Bond issue vote next week

Kemper County voters will go to the polls Thursday, August 5, to decide on a \$12 million bond issue for a new upper elementary school.

Voters may cast their votes at the Kemper County High School basketball gym. The election will be from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. It will take 60 percent of the vote for the measure to pass.

If you are going to be out of

town on election day, the Kemper County Circuit Clerk's office will be open Saturday until noon for you to vote absentee. If you have received a mail-in ballot, it must be post marked by election day to count.

The building will be located on land currently used as the football practice behind the Kemper County High School gym. It will face west. It is one floor with wings running off a central hall.

The new school will house approximately 320 students. It

will consist of 16 state-of-the art classrooms. It will also have four specialty classrooms, an art room, a music room, a self-contained classroom and a gifted classroom.

There will be a multi-purpose room and a school cafeteria.

In the center of the new school will also an administrative area located which include offices and support areas. There will be a receptionist area at the entrance of the building so traffic in and out of the building can be monitored. There is also a teacher's work-

will consist of 16 state-of-the art room, a nurses station and storage

There will be covered walkways at the drop-off areas for students who come by car and those who ride the bus.

"This is not a situation of us saying, 'hey, we want a new school," said superintendent Hulite Hudson said. "You have two elementary schools. One was built in 1961 and the other built in 1967. We are talking about being in need of a new school.

The following summary of WMA draw hunts for the recent 2020-2021 hunting season, has been compiled using actual numbers of applicants and actual hunting opportunities available for the

current (2020-2021) hunting season.

These numbers are representative of draw hunt participation for this season, only. Future WMA draw hunt activity will be dependent on actual number of applicants and the total number of available draw hunt opportunities which are determined on a year-to-year basis by Wildlife Bureau biologists based upon numerous factors

including but not limited to the geography and topography of a given WMA, available food sources or mast crop production, available water, available cover, observed herd density, and other carrying capacity factors which impact habitat and wildlife management decisions.

The box turtle enjoys omnivorous lifestyle

The term "box turtle" can refer to either the Asian box turtle or to the North American box turtle.

Box turtles are characterized by their domed shell which is hinged at the bottom. This hinging allows the turtle to tightly close its shell providing better protection from predators. While this domed, hinged shell is common to both genera, the turtles differ in habitat, behavior, and appearance.

The North American box turtle, which is what we will be referring to in this article, is omnivorous. Their sharp eyes and keen sense of smell help them to find foods such as snails, berries, fungi, slugs, worms,

roots, flowers, fish, frogs, snakes, salamanders, birds, and eggs.

Their feasting preference varies by season but there is a definite trend as to age. The young are primarily carnivorous leading them to hunt for their food in ponds and streams during their first 5 to 7 years, while the adults usually feed on land as they tend to be more herbivorous. However, box turtles eat no green leaves.

Temperatures tend to determine activity rates. The preferred body temperature of the box turtle is between 84° and 100°F. This is why in the heat of summer, box turtles restrict their activities to mainly mornings or after it rains. If they get too uncomfortable in the heat, they will hide under decaying logs and

leaves, crawl into abandoned mammal burrows, or dig into the mud. In the spring and fall, with the cooler temperatures, the box turtle will forage during daylight hours, sometimes stopping to bask in the sun for warmth. Box turtles are active in daytime and will scoop out a shallow bed for the night.

Box turtles go into hibernation by November in the Northern regions, but remain active on into December in the warmer Southern climates. To hibernate, they will dig up to 2 feet deep. They often return to the same place to hibernate and sometimes more than one turtle will share this place. Hibernation typi-

cally lasts until April.

These turtles have a home range with a diameter of 750 feet or less in

which they normally stay. For unknown reasons, they will occasionally journey beyond their range and will find themselves within the space of another turtle. Though this seems intrusive, when found together, these turtles show no antagonism towards each other.

The biggest problem facing the box turtle is habitat destruction. Woodlands converted into farmland have reduced the range of these turtles in many states. The remaining available land is often fragmented with housing projects and roads. These obstacles break up the turtles' habitat

A further threat includes the capturing and selling of wild-born box



Getting the Message/Rev. Chris Shelton

Acts 10:34-48

All the saving blessings of God all upon Him. come through the gospel. Peter, a Jew, is explaining the gospel to Gentiles. He had been summoned by messengers to the home of Cornelius, a Roman Centurion, and when he arrived he found a large crowd of the family and friends of Cornelius.

Peter summarizes the gospel in verses 36-43. He says the word of the gospel is good news because it proclaims "peace through Jesus Christ." It is a sad truth that we are estranged with God in heart and mind. But God takes the initiative to make peace with us: "While we were yet sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8).

When Christ was born, the angels sang, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men." Christ is the "Prince of Peace" (Isaiah 9:6). It is a wonder to have peace with God. There is no father like God for love. You cannot love your own soul the way God does. So this is the peace you must make sure of.

The peace of God makes God the object of our love and delight. It is in God that we find rivers of joy and contentment. He gives us unsearchable riches (Ephesians 3:8). He knows what is best for us, and how to best comfort us. Conversely, there is no peace with God outside of Christ. God commands us to repent and come to Christ because we will remain His enemies if we do not. A blessed command!

Peter tells the people assembled about the love of Christ: "He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him" (Acts 10: 38). To be oppressed by the devil is a doleful condition. But the Lord Jesus has power over all evil powers. Everything Peter says commends Christ to the assembled crowd.

In verse 39, we read: "They put him to death by hanging him on a tree." It conveys the sinfulness of man to put to death the righteous Lord Jesus. It also reminds us that Jesus bore the curse of God for sin in our place, because the Scripture says, "He that hangs on a tree is cursed of God." Jesus had committed no crime that deserved death, but the Lord laid the iniquity of us

The Lord Jesus did not remain dead though. Peter says, "But God raised him on the third day and made him to appear, not to all the people but to us who had been chosen by God as witnesses who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead" (verse 41). It must have been an incredible experience to eat and drink with the resurrected Jesus and hear his explanations of all that had taken place.

The resurrection of Christ means his death was approved of by God as atonement for sin. He destroyed the works of the devil and has taken away the sting of sin which is death. His resurrection means all who believe in him are justified before God, and that they will also one day have their bodies raised from the dead unto glory. They also will have the privilege of eating and drinking with the Lord.

Peter testifies that the apostles were witnesses to the work the Lord Jesus did, the death he died, and the resurrection of Christ. He points to the prophets in the Old Testament as witnesses also, who wrote of Christ before he came into the world.

So men have to reject these witnesses as false if they refuse the gospel. They have to deny their need of the sacrificial death of Christ and believe that the things Jesus did and said are of no consequence to them. Worse, they have to imply Jesus was false.

Peter says that the Lord "commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one appointed by God to be the judge of the living and the dead." It is a terrible thing to reject so great a Savior and so great a salvation. You and I will be judged by the Lord as either friend or foe. So pay careful attention to Peter's sermon. Those hearing him at Cornelius' home responded in faith. They are in heaven with the Lord now.

Peter closes his sermon with "Everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name." It is an amazing thing to think of your sins wiped away, and you are welcomed into the presence of the Lord. I should say amazing grace, because that is what is offered in the gospel.

Time to can, freeze vegetables for later enjoyment

Summer is wrapping up. Be sure to harvest and save your garden produce so you will have the advantage of homegrown foods through the year.

With most of your herbs, such as basil, oregano, parsley, or thyme, you can hang the stems in paper bags until they are dried. Then put the leaves in a sealed jar for use in your recipes. You can also freeze them. They will become limp but the essential oils will be saved and add the fresh flavor to your recipes.

Vegetables, such as corn, string beans, Crowder peas, squash, etc., can be blanched and frozen.

One real time saver is to chop your peppers and onions and freeze to be used through

Of course, you can also use the big blue canner to preserve your vegetables. The following are two of my favorites for tomatoes.

CANNED CRUSHED

NOTICE OF PROPOSED AD VALOREM TAX EFFORT **Kemper County School District**

The Kemper County School District will hold a public hearing on its proposed school district budget for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 on Thursday, August 5, 2021 at 5:00 pm at the Office of Superintendent, 159 Main Avenue, DeKalb, MS 39328. At this meeting, a proposed ad valorem tax effort will be considered.

The Kemper County School District is now operating with a projected total budget revenue of \$15,628,888. Of that amount, forty-three percent (43%) or \$6,752,482 of such revenue is obtained through ad valorem taxes. For next fiscal year, the proposed budget has total projected revenue of \$17,786,507. Of that amount, forty percent (40%) or \$7,035,195 is proposed to be financed through a total ad valorem tax levy.

For the next fiscal year, the proposed increase in ad valorem tax effort by Kemper County School District may result in an increase in the ad valorem tax millage rate. Ad valorem taxes are paid on homes, automobile tags, business fixtures and equipment, and rental real property.

Any citizen of Kemper County School District is invited to attend this public hearing on the proposed ad valorem tax effort, and will be allowed to speak for a reasonable amount of time and offer tangible evidence before any vote is taken.

This makes a person want to use meth again and again to achieve the same rush, which eventually leads to addiction.

Even taking small amounts of meth, or just trying it once, can cause harmful health ef-
