Daphne parents puzzled about potential new school district

STAFF REPORT

Daphne city leaders are studying a possible split to create a Daphne City Schools system, but some local residents were

intrigued when they saw that could mean their children would be going to different schools.

At a recent PTO meeting at Daphne East, parents got a glimpse of

a potential zoning map, which showed the borders of what a Daphne City system might look like.

Some neighborhoods like TimberCreek and Bay Branch, which currently

send their kids to Spanish Fort schools, would be drafted into the potential Daphne system, while the Belforest community would see its kids moved from the Daphne schools

to Robertsedale's schools. Parents present at that PTO meeting said they would have liked to have asked more questions, but

Fairhope planning director resigns

Fairhope Planning Director Jonathan Smith confirmed to The Courier he would be resigning

from his position two weeks from last Friday. Smith's departure follows the hire of former Baldwin

County Planning Director Wayne Dyess coming into the department.

"I'm working the next two weeks and doing my best to help Wayne Dyess come in," Smith said. "I want to help him learn our files, ordinances and how we do business in our department."

In an interview with WABF 1220 AM radio last week, Mayor Karin Wilson indicated Dyess would be hired as the city's new planning director and that

Fairhope council president combats bid rigging claims

Fairhope Council President Jack Burrell has allegedly been the subject of several complaints filed with the Alabama Ethics

Commission regarding his involvement with a bid submitted to the Fairhope Airport Authority.

Local blogger and lawyer Paul Ripp provided a 34-page supplement to a complaint he filed with

the Alabama Attorney General's office, the U.S. Attorney's Office, the 28th Judicial Circuit and the FBI office in Mobile.

In that complaint, Ripp said he "has no confidence" in the Alabama Ethics Commission and ap-

pealed to those offices to pursue a formal investigation.

"The council president was part of a two man ad hoc committee selecting the most qualified

were unable to do so, which left them feeling confused about what could happen with their children.

Daphne city council members said nothing is set in stone yet, as the council is currently discussing how much they're willing to pay to complete such a study.

The council had previously budgeted \$30,000 for a feasibility study to assess what it would take to create a city school system, but during a recent work session, questions were raised about the

study possibly costing more than that.

"It's something we're going to have to continue to discuss and come to an agreement on," Councilman Robin LeJeune said. "Obviously, nothing is set in stone yet. We're just trying to gather information to show people and get some guidance on what we think could be best for the city of Daphne."

An official with the Baldwin County School system explained the map had been created after parent concerns reached a school board member.

"This is not being initiated by the Baldwin County School System," the official said. "The request came from a board member to the system about what it would look like if a Daphne city schools system had formed."

The official said the county school system certainly did not endorse a Daphne split from the system.

"The Baldwin County School System is not looking at rezoning nor are we pushing for a Daphne school system," the official said. "Our stance has always been that we are better together."

Smith would be shifted into another position within that department.

Smith was hired as a planner for the city back in 2006, eventually rising to the position of director of planning and zoning.

Smith said he was sad to leave the city, but felt it was the right call to make.

"It's been a difficult job, but a great one," Smith said. "I hated to make the decision, but I'm excited for the opportunities ahead and now is the time to do it."

Smith praised his department for the work they've been able to do over the last ten and a half years together.

"We've done the best we could with what we have," Smith said. "We've certainly been through a lot together over the last 10.5 years, and I have nothing but good things to say about everyone. I love the city, the people and the envi-

ronment here. I grew up here, so I've always had a sincere vested interest in Fairhope and making it a great place to be."

Smith's exit marks the second departure of a Fairhope department head, following the sudden resignation of Operations Director Scott Sligh on Jan. 20 after three days on the job.

Wilson said she had seen Smith's resignation letter Monday morning.

"I appreciate Jonathan's many years of service for the city and wish him well in his future endeavors," Wilson said.

Council President Jack Burrell said he was surprised by Smith's announcement and said he hated to see him leave the city.

"I'm very sad to see him go," Burrell said. "He'll be hard to replace. We'll miss his experience and knowledge of the city. Losing quality, informed employees like Jonathan is certainly worrisome, but we wish him well in whatever his future plans may be."

bid for a lease hangar space," Ripp wrote. "All of these gentlemen share a common friendship away from the airport. An official investigation should reveal the scope of their business relationship. It is a classic case of the Ethics Commission being played by individuals that manipulate the Commission with their own Advisory opinions."

Ripp alleges the RFP process for a hangar lease at the Fairhope Airport was "grossly flawed and gerrymandered" by Burrell to be awarded to Ray Hix, who sits as a member on the Fairhope Airport Authority.

Burrell said he did not take part in writing the RFP and was asked by the Authority's chairman to simply review the bids as they came in.

"The RFP was written by the chairman, and I had no hand in that," Burrell said. "Just like with RFP's done by the city - I certainly review them but I don't tell city

staff how to write them. The chairman asked us to review the RFP, review the bids and come back with our recommendation, which is exactly what we did."

Ripp alleges Burrell "aided and abetted" Hix in rigging the bid.

"We have received reliable information that Mr. Burrell (sometimes accompanied by his wife) has made numerous flights on aircraft provided by Hix/Snedeker aircraft aka Mid Bay Air LLC while an elected official."

Burrell denied this claim, adding that, to his knowledge, his wife had never even been on any type of private aircraft.

"That claim is just patently false," Burrell said. "I'm not certain he can prove those claims because they never took place."

Ripp claims that of the three bids for the hangar space, "two bidders were not qualified and did not meet the guidelines to bid set by the Authority," a claim Burrell said is just not true.

"Their bids weren't tossed out at all," Burrell said. "Vince Boothe and I considered all of their proposals when we went through the review we were asked to do

by the chairman. We treated each bid as if they were fully qualified and tried to make a decision that would bring the most money to the Authority, which is exactly what we did."

Burrell said the three bids came in close to one another in construction costs and that the real difference came in the amount of fuel flow estimated in each proposal.

Documents shown to The Courier revealed Kel Jones' bid from Executive Aviation came in with actual fuel numbers of 25,000 gallons, with an estimated 40,000 gallons possible with the new project. Terry Chapman, another bidder, had projected fuel flow of 45,000 gallons. Hix showed actual usage of 85,000 to 95,000 gallons and predicted a 20 percent increase in fuel flow once his upgrades were completed.

Burrell sent several emails to Boothe and Airport Authority Chairman Joe McEnerney where he wasn't certain that Hix's inflated estimates would be the best way to measure the potential bid numbers.

"I asked that we lower Hix's estimate to the actual usage 85,000, making it more conservative than what he suggested his flow might be," Burrell said. "At that same time, we allowed Kel to use his estimated number of 40,000 gallons instead of the actual number of 25,000. If I was really trying to rig something in Ray's favor, why would I consistently be questioning the bid and trying to lower his fuel flow numbers?"

While Ripp alleges Executive Aviation's bid was "by far the most qualified," Burrell said the numbers showed Hix's bid came in almost 21 percent higher.

"It's about \$6,000 a year more, which is not a small amount," Burrell said. "Even without the fuel flow, it was still a larger amount, almost 11 percent higher. Those were the numbers the bidders submitted, and we made our recommendation to go with the bid that offered the Authority the most money."

Burrell said he and other Airport Authority members were currently negotiating with the FAA to try to find grants and funds to be able to provide further expansions to the airport facility that could accommodate the other bidders.

"We want to find the space for all of them," Burrell said. "We are always consistently looking for ways to expand and improve our facilities out there."

When asked why Ripp might allege wrongdoing on his part, Burrell said he had a long history of Ripp being angry with him over various decisions he had made or ones Ripp had wanted him to make.

"I have always been independent, and I think that's served me well," Burrell said.

Burrell said he was aware of the numerous complaints filed against him by Ripp, but said he felt the truth would show he had nothing to hide.

"I always try to act in the best interest of the city and the people of Fairhope, and that's exactly what was done here," Burrell said. "We helped create a lease that gives more money to the Airport Authority and brings in more business every year, which benefits us."

Fairhope police warn about counterfeit bills

In January, the Fairhope Police Department received five complaints of counterfeit money being passed in our jurisdiction. On average, the agency receives between five and seven reports per year, so this month has seen a marked increase in counterfeit money complaints.

In the recent cases, counterfeit bills in varying denominations have been passed in local businesses.

Typically, the bills are passed at restaurants and retail businesses where cashiers have a high volume of customers with frequent, rapid transactions which prevent the employee from adequately examining the security features of the bill.

The quality of printers available on the consumer market has made it easier for counterfeiters to duplicate and print fake bills, so it is incumbent upon retailers and members of the

public to familiarize themselves with the security features included in modern currency.

The security threads, watermarks, color shifting ink, and other unique features are easy to recognize, but difficult to reproduce. They are designed to allow citizens to recognize legitimate notes versus counterfeit ones. When handling money, everyone should take a few seconds to examine the currency, both by feel and by sight.

The public is encouraged to visit that website and familiarize themselves with the security features. The website offers informational PDF format fliers that can be printed and posted within the workplace as well.

If anyone receives a counterfeit note, they are encouraged to notify their local police department.

John once told me that he was "born into gardening" on his parents' truck farm in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, where they grew "everything that would grow." After settling with his wife, Dottie, in Fairhope several years ago, John began anew learning what would succeed and grow well

in coastal Alabama and found uncommon success.

After becoming a Baldwin County Master Gardener, it was John who was sought out to educate the public on the successful growing of virtually anything in containers. From annuals to perennials to herbs, fruits and vegetables, with John's loving attentive care, they all sprang to life as container grown plants. His gorgeous and varied containers worked beautifully with his experimental color combinations of Johnny-jump-ups and coleus, grouped along the walkway of his home. Hanging baskets and planters were charmingly situated throughout his Fairhope garden.

John's willingness to share his knowledge with

anyone was well known. He was, indeed, a natural born gardener, talented educator and gifted speaker who always said "yes" to sharing. At various times in his life, John taught high school biology classes, pursued an ornamental horticulture degree and taught landscape design classes. Whether speaking at educational seminars, teaching container vegetable growing through the Eastern Shore Institute of Lifelong Learning, or designing and maintaining beds at the 104 Extension office, John was ready to help. Yet, his kind and gentle spirit required little in return.

John once shared, "You have to develop a close relationship with your plants. I enjoy being out-



doors with them and yes, I do talk to them. They are really neat life forms. They grow all over the world and give us so many rewards-in both beauty and food."

As fellow master gardeners, along with John's family, mourn his passing, I am reminded of these

words shared by John Robins, a kind proponent of healthy living and peaceful dying. "When you are born, you cry and the world rejoices. May you live your life so that when you die, the world cries and you rejoice."

‘It’s good to be home’ New Robertsdale business owner sets up shop near where he spent part of his childhood

ROBERTSDALE — Romeo Edward Breau III has lived all over the United States, but he considers Baldwin County his home.

“It’s good to be back home,” said Breau at the grand opening of his new business, Romeo 3’s Collision Center in Robertsdale, with the Central Baldwin Chamber of Commerce on Jan. 23. “I appreciate everything the city and the Chamber has done to make this possible.”

A native of South Carolina, Breau says he dropped out of school in the 10th grade, returning later to get his GED, but the majority of his education came from his parents’ body shop, People’s Paint and Body in South Carolina.

His mother died when he was 5 years old, Breau said, he and his father moved to Massachusetts, landing in the Bay Minette area of Baldwin County a year later.

“I lived here from about age 6 to about age 10,” he said. And while he has lived several places since, he has always wanted to come back and start a business.

And it doesn’t hurt to have other ties to the area.

“My wife (Billie) is from here, and she has several relatives who live in the area, so

it’s good to be back closer to them,” he said.

Breau said he learned everything he could about the paint and body business from his father and others before opening up his own shop in Greenville, Alabama, in 2006. When his first shop burned to the ground, he said, he took a 250-square-foot facility, renovated it and opened back up.

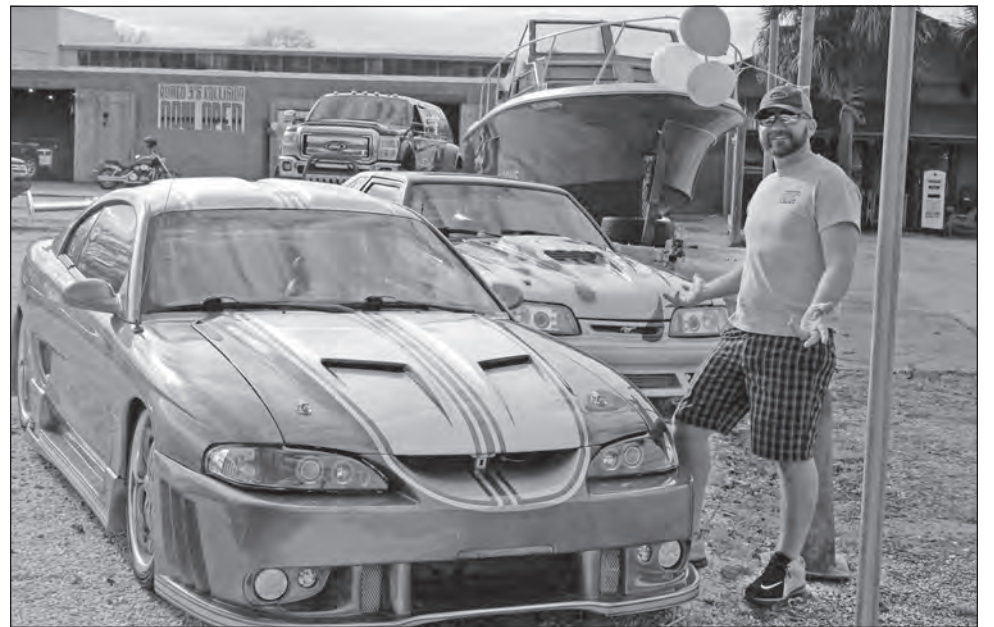
He ended up acquiring six acres of property and a shop on Highway 59 in Robertsdale last year and, after months of renovations, opened the new Romeo 3s last month.

“Our shop in Greenville is relatively small and we work primarily on collision work there, but here we have room to do just about everything,” he said.

That includes custom work, which he does all himself, everything from cars and trucks to boats and other vehicles, including a custom painted military vehicle which is parked front and center on Highway 59.

“We will probably eventually hire at least one other person to do custom work,” he said. “We want to keep growing and expanding in order to be able to serve our customers.”

Romeo’s now employs five people at the new shop in Robertsdale, including Breau, his wife, and her brother, assistant manager Robert Sawyer. Jason Reaves manages

the shop in Greenville, which also has five employees.

Breau said he hopes to add as many as 15 employees over the coming months. He is also looking for other businesses to renovate in the area.

“We can take anything and make it pretty,” said Breau. “It’s all about taking a negative and turning it into a positive.”

SUMMERDALE — Baldwin EMC lineman Jerry Rider is being called a hero thanks to a quick-thinking response that saved the life of Spanish Fort resident Jack Gipson.

In recognition of his heroic deed, Rider was presented the Baldwin EMC/Touchstone Energy Power and Hope award on Dec. 15. The award recognizes co-op employees for exceptional actions that provide power and hope within the cooperative network or the communities in which the employees serve. Jack Gipson, along with his wife Nancy and son Greg, were there to help present the honor.

Last May, Gipson was fishing in his boat on Tensaw Lake in Stockton, a hobby he’s frequently enjoyed since retirement.

“While fishing the north end of Tensaw Lake near Upper Bryant’s Landing, I experienced a health issue that caused me to lose consciousness,” Gipson says. “I fell, striking my head, and went overboard.”

Baldwin EMC employee Jerry Rider happened to be fishing nearby, saw the incident and quickly responded.

“I was floating face down in the lake when [Jerry] pulled me from the water and eventually got me back into my boat,” Gipson says. “We sped off

back to Live Oak Fishing Camp to meet EMS, who would take me to Thomas Hospital.” Three days later, Gipson received a heart pacemaker and is doing well today, thanks to Rider’s quick actions.

It was only after the fact that Rider learned the man he saved is also the father of his coworker, Greg Gipson.

“My family and I will always be grateful to Jerry Rider for turning a near death situation into a lifesaving experience,” Gipson says.

Whither the Alabama lottery?

During the past couple of months everywhere I go people continually ask me why in the world the legislature could not simply put the issue of whether they could vote for or against a lottery on the November ballot.

Well, to answer your questions, it is difficult to pass anything in a congress or legislature. That is why they have the old adage, "It takes an act of Congress to get something accomplished."

In Alabama extraordinary special sessions of the legislature are the way to go to get something accomplished if you are the governor. The legislature has to address what the governor calls the legislature into session for, it is called "the call."

George Wallace was a master of using special sessions to get what he wanted done. He would call them repeatedly. However, before he called them, he would have his ducks in a row. He would have called you on the phone, had you visit with him one on one in his office at the capitol or at the governor's mansion. Even though Gov. Bentley shoulders the blame for failure to at least put the lottery issue on the ballot, he has shown profound leadership with his creation of an advisory council on gambling. This advisory panel has done a thorough job of studying this issue. Jim Byard and Clinton Carter, two bright stars in Bentley's cabinet, have led the comprehensive study of gaming. The commission looked at what other states are doing to reap revenue from gambling that already exists to get a clearer picture of what a lottery would generate for state coffers. They have looked at all gambits of gambling in the state, not just the lottery. They are designing a long term approach to present to the legislature. The administration has extended the panel's deadline to report to the legislature from January 31st to June, probably because they do not want to deal with gambling during this legislative session. The final solution must allowed Alabamians to vote on this issue.

Lawsuit loans put victims last, lenders first

If you have ever served on the jury of a civil trial (or if you've watched Judge Judy), you know how easy it is to identify the interested parties in the courtroom: the plaintiff and the defendant.

This seems clear cut, as it should be. But in Alabama, lurking behind the scenes are lawsuit lenders, who provide up-front cash to the plaintiff in exchange for a cut of the lawsuit's outcome.

The lawsuit lending industry (not to be confused with legitimate financial institutions that lend money) has been distorting Alabama's civil justice system, turning it into a casino rigged in favor of these litigation investors. Victims are targeted with a "quick cash" loan in exchange for sharing any lawsuit award not only with their lawyer, but also with these third-party funders. Lawsuit lenders are bold and unscrupulous opportunists, charging fees and interest rates that often exceed 100 percent of the money they provide to plaintiffs up front.

This practice is doing real damage to Alabama's justice system. Not only does it foster more lawsuits, it also raises the costs of litigation. Perhaps most troubling is how these loans can change plaintiffs' behavior. Because the fees and interest charged by their lawsuit lender can, in effect, put them into debt, plaintiffs face tremendous financial pressure to turn down reasonable settlements and keep litigation going, hoping they will somehow

win an award that lets them at least break even.

It's almost like being underwater on a mortgage – just as a homeowner in that situation can't afford to sell their house without losing money, a plaintiff who owes more than he or she can pay to a lawsuit lender can no longer afford to settle a case. This clogs the courts with cases that should have been resolved quickly, keeping others from getting their day in court.

Not only does lawsuit lending corrupt the legal system, it also harms consumers by eating into their recoveries in litigation. States next door – like Tennessee – know this, which is why they have already restricted the worst aspect of lawsuit lending by capping the interest rates charged on these loans.

The Alabama Legislature needs to act to protect its citizens from lawsuit profi-

teers. And there is legislation to do just that – if only a handful of lawmakers will get out of the way.

In each of the past two years, the Alabama Legislature has considered a bill to rein in lawsuit lending. Specifically, the law would require that these transactions are defined as loans and it would require consumer protection measures such as disclosure and transparency. Bipartisan majorities in the House have passed this legislation both times – by votes of 98-1 and 86-6. Unfortunately, a few senators have used procedural rules to stop lawsuit lending reform dead in its tracks.

In 2017, the Legislature will try again. This year it's time for the obstructionists to support restraints on lawsuit lending. It's time for them to stand for easing the burden on our state's overloaded courtrooms, protecting vulnerable individuals from predatory lawsuit lenders, reducing the cost of litigation, and removing shadowy third parties from the courtroom.

Alabama has made tremendous progress in improving its lawsuit climate and providing a welcoming environment for employers. In this session, the legislature can take yet another positive step forward.

such a lovely place

In February, 1979 we were invited to a special evening at the Hotel Magnolia. Oh, the stories we heard ... we will never forget. Two great storytellers in one night!! What an experience.

We were welcomed at the magnificent front door of the Hotel Magnolia by John and Marjorie Snook who were hosting an evening with the renowned Alabama storyteller Kathryn Tucker Windham. I could not help but think of the Eagles recently (1977) released hit, *Hotel California* as we were drawn into the spell of the hotel. We were escorted into the parlor where the other members of the Baldwin County Historic Society were eagerly anticipating hearing Mrs. Windham share from her book *Thirteen Alabama Ghosts and Jeffrey*. John introduced the speaker and, as usual, the audience was spellbound by the talent of the guest of honor. Mr. and Mrs. Snook then presented each guest a copy of the book, which was personalized with a nameplate and then signed by the author. It is still one of my most treasured volumes.

As entertaining as the program was, there was more to come. Little did we realize that the stories told by John Snook would be just as much fun as those we had already heard. We were led on a tour of the historic hotel by Mr. and Mrs. Snook while Don Henley's lyrics kept going 'round and 'round in my head. The hosts shared the story of the hotel built

in 1908 by John Foley to house prospective real estate buyers during the earliest years of the new town. The Snooks were the final in a line of several owners and operators of the inn, and as he told us of those earlier years he showed us places where some of those stories took place.

He called our attention to the large mirror on the wall and pointed out one on the opposite wall. When one stands between the two mirrors, a "Tunnel of Death" or "infinity" tunnel is perceived; the reflections seem to go forever -perhaps even into another dimension. Old beliefs hold that the lady of death resides in mirrors and is sometimes seen beckoning for the unlucky person to join her in the journey through the tunnel. "Such a lovely place, such a lovely face."

There were several residents who lived there for years. One was a Mr. James Clark, whose family hailed from England. He was quite the dapper gentleman, some even saying he claimed noble English blood. He often wore his formal clothes, complete with cape, top hat and cane. He loved the rounds of Christmas and Mardi Gras parties and balls, and attended social events many evenings, often returning home in the wee hours of the morning between 3 and 4. Mr. Jimmy

was most thoughtful of his fellow residents and as he came in the front door, he removed his shoes before climbing the staircase. Because he did this so many times, the creaks of the steps are still heard nearly every morning in the early hours between 3 and 4.

Mr. John told us of doors that open by themselves, and of one room upstairs that will become locked from the inside even when vacant. He pointed out the nook under the staircase where the first phone was installed. Many a business deal was negotiated there and he said you could still hear voices there on occasion. There was no doubt in our minds that Mr. John Snook was a believer.

The Hotel Magnolia remains one of the premier inns in the south. Its charm and character make guests feel they are personal friends with the owner, Mrs. Snook. Mrs. Marjorie Younce Snook grew up in Foley and was a loving partner in all things that her amazing husband undertook. I was privileged to have a recent visit with her and her love for the old building was evident. Her parents spent their wedding night there on April 3, 1913, and she has lived there at times. When I asked Mrs. Snook if she thinks the hotel is haunted, she reported that the paranormal investigators had spent the night there in 1996 and did not record anything, but that does not deter her belief. She says that she has heard humming in the house when she was alone and that there is a door that often opens on its own. She

says, "Yes, there are some guests who refuse to stay in certain rooms." Probably the most famous bedroom of all is the second floor Red Room. I talked to someone who stayed there in November of 2016 and he told me that during the night he was awakened when he felt the bed give and creak as if someone were sitting on the side of the bed. He asked if the unseen being wanted anything, but he got no answer. He said he had no trouble going right back to sleep.

Another fascinating part of the hotel is actually underground. Some folks have been lucky enough to enter the tunnel that Mr. Snook had built running from the hotel to his Gulf Telephone Company office building. Local news channel reporter Darwin Singleton of Local 15 News produced a fabulous story on the mysterious tunnel, but no mention of anything too unusual going on down there. The tunnel is sealed up now for safety's sake, but the video is almost as good as being there. (Available on YouTube)

I hope you are lucky enough to spend a night or two in the iconic hotel. A word of warning, however. When you stay there and look into the Tunnel of Mirrors, if you see Lady Death beckoning to you, remember, "You can check out anytime you like, but you can never leave."

Patriots overcome 19-point deficit to win Super Bowl LI

In one quarter, Super Bowl LI went from the most lopsided game to finish out as one of the best Super Bowls of all time. After being up 28-9 at the end of the third quarter, the Atlanta Falcons lost a huge lead and momentum. With the Patriots considered out of chances, quarterback Tom Brady led one of the greatest comebacks in sports history by scoring 19 points (two touchdowns with two two-point conversions and a field goal) in the fourth quarter.

New England coach Bill Belichick forced the first overtime in a Super Bowl, received the ball first and won 34-28 on a two-yard touchdown run by James White.

2016 NFL MVP Matt Ryan and former Foley Lion, Crimson Tide receiver Julio Jones led an electrifying offense against a Patriots defense

that wasn't properly tested all season. Jones caught four passes for 87 yards as the most athletic player on the field making amazing catches and keeping his feet inbounds. Ryan threw 17 completions for 284 yards, two touchdowns. The Achilles heel for the high power offense was the offensive line where Jake Matthews gave up sacks and even Pro Bowl center Alex Mack gave up a sack. The Falcons gave up five total sacks.

The Falcons offense had 344 total yards on 23 minutes, 27 seconds. Trey Flowers accounted for six total tackles, four solo, two-and-a-half tackles for loss, two-and-a-half sacks and five QB hits.

Patriots' linebacker and former Alabama Crimson Tide Dont'a Hightower had two solo tackles, two tackles for loss, one sack, two QB hits and a

forced fumble on Ryan.

After an 82-yard pick-six by the Falcons' Robert Alford in the second quarter, Brady looked flustered from the aggressive Falcons defense. The Patriots did have trouble adjusting to the intense pass rush of Atlanta until they found cracks in the fourth quarter. Marcus Cannon did an outstanding job all night blocking Falcons star Vic Beasley Jr.

Brady led three successful drives in the fourth quarter in 8:08 minutes that tied the score 28-28 to force overtime. He threw for an all-time Super Bowl high 43 completions (62 attempts) for 466 yards (most in Super Bowl history), two touchdowns and one interception and was named the game MVP for the fourth time. This is Brady's and Belichick's fifth Super Bowl win and the most by a head coach-quarterback duo. It's only fair to call them the greatest of all-time.

Signs your running shoes need to be replaced

Running in old or worn-out running shoes can lead to running injuries. Over time, your running shoes lose shock absorption, cushioning and stability. When you run in worn-out shoes, it increases the stress and impact on your legs and joints, which can cause overuse injuries. One of the best things you can do to prevent running injuries is to replace your shoes at the right time. Here's how you know that you need new running shoes:

1. The mileage on your shoes is high.

A good rule of thumb is to replace your running shoes every 300-400 miles, depending on your running style, body weight, and the surface on which you run. Smaller runners can get new shoes at the upper end of the recommenda-

tion while heavier runners should consider replacement shoes closer to 300 miles. If you run on rough roads, you'll need to replace your shoes sooner than if you do primarily treadmill running. If you take good care of your running shoes, you may be able to get away with the higher end of that range.



2. You're feeling pain.

If you've been feeling muscle fatigue, shin splints, or some pain in your joints -- especially your knees -- you may be wearing shoes that have lost their cushioning. When you're feeling pain on both sides -- both knees, for example -- that's often an indication that you need new running shoes.

3. Your shoes fail the twist test.

If you hold your running shoes at


both ends and twist the shoe, it should feel firm. An old shoe or one that doesn't have proper support will twist easily.

4. Your soles are worn-out.

One tell-tale sign that you need new running shoes is if your soles are worn-out. The soles last longer than the shoe's cushioning and shock absorbency, so if the soles are worn down, it's definitely time for new ones. You should never run in shoes that have worn-down soles. Save them for working in the garden or mowing the lawn!

5. Newer shoes feel much better.

Some experts recommend that runners rotate two pairs of running shoes. If you get a new pair of running shoes about half-way through the life of your old ones, they can serve as a reference to help you notice when your old ones are ready to be replaced. If you notice a big difference in the cushioning of the newer pair, then it's probably time to retire the old ones.

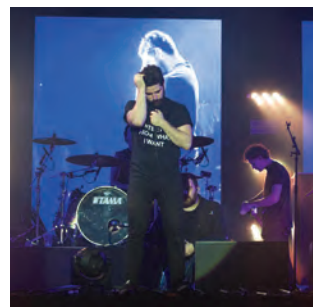

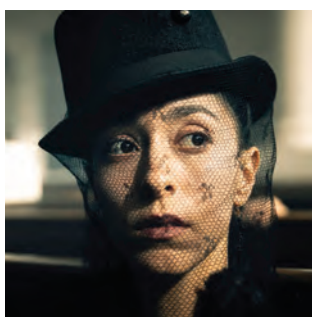

Oyster shell recycling program off to fast start

Oyster consumption has been occurring along the Alabama Gulf Coast for millennia with the Indian Shell Mound on Dauphin Island as historical evidence.

Fast forward to the 21st century and dining on oysters has increased exponentially. Instead of creating shell mounds, the Alabama Oyster Shell Recycling Program is designed to use the discarded shells in more creative and productive ways.

With the Alabama Coastal Foundation leading the way, a group of individuals and organizations started devising a plan to recycle the shells. Those involved included Chris Sherrill with the Florida-Bama Yacht Club, Chandra Wright with the Alabama Gulf Coast Convention and Visitors Bureau, Alabama Marine Resources Division Director Chris Blankenship and Judy Haner with The Nature Conservancy.

"We've needed an oyster shell recycling program in Alabama for a while," Blankenship said. "We have been meeting to put together a shell recycling program that would work long term."

"There was an opportunity to get a grant from the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF) to implement a pilot program to get this started. The Alabama Coastal Foundation stepped up as the lead agency and received the grant to begin a two-year pilot program to demonstrate the effectiveness of a shell recycling program in Alabama."

Mark Berte, Executive Director of the Alabama Coastal Foundation, said the grant from NFWF is for a two-part process – education and sustainability.

"Our whole mission is to improve and protect Alabama's coastal environment through cooperation, education and participation," Berte said last week at Gulf Shores. "And this program is all of the above. We work with restaurants to educate them that what they thought was trash is actually a valuable natural resource. The more shells we collect, the more shells we can get back into the water that will allow more oysters to grow and complete a nice, positive cycle."

The first phase of the shell recycling program went into effect in the fall of 2016 with six restaurants along Battleship Parkway (Causeway) at the head of Mobile Bay.

"Those restaurants are all close together, so it was easy for Republic Waste Services to run the route, pick up the shells and do the hauling," Blankenship said. "The shells are trucked to our Marine Resources property in Gulf Shores, where the shells are stored and seasoned so they can be used in several different projects, from replenishing reefs to grow more oysters to shoreline stabilization projects."

"There will be myriad uses for the shells, including oyster gardening. The important part is they are not going to a landfill. Now they'll be going back in the water to grow more oysters."

Larval oysters, known as spat, must attach to a hard surface to grow, and recycled oyster shells can provide an abundance of this vital structure.

Last week, the recycling program expanded with an additional collection route in the Gulf Shores and Orange Beach area, which puts the total number of restaurants involved in the recycling program at 13.

"The program has gained a lot of good public support," Blankenship said. "We're really glad this has taken off. The program is growing."


A celebration of the expanded program was held at two locations on the Alabama coast last week, including the Original Oyster House in Gulf Shores.

Joe Roszkowski, co-founder of the Original Oyster House restaurants, said the

number of oysters that go through their restaurants will quickly add up.

"We serve quite a few oysters," Roszkowski said last week at the ribbon-cutting ceremony. "In fact, we serve about 5,000 pounds a week in the summertime; that's quite a few shells. We know what oysters mean to the community and sponsor the oyster trail and Mobile's oyster gardening program. We learn how oysters impact our environment, our community and, of course, our health. For years these dedicated scientists, environmentalists and educators have worked to get oyster shells back in the water. We're so fortunate to be given the opportunity to help pilot Alabama's first oyster shell recycling program at our location on the Causeway."

"This program aligns with our core values of stewardship and will enhance the oyster population and help prevent coastal erosion. Best of all, this program will bring attention to how important it is to get the shells back to the reefs instead of the landfill."

As of the end of last week, more than 650,000 oyster shells had been collected.

Gulf Shores Mayor Robert Craft said the 2010 oil spill is a reminder that we should never take our environment for granted.

"This is an important first step for-

ward," Mayor Craft said. "This is what I think we learned, or should have learned, from the oil spill. When the oil spill happened and we couldn't fish in the waters, eat the seafood or enjoy the environment, what happened was that nobody came. They don't come here because they like the mayor or Gulf Shores. They came here for the environment. Because when it couldn't be used and enjoyed, people didn't come."

"If you connect those dots, what is the most important thing we need to do to maintain the quality of life in our community that is so special? That is to protect the environment. Part of that environment is having oysters that we enjoy eating. Our challenge here by recycling oyster shells is to recreate the reefs and grow more oysters."

Blankenship said the goal of the program is to eventually get all of the oyster shells that are discarded at restaurants along the Alabama Gulf Coast.

"Right now, we want to get at least the top half of the oyster that doesn't go to the table," he said. "We're working with the restaurants to collect the bottom half of the shells from the table so we can get all the oyster shells."

"Nothing grows oysters as well as oyster shells."

Blankenship said the program set a

conservative goal of collecting 2.7 million shells, but it should easily exceed that number.

"In two years we'll be well over the goal with the way the program has started," he said. "The ultimate goal would be to make the recycling program self-sustaining after those two years, after the consumers and restaurants see the value of recycling those oyster shells. Instead of having the grant help pay for the transportation of the shells, the money the restaurants pay for the shells to go to the landfill can be used in the recycling program. Restaurants pay by the ton to haul off waste. Oyster shells that go in the trash count toward that tonnage. The goal is to get the restaurants to separate out the shells, and instead of hauling them to the landfill, they would go to the Marine Resources Division to be recycled."

"The value of the shells that can be used for restoration projects would make this self-sustaining after two years."

Blankenship predicts the consumption of oysters along the Alabama coast will continue to grow, which will mean more shells for recycling.

"Oysters are becoming more popular," he said. "There used to be a limited number of people who ate oysters. Now it's becoming a much more popular seafood item."

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY OF DAPHNE, ALABAMA LAND USE AND DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE 2011-54, AS ADOPTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL ON JULY 18, 2011

ARTICLE XVII, PROCEDURES FOR SUBDIVISION REVIEW SIDEWALK INSTALLATION AGREEMENT & SIDEWALK BOND PROVISIONS

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Daphne, after due consideration believes that certain revisions to the City of Daphne Land Use & Development Ordinance are necessary for the proper administration of said Ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, at the City of Daphne Planning Commission regular meeting on January 26, 2017 the Commission considered certain proposed amendments to the City of Daphne Land Use & Development Ordinance, Ordinance 2011-54, and any amendments to the same and set forth a unanimous favorable recommendation to the City Council of the City of Daphne; and,

WHEREAS, due notice of said proposed amendment has been provided to the public as required by law through publication and open display at the Daphne Public Library and City Hall, a public hearing was held before the City Council on March 6, 2017; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DAPHNE, ALABAMA as follows:

SECTION I: THIS SECTION HEREBY AMENDS THE LAND USE AND DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE ARTICLE XVII, PROCEDURES FOR SUBDIVISION REVIEW, TO ADD SIDEWALK INSTALLATION AGREEMENT & SIDEWALK BOND PROVISIONS AS FOLLOWS:

17-2 MASTER PLAN SUBMITTAL

Any subdivision or development which is to be developed in phases or units shall require a master plan of the proposed subdivision or development which shall be submitted to the Planning Commission for approval prior to submitting a preliminary plat application.

The subdivider shall submit to the Department of Community Development, a written request for review and approval by the Planning Commission and a copy of said master plan. The master plan shall be of sufficient detail to show the proposed street, sidewalk and lot layout, drainage, utilities, detention, common, recreational, and landscaped areas.

17-4 FINAL PLAT APPLICATION

(a) Financial Guarantee of Performance in Lieu of Full Installation of Minimum Improvements:

1. The subdivider shall be responsible for the full installation of all required minimum improvements **except sidewalks** in the proposed subdivision prior to the submission of a final plat application to the Planning Commission or after no less than ninety percent (90%) of the minimum improvements have been installed, the subdivider may issue a financial guarantee with surety to the City of Daphne that the remaining minimum improvements shall be completed.

2. As such, one (1) or more of the following may be accepted as financial guarantee with surety payable to the City of Daphne: a letter of credit or certified check from an Alabama lending institution in an amount not to exceed one hundred and fifty percent (150%) of the cost of the required improvements remaining.

3. A cost estimate for any remaining civil improvements shall be certified and submitted by the design engineer with the application for final plat approval; a cost estimate of any remaining landscaping improvements must be certified and submitted by the professional landscape architect with the application for final plat approval and the financial guarantee.

4. Sidewalks around all common areas shall be installed prior to final plat approval. A surety for remaining sidewalk improvements shall be determined as provided in Section (b) Maintenance Bonds subsection (2) provided herein.

(b) **Street Maintenance Bond Bonds:**

1. The developer/owner shall submit to the Department of Community Development a **street maintenance bond** payable to the City of Daphne which shall be valid for a period of two (2) years. The bond shall be in an amount equal to twenty percent (20%) of the total street, utility, and drainage improvements in the subdivision. Said bond shall be required as a condition to dedication and acceptance of any new streets within the corporate limits. The Director of Community Development or Director of Public Works other administrative official as designated by the City Council shall determine the adequacy of said bond and security thereon.

The street maintenance bond period shall begin upon the acceptance of the street and drainage improvements by resolution of the City Council. No less than thirty (30) calendar days prior to the expiration of said maintenance bond, an inspection shall be conducted by the Department of Public Works and the Environmental Programs Manager or Site Containment Officer to ensure that the improvements are in satisfactory condition prior to acceptance.

2. If applicable, the developer/owner shall submit to the Department of Community Development a sidewalk installation agreement, a cost estimate for all undeveloped portions of the planned sidewalk network certified by the project civil engineer and a financial guarantee of performance to be used by the city to install said sidewalks. Said bond shall be payable to the City of Daphne which shall be valid for a period of two (2) years. The bond shall be in an amount equal to (200%) two hundred percent of the cost of the required sidewalk improvements for the applicable phase of the subdivision.

The developer/owner may request renegotiation of the sidewalk installation agreement with the city once fifty percent (50%) of the planned sidewalk network has been constructed.

The ~~City Council~~ **Planning Commission**, upon the ~~recommendation~~ **recommendations** of the Department of Public Works or ~~designee thereof~~ and the Environmental Programs Manager or ~~designee thereof~~ **Site Containment Officer**, may release or extend a **street maintenance obligation and may also release any sidewalk installation bond obligation or portion thereof.**

An extension of the maintenance bond shall be for a period **of time** no greater than one additional year. **The sidewalk obligation shall not be extended beyond the originally specified period. The city shall cause the sidewalk network to be completed using the funds from the bond.**

SECTION II: CONFLICT WITH OTHER ORDINANCES

That any Ordinance heretofore adopted by the City Council of Daphne, Alabama, which is in conflict with this Ordinance, be and is hereby replaced to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION III: SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this Ordinance are severable. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

SECTION IV: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the date of its approval by the City Council of the City of Daphne and publication as required by law.

On Faith

One of my favorite quotes from Flannery O'Connor is from a lecture she delivered in 1960:

Whenever I'm asked why Southern writers particularly have a penchant for writing about freaks, I say it is because we are still able to recognize one. To be able to recognize a freak, you have to have some conception of the whole man, and in the South the general conception of man is still, in the main, theological. . . . I think it is safe to say that while the South is hardly Christ-centered, it is most certainly Christ-haunted. The Southerner, who isn't convinced of it, is very much afraid that he may have been formed in the image and likeness of God. Ghosts can be very fierce and instructive. They cast strange shadows, particularly in our literature.

While the term "freak" certainly spills the banks of contemporary propriety, I think O'Connor's observations about the South and the function of Christ in this culture, on the whole, are true. By "freak," O'Connor meant "a figure of our essential displacement." This displacement, of course, is the fundamental reality of every person, not just Southerners. All

human beings want to go home, but we either cannot find it, or we are not welcome when we do. The pervasiveness of the church in the South, even when it has drifted badly from its mission, collides with the pervasiveness of the human "homelessness" exactly at the place of the cross of Jesus Christ—the ultimate "displaced Person," who is also the only way home. The church in the South would do well not to miss the opportunity of a "Christ-haunted" culture both by addressing and correcting our own distortions of the gospel and by magnifying the whispers, echoes, and moanings of the true, good, and beautiful gospel that is calling us home.

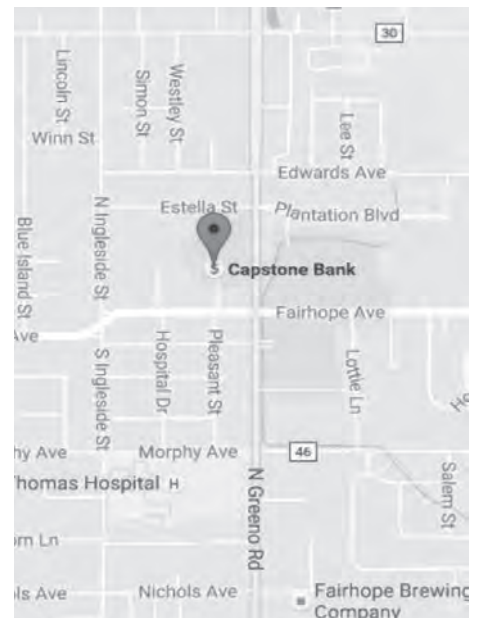

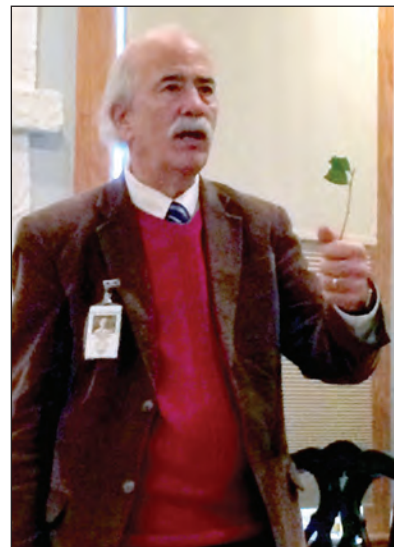


