasive phenotype of malignant cells, giving researchers reason to think that pulmospheres might work in IPF. The UAB trial was the first to study pulmospheres in IPF. Antony also hopes that modern drug discovery techniques, using high throughput screening technology to quickly screen numerous compounds for disease-modifying properties, will be enhanced by the use of pulmospheres. “There are many potential therapeutic agents for IPF in the discovery pipeline now, and this technique might prove to be a very effective way to determining which are the most promising,” she said. Thannickal serves as the program director of a translational program project grant, sponsored by the National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute, that is focused on identifying novel diagnostic and therapeutic approaches to fibrotic lung disease. “Without support of the

NHLBI, and in particular the tPPG funding mechanism, the tissue biorepository which was critical to developing these innovative screening methods would not have been possible,” he said. Funding for the study came from the National Institutes of Health. NIH describes IPF as a disease in which tissue deep in the lungs becomes thick and stiff, or scarred, over time. As the lung tissue thickens, the lungs are unable to properly move oxygen into the bloodstream. IPF is a serious disease that usually affects middle-aged and older adults. IPF has no cure and many people live only about three to five years after diagnosis. Leukemia research leads to discovery of cause for childhood syndrome

After studying leukemia, cancer researchers at the University of South Alabama Mitchell Cancer Institute confirmed that a mutation in a gene called SON leads to a neurodevelopmental disorder that produces intellectual disability, impaired vision and facial abnormalities in children. The new syndrome, ZTTKS, now bears the initial of one of the MCI researchers, Dr. Jung-Hyun Kim, Ph.D., a post-doctoral fellow in the lab of Dr. Erin Ahn, Ph.D., associate professor of oncologic sciences. Their research, published in September, confirmed that SON is a “master regulator” governing neurodevelopment, and that a mutation in the gene can result in ZTTKS.

“Identifying a previously unknown cause for a syndrome and having that syndrome named after a team member in your laboratory is quite an accomplishment, said Laurie Owen, Ph.D., MCI associate director for Basic and Translational

Sciences. For the Posey family of Beacon, N.Y., identifying the cause of their young daughter’s disability puts a stop to the endless searching for a diagnosis. “This means everything,” said Pamela Posey, mother of 3-year-old Emma. “I’ve already shared the papers with our doctors so they can better treat Emma.”

Emma attends a special-needs preschool with her twin sister, Ella, who has not been diagnosed with ZTTKS. “I was told that perhaps she could catch up with other kids her age,” Posey said. “Now I know that this may not be the case.”

While there’s no “cure” for ZTTKS, identifying its cause can help doctors predict future medical issues for Emma and allow the Poseys to connect with families facing a similar diagnosis. Posey has created a Facebook page to do just that. “It’s very new, and we’re all looking forward to getting to know each other,” she said.

THE SON GENE

As a cancer researcher,

Ahn had discovered that a shortened version of the SON gene was linked to leukemia, a discovery that was published in the prestigious journal Molecular Cell this past spring. Ahn had studied the SON gene since 2004, when she was a post-doctoral fellow at the University of California San Diego. She came to MCI in 2012, and Kim joined her lab in 2013.

The new discovery occurred after a clinician at Valley Children’s Hospital in Madera, Calif., and the clinical genomics team at Ambry Genetics near Irvine, Calif., reached out to Ahn because of her past work with SON. Using DNA sequencing technology, the physician at Valley, together with Ambry, had discovered a mutation in the SON gene of a 5-year-old girl with developmental disabilities. The mutation, they found, had not been inherited from her parents.

Owen said that Ahn and Kim’s work illustrates the importance of conducting basic scientific research, following where it leads, and ultimately applying



Dr. Jung-Hyun Kim, Ph.D., a post-doctoral fellow, and Dr. Erin Ahn, Ph.D., associate professor of Oncologic Sciences at the University of South Alabama Mitchell Cancer Institute, collected and analyzed the clinical features of 20 unrelated patients who shared a developmental delay and intellectual disability, and narrowed down which genes are closely related to brain development. They collaborated with clinicians, genetic counselors and clinical genomics scientists from all over the U.S. and Europe, including the U.K., the Netherlands, Germany and Austria, to publish their findings.

it in a health-care setting. “The ZTTKS story underscores the inherent value of basic cancer research being applied to solve an unrelated problem related to the underlying molecular basis for a neurodevelopmental disorder in children,” said Owen.

Ahn and Kim collected and analyzed the clinical features of 20 unrelated patients who shared the developmental delay and intellectual disability. They isolated white blood cells from blood samples taken from patients and their parents, and further isolated RNA to confirm a problem with RNA editing in the cells. “The goal was to narrow down which genes are closely related to brain development,”

Ahn said. “A lot of these genes are downstream targets of the SON gene.”

Ahn and her lab discovered that SON plays a key role in the way a cell translates DNA into protein – in particular, RNA splicing, or editing. She explains it this way: If there’s a mutation in the SON gene, the ensuing SON protein can become compromised and cause mistakes in RNA editing.

Ahn and Kim also confirmed the findings by repeating Ahn’s previous studies with zebrafish, a freshwater fish with regenerative abilities that is often used in scientific research. They confirmed that SON mutations produced developmental problems in

the fish: When injected with genetic materials that reduced SON levels, some zebrafish developed with bent tails; others had severe brain malformations. The problems mimicked the clinical features observed in the patients, which meant that the researchers had connected the dots from a SON mutation to the neurodevelopmental disorder.

A WORLDWIDE COLLABORATION

Ahn and Kim collaborated with clinicians, genetic counselors and clinical genomics scientists from all over the U.S. and Europe, including the U.K., the Netherlands, Germany and Austria, to publish their findings. “In research, you can never predict where the experimental results are ultimately going to take you,” said Owen. “But the real magic happens when you have researchers who are thinking outside the box, willing to collaborate across disciplines, communicate openly, and share data—that is the essence of team science.”

Protecting the public from superhero damage in NBC’s ‘Powerless’

In the world of DC Comics, superheroes duke it out with supervillains in a battle to protect humanity from the forces of evil. But what happens with all the collateral damage that results?

The good people at Wayne Security are there to help.

In “Powerless,” a satirical half-hour comedy series premiering Thursday, Feb. 2, on NBC, it falls to this subsidiary of Wayne Enterprises to create products that make innocent bystanders feel a little safer. It is here that recent business school grad Emily Locke (Vanessa Hudgens, “High School Musical,” “Spring Breakers”) begins her first day as director of research and development, full of big ideas and confidence, which of course runs counter to the agendas of her well-entrenched new co-workers.

Chief among them is her boss, Van Wayne (Alan Tudyk, “42,” “Death at a Funeral”), a spoiled rich kid who’s never had to work hard a day in his life and thus has difficulty relating

to the rank-and-file employees beneath him. There are also cynical co-workers and underlings (Danny Pudi, Ron Funches, Christina Kirk) she must motivate if she is to lead them to their full potential and prove that you don’t have to have superpowers to be a hero.

“She is extremely positive and just wants everyone to do their best,” Hudgens explains. “And she becomes the boss at Wayne Security and is met with a couple of characters that don’t really love working and she’s just trying to inspire them to change the world. And they’re dragging their feet the entire time.”

Emily’s primary responsibility is overseeing the creation of products that protect the general public from superhero/supervillain activity in Charm City, among them a device called “the rumbrella.”

“It protects people from rubble,” Hudgens says with a laugh, “because one of the main (hazards) in Charm City is falling rubble. So it’s something that everyone definitely needs.

(The writers) come up with a bunch of really funny, interesting products that they feel will make a difference. ... Some of the stuff they come up with, I’m cracking up every single time I read a new script. I mean, the writers are just killing it. It’s so funny because its just like so left of center. Like they’re really doing stuff that I would never think of.”

Hudgens also calls Tudyk a “comedic genius,” and counts herself lucky to be working in an environment where she’s laughing all day, though she strives to keep a straight face during takes.

“It’s one of my strong suits, I think,” she says. “... I’m pretty good at keeping a straight face because there’s stuff that Alan comes up with sometimes and just says that I have to keep a straight face for. It’s just so ridiculous that at times I applaud myself for not cracking up because he’s just too funny. I’ll be standing next to the cameramen and I’ll see the cameramen are cracking up during the take. It’s hysterical.”

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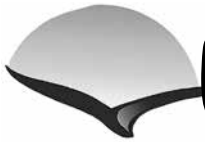

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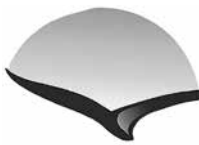
