## Detention Center implements COVID-19 protections

The Doña Ana County Detention Center has been working closely with area law enforcement agencies and the judicial system to reduce the number of detainees in custody, to further enhance preventive measures and minimize the risk of spreading COVID-19 to the community, staff or detainees.

"We have been working with the various area courts to

reduce the number of low-risk and non-violent offenders in custody, while preserving the safety of the community," County Manager Fernando R. Macias said.

The Center suspended in-person family visits and closed the lobby to public access, while extending online remote visitation hours, from 8 a.m. to 9:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, excluding holidays.

Management also negotiated two free 10-minute calls and one free 30-minute remote video visitation per week, per inmate, for adults.

Family members may schedule either free or fee-based calls and video visits from home, using a laptop or desktop computer, at [www.legacyinmate.com/](http://www.legacyinmate.com/)

Prepaid. Texting is available via [www.gettingout.com](http://www.gettingout.com).

Juvenile detainees will also have access to two free 10-minute phone calls, per week. However, that facility lacks video visitation capabilities. The Juvenile Facility lobby will also have access restricted. However, parents or guardians may schedule visits in advance, by calling (575) 647-7680.

The lobby kiosk for depositing funds into a detainee's account is deactivated. However, family and friends may provide funds to detainees' accounts, using the detainee's identification number, via one of the following options:

## County provides essential services, limits access to facilities

The Doña Ana County Government Center, 845 N. Motel Blvd. is closed to the public. However, all departments will continue to provide essential services. This action supports an effort to help prevent spreading the coronavirus disease 2019, COVID-19 by minimizing in-person contact.

Community Resources Centers are also closed, but will continue to provide meals for seniors.

Public access to County Commission meetings will remain available. However, the public is encouraged to access the livestream.

Employees providing essential services who have a job that requires them to be in the field, such as public safety, utilities workers and road crews will remain active, to meet the community's needs. Employees who are at high risk for COVID-19 will work from home.

County departments will continue to provide essential services by staffing websites, social media and telephones to minimize in-person contact.

# Recycling: Know what to throw

Recycling is good for your conscience and good for the planet, but it's not always easy.

Pizza boxes spring to mind. They're cardboard, and that's recyclable, right?

Wrong. It's dirty cardboard, with grease soaked through the bottom layer of the box and – in most cases – little tidbits of fused cheese, crust morsels and topping residue clinging to the inside.

The pizza box is trash.

But the confusion doesn't stop at pizza boxes, so the Rio Grande Recycling Corridor — a group comprised of recycling and solid waste agencies from Las Cruces to Santa Fe — has launched a statewide recycling education campaign geared to teach New Mexicans how to recycle correctly.

"There are many misconceptions about what can and can't be recycled, and there is a view that it is difficult," said Patrick Peck, director of South Central Solid Waste Authority. "Our goal is to set the record straight. Recycling right is simple, and with a few easy tips, every New Mexican can ensure they're doing their part to recycle the right materials."

Peck has been in the solid-waste industry for decades and is sought-after for his protocols and experience.

According to a press



release, the "Know What to Throw New Mexico" campaign aims to combat the most pressing issues found across the state, including eliminating food waste and plastic bags from blue bins.

Three basic rules can help serious recyclers contribute to the solu-

tion rather than remain lost in recycling purgatory, not knowing what to do with what materials.

**Rule 1: Empty, clean and dry items get recycled.**

Food residue and liquids should be rinsed from containers before recycling. Dirty materials are not recyclable

All items should be loose.

**Rule 3: Know what to throw for your area.** According to RecycleNewMexico.com, the South Central Solid Waste Authority accepts clean aluminum and cat-food cans, tin cans, empty and flattened boxes, brown paper bags, books, juice boxes, milk cartons, office paper, magazines, newspaper, uncorrugated cartons, phone books, grocery bags, plastic bottles and jars, rigid plastics and most cardboard.

If you're willing to haul recyclables to SCSWA facilities, they also accept glass, appliances, electronic devices and yard trimmings.

If you have friends and neighbors outside the Las Cruces area, encourage them to visit RecycleNewMexico.com for details specific to their communities.

"As important as it is for people to recycle, it's even more important for them to recycle right," said Sarah Pierpont, executive director of the New Mexico Recycling Coalition. "It's our hope that, through this campaign, New Mexicans will not only be educated, but also inspired to do what they can for their environment and their communities."

# U.S.-Mexico border stays open to trade, essential travel

“Commercial goods transported on trains and trucks won’t be affected” by the joint U.S.-Mexico decision to partially close the border between the two counties, Border Industrial Association President Jerry Pacheco of Santa Teresa said in a March 20 email message. “I just spoke to Santa Teresa Port Director Fernando Thome and he assured me that business is proceeding as usual,” Pacheco said in the email, adding that rumors that the border is completely closed are false. “Cargo will proceed, so our exports and imports to Mexico are not affected at this moment.”

The partial closing will only impact non-essential travel, Pacheco said. It won’t affect “citizens or legal residents, people with legal work permits, people who are considered ‘essential’ or people traveling for med-



ical education reasons.”

Pacheco said President Trump’s travel advisory about Americans traveling to Mexico “is only a travel advisory at this point and will not restrict Americans or any of the people listed above from coming to the U.S.

“Please take guidelines about conducting your everyday business during this coronavirus crisis seriously, but please proceed with your business,” Pacheco said.

BIA is a nonprofit industrial advocacy group founded by Pacheco in 2009. It is comprised of 125 industrial members that account for 6,000 employees and billions of value-added production, six million square feet of industrial space and more than \$1 billion in investment in the Santa Teresa-Las Cruces Corridor. Pacheco said it is the largest industrial association in New Mexico.

# Standing together, six feet apart

**T**he skateboarder rose up on his arc as a bird aloft to fly.

Then he smoothly dipped back down, continuing to move forward.

The freedom of the solo skateboarder was inspiring and uplifting, especially on a day when most people were practicing voluntary servitude, staying home – or at least away from others – to practice social distancing in the Time of Coronavirus.

It was Sunday, March 22.

From my vantage point, driving along Don Roser Drive, I couldn't see the concrete drainage culvert. So the skateboarder appeared to rise in slow motion from the earth.

It was a moment of grace and light in a period of worry and darkness.

\* \* \*

The day before, on Saturday, March 21, I drove around the square at Mesilla Plaza. The plaza was empty, save for five couples. On the bleachers at the south end of the plaza, two couples sat, at least six feet apart, smiling and enjoying the beautiful day. On the gazebo, there was one couple on each of the stairs opposite each other. I could only see the faces of one couple. They were smiling. Then on the north end of the plaza, a couple sat on a bench, not just smiling, but laughing together.

\* \* \*

As this column goes to press, our world is a different place.

Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham announced Monday, March 23, tighter restrictions on gatherings (dropping the recommendation from 10 people to five) and closing “non-essential” businesses.

“Basic retail in New Mexico is closed,” Lujan Grisham said.

And with it goes a lot of the life and the economic wind from our community.

We may not know for months, years, or even ever, how effective our closures were on stopping the spread of COVID-19.

We already know the immediate economic impact, but it may be a while before we know the long-term impact.

The experiences we've had could alter the way we do things in the future.

For example, with so many people working from home, a lot of businesses may realize they can operate without a brick-and-mortar storefront.

That causes me great pause.

We've all seen the frustrating and time-consuming fallout of perfectly innocent miscommunications in emails and texts. We've also seen the frustrating and time-consuming fallout of intentional negative communications in emails and texts. I THINK YOU KNOW WHAT I'M TALKING ABOUT!!!

I've had the good fortune of being a facilitator in the Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce's Junior Leadership program for several sessions. It's a program where 30 high school juniors meet once a month for field trips to learn about different aspects of the

Las Cruces community.

The students learn a lot, but the adult facilitators also learn a lot from the students.

Students are required to do presentations from chapters of the book “7 Habits of Highly Effective Teens.” One chapter talks about the importance of in-person communication. The students tell us as little as 10 percent of communication is conveyed through spoken words.

The vast majority of communication comes through the person's facial expression, voice tone, hand gestures and other critical non-verbal cues.

If you have an office of 25 people, significant and important communication is lost without face-to-face interaction. Losing that would have a negative effect on team-building and morale.

On the other hand, it has been impressive how much people have learned about the possibilities, as well as the limits, of using technology in different ways.

Early signs indicate nearly everyone realizes this whole situation is affecting everyone else. Banks have announced they will, in some cases, grant extensions on mortgages. That may, in turn, allow some landlords to grant extensions on rental payments.

If we can all operate that way, it could, theoretically, create a domino effect of businesses and individuals giving each other breaks. The net effect could be that our economy just went through a temporary “pause.”

If, however, this thing goes on for several months, that pause will turn into “game over” for many businesses and

services.

Beyond the economic considerations are the effects on the health of our people – statewide, nationally, globally. The coronavirus has already exposed worldwide weaknesses in our healthcare systems. We won't know for some time how many people died with COVID-19, or COVID-19-accentuated problems. We won't know for some time if an effective antidote essentially solves the issue, or if the virus mutates elusively.

And that's the hardest part of every aspect of this situation.

There is so much we simply don't know. So much we can't know for some time.

It doesn't help that every person is suddenly an expert on pandemics, and we're getting bombarded with information, much of it conflicting, on a constant basis. Much of the information is helpful; much is counterproductive.

There's a chance some of us will lose a loved one in this, which, as always, will bring it home in a powerful way.

It's a difficult situation no matter how you look at it.

But almost everyone is saying, “We'll get through this. We'll get through this together.”

And it's true. We will get through it together, even if we have to stand six feet away, in groups of five or fewer.

The human spirit can be dampened in many ways, and many of our spirits are troubled. Some of us are sick, and more will get that way.

But do what you will with the human spirit, you cannot extinguish it.

We'll be back.

# Rely on the experts, not the skeptics

It feels like we're all in the opening scene of a horror movie, with birds flocking ominously on power lines all over town.

Things are calm now. Some people see the danger coming and scramble to board up the windows. Others scoff at the nervous Nellies and go about their business as usual.

There is no certainty as to what the next few weeks and months will bring. But experts tell us a lot of people will get sick from the coronavirus here, just as they have in other countries.

And so, the government is taking measures that seem clearly dis-

proportionate to the problem that now exists. Last week, Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham shut down the schools. Casinos have also been closed. Bars and restaurants are limited to 50 percent capacity.

Any event intended to draw a crowd has been cancelled. No gathering in the state can have more than 100 people, even if it's private.

The decision by the NBA to cancel its season seemed rash until we learned that same night that two players for the Utah Jazz had tested positive for the virus.

Many of the things I look forward to each spring won't happen this

year.

The Sunshine Week event we had scheduled for last week had to be cancelled. Our topic was the future of community journalism, and I felt like we had a strong panel of both traditional and new-media journalists for the discussion.

My Nuggets and Avs had both locked up playoff spots with young, exciting teams. The Aggies looked like a lock to go back to the NCAA Tournament.

# Amid fear and devastation, COVID-19 may help the environment

Everyone knows the physical, emotional and economic impact of COVID-19. It may also be having some unforeseen benefits for the environment.

Southwest Environmental Center Executive Director Kevin Bixby said there have been “pretty dramatic reductions” in air pollution in countries like China, Italy and the United Kingdom since the onset of the virus in late 2019. There may be a similar reduction in parts of the United States, he said.

While acknowledging that the reductions in global-warming gasses and fossil-fuel production in some countries are “likely to be very temporary” and return to normal levels when the crisis ends, Bixby said he is “encouraged by a few signs” that a dramatic shift in behavior is possible.

For example, he said, one version of a U.S. House of Representatives bill to address the economic impact of the virus included a provision that mandated airlines substantially reduce their greenhouse gas emissions in exchange for a bailout of the industry.

“Maybe this is a wakeup call,” Bixby said. “Maybe it’s a lesson that people can take to heart that we can change our economic system incredibly fast if we have the will to do so, and do it in a

way that doesn’t hurt our economy or hurt people.”

The best way to accomplish the change is through “a planned transition,” he said, that will “take care of people who lose their jobs in the fossil-fuel industry.”

Bixby said the COVID-19 is “really dangerous; I think it’s very wise that we’re told to stay home.” But, he said, the disease is affecting only one species on earth – humans – while climate change and the effects of mass extinctions underway are “the equivalent of a pandemic in terms of the costs they will impose on humans and the planet itself,” he said.

“It would be nice when we come out of this that all nations and especially the U.S. are prepared to address the prospect of another pandemic and plan for that,” Bixby said, “and do the same for climate change and mass extinction.”

The world will likely see more infectious diseases in part because humans continue to destroy the habitats of

wild animals and force them into closer contact with other species and with humans. That destruction, along with wildlife trade and wildlife farming, make it easier for the pathogens that cause the diseases to jump from animals to humans, he said.

While COVID-19 may not be particularly lethal, it is very contagious, Bixby said. A worldwide outbreak of a disease like Ebola or measles with a higher mortality rate could be much more devastating.

“That’s something that we should be thinking about,” he said. “These pandemics aren’t going to stop. These are going to keep happening. The rate has been increasing in recent decades. You really have to start addressing these bigger issues.”

Construction of the Wall continues

COVID-19 has not slowed the Trump administration’s construction of the wall along the U.S.-Mexico border, Bixby said, and that could spread the virus, too.

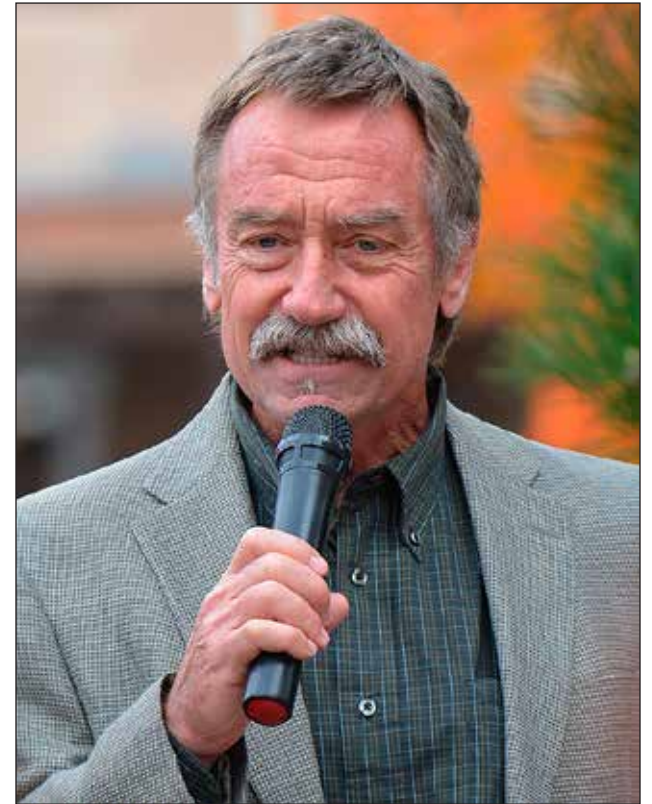
Hundreds of workers are gathering in New Mexico and other U.S. southern border states to build the wall, working in close proximity without practicing recommended social distancing, sharing tools and shopping in Las Cruces and other U.S. cities along the U.S.-Mexican border.

If the workers contract COVID-19, Bixby said, they will be visiting doctors and other

healthcare providers in those cities, “spreading the virus and helping to overwhelm our medical response. That’s a problem. The wall is continuing to be built as we speak.”

Bixby has a B.A. in biology from Dartmouth College and a master’s degree in natural resources policy from the University of Michigan. He moved to New Mexico in 1988 and started the Southwest Environmental Center (SWEC) in 1991.

SWEC works “to protect and restore native wildlife and their habitats through grassroots advocacy, systemic change and on-the-ground restoration projects,” according to [www.wildmesquite.org](http://www.wildmesquite.org).

# Domestic violence: Mary's story of survival and triumph

"I'm a survivor," said a Las Cruces woman about her 17-year struggle with domestic violence.

Mary (not her real name) was 18 years old when she met Frank (not his real name), the man with whom she would begin a long-term rela-

tionship and have a child.

"When I met him, he was super mysterious," Mary said. "I never really put up red flags with him because he was so charming."

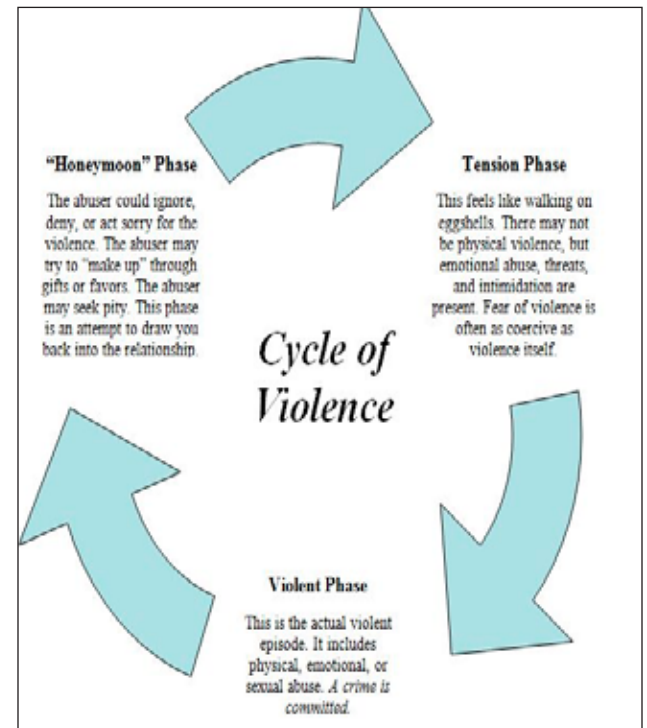
The two began dating and were "doing really good," she said. Then, one morning, "I was nagging him," because she was late to work. He told her to "be quiet or I'm going to get you quiet." Mary said she kept nagging him, and, "all of a sudden, I just saw knuckles coming toward my face. It happened so fast." Frank told her "to get quiet" or his response "would get much worse."

Mary didn't see Frank for a week after the attack, then he came back to her house and promised he would never hit

her again. They continued their relationship until he acted out again several weeks later. During the second incident, Frank gave Mary a fat lip and a black eye, breaking her glasses. He also broke a karaoke machine, candles and other things Mary especially liked.

Mary and Frank's relationship continued along these lines for the next seven years, she said. "It was chaos," Mary said. Frank was using drugs, and Mary also became a user, because it became the activity they did together. She eventually left Las Cruces, moving to a small town nearby to be with family members, where she overcame her drug habit and became clean.

Frank came to visit her while she was away, and Mary became pregnant. Upon her return, she became aggressive, she said. Because of her anger about the violence she had been subjected to before, Mary became verbally and even physically abusive toward Frank, nagging him and sometimes pulling his hair. Be-



cause she was pregnant, he "wouldn't retaliate or say anything. He was actually very nice," she said.

Frank exhibited no violence toward Mary until seven months after their daughter was born, Mary said. One morning, he told her to make him a meal before she could go to work or take their daughter to daycare.

"You're not leaving until you cook me something," she remembers him saying. When Mary said no, Frank punched her in the stomach.

"He knocked the breath out of me," said Mary, who was holding their daughter at the time of the attack.

Mary dropped to her

knees, then got up and made her way to the kitchen, pretending to begin cooking a meal while Frank was on the couch. Instead, she fled out the back door. The incident took place in December, during cold and windy weather, but Mary left without a coat.

"I ran to the first neighbor's house that would let me in," Mary said. She called her uncle, who came and picked her up. She did not call the police.

"For seven years I stayed away from him," Mary said. She did see Frank during public outings for their daughter, going occasionally to the park, the movies and restaurants for meals.

When their daughter was about to turn seven

years old, Mary "decided to try again" with Frank, she said. "Maybe this time will be different," she remembers thinking

at the time. "We're older. I know what I'll put up with."

After a "honeymoon period" of several months,

Mary looked at Frank's cell phone and saw photos of him with another woman and confronted him. Soon, Frank's other girlfriend began calling Mary and coming to her house and her workplace to harass her, Mary said. Frank also had upgraded his drug use, she said. One day at Mary's house, he became angry with her and began hitting her washing machine with a baseball bat and pouring bleach on her clothes and bedding.

Their daughter, then 8, was present and called 911. Frank was arrested and spent the next year in jail.

"I felt like I wasn't functioning as a normal adult," Mary said. It was now May 2017 and, for the first time, she made contact with La Casa, Inc. domestic violence program in Las Cruces.

She told her story to La Casa staff, "to see what they could help me with." Mary remembers that her story spilled out like "word vomit."

Out of jail, Frank has been clean and sober for two years, is on probation and is voluntarily participating in a battering intervention program La Casa offers for domestic violence offenders, Mary said. Part of what Frank is working through, she said, is the mental abuse and bullying he suffered as a child. "He was made fun of a lot, so he sort of became the bully," Mary said.

She said that, thanks to La Casa's people and programs, both have made progress, as has their daughter.

In treatment programs at La Casa, Mary also met other domestic abuse survivors.

"I got to hear other stories," she said. "Other couples are going through this."

That helped Mary to find the voice to speak up for herself, she said, and the courage to set personal boundaries.

La Casa, Inc. is continuing with modified services to the community during the Coronavirus pandemic. "We are offering telephonic services except in shelter," said Executive Director Henry Brutus.

Brutus said La Casa's greatest needs from the community are bottled water, toilet paper, non-perishable food items and personal hygiene products for men, women and children.

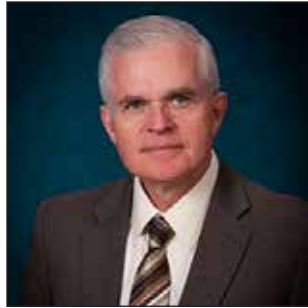

Our highest priority is keeping our community safe. That also means helping to keep our community healthy. ## Nonprofits can seek emergency funding

# Dig wisely, and only flush toilet paper

On average, LCU responds to more than 8,000 calls every year asking for crews to identify underground utilities. Homeowners and contractors need to know where gas pipes and other underground utilities are located before digging.

“With newly laid pipe, a ‘tracer’ line that we can find magnetically will always be added alongside the pipe. But that technology didn’t exist for older construction,” said Joe Atencio, LCU gas locating and mapping supervisor. “When we run into a situation where we don’t



have the records showing pipe locations, sometimes ‘fish taping’ is the best solution to find exactly where a customer’s line connects to the city’s main gas line.”

While new technologies generally make things easier, sometimes older methods still save

the day in locating underground utilities.

“Fish taping is a last resort before we have to actually have to dig up a pipe to locate it,” Atencio said. He describes it as feeding a gas line tracer through the end of a pipe where it will “ping” an electronic signal to the

above-ground crew.

It’s a “last resort,” he said, because it requires shutting off the gas while the crew searches for a pipe.

Before starting a landscaping or fencing project, patio or deck construction, call 811 to have underground utilities located and marked.

Las Cruces Utilities can be reached at 575-528-3500 from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Las Cruces Utilities provides services to approximately 100,000 Las Cruces residents and

businesses.

Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) is asking customers to stop flushing paper towels and disinfectant wipes, because they clog drains, back up sewers and cause issues at sewage treatment plants.

John Mrozek, LCU wastewater deputy director, said the word “flushable” appears on a lot of packaging, but it’s misleading – and often false.

“Wipes arrive intact and often wind themselves into ropes that get tangled into wastewater treatment equipment

and can break screens that are intended to filter out larger pieces of debris in the wastewater,” Mrozek said.

Dispose of wipes in the trash, he said, and avoid using paper towels as toilet paper.

Wastewater operations worker Carlos Almaraz said wipes can plug up pumps at lift stations and can damage equipment, which necessitates sending crews to vacuum the system.

While toilet paper starts disintegrating as soon as it hits the water, he said, the strong-fiber wipes and paper towels don’t break apart.

Service lines from homes into the city’s sewer lines are less than four inches in diameter, with sharp bends in the lines, where clogs occur, creating backups from the sewer line into the home.

## Don't Let Pain or Injury Dampen Your Creative Spirit

We often don't consider the long-term impact that practicing the fine arts can have on the body. Yet dancers, musicians, visual artists and even performing artists are not immune to experiencing pain and injury related to their crafts.

Artists of all types express themselves in ways that require various levels of strength, flexibility, balance, precision and dexterity. Over time, this can have a real impact on their bodies, issues that may manifest as discomfort, pain, injury and movement limitations."

The following are some common issues that can develop within various populations of artists:

**Dancers:** Along with the potential for acute injuries, dancers of all types are prone to overuse injuries in the hips, knees, ankles and feet. Injuries like hip impingement, tendonitis in the hip flexor or Achilles tendon, runner's knee (patello-femoral pain syndrome), stress fractures, and even the development of arthritis are common in dancers.

**Musicians:** Those who play string, percussion or wind instruments can, over the long term, also develop overuse and repetitive strain injuries (RSIs).



RSIs are in pain the muscles, nerves and tendons caused by repetitive movements. Conditions such as tendonitis, bursitis, carpal tunnel syndrome and thoracic outlet syndrome can be painful. They can also affect a musician's strength, endurance, and ability to properly grip their instrument.

**Visual Artists:** Visual artists such as painters and sculptors are also not immune to RSIs and overuse injuries (i.e., tendinitis, carpal tunnel, etc.). The focus and precision that goes into artists' efforts can cause them to work for long periods of time without a break – sometimes in awkward positions – adding tension and strain to the body.

**Performing Arts:** Covering a broad spectrum of people, from actors to stage and lighting designers, injury trends in the performing arts are more difficult to track. However, excelling in this field requires mental and physical endurance. Performing artists often work and practice long hours while wearing multiple hats, often crossing into other elements of fine arts such as dancing, music and visual arts.

The need to perform artistically is so strong in some people, it can seem to rival their need to breathe. So, when pain, weakness or discomfort starts to affect your work, it's important to get in to see a physical therapist early for an assessment. 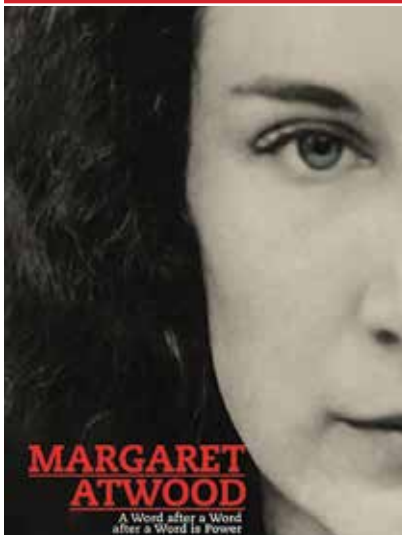

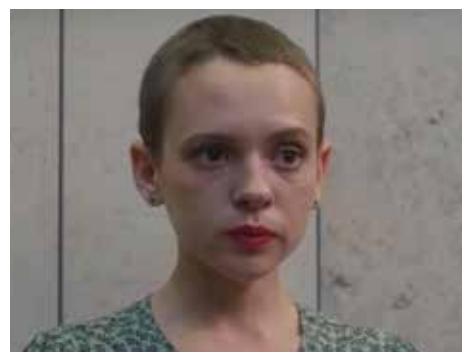

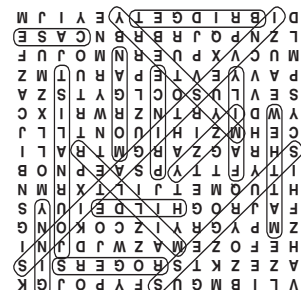

# Evictions on hold statewide for those impacted by virus

Earlier this week, the New Mexico Supreme Court ordered a temporary moratorium on evictions for inability to pay rent during the COVID-19 public health emergency.

Under the court's order, if tenants can provide evidence of inability to pay because the health crisis has impacted their income, the eviction process will not move forward until the order is lifted.

Landlords seeking a judge's assistance to have tenants removed for non-payment would be told to wait, and law enforcement would not be deployed to force the removal of a tenant.

Las Cruces community organizer Sarah Silva said the court's move is good news during uncertain times.

"This is a great step forward to protecting New Mexicans from homelessness. As a renter, I'm grateful to have this help if I and my family need it. As a community organizer, I hope that property management companies will take initiative on reaching out to tenants and giving us the ability to defer payment for at least two months without having to go to court," Silva said.

Mountain View Co-Op employee Dasha Lilly said her family is already feeling the pinch of the pandemic.

"Overall, [the order] will help a lot," Lilly said. "Dominic no longer has income from working at the

bar, and I have gotten my hours cut, which hits us pretty hard, not knowing if we'll be able to make the full portion of rent on top of making sure we have the needs to keep us afloat through all this."

Lilly said having children in the house complicates the matter even further.

"With kids, it's the debate on do we save the money for rent, or do we buy diapers if we can find any? Do we save money for rent, or do we get the shampoo and conditioner. We're to the point of reaching out to other family members and seeing who can help, which is nice but stressful."

Former Mayor Ruben Smith manages two properties near downtown. He said he's in "total support" of the court's ruling.

"I'm actually a step ahead of them," Smith said. "I'm already working with people. My view is that we all have to work together and get to the other side of this and then see how we can proceed. It's almost a no-brainer. Simple common sense says that people are struggling. And I'm going to evict them? Ridiculous."

The Bulletin reached out to two large property management firms in Las Cruces for comment, but neither responded before the print deadline.

"New Mexicans are struggling financially as workplaces close because of the public health emergency," said Chief Justice Judith K. Nakamura. "The court's order will provide temporary relief for families and individuals facing the possibility of losing their housing at a time when the governor and public health officials have ordered New Mexicans to remain at home to prevent the spread of COVID-19."

The court's order is the latest restriction and precautionary measure imposed on operations of state courts to protect public safety and safeguard the health of New Mexicans.

Other measures provide New Mexican additional time to pay fines and fees, require the use of audio and video conferencing for court proceedings that need to continue and allow self-represented litigants to submit case filings to local courts by email and fax to help them avoid courthouse visits.

# Eateries persevere with creativity

Lorenzo's Italian Restaurant is one of many local restaurants offering takeout and curbside service, as well as delivery.

Though state orders due to the coronavirus have shut down dine-in eating at New Mexico restaurants, pickup service is still allowed, and Vince Vacarro of Lorenzo's said he's glad.

"We want to help people have some normalcy with the distractions of this unseen force," Vacarro said. "The other thing I'm really concerned about is our employees, making sure they can make their rent payments and living expenses. I'm responsible for 30 people in the community."

He said Lorenzo's is also taking donations, so his restaurant can deliver to assisted living centers and other shut-ins.

Marci Dickerson, owner of the Game and Game II restaurants, said her primary focus is her employees.

"We're helping them with groceries and their rent," Dickerson said. "We've got 140 employees, and only 52 have been laid off. But they all know their job is waiting for them when things calm down. We're hoping that is sooner rather than later. The restaurant industry will not be able to stay intact if we go through more than a month of this."

In the meantime, both of her restaurants are offering takeout, as

well as free meals for children who have been "sponsored by many, many donations from the community." If the sponsorships subside, she said, the restaurants will keep the kids' meals priced at \$2.

Dickerson's philanthropic organization, Revolution 120, received an anonymous donation to create a grant program to help servers and food-service workers who have been laid off to pay their utilities.

"A lot of people are out of work right now," Dickerson said. "It's important for us all to work together."

While some restaurants have suspended operations, many remain operational. Call your favorite restaurant to check its status.

# Poster finalists illustrate their dreams of space

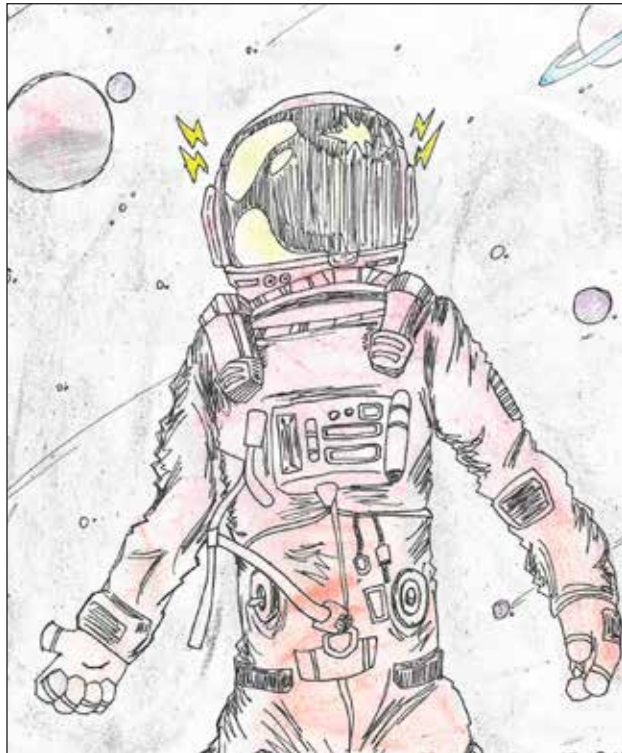

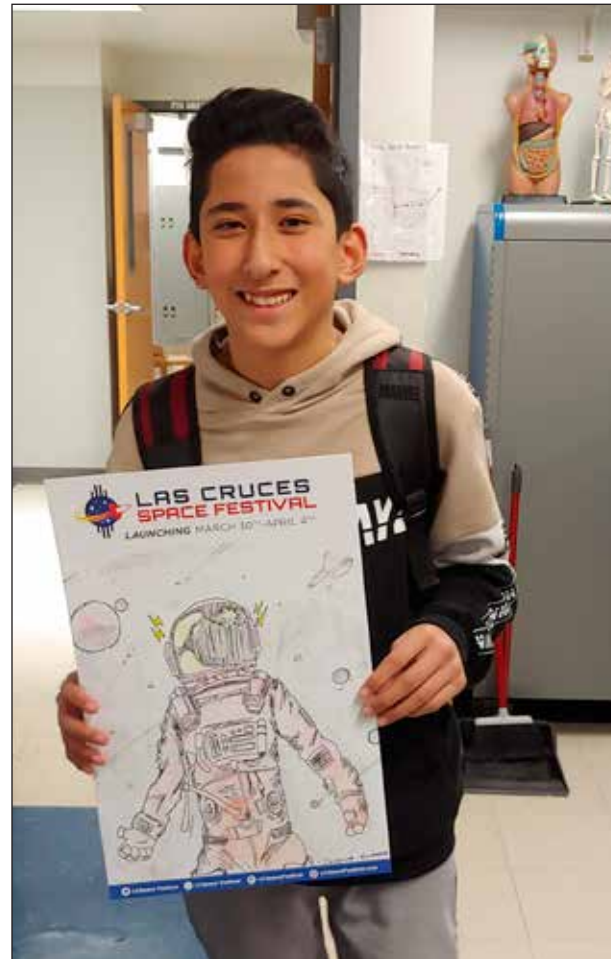
a Sid the Astro Gnome trophy along with a goody bag from festival sponsors at Spaceport America.

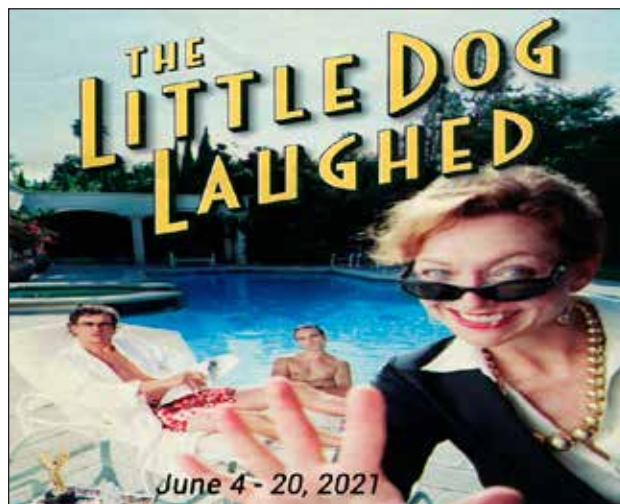
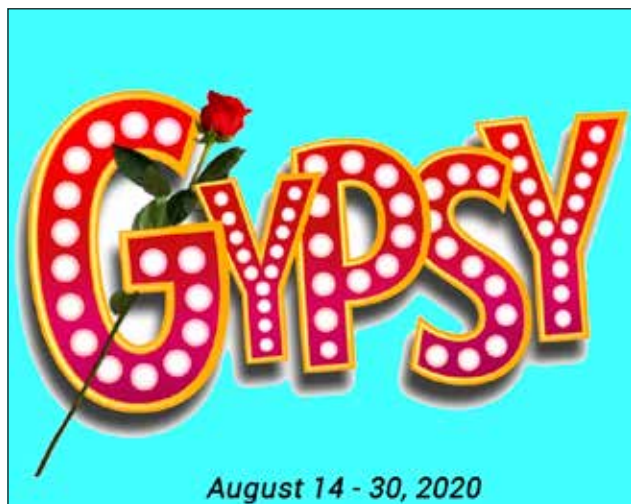

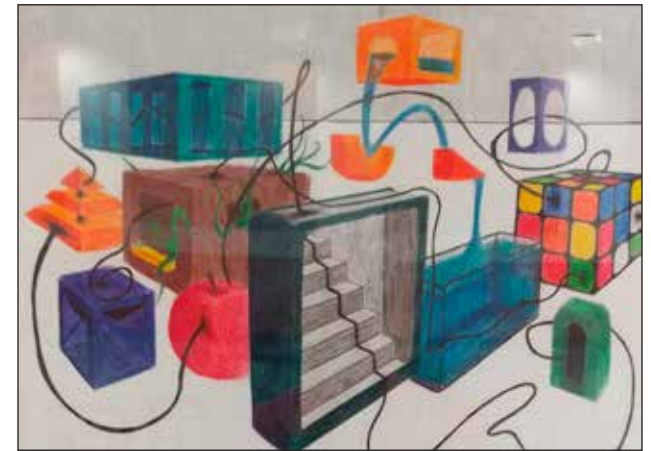

# 'The Sum of Us' aims for the heart

In 1994, before Russell Crowe was a box-office superstar, he played one of the lead characters in an Australian film costarring Jack Thompson.

"The Sum of Us" is a father-son story in which the father (Thompson, as Harry Mitchell) desperately wants his gay son (Crowe, as Jeff Mitchell) to find love.

Jeff is a rugby player with a big heart, but deep-seated insecurities about himself and his worthiness to be loved. Having lost his mother

as a child and having had his heart broken in his teens, he is reluctant to put himself out there. But his father – his biggest cheerleader – encourages him to try, try again.

At about the same time Jeff meets a guy he likes (John Polson, as Greg), Harry takes his own advice and enrolls in an on-line dating service, through which he meets

an attractive divorcee (Deborah Kennedy, as Joyce).

The Jeff/Greg courtship starts out swimmingly until Harry barges in on them in the bedroom one evening. Harry laughs it off, but Jeff is mortified, and Greg finds the whole relationship between Jeff and his father "too domestic," so he leaves.

Meanwhile, Joyce comes over to Harry's house on New Year's Eve – her first visit there after several successful dates – and while looking around, she discovers some racy male magazines purchased by well-

meaning Harry for his son.

Joyce loses it, and she accuses Harry of lying by omission by not telling her about Jeff sooner. She storms off. Harry walks outside to see the celebratory fireworks, and while he gazes upward, he suffers a massive stroke.

Jeff's role suddenly becomes that of caregiver, and Thompson's character – robbed of speech in the film – frequently breaks the fourth wall to speak directly to the viewer about the things he can't communicate as Harry.

Joyce learns

of Harry's stroke and comes to see him at his bedside, and at the door she meets Jeff for the first time, and he charms her. By the time she leaves, she confides in

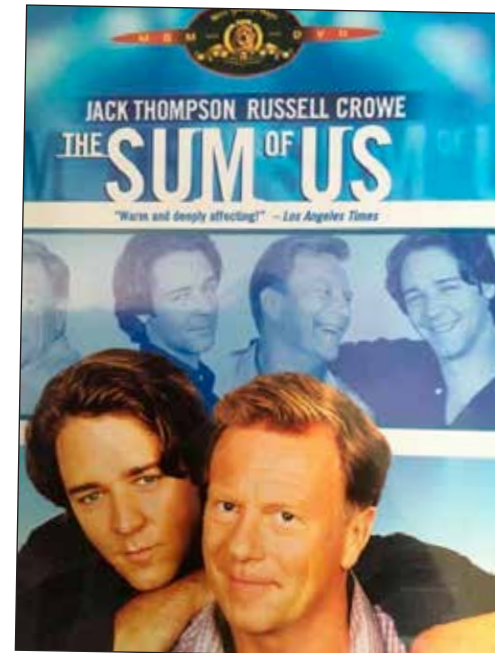
her daughter, who was waiting in the car, that she feels foolish for having been so judgmental.

Giving away the ending to this remarkable film would be a sin.

Suffice it to say that Greg reappears in a heartwarming, if somewhat uncertain, way.

The closing credits roll as Jeff rolls his father's wheelchair out of a park in Sydney, with Crowded House singing "You Better be Home Soon" as the Opera House and the harbor come into view.

See it. You'll thank yourself.



# Coronavirus: No evidence it's affecting family pets

## BULLETIN REPORT

“There is no evidence at this time that dogs or cats can become ill due to the novel Coronavirus,” said a prominent veterinarian and author.

Dr. Gary Richter, a veterinarian on Rover’s Dog People Panel and author of “The Ultimate Pet Health Guide,” said there have been cases of dogs “testing weak positive when they have been living with an infected person, but it is not suspected these animals can pass the virus to humans.”

Richter said there are no precautions regarding keeping pets clean relative to the virus.

“If the pet was exposed to an infected person, it is theoretically possible that virus particles on their fur could be picked

up by a human as a result of petting, although this is unlikely,” Richter said. “If a pet is suspected to have been exposed to an infected person, bathing the pet should resolve any concerns about them carrying virus on their fur.”

Taking a pet to a dog park “might expose people to other infected humans,” Richter said,

but “there is currently no evidence to suggest that transmission from dogs or cats to humans has occurred.”

# Animal agencies adopt steps to cope with COVID-19

While humans shelter in place and practice social distancing to protect from spreading or contracting the Coronavirus, COVID-19, the companion-animal community also is taking steps to protect people and pets during the pandemic.

The following information is compiled from



various press releases and sources.

The Animal Services Center of the Mesilla Val-

ley (ASCMV) has implemented changes to reduce the number of animals coming into the facility.

Healthy stray animals from the public will not be accepted for impoundment until further notice.

“Stray animals from the public is our second-highest impound reason. If we can keep those healthy stray animals out of the center, we will save lives here in the center,” said ASCMV Executive Director Clint Thacker. “The average number of animals leaving the center has dropped, causing our already high population to continue to grow. We topped 400 animals earlier this week.”

Thacker said the public can assist ASCMV staff in the following ways.

- Hold onto stray

animals. Post on the numerous lost and found Facebook pages for Las Cruces. Also post to or check Craigslist, and post fliers in any area where an animal was found.

- Rehome your animal rather than bringing it to the ASCMV. Look for friends or relatives who will care for it. Post it on Facebook and other sites. Keep in mind that it is against the law to abandon an animal.

- Fosters are needed! Fosters who can take one or more animals into their home pending permanent adoption are lifesavers. Fosters can choose a healthy animal or one that needs a little more TLC. Fostering saves lives.

Other temporary actions the ASCMV is taking to stabilize the population

are:

- Accepting only sick or injured owner-surrendered animals.

- Making only emergency health appointments.

- Reducing on-hand staff, allowing more to work remotely.

- Offering free adoptions.

- Asking animal control to bring only emergency cases to the center, such as cruelty cases, injured and sick animals

In response, the Las Cruces Police Department’s animal control division has announced it will maintain operations but will focus primarily on calls deemed high priority.

Calls falling under the high-priority category include:

Calls for assistance from LCPD officers.

Animal bites.

Vicious or dangerous dog complaints.

Animal cruelty complaints.

Animal care and maintenance complaints.

Stray animal calls.

Animals in traps.

Snake calls.

The following responses are being suspended until further notice:

Owner release of healthy animals unless they pose a threat to the owner or public.

Issuing of city-owned animal traps.

Permit inspections.

To file a report with Las Cruces Animal Control, call 575-526-0795.

According to LCPD spokesperson Dan Trujillo, the temporary changes are designed to both reduce the number of human contacts during the Coronavirus outbreak

and to help the ASCMV reduce its population.

A local rescue agency that frequently pulls animals from the ASCMV for foster and adoptions is Action Program for Animals (APA).

APA Executive Director Michele Munier has announced steps to protect staff, volunteers and potential adopters. Until further notice, she said, the APA Adoption Center at 800 W. Picacho Ave., is closed, as per state directive, with appointments available for potential adopters by calling 575-575-571-4654 or 575-644-0505.

Munier said APA is implementing a freeze on intakes until further notice, but the agency will continue to operate its pet-food bank Tuesdays and Saturdays from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m.

“APA will inform [the community] when normal operations resume,” she said. “APA prides itself on the care given to the pets who reside at our facility and with foster families before they find their forever homes. APA has high-standard cleaning practices that are followed each day for all our dog kennels, cat rooms, thrift store, communal rooms, lobbies, exam rooms, play yards, etc.”

Munier said APA’s Second Chance Thrift Store remains closed until further notice, and the organization is badly in need of donations to continue operations in the absence of revenue from that facility. To donate to APA, visit its Facebook page, where updated information also will be posted on a regular basis.

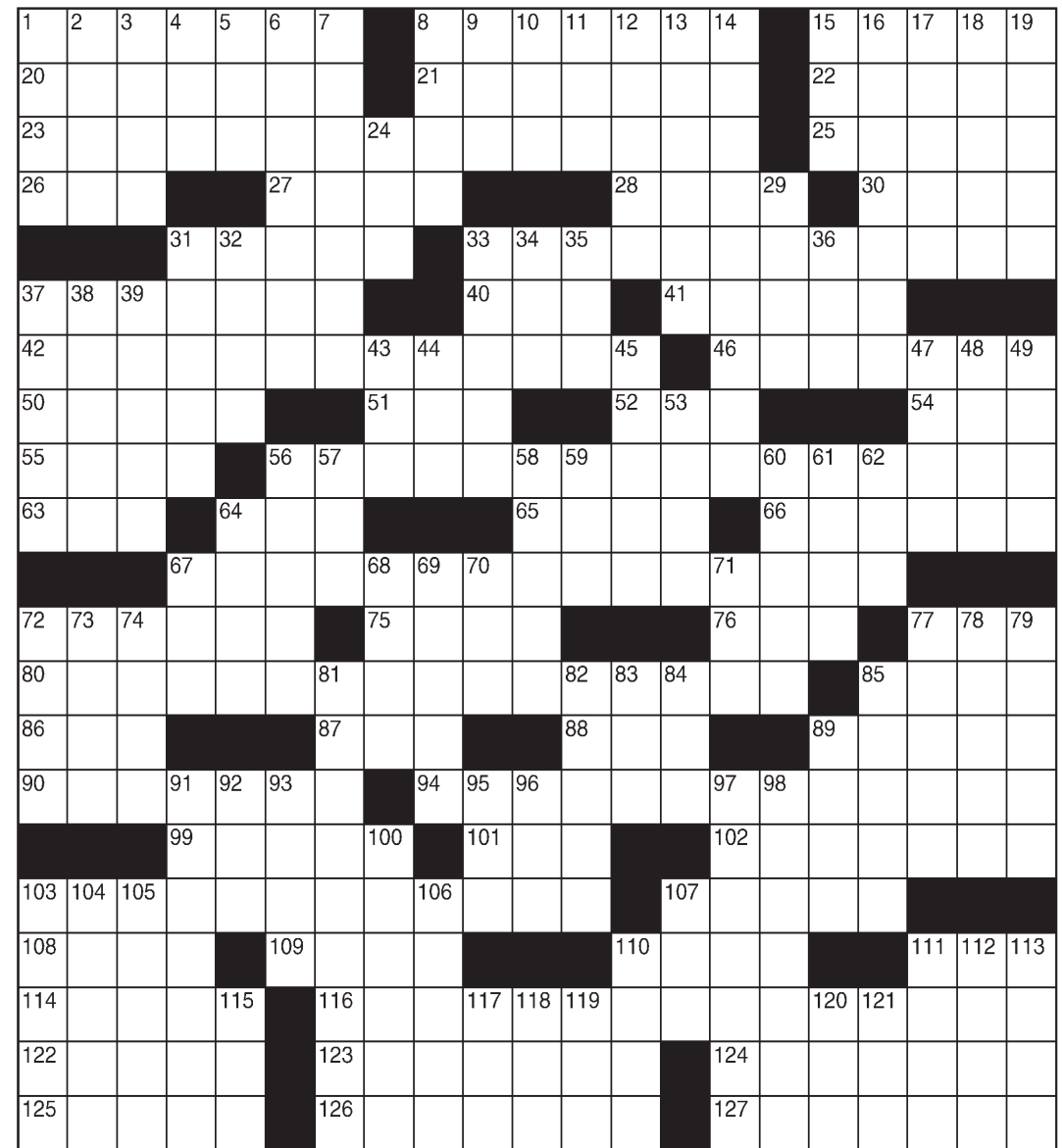

## Coping with Coronavirus: Stay healthy, reach out

- Use the media to educate, rather than obsessively checking the latest stories, which can create panic. Go to sites that speak directly to management of the Coronavirus and the latest news, such as the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and the World Health Organization (WHO). Limit your time on the media, i.e., check one or two times daily. Limit children from social media during this time to better manage their own anxiety.

- Manage isolation and quarantine by remaining connected to others through phone contact, Skype, Facetime. Human beings do not do well in complete isolation.

- Create a home environment that is safe and secure, especially for children, to combat the outside chaos.

- Utilize techniques to

bring down your anxiety, such as mindfulness. You can go on YouTube and listen to guided meditations, sounds of water, rain, etc.

- Use this time for self-care. Catch up on reading, watch a good movie, take a warm bath and rest as much as possible.

- Understand that although this is a scary time for everyone, it is also time limited. This will not last forever. Hang in there.

- And most importantly, become more connected to your own humanity – take care of others and yourself.

From **Jamie Michael, director of the Doña Ana County Health and Human Services Department:**

Taking steps to reduce your stress is critically important. If you are following advice to keep you and your family safe, such as social distancing, don't worry about the things you cannot control.

Keep your immune system as strong as possible by getting enough sleep, eating nutritious foods, exercising at home or doing other activities you can enjoy in your home.

Reach out to friends and family through text or phone calls to stay connected or call the NM Crisis Line or Warm Line to talk with someone if you are feeling anxious. Classical composers like Beethoven and Mozart overcame incredible obstacles in their lives. Beethoven, for example, was hearing impaired from

his mid-20s “and for the rest of his career he could not hear anything” as he composed some of the world’s greatest music.

Pyotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky suffered with serious mental health issues as he composed the “Nutcracker,” “Swan Lake” and “Sleeping Beauty” ballets. Mozart died a pauper. “Tell these stories to kids and try to impress on them the obstacles they had,” Klein said. “If you make it personal ... and then play the music of these composers, kids will recognize it.”

Lee Holden, a Qi Gong (“energy work”) instructor in California, is providing these excellent videos free during this potentially stressful time. # N.M.'s 'Fittest City' seeks stay-home options

In the days before “shelter in place” were the watchwords on everyone’s mind, a national survey was underway to find the fittest city in each state.

In New Mexico, Insurify said Las Cruces was selected for its “excellent track record of supporting health and fitness.”

Insurify analyzed communities for the availability and accessibility of outdoor recreation areas and for the proportion of community members working in jobs that promote health and fitness or that demand significant physical activity like park rangers, fitness club managers or dietitians.

Cities were also reviewed based on the highest proportion of residents living within a ten-minute walk to a park.

The recognition shines a pos-

itive light on the community, but that was then.

This is now.

The gyms are closed, but many Las Cruceans are hungry to stay fit while maintaining social distance.

Some are walking, jogging or running alone or in small groups. Others are watching yoga and fitness lessons online because the studios and spas they once frequented are shuttered.

Albuquerque-based Group HIIT (high-intensity interval training) is offering free 60-day subscriptions to its fitness website to help New Mexicans stay active during the pandemic.

Group HIIT co-owner Marlena Shirley said new users will have unlimited access to an online library of more than 300 workouts, including yoga and day-by-day programs designed for individuals, families

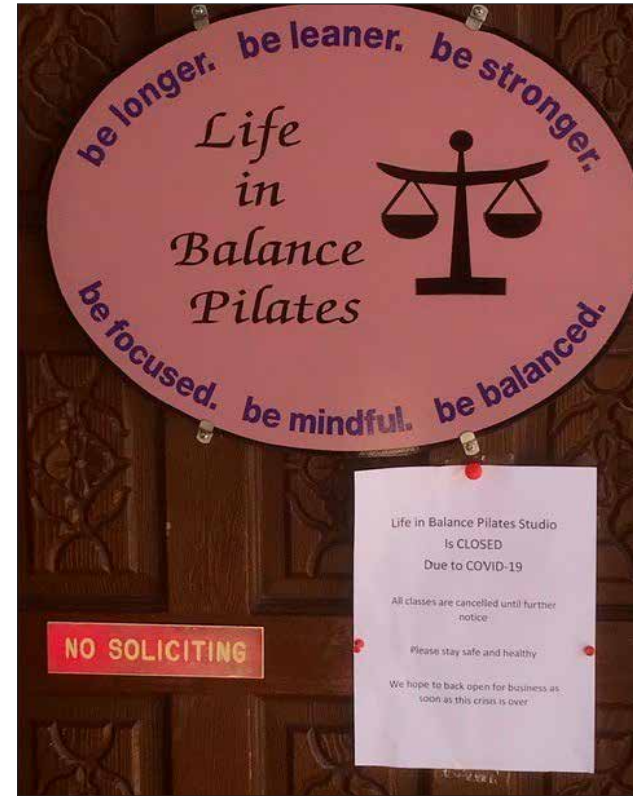
and children. The workouts require little to no equipment so families can get started immediately.

Shirley said at-home exercise, even during a period of government-advised social distancing, does not have to feel isolating.

“We encourage users to follow a program with friends or family members, even if they do not live together,” Shirley said. “Working out on the same day from their respective homes provides a feeling of connectedness and increases motivation to reach fitness goals.”

# FBI warns against COVID-19 cyber crime

The FBI says cyber-crime and the Coronavirus are hooking up, and the liaison is dangerous.

Frank A. Fisher, public affairs officer for the FBI's Albuquerque Division, said the bureau is reminding the American public to "continue exercising smart cyber hygiene in this uncertain

time."

He said cyber criminals are actively exploiting concerns surrounding the pandemic to perpetuate scams designed to steal money.

By remembering four tips, he said, people can protect themselves and help put a stop to the criminal activity:

Do not open attachments or click links

within emails from senders you don't recognize.

Always verify the information being shared originates from a legitimate source.

Do not provide your logins, financial data or other personal information in response to an email.

Visit websites by manually inputting domains to your browser.

Fisher said Dona Ana County residents who believe they are victims of an Internet scam or want to report suspicious activity can access the FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center at [www.ic3.gov](http://www.ic3.gov).

# Feldenkrais Method: Relearning how you think and move

You could say Feldenkrais is a relatively new movement about movement. Las Cruces practitioner Susan Conant describes the Feldenkrais Method as “rewiring your brain to learn to live with yourself differently.”

Ukrainian-Israeli engineer, physicist and judo master Moshé Feldenkrais (1904-84) began working on a new system of mind-body connection after he suffered a serious knee injury while playing soccer in the 1920s. He started teaching lessons in Awareness Through Movement (ATM) classes in the mid-1950s.

“Similar to Tai Chi or

gentle yoga, ATM classes use slow, mindful movements to achieve powerful effects in terms of strength, flexibility and holistic integration of body and mind,” according to the Feldenkrais Guild of North America nonprofit (<https://feldenkrais.com/>).

The Feldenkrais Method is unique, the guild said, because its lessons “tie directly into functional movements of daily life, such as walking efficiently, safely lifting objects and improving one’s posture in

sitting or standing.”

Conant is teaching Feldenkrais exclusively online right now because of the Coronavirus. There are also free lessons on YouTube and other online recordings on the method.

Through Feldenkrais, “You slow down and you really pay attention to (bodily) sensations,” Conant said. If a movement causes pain, “don’t do it,” she said.

“If I teach you anything, I’m going to teach you how to learn,” Conant said, including greater awareness of your bones, “the force of gravity traveling through your body, where your center line is, how you move around your central axis.”

Online and in-person classes are based on transcribed recordings of the thousands of lessons Feldenkrais taught from his home in Tel Aviv dur-



ing the last 30 years of his life, Conant said. With Ph.D.’s in physics and engineering and a black belt in judo, Feldenkrais “taught himself to walk again” after re-activating his knee injury in adulthood, Conant said.

He was married to a pediatrician who helped him understand how babies learn basic movement, she said, which became part of his teaching.

Feldenkrais served as a personal trainer to Israel’s first prime minister, David Ben Gurion, worked as a research assistant to nuclear chemist and Nobel Prize laureate Frédéric Joliot-Curie at the Radium Institute in Paris and wrote books that are still

available on ATM, judo and jiu-jitsu.

Feldenkrais “was an extraordinary human being. He was a genius,” Conant said.

Conant said one of her clients is a former New Mexico State University football player now in his 60s. Through weekly ATM classes, he was able to avoid having surgery, she said.

The hardest thing for clients to learn, she said, is “slowing down, paying attention, being serious, being really curious about a movement you’ve done your entire life.” That could be something as basic as lying on your back and paying attention to how you roll over, Conant said.

ATM also has benefits for children with special needs and people who have had strokes, she said.

“It’s rewiring your brain either to learn something you never learned or to learn things you’ve forgotten,” Conant said. “We forget we have a pelvis, a rib cage that can move in hundreds of different ways.”

“It’s not a fix,” Conant said about the Feldenkrais Method. “It’s a learning. It’s something you do for the rest of your life because your body is constantly changing. It’s

learning how to listen, especially for older people; learning the difference between your left and your right; being present in your body; how to calm down your central nervous system and let go of habitual tension. It not only changes your body, it changes your mind. It changes your emotional state.”

Conant said she began studying the Feldenkrais Method while taking a yoga class in Austin more than 20 years ago. She sought out an ATM practitioner because of a shoulder injury and found it “much more interesting” than yoga. Conant was already a licensed massage therapist but ATM “changed my process,” she said. “I can’t see myself ever not doing Feldenkrais.”

At 67, Conant said her balance is better than ever and “I am so much more agile than I probably was in my 20s.”

“I’m retired from my day job,” she said. “I do this because I love to do it.”

Hoarding huge supplies of high-demand items like toilet paper and hand sanitizer could leave others without. Plan to shop once a week and buy only what you need for that period.

- Donate supplies. Homeless shelters still need supplies, especially toilet paper and cleaning products. Consider donating those items to a shelter near you or call to see what other

items may be needed. Here is a list of New Mexico shelters, including those in Las Cruces: [www.shelterlistings.org/state/new\\_mexico.html](http://www.shelterlistings.org/state/new_mexico.html).

- Donate food. New Mexico food banks report they are having trouble keeping their shelves stocked due to increased demand for assistance and competing orders to distributors from other large buyers. Consider taking a box of non-perishable food to a food bank near you. # Coping with Coronavirus: Words of faith

From Fr. Gabriel Rochelle, pastor of St Anthony of the Desert Orthodox Mission, Las Cruces (<http://stanthonylc.org>):

Rituals are markers in time as old as humanity's emergence into consciousness. Rituals, music and art are the pieces that fit together to make up the jigsaw puzzle of an intelligible life. Rituals divide time into manageable units, like flags planted in the ground of our days, weeks, months and years. Rituals bind us back to

the source of our being.

In the topsy-turvy time we are experiencing, it will be important for you to maintain as much of your ritual as you can, because it will help you navigate the upside-down quality of your days and establish some sense of normalcy.

Our spiritual rituals are normally conducted in community, but that is not going to be possible for a while, so you have to compensate for the aloneness. Take refuge in solitude, which is not the same thing as loneliness. Know that others of your

community struggle along with you to keep a sense of community. Read texts that would be read, on the days when you would read them, as if you were in church or mosque or synagogue or any other community.

Sing your anthems in the shower or out the window, as people in Italy have been doing. We will get through this. Do not despair.

From Rabbi Larry Karol, Temple Beth-El (<https://tbelc.org/>):

A few weeks ago, I asked some of our Temple Beth-El Religious School students to comment on several sayings from an ancient collection of statements from the rabbis called Pirkei Avot, which literally means "Chapters of the Fathers/Founders."

One saying from a first-century sage known as "Hillel the Elder," said, "If I am not for myself, who will be for me? If I am only for myself, what am I? And if not now, when?"

The interpretations suggested by the students in early February did not take into account the current worldwide health challenge we now face.

What does Hillel's famous piece of wisdom mean in a time of a pandemic?

I believe that it means that we should advocate for ourselves and our own health and needs, but that we also need to take into account and attend to the needs of others around us. We should do what we can to sustain the well-being of our community with a sense of urgency.

A second saying from Hillel simply declared, "Do not separate yourself from the community."

I heard someone say recently that we are now "separating together." While we may not be gathering in public spaces, we still have ways to stay in touch with one another to offer our concern and caring. Technology enables us to reach across a physical distance, providing us with the possibility to see and hear each other, or to read one another's words that express connection. Religious congregations that have suspended in-person worship for the time being are generating and sharing communal prayer via livestream or pre-recorded video.

Whatever we do, we need to be certain that our actions exude kindness, generosity and compas-

sion. We will get through the COVID-19 pandemic, and we will look back and remember how we reached out to one another with creativity and persistence.

From Rabbi Bery Schmukler, Alevy Chabad Jewish Center de Las Cruces ([www.ChabadLC.org](http://www.ChabadLC.org)):

I suggest (and ask) that each of us make it our business each day to reach out to five people in the community just to say hi and see how they're doing. At times like this we need each other. Lifting up one another is the most uplifting thing we can do for ourselves. Remember to wash your hands, and in whose hands you are.

And remember: "TRACHT GUT VET ZEIN GUT - THINK GOOD, AND IT'LL BE GOOD."

# Unchecked emotions can hijack your game

While I have long been a proponent of “mental toughness” for competitive athletes, lately I have been placing more emphasis on winning behaviors associated with emotional intelligence and emotional resilience.

Performance coaching has previously placed priority on structured thinking, personal discipline and “correct” mindset.

In recent years, however, research is strongly pointing to the fact that emotions rule performance. Effectively managing your emotions may be golf’s new frontier.

Let’s say your prevailing emotions while playing competitive golf are anger and fear, though you may not realize it now. Pessimistic golfers undergo a flux of conflict-

ing feelings as they play, ranging from defeatism to frustration, both of which can have disastrous results. Research demonstrates that negative emotions can have the following

consequences: less ability to think clearly, less efficiency in decision-making, reduced coordination and higher cardiovascular stress.

Negative emotions tend to counter thoughts and efforts aimed at performing well. You have your central nervous system – your brain directing your body – getting the signals crossed with your autonomic nervous system, which controls organs, glands and hormones.

A typical scenario might be excessive worry about an outcome (an

approach shot to a green over water with the tournament on the line, perhaps), where we’re asking our muscle memory to produce a great shot, but the sympathetic nervous system shoots out adrenaline and constricts our flexibility. It’s like having one foot on the gas and the other foot on the brake!

Theory and research aside, there are several things you can do to elevate your ability to manage your emotions, ultimately resulting in your greater chance of success. One is inspiring and encouraging yourself to have more positive emotions, despite your tendency to get down and sour.

Do positive emotions just happen – are they random? Or can we choose the emotions which enhance our effort

rather than squelch it? You don’t have to be the victim of your past emotional breakdowns and disasters.

Data is telling us that learning to handle our emotions, and consequently our reactions, also can make a monumental difference in whether we are successful in life. Just a few of the amazing consequences of healthy and positive emotions are greater creativity, better problem-solving, sharper thinking and memory, healthier heart and immune system, improved performance and ultimately a longer life span.

The very first thing to do is eliminate negative and demeaning self-talk, while detaching yourself from blaming, whining and complaining on the

golf course. Most of the time when we complain about course conditions, weather, noise or wind – anything – it’s just a feeble attempt to wish away our own poor play.

In his book “Conscious Golf,” author Gay Hendricks talks about how we react when things don’t go the way we expect them to. The example he gives (page 143) is when a player hits his golf ball and the ball doesn’t go where he thought it should have gone (as usual).

“The unconscious golfer thinks, ‘It is unacceptable that the ball could be where it apparently is. The physical universe is wrong, and I must punish it.’ The conscious golfer looks at reality and concludes, ‘Regardless of my hopes,

dreams and expectations, the ball landed exactly where it should have landed.’”

Good breaks and bad breaks even out. Playing conscious golf – the best golf – means accepting responsibility for the outcome which you yourself created. If you are going to be undaunted by adversity – the true mark of the emotionally resilient player – you need to respond positively with self-nurturing thoughts, more intense focus and better play.

This is a tall order, I realize, especially when you must do it while avoiding trying too hard, which, of course, is almost always counter-productive in the game of golf.
