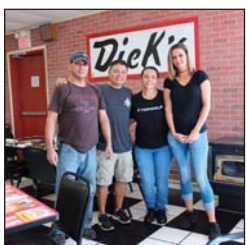

## Doña Ana County 'Your Partner in Progress'

### Free "NoThrow" app helps generate 1,700 reports

More than 1,000 residents and visitors to Doña Ana County have downloaded the free "NoThrow" app, resulting in 1,700 reports generated from the app.

"More than 60 percent of the reports we received through the app were remediated. That means we are gaining momentum and cleaning up our neighborhoods, public lands and trails, together," said Lee Galt, GIS Administrator with the county's Community Development.

App-generated, anonymous reports of illegally dumped trash were in addition to the 1,000 calls to the Codes Enforcement office. Those calls also helped clean up many other sites.

The free app enables users to help keep Doña Ana County beautiful by snapping a photo of an illegal dump site and uploading it to the app, along with the GPS or global positioning system location and some additional information.

"When someone takes the picture, we can seamlessly see the photo and its location and arrange for clean-up," Galt said.

The app is available for download on both Apple (iOS) and Android devices. To download the app, enter 'Dona Ana County,'

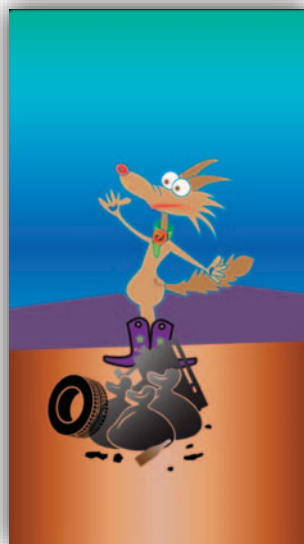
without the quotation marks in the app store search bar.

The app is an initiative of the Doña Ana County Illegal Dumping Partnership (IDP), a multi-agency task force founded to help combat illegal dumping throughout the County. The IDP is committed to increasing the public health and safety of Doña Ana County residents, as well as keeping the area clean and beautiful.

Since its start in 2002, with a pilot program, Doña Ana County codes officers have identified and recorded more than 850 illegal dumpsites, resulting in prosecutions of illegal dumpers and remediation.

The IDP is active in communities and schools throughout the county, providing public education to increase awareness about environmental responsibility and resources needed for community cleanup days. The relocation places staff near the live animal evidence area and court-hold services. "You don't have to come to the office to get a codes officer or an Animal Control Officer to follow up on your concerns," said Vicki Lusk, Animal Control and Codes Enforcement Manager. "Instead, please call the Mesilla Valley Regional Dispatch non-emergency number. Doing so will get an animal control or codes enforcement officer assigned to the case. Also, this helps us document incidents, track their frequency, adjust resources and plan."

# November ballot includes bond to benefit community college

Arguably, one of the most important items on the Nov. 5 election ballot isn't the name of a candidate or a race for public office. It's the \$16 million general obligation bond to benefit Doña Ana Community College.

DACC is one of at least four institutions that will have questions and/or candidates on what will be Las Cruces' first combined ballot, which will also include Las Cruces Public Schools' three-mill levy as well as races for two seats on the LCPS Board of Education; Las Cruces mayor, three city council districts and presiding municipal judge; and three seats on the Doña Ana Soil and Water Conservation District Board of Supervisors.

If approved, bond funding will support projects at both DACC campuses in Las Cruces (Espina Street on the NMSU campus and the East Mesa), as well as the DACC Workforce Development Center, 2345 Nevada Ave. in Las Cruces, and DACC campuses in Anthony, Chaparral and Sunland Park.

There will be no increase in property taxes should the bond pass, as 2019 bonds will replace those approved by voters in 2015, which will retire, DACC Vice President for External Relations Eddie Binder said. DACC has floated a bond issue every four years since 1973. A GO bond is a form of debt financing secured by property tax revenue.

The 2019 bond projects are part of DACC's goal of giving its students "the opportunity to change their lives," said DACC President Monica Torres, who was named DACC's 10th president in May.

But it's bigger than that, Torres said, because, when students improve their own lives, they also change the com-

munity for the better and make it more attractive to business and industry.

"We can actually alter

the life of the community if we're successful," she said.

The bond funding will

support these DACC projects, according to an Aug. 29 news release:

• Creative media

building, \$3.9 million (of the \$16 million total requested in the bond). "A 15,300-square-foot facility will be built in the Arrowhead Research Park to support the DACC Creative Media Technology Program as a tenant in the Creative Campus Concept at NMSU. It will connect students with local companies and allow DACC to partner with industry and others in film, gaming and creative media. The new facility will provide synergy with other tenants of Arrowhead Park."

• Security and safety upgrades, \$1.4 million. "DACC has undertaken a project to complete a comprehensive review of safety and security

# State Auditor Colón takes his office on the road

New Mexico State Auditor Brian Colón plans to visit all 33 New Mexico counties during his first 18 months in office to “increase people’s awareness of the work we do,” he said in an Aug. 29 interview during a visit to Las Cruces to hold open office hours.

An Albuquerque attorney and 2014 candidate for lieutenant governor, Colón, a Democrat, was elected state auditor last November with more than 57 percent of the vote. Since his Jan. 1 swearing in, Colón has “really wanted to take the office on the road,” he said, to help people learn about its mission and impact.

“We work best when the community engages with us,” Colón said. “I didn’t get elected to sit behind a desk.” His office performs “stronger and better audits if they’re

done in the communities where people live and government can serve them best,” he said.

In addition to Las Cruces, his late-August visits included stops in Deming, Lordsburg, Silver City, Los Lunas, Española and Wagon Mound.

“I’m loving every minute of it,” Colón said. “It’s been 241 days of awesome.”

Colón said he has been pleasantly surprised by the number of people participating in open office hours he’s conducted around the state. A woman in the audience said, “thank you for caring about us,” Colón said, when he attended a city council meeting in Las Vegas about the city’s budget.

The mission of the

state auditor, an office created in 1912, is “to hold local and state government accountable in its use of public funds,” according to [www.saonm.org](http://www.saonm.org). Pursuant to the state Audit Act, “every government agency in New Mexico that receives or expends public funds is required to account for that money daily and submit a report to the OSA (office of the State Auditor) annually. Accounting for this money may take the form of an audit or a tiered system certification or engagement.” (The tiered system of financial reporting applies to local public bodies that have less than \$500,000 in annual revenue, excluding capital outlay appropriations and grants,” according to the OSA website.)

In addition to performing audits, seven OSA auditors regularly conduct special audits and examinations, according to the website, related to allegations of governmental fraud, waste and abuse.

“Every complaint is im-

portant,” said Colón, who was the first in his family to attend college. He earned a bachelor’s degree in finance from New Mexico State University and lived in Las Cruces until he was 28.

Colón said calls to the OSA fraud hotline are up about 25 percent since he was sworn in. “We’re excited about that,” Colón said, because part of his function as state auditor “is to make sure New Mexico is getting what they deserve: good government. “There is no higher calling,” Colón said, than helping to “restore faith in government.”

Despite a divide between New Mexicans living along the Interstate 25 corridor and the rest of the state and between urban and rural residents, Colón said he finds “an optimism I have not felt or seen in a long time” in part due to increased state revenues.

“I’ve been around the state a long time,” Colón said. “I just feel an excitement that’s different.”

Colón said he has a

strong OSA staff backing him up, including Deputy State Auditor Natalie Cordova, a CPA. “She is dynamite,” Colón said. He has about 30 people on staff and oversees the work of 75-100 independent accountants conducting 600-1,000 annual audits and related reviews.

Colón is “living his dream” fulfilling a “deep desire to serve the state,” he said. “My job is to do the right thing and fear no one.”

concerns at all campuses,” said DACC communications director Eddie Binder. “The team includes representatives from police, fire, security, environmental health and safety facilities, information technology (IT) support and the safety committee. Examples of some of the items already identified include exterior and interior lighting needs, electrical hazards, sidewalk repairs, grounds work, signage, ADA issues, alarm system replacements, improvements to bio hazard, maintenance, IT storage spaces, lighting, cameras, fencing repairs and replacements.”

• **Infrastructure Improvements, \$2 million.** “Maintenance, repair and site development will be implemented, such as internal and exterior building system upgrades/replacement, building repair and painting at all campuses,” the news release said.

• **Classroom upgrades and renovations, \$1 million.** “Renovation of selected instructional labs and classrooms and updated equipment is part of the classroom renovation plan,” the news release said.

Renovations will include room configurations, furniture, finishes and instructional equipment as guided by a classroom renovation plan,” Binder said.

• **IT upgrades/equipment acquisition, \$4 million.** “All campuses have identified IT needs as part of a master plan to address network and wireless connectivity and technology at each cam-

DACC, which is celebrating its 45th anniversary, is the fourth-largest higher education institution in New Mexico.

pus and center,” according to the news release.

A detailed list of IT needs was developed that breaks down information into four primary categories: Infrastructure, including upgrades to cabling, wifi, VoIP, UPS, etc.; IT spaces, including removal of old, abandoned cabling, moving outside IT spaces indoors, proper set up of cable and IT data racks; security and surveillance systems, including access control and security systems; and audio visual systems, including updates and upgrades to IT equipment and additional technol-

ogy in support of the DACC Apple Initiative.

“Several years ago, we started with something called the iPad initiative to use new technology as a learning tool for today's students in the classroom,” Binder said. Using technology that “students had grown up with,” he said, “the program has grown exponentially” and now includes DACC's auto, nursing, dental hygiene and HVAC (heating, ventilation and air conditioning) training programs, as well as classes like math, sociology, computers, business, science and communications.

“With the improved IT asked for in this bond, the iPad technology will continue to increase,” Binder said. DACC changed the name of the program last year to include other Apple technology in the classroom, including the ability for students

to program in Swift, a language for app development.

• **Gadsden Advanced Technology Center, \$3 million.** “A 15,800 square foot center will include two technology labs and two classrooms to support the growth and utilization of technology

in career and technical education (CTE) programs,” the release said. Bond funds will “support the implementation of integrated technologies training to include cybersecurity, embedded tech programming, HVAC, aerospace, security, enterprise programming such as amazon and oracle, mobile device programming phones, devices, remotes and web programming,” Binder said.

GO bond funds will also benefit partnerships DACC has created in the community, Torres said, citing its work with Aprendamos, an early intervention provider that conducts visits to hundreds of homes in the county and can help DACC reach individuals who want to return to school but aren't sure how to begin the process.

Torres said DACC is also partnering with itself by providing customized training programs that connect with technical expertise available in the community to fit the specific needs of local business and industry. DACC will also be able to respond more quickly to the changing needs of the business community, Torres said.

And, bond funds will help as DACC's enrollment grows, Torres said.

**A New Mexico institution turns 80****“T**here’s no such thing as a self-made person.”

Those are the words of Katy Griggs Camuñez, founder of La Posta de Mesilla restaurant.

Camuñez made the comment in a grainy 1982 video that was re-shown Monday, Sept. 16, at La Posta’s 80th birthday celebration. Camuñez talked about her 1939 plan to start a little “chile joint,” and about finding a room to rent for \$8 a month.

Camuñez wanted to open the restaurant on Sept. 16, 1939, but that was a short time away, and the room was in sorry shape. She knew she needed help, so she walked across the street to what was then the Billy the Kid Saloon. She found a plasterer, a painter and another handyman, and bribed the trio with wine to get the work done.

And so, just under the wire, she opened on Sept. 16, 1939, the 129th anniversary of Mexican Independence Day. Katy

had no way of knowing that a much larger La Posta chile joint would celebrate its 80th birthday on the 209th anniversary of Mexican Independence Day.

She also could not have known her grand-niece, Jerean Camuñez Hutchinson (who did not exist in 1939, by the way), would own La Posta with her husband, Tom Hutchinson.

Even when Katy recorded that video in advance of La Posta’s 43rd birthday, the Hutchinsons were still 14 years from owning the restaurant.

And Katy could not have imagined Jerean’s sparkling decorating touch, that would add brilliant color and the beauty of Mexico’s old and new to the restaurant. She also could not have imagined the many expansions on her chile joint room which, now, would probably cost a little more than \$8 a month to rent.

Going back to Katy’s self-made person comment, though, Jerean echoed much the same thing Monday night at the 80th birthday celebration.

When you hear of people working for 20, 30 and even 40 years at the same place, you think of banks, insurance companies or the military. You don’t think of restaurants.

However, dozens of people

have logged those kinds of careers with La Posta. Jerean said those are the people who made La Posta what it is, which, to me is one of the great “experience” restaurants in the Southwest.

When I moved to Alamogordo in 1995, and my parents came to visit from Oklahoma, my mom was adamant we go to La Posta.

“I remember going to La Posta when I was a kid,” she said. “We have to go there!”

My mom grew up in Fort Worth, Texas, but her aunt and uncle, Florence and A.B. Cox, and their daughters, my mom’s cousins, lived in Las Cruces. Her summer visits, in the late 1940s and early 1950s, to the Cox ranch and to their Las Cruces home included trips to Mesilla to dine at La Posta.

So, when mom realized I lived so close, it became my obligation as a dutiful son to make sure she renewed her La Posta fix on any trip to New Mexico. We’ve had birthday celebrations for each of my daughters there, and I’ve been to many, many events and celebrations at La Posta.

The Hutchinsons are deeply engaged in our community and frequently host special receptions for various visitors, guests and special occasions.

I’m sure I’ve eaten several times my body weight in La Posta fare.

Everyone loves the parrots, and we’re fascinated by the piranhas. Although I’ve never had my burning question answered: How does piranha taste? I suspect, with some green chile, not bad.

Of course, the heart of any restaurant has to be the food, and many of the current dishes don’t stray too far from the ones Katy served 80 years ago. What she called tostadas and chile, we now call chips and salsa, and La Posta has some of my favorite. I love to doctor the salsa with some fresh lemon juice. I’m also partial to their red chile con carne and their green chile cheeseburgers.

I’m also a big fan of La Posta’s tequileria, which has as many as a hundred tequilas behind the bar. I prefer my agave spirits unadorned, but many La Posta regulars go strictly for one of the many specialty margaritas.

La Posta’s many patrons all have many favorite aspects about the restaurant, and each time I go, I feel a little as if I have my mom’s spirit in tow.

Here’s to you, Mom. And here’s to La Posta de Mesilla. Feliz Cumpleaños!

On Aug. 5, the City of Las Cruces adopted a resolution authorizing the City to allow a budget adjustment from the Telshor Fund for \$500,000, through an amendment to the City's adopted FY2020 budget, in order to pay for emergency humanitarian assistance to 15,007 asylum seekers from April through July of 2019. The Telshor Fund provides funding for health services and the transfer left the Telshor fund with an adjusted balance of \$33.5 million, according to the Las Cruces Sun News.

According to El Paso KVIA News, in 2016 "the Las Cruces City Council unanimously approved to contribute (only) \$25,000, also paid through the Telshor Fund, to a feasibility study to consider the possibility of building a public hospital to treat the mentally ill in Las Cruces. Mental health advocates at the council meeting expressed the need for a state-run facility in Las Cruces that provides long

# Trump rally like seeing a Kiss concert the second time

Steve Pearce had some advice for Donald Trump before Monday's campaign rally in Rio Rancho.

"Tone is everything," Pearce said, according to the Las Cruces Sun-News.

Throughout his political career, Pearce was a master at getting the tone right, speaking softly and respectfully while voting loudly and disrespectfully as a member of the most right-wing groups in Congress, first the Tea Party Caucus and then its offspring, the Freedom Caucus.

Pearce said he gave Trump that same advice during the last campaign. And, he insisted there is evidence that the president is listening.

"His persona is changing, some people say very slightly, much more gracious, much more presidential," Pearce said.

Then the rally started, and it was classic Trump.

Jimmy Buffet once advised, "Don't try to describe a Kiss concert if

you haven't seen one." I think the same can be said for a Trump campaign rally.

The Kiss concert, with its over-the-top pyrotechnics, demonic cos-

tumes, and massive stage design, not to mention Gene Simmons' serpentine tongue, was jaw-dropping the first time you saw it. Even for those who had seen thousands of concerts before, they had never seen anything quite like that.

That was Donald Trump in 2016. Jaw-dropping. Even the most hardened, jaded campaign veterans who had been to every county fair in Iowa, knew all the diners in New Hampshire and had covered candidates ranging from George Wallace to George McGovern ... none of them had ever seen anything like Trump before.

That was on full display when the Trump campaign came to Albuquerque for a rally prior to the 2016 election.

Outside the arena, police struggled to contain violent clashes between

Trump supporters and protesters.

But what was happening inside the arena is what made the rally so different - a candidate running for president who was completely unfiltered and unscripted, riffing off the top of his head, gauging crowd reaction and going wherever they wanted him to go.

There was an element of danger that made it all seem more exciting. You never knew what he might say, or how he would react to the inevitable protesters. The television networks couldn't get enough. Even those who disliked Trump tuned in to see what might happen.

Trump came back to New Mexico on Monday, and it was kind of like going back to a Kiss concert three years after having seen them for the first time. Instead of being surprised by what they saw, the crowd knew what was coming, and was eager to sing along.

There were no protests to speak of. One had been planned but was wisely called off for safety concerns due primarily to the remote

location of the arena. Which I think is a good thing. While I agree that many of Trump's policies are worthy of protest, I also thought protests Monday would have added an air of drama to the event that it didn't deserve.

Trump put on a show Monday for his fans in New Mexico.

For me, it was a disappointment. I tuned in expecting to be outraged and was bored instead. I tried to make it all the way through but kept drifting off and eventually gave up.

But I realize that, like rap music and abstract art, the show wasn't for me. It was for Trump's fans. And they seemed to enjoy it, based on the reaction.

It won't make a bit of difference, of course, in the 2020 election, despite the dreams of Trump's campaign manager Brad Parscale.

But it is nice that Trump's fans in New Mexico had a chance to see the show one more time before it gets cancelled.

A 2006 report by the National Alliance for the Mentally Ill rated New Mexico second-lowest in per capita spending for state-directed mental health service.

The state of New Mexico has one of the highest rates of opioid abuse in the United States with the 3rd highest drug overdose rate in America as of 2015. Doña Ana County ranks 4th out of 33 counties in the state for opioid-related overdoses. New Mexico suffers from very high alcohol abuse rates; the Las Cruces area alone accounts for 6.2 percent of New Mexico's alcohol-related deaths.

# Lecture series highlights discoveries on the Cañada Alamosa

Human Systems Research, Inc. (HSR) of Las Cruces, founded in 1972, is the oldest nonprofit in New Mexico doing archeological research, including as the sole-source archeological contractor for a host of historic sites on White Sands Missile Range.

In 1999 HSR, located at 535 S. Melendres St., accepted an offer to partner with Dennis and Trudy O'Toole, owners of the 5,000-acre Monticello Box Ranch, in a study to understand and relate the stories of the people who had lived along Alamosa Creek. Over the past 20 years, the Human Systems Research, Inc. (HSR) lecture series has included numerous researchers working on some aspect of the Cañada Alamosa analyses. Their subjects have included geology, geomorphology, obsidian

and ceramic sourcing, ground stone, projectile points, Apaches, climate change, etc.

A frequently asked question has been 'Can you somehow wrap up all this information?'

HSR Associate Direc-

tor for Research and Public Education and Cañada Alamosa Project Director Karl Laumbach will attempt to do just that over the course of five lectures offered in the 2019-20 lecture series.

Raised on a northeastern New Mexico ranch, Laumbach has pursued an archaeological career in southern New Mexico since 1974. A graduate of New Mexico State University, he spent nine years directing projects

for the NMSU contract archaeology program before joining Human Systems Research, Inc. in 1983.

Laumbach's research interests are varied, including land grant research in his native northeastern New Mexico, the pueblo archaeology of southern New Mexico, and the history and archaeology of the Apache.

The 7 p.m. Sept. 26 lecture:

• The Archaic Occupation of the Cañada Alamosa

For 13 years the Cañada Alamosa Project tested four sites with pithouse and pueblo components located on the Rio Alamosa in southeastern Socorro County, New Mexico. Given the nature of the sites, the project focused on obtaining 2,000 years of cultural, temporal and environmental data that included the historic period. During the last years of field work it became obvious that while Archaic materials were extremely limited on the surface of the sites and adjacent terraces, evidence for the Late Archaic could be found if the appropriate geomorphic contexts were explored. With a

bit of luck and the help of Dr. Curtis Monger, soil scientist, the outline of Late Archaic period climate change and horticultural development was gleaned from such contexts, including the earliest corn east of the Continental Divide. The lessons learned may have application in the Mimbres Valley and other areas where evidence for the Archaic is currently limited or absent from the record.

## Las Cruces Utilities trains for the worst with one of the best

Even before she became an emergency response trainer, Janet E. Kerley had a knack for being at the right place at the more dangerous times.

"First I was in Mexico working on a Ph.D. and there was an 8.2 earthquake. Then I went back to Washington state and Mt. St. Helens blew up," she said. "I returned to the Yucatan and Mt. Chichón blew. That's when I got a telegram from my dad that said, 'What are you doing?'"

Kerley explains that by training she is an archeological chemist with a 27-year career in emergency response. She lives in Albuquerque and works today as an environmental, health, and safety instructor at Santa Fe Community College. That puts her close enough to Las Cruces to drive down and train Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) associates for the yearly Hazardous Waste Operations and Emergency Response (HAZWOPER) recertification.

"Since 9/11, emergency response and management of incidents has changed significantly ... and there are more requirements for public sector agencies to train and work together," Kerley says. "Today, the National Incident Management Systems (NIMS) organizes agencies across the entire U.S. to respond to any incident of significance."

Kerley knows significant hazards. Over her career, she not only worked as a chemist, but served on the Emergency Response Team for Signetics; she also served on the Damage Assessment team for the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) follow-

ing the Exxon Valdez oil spill on the Alaska coast, acted as team leader following Hurricane Ivan in Florida, and was a chairperson of the local emergency planning committee for the City of Albuquerque/Bernalillo County.

In early August, Kerley worked with LCU associates to complete

their annual HAZWOPER recertification. During the refresher training, LCU staff reviewed their procedures for responding to a wide range of potential chemical spills. They demonstrated their ability to recognize hazards and use the appropriate Personal Protective Equipment to respond safely to different levels of chemical hazards.

"It's critical that agencies train for emergencies. Technology can always fail, and we have to be prepared for that," Kerley said. "We do annual refresher courses to be sure the information is fresh in the minds of responders. Employees never know what they might be called out to.

If a chemical from garbage leaks out on a city street or is taken in at the transfer station, they have to be ready."

But she also knew that it's not employees alone who need to be ready. She said, "If you're dealing with chemicals, please read the label and learn how to properly handle the material that may be dangerous for not only yourself, but to those who might deal with it as waste."

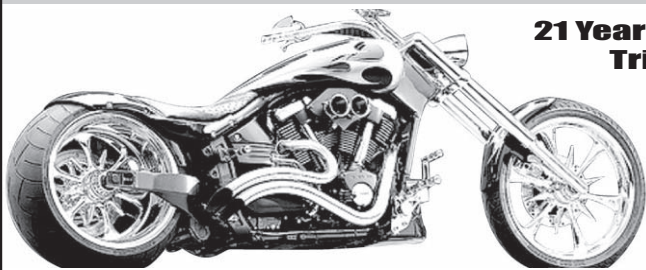

# Papen: 'My work isn't finished'

"I am running for re-election to continue the important work that I have started," New Mexico State Sen. Mary Kay Papen, D-Doña Ana, said in the news release announcing her bid for a sixth term representing state Senate District 38. "This community and the people of Senate District 38 are my priority," she said.

"I'm going to run hard, I always run hard," said Papen, who has two challenges in the June 2020 Democratic primary. She is one of several incumbent Democrats in the state Senate who have primary opponents. "The progressives are after us," Papen said. "They want us gone."

Papen said opposition to her re-election arose because of her votes on several bills during the 2019 legislative session, including House Bill 51, which would have repealed certain state laws that criminalize abortion. Papen said she has always supported abortion rights in cases of rape, incest and the health of the mother, but believes adoption is a better alternative to abortion in other cases. "There are so many people out there who want to adopt," she said.

Papen said serving as president pro-tem of the state Senate has placed her in a "unique position to really help this community. It has made a huge difference down here," she said. "We're

have power down here. We're not the stepchild to the north."

Papen said she "has helped pass some of the state's most important legislation" during her 20 years in the Senate and has served on 18 legislative committees.

A 2018 bill Papen sponsored transferred property to reestablish Mesilla Valley Bosque State Park near Las Cruces and Mesilla. She also is the author of Katie's Law, which requires that DNA samples be taken from all people arrested in the commission of a felony.

A long-time advocate for mental health, the de-

velopmentally disabled and autism awareness, Papen was critical of former Gov. Susana Martinez for freezing Medicaid payments to behavioral health providers in the state. "Her bill to provide access to Medicaid services and to afford due process to Medicaid providers will help resolve disputes and will require a judicial review of credible allegations of fraud," a campaign news release said.

The best way to solve immigration and U.S.-Mexico border issues is to "come together and come up with a comprehensive plan," Papen said. "We need to process people in the right way," she said, to accommodate those who come to the United States legally and to deal properly with illegals. Programs that allow workers from Central and South America to work in the U.S. and return to their home countries need to be re-established, she said. "We need to find a way to fix the problem, not just ring our hands and

just say 'no.'"

The international border is a federal issue, she said, "but they're not willing to tackle it." "I know this border," Papen said in the interview. "I understand this border. This border has always been a part of who I am."

Papen said one reason she decided to run for re-election is to "protect the things I think are important, including the state permanent fund, which some legislators have suggested tapping. "We are so flush with money, why would we go and take money out of our savings account?" she asked.

Papen said she is also running again because

of "unfinished business" on issues like mental health, autism, the colonias, addressing the needs of the City of Las Cruces and Doña Ana County and making sure New Mexico State University "is all it can be."

As part of that effort, Papen helped create funding for autism testing to be conducted at NMSU, so families needn't travel to Albuquerque and wait for service. "This is going to be big for helping people with a disability," she said.

"I believe in hemp," Papen said, adding that hemp farming could be a boon for Doña Ana County farmers and the

local economy. She's also an advocate of adequate research to determine any health risks related to the use of medical marijuana. "I'm willing to look at it," she said about the legalization of marijuana in the state. "I think you need to take a very measured approach on this. I want to know the effects."

Papen, 87, said age "should not be a determinant of whether you are capable of running or doing your job." She continues to drive back and forth regularly to Santa Fe and other parts of the state, she said, and remains in good health.

"I just feel like my work isn't finished."

# Las Cruces native hopes to add 'young voice' to council

Robert Palacios is a young candidate who is part of an old family.

Palacios, 29, is running for the District 4 seat on the Las Cruces City Council. He is a fourth-generation Las Cruces whose great uncle is former city councilor and mayor pro-tem Henry Benavidez. (Palacios' father is a retired Las Cruces police officer and his 93-year-old grandfather continues to run a ranch in Springer, New Mexico.)

"The more I get involved, the more I see a need for a young voice," said Palacios, adding that he will be a full-time councilor if elected and will focus "totally on Las Cruces and what directly effects our constituents." Palacios said he also wants to provide

a "bigger voice for Hispanic culture and arts in our community."

Incumbent District 4 Councilor Jack Eakman, who served one four-year term, is not seeking re-election.

Palacios is challenged in the District 4 race by Johana Bencomo and Antoinette Reyes.

# Jack Valencia seeks return to city council

Jack Valencia served 16 years on the Las Cruces City Council (1985-2001), and he wants to return.

"I have the passion to serve," said Valencia, 63, who is running for the District 2 seat on the council that is currently held by Greg Smith.

Smith is giving it up after two four-year terms to run for mayor.

Valencia, 63, said he made important decisions about Las Cruces' growth and development during his previous council service, including annexations, direct election of the mayor and other changes to the city charter, partnering with Doña Ana County on a joint solid waste authority and regional dispatch, and with Las Cruces Public Schools on the Field of Dreams; expansion of city parks and sports fields; building a new police station and new fire stations; improvements to the West Mesa industrial park and Las Cruces airport, as well as city streets; and initiating the

city's trail system, Court Youth Center, the city skate park and teen youth center, the Las Cruces Convention Center, Roadrunner Transit Dial-a-ride service and Branigan Cultural Center; as well as increased funding for the city Meals on Wheels program.

"I know we prospered and made progress," Valencia said of his time on the city council.

During his elected service, Valencia said he even survived a 1988 recall election, receiving the largest number of votes against being recalled of the councilors targeted.

With that experience, Valencia said he will have "no learning curve" if he is again elected to deal with city issues and citizen concerns like roads, lights, public safety and even barking dogs and

other complaints.

"Constituents need to be listened to and have someone they trust to act on their behalf," Valencia said in a campaign news release. "I have 16 years of results," he said, adding that he would "bring a broad base of knowledge" to the council if he is again elected to serve.

"It's all about finding opportunities and making informed decisions," said Valencia, a former mayor pro-tem who served with four different Las Cruces mayors and 15 fellow council members.

A native of Chicago, Valencia moved to New Mexico in 1961, living and working in Farmington and Santa Fe in addition to the 43 years he's spent in Las Cruces, returning here in 2012.

In Las Cruces, he attended Immaculate Heart of Mary Catholic School, Conlee Elementary, Lynn Junior High and Las Cruces High School. Valencia attended New Mexico State University 1974 -79, majoring in criminal justice with a minor in government, according to a news release. Valencia began his professional career as an investigator with the New Mexico

Child Support Enforcement Bureau (NMCSEB), the release said, then managed a regional NMCSEB office. He also worked as an investigator with the New Mexico Workers Compensation Administration and as executive director for the New Mexico Passenger Transportation Association and project manager for the North-Central Regional Transit District in Santa Fe. He is also a past-president of the New Mexico Municipal League.

City Council District 2 begins south of Missouri Avenue/Boutz Road and continues to the southern city limits. The district doesn't include NMSU, but does surround it, and Valencia said he feels a strong attachment to the university, which he said is one of Las Cruces' most important assets. "I love the campus," he said, "what it brings to our community."

In his news release, Valencia said his "clear vision for the future of Las Cruces" includes making NMSU and the city "into a more highly competitive community, to promote and recruit academic industries such as technology and manufacturing to meet the growing needs of our diverse community."

"I'm a common-sense person," Valencia said. "I've dealt with all kinds of government activities. I believe government can assist in making better situations. I have the passion to serve."

Palacios said he sees numerous important issues the city council needs to address, including economic development and job creation. Nearly a quarter of Las Cruces residents live in poverty, Palacios said, and there is a need to create good jobs for residents, especially so NMSU graduates don't have to move elsewhere to find gainful employment.

Continuing to develop the local film industry also is "a great opportunity for Las Cruces," he said. "Our area has a lot to offer." Growing the local economy also means "you've got to support small business," Palacios said. That includes streamlining the process for opening a new business to get everything done as quickly and safely as possible to get the doors open. Palacios said he is also an advocate for more city-run programs and workshops focused on starting a business and job creation.

Palacios said the council needs to do a better job of communicating with residents. "The council's not doing its best at

listening," he said. One solution would be to move council meetings from afternoons to evenings so more people could attend and "at least be heard."

City council also needs to be a "stronger voice for education," Palacios said. He wants trade-school electives like electrical, plumbing and HVAC built into high school curriculums, Palacios said, because "four-year college is not the fit-all answer to being educated."

Palacios also wants the city to grow the West Mesa industrial park and Las Cruces Airport.

"We need to do a lot with District 4," Palacios said. "I think there's great opportunity in District 4."

Palacios is a 2008 graduate of Mayfield High School. He completed the master recording program at the Conservatory of Recording Arts and Sciences in Tempe, Arizona, and returned to Las Cruces to pursue a degree in music business at NMSU. Palacios served more than six years with the New Mexico Army National Guard and was a member of the Leadership Las Cruces class of 2016.

With a passion for music and radio, Palacios

has worked at Bravo Mic Communications, KRUX 91.5FM and KRWG Public Media, and opened his own small business, the Las Cruces Mariachi Conservatory, in 2016, turning it over to the New Mexico Advocates for the Arts (NMAA) last November, according to his campaign announcement.

Palacios serves as the volunteer executive director of NMAA, is a member of Los Amigos (ambassadors) of the Hispanic Chamber of Commerce and serves on the governing council for La Academia Dolores Huerta charter middle school. He is a former member of the Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce Conquistadores and big brother with the Big Brothers Big Sisters of Las Cruces. Palacios also served on the executive leadership team of the local 2018 March of Dimes March for Babies.

Making his first bid for public office, Palacios said the most rewarding part of his campaign is "sitting down with the community members and listening."

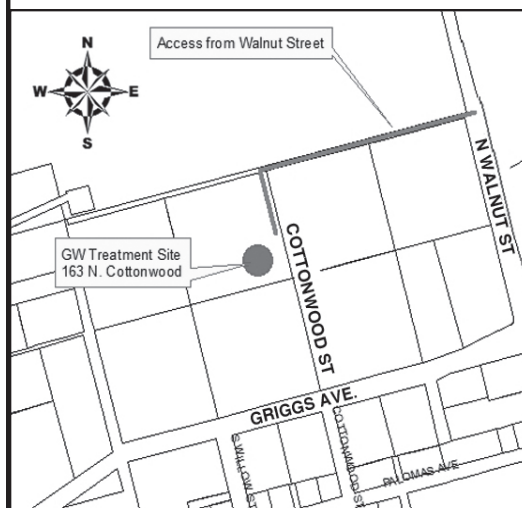

# Council vote could reduce some museum fees

The Las Cruces City Council has unanimously adopted a new fee schedule for the Las Cruces Museum System to provide uniformity in the fees it charges for camps, classes and programs.

The vote, taken at the council's Monday, Sept. 16, meeting, could reduce the minimum fee for participation in some museum programs and children's camps as well as an extension of hours for some.

The specific changes approved by the city council include:

- Studio programs for ages 6-17 and adults and summer, spring and winter camps: Potentially decrease the minimum fee

in the event grant-funded classes become available. That could reduce the minimum fee for studio programs from \$25 or \$40, depending on topic, funding stream and age group. The change could reduce the minimum fee for camps from \$5, \$10, \$15 or \$25 to zero.

- Museum workshops: Extends the length of a workshop from the current

one to six-hours to two-to-20 hours.

- Desert Treks: A name change and expansion of the description to use this program in all four museums instead of solely the Museum of Nature and Science.

- Scout merit badge: Variable program length depending on the badge in question and changing the fee from per child to

per troop to streamline the registration process. The previous fee of \$10-\$20 per child was changed to \$40 for a scout troop of up to 12 members.

Fees are calculated to 20-30 percent of the cost of programming, according to city documents. Almost three-quarters of the programs offered by the city museums are free of charge.

"The fee structure for those programs that do have a charge is designed to offer cost-effective services to the public, encourage participation in Museum System offerings and lessen the financial burden on the city," according to city documents.

The city Museum System consists of four facilities: Branigan Cultural Center and the Las Cruces Art,

Nature and Science, and Railroad museums. The museums are open 10 a.m.-4:30 p.m. Tuesday-Friday and 9 a.m.-4:30 p.m. Saturday. The museums are also open until 8 p.m. the first Friday of each month.

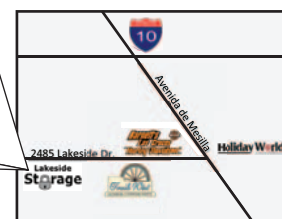

"Through historical preservation, civic pride can be enhanced, sustainable neighborhoods can be created, under-utilized buildings can be rehabilitated, and property values can be stabilized and increased," said Larry Nichols, Director of Community Development. "Having an historic preservation ordinance will help guide property owners who live in historic districts make the decisions

that are best for them and their neighborhoods."

The proposed historic preservation ordinance would create an Historic Preservation Commission with oversight to review planned modifications to the exteriors of registered properties. By establishing a standard board and a review process, the proposed ordinance affirms the City of Las Cruces' commitment to include historic preservation as a matter of public policy.

### Accepting applications

The Las Cruces Police Department's Victims' Assistance Unit is accepting applications for volunteers interested in joining CIRT – the Crisis Intervention Response Team.

## Public art: Las Cruces plans to put on a display

"We're pretty excited," City of Las Cruces Art Program Coordinator Lorenzo Zepeda said, as he and other staff and volunteers continue putting together the city's first-ever master plan for public art.

Developing the plan has included hosting public forums and roundtables and manning a booth at the city's National Night Out event in August to get community feedback on what the people

ple of Las Cruces – artists and art lovers, long-time residents and newcomers – think Las Cruces public art should be.

For one thing, public

input has shown that locals want to see more art in public spaces, Zepeda said, and especially in the bigger city parks.

Zepeda said a working

draft of the public art plan should be available soon, and the city hopes to have a final draft completed by the end of 2019.

Drafting the plan also highlights the role of the city Art Board, created in 2013 to advise the city council on public art issues. New Art Board Chair Meg Freyermuth, an award-winning Las Cruces artist, said the board is helping Zepeda define his new role as the city's first art coordinator, and helping find funding opportunities to provide more public art.

The city council established a dedicated funding source for the solicitation of artists and the procurement, installation and maintenance of public art in 2014 by setting aside 1 percent of the city general fund in the city's capital improvement program.

Zepeda, Freyermuth and other Art Board members have studied the public art collections at New Mexico State University and in neighboring cities such as

# 'Funan': An animated dip into stark human cruelty

The stark animation and storyline of "Funan" grab the viewer and then embed an ache deep into the chest where it sits and waits for a happy ending.

In Phnom Penh, Cambodia, in April 1975, Chou (voiced by Bérénice Bejo) and her husband Khoun (voiced by Louis Garrel) are living a normal life, a content couple with a 4-year-old son, Sovanh, and extended family around them.

When the Khmer Rouge topple the government, the family is evacuated from their home and city along with thousands of others. On the forced journey, Sovanh and his grandmother are separated from the family, disappearing into the masses of walking people. Finding their

son becomes the focus of Chou's and Khoun's lives now pushed through circumstances completely beyond their control.

This is not a children's movie. It progresses over four years through circumstances as horrific as any on the Bataan Death March. Each scene drags the watcher down another step of darkness as the ability of humans to do unspeakable things to each other is examined. There are those who do some small acts of kindness, but they do not end well.

"Funan" is an examination of behavior,

family cohesion amidst hunger, pain, favoritism and deep soul damage. The contrast in the peace and beauty of the world around the characters with the extreme cruelty they confront is stark. It is exemplified in a scene where the little boy and a girl he has befriended trap a frog under a bowl and laugh delightedly when it croaks, but then they hear someone ap-

proaching and the girl smashes the frog on a log and tucks it into her garment, presumably to eat later.

Filmmaker Denis Do uses his own family history for this film, which adds a layer of truth to the trials of the family. Many of us have never even heard of the Cambodian-Vietnamese War, which lasted 10 years, nine months and

a day. This provides a dose of reality about the effects of war on the lives of people dragged from the sidelines into the trenches and hard-labor camps.

The years this film depicts – about half of the war's duration – are when I was in high school. I found myself thinking about what I was doing every time a date flashed on the

screen. There, at the beginning, I was a freshman while Sovanh was separated from his mother. There, the parents are pulled apart when Khoun is taken away for a work detail, when I was playing an ant in a high school play, "Under the Sycamore Tree." And so on.

This is not a movie for the weak-hearted. It will stick with me for the rest of my life. I don't know if that is a good or a bad thing. I don't know if I can recommend it. If you see it, be prepared to fall into the mess journey and don't be distracted by the simple straightforward graphics of this animation. The people become real, and you will care about what happens to them.

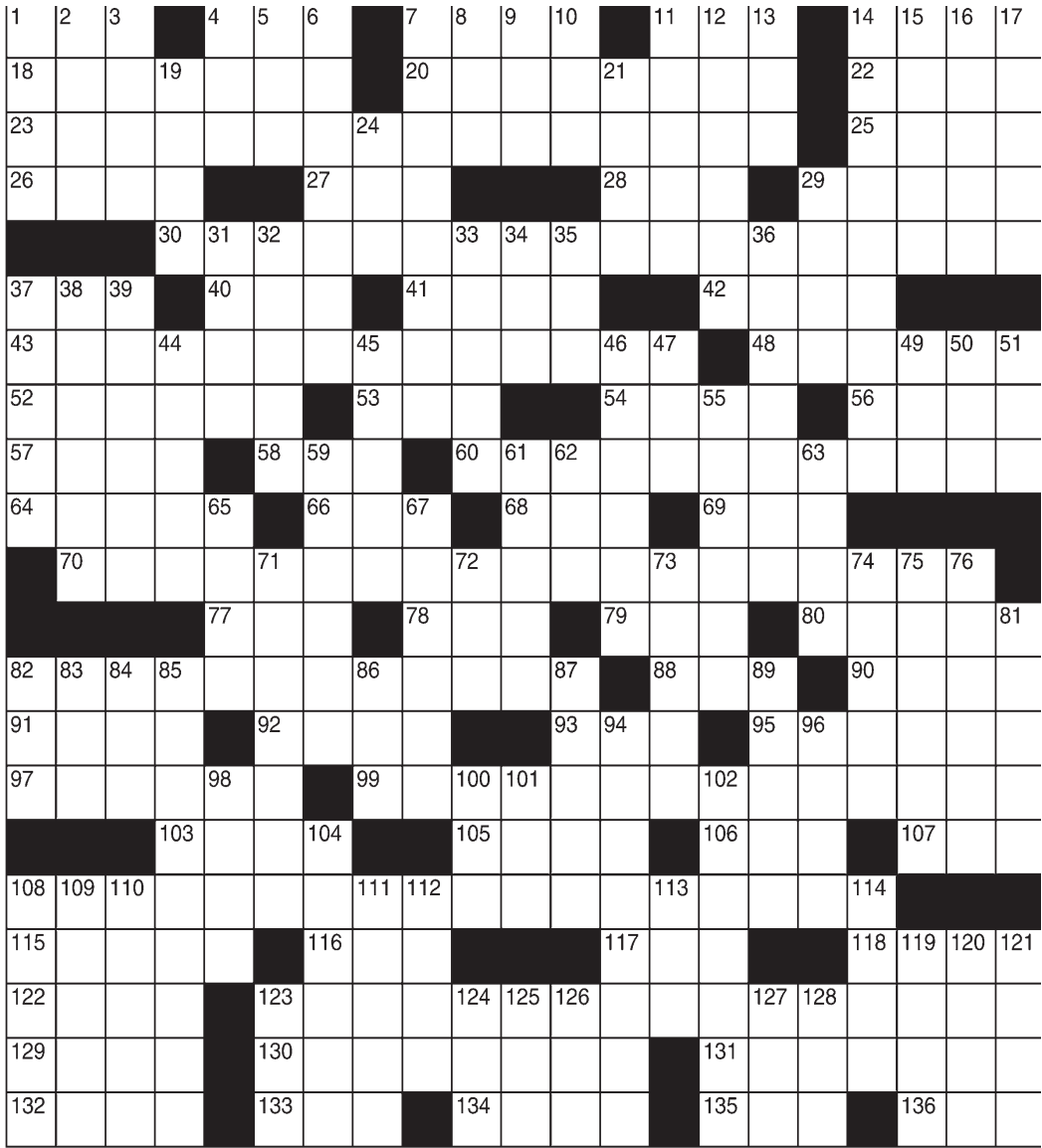

# ‘Deep Dig’ on Valley adds new storm drains, utility pipes

*Editor's note: 30th in a series on businesses impacted by Valley Drive road reconstruction.*

The New Mexico Department of Transportation (NMDOT) road reconstruction of Valley Drive has required complex coordination between the state agency, the City of Las Cruces and contractor AUI, Inc. The project involves not only the streets and traffic sections of Las Cruces Public Works, but also the water, wastewater and gas sections of Las Cruces Utilities.

After all, the Valley Drive project includes installing huge stormwater drains, where there was no drainage previously, and new underground utility pipes.

NMDOT assistant project manager Matthew Smith is the point person in the field for all the agencies, contractors and businesses that line Valley Drive.

“I start the process of solving problems,” Smith said. “A lot of time we can resolve issues relatively quickly, especially with the contractors who might have concerns about the project plan.”

Before a shovel hits the

ground, the project plan is completed – which includes designers onsite in person to make sure that their plan is feasible for the area. However, sometimes the best laid plans go astray; things happen like finding old pipes that break and disrupt businesses, or discovering strange and unexpected things underground, such as an old barn, that must be evaluated for its historical value.

“But many times, just knowing where to look for a solution helps to keep the contractor and the project moving forward,” Smith said. “Other times we have to move the problem up

the chain to get the right answers.”

Sometimes moving up the chain is working with the City of Las Cruces.

“LCU Water and Gas have participated and coordinated with the City of Las Cruces Public Works to assist NMDOT and move this project forward on the accelerated schedule,” explained Deputy Director of Water Adrienne L. Widmer, P.E. “This project is very important for Utilities in upgrading the natural gas, water, and wastewater systems on Valley Drive.”

If you have questions about the Valley Drive road reconstruction progress,

come to one of the NMDOT monthly public meetings at the Thomas Branigan Memorial Library, 200 E. Pícacho Ave. Matthew Smith will be there to answer any questions business owners or residents may have about the final phase of the construction.

The world’s first commercial “spaceline” is about to launch with Virgin Galactic and Spaceport America, opening doors of opportunity that simply don’t exist elsewhere.

The nation’s defense rides upon the testing and evaluation

The fifth-largest port on the US/Mexico Border is in our county, accounting for more than \$22 billion in imports/exports each year.

our community. It's the "ecosystem of opportunity" we do have here.

Building on that, I later met Albert Para at Electronic Caregiver and found out about the enormity of the work they are doing as the forefront of technological disruption in the healthcare industry. Their work is fueled by innovation from a growing team of people that includes numerous graduates from New Mexico State University. They have over a hundred people today, but they foresee many times that number in the next few years.

All of this is the real story of what's true in our community.

So, where did the conflicting message come from? It came from the voices of those who live here commenting on the boomtown story. Many didn't see our community this way. They spoke of low wages and limited opportunity. Some expressed concern that fulfilling our potential will in some way negatively impact our quality of life.

So, the question is: which narrative do our children and families believe?

Do they see the ability to do amazing things in great, well-paying careers that invite them to stay in our community? To raise kids of their own here and start new multi-generation stories of success? Or do they believe opportunity for them requires they go

somewhere else, like Denver, Scottsdale, Seattle or Dallas?

Griselda Martinez, interim economic development director for the City of Las Cruces, discussed how critical it is that we have a robust set of employment opportunities especially for those 20-24. Right now, they leave the community thinking there are no jobs here for them.

What I know is that, as I write this, there are 3,590 available jobs listed in the Las Cruces Metropolitan Statistical Area, which includes all of Doña Ana County. Different industries, different requirements – levels of pay ranging from \$24,000 to more than \$100,000.

As a community, we've worked hard to increase high school graduation rates to put our youth on a trajectory for success. And we are seeing a 4 percent uptick in the percent of opulation who hold an associate's degree or higher. Pointing them toward great and growing careers here is the logical next step.

The future of our community is bright, boomtown or not. Let's make sure our children and families have the full story, so they can take advantage of all the great things this community has to offer.

"We've fed a lot of people," he said.

More recently, Perez opened a Dick's Café/Smokey Dick's BBQ inside Frenger Food Court at NMSU, where he has been offering his menu to a new generation of college students for the past five years.

While Dick's sells a lot of Mexican dishes, one of the more popular items is the green chile cheeseburger, Perez said.

Perez said his family has a long history of working in the restaurant business and that many continue to do so.

"I bought this place and my dad's had the Chilitos (on S. Valley Drive and Foothills Road) ever since," he said.

Perez' cousins own Chachi's Restaurant, near the university.

"They all started

working (at Dick's)," he said. "Everybody worked here at the beginning."

Perez said he hopes to keep Dick's a family business long into the future, and that his son, Dylan Perez, may be next in line to take over.

In celebration of Dick's 60th anniversary, food and beer specials will be offered at the restaurant beginning in October and will continue throughout the rest of the year, with different specials featured each month.

"I want to thank the community for supporting us for so many years," Perez said.

## NM Wildlife Federation coordinator: 'Outdoors was my Disneyland'

Deming native Ray Trejo makes a lot of trips to Las Cruces and throughout the region as the southern New Mexico coordinator for the New Mexico Wildlife Federation (NMWF). "My Disneyland forever was going outdoors and hunting and fishing," said Trejo, who remembers those adventures with his uncles and grandfather from a very young age.

At some point years ago, Trejo heard about NMWF. He got involved with the organization about a dozen years ago, is a past president and is now the full-time southern coordinator. Working for NMWF, he said, is "where my passion and my paycheck come together. It's my reward for following my dream."

NMWF "is the best-kept secret," Trejo said.

With an overall goal of "inspiring New Mexicans to conserve public landscapes, watersheds and wildlife for our children's future," according to NMWF's website, Trejo said education is one of the organization's most important functions.

He brings 26 years with Deming Public Schools as a classroom teacher and an administrator to his NMWF job.

"We could change a lot of our culture by getting kids outside," Trejo said, including a lot less violence. He is an especially strong advocate for providing outdoor

opportunities for underprivileged children.

Protecting public lands and ensuring the public's access to those lands, including streams, now and in the future is important to Trejo, including providing more hunting opportunities and a more equitable tag (license) allocation, principally for antelope and elk hunting and particularly benefitting "blue-collar sportsmen and women" across the state, he said.

"The wildlife does not belong to any individual," Trejo said. "It belongs to the public in this state."

"We are advocates of outdoor recreation fighting for public lands," he said. "We make our stand and we defend it."

Trejo "did a lot of work" leading up to the designation of nearly 500,000 acres as the Organ Mountains-Desert Peaks National Monument, he said, has opposed the border wall between the United States and Mexico because of its impact on

wildlife corridors and supports science-based wildlife management.

Author and conservationist Aldo Leopold and other sportsmen created NMWF in 1914 as the New Mexico Game Protective Association, according to the NMWF website.

The nonprofit later changed its name to the New Mexico Wildlife Federation is now "the largest, oldest and most effective sportsmen's organization in our state, working on behalf of sportsmen," according to its website. Its accomplishments include helping to protect more than two million acres of public land in New Mexico, rebuilding depleted game populations, giving a voice to New Mexico sportsmen and women, advocating for sound wildlife management, insuring quality places in the state to hunt and fish and fighting for New Mexicans' permanent access to public lands.

Trejo attended Western New Mexico University in Silver City where he earned a bachelor's degree in education, a master's degree in teaching and a second master's in educational leadership, according to the NMWF website. He lives in Deming with his wife Teri, three horses, one mule, his Jack Russell terrier and three bird dogs.

## Autumn is about to fall as the full moons rise

The long, hot summer is drawing to a close, at least according to the calendar and meteorologists.

The 2019 autumnal equinox will occur at 1:50 a.m. MDT Monday, Sept. 23, and autumn will continue through Sunday, Dec. 22.

In the Northern Hemisphere's astronomical calendar, "the start and end dates of autumn are based on the changing position of Earth in relation to the sun," according to [www.calendarpedia.com](http://www.calendarpedia.com).

"The length of the astronomical seasons varies between 89 and 93 days, while the length of the meteorological seasons is less variable and is fixed at 90 days for winter in a non-leap year (91 days in a leap year), 92 days for spring and summer and 91 days for autumn," the website

said. That's because meteorologists define seasons "based on climatic conditions and the annual temperature cycle," according to the website, and they require a more exact definition of "a season's timing and length." For them, autumn begins Sept. 1 and ends Nov. 30. "On the day of an equinox, the geometric center of the Sun's disk crosses the equator, and this point is above the horizon for 12 hours everywhere on the Earth," according to [aa.usno.navy.mil](mailto:aa.usno.navy.mil).

Because it is the clos-

est one to the autumnal equinox, the September 2019 full moon, which occurred at 10:33 a.m. MDT Sept. 14, is the harvest moon.

The October full moon, the hunter's moon, will occur at 3:08 p.m. MDT Sunday, Oct. 13.

The moon has played a major role in marking the seasons and the time for planting and harvesting for millennia.

Originally, a month was the period from one new moon until the next. In fact, "month" comes from the word for moon: "from root 'me' – 'to measure' in reference to the moon's phases as an ancient and universal measure of time," according to [www.etymonline.com](http://www.etymonline.com).

Daylight Saving Time, by the way, will end at 2 a.m. Sunday, Nov. 3. It returns at 2 a.m. Sunday, March 8, 2020.

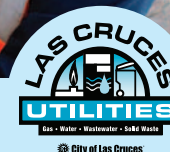

# Project Save a Kitten

## Jewelry heist adds fundraising challenges to annual Kitty Glitter event

After having several bins of donated earrings, watches, bracelets, necklaces and other decorative pieces stolen from storage, Project Save a Kitten is asking the community for help in collecting unwanted jewelry for the 5th annual Kitty Glitter event, set for March 27-28, 2020.

About seven large bins of jewelry, each weighing about 30 to 40 pounds, were taken, and the case is still under investigation, said Jackye Meinecke, a member of Project Save a Kitten and a lead organizer for Kitty Glitter.

"They stole every bit of our jewelry; the little bit we had left, but also all our donations that we've had since last March," Meinecke said. "So, we're really getting the word out that we need donations more than ever this year, because we're starting over from scratch."

Members of Project Save a

Kitten, a group of 11 cat lovers and animal activists, hope that with enough donations, the 2020 event will be just as successful as it has been in previous years.

Kitty Glitter, the group's biggest fundraising event, is a jewelry sale that raises money to benefit local animal welfare organizations that are cat-specific, such as Broken Promises SW and The Cat's Meow Resource & Adoption Center, the fiscal sponsor of Project Save a Kitten.

"The problem here is huge and the need is huge," Meinecke said. "We never have enough funds in this community for the volume of cats that we have, and the shelter has limited funding."

Meinecke said a benefit of Project Save a Kitten is that the members can choose an organization and cause to support with funds raised.

"After we raise money, we put it toward what is most needed," Meinecke said. This can be any-

thing from helping to fund an extra spay and neuter clinic with one of the vets to transporting cats out of a crowded shelter, she said.

Last year's Kitty Glitter event, hosted at Griggs at Raymond Arts & Antiques, 504 W. Griggs Ave., the working studio of Paula Van Overbeke Voris, attracted hundreds of people and raised about \$8,000, Meinecke said.

"The nice thing is you don't have to be a cat person to enjoy a jewelry sale," she said. "Anyone who loves jewelry is welcome."

Jewelry at the event is displayed and arranged by color and price, making it easy to sort through, Meinecke said.

"You're not just digging through piles of stuff hoping you find something good."

Jewelry at the event starts as low as \$1.

"You can take a home a bag of jewelry for \$20 dollars," Meinecke said.

Those who wish to donate to

the cause can drop off their used or unwanted jewelry to Better Life Pet Foods, 315 S. Telshor Blvd., which accepts donations to Project Save a Kitten year-round; or to The Cat's Meow, 2211 N. Mesquite St. All kinds of jewelry, from costume to gemstones, will be accepted.

Donations for the 2020 Kitty Glitter will be collected through Feb. 28.

"I believe we have a generous community, and I believe we'll be able to have as big a sale as we've ever had this next spring," Meinecke said.

Project Save a Kitten hosts other fundraising events throughout the year, including its other main event, Caroling for Kitties, in December.

# Mother played our accompaniment, part 2

Last time I started to tell about my dear, wonderful mother “who played our accompaniment.” I begin this column by relaying a story which she loved to tell my brother and me, or any other handy audience.

It was “The Story of the Crooked-Mouth Family.” The setting was in the mountains of Kentucky in the early part of the 19th century. A college student was traveling home for Christmas, walking or hitching wagon rides. He

arrived at this cabin home near dusk. It was the custom in those days for travelers to seek lodging with people who lived along the way since there were no hostels or hotels. The

student asked if he might spend the night with the family. They agreed.

In those days the main source of light at night was candles rather than lanterns, which came later in history. The family had the peculiar trait of speaking out of the sides of their mouths.

“Paw” spoke with his lower lip turned up, “Maw” with her lip turn down, “Sonny” spoke out of the left side, and “Sis” out of the right side.

As the story goes, after supper and visiting awhile, it came time to go to bed, and to blow out the candle. Paw started, but his turned-up lip made the air go upwards and the candle did not go out. Frustrated, he asked Maw to blow it out. Since she blew downwards, the air did not blow it out either. Next, Son tried and failed because his air went to the left. Then Sis gave it a try but

her blowing also failed to do the job. Finally, Paw asked the college student to blow it out. He replied “Certainly,” took the candle and quickly blew it out. Maw then remarked, “Paw, that just goes to show you what a college education will do for a man.”

This story was especially delightful watching my mother with a lighted candle in her hand, twisting her mouth and blowing at the candle.

Mother always wanted to be helpful whenever there was a need. For a while, one of my father’s sisters and her daughter,

Phyllis, lived with us. At that time, my aunt had been divorced for a couple of years and was having a hard time making decisions.

While living with us, Phyllis developed diabetes, causing my aunt to become greatly distressed. My mother took charge and helped her with diet management, insulin doses and sterilization of the needles and syringes. In addition, she worked with a child who was a bit spoiled and would use every opportunity to sneak anything with sugar in it. Later, they

moved into a neighboring town eight miles away where my aunt took in sewing for people and my parents could be close enough to continue to help them.

Our lives were enriched with all the affirmation and encouragement with our dear mother “playing our accompaniment.”

## The Heritage breaks ground on new residential building

The Heritage Assisted Living & Adult Day Care, 854 Lettuce Lane, hosted a groundbreaking ceremony Thursday, Sept. 12 in celebration of the new 7,800-square-foot residen-

tial unit to be built on the three vacant lots next to the Heritage Houses.

The new unit, developed by Randy Farmer & Barry Prahl of Genesis Builders, will provide 16 more beds in addition to the 24 beds that already exist on The Heritage

property. The project is anticipated to be complete by the end of February 2020.

“There’s a huge need in Las Cruces for senior housing, and it’s not going to stop,” said Trevas Younger, owner and administrator of The Heri-

tage Assisted Living & Adult Day Care. “In fact, the demand will go up at least 25 percent as more baby boomers emerge, so we’re trying to fill that need.

“These lots have been vacant for 22 years, so they needed to be developed, and it really does complete the neighborhood,” Younger said.

The new building, budgeted at \$1.7 million, falls under the Community Revitalization Act, and is funded via a loan provided by Century Bank in collaboration with New Mexico Finance Authority through a program called Smart Money.

The Heritage provides a small and intimate assisted living experience for seniors, along with respite care for an occasional night, weekend or

vacation break for caregivers or family members as availability allows. It is the only fully licensed adult day program in Doña Ana County.

Younger said she invites the community to come visit The Heritage to see

what makes it unique.

“People don’t get lost in the crowd here,” she said.

# Centennial, Oñate renew rivalry in the big house

The budding Organ Mountain Rivalry between Centennial and Oñate high schools, now in its third year, gets the football season seriously underway at 7 p.m. Friday, Sept. 20, at Aggie Memorial Stadium.

Advance tickets (\$8 adults, \$4 students) were still available at both schools through 5 p.m. Thursday, and can be purchased game-day at the gates, which open at 5:30 p.m.

A large crowd is expected, and security will be tight for the game, which pits the unbeaten Hawks

(4-0) vs. the winless Knights (0-3). Ernie Viramontes, Las Cruces Public Schools athletics director, said security officials at the game will be inspecting purses and bags, and only stadium seats will be allowed in the stadium, excluding folding chairs.

"We want everyone to have a great time and more importantly, to be safe, so we will enforce a few rules to ensure everyone's safety" Viramontes said.

Viramontes encourages fans to arrive for the game no later than 6 p.m. to prevent traffic congestion.

Traditionally, hundreds of fans tailgate before the game in specified NMSU parking lots. Viramontes said pregame tailgating is allowed from 4-7 p.m. on Friday. Oñate High School fans will use lots #33 and #38 immediately north of Aggie Memorial Stadium, while Centennial High School fans will use lot #34 immediately east of Memorial Aggie Stadium.

Tailgating guidelines to observe are:

- No alcohol inside the stadium or in the tailgating parking lots
- Vehicles should park in designated rows and stalls and not block traffic
- No parking in the fire lanes
- One parking space may be reserved next to each vehicle for tailgating
- Pop-up tents that do not require stakes are recommended
- Grilling is allowed but no open flames will be permitted
- No glass containers are allowed in parking lots

# Centennial High baseballer making a name for himself

Steven "Monster" Milam, 15, of Las Cruces has been named to the 2019 USA Baseball 15U National Team Roster.

Milam, a freshmen student-athlete at Centennial High School under Coach Rusty Evans, is competing at the COPABE U-15 Pan American Championships currently underway through Sept. 22 in Playa del Carmen, Mexico. Milam is one of 20 rostered players hoping to bring home a gold medal.

Identified as a middle infielder and right-handed pitcher, Milam was recently recognized as the 2019 14U Rawlings Defensive Player of the Year by Perfect Game.

Milam has had a full summer of baseball and accolades representing New Mexico. Over Labor Day weekend, Steven was the first athlete from New Mexico selected to play at the Perfect Game 14U Select Baseball Festival at JetBlue Park. This event, aired live

# A few proven ways to greatly improve your golf game

All the golf club manufacturers have a product line they call “game improvement” clubs. Forget that. The only game improvement you need comes from within you and your golf swing. The men and women on the professional tours have closed one season and are about to embark on a new one, determined to improve how they perform. We should, too. Here are my key suggestions for getting your game to a higher level.

- Make a plan. Are you lazily content with the way you’ve always played, or are you driven by motivation for achievement? Get to work and decide on exactly what you need to do to become a much better golfer. Make a thorough

and shameless assessment of your game, focusing on your important strengths and your glaring weaknesses. You know what they are. Now turn your problem areas into strengths.

- Get a teacher. If you don’t want to keep losing to golfers with inferior talent, find a PGA instructor who you can work with. Then set up a solid practice schedule at least twice a week, which includes several dozen shots with irons and woods, followed by 30 minutes devoted to chipping and putting. Be creative with new shots. As your game steadily improves, try to come up with at least a couple of new short game shots you never

had before, remembering that most of your scoring is within 70 yards of the green. Examples would be a “bump-and-run” chip from the light rough around the green, and a lofted “flop” shot with a lob wedge to a tight pin.

- Commit yourself to working out at least three times per week. You may not need a personal trainer but understand how to use the machines and weights most effectively. You can buy a good home gym, but joining a gym works best for me. The golf courses aren’t getting shorter; we must get longer. As we get another year older, we become more challenged for distance with all our longer clubs. That’s why raising the bar on our strength and flexibility by gym workouts is so necessary.

- Putting. Pressure-proof your putting by focusing on process and technique rather than worrying over results. Grade your effort to trust the line and speed you chose every time. There are lots of practice putting games you can play alone or with a buddy, like “seven-up” and “twenty-one.” Try the “circle drill,” where you putt eight balls spaced in a circle six feet from the cup; you can’t quit until you make all eight in a row.

- Clubs. Are you playing up-to-date equipment? Being an avid golfer, it is

critical to grasp how technology can revamp and enhance your skill level. If money is an issue, update your equipment on eBay or other sellers on the internet – if you know what you’re doing and what you’re looking for. If you are over 60 and don’t have a couple of hybrids in your bag, you’re making a mistake.

- Attitude. If you get upset more often than you ought to it may be time to change your attitude. Attitude toward life in general usually expresses itself in behavior on and off the golf course. Complaining,

bellyaching, arguing, resentment and cheating are all tied to attitude. If you’re a surly, antisocial person who pays the bet and quickly vanishes before all handshakes and friendly talk are finished, you need a new attitude. Check with your frequent playing partners about your ‘tude and ask them for a little feedback. That would be novel. Or are you a bit afraid of what you might hear?
