Orange Beach Police make drug bust

The Orange Beach Police Department executed a narcotics search warrant at a residence on Ivy Lane Thursday which led to two arrests and the seizure of weapons and drugs.

Matthew Gregory, 27, and Wilson Gregory, 34, were taken into custody

and charged with two felonies- possession of drug paraphernalia and possession of marijuana. The men remain incarcerated at the city's jail until they can be transported to the Baldwin County Correctional Facility.

Police Chief Joe Fierro said more than 14 weapons were seized in the raid as well as more than a quarter pound of mari-

juana.

"In mid to late August, we received a tip about some drug activity on Ivy

Lane," Fierro said. "The narcotics unit here in Orange Beach immediately started investigating that and, as you can see, in two months we've brought this to conclusion. I think it's important to know for Orange Beach this was significant. We have over 14 weapons seized, majority of them long guns. They were found loaded, rounds cham-

bered throughout this duplex along with drugs and cash."

The tip mentioned above spoke to traffic in the area indicative of drug activity as well as the smell of marijuana coming from the home. Fierro said there as evidence of distribution and that this kind of activity

Kicking back at the Shrimp Festival

"We have everything to be thankful for in Orange Beach, Alabama."

Mayor Tony Kennon shared those thoughts during the Oct. 3 City Council meeting after welcoming a small delegation from Belgorod-Dnestrovskiy,

Ukraine, who were visiting Lower Alabama with Mobilian Joe Savage of the nonprofit Projects that Matter Inc./Emmanuel House.

Kennon's comments came after Savage described the stark realities of human trafficking faced by many orphaned teenage girls in the Eastern-European countries

of Moldova and Ukraine, and following warm words from Belgorod-Dnestrovskiy Mayor Alla Ginak as translated by her Councilman Rymskiyi "Slavik" Viacheslav.

With the help of Savage, Slavik had visited coastal Alabama with young Ukrainian

Gulf Shores votes to establish city school system

Met by thunderous applause and a standing ovation, the City Council of Gulf Shores voted unanimously to establish a city school system.

The resolution would allow the city to establish a city school board to be appointed by the city from a pool of applicants. The school board would then negotiate with the Baldwin County Board of Education on behalf of the city on the details of the split. Mayor Robert Craft clarified that this move was not meant to be a negative slap in the face toward the county school system.

"We don't agree with some of their philosophies and we don't agree with the way it affects us, but we recognize what an overwhelming challenge they have," Craft said. "With the size of this county, the number of students, the number of facilities and teachers — it is broad and it's diverse. Trying to come up with one formula that takes care of everybody is daunting task."

Recently, the Public Affairs Research Council of Alabama (PARCA) was contracted by the City of Gulf Shores to develop potential budgets for a possible Gulf Shores City School system. PARCA developed budgets based on projected enrollment, or Average Daily Membership (ADM), numbers.

"What we learned from there is there is enough revenue in this city that will flow from the student through the process to us for us to fund a city school system with no new taxes," Craft said.

would not be tolerated in Orange Beach. “That’s not something that this city is about,” Fierro said. “We are a family-friendly destination, and we will keep it that way.” With any investigation like this, the next step is to see the source’s supply and to see where this is coming from and who else is involved which can lead to more arrests. The mari-

juana collected was said to be of a high-quality, but the street value has not yet been determined. The OBPD worked to execute the warrant in conjunction with the Baldwin County Special Response Team and the Foley Police Department. “We executed a search warrant at about 6:15 this morning,” Fierro said. “There are tactical and safety reasons for the officers and, quite frankly, the offenders as well as to why we do that. It was a

knock and announce warrant. In this particular case it did require us to breach the door, and that’s when we apprehended the suspects.” Any person wishing to report suspicious activity can call the OBPD tip line at 251-981-1018 which will do directly to the investigations unit. Those wishing to remain anonymous can and citizens can also send an email to info@obpd.org. “The things to take away from this are we

encourage the public to work with us,” Fierro said. “We’re in a day and age where this is not something police departments can do independently. We work with the sheriff; we work with the other police departments and our state and federal partners. We solicit that same involvement from the community. We want them to know we take their concerns seriously. We take their safety seriously. We will act, and we will act decisively.”

Craft spoke to the crowd about failed options to enhance the education experience for Gulf Shores students, including a task force and special tax districts. He said he felt the only option left to consider was a city school system. “The key of where we go from here was what the citizens wanted us to do,” Craft said. “This didn’t need to be a city council decision. This needed the community coming to us.”

The community did just that. In late July, citizens packed city council chambers to present an option for the PARCA study, with a check for \$12,000 of the \$15,000 needed to complete the study.

Craft said he wanted to find out from the study the level of education the city would financially be able to provide.

Blake Phelps, the city’s economic development coordinator, broke down the PARCA findings for the council.

“They looked at three different models,” Phelps said. “One was existing expenses, basically what we’re spending currently today within our schools on a per student basis. They also went into what they call high-performing and top-performing schools.”

PARCA estimates a Gulf Shores City School System with an ADM of 1,725 students would generate \$15,386,796 in revenues through existing revenue sources. PARCA estimates expenses for a Gulf Shores City School System with an ADM of 1,725 students to be between \$14.9 - \$17.4 million depending upon the academic needs and desires of the community; with \$14,905,185 needed for current expenses, \$16,449,799 to be on par with high-performing schools and \$17,412,275 to be competitive with top-performing schools.

“This actually excludes the 1 mill county-wide special ad valorem tax that was not renewed by the citizens of Baldwin County,” Phelps said. “It’s set to expire next year. We don’t include that in these numbers. It also doesn’t include a portion of a third county-wide sales tax. If that 1 mill is renewed by the county, that’s additional revenues. We wanted to look at a worst-case scenario and be very conservative through this.” PARCA estimates a Gulf Shores City School System with an ADM of 1,725 students could expect to require between \$0 - \$2.1 million in additional annual revenues depending upon the academic needs and desires of the community.

Councilman Jason Dyken, also chairman

of the finance committee, said the city was in dire straights in 2008. Gulf Shores was operating in the red every year and “basically living on credit cards.” Since then, the city had been able to get to a place financially where it has \$24 million in reserves and is even making accelerated debt payments. He said he had spoken to credit agencies to see how much the city needed to have in reserves to get the best possible rate in capital markets and found they had already reached that number.

“By putting more money in reserves, we weren’t getting a return on that investment,” Dyken said. “We looked at how best to reallocate that money. It’s y’all’s money.

That money is in excess of \$2 million a year.”

By reallocating money previously used to bolster the city’s reserves to education, the city would have enough money for the estimate to put it on-par with top-performing schools in the state.

“We’re not doing this to keep schools as they are,” Dyken said. “We’re not talking about just buildings, but improved academic performance. That has always been our perspective as a city through this administration.”

Baldwin County Superintendent Eddie Tyler responded to the announcement by wishing Gulf Shores well in its endeavor and reassuring parents that the county system doesn’t expect significant disruptions from

the transfers.

“We have been anticipating the Gulf Shores split for several months,” Tyler said. “In fact, our decision to move forward with the middle school in Orange Beach was in large part a result of information we had received about the impending decision in Gulf Shores.”

He said the county school system is on fire right now with graduation rates and college scholarship awards are higher than they have ever been. He also expressed concern with Gulf Shores not coming out of the gate with a plan of excellence.

“In fact, their five page plan is the bare minimum, with a significant reduction in per pupil spending from where they

are today,” Tyler said.

“Had they come out with a plan to be the best funded, best staffed system in Alabama, then I would be applauding them and excited for what they can do, but that is not what they have shown. While I have hope, and I wish them well, I am also concerned for these families and their future education.” Councilman Philip Harris said he had

been asked several times why the city had not gone in for a more in-depth study like it had done years back.

“What we realized from all that was that we were trying to do too much out of the gate,” Harris said. “What we realized what that we don’t need to start at the end. We just need to start.”

Gulf Shores approves signaled intersection on Foley Beach Express

The Gulf Shores City Council approved a resolution to begin improvements to the intersection of County Road 8 and the Foley Beach Express (FBE) at its last council meeting, including making the intersection signaled.

Mayor Robert Craft said this is something the city has been working on for quite a while to try and understand the dynamics of it.

“We have received a word from the county that they are in favor of allowing this to happen which is what was required there,” Craft said. “There is limited access on Foley Beach Express, but this will provide full access north and south onto County Road 8 with a signal there.”



A look at the proposed improvements to County Road 8 including bike lanes, sidewalks and medians.


The goal is to improve the capacity of County Road 8 from Hwy 59 through to the FBE. The city will enter into a funding agreement with ALDOT for preliminary engineering and to come up with a schematic design for an at-grade signalized intersection at County Road 8 and FBE.

Public Works Director Mark Acreman said the city has been looking at major transportation improvements and one of the first areas they wanted to

focus on was the County Road 8 corridor.

“That’s become a major cut-through for tourists as well as a major growth area for single-family residential,” Acreman said. “We have the new Auburn campus being constructed and there’s a lot of growth there with our city’s education campus.”

Volkert Associates was preselected by the department of transportation as they are prequalified to perform roadway and infrastructure design of this

nature. Included in the proposed scope of work are:

- Widen County Road 8 East to four lanes with center median
- Add right-turn, left-turn and stacking lanes to the County Road 8/ Hwy 59 intersection
- Redesign the stormwater along County Road 8
- Add a traffic signal to the County Road 8/ Foley Beach Express Intersection

ALDOT will reimburse

the city for the design costs related to the Foley Beach Express intersection improvements and the money for this project has been budgeted and accounted for in the 2017 and 2018 budgets. The work will include bike lanes, sidewalks and medians.

Craft said with the problems with congestion on Roscoe Road and the concentration of traffic on County Road 4, the city has been aiming to make County Road 8 the main thoroughfare into and out of Gulf Shores.

“That is a dramatic growth opportunity for the city moving forward, and we want to see it enhanced the best that we can and transportation and traffic will be a factor,” Craft said.

Also approved at the council meeting were:

- An exchange of services

agreement with the Gulf Shores and Orange Beach Tourism Board to cohost the NAIA Track and Field National Championships for 2018 and 2019.

- Annexing of more lots in the Martyn Woods subdivision. Planning Director Andy Bauer said 13 lots owned by four individuals remain to be annexed into the city in Phase II of the development.
- A reroofing project for the annex buildings in an amount not to exceed \$325,000. There have been multiple roof leaks over the past several years in both the Executive Annex Building and the Building/P&Z Annex Building. The existing shingle roof has been patched multiple times and has passed its anticipated life cycle.

“No Questions Asked” is a bad way to Lead

Years ago, when John David and Emily were in grade school and Jake was a toddler, Santa brought us a Labrador Retriever named Hank. As is usually the case with family pets, the snow job from the children was that they would be solely responsible for its care. Soon, however, it was I (full disclosure: I’m not really a “dog person”) who was doing all the feeding and walking. The walking was especially crucial because Hank was a one-dog-wrecking-crew indoors if he didn’t get plenty of exercise outdoors. One cold February weekend, I put my foot down and informed my oldest that when I gave orders for a walk to be given, I wanted immediate obedience, no questions asked, then I flopped onto the couch for a little siesta. I noticed after a few minutes that the house had become eerily quiet, so I looked outside. To my astonishment, John David, bundled up in a parka to protect him from the freezing rain, was leaning against the mailbox watching Jake, not Hank, toddle up and down the driveway in diapers and a tee-shirt. I shouted my dismay to which John David replied, “You told me to walk Jake, no questions asked!”

“I meant Hank!”

“Well, you said Jake.”

“Who walks a toddler?!?”

“You said, ‘No questions asked.’”

While there are a number of lessons to be

learned from this little episode, the one for consideration today is this: “No questions asked” is a bad way to lead. While often employed in the belief that such an approach streamlines decision-making, it really serves mostly to cover up poor preparation, insecurity, intimidation, and laziness. Questions are greatly more likely to be keys to problem-solving than problem-creating. In the life of faith, I’m so thankful that God doesn’t treat us that way. The Scriptures are filled with people asking God the toughest kinds of questions. He doesn’t always give us the answer we want, but He very much wants us to come and ask, and He will always give us Himself, no questions asked.






Solomon, the 60s, and taking a knee

After church last Sunday my husband Bill and I sat outside our local bookstore reading the New York Times. Bill glanced up from the sports section and said, “I hate all this kneeling during the national anthem. Can’t they protest some other way? I mean, the national anthem,” he added, emphasizing the last two words. “If they don’t like our country, let them get on a plane and go to Australia.”

“Bill, in the ‘60s Americans were burning the flag,” I replied.

One of the benefits of getting older is that we begin to understand the wearied cynicism of the book of Ecclesiastes, written by Solomon — how long ago?

That which has been is what will be,

That which is done
Is what will be done.
And there is nothing
new under the sun.

Until PBS began airing Ken Burns’ and Lynn Novick’s documentary, “The Vietnam War,” I had almost forgotten how bad the ‘60s were.

The counterculture’s mantra, “make love, not war,” had hippies copulating in the streets. The shocking assassinations, the Cuban missile crisis, war protests, the burning and bombing of campus ROTC buildings, the killings at Kent State, Charles Manson, the upheaval of civil rights, fire hoses and snarling dogs, ceaseless violence and death in Vietnam, the sudden dissolution of morale standards that

theretofore had been commonly accepted, and then, the frightening duplicity of Richard Nixon.

I remember thinking, in my inexperienced youth, that “the country was coming apart.” Sound familiar?

Now, though I disapprove of it, the protest of a few athletes kneeling during our national anthem doesn’t get me “all fraught up,” to use a phrase favored by my father. An intransigent Congress, a shoot-from-the-hip president, the poisonous seepage of Islamic extremism throughout the world, war upon war ... Thank goodness I now possess an experienced core that shrugs and remembers we’ve survived worse.

Yet we do well to care, very deeply, about the is-

suues troubling us and our country, no matter that it has ever been so and will ever be. We suffer in our present moment, and decent people do their best, individually and collectively, to make circumstances better. Just as they have throughout human history.

I’m not suggesting equivalence here, but the pose of football players taking a defiant knee bears a strong resemblance to the depiction of General George Washington kneeling in prayer at Valley Forge. Taking exception to unfair treatment is thoroughly American. Lest we forget, our own Revolutionary War was a violent protest against being viewed as vassals.

As a democracy, we require an agonizingly long

time to redress wrongs. Sometimes we need a nudge even to see the problem. Like it or not, protests that provoke outrage get the gears grinding, often more quickly than reasoned discourse.

In one segment of “The Vietnam War,” an American POW recalls that at night, he and his fellow prisoners would softly sing patriotic and spiritual songs. We finally realized, he said, that though we came from different social and economic backgrounds, different races and religions, we were all Americans.

Yes we are, have been, and ever will be. Americans, all.

All is “vanity and grasping for the wind,” Solomon chants throughout the book of Ecclesi-

astes. Despair pervades his worldview. In the last two verses of the book, however, he lifts his head and says the following.

Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter:

Fear God and keep his commandments,

For this is man’s all.

For God will bring every work into judgment,

Including every secret thing,

Whether good or evil.

Or as the prophet Micah said, “What does the Lord require of you but to do justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God?”

And to bear in mind that there is nothing new under the sun.

Work, work, work

There is a poem by an unknown author that I heard many years ago, and it has stuck with me:

Stick to your task ’til it sticks to you;
Beginners are many, but enders are few.
Honor, power, place and praise
Will always come to the one who stays.
Stick to your task ’til it sticks to you;
Bend at it, sweat at it, smile at it, too;
For out of the bend and the sweat and the smile
Will come life’s victories after a while.

This poem is about work, just plain, old work.

In one way, we are all the same. We all have problems. Some are everyday, ordinary, even mundane problems such as getting out of bed, what to wear, fixing breakfast, getting the car out of the garage, and getting to wherever we need to be on time. Others are more profound such as failing a class, losing a job, loss in a relationship, the death of a loved one, having a major illness, or being the caregiver for someone with a major illness. We all have problems, but they all have a common solution, work. Just plain, old work.

Work and time will solve any problem. That may sound like a simplistic statement, but if you think about it, it is basis for any solution. Some problems may take a long time to solve, but if you don’t work at them, they take longer. Work is the basic, essential element to the solutions of every problem. We can sit, wringing our hands, lamenting how hard it is, or how unfair it is, or how long it will take, but if we don’t get to work, the problem will not be solved.

Nowhere in the poem does it say that the task will get easier. It doesn’t. What changes is you. “Stick to the task ‘til it sticks to you”, means that as you work, your ability to do the task improves, making the task seem easier. For example, very few of us walked the first time we tried. We bounced off our behinds a lot before we mastered balance, but if we had quit the first time we fell, we would still be crawling. Life’s problems, small or over-

whelming, can be solved by applying the simple principle of sticking to the task... working.

I hear people lament, “There’s nothing I can do.” Sure, there is. If nothing else, sit quietly and think about it. Thinking of a bad situation may be painful, but if you allow yourself, you can come up with a solution, or at least an idea, and that’s a start. Starting is the hardest part of any task.

Talk about it. It may be that you are too close to the problem, the proverbial not seeing the for-

est for the trees. Often, an objective third party can see a solution you cannot, or point you in the right direction and get you started. Whatever you do, get to work.

Sometimes, the solution is to do nothing, and that is often the most difficult task, especially dealing with teenagers who know it all. When you see a clear solution to a task you have experienced, you have to keep quiet and do nothing knowing that if you interject uninvited, they won’t take advantage of your experience and may do the opposite of what you suggested. If they stick to the task, they will solve the problem in a way unique to themselves. All the while, you must endure their growing pains while swallowing your pride and the blood from biting your tongue.

When the solution won’t come, or isn’t obvious, get to work even if it is not on the problem puzzling you. I find that if I work on something, anything, even if it is raking leaves, I am solving problems, and often a solution comes to the more difficult problem.

Work is a blessing, and a hard one to earn, you have to work at it, but if you “stick to the task ‘til it sticks to you”, the blessing of life’s victories will come to you.

Micah’s mother likely put it best when she said that her “heart is grieved that babies are allowed to be aborted at the same age that my own son was born and even later.” It is simply heartbreaking.

Well, I recently voted to change the law and ban abortions in the United States after 20 weeks. Thankfully, the Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act, also known as Micah’s Law, passed the House by a vote of 237 to 189. The bill now awaits action in the Senate.

This is a commonsense, pro-life bill that simply states that abortions after 20 weeks are unlawful in the United States. The bill does include very limited exceptions in cases of rape, incest, or when the health of the mother is at risk.

To be clear, I do not support abortion at any point, but there is great significance to the 20-week timeframe.

Twenty weeks is the point at which doctors and scientists agree that ba-

bies can actually feel pain. The more premature an infant is, the worse the pain because they have yet to develop pain inhibitors.

Sadly, thousands of babies right here in the United States are killed and subjected to excruciating pain due to late-term abortions. It is simply unconscionable. That is why this legislation is so critically important.

We shouldn’t stop with Micah’s Law. As a member of the House Pro-Life Caucus, I am always looking for new opportunities to stand up for the unborn.

For example, I am a staunch supporter of the Hyde Amendment, which is a provision included in annual government funding bills to ensure no taxpayer money is used to perform an abortion. I have also supported legislation to make the Hyde Amendment permanent, so it no longer must be passed each year.

I also previously voted to eliminate funding for Planned Parenthood, an organization that promotes abortions. I support redirecting the money away from Planned Parenthood and putting it toward community health centers, which are more plentiful and provide a wider range of services. These are just a few examples.

As I cast my vote in favor of the Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act a few weeks ago, Micah was on my mind. I thought about his smile and how he was full of energy. I thought about others like him who may have been given a chance at life were it not for our nation’s broken laws.

As is written in Jeremiah 1:5, “Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart.” I promise to always stand up for God’s precious gift of life and to support pro-life policies throughout my time in Congress.

Religious liberty for all

Free exercise of religion is a bedrock principle of American governance. As schoolchildren, we're taught that Pilgrims fled to America to avoid persecution by the Church of England. While many of America's founders were Christians, they prohibited government from favoring one religion over another. Our constitutional protection for religious exercise is listed first in the Bill of Rights. That wasn't a mistake.

Since I've been involved in Alabama politics, I've noticed that a good number of people, Christian conservatives in particular, tend to equate "defending religious liberty" with "defending Christian principles." Many of the religious-liberty cases around the country that we hear about in conservative circles involve Christians being sued for refusing to do things that violate their beliefs. So I understand, to some degree, why this religious-liberty confusion occurs. That's why it's important, when we find ourselves thinking about the intersection of faith and government, to remember what the founders intended when they first laid out the concept of religious liberty.

We can turn on the news almost any given day and see people around the world persecuted for their beliefs. Even in America, we see targeting of different religious groups by radical individuals. I am thankful we do not live in a country where government-sanctioned religious discrimination exists, but with that comes the obligation of our government to defend the rights of all individuals to worship across all religions.

When it comes to politics, I am more likely to vote for a candidate who is a Christian, not because I think that they intend to use their office as a soapbox for our shared beliefs, but because I believe they are more likely to prayerfully consider decisions they may make. I have the right to do that, just like the person sitting next to me at my polling place has the right to vote for a candidate who has a different system of beliefs, or no religious beliefs at all.

I'm afraid if folks start thinking about what religious liberty really means, some won't like it. From where I'm sitting, it looks like many are okay with the concept of religious liberty as long as it only applies to what they believe. But here's the problem with that — who defines what's right in terms of religion? I think John Adams said it best: "Nothing is more dreaded than the National Government meddling with religion." True freedom means that people are given the opportunity to worship the way they see fit, and the government shouldn't stifle or promote any particular religion, theology, or belief system.

Today, we live in a state where many politicians are proud to be Christians, and for that I am truly thankful. But what if, one day, that changes and Christians become the ones compelled to comply with another religion, or shamed by the government for adhering to our religion? One day, it could be that most of our elected officials espouse a religion that I do not. Would we want to receive the same treatment we've extended to other religious groups? If we can't answer that question in the affirmative, we need to rethink our stance on religious liberty.

The theory of economics in Orange Beach

The differences between theory and practice are often insurmountable, but Orange Beach may be the exception.

Community-oriented development started in late 2006 with the Horizon 20/20 Plan, defining the direction Orange Beach wanted to take. The Great Depression of 2008 changed that, re-inventing the way businesses and cities look at long-term growth. A decade later, our local economy is booming, breaking records for municipal revenue, according to Mayor Tony Kennon in a Facebook video.

John Maynard Keynes said, "Employment levels are determined by aggregate (total) demand rather than by the price of labor. Economies should not be expected to automatically right themselves after a temporary shock," according to Macat An Intro to Keynes' General Theory of Employment, Interest and Money, a YouTube video.

After the Great Depression in 2008, finally seeing the ship right itself with recordsetting revenue levels in Orange Beach, generating \$48.6 Million in revenue in 2016, compared to \$36.3 Million in 2010, according to Financial-Audit Documents on the website, cityoforangebeach.com.

This ship was not self righting, municipal intervention played an integral part with stimulus programs, like beach cleaning and the "Leave Only Footprints" initiative of 2014, injecting money into the economy, being so successful that a 2 percent lodging tax was laid-ontop in 2017, generating \$5 Million in revenue, according to Ford Handley, Finance Director for the City of Orange Beach. This tax-based stimulus was enshrined into law, ex-

panding its brief to cover traffic infrastructure, creating additional jobs and more economic growth.

The importance of government intervention, helping economies grow cannot be underestimated. Assuming that natural-market forces and free enterprise will keep the economy in Orange Beach thriving is delusional, because governments have resources to intervene during economic shocks, creating jobs, like cleaning the beaches, and providing ambassadors for sunbathing visitors. These municipal efforts have a positive affect, supporting restaurants, fishing trips, and beach services.

Stimulus may not have been Council's Plan, but it is the result of their actions.

Another example where actions begat stimulus is the \$14.9 Million Middle School approved for construction in Orange Beach by the Baldwin County Board of Education in 2017, according to John Sharp at AL.com. These monies will generate jobs, purchasing everything from alphabet soup to zip ties. Workers will need to eat, perhaps persuading the city to temporarily ease permitting on food trucks, specifically servicing the school's construction site.

Local vendors will also benefit, because the city allows 5 percent leeway on Bids for City Contracts. "In accordance with State Law (Act 2015-293), the City does have a 5 percent local preference. Our local preference zone as set by City Council is Baldwin County. Please note that this local preference only applies to purchases subject to the State of Alabama's Competitive Bid Law, which includes materials, equipment, and services \$15,000 or more, with some exceptions, and does not apply to competitively bid Public Works Contracts," said Renee Eberly, City Clerk & Pro-

curement Officer for the City of Orange Beach in an email.

Even without a written plan, big dollars will pour into the city's coffers from the Middle School's construction. Afterwards, additional jobs will come online for school

administration, teachers, special-needs personnel, bus drivers, cleaners, cafeteria staff, and grounds keepers who will spend money in Orange Beach.

So, who needs a plan?

The stakeholders in Orange Beach are the entire community from beach condos to residential homes to local businesses. No one escapes an economic downturn like the one we had in 2008, knowing it has taken a decade to recover from the last cycle. We cannot avoid what happens on the national level, but we can lessen the impact on the local level, understanding there is a pillow to soften the landing with stimulus.

Decision-tree strategies give government self-policing oversight, checking in the rear-view mirror, ensuring they are between the lines, defined by plans like Horizon 20/20.

In the case of Orange Beach, I do not believe we would have achieved this level of success by welding our colors to one particular strategy. It took navigating-by-gut, seeing an opportunity to grow, strengthening beach tourism, and a little luck from hurricane-free years to succeed. Seen with 20/20 hindsight, we had a viable plan, as if the path were intentional, perhaps we should write it up, and share it with other municipalities.

The classic-economic model decries stimulus-related thinking, "If the economy is allowed to work, the economy will automatically gravitate towards full employment, according to John Nash, The Keynesian Model and the Classical Model, a You-

Tube video.

This will happen eventually, but taking so long that the economic devastation will impact a generation.

Milton Friedman, the doyen of classical economics, argued against government stimulus. This is where the social conflict between the two ideologies of stimulus versus non-intervention becomes important. Friedman espoused free markets should be free from government meddling in his book Capitalism and Freedom according to Macat, An Introduction to Milton Friedman's Capitalism and Freedom, a YouTube video. Friedman saw government intervention, leading to economic stagnation without innovation, threatening democracy, because of excessive-governmental intrusion.

Both the Keynesian and the Friedman Models strive towards an economy operating at its full potential. The Keynesian model forces government intervention, arguing the economy is not always in full employment, realizing wages and prices can get stuck, like in a recession, requiring government stimulus for help, kick-starting the economy for a faster recovery.

Keynesian theory is clearly the corner stone of economic thought in Orange Beach.

Perhaps not being defined as such, because Keynesian doctrine was liberally applied by the Obama administration, yet here we are, enjoying the fruits of municipal stimulus in the heart of conservative orthodoxy. Proving liberal theories and conservative practices can work in harmony. Perhaps Orange Beach is the small-town exception, defining new rules for municipal economics.



AN UNWILLING ACCOMPLICE

According to a popular song, one good way to get by is with a little help from your friends. Bridge players sometimes can go a step further by enlisting the aid of the enemy to help them out of a difficult predicament.

Consider today's deal from the 1987 North American Swiss Team Championship. South, Dorothy Truscott, had a difficult decision after East's weak two-heart opening. A double would be for takeout and might well elicit an unwelcome club response, while the unbalanced distribution and lack of fillers argued against a two-notrump overcall. So she elected to pass, hoping her partner would reopen the bidding, as in fact happened.

West led the heart eight against three notrump. East covered dummy's ten with the jack, and Truscott ducked. East switched to the king of diamonds, and declarer ducked twice before taking the ace. She then successfully finessed

the club queen and cashed the ace, discarding a small spade, before leading the three of hearts from dummy.

East had to put up the nine to prevent South from winning the trick with the seven. Truscott won with the king and cashed the A-K of spades to bring her total thus far to six tricks. It was now time to enlist the help of the enemy. So after cashing the second spade, she exited with a diamond to East's nine.

With nothing but hearts left, East had to lead from the Q-6-4 to South's A-7. This not only gave declarer an extra heart trick, but also provided the entry with which to cash her good diamond.

So Truscott wound up scoring two club tricks, two spades, two diamonds and three hearts — just enough for her contract. The result gave her team a 10-IMP pickup when the North-South pair at the other table stopped in three clubs and went down one.

Toros pull away for inter-region win over Lions

FOLEY — Spanish Fort and Foley met in a cross-class matchup in Lions territory Friday. In a matchup that could’ve been an upset alert game for Spanish Fort, it ended

up being a one-sided performance in a 49-14 win over Foley.

After the Lions’ scored with a 3-yard wildcat run from Chris Armstrong on their second drive, the Toros’ defense played more consistently and sound.

Foley wouldn’t have another scoring drive until their final possession late in the final quarter.

The best play of the game was a screen from Jack Samsel to Reed where he quickly pitched to Troy Trojans commit Grant Betts for a 19-yard touchdown in the first play of the second quarter.

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“The Walking Dead” begins its eighth season with its 100th episode Sunday on AMC.

‘The Walking Dead’ salutes its fans and its past in Season 8

Sometimes actors can take on the traits of their characters. Take, for instance, Melissa McBride, who plays abused wife-turned-fearless warrior Carol Peletier on AMC’s zombie apocalypse drama “The Walking Dead.” When a snake recently appeared in her home and got stuck to a glue pad used to catch invading pests, the 52-year-old actress took action and without a second thought grasped the slithering critter and freed it from its sticky prison.

“I had a pair of gloves on,” McBride recalls, “and the exterminator guy was helping me and I got to the head part and I just put my fingers right below its mouth, around its neck and took its tail and took it to a bush and threw it. And it slithered away. And I was like, ‘That’s something Carol would have done. Thanks Carol.’ ”

The eighth season of the hit drama kicks off Sunday, Oct. 22, with its 100th episode, and as has been the case in seasons past, AMC is offering scant few details on what lies ahead, lest spoilers be revealed. But published reports have indicated the new season will refocus the series on small-town sheriff Rick Grimes (Andrew Lincoln), now sporting a gray beard and cane, evidently the result of a time jump. At least one episode will be devoted to Season 7 villain Negan’s (Jeffrey Dean Morgan) past and how he became the baseball-bat-wielding brute responsible for the deaths of two regular characters.

Elsewhere, Maggie (Lauren Cohan) is still pregnant but will not have the child, the time jump apparently not affecting her. A Muslim character, Abbud (Avi Nash, “Silicon Valley”), is introduced. And as a tribute to the series and its hardcore fans, little in-jokes and nuggets from past seasons will be sprinkled throughout the episodes.

It’s “All-Out War” in the new season, which follows the 20th volume of “The Walking Dead” comic book series, as the Alexandrians and their allies rise up against the totalitarian Saviors. Carol will undoubtedly be involved, but what that means for the character going forward, McBride was offering few details.

“There is a lot of action this season,” McBride says, “and I’m really excited about some of the things that Carol is getting to do, engaging in this fight with the Saviors. I think this is the most physically challenging season for Carol. I’m excited.”

Such is life around a successful series whose storylines hinge on cliffhangers. In fact, so hush-hush are things surrounding “TWD” these days that on the day of this interview, McBride was noncommittal as to whether she was working that day.

“Kind of,” she says with a laugh. “I’m trying to avoid spoilers. If I tell you that I am, then that means Carol’s still alive.”

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Conservation Advisory Board welcomes new members

The Alabama Conservation Advisory Board will welcome new members and share its appreciation with departing members at its first meeting of 2018 in February. Jessica Butler of Scottsboro and Greg Barksdale of Hanceville will join the board as first-time members, while Brock Jones of Boligee returns to the board for a new term.

“I’m excited to have Jessica Butler and Greg Barksdale as new additions to the board,” said Chris Blankenship, Commissioner of the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources. “Both seem to have a real passion for the outdoors, and they may bring a different perspective than before. Brock Jones was appointed about a month ago, and he understands the process after being on the board previously.”

Dr. Warren Strickland of Huntsville, who served as chairman for the past several years, and Austin Ainsworth of Guntersville recently finished their terms on the board. “I really appreciate the leadership of Dr. Strickland as chairman for the last several years and his service to the board for over a decade,” said Blankenship. “I also appreciate Austin’s contribution

to the board. It’s always bittersweet when you get new members and members you’ve enjoyed working with move on to other things. I would be remiss not to thank Dr. Strickland and Austin for their service to the board and to the hunters and anglers of Alabama.” Current board member Joseph “Joey” Dobbs Jr. of Birmingham was named the new chair of the board, and Ben Stimpson Jr. of Mobile was reappointed by Gov. Kay Ivey.

“I’m also looking forward to working with our new chairman, Joey Dobbs,” Blankenship said. “He’s been on the board for a good while. He’s a skilled statesman and will do a very effective job of working with all the members of the board to make sure their voices are heard, and that they have the opportunity to represent their districts.”

Butler is a member of the Scottsboro City Council and Marketing Director at Highlands Medical Center in Scottsboro. She took her first buck, a 9-pointer, in the eighth grade and has been an avid hunter and angler all her life. Among her other outdoor pursuits are waterfowl hunting and fly-fishing.

Barksdale has a background in banking and insurance and has been an avid outdoorsman for 40 years. He brings

a lifelong love of hunting and fishing in Alabama and several other states. Barksdale, who is involved with the Cullman County 4-H Shotgun Sports program, pursues opportunities to mentor and educate young people about natural resources, wildlife and wilderness conservation.

Jones, a Camden native who works in finance, lives in Boligee where his outdoors endeavors include hunting deer, dove and quail in Greene and Wilcox counties.

For those not familiar with the Conservation Advisory Board, it is composed of 10 members appointed by the Governor for alternating terms of six years, and three ex-officio members. Those ex-officio members are currently Gov. Ivey, Commissioner of Agriculture and Industries John McMillan and Director of the Alabama Cooperative Extension System Gary Lemme. The Commissioner of the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) serves as the ex-officio secretary of the board.

The Advisory Board, which was created by statute, meets two to three times per year to assist in formulating policies for the four DCNR divisions — Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries, Marine Resources, State Parks and State Lands. The board is regularly updated on all rules and

regulations and takes public input at the public meetings on any issues regarding conservation and natural resources in the state. The board can offer recommendations for change or amendment to the rules and regulations. Any changes or amendments to those rules and regulations must receive approval of two-thirds of the members and the approval of the Governor to become effective.

“The Conservation Advisory Board members come from all over the state,” Blankenship said. “They work with people in their districts to understand the conservation-related issues they face and to share those with the Department.

“Also, as we have regulations, as we have needs, it’s good to work with the Advisory Board to get their advice and to get the word out about different regulations or things we’re doing in the Department.”

To ensure the public is aware of any changes in the rules and regulations, the board made changes to its procedures to get as much public input as possible before any votes are taken.

“I think people view the board as very fair,” Blankenship said. “The public can bring up an issue or a board member can bring up an issue at one meeting, but we can’t bring it up and vote on it at the same meeting. That’s

been the rule of the board for the past several years. That way, people get plenty of opportunity to look at the proposals and provide public input so the decisions made by the board and the Department are very sound.

“Our process provides a good back-and-forth with the Advisory Board and the divisions of the Department and the public to try to do what’s right for the natural resources of our state and for the people who enjoy the outdoors.”

With the additions of Butler, Barksdale and Jones, the board has now reached its 10 members who represent the different districts in the state.

Representing District 1 are Stimpson and Gary Wolfe of Fairhope. District 2 is represented by Patrick Cagle of Montgomery and Grady Hartzog of Eufaula.

Jeff Martin of Pell City represents District 3, while Barksdale represents District 4. Butler and Raymond Jones Jr. of Huntsville represent District 5. Dobbs is the District 6 representative, and Brock Jones is the representative from District 7.

The board usually meets in February each year, followed by a meeting later in the spring.

As numerous hunters and anglers can attest, regular attendance and input at the CAB meetings can result in the changes the public desires as long as those changes are in the best interest of the natural resources and outdoors enthusiasts in Alabama. Those who do not participate are missing a valuable opportunity for their voices to be heard.

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

How to choose a personal trainer

Why should personal trainers be only a luxury

of the rich and famous? Some say that they cannot afford a personal trainer yet they will splurge on the purse that is in style,

an expensive dinner out, or on a piece of exercise equipment that they promise to use. Unlike the purse that goes out of

style, the instantly gratifying meal, and exercise bike that is used to hang clothing on, personal training is an investment in your health and fitness which can bring lasting benefits.

Before you splurge on the gift of personal training for yourself or for someone you care about, there are a few considerations that you should be aware of to make a sound investment. The following checklist will help you in your search for an educated, qualified, and compatible trainer who will help you to meet and to exceed your fitness goals.



Education and Certification

First and foremost, a professional trainer should have a degree in exercise science, kinesiology, exercise physiology, or a related health and fitness field. Ideally, your trainer should also have a current certification from a nationally recognized organization. The title “Personal Trainer” is not a guarantee that the person is qualified to lead you in a safe effective exercise program. The degrees and certifications are more than just pieces of paper. Rather, they are your assurance that your trainer has spent hours of serious preparation and did not get certified on a whim. Currently, there aren't any national standards or minimum requirements for holding this job title. Therefore, it is best for you to choose a trainer who is certified by one of the following organizations:

- American College of Sports Medicine (ACSM)
 - Aerobic and Fitness Association of American (AFAA)
 - American Council on Exercise (ACE)
 - National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA)
- While there may be other qualified certifying bodies not listed above, these are the most recog-

nized and respected in the field. These certifications require a valid CPR card, the passing of written and practical exams, and continuing education requirements. These organizations also offer professional liability insurance to their trainers. Some of the organizations even provide an online database of trainers in your particular area.

The Right Fit

You must decide if you would prefer a male or female trainer. Is the trainer able to accommodate your schedule? The trainer should be able to communicate clearly and explain your program in an easy to understand manner. Ask yourself if this trainer is someone you could get along with. The trainer should be an individual genuinely interested in helping you to make the lifestyle changes necessary to reach your fitness goals.

Fees

Rates will vary depending on the length of sessions, location, and trainer's experience. Some gyms offer discounts on package deals and even group personal training options. On average, hands-on personal training is \$65 to \$100 an hour depending on the market.

A Game Plan

Be cautious of a trainer who insists on a workout during the first meeting without first getting to know your goals and physical capabilities. Qualified trainers should ask you to complete a health history

questionnaire, informed consent form, and require a physician's approval to exercise. Baseline measurements to assess body fat, flexibility, cardio respiratory endurance and muscular endurance can be utilized to prescribe the best type of exercise, equipment and level of intensity. No exercise plan is complete without giving proper attention to nutrition. Your trainer should have a network of professionals such as nutrition specialists, physical therapists, and physicians to refer you to in areas outside of their expertise.

Proceed With Caution

Beware of trainers who may engage in unethical practices. Be on guard and skeptical if your trainer:

- Tries to sell dietary supplements or ergogenic aids.
- Is uninsured.
- Doesn't have written policies on billing and cancellation procedures.
- Is not punctual or is unavailable via telephone or email.
- Does not practice what he/she preaches.

With the above information you are now equipped to go out and find the best trainer to best suit you. So, go ahead and splurge because you are investing in one of your greatest assets — your health and fitness!



professionals in late summer and returned home only to be encouraged to return with his mayor. In addition to his city duties, Slavik is an International Assistant in the Ukrainian Parliament and he and his wife also work in orphanages.

“I have an organization, a nonprofit, in Moldova, which is a neighboring country to Ukraine,” Savage said in the council chambers on Oct. 2. “Moldova is the poorest nation in all of Europe and they have a problem; and the problem is human trafficking.

“I go up and down our coast, we have a lot of workers from those Eastern European countries. Well, what happens over there is because of the lack of jobs and opportunity, and the economy is so poor, that a million young people for instance in Moldova, between 18 and 28, have left that country for work in places like Gulf Shores, Orange Beach, etc. And so in the midst of that are the human traffickers because the girls tend to be very pretty and very poor.”

Adding being orphaned to the situation, Savage

called it the tragic trifecta of trafficking.

“What happens is the mafia takes these orphans when they finish [leave the orphanage] at the age of 15, offer them jobs around the world — at resorts or resort communities like Gulf Shores and Orange Beach — and the result of that is they get them there and then they turn them into prostitutes whether they want to or not,” Savage explained.

“Statistically, 60 percent of all orphan girls in Ukraine and Moldova will become victims of trafficking - 60 percent. And when that girl becomes a victim of trafficking, she’ll be prostituted 6,000 times and she’s dead in seven years.”

Savage said when he came across the “horrific situation,” he knew something had to be done. Teaming up with a missionary couple in Moldova who were already helping orphans and thanks to the “generosity of American people,” Savage said The Emmanuel House opened in 2013 near Chisinau, Moldova. The home aims to rescue 15- to 21-year-old girls from dangerous situations and give them every opportunity possible to have a wonderful life.

The nonprofit is now working with another house of refuge for older

orphans in Belgorod-Dnestrovskiy and finding foster homes for the young at-risk women.

“These are my dear friends,” Savage said as he introduced Mayor Ginak, Slavik and others. “Mayor Alla here started a shoe factory several years ago, 10 years ago. Her factory last year produced 6 million pairs of shoes, so she is a big-time business woman in Ukraine. She

decided to give that up because she saw her people in despair with unemployment and she decided to go run for mayor to see if she could turn their city around. Now Belgorod-Dnestrovskiy is becoming an emerging city on the hill for all of Ukraine and what it needs to be. And so she is over here making relationships.”

Mayor Ginak thanked the city for the warm wel-

come.

“I am truly delighted by what you have accomplished in this city but even more I am delighted with the people who live in this city,” Ginak said through Slavik’s translation. “I am sincerely grateful for your warm hearts and with the hospitality which you have treated us with. ... And we hope that our relationship with your people and specifically with the city, will go on and result in sister cities because we are very similar and we have something we can learn from you and implement in Ukraine.”

Ginak then presented a gift to Mayor Kennon, a framed depiction of the ancient medieval fortress that is located in the city. It is the largest ancient fortress in Ukraine. Built during 13th-15th centuries, the fortress attracts millions of tourists.

“This is our pride. This our pearl fortress,” Ginak said. “I would like for you to have this picture in your office that every time you look at it you may be reminded of our sister city in Ukraine. This is our history. This is our heritage and we would love to host your delegation to show

you around and to bless you and to welcome you to the Ukraine in Belgorod. And thank you very much to all of the residents of Orange Beach.”

Belgorod-Dnestrovskiy, formerly known as Akkerman, is a port city situated on the right bank of the Dniester estuary that is linked to the nearby Black Sea. The population of the city is approximately 55,000 people.

Mayor Kennon said he spent an “eye-opening few hours” with the Ukrainian delegation prior to the council meeting.

“It’s unbelievable the difference between what we take for granted, such as water, sewage — I mean it’s just unbelievable,” Kennon said. “A town of 60,000 with a \$12 million budget. We’re a (city of) 6,000 with \$40 million plus. It’s unbelievable how blessed we are in this country. But I guess until you see and hear it, it’s hard to remember it.”

Gulf State Park Pier reopens after Hurricane Nate

Meaher fishing pier remains closed

With only minor repairs remaining, the Gulf State Park Fishing and Education Pier reopened Saturday, October 14. The pier had been closed due to damage received during Hurricane Nate, which made landfall in southeast Louisiana and again near Biloxi, Miss., on Saturday, October 7. During the storm, several wooden panels were blown out along the pier's walkway. The pier also sustained ruptured

water lines and electrical damage. Some sections of the pier's handrail lighting system remain to be repaired. "Fortunately, the damage caused by Hurricane Nate was not as bad as it could have been," said Greg Lein, Alabama State Parks Director. "Thanks to repair crews and our staff we can reopen the pier on Saturday so that visitors can enjoy their planned vacations." The current pier was

designed with removable panels that allow the force of the wind and water to be dispersed. This prevents damage to the pilings and caps on the current pier which replaced the one destroyed during Hurricane Ivan in 2004. The fishing pier at Meaher State Park was also damaged by Hurricane Nate. That pier remains closed until crews can complete repairs and ensure it is safe for public use.
