County recognizes as first responders 9-1-1 telecommunicators and call takers

The Doña Ana County Board of Commissioners recognized Mesilla Valley Regional Dispatch Authority, MVRDA, 9-1-1 emergency telecommunicators and call takers as first responders.

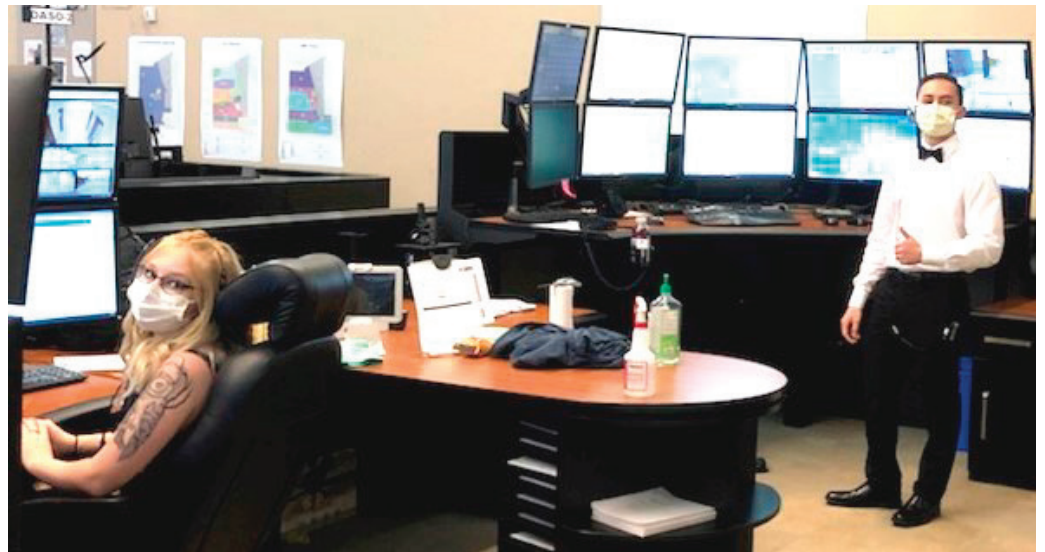
"They are the first, first responders," Dist. 4 Commissioner Isabella Solis said. "Without them, our first responders would not know about an emergency or where help is needed.

In 2019, MVRDA 9-1-1 telecommunicators and call takers provided medical guidance to about 25,000 callers, dispatched more than 200,000 law enforcement calls and nearly 36,000 fire calls, throughout the Mesilla Valley.

Trained in law enforcement, fire and emergency medical dispatch, they are qualified to offer potentially lifesaving instructions to callers on the telephone, until first responders arrive. The information and instructions they provide callers and first responders are critical to keep residents and field units safe.

MVRDA 9-1-1 telecommunicators have been recognized for their role in saving the lives of callers while also looking out for public safety field responders. The United States Congress is considering the 9-1-1 Supporting Accurate Views of Emergency Services Act, SAVES, which would reclassify 9-1-1 telecommunicators from "Office and Administrative Support Occupations" to "Protective Service Occupations" in the Office of Management and Budget Standard Occupational Classification, SOC, catalog.

"They do caring, technical, stressful work and dutifully send out our most precious resources, where they are needed most," Solis said. "We certainly consider them first responders already."

New Mexico launches NMConnect smartphone app

The New Mexico Crisis and Access Line, NMCAL, launched NMConnect, a smartphone app available throughout the state in both iOS and Android. The NMConnect app engages people with immediate access to mental health professionals and resources. NMCAL aims to expand its reach to New Mexico's more than 2 million residents.

The organization fielded more than 245,000 calls and 70,000 text messages in its seven years of existence.

The app offers direct connections to a counselor or peer support worker; direct text to a peer support worker; access to up-to-date resources for substance use, mental health services, and other community resources and the latest information on the state's response to COVID-19.

Stimulus funding touches down at three Doña Ana County area airports

Three airports in Doña Ana County are in line to receive federal stimulus funding announced last week by the offices of Senators Tom Udall and Martin Heinrich.

Among the 50 airports statewide that will receive funding are the Doña Ana County International Jetport at Santa Teresa, the Las Cruces International Airport and the Hatch Municipal Airport.

The Santa Teresa and Las Cruces facilities will each receive \$69,000 in stimulus funds, while the Hatch operation will rake in \$20,000.

The idea behind the funding is “to sustain critical operations and connect the state and rural communities to the resources they need,” the release stated.

William ‘Bill’ Provance manages the Doña Ana County International Jetport at Santa Teresa, and he said talks are still

underway about how exactly the stimulus funds will be used.

The infusion of funds, he said, comes on the heels of a major renovation to the Jetport’s main runway. The \$9 million project, he said, will allow the Jetport to “handle aircraft up to the older model Boeing 737-400 series aircraft [as well as] limited cargo aircraft and larger corporate aircraft.

The previous runaway was 36 years old, he said, and had a weight capacity

of about 20,000 pounds. The nearly completed renovation will allow aircraft up to 94,000 pounds to safely land.

“Basically, we rebuilt the runway from the base up,” Provance said. “They went down three feet and re-compacted the substructure, added six inches of base course and finished it with six inches of asphalt.”

He said the Jetport is home to two 85,000-pound aircraft, “so this was needed.”

Provance said the renovation projects was funded by grants from the Federal Aviation Administration, the New Mexico Aviation Division and three legislative capital outlay grants, one of which was for the planning phase.

As of last week, he said, “the new asphalt has been laid [and] they are now in the process of grooving the runway and installing the lights and new power transformers. It will then have to be painted and the temporary runway converted back to a taxiway.”

He said the engineering consultant on the project is Bohannon Huston, the construction contractor is Mountain States Constructors and the electrical contractor is Bixby Electric.

U.S. Rep. Xochitl Torres

Small praised the stimulus funding and the role of New Mexico’s municipal and rural airports.

“Families across New Mexico are doing their part to slow the spread of COVID-19 by staying at home and limiting air travel,” she said. “Our local airports, however, need to keep their doors

open to support our front-line workers and connect communities with necessary goods and resources. This grant provides critical funding to help local airports continue operations and keep employees on payroll in both urban and rural communities like those across southern New Mexico.”

Transit drivers see protective shields installed on fleet

Doña Ana County's South Central Regional Transit District (SCRTD) is installing plexiglass shields to help protect bus drivers from COVID-19 transmission, and already has instituted ongoing vehicle-sanitation protocols to protect both drivers and passengers.

SCRTD Executive Director David Armijo said the first plexiglass shield was crafted from materials obtained locally, but supplies are limited, and new shields are being crafted and installed as the materials are received from online sources.

He said the district's maintenance manager, Fernando Ramirez, builds and installs the shields at a maintenance facility in Anthony, N.M.

Each shield costs about \$400 in parts to make and install, he said, adding that the shields enhance driver protections that already include masks,

gloves and spray disinfectant. He said that, once installed, each shield will be a permanent fixture in

each bus. Soon, he said, drivers will be fitted with face shields, as well. Passenger

protection is enhanced, he said, by ensuring maximum safe distance between all persons riding on each vehicle. CDC recommendations are posted in each bus, as well. Fares have been eliminated to minimize touch and transactions.

Additional precautions, Armijo said, include asking drivers not to come in if they are ill, in which case reserve drivers can be called in to take over routes.

"The district has maintained 80 percent of its core service," Armijo said. "Trips to school and business have been reduced in the peak hours to better reflect demand for service. Calls for service have increased, requiring both administrative and operations staff to maintain the customer service

phone line and to respond to these service-related calls."

Armijo said the district is committed to uninterrupted service throughout the COVID-19 pandemic.

"We understand that you rely on the Transit District for your essential travel," he said. "That is why we have continued to operate service during the COVID-19 pandemic

to get you to the grocery store, to the pharmacy or to your doctor's appointments. We are committed to continue to provide the safest way to travel to and within Doña Ana County, including Garfield and Hatch to Las Cruces, and Las Cruces to Anthony, Chaparral, Santa Teresa and Sunland Park and connecting service to El Paso."

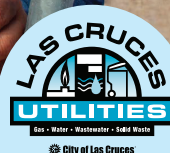

Editor's Notebook

As a lifelong asthmatic, I went to work from home before the governor shut down the state and ordered social distancing. I'm in my sixth week of isolation, and I've learned some things about myself and the very few people with whom I interact during this period.

I'd been retired for almost a year when Richard convinced me to join The Bulletin team, so I knew from experience that the days would not drag by in some Kafka-esque fashion. Days have ways of filling up with things to do.

What's been eye-opening is the caring of neighbors for one another. I'm fortunate to live just a few houses down from my sister, Kellie, and her family. She cooks a few meals for me each week and leaves them out

in the planter by the front door. A text alerts me that she's come and gone, and the food is there. She wears gloves and uses paper plates from the middle of the stack.

My backyard and across-the-street neighbors never fail to wave, and across fences and streets, we converse loudly enough to be heard. At some point in each conversation, the predictable question gets tossed around: "Are you okay?" It seems like we're mostly okay.

I have one neighbor who, well, we don't share a strong bond of affection for one another even though (perhaps because) we could — if we wanted — toss rocks into one another's back yards. Even he and his wife and I are waving at one another the last few weeks after ignoring one another for years. It's not a big gesture, except for the part that it is.

The other day, I was letting Toby — my Yorkie — do his

business in the front yard, when a truck slowed and stopped. It was Bob Diven. He leaned against his tailgate and I stood under a mulberry tree. Normally, Bob and I visit just about every Saturday at the Farmer's Market, so we hadn't seen one another for at least six weeks. It was cool to catch up.

Even before COVID-19 I had — like I suspect many of you have — a love/hate relationship with social media, particularly Facebook. In this time of isolation, however, the love side of the equation is winning. People seem more open to chatting and sharing jokes and videos, and these interactions and shared materials do more than just pass the time. They remind us we remain connected. We're checking on one another. "Are you okay?"

On Monday, April 20, my second granddaughter was born. When my first granddaughter was born, I was at the hospi-

tal. Not this time. No visitors. Besides, a hospital is the last place I want to visit right now, even when the occasion is so very momentous. My son and I exchange text messages — a LOT of text messages — and he sends me photos, and we share video calls. I may not physically hold little Giuliana for a while, but she's already wrapped herself around my heart.

I get lonely, and sometimes I get a little bored, but the episodes are few, and they pass quickly enough. Because I'm the only human on my little plot of land, I don't have other people's quirks grating on my nerves. My critters keep me company in their own ways, and the occasional yard and street shoutings, combined with social media, make this bearable.

COVID-19 is no joke, and it's no fun, but I think the answer for most of us is, yeah, we're okay.

State will need help to get out of the hole

In the wee hours of the morning on Feb. 19, the New Mexico House of Representatives voted to give final approval to a \$7.6 billion state budget, an increase in spending of about 8 percent from the previous year.

Along with increases in education spending that had been mandated by a recent court ruling, the budget also provided a 4 percent salary increase for most state workers. The original plan was to give a smaller increase to workers other than teachers. But with so much new money available, lawmakers decided they could afford to be generous.

This was the second year in a row that Gov. Michelle Lujan Gisham came into the legislative session with revenue projections anticipating a surplus of hundreds of millions of dollars, thanks to the booming oil and gas economy in southeast New Mexico.

I had started to won-

der if advances made by fracking might have made Lujan Grisham immune to the boom and bust cycles that have plagued governors before her.

But, in the 21 days between when the budget was passed on Feb 19 and when it was signed on March 11, all of the expectations and assumptions that the revenue estimates had been based on crumbled.

On March 8, Saudi Arabia began flooding the market with cheap oil in response to a price war with Russia, sending prices tumbling worldwide.

Revenue from oil and gas production accounts for more than one-third of the state's budget.

It is estimated that for every \$1 change in the price of oil, the state will gain or lose \$22 million. The budget is based on assumptions that oil would remain at more than \$52 a barrel. At one point Monday afternoon, April 20, the

price fell below \$0 a barrel.

On March 11, the same day that the governor signed the budget, the first confirmed case of coronavirus was reported in New Mexico. That would quickly result in the isolation orders now in place that have shuttered state businesses.

Within four days, the state saw its most important industry devastated by a global political dispute, and its entire economy shut down by a global pandemic.

The budget did include money for reserves, bringing that fund up to about \$1.7 billion. That will help soften the blow, as will vetoes made by the governor to capital-outlay projects and a bill to beef up the

retirement fund for state workers.

But that will only help put off the difficult decisions that are still to come. Senate Finance Committee Chairman John Arthur Smith has said the Legislature will likely need to call a special session to deal with the budget shortfall, something they have done before when the oil and gas market turned sour, but never with these kinds of health challenges.

Unlike the federal government, the state must balance its budget each year. And, there is just no hope to cut our way out of the red without enormous help from the federal government.

Cities will need help too. Counties can still collect

property taxes, but cities will see a big drop in gross receipts tax collections. And, both cities and counties will see an increase in expenses as they help those most in need.

Fiscal concerns remain secondary to the ongoing life-and-death battle against the virus. And thus far, the governor and other state and local leaders de-

serve credit for preventing the death and devastation we see happening every day in other states.

But our state lagged behind others economically going into the crisis, and we'll have a deeper hole to dig out of once it's over.

New Mexico Water & Electric

Vote by mail

To the editor:
 State Rep. Jan Townsend, R-Lea County, is on record opposing mail-in ballots. His misgivings are political. Five states — Colorado, Oregon, Hawaii, Washington and Utah — conduct all elections entirely by mail, and 21 other states use it for special elections. They're very happy with their voting arrangement and have seen little or no fraud.

The primary reason Republicans like Townsend and Trump are against this approach is to suppress the vote — to make it inconvenient for many categories of voters to participate, e.g. students, disabled people, the poor, minorities and those with limited time, because they're more likely to vote Democrat. The integrity of the process has little to do with their concerns.

Several independent and government studies show that impersonation fraud by mail-in-voters is very rare. A Columbia University political scientist tracked incidence rates for voter fraud for two years and found that the rare fraud that was reported generally could be traced to false claims by the loser of a close race. Without evidence, Trump recently stated that mail-in voting is riddled with fraud and abuse. "You get thousands and thousands of people sitting in someone's living room signing ballots all over the place"

Digging: Your Rights and Responsibilities

Know what's below. Call before you dig.

New Mexico excavation law places certain responsibilities with the excavator (a person using a mechanical digging device) for preventing damage to underground facilities. The law provides for a one-call system that the excavator can use free of charge to arrange to have underground facilities located and marked before an excavation occurs.

State Law Requires Excavators to:

- 1) Plan your excavation.
- 2) Mark the excavation area in white.
- 3) Call before you dig.
- 4) Determine the location of any underground facilities.
- 5) Call the one call center if any facility is not marked to determine if it is "clear."
- 6) Preserve line location markings or provide offsets.
- 7) Expose any conflicts and maintain at least 18 inches of clearance from the horizontal mark and the edge of the mechanical digging device.
- 8) Support underground facilities during excavation as necessary.
- 9) Backfill in a careful manner.
- 10) Notify facility owners and 811 of any damage immediately.
- 11) Standard locate tickets are valid for 10 working days.

What Happens When You Call:

Once you provide the necessary information, the one call operator will confirm all pertinent details. It is your responsibility to ensure the information was properly recorded on the request. Likewise, faxed or on-line requests will be returned to you as confirmation, and it is your responsibility to immediately confirm the information is correct.

La ley de excavación de Nuevo México impone ciertas responsabilidades al excavador (Es una persona que utilice un artefacto mecánico para escarbar) para prevenir daños en las instalaciones bajo tierra. La ley provee un sistema de "una llamada" que el excavador puede utilizar sin costo para hacer arreglos para que le localicen las instalaciones bajo tierra y que estas sean marcadas antes de que la excavación ocurra.

La ley requiere que los excavadores hagan lo siguiente:

- 1) Planeé su excavación.
- 2) Llame antes de escarbar.
- 3) Marcar el área de excavación en color blanco.
- 4) Determine la ubicación de cualquiera de las instalaciones existentes bajo tierra.
- 5) Llame al centro de "una llamada" si alguna de las instalaciones no está marcada para determinar si es "seguro proseguir."
- 6) Conserve la ubicación de las líneas marcadas o proporcione la distancia/desvío.
- 7) Avise de cualquier conflicto y manténgase al menos 18 pulgadas al margen y de la orilla de algún artefacto mecánico para escarbar.
- 8) Apoye/ preserve las instalaciones bajo tierra según sea necesario cuando este excavando.
- 9) Rellene con cuidado.
- 10) Avise a los dueños de las instalaciones y marque el 811 inmediatamente para reportar cualquier daño.
- 11) Las peticiones estándar (ticket) son válidas 10 días hábiles solamente.

Qué pasa cuando usted llama:

Una vez que usted proporcione la información necesaria, la operadora de "una llamada" le confirmará acerca de los detalles pertinentes. Es su responsabilidad asegurarse de que la información sea registrada adecuadamente en el documento de la petición. A sí mismo, mande por fax o por Internet su petición, se le mandará una confirmación, y es su responsabilidad corroborar de inmediato que la información es correcta.

Make-A-Wish Foundation sports strong Las Cruces Ambassadors

The national Make-A-Wish Foundation celebrates its 40th anniversary April 29 with a strong New Mexico chapter and a relatively new but very engaged local presence called the Las Cruces Ambassadors.

The organization grants wishes to critically ill children (Wish Kids), including more than 100 a year in New Mexico and about a dozen annually in Doña Ana County.

Shortly before retiring as NMSU provost in 2018, Dan Howard joined the board of Make-A-Wish New Mexico (MAWNM), and shortly after that, the Las Cruces Ambassadors was created.

“I wanted to give back a little bit in retirement,” Howard said. “I got together with a group of people who felt the same as I did, that this was a good organization and good for the community.”

Howard said the Ambassadors include Christine Woods, Pam Doyle, Andrea Tawney, Jan Moorehead, Roseann Bensley, Brigitte Salopek, newest member Christy Buchanan and Dana Jorgensen, who is no longer an Ambassador but still very active in granting wishes. He also recognized The Hood owner Richard Parra, who hosted a MAWNM fundraiser earlier this year. Parra is “not an ambassador,” Howard said. “He is simply a saint.”

“We’re all volunteers for

Make-A-Wish,” Howard said. “We meet with families and children and do what we can to expedite wishes. There’s an awful lot of hopefulness and joy associated with this,” he said. “It gives the family and the children something to focus on besides the illness.”

Wish Kids “have better outcomes if they have a wish granted,” Howard said. “They have fewer visits to the doctor’s office, and therapy seems to work better (because) the optimism that comes from a wish helps the kids. We know from going back and talking to these kids years later how much of an impact that wish had.”

It often comes as a surprise to people that while all Wish Kids are critically ill, two-thirds of them survive, Howard said. And being critically ill is the only qualification, he said, along with a referral from a medical professional.

Howard particularly remembers two local Wish Kids he’s helped grant wishes for. A girl with cystic fibrosis had just graduated from high school and wanted to go to Venice. The trip included her parents and brother. The family “made a video of that trip that just broke your heart it was so gorgeous, so joyful,” Howard said.

A boy in Vado wanted a gaming system, so a TV

and game console were installed in his bedroom. And, Howard reached out to the contractor who had painted his house and asked if he would paint the boy’s room in Denver Broncos colors. He and other painters donated their time, and the entire room was prepared one day when the boy, who has cancer, wasn’t home.

“We surprised him,” Howard said. “It was a really lovely thing to be involved with.”

Both these Wish Kids

are “alive and doing well,” he said.

“Dan has been a total godsend for our organization,” said MAWNM President and CEO Sara Lister. “Dan created a presence down in the Las Cruces area. He used his contacts to put together people who are passionate about the mission. That group of folks put their heart and soul into Make-A-Wish,” said Lister, who joined MAWNM about the same time Howard did.

Lister said the national

Make-A-Wish Foundation started in Phoenix, when Chris, a little boy with cancer, wished he could be a police officer. The boy got a uniform, was sworn in and got to ride in a police car and a helicopter. Chris didn’t survive his illness, but his mother decided more kids like him should have their wishes granted, and the organization was born.

It began serving only terminally ill children,

Mayor pro-tem: Fight against adverse childhood experiences continues

Even as COVID-19 stay-at-home orders are causing unintended spikes in child abuse and domestic violence, Las Cruces and the state of New Mexico continue as national leaders in the fight against these and other adverse childhood experiences (ACES). The state office overseeing that effort is moving to New Mexico State University.

ACES include experiences before age 18 like physical and sexual abuse, neglect and living in an environment of parental conflict, substance abuse and violence.

An ACES score of three or higher has been found to “have devastating effects on the future health and prosperity of children,” said state Sen. Bill Soules of Las Cruces, who has a Ph.D. in education and psychology and is chair of the New Mexico Senate Education Committee. Higher ACES scores correspond to lifespans reduced by as much as 20 years. (Take the 10-question survey at

www.annaageeight.org/the-problem-to-determine-your-aces-score.)

In Las Cruces, Mayor Pro-Tem Kasandra Gandara, a retired social worker, has worked with Soules and others to create the state’s first data-driven program focused on ways to “make the change from adequate to quality” local vital services like housing, health care, transportation and food to battle ACES.

Soules and other legislators allocated state capital outlay funds to create the Anna Age Eight Institute (AAEI), the state ACES office, at Northern New Mexico Community College in Española in 2019.

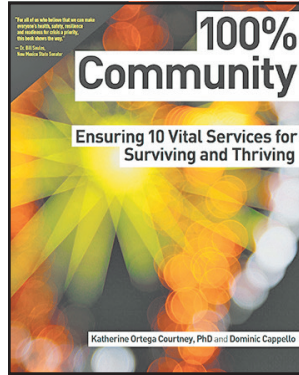
The name comes from a book written by AAEI co-directors Dominic Cappello and Katherine Ortega Courtney, Ph.D., which details the life and

death of a fictional eight-year-old girl, based on a real child Cappello knew of while working in the state Children, Youth and Families Department. The real child was passed back and forth eight times between her mother’s custody and state care before being kicked to death by her mother, Cappello said.

Cappello said AAEI is in the process of relocating to NMSU because its Cooperative Extension Service has offices in all 33 New Mexico counties. That “fits in perfectly ... with our mission of “en-

suring 10 vital surviving and thriving services, through countywide mobilizing,” Cappello said.

“Strengthening local systems of care ... to increase family health, safety and resilience” is a major AAEI focus, he said.

Capello and Ortega’s new book, “100% Community: Ensuring Ten Vital Services for Surviving and Thriving,” will be published soon, Capello said, and free to download at www.AnnaAgeEight.org. Those 10 sectors to be addressed in each community are medical/dental, food, housing, transportation, parent supports, early childhood, community schools, youth mentors and job training.

Doña Ana County has completed a survey of residents to identify gaps in vital services and created a task force and action teams to address those gaps. An ACES summit held in Las Cruces in December drew more than 300 participants, Gandara said.

In Las Cruces, COVID-19 forced the cancellation of a March task force

Here are some of the results of the Doña Ana County Resilient Community Experience Survey conducted in December 2019 by local “resilience leaders,” New Mexico State University and the Anna Age Eight Institute. About 550 survey responses were received.

Difficulty accessing these local services:

- Food assistance: 33 percent
- Affordable housing: 66 percent
- Health care: 34 percent
- Dental care: 54 percent
- Behavioral health services: 49 percent; couldn’t find a quality provider: 48 percent
- Public transportation: 47 percent; “did not run during the times they needed it:” 55 percent
- Pre-school programs for their children: 19 percent
- Behavioral and physical health services for their children at school: 37 percent
- Job training services: 41 percent

meeting, but plans are underway to conduct future meetings on Zoom, she said. The virus is a reminder about “the importance of access” to vital services, Gandara said, and that the work of getting them in place must continue.

“Kids deserve 100 percent access to quality services,” Gandara said. “We can’t continue to do business as usual. We have to do better.”

It’s a community and countywide effort, Gandara said. “We have to

be all in it together,” she said. “We can’t afford to work in silos or compete for resources. If we want this to change, everybody has to come to the table.”

That means everything from volunteering to spending an hour or so a week mentoring a child, Gandara said.

Lister said, but that soon changed. Some Wish Kids don’t survive, she said, but many “go on to live full, happy, healthy lives; they go into remission or they learn how to manage their disease for the rest

of their lives.”

“We have heard from doctors and parents,” Lister said. “They really see a change in kids when they’re going through the Wish Kid class. After the wish, that hope is still there; their whole life isn’t just about their diagnosis anymore. We really feel like Make-A-Wish is part

of the child’s medical journey. We want to be there to help them create memories that they can hold onto. They think about just being a family, not about appointments or hospital stays. It’s extremely difficult ... when we lose a Wish Child, but we feel greatly honored to be a part of their legacy,”

she said.

In addition to monetary donations, Lister said MAWNM welcomes in-kind donations. Since the chapter never knows what a child might wish for, she keeps a list of people offering all sorts of in-kind services, like Howard’s painters.

Lister said MAWNM

never turns a child away, but it is having to postpone wishes right now because of COVID-19.

The first wish Lister was involved in granting was for a young girl who wanted to meet gymnast Gabby Douglas. “It was just fun,” Lister said. “I felt like I was 12 years old again. We fall in love

with every kid and every wish.”

Lister’s wish? She wants to meet Queen Elizabeth.

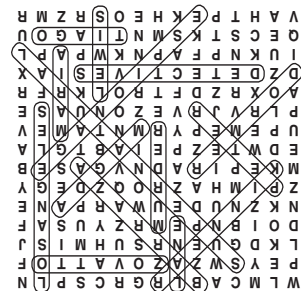

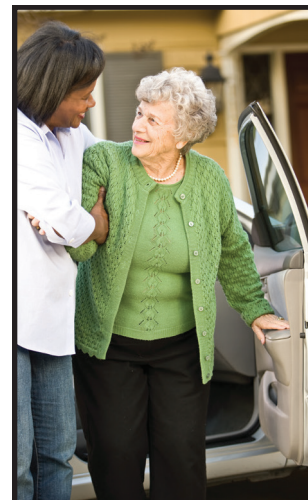

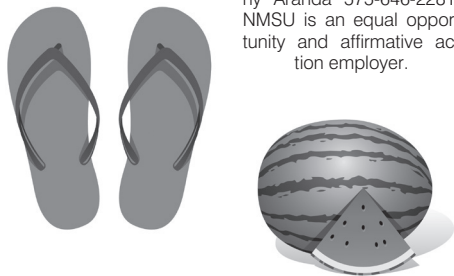

CCRC is an existing collection center owned and operated by SCSWA. CCRC has been in operation since 2016. It is operated in compliance with the Collection Center Registration

granted by the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) Solid Waste Bureau (SWB) on December 12, 2016 pursuant to the New Mexico Solid Waste Rules (NMSWR, 20.9.2-20.9.10 NMAC). Current operating hours for the CCRC are 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday and 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Saturday and Sunday. The CCRC is closed on Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, and New Year's Day. The CCRC may operate outside of scheduled operating hours to accommodate site preparation, inclement weather conditions, special projects, infrastructure construction, internal operation/projects, maintenance, monitoring and other special circumstances.

3. Description of the Facility:
a. General Process. The Chaparral Collection and Recycling Center is an existing collection center that receives and processes solid waste received from the public. Solid waste is placed in transfer trailers within the transfer station building and transported to the Corralitos Regional Landfill for disposal. Recyclables are transported to the Las Cruces Recycling Center.
b. Location. The CCRC is located at 180 Chaparral Drive, west of McCombs Road and north of the State Line Drive, in Chaparral, Doña Ana County, New Mexico 88081.
c. Size. The CCRC "solid waste facility" (20.9.2.7.S(11) NMAC) footprint encompasses approximately 10± acres.

On the stump: in an artistic, not political, way

Roadrunner, bear, puzzle piece, peace symbol, flower and 45 other surprises are hanging out on stumps along the Tierra Verde neighborhood main drag on the edge of Mesilla.

The 50 small metal sculptures are the brainchildren of area artist Ron Saltzman, former owner of the Frame and Art Gallery, and retired teacher Teresa Phillips. In the midst of the pandemic,

they have focused on the positive, and given the community something to explore.

Saltzman said he had been thinking about the project for a long time. “We tried to do it anonymously,” he said. “The first batch was 32 pieces. We got up in the middle of the night, met down here and at 1:30 in the morning we had the 32 placed. We thought someone would call the police on us, but nobody did.”

Saltzman and Phillips thought they would just

sit back and listen to see if people noticed the next day. But by 6:30 a.m. when he went to see what the area looked like in daylight, there were already walkers, runners and friends wondering what happened.

As the president of Tierra Verde Landscaping, Saltzman is in charge of the team that takes care of the main drag, and people started approaching him.

“They came up and said, ‘Something happened last night, who

did it?’” he said. “I kept a straight face with the first guy, but I have a hard time lying, and by 10 in the morning, I couldn’t lie anymore.”

Saltzman said the city periodically plants new trees and just leaves the stumps of the old ones, because it is too hard and too expensive to grind them to ground level. So he turned them into sculpture bases.

“Now, you really don’t see the stumps. You see

the artwork on things,” he said.

Phillips and Saltzman worked for about a month creating the sculptures with his plasma cutter and a welder.

“We would design them,” he said. “Some I helped and tweaked, some I did by myself, and some with her. She is super creative. Her way of thinking is very analytical, and she can look at something and see things in it that I would have glossed over.

As we were creating these things, she would find meaning that I never saw before.”

Saltzman describes the works as whimsical, animals or just something fun. Two of the pieces are interactive: an envelope in which the investigator can find inspiring works and a bell that children often

take advantage of to make some joyful noise.

“Families come out here and turn it into a scavenger hunt,” he said. “We’re just bringing in a little bit of happy with all the negativity that is going on in the world. I wanted to

have a good feeling coming off of it. You see these things and you get a smile. I’m enjoying it, it gave me a lot of pleasure making it and doing it and seeing

Las Cruces in the 1950s: Jim Flanagan's photo archive

Nestled away in the New Mexico State University Archives and Special Collections are more than 10,000 photographs shot by the late Jim Flanagan, who was a long-time Las Cruces resident.

Flanagan was born Aug. 20, 1912, in Junction City, Kansas, according to a report filed by Jim Eckles in White Sands Missile Range's Hands "Across History" newsletter, Flanagan worked as a Geary County deputy sheriff in Junc-

tion City until he moved to Las Cruces in 1937. Flanagan worked briefly for the New Mexico National Guard and in 1938 married Amelia Moya, with whom he had four sons. Flanagan served with the 45th Infantry Division as a warrant officer during World War II and saw combat in Sicily, Italy, Eckles reported. Flanagan was seriously wounded in combat near Lauf, Germany, when the tank in which he was riding struck a mine. Everyone else aboard was killed.

Flanagan ran a Las Cruces gas station from,

1946-47, Eckles said. He served as a deputy in

the Doña Ana County Sheriff's Department

1949-59 and was chief deputy from 1955 until his resignation in September 1959. Flanagan served briefly as chief of the Las Cruces Police Department but resigned in February 1961 in a dispute over department pay, Eckles reported.

Flanagan was a competitive shooter, Eckles said, and for several years was rated the best all-around marksman in New Mexico and twice was national small-bore champion. He later ran a gun store in Las Cruces, Eckles said, served as consultant to an ammunition manufacturer and, in 1974, ran unsuccessfully for county sheriff.

Flanagan died in 1983 at age 71.

"I have fond memories

of the gun store when I was a little kid," said Las Cruces native and Bulletin Editor Jess Williams. "My dad used to take me down there for hours each Saturday, where Mr. Flanagan would hold court with a lot of the local gun enthusiasts, including my dad. I remember John Van Horn, Joe Mott, Pardner Tellyer, Frank Conway and others would congregate and swap stories. All these years later, if I get a whiff of Hoppe's Number 9 Gun Oil, the first flashback is to that little gun shop on South Main Street, before the urban-renewal project."

The photographs made by Flanagan offer "an incredible glimpse into

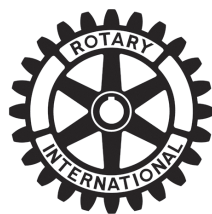

the decade of the 1950s in Las Cruces," said NMSU Archives and Special Collections Department Head Dennis Daily, who is curating the series for

the Bulletin.

"The photographs are black and white and reminiscent of the film noir detective movies of that era — except these depict the real events," Daily said. "He was a real proponent of the use of photography in police

work."

Flanagan also photographed a wide range of social and cultural activities throughout the area, including weddings, school pageants, Cinco de Mayo celebrations, parades, sporting events and portraits.

Flanagan made photographs of many local businesses, such as cafes, motels and gas stations, for advertisements that appeared in area newspapers.

"These photographs document our region's vernacular architecture and constitute an interesting inventory of businesses operating here in the 1950s," Daily said. Hundreds of aerial photographs show the development of Las Cruces.

Daly said he and his staff have scanned about 4,500 of Flanagan's photographs, and about 1,500 are viewable online at www.lib.nmsu.edu/archives/rghc.html. Click on the "Search Photograph Collections" tab and enter "Flanagan" in the search box.

On toilet paper, price gouging and ventilators

One of the humorous aspects of an otherwise bleak situation is the disappearance of toilet paper from our store shelves allegedly caused by irrational hoarding. This has inspired jokes from six-year-olds to late-night comedians. Beyond jokes the shortage and the accompanying accusations of price gouging can serve as an illustration of how capitalism can help manage a disaster.

Hoarding in the face of disaster is a natural human response. My own freezer is stuffed right now when normally I keep a pretty bare frig. The desire to hoard when faced with uncertainty is a reality. The question is how to allocate goods.

One solution, urged by Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham, is for stores to limit purchases to, say, two per consumer. This assumes that "one" is all that's needed. But do we

know how many children are in that household or what other needs the consumer might have? And even if this would work with toilet paper, will it work with other products subject to hoarding?

Another solution is to raise prices to discourage excessive purchases. But such gouging during a natural disaster is extremely unpopular and even illegal.

New Mexico's attorney general has issued a statement saying price gouging is unconscionable. Even Amazon has prohibited sharp price increases.

Most economists disagree with policies against price gouging. We argue that higher prices serve two purposes. Prices allocate goods to their best use. Those willing to pay more for toilet paper have a higher need for that toilet paper, even if the need might be based on irratio-

nal fear. Providing a sense of security is not without value.

The second purpose of higher prices is to signal suppliers to increase production. One of the messages that comes from economics is that people respond to incentives. For producers, these incentives are in the form of profits. Higher prices make for higher profits, motivating production.

All this illustrates both the strength and weakness of the capitalist system. If we let the market work, it will allocate resources in a way that satisfies the needs of consumers. But higher price for necessities, like toilet paper, may impose a hardship on the poor, who cannot afford the higher prices.

Efficiency vs. fairness is the eternal tradeoff of capitalism. To ensure fairness, we impose laws against price gouging, but we then sacrifice a market response that provides more toilet paper.

This problem becomes more extreme when we look at issues less trivial than toilet paper. Take ventilators. There is a global shortage of ventilators. The demand has resulted in a rise in prices. Responding to market demand, CPAP manufacturers are converting their production facilities to make ventilators.

The alternative is to use government action to order manufacturers to produce needed products. Trump did this late last month, when he used the Defense Procurement Act to order General Motors to produce ventilators. According to media reports, the CPAP manufacturers, responding to market incentives, are going to produce multiples of what GM is set to produce.

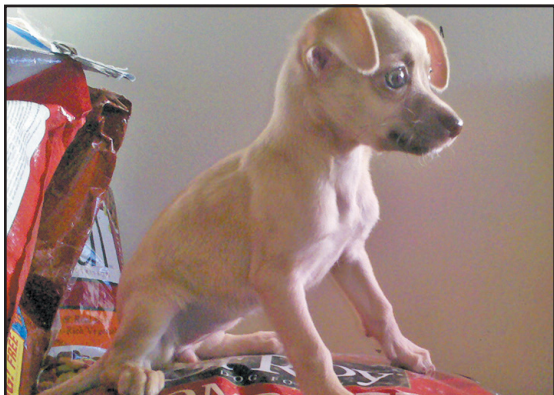

LCPS: Remote learning proceeding smoothly

BULLETIN REPORT

As the first week of remote learning wraps up amid a statewide shutdown to reduce the spread of COVID-19, Las Cruces Public Schools administrators and staff report the transition is “going well.” Most families who elected to check-out laptops and tablets had already done so as of April 17, with nine schools in the district reporting 100 percent of needed technology already in students’ hands.

Of the district’s 25,000 students, roughly 4,500 reported not having access to a laptop or tablet at home. Approximately 1,700 did not have access to the Internet.

“Our teachers are the best resource to determine what our students need to engage in learning,” said Dr. Karen Trujillo, superintendent for Las Cruces Public Schools. “During their regular phone calls

with students and families, teachers are able to pinpoint how we can support our families, and our leadership teams have been working on ways to address those needs.”

After surveying families and existing inventory, each school determined there were enough devices to meet the needs of students who were without access to technology at home. As of April 15, most elementary schools reported 70 percent of needed technology had been picked up, and four schools — Monte Vista Elementary, Las Cruces High, Doña Ana Elementary and Camino Real Middle — had pick-ups scheduled.

District officials said Internet access codes from Comcast have been provided to teachers and students and six months of service fees will be derived from emergency funding from the City of Las Cruces. Families living

outside Comcast’s service area will be provided with paper copies of instructional materials. Additional support systems are in place to support special education and Spanish-language learners.

Since the announcement was made by the New Mexico Public Education Department to shutter schools through the end of the school year, district administrators began work on developing two-week learning blocks with assistance from teachers and district instructional and content specialists.

The LCPS Continuous Learning Plan, classroom resources and learning targets can be found online at www.mrowl.com/user/lcpsmrowl. Additional enrichment resources can be found on the same website, including the LCPS Enrichment YouTube channel, which has live lessons for all grade levels and a “Counselors Corner,” where school counselors help students with their social emotional needs. Some teachers are incorporating video platforms to connect students in a virtual

classroom setting, which is something new for most of them.

“Teachers, students and families are adjusting to learning in new ways, and our live lessons on YouTube are a great way to supplement what our teachers are providing for students to meet the learning targets,” said Deputy Superintendent of Teaching and Research Dr. Wendi Miller-Tomlinson. “Our top goal is to make sure students and their families are safe and healthy while navigating remote learning.”

If parents are looking for extra learning resources, KRWG is providing elementary content daily from 8 a.m. to noon, Monday through Friday.

“Communication is key,” Miller-Tomlinson said. “We encourage families to continue reaching out to teachers and principals if they need assistance.”

Remote learning, along with breakfast and lunch distribution, will continue through May 20, the final day of instruction in the 2019-2020 school year.

Las Cruces musician, counseling grad student: Be calm, resilient; reach out during crisis

Editor's note: Singer, songwriter, musician Christine Sanders has for more than 15 years been a member of Las Cruces' Hard Road Trio, which plays "original southwestern acoustic music at the crossroads of Roots and Bluegrass. She also has completed 21 credits toward a master's degree in counseling.

I've heard fear described as a response to an obvious threat whereas anxiety is the

response to perceived or imagined danger. We can often take action in the face of a clear and present threat, but there's a component of helplessness with anxiety, and not knowing what to do adds more anxiety. I'm sorry I can't cite the source — just my memory.

Dr. Murray Bowen was a pioneer in family therapy and one idea of his that I especially love

is that as family systems ramp up their anxiety, the presence of even one

person that can stay calm will interrupt that process. So with our present situation. How do we each find calm knowing that it will help not only ourselves but our families and our communities? Beyond our own practices of meditation, prayer, connection with Nature, or

listening to music, we can make contact with people we know who calm us. We can monitor where we get our information and how it's presented. We can be aware of when we're tuning out (TV, media, chardonnay) to avoid facing responsibility, or tuning in to take a break for renewal. We can accept the gift of time to savor our backyards, our instruments, our coloring books, our favorite authors, those CDs we bought and never listened to.

We can check in with our older relatives often by phone and exchange calm. My father-in-law just shared his experience of being in London during the Blitz; a notice would scroll across the bottom of a movie screen

saying that there were incoming aircraft and that you could stay in place at your own risk. Now we have incoming virus-craft, and we haven't had a war on the mainland for a long, long time. We did, however, rally for a war effort. That's what we're being called to do right now. We can ration ourselves to consume less rather than hoard more. We can ask ourselves every day, what's one thing I can do that is good for me, and one thing that is good for my community?

Also, there's resilience. While we build our bodies' resilience to infection, we can build up our emotional resilience. Sugar consumption applies to both these areas for me. Less sugar in my

diet reduces the environment that germs like. I'm also less prone to dramatic mood shifts with less sugar and alcohol. Daily walks help on both counts, too. And sleep. Less sleep produces more anxiety. Now is a time when we can get regular sleep at regular hours, and importantly, we can turn off our screens an hour or two before we go to bed. 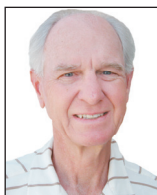

From a business standpoint, golf is suffering

When the dust settles from the coronavirus pandemic recreational golf may very well find itself at a crossroads. A week prior to Gov. Michelle Lujan Gresham's order for New Mexico golf courses to close, the Albuquerque Journal ran a story about "golf courses experiencing (an) uptick in rounds because of virus outbreak." That was encouraging, but then we joined other states that prohibited golf. Now, almost half of the nation's golf courses are closed to play, either by edict from elected government leaders or by precautions taken by the facilities themselves.

Throughout the 1990s there was a golf course building boom, based on nothing more than the expanding popularity of

golf, along with a "Field of Dreams" model. As early as 1988, The National Golf Foundation announced the industry goal of "a new golf course a day," but that overly ambitious idea did not and could not foresee the ultra-rapid change in real estate, the economy, and golf's decline in popularity a decade later.

Golf was peaking even when Tiger Woods became a young sports sensation. Baby Boomers were retiring and had lots of discretionary money to spend on things like golf. But golf course developers over-extended in dramatic fashion.

From 2004, when golf's popularity started its decline, until 2016, more than 1,000 golf courses closed their doors. In 2014, a golf

course was closing every two days! Much of that was due to the 2008 recession, coupled with changing adult lifestyles.

Locally, we felt the impact several ago, with Santa Teresa Country Club and White Sands Missile Range Golf Course both closing for good. In each of 2018 and 2019, some 200 golf courses closed for good. Those figures were in a rather robust economy.

At this juncture, the golfing world is doubtless facing another crisis. For years, industry leaders promoted the mantra "grow the game," but now it may be a matter of "save the game." We are looking at the highest unemployment since the Great Depression. We will be dealing with a recession, not due to bank failures from stupid mortgage loans, but instead due to

one of the Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse — disease.

This is just reality. Despite billions earmarked for small-business relief, many small, independent businesses do not have enough cash reserves and will fail. Many golf courses in the Midwest, Northern Plains and the Northeast are coming off five months of no play and no cash flow, which means they have depended on a brisk opening season in April that's not going to happen.

Starting in late March, they needed a normal number of rounds and revenue for the coming 30 to 35 weeks, and that is certainly in jeopardy due to what appears to be a protracted national shutdown.

My research indicates the ultra-high-end private golf clubs that are

member owned with deep pockets will manage the storm. Private golf clubs throughout the country will sustain. And destination golf resorts should see a decline, but will likely survive. The Villages, a retirement community in central Florida, sports 32 square miles of property and 130,000 residents, 12 country clubs with championship courses and 40 nine-hole executive courses. Most of the residents have their own golf carts. Golf has not ceased there.

Last week, Butterfield Trail Golf Club (owned

by El Paso Airport) announced it has closed permanently. Butterfield was on the list of "America's Best New Courses" by Golf Digest in 2008, and "Best Municipal Course" by Links Magazine in 2011. Golfers, like every other demographic in sports, is entering a new normal with broad ramifications for the game and the people the industry employs.

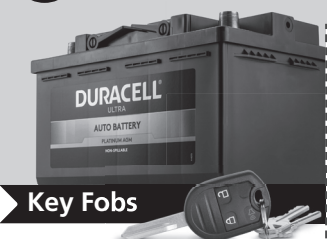

Celebrate Earth Day by making a DIY composting bin for your home

The Museums are closed through April 2020, but you can still do fun activities at home! This week, to celebrate Earth Day, make a composting bin for your home.

DIY Composting Bin

What You'll Need:

Rubbermaid Storage Container
+ Matching Lid

Drill

Directions:

1. Drill holes into all sides of the tub.
2. Place layer of dry material such as shredded paper or dry grass clippings.
3. Add a layer of fresh materials such as coffee grounds, egg shells, tea bags, and banana peels. NOTE: remember if you add cheese or other oils to the compost bin, do so sparingly. These materials can attract pests such as bugs to your compost bin.
4. Add another layer of dry material on top to keep it from smelling.
5. Add about 2 cups of water to the bin.
6. Remember to stir your bin and repeat steps 4 & 5 every time you add fresh materials.
