# **Main Street** funds short

## City seeks more money to re-open north end of mall

City officials are looking for ways they can begin awarding contracts for re-opening the north end of Downtown's Main Street by the end of next month.

While the city was able to hold onto \$830,000 from the state for the project, maximum cost estimates for work exceeds the budget by almost \$1 million if only the street is re-opened without land-scaping and street features included in the middle re-opened section. To add trees, shade structures, lighting

and other distinctive street features, the cost exceeds the city's committed funds for the project by almost \$2 million.

City officials reviewed possible op-tions to reduce the scope of the project and possible funding to close the shortfall Monday, April 12, at the City Council meeting.

Councillors rejected one option to partially re-open the north end, as well as expressed reluctance to raid the city's general fund or road repair fund from gross receipts taxes to increase the project's budget.

Currently, there is about \$400,000 available from the Downtown Tax Increment Development District (TIDD).

City Councillor Dolores Connor said the TIDD was created to fund projects such as street improvements.

But city Financial Services Director Mark Sutter said the \$400,000 now available from the TIDD is likely more than what can be expected on a recurring basis because of all the government-related Downtown construction - the new City Hall and federal courthouse.

Without a history of TIDD income not influenced by large construction projects, the state financial authority would not likely loan money to the city, he said.

Cindi Fargo, director of the Down-town Las Cruces Partnership, said future investment into the area hinges on the city coming through on the street re-opening with the same design as the first middle section.

# **Spaceport America director resigns** Landeene cites personal reasons for leaving NMSA

Citing "a need to regain some work/life balance," Steve Landeene is resigning as the executive director of the New Mexico Spaceport Authority and will no longer be the face and voice of Spaceport America.

Since taking the position two and a half years ago, Landeene has been an effective spokesman for the spaceport now under construction in the desert rangeland between Las Cruces and Truth or Consequences, as well as a focused administrator.

As the spaceport's boss, Landeene accom-

plished getting a critical gross receipts tax (GRT) increase passed in Sierra County to support financing construction. In short order, he also pushed to finalize an Environmental Impact Statement process for rapid Federal Aviation Administration spaceport licensing just in time to meet a funding deadline. He also shepherded key legislation and spaceport staff expanded during the state's fiscal belt-tightening.

With nearly all major construction contracts awarded, it seemed Landeene was ready to see the spaceport through to completion by

the end of this year.

Recently, however, Landeene had been faced with some criticisms externally and internally.

Because the only paved road to the spaceport can be accessed from the north, T or C is enjoying most of the benefits of spaceport-related construction activity. Landeene heard criticism from Doña Ana County residents that they also passed a GRT increase but have yet to see the space-

port's benefit. He wanted to make funding for paving the southern road – which is more than See Spaceport on page A8

# You have diabetes'

This was no April Fools joke: These three words mean my lifestyle and habits will need to change ... forever

Something was wrong. Over a period of just a few days, my body began craving water, and I found myself needing to go to the bathroom every hour or so, even during the night. Each morning, I awoke with cramped fingers, and I would become very tired, very quickly. At times my vision was blurred.

Just a few weeks before, during a regular checkup, my eye doctor said my eyes were in excellent physical condition, adding that my eyesight had actually improved slightly since the last visit. I had even asked the doctor if he could see any evidence of diabetes, knowing that as a person of American Indian heritage, my body was in a high-risk group for developing the disease. Because my mother and younger siblings had already been diagnosed with type 2 diabetes, there was a high probability that, at some point, I might be afflicted as well.

Over the past several years, I did many of the right things to prevent the disease, such as regular exercising, eating reasonably healthy foods, regular medical checkups and occasionally monitoring my blood sugar levels. However, at the end of March,

while Jaki and I were visiting with our new grandson Hendrix in Albuquerque, my symptoms became more apparent, and my blood sugar suddenly rose to unprecedented levels from a normal reading of about 125 to nearly 500. My personal physician in Las Cruces urged me to come home immediately so she could discern what was going on inside my body.

Back in Las Cruces, the medical lab tests confirmed what we had already expected, a verdict of diabetes. Unexpectedly, the diagnosis was not type 2, like my other family members. Instead, this was type 1, which means the pancreas simply has quit

producing insulin. Without insulin, the human body cannot break down sugars to provide energy to the body's cells. Without insulin, sugars become attached to the blood cells and begin to clog the entire circulatory system. Additionally, because the body cells are not receiving the proper nutrients, causing fatigue, the liver is directed by the brain to produce sugar on its own. The additional sugar exacerbates the situation because, with no insulin, the liver-produced sugar cannot be processed and even more sugar becomes attached to the blood cells. Uncontrolled, high sugar levels can take a toll on the human body very quickly, and can result in lethargy, neuropathy (numbness), especially in the feet, blurry vision and even blindness.

Obviously, diabetes is a disease that cannot be ignored. My twice-a-day insulin injections began immediately on April Fool's Day and will likely be a part of my life from this point forward. My diet and eating habits will have to become precise (in terms of quantity) and consistent (as to eating on a regular schedule). Exercise will have to be more controlled. Blood sugar will have to be monitored throughout each day.

According to the Centers for Disease Control, in 2007 more than 24 million Americans were diagnosed with diabetes. Additionally, CDC estimates that another 57 million Americans are considered to be "pre-diabetic." This means they are likely to develop diabetes unless they adjust their diets, increase exercise and reduce stress levels.

Personally, I am fine with my situation and feel blessed to have family and community support, as well as the health care and medicines available to allow me to continue a relatively normal life. # Candidate's own money replaces face-to-face fundraising

A new trend has emerged in political campaign financing. It's called doing it yourself. Digging into your own pocket. Needless to say, it helps if those pockets are deep.

A basic rule of politics is that if you can't raise money, you won't be any good at rounding up votes either. But in an era when the rich are getting richer, many candidates are finding it possible to dig deep enough to find sufficient money for a victory.

Former Gov. Garv Johnson started it in New Mexico. He turned a handyman business into lucrative construction contracts, mostly at Intel in Rio Rancho, and made millions. That got boring so he decided to use some of that money to run for governor.

Johnson wasn't a great campaigner. He didn't care for large crowds where he was expected to shake every hand and remember nearly everyone's name.

His opponent, Gov. Bruce King, was the master at that. King was one of the biggest landholders in the state and could have personally financed his many campaigns, but I feel supremely confident guessing that he never spent a penny of his own money on a campaign.

Many factors entered that gubernatorial campaign of 1994 but it was in part a test of whether a guy who didn't like raising campaign funds and who didn't like retail campaigning could buy enough television ads to beat a popular incumbent.

It worked. Of course, the ads had to hit the right issues, be well produced and part of a well-conceived campaign strategy. Johnson's campaign manager Doug Turner took care of that.

Sixteen years later that same Doug Turner is trying the strategy himself, loaning his campaign around \$400,000 so far. But this time, he has company. Other GOP gubernatorial candidates are digging in their pockets too.

Candidate Allen Weh has laid out some \$750,000 of money he pulled in from government defense contracts. He is currently leading the TV race. Candidates Pete Domenici Jr. and Janice Arnold-Jones have made about \$70,000 and \$54,000 in loans to their campaigns.

The only GOP gubernatorial candi-date depending solely on raising funds from others is Doña Ana County District Attorney Susana Martinez. She notes that if personal loans from her opponents are discounted, she is the top fundraiser among Republicans.

Will that make a difference? If old-style politics still has any validity, maybe it does. It means that Martinez has gotten out there and touched a lot more lives than her opponents.

In the GOP lieutenant governor race, roofer John Sanchez, the Republican gubernatorial nominee in 2002, has personally contributed \$274,000 of his \$279,000 war chest.

This is a guy who cultivated supporters throughout the state

eight years ago and has chosen not to use those contacts for fundraising purposes this time. Candidates who have to rely on

complain about the amount of time fundraising takes away from making other campaign contacts. Sanchez doesn't have to worry about that.

Early in the campaign, GOP lieutenant governor candidate Brian Moore, of Clayton, put \$100,000 into his campaign, thereby serving notice that he is in the race to win. Moore is a former state representative and is expected to do well in rural New Mexico.

On the Democratic side of the ledger, Lawrence Rael is reported to have put \$105,000 into his campaign. He is considered to be the principal challenger to former state Democratic Chairman Brian Colón, who has raised the most money so far.

Colón's lead in money raising is somewhat to be expected since he is the former state Democratic chairman and hit up the big money donors for contributions to the state party during those years.

Rael made his name by getting the Rail Runner commuter train up and going in record time.

The champions at self-financing campaigns are U.S. Rep. Harry Teague and former Rep. Steve Pearce. Both wealthy from the oil business, they are capable of contributing whatever is necessary to win.

## **April 28 is PTSD Awareness Day**

April 28, 2010, has been proclaimed by Gov. Bill Richardson as Post Traumatic Stress Disorder Awareness Day. Are you aware that more than 1 million Vietnam veterans suffer from PTSD and thousands more are or will be afflicted by our current wars in Iraq and Afghanistan? PTSD is a major problem in New Mexico and our nation.

Medical practioners define PTSD as a normal reaction to an abnormal traumatic event. The disorder results in symptoms such as anxiety, depression, sleep disorder and isolationism. It severely affects a person's quality of life and the lives of their family, friends and neighbors. It often leads to violence, breaking of laws, illegal drug use, an overuse of alcohol and often results in homelessness. Because of the stigma attached to mental illness, those afflicted may go underground and not seek treatment.

Anyone who has gone through a life-threatening event can develop PTSD. The symptoms can occur after someone is exposed to an extremely traumatic event such as war, torture, rape, a physical assault, kidnapping, a natural disaster or even a car accident. Combat veterans, in particular, become afflicted and often may not seek treatment.

April 28 provides veterans, family, friends and health care providers the opportunity to participate in awareness projects and publicity regarding PTSD. It is important that all of us understand more about this disorder. Raising such awareness may help overcome the stigma often associated with PTSD and to encourage those who are suffering to seek needed professional help. We are all involved in these wars and we need to help support those who have fought on the front lines.

The good news is there is help available. If you are a veteran you may seek assistance from your local U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs or the New Mexico Veterans Services Department. The tollfree number for the U.S. VA is 877-222-VETS and the New Mexico Veterans Services office number is 866-433-8387. You may also help by merely becoming more aware of this condition. Let's all become knowledgeable and sensitive to those who are troubled by PTSD. It is of epidemic proportions.

# The cactus photo BaxterB

It is a photo embedded in my memory; partly cloudy blue skies, a nearby mountain range coursing diagonally across the background, a finger shadow on the lens and the glimpse of a startled horse's left eye in the bottom right hand corner.

I was making a big circle one cold spring morning. I'd made it clear to the Canary Springs on the high end of the 7-section pasture. My horse picked up when I started back down over the ridges and smaller canyons. I passed a few cows, looked 'em over then topped the last big rise. The view was magnificent. It was a cowboy moment to be appreciated.

I pulled up to take it in. Rifling my coat pockets and banana bag, amongst the GPS, walkie-talkie, reading glasses, notepad, deerskin gloves, mini-binoculars, water bottle, runnin' iron

and tortillas, I finally found my camera.

Simultaneously, I was struck by an urgency that required me to dismount.

Relieved, I began sweeping the landscape with my camera. A large green century plant lent color to the sea of yellow winter pasture grass and dark mesquite trees. Seeking the right composition, I was snapping away, manipulating the zoom and trying to capture the horse's majestic head, ears alert and silver concho shining. I stepped back, my spurs hit an obstacle and I sat, backside first ... into the welcoming arms of a prickly pearis maximus as big as a Barcalounger!

After sending out my emergency signal, "Ay-y-y-y-y-yy-y-y!" in case a curious doe, javelina or mountain lion was in

the area, I sized up my situation. I was alone, no cell phone, 3 miles from the truck and pinned to a cactus like a butterfly on a board.

# Attracting business key to development

No grace period The City of Las Cruces has installed a second speed and red-light traffic-enforcement camera at the intersection of Telshor Boulevard and Lohman Avenue. The second camera is for traffic traveling west on Lohman Avenue as it approaches the Lohman and Telshor intersection. A camera for eastbound traffic has been operational since last

year The second camera is scheduled for activation on Friday, April 30.

It is important to note that there will be no grace period associated with the camera's activation; violations will be cited immediately. Rumble strips and warning signs have been installed for traffic approaching the intersection.

The City of Las Cruces implemented its traffic-enforcement camera program in February, 2009.

Penalties for running a red light or speeding through a lighted intersection employing traffic-enforcement cameras are capped by state law at \$100 per violation.



by accident that some states garner the majority of certain types of business. Boeing recently moved from Seattle to Chicago for business reasons. The drill is to make New Mexico attractive to certain types of businesses.

A whole new way of looking at taxation and regulation must happen for businesses to be attracted to New Mexico. Those who want to make it harder and harder to do business have made our state uncompetitive while at the same time the state really needs the money business brings.

As an example, why not compete for what our nation needs most? This is domestic clean power and food. It is insane for our resources to go to other countries for power and food. Because of cost factors tied to regulations, our domestic power and food production is not competitive.

Solution: New Mexico is a prime candidate to build many new-generation nuclear power plants. It would take real leadership to realize that nuclear power plants would allow New Mexico to be a net exporter of clean power, an important resource. New Mexico would also have plenty of power for new manufacturing at a competitive price. Finally, since nuclear power plants like to run at 100 percent, there would be excess power-generation capability, which the state could use to make hydrogen fuel for the next generation of autos and

desalinate water to energize our agriculture by offering cheaper and better water to growers. These resources would build wealth.

Transportation is critical in a state as large as New Mexico. The Rail Runner should go all over the state so that travel is enhanced. Additionally, it should include automobile platforms so people can travel by train and have their vehicles at their destination. Why not learn from Europe how to run trains?

Health care and education are sticking points, but what is obvious is that some states make these more attractive. Can we learn from them? New Mexico has a perpetual shortage of doctors because the tax laws are punitive to doctors compared to other states. Making it easier to do medicine in New Mexico is a key to improving our attraction of new money.

Finally, entertainment and culture are so very important that we should continue attracting the movie industry, beef up our attractions, including the beef industry, and think carefully about how to increase the value of the New Mexico brand.

There may be more ways to bring more money to our state, but first we must have leadership who can see the potential of our state.

# **AG clarifies rebate program** Rules come with Cash for Appliances initiative

New Mexico Attorney General Gary King's Consumer Protection Division is advising consumers to get the facts before taking advantage of the Cash for

Appliances program. Unlike last year's Cash for Clunkers program, consumers do not have to "turn in" their old appliances. Applications and requirements are available at www.e-rebates.org/nmarp.

The program began Thursday, April 22, and rebates will be made on a firstcome, first-served basis based on the postmark date for a completed, signed application with all required documentation. New appliances purchased before April 22 are not eligible.

Qualified appliances include clothes washers, refrigerators and gas furnaces. The rebate is \$200 per higher-effi-

ciency Energy Star appliance. The rebate program is made possible by American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 funding through the U.S. Department of Energy to New Mexico's Energy Conservation and Management Division. The AG Office noted that funds in

other states were depleted within the first 24 hours the rebates were offered.

"There has never been a more important conversation about Downtown," Fargo told the council.

Earlier in the meeting, Fargo gave a report to the council that indicated new businesses locating Downtown have resulted in more than \$1 million in economic activity and construction.

Should the city be unable to re-open Main Street as envisioned by the Downtown revitalization plans, Fargo said current investors would be left in limbo and confidence would be so shaken that her organization would be put "in poor position for business recruitment."

City councillors and Mayor Ken Miyagishima discussed a number of scenarios, including seeing how much of the work can be done by the city in-house and whether some of the landscaping can be donated through programs to get more trees planted in urban areas.

'We need to get as creative as we can, right?" said Mayor Pro Tem Sharon Thomas.

Whatever solution is reached, it needs to be reached quickly. To get the state to release \$830,000 for the project, officials including state Sens. Mary Kay Papen and John Arthur Smith promised state officials the money could be committed to contracts by the end of May. That means the council must act on the problem when it revisits the issue in its May 3 meeting.

20 miles long - a legislative priority, but was told publicly by Economic Development Secretary Fred Mondragón to back down from the issue because of the state's tight finances.

That left Landeene to tout that, at least, all the major contracts were going to New Mexico companies, though most of the contractors are based out of Albuquerque. But even that claim has been called into question.

Just prior to Landeene turning in his resignation letter Friday, April 16, the Albuquerque Journal looked into the latest company to win one of the large contracts - Summit West, which is building the \$32.5 million signature terminal hangar facility that will house Virgin Galactic spaceliners.

Though the state Purchasing Office gave Summit West a 5-percent "in-state preference" discount on its bid, its corporate headquarters are in Phoenix and the Journal found its Albuquerque office to contain nothing but an unplugged telephone. The official Spaceport America press release announcing Summit West's selection described the company as having a "strong history of construction in New Mexico and throughout the Southwest," but the Journal could only find one New Mexico project listed on its website.

According to the Associated Press, Toni Balzano, deputy cabinet secretary for the Economic Development Department, suggested Summit West moved its offices to trailers at Spaceport America and will return to Albuquerque.

In his resignation letter, however, Landeene made no mention of the recent controversies.

"It is with mixed emotions I am submitting this resignation to be effective May 15th, 2010," Landeene wrote. "Effective immediately I will not be acting as executive director, but in a transition role ...

Landeene detailed his successes with Spaceport America, but his letter indicated the executive director's duties required him to work "tirelessly." With recent legislation to minimize spaceport passenger liability signed into law, "the last major element solidifying Spaceport America reality has been accomplished." Landeene wrote. "I now have a need to regain some work/life balance that can not be accomplished given the current stresses and time commitments of the Spaceport America executive director role."

Landeene has a wife and three children who still live in Arizona, where he previously worked for Honeywell Aerospace and Landmark Aviation.

The official state Economic Development press release announcing Landeene's departure stated he was leaving "after successfully meeting all legislative mandates and putting Spaceport America on track to be operational by the end of the year."

We appreciate Steve's service and wish him well in the future," said Mondragón, who also chairs the Spaceport Authority board. "The authority will move aggressively to find a replacement and move forward with the construction schedule for Spaceport America.'

# Anthony, N.M., elected officials sworn in

Doña Ana County Clerk Lynn Ellins swore in the newly elected mayor, municipal judge and trustees of Anthony, N.M., at a ceremony Monday, April 19, in the offices of the Anthony Water and Sanitation District.

Ramon Gonzalez is mayor, Peggy Scott is the municipal judge and Betty Gonzalez, Juan Acevedo, Diana Murillo and James Scott are trustees. Residents of the city recently voted to become incorporated.

#### Moore to stay for now

A search committee has selected four finalists for city manager of Scottsdale, Ariz., and Las Cruces City Manager Terrence Moore was not among the group. He had been one of 50 candidates for the job and was reportedly on a short list of semi-finalists.

The Arizona Republic reported that Moore wasn't in the final four. The finalists include: Scottsdale Acting City Manager David Richert; George Gretsas, city manager of Fort Lauderdale, Fla.; Todd Hileman, village manager of Glenview, Ill.; and Chris Hillman, city manager of Clearfield City, Utah.

Moore has said he is currently happy as the city manager for Las Cruces, and he was recommended to the Scottsdale search committee.

Besides recently completing the new City Hall, Moore has said he focused on getting the city's new convention and aquatic centers open, as well as filling vacancies for police and fire chiefs.

Moore has been the Las Cruces city manager since Feb. 14, 2005, and earns an annual salary of \$136,500.

# House bill to improve veterans health services

The U.S. House of Representatives voted Wednesday, April 21, to approve the Veterans Omnibus Health Services Act.

Included in the legislation was Congressman Harry Teague's bill to assist caregivers who accompany veterans when they have to travel to be seen by a doctor. The Teague provision expands Department of Veterans Affairs' authority to make per diem and lodging payments to those caring for veterans who are receiving medical treatment.

"This is a common-sense bill and something we should have done for our veterans and their families years ago," said Teague, who serves on the House Veterans Affairs Committee. "I've met with many New Mexico veterans throughout my district who have told me about being forced to rely on their family, friends or other veterans to drive them to medical appointments that are often times three or four hours away from their homes. And I have heard from family members who often have to travel with their loved ones to the VA hospital hundreds of miles away knowing that they cannot afford to stay in a hotel room if an appointment runs late or an examination takes too long. We are changing that so that veterans aren't discouraged from seeking the health care they need simply because they can't afford the trip to the VA.

The New Mexico Department of Veterans Services estimates that approximately 56,000 veterans in New Mexico have to be transported to a veterans hospital annually. Currently, the only lodging option for caregivers of inpatient veterans is to apply to stay in one of the 27 beds offered at the veterans hospital. Renting a hotel

room at their own expense is often times cost prohibitive for caregivers as well.

Besides the Teague provisions to assist caregivers, the legislation also creates a caregiver support program, improves health care services for America's women veterans and expands the mental health services provided by the Department of Veterans Affairs. The bill also:

- Creates a national quality management officer to act as the principal officer responsible for the Veteran Health
- Administration's quality assurance program Provides for a pilot program studying the use of community organizations and local and state government entities in providing care and benefits to veterans.
- Creates a pilot program, which would provide specified dental services to veterans, survivors and dependents of veterans through a dental insurer.
- Prohibits the VA from collecting copayments from veterans who are catastrophically disabled.
- Provides higher priority status for certain veterans who are Medal of Honor recipients.
- Requires the VA to provide hospital care, medical services and nursing home care for certain Vietnam-era veterans exposed to herbicide and Gulf-War era veterans who have insufficient medical evidence to establish a service-connected disability. The bill now heads to the Senate.

Adoptions, crisis care added to foster care services

Known best for its statewide network of treatment foster care parents, the nonprofit Family Pride Foundation has recently added two new services – an adoption service and a crisis nursery.

The newest service is the crisis nursery, made possible by grants from the New Mexico Children's Trust Fund and the United Way.

Children from birth to age 12 will be able to stay with one of Family Pride's trained foster care parents for up to three days under the crisis nursery program, said Family Pride Executive Director Carrie Greer.

Knowing that there was need for this kind of service in the community, Greer said the crisis nursery was modeled after a similar successful program in Chicago.

Since the crisis nursery began last July, several families have been assisted by the service, she said. In one case, the parent had to go out of town for emergency dialysis, and she needed someone to care for her five children. Greer said Family Pride was able to respond quickly, and foster parents took care of the children during the emergency.

"Our parents are really giving," she said. "They'll take kids at a moment's notice."

The crises are often short-lived for things such as medical treatment or a parent having to go to a funeral or out of town for a job interview, Greer said. The service gives parents with limited means a safe way to have their children watched without becoming overly stressed.

Should the crisis be more severe and lasting, Greer said the agency has a good working relationship with the state Children, Youth and Families

Department to determine if more long-term foster care is needed.

Family Pride has a statewide network of treatment foster care parents – parents trained to deal with children with at-risk emotional and behavioral needs, as well as other life challenges, Greer said.

Besides the 20 treatment foster care parents Family Pride has in Doña Ana County, the agency has treatment foster care parents in Deming, Hobbs, Capitan, Roswell and Albuquerque. It is currently working on expanding into the Lordsburg and Silver City areas, as well.

All parent receive extensive training in dealing with behavioral issues, as well as emergency medical care, Greer said.

Stays with treatment foster care parents are usually limited to six months, she said, but the goal is to also work with the children's family so they can return to their original homes.

"Treatment foster care is really a bridge back to home," Greer said.

Family Pride takes a team approach to the services they provide, she said, with therapists and directors working with the families and other agencies.

The other new service at Family Pride is its new adoption agency called Angel's Watch.

Greer said the service finds prospective parents who are ready to adopt and match them with newborns given up for adoption.

What makes the service different than traditional adoptions is that the birth parents get to learn about – and choose – the adoptive parents. This is an open adoption service from the start, Greer said. "It saves a

lot of hassle later on," she said. Currently, Angel's Watch has seven

families waiting to adopt newborns.

As is the case for its new crisis nursery, Greer said the biggest challenge is getting the word out to parents and expecting mothers that the services are available.

Though Family Pride provides its services through grants and managed Medicaid for its treatment foster care, the agency also holds fundraising events and will take donations of needed items, such as diapers, children's clothing, car seats, duffle or sports bags and personal hygiene products.

# **Electric rates will go up** during summer months Greater usage spurs market power buys

During the winter months, New Mexico's demand for El Paso Electric power can usually be met with what the company generates locally

But as temperatures heat up and air conditioners are turned on, the company has to buy power on the open market at a cost greater than locally generated power.

That's why El Paso Electric went to seasonal rates, said Clay Doyle, vice president for New Mexico Affairs.

Most customers took scant notice of the change approved by the New Mexico Public Regulation Commission (PRC) because the winter rate was lower than the old rate, Doyle said

But when they start getting their bills under the new summer rate, they may take notice, he said

Doyle explained the new rate structure Monday, April 19, at the City Council meeting in case residents contacted local officials about the rate change.

For residential customers, the old rate was a base fee of \$6 and a charge of .11482 per kilowatt hour. The new structure has a base fee of \$7, but charges a lower rate of .1079 per kilowatt hour during winter months, which are November through April.

The summer rates, which run from May to October, will be .1179 per kilowatt hour for the 600 kilowatt hours. If a customer uses more power, the rate per kilowatt hour goes up to .13599.

Doyle said the average home that El Paso Electric serves in New Mexico uses about 600 kilowatt hours of energy a month. Under the old rate, the average bill was \$71.89. Under the new seasonal rates, the winter bill would be \$71.74, but the summer bill goes up to \$77.74.

For a home that uses 1,000 kilowatt hours of energy a month, Dole said the old bill was \$120.82, with a new winter bill of \$114.90 and a summer bill of \$132.14.

Besides better reflecting the utility's actual cost of making adequate amounts of energy available during times of peak usages and high demand, Doyle said the new seasonal rate structure encourages better energy conservation by customers, such as not letting the air conditioning unit run all day if no one is home.

The PRC also approved changes to time-ofuse rates - which very few customers subscribe to - and business rates were simplified, especially for small businesses.

## Berino kids learn cooking s in extension c

It's rare for even an accomplished chef to use purple potatoes in a dish. It's even more unlikely for sixth-graders in Berino Elementary School - many who readily admit they're not fans of healthy food – to use the exotic ingredient while preparing a lunch. That's exactly why New Mexico State University's Doña Ana County Extension Office started the Cooking with Kids program at the school, to introduce school children to healthy, inexpensive meals. "Cooking with Kids motivates and empowers students to

make healthy food choices," said Terri Von Wolff, an Extension nutrition educator at NMSU.

She started teaching Cooking with Kids last November and travels to Berino Elementary, in southern Doña Ana County, throughout the school year. It's the first time the Doña Ana County Extension office has had someone working on the program.

"It's important because students who come from low-income areas are less likely to broaden their eating horizons," she said. "Most tell you right off they don't eat vegetables. After the lesson, they are more inclined to taste it because they cooked it.'

In a recent class, students learned how to make llapingachos, a dish from Ecuador resembling a potato pancake with corn, onion and cheese served with a chile sauce. Students also made a fresh green salad to accompany the meal.

During the course, students learn how to use a chef's knife and other kitchen utensils, how to follow a recipe and actually saw what half a cup of vegetables or flour look like. They also learned about the geography, culture and climate of the country from which their dishes originated.

"It really teaches them that there is a bigger world out there than what they may have experienced," Von Wolff said.

After the meal is prepared, students eat "family style" by serving one another, eating together and then washing the plates,

dishes and utensils.



school and teachers," she said. "This would not have been possible without their support."

"The Cooking with Kids program has had a very positive impact on our students," said Principal Reyes Valtierra. "The curriculum complements many of our literacy and math standards and objectives. The program is rigorous but extremely appealing to our students. They are always excited whenever they know that the program is taking place."

The Cooking with Kids program has afforded our students a great opportunity," said Jean Jacks, the school nurse at Berino Elementary. "The kids love the classes."

McKinley Boston, New Mexico State's athletics director, predicts it will. And he should know.

Boston, remember, sat on the NCAA's post-season basketball tournament committee from 1995-99. As a committee alumnus, he was invited to comment at the recent NCAA Board of Directors meeting during this year's post-season tournament finals in Indianapolis.

I'm a traditionalist," he said. "I don't always like changes. But I know the economics of it (expanding to 96 teams).

CBS, which currently owns sole rights to televise and broadcast the entire event, is reportedly unable to continue its financial obligation for the next three years.

Which gives the NCAA the opportunity to opt out of its contract with CBS. That, Boston said, is one of the driving forces behind expansion.

The Aggies' AD believes a new pact will be formed with one of the major networks such as CBS joining Fox, for instance, or ABC joining ESPN to bid for the rights.

That would open the opportunity for more nationally televised tournament games and less switching regionally from game to game

I'd vote for that.

Boston said Division 1A college presidents will be heavily involved in the expansion.

That worries me.

Academics and athletics don't always mix well. How about the athletic directors designing the expansion plan instead? They're involved in the day-to-day operation of sports. Presidents should be fundraising for their school's academic programs, not for the basketball operation.

Öddly, it's the presidents who refuse to endorse a playoff system for college football. They could untangle that mess in a hurry. Alas, in their minds, the current bowl system is too profitable to change.

If the new basketball tournament format prevails, the top 32 teams would receive first round byes, allowing it to continue to be a three-week event.

I have to believe that the majority of Division 1A basketball coaches would approve expansion. Call it job security. How do you fire a coach whose team

made the post-season tournament despite a mediocre record?

# **Sports** For now it's foctball only Aggies' Rust battling at QB

Maybe the chance to play quarterback for the Aggies convinced Tanner Rust to stick with football.

He does, according to the Aggies' football coaching staff, like being in charge. Most good quarterbacks do. When Rust arrived on campus as a

freshman in 2009, baseball was still an option. He starred at third base and catcher at El Capitan High School in San Diego.

But football is priority now. Baseball later, perhaps.

Rust, a healthy-looking 6-foot-2, 195-pound redshirt freshman, is involved in a heated battle for the starting quarterback position this spring. He said that competing with Jeff Fleming, Trevor Walls and Matt Christian is productive for all concerned. "Makes us all better," Rust said. Translated, he wants the job, no questions asked.

After last Saturday's scrimmage, head coach DeWayne Walker said he liked Rust's aggressive approach to winning the QB position. "He's in the film room with coach Dunbar (Mike, offensive coordinator) constantly," Walker said.

"He spends a lot of time studying film. He wants to be the starting guy, you can bet on it.

"Is he a good passer? He's a good thrower. He can move the offense throwing or running.

"We won't make any decisions at quarterback until next fall.

Walker, Rust said, was a big reason he chose New Mexico State.

"I came here because of him (Walker) and the staff," Rust said. "I'd heard about them when I was in high school and they

were at UCLA. "And I like the offense here. Being able to run or throw. It's versatile."

As a senior at El Capitan, Rust passed for 2,700 yards and 28 touchdowns. He rushed for 385 more yards and four TDs.

"I like to use my feet," he said. "I like making plays out of the pocket."

Rust said that Dunbar is stressing mechanics for NMSU's quarterbacks in practice this spring. "With him, mechanics is awfully

important," Rust said. "We watch a lot of film on ourselves."

Like many athletes, Rust has heroes. "In baseball it's Mickey Mantle," he said. "In football it's Troy Aikman. I'm a big Dallas Cowboys fan."

Which puts him alongside a majority in the Las Cruces com-

munity. Dallas is big here. The Aggies will practice Monday, Wednesday and Friday before the spring intrasquad game at 11 a.m. Saturday, May 1, that ends spring drills.

Former Oakland Raiders coach Tom Flores will deliver keynote remarks during the second annual Lou and Mary Henson Community Breakfast for the Boys & Girls Club of Las Cruces at 7:30 a.m. Thursday, April 29, at the New Mexico Farm & Ranch Heritage Museum, 4100 Dripping Springs Road.

**NMSU women's golf earns** fifth place in tournament Aggies will have experienced team next year

The New Mexico State women's golf team finished fifth at the 2010 Club Glove Western Athletic Conference Championship with a threeround total of 931 at the Longbow Golf Club in Mesa, Ariz., Wednesday, April 21.

San Jose State won the WAC title by one stroke with a 918 over three days. The Spartans came in with scores of 304-302-312 to take home the WAC trophy. Host team Hawai'i, finished second with a 919 (305-303-311), just ahead of third-place Idaho which carded a 920 (308-303-309) on the par-71, 6, 146-yard Longbow Course. Fresno State

finished in fourth just ahead of New Mexico State. The Aggies came in with rounds of 312-302-317 to wrap up the 2009-10 season.

"We had some chances but fell short," head coach Paul Brilliant said. "We are going to miss the leadership of Maggie (Murphy). She was a great role model on the course and even more so in the classroom."

Senior Maggie Murphy finished 34th with a threeround score of 245. Sophomore Ashley Elias was the top finisher for NMSU. She played consistently all week carding a 77 in rounds one and three and a 76 in round two for a 17-over 230, finishing ninth. Junior Buz Bowerman-Ritchie was right behind Elias in 10th place with an 18-over 231 (76-75-80).

"We have lots of experience coming back next season, so things will be looking positive for us," Brilliant said.

Junior Pang Chanachai improved her play each day coming in with rounds of 82-76-75 for a 20-over-par 233. She finished 13th, while Mint Swaschuto tied for 22nd with a 26-over-par 239. Swaschuto started the tournament with two scores of 77 but faltered on the last day with an 85.

# Ag baseball stays in hunt for WAC conference title

## League-leading Sacramento State on deck

The New Mexico State baseball team opens a four-game series against Sacramento State in Sacramento, Calif., starting at 2 p.m. Friday, April 23.

Senior Leo Aguirre picked up hit No. 200 of his career as the Aggies took the four-game series from San Jose State after defeating the Spartans 5-3 at Municipal Stadium, Monday, April 19.

Aguirre, who leads the team with a .410 batting average, was 2-for-5 at the plate with an RBI and earned career hit No. 200 in his first at-bat of the day. Center fielder Wes Starkes joined Aguirre, going 2-for-3 with a double, RBI and a run scored.

With the win, New Mexico State, 27-12-1 overall, are second in the Western Athletic Conference with a 5-2-1 record in league play. The Aggies scored their five runs on eight hits and were fortunate enough to not let the two errors they committed affect the outcome of the game.

The Aggies had to come from behind for the second day in a row as SJSU scored the first run of the game in the bottom of the first. Freshman starting pitcher Tyler Mack, a native of Katy, Texas, worked 6.1 innings on the mound and struck out three batters.

Other than giving up the run in the first inning, Mack allowed the Spartans to cross the plate once again in the seventh.

The Aggies tied the game in the sixth on an RBI single by senior third baseman Wade Reynoso. He now has 38 of NMSU's 419 RBI on the season. New Mexico State gave up two runs in the bottom of the seventh to fall behind once again.

Steven Anderson shut down SJSU to preserve a win for himself and his team. Anderson threw 2 innings, struck out two batters and gave up only two hits.

Starkes hit an RBI to right field after pinch hitter Kyle Decatur led-off the inning with a double. Junior shortstop Ryan Aguayo posted a two-run double to center field, putting the Aggies on top, 4-3. Aguirre added an insurance run with an RBI single to right-center field.

# **Onthegreen: Golf's new frontier**

# Extend golfing boundaries by regulating emotions and showing mental toughness

During my years of performance coaching with golfers, I have been a proponent of "mental toughness." For me that simply meant being able to produce under pressure and not choke. While there is much more to it than that, I have had pause to re-think the larger picture of mental toughness and revise some of my earlier observations.

Lately, I have been placing more emphasis on winning behaviors associated with emotional intelligence and emotional resilience. Previously the emphasis was on structured thinking and "correct" thoughts. In recent years, however, research is strongly pointing to the fact that emotions rule performance.

Effectively managing your emotions may actually be golf's new frontier.

Let's say your prevailing emotions while playing competitive golf are anger and fear. Usually pessimistic golfers undergo a flux of conflicting feelings as they play, ranging from defeatism to frustration, both of which can have disastrous results. Research demonstrates that negative emotions can have the following consequences: less ability to think clearly; less efficiency in decision-making; reduced coordination; higher cardiovascular stress.

Negative emotions tend to counter thoughts and efforts aimed at performing well, whether it be in sports or public speaking. You have your central nervous system - your brain directing your body - getting the signals crossed with your autonomic nervous system, which controls organs, glands and hormones

A typical scenario might be excessive worry about an outcome - an approach shot to a green over water with the tournament on the line, perhaps - where we're asking our muscle memory to produce a great shot, but the sympathetic nervous system shoots out adrenaline and constricts our flexibility. Like having one foot on the gas and the other foot on the brake.

#### What you can do

Theory and research aside, there are several things you can do which will elevate your ability to manage your emotions, ultimately resulting in your greater chance of success. One is disciplining yourself to have more positive emotions, despite past tendencies to get down and sour.

Do positive emotions just happen – are they random? Or can we choose them ourselves at different times and for different reasons?

You don't have to be the victim of your past emotional breakdowns and disasters. With practice you can learn to create positive feelings for yourself. Researchers are telling us that learning to handle your emotions can make a big difference in whether or not you are successful in life. Just a few of the amazing consequences of healthy and positive emotions

are: greater creativity; better problem solving and decision making; sharper thinking and memory; a healthier heart and immune system; improved performance; and, ultimately, a longer life span.

The very first thing to do is eliminate negative and demeaning self-talk, while detaching yourself from blaming, whining and complaining on the golf course. Most of the time when we complain about the course or conditions or weather or noise or wind - anything - it's just a feeble attempt to wish away our own poor play.

If you are going to be undaunted by adversity - the true mark of the emotionally resilient player - you need to respond positively with self-nurturing thoughts, more focus and better play. This is a tall order, I realize, especially when you do it while avoiding trying too hard to do better, which, of course, is almost always counter-productive in golf.

If you've ever seen anyone panic as they're about to give a speech you know it's not a pretty sight. The speaker's galloping anxiety, perhaps accelerated by uncontrolled irrational thoughts, becomes part of a classic "fight-or-flight" syndrome, where worry, tension, fear and panic all converge making the person virtually helpless to act calmly and rationally. It may get worse - "freeze-or-faint" may also be reactions.

#### Tension is the enemy

Emotional tension is the enemy of the golf swing, and the emotions rule where tension is concerned. And golf is a rare game where the swing is allowed to occur voluntarily, not as the result of a reaction, say to a pitched ball. Negative thinking and negative feelings coexist and will handicap a golfer more than any course conditions or opponents. When you engage in rigid thoughts of "must," "should," "have to" you are simply jacking up the tension and making it harder to perform well. Any round of golf can be an emotional roller coaster if we fail to recognize the warning signs of maladaptive feelings, thoughts and tension.

It strikes me that there is a close tie between confidence and emotional regulation, one that we need to exploit if we are to make ourselves our own best friend on the golf **Charlie Blanchard** Golf Doctor



course, rather than our own worst enemy. Just like positive, performance-enhancing emotions, confidence is something we choose, not something that just pops up in our game by happenstance.

Yes, you can take action to create your own confidence, and the happy anticipation that goes along with it. Start by practicing and warming up in a way that promotes the feel of solid contact and sinking short putts. So many golfers unthinkingly go to the range, pull out their driver and start wailing away. And then they're left with one or two randomly lucky good hits. Start with half wedges and take your time. Next learn to manage your anxiety by personal affirmations ("I'm a good short putter") and relaxed breathing - all selfdirected moves to build your confidence.

When you're on the golf course think of yourself as your own caddie. Caddies on tour don't tear their players down; they build them up. Don't be overly critical of yourself. Be your own caddy and coach yourself into good decisions and good shots. Make a choice to feel good about yourself regardless of the outcome of any single shot or round. If today didn't go well, there is always tomorrow, and we can accept the challenge of changing what we didn't like about yesterday. One of Annika Sorenstam's first golf coaches, Pia Nilsson, put it best when she told Sorenstam, "Learn to guide your own emotions on the course and in life."

# It's obvious that Ags improved on offense

QBs, receivers shine in spring practice

"I have to admit, it's getting better."

As a 1960s guy, I borrow the Beatles lyric to offer my observations on the Aggies' passing-game progress as compared to this point last year.

Last year's spring game saw a ragged passing game from all involved. The improvement in the past 12 months is emerging during April.

A new offensive coordinator and a new receivers coach seem to be the tonic the offense needed. The experience from Mike Dunbar and the enthusiasm and verve from R. Todd Littlejohn have provided a new prescription for more points and subsequently more wins this year, it is hoped.

A new playbook is helping, but the intensity Littlejohn is lending has found a new gear for the offensive machine. His vocal encouragement from the sidelines and his passionate teaching of the offense has helped to breathe life into an attack that was moribund in 2009.

Getting back to my impressions, the improved mechanics are what has caught my eye. The throws are smoother, crisper and more effective than what was shown at drills a year ago.

Receivers have learned how to hang on to the passes when they are within range. Junior Jeff Fleming is holding his own and is getting a lot of work with the first team. Junior college transfer Matt Christian is rehabbing from surgery on his left clavicle, but he has been able to impress even so. Redshirt fresh-



man Tanner Rust has had a year to learn about Division IA football and seems to be comfortable when he has been given the reins during scrimmage situations.

The effectiveness of the offense starts with the quarterback, but whoever is running the offense will have a good variety of complementary skilled players to go to.

At wide receiver, junior Julius Fleming is having a good spring, and senior Marcus Allen has had some big-play moments this April. Tight ends are showing improvement at snagging passes as well. Seniors Kyle Nelson and Kyle Hipp are more than just blockers as both turned in good gains during scrimmage play. If there is a tight end that can keep the defense occupied when the ball is snapped, there is one more option for the Dunbar attack.

A running back with good size is a valuable commodity. Grayshirt freshman Marques Dunn is a big running back at 6-foot-2, with a solid frame. NM State had big running backs named Chris Barnes and Jim Germany produce yards and wins in the past. Senior Seth Smith is proof that size won't keep you from gaining a 1,000 yards, but having three guys who can do it keep your offense from getting stale.

# Disciplining child with ADHD must suit their characteristics

Do childhood traumas inevitably twist and warp a person in the adult years?

No. It is well known that difficult childhoods leave some people wounded and disadvantaged. For others, they fuel great achievement and success. The difference appears to be a function of individual temperaments and resourcefulness.

In a classic study called "Cradles of Eminence," Victor and Mildred Goertzel investigated the home backgrounds of 300 highly successful people. The researchers sought to identify the early experiences that may have contributed to remarkable achievement. All of the subjects were well known for their accomplishments and included Einstein, Freud, Churchill and many others.

The backgrounds of these people proved very interesting. Threefourths of them came from troubled childhoods, enduring poverty, broken homes or parental abuse. Onefourth had physical handicaps. Most of those who became writers and playwrights had watched their own parents embroiled in psychological dramas of one sort or another. The researchers concluded that the need to compensate for disadvantages was a major factor in the drive toward personal achievement.

One of the best illustrations of this phenomenon is seen in the life of Eleanor Roosevelt, a former first lady. Being orphaned at 10, she underwent a childhood of utter anguish. She was very homely and never felt she really belonged to anybody.

According to Victor Wilson, Newhouse News Service, "She was a rather humorless introvert, a young woman unbelievably shy, unable to overcome her personal insecurity and with a conviction of her own inadequacy."

The world knows, however, that Mrs. Roosevelt rose above her emotional shackles. As Wilson said, "From some inner wellspring, Mrs. Roosevelt summoned a tough, unyielding courage, tempered by remarkable self-control and selfdiscipline..."

That "inner wellspring" has another appropriate name: compensation.

Obviously, one's attitude toward a handicap determines its impact on one's life. It has become popular to blame adverse circumstances for irresponsible behavior (e.g., poverty causes crime, broken homes produce juvenile delinquents, a sick society imposes drug addiction on its youth). There is some truth in this assumption, since people in those difficult circumstances are more likely to behave in destructive ways. But they are not forced to do so. To say that adverse conditions cause irresponsible behavior is to remove all responsibility from the shoulders of the individual. The excuse is hollow. We must each decide what we will do with inner doubt and outer hardship.

The application to an individual family should be obvious. If a child has gone through a traumatic experience or is physically disadvantaged, his or her parents need not give up hope. They should identify his or her strengths and natural abilities, which can be used to overcome the hurdle. The problem that seems so formidable today may become the inspiration for greatness tomorrow.

We have a 5-year-old son who has been diagnosed with ADHD. He is really difficult to handle, and I have no idea how to manage him. I know he has a neurological problem; I don't feel right about making him obey like we do our other children. It is a big problem for us. What do you suggest?

I understand your dilemma, but I urge you to discipline your son. Every youngster needs the security of defined limits, and the ADHD boy or girl is no exception. Such a



child should be held responsible for his or her behavior, although the approach may be a little different.

For example, most children can be required to sit on a chair for disciplinary reasons, whereas some very hyperactive children would not be able to remain there. Similarly, corporal punishment is sometimes ineffective with a highly excitable little bundle of electricity. As with every aspect of parenthood, disciplinary measures for the ADHD child must be suited to his or her unique characteristics and needs.

# **Shots for tots**

## The right answers to some common booster questions

Anyone who is a parent has expe-rienced the "Why?," "Why not?," "But why?" trifecta of inquisitiveness from their child(ren), and while curiosity is alleged to have killed the cat, it certainly has not slowed down the inquisitive nature of toddlers, tykes, tweens and teens.

Adults, though, can be just as curious and nowhere is this manifested more than in those people who are about to embark on a new journey - new parents. Curiosity especially rears its head when the health of a new son or daughter is discussed.

National Infant Immunization Week began Thursday, April 22. Some of the more frequently asked questions about infant immunizations that have been posed to the Centers for Disease Control are as follows.

Is it okay for my baby to have so many shots at once? Studies have shown that even infants can handle many shots at once. A single shot of combination vaccines will protect your child against more than one disease. As science advances, protection against diseases advances, too.

Don't infants have natural immunity? During the last few weeks of pregnancy, babies get some temporary immunity or protection from their mothers, but this is only for the diseases to which the mothers are immune. Since these antibodies do not last long, the infant is left vulnerable to disease.

Haven't we gotten rid of most diseases in this country? It's true that vaccines have played a crucial role in the eliminating of certain diseases. However, if vaccinations stopped, the amount of diseases in this country could quickly grow to tens or hundreds of thousands of cases. When vaccination rates drop, an increase of measles, whooping cough, chickenpox and other disease outbreaks is common. Children who are not fully vaccinated can become seriously sick and spread it through a community.

I heard that some vaccines can cause autism. Is this true? Scientific research has found no relationship between vaccines and autism. The American Academy of Pediatrics, Institute of Medicine and other groups agree that vaccines are not responsible for the number of children now

recognized as having autism.

Can't I just wait until my child goes to school to catch up on immunizations? The old adage, "an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure," applies here. Why wait? Many diseases can be very dangerous to infants. Newborns, babies and toddlers can be exposed to diseases from parents and other adults, brothers, and sisters. The exposure can take place anywhere - in a store, in a child care facility, or in an airport. More people travel internationally now than in past years, increasing the chances of your baby's exposure to diseases from other countries without you knowing about it.

Why does my child need a chickenpox shot? Isn't it a mild disease? If blisters become infected, chickenpox can be a serious disease for children. Before vaccine was available, about 50 children a year died from chickenpox, and about 1 in 500 kids who got chickenpox were hospitalized.

My child is sick right now. Is it okay for her to get vaccinated? In most cases, this would not be a problem. Even though children with colds, mild fevers, earaches, or diarrhea can get vaccinated, it's best to check with your child's doctor first.

# State confirms more spring pet cases of the plague

Dr. Paul Ettestad, the New Mexico Department of Health's public health veterinarian, is warning New Mexicans that plague activity is increasing this spring.

He is encouraging people to protect themselves from plague and Hantavirus as increased precipitation this winter and spring can make rodent populations grow and increase people's risk of getting sick with diseases that rodents carry.

The Department of Health's Scientific Laboratory confirmed plague this week in a dog that lived near San Jon in Quay County. Other confirmed animal plague cases this year include a dog and cat from Santa Fe County (city of Santa Fe and Eldorado) and a dog and cat from Rio Arriba County (Alcalde and Abiquiu area). All cases have recovered. No human plague or Hantavirus cases have been confirmed so far this year.

The increased winter and spring precipitation can stimulate increases in rodent populations and lead to in-

creased plague and Hantavirus activity," Ettestad said. "Plague cases in pets serve as a warning that there is plague activity in rodents and their fleas, and human cases can follow. Pets infected with plague are hunters who have eaten an infected rodent or been bitten by a rodent's fleas prior to getting ill. Pets can transport the fleas back into the home where they can infect people."

Plague, a bacterial disease of rodents, is generally transmitted to humans through the bites of infected fleas, but can also be transmitted by direct contact with infected animals, including rodents, rabbits and pets.

Hantavirus is a deadly disease transmitted by infected rodents through urine, droppings or saliva. People can contract the disease when they breathe in aerosolized virus. The deer mouse is the main carrier of Hantavirus in New Mexico.

Four cases of Hantavirus occurred in New Mexico in 2009, one each from Rio Arriba, Taos, Santa Fe and San Miguel

counties. None were fatal. Two cases of Hantavirus occurred in New Mexico in 2008, one each from Taos and Otero counties. Both of which were fatal.

'Most people are exposed to Hantavirus in or around their homes, especially when they clean out enclosed areas that have lots of mouse droppings," Ettestad said. "The best defense against Hantavirus is to avoid disturbing areas of rodent infestation, including nests and droppings. As warmer weather occurs, people need to air out their cabins and sheds before entering them for the first time.'

Early symptoms of Hantavirus are fever and muscle aches, possibly with chills, headache, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, abdominal pain and cough. These symptoms develop within one to six weeks after rodent exposure.

It's official. Saturn's no longer with

us. No, another planet hasn't been demoted. The Saturn dealership next to the Las Cruces Bulletin is finally vacant.

More than a year after General Motors announced it was dropping the Saturn brand from its line of vehicles, the shop's finally been abandoned.

Saturn was formed in the '80s as a subsidiary of GM in response to increased competition from Japanese automakers. The company branded itself as a "Different Kind of Car Company." Probably not the type of different GM intended.

Perhaps GM's import fighter was too ambitious. GM built a new standalone plant, manufacturing process, dealer network and recruited a new workforce to produce the new platform.

The brand struggled to gain popularity in the American auto market in the early and mid '90s. The Wall Street Journal reports that 41 percent of Saturn buyers also owned another GM car during that time, which meant GM wasn't tapping into the import market as much as it had planned.

In an attempt to refresh Saturn's image, GM rolled out in 2002 with the Saturn Vue, a crossover sport utility vehicle. It followed that line with the Sky roadster, a look-butdon't-touch gorgeous two-seater with a space-age design and a lot of ponies under the hood.

After the brands failed to live up to expectations and in the wake of a global recession, GM chose to focus its production efforts on its four original brands: Chevrolet, Cadillac, Buick and GMC. It dropped Pontiac, Hummer, Saturn and Saab

All Saturn dealers nationwide are ordered to close by October 2010.

So what's next for Saturn owners? If their local Saturn dealership closes, they can take their cars to be serviced at any GM dealership.

To calm some of those service-related fears and the anticipated drop in resale value, GM announced in February it would offer current Saturn owners up to See **Saturn** on page B2

## Medoff's mentality: 'Free and local'

You can mimic direct natural sunlight with a whiteboard or a car reflector. With a two-by-four and some ingenuity, you've got yourself a dolly-mounted camera. Look hard enough and you'll find someone willing to donate equipment in exchange for a speaking part in your film.

But how do you get two Hollywood vets on board, an entire below- and abovethe-line crew and

several film locations to

complete an ambitious film project?

"On the cheap," said Mark Medoff, acclaimed script and playwright and director of "Refuge," filmed in southern New Mexico. "Always start from free and work from there."

Medoff, also a theater director, actor and professor, is best known for his play "Children of a Lesser God," which received both the Tony and Olivier awards.

His latest project, "Refuge," is currently in post-production and awaiting acceptance into the Cannes Film Festival indie market.

The film stars Linda Hamilton ("Terminator," "Black Moon Rising"), Christopher McDonald ("Happy Gilmore," "Thelma and Louise"), Chris Payne Gilbert ("The Shield," "Sex in the City") and Lena Georgas ("Kingdom Hospital").

We made this movie for under \$1 million total and under \$100,000 cash," Medoff said. "They said it couldn't be done."

As a longtime resident of Las Cruces, Medoff said he knew just where to dig to stay on budget. First, he used the resources available to him at New Mexico State University's Creative Media Institute and Doña Ana Community College's Creative Media Technology program to help staff his crew.

He brought in a union crew that would be willing to work with students and hired local sound mixer David Wheeler, local hair and make-up artist Pepper Gallegos and local costume designer Mary McGinn, who also owns The Bean in Mesilla. "We proved what we set out to do, which

## **EBID channels focus on cutting costs**

## Schedule changing for area ditch riders

The Elephant Butte Irrigation District Board of Directors at its April meeting proposed to modify ditch rider hours to cut expenses while continuing to provide efficient services.

The changes are needed to reduce ditch riders' overtime hours, which the board thought brought excessive expenses last year.

"We have to do something to save money and jobs," board chair James Salopek said.

Ditch riders control the EBID irrigation systems that allow water to be conveyed to farms in assigned areas, according to water rights.

The change is being made on the west side of the Rio Grande in the three-unit District 5, which extends south from Berino to Anthony, N.M.

The board's rescheduling efforts are focused on "saving money and saving jobs."

Formerly, ditch riders worked on the canals and diversion structures in 12-hour shifts, five days a week, but the board and manager Gary Esslinger modified the schedule to four days

each week for the 12-hour shifts.

District 5 was broken down into Units A, B and C, each containing three ditch riders. A "floating rover" also works the district, water master Ricardo Bejarano said.

The District 5 Unit C is being eliminated, and the Unit A and B ditch riders will take up the slack. The former Unit 5C ditch riders are being reassigned, one each to District 6A, District 5B and District 4B, Bejarano said.

This was not easily done as the third part unit plays a very important part in the smooth operation of the La Union main canal," Bejarano said in his report. "This canal helps the district deliver water to the Texas accounts.'

When board members reviewed EBID's budget at the end of the 2009 season, they learned that overtime salary costs exceeded \$200,000, said Esslinger, and they asked him to find ways to reduce costs while keeping the patron farmers' fee to \$80 for the first two acrefeet.

"We incorporated our efficiency to try to cut our expenses but to continue with highquality, reliable water delivery," Esslinger said. See **EBID** on page B2

was filming ('Refuge') with a very young crew and young film professionals," Medoff said.

Second, Medoff met with potential investors to discuss the state film incentives. He is counting on receiving a 25 percent return, in the form of a tax credit, by the end of next year's tax season.

We got an extension on our income tax (filing) so we can get 25 percent of our money back," he said. "It ended up that I had three of my high school and one college friends who put the cash into this that allowed us to buy everything we needed to start filming."

Third on Medoff's list was scouting locations vital to the script.

"I set out to take advantage of every-body I knew," he said. "Working with that dictum, 'Start free and work from there,' is how we did this for under \$100,000 cash. We did not pay for a single location." "Refuge" scene locations include a lo-

cal wrecking yard, The Gen costume shop, a hangar at Las Cruces International Airport, Alma d'arte Charter High School and Butterfield Trail, among others.

With most of the pieces in place, Medoff set off to find the film's protagonists. He knew if he wanted his film to be in contention for TV, DVD or cable TV release, he had to ride the marketing efforts

to do this, but I'll show it to her anyway." Two weeks later, Medoff met Hamilton for breakfast in Los Angeles, during which Hamilton gave Medoff a hug and said, "I've never wanted to do anything more than this in my life."

"And at the same time we were putting together the pre-production staff, which is like putting together an army," Medoff said.

To pad the staff, Medoff used many CMI and CMT students, including second assistant director Marissa Macias, a CMI student.

'We didn't have money to hire a transportation captain or people to do any other number of jobs so we worked with mostly students," he said.

The movie is now in post-production and Medoff and his staff are in the marketing and selling process. He's optimistic that his film will make it to the Cannes Film Festival circuit, where independent films "sell like vegetables at the market," he said.

"They have a number of foreign sales representatives who rent screening rooms and create public relations materials to sell your movie in foreign territories,' Medoff said. "But in order to do the final DVD version we will need money from somewhere across the sea, or even Canada or Mexico, so that we can finally distribute it.'

"Farmers have to get their water on time. In order to do this, I met with my staff, middle managers and employees to try to reduce expenses by cutting overtime. By doing so we came up with this 48-hour schedule. But with this proposal we'll incorporate our veteran employees to cover these areas and provide the irrigation services we need."

The decision to dissolve the third unit was not completely well-received, and management decided to use the third-unit men in the same La Union main canal area.

This would allow the men to still work with the farmers who are used to them," Bejarano said. "The three men will be assigned their respective areas and duties and still be an integral part of the La Union main canal."

The number of farmers' orders for irrigation prompted EBID to release water for the 2010 season on March 15 in the Arrey Canal and to follow with a release on March 24 into the upper part of the Mesilla Valley.

Thus far, ditch riders have diverted 28,396 acre-feet of water into farmer fields for early vegetables, ground prepared for cotton, alfalfa and some pecan orchards, leaving an EBID balance of 76,198 acre-feet, Bejarano reported.

## Finding the best fit is a necessary process

When Las Cruces area homebuyers Steve and Mari decided it was time to purchase their first home, their initial step was to research available financing options.

What size down payment will they need? Will there be any closing costs? How much will they have to pay each month? Other questions include asking what types of loans best match their qualifications and what size mortgage they can afford. Also of interest is learning if the newest first-time buyer loan is more or less expensive for them than the VA, FHA or Conventional mortgages that might also be available.

Questions such as those, as well as other curious loan-related thoughts, fill the minds of most buyers who contemplate purchasing a home. The main question they have to ask is "Exactly where can we obtain the information we need in order to be informed mortgage consumers?" The simple answer is from Realtors and lenders. Which source is the better choice? Neither, when they're considered individually.

Some Realtors don't care to get involved in the loan process, while others, such as those who have earned the Accredited Buyer Representative designation, make it their business to personally walk buyers through the loan process. On the lenders' side of the fence, some loan officers will openly share their full array of loan "products" with prospective buyers, while others follow corporate office directives to push a particular mortgage product even when it may not be the most cost effective loan for the buyer.

Some lenders are also reluctant to tell buyers that a better mortgage product is available from a competitor down the street, or they many not be knowledgeable about the latest loan products. The latter was the case with Steve and Mari. One unknowledgeable lender they talked with advised them against using a loan product that, in the end, turned out to be a perfect fit for their family's financial needs.

So how can purchasers like Steve and Mari know whether or not they're being given the straight scoop? In addition to speaking to as many lenders and Realtors as possible, consumers can gain additional perspective on the loan process by thinking of lenders as if they were shoe stores. Shoe stores, you ask? Yep!

For one thing, lenders and shoe stores are both retailers (although some major lend-

## **Signs are positive for local recovery** Statewide recession continues

The recession may be over in Las Cruces. More precisely, there is good reason to think March employment data will show job growth for the first time since January 2009. If it does, that will mark the "official"

end of our city's recession. Regional economists measure local economic recessions as beginning when yearover-year growth turns negative and end a recession when year-over-year growth returns to the positive. By this standard, based on revised data released March 11 by the New Mexico Department of Workforce Solutions, Las Cruces entered recession in January 2009 and has remained in recession for 14 months.

So what are the indicators that the recession is coming to an end? First is anecdotal evidence from business people. When you ask them how things are going, they say business is picking up; that we seem to be over the hump; that the worst is behind us. And the economic data seems to bear this out. The Las Cruces economy, on a seasonally adjusted basis, gained jobs in February compared to January (although February employment was still down compared to 2009).

The second indicator of economic recovery is that the recession is getting long in the tooth. The 14 straight months of job loss we have experienced is a record. The current recession is nasty, but not the Great Depression. It's time for recovery.

Third is the recovery in the national economy. Nationally, we have seen em-

ployment growth in three of the last six months. The same factors at work in the national economy are at work in Las Cruces and should cause the economic turnaround to manifest locally.

While Las Cruces appears to be entering recovery mode, the state is not doing as well. Employment seems to still be in free fall, having fallen 2.8 percent in February compared to February 2009. This is a problem for Las Cruces. Falling tax revenues statewide means cuts in state funding for local construction projects, and education.

There is reason for hope in the state economy. New Mexico is an energyexporting state and energy prices are up, although it will be a while before we see the lofty levels from two years ago. The general recovery nationally will ultimately trickle down to New Mexico. Nevertheless, the statewide recovery is still a ways away.

When all is said and done, what was predicted at the beginning of this recession is coming true now, which is that the recession would be long and nasty, but that Las Cruces would fair better than the national economy.

With its large government sector, retirement community and White Sands Missile Range, the Las Cruces economy is relatively stable. We missed the recession in 2001 recession altogether. The current recession, was less severe than might otherwise have been expected. Unfortunately, stability cuts two ways – a less severe recession but also a slower recovery.

While shoe stores sell mostly shoe products, lenders sell loan products. And as in real life, not all shoe stores carry the same shoes and not all lenders carry the same loans. Additionally, even if two "stores" offer identical products, they may not offer them at the same price. Still sound

complicated? Here's an easy way to sort through the

mess: First, define the type of shoe (or loan) you're going to need.

Will it be a tennis, work or dress shoe? The same logic can be applied to loan shopping. Will you need the money for a short or long time? Will you have a large down payment or no down payment at all? Once you've defined the character of your financing

needs (or what type of shoe will do the job for you), you're ready to move on to the next step: Measure the size of your mortgage like you'd measure the size of your shoes.

You probably recall sitting on that little chair or bench in the shoe store while the salesperson measured your shoe size by pressing that big metal thing against the bottom of your foot. At the conclusion of the process, you knew exactly what size shoe would fit your foot and, as a result, could choose any shoe in your size. The same theory can be utilized when applying for a mortgage. Once your Realtor or lender accurately measures your loan size, you'll be able to choose any type of mortgage loan that fits your situation.

To do that, you have to begin mortgage window-shopping. Effective window shopping starts with a credit application at the bank, mortgage company or credit union. Should you allow multiple lenders to request your credit report? According to Fair Isaac and Company (FICO), the folks who developed the credit scoring software used by the major credit reporting agencies, consumers searching for a mortgage or auto loan are not penalized for shopping around for the best rate.

"tate. "Looking for a mortgage or an auto loan may cause multiple lenders to request your credit report, even though you're only looking for one loan," according to Fair Isaac's website www.myfico.com. "To compensate for this, the score counts multiple auto or mortgage inquiries in any 14-day periods as just one inquiry. In addition, the score ignores all mortgage and auto inquires made in the 30 days prior to scoring. So if you find a loan within 30 days, the inquires made by lenders won't affect your score while you're rate shopping." Still, it's a good idea to keep the number of inquires to a minimum – just in case.

Once you've had a Realtor or lender review

your application and your credit, they should be able to discuss with you the loan or loans that appear to fit your needs. Should you obtain a 30-year loan if you're only going to live in the property for two years? Maybe, maybe not. Once you've identified the loan "products" that appear to best suit your needs, ask the lender for a "Good Faith Estimate" (GFE) and Truth in Lending (TIL) Disclosure. The documents will outline the costs, payments, terms, adjustments and other features that will apply to the various loan products. Make sure you keep a copy of your application. It can be submitted to other lenders who can also provide GFEs and TILs for the products they carry in their "stores."

After comparing the features and costs of the various loans from the different stores, most consumers are in a position to obtain a Conditional Loan Commitment from one or more of the lenders. The commitment should not contain a qualifying loan amount, but should contain language indicating that the lender has reviewed your credit, income and debts and that you're qualified to obtain a loan from their company (with absolutely no obligation to do so), subject to finding a property that also qualifies for the loan program.

The Loan Commitment is one of the key documents buyers need when negotiating a good price with a seller, because it tells the seller that you've done your "homework" and are someone whom he or she should take seriously. The final step in the process comes once you've contracted to purchase a property.

With a Purchase Agreement in hand, you can ask some or all of the previously visited lenders (and others) to provide a GFE and TIL that is specific to your transaction. It is at that moment that you will be in a position to pit one lender against another. Each lender can compete for our business by submitting to you the best products they may have to offer at the best prices at which they're able to offer them.

Negotiating a good price for a property is important, but negotiation for the price for the money is even more important. After all, you'll be thinking of your loan each and every time you write the check for your monthly payment.

## Friday, April 23, 2010 DACC festival gives onions an ed Farmers, students to showcase 'versatile vegetable'

Southern New Mexico is known for its pecan and chile crops, yet one locally grown "versatile vegetable" is just as valuable and will get its moment in the spotlight Saturday, April 24, and Sunday, April 25, in Mesilla.

The inaugural Mesilla Valley Onion Festival will showcase the multifaceted onion, the farmers who grow it and how local culinary practitioners and students use it.

The two-day event will offer a family-friendly environment in which attendees can enjoy local music, cooking demonstrations and a wide variety of onion-related food.

Why onions?

"We wanted to showcase a little-known, little-appreciated agricultural product in the area," said Kim Seifert, department chair of the Doña Ana Community College Business and Marketing department and co-creator of the Onion Festival. "We wanted to do something that would catch people's attention - onions catch people's attention."

Along with Seifert, the Onion Festival was co-created by Gemma Nicholson, an assistant professor for the DACC hospitality program, and Daniel Sandoval, a DACC instructor for the hospitality and tourism department. The three educators then placed the challenge of creating the event on the shoulders of their students, giving them four months to plan an event that would normally take more than a year.

At first, Sandoval said his students responded with a "glazed look" and the question "why onions?" But beyond the initial reluctance, all three educators said their students rose to the occasion with "diligence and professionalism."

They said student participation in the event was the true purpose of the festival. Students could get real life, hands-on experience and enter the workforce with a solid résumé and knowledge to land them a job.

Nicholson's culinary and event-planning classes have done the cooking and food preparation side of the event, while Sandoval's marketing class handled the promotion of the event. Both instructors say select students have risen above the bar of expectation, volunteering 15 to 30 hours of free time each week.

Seifert said students have had to do everything from the ground up, including price shopping for portable restrooms for the event. One student impressed a local business so much that, what was supposed to be a five-minute sales pitch for event sponsorship, turned into an on-the-spot job offer.

In Nicholson's culinary class, students have created anything and everything onion. They've made onion ice cream, onion cookies and an even stranger creation - onion lemonade.

To prove whether or not their onion concoctions could impress the toughest of critics, the students of the DACC culinary program held a focus group with local second graders. After some skepticism, the reviews of the onion creations were positive, especially for the ice cream.

Creators of the Onion Festival also wanted to promote the area as a tourist destination and showcase one of its signature crops.

"Part of our goal is not only to provide the education to the general public and our students, but to help expand the markets of (the

Mesilla Valley's) agricultural products," Sandoval said. Doña Ana County accounts for 53 percent

of the 6,600 acres of onions harvested in the state of New Mexico, according to 2008 New Mexico Department of Agriculture statistics. The U.S. Department of Agriculture valued all U.S. onion production in 2007 at \$334 million, with New Mexico accounting for \$47.5 million of that.

Seifert said during New Mexico's onion harvest season (June to August), the state's production of onions accounts for 65 percent of onions consumed in the U.S.

Seifert said one of the main inspirations for the Onion Festival was the Gilroy Garlic Festival in Gilroy, Calif., one of the largest food festivals in the U.S.

The Mesilla Valley Onion Festival will be held at the Mercado de Mesilla near the Preston Contemporary Art Center. Tickets can be purchased for \$4 at local Pic Quik convenience stores or at the festival gate. A ribbon cutting ceremony will kick-off the festival at 8:30 a.m. Saturday, April 24, and gates will open at 11 a.m. Sunday, April 25.

More than 5,000 attendees are expected for the event. Ticket proceeds will benefit the New Mexico Hospitality and Tourism Education

## **Gary Sandler:** Realtor riding the airwaves since 1999

## Sandler named longest running talk show host in southern NM

A real character – one of the most knowledgeable and colorful real estate agents in the game – that's how many friends, clients and business colleagues have referred to Gary Sandler, owner of Gary Sandler Inc. Realtors – also now the longest running talk show host in southern New Mexico.

Sandler, a southern California native with a long history in real estate, hosts a talk show from 4 to 6 p.m. every Monday on KSNM-AM 570. He also regularly contributes his real estate know-how to the Las Cruces Bulletin.

"To be able to operate in such a friendly environment and to have the open spaces to share with people is a bit like heaven," he said.

Helping people is akin to Sandler's personality.

"People like me because I'm positive, and if there's a way, I can find a way to get it done," he said.

Sandler was born in Long Beach, Calif., where he attended and graduated from Robert Millikan High School. Sandler joined the Air Force post–graduation, "to avoid the draft," he chuckled. He became a B-52 crew chief during his four years in service. "I loved airplanes since I was a kid, and I wanted to support the war effort," he said. "It was a blast. Here I was, a 20-year-old taking care of one of the most lethal weapons in the

U.S. arsenal. I really enjoyed it." It was during his time in service Sandler met his first wife, which led him to a new life in Council Bluffs, Iowa. There, he applied to become a firefighter, but jumped at the chance of becoming a police officer.

"I enjoyed my time as a patrol officer in Council Bluffs, but honestly, the pay was too poor – you couldn't make a decent living at it," he said.

Instead, Sandler focused his efforts on maximizing his selling potential. He left the force after two years and began selling Chryslers.

"I became a top-seller and transitioned into management in no time," he said. "It was easy."

It was also during his time in Iowa that Sandler's first daughter Julie was born, but never wanting to sit still and with a desire to fish in a bigger pond, Sandler again was California-bound. He returned to his hometown to sell real estate with his father and grandfather, who were already established Realtors.

"It took about a year for me to

get out from under their wing, and strike out on my own," he said. "I learned a very important lesson during that time – put customers first, because real estate is not about the property, it's about people. Whatever success I've achieved has come from focusing on the people."

From the late '70s to the early '90s, Sandler comfortably lived in harmony with the real estate industry. He learned to predict market shifts, became attuned to his clients' needs and prospered from his ability to sell homes.

"During a time when I worked for Coldwell Banker, out of 42 offices and 1,600 agents in southern California, I was No. 8 in listings sold," he said. "I'm pretty proud of that, because it was during a time like this when the market had collapsed."

Sandler said he often gave the same response when people questioned the California market.

"It's unbelievable, I would tell them. Because it was – it was either unbelievably good or unbelievably bad," he said.

After unsuccessfully moving further south to escape the congestion of the big city and watching market trends continue to fluctuate, Sandler decided it was time to start a new chapter in his career. Always analytical, Sandler researched various Southwest locales and chose Las Cruces to make his new home.

"California got so crowded – all the way from Long Beach to South Bay and into San Diego County. It was just too congested," he said. "I researched the market here and found it would be a perfect place for a guy like me."

Sandler moved to Las Cruces in 1993 and began working for Electronic Realty Associates, where immediately he made an impact.

"I came here, plugged in the same marketing plan that I used in San Diego and in my first full year here I became the top-selling ERA agent," he said. "For two years in a row I had the top dollar volume, and the next year I sold the most units."

The transition wasn't as hard as Sandler had imagined.

"It's much easier here. You can tour the whole area in two hours by car," he said. "It's a lot more personal and hands on because LA is so dense you really can't see much when you're driving around. The quality of life here has always been my selling point."

Sandler then moved on to work for Re/Max Classic Realty, where he became the No. 3 Re/Max sales associate in New Mexico.

In 1999, he began to host a talk radio show on KOBE-AM 1450, the start of an 11-year relationship with the listeners of Las Cruces. Coupled with a column Sandler wrote for the Las Cruces Sun-News, he was back in the marketing niche he had mastered in southern California.

In 2001, Sandler started his own business, Gary Sandler Inc. Realtors, occupying space in the Telshor Towers business complex.

In 2003, Sandler took his show to KSNM-AM 570 and his column to the Las Cruces Bulletin as part of a rebranding effort. Together, they formed Gary Sandler's Real Estate Connection.

"I always enjoyed the radio, and listening to people's concerns and thoughts," he said. "I especially enjoyed having guests on such as Gov. Bill Richardson and other city, county and state officials."

Today, Sandler operates from his own location at 1240 S. Telshor Blvd., Suite A, and sermonizes real estate over the airwaves every Monday afternoon. He said retirement is still not in the picture.

"I think real estate is just a part of my life, so I'll always be in real estate somehow," he said. "I don't picture myself retiring in the traditional sense. There's no timeline for that at this point."

## In Good Company: Quality Firewood and Materials Inc.

## Quality extends beyond the cord

QFM branches out to include myriad of home products

The dream started in a corner lot peppered with Christmas trees and a "for sale" sign.

That's how Miguel Lucero, owner of Quality Firewood and Materials (QFM) Inc., started his business – now more than 8 and a half acres exploding with firewood, railroad ties, pottery, flagstone, outdoor furniture, vigas, latillas and Southwest and Mexican art.

Lucero, a New Mexico State University engineering graduate, started a side job with his college buddies in the late '80s – cutting down trees in the mountains and selling them in an empty Las Cruces lot.

"I used to round up all my friends and we'd all go cut them down together and sell them," he said. "It was just a hobby, but it was really good business. When people started asking for firewood, that's when I decided to start the business."

Lucero began by cutting and hauling piñon and cedar from the surrounding mountains, only to realize that people were getting their wood for free at one of Las Cruces' most plentiful stockpiles – Stahmann Farms.

"They used to give it away to everybody, so there was not much value in what I was selling," he said. "So I made an arrangement with Stahmann Farms to have exclusive rights to the orchard, and in return, I would clean up their orchard and maintain some of their trees."

Now in business with his former competitor, Lucero began scouting a location to store his inventory. He found just the place at 6015 Las Alturas Drive, a lot that most Las Crucens traveling into town from El Paso are accustomed to seeing.

"The owners rented this lot to us

for real cheap in 1991," Lucero said. "About \$200 a month – but we had to put the fence up and build the structure."

Today, the location can't be missed when traveling on Interstate 10 near the Interstate 25 intersection. The front of Lucero's business is stacked with an array of pots, outdoor furniture and Tuscan-style fountains, among other products.

"From the firewood we moved on to selling railroad ties and then flagstone and pottery," Lucero said.

QFM outgrew the partial lot Lucero was leasing and in 10 years more

we only had one truck and basically me and another guy were the only ones hauling wood," Lucero said. "We would take turns driving a semi with one trailer."

The business now has 11 trailers, three semis, six dump trucks, a couple of forklifts and "a lot of other cool stuff," Lucero said.

In the winter, firewood is the hot seller. QFM sells oak, juniper, cedar, piñon, pine and pecan firewood. In the spring and summer, the majority of business comes from QFM's vast selection of flagstone.

"Within 200 miles, we have the largest selection of flagstone," said office manager Stephan Courter. Courter was hired by Lucero after installing an IT network for the business. Courter said he enjoyed the working atmosphere so much he decided to stay, and is now Lucero's right hand man.

"Before Stephan came I had to keep track of all my inventory on paper files and in my head, and I became very good at it, but boy, it was tough after a while," Lucero said. "I couldn't remember all the stuff anymore."

Courter keeps tracks of shipments and deliveries from countries as far away as Vietnam and Spain and more often from Mexico and the Midwest United States, where many of QFM's products come from.

"We also sell Coronado stone, and we've got the best price in town for it," Lucero said.

Courter said when people walk through QFM's doors (a modified classroom portable), he consistently hears the same greeting.

"They say 'wow,' I never realized you guys had so much stuff' and 'I've always wanted to come here because I've seen your store from the highway," Courter said. "They're really shocked at how much we have in our inventory."

But just as important as steadily growing the business is staying humble, cheerful and always honest, Lucero said.

"When people see that we're honest, they always return," he said. "When I started selling firewood I saw guys that weren't selling the right

amount for the right price. It's tricky because with firewood you can't tell unless it's stacked. We're at the point now where we never have to stack, people know what they're getting. We are as honest as we say we are."

A 20-foot, freestanding tower made of heavy-duty aluminum depicts the different rooms of a castle at night.

On the ground floor, the mother figure or "Queen" dances in a dress with a 6-foot train. High above her, a hammock and corde lisse (an aerial circus skill or act that involves acrobatics on a vertically hanging rope) enable an aerialist to twist his way down the tower.

plays in a cube swinging on a harness attached by bungee cords that barely allow his feet to touch the floor. "The Bird in the Tower" climbs fabric in what could be looked upon as the sculpture's attic window.

The collaborative efforts of choreographers, composers, costume sculpture/constructors designers, and athlete/dancers have created this unique, original dance titled "The Palace at Night." The half-hour-long piece is part of "Project IN Motion: Wingwalkers" presented Saturday, April 24 and Sunday, April 25 at the Rio Grande Theatre.

laborative effort ever undertaken by the 10-year-old company.

"We worked with an aerialist and equipment designer, Trevor Boswell, for about nine months, revising the design and allowing for the stress put on the structure by aerial performers," she said. We eventually achieved a workable sculpture symbolic of various sculptures, paintings and writings created by Giacometti."

Red Bennett, John Hegner and Ed Pias created original scores, or sound tableaus, for each part of the piece. Costumes were designed and created by Bineke Kiernan, including the Queen's dress, which actually attaches to one side of the sculpture.

The second half of the program features several aerial pieces created collaboratively by choreographers Deidre Morris, Mei-Ling Po McKay and Billy Blanken.

Morris, who has worked with Wise Fool of Santa Fe and Stalker Stilt Theatre of Australia, involves aerial fabric and all 10 members of the company. Her theme is the spring awakening of a family of foxes and a family of falcons.

Blanken, who has worked with PIM for 10 years, currently resides in New York City. He will perform some older pieces from the PIM repertory as well as some new works. "Tuscany," choreographed and danced by PIM founding members McDaniel-Douglas and Randy Strickler, will feature Blanken and company member Anika Jones. It utilizes motion capture projection of the dancer's movements accompanied by a cello score by Gideon Freudman. Blanken and dancer/choreographer Sarah Navarette will recreate a duet, "The Intimacies Project," that was originally performed at New York's Port Authority Station. Another Blanken piece features him along with male dancers Joe Putman, Joe Duerkson and Stephen Pohuski.

A trio of Asian-influenced aerial pieces utilize fabric, nets and dance trapeze with visual depictions of sea life contributed by local videographer Robert Yee as a backdrop. In "Fu Xi: Who Taught Man to Fish With Nets," projections of jellyfish serve

as a backdrop for aerial fabric work, Chinese fans are used to mimic sea creatures, men flip in aerial nets like fish and Tai-Chi movement, created by Po McKay and Navarette mimic slow moving fishermen. Yee's photographs of geese provide the backdrop for a quartet on dance trapeze in the final movement of this trio.

#### Her mood brightens when she talks about a natural tendency to climb things.

"I was a tomboy, and we have pictures of me as a child climbing all sorts of things," she said. I never had it in my mind that I was going to be a ballerina."

McDaniel-Douglas grew up in an academic household – her father taught at Purdue and was a Middle Eastern historian, specializing in Iran. When she was about 13, she washed dishes in a cafeteria to earn money to attend a summer camp at Interlochen Center for the Arts in Michigan, and she later received a scholarship to attend as a regular student.

She made many friends and connections that she maintains even now. Interlochen provided an atmosphere that encouraged young artists to become multi-faceted and McDaniel-Douglas expanded her interest in dance to include music and poetry. She attended Sarah Lawrence, and after getting a degree from the University of Indiana, she found herself becoming more intrigued by aerial performing, including the trapeze.

Then came Project IN Motion, a dance company started in Indianapolis in 2001 along with four other friends - Randy Strickler, Stephanie Scopelitis, Beverly Sykes and Debra Knapp.

After our first big concert, we all got offers to do other things," she said. "Debra came to New Mexico State and is head of the dance program here.

to present programs. We did a lot of community work and programs for young audiences," she said. "And we were always working to incorporate aerial work. We substituted ropes and large strips of cloth for the trapeze."

Knapp invited McDaniel-Douglas and partner Strickler to present "Tuscany"- a piece created and danced by them in 1998 - at New Mexico State University. This led to a relocation to New Mexico.

"My grandfather was a surgeon in El Paso and had a house in Ruidoso that I thought was the most beautiful place," McDaniel-Douglas said. "I also have friends in Taos so New Mexico was an easy leap for us."

Then in the winter of 2008, an aerial dance segment was included in a mixed dance program presented by the New Mexico State University Dance department at the Rio Grande Theatre. Audiences were smitten.

Another program was presented to packed houses in May 2009 and now "Wingwalkers" this weekend. The company has performed outside using a portable trapeze unit and tree-trimming cranes. Project IN Motion has an active board of directors "at last," and they have given McDaniel-Douglas the title of artistic director.

She hopes to eventually have studio space for the company "as opposed to my backyard" and maybe even do a tour. And above all, she wants to continue to nurture the enthusiasm of her young athlete/artists

## **Setting off a chile explosion** Adobe Café brings the heat to Las Cruces

As a devoted "chile head," I am always a bit skeptical when I see restaurants using promotional phrases like "Hottest chile in town." They may in fact be telling what they feel is the truth, but their hottest rarely gets any response from my battle-scarred taste buds.

So when I read the recently opened Adobe Café in Mesilla had a chile "10 times hotter than habanero," I just snorted and scoffed, "Yeah, right." I had to see for myself. Well I can sum up my experience in just two words "Ooochie mama!"

It was a Friday, just about 1 p.m. and the place was buzzing. Good sign. Owner Denise Sanchez-Montes greeted me somewhat breathlessly and very apologetically, "It's been very busy."

I had a seat at the counter. Yes, there is a counter and what I call a "full-disclosure" kitchen. It isn't tucked away in the back, it's right there in the open. Rather like a short-order diner, but more genteel. The place has been recently re-done and it has big windows, earth-toned walls and enough space in

the large room to warrant a small show of artwork from the Southern Chapter of the New Mexico Watercolor Society.

Sanchez-Montes moved to Las Cruces from Rancho Escondido near Santa Fe two years ago. She ran a restaurant there, but recently has been in the construction business with her husband. Their company, Beyond Construction, does, among other things, swimming pool construction. They like Las Cruces "friendlier people, better weather than Santa Fe" and were anxious to get back into the restaurant business. Good decision.

Adobe Café has some northern New Mexico influences in its menu, most notably blue corn tortillas and calabacitas. While not strictly a northern New Mexico thing, the calabacitas, made of zucchini squash, corn and onions, is a bit more prevalent up there. Its inclusion as a side dish to just about every entrée was most welcome.

Breakfast items are available and not just burritos and egg dishes, but pancakes and French toast. A friend of mine that I ran into was having pancakes. "I just can't eat Mexican food," he

confessed. He did proclaim his flapjacks "super good," however, and his daughter's combination plate also got a thumbs up. Father and daughter Dick and Kelly Buchanan declare their pancakes and combo plate "super good."

I had the soft chicken tacos on blue corn tortillas. It came with rice, beans and calabacitas. It was loaded with chicken and, by request, smothered in green chile. It was also, by request, hot. I also ordered a side of green chile "Level Two," the habanero-eclipsing variety. Both were a revelation! Heat I had not experienced in years. Tear-inducing, nose-running, water-guzzling magnificent heat.

This alone would be enough to warrant a return trip, but there are so many other enticing possibilities on the menu – some more traditional and familiar to southern New Mexicans such as enchiladas and tacos and other more familiar to northern folks, such as Frito pie and stuffed sopapillas.

Add some shrimp to those enchies, tacos and quesadillas and you've got something a little different. There are burgers on tortillas, steaks and steak and enchilada (joyfully together) as well as tilapia and salmon on the dinner menu. Look for their front patio to open soon, beer and wine availability in the near future and the possibility of having guacamole prepared tableside. Everything is made fresh every day and many come with my favorite option – five words dear to my heart, "Best when smothered in chile."

## AttheMovies A disturbing look at salt 'Araya' examines practices unchanged for 500 years

In the extraordinary 2007 Australian film, "The Proposition," Ray Winstone's character, Captain Stanley, uttered the line, "What fresh hell is this?"

That line fits the beginning of the very interesting and moving Venezuelan-made documentary, the recently re-released "Araya."

The film is about the people who once labored in an old natural salt mine located in a peninsula in northeastern Venezuela, 500 years after its "discovery" by Spanish invaders.

The film, originally released in 1959, was directed by Margot Benacerraf, and was one of only two films she made during her career. This is her only feature, and Benacerraf now lives in the Houston area, where she has remained a strong advocate for Latin American films.

Over those 500 years, little, if anything, had changed at Araya. The method of mining was labor intensive, using the most primitive backbreaking methods imaginable, and only allowing the "salineros" to make the most meager of livings, all of whom were still being exploited so many years after its discovery by the Spanish.

Salt in those times was as valuable as gold, and supposedly some Spanish soldiers were actually paid in salt throughout the years.

The film focuses on three families, the Salazars, Ortizes and Peredas. Each one has a clearly defined job, set in repetition and ritual.

At night, the Peredas would cut the salt into chunks from the marsh. During the day, the Salazars take over, and after drying the salt, place it onto monolithic-type stacks, while the Ortiz family fishes each day, since the marshes of Araya are even harsher than the Chihuahuan Desert.

Certainly these are not the only people working at this squalor-filled and hopeless place, but by concentrating on the main "duties" of the workers, Benacerraf is able to give



us a direct look into history – 500 years worth.

One might think this is a boring and repetitive film, but it is far from that. The lives of the families are certainly that way, but the film is enhanced by its uniqueness (especially for 1959), and the superb voice-over narration carries the story along quickly and smoothly, while never missing a chance to hint at us that we have nothing to complain about.

Just as your empathy and curiosity begin to peak, Benacerraf – who was the entire crew, except for a cameraman – jolts us back into reality with a startling and effective ending.

If Captain Stanley were to witness this ending, he would again have to ponder aloud, "What fresh hell is this?"

"Araya" is a rare and insightful look at another piece of the world around us of which we know nothing.

## **Death at a movie theater** Star-studded cast fails to reach comedic potential

With a star-studded cast that included my favorite comedians – Chris Rock and Tracy Morgan – the 2010 remake of "Death at a Funeral" is definitely funny, that is, if you haven't seen the trailer before you head to the movie. If you have seen the trailer, however, you've also seen the funniest parts of the film.

Instead of a proper English family as in Frank Oz's 2007 film, director Neil LaBute has re-created the same storyline across the pond to fit a black upper middle-class family in the suburbs of Los Angeles. The characters are essentially the same as in the 2007 movie, including Frank, the 4-foot-tall gay lover of the deceased patriarch. Peter Dinklage plays Frank, and he also played the same role (with a different name) in the 2007 film.

Frank comes as an unexpected guest to the funeral with explicit photos and demands \$30,000 to stay quiet, but that is just part of the chaos that ensues during the funeral.

The casting couldn't be better – Chris Rock plays Aaron, the responsible accountant who is mourning his father's death, and Martin Lawrence plays Ryan, Aaron's younger (by nine months), more successful, irresponsible brother. Their sibling rivalry is full of biting wit, and I love it.

Danny Glover plays wheelchairbound, crotchety Uncle Russell, and Zoë Saldaña plays Rock's cousin Elaine, who brings her white fiancé Oscar (James Marsden) to the funeral. Nervous to deal with Elaine's father, Oscar takes a valium, but it's really a hallucinogenic, and he's on an acid trip for nearly the entire movie.

Tracy Morgan plays Norman, the simple-minded family friend for whom no one really cares, and in a small role, Luke Wilson plays

# A hole-in-one at Sonoma Ranch

## Golf course view just one of the features of this Tuscan abode

While many Las Crucens enjoy the view of the Organ or Robledo mountains, a select few take pleasure in sitting on their patio and peering out at a lush, green golf course.

The home at 3581 Cave Creek Manor, on the Sonoma Ranch Golf Course, offers such a view. "It's located on the ninth hole and it has a

"It's located on the ninth hole and it has a view of the lake and the city lights," said Realtor Beth Dage of Steinborn GMAC Real Estate, who represents the listing. Inspired by a Tuscan Villa, the 3,934-square-

Inspired by a Tuscan Villa, the 3,934-squarefoot home was built in 2005 by Roberts Construction of El Paso. Featuring four bedrooms and three and a half bathrooms, Dage said the builders paid close attention to detail, from small mosaic squares seen throughout the home to crown molding accents in several of the rooms.

"The home is special because of all of the amenities it has that aren't found in most houses," said Dage, adding that this includes the home's security and smart wiring systems.

The two-tone gravel front yard complements the home's soft tan façade while green bushes and shrubs, the red tile roof and a grey slate mosaic add touches of color.

A flagstone pathway leads to a large wooden door, which encloses a courtyard. Ceramic tile takes guests past the soothing water fountain and flowering plants to the iron and metal front door.

"My favorite area is the gated courtyard entry that leads to the grand foyer with a 20-foot ceiling and dome entry," said Dage, adding that the multiple windows at the top of the dome fill the area with natural light.

Near the entrance is the formal living room as well as the formal dining room, which includes a turquoise buffet that adds a splash of excitement to the neutral setting.

"A lot of people love the dining area with the built-in buffet and the way it flows into the kitchen," Dage said.

Strategically placed columns and arches separate the formal spaces from the other areas. Nichos line several of the walls, allowing for art or photographs to be displayed.

The kitchen, which also consists of a breakfast area, includes a large marble island and granite countertops. Featuring custom-made cabinets, hanging lights and a tiled backsplash, the earthtone kitchen also contains a double oven.

the covered patio and a two-way fireplace to the bathroom.

"The master bathroom is just awesome with that two-way fireplace that sees through to the bath," she said.

## Single-stream recycling

One thing that has made recycling easier for Las Cruces residents is single-stream recycling, also known as fully commingled recycling. Single-stream recycling means that you can now mix all of your recycling together in one bag, rather than doing the messy work of separating it.

The city and county made this recycling improvement a reality for residents in February. Many central recycling locations now accept commingled recycling.

"Before we started single-stream recycling we were doing probably 30 tons (of recycling) a week," said Bonnie Tafoya, recycling coordinator at South Central Solid Waste Authority. "Now, we're doing over 80 tons a week."

That means the switch to singlestream centers has almost tripled the amount of recycling being collected. Way to go Las Crucens! That is a huge improvement in our recycling efforts.

Besides making recycling easier, the new service has also expanded types of items that can be recycled.

"Now all No. 2 plastics, colored office paper, magazines, catalogues and glossy inserts are accepted," Tafoya said. "It's opened up recycling tremendously for our community."

Other items that are currently accepted at the single-stream recycling stations include aluminum and tin cans, cardboard, newspapers, office paper, mixed papers, junk mail, magazines, catalogues, phonebooks and No. 1 and No. 2 plastics.

## Curbside recycling

While single stream collections have increased recycling efforts, curbside recycling is the movement that has the potential to make the largest impact in our community.

Curbside recycling has become increasingly common around the United States. A recent report from R.W. Beck found that 229 million Americans, or 74 percent of the total population, have access to some form of curbside recycling at home.

Curbside recycling overcomes barriers by making it easier and more convenient for residents to recycle. The more convenient recycling is, the more likely we are to recycle.

Today in Las Cruces, Mesilla Valley Disposal is the only company providing curbside recycling. Its offering this service to residents in



the Picacho Mountain and Fairway Village Communities in the Picacho Hills area.

While we are pleased to be able to offer curbside recycling service to our residents in Picacho Mountain, it just isn't enough. Many of the people who are looking to relocate or retire in Las Cruces have come to expect curbside service.

According to Tafoya, cost and logistics have been the two barriers that have prevented the city from adding curbside recycling service. The good news is that curbside recycling should be available soon for the rest of the Las Cruces community.

The city is currently reviewing bids from service providers. It hasnot released an exact date to begin curbside recycling, but its moving in that direction.

In the meantime, take advantage of the new single-stream collection centers located around town. Contact your city councillor or county commissioner and let them know you support curbside recycling. And keep recycling Las Cruces.

Once a project is completed, Koch can sit back and bask in the finished project.

## A mess with benefits

## Mulching mower puts important nitrogen into soil

Using a mulching mower is one of the best things you can do for your lawn, and yourself.

Leaving your grass clippings returns nitrogen back into the soil. It adds organic material and helps retain soil moisture. You don't have to bag up and haul away the clippings – this is the part where it's good for yourself – and they don't end up in the landfill. It is a win-win situation for everyone.

There are some things to consider first. It may be a bit messy if your lawn is slightly wet. You may track some of the clippings into your home. This is probably the only drawback of doing this.

You can make this problem go away if you mow your lawn while the blades are completely dry, and then water thoroughly afterwards.

Make sure that you do not cut off more than one-third of the height of the grass



blades. This will prevent sunscald or dead, dry looking areas that have no chlorophyll, the stuff that makes plant tissue green.

Make sure your blade (use a mulching blade) is kept sharp. This will prevent your lawn from getting "split ends" – yes, grass gets split ends, too. Once this occurs, the ends of the blades dry up and get straw colored which gives your lawn a "dusty" appearance. Remember, the smaller the clippings the faster they break down into usable food for your grass.

Don't forget to raise your mower height up a notch or two during the summer months. This will give your lawn a much greener look during the hottest time of the year. It will also help reduce weed seed germination and reduce water usage, by shading the soil underneath.

# How to avoid wasps

Stay aware and out of the stinging bug's way



Refreshing spring is upon us. I'm glad to say adios to cabin fever for a while and hello to the great outdoors. But getting back out to sun and fun has a few perils, such as wasp stings, which we need to take steps to avoid.

Wasp stings really aren't that difficult to duck. Wasps, whether they're yellow jackets, paper wasps or even tarantula hawk wasps, won't go out of their way to sting you, according to the University of Arizona. If you threaten their nest or crush or capture them, you're escalating the risk.

So, my first advice: Don't threaten their nest, crush them or try to capture them. Seems easy enough, but sometimes you might be in a position to cause wasps harm without even realizing it.

For instance, if you're innocently standing somewhere being buzzed by a persistent, angry wasp, it could be that it has a nest nearby. Don't swat at the wasp, or wave your hands, just walk purposefully away until the creature no longer bothers you.

Stings often result from purely accidental circumstances, and eating outdoors is one of the roots. Before eating a sandwich or any food, look at it carefully to make sure a hungry wasp hasn't landed on it. If you bite a wasp, it will very likely sting you.

The warning extends to drinks as well, particularly canned sweet beverages that you can't see into. If you are drinking from a can, make sure to cover it to guard against a wasp that may have crawled in. They're attracted

by the sweetness, particularly in late summer and fall.

My basic advice for sting avoidance is to use common sense. Stay aware and out of the way of wasps to avoid the pain of their sting.

# Serve up tasty salads, soups and sweets

Mother's Day treats that can be enjoyed any time

Ah, there's nothing like springtime in the desert when its vast sandy floor becomes a riot of plant life, many of which sprout colorful blossoms as vivid and varied as a kid's box of crayons.

Celebrate Mother's Day on Sunday, May 9, and our floral beauty surrounds by rustling up a colossal bowl of multi-col-ored pasta salad tossed with chile peppers and a lively dressing that blushes with a hint of chili powder. Serve with a dainty teacup of peppery papaya soup, followed by a snappy citrus tart topped with a generous swirl of fluffy whipped cream garnished with a mint sprig. They're simply enchanting.

## **Enchanting Springtime Pasta Salad Toss**

1 (8-ounce) package dried multi-colored corkscrew pasta 3 medium slightly ripe tomatoes, stemmed and chopped

- 1 medium onion, peeled and chopped
- 2 (4-ounce) cans diced hot green chile peppers, undrained
- 2 (2 1/4-ounce) cans sliced ripe black olives, drained
- 1/4 cup green bell pepper, stemmed, seeded and chopped
- 1/4 cup red bell pepper, stemmed and seeded
- 1/4 cup (or more to taste) extra light olive oil
- 2 to 3 tablespoons fresh lemon juice
- 3 tablespoons vinegar
- 2 tablespoons snipped fresh cilantro leaves
- 1 1/2 teaspoons chili powder (Texas style)
- 3/4 teaspoon garlic salt
- 1/2 teaspoon sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper
- Fresh cilantro sprigs for garnish

Pasta Mix: Cook pasta according to package directions and drain. Rinse with cold water and drain again. Combine the drained pasta, tomatoes, onion, chile pepper, olives and green and red bell peppers in a large mixing bowl. Toss to mix well.

Dressing: Combine oil, lemon juice, vinegar and the 2 tablespoons of cilantro, chili powder, garlic salt, sugar and black pepper in a screw top jar. Secure top on jar and shake well. Add the dressing to the pasta mixture; toss gently to coat. Cover and refrigerate, preferably overnight to meld flavors. Serve on individual salad plates and garnish with a sprig of cilantro. Makes 10 servings.

## **Peppery Papaya Pizzazz Soup**

- 1 large onion, chopped (1 cup) 2 unripe papayas, seeded, peeled and cut into 1-inch pieces
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 2 or 3 fresh serrano or jalapeño chile peppers,
- seeded and finely chopped
- 2 cups papaya nectar
- 1 cup fat-free vegetable broth
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon ground ginger 1/8 teaspoon ground nutmeg

Serve a snappy citrus tart topped with strawberries to celebrate springtime in the desert and as a special Mother's Day treat.

1/8 teaspoon ground white pepper 1 cup whipping cream

Fresh mint, snipped for garnish

Cook onion and papayas in hot butter in a large saucepan over medium heat for 4 to 5 minutes or until onion is tender, but not brown. Stir in serrano or jalapeño chile peppers. Cook and stir for 1 minute more.

Stir in papaya nectar, chicken broth, salt, ginger, nutmeg and white pepper. Bring just to boiling; reduce heat. Cover and simmer for 15 to 20 minutes or until papaya is tender. Remove from heat; cool slightly.

Transfer half of the mixture to a blender container or food processor bowl. Cover and blend or process until smooth. Stir into remaining mixture in saucepan. Stir in whipping cream. Cook and stir over low heat just until heated through. Sprinkle with snipped mint. Makes 6 to 8 side servings.

## **Snappy Spring Citrus Tart**

"...For a prettier presentation, use a thin tart shell. The quantity of sugar depends on the sourness of your fruit; I like the pie a bit on the tart side. The most difficult part of this recipe is removing the seeds, especially if you use kumquats. Don't forget to start the recipe the night before you plan to serve it." - Barbara Troop, author of "The China Moon Cookbook"

Approximately 2 cups organic citrus of your choice with thin, unblemished skin (such as 2 large lemons, 3

- to 4 medium limes, 8 limequats or 24 kumquats) Finely grated zest of 1 scrubbed lemon
- 1 to 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 2 extra-large egg

Tart shell, partially baked (put citrus zest in the crust for an extra hit of flavor)

Scrub the citrus under warm water with an abrasive scrubber. Rinse well. If using large citrus fruit, such as lemons or limes, cut off both ends of to expose the fruit (if using kumquats, this is not necessary). Cut the citrus into paper thin slices (I like to use the slicing tube on my food processor).

Remove any seeds. Layer the citrus slices, zest and sugar in a large bowl. Toss gently and set aside for 30 to 60 minutes. Toss again. Cover and set aside at room temperature for 8 hours or overnight, stirring once or twice, if convenient.

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Stir the citrus mixture carefully and remove any remaining seeds. Whisk the eggs until light in a separate bowl, add them to the citrus mixture and mix well. Pour into the tart shell and arrange citrus slices as needed so that they lay flat in the tart shell.

Bake the tart until the filling is set and lightly golden, ap-proximately 25 to 30 minutes for a thin tart and 30 to 40 minutes for a pie. Rotate the pie in the oven midway through baking to ensure even coloring. Remove and place on a wire rack.

Serve the pie warm or cool. To keep the tart, wait until it cools, cover it and refrigerate. Bring it back to room temperature before serving. Top with a swirl of whipped cream, strawberries and a mint sprig, if desired. (Adapted from "The China Moon Cookbook.")
