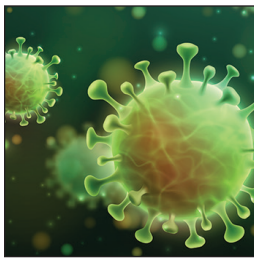

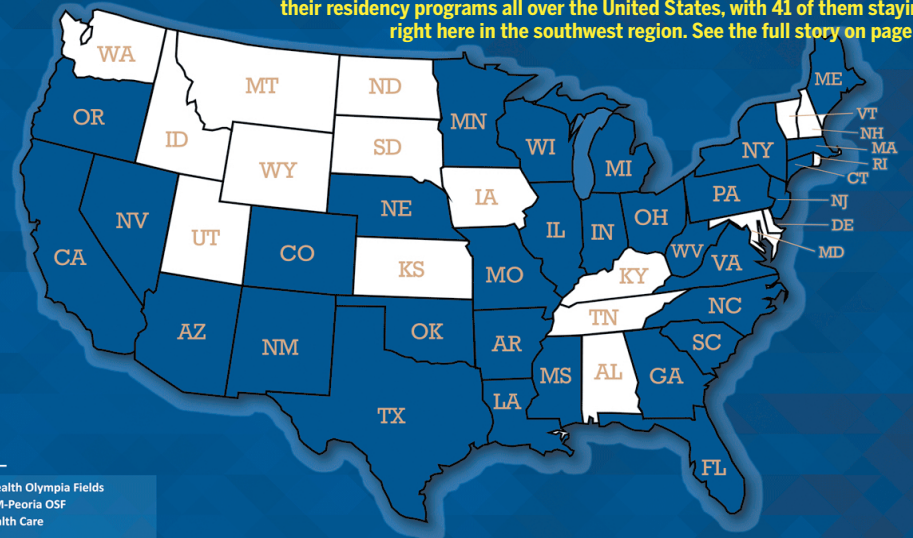

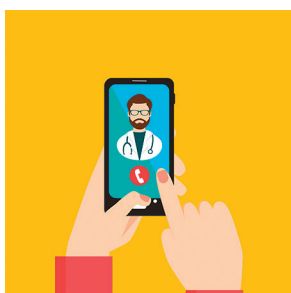

Thompson named assistant county manager

Doña Ana County Manager Fernando R. Macias announced the appointment of Robert J. Thompson as Assistant County Manager, for the Administrative Division.

In this role, Thompson will oversee administrative departments, including Human Resources, Information Technology, Finance, Health and Human Services, Media and Public Communications Center, Animal Control and Codes and the Detention Center.

Thompson brings to the County more than 20 years of leadership experience from the public and private sector. Thompson is a Service Disabled Veteran who served in the United States Air Force, during Desert Storm.

Most recently, Thompson served as the Compliance Officer and Associate Director for the Office of Unemployment Compensation at the Department of Employment Services in the District of Columbia Government. He managed two divisions, a \$32 million operational budget, leading 105 union staff and 16 managers.

Prior to that, Thompson was the Deputy Chief of the Assessment Services Division at the Real Property Tax Administration in the Office of Tax and Revenue. His duties included billing and collecting annually more than \$2 billion in real property taxes, along with representing the District of Columbia Government in its Superior Court, on real property tax lien cases.

Thompson served as an adjunct professor at Stratford University and specialized in graduate and undergraduate business courses.

Thompson holds a Master's in Business Administration from the University of Phoenix; a Bachelor's in Political Science from Bethune-Cookman University and currently pursuing a Ph.D. in Public Policy and Public Administration at Walden University.

Restricted public access to solid waste facilities for operations continuity

To ensure continued functionality of the Solid Waste System, the following restrictions were implemented at Solid Waste facilities in Las Cruces and Doña Ana County:

- Amador Ave. Transfer Station - 2865 Amador Ave. is closed to the general public and available for essential businesses only.
- Las Cruces Recycling Center Drop-off - 2855 Amador Ave. – closed to the general public.
- Sonoma Ranch Recycling Drop Off Center – 555 S. Sonoma Ranch Blvd. – closed to the general public.



South Central Solid Waste Authority

- Corralitos Regional Landfill – 14535 Robert Larson Blvd. – closed to the general public.
- County Collection Centers – punch card system is suspended and hours for the general public are limited to Saturdays and Sundays 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Only 4 bags of waste allowed per vehicle. No yard waste or construction and demolition waste (C & D waste) accepted at this time.
- Chaparral Collection and Recycling Center – 180 McCombs Rd. – remains open to essential businesses only. Residential fees are suspended. The general public is restricted to dropping off 4 bags of trash per vehicle on Saturdays and Sundays.
- Old Foothills Landfill Clean Fill, Green Waste and Compost – 555 S. Sonoma Ranch Blvd. – closed to general public/ essential businesses only Monday – Friday 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Closed Saturday and Sunday.
- Residential green waste can be picked up at curbside by the Green Grappler on scheduled pickup dates. Schedule available at: www.externalforms.las-cruces.org/Grappler/Grappler. Essential businesses may be required to provide documentation of their status for access to local Solid Waste facilities.

One-third of medical school's first graduates to remain in region

The bad news first: Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine (BCOM) cancelled its first ever Match Day celebration and moved its first graduation to June because of the COVID-19 public health emergency. Now, the good news: More than a third of the graduating physician class of 120 will remain in the tri-state region of New Mexico, Texas and Arizona, helping to address a persistent physician shortage in the southwest.

Graduation, which had been set for May 8, has been postponed to Friday, June 5, said BCOM

President John Hummer. Three weeks before then, on May 14, BCOM “will assess the local, state and national requirements as they pertain to COVID-19 and make a final determination on whether to hold the ceremony,” Hummer said. “Regardless, the diplomas will state May 8 as the official date of the granted degree. We will not allow this pandemic to prevent us from celebrating and honoring the Class of 2020.”

Even without a public celebration, BCOM’s graduating class learned where they will first practice as doctors and

complete the next phase of their medical training in late March, said BCOM Director of Communications & Marketing Nadia Whitehead.

The Class of 2020 applied to residency programs throughout the country, BCOM said. Multiple prestigious placements include residencies at Honor Health in Phoenix, anesthesiology at Baylor Scott & White in Temple, Texas, and emergency medicine at the UT Southwestern Medical Center in Dallas.

More than a third of the class — 41 doctors — will remain in the Arizona, New Mexico and

Texas regions, BCOM said. Many graduates will remain close to home, pursuing their residencies at Las Cruces’ Memorial Medical Center and MountainView Regional Medical Center, Albuquerque’s University of New Mexico Health Science Center and El Paso’s Paul Foster School of Medicine at Texas Tech University Health Science Center.

“These outstanding results attest to the mission and vision of BCOM,” Hummer said. “We established this medical school to improve health and wellness within our region. Our goal is to maintain strong ties with our alumni, especially those

with residencies outside of our mission region, and encourage them to pursue future opportunities in our mission area upon the completion of their residencies,” he said.

The following are some additional highlights from the Class of 2020’s residency results:

- 18 graduating physicians will receive their residency training in Las Cruces, Albuquerque and El Paso.
- 27 graduating physicians will pursue family medicine, a physician specialty that is critically low in the U.S.
- 14 graduating physicians will pursue emergency medicine,

serving on the front-lines of health care in emergency rooms and departments.

BCOM graduates will pursue residencies in the following specialties: anesthesiology, dermatology, emergency medicine, family medicine, internal medicine, general surgery, neurology, neuromusculoskeletal medicine, radiology, ophthalmology, urology, obstetrics and gynecology, pathology, pediatrics, psychiatry, orthopedic surgery and physical medicine and rehabilitation.

Las Cruces public school seniors staying on track to graduate

After an announcement by the New Mexico Public Education Department Friday, March 27, that schools would remain closed through the rest of the year and students would be on a pass/fail basis rather than a letter-grade system for the duration, Las Cruces Public Schools Superintendent Karen Trujillo said Las Cruces schools will move forward.

Trujillo said LCPS is developing learning plans for district seniors who should be graduating. Most seniors should have already been contacted through their schools to talk about

their needs. By April 6, LCPS will have a learning plan for all students through the end of the year.

“Our instructional specialists are developing a plan for delivery of the content, keeping in mind some of our students have digital access and some will get their information in packets,” she said.

Seniors looking to graduate will need to keep up and pass competency requirements as determined between themselves and their respective educators.

During a March 27 online press conference, Public Education Secretary Ryan Stewart said no qualifying high school senior will be denied the

ability to graduate, and he said alternative learning opportunities will be available through mid-June. Individual schools and systems will create plans with seniors in mind.

Milestone moments for seniors still need to happen, he said, citing proms and graduation ceremonies.

“These events have to happen,” he said. “If that means we have to postpone them to a later date, we will look at the prevailing public health order at the time and make a decision as to when they can be held.”

For college purposes, the grade-point average graduating seniors ended up with as of the 2019 fall

semester is the one they will be going forward with into the future. Students currently in dual credit courses with Doña Ana Community College or New Mexico State University will also be receiving pass/fail credits for those classes.

“Be patient and give

your children grace,” Trujillo said. “In the grand scheme of 12 years of education, six weeks is not going to make or break your child’s education. Exercise every day, read, play games, have conversations and connect with friends and family.”

Scammers use coronavirus panic to lure in victims

From emails and websites to a knock on the door, those who take advantage of fear, confusion and age to weasel money out of others have jumped on the coronavirus bandwagon.

"The first thing you should know is that we continue to pay benefits," said Social Security Commissioner Andrew Saul. "Be aware that scammers may try to trick you into thinking the pandemic is stopping your Social Security payments, but that is not true. Don't be fooled."

He said an informational COVID-19 web page is available at www.socialsecurity.gov/coronavirus.

New Mexico Attorney General Hector Balderas also has put out scam alert, saying New Mexicans should continue never giving out personal information over the phone or by email, and never providing personal information to a stranger, even if they are very persuasive.

"We must protect the health and safety of New Mexican families during this emergency, and that includes protecting them from fraud and abuse when they are most vulnerable," Balderas said. "My office will prosecute anyone who breaks the law and takes advantage of vulnerable New Mexicans."

Watch for these scams:
COVID-19 HOTLINE

SCAM: There are several phishing scams where the caller impersonates a representative from the COVID-19 Hotline or other medical entity. The scammer is asking for personal information like Social Security number and date of birth, telling callers they must have that information in order to release COVID-19 testing results.

GENERAL PHONE SCAMS: Be suspicious of anyone who uses threats or promises and who requires upfront payment, demands personal or financial information, or asks for payment with a gift card. Real legal notices are sent in writing and are not communicated over the phone.

DOOR-TO-DOOR SCAMS: Groups or in-

dividuals sometimes go door-to-door claiming to be from the government or authorized by the government, falsely claiming to provide in-home testing for coronavirus for a fee. Don't let them in, and don't pay a dime. Call the police.

COVID-19 CURE SCAMS: There is no FDA-approved cure for coronavirus. Any company or individual claiming that a product can prevent, diagnose, treat or cure coronavirus is breaking the law. There is no credible evidence that coronavirus can be cured by drinking bleach, drinking colloidal silver, taking herbal supplements or using other homeopathic remedies. When in doubt, consult a medical professional.

E-MAIL PHISHING SCAMS: Do not click on links unless you trust the source, and even then, be careful. Scammers often call, email or text consumers claiming to offer things like free vaccines or free

testing kits. Scammer will also attempt to collect personal information by impersonating a government agency like the Centers for Disease Control, the World Health Organization, the United Nations and others.

HUNTING SCAMS: New Mexico Department of Game and Fish reassures New Mexico hunters the results of the 2020-2021 big-game draw will be released by April 29, despite posts on social media stating otherwise. Links attached to such posts should not be opened.

FUNDRAISING SCAMS: Do some homework before donating to a coronavirus-related charity. Visit the Attorney General's Charities webpage (www.nmag.gov/charities.aspx) to search for legitimate charities, and never donate to anyone asking for cash, gift cards or for money to be sent via wire transfer.

GENERAL DISINFORMATION SPREADING: Know how to spot disin-

formation. Many websites contain misleading or inflammatory information about coronavirus in order to drive up page views and make money from advertisers. Here is a list of websites that have been reported for posting or publishing false information about the coronavirus outbreak: www.newsguardtech.com/coronavirus-misinformation-tracking-center/. For legitimate information, visit the State of New Mexico's comprehensive resource site (newmexico.gov), the CDC's website (www.cdc.gov), or the World Health Organization's website (www.who.int).

Any New Mexican suspected of having fallen victim to price gouging or scamming activity can file a complaint with the Office of the Attorney General at nmag.gov.

Unanimous city council passes emergency powers ordinance

At a special meeting Friday morning, March 27, the Las Cruces City Council unanimously passed an ordinance that allows the mayor and council to exercise emergency powers through a proclamation.

The term of an emergency proclamation under the ordinance will be for three days. The council can extend the term of the emergency for up to 14 days, at which time an extension or renewal by council vote would be required.

The ordinance becomes effective immediately. If it is invoked, the city council must approve the emergency action taken by the mayor at its next meeting.

“This is something every local government

needs to have,” Councilor Gabe Vasquez said.

The ordinance was amended by Vasquez to mandate that the emergency ordinance “shall expire at the end of the current mayor’s term.”

The proclamation includes this language: “When the mayor, or in the event of the mayor’s inability to act, the mayor pro tem, determines in consultation with the emergency manager, chief of police, and/or fire chief that a civil emergency, disaster or emergency exists in the municipality, the mayor may proclaim a state of emergency in the area affected and may also request that the governor proclaim a state of emergency.”

If the mayor declares an emergency, he or she would have the power to: enact a public curfew, prohibit public gatherings, prohibit combustible devices and materials, prohibit the use of certain roadways and control the flow of traffic within the city, require evacuations, prohibit other activities to protect the city, require the city manager to direct city employees to perform emergency functions, require the use of available resources as necessary, utilize non-city personnel and resources to adequately respond to the emergency and, if necessary, to assist in the relocation or return of non-U.S. citizens to their country of citizenship.

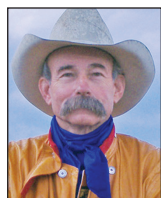

A grandmother's thoughts on a contagion of kindness

In the beginning, I wanted to poo-poo the novel coronavirus, aka COVID-19, but I couldn't.

I saw people doing foot bumps, elbow bumps and even butt-bumps on BBC News and watched a vlog from an English family in Italy who live in a "red zone," who have been quarantined for two weeks. The kids get their schoolwork by computer, and Mom waits in long lines to go shopping in a store that controls the flow of shoppers. Suddenly, we're doing the same thing in southern New Mexico.

Wait, are we supposed to cough in our elbows and then bump them?

How will I talk about this disaster to my

grandchildren? Can it be that the lesson here is one of love?

Dear grandchild,

The world has become very weird, and whatever happens next, this will be one for the history books.

You know how everybody knows where they were when the twin towers were hit in New York? Well, this was the same, only longer.

We learned phrases like "social distancing," "flattening the curve," "self-quarantine" and "community spread" — and started using them regularly. The word "panic" was used frequently, but not actually happening. Sure, there was plenty of worry

and concern, and every planned gathering of 10 or more people was canceled, but people mostly did what they needed to do and adapted to the situation.

For some reason, all the toilet paper disappeared off the shelves, then other things soon followed — milk, pasta, eggs, anything related to disinfecting things, even dog food.

But then something else happened — kindness.

Musicians and artists took to the Interwebs, providing "quarantine concerts," art classes and conversation remotely and free or for tips. Social media took hold and connected the world through numerous

platforms. There were groups where you could find drive-up and delivery restaurant services, home-cleaning services and exercise classes — most for free.

Utilities stopped turning off their services for non-payment, and

schools and businesses began making meals for isolated individuals.

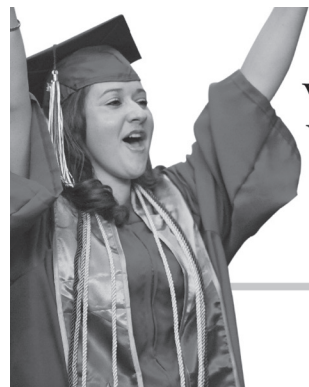
When we truly realized we were all in this together, we made it work in the kindest ways we could.

Nursing homes

To the editor:

I would like to call attention to a serious humanitarian problem.

Eighty four percent of the government-certified nursing home beds in Las Cruces are in homes rated one star (much below average) or two stars (below average) on a five-star scale. An estimated 339 people reside in those nursing homes, based on Medicare.gov figures.

Conditions in three homes were serious enough to result in federal fines of \$208,151 in 2018 and 2019, according

to Medicare.gov.

As of late March, the most recent annual health inspections at the one- and two-star facilities in Las Cruces resulted in 78 citations, or an average of 19.5 per facility. The average number of citations for all government-certified nursing homes in New Mexico is 11.1, and the average for the U.S. is 8.0.

This is a chronic problem. Medicare.gov has 122 pages of details on deficiencies and complaints about Las Cruces nursing homes. The cited deficiencies are listed as "corrected" on Medicare.gov. However, we can

reasonably expect more citations of uncorrected deficiencies to come in the next round of inspections. One nursing home had 14 citations in 2017, 17 in 2018, and 21 in 2019. Another had 23 in 2017, 19 in 2018, and 24 in 2019. The cited conditions don't exist only at the time of the inspection.

Compassionate people should ask our city, county and state officials to find out why Las Cruces has this exceptionally serious persistent problem, and then get it corrected.

Making masks

To the editor:

Like many others, I am making face masks for those working in various medical fields during the Covid-19 crisis. Based on the information from those I make the masks for, this is what they need.

Two sides of medium weight washable fabric with a slot in the top (so they can insert a pad of their choice for extra pro-

tection). Narrow elastic (1/8 inch preferred) to go around their ears; nothing with strings that need to be tied around the head. A six-inch pipe cleaner with the ends doubled back in one side of the top so it can be fitted across the bridge of the nose for a snug fit. (Plastic/wire bread-type ties and floral wire can also be used with ends bent back). Some want a narrow piece of elastic (or a small dart)

in the bottom for extra snugness under their chin. While this is not the quality needed, it is better than a bandana or two pieces of fabric. It is washable.

If we are going to donate our time and effort to this cause, we want to be sure masks are safe and usable when we get finished.

Collapse of oil prices means special session looms

The chair of the New Mexico State Senate Finance Committee said there is no question the state legislature will meet in special session later this year to deal with the budget crisis initiated by the collapse of oil prices.

"It's not a question of if, it's a question of when you're going to have it," said state Sen. John Arthur Smith, D-Luna, Hidalgo, Sierra, Doña Ana, who is in his 32nd year in

the state Senate and is the legislature's most senior Democrat and second most senior member.

In conversations with the staff of Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham in late March, Smith said he recommended holding the special session at the end of June or in July. By then, Smith said, the governor and legislators should have a better idea of where the state is financially and what financial relief the federal government has taken.

"I want to be able to look

further down the road than say March, look at June and see what the future holds," Smith said.

The collapse of world oil prices began March 8 when Saudi Arabia and Russia, two of the world's largest petroleum producers, initiated a price war. Prices have declined further as a result of the reduction in travel caused by the worldwide COVID-19 crisis.

Even before the collapse, Smith said he was concerned by the state's continued increases in

spending. Smith said he did not object to the governor's veto of \$150 million in state general fund non-recurring revenue approved during the 2020 legislative session. But, after the collapse, he said, "it became rather obvious to me that the problem was far more serious than vetoing \$150 million."

Smith said his "back-of-the-napkin" preliminary calculations show a state budget shortfall of up to \$3 billion, depending on which economic model is followed and where oil

prices stabilize.

With the economic situation in New Mexico and statewide caused by COVID-19, Smith it's "the wrong time" to raise taxes. "You're left with the dilemma of tapping into the reserve we do have and reducing unnecessary spending," he said.

Smith, who was born at the end of the Great

Depression (in 1942), he said, "so there was always caution exercised in the family. My contemporaries were brought up that way. That philosophy sort of molded the way we are today."

Survey seeks to pinpoint abuse issues statewide

The Unified Prevention (UP!) Coalition for Doña Ana County and New Mexico State University's (NMSU) Wellness, Alcohol and Violence (WAVE) Rx local drug prevention programs are jointly working to collect survey data on local perceptions of and experiences with substance use and misuse.

The survey is available at www.tinyurl.com/NMCS2020.

The data collected in the UP! survey will be used by the Behavioral Health Services Division of the New Mexico Human Services Department and the division's Office of Substance Abuse Prevention. It will also be used by the UP! Coalition and WAVE Rx to determine substance-abuse prevention and treatment needs in Doña Ana County and New Mexico as a whole.

The NMCS is com-



pletely anonymous, voluntary, targets all residents 18 years of age or older and is bilingual. After completion, participants can enter to win a drawing for a \$100 cash card.

Based on previous survey results, parties were identified as the main source of alcohol for 18-20-year-olds in Doña Ana County, which allowed the UP! Coalition and WAVE Rx to target efforts to reduce underage drinking parties.

Also, more than half of 2019 survey respondents reported that it was okay to provide alcohol to a minor for one reason or another. To address these illegal behaviors, UP! and WAVE Rx have worked to increase perceived risk of legal consequences for breaking alcohol-related laws and have partnered

with schools and law enforcement to enforce local laws and policies. The amount of 18-20-year-olds accessing alcohol at parties decreased by 42 percent from 2018 to 2019, providing support for continued prevention efforts.

In 2019, 21 percent of NMSU students and 24 percent of community members received a prescription for painkillers in the year prior to taking the survey. Evidence-based preven-

tion strategies prove that restricting social access to prescription painkillers curbs misuse. There was an increase of 24 percent in locking up meds and a decrease of 25 percent in sharing of prescription medication from 2018 to 2019.

Electronic Caregiver uses own technology to keep employees safe

With the outbreak of COVID-19, Las Cruces-based Electronic Caregiver (ECG), a 24/7 virtual care and health technology company, has begun using its own product and services to monitor the health of its employees, ECG said in a news release.

“Employees who opt in on the initiative have, since early March, received the company’s Pro Health system, a chronic-care and remote-patient monitoring system, to install in their homes at no cost,” the release said. “All employees who opted into the initiative can use the Pro Health to monitor their health whether they are working from home or not.”

“We’re in a critical and important position serving public health interests,” said ECG founder and CEO Anthony Dohrmann. “Because thousands of patients and high-risk individuals depend on our solutions and services, we’ve got to make sure we’ve optimized internal safety and health protocols to ensure our staff is healthy and present, and able to serve. We are not a business that can accept disruptions to our care network.”

While ECG Tower in downtown Las Cruces is technically closed, the company is still open and operating because it is considered an essential business. Currently, only ECG employees whose jobs require them to be at the office are going into work, ECG said, and any employee who feels sick “is excused from work/allowed to work from home.”

The Pro Health will issue a daily morning

reminder to use a connected, non-contact body-temperature device to check on employee health, the news release said. If a reading is designated as out-of-normal range, a custom, interactive assessment is conducted through the Smart Health Hub to survey for additional symptoms. Free apps are provided to loved ones the company refers to as care circles, so alerts and updates can be shared with family and even providers through a clinical portal. At the touch of one button an employee can connect with a physician-on-demand service remotely, called pocketMD. The employee can get a rapid in-home consultation and, in many cases, a prescription

can be called in, all from home.

“This process gives us the ability to monitor for risk, slow and even stop the spread of infectious disease,” said ECG Chief Clinical Officer Tim Washburn. “We deploy a method of early identification and continuous monitoring which is paramount in situations like the coronavirus. - Amador Transfer Station, 2865 Amador Ave.: Essential businesses only. Closed to the public. Closed Sundays for cleaning and disinfection.
- Las Cruces Recycling Center Dropoff, 2855 Amador Ave.: Closed to

the public.

- Sonoma Ranch Recycling drop-off center, 555 S. Sonoma Ranch Blvd.: Closed to the public.
- Corralitos Regional Landfill, 14535 Robert Larson Blvd.: Closed to the public.
- County collection centers: Punch-card system suspended, hours for public use limited to Saturdays and Sundays 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Limit, four bags of waste per vehicle. No yard waste or construction/demolition waste accepted.

- Chaparral Collection and Recycling center, 180 McCombs Rd.: Open to essential businesses only. Residential fees suspended. Hours for public use limited to Saturdays and Sundays 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Limit, four bags of waste per vehicle.
- Old Foothills Landfill (clean fill, green waste and compost), 555 S. Sonoma Ranch Blvd.: Essential businesses only. Closed to the public. Hours, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday.

- Curbside residential green waste by the grappler truck remains on schedule. Schedule accessible at: www.las-cruces.org/Grappler/

Essential businesses must supply written documentation of essential status to access solid-waste facilities.

All facilities remain open to regional commercial trash haulers during normal business hours.

Through emergency alerts, the state is encour-

aging residents to stay home. The SCSWA will reopen its facilities to normal business protocols as soon as possible.

The SCSWA can be reached at 575-528-3800 from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. The SCSWA manages solid waste and recyclables for residences and businesses throughout Doña Ana County.



City council to allocate funds to help ease virus impact

During a special meeting held entirely by teleconference Monday afternoon, March 30, the Las Cruces City Council discussed options for providing financial support to city residents most in need because of the COVID-19 public health emergency.

The council will hold another special meeting via videoconferencing at 9:30 a.m. Friday, April 3, to vote on a resolution that authorizes the city “to accept a budget adjustment for emergency assis-

tance for the impact from COVID-19 to various programs from the Telshor Fund for \$1 million.”

The Telshor Fund (TF) was created by the council in October 2004 with proceeds from the pre-paid lease of Memorial Medical Center to Providence Healthcare Company and contains about \$40 million.

Through that initial and possible future TF allocations, the council plans to provide funding to Las Cruces nonprofits and other governmental entities to help city residents who have lost their jobs or income as a direct

result of COVID-19 and need assistance with rent and mortgage payments, utility payments, food and other basic needs.

According to the council discussion at the March 30 meeting, TF funds may also be allocated to partner with nonprofits and other governmental agencies, including Las Cruces Public Schools and the New Mexico Department of Health, to provide Internet access and computers for families with children who don’t have them, drivers to deliver meals and groceries to hard-to-reach residents in need and possibly to assist

in transporting Las Cruces COVID-19 test kits to Albuquerque for quicker test results.

Some TF funds may go to the Community Foundation of Southern New Mexico’s (CFSNM) new Together Las Cruces fund.

WILLIAM HART

Aug. 11, 1946 – March 18, 2020

God chose to call his son home on March 18, 2020. William Scott Hart was born at home in New Franklin, Ohio, on August 11, 1946. He served in the United States Army as a crew chief on a Huey helicopter in the Vietnam War, returning home in March 1969.

For 30 years, Bill was a professional truck driver, settling in Las Cruces in 2001. During the past 12 years, his passion was Beagle and Bassett Hound rescue and, at one time, he



shared his home with 15 Beagles and Bassets, making his last delivery of a Beagle to Deming the Monday before his passing.

In 2019, a friend told Bill about the Honor Flight of Southern New Mexico and El Paso, and his friend encouraged Bill to apply. In October 2019, Bill took flight with fellow servicemen to Washington, D.C. That experience changed his life. In an interview on the trip, Bill shared that his new Honor Flight friend walked with him, arm-in-arm, down the steps to the Vietnam Memorial Wall. There he found his lifelong friend's name. They had enlisted together, and his friend was killed two weeks after

Bill returned from war. In the interview, talking about Vietnam, returning home after and the Honor Flight experience, Bill said, "It was like we did this deep inhale 50 some years ago. Took a deep breath, held it, gritted our teeth, and 50 years later we can exhale and let it all out."

He is survived by his wife, Judy Hart, his lifelong best friend Craig Campbell, one sister and was preceded in death by his parents and a sister.

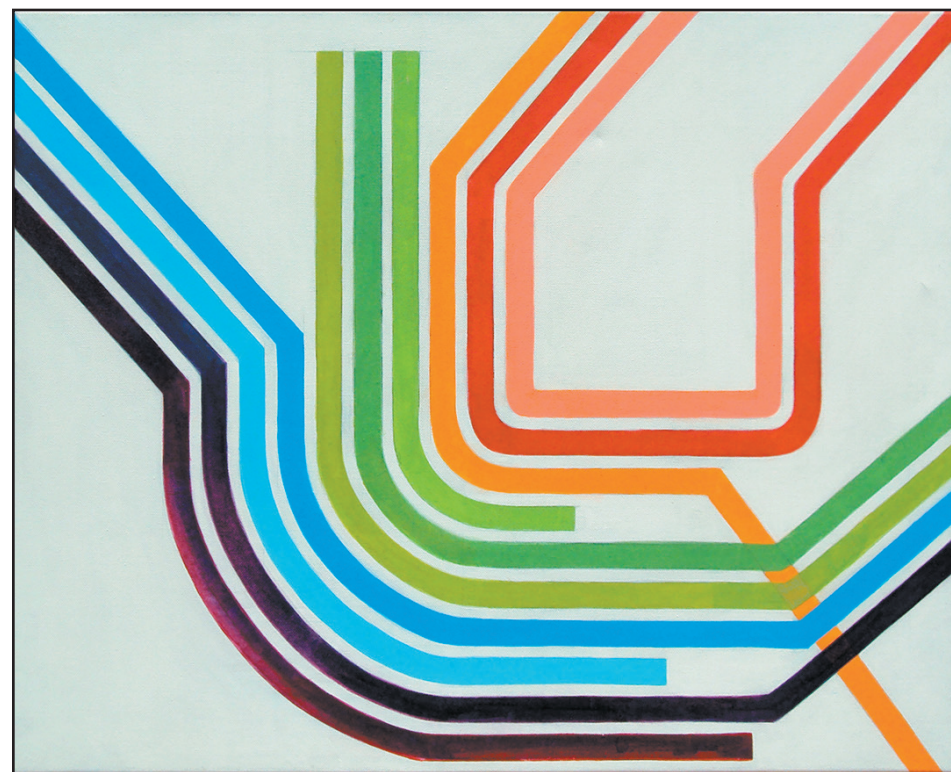
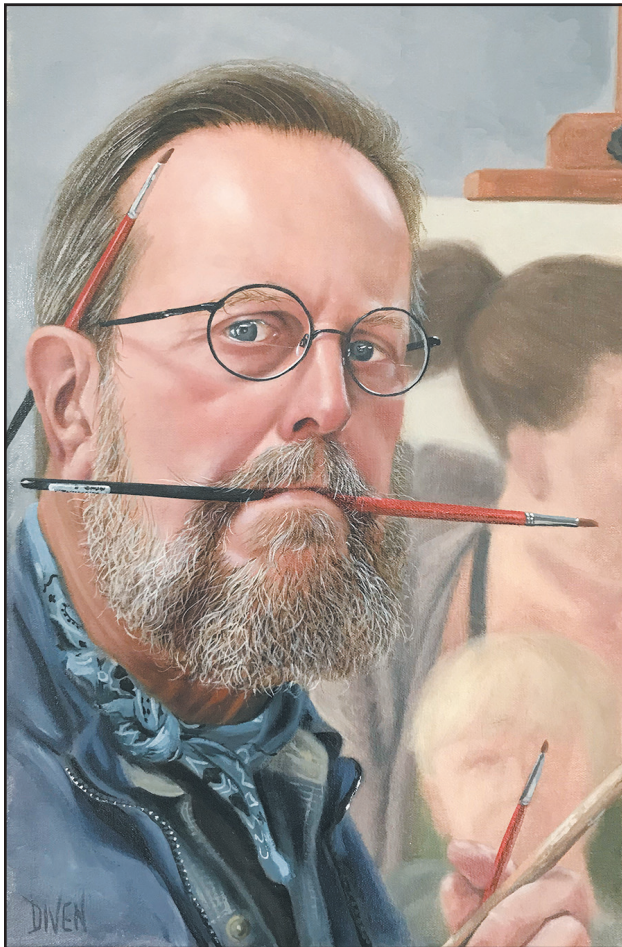

'Marriage Story'

"Marriage Story," (2019) is full of pain, angst, regrets and anguish, but it's also full of moments that reach into the heart and make you say, "Yes!"

The film starts with lists the two main characters have made enumerating the good things about one another, thus we start into the film understanding that these are good human beings who know what marriage is all about.

"Marriage Story" centers around Charlie (Adam Driver) and Nicole (Scarlett Johansson) who are getting a divorce. It follows the process of a woman who is finding herself and a man who doesn't understand what is happening or how they reached the stage of apartness. A beloved child, Henry (Azhy Robertson), is in the middle of it all.

This film is well made, earning six Oscar nominations and one win for Laura Dern, who played

Nicole's divorce attorney. One could almost be fooled into thinking it is realistic. The couple at first agree to an amicable no-attorney divorce, then things get complicated when Nicole moves from their New York home to Las Angeles, and it becomes a cross-country ordeal.

Problems escalate when Nicole finds power attorney Nora Fanshaw, played by Dern. Her introduction into the plotline forces Charlie to fight back, first choosing the kind, reasonable attorney Bert Spitz (Alan Alda), then resorting to an expensive shark type, Jay Marotta (Ray Liotta).

I chose to watch this Netflix Production that came out last year in the theaters (still available on Netflix), because I'm a sucker for the Academy Awards and because I have had a fascination for the way Driver functions. I first saw him in the HBO series, "Girls." His tall,

awkward, gangly weirdness is just peculiar, and when he became part of the Star Wars saga, I was blown away.

"Marriage Story" is a movie for the film industry and those who watch it. Seeing Alda, Dern, Liotta and Wallace Shawn brings back so many memories of beloved films and moments on film that stick with you.

Where does it fail in the realism department? For one thing, there really is no true fault with these people. They, Nicole mainly, grew in different directions and were done in the marriage. Both do things that are wrong, and both are right as well. In other words, they are on completely equal footing.

Part of the point of this movie is that despite two parents being equal, the system will never treat them equally.

The other failure is where the child, Henry, is concerned. These parents are essentially perfect. They don't get super frustrated with him, and they do nothing at all that

might divide his feelings toward them. They read with him, play with him, don't tell him to go mind his own business or even seem to punish him for anything — ever. The worst thing Charlie does is not check to make sure a rental car company properly installs a booster seat, a situation that is resolved before Henry ever uses the seat anyway.

Despite its issues, I enjoyed this film immensely. I enjoyed the perfor-

mances, the story line and the honesty of the characters. I loved delving into the world of New York theater and the Hollywood "space."

I liked the little truths that were shared — Henry's rejection of a Frankenstein Halloween costume that had been created by a Broadway costume designer, when he preferred a store-bought Ninja costume; Nicole's being unable to read aloud in front of a mar-

riage counselor; Charlie making a very stupid mistake when an "observer" was in his apartment to watch his interactions with his child.

This is such a worthwhile movie on so many levels, I must forgive its faults and fall into it, feeling the frustration, love and pain of both its main characters.

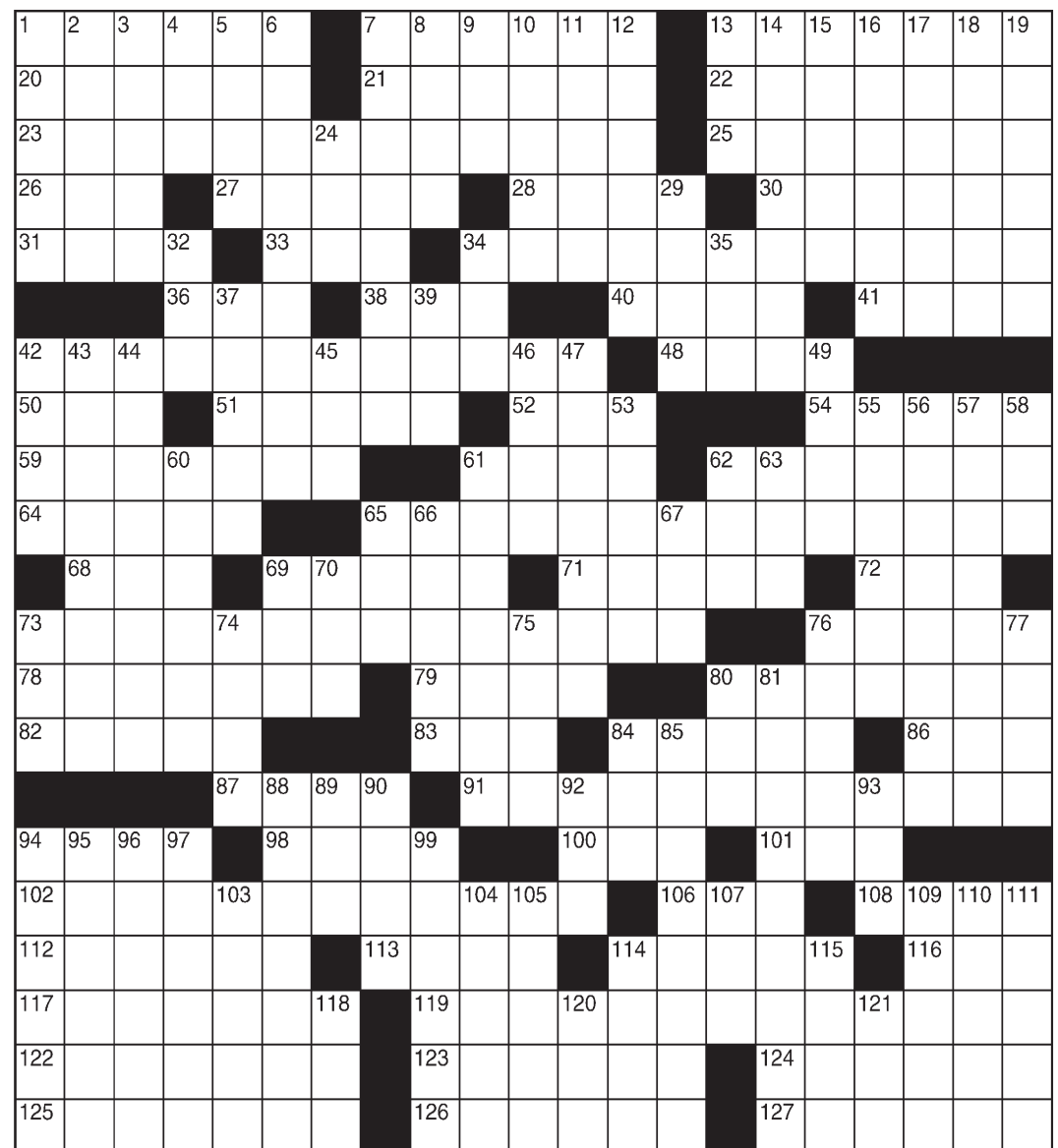

Virus crisis? MVT is still moving toilet paper, goods

There are 1,500 of them in service, and about 80 percent are on the road at any given time, many carrying toilet paper, food and the other essentials that grocery stores have to restock onto their shelves night after night.

They are trucks with the cobalt blue paint jobs and the red letters that proclaim they are part of the fleet of Mesilla Valley Transportation (MVT).

What started in 1981 as a small trucking firm based in Las Cruces that specialized in refrigerated cargo delivery has since grown into a major player in the United States trucking industry, and since day one, Royal Jones has been at the helm.

Jones said moving products safely and on time is the company's mantra, and he said that since China's freight shipments to the United States fell off in late February, due to the

outbreak of COVID-19, the company has been "working at 120 percent" to keep stores stocked along every route the company services.

As a key player in the supply chain, Jones has a different perspective than most about what's happening in the United States relative to essential goods.

"We don't believe that hoarding has much to do with the shortages you see in stores, he said. "At first, people were hoarding toilet paper, but [now] the stores aren't allowing this. I would say the biggest reason for the runs on the grocery stores is that most people eat out nowadays and don't keep a lot of food inventory at home."

He said the pandemic has forced some operational changes for the company as it works to keep the supply chain on track.

"We have installed hand sanitizers in all locations at every spot possible," he said "We have also let people in the cor-

porate office work from home and have about half of them coming in and half working from home. Especially those with small kids with no place to go."

Jones said he's heartened by stories he hears from his drivers about kindnesses they see on the road.

"We've had drivers who have witnessed people buying them lunch at drive throughs since their trucks won't fit, in and most [establishments] won't let you walk through the drive up windows," he said. "Many have just expressed a big thanks to our drivers for working to keep all of us in food and necessities."

One of MVT's biggest contracted customer's Jones said, is Walmart.

"We're delivering to the local WalMart stores more than ever, but, as you see, people are lined up to get in, so by end of day, people don't realize that [the store] gets restocked each night," he said. "We haven't had to go out of route to do this,

and our rates are contracted, [so] we haven't been price gouging. The rates are set for a year."

Jones said the pandemic has created challenges for MVT, but the foundation of the company remains strong.

"We're proud to serve the Mesilla Valley and El Paso areas for the last 38 years," he said.

New fund aims to transition N.M. through COVID-19 virus

BULLETIN REPORT

Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham has announced a new fund established by the New Mexico Coalition of Community Foundations to help New Mexico respond to and eventually recover from the COVID-19 pandemic.

The All Together NM Fund will be used to address immediate needs and offer long-term support for the recovery work that lies ahead.

Pledges of more than \$1.1 million from Ian and Sonnet McKinnon; Intel; Pattern Energy; Blattner Energy; and Tri State Generation and Transmission Association will seed the fund, which will be administered by the Santa Fe Community Foundation.

Donations to the fund will be tax-deductible and can be made through the website, <http://www.AllTogetherNM.org>.

"I encourage everyone who can give to do so — individuals, businesses and all those who care deeply about our great state. We need your help

in the face of this threat," Lujan Grisham said.

"The All Together NM Fund represents an unparalleled collaboration between the public and philanthropic sectors in New Mexico and at a time where working together is an absolute must. By aligning our efforts and coordinating resources in a way that listens and responds to the needs of communities, we are optimally equipped to meet the challenges before us," she said.

The New Mexico Coalition of Community Foundations spearheaded the idea and will coordinate the fund. Its member organizations — the Albuquerque Community Foundation, the Community Foundation of Southern New Mexico, the Santa Fe Community Foundation and the Taos Community Foundation — will work with the larger philanthropic community across New Mexico; they will also consult with the State of New



Mexico to determine the most urgent needs to be addressed through grant-making.

The All Together NM Fund will provide a phased response to the pandemic. First, it will address immediate needs in New Mexico communities, including, procurement of food, medical and cleaning supplies for at-risk communities, support for childcare workers who are supporting front-line employees and grants to address income insecurity among smaller businesses and employees affected by COVID-19 disruptions.

Later, the grantmaking process will shift to address income insecurity among affected workers and businesses and to fill gaps left by the government response. Finally, when the time comes, the fund will support recovery efforts.

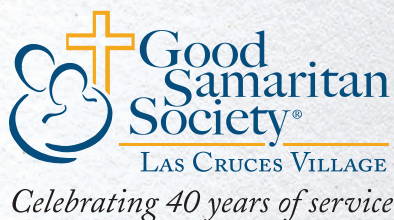

Families stuck at home can adopt coping strategies

There are many questions and concerns due to the Covid-19 pandemic. The shutdown of schools, business establishments and restaurants combined with social distancing and self-quarantine have resulted in major changes to how daily lives are navigated.

Families with children of all ages are impacted by

these changes. Parents are creatively looking to adapt to new routines to support their children while seeking to establish responsibility, peace and joy in the household. The balancing act can bring both rewards and challenges.

Staying at home and following the directives from government officials is important. Finding safe and meaningful ways to support children is another. Here are some tips to help.

- Practice frequent hand washing with soap and water. When not available, use hand sanitizer.
- Wash or clean incoming groceries before bringing them into the home.
- Wipe down common household surfaces, such as the kitchen/bathroom counters, dining table, doorknobs, refrigerator handles, etc.
- Create a calm tone. Adults should strive to be self-aware. Anxiety

may be high, but it's important to provide reassurance and calm to children who are watching and listening to how adults adapt.

- Check in with loved ones and talk with children about their thoughts and feelings. For younger children, follow their lead. Be honest and use appropriate talk. Limit child viewing of daily news broadcasts. For older children, be honest and

have age-appropriate discussions. Validate their concerns while providing reassurance and understanding for their feelings.

- Maintain routines. Young children need structure that replicates a school week. Make time for snacks and movement breaks.
- Give daily, positive affirmations and encourage family members.
- Offer healthy and nutritious snacks and meals.

- Use the time at home to engage in activities such as board games, baking, puzzles, home projects, book discussions, arts and crafts, etc.
- Encourage age-appropriate family chores. Offer praise for completed chores, and talk about how everyone is working together.
- Write down intentions and realistic expectations for the day.
- Exercise self-compassion.

Cruces swimmers shine at state meet

The Las Cruces Aquatic Team (LCAT) sent a squad of 23 swimmers to compete in the 2020 New Mexico Swimming Short Course State Championships at the West Mesa Aquatic Center in Albuquerque last month.

Coached by Daniel France, the team placed fourth among 14 teams competing.

On the event's first day, the relay team of Sean Greene-Cockriel and Nye Hanan, both 14, and Stephen Ewing and Asa Mynatt, both 17, won gold

in the boys' 11-and-over 800-yard freestyle relay with a time of 7:20.11, outswimming their closest competitors by more than four seconds.

On the second day, LCAT scored eight first-place finishes: Dara

Ayala, 10, won the 10-and-under girls' 50-yard backstroke with a time of 34.16. She also won the 50-yard freestyle in her age bracket with a time of 27.49.

Ellie Krizek, 12, won the 11-12 girls 50-yard

backstroke with a time of 32.02, while Olivia Pratt, 13, won the 13-14 girls' 50-yard freestyle at 25.34 and the 100-yard butterfly, coming in at 1:00.76

On the boys' side, Greene-Cockriel took the 13-14 200-yard individual medley at 2:02.64 and the 100-yard breaststroke, with a time of 1:01.85. Not to be left out, Mynatt claimed the 15-and-over boys' 50-yard freestyle at 21.50.

Before the competition came to a close, LCAT posted six additional gold-medal times. Ayala hauled in three, with the 10-and-under 200-yard freestyle at 2:18:80, the 100-yard individual medley at 1:12:88 and the 100-yard freestyle, when she posted a time of 1:00.35. Mynatt took the 15-and-

over boys' 100-yard freestyle at 47.52 and the 200-yard freestyle at 1:44.68, while Maggi Martinez, 10, won the 10-and-under girls 100-yard butterfly at 1:21.19.

Nearly 90 percent of LCAT's competitors posted between one and seven personal-best swims, with five swimmers having achieved 100 percent best times in their individual races. Additionally, of the 22 relay teams fielded by LCAT during the four-day meet, 19 finished in the top eight, and 10 of those finished in the top three.

The collective performances of the team catapulted LCAT up the leaderboard, trailing only three teams, each with more than 90 swimmers competing.

Two LCAT swimmers got into the record books at the meet. Greene-Cockriel broke the 13-14 boys' team records in both the 100-yard breaststroke with a time of 1:01.11, and 200-yard breaststroke at 2:14.84.

Ayala broke the 9-10 girls' team records in the 50-yard freestyle at 27.49, the 100-yard freestyle at 1:00.35 and the 200-yard freestyle at 2:18.80. Her 50-yard freestyle performance also earned her the title of New Mexico Swimming's 10-and-under girls' state record-holder, besting a 20-year-old record by 0.25 seconds.

The team's next scheduled competition was set to be the 2020 Suntan Classic, May 1-3, at the NMSU Aquatic Center.

Cultivating positivity will help you improve your golf game

If you've ever seen anyone panic as he or she is about to give a speech, you know it's not a pretty sight. The speaker's galloping anxiety, surely accelerated by uncontrolled irrational thoughts, resembles part of the classic "fight-or-flight" syndrome, where worry, tension, fear and panic all converge, making the person virtually helpless to act calmly and rationally. It may get worse — "freeze-or-faint" may also be reactions.

Emotional tension is the enemy of the golf swing, and the emotions rule where tension is concerned. Golf is a rare game where the swing occurs voluntarily, not as the result of a reaction, like a batter hitting a pitched ball. Negative

thinking and negative feelings co-exist and will handicap a golfer more than any course conditions or opponents.

When you engage in rigid "I" thoughts attached to "must," "should" or "have to," even

below your awareness threshold, you are simply jacking up the tension and making it harder to perform as well as you want to.

Any round of golf can be an emotional roller coaster if we fail to recognize the warning signs of maladaptive feelings, thoughts and tension. It strikes me that there is a close tie between confidence and emotional regulation, one that we need to comprehend and embrace if we are to make ourselves our own best

friend on the golf course, rather than our own worst enemy. Just like positive, performance-enhancing emotions, confidence is something we choose, not something that just pops up in our mind and our game by happenstance.

Yes, you can take action to create your own confidence, and that happy anticipation that goes along with it. Start by practicing and warming up in a way that promotes the feel of solid contact and holing short putts.

So many golfers unthinkingly go to the range, automatically pull out their driver and start wailing away, lucky to hit a good shot at random, instead of starting with short, controlled shots, like half wedges.

Next, learn to manage your anxiety by personal af-

firmations (e.g. "I feel calm and in a good place") and relaxed breathing. These are all self-directed moves to build your confidence.

Self-image and self-talk are both closely associated with emotional well-being; they can result in positive or negative influences.

When advising us about the role self-image plays in our performance in his book "Your 15th Club," Dr. Bob Rotella offers this: "You can think of the self-image as the sum of all the thoughts you've had about yourself. Some of them have been supplied by others. But most of them originate with you. These thoughts stay in the conscious brain for a while. They are then absorbed by the subconscious."

Self-image, he says, can produce such self-affirming

thoughts as, "I'm a pretty good golfer and I'm a good putter;" or horribly maladaptive self-talk such as, "I'm just a choking dog. I just suck."

It's like the warped inner image of an anorexic turned to golf. And as Dr. Rotella points out, your self-image lives in your subconscious, while you remain unaware of how influential it is to your behavior.

"But it's your subconscious that rules your golf game," he says. "That's because golf is one of those physical activities, like driving a car, that are learned by the conscious brain and then controlled by the subconscious brain." Very similar to our emotions.

When you're on the golf course, think of yourself as your own caddie. Caddies on tour don't tear their play-

ers down; they build them up! Don't be overly critical of yourself. Be your own caddy, and coach yourself into good decisions, a good mood and good shots.

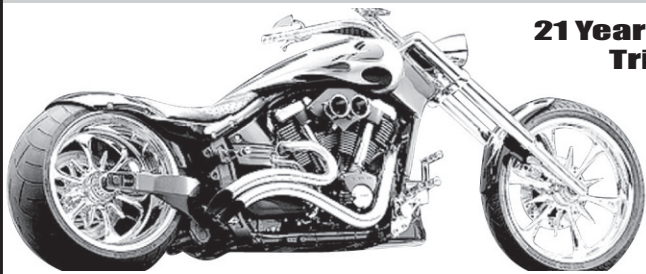
Make a choice to feel good about yourself regardless of the outcome of any single shot or any single round. If today didn't go well, there is always tomorrow, and we can accept the challenge of changing what we didn't like about yesterday.

One of Annika Sorenstam's first coaches, Pia Nilsson, put it best, telling Annika, "Learn to guide your emotions on the golf course and in life."

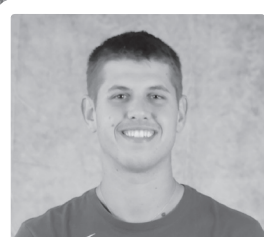

In the meantime, enjoy a bit of the museum at home!

LUCHADOR THUMB WRESTLING

1...2...3...4! We declare a *Lucha Libre* Thumb War! Who will emerge victorious among your family?

What you need:

- Rubber Kitchen Gloves
- Scissors
- Markers

To make your wrestler, cut off one finger of a rubber kitchen glove for each of your thumb wrestlers about 1-1.5" from the tip, then place the finger tip over the end of a thick marker or on a finger on your non-dominant hand as you design and decorate your mask with markers.

Next, you will need to build a "Thumb Wrestling Ring" (adapted from [instructables.com/id/Thumb-Wrestling-Ring](https://www.instructables.com/id/Thumb-Wrestling-Ring/)).

What you need:

- String
- Skewers
- Scissors
- Ruler
- Marker
- Cardboard
- Hot glue gun and hot glue stick (or regular glue and patience)

To make the ring, cut the cardboard in a 3.5"x3.5" square; this is your mat. Pick two opposing corners of the square and draw one circle with $\frac{3}{4}$ " diameter on each side. Cut out these circles for your thumb wrestlers to enter the ring. Cut the skewer into four 1.5" pieces; these are your ring posts. Warm up your hot glue gun (make sure to ask an adult for help if you need it!). If you don't have a hot glue gun you can use regular school glue or whatever you have on hand. Be sure to follow the safety instructions for whichever you use. Poke a small hole in each corner of the mat for the posts. Gently insert a post into each small hole and glue the skewer in place. Allow the glue to dry completely, which may take several minutes. Cut two 18" pieces of string and put a drop of glue at the top of any post and attach the end of the string. Wrap the string around the four posts until you are back where you started. Glue down the end and trim off any excess, repeat with the second piece of string halfway down the posts.
