Tracking software found on 7 Fairhope employees' computers

Software that tracks employee computer usage and key strokes was placed on the computers of at least seven City of Fairhope employees, allegedly at the direction of Mayor Karin Wilson. Those employees were not informed of the actions at the time of the installations.

Gulf Coast Media has seen screenshots from a credible source taken from these employees' computers that confirm the presence of the software there.

Those screenshots showed the software was placed on the computers of Human Resources Director Pandora Heathcoe, City Clerk Lisa Hanks, City Treasurer Deborah Smith, Purchasing De-

partment Buyer Randy Weaver, Water and Sewer Superintendent Dan McCrory, Gas Superintendent Robert Rohm and recently retired Electrical Superintendent Jimmy Cluster.

According to confidential sources, the spyware was placed on the PCs by a member of Fairhope's Information Technology Department at the instruction of Wilson and

without notification to the seven employees.

The spyware, SentryPC, allows a user to monitor and control what is done on computer upon which the software is installed.

"Every activity your users perform on the computer and internet is recorded in real-time and in full detail for viewing - you will know exactly what they did and when they did it," the Sentry PC

website stated.

SentryPC is a completely cloud-based computer monitoring system, which raised some concerns among sources about the information being logged from some of the Fairhope employees' computers.

"The city has no control over it," a source said.

"Medical information, HR

information, bank account information - it's all being stored off-site on a cloud network that may or may not be secure. And that's just the information that belongs to the city."

The spyware could have also logged passwords, emails and private information from those employees' personal

accounts if they were accessed on those computers.

"So, Heathcoe's conversations with her attorney on the assault allegations against the mayor could be tracked if it was accessed on her computer at work, which could be an unfair advantage," the source said. "Personal emails, personal bank statements and passwords - the SentryPC software logs everything on those computers."

The SentryPC program was installed on Smith, McCrory, Cluster and Rohm's computers on March 31, Heathcoe's on April 5, Weaver's on April 12 and Hanks'

on April 25.

Multiple sources questioned the reasoning for installing the spyware on those particular employees' computers, and alleged Wilson's motives in placing the software could have been motivated by the employees' closeness to former Mayor Tim Kant.

Gulf Coast Media attempted to contact Wilson several times for her comments, but she turned down the interview requests. Any updates to this story can be found at gulfcoastnewstoday.com.

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Eastern Shore Art Center director set to retire in September 2017

Executive Director Kate Fisher has been with the Eastern Shore Art Center for seven years, and it is with a heavy heart that ESAC announces she will be retiring from her position September 30.

Current Board President Gaye Lindsey remembers Fisher's devotion to the Art Center fondly.

"I have come to discover how much the Association owes to her dedication, tireless effort, and unselfish

commitment to live up to its mission to connect people of all ages and abilities with the arts," Lindsey said. "During the recession of 2008 - 2009 there were lean years when the very existence of the Association was in doubt. Kate was forced to make difficult decisions, but guided the organization through the crisis and brought it back on a solid financial footing, even while expanding its impact on the community."

Being the director of a nonprofit organization is not a small feat or a

glamorous position by any means. Most visitors do not realize this, but the Art Center is a giant facility with five galleries, four studios and recurring events throughout the year, staffed by only four part-time employees.

Fisher can be found anywhere throughout the building: in the gift shop unpacking new merchandise, in the kitchen loading up the dishwasher or in her office writing a grant for the Art Center's Outreach programs.

"She is always there, weekdays,

weekends, evenings," Lindsey said. "She hasn't had a vacation in the entire time she has been Director. Board chairpersons have threatened to lock her out of the building, but she just keeps on coming back. Sometimes I worry that the building will fall apart as soon as she retires."

The board, staff, teachers, volunteers, artists, members and supporters are greatly appreciative of the time Fisher has been with the Art Center and look forward to the future she has created for everyone there.

Rotary Club of Fairhope recognizes essay contest winners

At a recent weekly meeting, the Rotary Club of Fairhope recognized fifth-grader Hayston Savage and sixth-grader Qualin McCants as winners of an essay contest at the Fairhope-Point Clear Rotary Youth Club. The subject of the essay was "What the Four-Way Test Means to Me." Each of the winners received a \$50 bill.

From the earliest days of Rotary, Rotarians were concerned with promoting high ethical standards in their professional lives. One of the world's most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics is the Four-Way Test, which was created in 1932 by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor

when he was asked to take charge of a company that was facing bankruptcy. This 24-word code of ethics for employees to follow in their business and professional lives became the guide for sales, production, advertising, and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company is credited to this simple philosophy. The test asks simply:

1. Is it the truth?
2. Is it fair to all concerned?
3. Will it build goodwill and better friendships?
4. Will it be beneficial to all concerned?

The test was adopted by Rotary International in 1943 as part of the organization's vocational service ideals.

New Buffett book takes readers to the making of Margaritaville

Ryan White was driving his toddler daughter to daycare, listening to Jimmy Buffett's, "Volcano." By the time they reached her classroom, the tot was singing along – over and over and over, again.

"I looked at her teacher and said, 'I don't know how long this will go on. I'm sorry'."

Those are the breaks when your dad is writing a book about Jimmy Buffett.

Last month, White released "Jimmy Buffett: A Good Life All the Way."

The book began as a travel narrative of sorts, detailing the journey taken by both the song "Margaritaville" after it became a hit in 1977 and that of White as he navigated life after a decade working as a sports reporter.

White had traveled I-75 to Florida many times from his home state of Michigan to visit relatives in Tampa and on college weekend trips. On these roads, Buffett became the soundtrack of their lives.

"There was a sense of elsewhere and adventure in his music that grabbed my attention," White said.

Decades later White said he began to realize what Margaritaville had become as it navigated 40 years of popular American culture.

"I began to think, 'how do you handle that kind of change' and it just so happened I was hit with a change of my own," he said. White was laid off in 2013 but fell back on a book

contract, to explore Margaritaville.

"It began as a first person travel narrative, traveling the modern Margaritaville to see how we got from here to there and what happened along the way," he said. "A whole lot of people said, 'Yes. I'd love to talk,' and their stories were infinitely more interesting than me walking around."

White knew he wasn't writing a biography, but he didn't quite realize he couldn't separate the man from the joy that was Margaritaville.

He met John Cohlan, CEO of Margaritaville Holdings, during a Parrot-head convention and spoke to him about his book idea. Cohlan corrected him - the book was indeed about Jimmy.

"He said you cannot separate everything that makes people come to Margaritaville from Jimmy. It's all wrapped up in Jimmy's story and the ball of goodwill they take from town to town," White said. "What we got was a really neat character study of the real life citizens of Margaritaville over the years and these kind of big themes of urbanization and workaholicism among really entertaining stories from the road."

White interviewed Buffett's friends and neighbors who knew the singer before his fame, he interviewed managers and stage crew and even a tour manager who was in the limo when the term Parrot-head was coined.

"You get on an airplane and you go and talk to people and you keep working on it. It really helped that I didn't quite know what I was getting myself into," he said.

White said he strived in his book for two things, first to write it in the spirit of what Buffett and his crew bring every night to the stage and what the crowd brings to them.

Cohlan told him, "Everything that made [Buffett] a star is what people keep coming back to time and again - for that little bit of a break which we all need."

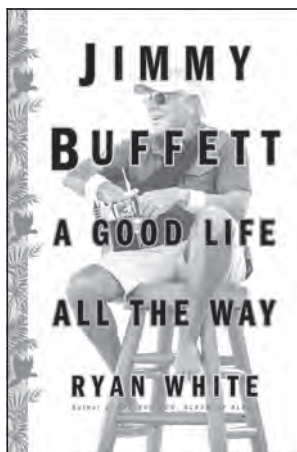
Second, he said he couldn't pretend to see the world through Buffett's eyes.

"That's his story. I could never do that. I don't want to try to do that," he said.

White did not interview Buffett for the book. He said he has heard that the singer is planning another book of his own. It's ok though, White said, the book is as much about Buffett as it is about change.

During an interview with a fishing guide who lived below Buffett in the 1970s, White asked about change on the island and what he thought of it.

"I watch these kids come from the Midwest and it's still Margaritaville to them," the man told White. "When I got here in '72 the old timers pulled me aside and said you're ten years too late. We all at one point or another have a tendency to think we're 10 years too late and miss a perfectly good opportunity sitting in front of us."



The idea of change, both scary and exciting, flowed through the book and White's personal journey in writing it.

"At the end of the day I wanted to have this chapter in my life come to end in newspapers and I wanted to take on the hardest thing I've ever done, the biggest thing and hopefully the most interesting and most fun thing I've ever done," White said. "And it really was a success on all those fronts as far as I was considered."

"It was a real pleasure to spend a couple of years in Margaritaville," he said.

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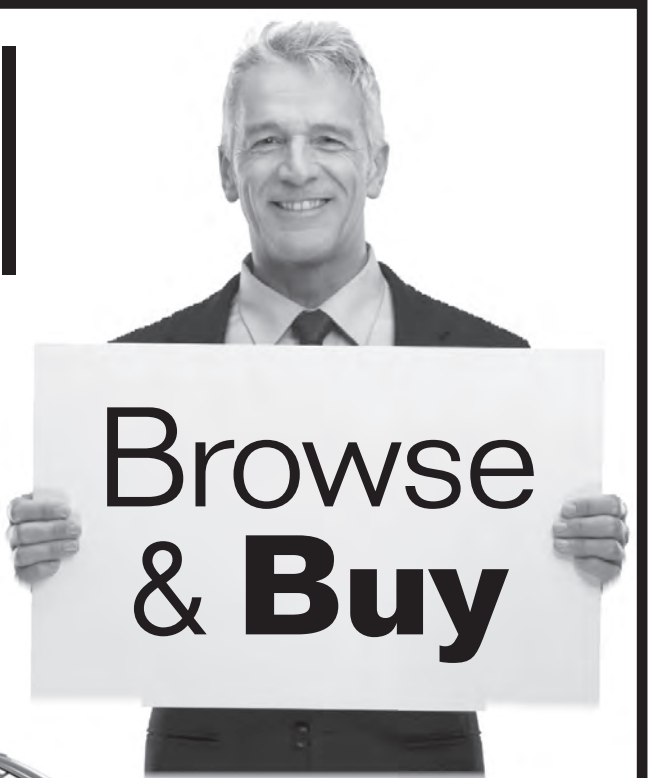
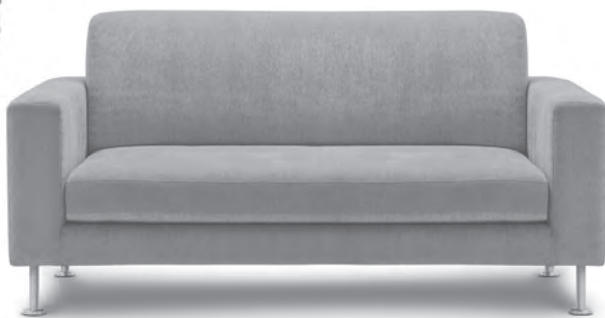
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Some Things Aren't What They Say They Are

Alabama's answer to the Kennedys: the Bankheads

Since we are in the midst of an election for a U.S. Senator, let me share the story of one of the most prestigious congressional families in Alabama history. The Bankheads of Jasper would likely be the most prominent political family in Alabama political lore. More than likely there has never been a father serve as one of America's most powerful U.S. Senators while their son, William Bankhead, served as Speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives.

The original founder of the famous family was John Hollis Bankhead. He was the patriarch of a family that spawned sons John H. Bankhead, II and Speaker of the U.S. House, William B. Bankhead and daughter, state archivist, Marie Bankhead Owen and granddaughter Tallulah Bankhead, who became a star of stage and screen.

John Hollis Bankhead was born in 1842 on his family's plantation in present Lamar County. He was educated in local schools and joined the Confederate Army at 19. He fought in numerous Civil War battles and was wounded several times. He entered the Confederate Army as a private and rose to Captain.

After the Civil War he married Tallulah Brockman of Wetumpka and returned to farming his family land. He began his political career by serving four terms in the state legislature. He then was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in 1886 and served 20 years in Congress.

In 1906, Alabama did an extremely unusual thing. At that time, state legislatures still appointed U.S. Senators. Alabama's legislature met only every four years and both of the states Senators, Edmund Pettus and John Tyler Morgan, were aging. The State Democratic Party held a primary to choose a successor should one or both of the Senators die before the Legislature met again. It was called the pallbearer's primary. Bankhead won the primary. In June of 1907,

Morgan died and Bankhead took the U.S. Senate seat.

John Bankhead left an indelible legacy as a senator. He was a champion of building federal highways and waterways.

America's first national highway that traverses from Washington D.C. to San Diego, California is named the Bankhead Highway after our Senator John H. Bankhead.

John's son, William, was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in 1916. Thus he served simultaneously in the House while his father served in the Senate. He followed his father's advice to learn the rules. He did and it earned him a seat on the powerful Rules Committee. He was joined on the committee by another southern congressman, who would also make his mark in Congress, Sam Rayburn from Texas.

During William Bankhead's 23 years in Congress, he became Chairman of the Rules Committee, Majority Leader and then Speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives. He was and continues to be our only Alabamian to serve as Speaker of the House.

Even though William Bankhead was Alabama's most distinguished congressman, he was best known as being the father of the most famous and flamboyant actress of that era, Tallulah Bankhead. Tallulah, who was named for her maternal grandmother, was very close to her Speaker father, William. She was renowned for her eccentric

and uninhibited behavior and for her throaty utterance calling everyone, "dah-ling." She thrust the Bankhead name in bright lights on Broadway and in Hollywood.

Senator John Hollis Bankhead had a daughter named Marie who made her mark in Alabama history. Marie Owen Bankhead was the founder of the State Archives Building. She was affectionately called "Miss Marie." Our magnificent Archives Building across from the Capitol, was built and the funds secured by Miss Marie from the New Deal WPA Program. It did not hurt that her father was one of the nation's most powerful senators and her brother was Speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives. Miss Marie Owen Bankhead served as director of the State Archives for 35 years, from 1920-1955.

Besides the national Bankhead Highway, in Alabama we have the Bankhead Tunnel in Mobile, the William B. Bankhead National Forest, which transverses a good portion of Alabama, the Bankhead Home and Heritage Center in Jasper, and the historic Bankhead Avenue in Montgomery.

The Bankhead's of Alabama are the Deep South's version of the Kennedy's.

In either case, our sweet, pleasant city has been rocked from day one with reports of Mayor's Wilson's fiery relationship with the City Council

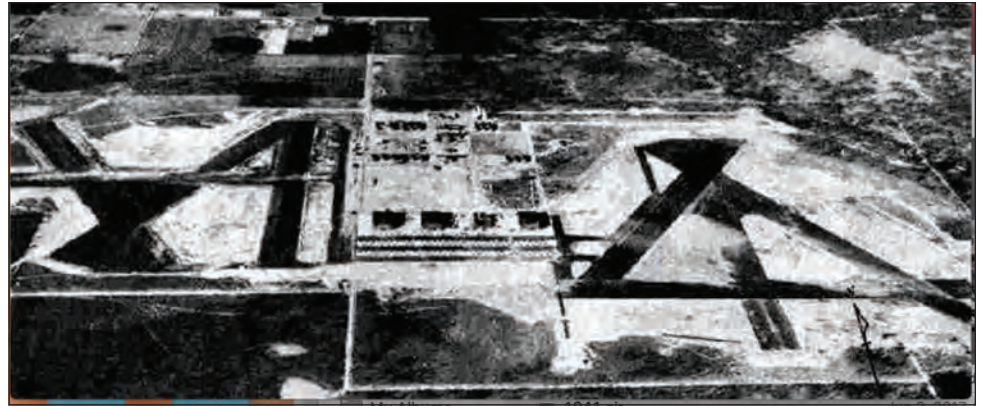
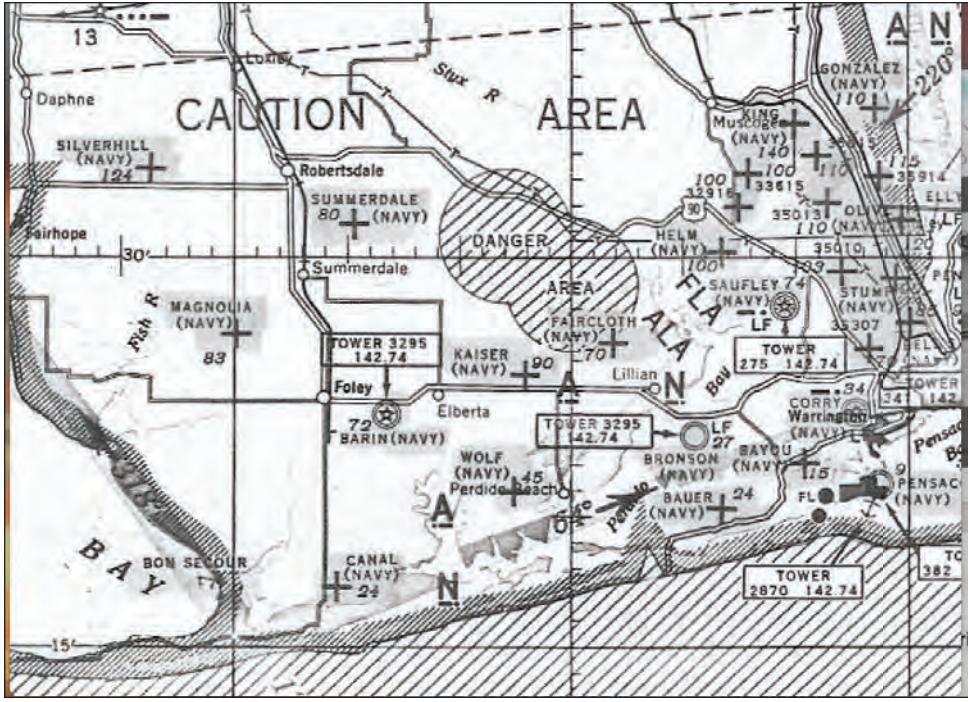
in conducting the affairs of the city. Now the fireworks have expanded from the City Council to the city employees.

BLOODY BARIN

I took my young children to see Uncle Everett in the nursing home, I think about 1975. He was a “Wounded Warrior of the Greatest Generation.” We arrived about an hour before the Fourth of July Program was to begin.

Sitting in his wheelchair, he opened his pocketknife, and said, “Yeah, the Navy taught me to be tough; watch this.” He jabbed it through his pants into his leg just above the knee, where it stood upright. Jessica’s and Joe’s eyes opened wide and they were speechless. Smiling, he lifted his trouser leg and showed them his wooden prosthetic leg. He was one of those people who had that special way of looking at life.

I wanted to try to capture that attitude, so I pulled out my brand new portable cassette recorder and asked him to tell us about his Navy years.

When Pearl Harbor was bombed nearly everyone he knew went to fight the war to end all wars. Everett was a senior in high school, but he and most of his friends decided a high school diploma could wait until after the war. “I chose the Navy because their uniforms were the best looking,” he chuckled. “We knew if we volunteered we could choose the branch of service we wanted. But, by golly, we really did want to help win that war.”

In 1942, our family heard he was chosen for mechanical aviation school at Naval Air Station in Pensacola. Wonder of wonders, he was stationed

close to home at Barin Field in Foley, built on 950 acres including the old Foley Airport site. He was there when the first group of flight students entered the facility at its commission on Dec. 5, 1942.

“At first there were 111 SNJ planes there, but by April 1944, the number was more than 400. There were four hangars, the main office building, and stores. Oh, yes, there were two runways, busy day and night.

“I think one time there were as many as 800 pilots being trained, and the ground crew numbered in the thousands. For every pilot there was about 10 of us support personnel. We were housed in typical two story open barracks with double bunkerbeds and lockers. It was hard, but we were willing to do what it took to win that war. And we kept thinking about our buddies overseas.

“Training was tough for those pilots, I tell you. There were at least 40 men killed and soon people called it Bloody Barin.

“Man, the mess hall was something else. Can you imagine peeling potatoes for that many men? We also had a baseball team, just like we had at home in Rosinton. In fact, we even played against Rosinton one time at the big field

there. We won.

“I guess the most fun we had was at the USO hall on Laurel Street downtown Foley. Girls from all over the county came to dance with us. They served cake and lemonade and sometimes the locals put on a show for us, my sisters included. That first Christmas we were at Barin, Commander Brigg landed his SNJ with Santa Claus in the back seat. Now, that was a hoot.”

My daughter asked him how he lost his leg. He stared into the air awhile, his eyes watered, and when he spoke his voice cracked.

“I wanted to make a career of the Navy, but that just wasn’t to be. It was a freak accident; the plane we were working on was not securely anchored and it fell on me while I was underneath. It coulda’ killed me. All during recovery, I kept thinking of my buddies that weren’t coming home, and kept asking why I was spared. I have always felt lucky.

“The Navy has taken care of me pretty good. I learned to walk on this wooden leg, and worked as a mechanic my whole life. That is until the last year or so. I can’t stand by myself anymore.”

(What happened to Barin Field after you were discharged?)

“I used to ride down to the field after the war. It was out of use, but the Navy still stored planes



there and used it as a landing field. Big old fence all around it. In 1948 they started back training there and in 1952 the Korean War came along and suddenly Bloody Barin was in full swing again.

“I could see those guys landing and taking off. Sometimes the instructor’s plane pulled a target sleeve. That was when there was gunnery training going on. Out over the gulf, six SNJs practiced hitting that target. I never heard if any of those 0.30 caliber guns hit an aircraft by mistake!! I sure hope not. I hope Bloody Barin didn’t live up to its nickname.

“Yeah, those were the good old days. Actually every day is a good day. I’ve had a wonderful life.”

It was time to go down to the activity room where the program was to take place. Jessica and Joe pushed his wheelchair right up to the front row.



When the “Star Spangled Banner” was played, we realized that Uncle Everett was attempting to stand. I reached to help him and he pushed my hand away. He struggled a little holding onto the arms of the chair, but rise he did. His right arm raised in salute, tears rolling down his face. There were tears on my face, too.

I am not ashamed that there are still tears each and every time I stand for our National Anthem, I think of the sacrifices

he and so many others made for me just so I could stand. And stand up I will, every time.

The Beach Express now runs through the West Field’s runway, which was the original Foley Airport. The former USO hall is now the Gift Horse Restaurant.

New birth center to open at Thomas Hospital

Most new moms are given 48 hours to recover after a typical birth at Thomas Hospital. However, after staying just a few hours at the new Birth Center, women may never want to leave.

Later this month the hospital will officially open the new unit, after the staff hustles through a 12-hour move to shift the entire operation one floor up and into a space more than twice its current size.

Every nook and cranny has been thoughtfully considered and redesigned. A walk through the current birth unit and into the new is more than just an update. It is a tour through time.

The current unit is small, itty bitty by comparison. Nurse stations line the walls outside delivery rooms that lack windows or much space for families to stretch out. The furnishings were the hottest look in 1999, the year it opened

– cherry dressers and headboards set beneath wallpaper boarders that feature seashore scenes.

These rooms have seen a lot of Baldwin County babies, nearly 100 every month. The exhaustion of that workload seems to seep from the tired, aged walls.

One floor up, the new Birth Center is nearly ready to take up the mantle. Visitors seem to glide across chic wood floors past soothing, pale green paint that covers the walls behind graceful artwork. Even the signs outside each door to pay homage to donors are formed from delicate sea glass. Furniture is slick and smooth with modern handles. Windows are enormous and are found in every room. The theme is flow - and calm.

“I can’t tell you how huge this is, it’s amazing,” said Vicki Curtis, nurse manager of the Birth Center. “The architects, the design, the art - everything that’s been taken into consideration is incredible.”

Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. It is because of their dedication, compassion and commitment.”

In labor and delivery, nurses will no longer shuffle patients along with furious pace as they now have seven rooms for laboring patients. The old unit boasted only four. Large closets and a Jack-and-Jill prep space between every two delivery rooms means there is more space for everyone to stretch out, families and staff alike.

Speaking of stretching, dads and birth coaches will now have their own place to rest after delivery. Postpartum rooms feature a combo sofa-sleeper for the new mom's plus one. There are also sloped baby sinks in every room so that more baby care can be done with mom.

And the bathrooms here will leave every visitor feeling jealous.

Each postpartum room features a restroom and shower that rivals the size of a bedroom in modest homes. The toilet lid pops open automatically and new moms can enjoy a

heated seat and front and rear bidet spray, with remote control, of course.

The unique touches are not just upgrades but also meant as enticements to bring more Baldwin babies to Thomas Hospital.

Currently, the hospital averages 105 deliveries a month, with the busiest month being August with the arrival of all those holiday babies.

In 2016, the hospital welcomed a total of 1,285 babies, which marked an 8 percent growth. As one of only three hospitals in the

county that deliver babies, Thomas Hospital has 65 percent of the market share, Curtis said. Some moms, however, are still making the drive to Mobile to deliver.

She hopes the new unit will bring them here instead.

“Studies show that women make most of the healthcare decisions in their households. Moms will drive past a birth facility to get to the one they want to deliver at,” she said. “I hope they will consider coming here.”

NAIA TRACK CHAMPIONSHIPS

Gulf Shores plays host to national event for fourth-straight season

B.C. Thunderbirds claim first-ever national crown/Wayland Baptist wins women's title

GULF SHORES — After three days of competition a new national champion was crowned in NAIA Men's Outdoor Track & Field. British Columbia gathered 71 total points to take home its first-ever team title to Canada. The Thunderbirds finished seven points ahead of runner-up Indiana Tech after competing over the past three days. For the fourth-straight season, the national championships were held in Gulf Shores at Mickey Miller Blackwell Stadium.

For the Thunderbirds, John Gay ran away with the men's steeplechase national title for the second-straight season. Gay hit a time of 9:12.14 in 2017 to maintain his title in the event. The Thunderbirds captured the title in the men's 4x800m relay with a time of 7:33.45 to claim British Columbia's first-ever title in the event.

Besides the Thunderbirds being handed the 2017 red banner, other awards were given out to individuals from the meet. The 2017 Men's Coach of the Year went to Larurier Primeau from British Columbia. The meet's Men's Most Outstanding Performer saw Moriba Morain of Wiley (Texas) claim the title, while Jackson Thomas (Bacone) and Goabaone Mosheleketi (Lindsey Wilson) both were named Most Valuable Performers.

In the marathon, competitors battled heat and humidity in the 26.2 mile race. Christian Graham of British Columbia took the marathon with a time of 2:37:31.

The strongest performance of the day came during the men's 200m dash when Moriba Morain bettered the previous meet record by running a 20.32 in the event. Morain also became a back-to-back national champion in the men's 100m dash, this season running a 10.19.

One of the most powerful moments of the final day was when the men's triple jump event held a tribute for Tyler Carter, the student-athlete who passed away earlier in the week. Carter was set to compete in the event and came in ranked No. 4. With his fellow teammate, officials and competitors honoring Tyler with a moment.

The top-eight finishers in each event receive All-America honors.

The Pioneers of Wayland Baptist (Texas) claimed their second national title in three years and fourth all-time title. The Pioneers gathered 75 points to take the red banner back to Texas, earning 19 points more than the runner-up spot claimed by Indiana Tech

with 56 points.

For the fourth-straight season, the national championships have been held in Gulf Shores at Mickey Miller Blackwell Stadium.

Telecia Briscoe was the lone individual national champion for the Pioneers as she claimed the women's 100m hurdles title with a time of 13.7. This was Briscoe's first individual title at the outdoor championships, as she helped lead her Wayland Baptist squad to another national title and the 2017 red banner.

The 2017 Women's Coach of the Year went to Brian Whitlock from Wayland Baptist. The meet's Women's Most Outstanding Performer saw Marissa Dewispelare of Doane (Neb.) claim the title, while Becky Collier of Westmont (Calif.) earned the most individual points to take home the meet's Most Valuable Performance award.

The longest race of the meet, the women's marathon, started out the final day with an early competition. Michaela Werner of Oklahoma City captured the 26.2 mile race crown with a time of 3:03:41.

As for the individuals who now have more than one national title in the same event to their name, Brianna Woods of Indiana Tech leads the way. Woods ran an 11.45 in the women's 100m to claim her second-straight national title in the event. Woods tied her time from last season. Doane's (Neb.) Marissa Dewispelare completed her second-straight outdoor steeplechase race with a time of 10:23.99 to win her second title in the same amount of years.

Another strong performance came at the jumps by Westmont's (Calif.) Becky Collier who won the women's high jump. Collier finished the competition with a height of 1.77m. Collier also won her second-consecutive heptathlon national championship.

Anna Shields of Point Park (Pa.), the teammate of Tyler Carter who passed away earlier in the week, won the women's 1,500m with a time of 4:24.58.

The 2017 NAIA list of Women's Outdoor Track & Field All-Americans have also been announced. The award winners competed at the 37th annual NAIA National Championships. Honors were given to the top eight individuals from each event and all four runners in the top eight relays.

Silvers helped Troy last season to a 10-4 record, the first time in the FBS to post a 10-win season. Last season was also the first time the program was ranked in the AP top 25.

Expectations will be high for the Troy Trojans as they hope to be Sun Belt Conference champions. For the past two seasons, the Arkansas State Red Wolves have been regular season conference champs. Last season, the Appalachian State Mountaineers shared that title with Arkansas State as champs. Troy has not been regular season conference champions since the 2010 season.

Last season, Silvers passed for 293 completions (460 attempts) for 3,180 yards, 23 touchdowns and 12 interceptions. Silvers had two games over 300 yards and eight games with multiple passing touchdowns. He was selected by Sun Belt coaches to first-team team All-Conference.

Despite Troy returning a 1,000-yard rusher in Jordan Chunn, the Trojans passing game is expected to increase heavily in efficiency with Silvers and four

starting receivers returning. Despite the Trojans having the best passing offense in the Sun Belt, they will need to be more insistent on the deep passing portion of their playbook. With one of the most experienced passing games in the nation, they should score a lot of points.

Silvers will be entering into his senior year with Troy and has been getting looks by scouts for the NFL. This is the season to prove that he can play in the NFL.

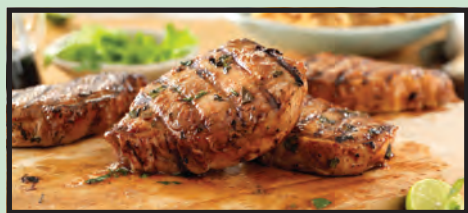
