COUNTY RESUMES TRASH COUPON REQUIREMENT

Effective May 15, the South Central Solid Waste Authority will resume requiring trash coupons when residents utilize the County solid waste transfer stations.

Doña Ana County's Utilities Department, 845 N. Motel Blvd. sells Disposal Coupons or 'punch cards' to offset the cost of processing and hauling solid waste or trash to dumpsites. Currently, the Government Center is closed to the public. However, the Utilities Department is available for questions and purchases using a credit card, at (575) 642-7142.

Coupons can also be purchased at other locations, throughout the County, in the amounts of \$12, \$24 or \$48.

For each drop-off, the coupon is punched at least once, which is equivalent to \$4, for up to 200 pounds of trash or solid waste. The total fee is determined by the amount of trash brought to the collection center, each time.

There is no charge to drop off recyclable items.

Ongoing efforts to avoid the spread of Covid-19 require members of the public to comply with Centers for Disease Control, CDC recommendations at all times:

- Wear mask and gloves during the entire duration of time in the disposal area;
- Anyone who does not have this protective gear will be turned away;
- No more than five people are allowed in the disposal area at one time;
- Customers must practice social distancing and remain six (6) feet away from one another.

The South Central Solid Waste Authority, SCSWA is a city and county agency that serves residents from Hatch to Sunland Park, via eight collection centers located across the County.

Arts organizations can seek funds to offset COVID-19 impact

A number of Las Cruces and Doña Ana County-based arts organizations will be eligible to apply for \$1.5 million in state and federal funds to pay employees and independently contracted artists and arts administrators and educators across the state to help offset the impact of COVID-19.

The local organizations eligible to apply for the funds include A Children's Theatre of the Mesilla Valley (ACT), the City of Las Cruces, the Doña Ana Arts Council (DAAC), Las Cruces Symphony Orchestra, Las Cruces Community Radio and Project in Motion modern and aerial dance company (PIM) of Las Cruces.

The funds will be allocated by New Mexico Arts, a division of the New Mexico Department of Cultural Affairs.

"We are going to have to exercise some caution when we begin to reopen the doors that were closed in March. So, keeping the arts funded and supported will still have some challenges as we continue to ensure we are attending to the basic needs in our community first and foremost," said DAAC Executive Director Greg Smith.

"One of the ways we will rebuild jobs and a healthy economy here is through the arts, the creative economy," Smith said. "In the immediacy of this crisis, it may be a

struggle to see what happens once it has passed. However, that is precisely what many of us are compelled to do. Any vision for our future has to include the creative economy actively helping us get to a better place."

"The future of the arts is as uncertain as the new vaccine we all hope for," said PIM founder Hilary McDaniel-Douglas. "Likewise, there is no time that the arts and the inspiration they provide have been more necessary. We fall just a year short of being able to apply for NEA funding, so this is very needed.

Performing arts are

being redefined as we speak, as this juncture has closed traditional means of revenue like live performance which we rely on for a large part of our income."

"We are planning to apply for this funding," said ACT Artistic Director Kelly King.

"As a children's performing arts group, we feel strongly that our work is vital to the arts in Las Cruces. Local youth get their first taste of performing arts through groups such as ACT. Also, we are adamant in our mission to provide high quality theatre and film experience to children regardless of their socio-

ditional COVID-19 related expenses of more than \$1.2 million, with 90 percent of arts organizations having canceled programming and 67 percent saying staff cuts are likely. A third of respondents said they are not confi-

dent their organizations will survive the impact of COVID-19.

2020 graduates get to celebrate at Field of Dreams

Las Cruces Public Schools (LCPS) high school principals have joined forces to create a memorable graduation celebration May 21 and 22 for the more than 1,600 graduates who are part of the class of 2020.

"We know it is impor-

tant for them to have some kind of a culminating event," said Superintendent Karen Trujillo during a virtual press conference. "Our commitment is to [also] have an actual commencement when and if we are able, knowing it may not be able to happen until the fall, or even six to nine months from now, and

not everybody will be able to attend. We know that this is something that will be special to everybody."

Trujillo said the principals of the individual high schools have been meeting and planning the celebration, and she turned the meeting over to allow them to talk about the specific plans for the event.

The graduation celebration will be held during the regularly scheduled graduation

times already set up for each school May 21 and May 22, all at the Field of Dreams.

Graduates should show up at the Field of Dreams east parking lot at least 30 minutes before the start of graduation with no more than five people in the vehicle, including the graduate.

"We would like the seniors to decorate their cars and wear their cap and gown," said Arrowhead Park Principal

Gabriela Alaniz. "And seniors, for the first time in I don't know how long, you can decorate that cap if you want to. We chose Field of Dreams because we can control the traffic and broadcast live from there."

There will be staff available on the east side to line up all the cars and each graduate will get their name card, so the names can be read on the other side of the stadium for the live portion of

the ceremony. Students are not going to be announced in alphabetical order.

Principals will be reaching out to the graduation speakers to prerecord their speeches, Pledge of Allegiance and any performances that each individual high school has planned. These recorded pieces will be put together as the preprogram and will be livestreamed at the start of graduation on Facebook and on the district website.

Once the prerecorded portion is over, the procession will start. The cars will be driven to the west parking lot, where school administration will give out graduation memorabilia. And the graduates may have their picture taken at that time.

Finally, they will drive out through the west parking lot. There are no plans for spectators or parades at any time, to comply with state restrictions on social distancing, and it will not be possible to accommodate spectators due to large graduating-class sizes.

Principals were scheduled to have sent out detailed information to seniors and their parents earlier this week.

"Go all out with your cars, decorate your caps, and take advantage of the opportunities that we have, and let's make this something to remember for the entire community of Las Cruces," Trujillo said.

Henson's talk inspired everyone in attendance, including this season's Aggies, who won the game on a last-second shot. That was NMSU's 15th victory in a row, and they won four more on their 19-game winning streak to make it a perfect

2020. The Aggies were Western Athletic Conference champs, but, unfortunately, did not get

to test their mettle and try for another shot at the Final Four, as the NCAA tournament was canceled.

Coach Henson and his wife, Mary, often the driving force in their many charitable efforts, made the annual Com-

munity Breakfast something special. Henson has missed the last few because of health issues (he was wearing a personal protective mask well before it became fashionable!), but he and Mary have continued support behind the scenes.

They have used their connections to help bring powerful guest speakers from the world of sports. Last year, we had Olympic decathlon gold medalist Dan O'Brien. Another year it was Jimmy Collins, the star of that 1970 Aggie team. There was another Olympic gold medalist, Jackie Joyner-Kersey, Denver Broncos Hall of Fame running back Terrell Davis and many others.

If you're reading this Coach Brown, I'm still asking you to bring your former LSU player Shaquille O'Neal to speak at the event.

The event is the Boys and Girls Club's signature fundraising effort each year. Just as many other local nonprofits, the Boys and Girls Club will be suffering the next year without the donations from the breakfast.

Everyone's financial worlds have turned upside down the past 60 days, and probably will continue to be precarious for the next 18 months.

As always, Las Cruces have stepped up to the plate to help out, even now.

If it's practical for you to do so, reach out and help your favorite charity. They need it now more than ever. I'm sure it would bring a smile to Coach Henson's face, as well as to Mary's.

The Infodemic: conspiracies, misinformation, nonsense

Have you heard? 5G cell towers are spreading the coronavirus; Dr. Anthony Fauci sent the virus to China in 2015; Medicare is incentivizing hospitals to lie on admittance and deaths of patients, giving out \$39,000 for each death; miracle cure gets rid of COVID-19; Bill Gates did it; vaccinations are designed so governments can depopulate the world; Schweppes tonic water prevents the virus; COVID-19 is a bioweapon developed by China; more; more; and more.

Why write about this?

There are people saying, “Oh sure, that sounds

reasonable.” Investigate before jumping on. Look at sources that are NOT in your social media streams. Search elsewhere.

Misinformation spreads like, yes, a virus. Social media algorithms look at what the reader is exploring and suggest more of the same, so if you look up the 5G conspiracy, you will find it, and a thousand more reinforcing videos and posts to support it. Finally, you might think, “Well so many people talk, write, video and post about this, it must be true.”

It is not.

To make things worse, when celebrities start to chime in, people believe them even more. Just because someone famous says

something, doesn’t mean it is true. Actor Woody Harrelson and UK personality Eamonn Holmes chimed in on the 5G theory, and people went crazy. This theory got so far out of control that 5G towers in the UK have been set on fire and broadband engineers have been threatened.

Then there’s the idea that secret messages about 5G and coronavirus are hidden in the design of the new 20-pound note in the UK. To quote an article from theconversation.com, “In reality, 5G relates to viruses and bank notes as much as the tooth fairy relates to zoology — not at all.”

There are some especially frightening ideas out there promoting dangerous

and disgusting thoughts which have been around for a while but are being adapted to the pandemic situation. QAnon is a complex political conspiracy theory group that cleaves to several of the COVID-19 misinformation flows. For example, QAnon promotes the use of Miracle Mineral Solution (MMS), which has been touted as a cure for everything from autism to cancer and HIV/AIDS. Now, MMS reportedly can cure COVID-19. What is this miracle cure? Um, its chlorine dioxide, also known as bleach. What can happen if you take it in amounts as small as one gram? Results could be nausea, vomiting, shedding of the mucous membranes in small and

large intestines and ruptured red blood cells.

It is our nature, as human beings, to look for answers to make sense of the world. We are organized and logical and unwilling sometimes to believe in the randomness of the universe. In a speech to open the second night of the draft, Payton Manning said our diligence in staying apart offers hope for the future.

"This may look like separation, but it's actually solidarity," he said. "It's sacrifice and service to the greater good. It's a sign that, through isolation, we are fighting as one. And there's no better reason than that for hope."

Hope is something all sports fans embrace, Manning said.

"But this year, we're hoping for more than a future star, a stronger

line or greater speed. We're hoping to fill a deeper need, with a future of full arenas, full voices, free rein to gather together. To feel the power of football together. Because that will mean life is back to normal for us all."

Cue the choir.

I've been a Peyton Manning fan ever since he brought a third Super Bowl championship to my beloved Broncos. But

we're not getting back to normal this fall.

The draft shattered past TV ratings, with 15.6 million sports-starved viewers the first night and 8.2 million the second. It was done by video conferencing, just like everything else these days. But that didn't really matter. The lack of drunken Jets fans booing the commissioner didn't diminish the entertainment value of the draft.

They will be missed, however, at Jets games.

The league has not yet released its plan for the coming season, but options reportedly include playing in empty or partially filled stadiums; moving or rescheduling games; and playing a shorter season.

The only live sports that have continued during the pandemic have

Hospitals taking 'measured approach' toward full operations

The information below from MountainView Regional Medical Center (MVRMC) and Memorial Medical Center (MMC) was provided to the Bulletin by Kelly Jameson, who is heading up the city/county Office of Emergency Management joint information center during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Bulletin: Both hospitals have had layoffs as a result of COVID-19. Will MVRMC and MMC begin rehiring/returning those laid-off employees immediately? And if not right away, when?

MVRMC: We are looking forward to opening up services to care for our

community. We have evaluated the public-health order along with recommendations and considerations of the New Mexico Medical Assistance Team (MAT), [which is] a planning group formed to assist with the combined response. We want to ensure that we remain compliant with our governor's expectations. The safety of our patients and staff remains our top priority, and we are working to ensure a safe environment for care as we take a measured approach to returning to elective and other non-urgent healthcare services.

MMC: Staff will begin returning from leaves of absence based on job function and department

census.

Bulletin: When does each hospital expect to be back at full employment?

MVRMC/MMC: This is an extremely variable target that isn't easily answered as it corresponds to the governor lifting the stay-at-home order and/or elective-procedure guidance. We will follow what is mandated and will return to normal operations as soon as deemed possible.

Bulletin: If a person needs surgery or treatment of some kind for a non-COVID related health issue, is it safe and advisable that he or she, or his or her doctor, be in contact with MVRMC or MMC now to schedule those procedures?

MVRMC: If a person needs surgery or treatment for a non-COVID related health issue, we encourage them to contact their physician or the hospital now to schedule those procedures. Our plan is to begin elective procedures and surgeries on May 11, pending completion of steps we are enacting. We have implemented safeguards to ensure a safe environment of care, including the creation of specific non-COVID areas and segregated staff assignments for additional patient protection.

MMC: Our staff continue to work with surgeons and other providers to ensure the patients who require treatment now

and meet the established guidelines have access to the proper treatment. Be assured our commitment to quality and safety remains our top priority. MMC has policies and procedures in place to protect our patients and staff.

Bulletin: Is each hospital's emergency room at full service?

MVRMC: Our emergency rooms remain open and fully operational. We strongly encourage individuals who may be experiencing a medical emergency or situation to call 911 and seek emergency medical treatment immediately. All hospitals, including ours, have infection-control practices in place in order to continue caring for patients.

MMC: Yes, MMC's Emergency Department is open 24/7, fully operational and staffed to handle all emergencies.

Bulletin: What about each hospital's remote locations in the county? Are they continuing to operate and provide a full range of services?

MVRMC: MountainView Medical Group's urgent-care sites and clinics are open and available for patients through either telehealth or in-person visits. Find out more at MountainViewDocs.com.

MMC: Many of the services have been centralized. MMC Physician Practices are continuing to see patients via telemedicine to ensure the safety of the patient.

New Mexico ranked third nationally for nurses

In part to celebrate National Nurses Week, May 6-12, the personal-finance website WalletHub ranked the best and worst states in the country for nursing, and New Mexico finished third.

Trailing only the states of Washington and Oregon overall, New Mexico was rated third in opportunity and competition, 4th for projected share of elderly population by 2030, 8th for nurses per capita, 13th for projected competition by 2026, 19th for both monthly and annual average starting

salary, adjusted for cost of living, and for share of best nursing homes, 22nd overall in work environment, 23rd for average number of work hours, 24th for nursing job openings per capita and 27th

for healthcare facilities per capita.

"I'm not at all surprised to read that New Mexico ranks third in attractiveness for nurses when compared to other states," said Mesilla Val-

ley Hospice Compliance Manager Lennie Marie Brown of Las Cruces. "I returned to NMSU in my 40s to pursue a new

career, and after reviewing my options, I was confident that becoming a registered nurse was the best choice."

Physical Therapy and Telehealth

It's said that necessity is the mother of invention. As the need for social distancing has become top of mind, we are offering patients a "virtual" option called 'Telehealth' that ensures both personal safety and continuity of treatment. These appointments allow patients to access physical therapy remotely, from the safety of their own homes. This option ensures those experiencing pain, injuries, or delayed orthopedic surgeries, or who haven't yet completed their full course of care, can directly access a physical therapist.

Physical therapy remains an essential service, and telehealth allows us to meet with patients virtually to track progress, review home exercises, and answer concerns and questions that our patients may have. We can use telehealth for screenings, for follow-up appointments, wellness check-ins, exercise progressions, and also initial evaluations and treatments.

A telehealth appointment is essentially a video conference between the patient and their physical therapist, using a home computer with webcam, a laptop, or a smartphone.

During the visit, patients can discuss treatments and progress, assess function, review rehab exercises, and modify home exercise programs. To prepare for one's telehealth visit, we suggest the following:

Find Ample, Quiet Space: Don't just connect from the comfort of your armchair. Even while you're at home, privacy is still important for your PT visit. Plus, you'll need space to move. Depending on the nature of your visit, your physical therapist may ask for you to demonstrate or repeat movements and exercises.

Dress for a Physical Therapy Visit: Wear comfortable clothes you can move in and which allow the physical

therapist to see and evaluate your movements. Workout clothes will likely work best.

Be Prepared to Share: As movement and exercise is the essence of physical therapy, be prepared to answer questions about your access to space and equipment in the home. Also, let the PT know if you have access to workout and rehab tools like mats, exercise bands, foam rollers, and so on.

Open Your Mind: If telehealth is new to you, welcome the experience. While it won't feel the same as a one-on-one visit, much thought and study has gone into ensuring the experience is effective. After an evaluation, the PT will tell you if he/she feels that an in-person session is needed.

With all the unknowns surrounding COVID-19 and the various ways it may continue affecting our lives, this is a way we can ensure all patients are empowered to take better control of their health care journeys. Not only does it allow our patients to continue treatment, but it also allows them the flexibility to determine what appointment method best meets your personal conditions.

Telehealth appointments are typically covered by insurance and require no additional appointment or access fees, though it is important to check with the insurance company.

While we are working hard to ensure that telehealth is an effective and useful tool for our patients, there are some patients who are in need of direct care. We are assessing the urgency of each patient's treatment program, and we are able to see some patients in the clinic when necessary.

City touts clean, tasty tap water

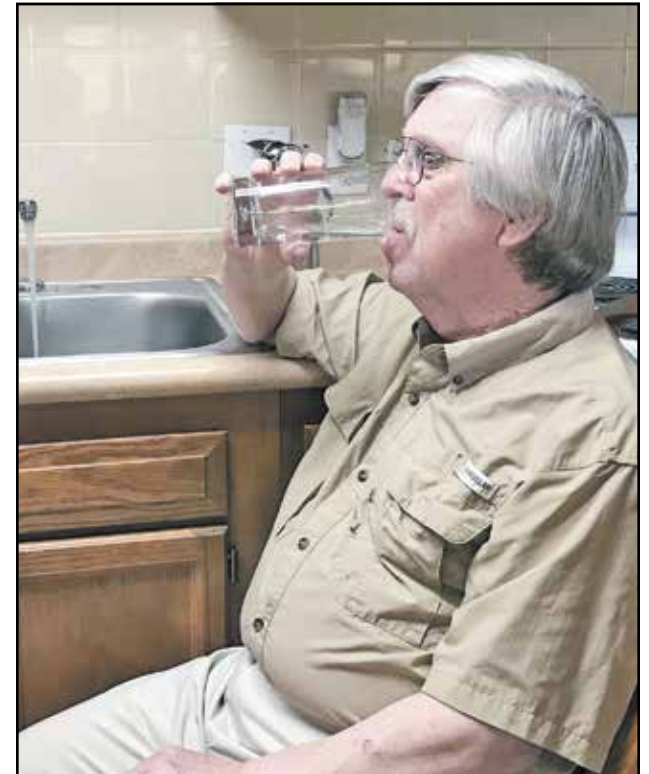

Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) Board of Commissioners Chairman William Little said he has complete trust in LCU providing safe and clean drinking water for city residents. Little, a professional hydrologist, had a 40-year career in environmental investigation and regulatory compliance.

"I always drink tap water. It's safer and tastier than any bottled water," he said.

Sampling and analysis of the tap water produced by all New Mexico cities is conducted independently by the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) Drinking Water Bureau samplers, and the state contracts with independent laboratories certified for drinking-water analysis.

Las Cruces water is naturally full of minerals and comes from deep groundwater reserves

— some of the wells are up to 1,100 feet deep. A charcoal filter on the faucet or on pitchers can remove any trace of chlorine."

Las Cruces city councilor joins advocates for immigrants to receive COVID-19 relief support

City Councilor Johana Campos said Las Cruces stepped up to provide care and support for more than 17,000 asylum seekers in Las Cruces last year when the federal government failed to do so, and the city is doing the same now for immigrants not included in state and federal COVID-19 relief funding.

Not providing funding to immigrant families “is not only irresponsible and offensive,” Camps said, it “will also have ripple effects” for Las Cruces. Restoring the economy will depend on everyone’s participation, she said.

Campos was speaking at a Zoom news conference Thursday, April 30, during which the nonprofit New Mexico Voices for Children (NMVC) introduced a report examining “the contributions immigrants make to the state and the nation – including the taxes they pay, the jobs they do, and the people they employ ... (and) how the major relief efforts are excluding many immigrants, and how, in turn,

this short-changes the communities in which they live.”

The report included policy recommendations “the state and federal government should take to include immigrants in the relief programs that are paid for, in part, by the taxes they contribute.”

“All COVID-19 relief efforts at the city level continue to include all of our families,” Campos said. “But I fear that it won’t be enough. We must continue to call on our state and federal governments to provide adequate relief for all of our families.” She said federal relief funds coming to Las Cruces and other local governments should be unrestricted, because “we know what is best for our community.”

NMVC Deputy Director Amber Wallin said nearly 200,000 of New Mexico’s approximately 2.1 million residents are immigrants, including 18 percent of Doña Ana County residents. She said New Mexico has many mixed-status families that combine residents and immigrants.

“Due to the Social Security number requirement in order to receive a rebate check, more than 30,000 New Mexico adults and more than 38,000 New Mexico children will be denied more than \$55 million in recovery rebates, meaning that money will not be circulating in New Mexico’s economy,”

according to the NMVC report, titled “Essential but Excluded.” The report also said “60,000 undocumented New Mexicans pay more than \$67.7million a year in state and local taxes.”

“We need to ensure that all new Mexicans are included in relief and continue to rebuild our economy,” Wallin said.

Other speakers at the news conference were immigrants and mothers in Albuquerque, Roswell, Hobbs, Deming and Santa Fe, including a housekeeper and a restaurant worker.

“Like all residents in the United States, immigrants make use of public services like education, health care and public safety,” the report said. “However, immigrants’ economic contributions far outweigh the cost of the public services they use. Immigrants hold a tremendous amount of purchasing power, and New Mexico immigrants inject \$3.2 billion every year into the economy in spending which keeps thousands of New Mexicans employed.”

The report recommends that the federal government “pass measures that are inclusive of all residents, regardless of immigration status, in order to strengthen the ability of workers, families and children all across the country to thrive and to make our economy and future strong,” and that state and local governments “do what they can to address those left out of federal relief in order to ensure that all New Mexico workers, families, and communities can survive through and

thrive after this crisis.”

Founded in 1987, NMVC is a nonpartisan nonprofit based in Albuquerque whose mission is “to improve the status, well-being and racial/ethnic equity of New Mexico’s children, families and communities in the areas of health, education and economic security by promoting public policies through credible research and effective advocacy,” according to www.nmvoices.org.

With a bachelor’s degree in chemistry and a minor in agriculture, a career in the controlled-environment crop cultivation, a natural green thumb and a love for sustainability and making nature and science work together, she’s producing about 150 pounds of mushrooms each week to sell to local restaurants and residents. She even delivers!

Zamacona uses wood pruned from Stahmann

Farms pecan trees as a host and adds nitrogen and other nutrients to grow shiitake, lion’s mane, oyster and black pearl mushrooms in a small greenhouse on south New Mexico Highway 28 in La Mesa. The four varieties take several weeks to mature in an environment where everything is controlled, including the amount of sunlight they receive, the humidity, temperature, carbon dioxide and fresh air.

“You need to find a balance so they can grow big and healthy,” Zamacona said.

After the mushrooms are harvested, the organic material created to help them grow is put back into the soil as compost,

she said, and the cycle of growing and harvesting continues.

Mushrooms are a healthy food that can help the human body build immunity and fight disease and cholesterol, Zamacona said. “They enhance flavor too,” she said.

Born in Morelia and raised in Querétaro, Mexico, Zamacona started working in greenhouses soon after graduating from college.

“That’s my thing,” she said. “I’ve always loved being around plants and nature.”

She moved to the United States to accept a job working for a greenhouse in Dallas, then took a job with Houweling’s Tomatoes, a family-owned greenhouse and farm in Mona, Utah. She met Roviro there and moved back with him to his native Las Cruces two years ago.

The couple began growing mushrooms last August and launched Full Circle in January. COVID-19 has temporarily slowed the company’s outreach to local restaurants, Zamacona said, so she is

focusing on home delivery. The minimum order is a half-pound, with Zamacona packing mushrooms each morning and making deliveries in the afternoon.

“I’m doing everything right now: growing, marketing, the cleaning lady, packing, delivering,” Zamacona said. She is also talking to the New Mexico State University College of Agricultural, Consumer and Environmental Sciences about “how we can work together,” she said.

“Ximena has an ex-

tensive background in biochemistry and greenhouse,” said Humberto Hajar, regional manager of WESST, a small-business consulting firm with offices in Las Cruces.

“Her history, as well as her methodology, is very unique, environmentally conscious and resourceful,” Hajar said.

Lazy Dog is bringing pocket billiards back to Las Cruces

Starting a business in the best of circumstances is difficult, but Sara Armijo said trying to launch Lazy Dog Billiards Club (LDBC) during the COVID-19 pandemic has been among the most challenging endeavors either she or her co-owner husband, Alan, can remember undertaking.

"We started this business in July of 2018 with the prospects to open in June of 2019," she said. "However, there were two national government shutdowns that delayed our [Small Business Administration] funding, local turnover in the city that delayed decisions on plan reviews and permits, and delays on the business-classification designations. We were very excited to finally get things moving at the be-

ginning of 2020 and we're on target to open in June."

Armijo said that if all goes according to plan, there will be a few soft openings to test all the areas of the operation and then a full grand opening with a triple ribbon cutting, with the Greater Las Cruces, Hispanic and Green chambers of commerce.

Armijo said LDBC have a full-serve liquor license for spirits, beer and wine, as well as a menu that will consist of pizza, pretzels, wings and salads.

The building is located on the northwest corner of the intersection of East Amador Avenue and South Campo Street. It will have 12 pool tables, each with high-grade, tournament-quality playing cloth. The building she said, is just shy of 6,000 square feet in area, and will also have dartboards.

"The tables are Dia-

mond Pro-Ams, which are among the highest quality tables for competitive billiards in the world," Armijo said. "Last year, we purchased [them] from one of the founding fathers of Billiards Congress of America, Mark Griffin, in Las Vegas, NV. We were lucky to score 12 Diamond box lights to match the Diamond tables."

She said service for the tables will be a combination of local vendors who specialize in Diamond products, as well as in-house upkeep.

Armijo said LDBC will be open to leagues for both 8-ball and 9-ball players, in both men's and women's formats. In addition, tournaments will be scheduled weekly. When leagues and tournaments are not in session, table rentals will be \$9 per hour. Dart board rentals will be \$5 per hour, with an addi-

tional rental fee for equipment, if players opt not to bring their own.

All rental fees will be halved, she said, for people who buy memberships in the club and keep them current. Other membership perks include food and beverage discounts and a reduction in league fees.

LDBC's dartboards will be Winmau Pro SFB Bristles, Armijo said, adding, "We intend to offer dart rentals, and hope to host a dart league during the week. We have been asked about a shuffleboard table and, as of now, it is not something we're planning to do."

Because of COVID-19, Armijo said the club will not initially open or run at full capacity.

"We'll follow all of the rules that are in effect at that time as far as sanitization, social distancing and other protocols set forth by the state," she said. "In addition, there will be further steps taken to assure our clients that

they are safe, including disposable menus, a person at all times dedicated to constant sanitization, contact-free payment, etc."

Armijo said that although the process has been arduous, and the opening conditions will be challenging, both she and her husband are excited about bringing pocket billiards back to Las Cruces, which lost both of its pool halls in recent years with the closings of My Brother's Place and Q-Time.

"We're very excited to bring a professional-level pool hall to Las Cruces," she said. "Our goal is not only to service those who are experienced pool and dart players, but to also develop new players with available classes and a fun environment. We are also planning on having family-friendly hours during the days on weekends, when children will be allowed, and alcohol will not be served."

changes," a news release stated. "We will be making temporary accommodations to ensure follow-up care is uninterrupted and any new issues can be addressed promptly. We expect more permanent accommodations to be finalized in the future."

Farmers, public can help keep canals clean

As irrigation season gets underway, local farmers and Elephant Butte Irrigation District (EBID) are teaming to prepare and maintain the area ditch networks, and they're seeking cooperation from all residents to keep the waterways clean and clear.

Jeff Pierce is a local business owner who also operates a small pecan farm south of Las Cruces.

"Clean canals and ditches means the water flows freely, which speeds up delivery and makes it quicker to irrigate a field," he said.

He said that tumbleweeds and stray vegetation are generally a bigger

maintenance problem than trash, but he still finds that "there is always a beer can or two that make it down my way."

EBID's essential ditch riders are still managing irrigation orders and driving canals to ensure there are no safety or maintenance problems,

said EBID's Karen Ray, who said the public can help by keeping them free and clean. She said trash in the ditches can become a safety hazard by causing water to back up and overflow the banks, creating flooding problems.

Pierce said his area of the valley is dominated

by a Salopek orchard, but every farmer pitches in.

"The ditch rider is usually very good about telling you when mowing debris or tumble weeds are coming down, and he usually says to leave the gate open and let it flow through before taking water from the canal," Pierce said. "I'm on the same canal as Salopek 6U farms, and those guys are on the ball when heavy cleanup is needed. Great neighbors. There are five of us smaller farmers on the same ditch. Me and one other kind of ramrod things."

Ray said the public can help farmers like Pierce by watching out and reporting the following to EBID's main office at 575-526-6671.

- Trash in the canals, including small items but also furniture, mattresses, shopping carts, etc.
- People living in the canals, drains and some of the box structures (mostly within city limits)
- Illegally dumped hazardous materials (i.e., needles) within city limits.

Ray said hot weather coincides with the advent of cooling water in the canal system during irrigation season.

"This year, with kids out of school and many people at home, makes it critical that families have that safety talk with their children. Don't play in the canals and ditches, it

is dangerous. Undercurrents and metal gates can become a life-threatening hazard to people in the water. Canal walls, both dirt and concrete, become slippery and can make it extremely difficult to climb out," she said. "Please be aware that bacteria in the irrigation water and fertilizers delivered through the water in the canals are all dangerous to human beings.

Pierce agreed and summed it up this way: "This is water we're talking about. Keep the water clean, no dumping. Very important."

Local representative's bill could help fight pulmonary illnesses

A bill co-sponsored by a Las Cruces state representative during the 2020

New Mexico legislative session could help in the fight against COVID-19 and other respiratory illnesses.

The Tobacco Products

Act, which state Rep. Joanne Ferrary, D-Las Cruces, co-sponsored in the state House of Representatives, "adds state licensure of in-state manufacturing, distribution or retail sale of tobacco products to the existing provisions on sales to minor(s) and e-cigarettes and liquid nicotine containers, effective July 1," according to a state Legislative Finance Committee impact report on the bill.

The bill defines a minor as anyone under age 21.

The new law "will also help people who have predisposition for lung problems," said Ferrary, who was first elected in 2016 and re-elected in 2018. It will mean "people with asthma or any other type of respiratory problems (are better) able to fight any kind of corona virus that might attack their system," she said. It will also reduce underage smoking, Ferrary said.

The New Mexico Department of Health (NMDOH) said the great-

est health impact from the act "will come from reducing legal and social access to tobacco products by youth and young adults."

Another new law that came from a bill sponsored by Ferrary is the Pet Food Fee for Neutering and Sheltering. The bill "creates a new spay and neuter program fee in the Commercial Feed Act to be

collected by NMDA on each brand name of commercial feed distributed in New Mexico for pet consumption," according to an LFC analysis of

the bill.

The fee won't deter the sales of pet food or pet owners' ability to feed their pets, Ferrary said, but it will generate money for spay and neuter clinics around the state.

A total of 13,300 pet food and pet treat labels were registered with New Mexico Department of Agriculture in 2019, the LFC analysis said. Based on that figure and the bill's graduated fee schedule, estimated revenues would from the new fee would be approximately \$657,850 in FY21, \$986,775 in FY22 and \$1,315,700 in FY23.

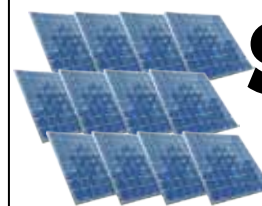

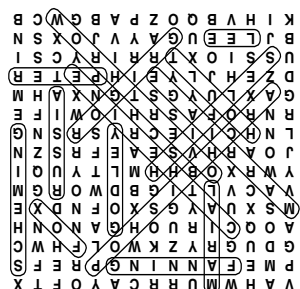

COVID-19 prevention is focus of long-term-care facilities

Editor's note: The Bulletin emailed more than a dozen local nursing homes, assisted-living facilities, senior living centers and long- and short-term care facilities to ask them for information about the precautions and protocols they have in place to deal with COVID-19. • Rehabilitation Hospital of Southern New Mexico and Advanced Care Hospital of Southern New Mexico: “We are following all Center for Disease Control (CDC) guidelines and taking the necessary precautions to keep our patients and staff safe and healthy. We screen each employee prior to their shifts, and we are not permitting any visitors at this time,” said Andriena Rosati Martinez, director of marketing and business development.

• Blue Horizon Memory Care is “following all CDC and (New Mexico) Department of Health (NMDOH) guidelines,” said owner Tracy Ayers. “In addition to practicing all recommended universal health precautions and PPE usage, we are screening all staff prior to each shift, residents’ temperatures are taken daily and they are monitored for symptoms 24 hours a day. We have an ample supply of PPE. We provide NMDOH with information every single morning regarding staffing, residents, PPE inventory, etc.” Ayers said Blue Horizon residents and staff are tested for COVID-19 “on a case-by-case basis and directed by NMDOH.” She said Blue Horizon is not currently allowing any visitors. “We are doing electronic visits using Face Time, etc., and we have windows and six-feet-away patio visits, following all guidelines. This protocol is also being followed at Casa Bella, which Ayers co-owns.

• Mesilla Valley Hospice. “The health of our patients, assisted living residents, staff and volunteers is of the utmost importance to us, therefore we are taking every necessary precaution and following guidance from NMDOH and the CDC,” said CEO Nina Salmon.

“All facility patients and residents are screened for symptoms daily. Staff and anyone else coming into the facility are screened at the door. We are not allowing visitors except for in situations where the patients are very near end of life. In fact, we started restricting visitors very early on, before the state mandated. We are in the process of having all staff and residents tested for COVID-19. Once this is completed, the DOH will require us to test 15 percent of our staff and residents on a weekly basis. Anyone who comes into the facility is required to complete a screening questionnaire, have their temperature taken, wear a mask and they are escorted to and from their destination within the building. We are also doing what we can to keep them connected through phone calls and Facetime.”

• Village at Northrise. “CDC and Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) began providing protocols and guidelines for the coronavirus,” said Chief Medical Officer Richard Feifer. “The Village at Northrise campus has diligently followed them. Some additional steps we have taken include screening residents and patients for symptoms, first daily and now three times daily, actively screening and taking temperatures of all staff upon building entry, visitation restrictions (except for exceptional circumstances, such as end-of-life situations) and cancellation of all outside medical appointments except for medically necessary and time-sensitive treatments, such as dialysis and chemotherapy. We have implemented video conferencing calls using Zoom technology. At this time, the Village at Northrise campus does not have any cases of COVID-19.

NMDOH is tracking positive COVID-19 cases in residents and/or staff at 25 congregate-living and acute-care facilities around the state. One of those facilities is in Las Cruces. On Tuesday morning, May 5, NMDOH Public Information Officer David Morgan said that facility had one staff member “in their 20s who tested positive. That person has gone on to test negative in retesting and has since been cleared as recovered.”

City examines options for film studio needs

After negotiations failed between the city and a private company to build a new film studio in Las Cruces, the city is evaluating two options as it moves forward with plans for a purpose-built studio, said city Economic Development Director Griselda Martinez.

After a year of negotiations, Martinez said the city was unable to come to an agreement with Tetrad Property Group, which was the only respondent to the city's RFP for the management and operation of a Las Cruces film soundstage facility. The RFP was cancelled in January, she said.

The two options now on the table:

- 1) Acquisition and retrofit of Las Cruces Film Studio at 2100 S. Valley Drive. Cost associated with this option would include acquisition of existent building, retrofit expenditures and management and operations costs of facility for the purposes of a film production facility, Martinez said.
- 2) Partnership with New Mexico State University/Doña

Ana Community College for a built-to-suit commercial film studio co-located with NMSU's Creative Media Institute and DACC's Creative Media Technology programs and their new buildings at NMSU's Arrowhead Park. This would require an industry partner to invest, manage and operate a commercial film studio, Martinez said.

"In any option, city staff is committed to support the growth of the digital media sector, with film as the catalyst for career opportunities for community members," Martinez said.

"Work is continuing to make a purpose-built studio happen," said state Sen. Jeff Steinborn, D-Doña Ana, who is president of the nonprofit Film Las Cruces (FLC) board of directors. "FLM is working closely with the city, NMSU, the community college and other partners on that."

Steinborn said FLC's film studio on Valley Drive is "open and

"He joined the film industry in the first years of the state's robust film-incentive program and is credited with being one of the key drivers in helping the industry to become a thriving economic sector in the state."

"You have a very, very engaged film community here. I always felt that energy when I came here,"

Gray said. Las Cruces “already has many of the assets you need to support the film industry here,” he said, including a major airport nearby, a large population base, the infrastructure, a supportive business community, a strong crew base and a “really incredible technical, creative community at Doña Ana Community College and New Mexico State University.” The city also has a 75,000-square-foot film studio located on Valley Drive.

What Las Cruces needs, Gray said, is to draw more attention to itself as a mecca for film and

television production. “That’s my job,” he said.

When he went to work in the film industry nearly 20 years ago, Gray said the thing that surprised him the most was “how small the industry is. It’s really a relationship-driven industry,” he said. “Everybody in the industry knows everybody else in the industry. I have a lot of those relationships. I know a lot of people in the industry. That is something I think that I bring to the table (for Las Cruces), which is a pipeline into the industry.”

One of Gray’s goals at FLC is to “open up the eyes of people who looked at Albuquerque before. Now I really am hoping that I’ll be able to bring

some exposure within the industry itself. I can really help Las Cruces.”

Both Gray and Steinborn are optimistic about the future of the film industry in Las Cruces and New

Mexico. The state created a rural film tax credit — as proposed by Steinborn during the 2019 legislative session—that gives film productions an extra 5 percent rebate for filming in Las Cruces and other New Mexico communities outside of Albuquerque and Santa Fe. And that’s on top of the state’s 25-30 percent rebate.

As with many other industries, the impact

of COVID-19 on film and television production is unknown at present, Gray said. “When we come out the other side, who knows what’s going to happen.”

But, other than basic necessities, the number-one consumer product is “entertainment content,” he said. Once COVID-19 passes, there “likely will be an explosion of productions.”

Film and television production “will sustain and come out of this in pretty good position,” Gray said. His goal is to make sure “Las Cruces will be ready, considered and in the mix (for producers) “to look at when they go

back to work.”

Gray said a Motion Picture Association of America study showed that 85 percent of the businesses that support the film and television industry have five employees or fewer. Film and TV production “is this incredible driver of small businesses,” he said. “It creates this great opportunity.”

Part of his job at FLC will be to get Las Cruces businesses and individuals to list the services they have available when a production comes to town, Gray said. “The

bottom line for small businesses in Las Cruces is, get listed in the directory for FLM to be ready when they call,” he said.

A production company could need a doctor to come on set at 2 a.m., a dog walker, a hotel, a caterer or everyone someone who makes green chile, he said. Visit www.filmlascruces.com and click on How Can We Help?

In addition to Gray and Foley, FLC staff includes Operations Coordinator Chris Sheppard and Studio Coordinator Guillermo Portillo.

ready for business (and) will continue to serve this community now and into the future.”

FLC manages, and DACC pays \$50,000 in

annual rent for the building, a one-time Coca Cola bottling facility that is owned by Duane Green of Roswell.

The city has committed \$4 million to invest in a public-private partnership to build and operate a film studio.

Submitting artists or groups of artists are responsible for:

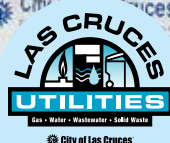

NMSU theatre professor, students collaborate with local nonprofit

What do you get when you combine talented students and staff from the New Mexico State University Theatre Department with members of the Doña Ana Communities United (DACU) nonprofit of Las Cruces? The answer: An innovative and creative monologue-writing workshop held interactively.

Two workshops were held in April with NMSU Theatre Department actors and DACU members via Zoom, said Assistant Professor of Theatre Arts Nichole Hamilton.

For the first workshop, “we improvised with writing games and then I provided ‘How to write a monologue/writing prompts,’” Hamilton said. “The participants then spent the next week or so writing monologues. Some reflected on our current situation, others varied in time and location or theme,” she said.

Monologues were submitted from DACU Director Kari Bachman, DACU timebank coordinator Samantha MacNeil, Beth Brandt, Rob Bustamante, Jim Rogers, Florence Hamilton, Michael Seamster and Sandy Bein. Hamilton also submitted a monologue.

During the second workshop, “student actors performed the monologues, with writers and other DACU members present through Zoom,” Hamilton said. “The actors received the monologues

before to allow some time to prepare.”

Hamilton said the volunteer actors she recruited for the project are all NMSU seniors.

“It was not necessarily the original intent, it just occurred to me that this could be a way to celebrate and honor them as well,” she said. Participating students were Nick Check, Xodia Choate, Jenna Ivey, Samuel Alvelais and Yamillex Holguin.

“I typically provide one theatre workshop per semester with DACU,” Hamilton said. “Originally, we had intended to do improv games focusing on community building. And like many, we adapted to a different theme and a different format – but we found a way to keep going. I believe the outcome had a profound effect in community building and was, in many ways, therapeutic. Disruption serves a purpose.”

“It was a really great experience,” said Choate, who has performed in many theatre productions at NMSU and in the community. “I definitely didn’t

know quite what to expect going in, but it ended up being a really wonderful moment of togetherness and hope. It’s been a very isolating time, so it was great to have the opportunity to foster a sense of community through the arts again, and through theatre especially. The monologues were all quite personal, and by truthfully taking on the words that someone else had written, we were able to all connect with each other, even though we were working remotely. It’s been interesting to see how collaborative artforms are adapting to the world we’re currently inhabiting, and I think this was a

particularly successful experiment. More than ever, it feels like the sense of community that’s inherent to theatre is needed right now, so it was wonderful to be able to explore that through the medium of a Zoom meeting,” Choate said.

“I thought the project was a really good way for our students to experience working with ‘amateur’ writers, and focusing on our voices as a tool of performance, rather than full body movement, which is really a slight change to the entire performance aspect,” said Check. “And with the writers, there was no intent to create a wild story, at least not for my writer, it was very much channeling a lot of just their everyday thoughts and putting it in a way that is outward, sort of voicing their subconscious, if you will.”

The workshops were part of DACU’s regularly scheduled United Friday programming, Bachman

said.

Here are Hamilton’s suggestions on how to write your own monologue: Include a beginning, middle and end; include background information, climax and resolution; talk to another person.

Her topic suggestions were: How do you thrive? Write a letter to your one-year-old self from your now self. Write a letter to a different generation. Write a letter to someone you wish you would’ve said something to when you had the chance. What would you say to someone if you had the courage? Put the current public health emergency into a metaphor and tell it as a children’s story.

Poetry Out Loud: Las Cruces travel north to face a poetry challenge

When Lizzett Solis stepped on the stage in Albuquerque to recite three poems, she felt like everybody there could hear her heartbeat.

"It was pretty awesome and frightening, but it was actually one of the greatest experiences of my life," she said. "Overall,

what I learned with my experience is, if you put your heart to it, be yourself, as long as you have the courage to go up there, it's ok. People really liked the performance. If you put your mind to it, you can do it."

Solis was one of seven finalists from across the state participating in the 2020 Poetry Out Loud National Recitation Contest,

hoping to go on to the national level, which was slated for April 27-29 but now has been canceled. She represented Las Cruces' Rio Grande Preparatory Institute.

Simran Grover of Arrowhead Park Medical Academy was the other local participant for the state event, which was held March 8. Arrowhead sponsor Reyes Duran described the event as a national poetry recitation competition.

"In schools all over the country, students memorize poems and recite them," Duran said. "The winner gets a big prize. It's a pretty nice event, and they do win money at the state level.

Duran and the other Arrowhead sponsor, Kernie Zimmerman, are English teachers who have been running a Poetry Out Loud Club for students who are interested in poetry and public speaking.

"So, we had two girls who loved poetry," she said. "It's good for both of them to have to stand up and do it in front of the public. Some teachers do it, too."

Judging the recitations is based on several crite-

ria, she said, including memorization, understanding, articulation and overall performance.

"How do they stand or add dramatic effect, use their voice, do hand movements," Duran said. "And then I think articulation is the last category. Our students just really enjoyed poetry and thinking about how they express themselves."

Solis faced additional challenges to get herself to the state competition. A 23-year-old, returning senior, she returned to high school after "going on the wrong path." A single mother, Solis became an alcoholic and drug addict, then she pulled herself up and got out of that life.

"I had a choice, either

I worked or went back to school," she said. "I barely got out, got purpose, went to recovery, and have been sober and clean since last May."

With dreams and goals she had lost track of, now she is ranked second in her class and participating not only in Poetry Out Loud, but other school related activities, as well.

"I supposed I am determined," she said. "It's been really weird road, but it's going the way I want it right now."

Solis and the other six finalists recited three poems they had chosen. For Solis, the poems she chose were "Revenge" by Laticia Landon, "Broken Promises" by David Kirby and "Advice from La Llorona" by Deborah A. Miranda.

After hearing a talk and recitation from a well-known slam poet, Solis said she was touched and started looking for poems to read.

"I was more interested in the way she recited a poem with all her heart," she said. "I started looking for the poems. At the end ... they chose me."

Grover said she found her way to the Poetry Out Loud Club at Arrowhead because the school is curriculum based, with no electives, and she has a penchant for drama. She had a friend in the club who encouraged her to join.

"I really like art, love writing, theatre, music and I really didn't have many opportunities," she said. "I didn't know if I would like this, but it was the closest thing to something I wanted to do."

In the end she loved the experience.

"It really helped me be confident in speaking as well as gave me an outlet for what I wanted to do," she said. "I thought it would make me nervous [reciting at the finals in Albuquerque] but everyone was so nice and so kind. I wasn't as nervous as I thought I would be. It really just reminded me of acting. I always loved the film side of art. It was a way to do what I like in an unconventional way."



COAS selling books online

You can still peruse the vast inventory (more than one million books) at COAS Books, but you'll have to keep doing it online for at least a little while longer.

Temporarily closed because of the public health situation, "COAS Books has an online store for you to browse an awesome library of books from the comfort and safety of your in-home isolation," COAS owner Mike Beckett said on Facebook. "Some Las Cruces consider COAS Books to be our community living room.

It's been sad that we've been unable to visit for so long, and we're excited to return after this crisis is over," Beckett said.

COAS history (from the Bulletin files)

COAS Books got its start in 1984 when Mike's dad, Pat Beckett, resigned his job as head of contract archeology at New Mexico State University. Mike graduated from NMSU with a business degree in 1988. He had been a sheet-metal worker but decided to trade metalworking for book selling and went to work at the bookstore.

Pat had been an "archaeological publisher and researcher" since

1973, collecting books at archeology conferences and calling his business the Center Of Anthropological Study (COAS).

Discovering that his house was "separating" because of the weight of his personal library in one corner room, Pat rented a space on Solano Drive, with his office in the back room and books for sale in the front. "That was the start of the bookstore," he said. The Becketts bought out other bookstores around the state to add to their growing inventory.

"We opened a store called 'My Bookstore' around 1988 on the corner of Mesquite and Solano,

when we bought out Books Galore and More," Mike said. "That store is what moved to the downtown mall (in 1990). At that time, Dad leased the second floor to a couple of art studios, Teddy Sullivan's Piano Studio, Quote Magazine, and to Human Systems Research (HSR)." When HSR moved to its current location on Melendres Street, "we moved a lot of the inventory from Melendres to the upstairs (of the Main Street bookstore), all the while having to prepare the Melendres property to be occupied by Human Systems Research," Mike said. Pat described the double move as "like trying to get two elephants through a doorway."

The bookstore at 317 N. Main St. has 14,000 square feet filled with books on its first floor, with another

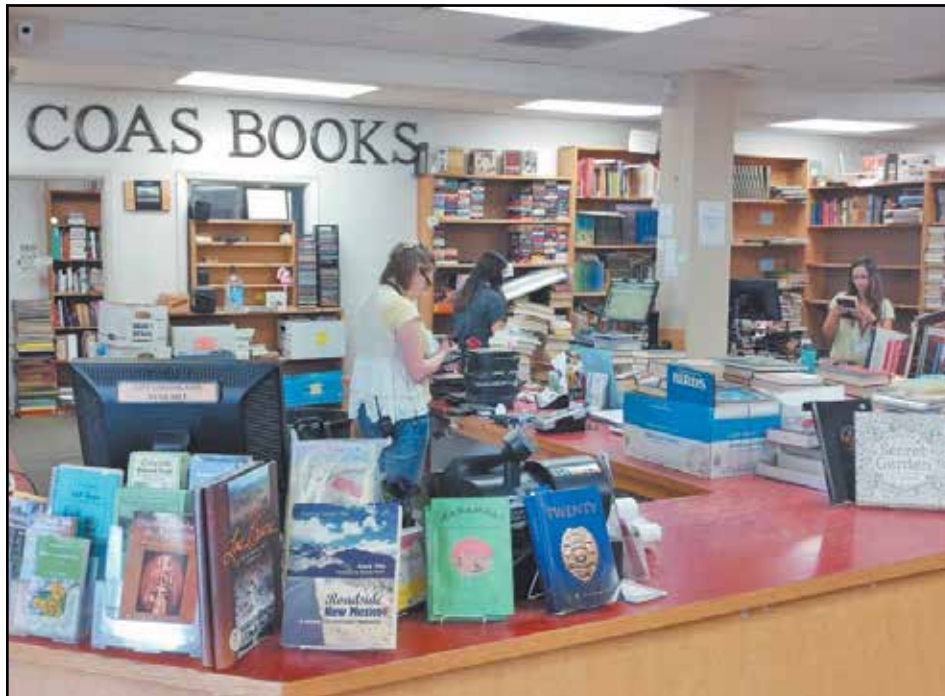

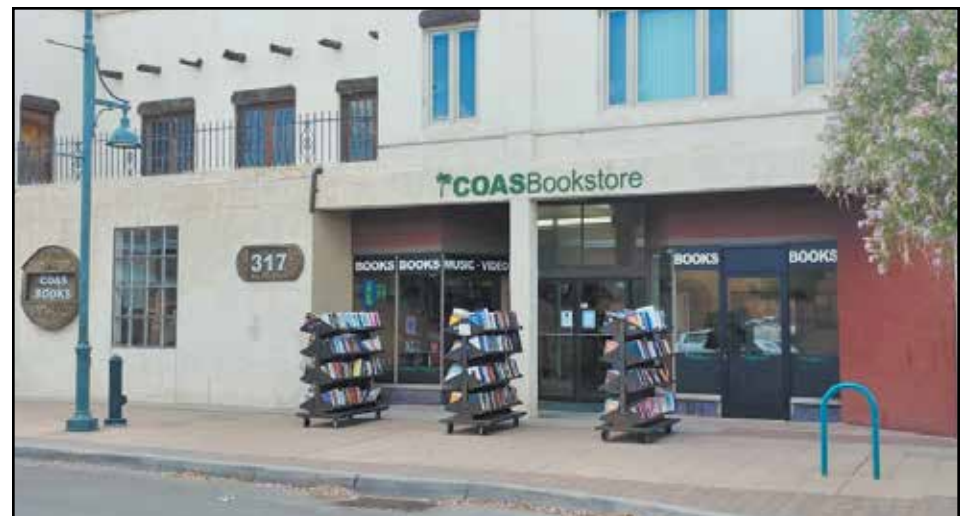
COAS Bookstores owner Mike Beckett working hard at the COAS warehouse, the bookstores' e-commerce division.

9,000 square feet upstairs. The Becketts' opened a second COAS at 1101 S. Solano Drive in 2005 that adds another 6,000 square feet, and there's even more warehouse and storage space.

Held annually in more than 600 communities nationwide, the walk is the world's largest event to raise awareness and funds for Alzheimer's care, support and research.

"We're looking forward to celebrating and honoring our loved ones with all of you," Chaddock said. "We hope we still have your support so we can continue to move our mission forward. A world without Alzheimer's is our vision, and we are still working hard to make this vision a reality. We will be proactive in notifying everyone of any changes regarding our event. Please continue to check our website for updates."

Electronic Caregiver (ECG) of Las Cruces has already pledged its support for the local walk. ECG staff are volunteering on the Las Cruces walk committee board, and a

Today, 5.8 million Americans are living with Alzheimer's disease, according to the Alzheimer's Association. By 2050, that number is expected to rise to nearly 14 million. It is the sixth leading cause of death in the United States. In New Mexico, an estimated 43,000 people over age 65 are living with Alzheimer's. There are about 108,000 unpaid dementia caregivers statewide, including many family members of Alzheimer's patients.

Currently, there is no prevention, proven treatment or cure for Alzheimer's.

The Alzheimer's Association is the largest and most impactful nonprofit funder of Alzheimer's and dementia science in the world. It is currently investing more than \$167 million in more than 500 projects in 27 countries.

children who can least afford to fall further behind. These effects occur during the usual eleven-week school vacation. These are certainly not usual times.

The COVID-19 educational interruption has now grown to at least 21 weeks.

Children's Reading Alliance is facing the challenge head on. Audrey

Hartley and Jennifer Alvarado are hastily creating pathways to get books to kids as quickly as possible. They are reaching out to community centers and school sites to add books to food-distribution programs. They are making books available every Friday at Lynn Community School and the Boys and Girls Club in conjunction with free breakfast/lunch programs. Their plan is to expand an ambitious outreach program to more relief sites for as long as we have books to give.

As we increase our outreach to more places across the county, our supply of books needs to be replenished. Each spring, we depend on the generosity of this amazing community to fund our books and our mission. Thanks to donations and a recent infusion of books from Mesilla Valley Rotary Club and Kappa Kappa Gamma Sorority, we have had enough books

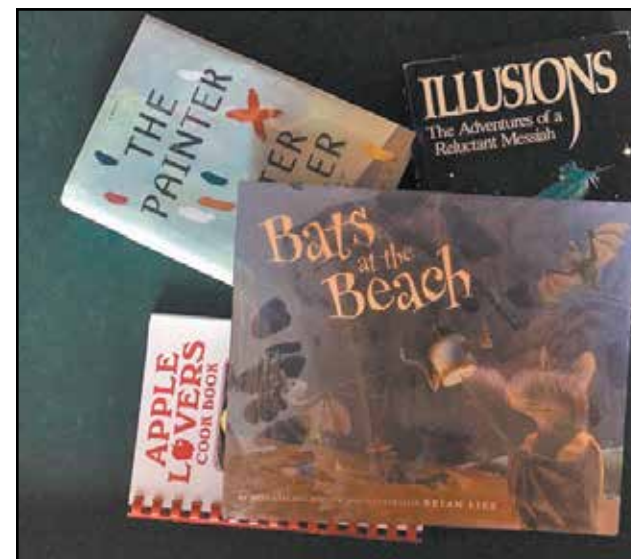
to make a good start. We will be needing many more.

The good news is that national book distributors are trying to help by offering warehouse prices for children's books sold in bulk. If we can take advantage of these bargains, we can keep a steady flow of books coming to children with the least access to resources.

A contribution at this time will put books into the hands of children while they are stuck at home and will keep CRA's mission alive and thriving when our community needs us most. In the meantime, don't forget about reading for your own enjoyment and to bolster stamina for the challenges we face. If there are others in your house, or if you communicate with loved ones through electronic chats, try sharing a story or poem with each other and tell us what happens.

Family read aloud time is enjoyable at every age. Shared reading provides precious opportunity for you to reacquaint with favorite books, discover some new ones and pro-



mote everyone's desire to read. Adults reading to children and talking about the stories builds essential listening comprehension skills and vocabulary. Just 20 minutes a day will impact your child's education well into the future. Increase the impact by asking follow-up questions like "What do you think...?" or "Why did you like that?" as you read. When adults read aloud and discuss books that are beyond their child's current independent reading level, essential skills are strengthened.

Not a confident reader? Use songs, nursery rhymes and silly poems you know to create a special story time. Hearing and repeating the rhyming and repeating patterns of sounds and phrases are fun and essential foundational props for small children, as well as beginning readers. Even before children can talk, your responses to their sounds and actions are building blocks to literacy.

Each day at home,

enjoy this extra time with your family to chat with them, notice and talk about things around you. Discuss the day's events. Explain what you are seeing, hearing and doing. Encourage children to ask questions and talk about what is happening.

Make each conversational moment longer by building upon what your child does and says. Talk about the things you see, hear and do together. Explain what is happening around you. Take turns and, make eye contact while talking to each other to stimulate longer, more meaningful conversations. Follow up with more information about subjects that interest your child. There is great power in family fun!

Make a woven bookmark

The Museums are closed until further notice, but you can still do fun activities at home! This week, make a woven bookmark to use when reading your favorite book. If you need a new book to read, check the digital resources available at the Thomas Branigan Memorial Library (library.las-cruces.org).

Supply list:

- 1-2 pieces of sturdy cardboard
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Ruler
- Tape (optional)
- Yarn (1-3 types)

Directions:

1. Gather supplies
2. Measure 0.25 inches from each end of the cardboard (1)
3. Cut 8-10 tabs from the edge to the measured line (2)
4. To make the weaving easier, cut two pieces of cardboard and tape to the loom as shown (3)
5. String your loom with one type of yarn as shown (4)
6. Make a weaving "needle" out of a piece of cardboard for each type of yarn you plan to use (5)
7. Weave the yarn across the loom in an "over/under" pattern, when you reach the end of the loom, weave back to the start going "under/over" (6,7)
8. Keep weaving "under/over" and back all the way down the loom (10). Make sure not to pull to tightly, leave some slack or you'll get an hourglass shape! (8)
9. Cut the strings on the back of your loom (9)
- Tie the ends together, two pieces at a time (10,11)
10. You now have a finished bookmark! (12)
