# Gulf Shores provides assistance to zoo

The Gulf Shores City Council approved a measure which would help the Alabama Gulf Coast Zoo secure funding to move to a larger facility. At the December 21, 2017 special called meeting the council conducted the first public hearing on considering the appropriation of a one-time grant of \$1,000,000 to

the Zoo Foundation. The grant would help secure \$26,260,000 in tax-exempt financing for the purpose of relocating the Alabama Gulf Shores Zoo from its present location and expanding and constructing a new zoo facility on a 25-acre property off of County Road 6 East in Gulf Shores. The \$1,000,000 is proposed to be transferred at the conclusion of their construction to be set aside and utilized as part of its operating

reserves when the zoo construction is completed in 2020. This is a condition of the approval of the bond issuance scheduled in February 2018.

City administrator Steve Griffin said since the last meeting, the measure had been slightly modified to help the timing to close on the loan.

"There were some specifics that we wanted to articulate in the agreement," Griffin said.

"They are as follows: that the zoo be within the City of Gulf Shores, that construction be started within six months and completed within 24 months, that finished construction would be evident by the City's issuance of a certificate of occupancy, that the zoo will provide certificate that it will not ask the City for any more money until at least

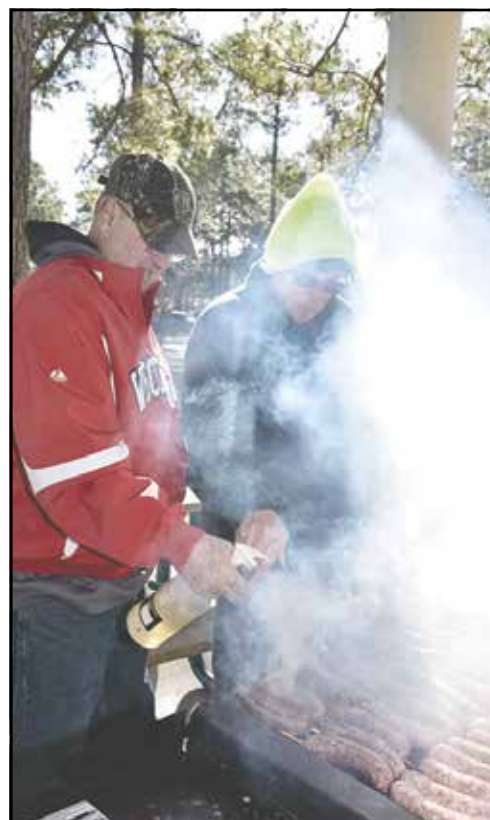

# Severe weather preparedness sales tax holiday begins Feb. 23

From Friday, Feb. 23, to Sunday, Feb. 25, Alabama will observe its seventh annual severe weather preparedness sales tax holiday. The Alabama Retail Association encourages Alabamians to restock emergency supplies in homes, workplaces and vehicles during this three-day tax holiday. Certain emergency preparedness items will be exempt from

the state's 4-percent state sales tax, and in some cities and counties, local taxes are waived on those items as well. It means shoppers can save as much as 10 percent on these items in some areas of the state. Last year, more than 220 city and county governments opted to waive their local taxes as well.

From 12:01 a.m. Feb. 23 to midnight Feb. 25, the tax-exempt items include the following priced at

\$60 or less: - Flashlights, lanterns - Battery-powered or hand-crank radio - Batteries - First-aid kits - Cell phone charger - Two-way radios - Manual can openers - Tarps and plastic sheeting - Duct tape - Fire extinguishers - Tie-down kits, bungee cords or rope

Other tax-free items include: Coolers, ice packs, plywood, window film and smoke/fire/carbon monoxide detectors. Portable generators and power

cords costing \$1,000 or less are also tax free. For a full list of tax-free items, go to [alabamaretail.org/alabamasalestaxholidays](http://alabamaretail.org/alabamasalestaxholidays).

Alabama's tax holiday is the earliest among the four states with a severe weather preparedness sales tax holiday. The Texas tax holiday is in April, Louisiana's is in May and Virginia's is in August.

"Severe weather can occur at any time, in any

season," said Alabama Retail President Rick Brown. "The tax holiday helps Alabama consumers remember to stock and prepare emergency kits to be ready when storms strike."

Dan Moran, the owner of Rocky Ridge Hardware in Vestavia Hills, hopes his customers will take advantage of the opportunity to prepare early.

"When bad weather hits or is about to hit, that's when the flashlights go,

the batteries, the candles, the tarps," he said. "We're letting customers know what is included and not included in the tax holiday."

Alabama Retail recommends having enough supplies in emergency kits to last 72 hours following a disaster. For information on what items to include in emergency kits, as well as steps to take before and after disasters, visit [ready.gov](http://ready.gov).

the bonds are paid for, the other parties will recognize that the city has no other liabilities or obligations for money and finally that once the resolution is adopted the City will be required to make the transfer within the 2020 fiscal year."

The existing Gulf Shores Zoo began its operation in 1989. It is located on seven upland acres surrounded

by wetland areas and vulnerable to storm surge. In 2006, a 25-acre site in North Gulf Shores off of County Road 8 East was donated to the Zoo Foundation for the purpose of a new zoo location. The benefits of the new zoo location as described by the foundation include:

- Relocating the animals away from tropical storm danger and providing enhanced animal habitats.
- Expansion opportunities that will enable

the Zoo to be a more regional attraction. I would consider the Zoo to be one of the many attractions in Gulf Shores that serves to promote the Gulf Shores area as a family orientated destination.

The \$26,260,000 bond issue's purpose is threefold including:

- Refinancing existing zoo debt
- Purchasing an adjacent 69 acre property for future expansion oppor-

tunities

- Financing construction of the new expanded zoo estimated to cost \$16.5 million

The construction of the Zoo will be managed by Terry P Christmas and Associates. The Zoo's two main construction contractors include:

- Stuart Construction for vertical construction of buildings and the restaurant
- Blade Construction for

site work and hardscape

Also approved at the meeting was a request for council approval to apply for a grant through the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG).

Beginning with the 2019 budget, the city's Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) started the critical replacement process for self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) units. There are 65 units that

need replacing. The total projected cost of \$450,000 is to be spread out over three years reducing budget impact to \$150,000 per year.

This year, the AFG grant has placed a high priority on SCBA acquisitions and replacement. Due to the size of its population, Gulf Shores would fund 5 percent, and FEMA would fund the remaining 95 percent. The city's out-of-pocket portion if awarded is \$21,428.57.

The City also awarded the bid for a 12-passenger handicap accessible van to Alliance Bus Group in an amount not to exceed \$49,144. A similar bid, but for a 15-passenger van not handicap accessible, was awarded to Transportation South in an amount not to exceed \$39,992.

A big infrastructure improvement for the city was also approved with ALDOT reimbursing 100 percent of the costs.

The ALDOT funding agreement would be for up to \$300,000 for construction and CE&I for widening Hwy 59 to lengthen the existing Watterville left-turn lane from 35 feet to 225 feet. Public Works Director Mark Acreman said the anticipated construction time would be 45 days, with the goal being to implement work at night to minimize traffic impacts. If the work is unable to be finished by May 1, then work would not be done until after Labor Day. The City would potentially accept a bid from Volkert Associates to provide permitting, bidding preparation and CE&I as required by ALDOT.

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## Want to Go?

In my early days of ministry, I found myself attempting to teach a Bible study on Luke 9:23 where Jesus says, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself, take up his cross daily, and follow me." I was fumbling through my points, trying and failing to communicate the magnitude of the grace and truth of the passage. Finally, desiring to rescue me from myself, one man, who had found hope and peace in Jesus through our church's recovery ministry after a long bout with alcoholism, raised a gnarled hand and said, "Preacher, I guess what your trying to say is, 'Everybody wants to follow Jesus until they find out where he's going.'" Exactly. At a critical moment in his ministry, just as the disciples are becoming convinced that he really is the Messiah, Jesus turns their expectations (and ours) upside down. He needs them to know that following him is not the path to worldly riches, power, or comfort. Following him means sacrifice and suffering as integral features of his Way. When Jesus speaks of cross-bearing, he's not talking about stoic forbearance in the face life's challenges. He's saying, "Prepare to die."

And the death he speaks of is no quiet slipping away after a life of ease, but the brutal, shameful death of the condemned criminal, even though he is innocent. Following Jesus sounds wonderful when we think it will lead us to a nice life with few problems. But that's not where Jesus is going. Ever. He is always going to the places where sin is most serious, where evil abounds. He doesn't go there with muscles bulging to triumph by brute and destructive strength. He goes to die, absorbing the blow of failure, sin, and death for us. And then he calls us to join him there. Will you follow?

So many lamentations over that frozen, brown, stiff display that used to be lovely, lush green floweringingers--and the butterfly garden, well, that will be a definite do-over. This column is for the timid, would-be gardener, thinking about putting toe to shovel for the first time, if he just could get the nerve up.

Most of us know that gardening is not just an activity indulged in only by elderly ladies wearing flowery gloves. The spirit of gardening is an ever deepening connection with nature that can transport all of us as adventurers and students who encounter lessons great and small. The con-

nection to the garden is that space in which a genuine healing relationship between person and place can form. For that gardener seeking the Zen of gardening, a sense of place and purpose will become clear.

Over the years, I have had the pleasure of interviewing dozens of gardeners and have found that the call of shovel and soil beckons folks to grow and nurture plants for many different reasons. Gardening actually helps some relax. Such routine and down-to-earth chores as digging in the soil, pulling weeds or dividing irises gives others a second burst of energy.

Some people are drawn into gardening because they fall in love with a particular plant or flower, such as African violets, orchids, roses or daylilies. They are driven to learn as much as they can and devote themselves to growing prize specimens.

Often, friends, neighbors and family members turn others on to gardening. Many a gardener today has precious childhood memories of spend-

ing hours with cherished grandparents who taught them, by example, to love gardening as they planted and harvested those first carrots or radishes. These sweet memories provide a tender answer to the question of why take up gardening. Memories can be strong motivators. Helping to pick an aunt's gorgeous tomatoes before a delicious lunch brings a reminiscent smile. Fuzzy remembrances of grandma's moon vine which opened after dark on sultry, long ago summer evenings, can strongly appeal to the child in us to take up the cause. Gardening is timeless. It is a strong and deep connection to the past and provides reaches into the future, which may outlast us.

One of my own favorite childhood memories consists of running around and through my father's garden patch until way past dark, chasing lightning bugs and looking for toads. Sadly, it seems that some of today's children spend much time indoors on video games or watching television. It has been verified that a lack of contact with nature can negatively affect children's health, well-being



and, even, academic performance. Nature deficit disorder is real and when parents take the time to unplug their children's, and their own, electronic gadgets, and involve the whole family in gardening, everyone benefits.

Some successful in the business world, who grew up on the farm and couldn't wait to leave the endless chores behind, often find that, upon retiring, they end up happily planting and maintaining huge vegetable gardens. The memory remains, takes root and can remain dormant for decades until life's seasons again put us back in touch with those precious roots we knew as children.

Others have a strong sense of community pride and wish to beautify their neighborhoods and com-

mon areas. Gardening does build community. It seems sometimes that few people even know their neighbors anymore. But, when time is spent outside in the yard, neighbors can form deep connections while chatting about compost and plants over the garden fence.

And, of course, on the practical side, a number of gardeners have shared that their hobby provides a wonderful feeling of satisfaction as they help to create beauty in an empty pot where there was none before. A summer's worth of chemical free vegetables to share with family and friends is no small thing, either. Almost everyone knows that fresh fruit and vegetables picked from your own back yard simply taste better. A vegetable garden

can provide fresh and great tasting produce for a pittance of grocery store prices. Fresh grown vegetables are actually 50 percent higher in nutrients than their long-traveled Californian or Mexican cousins.

Growing a sunflower from seed or erecting a bean teepee in the backyard helps kids and adults broaden awareness of the world around us. From interaction of water, the sun, butterflies and bees, we all learn to appreciate the way nature works, as well as honing knowledge of biology and nutrition.

For the health conscious, gardening most definitely provides healthy ways for everyone to stay active. Between digging, raking and planting, gains

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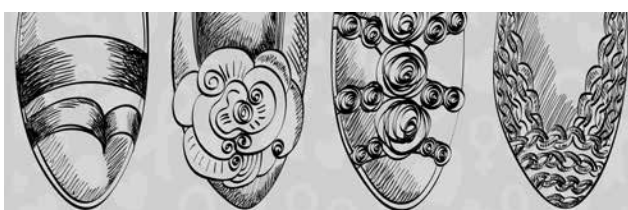

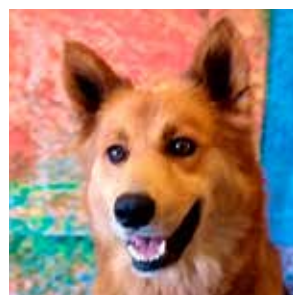

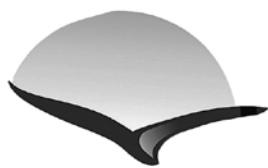

## Super Bowl LII: Eagles top Patriots, Foles named MVP

Throughout the NFL postseason, the Philadelphia Eagles were underdogs in every game they played, and they embraced that role. Now the Eagles are Super Bowl LII champs after defeating the heavily favored New England Patriots with a thrilling 41-33 score. Many didn't believe the high efficiencies of the Eagles defense was enough to defeat the 2017-18 NFL MVP in the Patriots' Tom Brady. They also didn't believe that backup Eagles Nick Foles would return to his 2013 prime, where

he was the league's leader in passing yards.

Philadelphia needed Foles to become the quarterback that would put them in consistent scoring drives. Foles went above and beyond by spreading the ball around, waiting patiently in the pocket by trusting his offensive line, and keeping the ball out of the Patriots hands. From start to finish, the Eagles could not be stopped from driving the ball down the field and creating points.

The New England defense was one of the top

defenses in the league in the red zone, but they were 29th in total yards allowed per game (366 yards). The three touchdown plays over 20 yards were a 22-yard pass from Foles to rookie Corey Clement, a 34-yard pass from Foles to Alshon Jeffrey, and a 21-yard run by LeGarrette Blount (a former Patriot). The Eagles were too explosive for the Patriots' defense that was ranked fifth in the league in points allowed per game (18.5).

The other Eagles' touchdowns did come from the red zone where the Eagles just simply outmatched New England. Those trick plays (a 1-yard pass from

Trey Burton to Foles) and an 11-yard pass from Foles to Zach Ertz to take the lead back 38-33 with 2:21 left in the game.

New England outgained the Eagles in total yards (613 to 538), passing yards (505 to 374), and first downs (29 to 25). Tom Brady played at an incredible level by accounting for 505 yards on 28 completions (out of 48), three touchdowns, and accounted for an 83.8 QBR and 115.4 passing rating. He had a great game efficiently passing the ball creating isolation and big plays by reading the Eagles' defense and their weaknesses in matchups.

The Eagles' defense

shut down the Patriots running game with only 113 rushing yards and did a great job of holding Rob Gronkowski to only one reception in the first half. New England's offensive line did an outstanding job on the Eagles' defensive front. Philadelphia accounted for no tackles for loss and only one sack but that sack by Brandon Graham caused a fumble for Brady recovered by Eagles rookie Derek Barnett in Patriots' territory with 2:09 left in the game. That was the only sack in the entire game for both teams.

The Eagles rushing game accounted for 164 rushing yards and aver-

aged 6.1 yards per rush. The Eagles offense was more efficient in winning matchups in receivers routes, opening running room by the O-Line, and efficiently passing the ball. Foles had 373 passing yards on 28 completions (out of 43 attempts), averaged 8.7 yards per pass, accounted for three touchdowns, caught one interception (on a tipped ball), a QBR of 88.6, and a passer rating of 106.1 rating. Foles was voted the Super Bowl MVP and Eagles are looking to build their franchise with more Super Bowl titles after winning their first last Sunday.

## Opportunities in coaching and sports growing

DAPHNE — As we look back on an amazing college football season that saw the College Football Playoff rankings change time and time again, one memory of the year includes seeing coaches and staffs feverishly working the sidelines and booths to pull off that next big win.

The season saw a lot of discussion about the

addition of new and specialized professionals to the coaching and support teams throughout college football, including the use of "analysts," highly specialized position and skills coaches, expanded support staffs and other related positions.

Whatever one's personal stand might be on the trend of football and other college sports becoming more prominent, more complex and more thor-

oughly staffed, one thing is true — coaching and specialized sports related professions are a growth industry.

The growth of sports and increased competition for high quality, well trained sports professionals are driving a greater demand for people with coaching and related specialized skills, creating greater opportunity in both the numbers of positions and the salaries

## After Mazda-Toyota, state looks to patch up incentives potholes

In the wake of the massive 4,000-job Mazda-Toyota project announcement and with state unemployment at record lows, Alabama is experiencing historic economic momentum. Yet, looking ahead, state leaders are concerned that legal potholes could threaten Alabama's ability to compete for the next big jobs opportunity down the road.

One pothole to fix: an interpretation of the state's ethics code that might force project site selectors and local chamber of commerce officials

to register as lobbyists before they can approach the state about a potential project. The 2010 overhaul of Alabama's ethics code required for the first time those seeking to do business with the Executive Branch to register as lobbyists with the Ethics Commission. Before, those lobbying the governor or cabinet officials for prison, Medicaid, mental health, or other executive contracts were not required to register like those seeking to influence state lawmakers. It was a gaping loophole and lawmakers were right to close it. However, though it was never

intended to be, that law is now being interpreted by some to apply to any project site selector or local chamber of commerce director who wants to approach the state about a potential economic development project.

Why is that a problem? Major economic development projects like Mazda-Toyota are highly secretive in their early stages. Site selection consultants might provide state and local officials an industry sector or potential number of jobs, but never reveal the name of the company. These are decisions that affect global

stock markets, to say nothing of other people's jobs, and word getting out prematurely is more than enough to spook away a project.

So, imagine the site selector for Mazda-Toyota being told that, before having a conversation with the Department of Commerce about the project, they would first need to register as a lobbyist with the Ethics Commission and disclose their client or principal.

Congratulations, North Carolina, and you're welcome for the 4,000 jobs.

That unfortunate situation is one that state lead-

ers are trying to avoid.

The Alabama Ethics Commission recently voted to allow the legislature time to clarify the law rather than issue an advisory opinion with potentially damaging effects on job recruitment efforts.

HB-317, the Alabama Jobs Enhancement Act, sponsored by Rep. Ken Johnson (R-Moulton), is intended to clean up this and other problems in the state's incentives and reporting statutes. The bill would clarify that legitimate economic development activity – defined as seeking legally-authorized incentives for a specific

project – does not qualify as lobbying.

Secretary of Commerce Greg Canfield recently made his case for the bill in a letter to lawmakers saying lawyers in competitor states are starting to use the legal confusion against Alabama.

"Simply put, certain site consultants may choose to disqualify Alabama because of their concerns with the law. Additionally, inaction could subject your local economic developers and Chamber of Commerce employees to unnecessary legal liability

## Is 2018 the year of Alabama women?

This political year of 2018 may very well be the year of the woman in Alabama politics. In Alabama's 200 year history, only one woman has been elected governor. Lurleen Wallace won in 1966. Only two women have served as governor, Governor Lurleen and our current governor, Kay Ivey. It may be a historic year.

Sue Bell Cobb, the former Alabama State Supreme Court Chief Justice, and the first woman to hold that position, is hoping to be able to be the Democratic standard-bearer. She was elected Chief Justice in 2006, in a very expensive, high profiled battle with Republican Drayton Nabors. She had been a District Court Judge in her native Conecuh County for a long time before running statewide. She was elected to a six year term as Chief Justice in 2006, but quit after four years, inexplicably.

Cobb, 61, is predicting that it will be an all female gubernatorial showdown. She believes that she will be the Democratic nominee and that Governor Kay Ivey will carry the Republican banner into battle. She says, "That's never happened and my prediction is that is what it will exactly be."

However, first things first. Judge Cobb has to win the Democratic nomination. She is not the favorite in that primary. Tuscaloosa mayor, Walt Maddox, is the early favorite to win the Democratic nomination.

Most political insiders suggest that Maddox is expected to get the overwhelming support of African American voters. The black vote makes up the bulk and majority of Democratic Primary voters in the state. This is no longer a monolithic vote. However, it tends to gravitate to one candidate in a primary. The few white voters who participate in the Democratic primary are young and they can more readily identify with Maddox who is 45.

In addition, there is some disillusionment among Democratic voters that Cobb quit her term midway as Chief Justice and allowed Republican Governor Robert Bentley to appoint a replacement. He, of course, appointed a Republican. She was the only Democrat on the Supreme Court. Roy Moore won the seat of Chief Justice in 2012.

Other Democratic partisans were dismayed that Cobb said she supported Donald Trump's selection of Jeff Sessions for Attorney General. It may be perceived that her day has passed.

Kay Ivey appeared to be headed for

the house and her day may have passed when out of the blue Bentley resigns and she is plucked out of the obscurity of the Lt. Governor's office and thrust into the governorship. She seems like a grandmother who sticks to her knitting and steadies the Ship of State, which

has gone through stormy waters the past four years. Kay Ivey may indeed make it to the dance as the Republican nominee in November. She is in the catbird's seat and favored to win the GOP Primary.

However, she created a couple of stumbling blocks during the 2017 Senate election year that may thwart her reelection.

Some GOP establishment stalwarts say that her changing the Senate election from 2018 to 2017 threw Luther Strange, their candidate, under the bus and gave the nomination to Roy Moore, which led to losing the seat to a Democrat. Her move also cost the state's beleaguered General Fund \$10 to \$15 million. Some suburban women became disenchanted with her with she said she had no reason to not believe the women who accused Roy Moore of assaulting them as teenagers, yet she was still going to vote for him because he was a Republican. These two actions are only political stumbling blocks, not roadblocks.

Therefore, what I see as a possibility is not an all female race for governor, but a possible triumvirate of females being sworn into the top three constitutional offices next January. You could see Kay Ivey sworn into the Governor's office, Twinkle Cavanaugh sworn in as Lt. Governor, and Alice Martin sworn in as Attorney General. All three are Republicans.

The Republican nominee goes into the general election with a 60/40 probability of winning. Currently, Kay Ivey is the favorite in the governor's race. Twinkle is the favorite in the Lt. Governor's race. Alice Martin or Troy King is favored in the Attorney General's race.

If you made me bet right now, I would bet that Alabama would at least have a governor and Lt. Governor that are women. That may be the story of the year in Alabama politics in 2018.

## Live from South Korea, it's the 2018 Winter Olympic Games!

Get ready for more than 2,400 hours of skiing, skating, bobsledding, curling, luge and more as NBC and its partner networks broadcast the games of the 2018 Winter Olympics from PyeongChang, South Korea.

Beginning Thursday, Feb. 8-25 on NBC, NBC Sports Network, CNBC, USA Network, NBCOlympics.com and the NBC Sports app, these games will see nearly 3,000 athletes from 88 nations (plus the Russian federation) competing in seven sports for 102 medals, among them Lindsey Vonn, Shaun White, Kelly Clark, Mikaela Shiffrin, Nathan Chen and Chloe Kim. There will be four new events at these games — big air snowboarding, freestyle skiing, mass start speed skating and mixed doubles curling — and viewers across the nation will get to see prime-time and late-night competition live at the same time thanks to South Korea being 14 hours ahead of New York and 17 ahead of Los Angeles.

"There's no spoiler alert with a call from your aunt on the East Coast if you live in California, that, 'Hey, did you see this person or that person win a medal?'" points out Mike Tirico, who succeeds Bob Costas as NBC's Olympics studio host with these games. "And they have to wait to see it three hours. They'll see it all as it's happening, it'll be on live across the country in the evening and then a little bit later on late night on the East Coast, which is prime time on the West Coast. So I think that's going to be the major difference in the coverage of these games from Asia."

There will be a few glaring absences in PyeongChang, probably the most significant being Russia, which was banned from these games because of a doping scandal. Any athletes competing from that country will do so under the aegis "Olympic Athlete from Russia" or O.A.R., which should make the medal ceremonies interesting.

Also missing in men's ice hockey are the players from the NHL, which has opted not to pause its 2017-18 season for

the games, thus ending a run of five consecutive Olympics.

"Well certainly that was a terrific competition over the last few Olympic games and not having the National Hockey League players will certainly impact that ...," Tirico says. "I think we'll see perhaps a return to that magical 1980 feel if the U.S. team can become one that makes a run in the tournament, because we'll have a lot of college players involved, which is the real essence of that 'Miracle on Ice' team. So maybe there'll be some new names and some amateurs to root for, as opposed to what we've become used to of late with the professionals."

As for the host city itself, Tirico has been there, toured some of the 13 venues and came away impressed with the city's preparations. He expects PyeongChang to put on a world class show for the opening ceremonies on Feb. 9 and for all 18 days.

"Everything from what we saw when I was there," he says, "they are ready to go and excited to be welcoming the world there."

in their efforts to bring jobs to your communities,” Canfield wrote.

Some have raised concerns that the bill would open the door to abuse from lobbyists or public officials themselves trying to skirt state ethics requirements using economic development as a cover. Alabama has earned a notorious reputation for high-profile public corruption cases over the last several years, and lawmakers are right to be concerned

about anything that would exasperate those problems.

That's why the bill's authors included a provision making the definition of bona fide economic development activity contingent on seeking specific state-authorized incentives for a specific project registered with the Department of Commerce. Also, the state's existing prohibition against public officials lobbying or otherwise attempting to influence a government body on behalf of a paying client remains unchanged.

In other words, claim-

ing the theoretical use of economic development as a get-out-of-jail-free card wouldn't work for lobbyists or public officials.

While the ethics connection generates a lot of discussion, Johnson said his bill is mostly geared toward fixing the transparency requirements in the law.

Current Alabama law requires cities, counties or local development authorities to notify the Alabama Department of Commerce about the use of economic incentives – but only for incentives that no longer exist. HB-317 would update

the law to require the same reporting for newer incentives authorized in the Alabama Jobs Act of 2015.

The bill also requires those seeking tax abatements to notify the Department of Commerce, something current law does not require. And, the Department itself would be required to publish economic incentive information two years after a project has announced, whereas it can now withhold that information as long as it wants.

“What good is a reporting requirement if it doesn't apply to the

incentives we are using?” Johnson asked rhetorically. “Why wouldn't we require the same reporting requirements of tax abatements that we do of other incentives?” Good questions.

In today's world, states and local governments needing to offer economic incentives to lure companies is an unfortunate fact of life. Though the state can't do much about the competitive nature of project incentives, they can do more to make the process transparent and accountable. And the legislature can certainly make sure

unintentional interpretations of Alabama law don't put our state at an automatic disadvantage.

Johnson's bill has passed through committee and is expected to be considered by the House of Representatives as soon as this week.

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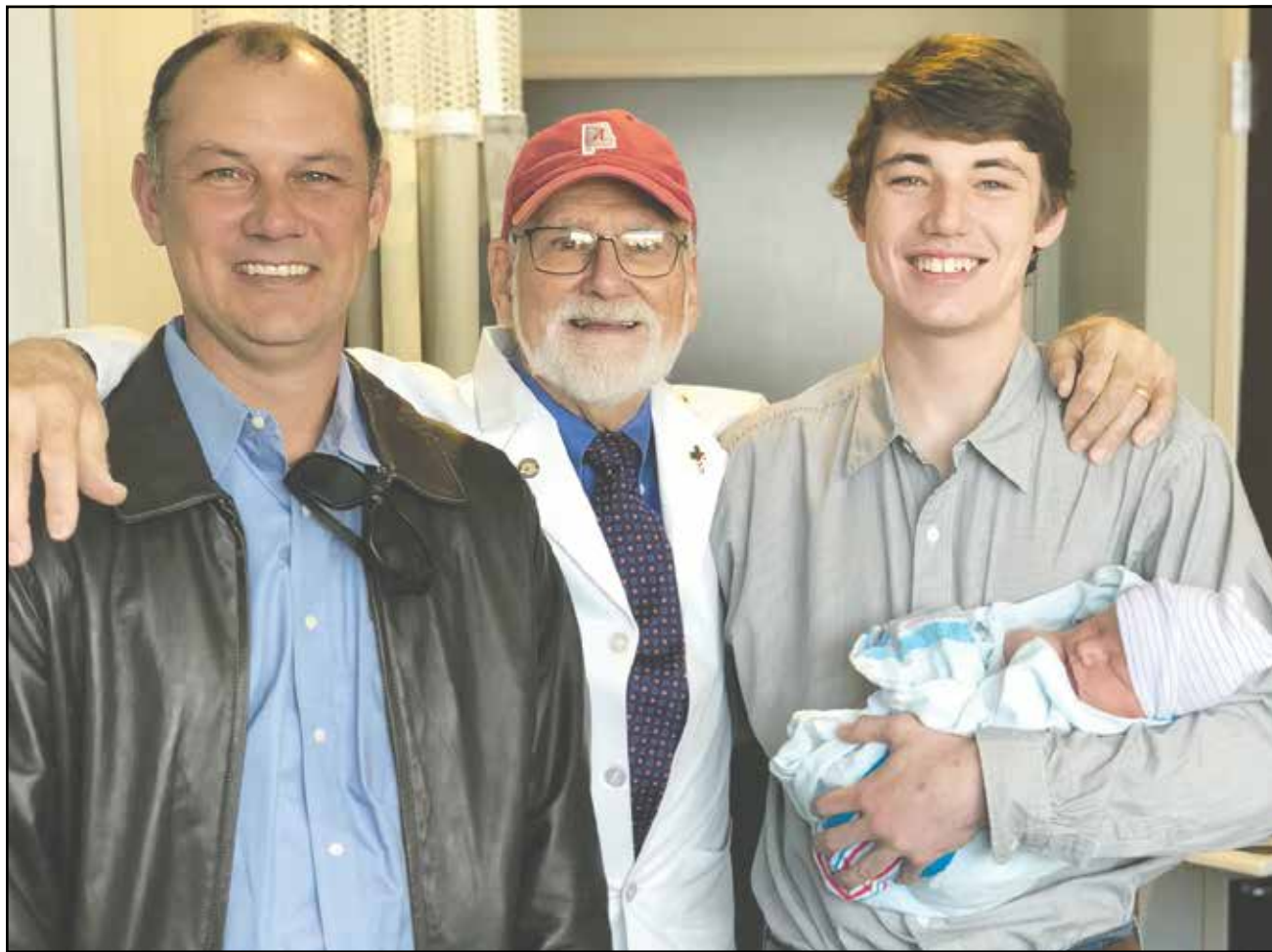

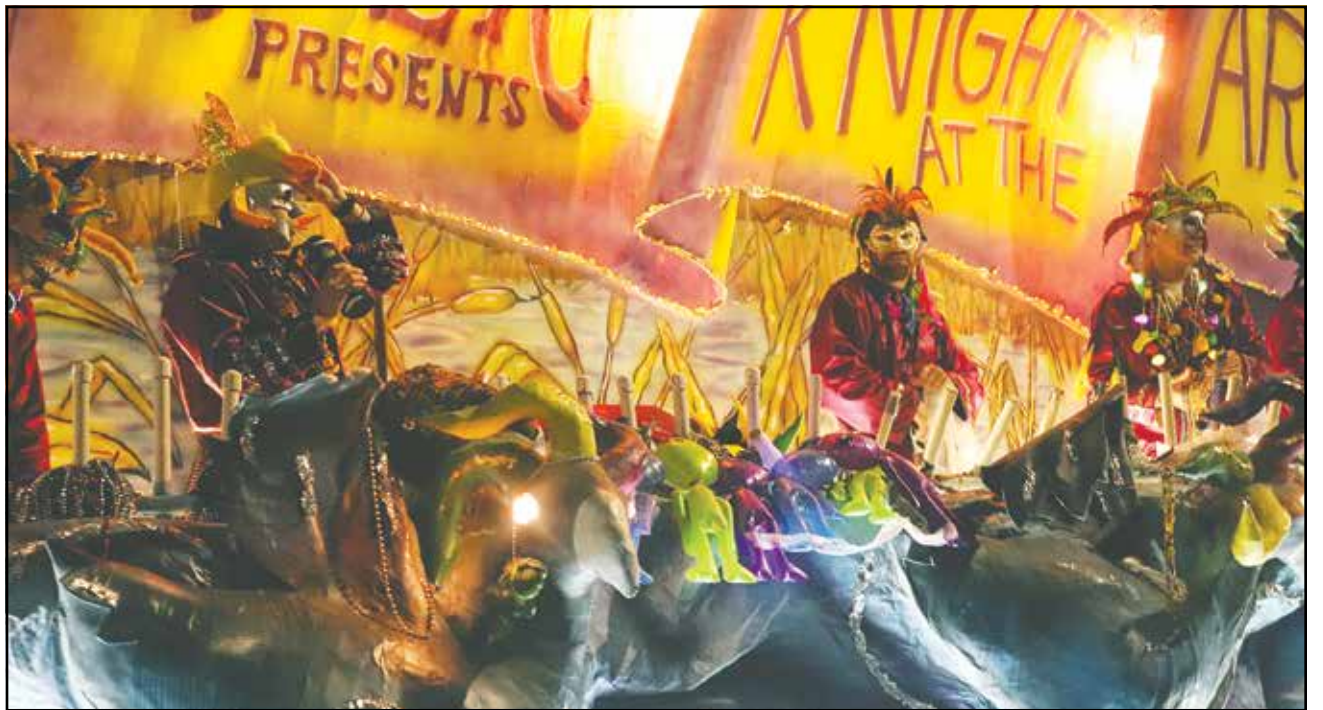

NOLF Barin is located 40 miles southwest of Mobile, Alabama, in Baldwin County.

Site UXO 3 consists of a 1,200 cubic yard soil pile that was generated during construction of a storm water pond in September 2014 as part of a runway expansion effort. The soil came from excavation of a previously unknown 5-foot square munitions disposal pit at the site. Discarded munitions were removed by DON as part of a previous Time Critical Removal Action. Contaminants and potential explosive hazards still exist in the soil pile that may present risks to human health and the environment.

The EE/CA proposes a NTCRA at Site UXO 3 to address Munitions and Explosives of Concern (MEC) and associated Material Potentially Presenting an Explosive Hazard (MPPEH) and Munitions Constituents (MC), if present within the site boundary.

The EE/CA describes the removal action objectives and evaluates three alternatives: 1) no action; 2) land use controls designed to prevent exposure; and 3) MEC/MPPEH removal and treatment, soil removal and disposal, and site restoration, as necessary. The EE/CA recommends the MEC and soil removal action alternative.

communities."

In December, Byrne sent a letter to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) and the National marine Fisheries Service urging their support of the exempted fishing permit pilot program for Red Snapper. The Gulf States, including Alabama, have submitted proposals for an alternative style of red

snapper management for private and state charter vessel anglers during 2018 and 2019. If approved by NOAA Fisheries, each state would have the ability to establish fishing season start and end dates in federal waters off their respective state's coast.

Under the proposals, each state has requested a portion of the total allowable catch for private recreational anglers in the Gulf and they would each be responsible for monitoring landings so they do not exceed their portion. Alabama will use Snapper Check to monitor its landings and determine if

1) the season will close as anticipated; 2) the season

will close earlier than anticipated due to daily landings exceeding forecasted totals; or 3) the original season length should be increased if daily landings do not meet anticipated levels (i.e. due to smaller fish size or inclement weather). Alabama's proposal has state and federal waters opening for weekends only (Friday-Sunday) from June 1 through Sept. 3 (Labor Day). The season would also include the entire week of Independence Day, June 30- July 8.

These specific proposals are referred to as Exempted Fishing Permits. They will be reviewed by NOAA Fisheries and state

representatives today during the Gulf of Mexico Fishery Management Council meeting in New Orleans.

The proposals are available for review in the following URL ([gulfcouncil.org/meetings/council/january-council-meeting-2018](http://gulfcouncil.org/meetings/council/january-council-meeting-2018)) and comments can be submitted via the link provided under the Wednesday portion of the agenda.

The season for anglers planning on fishing from a federally-permitted charter vessel this year will begin June 1 and end sometime in late July. The season will be announced by NOAA Fisheries in the coming months.

"I also want to thank Senator Richard Shelby, Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources Commissioner Chris Blankenship, and our other Gulf Coast colleagues for working together to ensure our fishermen and coastal communities have a full and adequate Red Snapper season," Byrne said.

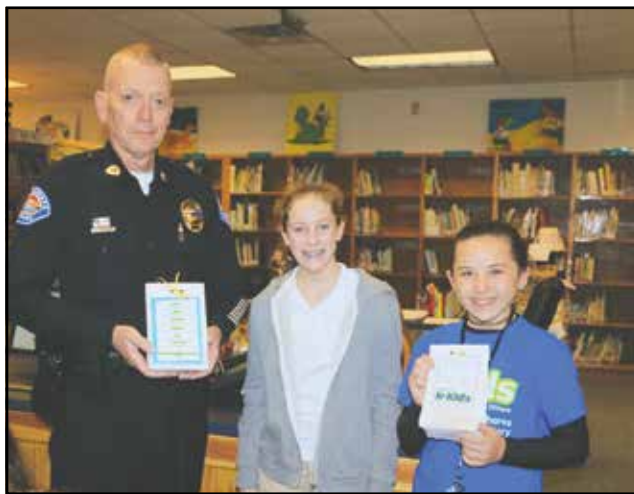
