Foley Planning Commission approves Peachtree rezoning

FOLEY — After confusion in the vote during the October planning commission, Foley commissioners voted in what some citizens considered a controversial motion to approve the request to rezone approximately 24 acres on East Peachtree Avenue from R-1A to R-1B.

“I just want to say that I understand, I know people out there may be frustrated,” said council representative Ralph Hellmich. “And yes, traffic does concern us, the city is constantly working on traffic, improving bike trails, things of that nature, we try to stay ahead of it ... I think our city does take very seriously the growth. We are having growth in the city, and I think our job is to try to manage it.”

At the end of the October meeting, the commissioners realized there had been confusion in the votes, where the voice vote did not match up with the roll call vote. One way the vote was approved, while the other way it was denied. Upon leaving the October meeting, the public believed the rezoning

Elberta grants sick leave to police chief

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Last week, the Elberta Town Council voted unanimously to extend six weeks of sick leave to Elberta Police Chief Stan DeVane as he recovers from injury.

DeVane was injured in a horseback riding accident in July while on vacation, but since then has suffered as bacterial infection that affects his spine and has paralyzed him.

The decision activated DeVane’s six weeks of accrued sick

leave, which extends until January 2018 and gives DeVane an opportunity to return to the office.

While the council vote was unanimous to extend the leave, some town residents questioned the decision during public comments.

Former Elberta Town Clerk Sandy Germany questioned the entire process of how DeVane’s leave had been handled from the get-go.

“He has been gone since July and as a salaried employee, he does not earn any extra hours,”

Germany said. “His vacation and sick leave should already be done. How for four months has he been paid a salary?”

Elberta Mayor Jim Hamby said DeVane is the town’s only salary worker and that DeVane had been participating in departmental decisions even though he was not physically present.

“He’s participated in the budgeting process, hiring and firing of employees and a whole lot of other things we’ve needed,” Hamby said. “Everything he’s

done for the department has been through conversations, phone calls or visits with members of the department or myself.”

Hamby said if DeVane was unable to return after the six week period was over, he could place DeVane on unpaid leave and hold the position open for a year, a move Hamby said was first done for Germany years ago.

Germany said she was worried a precedent was being set

Robertsdale Council approves rezoning

ROBERTSDALE — The Robertsdale City Council paved the way for a local resident to open a dog kennel by rezoning property from residential to agriculture at its meeting Monday, Nov. 20.

Owner Peter Nesbitt told city council members that he purchased the property, located off of County Road 52 in Robertsdale's planning jurisdiction, in April.

The home with a small barn located on the property was built in the 1960s, Nesbitt said, and remodeled just before he purchased the property.

His plan is to remove the barn and replace it with another structure, which would be used to house 14 to 20 dogs for use as a kennel, he said.

Robertsdale city engineer Greg Smith said all of the surrounding prop-

erty is currently zoned agricultural and there were no objections voiced during a public hearing held during the Monday morning meeting.

The council voted unanimously to approve the rezoning request, adopting Ordinance No. 006-17 after voting unanimously to suspend the rules for immediate passage. Council member Ruthie Campbell was not present at the meeting.

In other business Nov. 20, the council approved a 5K and 10K benefit request from Julie Waters to be held in February.

Police Chief Brad Kendrick said the 5K run would use an existing route along Silverhill Avenue with a turnaround at Central Christian Church and School. The 10K run would extend along Hill Road, turning around at County Road 54, Kendrick said.

The fundraiser would

benefit the Waters family foundation, which assists those who have gone through drug rehabilitation.

"Right now, funds would be used to send recovering addicts to a transitional facility, either in Mobile or Baldwin County," Waters said. "Because there are so few facilities here, our ultimate goal is to eventually open our own transitional facility."

The fundraiser is set for Feb. 10, Waters said, with a rainout date of Feb. 17.

Also on Nov. 20, the council:

- Approved the purchase of a new patrol vehicle for the Robertsdale Police Department.
- Approved a temporary ABC License for the Central Baldwin Chamber of Commerce's Annual Banquet, which will be held Jan. 18 at the Baldwin County Coliseum in Robertsdale.

Heart ... is to foster an environment of goodwill among combat wounded veterans and their families, to promote patriotism, support legislative initiative and most importantly, make sure we never, never forget," Wilson read. "Whereas Baldwin County, Alabama has

a large veteran population and is the home to a number of Purple Heart recipients, and whereas the Town of Summerdale has a great admiration for the men and women who have selflessly served our country and acknowledges our veterans who have paid the highest price of freedom by leaving their families and communities behind and placing their own lives in harm's way

for the good of all."

Along with the proclamation itself, Summerdale also received Purple Heart signs welcoming all who drive into town.

"Mr. Evans brought us some signs, and we're going to have these mounted for when you come into Summerdale," Wilson said. "They say 'Welcome to our Purple Heart Community.' This is to let you guys remember what these men and women went through to give us the freedom we have. Thank you all so much for doing this."

The program for the veterans began with a video in remembrance of Veterans' Day and how it came to be, and also included a slideshow of photos of local veterans. The photos had been given to the town prior to the cele-

bration, and Summerdale welcomes anyone with photos of veterans to drop them off by town hall for next year's celebration.

The musical group Four a Change performed

the National Anthem, and the youth choir from Robertsdale Assembly of God Church put on a performance full of costumes and songs in honor of veterans from each branch.

Afterward, every veteran or active servicemember was given the opportunity to stand and introduce themselves, letting everyone know how they served their country.

The Summerdale Museum and Archives, located at 300 E. Jackson St., also announced a display up now for everyone to see.

"Included in the museum are all the men and women who have served and are from Summerdale and the surrounding areas," said councilmember Norma Giles. "They've duplicated the photos of our veterans, which are on display there."

Currently there are over 150 photos on display in the museum for viewing.

The town hopes everyone will be on the lookout for the new signs proclaiming Summerdale as a Purple Heart Community, and honoring veterans everywhere.

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Silverhill purchases truck for police department

SILVERHILL — Following a lengthy discussion, which took up the entire work session and part of the regular meeting, the Silverhill Town Council voted to purchase a new vehicle for the police department during its regular meeting Monday, Nov. 20.

Police Chief Kevin Brock and members of the Silverhill Police Department fielded several questions from council members about the need for the truck, an F150

Crew Cab 4 x 4 which would be purchased from Stivers Ford Lincoln in Montgomery as part of the state bid contract.

“It’s something that would be nice to have,” Brock said. “If we have a crime scene that is a little off the beaten path that we need to get to, it would certainly make it easier.”

Brock presented a total estimate of \$38,271 for the truck, including the purchase price of \$28,737, an equipment fee of \$8,949 and graphics, with an estimated cost of \$585. The estimate did not include the installation of a cage,

but council members elected to include that with the purchase. Brock said a cage for the vehicle would cost about \$850, plus installation costs.

The town has about \$51,000 in an equipment fund, which could be used to purchase the vehicle, officials said.

Brock also presented a bid estimate on purchasing a 2017 Ford Taurus from the state bid of \$32,615.37, plus the cost of purchasing and installing a cage. Brock asked the council to consider purchasing that vehicle sometime early next year.

Brock also asked the council to consider hiring Scott Poole as a part-time training coordinator and administrative assistant for the police department.

Poole is set to retire from the Federal Bureau of Investigations office in Mobile in December and, Brock said, he is looking to continue working part-time in law enforcement after his retirement.

“This is a rare opportunity,” Brock said. “He is a certified firearms instructor and has all the contacts for us to be able to do most of our training in-house, as well as host

training for other departments.”

Council members expressed concern as to whether or not there was money in the budget to hire Poole. Mayor Tim Wilson asked that the matter be tabled in order to see if something could

be worked out.

Wilson also asked that council members get together with the Silverhill Volunteer Fire Department, again tabling action on passage of the SHVFD Ordinance, which was tabled from the Nov. 6 meeting.

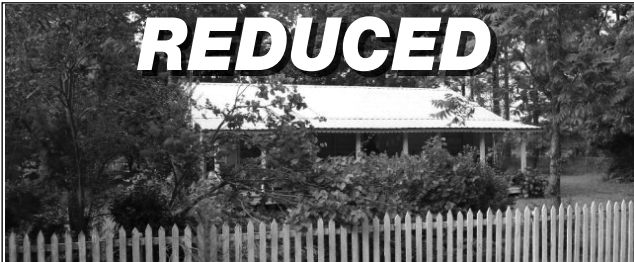

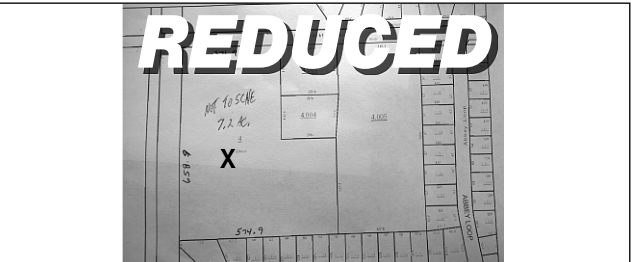

Senate race will depend on who comes out to vote

The big question in the Senate race is will allegations against Roy Moore and his purported propensities forty-years ago cause him to lose. We will soon see. The election is less than three weeks away.

The book on Moore is easy to read. The polls have consistently revealed that 30 percent of voters like him and 70 percent do not like him. He is a polarizing figure and well known

However, the real poll that counts is the one on Election Day. The reason that he won the GOP primary was that his people showed up to vote for him. no following. It is all about Moore. The votes that Jones gets will be the Democratic base coupled with those disenchanted with Moore, who dislike him enough to go vote for a Democrat for a U.S. Senate seat. As George Wallace use to say, “More people vote against someone than for someone.”

My guess is that Moore’s 30 percent is unswayed by the Washington Post revelations. They look upon it as a scurrilous last minute political attack by the Washington establishment and left wing media. Some suggest

BCA’s leadership changes at their annual meeting on Dec. 1. Perry

Hand of Baldwin County will take the reins of the once powerful organization. Hand is a very well regarded gentleman in the private and public sector of Alabama. He is an engineer by profession and a principal in Volkert Engineering. He has been an outstanding businessman, road builder, state senator, and Secretary of State.

Canary has basically made the Business Council a joke among powerful legislators. He is so disliked and disrespected that he is thought of as a clown or caricature. In visiting with the majority of Republican senators, they say he has never even said “hi” to them. He walks the halls occasionally with a haughty, arrogant air and snubs not only all nine of the Democrats in the state senate as well as the 26 Republicans. I could not find one state senator who would say

anything good about the New Yorker. They snicker and say that no bill will pass my committee if he is for it.

State Senator, Slade Blackwell, a respected businessman and staunch Republican from a silk stocking Jefferson County area said Canary actually does the BCA more harm than good. He said the BCA members would be better served to give campaign money directly to candidates than have it tainted by Canary. Blackwell, who also chairs the Senate Banking and Insurance Committee, has only spoken to Canary one time in seven years.

Dr. Paul Bussman, who is very independent and represents Cullman and parts of Northwest Alabama as a Republican state senator, said that Canary threatened him so abrasively over a piece of legislation in his first

term that when he got home he wrote a check for \$26,000, the amount the BCA had given his campaign, and sent it back to Canary with the message to not ever talk with him again.

The well liked, mild mannered, pro-business state senator, Shay Shelnut, said Canary has never spoken to him in his entire five years in the senate. This is the prevalent theme among most Republican members of the senate.

The most important senator, U.S. Senator Richard Shelby, has barred Canary from his office. See you next week.

Saving our sovereignty

While it is difficult to persuade a state that relies on the federal government for 42 percent of its budget that it should begin to unwind some of those funds, there is arguably more for a state to gain than lose by shedding some of its dependence on the federal trough. But even if voluntarily forgoing such assistance is a bridge too far, it is becoming more and more essential for the state to assume greater financial responsibility.

Alabama voters are looking at legislators to do just that.

An overwhelming 79 percent of recently surveyed Republican primary voters considered it important for Alabama to be financially prepared for the likelihood that DC will reduce its funding to the state.

Questions about Washington’s reliability are well founded, given the nation’s own financial and political health. Even the most politically disengaged must pause to fathom the \$20 trillion (and rising) debt amassed by our federal government. What’s more, in an increasingly politicized environment, states have seen federal funds threatened over policy differences with sitting presidents of both parties. Whether unable or unwilling, nothing binds Washington to sustain the support on which states have become accustomed.

But there are other reasons to approach conditional federal grants with caution.

When a state accepts conditional funding, it necessarily relegates itself to the dictates of Washington, selling short both legislators and citizens alike; state lawmakers are unable to influence the policies imposed on their constituents and cannot be held responsible for complications in implementation. Accordingly, citizens must rely on a detached DC bureaucrat to address concerns about policy impacts on their lives and businesses.

Voters resent this “Mother May I?”

approach to lawmaking. Nearly three-quarters of those surveyed trusted the efficiency of state-run programs over federally run programs, while only 34 percent indicated any faith that federal spending in Alabama reflects our state’s values and priorities.

Furthermore, the nature of grants conditioned on DC mandates invites cynicism that develops when governing policy and law is developed by a far-removed legislative body. Only 33 percent of voters polled felt informed about the federal policy “strings” attached to money already accepted by the state.

These obstacles to accountability and transparency — hallmarks of good government — hinder voters’ ability to identify or expound on specific programs and is a pariah to the spirit of the American system, which rests on the consent of the governed.

Making a bad situation worse, federal funds can lead to increased spending in already-strained state budgets, a consequence opposed by 67 percent of respondents surveyed. This can happen directly, such as when grants require matching funds or financing beyond the initial federal investment to maintain or enhance a program. But it can also happen indirectly, either when federal grants encourage states to undertake projects they would not otherwise choose or when state or local taxes are increased to bankroll overextended commitments. Whatever the cause, “free” money can become expensive quickly.

Because spending is often the first solution offered by Washington, conditional grants sometimes involve sympathetic causes, such as disaster relief or, on a smaller scale, safety equipment for law enforcement. Such programs create short-term fanfare for politicians and temporary relief for beneficiaries, but they invite a potential crisis when the money runs

Ecotourism as economic stimulus in Orange Beach

For many years, I have assured people that it is easy to be an expert on Orange Beach because there are really only two answers to any question you could ever be asked about it: "I don't know" and "It depends." While glib, this point is strikingly accurate. The public face of Orange Beach's council system is highly transparent with meetings and work sessions in a public forum. Its inner workings and decision-making processes are shrouded in mystery, wondering about who is really making the decisions, rarely conforming to what any outsider might predict. Perhaps ecotourism's economic value to this community is the galvanizing exception, making it priceless. "Ecotourism is considered the fastest growing market in the tourism industry," according to the World Tourism Organization with an annual growth rate of 5 percent worldwide and representing 6 percent of the world's gross domestic product, 11.4 percent of all consumer spending, bolstering local economies. Behavioral economists combine economics with insights from psychol-

ogy to show how heavily economic decisions like ecotourism are influenced by cognitive biases, according to the Economist Magazine's summary of Richard Thaler's work. He is the winner of this year's Nobel Prize in Economics. According to him our economic decisions are influenced by cognitive biases like ecotourism, influencing our decision to choose vacation cities that are eco-friendly. Environmental tourism began in Orange Beach after the Great Depression of 2008, being an inadvertently disguised format for economic stimulus, injecting government funds into the economy, bolstering the recovery, as John Maynard Keynes espoused. The City wrote grants to build the Backcountry Trail System, continually encouraging investment in offshore fisheries with artificial reefs and scuba diving, having ships demolished as underwater attractions, extending the red-snapper fishing season, using cognitive biases, ensuring vacationers understood we are pro-environment, promoting growth in the local economy. A Beach Ambassador Initiative was started. "Leave Only Footprints," affects all aspects of beach life, erasing tents,

chairs and paraphernalia from the beach at night, presenting a fresh canvas each morning for our visitors to enjoy, creating jobs in the economy. These emissaries had a busy season in 2016: Public Interactions: 51,124; Promotional Items Distributed: 20,439; Glass Warnings Issued: 3322; Tent Warnings Issued: 3285; Tents Tagged: 886; Hole Warnings: 1378; Holes Filled: 2170; Trash Warnings: 485; Trash Bags Distributed: 5689; Law Enforcement (Backup) Requests: 46; Fire/EMS/Rescue Requests: 14; Dog Issues/Encounters: 157; Wildlife Related Incidents: 88; Metal Shovel Warnings: 71, according to a representative from Orange Beach Coastal Resources in an email. Investing in ecotourism as a form of economic stimulus has strengthened economic growth in Orange Beach through active participation by our tourism partners: Alabama Department of Environmental Management, The Citizen and Visitors Bureau, The Orange Beach Chamber-of-Commerce, The Backcountry Trail Foundation, The Islands of Perdido Foundation, The Alabama Coastal Foundation and the Fishing Association, providing sustainable-business examples to build on.

Perhaps economic stimulus was not the root concept of the initial plan, supporting ecotourism from the beach initiative to turtle nesting, but economic stimulus was certainly the end result. The trails network, beach ambassadorship, turtle nesting, trash pickups on the islands, dredging the pass for off-shore-fishing access, increasing the red-snapper season require complex management skills and grant-writing abilities, rewarded when driven from the perspective that infrastructure stimulus creates jobs in the local economy. Businesses profit from ecotourism. Being seen to be caring for and taking care of the environment is behavioral economics, supporting initiatives for Beach Mouse habitat; tag-and-release fishing; rental of bicycles, pontoon boats, and jet skis; or going on Segway tours, is making an environmental statement to our visitors, underlining the council's commitment to Orange Beach's eco-friendly image. Finding the funds for these projects is key; writing grants is not a funding source one can depend on year-in-and-year-out. The City of Orange Beach recently increased the Lodging Tax by 2 percent from 11 percent to 13 percent, generating \$5

Million per year in additional revenue, according to Finance Director Ford Handley. One assumes some of these funds will be allocated to stabilize ecotourism's infrastructure budget. The Backcountry-Trail Tours yielded: 408 tours and 1869 visitors, divided by the number of years since inception is 208 visitors per year. On tour, visitors learn the interdependency between flora and fauna indigenous to the Gulf Coast. This educational approach diversifies the offerings available to visitors in Orange Beach. Turtle nesting is also an important component, watching the beach during the summer months, patrolling at night with teams of volunteers, looking for females coming ashore, burying their eggs in the sand. Volunteers protect the nesting sites with markers, patiently waiting for the hatchlings to surface, escorting them to the sea, ensuring the survival of another generation. Environmental projects like these require funding to continue. The City of Orange Beach has shown no sign of curbing its appetite for allocating resources, presenting a unified face with everyone in step, assuring council remains proud of the city's eco-friendly image.

Some holdouts still exist, citing "disputable findings about climate change", quoting the new Director of the Environmental Protection Agency, Scott Pruitt. "I would not agree that carbon dioxide is a primary contributor to the global warming that we see," he told CNBC's "Squawk Box." President Trump's position on environmental protection "has been consistent," Environmental Defense Fund President Fred Krupp notes in an essay published in the July-August issue of Foreign Affairs, a subscribers-only magazine. "He wants far less of it," according to their blog. Therefore, the constituents of Orange Beach must follow their own compass, because Federal Grants for environmental projects are diminishing. Orange Beach's 5,000 residents are a tiny microcosm in the greater scope of the nation, manning their own tiller, implementing their own style of environmental ethics, riding the wave of ecotourism to stimulate the local economy, gladly pulling together with all-hands-on-deck towards a common-ecological goal, because ecotourism's economic value to this community is priceless.

dry. Once the federal government assumes responsibility for essential services, citizens and states are left dependent on the whims of Washington to meet critical needs.

Of course, Washington's willingness to meet these needs is not based on benevolence; rather, it is driven by a desire to impose a particular agenda simply by dangling an irresistible carrot. But the resources and attention required to avoid the proverbial stick detract from

priorities state legislators and officials might pursue if left to their own devices. Ironically, conditional funding can even lead the state to work against the wishes of its own citizens, as was the case with Race to the Top dollars associated with Common Core. In an era of Washington

overreach, Alabama must begin to challenge the mechanisms that make us beholden to the federal government if constitutional state sovereignty is what we desire. Taking a closer look at conditional federal funding — phasing out existing commitments and more critically evalu-

ating future opportunities, while reevaluating the allocation of our own state funds — is a good place to start.

Southern Eagles team. Coach Jones will coach the Jaguars one final time in South's regular season finale at New Mexico State. The Aggies are 5-6.

Jones has been the head of the South Alabama Jaguars football team since the program started in February 2008. USA

began playing competitively in 2009. In their first two seasons of their program, the Jaguars went 7-0 in 2009 and then 10-0 record in 2010. The Jaguars joined the Sun Belt Conference in the 2012 season where they experienced a typical rough transition of 2-11. Jones then led South to a 6-6 (4-3 in Sun Belt play) record which would give him the title of 2013

Sun Belt Coach of the Year.

In 2014, he led the Jaguars to their first ever bowl game in the 2014 Camellia Bowl in Montgomery. They lost to the Bowling Green Falcons 33-28.

Last season, South Alabama had many firsts. The Jaguars claimed their first-ever win over a power-5 team, the Mississippi State Bulldogs 21-20.

The Jaguars would also account for their first-ever win over a ranked team in the No. 19 San Diego State Aztecs 42-24. South finished 2016 with another bowl appearance in the Arizona Bowl with a 45-21 loss to the Air Force Falcons.

Jones also helped the Jaguars get their first-ever NFL Draft pick selection from the school with Ger-

ald Everett being picked in the second round. Jones could also get another Jaguar, Jeremy Reaves selected in the 2018 NFL Draft.

Despite the loss to Georgia Southern, the Jaguars encountered a good season by giving the Troy Trojans and Arkansas State Red Wolves their only conference losses so far this season.

CBS, and the star herself, celebrate ‘The Carol Burnett Show’s’ 50th anniversary

Fifty years after her classic comedy-variety series debuted, Carol Burnett is still so glad she and viewers had that time together. The entertainment icon returns to the soundstage where she and comrades Vicki Lawrence, Harvey Korman, Tim Conway and Lyle Waggoner did the show in CBS’ two-hour “Carol Burnett 50th Anniversary Special” Sunday, Dec. 3. Lawrence and Waggoner also appear in the program, though Conway was “under the weather” per Burnett at the time of the October taping. The late Korman is recalled by guests including Jay Leno and Bill Hader in a segment devoted to his antics, and many others participate in helping Burnett mark the half-century milestone. Among them: Bernadette Peters (who was the first guest ever booked for the series), Jim Carrey, Kristin Chenoweth, Harry Connick Jr., Martin Short, Jane Lynch, Stephen Colbert and Maya Rudolph. Bob Mackie, who designed count-

less costumes for “The Carol Burnett Show,” also appears. “It was pretty overwhelming,” the ever-friendly, much-honored Burnett says of doing the special. A winner of 20-plus Emmy Awards, “The Carol Burnett Show” ended its run in 1978, and the title star has returned to its studio a number of times since: “We did some specials and the 25th-anniversary reunion show there. Still, every time I go back and get on that stage, I think of all the wonderful memories that I have.” Some of those, naturally, are related to the question-and-answer session Burnett always opened her program with (and which she still does in the in-person show that she tours with). She has another of those openings in the new special, and she reveals of the questions, “Two of them are asked by Tom Selleck and Pat Boone! They were in the audience. And then, a lady asked about my grandmother and my pulling my ear. I didn’t do a lot of those, though, because the show was so chock-full of stuff we had to get to.”

That includes Burnett’s eventual rendering of “I’m So Glad We Had This Time Together” (written by her then-husband, “Carol Burnett Show” executive producer Joe Hamilton), and she notes that someone sings it with her for a special reason. “Harry Connick Jr. was born the day the show premiered — Sept. 11, 1967 — so I said, ‘Will you join me in the theme song?’ And he said, ‘I’ve been waiting 50 years to do this.’ And he flew out (to Los Angeles) to do it. I was so thrilled.” A sitcom pilot Burnett made for ABC (with Amy Poehler as an executive producer) is being redeveloped, but “The Carol Burnett Show” remains present in home-video releases, on YouTube and in repeats re-packaged as “Carol Burnett and Friends” and shown weeknights on Me-TV. “As a result, I’m getting fan mail from 9- and 10-year-olds,” she muses. “They’ll draw me pictures on their lined school paper, and it is so cute! And when I go out and do live shows every so often, I get audience members ranging from 9 to 90. I’ll keep doing those as long as I’m mobile.”

“The Carol Burnett 50th Anniversary Special” airs Sunday on CBS.

Wild Game Cook-Off, WFC preludes to Thanksgiving feasts

Despite Alabama’s woods teeming with deer and deer hunters, many took a Thanksgiving break to acknowledge the bountiful blessings of living in our great state.

Those blessings included food – lots of food – on Thursday through the weekend. The traditional turkey was likely on the table, but many families who love the outdoors enjoyed wild game as well.

For you movie buffs, like Lloyd Bridges’ character in the movie “Airplane,” it looks like I picked the wrong time to try to lose weight.

Actually, I got a huge jump on the Thanksgiving season by being a judge for both the Alabama Wildlife Federation’s (AWF) Gulf Coast Wild Game Cook-Off in Spanish Fort and the World Food Championships in Orange Beach.

First on the calendar was the AWF Cook-Off at the Blue Gill Restaurant on the Causeway, only a few miles from where the Cook-Offs started in 1996 in Mobile. Because of the success of that event, AWF expanded the Cook-Offs across the state with a total of 15 events in the Mobile area, Andalusia,

While the Cook-Offs participants may not have the technical expertise or experience of the chefs competing in the World Food Championships, the wild game preparers spare no expense or effort to win those bragging

rights.

In the 2017 version of the Gulf Coast event, the Mobile County Wildlife Association (MCWA) scored on all three of its dishes and took home the best overall prize, which qualifies the team of Wesley Williams, Tom Leath-erbury, Sonny Kearley and Patrick Kelly for the State Finals.

The best overall dish and top finisher in Wild Game was a dish the MCWA team named Percy Sledge’s Venison Balls. I’m not sure what the dish has to do with the late legendary soul singer from Alabama, but the dish was worthy of the title.

The MCWA team also took third place in the fowl category with a grill-cooked pizza topped with wild game.

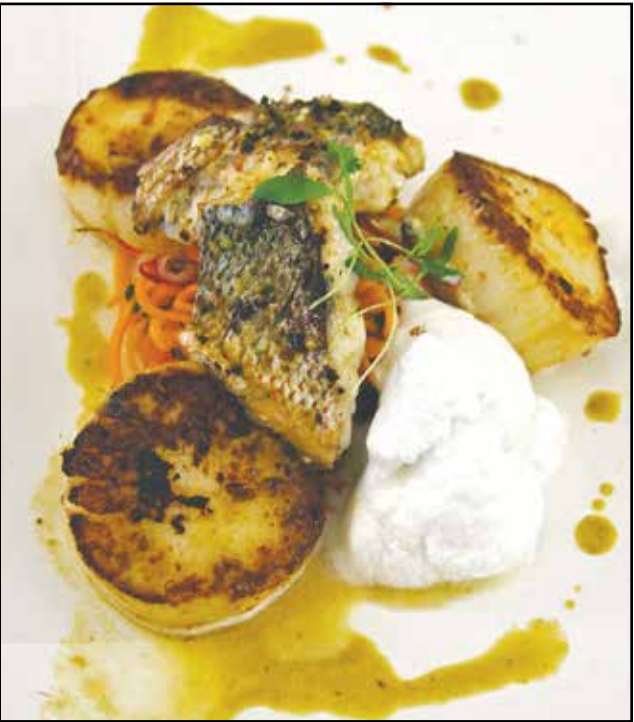

fish division with some delicious barbecued shrimp reminiscent of Pascal Manale’s in New Orleans.

Unfortunately, the other first-place winners declined to share their recipes. The top fish dish went to the Salty Worm team with a delicious Wild Gulf Gumbo. The top fowl dish went to the High Ball team for its Duck Pastalaya.

Fast forward to the second weekend in November for the World Food Championships, which brought chefs from all over the world to offer their best dishes in Seafood, Steak, Barbecue, Burger, Sandwich, Dessert, Chili and Recipe (chicken) categories.

One of the WFC sponsors was Alabama Gulf Seafood, which was a perfectly good reason for

me to request to judge a round in the seafood competition. I was selected for the seafood structured build, which requires chefs to execute a specific dish. This time it was Oysters Rockefeller. Man, am I lucky.

Because it was blind judging, all I can tell you is that all were really good and two were great. The team that had the Oysters Rockefeller topped with crab meat was my winner.

Two Alabama chefs were able to advance to the Top 10 in Seafood — Paul Kerr (Tuscaloosa) with Team Gulf Coast and Robert Entrekin (Birmingham) with Spices Smokehouse Catering. Unfortunately, I didn’t get to try Entrekin’s entry in the Seafood preliminaries. His “Southwestern Oysters Rockefeller topped with fresh pico and spinach and fresh oyster sauce” finished with a 98.7 score, the

highest in the round. Kerr finished in 6th place overall and Entrekin took 9th.

Chef Brody Olive of Perdido Beach Resort finished in 11th place by less than a 10th of a point. However, in a subsequent Super Qualifier, he earned a Golden Ticket to next year’s competition with a dish that included fresh Gulf seafood — scallops and snapper.

During the four days of the WFC competition, I got to judge Structured Seafood, Signature Burgers and Structured Chili. During the final round that judged the Top 10, I was at the judging table for the Recipe competition, which featured chicken, and Sandwich.

It was a difficult proposition to determine the winners in the finals. The dishes were outstanding. It was a tough job, but somebody had to do it.

Like I said, I really picked the wrong time to try to lose weight.

Uncle Tom’s Causeway Slice of Spice

8-10 dove breasts or 4-5 small duck breasts

Olive oil

Flour

16 ounces fresh pizza dough (homemade or purchased fresh from bakery)

1 cup thick BBQ sauce

1 cup grated mozzarella cheese, divided

1 cup grated smoked Gouda cheese, divided

1 small red onion, sliced

Kosher salt

Black pepper

Basil

Cilantro

Yellow Cornmeal

Make sure you have a pizza stone and pizza peel before starting. Pre-heat oven or grill to 500 degrees. Put pizza stone in oven or grill while pre-heating to allow stone to come up to temperature. While pre-heating, cut each dove or duck breast into quarters and sauté in olive oil over medium-high heat for 5-7 minutes then set aside. Using flour, roll out pizza dough on a pizza peel into the shape of a pizza. Coat pizza dough with BBQ sauce and lay down one base layer of cheese. Use ½ cup of Mozzarella and ½ cup of Gouda for base layer. Evenly spread sautéed breast meat and sliced red onion over pizza. Add remaining ½ cup of mozzarella and ½ cup of Gouda evenly around pizza. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Garnish with fresh basil and cilantro. Sprinkle heated pizza stone with yellow cornmeal, and transfer pizza from pizza peel to pizza stone. Let pizza cook until the crust is golden brown, usually 12-14 minutes at 500 degrees. Cook slightly longer for crispier crust.

Coontainer Shrimp Surprise

1 ½ lbs large head-on shrimp (15-20 count size)

2 tbsp olive oil

1 stick butter

2 tbsp Dijon mustard

1 ½ tsp chili powder

¼ tsp basil

½ tsp oregano

1 ½ tsp ground pepper

2 tbsp Tony Chachere’s

¼ tsp thyme

1 tsp hot sauce

2 cloves garlic, crushed or chopped

Juice of 1 lemon

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. In a skillet, heat oil over medium heat; add butter and all remaining ingredients except for the shrimp. Simmer over medium heat for 5-7 minutes, stirring occasionally. Place shrimp in a 9x13 baking dish. Pour sauce over shrimp and stir to coat shrimp with sauce. Bake uncovered for 20 minutes stirring after 10 minutes. Remove from oven, stir one more time and serve immediately. Serve with fresh sliced French bread.

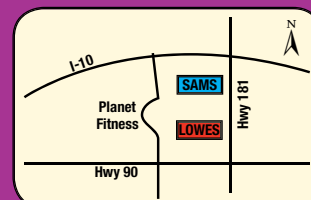
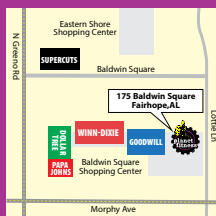

The North Baldwin Infirmary Auxiliary's Governing Board is excited about new plans for the hospital. The board met earlier this month to make plans for the rest of the year and 2018.

Administrator Ben Hansert said that he is very pleased with the service the auxiliary provides and their voice of compassion. He also gave an overview of the hospital. "The average daily cen-

sus was 12 in past years. However, it has grown to an average daily census of 36. Dr. William Bose, orthopaedic surgeon, committed to staying in Bay Minette to do all his

orthopaedic cases and has added 30 percent of growth in surgery," Hansert said. The Senior Behavioral Health in the hospital continues to grow. Han-

sert said construction will start soon for additional beds to be available as SBH had to turn away 50 patients since May of this year.

"There is a certificate of need to being prepared for the relocation of eight beds from MIMC to our hospital, which will give us 23 beds," he said.

A fourth operating room will be constructed soon. Radiology has acquired a new 64-slice CT scanner and it is being installed. The old scanner will go to the emergency room. Car-

diologist Megan Courtney started practice in Bay Minette in October.

The labor and delivery department has been awarded the "Baby Friendly" designation.

"Our hospital has been selected for this designation and NBI is one of the six hospitals in the state to receive this honor. The designation was earned because our birth center promotes bonding with mothers," Hansert said.

He also told the auxiliary that, "We depend upon you and what you

contribute to our hospital. The money our volunteers save the hospital each year is \$100,000."

The auxiliary is excited too about North Baldwin Infirmary kicking off the Christmas Fest for Bay Minette this year with a tree lighting on Nov. 30. The auxiliary is donating \$2,000 to help with Christmas decorations for the hospital.

Plans were made for a spring yard sale in 2018, hosted by the auxiliary. The next meeting will be on Jan. 10, 2018.

Get on the ball

There are many gadgets that have been advertised on the market that promise you will develop six-pack abs and a stronger core. The most recent piece of exercise equipment gaining popularity is the stability ball. It is inexpensive, colorful, lightweight, and looks like an oversized beach ball.

Stability balls were first used in the physical therapy industry and have now made their way into the general fitness arena. With proper instruction, the stability ball can improve stability, strength, posture, and facilitate stretching.

Much of the exercise that we have done in the past has focused on lower body; not paying atten-



tion to the trunk or core muscles (abdominals, back muscles, hip flexors, and extensors). Because the ball is unstable, exercises performed on the ball actively engage all of these muscles throughout each exercise.

It is important to purchase the correct size ball according to your height. The firmer the ball, the more challenging the exercise will be, so it is important to maintain proper air pressure.

This is one gadget that has proven results and one that seems to be sticking around. So if you can keep the ball away from the children, grandchildren,



or pets long enough, get on it and have a ball.

November is American Diabetes Month

November marks the annual observance of American Diabetes Month®. Sponsored by the American Diabetes Association, this observance aims to focus our nation's attention on the disease and the tens of millions of Americans affected by it.

Judging by the numbers, it is imperative that individuals are informed about diabetes and the consequences associated with the disease. Data from the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System survey suggests that approximately more than 552,000 adults in Alabama (14.6 percent of the adult population) have been diagnosed with diabetes.

However, there are many who are unaware they have the disease. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Pre-

vention, an estimated 30 million Americans have diabetes and 84 million have prediabetes.

Diabetes is not just physically costly — complications include heart disease, stroke, amputation, end-stage kidney disease, blindness and even death — it is also economically costly. Individuals with diabetes have medical expenses 2.3 times higher than those who do not have diabetes. Combined, diabetes and prediabetes cost an estimated \$5.4 billion each year in Alabama.

While these statistics are alarming, there are programs available to help individuals keep from developing the disease and assist those diagnosed with diabetes to better manage their health. Diabetes Prevention Programs (DPPs) and Diabetes Self-Management Education (DSME)

Programs are available throughout the state and can help reduce the burden caused by the disease. These programs are proven effective for those who regularly attend.

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Rural Americans are much more likely to die in motor vehicle crashes; Alabamians urged to wear seat belts

Motor vehicle crashes are among the leading causes of death in the U.S. A recent study found the rate of death for adult drivers and passengers from motor vehicle crashes is three to 10 times higher among rural Americans. The simple act of buckling seat belts

can prevent needless loss of life. Researchers at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention examined passenger vehicle occupant deaths among adults ages 18 or older. The study found lower seat belt use, higher death rates, and a higher proportion of drivers and passengers in rural areas were not

buckled up at the time of the fatal crash. About 40 percent of Alabamians live in rural areas. Seat belt use prevented an estimated 64,000 deaths in the United States during 2011-2015. The study found that “increasing rurality is consistently shown to be associated with increased crash-related death rates and

lower seat belt use.” Wearing seat belts has been shown to reduce the risk of serious injury or death by about 50 percent.

To buckle up safely

- Lap and shoulder belts should be secured across the pelvis and rib cage. These areas are better able to withstand crash forces than other
- parts of the body.
- Place the shoulder belt across the middle of the chest and away from the neck.
- The lap belt needs to rest across the hips, not the stomach.
- NEVER put the shoulder belt behind the back or under an arm.

Air bags are designed to work with seat belts,

not replace them. Motor vehicle occupants who do not buckle up could be thrown into a rapidly opening frontal air bag. Such force could injure or even kill.

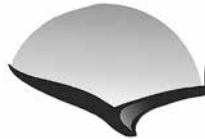

to be denied, and were surprised when they received a letter from city officials explaining the situation.

Since the mistake was on the commission and not the applicant, the City of Foley made the decision to begin the process anew.

“One of the members got confused and actually voted the wrong way on the second vote,” said Hellmich of the confusion. “She was very clear about it that it was not her intent. We want to be completely transparent so we’re not

doing anything after the meeting to reverse things, so we’re starting the process over.”

The decision was made to bring the item back for discussion once more, allowing the public to come to show their support or opposition to the rezoning during the November meeting.

The controversy comes from multiple angles, including the number of houses allowed in an area when changing zoning from R-1A and the decrease of property value of homes already in the area, along with traffic, drainage issues and safety. The

developer has concerns on their end about losing space for housing due to requirements from the city.

“There’s some requirements from the city by way of greenspace and drainage that are going to take up a certain amount of property,” said Ercil Godwin speaking as the agent for the applicant. “Obviously that’s what initially effected the request for the change in zoning.”

After discussions with the developer, Godwin came before the commission to request a compromise, changing the original request to rezone from R-1C to R-1B.

“This basically increases the lot width from 75 feet to 85 feet,” said Godwin. “So doing that we’ll obviously lose a few lots, but apparently the developers looked at it and they can make their numbers work.”

Fifteen percent of the property must be set aside for greenspace, and Godwin believes around nine acres will be greenspace and storm water detention areas. This puts the development at 2.3 units per acre in an R-1B zoning.

“R-1B allows 3.3 units per acre, so we’d be a full unit less per acre than what’s allowed,” Godwin said. “So we’re well under the density of the zoning.”

Plans for the subdivision also include a 20-foot buffer around the property as well as the addition of a new roadway.

Citizens remain concerned about the amount of traffic that is already in the area, as well as a decrease in their property value were the subdivision to be built.

“This is going to do nothing but congest the traffic to the point that we can’t even drive there,” said local resident Tina Phelps. “It’s going to bring down the value of the homes out there because it’s going to be too much congestion.”

Residents also voiced worries about the number of children already living in the area who travel

on foot to the bus stop for school, and the implications of the increased traffic.

Brock Wells, a resident of the area, came to voice his concerns on how the new subdivision and rezoning would affect property values.

“With wealth coming to us, growth comes to us, and that’s what we’re seeing here in Foley today,” said Wells. “We’re starting to expand at a rate that requires studious control, and that’s what we look to you [the commission] to do.”

Wells argues that by leaving the zoning at an R-1A, the subdivision would conform to the housing that is currently on Peachtree and surrounding areas, but Godwin stated by leaving the zoning untouched the developer would be left with minimal space for homes.

“Even in the R-1B, I still have to have 15 percent greenspace,” Godwin said. “I still have to have pretty much the same detention area, I still have the same right of way width, none of those things change. I just get less lots, so that’s the thing.”

While there were 61 homes in the R-1C zoning, it is predicted the number will fall to the lower 50s with the zoning change, but could be lower once environmental impact is

taken into consideration.

Despite the oppression, Hellmich said that the plans for the new subdivision were some of the few that reach a public hearing, and that many applications never leave the staff level due to not being acceptable to the city standards. The commissioners also felt the compromise to be sound.

“I just wanted to say that at the work session [on Nov. 6] there was a lot of concern about the R-1C,” said Hellmich. “We heard you, and we felt that this piece of property is one of the greatest pieces of property in the world, but they [the owners] have a right to develop it. So I feel this is a compromise, and it does keep the density down in the 2’s, which is not far above where [the rest of the area] is at 1.6.”

With the approval from the planning commission, a public hearing is scheduled at the Dec. 4 council meeting, which begins at 5:30 p.m. in the council chambers. The city council will be the final decision for the zoning change, and Godwin hopes to have a conceptional plan ready to present for R-1B zoning. If the council approves the rezoning, then the developers will begin the process of submitting the subdivision designs through the planning commission for final approval.
