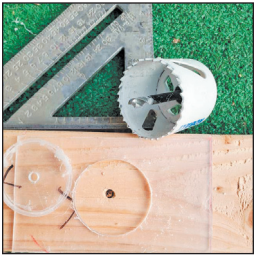
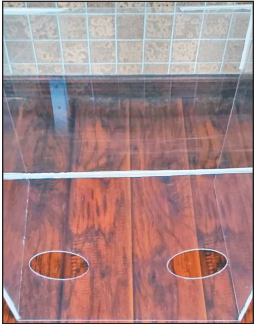

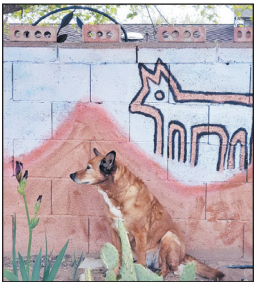

County seeks Planning and Zoning Commission applicants

Doña Ana County seeks applications from residents interested in serving on the Planning and Zoning Commission to fill four volunteer positions.

As members serve staggered two-year terms, four seats will expire on Apr. 30.

The seven-member Planning and Zoning Commission reviews land-use and development matters.

Matters that historically have come before the commission include variance requests to land use requirements; special use permits (SUP) designations; zone changes; subdivision reviews and approvals; appeals of staff decisions; reports to the Board of County Commissioners; and recommendations related to amendments or changes to the county's comprehensive plan and Unified Development Code.

Meetings are generally held from 9 a.m. to noon, on the second and fourth Thursdays of the month, at the Board of County Commissioners Chambers, 845 N. Motel Blvd. in Las Cruces.

The Board of County Commissioners will appoint the new members to the Planning and Zoning Commission, at their Apr. 28 meeting. Applicants are encouraged to attend the meeting to address any questions that may arise. The appointment will be effective on May 1.

Applications will be accepted through 5 p.m., Monday, April 6. Teenage hero honored for bravery

The Doña Ana County Board of Commissioners recognized Canaan Bower, 16, for his act of heroism on March 25, when he helped prevent a potential kidnapping of three children and further assaults on their mother and others, at Chucky's Convenience Store, 800 Thorpe Road.

Bower, a Mayfield High School wrestling champion said he heard yelling and then saw a man pulling children away from their mother and hitting others, as he finished pumping gas, across the street. He said he walked into the grocery store and pulled the suspect away from an office door, behind which the mother and three children tried to escape him. Bower pinned the suspect to the ground and held him until a Doña Ana Sheriff Deputy arrived and arrested him.

Canaan's act of bravery was so inspiring that many news outlets took notice and praised this example of valor, including the Las Cruces Sun-News, KVIA ABC-7, KRQE News, talkSPORT, USA Today, The Washington Post - even the Daily Mail.com in the United Kingdom and a number of wrestling publications.

The Commission voted unanimously to proclaim April 14, 2020 Canaan Bower Day of Valor. That behavior was typical for Bower, his father, Troy Bower said. When Canaan was 10, he saved up for a year to buy an iPod. However, by the time he had enough money, he had changed his mind and instead donated his savings to a charity that provided food and shelter for people in need. "Thank you for recognizing my son," Troy Bower said. "This means a lot to all of us."

NMSU students help to protect healthcare workers

“Our goal is to help those who are helping us,” said Joel Cannon, president of the New Mexico State University chapter of the Society of Physics Students (SPS).

SPS, which includes nearly 30 physics, engineering and other discipline majors, are making COVID-19 boxes and other personal protective equipment (PPE) that will be donated to hospitals in Las Cruces and elsewhere to protect healthcare workers during the coronavirus pandemic.

The students are also using 3D printers to make face shields for healthcare workers, and are making protective masks, Cannon said. The group has reached out to Memorial Medical Center and MountainView Regional Medical Center in Las Cruces and to hospitals across the state to gauge their interest and needs. They are asking for donations from the community through a Go Fund Me account to help pay for materials to build the boxes.

“The COVIDBox is an acrylic box that can be placed over a patient who has developed COVID-19 to allow medical care workers to safely manipulate patients (intubate, check vitals, take samples, etc...) through two arm openings,” Cannon said on the project’s Go Fund Me page. “This can help prevent medical care workers from contracting the virus. The box will be the first line of defense to keep the virus contained if the patient coughs, sneezes or otherwise releases the virus.”

Healthcare workers are “real-live superheroes and they deserve our support,” said Cannon, a Las Cruces native and Oñate High School graduate who will graduate from NMSU next month and wants to work in the defense industry or for the federal government.

Cannon said fellow SPS-NMSU member Juan Treto adapted the COVID Box being produced in Las Cruces from an open-source idea and is “the mastermind” behind the project. Treto is president of the Society for

Engineering and Physics National, which is partnering with SPS on the project.

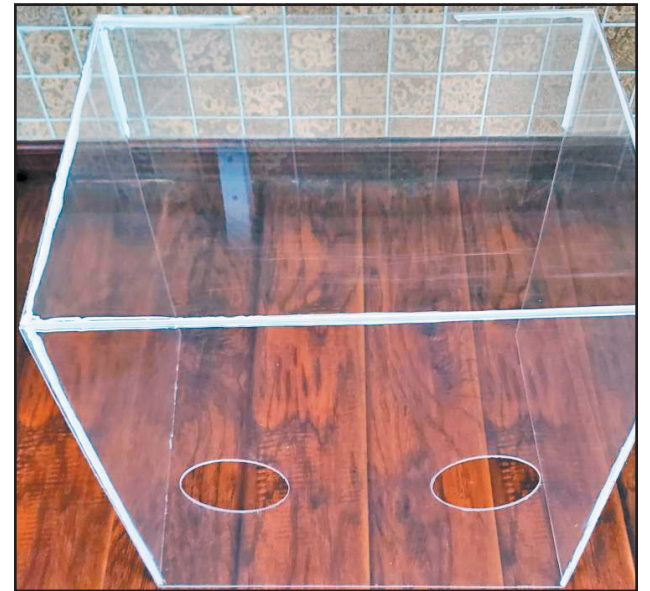
Another SPS member, Alejandro Solis, has been the main engineer, “producing the prototypes and running all the structural and chemical tests,” Cannon said.

Cannon said students completed a prototype of the box April 10 and are continuing to conduct tests to make sure it can stand up to hospital cleaning products like bleach, ammonia and isopropyl alcohol.

They are also doing structural-integrity tests, he said, “to make sure when we do donate these to the hospitals, they don’t have to worry about being affected by cleaning agents or about breaking them.”

So far, Cannon said, the test results have been

positive, and so has the response from the medi-

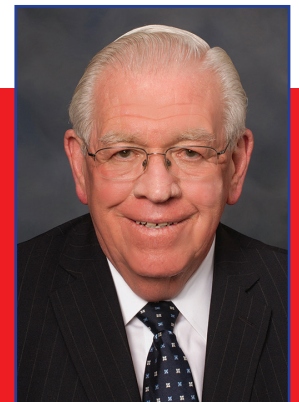

Energy association fights hunger amid falling oil prices

Even as the price of oil has dropped dramatically because of COVID-19, the organization that represents the oil and gas industry in New Mexico is contributing \$50,000 to organizations in Las Cruces and across the state to fight hunger and increase food security during the public health crisis.

“It’s the right thing to do,” New Mexico Oil and Gas Association (NMOGA) Executive Director Ryan Flynn said in a telephone interview.

“We’re not just here for the areas we operate; we’re here for the state. We’re not just part of the

community when it’s convenient or easy,” Flynn said. “It’s more important than ever to find ways to participate. It’s really what we’re about. It’s who we are. It’s what we do.”

“The prices of oil have collapsed over the last month,” he said. “Everything is driven by the COVID-19 pandemic.”

Three months ago, Flynn said, the price of a barrel of oil was in the high \$50s and low \$60s. In early March, it had dropped to the mid-\$40s, he said, “and things were not looking good. We’d love to be back in the mid-40s right now.” Oil is currently at \$27 a barrel, which Flynn said is an improvement over the

first week in April, when prices dipped into the teens.

“All roads lead back to the demand perspective,” he said. Because of the health crisis, “people aren’t driving, aren’t flying.”

The only “silver lining,” he said, is that the drop in demand has reduced the impact of the Saudi-Russia feud over oil prices.

Without the pandemic, that feud “would be having significant impact on global energy markets,” Flynn said. “The fact that the market is very well supplied, and demand has been dramatically reduced by the pandemic, really kind of tempered

the impact.”

Even if Russia and Saudi Arabia agreed on oil production levels, “that’s not going to move prices,” Flynn said. “Really, to get back into a healthy price point where the industry is able to survive in the long-term and consumers are not feeling the pinch, we just need to start traveling.”

The drop in oil prices could be especially serious for New Mexico, where 39 percent of the state’s general-fund revenue came from oil and gas production last fiscal year, Flynn said, and that doesn’t include related gross-receipts tax payments and royalties.

Sen. John Arthur Smith, D-Luna, Hidalgo, Sierra, Doña Ana, chair of the New Mexico Senate Finance Committee, said he recommended to Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham in late March that a spe-

cial legislative session be held in late June or in July to deal with the budget crisis initiated by the collapse of oil prices.

“It’s amazing to me how relatively swift the response (to COVID-19) has been, certainly here in New Mexico,” Flynn said. “That’s a good thing. The governor has done a really good job of getting on top of this and moving quickly.”

The oil and gas industry’s recovery from the crisis “will be slow,” Ryan said. “The return to normalcy will be much more gradual.”

The good news, he said, is that New Mexico will continue to benefit from its location.

“The Permian Basin is the most important place to produce oil in the U.S.,” he said. “It’s the epicenter of the American oil industry. We will emerge from this, prices will



rebound. Demand will rebound. We will recover.”

New Mexico ranks third in annual oil production and eighth in natural-gas production among all states, according to www.nmoga.org. The Permian Basin covers more than 86,000 square miles in southeast New Mexico and southwest Texas. NMOGA has more than 900 members.

Saudi Arabia-Russia oil feud

“It’s a price war is all it is,” Flynn said about the feud that began in March between Russia and Saudi Arabia.

The U.S. has become the world’s largest pro-

Classroom grants available to local teachers for 2020-21 school year

Bulletin Report

Full-time teachers in the El Paso and Las Cruces area are eligible for resource grants for the 2020-21 school year from the El Paso Community Foundation's (EPCF) The Classroom Fund.

Grants for \$1,000 or less will be available.

The Classroom Fund provides requested classroom materials directly to educators in the El Paso-Las Cruces area. Applications are due by June 1.



Grants are available to all full-time, pre-K-grade 12 educators, including teachers, librarians, guidance counselors, school nurses and coaches who are also teachers. Eligible

candidates must spend at least 75 percent of their time working directly with students.

Requests must be for materials that students will use or experience directly.

Grant recipients are required to follow up with a report on the use of materials through photographs, video or a written letter. Grant requests will be reviewed by EPCF's Classroom Fund Review Committee and approved based on merit and available funds. All grantees

will be notified the first week of July.

The Classroom Fund has awarded more than \$500,000 in resource grants, \$400,000 in impact grants and \$200,000 through its ArtStream program since it was created in 2011 as a special project of EPCF. A total of \$50,000 was awarded to 55 teachers in 2019.

Slowly wrapping up

The Valley Drive construction project that began July 2, 2018, was scheduled to be substantially complete March 30, 2020, but final work continued into early April. The New Mexico Department of Transportation (NMDOT) project – Valley Drive is N.M. Highway 188 – will cost \$24 million, about \$1 million above the original cost estimate. ducer of oil, followed by Saudi Arabia and Russia. Collectively, the three countries “produce the overwhelming lion's share” of oil globally, he said. “American energy production is eating into the market share that the Russians and the Saudis have enjoyed,” Flynn said, and the feud originated because Russia felt that it rather than OPEC (which includes Saudi Arabia) had been holding the line on oil production to keep supplies and prices stable. “The Russians approached the Saudis and said they were not willing to do that anymore,” he said.

Saudi Arabia surprised the Russians when it “totally went in the opposite

direction” by increasing production, Flynn said, which it can do more cheaply than both the U.S. and Russia. A price war “between two major global commodity producers” resulted.

NMOGA donations

NMOGA's Brighter Future Fund (BFF) awarded \$50,000 this month to eight New Mexico nonprofits to help fight hunger in New Mexico, including Casa de Peregrinos emergency food program (CdP) in Las Cruces.

“It's exciting to be included in this funding by the NMOGA,” said Lorenzo Alba, executive director of CdP, which received a \$5,000 award from NMOGA to reduce hunger in Doña Ana County. “The timing is impeccable, as we are fac-

ing difficult times in this COVID-19 crisis,” Alba said. “We are certainly grateful and humbled by this grant. “We are looking forward to a fruitful partnership with NMOGA.”

NMOGA prioritized food banks for funding because of COVID-19, an association news release said. The organizations receiving money serve 15 counties that represent

about 70 percent of the state's population.

The awards are the second installment of a \$200,000 NMOGA commitment this year to education, economic opportunity and food security statewide, NMOGA said.

The least fun Jenga game ever

Do you feel like a big Jenga tower?

If you're not familiar, the Jenga game is a tower made of rectangular, wooden blocks neatly stacked in alternating patterns.

It's pretty solid in the beginning.

Players take turns pulling out blocks and, eventually, the stack de-stabilizes and falls.

Before the inevitable fall, when the stack is rickety, sometimes a player strategically removes a block that can improve the stack's balance.

I was talking with Bulletin editor Jess Williams and he said Coronavirus is exposing the Jenga nature of so many systems, not just our economy, but our healthcare system, our environment and even our personal households.

Here's a look at just some of those Jenga blocks.

The Jenga block of SHOPPING: I've never been much into shopping as an art form or a way of life as it is for many. When your shopping options are suddenly reduced, however, you quickly realize your established patterns. Mine are influenced by having a 16-year-old daughter, but I discovered I do a lot more shopping than I thought. Oddly, in the Time of Coronavirus, the places I have shopped the most are Toucan Market, Chavira's Produce and Auto Zone. Doing minor vehicle repairs and maintenance has

been oddly satisfying for me.

The Jenga block of FAMILY: I've been blessed with having additional time with my daughter. Unfortunately, the option of visiting my elderly and ailing parents in Oklahoma (a trip I had been making every 2-3 months), was suddenly pulled away, as their assisted living prohibited visitors. While I know this is protecting them, I worry about THEIR Jenga towers, not to mention the Jenga towers of their caregivers, whose stress levels must be through the roof. I grieve, too, because every day is one less day I'll have with my parents. For many, with the closures of schools and workplaces, all those people under one roof trying to share one or two computers has been a source of joy, but also a source of tension.

The Jenga block of HOME: For many, our homes are our retreat and our sanctuary, our respite from the crazy world. However, when you're forced to stay at home 24/7, as many are, home can become a kind of prison.

The Jenga block of FINANCE: The Coronavirus has hit us all in the pocketbook. Many have lost their jobs and could be in danger of losing a place to live. Many businesses are teetering. Some of us are doing OK right now, but will be really hurting a few months from now, when the long-term effects kick in. The fragile, house-of-cards nature of so many of our personal, our

state, our federal and our global economies is being blatantly exposed.

The Jenga block of INDEPENDENCE: When the simple joys of heading downtown to peruse the book store, sitting down at the coffee shop or going fishing are stripped, we lose those mental and emotional releases. Even the tiny peace of having the house to yourself for just a few minutes of silence is gone for many.

The Jenga block of SOCIAL LIFE: I didn't realize how much of my job involved attending various events until all the events got canceled. I also didn't realize how much I enjoyed seeing all the old friends, new friends and acquaintances at those events. It's a drag when simply going out with friends for an ice cream or an adult beverage is no longer possible.

The Jenga block of PHYSICAL EXERCISE: I enjoy hiking and taking walks with the dog, which I can still do to some degree. My most rigorous, and most social, exercise, though, is playing basketball. I've been playing pickup basketball a couple of times a week most of my adult life. Now I can't do that. My basketball buddies and I talked briefly of playing games using zone defense, six feet apart, but quickly realized that wouldn't work. Now, with the parks closed, I can't even go shoot baskets by myself at the outdoor courts. One guy I know got pulled over by the police

while he was out for a run.

The Jenga block of HEALTH: The specter of Coronavirus hangs over us like a dark cloud, but many face health issues totally unrelated to COVID-19. Ordinarily, we would make an appointment with the doctor and get checked. Now we're hesitant to do that and, in many cases, are asked not to do that. Who knows the eventual ramifications of those delays? And I hope you don't sprain your ankle stepping onto your back porch.

The Jenga block of SPIRITUALITY: Christ, Buddha and Muhammad all spent significant time alone, praying and contemplating. There is an important solitary element to spirituality, and it can deepen the faith. But spirituality's social aspect is the yin to spiritual isolation's yang, and both are needed to fill the whole. Churches have gotten creative, using technology for worship services. It can be kind of fun, but not the same. For some, closer family time has deepened spiritual connections, but many are missing the power of congregation. I deeply miss the weekly sacrament of communion.

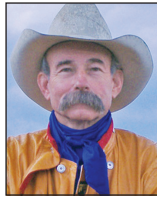
We all have these and other Jenga blocks being pulled from our towers. I pray you're able to stay in balance and maybe even add a supporting block or two. If this goes on too much longer, our towers are all going to collapse to the floor.

Brushes With Fame

Over the years, I have gotten to know or meet or hang out with what I call 'famous people.' From movie stars, politicians, world champions, athletes, writers and moguls. Often it was just circumstance. Other times, it was an intentional connection. Like being invited to be on ABC's first "Dolly Parton Show." What I remember is how small she was in person and how she could play guitar with such long fingernails. She was also very kind to Little Richard, who couldn't get his song right after 25 takes!

Or when I sent the manuscript of my first novel, "Hey Cowboy, Wanna Get Lucky?" to five authors I most admired: Tom Robbins, Thomas McGuane, Hunter S. Thompson, Dan Jenkins and John Nichols. I didn't realize the disposition of unsolicited manuscripts was the trash can! But Tom Robbins ("Even Cowgirls Get the Blues") wrote me back, quoted me to myself and gave me his agent!

I took a shot in the dark and gave the Sunbeam

Clipper salesman a cassette of songs I'd written, because he claimed he knew Lynn Anderson. Months later, Red Steagall called me and said he liked one of my songs. He didn't

know about Lynn Anderson, but he said the Sunbeam Clipper salesman gave it to him. Red has become one of my best friends. He introduced me to Reba McEntire when she was driving a Chevy van with a pick-up band. They did a show together in Ft. Worth Stockyard. I held her horse. Jack, Red's bus driver, got to hold Red's horse. Jack claimed to be the cowboy in Gordon Snidow's Coors painting. Gordon denied it.

Ed Bruce (wrote "Mamas, Don't Let Your Babies Grow Up to be Cowboys"), took pity on me. He got me on the Ralph Emery Show. After the show, we went to dinner. They asked if there's anything else that could make it better. I said it would be nice if somebody famous would

record one of my songs. His wife said, "Every poet thinks he's a songwriter, every songwriter thinks he's a singer, every singer thinks he's an actor. Why can't you just be happy with what you're good at?"

I walked into a restaurant in Denver, and saw Denny Gentry, the man who literally made team roping the most popular rodeo sport in the world! He drew out his plan for the USTRC on an envelope. "Whattya think?" he asked. I said that I didn't think any two team ropers could ever agree on something that good and walked off. He sold it for multiple millions 20 years later.

So when Patrick Gottsch (inventor of the RFDtv empire) called me and described his vision for an all-agriculture/rural television network, I listened. He told me what he needed from me. I asked if this was a payin' job. He said, "No, but it will be good for your career!" I said, "Sign me up." RFDtv has changed

agricultural marketing and become the 'party line' for ag neighbors across the country, and I'm a part of it!

Walt Garrison, Dallas Cowboy professional football player and rodeo champion, does my poetry. According to his daughter, Slim Pickens reads my column, Ty Murray did one of my poems at Freckles Brown's funeral, former Sen. Kent Conrad, D-N.D., read one into the Congressional Record, former Speaker of the House Tom Daschle, D-S.D., asked me to do public-service spots after the blizzard of '97.

I've changed John Malone's tire on his ranch in Raton, NM. He's the biggest landholder in the U.S., I made Johnny Carson laugh, roped with Fred Whitfield (he laughed!), I get my blood-sugar evaluations from Wilfred Brimley, I've traded horses with Larry Mahan, been recorded by Ian Tyson, been quoted by for,er U.S. Supreme Court Justice Sandra Day O'Connor, as well as Paul

Harvey and Charles Krauthamer (in his last book) and shared a champagne glass with Casey Tibbs sittin' by a campfire at two o'clock in the morning, just me and him.

Thos of you who have watched the movie "Forrest Gump" remember him as a just a regular guy who seemed to pop up in photos with presidents, performers and kings at hangings, earthquakes and county fairs. I really liked that movie, I can relate to ol' Forrest.

Don't let old law halt urgent preparations

This is a time for bending the rules.

The First Amendment clearly protects churches from interference by the government, but at a time when thousands of people are dying every day from a virus that we know with absolute certainty is spread by close contact with other people, those constitutional protections must give way to life-saving restrictions.

Allowing packed church services now would endanger not only those attending the services, but potentially everybody else they come within six feet of for the next 14 days. Two funerals in the small

town of Albany, Georgia, led to a spread of the virus throughout the community, resulting in some 500 confirmed cases and at least 29 deaths.

Services were held by churches throughout town during Holy Week, but without the packed pews. Traditional messages were delivered in a new way.

The government is not trying to silence religious speech. It is trying to slow a rampaging pandemic and preserve as many lives as possible. That must be the top priority.

In Las Cruces, attempts by the city government to prepare for the pandemic

are being hampered by a provision in our state Constitution that was intended to deter profiteering when the railroad tracks were first being laid across New Mexico.

Our state had a pretty shady reputation at the time, and the Anti-Donation Clause (ADC) may have been needed to curb corruption more than 100 years ago. City coffers throughout New Mexico were emptied by town officials trying to lure the railroads to come through their communities.

The clause prohibits the state or any government entity within it from making "any donation to or in aid of any person, association or public or private

corporation."

That sounds simple. But, as Alan Hall wrote in a 2014 analysis of the clause, it isn't. For example, money for college scholarships is seen as a violation of the clause, but not money for the Lottery Scholarship Fund.

Interpretations of the clause have changed over the years. The rules were tightened a few years ago to prohibit things like dances at the Munson Senior Center that had been held there for years.

The clause is now standing in the way of city officials as they work to prepare for the spread of the coronavirus in Las Cruces,

The City Council ap-

proved a \$1 million aid package recently that will assist the school district and local non-profits, and pump money into its own planning and equipment. But there were other things the city wanted to do but decided against because of the ADC.

One idea was to purchase meals from local restaurants to help feed healthcare workers and first responders, addressing two problems at once. They also discussed gift cards from local businesses for healthcare workers or first responders and cash vouchers to help the unemployed.

All those ideas were set aside over concerns about the ADC, but councilors

made it clear that this will not be their final attempt at addressing the many issues caused by the pandemic.

As we go to press, there are 50 confirmed cases in Doña Ana County. Based on the state averages, that probably means three or four people have been hospitalized.

The healthcare crisis has not yet reached us with full force. Let's hope it never does. But the financial crisis has. And city officials need to prepare for both.

At some point down the line, that may mean bending the rules. Get through the crisis and worry about the technicalities later.

Las Cruces Realtors weathering COVID-19

Nationally, real-estate business activity is slowing, but many Realtors remain hopeful for a post-pandemic market rebound, according to a new survey from the National Association of Realtors.

Locally, some of the national trends are tracking, and some are not.

The Bulletin reached out to Realtors Jeffrey Stevens and Terriane Morrison Everhart for their thoughts regarding key findings from the national poll and how the local market is either reflective or different. Stevens is an associate

broker, and Everhart is a qualified broker/property manager, both with Berkshire Hathaway HomeServices/N.M. Properties.

Poll finding: Due to the outbreak, 90 percent of members said buyer interest declined, and 80 percent of members cited a decline in the number of homes on the market.

Stevens: We've seen some buyers decide this is not the right time to purchase a home, but we have also seen other buyers renew their interest in finding a home to take advantage of lower interest rates. There are sellers out there who are putting their houses on the market. Single-family

housing inventory in Dona Ana County is low, down 6 percent from this time last year.

Poll finding: Home prices look to hold steady after rising before the pandemic. Almost three in four members — 72 percent — said sellers have not reduced prices to attract buyers. Conversely, more than six in 10 members — 63 percent — said buyers are expecting a decline in home prices as buyers sense less competition in the current environment.

Stevens: Overall, Dona Ana County has seen a slow but steady rise in home prices. The current average sale price is \$223,000, up about 4

percent from this time last year. It is still important to price your home within market value. Buyers may find some wiggle room on price, but I doubt you will see a dramatic decline in the average sale price.

Poll finding: Technology plays a vital role as the real estate industry adapts to the new reality of managing deals virtually with social distancing directives in place.

Stevens: Most of us have already implemented technology into our everyday business practices. With the threat of COVID-19, we rely on e-signatures and video conferencing with our clients. Showing homes

via 3-D virtual tours is catching on. 3-D tours allow buyers to tour before they decide on a possible viewing and purchase.

Poll finding: Residential tenants are facing rent-payment issues, but many delayed payment requests are being accommodated. Nearly half of property managers — 46 percent — reported being able to accommodate tenants who cannot pay.

Everhart: In my opinion, Doña Ana County residents have always been community-minded, extremely giving and socially responsible. Now is no different. We are seeing many owners

accommodating their tenants in this uncertain time. There have been temporary government mandates set in place to protect owners and tenants.

The national poll found that the majority of the nation's Realtors® believe buyers and sellers will return to the market as delayed transactions following the end of the health crisis. Nearly six out of 10 members — 59 percent — said buyers are delaying home purchases for a couple of months, while a similar share of members — 57 percent — said sellers are delaying home sales for a couple of months.

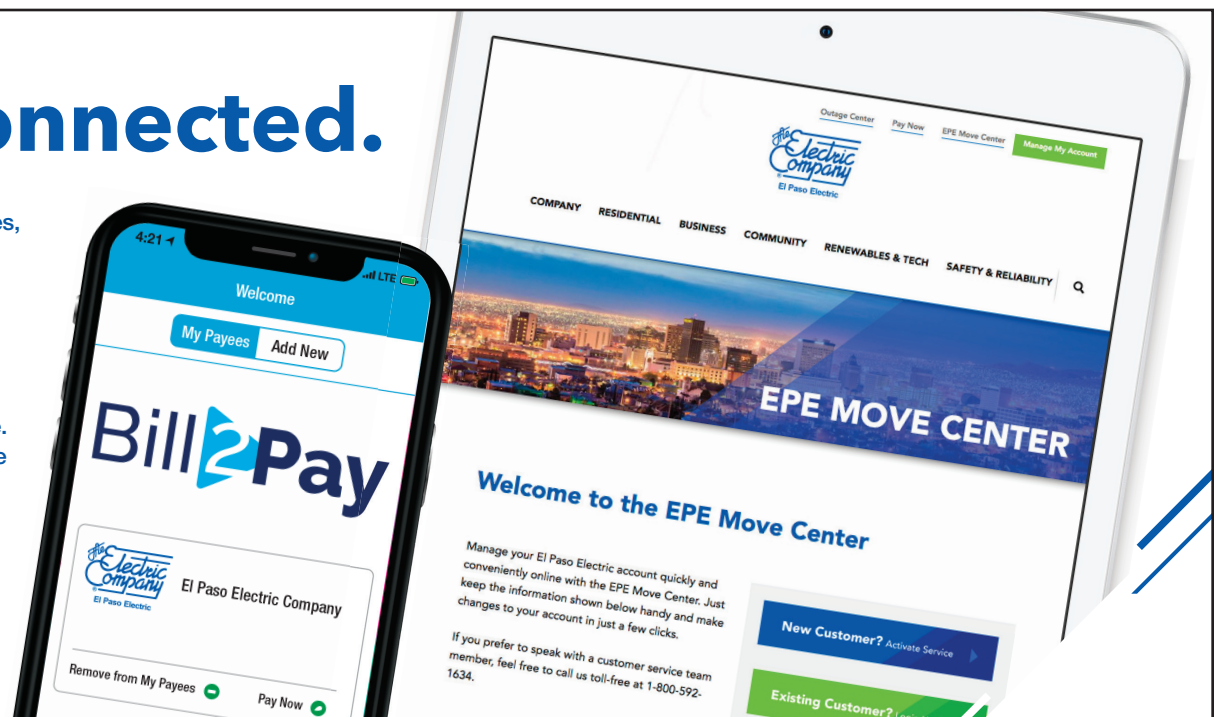

Spaceport America cancels college rocket competition

Since 2017, Spaceport America has hosted the Spaceport America Cup, an event drawing college students from around the world to compete in their rocket-building skills and sending their rockets zooming over the New Mexico desert.

The 2020 event was set to engage more than 1,700 students from 17 countries on a weeklong rocket design and launch competition.

The key word is “was.”

Since now is the time the students would be ramping up, working head-to-head on the details of rocket engines and electronics,

Spaceport America and the Experimental Sounding Rocket Association (ESRA) made the decision to cancel the Fourth Annual Spaceport America Cup that was scheduled for June 16 – 20, at Spaceport America.

“Having groups of students working together to build their team’s rocket is contrary to the COVID-19 protocols released by the CDC, and the State of New Mexico’s proactive leadership on this issue,” said Dan Hicks, CEO of Spaceport America in a press release. “As much as we looked forward to having 154 universities participate, it is not the appropriate course of action at this time.”

The 2019 Spaceport

America Cup had 124 teams, 1,500 students, and representatives from 14 countries. The University of Washington took first place in the Spaceport America Cup and the University of New Mexico won the inaugural Spaceport America Chile Cup. Information on the 2021 Spaceport America Cup and possible actions with the 2020 Cup will be posted at www.spaceportamerica-cup.com.

“It is important that the students respect and abide by their state and country guidelines for the health and safety of all,” Hicks said.

ESRA has operated the Intercollegiate Rocket Engineering Competi-

tion (IREC) since 2006. In 2017, ESRA partnered with Spaceport America to expand the IREC into the Spaceport America Cup. Each team designs, builds, tests and launches rockets with a payload size of 8.8 pounds and target altitudes of either 10,000 or 30,000 feet.

Rockets are typically 4 to 8 inches in diameter and 8 to 20 feet long. Multistage rockets and all chemical propulsion types (solid, liquid and hybrid) are allowed.

“This is the only design/build competition for students interested in rocketry,” one of the founders, Matt Ellengold, said previously. “We give these students the opportu-

nity for hands-on rocketry experience. It’s incredibly rewarding.”

The IREC has been an annual occurrence since 2006. The competition

achieved international status in 2011 — when schools from Canada and Brazil joined — and has continued to grow rapidly ever since.

emergency relief funds through Together Las Cruces.

The foundation has received more than 400 applications for the grant. Applications are reviewed by a volunteer committee before funding decisions are made and recipients are notified.

Local providers see funds flowing in

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services has released more than \$15 million in emer-

gency grants to 16 community health centers on the front lines of New Mexico's response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Much of that money will be coming to Las

Cruces and Doña Ana County.

La Clinica de Familia is set to receive \$1.15 million, while St. Luke's Health Care Clinic will receive slightly more

than \$500,000. Ben Archer Health Clinic in Hatch will receive \$1.75 million.

According to a congressional press release, the funding is designated for emergency preparedness

in order to respond to COVID-19 while continuing to support essential primary care services to underserved populations. The funding announced was included

in the \$2 trillion CARES Act passed by Congress on March 29 to bolster the U.S. coronavirus response, supported by the full New Mexico delegation.

Las Cruces native Chaparro announces for commission, District 4

Las Cruces native Irma Susana 'Susie' Chaparro, has announced her candi-

dacy for the District 4 seat on the Doña Ana County Board of Commissioners.

Chaparro is a certified court interpreter and owner of a local interpret-

ing and trial-consulting firm. She serves as board president of La Casa Inc., a nonprofit agency that operates New Mexico's largest domestic violence shelter. She also served as vice-chairperson of the Democratic Party of Doña Ana County.

A former Magistrate

Recycling fits with curbside pickup and 'to-go' meals

Las Cruces has been stepping up to support its eateries in their times of need. Since sitting areas are closed, and to-go or home delivery are the only options, some restaurants are looking at new ways to stay green while serving their customers.

Russell Hernandez, co-owner of Salud! de Mesilla at 1800 Avenida de Mesilla, said he has tried to adjust as much as possible. The normally well-lit dining room is dark,

but he's answering customer calls as they come in, ready to take to-go orders, and he also is handling orders popping up on the business website.

While Salud's hours have changed — Wednesday through Saturday, noon to 7 p.m. and Sunday, noon to 5 p.m., Hernandez said Salud's business values remain unchanged, which include providing sustainable business tactics, such as serving orders in paper/cardboard containers made with sustainable forestry initiatives.

Even though his containers won't be recycled — the containers have food waste that contaminates them — it's a way for customers to be reminded that Styrofoam and plastic bags don't need to be the only way to go for to-go to be handled. In fact, Hernandez said he carries each order out in a brown bag paper (which can be recycled) and has gone completely electronic with his purchases. Customers get a text or an email with their receipt.

"Every bit helps," Hernandez said. "Some of our

regular customers will have their insulated bags in their trunk and we bring their order to them and place it in their bags."

He said the only issue he's had with sustainability has been with condiments.

"We'll have changes with that in the future, but I wanted to use what we have in stock first now," he said. "We're committed to see our customers here in the future, but we know we can stay as green as possible in the meantime."

La Casa board member survived domestic abuse

For nearly five years of his childhood, Marco Olvera used toilet paper rolls as toy soldiers and watched television lying on the floor so he could see under a closed door.

From the ages of 8 and 4, Olvera and his younger brother were kept almost continuously in a small room with the door closed in the family's Deming home. The boys were fed and had a toilet, but the windows in their room were sealed shut, they could only take showers once a week and they weren't allowed to attend school or celebrate birthdays or Christmas.

The long-term abuse came at the hands of their mother's companion, who owned the house and was the family's breadwinner. He regularly told both boys – the only males in what would become a family of seven children – that they were “a waste of space,” and he was physically abusive to both.

“He was the puppeteer,” said Olvera, now 26. “There wasn't anything we could do.”

After five years of isolation and abuse, Olvera, his brother, their mother and five sisters fled one night in 2007, escaping through a window as their abuser slept on a couch near the door. Their vehicle broke down on Interstate 10 east of Deming, but with the help of a sheriff's deputy and a passing motorist, the entire family found its way to La Casa, Inc.'s domestic-violence program in Las Cruces.

“La Casa is what really helped put my family back together,” said Olvera, who is today a successful Las Cruces entrepreneur and a member of the La Casa board of directors. Olvera is writing a book about his personal experience with domestic abuse, with proceeds going to La Casa, which he said “did an amazing job” for his family.

“I'm in a good place, where I can give back,”



Olvera said. “I met Marco at the 2018 (domestic violence) vigil through a mutual source,” said La Casa Executive Director Henry Brutus. “He is so selfless and talented. I asked him to join the board of directors, because the voice of a survivor was missing. He agreed and has been not only a voice for survivors but also a voice of reason. I truly believe Marco's journey has only just begun.”

After the escape and during a year living in La Casa-sponsored housing, Olvera started school as an eighth grader. He later graduated from Las Cruces High School and from Doña Ana Community

College with business and media certifications. One of the most important contacts Olvera made at LCHS was his close friend and business partner, Isaac Palafox. Together, they own a videography business in Las Cruces called Palamora (www.palamora.com and on Facebook).

“I found my way,” Olvera said. A native of Mexico, he became a U.S. citizen at age 21.

During the years of abuse, Olvera would picture himself five years in the future and fantasize about going to McDonald's and owning a car. “I didn't think I'd live to see 25,” he said.

“We didn't have much in the room,” he said. “We'd use our imaginations. Olvera became a storyteller, often relating entire episodes of “Spongebob Squarepants” to his younger brother.

Olvera and his family, which then included five children, had come to the United States in the summer of 2001 to escape another abusive situation in Mexico. His mother was a U.S. citizen, but she had been orphaned as a child and had no family or friends in the U.S. She met the man who would become her companion in El Paso and, with her children, moved into his house in Deming.

Olvera's family received threatening phone calls from him after leaving and learned in 2015 that he had died several years earlier as a result of his addiction to alcohol.

Today, Olvera and his entire family are closer than ever, and Olvera remains especially close to his brother. Two of their sisters live in Phoenix, but everyone else is in Las Cruces, and they get together regularly. Everyone talks openly about their experiences during the long period of abuse, but there is no blame or judgement, Olvera said. His mother “feels a lot of guilt,” he said, but added, “we were all victims.”

Olvera's self-published book, “In the Land of Opportunity,” will be available in May on Amazon.

cal community. Some hospitals are already using protective boxes and have found them “really effective.”

He said students are building the boxes at their respective homes in Las Cruces as they maintain social distance from one other.

Cannon encouraged hospitals, doctors and nurses to get in touch

with him about their PPE needs.

To make the boxes, students are buying sheets of acrylic from local home improvement stores at a cost of \$150 each. With the \$1,000 they have collected in donations so far, they will be able to purchase eight sheets of acrylic, which Cannon said will make 24 boxes.

“I estimate we can produce those 24 boxes in the next couple of weeks, depending on how much manpower we get,” he

said. If they get enough donations, they can upgrade to polycarbonate to make additional boxes, he said. And if they can collect \$5,000 or more in donations, an online company will pre-cut the sheets.

“Our challenge lies in the cost of the acrylic, and we have exhausted our funds to purchase the materials required for further production,” Cannon said on the Go Fund Me page.

He said donations to

the COVIDBox project are welcome in any amount. It likely will cost about \$50 to produce a single box, Cannon said, but that could change as more donations are received. He said all project spending will be fully documented.



'Art With Heart' draws together creativity, social distancing

A new Las Cruces project called Art With Heart is getting participants outdoors and giving them a way to be creative while staying safe during the COVID-19 pandemic, and it's producing unique, beautiful and permanent art for everyone to enjoy.

The project started March 18, as Las Cruces Public Schools elementary art teacher Matthew Reiter and his wife, Las Cruces artist Megan McQueen, were walking

down the railroad tracks crossing Hoagland Road near their home east of

Mayfield High School.

There is a regular smattering of tagging around that area, but that day they noticed a swastika and a crossed-out Star of David, McQueen said.

"We were very upset," Reiter said. "We didn't want it to simply be painted over. We wanted to counter its negative message. My wife and I wrote a letter to the distant neighbor we'd never met whose fence it was on and left it on her house. She responded with the most lovely words of encouragement on Saturday."

Here is the text message from the property owner,

Wanda Saip, to Reiter and McQueen: "...It's very kind of you to offer to paint over the graffiti that is on my back wall. It's so sad to see people doing these sort of things, but feel free to do what you like to get your message out there. If you need some help, please let me know. Thanks for caring."

"That day, we used leftover paints from our garage and made the first murals," Reiter said. "Since then, friends have joined us, and we've created murals nearly every day. We want to line the railroad with hundreds of positive messages at this troubling time."

That evening, Saip posted an appreciative message about the incident to the Facebook group Las Cruces Community Watch, McQueen said. Within a day, the post had nearly 800 likes and 44 shares.

"THIS. This is what we should all be doing," was the message from Sheila Simms Telles. "Turn negative into positive."

"Love it need more individuals with talent to step up and share the love not the hate," said Art With Heart Facebook group member John Reese.

"Our neighbors are aglow with this momentum of artistry," McQueen said. "We've already painted about 18 pieces on the walls that line the railroad tracks crossing Hoagland between the bike path and McClure. It seems something beautiful can safely rise out of

this moment of global anxiety and tragedy," she said. The Facebook group 'Art With Heart' in Cruces now includes 255 members.

Art With Heart participants are painting each day, but doing so very cautiously, McQueen said. "It is of utmost importance ... that we do not endanger anyone by doing this project," she said. "Please, take great precautions in bringing materials, in interacting with others, etc. While it is our understanding that being outside without coming within 10 feet of anyone else remains beneficial for our health, we must each be individually responsible for responding to the governor's orders, updates from the Center for Disease Control and information from the World

Health Organization.”

McQueen said anyone is welcome to a “canvas,” or “donated” section of cinderblock wall to paint. “People have worked with the household they are socially distancing with, or many have worked alone or many feet from friends,” she said.

Here is how people can help and participate:

Paint on the approved walls

- “Message us and we will notify you of an approved area to paint,” McQueen said. “We have dozens of approved ‘canvases.’”
- If you decide to paint, you will get directions to a numbered area. “Please practice social distancing while working on your area,” McQueen said. “Your household may interact as you see fit, but do not approach other participants.”
- Plan to leave the area in equal or better condition than it began in. Clean up after yourself.
- Make sure whatever

you choose to paint is positive and family friendly.

- Paint only during daylight hours.

Donate paint

- Message the project if you have paint to donate.
- “We prefer you do not

go to stores and buy paints or supplies,” McQueen said, “because that would increase social interaction. Rather, if you have old paints or brushes, think of this as a way of spring cleaning.”

- “Practicing safe social distancing, we will coordinate receiving your

donation,” she said. “You can message us your address and leave the paint outside your home for us to pick up. We can message a time when we’ll be available while painting and you can drop it by on the ditch.”

Grow the project

- Volunteer a wall on your property to be painted.
- Send a message and McQueen and Reiter will coordinate volunteers to paint your location when there are enough available.
- Invite others to join the group.
- Share on your own social media platforms: #ArtWithHeartinCruces, #DontHateCREATE and #JOYisContagious
- Create your own similar projects. “Make something beautiful or do something loving in this time of fear,” McQueen said. “Joy and love are also contagious. Spread that while being responsible to not possibly share disease.”

Roy Covey and his wife are among those property owners who requested that their wall be painted, McQueen said.

“I’d landscaped my back wall by the ditch, and I used to pick up garbage in the area,” Cover said. “I’d kind of given up on it.” Now Covey is picking up trash and tending to the area nearly daily. He shared a photoshoot of his dog with the group’s desert landscape mural. “I’m looking forward to up and coming art,” Cover said. “My wall art has special meaning to me.”

One could definitely say that I am a cinephile, or if you prefer something less pretentious, movie maniac, film fanatic or any alliterative appellation you choose. I love them. And it's very hard during these viral times when the theaters are shut down. (I especially miss the Mesilla Valley Film Society at the Fountain Theater.) But thank goodness there are still streaming services and, believe me, I have plenty to choose from.

Giving it a quick count the other day I have more than 1,100 movies in various queues and watch lists on Netflix (DVD

and streaming), Amazon Prime, The Criterion Channel, Hulu and my own DVR. And don't get me started on Disney+. That's insane, I know. But, like I said, I love movies.

And this time of self-isolation is the perfect time to whittle those lists down a bit. Let me see – if I watch three movies a day, it will only take me a year, but I can watch four movies a day, so that cuts it down a little – maybe three months.

I guess I've always loved movies but I really can't remember the first one I saw. I can remember certain ones that had enough of an impact to make a lasting impression – at least little pieces or im-

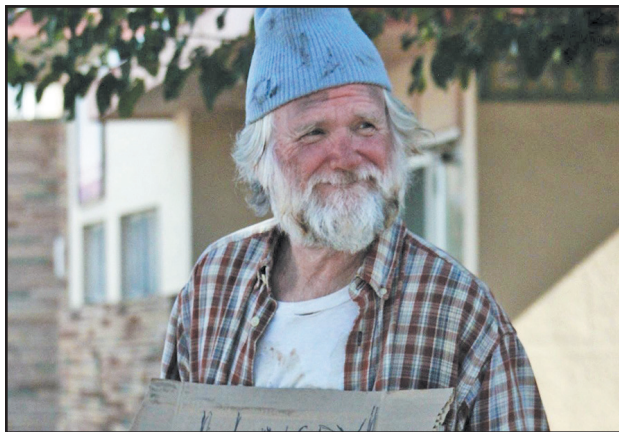

ages that burned into my memory.

I remember seeing "Lonely Are the Brave" with Kirk Douglas trying to escape the law on his beautiful horse. It wasn't until much later that I discovered the story was based on a novel by Edward Abbey, with a screenplay by Dalton Trumbo. I watched on my grandparents' black-and-

white television. It was released in 1962, when I was nine, but I'm not certain which year I saw it.

Another vivid memory, which my parents insist didn't happen, was seeing "Gone With the Wind" at the drive-in in Clovis. I remember that crane shot of the hundreds of Confederate wounded as Scarlett wandered among them. I vividly recall tell-

ing the kids I played with all about that scene the next day.

I saw "The Alamo" probably in a theater, also in Clovis, sometime after it was released in 1960. We likely saw it in the theater, since we were from Texas. I saw "Lawrence of Arabia," and I vividly remember Peter O'Toole wandering through the column of Turkish refugees with his bloody dagger. It remains one of my favorite movies, and I had no knowledge of the director, David Lean, who has directed several films I really admire.

But the film that left the most significant impression on me is "Chinatown." I was on a little road trip with a friend, and we went to San Patricio near Ruidoso to see a girl I was madly in love with. We made the excuse that we really wanted to see the art at the Hurd ranch. We ended up going to Lubbock for dinner and we saw the film afterward.

The rich, powerful and corrupt forces that Jack Nicholson as Jake Gittes struggles against to solve a murder made a real impact. It is still my favorite movie. However, I would be kidding myself if I ignored the circumstances under which I saw it.

My interest and love of films increased as I became an aspiring actor. Theatre and movies were my loves. I had always paid attention to the Oscars, but when I became a member of the Screen Actors Guild, they became an obsession.

With the DVD screeners and now downloads of nominated performances, many of which carry over to the Academy Award nominations, I had an opportunity to see, on video, all the actors who would be nominated. I feel fortunate to have that opportunity, and February is a time when I cram many viewings of different mov-

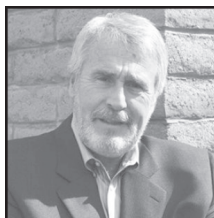

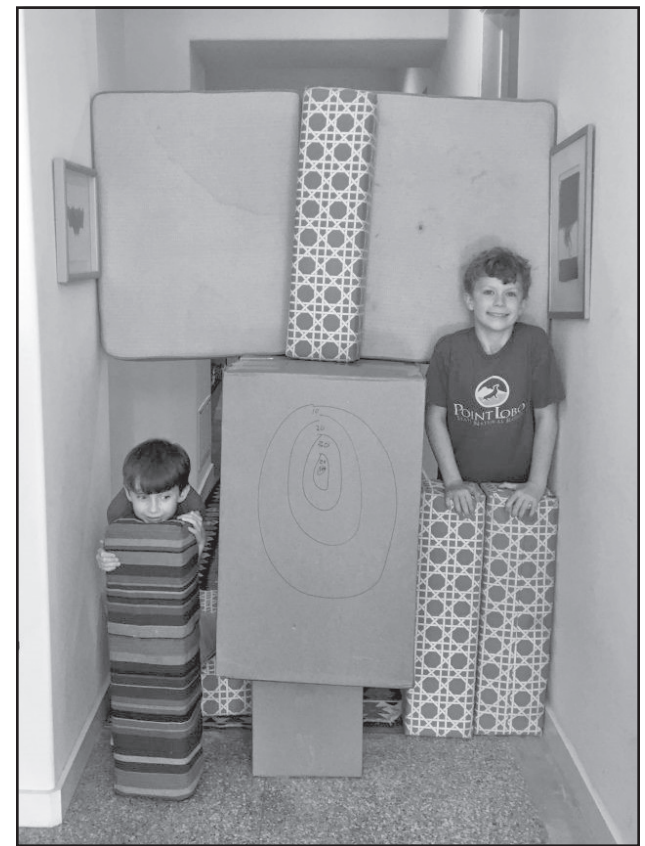

It turns out that pandemics provide perspective

The literal upending of our collective lives in response to COVID-19 has given us a new-found appreciation for basic things to which we used to not give even a second thought, like toilet paper, shaking hands and going to school or work.

Now, we find ourselves in one of two places — grateful to still have those things or fearful because we don't.

Fear in the face of this crisis is clearly the prevailing emotion. The economic impact of coronavirus right now is affecting far more people than the virus itself, all in an effort to save lives. But the truth is, lives and livelihoods are being devastated anyway. What makes it worse is that we really can't do much to turn things around until

someone's got a handle on controlling the virus.

So, in this moment of collective pause, we have a choice to make. Do we fear that over which we have no control right now, or do we appreciate that which we do? The choice can impact our resilience as individuals and as a community, as well as how we'll emerge from it.

Gratitude is widely recognized in psychology as key to not just good emotional and physical health, but also to handling adversity and improving relationships. Harvard Medical School wrote an article in the *Harvard Mental Health Letter*, titled, "In Praise of Gratitude."

The article stated: "Gratitude is a way for people to appreciate what

they have instead of always reaching for something new in the hopes it will make them happier or thinking they can't feel satisfied until every physical and material need is met. Gratitude helps people refocus on what they have instead of what they lack. And, although it may feel contrived at first, this mental state grows stronger with use and practice."

Their recommendations include things like sending thank-you notes, thinking about and writing down things you're thankful for, prayer and mindfulness meditation.

For me, there's a forced simplicity of our lives at the moment that is making space for gratitude. Every morning I wake up without a fever or cough, I'm grateful. When I talk to my kids, I'm grateful. I have time to appreciate new buds on my rose

bushes about to bloom and a recently cleaned closet that's been a disaster for years.

I'm also grateful for this community I get to call home. I'm grateful for the strength of our leaders and their willingness to confront the really complex challenges we face. I'm grateful that they don't hesitate a moment to mobilize as many resources as they can muster to help our neighbors who are really struggling right now.

I'm grateful for the fact that, according to Barnacom, Las Cruces (and El Paso as a region) is once again recognized as the most generous city in America. Regardless of income, fully 92 percent of us give to charities and nonprofits, according to the research. It shows our strength and commitment, as a community, to finding ways we can take care

of one another all of the time, as well as throughout this pandemic.

In fact, the Community Foundation of Southern New Mexico has taken the lead in meeting emergency financial needs at this time through two efforts:

- Together Las Cruces, a new fund to support Doña Ana county residents who have been laid off, furloughed, or have experienced a significant loss of income as a result of the state's executive order.
- The Nonprofit Emergency Fund helps support the very organizations whose work is so critical, at the same time their own resources are in jeopardy. If you can help, please visit their website at cfsnm.org.

I'm grateful for the collaboration and relationships all over this

community that drive the change taking place here in a host of areas, including education, workforce development and building resilience in our children and families. I'm grateful to know and work with so many of you on these amazing efforts.

So perhaps this column is my thank you note to you, my community. Thank you for weathering this storm with courage and compassion. Thank you for all that you are doing now, and what we'll still have to do when this is over.

Thank you for the privilege of working alongside you as we recover from COVID-19 together.

Stimulus package may preserve small businesses

The COVID-19 pandemic represents a huge labor market shock. Regional lockdowns have forced the layoffs and furloughs of millions of workers, disrupting long-term relationships between employers and workers de-

veloped in some cases over years.

Restoring these labor-market relationships post-COVID-19 is critical if a prolonged recession is to be avoided. This is why I am impressed with the design of the stimulus package.

It includes provisions aimed at maintaining small business as going concerns, important among which is a small-business loan program. This program encourages keeping employees onboard via loan forgiveness.

In a normal recession, the economy is out of

whack and there is a need to reallocate resources from inefficient, declining businesses to more innovative sectors. This sort of reallocation is an ongoing process in a capitalist market economy. During a recession, the reallocation is much more rapid.

This is bad news for those workers and fami-

lies adversely affected by the contraction but ultimately in the best interests of society. Recognizing the inherent unfairness of some being harmed for the benefit of the whole, we mitigate the cost to individuals of market dynamics using government program such as unemployment insurance.

The current recession, to say the least, is a different beast. It is not the outcome of the typical gyrations of a market system that at times leads to higher than normal unemployment. Rather, it is a random event with no relation to economic

circumstances. Efficient company are equally affected by the COVID-19 lockdown as are the inefficient. Well run innovative companies must lay off workers as do less well-run companies.

The unique circumstances of the current disaster require different actions than a typical recession. This is reflected in the stimulus package. The need is to maintain businesses as going concerns. Things were going well, and we want to get back to that when the epidemic recedes.

Economists talk about something called match capital. It is the value created by matching the right employee with the

right job. This is no trivial thing. A whole industry exists to help employers find qualified employees with firms such as Indeed and Linkin, among others. At NMSU, it is common to spend \$10,000 recruiting new assistant professors.

Without action, large numbers of businesses will shut down permanently, displacing many workers who otherwise would have continued as productive employees — destroying the match capital in the process.

The stimulus package provides \$249 billion in small business loans. Businesses can borrow 2.5 times their monthly payroll that can be used to make payroll, cover rent and mortgage interest, and pay utilities. The loan is forgivable if employees

are retained. The effect is to keep in place large number of workers that otherwise would have been displaced by COVID-19. Exactly what economists are recommending.

A problem with the new small business loan program is that it is expected to be rapidly exhausted. There is talk of another stimulus package that would extend additional lending.

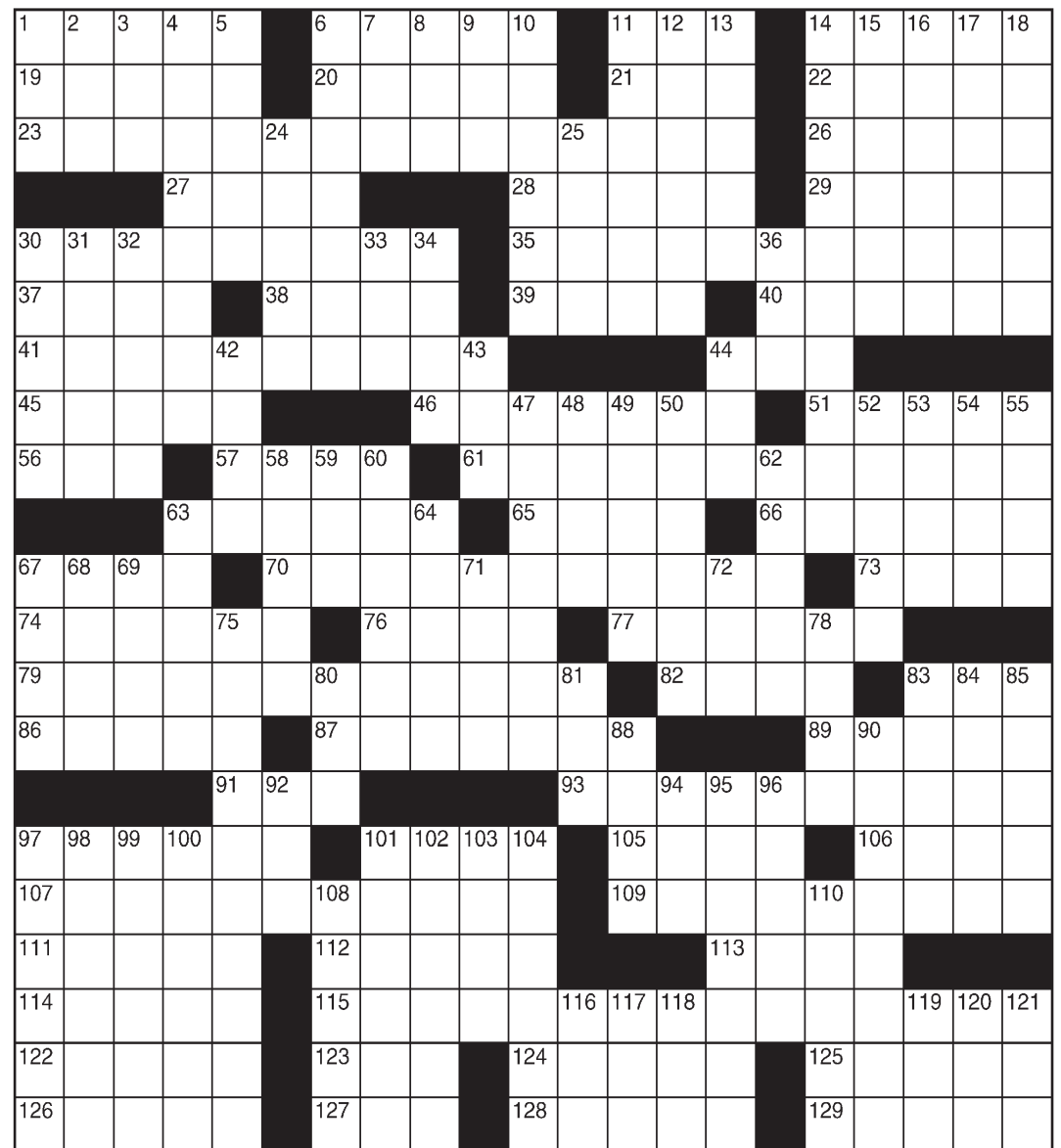

Books, other distractions help with isolation

When sheltering in place begins to feel like house arrest, books provide a great escape. However, catching up on your reading for long periods of time can lead to back and neck pain. I consulted a chiropractor and searched online for the best remedies. These tips are working for me.



RORIE MEASURE
Reading Solution

Sit straight up in the chair with tailbone snug against the chair's back while keeping feet flat on the floor or propped so legs maintain a right angle. Be sure the edge of the chair isn't cutting off circulation to your legs. Next, support

your elbows with pillows to bring the book or screen up to the level of your eyes. This will keep your back straight. Take breaks.

For reading in bed, use a pillow under your knees so your legs are slightly bent. To correctly align your spine into a gentle S shape,

use several pillows behind your back adding a thin pillow to support your lower back without pushing it out too far. You may need another pillow behind your head to keep your neck straight. Use another pillow on your legs to sup-

port your arms. Keep eyes level with the top of your book so you don't have to look down.

Alternately, if you prefer to be a bit more supine, get comfortable on your back with one or two pillows behind your head and draw your feet up so your legs can serve as a prop for the book. To avoid bending your head too far forward, bring the book closer to your face instead of putting lots of pillows behind your head.

Another alternative is audiobooks. The American Library Association is giving free access to all its on-line content. At lovelibraries.org a bibliophile's treasure trove of information includes The ALA book review magazine Booklist, with reviews of eBooks and audiobooks to check out electronically from the library. For even more reading suggestions, try their blog, Booklist Reader and its supplement

BookLinks. I found some great articles in the January edition for family reads that address the topics of overcoming difficult situations, collaboration and resilience, embracing many kinds of diversity.

The new normal is a scary proposition for golf

Coronavirus has changed everything! At least for now, anyway. When we are finally permitted to play golf by the rulers in Santa Fe, we may be looking at “new normal.”

No touching the flagstick on the golf course? My group started that as soon the new rules of golf permitted putting with the flagstick in, and now the flag-out folks need to adapt. Flagsticks may be removed altogether, with hole location sheets serving as guides for players.

No using the ball wash-

ers; bunker rakes are all gone. Cups are raised up over the surface edge a couple of inches, lending a new meaning to “get it close.” Some courses have donut-sized sections of a pool noodle inserted into the hole thereby eliminating the need to reach far into the hole with sweaty, dirty hands.

Golf course operators now recognize the requirement of sanitizing all touch areas of their golf carts, and limiting one cart per person. No handshake

before and after the golf round is OK, but I can't see playing golf wearing a face mask. No going into the pro-shop to pay in cash or credit card — you pay for your round online in advance.

Gosh, I wonder what golf courses are going to do with all the unsold merchandise in the shops. And I wonder how the PGA Merchandise Show in Orlando will survive without buyers writing big orders for golf clothing and accessories.

The professional golf tours should resume play in June. The Masters has been rescheduled for Nov.

12-15. The U.S. Open is rescheduled for Sept. 17-20, and the U.S. Women's Open has been rescheduled from June to Dec. 10-13. The PGA Championship is now scheduled Aug. 6-9.

The R&A announced that The British Open has been cancelled; the next Open will be in 2021. The Ryder Cup is still scheduled for Sept. 22-27.

And are the pros supposed to play without spectators lining the fairways, filling up the stadium-type stands and crowding into the sponsor tents?

Of course, that begs the question about the other

pro and college sports that depend on filling stadiums and arenas with fans.

Thoughts of the new normal are scary, and depressing. What's even more depressing is the prospect of the many golf courses across the country that will be closing permanently due to this protracted national crisis.

On April 3 a formal letter was sent to Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham, basically urging the lifting of the ban on playing golf in New Mexico, and that the bodies responsible for overseeing golf in our state would be able to supervise operating

under social and health requirements. The letter was signed by Sun Country Section of the PGA of America, Sun Country Amateur Golf Association (USGA), Sun Country Junior Golf Foundation, and Rio Grande Chapter of the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America.

I personally hope the new normal is just temporary.

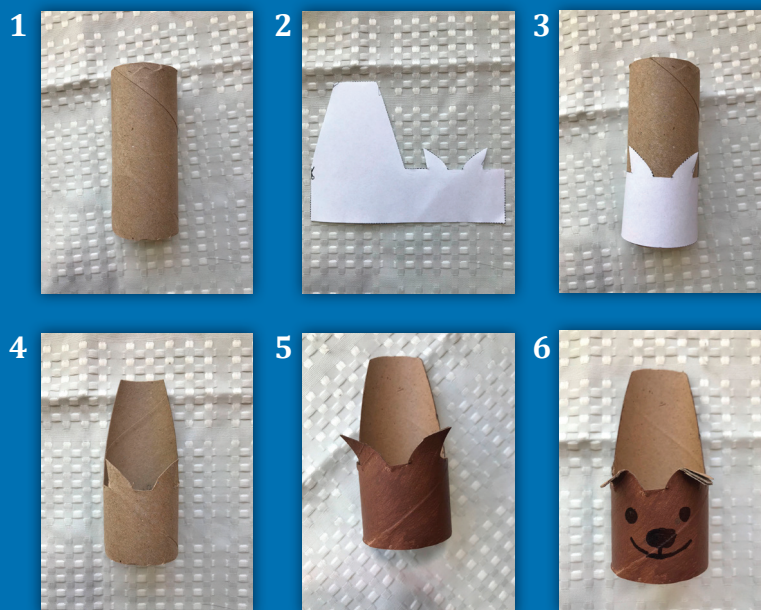
