

7 Ways to Live Stream Evangelistically Engaging Sermons

1. Every single sermon . . . make the **Gospel** accessible and understandable.
2. Call people to **respond** to the Gospel every week.
 - A) Consider using a texting service (eg: “Text in Church,” “EZ Texting”)
 - B) If you’re streaming on Facebook, encourage listeners to comment or send private messages to your church’s Facebook page.
 - C) Provide a link for a Zoom call the following week for anyone who wants to respond or know more about following Jesus.
3. When preparing your online sermons, remember: **shorter** is better.
4. Consider using **visual illustrations** while preaching.
5. Invite your viewers to **participate** while you preach.
 - A) Ask viewers to comment/respond to questions/ideas during the sermon.
 - B) Use “meet and greet” time for texting and sharing selfies with other church members.
 - C) Encourage viewers to post prayer requests in “comments” section, and assign a church member to collect the requests.
 - D) Ask church members to video themselves reading the sermon text and praying.
 - E) Ask church members to provide short video-testimonies to be played in the service.
6. Engage the **kids** while preaching.
7. Multiple time each service, encourage your people to **share** the link for your church’s service.
