## Lebanon Girls' Tennis

The Lebanon High School girls' tennis team is coming off one of the most successful seasons in program history last fall. In fact, the Lady Jackets have a combined record of 31-11 in the past two seasons, including a 15-6 record in 2023.

Lebanon finished second to Bolivar for the Ozark Conference title and had tremendous post-season success.

"We had two players that were All-Conference in Olivia McGruder and Kelsey Daugherty," said longtime head coach Ron Crowell. "They were also All-District, and both were very close to advancing to State. Kelsey lost a heart-breaking 3rd set match in the district semifinals, and Olivia suffered a season-ending ankle injury

in the district semifinal match. She was the No. 1 seed and had an incredible 19-6 record in singles and a 16-4 record in doubles. Kelsey finished the season with a 19-11 record in singles.

"Overall, we had an

incredible season." Crowell enters his 21st year as the head coach of the girls' and boys' tennis programs at LHS, but this year will look a little different as LHS heads to the Central Ozark Conference. Crowell and his team are

looking forward to the challenge of continuing play in a high-caliber conference.

"My expectations are to get better every day," he stated. We obviously want to have a winning season and to compete well in the

COC. With the exception of Olivia (McGruder), everyone else will be new to varsity tennis, so we will be taking everything one day at a time."

McGruder will return to the top spot for LHS as one of the top players in the

State of Missouri. Crowell will also rely on the likes of Opal Antoszewski, Adalyn Coryell, Hope Cox, Aleyah Jemes, Tommia Blankenship, Emma Johnson, and Ray Guccione to have an impact on this year's varsity team.

"Olivia is one of the most talented players I have coached," he said. "She comes to practice every day ready to work and is a great leader for this team."

"While the other girls behind her may not have that varsity experience, this entire group is willing to put in the work, and I can't wait to get started with them."

Lebanon will open its season on August 30 at the Joplin tournament. Its first home match will be against the Central Bulldogs at 4:00 p.m. on September 3 at the Mary Jean Wampler Tennis Complex.

# Lebanon Boys' Soccer

After losing six games by one goal in 2023, the Lebanon High School boys' soccer team hopes to use those close losses as a learning experience and build into 2024.

"We have a lot of experience returning and know that our leadership will be there this year," head coach Matt Jernigan said. Guys know how to compete in big games; now it is just finding a way to get over the hump and win those close games."

The 'Jackets return key players to the pitch such as senior Noah Anderson (Class 4 All-District 5 first team, All-Ozark Conference first team), senior Brock Piercy, senior Chris Kilburn (All-Ozark Conference honorable mention), senior Ethan Fisher, senior Jacob Reagan (Class 4 All-District 5 honorable mention, All-Ozark Conference second team), senior Curtis

Frazier, senior Jeremiah Rivera, and junior Will Hodges. Below is an excerpt from Jernigan:

Noah Anderson, senior forward/midfield – Noah loves the game of soccer. He is always working in the offseason to improve and has a ton of talent. We are excited to see what he can do in his senior year.

Brock Piercy, senior midfielder/defender – Brock tore his ACL and MCL right after soccer season last year. He has been working hard in rehab, and we hope he can be fully ready to go on that first day of practice. He is a multi-sport kid and is a big piece of our team.

Chris Kilburn, senior goalkeeper— Chris can play anywhere on the field. In his three years with us, he has played keeper, midfield, forward, and defense. He is a baseball kid who is just athletic. He is a leader on and off the field for our team.

Ethan Fisher, senior defender— Fisher is an

anchor in our defense. He has played varsity all three years and is a great asset back there. He has been a captain for our team, and the boys look up to him. We will be pretty young in our defense this year, but Ethan will be the leader back there.

Jacob Reagan, senior defender— Jacob verbally committed to SBU this offseason and has been working hard to keep improving. He can play anywhere on the field, and we are excited to see where he fits best in our new system this year. He can defend at a high level and has a great shot as well.

Curtis Frazier, junior defender – Curtis is a tough kid. He works hard and will do anything for the team. He plays in our midfield and defense and brings some toughness to our game. He isn't afraid of contact and will put his body on the line for the team.

Jeremiah Rivera, senior midfielder – Jerry

had a great season last year in the midfield and will be a big part of our offense this season. He has great vision and a great shot and will help us solidify our midfield this year.

William Hodges, junior defender — Will is an unbelievable athlete. He has all the physical skills to play anywhere. His role will be changing this year, and we are excited to see how he steps up into that role.

"We really like our experience returning this year," said Jernigan. Most of our seniors have been playing varsity for three years, and all of our starters this season will have varsity experience. We have a hard-working group who loves the game. We are an athletic group who loves to compete and can't wait to get started.

"We expect to be competitive night in and night out. With our new conference, we will see a lot of good competition and are excited to see where we stack up."

Other newcomers who could impact the varsity level are Josh Rogers (sophomore, defense), Trent Penner (sophomore, forward), Aidan Ziehr and Gavin Ziehr (juniors, defense), and Noah Hinson (junior, midfield).

"Josh started for us as a freshman last year and did a great job up top and in the defense. He is going to be on our back line this year, and between him and Ethan Fisher, they should be a fun group to watch," Jernigan explained. "Trent started as a freshman last year and did a great job. He is a hard worker and has really taken it to another level over the offseason. Aidan and Gavin are twins who have really stepped up this offseason. Noah has been dealing with injuries for the last couple of years, but he is looking good over the summer, and we are expecting a big year from him this season."

Jernigan is starting

his 17th season with the Yellowjackets, and fans will have something to look forward to when they attend home games this season at the soccer field.

"We are excited about our new field, which will be ready for our first home game this fall," he said.

Jernigan said the project for a new playing surface began in 2023 with a meeting with parents discussing the field and scoreboard.

"Many issues were addressed, but the scoreboard and field surface were two of the major issues that were brought up," he said. With the help of several of the soccer parents, spearheaded by local businesswoman Magda Reagan, we were able to put together a plan to give our facility a facelift. With a go-ahead from the school district in 2023, we were able to raise enough money from local businesses to build a new scoreboard with advertising space.

"After the scoreboard was done, we set our sights a little higher with the renovation of our field surface. The field surface had no major renovations since the teams began in 1995. With the school district's approval, we started raising funds last spring with the goal of raising \$60,000 to level and resod the field. Within one month, we were able to secure the funds to start the project. The sod was laid in June and looks amazing."

Jernigan took time to thank the following who donated without any school district funds being used:

Lebanon All-Sports Booster Club, PT Signature Cabinetry, David, Melinda, and Cody Cates, Heritage Bank of the Ozarks, Lebanon Soccer Association, Magda's Kitchen, and Two donations in memory of LHS Soccer players Jason Frye and Michael Donigan, who graduated in 2002, and 2003.

Lebanon will compete at the Bolivar Jamboree on August 27 and travel to Hillcrest for their opening game of the season on September 3. The 'Jackets will host their home tournament on September 6 and 7 on their new field.

Coming off one of the most successful seasons in program history, Lebanon High School cross country coach Josh Smith is excited about the team he will bring back in 2024.

“Our boys and girls both had very successful seasons in 2023,” he said. We had a great group that really bought into putting in off-season miles and working hard. Our girls’ team won the Lebanon Invitational, the Camdenton Invitational, and the Buffalo Invitational and finished third in the Ozark Conference. The girls had a really solid team that enjoyed being around each other and fought hard for each other’s success.

“Our boys won the Lebanon Invitational and finished 2nd multiple times throughout the year.”

The ‘Jackets graduated key runners in Ella Johnson, Peter Stunja, and Kelby Conner.

“Ella was the heart and soul of our team last season,” Smith said. She was a two-time team captain and a leader on and off the course. Ella is impossible to replace, but she showed the younger girls how to work, succeed, be a leader, and be a wonderful person.

“Peter Stunja became a two-time state qualifier. Over the past four years, Peter has grown and contributed a ton to our program. He was

a standout runner in cross country and on the track. Peter will continue his running career at Crowder College this coming season. We look forward to seeing Peter grow as a runner and a person this coming season.

“Kelby Conner was our third male state qualifier. He went from a JV runner to a team leader and a state qualifier. He had a special career at Lebanon, and we will miss his work ethic and running ability. Kelby is also continuing his running career at Crowder College this fall. He has put in the work to be successful at the next level, and he will see the results of that work.”

Smith, who graduated from LHS and ran cross country for the ‘Jackets, has taken this program to new heights.

“I take a lot of pride in this program and this school,” he explained. “This is my 9th season with the LHS cross country program and my sixth season as the head cross country coach. This is my 15th season coaching cross country. I spent my first six years coaching cross country and track at El Dorado Springs.”

Back for the Black and Gold this fall will be standout runners Abigail Tague and Liam Allen.

“Abigail was our top performer and had a historic season for LHS,” Smith said. “Abigail has done more than nearly anyone in LHS history

in just two seasons. She had her mind on a state medal before the season started and would not be denied. She set the school record at 18:46 and earned All-State honors, finishing 27th in Class 5. Landon had the potential to be a state qualifier for us this season. He has sneaky speed and is very goal-oriented.

## 2024 LEBANON HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL TEAM

The Lebanon High School football team became Ozark Conference champions for the third straight year. This past year was special because it was the final Ozark Conference football championship. After an undefeated regular season (third time in school history), the 'Jackets survived the Branson Pirates in the Class 5 District 6 semifinals (42-35) before falling to the eventual Class 5 runner-ups Republic Tigers (35-32). Now, Lebanon will look to replace a large and talented senior class, including the likes of Gavin Smith, Drew Bowling, Griffin Jones, Hoyt Honey, Gunner Williams, Danen Conrad, Dathan Durbin, and Canon Roark. The Jackets enter the Central Ozark Conference and will face powerhouses such as Webb City and Nixa in their

inaugural season. "Our program is super excited for the process of our new journey," Lebanon head coach Will Christian said. "Obviously, we understand our new conference is going to be very difficult, and literally every game will be tough. We also know and believe that we will be the most prepared we have ever been for the postseason with these new challenges. We also understand we have much to prove and plenty of doubters on if we can compete in this new situation. So, without question, we will be working very hard to earn respect and improve in our process every day. Through our core values, we greatly desire to represent our community with class and excellence." Back for the Black and Gold this fall will be All-State star Jax Glendenning. Glendenning, a four-year varsity starter, was named the Ozark Con-

ference Offensive Player of the Year and has committed to Harding University to play collegiate football. In 2023, Glendenning rushed for 1,727 yards and 24 total touchdowns in 11 games while racking up 66 tackles as an All-Conference linebacker. Also returning to the backfield for LHS will be senior Abe Allen. Allen started all 11 games at slot and rushed for nearly 450 yards and four touchdowns while serving as the No. 1 cornerback on defense. Brayden Christian is set to take over the other slot position, and Carson Hill and Braiden Lamontagne are poised to see some carries. At receiver, juniors Evan Ogle and Brody Shoemaker will look to step up as solid blockers and pass catchers in their first varsity season. For the first time in two seasons, Lebanon will welcome a new quarterback. After

a summer full of competition, junior Westyn McKinney is likely to be the man in charge for LHS after a knee injury cut his varsity sophomore season short as a member of the Jackets' secondary. The offensive line will see a familiar face, with Eli Jackson

returning after starting five games a year ago. Kason Woods and Jake Rebmann are also expected to start along the offensive line. A couple of positions are still up for grabs, with competition between Kameron Myers,

Hayden Perkins, Colin Alford, and Tommy Jennings. On the defensive side of the ball, Lebanon returns seniors Nick Allen and Mason Hendricks, who might be one of the top defensive end duos in the Central Ozark Conference. Allen and Hendricks combined for five sacks and eight tackles for loss in 2023, earning them both first-team All-Conference honors. Jennings, Rebmann, Mason Jones, Christian Williams, and

Kinnett Lucas are also names to watch along the defensive front. Senior Avery Starnes and Christian will line up alongside Glendenning at the linebacker spots. Starnes started 11 games with 47 total tackles, while Christian had 31 tackles and one TFL. Both were named Honorable Mention All-OC last year. Eric Nichols and Carson Hill are also expected to compete for playing time as linebackers. Joining Allen in the secondary will be a mixture of Cameron Rose, Lamontagne, Shoemaker, Ogle, and Bodee O'Neil. Junior Rhett Rhoades will continue to be the special teams leader, returning for his third season

as the starting kicker. Rhoades was 51 of 54 (94.4%) on extra points while going 6 of 6 on field goals last year with a long of 37 yards and earning first-team All-Ozark Conference. "We have a nice core of returners who have been a part of success at each level. I like our team's physicality and desire to earn respect," Christian said. "We do lack experience in our new conference and overall depth, but we are still trying to increase numbers in our program and develop all depth." Lebanon will travel to Sarcocoe for their jamboree on August 23 before hosting Webb City at 7:00 p.m. on August 30.

# Lebanon Volleyball

A year after going 19-11-1, the Lebanon High School volleyball team is stepping into a new era as they transition from the Ozark Conference to the competitive Central Ozark Conference (COC). This move is seen as a major opportunity for the Yellowjackets, who are no strangers to facing high-caliber opponents. With the likes of Republic, Willard, Nixa, and Webb City already familiar foes from past regular seasons and tournaments, the team is well-prepared to handle the rigorous competition the COC will bring.

"It is a big move for our entire school district," 10th-year head coach Jenny Collins said. "Each conference match will bring highly competitive play and will be one of the toughest conferences in the state for volleyball."

After graduating key seniors last year, including Addy Collins, Ciarra Keeney, Raylee Quick, Sadie Douglas, and Ella Goforth, the 2024 season is looking promising for the Lady 'Jackets, with a strong foundation built on returning talent and the integration of new faces ready to make an impact.

Lebanon will be led by a core group of seniors who have been playing together since the fourth grade, providing stability and a deep understanding of each other's playing styles.

Addy Rebmann (senior outside hitter) – Pittsburg State Volleyball commit, 1st Team All-Conference, 2nd Team All-District, Branson All-Tourna-

ment Team "Addy has tallied over 1,000 kills in her three prior seasons," Collins said. "She will need to be a continued offensive threat for our team. We will look for her to bring leadership not only in her abilities offensively but defensively as well. Addy can attack effectively from all areas of the court. She takes advantage of the opportunity to pass out of serve receive and transitions to receive the set right back. She has really developed a strong back row attack and can be challenging for opponents to defend."

Saylor Helton (senior defensive specialist) – 2nd Team All-Conference, Honorable Mention All-District, Pinkfest All-Tournament Team

"This will be Saylor's third season at the varsity level. Saylor shows so much versatility in her play," said Collins. "She makes smart decisions out on the court that allow her to be a factor even when she is outsize at the net. She's shown she can be an effective attacker because she has developed solid off-speed tools, uses the blocks, and finds holes on the court. More impressive is her defensive play. She anticipates and reads hitters well, making some incredibly tough defensive plays look easy. She loves the defensive grind."

Morgan Durbin (senior setter) – 1st Team All-Conference, 2nd Team All-District

"Morgan will be in her second season captaining our offense. She is a smart, gritty athlete who is confident in her abilities and works to deliver a ball that helps us to run a faster

offense," Collins stated about Durbin's play. "She works incredibly hard to build upon her setter/hitter relationships. She has the ability to create an element of spark that is contagious amongst her teammates."

Kaidynce Buttram (senior middle hitter)

"Kaidynce is effective in scoring out of the middle and likes to get in for the quick-tempo ball," Collins mentioned. It will be important that she establishes herself in the middle early in the match to take pressure off of our pins."

Rilee Jackson (senior outside hitter)

"Rilee has played at both pins over the summer months," stated Collins. "She isn't very big but is a very explosive jumper. She is quick to the ball and has a fast arm swing. We look for her to be a factor at the net this season."

Kaylee Uder (senior defensive specialist)

"Kaylee brought some defensive tenacity last season when called upon," Collins explained. "She has an even-tempered personality that brings calmness to her teammates. She's athletic and comes up with big plays in crucial situations."

The team also welcomes several newcomers and juniors who are poised to contribute significantly. Below is an excerpt from Collins about each one:

Missy Mizell (Junior, MH) — Missy is well-known in the area for her swimming success. We are excited to have her back in the program this season. Missy brings a big block and will more than likely see hitter action

She has been very complimentary as a pin hitter alongside Rilee. She makes smart decisions and shows great ball control, being able to turn and place the ball effectively on the court. Defensively, she anticipates and reads hitters well and makes solid defensive plays.

Addison Dent (Junior, Setter/DS), Baylyn Williams (Junior, Setter/DS), and Jaylin Keller (Junior, MH) — All three of these juniors have seen themselves in the varsity line-up over the summer months. They show great versatility within their play. They can run an offense, make great defensive plays, and find

ways to score. I have no doubt that when given the opportunity, they will capitalize on it and fill the role given.

Liv Ahmann (Freshman, MH) — Liv brings a nice element of height to the net. Being a freshman, she is young in experience but has completely embraced the challenge of being "thrown to the wolves" not only in practice but also in summer league play. She's athletic-minded, and we will look for her to help put up a big block in helping to shut down the offensive threat of some of our opponents.

After losing to Nixa in the district opening round a year ago, Collins said her team has been motivated this offseason and is excited to get the season rolling.

"Our team will be known for resilience and teamwork," she said. "We

never give up, we support each other no matter what, and we play with passion and determination. We want to be known as a team that's tough to compete against because we work hard together and never back down from a challenge.

"We need to be able to execute our strategy without getting overly distracted by what the other team is doing. By staying focused on our own performance and improving ourselves, we should be able to put forth a competitive match regardless of the competition we face."

Lebanon, Central, Strafford, and Hollister will compete at the Central Jamboree. They open their season at the Branson tournament on Saturday, September 1. LHS will host Neosho in their home opener on September 10.

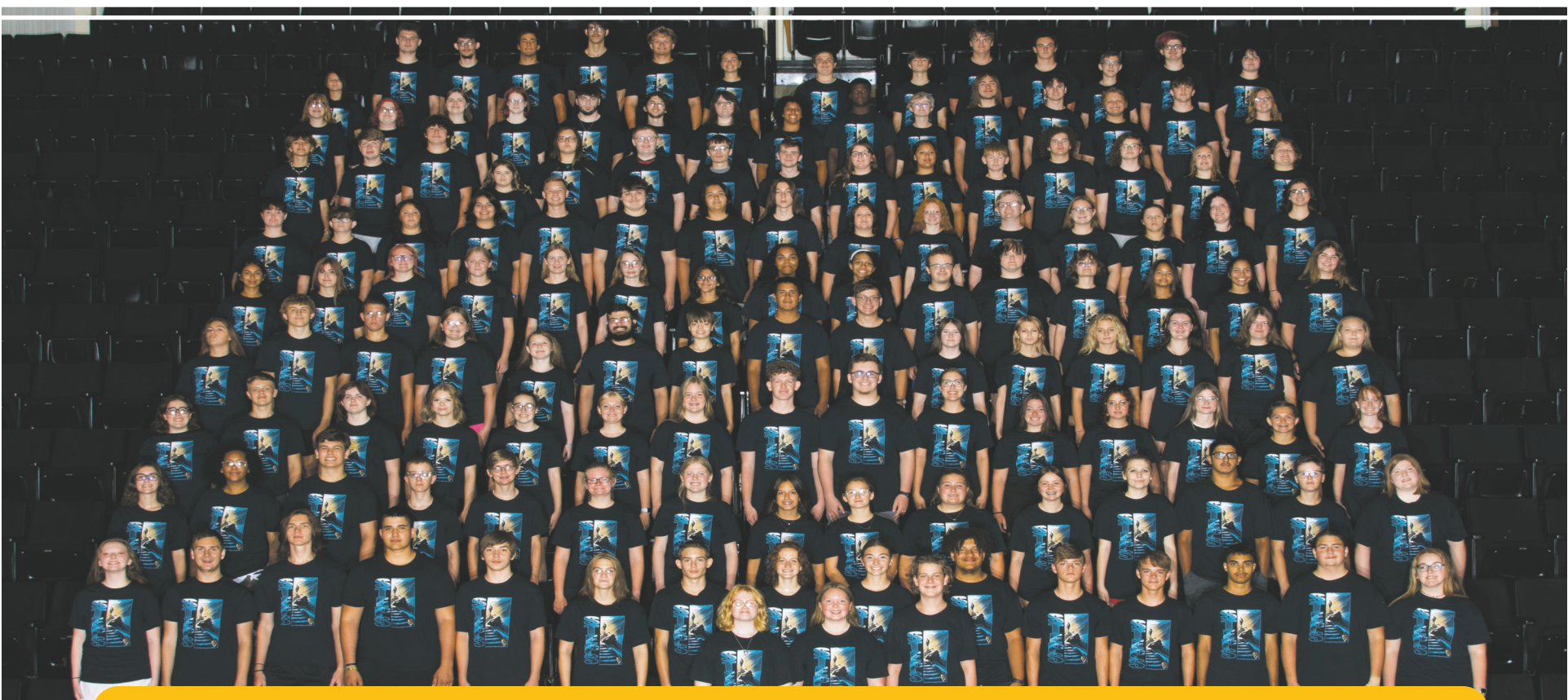

Conway competes in the Summit Conference, which includes Hartville and Mansfield. All competitors in the conference are within an hour of one another, according to Robison.

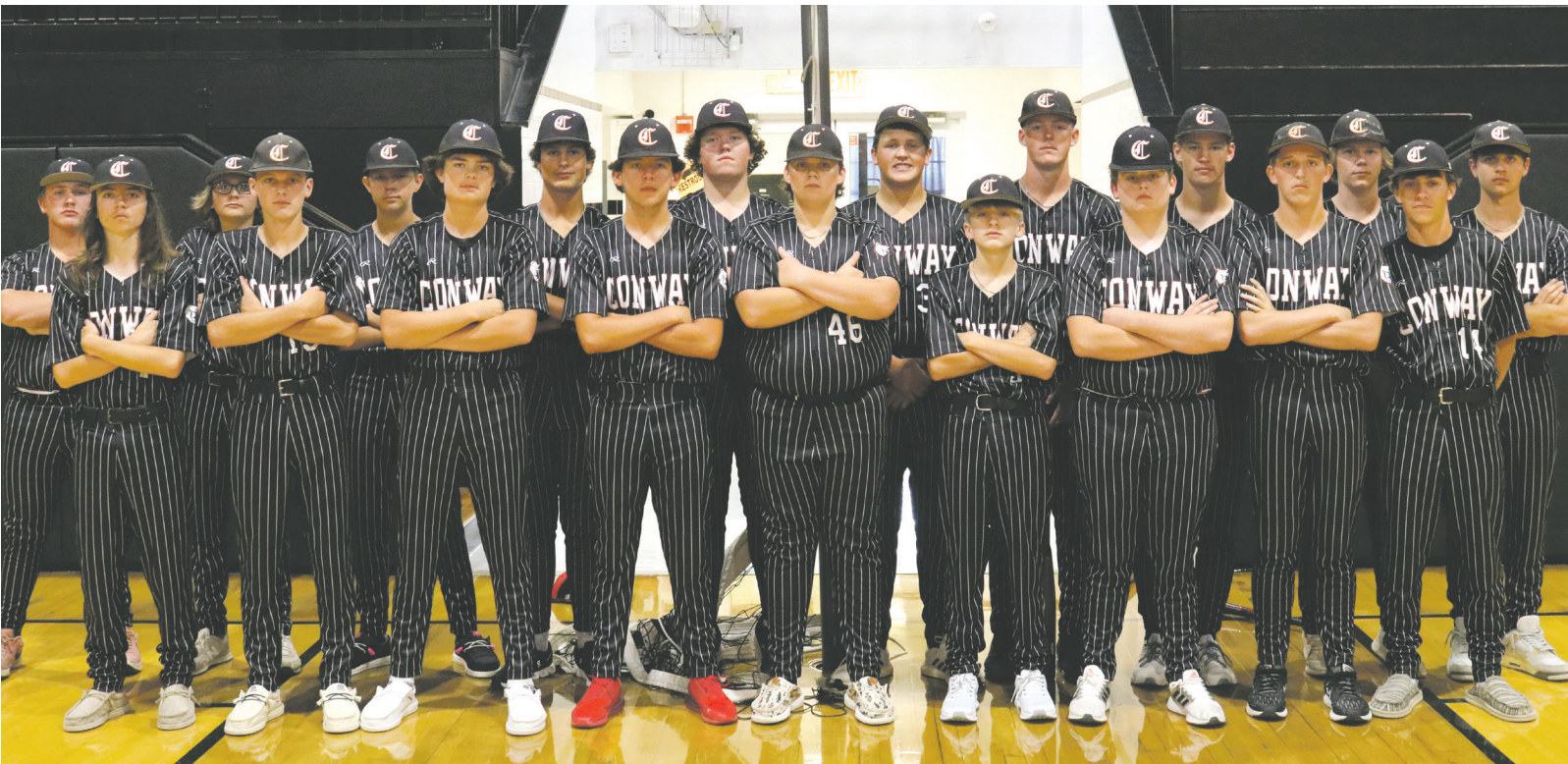
"We're pretty excited about the competition level, too," Robison said.
