County Airport seeks Advisory Board applicants

The Airport Advisory Board for the Doña Ana County International Jetport at Santa Teresa seeks applicants for two seats that will expire in July, to serve on the seven-member body. Applications are due by 5 p.m. on Friday, June 5.

Board members work closely with the jetport manager, County engineer, planning director and a representative of the County Attorney's Office to identify safety, growth, development or administration issues relevant to the airport.

The Board serves a staggered three-year term, meets monthly and periodically reports to the Board of County Commissioners. Selected applicants will serve from July 2020 to July 2023.

Long-time local legislators trail in unofficial Primary returns

Editor's note: Final Primary Election results were delayed in Doña Ana and five northern New Mexico counties due to the unprecedented number of voters who voted using an absentee ballot, according to New Mexico Secretary of State Maggie Toulouse Oliver. The 2020 Democratic Primary was apparently a mixed bag for incumbent Democrats who represent Doña Ana County in the New Mexico Legislature and who hold county offices, as unofficial results from the New Mexico Secretary of State's Office show several incumbents were trailing their opponents as The Bulletin went to press.

Unofficial results show state Sen. John Arthur Smith, D-Luna, Hidalgo,

By 2 p.m. June 2, 250 people had trickled in to vote in person at Las Cruces City Hall. Social distancing habits were generally observed, and poll workers were on duty to hand out ballots.

Sierra, Doña Ana, trailing Noemi O. Parra-Martinez, a Lordsburg teacher, by a wide margin in the Democratic Primary in Senate District 35. Smith has held the seat for 32 years.

In the District 38 Democratic Primary, state Sen. Mary Kay Papen, D-Doña Ana, was trailing Las Cruces Green Chamber of Commerce President and CEO Carrie Hamblen by 139 votes. Papen has held that seat for 20 years and is Senate president pro-tem.

State Sen. Joseph Cervantes, D-Doña Ana, appeared headed for an easy win against two opponents

in the Senate District 31 Primary. Cervantes is chair of the Senate Judiciary Committee with eight years of service in the state Senate and 12 years in the New Mexico House of Representatives before that.

State Sens. Jeff Steinborn (District 36) and Bill Soules (District 37) did not have opponents in the Democratic Primary. Steinborn will likely face Republican Kimberly A.

Skaggs in November. She was well ahead of Roger Martin Baker II in that Primary race in unofficial returns.

There was only one contested Primary in local New Mexico House races, as incumbent Ray Lara was ahead of former state Rep. Bill Gomez in the District 34 Democratic Primary. Both are from La Mesa.

In county races, incumbent County Commissioner Ramon S. Gonzalez was trailing Anthony Mayor Diane Murrillo-Trujillo in the District 2 race.

In the District 4 county commission Democratic primary, unofficial totals show Debra Ann Hathaway with a small lead over former county Magistrate

Judge Susana Chaparro, with Sam Bradley in third place. In the Republican Primary for that seat, Stacie Michelle Durham was ahead of Richard J. Reynaud by less than 40 votes in unofficial returns, with Jesus O. Oropeza in third place. The District 4 county commission general election race will also include Libertarian Buck Bonner, who was unopposed in his Primary. Incumbent District 4 Commissioner Isabella Solis, who could have run for re-election, filed instead for state representative, District 37. She was elected to the county commission as a Democrat in 2016 but switched to Republican after an unsuccessful campaign for mayor of Las Cruces last year.

District 5 County Com-

missioner Manuel Sanchez did not have an opponent in the Democratic Primary.

Incumbent County Clerk Amanda Lopez Askin received more than 83 percent of the vote against Andrew J. Ostic in that Democratic Primary. Incumbent County Treasurer Eric L. Rodriguez was more than 1,600 votes ahead of Gina Ortega in unofficial returns in the Democratic Primary.

Gerald M. Byers had no opponent in the Democratic Primary in the race for third Judicial District Attorney, and also has no General Election opponent, making Byers the presumed new D.A., taking office next Jan. 1 and succeeding Democrat Mark

D'Antonio, who is completing his second four-year term and did not seek re-election.

While Democratic winners in the District 2 county commission seat and district attorney Primaries won't have opponents in November, there will be contested General Election races for county clerk, treasurer and county commission Districts 4 and 5. All local legislative races are contested in November.

Unofficial totals show statewide voter turnout for the Primary was almost 37 percent and was almost 26 percent in Doña Ana County. Almost 994,000 voters were eligible to cast ballots in the Primary.

Mayfield High grad is presidential scholar; will attend Harvard this fall

Mayfield High School 2020 graduate Mireya Cosima Sánchez-Maes was one of two high school seniors named a New Mexico presidential scholar this year. The other recipient is Zachary J. Auster of Albuquerque Academy, against whom Sánchez-Maes competed in numerous speech and debate competitions in the past few years.

Sánchez-Maes was the 2020 Mayfield valedictorian and honor graduate.

“Now that I’ve graduated, I’ll be participating in Google’s Computer Science Summer Institute, a summer program typically held at Google headquarters (now held online) for historically underrepresented college students in computer science,” Sánchez-Maes said. “I was also chosen by the National Youth Science Foundation as one of two New Mexico delegates to participate in a series of interactive seminars

and lectures traditionally held at the National Youth Science Center in Davis, West Virginia (also now online).”

This fall, Sánchez-Maes will attend Harvard University with a full scholarship to study computer science and molecular/cellular biology.

“I’d like to pursue an MD/Ph.D. and eventually perform clinical research to benefit New Mexico’s medically underserved populations,” she said.

“The students of Las Cruces Public Schools can accomplish incredible things with the right

support,” Sánchez-Maes said. “I’ve had many really amazing teachers and mentors throughout my four years in high school – both at Mayfield and within the Las Cruces community – who deserve a big thank you. So many of my endeavors would not have been possible without their support.”

“I was the principal of Albuquerque Academy’s high school division for nearly 20 years before retiring to Las Cruces last summer, so I have known scores of incredibly talented kids over the years,” said Sonya Roth. “I met Mireya early last fall and she quickly became my absolute favorite of all time because she is not only brilliant and extremely talented, but also genuinely kind, modest, funny and thoughtful toward others. She’s the best.”

Sánchez-Maes took first place in humorous interpretation and second in both congressional debate and informative speaking and was named

outstanding speaker in Lincoln-Douglas Debate at the New Mexico Championship Speech and Debate Tournament, held Feb. 29 in Albuquerque

As directed by Presidential Executive Order, the 2020 U.S. Presidential Scholars are comprised of one young man and one young woman from each state, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico, and U.S. families living abroad, as well as 15 chosen at-large, 20 scholars in the arts and 20 scholars

in career and technical education.

The U.S. Presidential Scholars Program was established in 1964 to recognize and honor the nation’s most distinguished graduating high school seniors. In 1979, the program was extended to recognize students who demonstrate exceptional talent in the visual, creative and performing arts. In 2015, the program was again extended to recognize students who demonstrate ability and

accomplishment in career and technical education fields. Each year, up to 161 students are named as presidential scholars, one of the nation’s highest honors for high school students.

Raul Casillas of Mayfield High School was named a 2020 U.S. Presidential Scholars Program distinguished teacher in New Mexico. He was nominated by Sánchez-Maes.

Aggies' Gonzales named college baseball's best

There are about 300 Division I college baseball teams. That translates to more than 8,000 players.

Only one of those, however, can be named player of the year.

And that player for 2020 is a New Mexico State University Aggie.

Collegiate Baseball Newspaper last week named Aggie junior Nick Gonzales as its 2020 National Player of the Year.

Gonzales is no stranger to national accolades. He was a first team All-American last year as a sophomore, and named a freshman All-American in 2018. In addition, he was named a 2020 preseason All-American, and was the National Player of the Month in both February 2019 and February 2020.

The Aggies' last four home games of the season, Feb. 27-March 1, against Purdue-Fort Wayne, provided a perfect showcase for Gonzales' skills. During that series, Gonzales was 7-for-15 from the plate, with five home runs, 8 runs scored, 10 RBI, 6 walks and 3 stolen bases.

The triple is often called "the most exciting hit in baseball." And while it is very exciting, it's

did Feb. 29, a day he finished

with five homers as NMSU

swept a double-header.

Gonzales finished the pandemic-shortened 16-game season with 12 homers, 36 RBI, 21 walks, and five stolen bases, helping the Aggies assemble a 12-4 record. In addition, Gonzales plays arguably the toughest defensive position, shortstop. In the field, he handled 71 chances with only two errors, for a .972 fielding percentage. He has a nation's best on-base streak of 82 consecutive games.

And, oh yeah, he also joined Aggie teammate Tristan Peterson on the College Sports Information Directors of America 2020 Academic All-District Team. Gonzales is majoring in individualized studies, with a 3.33 GPA, and was an academic

All-Western Athletic Conference honoree last year.

Gonzales attended Cienega High School in Vail, Arizona, about 20 miles southeast of Tucson.

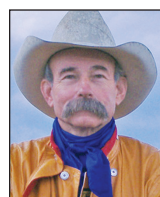

Inconvenient stimulus

Those expecting economic-stimulus payments in the form of a check may instead receive an innocuous-looking envelope containing a VISA debit card instead. That's what happened to my wife and I just this week.

At first glance, it looks like junk mail. Open the envelope from Money Network Cardholder Services, and it looks like some marketing scheme to get you to start using the Metabank VISA debit card to buy things.

What looks like some scam turns out to be legit. It is an Economic Impact Payment (EIP) debit card

loaded with your stimulus money. You have to go online and jump through hoops to activate the debit card sent on behalf of the Treasury Department, but unlike their claims, the card is neither "convenient" nor easy to use. Why hasn't this incompetent Administration publicized this? Who in this corrupt Adminis-

tration is benefiting from this scheme?

You have to dig through the IRS website to find any info about this method of providing C.A.R.E. Act money that's being sent to four million taxpayers. The EIPCard website says it's easy to transfer money from the card to your bank account. No, it's

not. It doesn't work. So, if you need money from the card to pay rent, put in savings or for cash to live on, you have to make a series of trips to an ATM to withdraw funds a little at a time. This is ridiculous, infuriating and inconvenient. Of course, beware of hidden fees when you use this card.

Stock Market

To the editor:

With the economy in such bad shape, why is the stock market gaining strength? All indicators like jobless rates, weak service and mfg. sectors, drop in consumer income, etc. points to poor earnings for investors. What factors are at work here? Remember

that 84 percent of stocks are owned by 10 percent of investors and the top 1 percent has 40 percent of the nation's wealth. The primary option for their wealth are treasury and corporate bonds, where yields are poor because we have low interest rates. Actual yields for these low-risk bonds are less than 1 percent. Therefore, the plu-

ocrats are taking a chance on the future of stocks. However, the market does not measure the wellbeing of most Americans.

The official U.S. unemployment rate is 15 percent, but when you include those not officially in the work force — it's closer to 20 percent. Many of these workers also lost their employer-based

health insurance. In other developed countries the unemployment rate is below 5 percent, because their government policies made sure workers got paid during the pandemic. These countries also have universal health care. The U.S. didn't do that, because they were more worried about (primarily large) business owners and

banks than workers. We also spent more stimulus funds per worker than these countries did. Top-down economic policies and inequality is alive and well in the U.S. and has been for many years.

The Federal Reserve just tossed a glass of cold water in the face of anyone predicting a swift recovery. The Fed

recently said, "The ongoing crisis brought on by the pandemic shutdowns has caused steep job losses with economic activity falling sharply across the map." And business owners report their outlook for recovery remains "highly uncertain."

Rabbit raisers are careful to avoid any advertising, including the words BunnyBurger or BBQ'd Bunny Ribs or Bunny on a Grill. Even in the frozen north, they've never developed a market for the Baby Seal Club Sandwich. Australians have never had trouble eating lamb,

mostly because they're so numerous over there, they are thought of more often as ants or road-kill. Yet in my three trips 'Down Under,' I saw no Koala Kabobs. Too cute.

The Chinese seem to eat anything under the sun from thousand-year-old eggs to objects that crawl on the sea floor, but I've never heard of a Panda Patty.

The reverse is also true: it is easier to eat something less cuddly. That may be part of the success of the chicken business. In books, movies and stories, chickens are seldom portrayed in flattering roles. They're usually stupid

or pompous, i.e. Foghorn Leghorn, Chicken Little, Huey, Dewey and Louie. Even the Little Red Hen turns out to be a Republican.

The eel is another good example. The oyster, the goat, fish in general, most reptiles and the spotted owl in certain parts of the country.


But I do suspect the pork producers were worried about their business while "Babe" was showing in thousands of theaters to hundreds of thousands of young, impressionable kids. Had to be. I know French restaurateurs worried when "Black Stallion" was showing.

Both laws and attitudes on policing need to change

Fans of horror movies know there are always early scenes that tip you off to the terrible things that will come later.

I had that feeling last week as I watched the press conference held by prosecutors in Minnesota. I assumed that it was called to announce an arrest in the murder of George Floyd. I was wrong.

They opened by announcing that there was nothing to announce. That was bad. Then they started talking and made things worse.

“There is other evidence that doesn’t sup-

port a criminal charge,” County Attorney Mike Freeman said.

And my heart sank. Here we go again. They’re going to try to defend even this.

We’ve seen this movie before. Call it Friday the 13th, Part 709. That’s for the 709 black people

killed by police in the United States since the start of 2017, according to the website Statista.

It’s always the same. The officer feared for his life. He had to make a split-second decision. The last thing that went through his mind before using deadly force was

his wife and children, and making sure he got back to them alive at the end of the shift.

That’s an incredibly powerful argument, especially when applied on those of us who have never walked in their shoes. But how are they going to explain away this one?

Three officers are kneeling on Floyd while he is handcuffed and face-down on the pavement. A fourth officer stands guard. Two are kneeling on his body. The third, Derek Chauvan, kneels on his neck for more than eight minutes until he dies. The officer ignores the man’s pleas that he can’t breathe. In the end,

Floyd calls out for his deceased mother as he feels the life ebbing from his body. He then goes limp. Chauvan keeps his knee on the neck for nearly three minutes longer.

Was he still afraid then? This wasn’t one bad apple. It was four officers working in coordination to execute what looked to be an oft-used technique.

The county attorney filed charges the day after the press conference, but they were too little (third-degree murder and second-degree manslaughter for Chauvan only) and too late. Still, he boasted that it was the fastest they have ever been able to charge a police officer with a crime. It usually

takes months, he said.

That’s the problem. Our desire for law and order has led us to pass laws that protect police officers who commit acts of even lethal brutality. I have no doubt that attorneys for Chauvan will mount a vigorous defense based on the laws of Minnesota, where neck restraint is allowed. And, I won’t be surprised if his trial results in either a hung jury or acquittal.

We used to think this would end with body cameras and cellphone videos. These officers knew they were being videoed, and it didn’t give them a moment’s pause.

When the press conference was over, I knew

what was coming next. If this wasn’t over the line, then there is no line. And if there is no line, there’s anarchy: stupid, senseless, destructive anarchy.

And not just in Minnesota. Anger and frustration regarding decades of racist and brutal policing erupted across the nation.

Police need better pay and training, with a focus on community policing. But that’s not enough. This isn’t going to end until we change both laws and attitudes and start treating police officers like violent criminals every time they commit violent crimes.

City economic review shows recovery could take nearly five years

Officials from an Albuquerque-based nonprofit think tank said Las Cruces could see a temporary and permanent loss of about 8,000 jobs because of COVID-19, and that it could take about four and one-half years for the city to achieve full economic recovery from the pandemic.

In what the city called an "economic flash assessment," Paul Hamrick of Community Economics Laboratory (CELab) said key industry leaders in Las Cruces think all the local jobs that can come back from the public health emergency by themselves will have done so by June 2022 and that a full recovery by January 2025 must be driven by a comprehensive local strategy. He said the assessment is based on a consensus of 15 leaders in various economic sectors of the city economy who gathered recently by Zoom for nearly seven hours. It also includes city economic data and input from a local economist, Hamrick said. He made the presentation along with CELab Executive Director Grant Taylor at the Las Cruces City Council's May 26 work session.

Taylor said the city should be commended for "trying to orient yourself to respond to this crisis," which he said places Las Cruces at the leading edge of both the state and the country.

To plan for the recovery, Mesilla Valley Economic Development Alliance (MVEDA) CEO Davin Lopez said the city should focus on 1) the hugely developing trend of "onshoring" – large U.S. companies keeping operations in the U.S. instead of moving them overseas, to lessen the likelihood of a supply-chain interruption; 2) the national move toward working at home; and 3) food security and sustainability, for which he said Las Cruces-El Paso-Chihuahua are well-positioned.

New Mexico needs to enact major policy changes, including changes in its tax policy, to "get out in front of this discussion and not fall behind," Lopez said.

The city's response to COVID-19 is also "an opportunity to build your workforce to where there are going to be employers who want to employ your residents," Taylor said. Lopez said that will mean working closely with the Bridge of Southern New Mexico, New Mexico State University and Doña Ana Community College "to figure out new skill sets that need to be developed."

City council creates Las Cruces Economic Recovery Board; applications welcomed

The Las Cruces City Council has unanimously passed a resolution creating the Las Cruces Economic Recovery Ad Hoc Board.

The 14-member board will make specific recommendations to the council on strategies for gradually reopening the Las Cruces economy affected by the COVID-19 pandemic "in a smart, safe and effective manner that fits the needs of Las Cruces" and is aligned with direction from the state Economic Recovery Council appointed

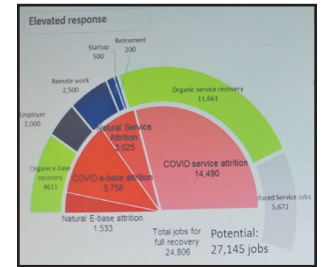
by Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham. The local council will dissolve "upon full reopening" of the Las Cruces economy, according to city documents.

Membership will include one member each of United Food and Commercial Workers Union, a local nonprofit organization, the business community (an employee), the healthcare sector, the state Workforce Solutions Department, the mental/behavioral health sector and the Business Recovery Committee convened by the Las Cruces Greater Chambers of Commerce; along with seven business owners, with one

each selected by a councilor as a member from his or her district.

Behavioral health collaborative working to address needs based on survey

An assessment of the community's behavioral health system shows there are a lot of gaps to fill, but a new coalition of providers, nonprofits, local governments and other interested groups and individuals is working together with a vision of restoring and enhancing services throughout Doña Ana County.

The assessment was presented at a Zoom meeting of LC3, the behavioral health collaborative that organized countywide late last year with funding from Paseo del Norte Foundation, and with Families and Youth, Inc. (FYI) of Las Cruces

serving as "the backbone agency." More than 50 people participated.

The survey showed that since the administration of former Gov. Susana Martinez statewide shutdown of behavioral health services in 2013:

- A gap has developed between needs and services, with fewer specialized and experienced provider support and services available for patients and available providers/agencies at risk of being overloaded;
- Collaboration has been disrupted, including

a loss of trust and communication between providers and patients that has impeded referrals;

- Patients have been put at risk because of a lack of support and increased difficulty in accessing services, including language barriers, insurance and Medicaid issues and transportation;
- There has been a lack of government accountability, funding and resources for behavioral health;
- Responses to the shutdown have included improvised collaboration among agencies to provide services and more

training and classes for providers.

Survey respondents said an ideal system would 1) be patient centered; 2) have inclusive services (no barriers to low-income, uninsured or underinsured, undocumented immigrants, Spanish speakers, homeless, patients with criminal records or those who lack transportation to services); 3) provide training and education programs about behavioral and mental health; 4) provide comprehensive care; 5) provide collaboration among agencies, providers and patients; 6) facilitate access to services and referrals; and 7) be community focused, including schools and universities.

The survey was conducted by New Mexico State University's Southwest Outreach Academic Research Evaluation and Policy Center (SOAR). It included 61 participants from 29 different providers, agencies, departments and organizations, including 15 that work

with children, 16 with adults and 18 equally with both. About half the survey participants have more than 10 years of experience in behavior and mental health.

Assessment results were presented during the LC3 meeting by SOAR Director Rachel Boren, Ph.D., and Germain Degardin, senior program specialist.

Boren said a phase-two survey likely will be conducted in late 2020, with the results of the current assessment being used to enhance participation in phase two. Combined results can be used to "prioritize what areas need to be addressed first and what's most critical," Boren said, and to begin work on a strategic plan for countywide behavioral health services that includes timelines and deliverables.

"We definitely want your feedback very, very much," Boren said.

Dr. Amy Cohen, Ph.D., a clinical psychologist with the American Psychiatric

Association, presented information on a new initiative called SMI Adviser, which is funded by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA).

"SMI Adviser aims to improve the delivery and uptake of evidence-based practices and person-centered care for individuals with schizophrenia, bipolar disorder and major depression," Cohen said. Resources for clinicians, including free accredited learning activities, vetted resources and on-demand consultations, as well as resources for families and individuals, can be found at www.smiadviser.org.

"One of the things that's near and dear to me is mental health and developing a seamless continuum of care," said Las Cruces Mayor Pro-Tem Kasandra Gandara, a licensed social worker. The city is "very committed"

Full moon is June 5; solstice on its way

Who wouldn't swoon for a full moon in June?

It's the Full Strawberry Moon that fills the sky, officially peaking at 1:12 p.m. MDT Friday, June 5.

It's the last full moon of spring, as the summer solstice occurs at 3:43 p.m. MDT Saturday, June 20.

June's full Moon is traditionally called the Strawberry Moon, according to www.almanac.com.

"This name originated with Algonquin tribes in eastern North America who knew it as a signal to gather the ripening fruit



of wild strawberries," the website says. "Alternative European names for this moon include the Honey Moon and the Mead Moon. It has also been called the Rose Moon. June was traditionally the month of marriages and is even named after the Roman goddess of marriage, Juno. Following marriage comes the "honeymoon," which may

be tied to this full moon's name."

The word solstice, meanwhile, comes from the Latin solstitium, from sol (sun) and stitium (to stop), "reflecting the fact that the sun appears to stop at this time (and again at the winter solstice)," according to www.almanac.com.

The summer solstice — the longest day of the year — occurs when the sun is directly over the Tropic of Cancer, the northern-most circle of latitude on planet Earth. At this point, the northern hemisphere is tilted toward the sun to its maximum extent.

"The astronomical start of a season is based on the position of the Earth in

relation to the Sun," the website said. "More specifically, the start of each season is marked by either a solstice (for winter and summer) or an equinox (for spring and autumn). A solstice is when the Sun reaches the most southerly or northerly point in the sky, while an equinox is when the Sun passes over Earth's equator. Because of leap years, the dates of the equinoxes and solstices can shift by a day or two over time, causing the start dates of the seasons to shift, too."

The fall equinox will occur at 7:30 a.m. MDT on Tuesday, Sept. 22. That means summer 2020 will be a few hours short of 95 days long.

Wasps on the move

Post COVID Quarantine Working through the backlog of delayed healthcare.

The COVID-19 pandemic has delayed many physician appointments, elective procedures, and medical tests. As restrictions ease, working through this backlog will be a challenge. For people who have pain or orthopedic issues, their best option may be to see a physical therapist first.

A study of 150,000 insurance claims published in *Health Services Research*, found that those who saw a physical therapist at the first point of care had an 89 percent lower probability of receiving an opioid prescription, 28 percent lower probability of having advanced imaging services, and a 15 percent lower probability of an emergency department visit.

Faster Recovery

The Mitchell Study published in *Physical Therapy* looked at outcomes when patients went to a PT first. It found that patients who went to their physician before their PT spent 65% more time recovering, and had 60% more office visits than patients who went directly to their PT.

Less Expensive

There are many studies showing that the faster you get to your PT, the less money you spend. A study published in the *Journal of Orthopaedic and Sports Physical Therapy* showed that patients who obtained physical therapy via direct access had significantly lower medical costs— an average of \$1,543 less per patient than those who chose referral from a physician. The Mitchell study mentioned above found that the total cost for physician referral to physical therapists was 123% or 2.2 times higher than the paid claims for people who went straight to PT.

As the healthcare system tries to work through the backlog of delayed visits and procedures, using physical therapists as the first provider for patients with pain or orthopedic issues could take some of the pressure off of primary care physicians and orthopedists. It could also lead to better outcomes, quicker recoveries, and cost savings for patients. That's a winning solution for everyone involved.

Las Cruces' Citizens Bank steps up big on PPP

Citizens Bank of Las Cruces has approved about 10 percent of all the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loans made in New Mexico, a top bank official said. And, "the money is going to small businesses which is where it needs to go."

As of Tuesday, June 2, Citizens had awarded approximately 850 PPP loans totaling about \$76 million, said Citizens Executive Vice President and Chief Credit Officer Tim Hargrove, and those numbers are increasing daily.

"The total number of jobs that have been retained in our community as a result of these PPP loans is 11,000+," Hargrove said.

The loans are funded by the bank and are 100 percent guaranteed by the Small Business Administration (SBA), said Hargrove, who has been a banker for 32 years. The loans have gone to businesses of all kinds in Las Cruces and throughout New Mexico, El Paso and Colorado.

And, Hargrove said, Citizens has welcomed both bank customers and non-customers who need the money to apply for it, including people who are self-employed.

In addition to PPP loans, Hargrove said the

bank has also been proactive in reaching out to its customers to determine if they need payment deferrals on loans or other modifications as they deal with COVID-19.

"We understand if you can't open your business, if you can't get a paycheck, how are you supposed to pay your bills?" Hargrove said. "I don't want people to

have to worry about their loans right now. We want to do everything we can to help our customers get through this unprecedented pandemic. Not only does this help businesses, it has also been instrumental in allowing numerous individuals in our community keep their jobs."

The PPP was created by the U.S. Treasury Department as part of the federal CARES Act, Hargrove said, with the SBA handling approval processing through their ETRAN system. Funds authorized by the U.S. Treasury and Congress total \$670 billion for this loan program. And even though there have been several problems with the SBA processes and guidance, Hargrove said he

has "never seen the SBA move like this" in facilitating the program. He said the FDIC and other bank regulators have also been extremely supportive.

"Early in the process, I reached out to our chief regulators and had conversations with them about what we wanted to do, and they have been very accommodating," Hargrove said.

The FDIC told him "Do whatever you have to do to take care of your customers. We're going to work with you," he said. "It has been so encouraging to see the amount of support we have received from our regulators."

Under PPP, a business takes its average monthly payroll and multiplies by 2.5 to determine the amount of the loan it

should apply for. He said the SBA is requiring that 75 percent of the loan proceeds be spent on payroll, with the remaining 25 percent being used for utility bills, mortgage interest payments and rent. He said the Independent Community Bankers Association is advocating for the removal of the restriction on these requirements.

"We are still waiting on guidance from the SBA regarding documentation necessary for the forgiveness process," Hargrove said. He said he is hopeful the majority of the loans will be 100 percent forgiven.

Hargrove said he also will not be surprised if there is another round of PPP loans at some point in the future.

NMSU music professor, conductor releases new album

New Mexico State University assistant professor of violin and NMSU Philharmonic Orchestra Conductor Simon Gallo is releasing a new album, “Chausson,” featuring the music of French romantic composer Ernest Chausson (1855-99).

The album was recorded in Granada, Spain, and was “a very big production,” Gallo said, that took many years to complete and included rehearsals and production in New York City and other cities in both North and South America.

The album includes Chausson’s “Concerto Op.21” for violin, piano

and string quartet and “Chanson Perpétuelle op.37,” featuring Gallo as violin soloist, piano soloist John Novacek, violinists Benjamin Sung, Ingrid Capparelli Gerling and Randolph Kelly, cellist Maki Kubota and so-

prano Mariola Cantarero. Written between 1889 and 1891, the concert, Gallo said, is unique in the chamber music repertoire. It premiered March 4, 1892, in Brussels, Belgium.

Gallo, a native of Venezuela, grew up in Europe, where he learned to love the music of France, including the compositions of Chausson. Gallo moved to the United States eight years ago.

“I had to work very hard, and I got the position at NMSU, and I am so grateful to my colleagues and my department and the whole structure of NMSU,” Gallo said. “I feel at home.”

Gallo is founder and artistic director of the

Aruba Symphony Festival and Academy and several other international music festivals.

“I feel that my international background is an asset for our community,” said Gallo, who plans to start an international music festival in Las Cruces, El Paso and Juarez.

Las Cruces, he said, is “a very beautiful town that could (benefit from) even better cultural development. Now we have to place Las Cruces in the international picture. We can be a music city.”

Gallo, who founded the Las Cruces Youth Orchestra in 2018, said he is especially committed to enhancing music educa-

tion and participation for the city’s youth.

“I want to share with young people,” Gallo said. “It is difficult sometimes to have big dreams. This recording is for a big achievement in my career. I hope for sure people will understand I’m here to support my community. I am here to support education.”

The album debuts, Gallo said, as people are waiting and excited to return to live concerts.

“How important it is to attend the concert, creating memories of ‘yes, I went to the concert and it was a beautiful moment and it was a beautiful memory for all of us,’” he said.

In the meantime, enjoy the beautiful music of a French composer as interpreted by a young and talented Venezuelan violinist who now makes his home in Las Cruces, accompanied by other great musical artists.

The Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) Outreach Center, housed in the College of Education at New Mexico State University, is offering five summer camps online beginning this month.

The camps are being offered to students exiting grades 5 through 8. Space is limited to 20 students per online camp session. Live camp sessions will be offered via Zoom, while camp content and student engagement will be shared via FlipGrid. Details on



specific camp logins and connections will be sent in registration confirmation emails.

The STEM Outreach Center will provide the materials needed for all online camps. Details on how to obtain the materials will also be listed in the confirmation emails.

All camps will take place Monday through Friday in June and are offered at no cost. Camps are funded through local and state grants that provide out-of-school time programs to K-12 students.

This year's camps include:

- **Fidgetneers:** Students will spend the week building rockets, rubberband cars, towers and more while sharpening problem-solving and engineering skills. They will pit their creations against those made by other stu-

dents in some friendly online competition and wrap up the week with two different rocket launches, followed by a virtual egg drop.

- **Click Click Challenge:** During the center's first virtual photography summer camp, students will test their creativity through the art of photography and get a glimpse of what it takes to be a photographer. Different daily challenges will be posted to complete, along with some photography basics. All photographers who finish the challenge will receive their photographs printed

on photo paper, along with a t-shirt and a certificate.

- **Escape from Disce:** Strange things are happening in Disce and Resu, Sour and Gelo need help. Students will investigate catapults, ciphers, egg drops and more as they plan their escape and save the city.
- **Let It Grow! The Science Behind How Plants Grow:** Students will learn about soil, seeds, germination, photosynthesis and everything they need to know about how and why plants grow. Even though the camp is online, camp leaders will be sending students

outside to conduct experiments and observation studies. Plus, students will be learning botany from actual biologists.

- **STEM Explorers:** Become a STEM Explorer and discover many of the STEM departments and careers hidden around the NMSU campus. Each day, students will virtually visit new departments and labs to participate in hands-on activities and figure out how they are part of STEM.

June 21 is Las Cruces Make Music Day virtual festival; registration open

BULLETIN REPORT

Make Music Day (MMD) was going to be a raucous and joyful street party with live events around the city to mark Las Cruces' first observance of what has been a global phenomenon for the last four decades. And then the coronavirus pandemic, as it has done with so many other large gatherings, scuttled those plans.

Now members of the Las Cruces Make Music Day Alliance are pivoting to create a free, on-line virtual festival of streamed and recorded showcases of local musical talent on international MMD, Sunday, June 21.

The alliance will stream live on its MMD Facebook page (Make Music Day- Las Cruces) and have pre-recorded performances from The Range, Las Cruces' only recording studio and event venue. Anyone interested in virtually sharing a musical performance with the commu-



nity can contact planners at lascrucemakemusicday.org. The alliance welcomes other live streams and recordings from local musicians, music teachers and amateurs showing off their talents.

Free registration is open until the day of the festival at www.make-musicday.org/lascruces. Musicians of all levels, teachers, performers and local venues with an active social media presence are invited.

To watch or participate in the festival from a phone, laptop or tablet, there are tutorials and links on the website and Facebook page on how to go live and get access using social media.

MMD was born in

France on the summer solstice in 1982 as the Fête de la Musique – literally, Music Party or Music Festival. The French Ministry of Culture launched the observance by taking to the airwaves and encouraging the nation's amateur and professional musicians to get out into the community and share their talents at public events. The French people so enjoyed the first Fête de la Musique that it has continued flourishing and spreading.

MMD is not quite a music festival, because it's not confined to one location and it's not completely organized, since musicians don't need official permission to perform in public.

As MMD Alliance Executive Director Aaron Friedman has said, "Make Music Day is kind of like Halloween for music – a day when regular folks are given permission to get out in the streets and share their love of music."

Until this year, MMD

had not been observed in New Mexico. In December 2019, Friedman, with the assistance of the office of U.S. Sen. Tom Udall, D-N.M., a patron of the arts and sponsor of legislation aimed at boosting the creative arts economy, traveled to cities around the state, including Las Cruces, to encourage organized MMD events in their communities.

The Las Cruces MMD Alliance is comprised of community members from Visit Las Cruces, Doña Ana Arts Council and various musical groups and organizations.

"Make Music Day, Las Cruces is a great way to bring together musicians, artists, arts organizations and all Las Cruces to

ease back into 'normalcy' by supporting and enjoying our local creative economy, while in solidarity with a worldwide event, as we are facing this global pandemic," said David Senk, who is the principal organizer of MMD-Las Cruces. The Range owner Logan

Sage is co-producer, co-presenter.

MMD- Las Cruces will stream performances throughout the day on YouTube and Instagram, as well as on Facebook.

A spoonful of genius makes 'Mary Poppins' a treat

EDITOR'S NOTE: This is another in The Bulletin staff's series of reviews of movies available on various streaming services. Bulletin staff writer Mike Cook explains why "Mary Poppins" pops for him.

Have you ever made a list of the people you would most like to meet?

My list includes Dick Van Dyke, for many reasons, especially his performance in my all-time favorite movie: "Mary Poppins."

Bert the chimneysweep is almost as iconic as Mary Poppins herself, but I am even fonder of Van Dyke's portrayal of Mr. Dawes Sr., the elder board member at the bank where George Banks works. It's a small part, but the bit near the end of the movie when Banks is fired is one of my favorite scenes of all times. I fall off my chair every time Mr. Dawes Sr. says, "Impertinence, Sir!"

Van Dyke was hired to play Bert and is apparently remembered — he

even publicly apologized for it — for one of the worst cockney accents in movie history. He lobbied Walt Disney to get the part of old Mr. Dawes.

The late David Tomlinson's portrayal of George Banks ("It's that Poppins woman!") is also one of my favorite performances of all time. Remember him and his wife, Winifred (Glynis Johns, in another absolutely brilliant performance), arguing about hiring a nanny while holding the furniture in place during a cannon firing by neighbor Admiral Boom?

Tomlinson's performance always reminds me of Alastair Sim's Ebenezer Scrooge in the 1951 film by that name — which is my second favorite movie ever. Tomlinson and Sim were completely believable as both their mean and cranky selves and as the joyous and re-born Scrooge and Banks.

And, of course, no one could ever top Julie Andrews' eponymous performance in this movie. It

has to be one of the greatest in film history. "Spoon Full of Sugar" always makes me cry.

Clearly, Walt Disney knew how to cast a film. And there must have been something very special indeed about this cast. The movie was filmed May-September 1963, at Disney Studios in Burbank, California, and released Aug. 27, 1964 — almost 56 years ago.

Most of the actors were seasoned professionals well into adulthood even then, but many are still alive. Van Dyke is 94, Johns is 96, Andrews is 84.

Richard M. Sherman, who co-wrote the music, is 91. His brother and collaborator, Robert B. Sherman, died at age 86.

Jane Darwell (the Bird Woman) was 87 when she died, Tomlinson was 83, Reginald Owen (Admiral Boom) was 85, Elsa Lancaster (Katie Nana) was 84. Author P.L. Travers lived to age 96. The man who painted 102 glass backgrounds of 1910 London for the film, Peter Ellenshaw, lived to 103.

Matthew Garber, who played young Michael Banks, however, died of haemorrhagic necrotising pancreatitis in 1977 at age 21. Karen Dotrice (Jane Banks) is alive and kicking at 64. She was 8 when the movie was made; Garber was 7.

"Mary Poppins" won five Oscars, a Golden Globe and two Grammy awards. Andrews won both the Oscar and Golden Globe for best actress in a leading role. Van Dyke was nominated for a Golden Globe for best actor.

"Mary Poppins" was nominated for the Oscar

for best picture (Disney's only nomination in that category during his lifetime) but lost to "My Fair Lady." Andrews had played Eliza Doolittle in "My Fair Lady" on Broadway but lost the film role to Audrey Hepburn.

So, Mr. Van Dyke, if you're reading this week's Bulletin, drop me a line and let's have a spot of tea and talk about old times.

Don't distance yourself from this tasty taco treat

10 Minute Roasted Chicken Soft Tacos

From Coffeen's "300 Best Taco Recipes," (Robert Rose Publishing, 2011)

Makes 8 tacos

There are many days that I just don't have enough time to create a delicious meal from

scratch. That is why this chicken taco recipe is number-one on my list. I just swing by the market and grab a fresh roasted chicken, and dinner is ready in minutes.

- » 1 cup chopped romaine lettuce
- » 1 cup chopped fresh spinach
- » 3 cups warm shredded deli-roasted chicken (see tip)
- » 8 6-inch corn tortillas, skillet-warmed
- » 2 ripe avocados, diced
- » 1 red onion, minced
- » 1/2 cup shredded Monterey Jack cheese

1. In a medium bowl, combine lettuce and spinach.
2. To build tacos, divide chicken equally among tortillas. Top with lettuce mixture, avocados,

red onion and cheese. Fold tortillas in half. Serve with a favorite red or green chile salsa.

Tip: Measure out three cups of chicken for this recipe. Reserve remaining chicken for future recipes

Place in an airtight container and freeze for up to four months.

Tough times demand meditative thinking

The ugliness of the coronavirus epidemic becomes more apparent daily. I

don't mean the ugliness of the coronavirus attack itself, which is difficult enough to comprehend and respond to either individually or collectively. I mean the ugliness that begins to surround the problem, swirling above it like a swarm of locusts.

This ugliness is the ongoing blame game that is taking place. In a way, it is understandable. When

something bad happens, we look for reasons. We might look for reasons

when good things happen, but we're less likely to be focused on them in such a situation.

But when bad things happen, we usually ask "who's to blame?"

We look for a cause to exonerate ourselves from any responsibility. And that's what has begun to happen in recent weeks as all of us tire of the isolation and the economic slowdown that affects us, or the profound

dislocation we have felt in our lives. As weeks go by, we are less willing to sit still during the crisis and more frustrated with our circumstances. It's a deadly and predictable syndrome.

Look, when the economy is going strong and the president takes the glory for that occurrence, we all secretly or openly scoff and say that it had little or nothing to do with that leadership. Why not the same equanimity when it comes to something like the coronavirus? All we can do is look at the responses and judge whether

they are adequate or not.

The great Flu Epidemic of 1918 has been suggested as a model, but that occurred in vastly different cultural surroundings and with vastly different resources than we have today.

So here we are in 2020 confronting a faceless enemy. The cheap route is to crank up the blame game, point fingers at various national targets, or succumb to inane conspiracy theories. These knee-jerk responses are for those who have lost balance and cannot find it.

Calm yourselves, people:

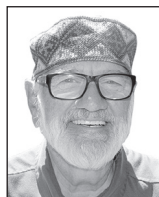
there is little or nothing you can do to allay the onslaught beyond preparing yourselves as much as possible via the proposed channels – masks, social distancing, washing – you know the drill by now. Unless you are directly involved in medical research, you're not going to solve the problem by weird ideas or weird science.

People who have deep spiritual grounding are not going to succumb to either fear or nonsense. They will look like ordinary people going through this mess, but with the inner resources to resist

name-calling, false solution chasing and the blame game.

They will trust in genuine science as the aid to end the nightmare. They will trust that eventually the cloud will lift and "all shall be well, and all will be well, and all manner of things shall be well," as the 13th century English nun Julian of Norwich said.

Rights and responsibilities are very different

Some of the discussions swirling around the COVID-19 pandemic have focused on rights in relation to responsibilities.

One of the central teachings from my tradition, which I have shared in previous columns, relates to both rights and responsibilities. It comes from the ancient Jewish sage, Hillel.

He said, "If I am not for myself, who will be for me? If I am only for myself, what am I? If not now, when?"

My fifth-grade teacher in the Temple where I grew up asked us to interview family members about this saying.

Mostly, the responses I heard from my family back then, and interpretations that I have

heard since, have viewed this saying as a progression.

First, advocate for yourself. Second, don't just advocate for yourself, because you don't live in

this world by yourself. Third, there is always an urgency to do both, and to properly balance them.

Another famous statement from Hillel declared, "What is hateful to you, do not do to your neighbor." That teaching seems to complete his message of self-confidence that leads to mutual respect and consideration.

For me, our current situation calls on us to identify these and other values that are the most important to us, perhaps more than ever before. Hillel's declarations are a good start.

I recently asked members of all ages at Temple Beth-El to share the moral principles which they view as central to our lives at this time.

Their responses were instructive and inspiring:

- Taking care of your body and health
- Togetherness/community/connection
- Kindness
- Remembrance for loved ones, and for those who have died in recent months during this pandemic
- Peace in our homes and

staying connected with family near and far

- Generosity: supporting people going through a hard time
- Acceptance and patience
- Being helpful and showing compassion
- Finding joy amidst everything going on
- Gratitude: finding something for which to be thankful at any time
- Visiting and staying in touch with people facing illness and health challenges, and praying for their recoveries.
- Treating everyone as equally valuable in this world
- Resilience
- Saving a life (or saving lives), so as not to jeopardize our lives or the lives of others

- Altruism: showing selfless concern for the well-being of others
- Noticing the wonders still happening around us in nature
- Truly trying to understand someone else's viewpoint
- Remembering and (hopefully) learning from the past
- And leaving the world better than when we got here

I received a request from the American Jewish Archives, which houses important historical documents from individuals and communities, to submit my sermons and articles that I have shared during the COVID-19 pandemic. They hope to chronicle,

for the future, what we are thinking now, and the messages that clergy and community leaders are trying to convey to guide their communities in the best way possible.

You are now reading what I hope will be a part of that collection. We are living in a time that will be studied and discussed for decades to come.

So, every day, may we act in ways that reflect hope, peace and love.

If not now, when?

Mountain View Market carrying on healthily amid COVID-19

Mountain View Market Cooperative (MVMC) — a longtime Las Cruces staple for local, natural, and organic foods, produce and wellness supplements — has adapted to COVID-19 with enhanced sanitization, personal protective gear, checkout shields and curbside delivery.

"We had begun the planning for a community-wide celebration for our 45th anniversary in April," said Corinne Whitmill, outreach coordinator at MVMC. "Once the COVID-19 pandemic began spreading, we re-

solutions at scale, grow the business and prepare the company's game-changing products for market," ECG said in a news release.

"With high demand at other organizations for Mark's skills, wisdom and connections, we're honored to receive the validation expressed through his decision to join Electronic Caregiver's leadership team," said ECG CEO and founder Anthony Dohrmann. "Mark's time at AWS empowers him with an understanding of our well-architected



infrastructure. His lengthy time at Intel Digital Health delivers an advantage of knowledge and insight to help us drive enhanced, digital-care solutions to patients, older adults, providers and payers around the world."

The move to bring Francis aboard coincides with the growing demand for digital health in a COVID-19 world, ECG said in the

news release. "ECG's technology, offering telehealth and remote patient monitoring services, has become a vital solution to the current crisis by helping to slow the spread and impact of COVID-19. In addition, the company is working to integrate coronavirus-specific features into their current products and is in the process of

developing a virtual caregiver with Addison Care."

Addison is anticipated to be released in 2021, as a state-of-the-art, 3D-animated caregiver designed to engage with and help monitor the health of aging and chronically ill clients, as well as child patients, via touch-screen devices strategically placed throughout a residence.

"COVID-19 marks a tipping point for the adoption of digital health technologies," Francis said. "The resistance to adopting telehealth, remote health

management, voice-driven technology and other emerging tech solutions has been knocked down. If companies can show results and demonstrate strong outcomes, then there is a real opportunity to make these changes permanent."

In addition to AWS and Intel, Francis has worked for smaller companies, nonprofits and the City of Boston, ECG said. He has 25 years of experience in aging service, technology

have been evolving ever since. Protocols include regular sanitation of all high-touch surfaces with a bleach solution. Registers, countertop, scales and PIN pads are sanitized after every transaction.

Whitmill said MVMC has suspended the use of reusable bags for grocery

purchases, instead offering customers the option of paper bags or cardboard boxes to carry out purchases.

In compliance with state mandates, the coop's dining area closed, and all prepared foods were prepackaged, she said.

The store has reserved the first hour of each business day for serving seniors, immunocompromised and high-risk

shoppers, she said. During regular hours, the store limits the number of shoppers to five at a time to ensure social distancing. Hand sanitizer and gloves are available for all shoppers and staff, and all staff members wear face masks.

In March, Whitmill said MVMC introduced call-in ordering.

"Shoppers call in their orders, pay over the phone and schedule a

pick-up time. A customer service staffer does the shopping and brings the purchase out to the car. This service is completely free," she said. "All call-ahead orders must be placed at least an hour before the end of business for same-day service. Orders placed after the cut-off time are processed the following day.

In response to limited product availability from its distributors, Whitmill

said MVMC has put some restrictions on purchases. Paper products are limited to two of each kind per shopper, and selected foods and supplements are limited to three of each kind as required by the state.

"MVMC has been fortunate to work with many smaller and local vendors to keep most of its products in stock," she said. "At this time, the produce department is fully

stocked with local and certified organic fruits and vegetables. The grocery department is receiving full shipments again, and most essentials are available. We'll continue working with its distributors to ensure that good, healthy, and local food is available to all."

Jean Gilbert's background is in elementary education, and her passion in life is for animals. When the pandemic closed her avenues for reaching out to children about animal issues, she found a way to keep moving forward.

"Putting together the units has been fulfilling, especially at this time, when it's not possible to hold 'Fur'ever Friends' or 'Critter Connection' sessions in the schools or Boys & Girls Club,"

Gilbert said. "I love children's literature, so being able to promote some of my favorite kids' stories is exciting. Many are award-winning and truly essential to the curriculum I use."

Children who read one or more of the featured stories or provide answers to the puzzles/riddles with a reply to HSSNM

are eligible for free prizes, including a book about animals and finger puppets, she said.

"It's fun learning about kindness to animals," she said, with a twinkle in her eye.

When you practice, do so with purpose

“The more I practice, the luckier I get,” quipped Gary Player several years ago. At the time, Player may have been thinking of Louis Pasteur, who once mused that “chance favors the prepared mind.” Regardless, what we know is that

to get better at anything, whether it's learning to play the piano or golfing your ball, practice is necessary. Here are some tips to make your practice time pay off to the max. First, warm up properly with some stretching, and then start with easy swings with a wedge. The golf magazines and internet blogs, like morningread.com and golf.com, always have articles on good stretches. Torso twists can loosen the back, leg extensions release the butt, hips and thighs, and arm rotations (like doing the back-stroke) free the shoulders.

When you start hitting balls, begin by hitting short shots, like wedges and 9 irons, then work up to long irons, woods and driver. All too often we see players warming up by pulling the driver out of the bag first, which is not the advised preparation. Also, use your pre-shot

routine and swing rehearsal ritual before your practice shots. This gets you comfortable with the routine on the golf course, and it solidifies the process during our practice sessions. Your practice should include work on trouble shots, such as from awkward lies, divots, hardpan and long grass. This builds the confidence of “I've got this shot,” instead of lamenting “Oh my, what do I do here?”

Practice the actual shots from the actual distances you encounter on the golf course, while visualizing the actual hole and conditions.

Swedish National coach Pia Nilsson, co-author with Lynn Marriott of “Every Shot Must Have A Purpose,” urges her players to “replicate course conditions as much as possible” when practicing.

In her chapter “Prepare to Play Great,” Nilsson has these ideas. “While warm-up practice gets you ready to play and maintenance practice improves your game by ingraining consistency, the third type of practice — preparation practice — is the most ambitious. Preparation practice has

as its focus a goal in the future. It could be getting ready for a certain type of course, it could be adding a specific shot, or it could be more drastic overhaul of your game.”

“Whatever your goal is, make sure that it and your expectations are paired with the right preparation,” advises Kim Lewellen, the Women's Golf Team Coach of the University of Virginia. “Sometimes I think we as players are disappointed with our scores because we expect to do better, but have we really prepared

fully to reach those expectations?”

Lewellen suggests that we have a plan for our practice before we get out of the car. She says we should set aside practice time and give our “full attention” to our effort, and then we will see the results.

Yes, I know, she coaches young college students, but we older adults can learn from her knowledge. We need to plan our practice sessions, pay full attention to what we do on the range and the practice green, and not treat

practice as a boring, autopilot chore that we would rather do without.

Practicing to be prepared also means being prepared for golf mentally. When I served as performance coach for the Aggies men's golf team, I remember one talented player who loved to practice, but only with his swing. I had a difficult time persuading him that “just one more bucket of balls” (his words) would not solve his scoring problems.

The idea is to incorporate your pre-shot rou-

tine and your key swing thought into every practice shot and putt. Don't go to the range without knowing what and how to practice, because you'll simply be ingraining ineffective motions and bad habits.

Sam Snead once joked, “I figure practice puts brains in your muscles.”
