Fundraising event to raise awareness of blood cancers

SILVERHILL — What started out as a small blood drive in Silverhill has evolved into a major fundraising event with sponsors, more than 30 vendors and support from a major media group.

"The response from the community has been overwhelming," said Emily Sanders Williams.

It all started when Williams, a graduate of Robertsdale High School, and her mom, Lauren Sanders, who works at Robertsdale Elementary School, wanted to organize a blood drive.

"So many people need it, and we simply don't have enough events around here to provide people with opportunities to give blood," Williams said.

So she called LifeSouth to organize a blood drive, to be held Saturday, July 22, at the Little Bohemian Hall in Silverhill.

But she wanted to do more. She wanted to do something to raise awareness for leukemia and other blood cancer diseases.

"I have not been personally touched by leukemia." she said. But she has been personally touched by cancer, which claimed the lives of both her grandmother and her aunt over the past year. "I just want people to be more aware of this disease that affects so

"At this point, we will continue preparing this case and do everything we can to get this to a Baldwin County grand jury as soon as possible," Simpson said.

Weekley is charged with three counts: sexual abuse of a child under 12, permitting or allowing a child to engage in production of obscene matter and production of obscene matter.


tacted the U.S. Marshals Service for assistance with apprehending some of the individuals in which three individuals were arrested with their assistance. Again, this was not a random act of violence.

many lives."

According to the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society (LLS.org), blood cancers such as leukemia, lymphoma and myeloma will account for more than 10 percent (estimated at over 170,000 of nearly 1.7 million) of the total new cases of cancer diagnosed in the

United States this year. Approximately every 3 minutes one person in the United States is diagnosed with a blood cancer and there are currently nearly 1.3 million people in the U.S. that are either living with or are in remission from leukemia, lymphoma or myeloma.

So Williams and Sanders reached out to the community and the result is The Giving Market, "a place

where small businesses come together to give back to the community."

In addition to the blood drive, which will be held from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., the event will include 30 vendors, entertainment provided by a local D.J., food provided by The Good Guys, and Mrs. K's Sno-Ball Shoppe.

There will also be a crafting area for children, including a space where

children can create their own painted rocks, which will then be placed around the area.

Queens from Loxley's Little Miss Strawberry pageant; Silverhill's Little Miss Heritage pageant and Robertsdale's Little Miss Honeybee pageant will also be on hand to greet guests.

The event has also partnered with the Cumulus Media Group, which includes more than 450

radio stations nationwide. including local FM stations WABD 97.5; WBLX 92.9; WDLT 104.1, and WGOK gospel 900 AM.

"They're helping us get the word out," Williams said, "and will be broadcasting live on the day of the event."

In addition, the event will serve as a fundraiser for 4-year-old Kallie, and young Keaton, who are both battling with the disease.

"Keaton's family live in Gainesville (Florida) so won't be able to attend," Williams said, "and while Kallie won't be able to come, there will be some members of her support group in attendance."

June 21, Simpson laid out the charges against Weekley and some of the information that led to her arrest.

"What we have in this case is Ms. Weekley has communicated with an individual in Florida via text message conversations," Simpson said. "We have those text message conversations. In those conversations, she discusses with this person in Florida as to the acts that she would perform with her children who were a girl at the age of 6 or 7 at the time and a boy the age of 3 or 4 at the time."

Simpson said multiple acts were included in the productions Weekley allegedly created.

"These are acts that she would perform on the children, the children would perform on her and the children would perform amongst themselves that she would encourage," Simpson said. "She would photograph these at the request of this individual in Florida

and send these images to this individual in Florida."

Simpson said authorities have confiscated the individual from Florida's cellphone and discussed with him what was sent on the phones.

"We have sent all of the phones we have collected, including Ms. Weekley's phone, to the FBI in Quantico where they are examining those phones," Simpson said. Simpson said they have also interviewed Weekley's daughter, who disclosed some of the actions performed.

"They had a game that they would call 'Huckle Buckle,' where she would disclose photographs and engage in activities like penetration that Ms. Weekley would perform on the child that were consistent with the images described on the text conservation and sent to the individual in Florida," Simpson said.

The felonies Weekley is currently facing include two that could carry sentences of 20 years to life in prison.

Local librarian a winner in Capstone's 'The Power of Librarians' contest

FOLEY — "Is it not every girl's secret dream to be a calendar girl?" said Sue Norman, the library media specialist at Foley Middle School. "Especially one that promotes the power of librarians."

Her dream has come true, as she is one of the 13 extraordinary librarians to win Capstone's "The Power of Librarians" national photo contest.

E-books have allowed us to provide an enhanced reading experience for our students. Also, there's no more waiting for a popular book to be returned by another student. Hundreds of students are able to access the same title at the same time using their Chromebooks."

Foley Middle School challenges the whole student body to read the same book during their "One Book, One School, One

Responding to the Trinity

In preparing lectures on the Trinity recently, I have been reminded that this doctrine has fallen on hard times in the evangelical church not because of outright rejection but widespread neglect. One of the first (and one of the severest) theological controversies in church history concerned the Trinity. While the ultimate solution to the problem was a century or so in the making, it was masterful: The Father, Son, and Spirit are co-equal, co-eternal; three persons, one essence. While there have been moments within the church and movements against the church that attempted to deny the Trinity, the classic formulation of three-in-one has been a stone cold non-negotiable of orthodoxy. The success of the trinitarian formulation is, however, the best explanation for its neglect in the church. It is assumed to be true with little thought as to how that truth manifests itself in the life of faith. All the obscure talk of "persons," "essence," and "perichoresis," make little sense to most Christians. With this in mind, let me offer what I believe is the basic significance of the Trinity. First, the Trinity means that our God is deeply, fundamentally relational. It is the fullest expression of the Scriptural claim that "God is love." The word "agape" essentially had to be invented to describe this deep relationality that exists in God, a relationality that He freely and graciously shares with all creation. In all the places where trinitarian concepts appear in Scripture, it is with reference to God's engagement with the world in creation, redemption, and the life of the church. Because

Member FDIC of the Trinity, we are the people of God, the body of Christ, the Temple of the Holy Spirit.


Second, the Trinity means our God is deeply, fundamentally mysterious. He holy and wholly Other. His existence is beyond our comprehension, and He cannot be contained by our constructs. All analogies ultimately melt before the magnitude of His ineffable existence. How exactly is He three and one? Only He knows. Trinity means that, while God freely chose to create, He absolutely did not have to. He was utterly and completely satisfied in Himself. His love was fully in action and perfect within Himself. The fact that He chose to make us and redeem us is all of grace.


Kim stuffed every single one.

"It's not about your size. It's about your heart," he said. "Keep working hard. You are going to be put down a lot of times. Keep fighting through. Keep working."

Filter your own fresh air

The days of July are long and hot and the peppery nights don't offer much relief from the heat. Now is a good time to head inside and show all of your houseplants some love. While you have been fighting the heat, houseplants have been possibly neglected by a lack of watering. All the while, they have been silently hard at work filtering all manner of toxins out of the air for your household.

The NASA Clean Air Study of 1989, originally done to research ways to clean the air in space stations, suggests that certain, common, indoor plants provide a natural way of removing toxic agents from air. NASA found that most of the effective air-cleaning plants originate in tropical or sub-tropical environments and, because of their ability to flourish in reduced sunlight, they photosynthesize well in household light.

Indoor air pollution comes from many sources, including paints, carpentry materials and plastics that can pose serious health threats over time. Ammonia is found in window cleaners, floor waxes and fertilizers. Benzene is found in plastics, rubber, nylon, synthetic fibers, drugs and pesticides. Xylene can contaminate printers, rubber, tobacco smoke, leather and paint while carbon monoxide is found in cooking stoves, water heaters, clothes dryers, fireplaces, power generators and cigarette smoke. Another contaminate, formaldehyde, is found in paper bags, waxed paper and plywood paneling. It is wise to remember that air pollution can be several times higher indoors than outdoors. Most scientists agree that indoor air pollution is a realistic threat to human health. We all tend to think that the air quality inside our homes is pretty good, but toxic compounds from wallpaper, paint, cleaning products, furniture, pollen, mold and bacteria make a not-so-clean contribution to inside air in our air-conditioned, poorly ventilated homes.

As they do in so many other circumstances, potted houseplants come to our rescue. In our frantically busy lifestyles, humans have a psychological need to be surrounded by greenery and items from nature. Indoor houseplants frequently fill home and office spaces as a way to reduce all of the physical and mental stimulation caused by the world's noise, rapid movement and visual complexity. Plants seem to have an inert nature to them that relaxes and calms down fast-paced lifestyles. In addition to these gifts, indoor plants improve human health mainly by purifying the air of the many types of pollutants found in all homes. Welcoming potted houseplants into our homes can greatly help purify the air and reduce harmful particulates in the air, as they absorb carbon dioxide to photosynthesize fresh oxygen.

Here are eight easily found and hearty houseplants that promote air quality.

- Bamboo palm These cute little miniature bamboo trees are touted as adding good luck to their owners. That is a guarantee as the bamboo palm is a formaldehydefiltering superstar that grows quickly from small palms to 12 foot high trees.
- Peace lily Often given as housewarming gifts with good reason. The white flowering plant with glossy green leaves packs a major air-cleaning punch to whatever indoor setting it graces as it banishes several indoor pollutants, gases and solvents like benzene, ammonia and formaldehyde.
- Dracaena or ponytail plant This interesting plant comes in varying shapes and sizes with its characteristic topknot of long, thin leaves lined with red, tan or creamy white. This common house and office plant is a wonderful filter for xylene, formaldehyde and benzene.
- Aloe vera Not only is this gift-giving plant wonderful to have on hand in burn or wound healing emergencies, but each swollen leaf contains a mixture of amino acids, vitamins and enzymes with anti-bacterial, anti-inflammatory and soothing benefits. All the while, this beneficial plant filters formaldehyde from polluted indoor air.
- Garden mum The colorfully common garden chrysanthemum is available in almost every pastel shade under the rainbow. In addition to being readily available and inexpensive, potted mums are air purifying superheroes. They remove multiple toxins from indoor airspace, including formaldehyde, ammonia, benzene and xylene.

Weeping fig - This lovely plant does so much for the infrequent watering and indirect sunlight it requires. During the colder months, it can be brought indoors where it will decrease pollutants like benzene and formaldehyde. In the warmer months, it will thrive in semi-shade and can grow to heights of ten feet.

- Mother-in-law tongue This practically indestructible, hearty plant does much for very little upkeep-infrequent watering and little sun. It will quietly sit in its pot and filter benzene, xylene and formaldehyde from the air.
- Spider plants- Thin, leafy spider plant is an ideal novice houseplant because it is tough to kill and can live through almost any neglect. The only thing this hearty plant requires to flourish is bright, indirect sunlight to keep multiplying its baby shoots as it absorbs harmful xylene and formaldehyde from the air.

All of these air purifying plants are easily available at local or online nurseries. Improve your home's air quality and grow your own fresh air by choosing your desired plants, taking care of them and allowing them to take care of you.



The opening lead often makes or breaks a contract, and we can all testify to this from bitter experience. There is nothing more consistently difficult in bridge than finding the most effective opening lead, but that doesn't mean the task is altogether impossible. One can frequently deduce, either from the bidding or from one's own hand, which card will probably be the best opening shot. There may not be a feeling of 100 percent confidence in the final choice, but that's not necessary when the evidence clearly points in one direction. Consider this deal where West, after ruling out a diamond or club lead, opted for his stronger major, spades. Declarer won the trick with the king and quickly ran

off eight more to score 600 points. Had West led a heart. the contract would have gone down five! East

would win the first heart



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with the jack and shift to the queen of spades, and declarer would lose the first nine tricks instead of winning them.

Of course, it's easy enough -- looking at all four hands -- to see that the heart lead is best. But the fact is that the heart lead should be chosen without seeing all the hands. West can reason that on the bidding South has either the king of spades or the Q-J-x, so that a spade lead is apt to help declarer more than hurt him.

Conversely -- again judging from the bidding - a heart lead is likely to find East with one or more heart honors sitting behind North's heart honors, and hence is the more attractive lead.

Rebuilding, Reforming, and Repairing Our Military

There is no greater responsibility of the federal government than to provide for the safety and security of the American people. I have found myself making this point over and over again throughout

my short time in Congress. With the wide range of issues under debate here in Washington, some of my colleagues seem to forget that our most basic responsibility as outlined in the Constitution is to "provide for the common defense" of the American people.

That is exactly what we did last week when the House passed the National Defense Authorization Act

(NDAA) by a strong bipartisan vote of 344 to 81. As you may remember, this is the bill that authorizes funding BRADLEY and sets policy for

BYRNE the entire United States military. Notes from your Congressman Needless to say, it is

a critically important piece of legislation that Congress must pass each vear.

As a member of the House Armed Services Committee and Vice Chairman of the Seapower Subcommittee, I was able to play a key role in the bill as it moved through our Committee and then to the House floor for a vote.

The bill is especially important this year given President Trump's pledge to grow our military. Our bill increases total military spending by 10% over last year's levels, which will help reverse the severe readiness crisis that has been plaguing the military.

Consider these numbers: thirty years ago, the Fiscal Year 1988 NDAA represented 27.3% of total federal outlays and 5.2% of projected GDP. This year's bill authorizes funding for the military at \$688.3 billion, which is 16.8% of total federal outlays and 3.4% of projected GDP.

We are spending less proportionally today on our military despite the fact that we face a wider range of threats across the globe. That should be troubling to

every American.

Thirty years ago our nation's military faced only one serious threat: the Soviet Union. There was no ISIS or al Qaeda or other radical Islamic terrorist organization threatening the United States. Iran was not an existential threat to the American people. North Korea wasn't developing nuclear weapons and ballistic missiles. China was not on the radar as it relates to military power. We weren't worried about cyberattacks or cyber espionage.

The threat environment today is incredibly complex, and we must ensure that our military funding is in line with the realities of the threats we face. This year's NDAA is a big step in that

direction.

The bill increases the size of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Army Guard and Reserve, Naval and Air Reserve, and Air Guard. It also provides for the procurement of critical military aircraft, ships, and equipment while also setting money aside for maintenance and repairs to current military resources.

Important to our area, the bill authorizes the construction of three more Littoral Combat Ships (LCS), which are built in part by Austal USA in Mobile. It is critical that the bill support three ships because that is the number necessary to keep the shipyard operating at full speed and keep the cost of the ships down.

Given the nuclear and ballistic missile threat posed by North Korea, the bill boosts our nation's missile defense programs. A number of important cyber security provisions and reforms related to the space domain are also included in the bill.

In an effort to support our servicemembers and their families, the bill authorizes a 2.4% pay raise for our troops. It also includes significant provisions related to military health care, housing, and benefit programs.

All told, this bill will help ensure the safety and security of the American people through rebuilding, repairing, and reforming our nation's military.

Caretaker or ideologue for U.S. Senate?

s the horse race for our open U.S. Senate seat heads down the stretch, let's look at the lay of the land.

All indications are that Roy Moore and Luther Strange are headed for a one-two finish on August 15 and ultimately a runoff on September 26. The winner of that match will be our junior U.S. Senator for the next three years of the Jeff Sessions' seat term. The short window for the campaign helps Moore and Strange. They both have name identification and have run several successful campaigns for significant statewide offices Roy Moore has worked the rural areas of the state quietly without much money. Luther Strange has bought heavy TV time in the Birmingham media market hoping to turnout upscale suburban Republicans. A combination

of polls as we head around the curve and into the last leg of the race has Moore at 30, Strange at 28 and Brooks at 18. The caveat to remember is that turnout is critical. Moore's 30 percent will show up. Therefore, his final vote tally on August 15 could be higher than 30. A poll is a picture of the entire electorate. The poll that actually counts is the poll on August 15 and it is comprised of those that showed up to cast their ballot. Congressman Mo Brooks has the best chance to upset one of the two frontrunners. He represents the vote rich Tennessee Valley in Congress. He is the only viable candidate from that neck of the woods. He is a member of the Right Wing Freedom

Caucus in Congress. If that ultra conservative group has a grassroots fundraising organization and they raise Mo some money, he could surprise and overcome Luther. There are two de-

scriptions I like to use when assessing a U.S. Senator and the script they seek as your senator. Senator Richard Shelby is the ultimate caretaker. He has proven to be the greatest U.S. Senator in Alabama history. Over the past 30 years, he has brought home the bacon. He has also voted conservatively. In fact, if you compare the voting records of Shelby and Sessions they would be identical. However, Jeff Sessions would be categorized as an ideologue. He was an ultraconservative during his ten-

ure in the Senate and was considered one of the upper bodies' most arch right wing reactionaries. Therefore, would Roy Moore or Mo Brooks or Luther Strange be considered a caretaker

Washington and by national standards would be the caricature that the Democratic Party would use as the poster boy that depicts how far right the Republican Party is today. It would be Moore's mission to be perceived as the most ideologically religious zealot on the scene. Alabama would be known for having the most

religious right wing senator in the nation. The national Democrats would use Roy Moore's picture in every ad in every California race the same way Obama was used Alabama. Luther Strange would be in the mold of Senator Richard Shelby as a caretaker. Shelby would mentor Luther, who is more of a mainstream conservative. Strange, Moore or Brooks would all vote conservatively right down the line. They would have the identical voting record as Jeff Sessions or Richard Shelby on all the litmus test GOP issues like abortion, immigration, balanced budget, pro-military, pro-gun, pro-agriculture and most importantly the appointment and confirmation of conservative Supreme Court Justices. However, without question, Luther Strange would be a much more effective U.S. Senator for Alabama than Roy Moore or Mo Brooks. He would be more of the type Senator that we have in Richard Shelby. We have had some greats like Shelby, Lister Hill, John Sparkman, and John Bankhead. Alabama would be better served to have a conservative caretaker in Washington than a reactionary right wing ideologue. However, Alabamians may prefer having a missionary in Washington rather than a visionary - at least those who show up to vote on August 15. See you next week.

any people wonder about the wonderful monument of red rocks on County Road 32 in the Summerdale area. So we set out to discover what they are all about.


Man has been piling rocks about as long as there were men on earth, and each man-made formation has a story. Earliest formations

were probably to mark an area for future use, like signposts. Many early cultures erected steles to commemorate an event, and many to mark a person's life. Eventually, like Ogham standing stones in Ireland, they were carved with writings and later were even shaped into obelisks. Some early cultures used rocks placed in perfect formations like Stonehenge for religious purposes or as dolmans to mark graves, but the earliest ones found were simply stacked in ways that created a permanent structure. Here in Baldwin County, we call them rock piles!

A couple of years ago, high in the Rocky Mountains. I pulled over to the side of the road, jumped out and went to a pile of rocks by the side of the road. There I picked up a large one and leveled it good in the dirt. Then my husband added one on top of that base. In turn, each of my three grandsons added a rock to the pile. Then I explained the custom.

I am trying to remember just when I started doing this - it seems like I have always done it. On every trip I make, at the furthest or highest point from my home, I build an Ebenezer. Then we sing, "Here I raise mine Ebenezer, Hither by Thy help I'm come. And I pray by Thy good mercy safely to arrive at home." We show our thankfulness for a safe journey thus far and ask for traveling mercies for our travels home.


ture of the Inuit and other Native American tribes from Alaska to Greenland. Earliest were single upright stones used as markers, as a

means of communicating some message to those who passed that way. The ranch is now expanded all the way through to County Road 28, where a similar rock structure can be seen.

enezers I have made, I treasure the memories of each place. We built one at Machu Picchu, at Mount Sanai, at Vesuvius, and one at Alabama's own Mount Cheaha. We built one at the westernmost point of Hawaii on the isle of Kauai at the end of the Hanakape'ai hiking trail on the NaPali Coast (Glad I did that when I was younger.)

The Biblical reference is in I Samuel, where a stone was raised in Israel to commemorate victory over the Philistines, but virtually every culture has similar monuments. Some even take on personalities and other meanings.

Sports Academy faculty train Fairhope football players on concussion awareness Free online course on sport-related concussions also offered

DAPHNE – United States Sports Academy faculty recently provided concussion prevention education to football players at Fairhope High School through a program designed to address the growing issue of sport-related concussion among young athletes.

Over the past year, the Academy has worked with the University of South Alabama (USA) Department of Neurology and the Mobile County Public School System (MCPSS) under the Concussion Awareness Program (CAP), funded in part by a grant from the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) to USA. Under the program directed by USA, the University and the Academy developed procedures for use by the school system to better protect student athletes from the negative health consequences of concussions. Students. coaches and others involved in contact sports programs are provided training on concussion awareness and prevention. Protocols are also put in place to make sure that student athletes who receive concussions are not allowed to return to play until medical professionals approve.

Dr. Vincent K. Ramsey, Academy chair of sports exercise science, said a letter of cooperation was recently signed to expand the CAP partnership to all Baldwin Count Public School System (BCPSSS) high schools. He and Dr. Brandon Spradley, Academy director of sports management, recently provided concussion awareness instruction to Fairhope High School football players under the educational aspect of CAP. This part of the program provides student athletes, coaches, trainers and parents with an online tutorial application to evaluate and build upon their knowledge of concussion. Student athletes are required to complete the tutorial as part of the program.

The second element of the program relates to ensuring that athletes with concussions are given proper medical treatment and not allowed to resume competing until medically cleared. This is achieved by medical intervention and by standardized neurocognitive testing, a component achieved by each player taking two tests before the start of the season – an online neurological assessment and a balance test – which establish the athlete's normal neurological function. After suffering a concussion or suspected concussion, the tests are taken again. Under the protocol, players suspected to have suffered concussions can not resume competition unless released by medical professionals.

"Last year with the NCAA grant, we went to every Mobile County high school and tested every football player through the Concussion Awareness Program," Ramsey said. "Athletes take a questionnaire, then watch a video with information about concussions and how they would report, then they would take the quiz again. The results showed a significant positive influence of the program.

"The results show a statistically significant improvement in the athletes' levels of knowledge of concussions, as well as their perception of what a concussion is and what they should do to report it and recover."

"Concussion education is very much needed, especially at the youth and high school levels," Spradley said. "Much of what we hear about concussions come from sports media covering the NFL and other professional sports. Sometimes young athletes are forgotten about and neglected.

"Our hope is that this program will educate thousands of young athletes about the signs and symptoms of concussion," Spradley said. "Our goal is for young athletes to have the right attitude and mindset towards concussion and improve their behavior and willingness to report concussion symptoms."

USA is currently seeking a \$1.6 million grant from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) to build on the progress already made by CAP by expanding the program to a wider geographical area, as well as serve younger athletes. The Academy would provide the educational component of the concussion prevention program as a sub recipient of the grant.

Dr. Anthony Martino, chairman of the Department of Neurosurgery in the USA College of Medicine, has practiced neurosurgery for 25 years and has championed head injury prevention programs. He is CAP's principal investigator, along with coprincipal investigators Dr. Ashley Marass, an assistant professor in USA's College of Nursing, and Ramsey. Spradley, as well as USA Professor Dr. Benjamin Hill and Mary Wilstrup, USA pediatric clinical nurse, are also involved in CAP.

Concussion has become a major issue of concern in contact sports in recent years, especially in relation to the discovery of Chronic Traumatic Encephalopathy, or CTE, among professional football players and other athletes. Caused by repeated blows to the head and recurring concus-

sions, the disease has been blamed for cognitive and intellectual impairment, mood disorders, depression, drug abuse, and suicide attempts among elite athletes.

In addition to its involvement in CAP, the Academy offers a free online course on sport-related concussions which provides an in-depth review of the risks, prevention, recognition, treatment and management of sport-related concussions. The course also discusses the importance of awareness and education strategies for coaches, athletes, parents, administrators, and health care professionals. The course is available by going to USSA.edu/free courses.

The season will be difficult at first for Southern Miss as they have to replace five key offensive starting positions including three offensive linemen and quarterback.

College Football season gets closer to starting, there are many teams that are on track to surpassing their respective previous seasons. Some of the re-

gional teams in the Gulf Coast have high potential for a big season and their fan bases are eager to see the continuing progress of their teams as they get ready for kickoff in late August.

The Troy Trojans accounted for their first 10-win season last year at 10-3 including a victory against the Ohio Bobcats in the Dollar General Bowl in Mobile. Now in his third season



Something evil is afoot in a small Texas backwater and a group of unusual locals is determined to put a stop to it in a new supernatural thriller series debuting this week on NBC.

The good news is, these women hold a clue to where Grace's missing sister is located.

Lem are in a relationship together that is very deep and twisted and we'll explore that as the season goes on. And for me, what I love about bringing Olivia to life is that she continues to surprise me. 

Shipp prepares to judge his 35th ADSFR

With a new pacemaker in place, Dr. Bob Shipp is preparing to oversee the thousands upon thousands of fish from the Gulf of Mexico and Alabama's coastal waters that will be tossed onto the counter at the weigh station during the Alabama Deep Sea Fishing Rodeo (ADSFR), scheduled July 21-23 at Dauphin Island.

Shipp, professor emeritus of the University of South Alabama's Marine Sciences Department, will serve as head judge at the weigh station during the 84th rodeo, which happens to be his 35th behind the rodeo scales.

Shipp started as an assistant judge to the late Roy Martin in 1982 and became the head judge when Martin rational in the late '90s

tin retired in the late '90s.

much it. But now with all the display tanks and Most Unusual category, it's just a great venue for tourists."

Shipp said the other big change he's experienced during his rodeo time is how marine science has flourished at the rodeo in the last 10 to 15 years.

"Way back when, there were a couple of us down there for the science," he said. "Now we have scientists from all over the country and Europe, too, to collect specimens. I would have to count how many masters' theses and Ph.D. dissertations have come from the rodeo. And the Jaycees (Mobile chapter that hosts the rodeo) have been so supportive."

One species that has been studied extensively at the ADSFR is Alabama's favorite reef fish, the red snapper, which has been the center of controversy for numerous years because of season restrictions instituted in federal part because of the rodeo support and the information gathered at the rodeo."

As part of his continued work at South Alabama, Shipp makes several research trips annually into the Gulf to gather red snapper specimens. The research, funded by the Alabama Marine Resources Division, gathers catch data and video footage during the trips. One species that scientists won't be able to process for this year's rodeo is triggerfish, which is closed for all of 2017. Shipp, however, has seen plenty of triggerfish on his research trips.

"We've been out several times and the videos show huge, huge triggerfish," he said. "They're also very curious. They come right up to the camera."

Shipp said during the trips, the bottom-reading electronics will reveal new spots to probe to determine if the structure is natural or man-made and to see what kind of marine life is present. "When we put the camera down, it's amazing," he said. "We have never had a single one of those spots that wasn't just loaded with snapper." Thanks to a change in the federal red snapper season, which runs each Friday, Saturday and Sunday through and including Labor Day, there will be tons of big red snapper brought to the rodeo weigh station. ber of fish species. The Roy Martin event is open to all young anglers age 15 and under. And the kids competed in several species not available during the ADSFR, including sea robins, croakers, hardhead catfish, spadefish, oysterfish, pinfish and whiting.

For the big rodeo, those anglers who wish to participate in the jackpot events will have to make captain's meetings at one of two venues, Orange Beach and Dauphin Island. The meetings for the Raymarine Big Game Jackpot, the Jesco King Mackerel Jackpot and the ADSFR Catch & **Release Shark Category** will be held at J&M Tackle in Orange Beach and the rodeo site at Dauphin Island. The Catch & Release Shark meeting is set for Thursday, July 20 at 5 p.m. at J&M Tackle in Orange Beach and the ADSFR site on Dauphin Island for a mandatory sign-out. The King Mackerel Jackpot sign-out will be Thursday at 6 p.m. at J&M and Dauphin Island, while the Big Game Jackpot will hold its meeting also at 6 p.m. at the two locations. If the participant or representative is unable to attend the captain's meeting, a boat representative has until 5 a.m. Friday, July 21 to complete the mandatory sign-out at the ADSFR site for the Big Game Jackpot, King Mackerel Jackpot, ADSFR Catch and Release Shark Category and optional cash prize divisions. Anglers in the big rodeo will compete in 30 categories, 15 inshore and 15 offshore. There is also a Speckled Trout Jackpot. The speckled trout anglers will fish in two divisions

- motorized and non-motorized.

The Live Weigh-In competition for speckled trout and redfish will return at the Dauphin Island site. The Live Weigh-In has been a popular addition to the rodeo and numerous trout and redfish have successfully been measured and released to the wild.

The rodeo will continue the special prize category started last year for lionfish. Rodeo anglers are urged to bring as many of the invasive species to the weigh dock as possible. Lionfish, which threatens the Gulf Coast ecosystem because it has almost no natural predators, is the rodeo's exclusive spearfishing category, and the winner will be decided by the number of fish brought to the weigh station.

Rodeo tickets are available at the usual outlets as well as online at www. adsfr.com.

After the rodeo is finished, Shipp will return to another familiar role – Alabama representative on the Gulf of Mexico Fishery Management Council. Shipp was appointed to a third term on the Council. Shipp knows the Council's top agenda item is obviously red snapper. "I think there is going to be a lot of effort to turn red snapper management over to the states," he said. "I know most of the legislative people along the five Gulf states are tired of trying to fight these silly regulations that we have in place now. "If the Council can't come up with something better than they have now, I think states will eventually take it over. I

think there's also a lot of disagreement about the state of amberjack and triggerfish, but those are not nearly as serious as the snapper situation."

Shipp said it's hard to resolve what the NOAA Fisheries computer models indicate and what anglers and even the research trips show about the red snapper population.

"Because of the artificial reef efforts, not just Alabama but the other states as well, we have created a tremendous amount of snapper habitat that did not exist before," he said. "The population has expanded increasingly rapidly. The problem is the way the feds view the population. They need a ratio of ages. They want so many 4-5-6-year-olds. With the population expanding as rapidly as it is, all these young fish are entering the population and it screws up the model.

"This goal of rebuilding the snapper stock by 2032 was put in place in the 1990s. Here they are looking 30-35 years in advance with no way to address the changes in habitat. Our hurricane people, with all the data they have, can't even predict four days out. So how can you predict 30 years out for a fishery. It's insane."

During Shipp's time as head judge, the ADSFR was recognized in 2011 by the Guinness Book of World Records as the largest and oldest fishing tournament in the world.

"It's become probably the biggest single event in Lower Alabama during the summer," Shipp said. "It's the focal point of all the activities with thousands and thousands of people who come to Dauphin Island and coastal Alabama. Plus, you've got people from Tennessee and Georgia and other states who come down just for the rodeo.

"What I think is really interesting is that it has become as much a spectator event for non-fishermen as it is for fishermen themselves. It used to be that fishermen were pretty tions instituted in federal waters.

"We've been able to gather a tremendous amount of information on red snapper in terms of growth and age structure at the rodeo," Shipp said. "That information is going to be used, eventually, to change the management regime for snapper. That also includes grouper and the other snapper species like vermilion, gray and lane snapper.

"We've gotten a tremendous amount of data that has pointed out the importance of artificial structures off of Alabama. We've got more than 15,000 artificial reefs that have totally changed the ecosystem and built up the reef fish fishery. That's due in

The rodeo kicked off on Saturday, the 15th, with the Roy Martin Young Anglers Tournament, which sees about 2,000 youngsters head out to catch any numShipp said another reason will likely factor into the transition to state-managed reef fisheries.

"Each state has different habitat," he said. "Alabama has artificial reefs. Alabama and Texas have oil rigs. Florida has a lot of natural bottom. Everything is different, so it makes much more sense for the states to manage it."

Baldwin County skin cancer rates higher than state and national averages

Casey Daniel says young women tend to believe that cancer is a disease of the elderly. They are not at risk. She is proof that they are

wrong. Daniel, an assistant professor of oncologic sciences at the University of South Alabama's Mitchell Cancer Institute, suffered from skin cancer at age 16. Since then, she has recovered and become an expert in cancer studies.

She tries every day to remind them that cancer, especially skin cancer, can come at any age. In fact, for women in their 20s it is the second most common cancer among that age group.

And for the rest of the population, it is just as widespread. Skin cancer is the most common cancer in the United States. The number of cases doubled between 1982 and 2011, and there were 5 million new cases in 2016 alone.

To put that number into perspective, there were

more cases of skin cancer in the U.S. than breast, prostate, colon and lung cancer combined. It's so many that one in five Americans will develop the disease.

Melanoma is the most widely discussed type of skin cancer because it is also the most deadly and most aggressive. Baldwin County currently has the third highest number of residents diagnosed with melanoma in Alabama.

Baldwin's occurrence rate is 10 points higher than both the state and national average. Daniel said that is partly due to the high number of retirees in the region, as the risk of skin cancer increases with age, and the fact that as a coastal community there is lots of opportunity for sun exposure.

"It hits close to home," she said. "It's something that we need to focus on as a community."

Daniel said while genetics and environmental factors contribute to skin cancer, our lifestyle choices also contribute to the disease, specifically how much we expose ourselves to UVA and UVB rays.


UVA rays of the sun can pass through glass and water penetrating deeper into skin, causing aging and wrinkles. Researchers believe 85 percent of skin cancer is caused by UVA rays. Indoor tanning beds also primarily use UVA rays but at a strength that is 12 times greater than those emitted by the sun.

Daniel said visiting a tanning bed more than once a month increases your risk of skin cancer by 55 percent.

In fact, experts consider tanning beds so dangerous that the U.S. Surgeon General ordered a call to action in 2014 that required a black box label be placed on every device. The World Health Organization has also labeled tanning beds as carcinogenic to humans.

UVB rays, also emitted from the sun, bounce off reflective surfaces and cause sunburns and eye problems.

Daniel said the only way to protect yourself from the



harm these rays cause is to cover your skin. Tales that a protective base tan will protect your skin from burning are false.

"There is no such thing as a base tan," she said. "You can burn no matter your skin tone - fair, red, dark,

super dark, it doesn't matter."

Prevention, she said, is your main weapon.

Hat – With a three-inch brim that covers your head and shoulders Sunglasses – Use only those labeled to block 99 to 100 percent of UV rays. Clothing – The tighter the weave of the fabric is the better. Dark clothing reflects the sun's rays too.

Protect against incidental exposure - Driving or riding in a car, the glass does

Cancer survivor welcomes visitors to new clinic with cookies

Three months after she finished cancer treatment for lymphoma, Fairhope resident Carolyn Carey began volunteering at USA Mitchell Cancer Institute.

"They saved my life," said Carey. "I do it to give back."

On July 5, the opening day of the USA Mitchell Cancer Institute Kilborn Clinic, Carey was distributing cups of coffee and her homemade butter cookies to patients in the Infusion Suite. She stopped to visit briefly at each recliner.

"I love the patient contact," said Carey, who visits the clinic each Wednesday. "It means a lot to me when I can talk to somebody and it makes a difference to them."



not protect you from the sun, gardening, sitting outside at a restaurant, swimming, outdoor sporting events, shopping at outdoor malls - "A lot of times we don't think about it because we are not actively sunbathing or trying to be out in the sun," Daniel said. Anytime you are outside you need sunscreen.

Sunscreen – Use SPF 30 or higher and make sure it says it blocks UVA and UB rays or a broad spectrum. Reapply every two hours. Also, sunscreens can go bad. If there is not an expiration date on the label, only use the bottle for one year.

Daniel said there is no such thing as waterproof sunscreen and that the FDA has banned companies from saying that on



their labels. Also, don't be fooled by advertising. "I get frustrated with

cosmetics companies taking advantage of consumers," she said. "I see ads for SPF 3.000 and it's expensive. It's a gimmick."

A sunscreen with SPF 30 blocks roughly 97 percent of the sun's rays. An SPF of 50 only blocks 1 percent more.

Daniel said the SPF is not the issue, it's the application. "The SPF is good but people don't apply enough or often enough," she said.

Spray sunscreens present the same problem. Users are only misting themselves, not rubbing the coverage into their skins.

"Make sure whatever you are using you cover all your skin and get it rubbed in," she said, adding that sunscreen should be reapplied, at a minimum, every two hours.


