

# County Flood Commission adds 7 new flood warning system weather stations

The Doña Ana County Flood Commission recently installed seven new stations bringing the total number staff operates to 29, expanding the County's Flood Warning System by 24 percent.

The new automated weather and rainfall stations were installed at the Butterfield Trail Ranch, Chaparral Fire Station, Rincon Fire Station, Radium Springs, Lower Bilbo, West Mesa Cothern and the Williams Family Ranch, near Chamberino. All 29 stations collect a variety of data and continuously report rainfall depth, air temperature, relative humidity, barometric pressure, wind speed and direction, over a radio network, via repeaters at Caballo Peak, A mountain and in Chaparral, to a central base station at the Government Center.

Altogether, the Doña Ana County Flood Warning System is a network of 68 automated weather monitoring stations, rain gauges, pressure transducers and stream gauges that provide weather alerts and enable warning notifications throughout the state's southwest region. The system is a collaborative project between the Doña Ana County Flood Commission, City of Las Cruces, Elephant Butte Irrigation District, EBID, New Mexico State University, NMSU the National Weather Service, the Las Cruces and Santa Teresa Airports, along with other organizations.

Installing the new stations is part of the ALERT2 Flood Warning System defined in the Flood Warning System Master Plan, which was implemented in 2013. A disaster-mitigation grant from the Department of

> Homeland Security and Emergency Management, DHSEM funded the \$60,000 investment.

"As we continue to equip our Flood Warning System with more monitoring stations, we will be more effectively able to prepare for and respond to cause damage to County infrastructure and pose threats to residents' well-Flood Engineer with the Doña Ana County Flood Commission. "If we expect a large storm to occur in a particular area, we have the ability to warn residents who may be impacted by flash flooding or hazardous driving conditions so they can prepare, adjust or even evacuate."

One of the seven new flood warning system weather stations is installed at the Rincon Fire Station, by Doña Ana

The Flood Commission team includes two staff members devoted to the operation and maintenance of the Flood Warning System. They diligently monitor equipment readings to ensure the stations transmit accurate information and look for oddities or deficiencies to determine if the equipment is functioning properly or needs maintenance, Garza said.

"Our long-term plan is to continue increasing the efficiency of the system by adding more stations, continuously improving functional capabilities and ultimately, making people aware of the information we collect," Garza said. "We would like to add stream gauges inside major waterways to measure depth and velocity of flow, while also setting triggers for autoseasonal weather events that matic emergency notification when flow characteristics reach potentially dangerous levels."

These notifications would enable Flood Commission staff to warn of hazardous areas such as low water being." said Michael Garza, -crossings or areas known to have a high-risk of flooding. "Most importantly, they can help us keep residents informed and safe, countywide. Our Flood Warning System is well on its way to helping us reach that goal," Garza said.




Brook said the directory includes phone numbers, email addresses, as well

# Finding connections in silence and gratitude

It doesn't have 57,000 names like the Vietnam Memorial in Washington, D.C.

But there are 33 names that are on both walls.

It should mean something to you even if you don't know any of the names on it. But if you know at least one name, it means everything.

I'm talking about the memorial wall at Las Cruces' beautiful Veterans
Memorial Park. The wall lists
Orde the names of all the area military members who gave their lives in service since World War

I.

When Las Crucen SFC Antonio Rey Rodriguez was killed in Afghanistan Feb. 8 of this year, his marked the 204th name to go on the wall. The wall also lists the branches of service of each hero

Each year, on Memorial Day, the Military Order of the Purple Heart, Mesilla Valley Chapter, in conjunction with the Veterans Park Memorial Wall Committee, conducts a solemn service honoring the soldiers, sailors,

> marines and airmen whose names appear on the wall.

The ceremony will go on this year, but with a very limited group in attendance due to the public-health ordinances.

You won't be able to attend in person, but thanks to the Military

Order of the Purple Heart, you can review the names, and honor their sacrifice, in this week's Bulletin, on page 25.

Most years on Memorial Day weekend, I visit a local cemetery, browsing the graves. Typically, after some looking you'll find a military marker of a person who died young during a time of war. You can't know for certain if the deceased died in combat, but if not, you know that a fellow soldier or sailor likely did. I like to take a moment of silence and gratitude at the gravesite.

This year, I perused the list of names from the wall.

A name jumped out to me pretty quickly: Mike C. Beckett of the Army Air Corps, who died during World War II. I talked with my friend Pat Beckett, and sure enough, the deceased was Pat's uncle. Pat was only 3 or 4 at the time, but one of his earliest memories is of his grandmother, Antonia, spreading out all over the floor the letters Mike had written from overseas. Mike had gone through school in Las Cruces, was engaged to be married and 22 years old when he was declared dead Dec. 27, 1943. He had been missing since November, after being shot down in a B-17 over Germany. A newspaper clipping of the day said Mike was the 35th man from Doña Ana County to die in the war to that point.

Pat said, upon Mike's death, everyone in the family enlisted to go fight, including Herman, Pat's father and Mike's older brother.

"Mike joined the National

Guard before the war broke out, and he was part of the 200th Artillery Regiment that wound up going to Bataan," Pat said. "But he was such a good shot the Army Air Corps picked him up as a gunner."

Such is the randomness of war: Your assignment takes you away from one of the cruelest situations in World War II, and death finds you regardless.

Years later, Pat's wife, Becky, lost a first cousin – also named Mike – in the Vietnam War. Not long after, they had a son they named Mike, in honor of their fallen relatives. You may know the younger Mike Beckett; he and his wife, Veronica, run the COAS Bookstore, founded by Pat.

Look over the names yourself, and you'll likely find a connection as well.


Whether you do, or whether you don't, take a pause at one or two of the names, and take a moment of silence and gratitude.

from the front seat and blindfolded, but couldn't rope a live elk in an eight foot stock tank if his life depended on it.

#.0025 – Ropers who have been at it several years yet seem to have no aptitude for the sport. Still don't grasp basic concepts like nodding for the steer.

#.5 – Those cowboys condemned to always ride green, spooky, maladjusted "in train-

# Only feds can bust their budgets in a crisis

One of the big differences between state and federal governments is

that states are required to balance their budgets every year, but congresspersons still bellyache about the "fiscal irresponsibility" of the states.

The federal debt was just under \$23 trillion before the Covid-19 pandemic. The last time Congress passed a balanced federal budget was in 1996.

Since then, they've completely given up on the traditional budget process. They now fund the government with a series of continuing resolutions, simply repeating what has been done in the past, without any concern as to whether spending aligns with revenue.

States don't have that option. Nor do they have the option of seeking protection under the nation's bankruptcy laws, despite suggestions to the contrary by an ill-informed Sen. Mitch McConnell.

States have to make whatever spending cuts or tax increases are nec-

> essary to balance the budget every year. In 2017, then-Gov. Susana Martinez had to call a special session to make the cuts needed to make up for an unexpected drop

The situation in 2017 seemed like a crisis at the time, and it did result in deep cuts, especially to higher education. But it was caused by politics: a governor and Legislature of differing parties who wouldn't work together.

The crisis this time is real. And the hole is much deeper. It is estimated that revenue for this fiscal year could fall \$2 billion short of expectations.

The other big difference this year is the 2018 court ruling ordering the state to spend more on education. Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham had no reason to be concerned about that ruling when she took office and decided to abandon an appeal that had been filed by Gov. Martinez. But how will the state comply with it now?

It's clear that the spending increases passed in the last session are not sustainable and must be reconsidered in a special session. But rescinding those hikes won't be enough to compensate for both the economic shutdown caused by the pandemic and the drop in oil prices caused by a breakdown in international negotiations. The price for oil has bounced back from the day when it was trading for less than zero, but is still about half of what the state had based

its budget estimates on.

And it's not just the state. Municipal governments that rely heavily on gross receipts taxes will continue to see a huge drop in revenue until people feel safe to come out and freely interact once again.

They are the ones who pay for not just emergency services like police, fire and EMTs, but also basic services like trash collection and water delivery.

Las Cruces has enough money in reserves to get by for a while. But a lot of smaller towns were already struggling with a loss in revenue caused by online shopping and will now have to start making cuts to critical services if they don't get some help.

Congress has passed nearly \$3 trillion in relief packages for business and industry. That money has helped stabilize the economy and temporarily saved millions of jobs.

But it makes no sense to

throw a lifeline to the private sector while allowing the public sector to drown. And if you think things are bad now, imagine if those basic services are interrupted.







# Cruces Contigo: "With you" in English; together in any language

Local nonprofit pairs partners to check up on each other during pandemic

The National Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) states that a key to coping with stress caused by the pandemic is to connect with others. While it's critical that we abide by COVID-19 physical distancing guidelines, they go against our human need for connection and can lead to unnecessary health complications.

For example, people may hesitate to seek medical help for fear of contracting the virus. As well, their usual support systems may be stretched thin.

Loneliness and isolation are not just unpleasant. They are correlated with negative health outcomes as well as high health care utilization because lonely people often seek companionship through medical visits.

To address these challenges, Doña Ana Communities United (DACU) has initiated Cruces Contigo. DACU pairs up interested Las Crucens from all walks of life. Each pair agrees to check in on each other a few times per



week. The intent is to provide a link to the outside world, one which can help ensure that people are not experiencing medical or other crises. Check-ins usually occur by phone or text, though some happen via email or in person from a safe distance. The pair decides if they would like to conduct quick check-ins or have more extended conversations.

Cruces Contigo is available free of charge to all residents of Las Cruces, particularly those with health or economic chal-

lenges. While DACU initiated the program with members of the Mesilla Valley Timebank in late March, you do not need to be a timebank member to participate.

Already, one Contigo participant was rescued from a life-threatening medication imbalance when his Contigo partner noticed his text messages weren't making sense. In another case, a Contigo participant is helping her partner learn to use his new cell phone so he can connect with family mem-

bers across the country.

You can also join the timebank, through which county residents share their skills with one another without exchanging money. To become a member, make plans to attend DACU's June videoconference orientation. For more information, visit the DACU website at www.da-cu.org.

The timebank is one of three current DACU initiatives. The other two are social equity mapping and the Just Community radio show on Las Cruces radio station KTAL-LP 101.5, 8-9 a.m. every Thursday. "The show features voices that are less often heard in our community," DACU said on its website.

The nonprofit DACU, 151 S. Walnut St., unit B-13, was founded in 2013 to create "welcoming spaces for all people, especially those whose voices and stories go unheard," according to its mission statement. "We build genuine relationships, carry out uplifting projects and engage with local government."

# Ditch clean-up continues as irrigation season nears

Irrigation season in the Mesilla and south valley is underway, and the Elephant Butte Irrigation District (EBID) is pushing hard to finish canal cleaning, removing trash and debris to allow water to be safely delivered to farm fields and orchards without hazard to the public.

Canals are often used as a dumping ground and it

is an ongoing task to keep them free of obstructing trash, according to EBID Manager Gary Esslinger, whose employees are running backhoes to haul large trash out of the delivery. Others are mowing

and burning weeds, brush and other plant debris that accumulates.

EBID coordinates with the public works staff of the City of Las Cruces and Codes Enforcement along with the Las Cruces Police Department as they work to maintain these ditches and canals, especially around culverts that cross city streets, for which the city retains responsibility.

Keeping the ditches clean is magnified by the COVID-19 pandemic.

EBID Systems Director James Narvaez said people are a factor, as well. "In the midst of this whole COVID-19 and the tightening down of people not able to go to certain locations, people don't have a place to stay anymore. We're seeing a lot more of them living alongside the canal banks and inside the culverts under the city streets. There has definitely been

a big uptick in that this year, but we're trying to stay on top of it. We do our best because they are part of the community too and we try to give them a heads-up."

Water deliveries will begin around May 18. Farmers can call the Water Records Department Monday through Friday 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. at 575-524-8003 or by email at waterrecords@ ebid-nm.org.

The district is wellstocked with inventory of hand sanitizer, masks and everything necessary to provide a safe environment.

# Neighborhood gallery blossoms in Picacho Hills

After Paul Maxwell and other Picacho Hills artists had to cancel the Art in the Garden event this year. Maxwell started thinking about other ways to share his work.

He had a big spring planned with the Art in the Garden event and two other shows planned in Las Cruces to show his artwork. Then he remembered Florence, Italy, and the amazing street-chalk artists recreating the work of the masters on the ground.

"I got the idea maybe I could do some sidewalk art, and I walked out, and of course I don't have any sidewalks," he said. "I came up with the idea that I could get some plywood, and I had some house

paint samples."

Maxwell had participated in a Las Cruces downtown mural project in December 2019, and he had paint leftover. The first two panes he painted were copies of some of his own original acrylic works. He works in his front yard under a giant desert willow tree, where he can wave at neighbors cruising by.

There are some challenges in painting art in house paint outdoors, he admitted. It is hot and windy sometimes and house paint dries quickly.

"I try to get it done fast." Maxwell said. "These colors don't come out of a jar. I have a basic blue, red, a couple of greens, white and some tans. I mix like I do my acrylic. I use big brushes and move quickly. As an artist, it's a big challenge,

but I have fun doing it at the end of the day."

While the paintings are not for sale, he intends to eventually have a charity auction of some kind to raise money for the local food bank.

Other paintings that are part of "Our Neighborhood Gallery," (6648 Vista Hermosa) include Van Gogh and Monet replications. One of Van Gogh's paintings, part of the Saintes-Maries series,

has been one of Maxwell's favorites for a long time, since he saw the original at a San Francisco art museum. He takes suggestions at pmaxwell@bnsl.

"People ask me all the time, 'Have you always been an artist?' and the answer is yes," Maxwell said. "As a kid, I used to pick up pencils. As I grew up, I would do stuff in school, and I was doing portraits and oils in my teen years and my early 20s, but I was also going to college. I knew I had to make a living, and I also wanted to be financially successful, and I knew art is not paying bills."

Maxwell ended up with a doctorate in engineering and science. He taught for a while, was a consultant in Washington, D.C. for several years, served as a diplomat, was vicepresident of research at the University of TexasEl Paso and ran his own nonprofit in Santa Teresa, the Bi-National Sustainability Lab.

"I took kind of a crooked road down the path of creativity," he said. "But science and engineering are creative arts, as well, only they don't like to be called art. They like to think it's all logical and analytical, but the reality is most scientists I have worked with over the years are very creative."

In 2012, Maxwell was ready for a life change, and since art was something he wanted to explore, it became an opportunity to move in that direction. Now living in Picacho Hills, he has been taking classes, art training and creating art ever since.



Stone has a BA in chemistry from St. Olaf College, an MA in economics and mathematics from the University of North Dakota and a Ph.D. in economics from



For about 30 years, he was "a one-man band TV news guy (photographer, reporter, writer and editor), which was pretty serious work," Stone said. "My first, serious still photography was chasing butterflies around northern prairies."

Stone bought his first digital camera and highquality inkjet printer in 2005 and now carries a Fujifilm X-2 in a holster with a 50-200 mm lens and an X-t3 with 18-55 mm lens on a strap around his neck.

Now 77, Stone sells his work at the Las Cruces Farmers and Crafts Market and his gallery at 340 N. Mesquite St., which also features the works of other artists.



# Payroll-protection loans are popular, tricky to navigate

Banks in Las Cruces are busy processing loans for businesses that are taking advantage of the Payroll Protection Program (PPP) authorized by the COVID-19 relief package from the federal government

Jed Fanning, president of Citizen's Bank of Las Cruces, told Bulletin Publisher Richard Coltharp that his bank alone has staff working in shifts that begin at 4 a.m. to process all the applications they're receiving each week. He estimated Citizen's Bank has processed more than 800 loan applications through the program.

The Bulletin reached out to a local expert about the program, Christine Wright at Beasley Mitchell and Company, whose clients have been asking for information about the program and whether participating would work for them.

as of mid-April, so it's clear that New Mexico businesses are benefitt from this program. My firm has helped hundre of clients understand a apply for PPP loans, and from my conversations with local bankers I know they're busy processing.

**Bulletin:** Are a lot of Las Cruces businesses taking advantage of the payroll-protection program?

Wright: I recently saw statistics from the Small **Business Administration** indicating more than 5,300 loans were approved as of mid-April, so it's businesses are benefitting from this program. My firm has helped hundreds of clients understand and apply for PPP loans, and from my conversations with local bankers I know they're busy processing a large number of loans. Based on this, I know that many Las Crucens have already utilized this

program, and I'm still helping clients with their applications.

**Bulletin:** Is the program a loan or a grant?

Wright: The PPP is a loan available to business owners and non-profit organizations, and this loan is forgivable if borrowers use the money to keep paying their employees and comply with other program requirements. Any amount not forgiven will be a short-term, low-interest loan.

Bulletin: How many payroll cycles is it designed to cover?

Wright: The loan amount is based on 2.5 months of an employer's average [payroll], but after a business receives the loan, they have only eight weeks (or roughly two months) to spend

# Life Options & Advocacy: a voice for the elderly

During the time of COVID-19, many elderly people are isolated and alone. At least one local company works each day to alleviate the loneliness.

Life Options & Advocacy, LLC, (LO&A) has been owned and operated by Kat Mosier since 2006 as a home-based business. Mosier, along with Susan Shoberg and Mary Butkewich work closely with clients.

"We call ourselves healthcare advocates for the elderly," Mosier said.

In many cases, LO&A holds an individual's healthcare power of attorney. In other cases, they act as the "delegated agent" of the person holding power of attorney.

And in still other cases, they act as the elderly person's contracted advocate, working alongside them to research and decide upon issues that arise relative to the patient's care and quality of living.

"The vast majority of our clients reside in assisted living, all of which have been on lockdown since March," Mosier said. "Our company policy has always been that we visit our clients who live in a facility a minimum of once a week to make sure all is well, and they have no issues. We confer with staff if the client would rather not have a visit or if there are questions. With the lockdown, we've tried to supplement with phone calls to either the facility

or the client."

Mosier said clients who live independently in a facility "are a little easier to see, and we have continued to do medical appointments as needed while using precautions such as masks and gloves."

By whichever method they can, she said, LO&A staff communicates with each client on a regular basis and continues to assist with whatever they need.

"We collaborate with the client and the family. Our goal is to make sure everyone is safe and comfortable with whatever is going on at the time," Mosier said, adding "we're available 24/7/365 days a year."

the money. Fortunately, business owners are able to use up to 25 percent of their loan proceeds on certain non-payroll costs, such as rent or mortgage interest and utilities.

**Bulletin:** What are the main hesitancies of business owners in terms of enrolling?

Wright: In my experience, virtually all business owners want to know whether they should apply for the program. Most business owners know the basics, but they want more information to help them be confident in their decision-making. This is a new program. and business owners want to understand how it benefits them, what the rules are to receive loan forgiveness and get answers to their specific questions. That's where my firm has been able to help. By March 30, we had created a video that explained how the program works,

and we reached out to all of our clients to let them know how we could help them navigate through the PPP process.

**Bulletin:** What advice do you give clients who want to enroll but are unsure?

Wright: I help them understand the program, address their specific concerns and challenges and help them consider what other options are available. For example, a business who is shut down will struggle to meet the requirement to use 75 percent of their loan proceeds on payroll costs, in this case, it would be appropriate to consider various other SBA programs. For clients who are able to maintain their payroll without PPP, the employer retention tax credit is a great option but isn't available to PPP recipients.

**Bulletin:** What am I not asking that's important?

**Wright:** We should stress the importance of planning how business

owners will use their PPP money. In order to obtain loan forgiveness, they should make sure the money will be spent in the required time period on allowable expenses and have the necessary docu-

mentation they'll need in order to obtain loan forgiveness. My firm has developed a "PPP Loan Tracker," which we use to help our clients plan their PPP expenditures, and we start this process as soon

as the client's loan has been approved.

It's also important to focus on the intent of the Payroll Protection Program, which is to help businesses continue to pay employees and other expenses. I've experienced first-hand how the PPP program has enabled our local businesses to stay afloat. In many cases the businesses could not have survived without this help.



# Unprecedented recession makes forecasting difficult

One thing taught to every young economist is

that forecasting outside the sample is dangerous and that such forecasts are often little better than guesses. The problem with COVID-19 is that it is outside the sample. We have no historical

precedent for the current situation, so we're flying blind as we seek to develop policies. Our lack of understanding of COVID-19 is

reflected in the wide variety of predictions. Various economists have predicted recessions that are "V", a "U" or even a "W", by which is meant a sharp decline followed by a quick recov-

ery, a prolonged recession, and a double dip recession timed to each wave of the disease. As it turns out, according to a recent survey of economists, the current consensus is a "swoosh", so called because the hypothesized recovery is shaped like the Nike trademark — sharp decline followed by slow steady recovery.

The reason for this wide variety of forecasts is that the current recession is simply without precedent in the historical record: 36 million new jobless claims since the lockdown; the largest one-month increase in unemployment, result-

ing in the largest onemonth unemployment rate on record.

Early on in the crisis, many economists used the analogy of a natural disaster, recoveries from which are generally rapid. But this analogy doesn't work very well for COVID-19. Natural disasters affect relatively small areas. In the United States and most other developed countries, tried-and-true aid programs are available to help with recovery. Supply chains remain unaffected for the most part.

COVID-19 is very different. The impact is global. Massive government programs have been implemented, but there remains considerable uncertainty

about their effectiveness. And COVID-19 has massively disrupted supply chains, meaning recovery will likely be substantially delayed.

Some economists look back 100 years to the Spanish flu, the last major pandemic prior to COVID-19. But the economy back then was fundamentally different than today. In 1920, manufacturing, mining and agriculture enjoyed a much larger share of employment.

The best single (although far from prefect) predictor of the economy six months from now is the stock market, and the stock market has seen a strong rebound. After falling 35 percent, the market has regained 30 percent, indicating a strong recovery later this year. The problem is that the Fed has engaged in an unprecedented intervention into the market.

There just is not a good model to use when trying to understand the current circumstances. This makes predicting the recovery very difficult. Uncertainty — like unemployment — is at record levels.

# Sharp decline seen in numbers of cats and dogs coming to shelter

Las Cruces Bulletin

It seems that more cats and dogs are staying home during COVID-19

Animal Service Center of the Mesilla Valley (ASCMV) Executive Director Clint Thacker said the usual monthly average of about 550 animals coming into the center this time of year has dropped to 180-200 since the onset of the public health emergency.

"This is due to the city and the county animal control bringing in sick, injured and aggressive animals only," Thacker said. "Another big help has been our foster program. During quarantine. people have come willing to foster animals that would otherwise be here at the center. Many of these fostering families have already adopted the animal they've been fostering."

Thacker said he is

hopeful these trends will continue even after the COVID-19 pandemic is passed.

"We would like to see [animal control officers] continue to use similar efforts of only bringing animals in that really need the sheltering, the medical care and the safe housing. I feel a shelter is not a place for a healthy animal to be," he said. "It's a place an animal needs to be cared for, including euthanasia."

Part of that effort, Thacker said, requires animal control officers "to be very proactive and educate the animal owners when a dog is loose. Officers will also have to loosen their enforcement reasoning."

"Apparently, what we have seen happening here, during the COVID-19 pandemic, has also been happening across our country," said Greg Smith, who served on the ASCMV board for almost

the entire eight years he was on the Las Cruces City Council. "People discouraged from being in close contact with other people are turning to pets. So, animal surrenders seem to be down, animal abuse seems to be down and animal adoptions seem to be up. Whatever the reason, this is a serious net gain for our community. We know that people with pets tend to live longer, have fewer health issues and be happier. Given the special places our dogs and cats have had in our lives in our household, I can certainly attest to the warm spot our pets can hold in our hearts."

The public health emergency also presents a good opportunity to remind people of to be responsible pet owners.

"Provide them with food and water," Thacker said. "Love them and

treat them as such."

He said ASCMV would also "love more foster families. The program is simple. Just come in and select a pet, fill out paperwork and you're done," Thacker said.

The center also welcomes donations. "The best way to know your donations are doing good is to go to our Amazon wish list (see below) and watch our Facebook page (www. facebook.com/ASCMV). We are always asking for immediate donations. Our animals are fed a strict diet. If we get a food donation, we usually give it to someone to help keep their pet in their home."

Thacker said ASCMV's volunteer program is temporarily on hold for in-center duties like dog walking and pictures.



"But there are always means of volunteering while not in the center," he said. Working at home, people could "make goodies for the dogs, disposable toys for the cats, enrichment toys, etc."

"We were trying to achieve "no kill" status, and Clint Thacker has been a huge part of increasing our successes toward that goal," Smith said. "We were very fortu-

# Blood, plasma donations sought across nation

#### **BULLETIN REPORT**

Donated blood has always been a mainstay of modern medical care, but donated plasma is equally critical during the time of COVID-19.

The oldest and largest national independent nonprofit transfusion medicine organization, Vitalant, has launched a campaign to help COVID-19 and other patients through life-saving convalescent plasma and other blood donations, according to a news release.

"Donations are both safe and essential," said Dr. Ralph Vassallo, chief medical and scientific officer for Vitalant, whose local collection point is United Blood Services at 1200 Commerce Dr., in Las Cruces.

Under the banner of "Because of You, Life Doesn't Stop" Vitalant's network of donation centers, in concert with its hospital partners, operating under U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) investigational protocols, are collecting and transfusing plasma from eligible donors convalescing from COVID-19.

Recovered COVID-19 patients have immune-boosting antibodies to the virus in their plasma, which can be given to patients fighting COVID-19.

"Convalescent plasma from recovered COVID-19 patients is needed now, because it contains protective antibodies that may fight the virus and hopefully improve the outcome of COVID infection,"
Vassallo said. "The need
for these and all other
types of blood donations
has never been more immediate or more desperate. We believe that once
Americans are fully aware
of this crisis and the opportunity to save lives,
they will respond as they
always have in difficult
times."

In response to the global pandemic, Vitalant aims to raise awareness of the immediate need for plasma and the significant need for blood donations by highlighting these key factors:

 Convalescent plasma therapy is the only currently available investigational antibody-based treatment for COVID-19

- As shelter-in-place requirements are relaxed across the country, the weekly demand for blood components has increased by 25 percent compared to early April
- The need for blood is significantly increasing now that elective surgeries are being rescheduled
- Amid the COVID-19 pandemic, the need for blood has continued for childbirth, cancer treatments, essential medical procedures and everyday emergencies
- Resurgent use of blood requires an immediate increase in donations to maintain the U.S. blood supply

 Every blood donation can save up to three lives.

The U.S. Surgeon
General and Federal
Emergency Management
Agency (FEMA) have
designated blood donation
as an essential function,

you can't really change the other person. You have to work with what is there.

Nor can you change the golf course. It's interesting that two of the original rules of golf, settled on hundreds of years ago by the Scots, were: Play the course as you find it; and play the ball as it lies.

Now, that's a challenging business premise, isn't it? Since you can't change your boss (or your coworkers), you must change yourself for things to improve. This is what coaching helps you do. You ask yourself "How do

vourself. Get coaching. Take lessons, Read the literature. Practice regularly. Raise the bar on your own performance. Isn't that how you've made it so far in business?

# The Home Office Era

As millions transition into working from home to help thwart the spread of the coronavirus, maintaining both comfort and productivity has no doubt been an issue for many. While in-office workstations are often designed around ergonomic considerations and long-term trial and error, ensuring optimal comfort and health, home workspaces can often fall short in this regard. Home workspace safety and comfort, however, should remain top of mind.

#### Self-Care & Injury Prevention

While it sometimes feels we're all sacrificing right now to survive the COVID-19 outbreak, that doesn't mean we ignore self-care. This includes focusing on the hours you spend every day working from home, ensuring your workspace — whether at your kitchen table or at a desk in the corner of a spare bedroom — isn't putting you at risk of pain or injury.

According to the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), injuries resulting from work-related musculoskeletal disorders (WMSD) due to poor workplace ergonomics account for 34 percent of all workday injuries and illnesses.



Neck strains, pain in the shoulders or lower back, tendinitis, bursitis, carpal tunnel syndrome, and so on – injuries and ailments often associated with poor workplace ergonomics – can and should be prevented in the workplace, even when that workplace is in your home.

#### Boost Productivity

Sitting in fixed or constrained positions most of the day, often repeating



Dennis Prickett Physical Therapist Co-owner of Atrium Physical Therapy movements with the arms, hands and wrists, can take a toll on your body, leaving you more vulnerable to injury to the muscles, tendons and nerves. In contrast, a comfortable workspace is great for productivity and morale. OSHA estimates that the implementation of proper office ergonomics can increase productivity by an average of 11 percent.

So, whether your work-from-home stint ends in weeks or months, it's important to consider workspace improvements with an eye toward longevity. This includes abiding by the following guidelines for creating a safe and comfortable workstation:

- Set your desk, chair, keyboard and mouse in position so your hands, wrists and forearms rest in straight lines and run parallel to the floor. Use a wrist rest for your keyboard and mouse, if needed. Allow your upper-arms to hang normally from the side of your body, elbows bent at around 90 degrees.
- Place your monitor at a height that keeps your head level (or bent forward slightly) and in line with the rest of your body. The top of your monitor should sit slightly below eye level and about an arm's length away.
- Ensure your chair offers proper lumbar support, allowing for a slight inner curve of the lower spine.
- Keep your knees at about the same (or slightly lower) height as your hips, and make sure your feet can sit flatly on the floor. If they don't fully reach the floor, bring in a footrest to support your feet.
- Take frequent breaks from sitting. Take time to stand up and stretch for a minute or two every half-hour or so. And, if you can, take a walk over breaks or during lunch.

If stiffness, soreness, numbness and pain persist, or you have a question about setting up a proper workspace in your home, contact your physical therapist to discuss options for an initial assessment.

# **Blind Contour Drawing**

Want to try a weird and wacky experiment? Try drawing without looking at the paper! This practice is called blind contour drawing and is used by artists to improve observation. It is also a great practice in meditation. Here's how to do it:




- Decide how long you want to draw (Try to do it for 5 minutes—set the timer on a phone!)
- Get a piece of paper and a pencil (or pen or marker)
- Choose an object or person you want to draw
- Set the tip of your pencil on the paper—choose wisely! You don't want to lift your pencil up until you are done.
- Focus on one small area of the object that you want to begin with and start drawing.
- Try to draw the outline or contour of the object or person
- Don't look at your page until the 5 minutes is up!

What you get may look strange but it also might reveal something new!
