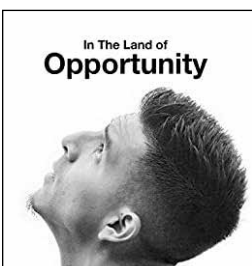

You are not alone

Dear Doña Ana County Residents,

As we close Mental Health Month, I want to thank mental health workers and celebrate that people can and do recover from mental illness and other diseases. We must also recognize that mental illness may be difficult to identify, and it can take years for people to access treatment.

It can be lonely and confusing for the person who is ill. At a time when they need the most support, they can experience even more isolation. Family, friends and a community that do not understand may unintentionally take a step back, misunderstand natural responses or the healing process.

As one in five Americans is affected, many of us know or love someone who is diagnosed with a mental illness.

I empathize with the families and caregivers of people with long-term illnesses because I know how devastating it is to see a loved one struggle and hurt, each time they fall.

I lost a brother who battled dementia for years. At first, we thought nothing of it. However, little by little, over months, we began to see the deterioration and it was devastating for all of us in the family and for everyone who knew him.

Salvador "Chovol" Gonzalez was well known in our small town of Anthony and across Doña Ana County because he was both a teacher and a coach for many years. Later, he served our community as county commissioner.

As his dementia progressed, the saddest thing for me, as his brother and long-time fan was to witness that he no longer remembered his good deeds. He forgot the students he taught and the athletes he coached throughout his Gadsden Independent School District career. Then, he stopped recognizing his closest friends and painfully, he no longer rejoiced in the significant contributions he made to our community.

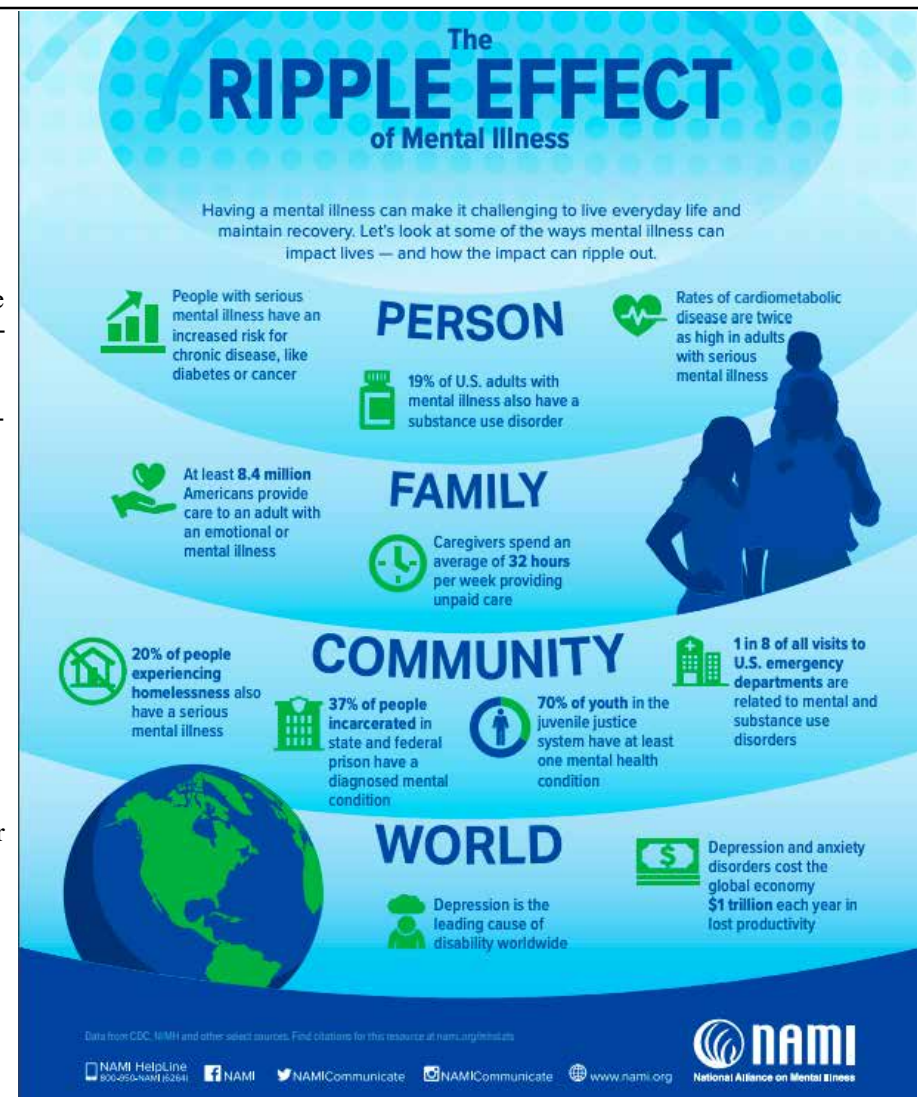
Chovol helped educate and shape our youths; then fought for and garnered roads, a police substation and funds for Doña Ana County District 2.

I am blessed to remember everything he accomplished. In his honor, I want thank everyone who works in mental health and help raise awareness about mental illness and the devastating impact it has on the person, their caregivers, their family and our community.

Let us change our approach and let them know they are not alone. By understanding mental illness better, we can also encourage people to seek help, rather than shame them.

Let us build our knowledge and foster a caring community. The National Alliance on Mental Illness sponsors the "You are not alone" campaign and encourages everyone to share their story. County political party chairs comment on primary voting, COVID-19 and more

The Bulletin asked the two major political party chairs in Doña Ana County for their thoughts on early voting, the impact of COVID-19 on the Primary and other campaign issues. Here are the responses from Mona Trempe, chair, Doña Ana County Democratic Party and David Tofsted, chair, Doña Ana County Republican Party.

Bulletin: Amid the public-health emergency, how are you reaching out to voters in the Primary, including early voting?

Trempe: In Doña Ana County, we are promoting absentee voting through our social-media posts, website and newsletters, and by participating in a statewide phone-banking effort. Even though the in-person candidate forum could not take place this year, we moved it online. That is, candidates in contested primaries were asked to answer questions about local issues and their responses are published on our website. The Democratic Party of New Mexico has launched an online campaign hub that serves as a central resource for candidates, activists and voters to learn about Democratic events and opportunities to get involved. The state party is also running a digital advertising program, which has seen massive success, including a 300 percent higher click rate than most political ads.

Tofsted: Our county

party has had Zoom-based outreach where our candidates have spoken during our monthly meeting. We also send out e-mails and maintain a Facebook page that gets good traffic.

Bulletin: What impact do you think COVID-19 will have on voter turnout for the primary? What are you hearing from candidates and from voters?

Trempe: In other states with recent primaries that required in-person voting, turnout dropped. This is something we are working hard to avoid in New Mexico. We are committed to making sure as many people as possible have their voices heard in every election. We have been encouraging voters to vote safely from home using an absentee ballot. Over 130,000 voters have already requested absentee ballots, so we are hoping our efforts are contributing to this result.

Tofsted: We don't anticipate a drastic change in either local or statewide turnout. Most of our candidates are attempting to work around the issues of the stay-at-home orders. So, this makes their situa-



tions difficult. The same sorts of limitations are happening to us as a party so we are not hearing as much as we normally would from the voters.

Bulletin: Do you think local voters are spending more time than usual learning about candidates and issues because of the stay-at-home order and the lack of campaign events?

Trempe: We are seeing a lot of enthusiasm for Democrats, as has been the case for the last several years. People are still adjusting to the new challenges and style of campaigning, but they are finding ways to educate themselves and to volunteer. Doña Ana County Democrats are fired up and ready to keep New Mexico blue in 2020.

Tofsted: No. We have few contested races, so we doubt they are spending more time than usual. Most of our candidates



have a Facebook page or a website. So voters could be able to connect to those and find information about their candidates.

Bulletin: In this county, more Democrats are early voting by absentee ballot and more Republicans in person. If there is a trend, does it mean anything?

Trempe: As soon as we heard from the (state) Supreme Court that in-person voting would be held, Democrats have been doing everything possible to encourage absentee voting. For example, our Facebook cover card and website remind people to

stay at home, wear a mask in public and vote by absentee ballot. We have been reaching out using every method available to us to make sure that people can make their voices heard without risking their health or safety or that of the poll workers. I think these numbers show the success of that education campaign and that voters, especially Democrats, are following the advice of public health experts.

Tofsted: There is a trend. Republicans who are voting in-person are more concerned about COVID-19. Also, our experience with the early voting is that the level of protection offered by the County Clerk's personnel is as good or better than anyone could experience visiting a supermarket or one of the essential

businesses in town, where lesser concern over social distancing is occurring.

Game II, Allen Theatres bringing drive-in movies back to town

(PUBLISHER'S NOTE: We learned at presstime that the Fort Union Drive-In in Las Vegas, New Mexico, originally planned to re-open May 15, but was halted by the governor's office, which said it fell under the same health protection orders as an indoor movie theater. Both of the establishments mentioned below, because they serve food and snacks, are certified restaurants, which are tentatively slated to re-open with restrictions in early June. All that to say, what you read below is subject to change.)

If life can't be like it was in 2019, maybe in at least one aspect, it can be like it was in 1959.

The unofficial start of summer is bringing to Las Cruces that iconic 1950s American summer activity: the drive-in movie.

Beginning June 3, and continuing through summer, Las Cruces can have a throwback experience watching a movie on a big screen, outdoors, from their own vehicle.

The drive-in fiesta begins

Wednesday, June 3, and Thursday, June 4, in the parking lot of the Game II restaurant at 4131 Northrise Drive.

Game II proprietor Marci Dickerson had planned to host a drive-in movie event earlier in May, but was prevented by the state's health protection order.

"We just wanted to do something different and give people a chance to get out and do something," Dickerson said. "So, we're going to do our thing for a couple of nights, and then Allen Theatres is going to start doing drive-ins."

Carside food service from the Game II will also be available.

Beginning Friday, June 5, and continuing nightly, movie-goers can drive up to their reserved spot at the back parking lot of Allen Theatres' Video 4 at 1005 E. El Paseo Road.

The parking spots areas will be treated as "auditoriums," with a blank space between each car, said Russell Allen of Allen Theatres.

"It'll be just like the way you

purchase tickets for the regular movie, only you're picking a parking spot instead of a seat," Allen said.

Popcorn and other goodies will be available from servers in the parking lot.

"You can order online, so it's completely touchless," Allen said, adding his staff will be wearing clear face shields instead of masks. "That way you can see them smile."

As of this writing, the movie selections had not been made, but Allen said they would likely go with older classics. Audio for the movies will be transmitted through FM radio signals.

"We know there's a lot of ways people can watch movies these days, but we also know people still really enjoy going out to the movies, and this is one way we could do it," Allen said. And for those who are staying home for their movie, but miss the movie popcorn, Allen Theatres' Cineport 10 at the Mesilla Valley Mall is selling popcorn every Friday and Saturday from 1-7 p.m.

Once the state gives the go-ahead for indoor movie at-

tendance, Allen Theatres is prepared.

"We bought foggers to disinfect every auditorium," Allen said. "We'll completely disinfect every auditorium between every show."

There will be another amenity waiting for customers when they return to indoor movies at the Telshor 12: adult beverages.

"We're officially a restaurant, with the same certification as a restaurant, and we've got our liquor license," Allen said.

The restaurant and liquor license are part of a larger plan Allen Theatres has to expand the Telshor 12 with an entertainment center, including video games and a bowling alley. Plans originally called for breaking ground on the entertainment center in May, but that has been delayed indefinitely, Allen said.

Whether COVID or DWI, preventing death is worth pursuing

I have spent my career fighting to reduce preventable deaths. It has been my life's work educating communities across New Mexico and the country about the dangers and consequences of drunk driving, one of the most tragically common causes of preventable deaths in the United States. Through education and public awareness, less than half as many people die in DWI crashes today than they did 20 years ago.

The fight against the coronavirus is ultimately a battle to reduce preventable deaths.

And like the fight to end drunk driving, the struggle to beat COVID-19 relies upon all of us taking personal responsibility and protecting ourselves and our fellow New Mexicans. That's why I support Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham's efforts to slow the spread of COVID-19. She understands that to win this war of attrition, every single New Mexican must continue to work together by listening to the science and following social-distancing guidelines to overcome this once-in-a-century pandemic.

Thanks in no small part to the leadership of Gov. Lujan Grisham,

New Mexico has made great strides toward winning this war. Transmission rates - one of the key indicators to determine how to reopen the state - are falling in most of the state. Rapid testing and contact tracing, encouraging social distancing and asking New Mexicans to stay home are some of the pillars of our statewide response that has finally put our state in a position to begin a cautious and balanced reopening. But ultimately, without everyday New Mexicans continuing to heed the advice of our state's public-health experts, we may soon find ourselves struggling to keep

open.

There is no doubt that doing what it takes to combat the coronavirus is taxing. Like many New Mexicans, after months stuck inside I'm eager to get back to normal; socializing with friends and going out to dinner with my family. But as Dr. Scrase (our New Mexico Dr. Fauci) has said, we must adjust to living in a COVID world for the time being. This means now more than ever — even as small businesses begin to reopen - that we must dedicate ourselves to following the governor's social distancing guidelines to ensure we slow the spread.

Here in southern New Mexico, this imperative is even more urgent. While the rest of the state has had transmission rates of each case tick down last week, southwestern New Mexico is the only region in the state that

saw an uptick in our transmission rate this week. With nearly 250 confirmed cases in Doña Ana County alone, we must remember that this fight is far from won. As businesses, churches

Archuleta, Cutter, others endorse Papen for Senate

Mary Kay Papen has always been a woman of boundless energy. Her skills and insights have established her as a knowledgeable and reliable leader. During her tenure in

the Senate, Mary Kay has improved New Mexico's way of doing things through her attention to complex issues. She championed an act that has brought \$33 million to our county's 37 colonias for much-needed infrastructure. She co-sponsored legislation making the Early Childhood Department a cabinet-level entity and has worked to clean up corruption in the New Mexico Housing Authority. Santa Teresa is a safer and more efficient port of entry because Mary Kay addressed border-trucking concerns. And all of us are safer thanks to Sen. Papen's success in passing "Katie's Law" requiring DNA testing in certain circumstances. This law is now a national model, providing a

tool for law enforcement and for families seeking justice for victims of violent crime.

The ability to secure funding for infrastructure projects and quality-of-life enhancements is an essential measure of a senator's effectiveness. Mary Kay Papen is consistently a star in doing this. She is able to balance many interests and needs while dealing with often limited funds. A list of Doña Ana County projects that Sen. Papen has supported includes roads, community centers, skateboard parks and water systems. City entities that have benefited include the Amador Hotel Restoration, Community of Hope, Klein Park, Pioneer Women's Park, Veterans Memorial Wall at Veterans Park, Regional

Aquatic Center, Henry A. Benavidez Community Center, Frank O. Papen Community Center, amenities for bus-riders and improvements to downtown parking and many local streets. Sen. Papen has secured funding for many elements of New Mexico State University: safety (crosswalk lighting, NMSU police cars), public service (Water Research Institute, Speech and Hearing Clinic, autism-testing program), academic resources (new facilities for arts programs, accreditation for psychology programs, hospitality/tourism kitchen lab, KRWG public-media equipment now being used to broadcast classes), and sports (upgrades to therapeutic riding facility, enhanced soccer field lighting,

renovation of women's locker rooms). Quite a list!

As the coronavirus hits New Mexico and oil prices plummet, it is essential that we have people like Sen. Papen in office working for us. Her wealth of legislative experience, her fiscal responsibility, combined with her deep humanitarianism, will safely guide New Mexico through these perilous times. Re-electing Sen. Mary Kay Papen is critical to the welfare of Southern New Mexico, and indeed, our entire state.

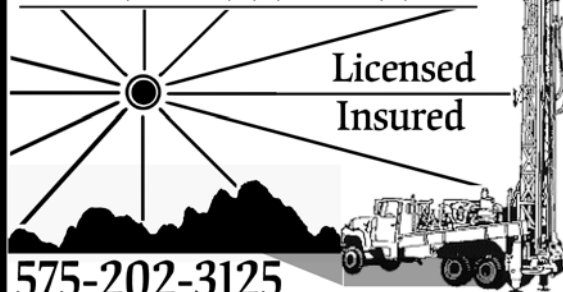

As demand grows, solid-waste team handles the load

A lot of households are doing spring cleaning, and demand for solid-



waste disposal is high.

Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) felt the impact of the clean-up and cleanout projects, especially those associates working with solid waste.

“Our solid-waste staff show up every day, deal with the extra workload, incorporate sanitizing efforts in the trash trucks, work long days, all the while being concerned about their own health and safety just like everyone else,” said Robin

Lawrence, LCU deputy director of solid waste. “I want to give kudos to each and every one of them.”

The numbers give a clear picture of the workload increase for LCU Solid Waste:

- Green Grapppler pickups in February totaled 772; in April, LCU had 1,658 pickups. That’s more than double the workload from the start of the stay-at-home orders.

- Regular Grapppler had 1,602 pickups in February; in April, pickups grew to 3,199. Another doubling of workload for the same number of drivers for solid-waste routes.

- Residential solid-waste tonnage rose from 2,257 tons in February to 2,936 tons in April, a 23 percent increase.

- Commercial tonnage went down, but, LCU set out three emergency/temporary roll-

off containers around town the last week in April, which were serviced (emptied) 21 times in six days, collecting more than 50 tons of trash.

With additional workload, some staff have gone beyond their regularly assigned duties.

“Supervisory Solid Waste staff now must ensure everybody has access to personal protective equipment (PPE),

constantly update their teams and on occasion jump on a truck to help staff pick up trash,” Lawrence said. “All the while, they’ve continued to do their best by providing support and encouragement in these trying times.”

LCU can be reached at 575-528-3500 from 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. LCU provides services to approximately 100,000 Las Cruces residents and businesses.

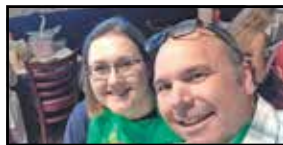

Anxiety and Exercise

Recent events have presented unexpected new experiences for all of us. For many, this has presented the potential for a "better normal" as we work to return to our regular home, work, and school activities.

But for those who struggle with general and consistent anxiety, however, the prospect of a 'different normal' and the expectations that come with them can be tricky to maneuver. Anxiety Disorders

- Your brain chemistry changes. Your body releases chemicals, like dopamine and endorphins in the brain, which contribute toward making you feel calmer and happier.

- General tension diminishes. Whether working out, playing or dancing, moving your body reduces general muscle tension in the body, decreasing your general feeling of anxiety.

- You get distracted. Exercising can have a distracting effect, diverting your mind from the things about which you are or have been anxious.

- You give your brain a boost. Several studies have shown that regular exercise can maintain, and even improve, cognitive function in the brain. That means exercise can actually help you strengthen your ability to weather high-stress situations.

On its own, exercise may not completely solve your anxiety issues. Those suffering from chronic anxiety should discuss options with their personal physician. When possible, though, studies show that regular exercise should be part of any natural, long-term treatment for anxiety.

Sticking with an Exercise Program

Do you struggle to stick with a consistent exercise regimen? Don't just join a gym. Experts agree you should find an activity or activities you enjoy. Recruit a friend or friends for some social support, and set a **SMART goal** – an acronym that describes a goal that's *Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Relevant and Time-based.* Also, visit a physical therapist if pain, discomfort, weaknesses or chronic conditions are keeping you from exercising safely and consistently. Following an initial assessment, a physical therapist can develop a personalized exercise program that best aligns with your individual circumstances and goals.

Based on the Phase I re-opening plan of the city Parks and Recreation Department (Parks & Rec) approved by city council

and aligned with Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham's extended public health emergency order and public safety guidelines, all city parks will be closed for the Memorial Day Holiday, except for a few

specialty areas and trails. Some city trails and specialty areas began modified schedules of operation May 22. Signage with reminders stressing the importance of social distancing, proper hygiene, trash pick-up and other tips is posted. Restrooms and water fountains are not available.

All players and participants must bring their own water and personal protective equipment.

Pickleball and tennis

- Apodaca Park pickleball courts, 801 E. Madrid Ave., open 8 a.m.-noon and 5-9 p.m. Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. Play is limited to two courts.
- Lions Park tennis

courts, 701 W. Picacho Ave. Play is limited to six courts.

Both facilities are open 8 a.m.-noon and 5-9 p.m. Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. Court sessions are limited to 45 minutes with 15 minutes between sessions. Players must bring their own water and their own personal protective equipment. Play is limited to singles or doubles play.

Other facilities

- Remote Control (RC) Track, 1453 E. Hadley Ave., will be open 9 a.m.-

noon Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday. The track will have a limit of four cars at one time. Racers will not enter until all racers from the previous session have cleared the track.

- RC Airport, located in the Las Cruces Foot-hills Landfill, 555 S. Sonoma Ranch Blvd., will be open 9 a.m.-noon Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday. The airfield will have a limit of three pilots during open sessions. Pilots will not be assigned to a runway until pilots from the previous session have cleared the runway. Participants must wear a mask and gloves to enter through the Foot-hills Landfill to get to the RC Airport.

- Butterfield Shooting Range, 3400 Frontage Road, 8-11 a.m. and 5-8 p.m. on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday. Participants are limited to five per bay or one


vehicle per bay. All users will be limited to a 90-minute session. Face coverings and social distancing will be required while onsite.

Parks & Rec will move into Phase II of its re-opening strategy with a target date of mid-to-late June.

Specialty areas, parks and facilities that will remain closed until further notice are all city parks (no services, including water fountains and restrooms), Skate Park, BMX track, Dog Park, athletic ballfields, East Mesa Recreation Center, Frank O'Brien Papen Center, Meerscheidt Recreation Center, Regional Aquatic Center and Frenger Pool.

Operational closures until further notice include sports practice, league play and tournaments on all city facilities (athletic fields); parks permitting to prevent gatherings; all youth and adult programming; all fitness classes; and Juvenile Citation Program and Keep Las Cruces Beautiful Program activities. Administration offices also remain closed.

Three Las Cruces high schools rank in Top 15 statewide

Three high schools in the Las Cruces Public Schools district have been named in the top 15 schools in New Mexico, according to a report by U.S. News and World Report.

Arrowhead Medical Academy ranked fifth on the list, Arrowhead Early College Academy took the ninth spot and Centennial High School ranked 13th.

The three schools were among more than 24,000 public schools reviewed across all 50 states, including the District of Columbia. Criteria for ranking included:

- College readiness based on the proportions of 12th grade students who took and passed advanced placement and/or International Baccalaureate exams.
- College curriculum breadth based on proportions of 12th grade students who took and passed AP and/or IB exams in multiple content areas.
- Math and reading proficiency, based on student performance on state-required tests.
- Math and reading

performance, based on whether performance on state assessments exceeded expectations given the school's proportion of underserved students.



ALANIZ

- Underserved student performance, based on how black, Hispanic and low-income students performed on state assessments compared with those who are not underserved in the state.
- Graduation rates based on the proportion of students who entered ninth grade in 2013-2014 and graduated four years later.

Domestic violence survivor, Las Cruces entrepreneur is now published author

He survived five years of abuse and neglect to become a Doña Ana Community College graduate and a successful Las Cruces entrepreneur. Now, Marco Olvera is a published author.

His brand-new book, "In the Land of Opportunity," is available on Amazon.com. Find it at www.amazon.com/dp/B088N7ZG5D/ref=cm_sw_r_cp_api_i_QsPWEb-HCHAM51.

In the book, "Marco tracks down the struggle that led to the isolation of



his family and the room where he and his brother were held captive for five years," said Amazon.com. "A journey toward citizenship while living in the shadows and the go-getter work ethic of two friends. Inspired by true

events." Here is Olvera's book dedication: "I dedicate this to my mother, my sisters, my brother and the new family to come. I wanted to write our history and rewrite our future. I also dedicate this to the hungry, the lost, dream-seekers and victims of domestic violence who inspired me to finish this story."

Chapter titles include "Role Models," "Life in Mexico," "The United States of America," "Living with the Enemy," "April 22nd, 2007" (the day he and his family escaped years of abuse in

Deming), "Working Well Together," "The Power of Manifestation," "From La Casa (domestic violence program) to Our Casa," "United States Citizen" and "Going Forward."

Here's a short excerpt from the book:

"My mother taught me endurance through these living conditions. There were times when she would come home with nothing. We used to rush her with hugs and kisses, asking if she made any money or if there was any food. When days were tough, the nights seemed to follow. I remember having to split sticks of

spearmint gum between the four of us. Those days were just too hard."

From the ages of 8 and 4, Olvera and his younger brother were kept almost continuously in a small room with the door closed in the family's home in Deming. The boys were fed and had a toilet, but the windows in their room were sealed shut, they could only take showers once a week and they weren't allowed to attend school or to celebrate their birthdays or Christmas.

The long-term abuse came at the hands of their mother's companion, who

owned the house they lived in and was the family's breadwinner.

Olvera credits La Casa, Inc. domestic violence program, where he and his family stayed for about a year after escaping their tormentor, with helping to restore their lives. Now 26, Olvera and close friend and business partner, Isaac Palafox, own a videography business in Las Cruces called Palamora (www.palamora.com and on Facebook).

"I found my way," said Olvera. A native of Mexico, he became a U.S. citizen at age 21.

New book details the geology of southern New Mexico

Did you know southern New Mexico contains parts of five geologic provinces and contains rocks that are nearly two billion years old?

Those are just two of the fascinating facts in a new book, "The Geology of Southern New Mexico's Parks, Monuments, and Public Lands" (GSNM) published by

the New Mexico Bureau of Geology and Mineral Resources, a research and service division of the New Mexico Institute of Mining and Technology in Socorro. The book was edited by Peter A. Scholle, Dana S. Ulmer-Scholle, Steven M. Cather, Shari A. Kelley, Belinda Harrison and Jennifer Eoff, and includes a cover photograph of Organ Mountain-Desert Peaks National Monument by

Las Cruces photographer Wayne Suggs.

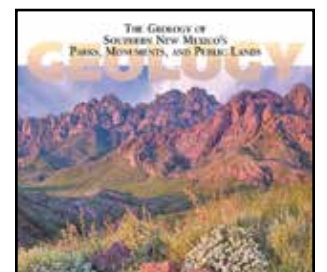
The 400-page edition is broken into six parts: the Mogollon Slope/Colorado Plateau, the Basin and Range, the Rio Grande rift, the Mogollon-Datil volcanic field and the Great Plains, along with a separate section on the Permian Basin.

The earliest geologic history of the Organ Mountains region is well more than one billion

years ago, the books says. Between 1.7 and 1.1 billion years ago, "volcanic islands and continents collided with the fledgling North American continent to build what is now much of the Southwest."

Closer to home, GSNM says "the majority of rocks exposed in the Organ Mountains are intrusive or volcanic in origin, the latter including both ash-flow tuffs and lavas." The oldest rocks

in the area are 1.4-billion-year-old granites. And get this: "Thin layers of Pleistocene volcanic ash in the upper part of the Camp Rice Formation include those from the Yellowstone caldera in Wyoming and the Long Valley caldera in California. These far-traveled ashes are a testament to the explosive power of these modern calderas."

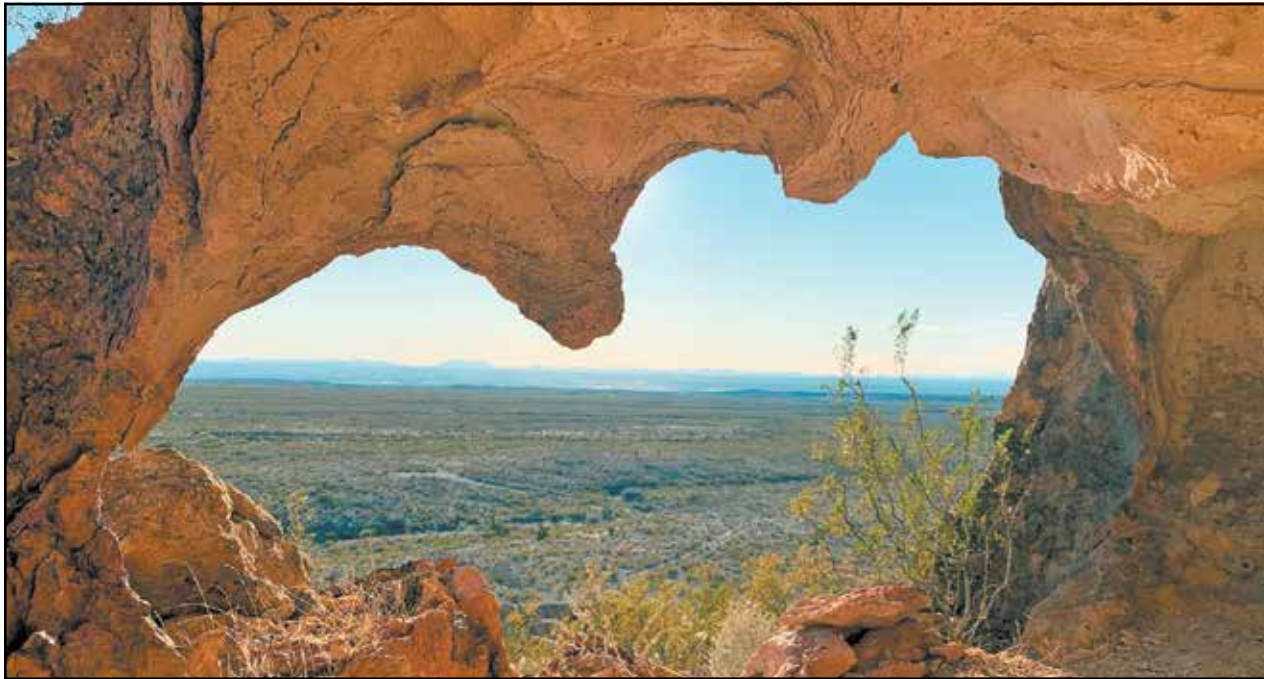

Ten rules for New Mexicans looking to get outside

From THE NEW MEXICO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT'S OUTDOOR RECREATION DIVISION

1. The health of others should still be your top priority. Bring a mask whenever you recreate and put it on when approaching other groups. Practice physical distancing.
2. Forget about campfires. There are statewide fire restrictions in place.
3. Avoid crowded trailheads. Have a back-up plan if your favorite spot is too crowded. Remember, the state parks that are open are operating under limited, day-use only capacity.
4. Check for closures. Check the land management agencies' websites before venturing out to recreate. Many of these places are closed right now to protect both recreationists and staff.
5. Practice "Leave No Trace" principles. Pack it in, pack it out.
6. Be prepared. Many developed recreation sites (including bathrooms) remain closed. Be self-sufficient by bringing in your own food, water and trash bags.
7. You can only camp overnight at dispersed, remote campsites. All public and private developed campsites remain closed.
8. You can book some outdoor guided trips and coaching sessions. You must still adhere to all group-size limits and physical distancing rules. Don't go out if you are sick. If you are not exhibiting symptoms, wear a mask to protect your guide or coach.
9. Gear rentals can resume so long as the equipment is properly and thoroughly sanitized between uses.
10. Public gatherings, events and camping in developed sites are still banned.

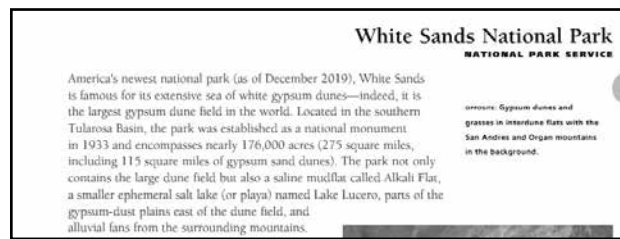

All told, the book “provides an understanding of the exposed rock units (and fossils) that record more than 1.7 billion years of geologic and biologic changes in this region.”

The book contains nearly 400 color photographs, plus maps and other illustrations that

detail the state’s geology from the Precambrian Era through the Paleozoic and Mesozoic eras to the present-day Cenozoic. (We’re in the Holocene Epoch of the Quaternary Period of the Phanerozoic Eon.)

Elephant Butte was formed more than 419 million years ago, Carlsbad Caverns is 250-300 million years old, the City of Rocks is about 56 million years old and the Organ Mountains rose about 36



million years ago. During the Pennsylvanian Period, about 300 million years ago, “as much as 80 percent of New Mexico was submerged beneath warm, shallow, tropical seas, (because it) lay close

to the equator at that time.” Human settlement, by contrast, began about 12,000 years ago.

areas and find a new favorite hiking trail,” said New Mexico Wild Deputy Director Tisha Broska. Using the guide “to find new wild places to explore once it is safe to do so will help us all recover mentally,” she said.

The guide can be accessed at hike.nmwild.org.

The guide provides a detailed description of each hiking trail, including driving instructions, the types of ecosystems present and an overview of the wilderness area containing the trail. Users may narrow searches to

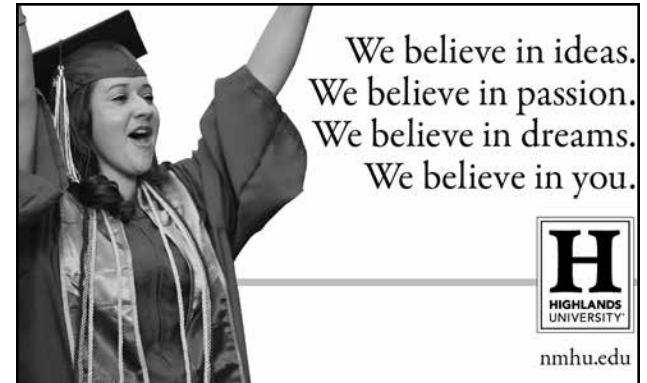
find trails that fit their interests using seven different filters: distance, route type, difficulty, water, natural features, activities and solitude. Users may also create a profile to share trail conditions and upload photos of their hikes to improve the accuracy of descriptions. Each trail features a downloadable PDF trail map and the ability to share trails on Facebook and Twitter.

vides a good example of the kind of information that is included with each trail, said New Mexico Wild Communications Coordinator Joey Keefe.

New Mexico Wild cautioned users of the guide to “heed the advice of Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham and public health officials when planning their next hiking trip. These guidelines include limiting long-distance travel and practicing physical distancing when on a hiking trail until the state’s stay-at-home order has been fully lifted.”

“Just as you would at the grocery store, please practice social distancing and put on a face mask when passing other hikers, bikers and bird-watchers on the trail,” the governor said in a state Economic Development Department news release. “And — as always — be respectful of the landscape. Follow all restrictions, including burn bans and leave nothing behind — whether it’s dog waste, your picnic trash or the jacket you needed in the morning but not in the afternoon.”

The exhibition “presents a body of work by MFA candidate Benero “that invites viewers to engage in sculptures that replicate childhood objects negotiating cultural dynamics and Mexican American hybrid identity,” the museum said in a news release.

Growing up in El Paso, Benero quickly realized that no matter how hard his family worked, keeping up with the Joneses was never in reach, UAM said. Through observation of other neighborhood kids having lavishly expensive toys while he was left to his own devices, he became aware of unbalanced cultural and class dynamics at a very early age. The goal of Benero’s use of accessible materials, such as cardboard, stucco tape, steel and plywood is to elevate commonly used household objects to “art status” by making a genuine gesture of authorship that is not implied through mass-produced objects.

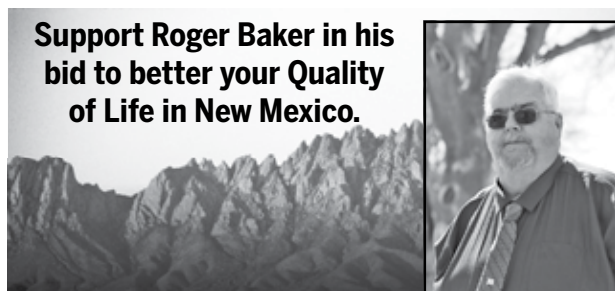

NMSU Teaching Academy director celebrates book's 15th anniversary

BULLETIN REPORT

The vision of the New Mexico State University Teaching Academy is to help NMSU educators develop extraordinary teaching lives embedded in exceptional careers.

NMSU associate professor of criminal justice and Academy Director Tara Gray is celebrating the 15th anniversary edition of her book "Publish & Flourish: Become a Prolific Scholar." She has been honored locally and nationally with 10 awards for teaching, scholarship and service.

Gray received her education at the United States Naval Academy, Southwestern College in Kansas and Oklahoma State, where she earned her Ph.D. in economics. Since then, she has published 50 scholarly works, including four books.

In 2005, after seven years of writing and development, "Publish & Flourish" was ready for print. It was published as a fundraiser for the NMSU Teaching Academy. The \$100,000 earned in book sales helps the Teaching Academy and has contributed to new carpet, paint and furnishings.

The book has been printed every five years since 2005. It aims to assist writers in tripling productivity, writing prose that is clearer, better organized and more compelling so they can publish in better journals and get more grants.

"Publish and Flourish" advocates three main ways of writing that are summarized in 10 steps. Gray encourages individuals to write 15 to 30 minutes per day or more. Her studies have shown that scholars using this method increase their submission rate from two articles per year to six. She advocates organizing each paragraph around a key or topic sentence. Gray also encourages writers to share their work with others informally before peer review.

"The book is equally applicable to many folks who write non-fiction, not just scholars," Gray said in an email to the Bulletin. "I wouldn't say the whole book is applicable for short-story authors, because one of the five sections is about organizing long, non-fiction articles, book chapters, or books. The other sections would be pretty applicable."

In 1998, Gray wrote an article titled, "Publish, Don't Perish."

"I was so excited about the paper that I began

thinking about the book and giving workshops on the subject here at NMSU and at conferences," Gray said. "Dr. Jane Birch from Brigham Young University participated in it at a conference, discovered me and invited me to campus."

Gray has now led workshops at BYU for 22 years. During that time, she has been invited to 120 other campuses, including Harvard. She has spoken to more than 10,000

academic participants in 35 states and seven countries.

Gray said her personal favorite piece of prose is "probably, Martin Luther King's 'Letter from a Birmingham Jail.'"

Las Cruces company receives state job-training funds

"X2nSat is grateful for the JTIP program and the approval of our application, said X2nSAT CEO Garrett Hill. "The program allows us to accelerate our hiring in Las

Cruces and expand our business. The application process for JTIP is relatively painless and very advantageous for companies looking to expand in New Mexico. Between the JTIP program and

partnerships with NMSU we believe that Las Cruces is well-suited to grow its community of high-tech businesses," he said.

"The job training awards demonstrate that New Mexico is becoming an even more attractive place where companies want to relocate and expand — and with that bring high-paying jobs," NMEDD Secretary Alicia J. Keyes said. "These incentives are vital right now so businesses can move past this uncertainty and into a period of sustained recovery."

The average hourly wage for the May JTIP jobs is \$31 statewide, with

positions ranging from \$17 to \$61 an hour, NMEDD said.

JTIP is one of the most generous training-incentive programs in the country, reimbursing 50-75 percent of employee wages for classroom and on-the-job training for up to six months, NMEDD said. The New Mexico Legislature created JTIP, formerly known as the Industrial Development Training Program, or "in plant training," in 1972. Since then, JTIP has supported more than 1,600 training projects and 47,000 new jobs.

The New Mexico Economic Development Department (NMEDD) Job Training Incentive Program (JTIP) board has approved funding for 20 New Mexico companies — including one in Las Cruces — to train 104 new employees and 24 interns, with an allocation of \$2.5 million in May, NMEDD said in a news release. JTIP awarded \$1.4 million to nine companies in March—none were in Las Cruces — for an additional 61 trainees and one intern.

The Las Cruces company receiving funds

is X2nSAT, Inc., which received \$141,570 for an average hourly wage of \$25 for eight trainees and \$18 for seven interns, the news release said.

X2nSAT, founded in 1996, provides wireless network and communications solutions, according to www.X2nSat.com, and "specializes in the unique needs and specific regulations of healthcare, utilities, oil and gas, enterprise, retail, distribution, telecommunications and maritime." X2nSAT has offices in Las Cruces and

Recovery or Revival? New Mexico's future is uncertain

Without question, COVID-19 has plunged us into far more than a health crisis. It has created a tidal wave of change in our daily lives, and, indeed, the "cure" has been painful — nationally, 16 people have lost their jobs for every one person who's been diagnosed with the virus, or about 120,000 New Mexicans.

So, while the conversation sweeping across the country is about reopen-

ing the economy, returning to normal, resuming our lives as we once knew

them, for New Mexico, that's simply not good enough. This moment gives us an opportunity to think beyond recovery to sparking an economic revival that carries our families from poverty to prosperity.

Economic revival can start here by taking the resources we have and strategically weaving them together into a

holistic "ecosystem of opportunity" that supports the economic potential for every member of our community.

First — we have to help our businesses get back to business. We must have a vibrant and growing business community to generate economic ripples in wages, taxes, investment, purchasing from local vendors, and attracting money from outside the community.

They need us to support them as customers, and we need to supply them with the well-qualified staff they need to be suc-

cessful. If there are employees unable to return to work, they can tap the flood of newly available workforce talent (experienced workers and recent high school, community college, and university graduates) to help them open safely and successfully. The technological transformation now essential to many business operations may even set the stage for any mom-and-pop business to reach more customers than ever before...and they'll need tech-savvy staff to keep them at the forefront of innovation.

Next — we need to help every single person — unemployed, underemployed, or struggling to make ends meet — acquire skills and training to secure jobs that pay life- and family-sustaining wages.

And with 120,000 people newly unemployed, now is the time to work seriously to lift as many people as possible off the need for public assistance programs.

Why? Because these well-intentioned programs have the unintended consequence of trapping people in pov-

erty and low wages with annual income limits (usually at 200% of the Federal poverty level) required to receive public benefits: \$25,520 for an individual and rising in scale by household size. A family of four, for example, has a limit of \$52,400.

According to New Mexico First's recent paper: Families in Crisis: The Cliff Effects and Churning, 800,000 New Mexicans currently receive one or more social supports through Medicaid, Temporary Assistance for

Needy Families, and the Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program. The New Mexico Child Care Assistance Program supports the families of 18,433 children with the cost of childcare for those who are working or pursuing their education to prepare for work. Another 26,000 people receive rental assistance for housing.

The financial “cliff” faced by those receiving assistance is that, if they were to earn more wages through a promotion, a job change, or working additional hours, the increase in their incomes may be offset by a greater loss of the financial benefit of the support: i.e. a

\$300/mo. raise may lead to the loss of \$600/mo. in childcare assistance, resulting in a net loss of \$300/mo. to the family. Even before the virus, the cliff effect negatively impacted the potential of people.

These programs need reform to support families in economically outgrowing their need for them by phasing out gradually... not an in-or-out approach.

Until that conversation is undertaken in a meaningful way, education, entrepreneurship, and economic development must drive the economic freedom of families. Fortunately for us, we have everything we need here to be successful.

- A first-class university with four-year and higher degree programs and research functions to drive talent development and seed new businesses through the Arrowhead Center.
- The Small Business Development Corporation ready to support

Keep adolescents away from liquor in your home

In this unprecedented time of COVID-19, we face a new reality of working and attending school at home. It is important to consider how to help your family make healthy decisions.

The Unified Prevention (UP!) Coalition of Doña Ana County and Wellness Alcohol Violence Education Program (WAVE) Rx offers parents and caregivers tips to help make home a safer and easier place for young people regarding alcohol.

Research from the National Institute on Alcohol

Abuse and Alcoholism (NIAAA) has shown that people who use alcohol before age 15 are six times more likely to become alcohol dependent than adults who begin drinking at age 21.

Evidence suggests that alcohol's effects on memory and learning are much

more severe in adolescents than in adults, according to the article "Alcohol's Effects on the Adolescent Brain" by Susanne Hiller-Sturmhöfel, Ph.D., and H. Scott Swartzwelder, Ph.D.

UP! Coalition and WAVE Rx encourage parents and guardians to regularly take inventory of the alcohol they have in the home and keep it in a locked area.

Each year the UP! Coalition and WAVE Rx conduct surveys, including the New Mexico Community Survey (NMCS) and the Student Lifestyle Survey (SLS), to understand the

nature and magnitude of youth alcohol, tobacco and other drug-use problems.

According to the most recent NMCS, 14 percent of New Mexico State University (NMSU) students surveyed under the age of 21 reported obtaining alcohol from a parent or guardian. Similarly, 22 percent of 18-20 Doña Ana County community members reported obtaining alcohol from an adult family member.

Change is a stressful thing for anyone, and young people are no exception to the rule. Stress is

often listed as a contributing factor to why young people start drinking, which is never a safe option.

It's important to help those under the age of 21 develop coping skills and gain tools to handle stress and change in healthy ways. One place to find resources to help young people and adults develop coping skill is Positive Psychology www.positive-psychology.com/coping-skills-worksheets/.

For support in talking to young people about underage drinking: Substance

Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA)'s "Talk. They Hear You." app is an interactive game that helps you learn the do's and don'ts of talking to kids about underage drinking (www.samhsa.gov/underage-drinking/mobile-application).

COVID-19 pandemic, the Department of Agriculture has assisted with identifying sources and securing food in a timely manner, whether it has been for food banks or for New Mexico's Nations,

Tribes and Pueblos.

To add to this effort, now consumers can link directly to local producers and agricultural businesses.

"We want to have a central hub for home-grown

and produced items," Witte said. "We're still working with the ag industry to grow this resource. Products are continuously being added to the list, and we plan to continue this effort post-pandemic."

Opinion: New Mexico needs a better healthcare system

The COVID-19 pandemic is revealing weaknesses in our health care system. As we fight this pandemic, it is imperative we re-evaluate the structure of our system.

One crucial question to ask is: should health coverage continue to be tied to employment? Because of the pandemic, millions of people are losing their jobs, and along with this, their health coverage.

A study published in

the Annals of Internal Medicine in April found that the layoffs caused by the pandemic could result in 7.3 million American workers (along with several million family members) being uninsured by June 30.

This is a tragedy not experienced in most other countries. In addition to facing unimaginable financial hardship, Americans are living in fear of not affording medical care if they get sick and not being able

to continue with their medications and other treatments.

How do we create a more effective and just health care system?

New Mexico has been working on its own home-grown solution for more

than two decades. The New Mexico Health Security Plan would allow our state to set up its own non-profit health plan, run like a cooperative, to ensure health care cover-

age for all New Mexicans.

It would include freedom of choice of health care providers, lifetime comprehensive benefits and fair premiums. If you lose your job or change jobs, your health coverage stays with you.

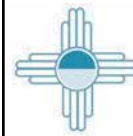

Mesilla Valley Hospital is celebrating Mental Health Month for the entire month of May, and will be recognizing Thursday, May 28 as, “#GoGreen4MH” Day. According to Mental Health America, the tools each individual uses to stay mentally healthy will vary and be unique. However, Mesilla Valley Hospital and the City of Las Cruces wants everyone to know that mental illnesses are real, and recovery is possible. When people develop their own #Tools2Thrive, it is possible for them to find balance between work and play, between the ups and downs of life, and between physical health and mental health.

Want to play better golf? Practice your awareness

When we make a post-round breakdown, shot-by-shot analysis of our last golf round, we might well notice things we did quite well, and we almost certainly will find some instances where we made some bad mistakes and unforced errors, especially having played under difficult conditions.

When I reflect on my own rounds, I begin to grasp how I failed to accommodate the myriad variables of the course

and conditions that day, and just how situational golf really is. Things like the wind, what's happening in the match, where do your misses go, are nerves holding up? Our performance at any given time depends on so much that can change in a heartbeat.

We can break down the conditions and situations into three categories to make things simpler.

First, there is internal: how you're feeling emo-

tionally, and what's going on between your ears.

The second is really social: where your match stands, who you are playing with, and how comfortable you are with the social context you find yourself in.

Thirdly, environmental factors are critical for making each shot. There is the lie, the distance, the wind temperature and humidity, the grass type, your equipment and consistency of the sand in the bunkers.

CBS on-course golf analyst and expert teacher Peter Kostis had a mantra

of "awareness and adjustment." He said pros have to calibrate their play and decisions to each course and each day's conditions.

Pros have caddies, who are probably better at awareness of conditions than their player. For us chops, the bad news is that detailed process of becoming awareness savvy and making successful adjustment each round seems daunting, almost like we should carry along a computer as we play.

But here's the good news: as we gain golfing

experience and golfing intelligence, we become more adept at adapting. That means we should become better as we acquire greater sensitivity of everything we should recognize, and greater capacity to regulate and modify our play to an infinite array of changing conditions. Awareness and adjustment take practice.

When it comes to self-management in a pressure situation, LPGA Hall of Famer (and New Mexico native) Kathy Whitworth once shared some wisdom she was taught by her mentor, the

late Harvey Penick.

Needing a par on the final hole to win an important tournament Whitworth recalled she had a short iron to the 18th green. "Not a difficult shot, but the circumstances made it hard. There was a lot riding on that swing. I was nervous, but as I approached the ball I could hear Harvey in my head saying, 'take dead aim.' He said it's too late to think swing, better think target. So I homed in on the flag, focused on nothing else and swung. I won the tournament." Timeless advice.

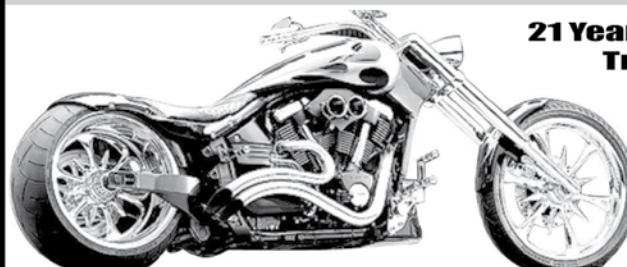
