

Exploring God's Word

Children's Bible Drill is designed to help children in grades 4, 5 and 6 increase in knowledge of the Bible and develop skills in effectively using the Bible. Each participant must learn the names of the books of the Bible in the proper order and be able to locate them. Each child must learn selected verses and passages and be able to locate them.

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Children's Bible Drill

Help children hide God's Word in their hearts. Children's Bible Drill is made up of three cycles of verses and key passages. The cycles rotate over a three-year period.

Children who are fourth, fifth, and sixth graders are eligible to participate in Children's Bible Drill. <u>Bible Drill Competition Guide, Games & Activities for Blue, Green and Red Cycles</u>, or <u>Bible Skills</u>, <u>Drills & Thrills</u> is available at Lifeway Christian Stores. <u>Bible Skills</u>, <u>Drills & Thrills</u> material is also available for use with first, second, and third graders to help them learn Bible skills in a fun, noncompetitive format.

The **purpose** of the drill is to help children:

- increase in knowledge of the Bible
- develop skills in locating Bible books and key passages
- memorize the names of the books of the Bible in order plus selected Bible verses and key passages
- learn how to apply the Bible to their lives

> What is Learned

Each child who participates in Children's Bible Drill will:

- Learn the names of the 66 books of the Bible in their proper order and be able to locate each within 10 seconds.
- Memorize the 25 verses and their references as listed in the current year's cycle of Children's Bible Drill resources.
- Learn the names, references, and locations in the Bible of the 10 Key Passages as listed in the current year's cycle of Children's Bible Drill resources.
- If a child participates in Children's Bible Drill for 3 years, he/she will learn 75 Bible verses, 30 Key Passages, and the names and sequence of the 66 books of the Bible.

Levels of Participation

CHURCH DRILL

The church drill is conducted by the local church. Children must (1) participate in a church drill and (2) give 12 or more correct responses to be eligible to participate in the associational drill. Schedule the church drill two weeks before the associational drill. Notify the associational office of the names of the children who qualify for the associational drill.

ASSOCIATIONAL DRILL

The associational drill is under the direction of the associational Discipleship Training director. Children who give 16 or more correct responses may advance to the state drill. The associational Discipleship Training director is to send to the Coordinator of the State site your children attend, the names and addresses of all participants and the name of each sponsoring church. The State drill sites, dates and coordinators are listed on the kybaptist.org/Bible Drill website.

STATE DRILL

The state drill is for children who give 16 or more correct responses in the associational drill. The dates and locations for the state drills are scheduled and listed in the kybaptist.org/bible-drills website. Children who give 20 or more correct responses will be declared state winners.

Types of Drills

QUOTATION DRILL – 6 calls (Quoted from memory)

- All verses are taken from the current year's cycle of Children's Bible Drill verses.
- The leader gives the reference (Example: John 3:16).
- If the child knows the verse, he/she steps forward one step after "Start" is called, prepared to quote the verse as it is stated on the Children's Bible Drill leaflet and to give the reference. NOTE: The child can state the reference before and/or after quoting the verse.
- After a correct response the leader says, "Attention."

COMPLETION DRILL – 6 calls (Quoted from memory)

- All verses are taken from the current year's cycle of Children's Bible Drill verses.
- The leader reads the part of the verse that is underlined in the Children's Bible Drill leaflet (Example: "God is our refuge and strength").
- If the child can complete the verse, he/she steps forward one step after "Start" is called, prepared to quote the verse as it is stated on the Children's Bible Drill leaflet and to give the reference. NOTE: The child can state the reference before and/or after quoting the verse.
- After a correct response, the leader says, "Attention.

BOOK DRILL – 6 calls (Bible is used)

- The leader says the name of any book of the Bible (Example: Exodus).
- After "Start" is called, the child finds any page in the book called, places his/her index finger on the page, and steps forward.
- If called on by the leader, the child gives the name of the book preceding the one called, the name of the book called, and the name of the book following the one called. (Example: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus).
- After a correct response, the leader says, "Attention.

KEY PASSAGE DRILL - 6 calls (Bible is used)

- Only the Key Passages listed in the current year's cycle of Children's Bible Drill resources are used.
- The leader states the title of the Key Passage (Example: The Beatitudes).
- The child finds the passage in his/her Bible, places a finger on any portion of the passage, and steps forward.
- When called on, the child states the title of the Key Passage and the reference (Example: The Beatitudes Matthew 5:3-12).
- After a correct response, the leader asks the child to read one verse from the passage. Then the leader says, "Attention."

The four kinds of calls can be completed in any order. Complete one kind of call before proceeding to another. NOTE: Children may choose whether to hold their Bibles during the Quotation and Completion drills.

> Administering the Drills

- The children's Discipleship Training director, a director or leader in a children's Discipleship Training department, or another worker may be asked to coordinate and lead the drill.
- The following leaders are needed for a drill: a caller (conductor), a timekeeper, and three judges. One of the three judges serves as chairperson. The chairperson checks the math and averages the scores given to each participant by the three judges.
- No more than 12 children should participate in a drill. If more children are involved, plan multiple drills.

> Drill Commands

ATTENTION

Stand straight; one foot not extended in front of the other; eyes focused on the leader until the command "Start" is given; Bible held at side (in either hand) with the Bible's spine down. (Holding the Bible is optional during the Quotation and Completion drills.)

PRESENT BIBLES

This call is used only in the Book Drill and Key Passage Drill. Bring Bible to waistline parallel with the floor. Following the "Present Bible" command, the leader announces the call.

It is recommended that a child who searches with his/her right hand hold the Bible in the left hand with Genesis down with the right hand resting flat on the back of the Bible and no fingers extending over the edges.

A child who searches with his/her left hand may hold the Bible in the right hand, Genesis up, with the left hand resting flat on the front of the Bible and no fingers extending over the edges.

START

This command is the signal for children to step forward or begin searching in their Bibles. For the Book Drill and Key Passage Drill, the child will begin searching in the Bible when the command is given. It is a mistake to begin before this command is given. In the Book Drill, the index finger must be placed upon any part of that book. In the Key Passage Drill, the child finds any part of the reference, place his/her index finger on any portion, and steps forward.

TIME

The timekeeper calls out "Time" at the end of 10 seconds. No one may step forward after this command, and all children should stop searching in their Bibles. The leader calls on one child by number who will give a response. The other children will remain quiet while the one called upon responds. If the child called on does not give the right response, the leader calls on another child.

ATTENTION

Close the Bible, return it to its original position, and take one step back.

> Judging and Scoring a Drill

- Judging is based on the verses and Key Passages printed in the current Children's Bible Drill leaflet and the books of the Bible.
- Mistakes are marked on the score sheet.
- Only one mistake may be scored for a child on any single call.
- While mistakes are scored, only the number of correct responses are reported to each child.

Mistakes are:

- 1. Child fails to step out within 10 seconds.
- 2. Child gives incorrect response. This includes any child who raises his/her hand, indicating an error.
- 3. Child fails to stand straight or keep eyes on the drill caller until the command "Start" is given.
- 4. When the Bible is used, child steps forward before the index finger is on the correct response.
- 5. Child fails to handle the Bible according to instructions or obviously misuses the Bible. The Bible should be parallel to the floor with one hand flat on the top and one hand flat on the bottom with no fingers extending over the edges.

> Preparing for and Conducting a Drill

BEFORE THE DRILL

- Prepare and write a drill to call.
- Put a strip of masking tape on the floor. The children should stand behind this line.
- Judges should meet to read aloud and discuss the five mistakes that will be recorded. Give judges their score sheets.
- Judges should sit in front of the drillers, facing the drillers.
- Make a set of cards numbered 1 through 12. Pin a number on each child. Line the children up in sequential order, facing the audience. (Judges record children's responses on the score sheet under the corresponding number.)

DURNG THE DRILL

- A drill should be preceded by instructions to children and at least one practice call to acquaint children with the voice and timing of calls by the caller.
- All judges should watch all the children.
- Judges should watch for the mistakes listed under "Judging and Scoring a Drill."
- Only one mistake can be scored against a child on any one call.
- Some judges find it helpful to slide a piece of paper down the page so they do not lose their places on the score sheet. The line across the top of the score sheet represents the order (left to right) in which the drillers stand. The numbers top to bottom represent the calls to be given.
- The person calling the drill should go slowly enough for the judges to record the scores.
- Every child should be called on during the drill.
- Do no always call on the child who is first to step out.
- Wait the full 10 seconds after the "Start" command has been given before calling on a child.
- Judges should give the benefit of doubt to the drillers but should not lose credibility. The rules are the standard.

AFTER THE DRILL

- In a church drill a child who gives 12 or more correct responses can advance to the associational drill. In an association drill, having 16 or more correct responses qualifies a child to participate in the state drill.
- Following a drill, the three judges go immediately to a private room. Each judge will add the mistakes made by each child.
- One of the three judges should serve as chairperson. This judge checks the math of the other judges. He/she then adds the three scores for each child and divides the sum by three to get the average number of errors. Then the chairperson subtracts the errors from 24 to get the child's final score. (Example 4+4+4=12÷3=4, 24-4=20. The child's final score is 20.)
- Judges should resolve all questions and come to final decisions before they leave the room.
- Judges should not have scores announced to the audience. To let children know if they will advance to the next level judges can put a seal on their certificates. All Children should receive certificates no matter what their scores.
- Judges should not discuss the scores. The decision of the judges should be final.
- Encouragement should be given to children who qualify for the associational drill to continue their training in preparation for the drill. Following the associational drill, encourage those who qualify to continue their training for the state drill.

> Preparing a Church Drill

Each drill should be written out completely for or by the leader. The four kinds of Drills (Quotation, Completion, Book, and Key Passage) have six calls each. The four kinds of drills can be completed in any order. Complete one kind of drill before proceeding to another.

Below is the format to follow in writing each of the four parts of a drill. Every word to be spoken by the drill caller and all the correct answers should be written, including some reminders as shown in parentheses below.

Attention

We will first have the Quotation Drill. I will give the reference. If you know the verse, step forward. If called upon, give the verse and the reference.

John 3:16. (Pause to give time for the children to think.)

Start.

(Call on a child after *Time* [10 second] has been called.)

Answer: "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." John 3:16. (KJV)

Attention.

We will now have the Completion Drill. I will give the first few words of a verse. If you know the verse and where it is found, step forward. If called upon, give the verse and where it is found.

"Study to shew thyself approved unto God" (Pause.)

Start.

(Call on a child after *Time* [10 seconds] has been called.)

Answer: "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." 2 Timothy 2:15. (KJV)

Attention.

We will now have the Book Drill. I will give the name of a book in the Bible. Upon the command "Start," find the book. Place your index finger on any verse in the book named and step forward. If called upon, give the name of the book before, the book named, and the book that follows.

Present Bibles.

Exodus. (Pause.)

Start.

(Call on a child after *Time* [10 seconds] has been called.) Answer: Genesis–Exodus–Leviticus.

Attention.

We will now have the Key Passage Drill. I will give the title given to the Key Passage. Find the passage, then place your finger on any verse in the passage, and step forward. If called upon, state the Key Passage and reference, then read the verse or verses asked for.

Present Bibles.

The Love Chapter. (Pause.)

Start.

(Call on a child after Time [10 seconds] has been called.)

Answer: The Love Chapter – 1 Corinthians 13.

(After the child called upon responds, ask him/her to read a verse from the Key Passage.)

Thank you, number _____. Please read verse 1.

Answer: "Though I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, and have not charity, I am become as sounding brass, or a tinkling cymbal." (KJV) **Attention.**

> <u>Steps for Beginning Children's Bible Drill</u>

- 1. **Obtain dates for state and associational drills.** The date of the state drill in your area is listed on this website Contact Associational office for associational drill date.
- 2. **Set the date for your church drill.** Usually the church drill occurs approximately two weeks before the associational drill.
- 3. **Determine a schedule for your meetings.** Some churches begin six months before their church drill. Others begin three months before the drill. Others begin with the new church year in September. The churches that allow more time are able to use more games and fun activities to help children learn.
- 4. **Decide when and where you will meet.** Reserve these times and places on the church calendar. Possible times to meet include the hour before children's discipleship, during children's discipleship, after school, Saturday morning, or Wednesday night. Choose a time that will allow the most children to participate. Include any special meetings such as a kick-off, parent orientation, or parties. The best place to hold Children's Bible Drill is in a children's room although an adult room will work. You will need a cabinet to store Bibles, workbooks, games, masking tape, and other supplies.
- 5. **Advertise when children's Bible Drill will begin.** Along with articles in your newsletter, letters to the parents of fourth, fifth, and sixth graders, and announcements in the children's Sunday School classes, you might wish to have an exhibition drill during worship with some of last year's drillers.
- 6. **Obtain resources.** Other supplies that you will need include masking tape, markers, and pencils.

7. Hold an orientation meeting for drillers and their parents.

- Explain the purpose of Children's Bible Drill.
- Go over the drills.
- Give children the current year's cycle of Children's Bible Drill Verses and Key Passages.
- Distribute copies of the letter to parents (see sample letter). Include a sheet with the schedule for your meetings.
- Discuss how important the role is that parents play. Children will need parents to help them learn the Scriptures and Key Passages and the books of the Bible.
- If the children are to use workbook at home, look at it with the parents and explain the procedures.
- Some churches may ask parents to contribute to the purchase of Bibles, workbooks, and special T-shirts. Discuss these costs at this meeting.
- 8. **(Optional) Hold a special kick-off.** The kick-off could be as simple as an all-day party at the church or as elaborate as a lock-in. Use this time to help boys and girls get a jump-start on learning the Scriptures and the books of the Bible. Make the time fun with refreshments and games to help them learn.
- 9. **Schedule additional meetings.** Meet weekly for at least an hour to help children learn the material and to practice drilling.
- 10. **(Optional) Plan a midway party.** The party should include some time practicing the material along with other fun activities such as playing miniature golf, going to the park, playing games in the gym, or eating pizza.
- 11. Hold the church drill. Send the names of successful children to your association.
- 12. Attend the associational drill.
- 13. Attend the state drill.
- 14. Recognize all of the children in your newsletter and church service.

Sample Letter to Parents

Dear Parents:

We are pleased that your fourth, fifth, or sixth grader is interested in participating in Children's Bible Drill. Your child will develop skills in the use of the Bible, and learn how to apply the Bible to his life. He will learn 25 Bible verses, learn and be able to locate 10 Key Passages of Scripture, and learn the order of and be able to locate books of the Bible.

Your child will be given current year's cycle of Children's Bible Drill verses and key passages, a special Drill Bible, and an activity book to be used with a parent at home. Use these resources to help your child be successful in what he is learning.

The four drills that are a part of Children's Bible drill are as follows:

<u>Quotation Drill</u> – The leader names one of the references from the Children's Bible Drill leaflet. If the child knows the verse from memory, he steps forward prepared to quote the verse as it is stated in the leaflet and to give the reference.

<u>Completion Drill</u> – The leader reads the underlined portion of a verse from the Children's Bible Drill leaflet. If the child knows the reference and the entire verse from memory, he steps forward prepared to quote the verse as it is stated on the card and to give the reference.

<u>Book Drill</u> – The leader names any book of the Bible. The child is to find the book called, place his finger on the page, and step forward within 10 seconds. If called on, the child will name the book preceding the book called, the name of the book called, and the name of the book following the book called.

Key Passage Drill – A title of one of the 10 Key Passages listed in the Children's Bible Drill leaflet will be called. The child finds the passage in his Bible, places his finger on the page, and steps forward. If called on, he must state the title of the Key Passage and the Scripture reference. Then he will be asked to read one verse from the passage.

There are three levels of drills: a church drill, an associational drill, and a state-sponsored drill. The following information gives the dates for these drills:
