Robertsdale teacher arrested for eight counts involving alleged sexual misconduct with Central Baldwin Middle student

On Feb. 20, John Daniel Hamilton, a teacher at Central Baldwin Middle School, was arrested for inappropriate sexual contact with a student.

Hamilton was arrested on two counts of second degree sodomy, two counts of second degree sexual abuse, two counts

of a school employee engaging in a sex act with a student under 19 and two counts of a school employee having sexual contact with a student under 19.

Hamilton is a history teacher and bus driver who had been employed with the Baldwin County School System since 2003, but was placed on administrative leave on Feb. 5.

Law enforcement officials said

they became aware of a potential issue with Hamilton on Feb. 5, when the Baldwin County School System reported the issue to the Robertsdale Police Department.

“The Robertsdale Police Department was notified of a situation and some allegations of an inappropriate relationship between a teacher and student at Central Baldwin Middle

School,” Lt. Rex Bishop said. “We began our investigation, which is still ongoing, and that investigation did turn up and develop into probable cause for an arrest.”

Baldwin County District Attorney Bob Wilters said all of the charges against Hamilton derived from actions taken at the school. Wilters added that there may be additional victims

in this case.

“There is some concern there may be additional victims,” Wilters said. “We hope if there are that they will come forward.”

Wilters said the incidents came to light when a student came forward and reported the actions to a teacher.

“Evidence came to a teacher

Stockton Heritage Museum shines spotlight on town's rich history

The people of Stockton know who they are and where they came from.

In 2012 a handful of residents drove more than 1,000 miles back and forth across Alabama to campaign for a statewide amendment vote to protect the town from forced annexation. And, they won.

This year they celebrated the one-year anniversary of the Stockton Heritage Museum, a careful and painstaking effort to cultivate and preserve everything that makes the tiny town precious.

They know their history well. They want others to be able to share in it because for anyone from Baldwin County, this is where their history began too.

“It's ironic, once we were everything in this area and now

we're forgotten, in a tucked away part of the county,” said Georgene Conner, president of Stockton Heritage Association.

gins with the Native American tribes who called this land home. Early settlers moved in and built Alabama's first saw mill. Industry boomed since the mills could

easily transport goods along the Mobile-Tensaw Delta which runs the length of the town.

through another student and that teacher did the appropriate thing and contacted people within the school system, and then the system contacted Robertsdale Police,” Wilters said.

Wilters said the alleged incidents involving the student, a young girl, took

place during school hours and in the teacher’s classroom.

Wilters added that it appears there was contact between Hamilton and the alleged victim outside of the school and that the alleged incidents occurred possibly 2.5 months before authorities became aware of the issue.

Baldwin County Superintendent Eddie Tyler was visibly upset during

a press conference held in Robertsdale about the arrest, praising the work of law enforcement officials and saying he hoped the harshest consequences under the law would be used in this situation.

“I appreciate the diligent work of the Robertsdale Police Department and the District Attorney’s Office,” Tyler said. “I say again, we have zero tolerance for anyone who preys

on children — an individual found guilty of such a heinous crime should be punished to the fullest extent of the law. I am just at a loss how anyone, anyone can harm a child. All of the things we see on the national and local news make me ask, where is our moral compass? As educators, we are entrusted with the lives of young people every day and our employees accept that honor and privilege very seriously. All of our employees are background checked, but that is no predictor of future behavior. Those who are convicted of these despicable crimes against students deserve swift and the harshest consequences possible under the law.”

Assistant District Attorney Matt Simpson, who handles child sex crimes

for the DA’s office, said he felt it was important for parents to have conversations with their children about incidents like this and said the investigation has remained a priority

for his office. “We have not stopped since we became aware of this,” Simpson said. “This is a priority investigation. We want to make sure we get the right thing done.”

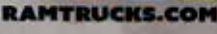

full scholarship to play football at Saginaw Valley State University in Saginaw, Michigan, but thanks to poor grades and bad choices, Prim says he found himself off the team and out of school.

After struggling to find his way, he was given another opportunity to

finish school at the University of Dubuque in Iowa, eventually finishing with two degrees, physical education and science.

Along the way, Prim said, he had a revelation and decided, he said, to give his life over to God.

“I came to the realization that I was being selfish,” he said, “and as long as I had selfish goals I was not going to be able to succeed in life.

“I told myself that I am not here for myself, but my life had to have a bigger purpose. I asked myself the same questions that everyone asks, ‘Who am I?’ and ‘Why and I here?’ and I decided that I needed to be able to make a difference in the lives of those around me.”

He discovered that to find his purpose, he needed to look no further than his mother, Donna, for his inspiration.

“She is what drives me to never quit,” he said. “Growing up, she worked two jobs for very little reward just so her kids could have a better life. We owe it to our parents to step up and make a better life for ourselves that those that come after us.”

While he is still single, he says, he works hard to make himself a role model to others.

“It all starts with me,” he said. “I have young cousins who look up to me and I have to work hard every day to make myself a better role model for them and everyone around me.”

Since coming to that realization, Prim his written and self-published

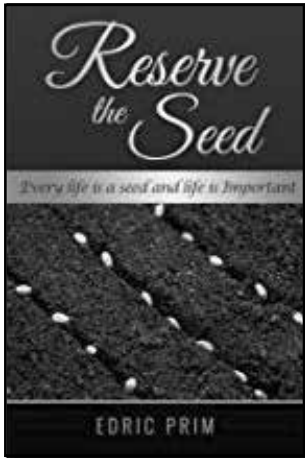
five books, all of which come from his experiences growing up, dealing with bullying and racism and the life skills he has learned.

His first book, “Constant Struggle That Made Me Who I Am,” published in March 2014, was followed quickly by “Trial and Error in Love,” published in April that same year.

A year later, he published “Check Your Pulse And See If Your Dream Is Still Beating,” and he published two more books just last year, “Can I Have This Dance?,” published in February, and his latest book, “Reserve The Seed,” published in September.

Since returning to Baldwin County, Prim has joined a group of 15 like-minded adults called Diversity Student and Parent Association, a program developed and founded by Kellie Watson.

Through the group, Prim said, he has been reaching out to local schools and is also hoping to reach out to local civic organizations to make his books available and to make himself available

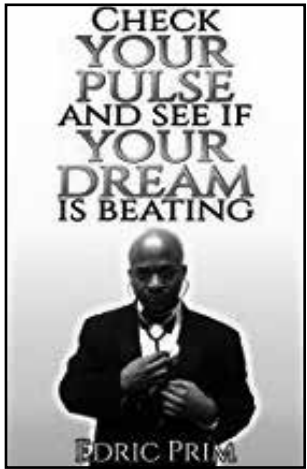


Prim’s latest book, “Reserve The Seed,” was published last September.

as a speaker to talk about his experiences and the challenges today’s youth are facing.

Obviously, the recent school shooting in Florida brings those issues back to the forefront with many calling for changes in the country’s gun laws, but Prim says, he feels the answers lie in looking inward, and changing focus, rather than just passing a few laws.

“I think the answers lie in giving these students focus and direction in life,” he said. “We are living in a world where children aren’t finding

answers to those bigger questions and they are increasingly angry. It is our job to show them that their lives can have a purpose. We need to get back to being able to humble ourselves and focus on what matters.”

Foley PD committed to keeping the city safe

When Foley began, there wasn't yet a need for a police department. The then town's main concern was livestock straying into town and cluttering the roadways. Eventually, the mayor learned of a young man of good rapport who would become the first chief of the one-man Foley Police Department. Chief Benjamin Cobb began work in 1943, protecting the city, helping with the livestock, and working to create the very first dispatcher department for the police force through the help of Gulf Telephone Company. As the town grew to a city, Cobb knew the police force would need to build as well.

And build it has. Today, the Foley Police Department, which began with a single officer, now consists of over 60 police officers and approximately 30 public servant civilian employees. The Department is organized into multiple divisions and provides one of the highest starting salaries for police officers in the region.

Foley's crime rate fell below that of surrounding municipalities in 2016, a feat which accord-

ing to Foley Police Chief David Wilson, "ten years ago would not have been imaginable. We have only had one murder in the last eight years. Though one murder is one too many, I'm very proud of how well our agency fights crime. They are proven crime fighters and are very talented."

The Foley officers are connected to the community and are approachable and ready to assist all citizens.

"The officers care about our community and it shows," said Wilson. "It shows in the work they do, the results they achieve, and the attitude that they keep. I often receive compliments on how polite and professional our police are. Though polite and professional, the Foley Police Officers will also get the

job done should the situation turn ugly."

The Department shares success with the community which they serve, and all the people who are involved in numerous neighborhood watch programs.

"We receive great support from Team Foley and from our city government and elected officials," said Wilson. "We also work closely hand-in-hand with other police departments and law enforcement agencies at the county, state, and federal levels."

As with any area which experiences growth, chal-

lenges also are to be expected. The Foley Police Department is prepared to take the challenges as they come, and to continue to protect and serve all citizens in all communities.

"Our goal is to deliver and continue to deliver an advanced level of police services regardless of the future growth of our city," Wilson said.

As the city grows, Wilson states the police department will grow as well in order to maintain the same quality of life Foley has come to know.

"Our secret is starting to get out with more and



more people discovering The Forward City," said Wilson. "In the meantime, we will be here keeping an eye on things

and talking with our citizens, protecting what we have: a great place to live, play, rest and raise our children."

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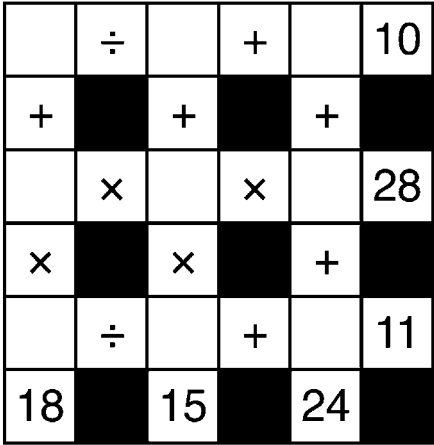

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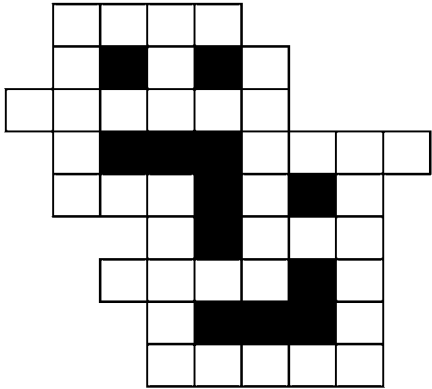

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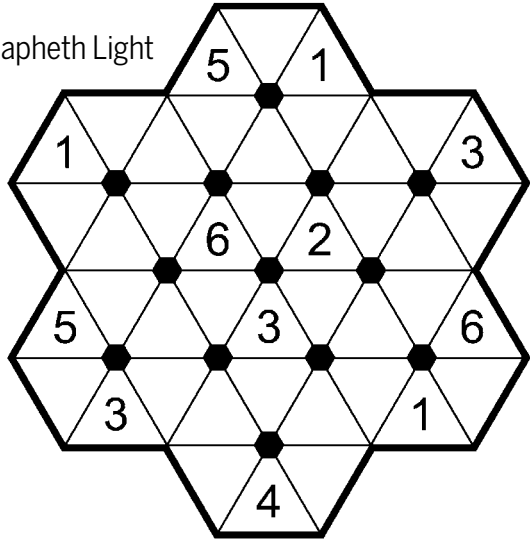

The ‘other’ duties of a Congressman

If someone asked you what a Congressman does on a daily basis, I can imagine what would come to your mind: voting on bills, attending committee hearings, holding meetings with others in Washington, and lots of time debating and arguing.

Those are in fact major parts of the job, but there is so much more that goes into serving the people of Southwest Alabama. I want to highlight some of the “other” duties of a Member of Congress and explain how they might impact you.

Before we get into that, some quick background information. There are 435 Congressmen who represent about 710,000 people each. ber of Congress should serve as their constituents’ liaison with the federal government. We do this through a process called “casework.”

I consider casework to be some of the most important work my office does on a daily basis. Whether it is helping a senior

citizen navigate the bureaucracy at the Social Security Administration or expediting a passport application for a college student taking part in a study abroad program, my office is constantly dealing with federal agencies on behalf of people in Southwest Alabama.

The most common type of casework in my office is connected to the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). The VA system is so fundamentally broken, and we hear from veterans all the time who are stuck in the system. Whether it is a problem getting health care from the VA system or issues with your VA disability check, my office can

help. Nothing is more rewarding than being able to help a local veteran get the benefits they earned.

If you ever need help with a federal agency or program, I strongly encourage you to contact my office at 251-690-2811 or send me an email online at Byrne.House.Gov. While I can’t always promise a positive outcome, I can assure you that my office will do everything in our power to get your issue resolved.

Another little known “duty” is to serve as a quasi-ambassador when people from Southwest Alabama visit D.C. My office can help arrange tours of national landmarks including the U.S. Capitol, the White House, the Library of Congress, and the Supreme Court. I especially love when school groups from our area visit D.C. So, if you are planning a trip to our nation’s capital, please get in touch with my office.

My office can also help local residents obtain a flag that has flown over the Capitol building. These flags can be a great

gift for retirement, a special birthday, or other special occasions. To obtain one, simply visit my website at Byrne.House.Gov and click on the “Flags” tab.

Through my office, we also offer internships for current college students and those who have recently graduated. As a former Congressional intern myself, I can say from firsthand experience how valuable and rewarding these internships are for students. Internships are offered year round in my D.C. office.

As you can tell, there is much more than just voting and debating legislation that goes into being an effective Congressman. I have a fantastic staff in Washington, D.C., Mobile, and Baldwin County that help me fulfill these responsibilities, so you should never hesitate to contact my office.

An entertainment district for Fairhope: part 1 - background

This is the first in a series of short essays on the idea of creating an Entertainment District in the city of Fairhope.

On the evening of Dec. 1, 2017, during the annual Fairhope City-sponsored Christmas parade, six liquor licensees in the downtown business district were cited by Alabama Law Enforcement Agency (ALEA) officers for violation of State Law or Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (ABC Board) rules and regulations, to wit, allowing customers to leave those licensed establishments carrying open containers of alcoholic beverages. Subsequent to the Dec. 1 issuing of citations, some Fairhope liquor licensees approached the City Council and requested that the Council enact an Entertainment District ordinance for the purpose of “protecting” the licens-

ees from being fined by the ABC Board for violations of allowing patrons to leave their licensed premises with open containers of alcoholic beverages. The Fairhope liquor licensees also indicated that they were seeking a “leveling of the playing field” with non-licensed downtown merchants. The merchants give customers glasses of wine for free to attract more pedestrians to come into their stores and shop for merchandise. These merchants are not subject to being fined for allowing their customers to leave the shop with an open container of alcoholic beverage.

In an effort to clarify the process of enforcement of liquor laws, the following detailed explanation is provided. Alabama State Laws relating to alcohol for consumption are administered and enforced by the ABC Board. The mission of the ABC Board is to

protect and support the public’s health, safety, and welfare by regulating the manufacturing, distribution, and sales of alcoholic beverages. The licensing and Compliance Division of the ABC Board issues licenses and permits to sell alcoholic beverages, regulates and investigates ABC licensed locations, and holds commission hearings which afford licensees due process in regard to citations. The main focus of the Licensing and Compliance Division is to promote temperance and prevent the use of alcohol by minors.

At the time they apply for a liquor license, applicants are educated on Title 28, Code of Alabama 1975, and ABC Board Rules & Regulations, all of which apply to alcoholic beverages. Compliance with all State laws in the handling and sale of alcoholic beverages is the sole responsibility of the licensee. To assist

licensees in complying with the many codes, rules, and regulations regarding the sale of alcoholic beverages, the ABC Board has established the Responsible Vendor Program (RVP), a voluntary program that allows licensees to become certified through the Board. The goals of the RVP are to: (1) eliminate the sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages by under-aged persons; (2) reduce intoxication, and accidents, injuries, and deaths which are related to intoxication; and, (3) encourage alcoholic beverage vendors to be prudent in their selling practices so as to restrict or reduce sanctions that may be imposed by the ABC Board against vendors who comply with responsible practices as taught under the RVP.

Alabama’s RVP requires the licensee to train all employees who are involved in the management, sale and/or

service of alcoholic beverages. This training includes Alabama alcoholic beverage laws, legal age determination, civil and criminal penalties, and risk reducing techniques. Licensees who voluntarily join the program are also required to establish policies ensuring legal, responsible sales and to train employees in these policies. Licensees must pay all costs associated with education and training delivered under the RVP.

Inspections of licensees for violations of State alcoholic beverage laws and ABC Board rules and regulations are conducted by members of the ALEA, all of whom are sworn law enforcement officers. If a licensee in the city of Fairhope is issued a citation by an ALEA officer for an alleged violation of State law or ABC Board rules and regulations, the licensee has two levels of appeal under due process. The first level is a meet-

ing with an ABC Board official at the District office located in Sumnerdale. At this meeting, the licensee may present any mitigating evidence relating to the issuance of the citation (just like in traffic court). Based on evidence provided by the issuing ALEA officer and the licensee, the District ABC Board official may levy a fine for the violation or may mitigate the penalty. If the licensee is dissatisfied with the decision at the District level, the licensee may make written appeal to the ABC Board Licensing and Compliance Division in Montgomery and request a hearing on the citation.

Part 2 of this discussion will examine the issues of “protecting” the liquor licensees from fines by the ABC Board and “leveling the playing field” with merchants who give customers a cup of wine to induce them to shop in their store.

Community must work together to prevent school safety issues

Recently in Baldwin County, there have been a number of incidents involving school safety across our county.

From a student bringing a gun to Fairhope Middle School, a gun scare on a Daphne school bus and a threat of bringing a gun to school at Foley, it is clear there are some problems with regards to school safety within our system, but we feel confident in the abilities of Baldwin County Schools officials and local law enforcement to help remedy the problem.

However, they can’t do it alone.

Baldwin County Superintendent Eddie Tyler said in a statement last week that the system also needs the help of parents having some tough conversations with their children.

“Parents, I need your help to sit down

with your child and have this discussion to reinforce the urgency — not to talk for the sake of talking about guns or bringing guns to school — and if your child sees something or hears something, to say something,” Tyler said. “This only works if there is not idle talk and chatter.”

It takes our entire community working together to make sure we’re keeping our children safe from harm and imparting to them the dangers in making false statements or threats.

This isn’t just a problem for our teachers and administrators — we all must step up and help guide our county’s young people to make good decisions and stay away from situations that may cause harm or panic.

Fairhope Police Chief Joe Petties also

released a statement last week to parents in his city, which included a three-point plan which Petties asked parents to help carry out. We agree fully with Petties’ request, as seen here:

“1. Do not engage or encourage rumors. Reply only to verified facts provided by proven, reliable sources.

“2. Lead by example. Every adult displays behavior that affects our students and establishing positive relationships with our youth is key. Reach out. Be active. Acknowledge and respond when something doesn’t feel right. We will continue to develop influential relationships with our kids as they are all OUR kids and our future!

“3. Engage civilly in attempt to fix the problem. Acknowledge that this is a

larger matter than a one-minded system can resolve. It is up to us a community to prevent disaster in our schools, which should be a haven for our students to grow and learn. We will stand up and lead that discussion, as we should.

Our children and grandchildren need everyone’s help and guidance during these difficult times. Let’s be there for them.

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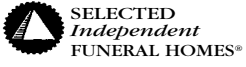

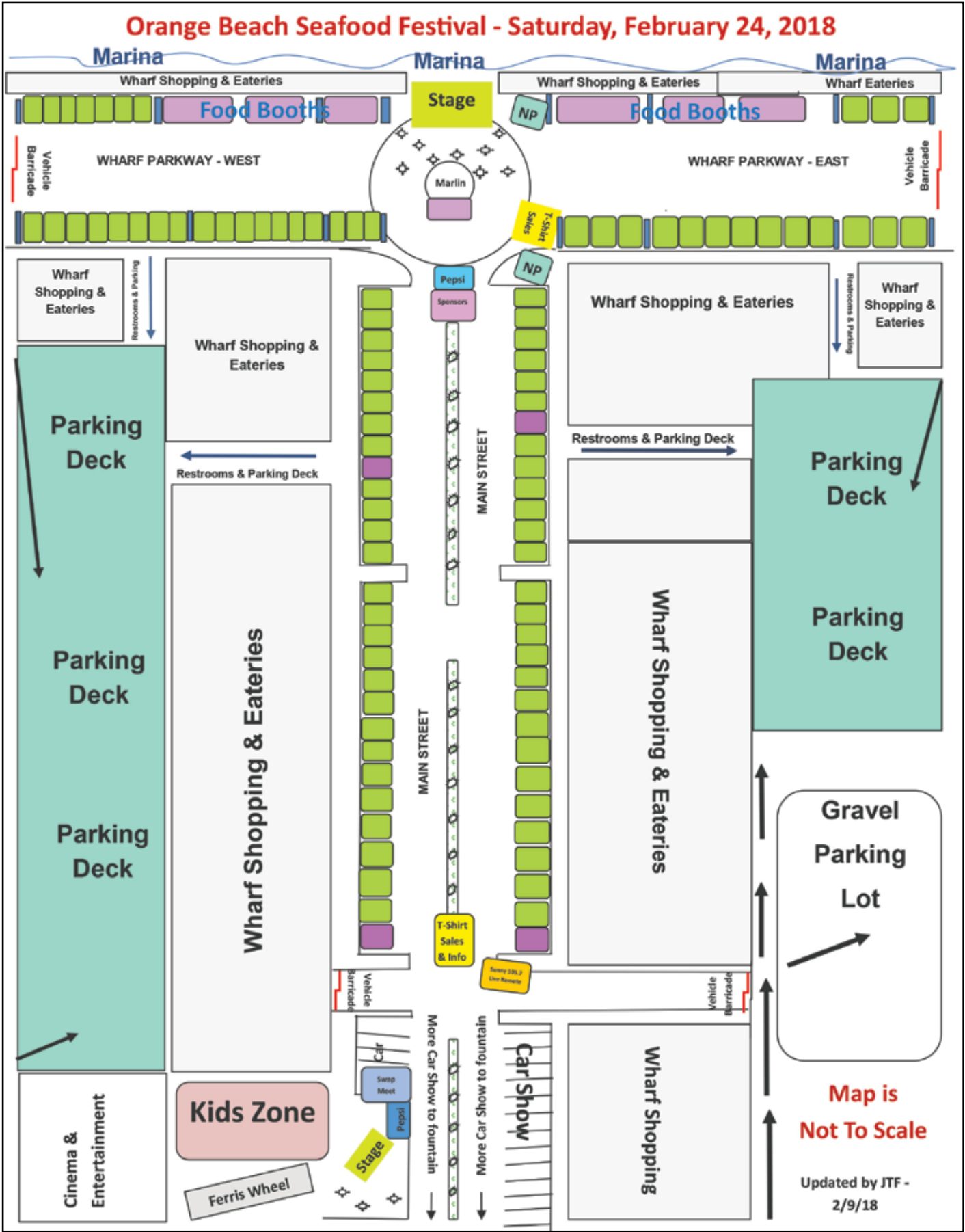

Alabama Coastal Bird Stewardship Program opens for volunteer signups

The Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, in partnership with Birmingham Audubon, has established the Alabama Coastal Bird Stewardship Program (ALCBSP).

This Program provides critical protection and monitoring of Alabama's sensitive beach nesting birds in Mobile and Baldwin counties. ALCBSP is implemented by science staff based from the Birmingham Audubon Coastal Programs Office in downtown Mobile and additionally supported by

Mobile Bay Audubon Society and other volunteers.

The Program focuses on the Audubon Coastal Bird Survey and continued breeding and overwintering success of the following 11 focal species of concern: Wilson's Plover, Snowy Plover, Piping Plover, American Oystercatcher, Red Knot, Sanderling, Short-billed Dowitcher, Least Tern, Black Skimmer, Reddish Egret and Brown Pelican. ALCBSP compliments the work of similar National Audubon Society initiatives in the Gulf of Mexico

including Florida, Mississippi, Louisiana and Texas.

The ALCBSP will help the declining populations of shorebirds and waterbirds by training volunteers to steward and monitor these targeted species and their habitats at key nesting sites along the coast.

During the nesting season, volunteers are also needed to maintain the health and safety of nesting colonies through public outreach and the installation of symbolic fencing at colony locations.

Educating beachgoers through print materials and scope-based viewing opportunities is critical to helping the public become more aware of wildlife and habitats in coastal Alabama.

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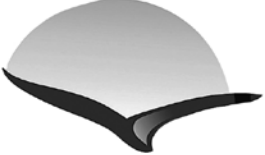

Louisville loses appeal — NCAA to vacate 123 wins

With the heavy competition in College sports sometimes comes controversy. On Tuesday, the NCAA rejected the appeal of the University of Louisville regarding their Men's Basketball team and the sex-for-play scandal. With the appeal dropped, the NCAA delivered a

harsh punishment to the Cardinals men's basketball team by vacating all 123 wins from the 2011-12 to 2014-15 seasons, forced the return of about \$600,000 from conference revenue (Big East, AAC, and ACC), imposed four years of probation and an NCAA fine of at least \$5,000.

Among the wins vacated include the 2013 NCAA National Championship title when Louisville defeated the Michigan Wolverines 83-76.

Also from their appearance in the 2012 NCAA Tournament, the two banners of the title and the Final Four appearance are now taken down in the Cardinals' home coliseum.

This comes after allega-

tions in 2015 of mishandling recruiting from an escort claiming that assistant coach later turned director of basketball operations Andre McGee paid her and other dancers, strippers, and prostitutes to dance and have sex with players at the time as well as recruits. The events were alleged to have been on campus. After the allegations of escort Katina Powell, the

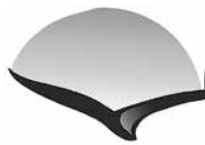
University of Louisville investigated the claims and self-imposed a postseason ban for the 2015-2016 season while the NCAA investigated as well.

Despite the cooperation from the University and the Men's Basketball program, the NCAA handed down a stiff penalty which has the University and former players outraged. Included in the vacated wins are three conference

tournament championships and four NCAA tournament appearances with three of them going to the Elite 8.

This does not include how the Basketball program is under investigation for a pay-for-play scandal with Adidas. The NCAA also vacated the 2004 football National Championship when the USC Trojans defeated the Oklahoma Sooners 55-14.

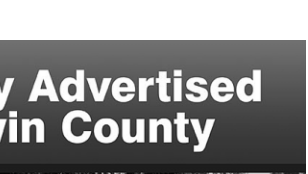

Grow your own salad

Many homeowners grow their own foods at home. Some grow their own because they question what is in or on the products available at the grocery store or curb market. Others grow their own because they have the time and enjoy gardening.

What can I grow?

According to Bethany O’Rear, a regional Extension agent in Home Grounds, Gardens and Home Pests ,you can grow lettuce, kale, spinach and tomatoes. Other items one can grow in their backyard are carrots, cucumbers, radishes, broccoli and cauliflower. A person can grow just about everything that goes into a salad.

How do you grow these things?

The vegetables found in salads need full exposure to the sun.

O’Rear recommends that gardeners do a soil test before growing their own salads. “That way — you will know pH level, which is important when it comes to availability of soil nutrients to the plant,” said O’Rear. A soil test will also allow a gardener to know which nutrients the soil may need. According to O’Rear, there is no need to put nutrients into the soil that are not needed. There must be adequate moisture added to the soil. She recommends drip irrigation, but one can also water plants by hand.

What benefits come with growing your own salad?

O’Rear said the plants grown in your backyard should have the same nutrient value. When it



comes to quality, backyard veggies usually beat grocery store options. The reason is that veggies grown at home can be picked and eaten at the peak of freshness. The options at the grocery store have to be harvested for days, maybe weeks before they hit the shelves. The quality of produce immediately begins to decrease as soon as it is harvested. The longer the time is between harvest and consumption, the lesser the quality will be.

O’Rear also mentions the satisfaction of growing your food as a benefit. “There is no feeling like the one you have when you look at your dinner plate and know that you grew a portion or even all of the food that makes up your meal,” said O’Rear.

Beginner’s advice

O’Rear recommends researching the plants and finding out their specific needs. She says to find a sunny spot, keep the plants adequately watered and don’t be afraid to try new things. “If you have trouble with a certain plant, or even if you lose that particular plant or plants, don’t hang up your gardening gloves. Gardening is trial and error.”

What should I do about the changing seasons?

Not all plants are meant to grow at the same time. “With proper planning and planting, there is always something edible, waiting for harvest.” Regardless of the time of the year, one can find a way to grow a salad.

In those days Stockton was nearly as large, and just as important, as Mobile with a daily steam boat connecting the two cities. Anyone who traveled between Montgomery and Mobile stopped in Stockton.

But the saw mills closed and trains traveled rails that detoured around Stockton. Jobs dwindled. Families moved away. Now, less than 1,000 people call Stockton home.

What Stockton lacks in numbers, it makes up for in devotion.

After residents rallied 1.5 million votes across the state to deem their town a

landmark district, the first in Alabama, they set their sights on preserving their unique history. The best place to keep it, naturally, was the town’s original general store.

Frederick S. Bryars built the store in 1894 and it remained in the family and operating until 1971. The family eventually gifted it to the Stockton Heritage Association and it was used as a community center until the town built a new center up the street.

The old store, which sits in the heart of downtown Stockton, was empty, again. And again, the citizens of Stockton stepped in. There were discussions about moving the historical building but the

locals wouldn’t hear of it. Stockton’s history would stay, and be celebrated, in Stockton.

Conner said over a three-year period the more than 120-year-old building was rebuilt largely by volunteers with nickels and dimes. A few grants paid for the building’s larger

structural needs.

“It was a lot of sweat equity,” she said.

Now the building is a clean, bright and a quaint reminder of Stockton’s bustling past. There are displays dedicated to the men and women who built the town and to the Native Americans who called this land home.

A beautiful meeting space upstairs hosts community groups and activities. Visitors can also purchase books by local authors and historians that detail the history of not just Stockton but all of north Baldwin County.

Most notable are two editions by Robert Leslie Smith, “Gone to the

Swamp,” about life on the delta and “Gone to the South Pacific,” a book about his tours of duty during World War II, including his description of watching the flags raising at Iwo Jima.

The town is also home

to 65 historic homes and draws more than 3,000 visitors each October for the annual Saw Mill Days celebration.

“We want to educate people about this wonderful history that we are all heirs to,” Conner said.
