900 potential new units alarm residents, school system

 Last week, the Daphne Planning Commission approved preliminary plans for a new subdivision that

could add more than 900 new homes to Daphne. The proposal passed the planning commission unanimously, despite concerns and comments from the public and the Baldwin

County School System. Baldwin County Schools Superintendent Eddie Tyler sent the planning commission members a letter expressing his concerns over what the new neigh-

borhood could mean for the Daphne feeder pattern, writing that such a development would only further aggravate overcrowding issues in that area. The system recently

broke ground on a new expansion for Daphne East Elementary School, but with the potential influx of new students this

Growth, infrastructure presents 'good opportunities' for Fairhope

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 Fairhope's newest department heads have had a lot on their plates to deal with since coming on the job.

Planning Director Wayne Dyess, Operations Director Richard Peterson and Economic and Community Development Director Sherry Lea Bloodworth-Botop have had to navigate multiple issues between the mayor

and city council members, as well as trying to find ways to make changes in their departments and the city at large for the positive. While all agree the job before them isn't an easy one, they all feel they have the ability and experience to keep Fairhope moving in a positive direction. "I think you've got a lot of people with a lot of experience from different places with all of us," Dyess said. "Sherry Lea

has experience in DC and LA and all over, I've been fortunate to be around a few places in planning and Richard's been at Riviera, one of the leading utility providers in Alabama, so there's a wealth of information and knowledge to draw from within our group to put to use for the city of Fairhope." Dyess said the openness and willingness from the city, especially Mayor Karin Wilson, to try to find new ways of doing

things has been incredibly promising. "Many times in local government, you're stuck doing the same thing again and again and again," Dyess said. "It's difficult to change that culture and that pattern of doing things, but I think the mayor has said there's a better way possibly of doing things, so let's explore every method we can to try to do that. We

Mayors meet for 'Bagels and Briefs' with BCAR

Daphne Mayor Dane Haygood, Foley Mayor John Koniar and Gulf Shores Mayor Robert Craft sat down last week with the Baldwin County Association of Realtors for their monthly Bagels and Briefs breakfast, with each mayor answering questions about some of the issues facing their municipalities.

Each mayor said the biggest issue facing the entire county was growth, but each had unique facets of that growth to deal with in their city.

Haygood said one of Daphne's issues was dealing with development just outside of the city limits.

"One of the biggest challenges is that a lot of the land area is not actually in the city of Daphne," Haygood said. "What that does is put the land owners in a catbird seat, and presents some unique challenges for us in terms of zoning and what we can or can't approve."

Haygood pointed to some positive recent development within his borders, including the groundbreaking of the city's \$16 million sports complex that will see more baseball and softball fields coming to the city, as well as the DISC project space which will bring much-needed Class A office space

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Fairhope songwriter named Gospel Entertainer of the Year

When Mike Turner retired to Fairhope in 2007, he looked forward to sailing on Mobile Bay and enjoying the natural beauties of Alabama's Gulf Coast. Making music was the furthest thing from his mind.

Now, ten years later, Turner has been named the

2017 Male Entertainer of the Year (Age 50/over) in New Gospel Music, by the North American Country Music Associations International (NACMAI).

"It's an incredible honor to receive this award, and I'm grateful to NACMAI for this recognition," says Turner.

Based in Nashville, NACMAI promotes the country, gospel and bluegrass music industry in the US and Canada. Turner's award capped a week of over 900 competitive performances by country, gospel and bluegrass artists hosted by NACMAI for its 20th year in Pigeon Forge, Tennessee.

Turner had previously been named by the Alabama Music Association (AMA), the Dothan-based Alabama member of NACMAI, as the 2016 Male Gospel Entertainer of the Year, as a prerequisite to the NACMAI competition.

"My thanks go to all the folks at AMA, who encouraged me to share my music," Turner said.

Turner's musical journey began in a family steeped in the mountain music and gospel traditions of his parents' native West Virginia. Raised outside Detroit, he grew up in a vibrant Motown and R&B music scene. But he didn't make music himself. "I tried to learn guitar as a teenager, but I was never more than a simple strummer," says Turner.

The guitar sat unused in the back of a closet while Turner pursued a 27-year career in Federal

law enforcement, first as an investigator with the US Defense Department and the Air Force, and then as a special agent with the US Customs Service. Rising to become a member of the Senior Executive Service, the Federal Government's top tier of civil service professionals, he served as head of Customs export enforcement and counterterrorism investigations in Washington DC; was appointed Special Agent in Charge of internal affairs and investigations in Los Angeles, San Diego and Phoenix, first with Customs and then Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE); and retired in 2007 as the Director, Office of Export Enforcement with the US Department of Commerce.

But it was an adult education class in beginner's ukulele in Fairhope in 2012, that started Turner down his musical road. "The ukulele really opened up the world of music for me. I wrote my first song three weeks after I started the class, and I've never looked back," says Turner. Today, he plays both tenor and baritone ukulele, along with tenor guitar and banjo, dulcitar, and cigar box guitar. "And I still noodle around with 6-string guitar - maybe I'll figure it out yet," he says.

As a songwriter, Turner writes in such diverse genres as blues, folk, gospel, country, pop, rock and jazz. His self-produced recordings have received broadcast and Internet streaming airplay in the US, Europe, Ireland, the UK and on the American Forces Network.

"I want to contribute to our community through my music," says Turner, who performs at charitable and fundraising events on the Eastern Shore and in Mobile. "I'm focusing on music with a message - gospel and folk-style songs on social justice topics and issues. I'm particularly drawn to songs with ties to local history and events." He has written songs dealing with poverty and homelessness in Mobile, the Gulf oil spill, the 1993 Sunset Limited train wreck in the Tensaw Delta and the 2015 Dauphin Island Race tragedy.

Turner will perform a selection of his original folk, blues and country songs at Earth Day Mobile Bay, April 22 at the Fairhope Pier.

just want to see if we can do better, and, if we can, we're going to find those better ways to do it and do them."

Bloodworth-Botop agreed with Dyess.

"All of our goals and the way that we're organizing are all direct results from getting input from the voters," Bloodworth-Botop said. "I was impressed with how quickly the mayor audited the landscape of how the city was structured for gaps in order to achieve the results for the citizens in the ways that they were asking. Responsible growth, transparency, fiscal responsibility - these are the type of things the voters said they wanted, so we're all trying to make them happen."

Bloodworth-Botop's department is a completely new one for Fairhope, but one she said the city has needed for some time.

"We had a Parks and Recreation department, but that's a completely different thing," Bloodworth-Botop said. "Our citizens are very sophisticated. We have business people, entrepreneurs, retired heads of corporations - people who know how businesses should be run, and a city is not that different."

Peterson's job is also a newly created position.

Since the city of Fairhope owns its own utilities, Wilson said she wanted to bring in someone with a great deal of expertise to get the most out of those city assets for the citizens.

"I feel like I've been received with open arms with the people I'm working with from the different utilities," Peterson said. "I think our mission today is to evaluate the condition of the infrastructure and the capacity of the infrastructure. While we have a wastewater facility that might be state of the art, we want to bring the rest of our facilities to that same level."

Peterson said he wants to see the utilities better engage new technologies and innovations that will help operate and maintain the systems more effectively, like mapping.

"There are pieces of some of this in place, but it's taking those pieces and putting them together in the right way to become an asset to the system and the city," Peterson said. "We have a mapping system in place, but we really don't have a direction in place as to how we want to utilize it, how we want it to perform for us down the road. It just takes time to develop the data and integrate those systems into the map."

Peterson said with all of the growth in the Fairhope

area, there will definitely need to be issues addressed and changes made to keep the city on track.

"We can't get to where we can be immediately," Peterson said. "We have to start taking steps to identify priorities and what we need to address immediately, from what's most critical and then continue to build from that."

For Peterson and Bloodworth-Botop, the creation of their positions was not without controversy, as some council members and citizens balked at the idea of creating two six-figure jobs that weren't currently in the city's budget.

"It was uncomfortable for me when I moved back," Bloodworth-Botop said. "There was a lot of talk among my friends that I had to hear, saying things like 'Wow, you're going to be making a lot of money.' That was the focus of that."

She said the controversy about the salary was really a misunderstanding.

"It was a misinterpretation of the pay grades," Bloodworth-Botop said. "For my position it was a pay grade that already existed and several other directors are on that spectrum. And I was at the lower end of that spectrum, but it got meshed into this conversation about bringing in new positions for hundreds of thousands of

dollars. That's all people heard, so it was unfortunate."

Bloodworth-Botop said there has been some confusion with her role.

"A lot of what I've learned and what I've been trained to do is in how cities are working now, which is cross-departmentally," Bloodworth-Botop said. "It's to look across the entire structure of city operations and look for opportunities for efficiencies, ways to work better with the citizens and engage them, to be responsible in the way we work and plan."

All agreed that their departments' focuses all overlapped with one another, especially with regards to planning.

"I'm looking at from the way of where is the opportunity to engage in this process and what are the economic opportunities for investors there," Bloodworth-Botop said. "For Wayne, it's much more logistics based and seeing what laws and ordinances have to be followed and making sure that the impact of any sort of development isn't harmful. For Richard, it's looking at our capacities and making sure we're growing in a sustainable way. We all overlap with one another, so we have to cooperate and work together to create

this vision of how we move forward."

Dyess said one way the group has been trying to address growth is to look at what the founders of Fairhope did in the beginning.

"I'm a student of history, so we've been going back to what the original founders did with their planning and seeing how they laid things out," Dyess said. "For something that's over 100 years old, they actually had a lot of great ideas for how to promote development the right way, and there's things that we can take and apply from that even today."

Dyess said Fairhope's strong sense of past and history is big part of what makes Fairhope Fairhope, and it's something that's important to him to try to protect.

"This is certainly a special place, and I think everyone that lives here wants to be sure that we preserve Fairhope for the wonderful town that it is," Dyess said. "So, we have to look carefully at what kinds of development we're talking about and what we're allowing to come in here."

All three agreed a new, more coherent comprehensive plan would be useful in achieving that goal.

"We've had some plans that show that we want to push development into a

villages concept, and the citizens have weighed in on that some," Dyess said. "But, we really need to have a set, cohesive plan in order to be able to enforce the kind of development areas that we've talked about there."

Another way for the citizens to provide input on development and planning issues is a design studio that Bloodworth-Botop said will eventually be set up at city hall.

"It just provides a space for anyone who wants to come to see what sort of developments or additions may be coming into the city, and it gives them a chance to provide real, immediate feedback on those issues," Bloodworth-Botop said. "Growth like this affects all of us, so this gives people a more direct way to give opinions and feedback than just a public hearing during a planning commission meeting or a council session."

All three said they were excited to be working for the people of Fairhope and they hope to get more feedback from citizens as they progress in their jobs.

"We're working for the people in these jobs," Dyess said. "We want to be sure that we're all moving this city in the direction that the residents want to go in, and that's what we're going to do."

Reenactment of last Civil War battle: April 1 at Historic Blakeley State Park

The Yankees are coming from Ohio, Indiana, Missouri and other states, and Confederates from Alabama, Florida, Louisiana and Mississippi are ready as they all head to Historic Blakeley State Park for the April 1 reenactment of the last all-forces battle of the Civil War.

Authenticity is the order of the day as volunteers in historically correct uniforms using reproduced Civil War weapons and living in period tent campgrounds reenact the final Union assault on the field where the original battle was fought 152 years ago.

Fierce combat, weapons demonstrations, exhibits of Civil War flags, history lessons, and narrated boat tours into the Tensaw and Blakeley where Confederate and Union naval vessels fought for control of the

river system, highlight a full day of activities beginning with the opening of campgrounds to the public at 8 a.m.

“The Spanish Fort and Blakeley battles were in defense of Mobile, the South’s last major hold-out”, explains Mike Bunn, Blakeley Park director of operations and historian who planned and is coordinating the largest Blakeley reenactment event in recent years. After Blakeley fell April 9, 1865, Union troops marched into Mobile unopposed.

Free buses shuttle spectators from parking to the Blakeley Battlefield for encampments, weapons demonstrations at 9 a.m. and 1 p.m., a Confederate sortie at 11 a.m. and the final Union assault at 3 p.m. as well as between the battlefield and the park’s Wehle Center for exhibits, food truck and restrooms.

A Confederate battle flag captured at Blakeley and permanently housed at the Alabama Archives and History will be shown by Graham Neeley with a lecture at 12:30 p.m. and a unit flag of the 21st Alabama from the collection of the History Museum of Mobile will be on rare display at the Wehle Center.

Boat tours of the river sites of Confederate Batteries Tracy and Huger and descriptions of the Civil War naval engagements in the Blakeley-Spanish Fort area of the lower Mobile-Tensaw River Delta are scheduled for 9 a.m. and 11 a.m. with narration and audio-visual presentations aboard Blakeley’s Delta Explorer. Limited seating is on a first come-first serve basis but reservations are available with advance ticket purchase.

Historic Blakeley State



Park has preserved and manages the nationally recognized Blakeley Civil War Battlefield that features some ten miles of Confederate and Union earthen fortifications, The Civil War site and other historic features such as that of the 1814 Town of

Blakeley are registered on the National Register of Historic Places.

Historic Blakeley State Park is located on State Hwy. 225 about 5 miles south of its intersection with U.S. 31 at Spanish Fort in Baldwin County. For more information go

to www.blakeleypark.com. Admission to the April 1 land reenactment events is \$10 adults, \$5 children 6-12. Tickets to the boat tour including land activities are \$25/15. The park is open daily with regular admission except for special events of \$4/3.

neighborhood could bring, those plans might not be enough.

“Had we learned about this project a few months back, even a month ago, we could have considered the expansion project, delayed it or altered it to prepare for additional growth,” Tyler wrote.

Tyler said the school system had only

heard about the potential development through the media, and said he hoped developers would be more forthcoming with information and communication in the future to help the county address the growth issues caused by new neighborhoods.

During the planning commission meeting, Baldwin County Schools CFO John Wilson further outlined the issues the school system saw with the neighborhood.

“An over 900 unit development that can

bring over 1,200 kids to a feeder pattern that is already at capacity with limited funds available to address that is absolutely concerning to the board, to the superintendent, to myself, to anyone, to principals and to the parents,” Wilson said. “I think this is irresponsible growth.”

School system officials said a possible redraft of the feeder pattern, which would likely send a number of students to the Robertsdale feeder pattern, could be a likely change that would have to be

made to prevent overcrowding.

While the planning commission gave the project a favorable recommendation, planning staff said it would still take a good amount of time, at least 15 to 20 years, for the neighborhood to be fully built out, which could give everyone time to address community and school officials’ concerns.

The proposal will now move forward for a city council vote, which will likely occur during one of its May meetings.

Mobile Symphony fills the Saenger Theatre with sound for Beethoven's 9th Symphony on April 8, 9

The Mobile Symphony Orchestra (MSO) will literally pack the stage with sound as its 70 musicians are joined by four soloists and 120 members of the USA Concert Choir and Mobile Opera Chorus to perform Beethoven's colossal Symphony No. 9, on Saturday, April 8, at 7:30 p.m., and Sunday, April 9, at 2:30 p.m., at the historic Saenger Theatre in downtown Mobile.

The concert begins with Handel's grand Coronation Anthems, created for the coronation of England's King George II in 1727 and performed at every coronation of a British monarch since then.

Beethoven's powerful and moving Symphony No. 9 is considered one of

the greatest compositions of all time and includes the frequently heard choral ending, Ode to Joy. Music Director Scott Speck says, "You can't experience Beethoven's Ninth and remain unchanged."

her as a child, growing up in Montgomery, during the days of bus boycotts and bomb shelters.

Farnell said the book wasn't planned, necessarily. She just took a memoir writing class at the St. Paul's Episcopal Church, offered by Donna Esslinger.

"For a class assignment, she told us to write about a memorable incident from childhood," Farnell said. "I wrote about different things, but I wrote about the time in first grade we had show and tell, and a kid comes in dragging a human skeleton."

This story eventually became the first chapter of Farnell's book.

"It really was inspired by things that happened to me in the '50s and '60s," Farnell said.

"People have sort of gotten the idea the '50s was an innocent time, and the way I put it was, at my house, it was more like the Addams family than the Cleavers."

Farnell had a somewhat unusual household in that both of her parents were attorneys, and she grew up during the fallout shelter and civil rights era.

"I still remember the bus boycott, which happened before the events of the book, but I can still remember my dad being mad at our maid because he had to go pick her up because of the boycott," Farnell said. "This book is about different incidents that happened to me and my family during that time period."

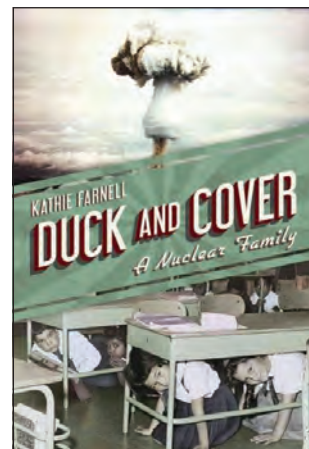
One incident she recalls, which does not

appear in the book, is admiring the models of fallout shelters at local stores.

"These displays were at shopping malls," she said. "It was like a boat show but for fallout shelters. I remember looking at these shelters, and they looked pretty good, like rumpus rooms, but they were expensive."

Farnell asked her mother if her family was going to get a fallout shelter. Her mother replied, "No, we're just going to die. It's cheaper."

"So, there was this air of morbidity hanging over," Farnell said. "You would go to school and our teacher didn't make us hide under our desks for the fallout drill because the idea was we were going to die sitting straight up, not hiding

under our desks. There was this cloud of doom. But if that's all you know when you're a little kid,

you think it's normal." Another experience Farnell recalls is that her mother, an attorney, "could strike a jury but was hopeless at making Jell-O."

"When my mother married — she was an attorney and worked full-time — she was 30 years old and had lived in a boarding house where all her meals were provided, so she didn't know how to cook and she didn't care anything about cooking," Farnell said, laughing. "But she was expected, even though she was working full-time, to be a '50s housewife. And it kind of hung over her head that she didn't like to cook, didn't want to cook, but was still expected to cook."

The Girl Scout troop Farnell was part of was also different than today's scouts.

"Our scout leader was this very kind woman who lived across from the school, and a lot of times at meetings, we would try on her evening dresses," Farnell said. "We didn't learn how to build a campfire, we tried on her evening dresses. This woman had spectacular evening gowns, she had a maid and a cook, and sometimes we would watch the maid iron ... it was like Troop Beverly Hills!"

Farnell said the worst thing that could happen to you in her Girl Scout troop was if you forgot it was your turn for refreshments. And, Farnell always forgot when it was her turn to bring refreshments.

"When that would happen, I would call up my mother at the law office and say, 'It's my turn for refreshments,' and instead of hanging up, my mother would come completely unstrung," Farnell said. "The other kids would

bring in these homemade treats that were frankly not very good, and my mother would have no choice but to go to this real swell bakery and get all these fudge brownies and Cokes. So, I would have the absolute best snacks anyone had ever seen. I was kind of this subversive thing, in that these other women were at home, baking away, and they would come up with these really, dry, oatmeal cookies. Then comes my mother in her beautiful suit, strutting from court with fudge brownies!"

Farnell began "Duck and Cover: A Nuclear Family," in 2012. The book will be released this month.

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The British Take The Gulf Coast

In October, 1763, the fate of the North American continent changed forever. That fall the British took control of most of the continent after defeating the French in the Seven Years War (The French and Indian War in North America). The French, in turn, set about destroying themselves internally except for a brief period when they assisted the fledgling United States in their revolution against England. And, by 1789, the

French were completely consumed by a revolution of their own that changed the face of the French state. The British future in North America lay along a different path. Among the 13 Atlantic Coast colonies dissension had already been sown and it would only take a few short years for war to return to North America. Along the Gulf Coast, the British took a more controlling approach to handling their possessions from Florida to Louisiana.

First, the British created

two colonies (East and West Florida) out of the holdings they obtained along the Gulf Coast. The first, East Florida, was situated east of the Apalachicola River with St. Augustine as its capital. West Florida, which ran west of the Apalachicola River to the Mississippi River, maintained a capital in Pensacola. West Florida was also divided into two districts with Mobile serving as the governmental center of the Charlotte District.

To the north the British established a territorial line at the 31st parallel which was, in effect, established by the Proclamation Line

of 1763. That treaty was originally established with the Atlantic Coast colonies in mind. The Proclamation Line established a western boundary between those colonies and Indian Territory to the west. It was put in place as a measure to keep peace between the Indians and the colonists who were hungry for the lands placed off limits by the treaty. Unfortunately, the Proclamation Line was violated on a routine basis and became a point of contention between the colonists and the British home government. North of the 31st parallel was designated as Indian Territory in keep-

ing with the 1763 treaty.

Along the Gulf, that type of contentious interaction was held in check because of the hands-on approach to governing the area established by the British. The West Florida colony was administered by a governor that was appointed by the king and a legislative assembly made up of two houses. The upper house, known as the Council, was appointed by the British government and the lower house, known as the House of Commons, was elected by property owners. Both owed much of their allegiance and their success to the crown. Stricter control from the home government was assured due to the subsidies that came from England to help underwrite

the success of the colonies. These formed the nucleus of the governmental difference with the Atlantic colonies which benefitted from little intervention from the home government, at least up until the end of the French and Indian War.

The British controlled their two Gulf Coast colonies until the end of the American Revolution in 1783. They made a lasting impact on the region through their policies and through the individuals that made the region their home, if only temporarily. Men like Robert Farmar and William Bartram changed the region and made their mark on the land and the people here. We will take a look at their legacy next month.

ful eyes of dedicated master gardeners. You can expect to find perennials, trees, vines, shrubs, succulents, decorative grasses, herbs and shade plants as you wander the pathway under the delightful trees at Weeks Bay. Perennials for both sun and shade-for both containers and patio pots, unique and hard-to-find annuals that would wow audiences in hanging baskets or porch pots will be available. On Faith

Recently, a friend gave me a copy of Andrew Pettegree's Brand Luther, a historical analysis of the Protestant Reformation in Germany that focuses on Martin Luther's intuitive grasp of the crucial role of marketing in the spread of his theological vision. Luther quickly understood the massive potential of print media. At that point in history, Gutenberg's epochal technology was starving to death because of the twin strictures of high cost and uninteresting/inaccessible content (think Betamax). It just didn't appeal to ordinary people. That was just the audience Luther cared about most. While he is most often thought of as a theologian and revolutionary, the truth is, Luther's concerns were primarily pastoral. He saw that regular people were struggling spiritually, and he needed to connect with them. Luther's own intellectual conversion occurred in critical engagement with scholastic theology, now a by-word for the tortuously arcane, abstruse, and irrelevant. I learned in Pettegree's book that Scholasticism was actually the topic of the first set of theses nailed to the Wittenberg door just a few weeks before the famous ninety-five. The problem with Luther's initial sortie was that his topic, by nature, made no sense to laypeople (I have a Ph.D. in Systematic Theology, and I'm not sure I really understand scholastic theology).

Luther's next casus belli focused on indulges, a manipulative money-making scheme of the Church that directly and negatively impacted the people in the pews. When these theses were put into print and then translated into German, the movement spread like wildfire, its popularity insulating Luther from the kind of sinister attacks that had done other critics of the Church to death. The lesson of this little snippet of history is this: powerful spiritual truth is of little use if it isn't in service of actually helping anyone. St. Paul calls this knowledge that puffs up rather than builds up. People don't care what you know until they know that you care. When "the love of Christ constrains us," then we become world-changing ambassadors to the world (2 Cor 5:11-21).

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Six Baldwin schools qualify for state archery meet

ROBERTSDALE — Six teams from Baldwin County qualified for Alabama's National Archery in the Schools Program Alabama State Championship to be held April 7 in Montgomery.

Arrows were flying March 15 and 16 at Robertsdale Elementary School nearly 500 competitors with 22 teams from Baldwin and Mobile counties converged for one of nine 2017 regional archery competitions for Alabama's National Archery in the Schools Program.

"We're so thrilled to be able to host this year's tournament," said Coach Samantha Lefford with Robertsdale's archery program, which includes students from elementary and middle school programs. "This is great, not only for our school, but for the central Baldwin community."

Robertsdale's middle school team topped the field at the two-day tournament with a score of 3,135, nearly 100 points ahead of the second place team, Fairhope Middle School with a score of 3,051. Foley Middle School also qualified in the middle school division with a score of 2,797 behind St. Luke's Episcopal, which finished with a score of 2,991.

Foley High finished as the top-ranked high school team with a score of 3,254. St. Luke's finished second in the high school division with a score of 3,185. Gulf Coast Archery of Foley also qualified for state with

a score of 3,078, behind St. Paul's Episcopal of Mobile with 3,138. Fairhope High also qualified for the state meet.

In the elementary division, Gilliard Elementary of Mobile qualified with the high score from the regional of 2,773 with St. Luke's also qualifying with a score of 2,742. Robertsdale finished third in the elementary division, edging out Loxley Elementary, 2,422 to 2,377, but did not qualify.

NASP is the most successful school archery program and has taught archery to thousands of students in many states. The program provides a physical education curriculum designed to teach International-style archery to students in grades fourth through 12th.

In Alabama, the NASP is a joint venture between the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources' Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries Division and the Alabama Department of Education.

Earlier this year regionals were held in Mobile, Troy, New Market, Northport and Pell City. Cullman and Prattville regionals were held March 17 and 18.

Additional schools from Mobile County qualifying for the state meet are Clark-Shaw Magnet School, Causey Middle, Elsie Collier Elementary, Grand Bay, North Mobile Christian, Old Shell Road School of Creative and Professional Arts, Phillips Preparatory and Saraland High.

Schools can qualify

individually or as a team, Lefford said. Qualifying depends on how teams scored from all regions.

"Who qualifies and how many teams qualify really depends on how everybody did," she said. "For example, if you have a team that finished in the top spot from a regional with a score of 2,500, but every team from another regional scored above 3,000, then it's possible that no team from the lower-scoring region will qualify."

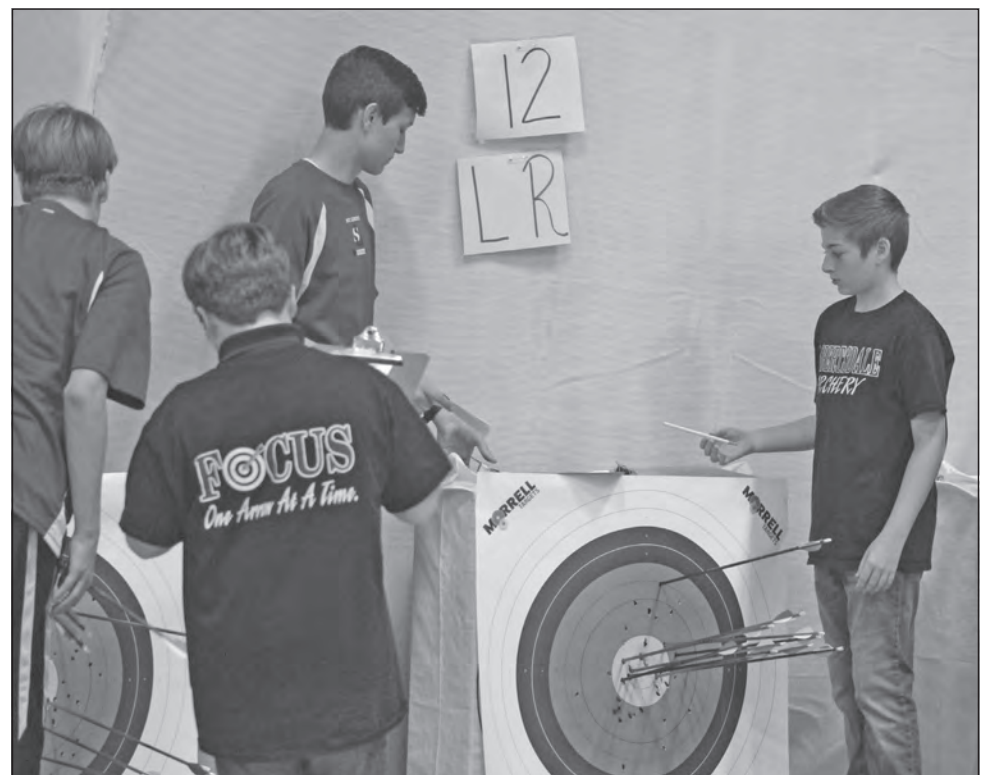
Robertsdale's elementary program qualified in the 14th position for last year's state tournament and ended up finishing ninth, Lefford said.

South Carolina Gamecocks. They shocked the No.2 seed Duke Blue Devils (88-81), the No.3 Baylor Bears (70-50) in the Sweet 16 and the No.4 Florida Gators (77-70) in the Elite 8. This is the Cinderella team that wants to be taken seriously especially playing the No.1 seed Gonzaga Bulldogs this Saturday.

The Bulldogs have done a good job of quieting teams looking for that big upset. Gonzaga, this season, is ranked first in overall efficiency — how often they score and how often they allow opponents. The Bulldogs are ranked 14th in the nation in points per game (83.2), sixth in rebounds (40.5)

fourth points allowed (60.9). Even though the Bulldogs have played in a weak conference, they have done well against teams in better conferences like West Virginia (Big 12), Xavier (Big East) and Northwestern (Big Ten).

Another No.1 seed still in the mix is North Carolina possibly coming from the toughest division to face No.2 Kentucky, No.4 Butler and No. 8 Arkansas. Head coach Roy Williams is no stranger to the Final Four as this will be his ninth time as a head coach (fifth with UNC). The Tarheels are ranked ninth in the nation in points per game (85.2), first in rebounds (43.7) and third in assists

(18.2). They are one of the smartest systematic offenses in the nation but are highly inefficient behind the 3rd point arc.

Playing the Tarheels is one of the most diverse teams in the No.3 seed (Midwest) Oregon Ducks. Their offense is fast pace but they have the patience to get a scoring mode going. The Ducks are also one of the best teams when it comes to shot blocking (second in the nation in regular season) in blocks per game (6.65). It will be difficult to out-rebound the Tarheels considering Oregon lost their star in Chris Boucher to an ACL tear in the PAC-12 conference tournament.

Get ready for a crazy campaign year

We are on the cusp of one of the best political years in modern political history in the Heart of Dixie. Prior to the 1970's our constitution disallowed succession of office for our state constitutional offices. In other words, you could not run for two consecutive four year terms. Like father; like son, so they say. In this case, the saying rings true. Robert Lucassen, son of Johnnie Lucassen, who had the soda bottle sculpture at his place of business in Fairhope, has rebuilt a landmark structure on Highway 98 in Montrose. It is now a part of Baldwin County Legacy. But it is time for us to use the real name of this architectural wonder. It is called a ShooFly!

People always notice it – and make reference to the white structure built around a huge live oak tree at Lucassen Body Shop. No one seems to know just what to call it. Most use the word gazebo, but the old timey name is a ShooFly. The name comes from the idea that if you are sitting high above the ground, in the shade of a tree, the ocean or river breezes will help shoo the flies away. A ShooFly is definitely a part of southern lore. Can you imagine the stories that were told while sitting in a ShooFly?

Robert had his first one built in 1989. He had always loved seeing the one that graced an antebellum homeplace facing Mississippi Sound in Biloxi. It was in front of the antebellum home Montrose and disappeared during Hurricane Camille. He also had photographed the one that George Brown had built at his home at the end of County Road 10. The Brown's ShooFly was damaged during Frederic, but was repaired and a wedding held there just two scant weeks after the devastating storm. It was featured in many publications about Baldwin County and was used by state tour-

ism department for advertising the southern part of the state. When Hurricane Ivan hit in 2004, it was washed away, and has not returned thus far. Robert thought we needed

a new one to enjoy!
In the early years of his business, people often asked directions to the shop, but still had a hard time noticing it from the car, so Robert thought, "A perfect place for the gazebo!" The one he had built in 1989 immediately became a landmark; eyes were drawn to it as cars made the curve on Highway 98. It stood time well until just last year when it started to show its age. The first one had been built dependent upon the oak tree for support, so as the tree grew, the structure suffered. One day he was talking to Don Hill, Construction Engineer, who took on the challenge to rebuild the ShooFly and had it up and beautiful in a few short days. Robert had the specifications he wanted and the result was true to his specs. The first one was held together with a cable around the perimeter, and when Don cut the cable, it "opened up like a Bloomin' Onion!" The new one is larger, about 26 feet in diameter and is free

standing. You may notice that some of the older shooflies have staircases to allow access to the floor of the structure. A staircase access could be considered a danger, so it was not allowed for this one.

Robert had lighting installed so the structure is even more dramatic at night. The huge oak tree is estimated by arborists to be about 200 years old. One neighbor has lived for about 80 years in his historic Clay City Brick home next to Lucassen Body Shop. He says he remembers playing on the lower branches of the tree when he was a little boy and it seemed just as big then as it is now.

It is wonderful when a private citizen takes ownership of his community heritage and makes the effort to enhance the perception that people have of it. That is just what Robert and Weezer Lucassen have done. They have created a landmark that seems like it has been there forever – a leftover from a long gone old home. Even if it is gone one day, people will talk about the ShooFly that was on Highway 98 in the Good Old Days. Aren't we lucky to have it? Thank you!!

FAMOUS HAND

Those who consistently perform well at the highest levels of the game certainly are deserving of the reputations they have earned. But the chances are that if you watched a top expert play, you would not be greatly impressed.

The fact is that an expert seldom does anything sensational. His most valuable trait is that he rarely makes a mistake. The ability to play one session after another without erring is his stock in trade, but it does not induce kibitzers to stand up and cheer.

Take this deal from a national championship. South was in four spades, and West led a heart. East took his A-K and returned a heart, won by declarer with the jack. South played the ace of clubs, ruffed a club and cashed the ace of diamonds. Next came the jack of spades, which lost to West's king. When West re-

turned a club, declarer ruffed and easily took the rest of the tricks.

What did South do that was extraordinary? On the face of it, nothing. He had to lose two hearts and a spade -- and he lost them. Yet, upon closer study, South did something really good, and if he hadn't done it, he would have gone down. He made the key play of cashing the ace of diamonds before taking the trump finesse.

And what did this accomplish? To see the difference, let's say that after South ruffed a club at trick five, he had next led the jack of spades, losing to the king.

West would then have returned a diamond, and the contract would have been lost. South would have been unable to lead from dummy without losing a second trump trick to West's ten, and he would have gone down one. Giant oaks from tiny acorns grow.

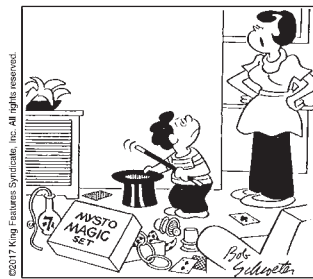

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Spring Cleaning? Clear Out the Medicine Cabinet Too

Cleaning out closets and shelves in the coming weeks?

Pharmacists urge everyone to add the medicine cabinet to their to-do list this spring. Leaving old medications unattended could be dangerous.

Medications, like any chemical, are given a date when they become less potent, known as a shelf life. After this date, the chemical compounds in the medication begin to break down. While the medication may still be safe to consume after this date, it may not work as well.

Once a medication reaches its expiration date, however, the entire bottle is considered unsafe, and needs to be removed.

Keeping medicines past the expiration in a bid to save money may cost you your life.

Pharmacist Stacy Davis, who owns Gulf Shores Family Pharmacy and Lillian Pharmacy, said some

medicines can hurt, rather than heal the body, once the chemicals begin the breakdown process after their shelf life ends.

As an example, she said patients who have taken the common, antibiotic, tetracycline after the expiration date have reported suffering from a rare kidney illness called renal tubular acidosis.

"It is difficult to determine how long after the medication has expired and when these effects can happen, so it is a good idea to discard of any expired medications," she said.

Patients should also strictly follow the storage directions as well, she said.

"Some medications, like insulin, have specific storage instructions, and though not expired, the medication may have degraded if it was not stored in the correct conditions. Other medications must be mixed as close to administration as possible," she said. These can include antibiotics like amoxicillin

and once mixed, they are good for a specific amount of time, and then can turn toxic after that. It is important to make sure medications are not expired and discuss with your local pharmacist about your medications."

Ready to rid your house of extra medications? Here are answers to some common medication questions:

Storage:

Follow instructions of individual medications. For all others, it is best not to store medication in the bathroom where there is a lot of moisture and high humidity. This leads to a break down in the drugs. Pick a dry, cool place in your home instead.

Cut in half?

If you are trying to save money by cutting your medication in half, you may be doubling your bill instead when you need to start the dosage all over again. Davis said some medicines can be cut, but only with a doctor's approval. Many medications

are designed to work in the body a certain way and release medication over time. If you cut it in half, you can destroy that mechanism and keep yourself sicker, for longer.

Control Access:

Davis said parents and grandparents are the main source of controlled substances and narcotic pain medications that are abused and become the cause of overdoses. Over-the-counter drugs, such as cough syrup, also can be abused if not monitored. "If you throw these items in the back of the cabinet and forget about them, they can become a problem," Davis said. "It is absolutely imperative that you dispose of them properly."

Share medicine?

Is your younger child hacking and coughing the same way the older one did last week? Too busy to make it to the doc? Don't share the medicine the doctor gave to

your first child. Davis said there are many variables that doctors consider when they prescribe medication, such as allergies and how the medicine will react with any other medicine the child is currently taking. Also, medications are dosed by weight, not age. Giving one person's medication to someone else can result in an overdose.

Disposal:

Never dump unused medicine down the drain or flush in the toilet. The drugs will eventually end up in the water supply, and wreak havoc. Davis' pharmacies in

both Gulf Shores and Lillian can dispose of non-narcotic medicines, free of charge. In Baldwin County, the Sheriff's Department's main office in Bay Minette, and its satellite office in Fairhope, maintain a 24-hour drop box in the lobby for the disposal of outdated or unused pharmaceuticals. Remove all labels before dropping, for privacy reasons.

Have questions? Davis said people should turn to their pharmacists for any questions about drug storage or use. "People need to understand the pharmacist is readily available, with no appointment."

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Jenna Elfman stars in "Imaginary Mary," premiering Wednesday on ABC.

'Imaginary Mary' posed a real acting challenge for Jenna Elfman in ABC sitcom

W.C. Fields once warned performers to "never work with animals or children," lest they be upstaged by their cute cast-mates. Were he alive today, the famously irascible vaudeville comic and actor would likely take a dim view of CGI-animated characters, too.

And that's not to say that Jenna Elfman is upstaged by the animated character she plays opposite in her new ABC comedy series "Imaginary Mary." Quite the contrary. It merely underscores the skill it takes to act and react to an entity that viewers can see but the actor can't.

In the half-hour series, which premieres Wednesday, March 29, Elfman ("Dharma & Greg," "Friends With Benefits") stars as Alice, a PR guru enjoying the fruits of success and the freedom that singlehood affords. But when Ben (Stephen Schneider, "You're the Worst," "Broad City"), a divorced father of three, crosses her path seeking help with his social media page, she falls hard. And that

sets off alarm bells in the commitment-phobic Alice and summons forth her imaginary friend from childhood, Mary.

Mary, who resembles something of a cross between the Pillsbury Dough Boy and a mogwai from the movie "Gremlins," would surface in times of crisis to talk Alice through whatever predicament she happened to be in. And now that the possibility of a long-term relationship has entered the picture, Alice needs Mary more than ever.

"She's my inner voice and my mentor," explains Elfman in a quiet corner of a Pasadena, Calif., hotel. "Mary kind of mirrors what's going on with my character. So when Alice is a little tipsy, Mary is tipsy. And when Alice is enjoying her melted mint chocolate chip ice cream, Mary is enjoying the mint chocolate chip ice cream. So she's mirroring her and challenging her at the same time, much like our own thought process."

Playing opposite the CGI Mary turned out to be quite the exercise in acting for Elfman. In addition to having to be funny and believable as Alice, the

actress also had to focus her eyes on a point in space where Mary was supposed to be while reacting to Mary's lines being thrown at her by a comedic actress off camera (on the show, she's voiced by Rachel Dratch of "Saturday Night Live" fame). And then of course, when the character moved, Elfman's gaze had to adjust as well.

"We would sometimes tape marks on the walls," Elfman notes, "but obviously if she's in this space and right here — like sometimes she'll be right here on the table with me so then it's a dimension point so there's nowhere to put tape. So sometimes there will be like eight to eleven eye (lines) in a scene that I'd have to remember while also focusing on performance (and) comedic timing."

In the end, it was 15-hour days and a lot of mental calisthenics, but Elfman welcomed the challenge and says the experience made her better.

"It was great because I was ready for that next level of challenge ... which really excited me," she says. "It wasn't just the same-old. It was like definitely the next level of game for me, which I loved.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Daphne, after due consideration believes that certain revisions to the City of Daphne Land Use & Development Ordinance are necessary for the proper administration of said Ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, at the City of Daphne Planning Commission regular meeting on January 26, 2017 the Commission considered certain proposed amendments to the City of Daphne Land Use & Development Ordinance, Ordinance 2011-54, and any amendments to the same and set forth a unanimous favorable recommendation to the City Council of the City of Daphne; and,

WHEREAS, due notice of said proposed amendment has been provided to the public as required by law through publication and open display at the Daphne Public Library and City Hall, a public hearing was held before the City Council on March 6, 2017; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DAPHNE, ALABAMA as follows:

SECTION I: THIS SECTION HEREBY AMENDS THE LAND USE AND DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE ARTICLE XVII, PROCEDURES FOR SUBDIVISION REVIEW, to add SIDEWALK INSTALLATION AGREEMENT & SIDEWALK BOND PROVISIONS as follows:

17-2 MASTER PLAN SUBMITTAL

Any subdivision or development which is to be developed in phases or units shall require a master plan of the proposed subdivision or development which shall be submitted to the Planning Commission for approval prior to submitting a preliminary plat application.

The sub-divider shall submit to the Department of Community Development, a written request for review and approval by the Planning Commission and a copy of said master plan. The master plan shall be of sufficient detail to show the proposed street, sidewalk and lot layout, drainage, utilities, detention, common, recreational, and landscaped areas.

17-4 FINAL PLAT APPLICATION

(a) Financial Guarantee of Performance in Lieu of Full Installation of Minimum Improvements:

1. The sub-divider shall be responsible for the full installation of all required minimum improvements except sidewalks in the proposed subdivision prior to the submission of a final plat application to the Planning Commission or after no less than ninety percent (90%) of the minimum improvements have been installed, the sub-divider may issue a financial

guarantee with surety to the City of Daphne that the remaining minimum improvements shall be completed.

2. 1. The developer/owner shall submit to the Department of Community Development a street maintenance bond payable to the City of Daphne which shall be valid for a period of two (2) years. The bond shall be in an amount equal to twenty percent (20%) of the total street, utility, and drainage improvements in the subdivision. Said bond shall be required as a condition to dedication and acceptance of any new streets within the corporate limits. The Director of Community Development or Director of Public Works other administrative official as designated by the City Council shall determine the adequacy of said bond and security thereon.

The street maintenance bond period shall begin upon the acceptance of the street and drainage improvements by resolution of the City Council. No less than thirty (30) calendar days prior to the expiration of said maintenance bond, an inspection shall be conducted by the Department of Public Works and the Environmental Programs Manager or Site Containment Officer to ensure that the improvements are in satisfactory condition prior to acceptance.

2. If applicable, the developer/owner shall submit to the Department of Community Development a sidewalk installation agreement, a cost estimate for all undeveloped portions of the planned sidewalk network certified by the project civil engineer and a financial guarantee of performance to be used by the city to install said sidewalks. Said bond shall be payable to the City of Daphne which shall be valid for a period of two (2) years. The bond shall be in an amount equal to (200%) two hundred percent of the cost of the required sidewalk improvements for the applicable phase of the subdivision.

The developer/owner may request renegotiation of the sidewalk installation agreement with the city once fifty percent (50%) of the planned sidewalk network has been constructed.

The Planning Commission, upon the recommendations of the Department of Public Works or designee thereof, and the Environmental Programs Manager or designee thereof, may release or extend a street maintenance obligation and may also release any sidewalk installation bond obligation or portion thereof.

An extension of the maintenance bond shall be for a period of time no greater than one year. The sidewalk obligation shall not be extended beyond the originally specified period. The city shall cause the sidewalk network to be

completed using the funds from the bond.

SECTION II: CONFLICT WITH OTHER ORDINANCES

That any Ordinance heretofore adopted by the City Council of Daphne, Alabama, which is in conflict with this Ordinance, be and is hereby replaced to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION III: SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this Ordinance are severable. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

SECTION IV: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the date of its approval by the City Council of the City of Daphne and publication as required by law.

Perdido River Canoe Trail offers scenic vistas

Now that spring is officially here, it's time to dust off the canoes and kayaks and take advantage of another opportunity to explore Alabama's great outdoors.

The latest addition to the Alabama State Lands Division Canoe Trail is the 19-mile Perdido River Canoe Trail, which is divided into two segments with three access points along the Perdido River in Baldwin County.

Typical of a coastal river, the Perdido, which borders Alabama and Florida, is tinted with dark tannin-stained water, like that found in nearby Styx River. The Styx River runs into the Perdido River near Seminole, Ala.

The canoe trail portion of this winding river provides numerous sandbars with white sands that are perfect for river travelers. The many sandbars provide paddlers with frequent opportunities to take a swimming break or lunch break.

The Alabama State Lands Division has provided three access points

along the river with two launches and one boat ramp suitable for small boats only. Canoeists and kayakers can stay overnight along the river at one of the six camping shelters that can be reserved or by pitching a tent on one of the sandbars located in front of the shelters. Camping is not allowed on sandbars located between designated shelter locations.

Doug Deaton, State Lands Manager, and Jeremiah Kolb, State Lands Natural Resources Planner, said the Perdido River Canoe Trail was funded through the Coastal Impact Assistance Program (CIAP) grant sponsored by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

Deaton said the Perdido River Canoe Trail was a natural fit for expanding

the State Lands' Canoe Trail system, which includes the Bartram Canoe Trail that traverses the upper and lower Mobile-Tensaw Delta. The Perdido trail runs along the 18,446-acre Perdido River Wildlife Management Area in Baldwin County.

"When looking for ways to expand our canoe trail, we thought the Perdido River presented unique opportunities because we already manage state-owned and Forever Wild Land Trust riverfront property there," Deaton said. "The CIAP program provided the catalyst to start the whole project by submitting a grant application for funding. We were excited to ultimately receive CIAP funding and seized the opportunity to add to the recreational options for the people of

Alabama."

Although the Perdido and Bartram trails are not connected, Kolb said it's easy to access both trails in a short amount of time.

"And there's a long history of people using the Perdido River and Styx River," Kolb said. "Anybody who enjoys canoeing and kayaking will get a lot of use out of the trail."

The trail amenities include a total of six shelters that will accom-

modate up to eight campers each in four locations found along the trail.

From north to south, these are the Nelson Ditch Shelters, the Peaden Lake Shelter, the Loggerhead Creek Shelters and the Swamp Field Shelter. Individual shelters, which are elevated, can be reserved for one night only, but campers can reserve additional shelters for \$25 per night as they travel down the trail. Reserva-

tions are from noon to noon, and campers need to keep a copy of the shelter reservation during the trip. No open fires are allowed within 20 feet of the shelters. Cooking stoves are allowed on the shelter porches. Pets are not allowed in the shelters. No alcohol is allowed.

"The shelters are screened in, so there will be protection from insects at night," Dea-

ton said. “Reservations are required to use the shelters. We don’t allow camping on the beaches unless it’s a beach adjacent to a shelter location. All campers need to keep an eye on the weather. If there’s a chance of a significant rain storm coming in, the river can rise rapidly. Campers need to check the river stage. We provide a link on our webpage to check the water level at Barrineau Park Bridge. If the river stage is 13 feet or higher, it’s out of its banks, so you need to stay away.”

The three access points for launching kayaks and canoes are Gravel Landing, Staple Fork Landing and Blue Lake Landing.

“Blue Lake is mainly for take-out, but we improved the launch enough that you could put a small boat in and motor up the river and fish,” Deaton said. “When we say small, we’re talking about a jon boat with a 25-horsepower motor max. What you’re most likely to catch is largemouth bass, bream, and catfish.”

In addition to the unique habitat of what are called blackwater rivers, the Perdido River Trail users will see a wide variety of wildlife, including bald eagles, ospreys,

white-tailed deer and occasionally an Eastern wild turkey. Several eagle and osprey nests are visible during the trek. Of course, loads of other wildlife may be spotted along the way, including gopher tortoises and a wide variety of songbirds and reptiles.

“It’s a very easy paddle,” Kolb said. “You can also tube down the river. But be aware that the river is spring-fed and is cold year-round.”

Trail users are urged to make a checklist before embarking on a trip. Included items should be a map of the area, paddles, life preservers, dry bag with a change of clothes, flashlight, drinks and food, sunglasses, sunscreen, cell phone secured in a waterproof container, car keys, lighter or fire-starter stick, toilet tissue, portable toilet, GPS and camping gear.

Kolb and Deaton warn that there may be the possibility of having to portage the canoes and kayaks during the trip because of logjams.

“And users need to be aware that those logjams don’t stay in the same place,” Deaton said.

“They’re constantly moving. It’s not hard to get around them, but you will have to take your canoe or kayak out of the water.

“Another thing we need

to emphasize to the day users and the overnight campers is there are no bathroom facilities along the trail. It is required that users bring their own portable toilet. You’ve got to take it out with you. That goes for any garbage, too. We want our users to ‘Leave No Trace’ that they’ve been there.”

to the Eastern Shore.

"It's a 75 acre campus which will provide us a needed footprint in that arena," Haygood said. "It will help us recruit tech-oriented jobs to help diversify not only Daphne's economy, but the county's as a whole."

Craft said Gulf Shores has continued to grow to the point where the city felt it needed to have some sort of comprehensive plan in place to help figure out how the city wanted to grow.

"We needed to know where we were going," Craft said. "We've developed a 2025 vision for sustainability that looks at some key areas and issues where we see opportunities."

One such opportunity is working with South Baldwin Regional Medical Center to create a medical facility closer to the Island area.

"The biggest issue we seem to be facing is the need for medical facilities," Craft said. "We have a large number of people

coming to the beach and a high retiree base and it can be difficult to make it up to the current facility in Foley during peak traffic times and months."

Craft said Gulf Shores and Orange Beach city leaders were working to possibly try to get South Baldwin to locate a new facility somewhere along the Beach Express, which could help with some of those traffic concerns.

For Foley, Koniar said the biggest growth has been in the retail sales area, an area that will only expand once the Poarch Creek's OWA facility fully comes online.

"They decided to make a small investment of around \$500 million into this little facility," Koniar quipped. "It will definitely be a game changer for not just Foley, but our region as a whole."

Koniar said the Foley Sports Tourism complex adjacent to the OWA property has also been a boon for the city, with numerous events already slated to take place over the next few years.

"And there are industries that are coming in around that complex, namely medical and wellness type businesses," Koniar said. "It's a good position to be in."

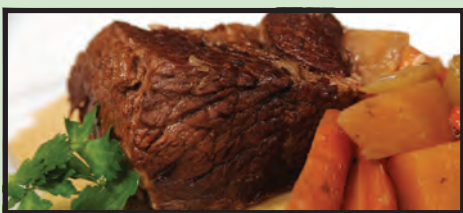
