## County treasurer waives fees

Doña Ana County Treasurer Eric L. Rodriguez announced today that his office will waive penalty and interest fees from property tax payments made after May 10, for accounts that meet certain qualifications.

“We have been waiting for state legislation to pass so that our office can legally provide some relief to Doña Ana County taxpayers who were affected by the COVID-19 pandemic,” Rodriguez said.

House Bill 6 provides such a relief by temporarily waiving penalty and interest for the second half of the 2019 tax liabilities on accounts that were current before May 10, 2020. The bill also provides significant relief and support measures for individuals, businesses and local governments, throughout the state.



Qualified taxpayers will not receive penalty or interest on their balance until May 10, 2021. “Our office will be working hard to identify residents who already paid the fees and qualify for this waiver. We will credit their accounts and apply it to their 2020 tax

liability,” Rodriguez said.

Residents who were unable to pay property taxes on time are encouraged to contact the County Treasurer’s office at 575-647-7433.

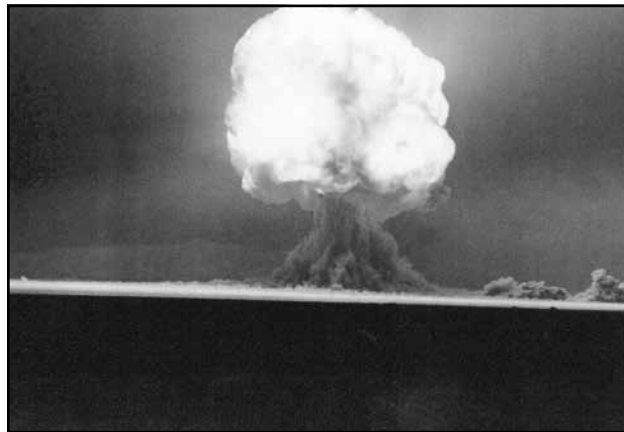


# The day the sun rose twice, 75 years later

Fay Lisk was 12 years old and fast asleep at 5:30 a.m., July 16, 1945. Her mother was outside and saw a bright flash in the sky. Their family lived on a ranch some 45 miles north of the place the Atomic Age began, now known as the Trinity Test Site.

Fay said her mother-in-law lived in Mountainair, 75 miles as the crow flies, from Trinity Site, and she saw the windows shake as if an earthquake had hit. It wasn't until the United States dropped atomic bombs on Japan, Aug. 6 and

9, 1945, that the people of the Tularosa Basin, Jornada del Muerto and surrounding areas knew what had happened in their area of the world.

Headlines screamed the U.S. had destroyed two cities, Hiroshima and Nagasaki, and the successful test in southern New Mexico was a back-

page story.

“It was after they bombed Japan that we found out that they set the test bomb off,” said Fay, who was born in 1932 and now makes her home in Globe, Arizona. “Everything was such a secret. We knew there was a town of Los Alamos, but all the contact we actually had was a radio, and we would only get a little news that way.”

The schoolhouse Lisk attended was in Bingham, 20 miles north of Trinity Site. She stayed with Ted and Sylvia Myers during the school week. Ted and Christian Myers drove the two

school buses that served the school. Fay graduated eighth grade in May 1945.

“At the time, Bingham was on the old dirt road that went across there,” she said. “There was a little post office and a little store and some little cabins. There was one teacher and that year I think we had 12-13 kids who went to school there. I was the only one in eighth grade. I loved school.”

Living next to the Myers was a younger couple. The husband's name was Henry, Fay remembers. They would visit to play cards.

“He [Henry] had a

short, scruffy black beard — all of a sudden he had these big blotches all over it,” Fay said. “They were gray, like if you had thrown bleach on somebody. And [another family] had ducks that hatched out deformed. There was just a lot of this that people started talking about. Cows and cats with blotches. They [the government] never did say or do anything about it.”

Fay said the people who ran the Bingham store, Harald and Sally Dean, died, she thinks, with lung cancer. The Myers moved to Farm-

ington and suffered early deaths, although she didn't know why. Fay's mother died in 1970 from lung cancer.

As an adult visiting the United Nations building in New York, Fay said she saw a display about the things that happened in Japan. She said it was truly terrible, but the bombs ended the war and she believes many more people would have died had the atomic bombs not been dropped.

"I think that if it hadn't had been for that, we would have lost a lot more Americans," she said. "And it ended the war. It ended — poof — right then."

Many more oral his-

tories contain stories of cows, cats and other creatures with gray

blotches. There was a black cat turned blotchy in Tularosa, reportedly

sold to a tourist for \$5. Effects were reported to be seen and felt across the region, including in Los Alamos, Hillsboro, Fort Bayard, El Paso and the Sacramento Mountains.

Memories of those even closer to the blast site provide amazing descriptions of the event itself. The scientists and personnel watching uti-

lized eye protection as the first atomic bomb in the world lit up the New Mexico sky. Residents

nearby were not told they needed eye protection.

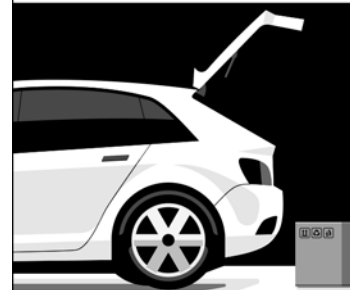

“The effects could will be called unprecedented, magnificent, beautiful, stupendous and terrifying. No man-made phenomenon of such tremendous power had ever occurred before. The lightning effects begged description. The whole country was lighted by a searing light with the intensity many times that of the mid-day sun.” – Brig. Gen. Thomas Farrell.

Trinity Site today is a national historic landmark, declared so in 1975. The 51,500-acre area includes base camp, where the scientists and support group lived, Ground Zero, where the bomb was placed for the explosion and the Schmidt/McDonald ranch house, where the plutonium core to the bomb was assembled.

The site, part of White Sands Missile Range (WSMR), is opened twice a year for visitors. Traditionally, the open houses are the first weekends of April and October. This year, due to the pandemic, the April event was canceled.

Two Tularosans, Tina Cordova and Fred Tyler, watched family and friends dying in what seemed abnormally high numbers of cancer incidents. They, with the help of many area residents, organized the Tularosa Basin Downwinders Consortium in 2005. Cordova is the fourth generation of her family to have cancer

since 1945.

“The test was the only time the government tested a bomb 100 feet above the ground,” Cordova said. “The reason they never did it again is because of the fallout. They believe it went seven miles past the atmosphere. It created more light than the sun, gathered up an enormous amount of plant, sand, material and took it into the air. Ash fell for days.

“They never evacuated anybody or warned anybody,” she said. “From the census, there were tens of thousands of people who lived within 50 miles, and some ranchers within 12 miles. When the ash fell, it settled on everything.”

Painting a picture of life in 1945, Cordova said there was no running water. People relied on cisterns for drinking water, and they used ditch water for bathing and laundry. There were no grocery stores, only mercantiles selling basic goods like sugar, flour, rice, coffee, cereal — nothing refrigerated. Everything else consumed was grown or hunted.

“People went back to their lives not under-

standing what all this meant,” she said. “They damaged us. People have been dying of cancers. We were the first people ever exposed to radiation in the world.”

Cordova said the Radiation Exposure Compensation Act was created in 1990, and \$2.3 billion was paid to downwinders of a test site in Nevada, but the people of southern New Mexico “got 100 times more radiation than the Nevada test site, and we have never been included.”

Resulting damages have devastated the people of rural New Mexico generationally, she said. Families affected by cancer exhaust financial resources with medical and funeral expenses, which prevents them from being able to pass along accumulated resources to their children.

“This is a social justice issue,” she said. “We were unknowing, unwilling and uncompensated.”

Usually in July, the Tularosa Basin Downwinders hold a candlelight vigil in Tularosa and often one in Socorro, to commemorate those who died of cancer. Those events will be foregone

this year because of coronavirus restrictions.

“Last year we had over 800 luminarias, and called out more than 800 names,” she said.

Cordova said there is an event planned in Albuquerque around 5 a.m. on July 16, commemorating the 75th anniversary of the explosion.

## Eyewitness to the blooming of the Atomic Age

“I was staring straight ahead with my open left eye covered by a welder’s glass and my right eye remaining open and uncovered. Suddenly, my right eye was blinded by a light which appeared instantaneously all about without any buildup of intensity. My left eye could see the ball of fire start up like a tremendous bubble or knob-like mushroom. I dropped the glass from my left eye almost immediately and watched the light climb upward. The light intensity fell rapidly hence did not blind my left eye, but it was still amazingly bright. It turned yellow, then red and then beautiful purple. At first, it had a translucent character, but shortly turned to a tinted or colored white smoke appearance. The ball of fire seemed to rise in something of a toadstool effect. Later, the column proceeded as a cylinder of white smoke; it seemed to move ponderously. A hole was punched through the clouds, but two fog rings appeared well above the white smoke column.

“There was a spontaneous cheer from the observers. Dr. von Neumann said, ‘That was at least 5,000 tons and probably a lot more.’ My estimate of the width of the ball of fire was guessed to be 1 to 2 miles at that time. Someone said keep your mouth open and just then, about 1-1/2 to 2 minutes after the light flash, a sharp loud crack swept over us – it reverberated through the mountain like thunder. Several small flashes took place some distance from and after the big flash, apparently part of a measuring system. Commander Bradbury said that the cloud was up over 20,000 feet and still rising. The top of the cloud was moving slightly northeast and was being sheared off.”

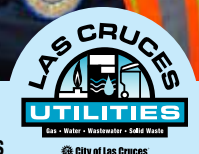

## Where is your line? Why do you stand where you stand?

It's all about lines. Where is your line? It varies from topic to topic.

Lately everyone, it seems, is expressing their line on almost every topic.

I have a very firm line of no ketchup on a hot dog. Never.

Daniel Snyder, the owner of the NFL's Washington Redskins, has been criticized for his team's name for decades. He once said, "We'll never change the name. It's that simple. NEVER. You can use caps."

NEVER appears to have finally arrived for Snyder, as he announced last week he will consider a new name.

The FedEx Corp., which paid the team \$205 million for the naming rights to FedEx Field, where Washington plays, recently requested the team change its name. Several Native American leaders asked Snyder to change the team name over the years, and the Oneida Tribe from Wisconsin asked FedEx six years ago to reconsider its naming of the stadium. Those pleas didn't affect Snyder, because he had a line. And it stopped at changing the team's name.

Now Snyder's line has moved, and the team is now looking at a name change.

Was it the \$205 million? Did he have a change of heart, or do more research about the Native Americans' request? Did he realize his team represents a city whose population is majority African-American?

Some will criticize Snyder for caving in or selling out: "Why didn't you stand your line, Dan? You're going to erase more than 80 years of history?"

Others will ask what took so long: "Stanford University got rid of its Indians nickname 48 years ago, Dan."

There is now discussion of changing the name of Oñate High School in Las Cruces.

The school, established in 1988, is named for Juan de Oñate, a Spanish conquistador, who led the quest to establish New Mexico as a colony for his country, beginning in 1598. He headed north from Mexico (New Spain), with an expedition to establish the colony, also driven by the search for a legendary treasure. He executed people in

his own party, and took Native Americans as slaves, torturing and slaughtering many of them. He was notorious for cutting off their feet to hobble and control them.

Oñate became governor of the New Mexico colony (Santa Fe de Nuevo Mexico), but resigned in 1607, and at trial, was found guilty of cruelty, immorality and other crimes. His conviction was reversed in 1624, but he was not restored to the governorship.

What will happen if Las Cruces Public Schools decides to change the name of OHS?

Some will criticize the school board for caving in or selling out: "Why didn't you stand your line? You can't change history, and we would not be where we are today if Oñate hadn't established this territory."

Others will ask what took so long: "Why are we educating our young people in a building named for a violent, gold-hungry murderer?"

There are some lines that extend for everyone. Example. What if, instead of Oñate, the school had been named for Dr. Mortimer McTavish (I made up that name). In this fictional scenario, McTavish had been a

respected principal, and later advocated for a third high school in Las Cruces, eventually becoming superintendent of LCPS. Let's say, when the new building opened in 1993, it was named McTavish High School. Then, say, in 1999, McTavish was convicted of statutory rape of five students.

McTavish's updated status as a convicted felon didn't change the things he accomplished in the school system. But I think everyone in Las Cruces would be screaming to change the name of the school. I bet everyone would agree a school named for a pedophile was beyond their collective line.

I use the Oñate High School name issue to represent hundreds of names and monuments now being re-evaluated in our country right now. Should we change names? Should we take down statues?

These are good questions we should be asking ourselves right now. And the important part of that is, I believe, asking "ourselves." Don't ask your neighbor, borrow an opinion from a TV commentator, check your social media group or listen to a local

# What do you mean? Misleading slogans can damage a cause

I have watched and know many law enforcement officers who have behaved in extraordinarily kind and compassionate ways. They have responded with care to dangerous situations and shown compassion to those who seem to be undeserving and in the wrong. When I hear terrible things about individuals and departments, I feel distanced from that. I feel safe in my southern New Mexico haven but I know the same things are happening right here, right now.

When I saw the acronym ACAB in a Facebook post and learned it stands for “All Cops are Bastards,” I was horrified and indignant. I see police officers helping injured animals; taking the lead in Special Olympics fundraising; holding yearly solemn events honoring the 9/11 first responders, so many of whom of course were law

enforcement officers; and so much more good in the community. How can they all be bastards?

Looking into it more I see ACAB, despite the specific implication, actually refers to the police as an institution and does not necessarily reflect upon the individual law enforcement officer. Its use is a response to police actions that have historically been perceived as abusive, obnoxious, corrupt and vindictive. Context is everything in this case. ACAB has been used by groups on all sides, from disruptive, racist, alt-right factions to current anti-racist protesters. Either way, as a way to indicate displeasure with an institution and system, it is a misleading phrase and there are better choices for signage.

A better choice for those protest signs might be #8cantwait, which boils down to a call for police policy reforms. The #8cantwait campaign

calls for communities to adopt eight specific policies aimed modifies that modify use-of-force procedures by law enforcement.

Those suggested policies are:

- Ban chokeholds and strangleholds;
- Require de-escalation training;
- Require warning before shooting;
- Require all alternatives before shooting, including using non-force and less-lethal force options;
- Duty to intervene proposes officers be required to intervene and stop excessive force used by other officers and report incidents immediately;
- Ban shooting at moving vehicles;
- Establish a force continuum that restricts the most severe types of force to the most extreme situations and creates clear policy restrictions on the use of each police weapon and tactic;
- Require comprehensive reporting for officers to report each time they use force or threaten to

use force against civilians.

When I hear calls to “defund the police,” my brain sees a filmstrip of “The Purge” type of images with people running rampant in the streets.

The truth, again, is different. Defunding the police could mean building a new model of public safety, including moving money from police departments into community-based safety strategies, including mental health services, emergency medical services and fire departments.

The idea does not necessarily mean getting rid of the police altogether. Rather, it would mean reducing police budgets and reallocating those funds to crucial and sometimes neglected areas, including education, public health, housing and youth services.

According to an article in “The Cut,” success is predicated on the belief that investing in communities would act as a better deterrent to crime by directly addressing societal problems like pov-

erty, mental illness and homelessness — issues that advocates say police are poorly equipped to handle and yet are often tasked with.

According to some estimates, law enforcement spends 21 percent of its time responding to and transporting people with mental illnesses. Police are also frequently dispatched to deal with people experiencing homelessness, causing them to be incarcerated at a disproportionate rate.

In 2015, the Washington Post found that one in four people killed by a police officer suffered from a serious mental illness at the time of their death. In certain situations, this kind of scenario could be decreased by replacing some police officers with trained social workers or specialized response teams.

The pressure on our law enforcement officers is huge today. I imagine they feel personally attacked and discouraged when they hear and see things like “ACAB” and “defund the police!” I

think if you ask a police officer why they chose law enforcement, they will say it was to serve the community and to keep people safe.

The problems currently inherent in our society might call for change, for rethinking what our roles are and what the role of the police is, but certainly not for individual attack. It is society that creates law enforcement and the need for it. We ARE the police and we need to heal what is wrong with the system without cutting off our noses to spite our faces.

# State budget fix is put off until next year

The New Mexico Legislature passed a number of useful bills in the recently completed special session dealing with police reform, racial equality and elections. But none of those were the reason Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham was compelled to call lawmakers back into session.

Reports about the coronavirus were starting to circulate in late February when the legislature was completing work on the state budget, but they apparently didn't reach the Roundhouse. Lawmakers passed a record \$7.6 billion budget,

an eight percent hike from the previous year, with large salary increases for state government workers.

By the time the signing period ended on this year's bills, it was clear that they had seriously overspent. Lujan Grisham vetoed capital outlay projects, but that wasn't nearly enough to make up the deficit.

It wasn't just the shutdown of our nation's economy from the coronavirus pandemic that cut into New Mexico's revenue. In March, a dispute between Russia and Saudi Arabia regarding oil production resulted in

a glut on the market and sent prices tumbling to below zero at the height of the crisis.

Our state's economy is so closely tied to the oil and gas industry that for every \$1 change in that market, we will either gain or lose some \$22 million. Prices are back up to about \$40 a barrel, but that is still \$10 short of what the budget was based on.

Lawmakers did just enough in the special session to get through this fiscal year. They trimmed about \$600 million from the budget, bringing it down to about \$7 billion. They were able to accomplish that primarily through reductions to agency budgets.

That, along with one-time federal aid money, should be enough to keep us out of the red this year without making tough decisions on things like the sustainability of recently passed salary increases.

But, it is estimated that lawmakers will need to cut as much as \$2 billion from the budget when they meet in January 2021.

It is, perhaps, appropriate that the tough decisions will be left to what will be the newly elected Legislature of 2021.

The group that met for the special session last month was essentially in lame-duck status, following the defeat of Sen. President Pro Tem Mary

Kay Papen and Finance Committee Chairman John Arthur Smith in the Democratic primary.

Smith, who served in the Senate for 32 years, has been making tough decisions for more than two decades as a leader of the Finance Committee. I was covering the legislature in Santa Fe and had a ringside seat as Smith worked to restrain the excesses of the Richardson administration.

Smith was tagged with the nickname "Dr. No" for his refusal to consider bills to tap into the permanent fund to boost spending for early childhood education. That and other progressive bills routinely died in Smith's

Finance Committee without ever being put to a vote, making him a target for frustrated activists in his own party.

Smith was defeated in June by Neomi Martinez Parra, a younger, more progressive candidate who is more in step with where the party is today. That's probably also true for Carrie Hamblen, who defeated Papen in the primary

If they win in November, it will be up to them and the other members of 2021 to figure out how to cut \$2 billion while still abiding by a court order to increase spending on education.

To the editor:

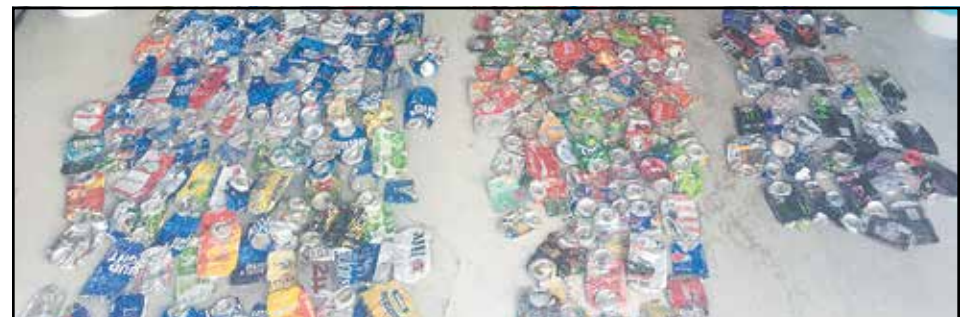
In the spring of 2019, I read an article about "plogging." This is a new "sport" that combines jog-

# Statewide survey: many Hispanics receive no federal relief

“This is really challenging time for all of us with the public health emergency, especially those who are most vulnerable,” Doña Ana County Commissioner Manuel Sanchez said Wednesday, July 1, as he participated in a Zoom news conference to discuss a statewide survey regarding Hispanic families in New Mexico who are ineligible for federal COVID-19

relief.

“Immigrant brothers and sisters too often are overlooked,” Sanchez said, and yet they are an “integral part of our county. They go to work the same as we all do. They go to school, and they’re going through the same challenges. Leadership in Washington have provided billions of dollars to corporations when really the people need it.”

The survey, conducted by the research firm La-

tino Decisions, showed that 20 percent of Hispanic families in New Mexico have had someone in their household lose their job since the onset of COVID-19; 20 percent of Hispanic parents/primary caregivers have seen their business shut down and/or seen significant drops in revenue; 33 percent of parents/primary caregivers have had trouble paying their rent or mortgage; and 48 percent had work hours cut or their pay cut,

but have kept their job.

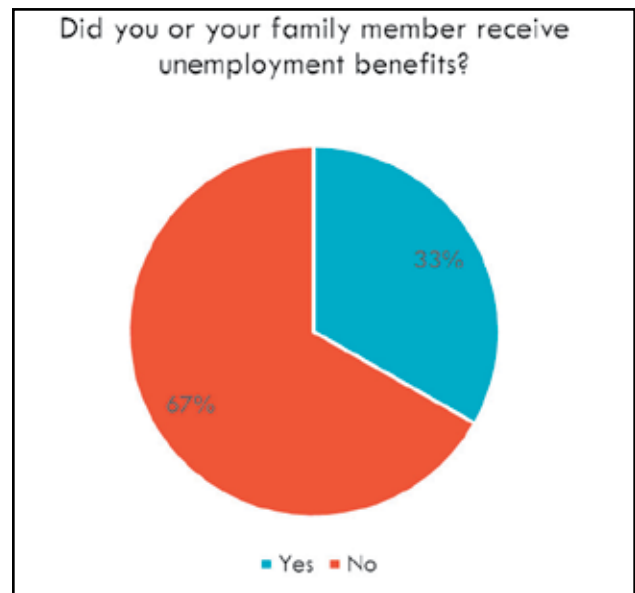
The survey also showed that nearly one-third of Hispanic families in New Mexico need help with wages and income as a result of COVID-19, and that nearly half have \$1,000 or less for emergencies.

For the survey, conducted June 4-12, Latino Decisions randomly interviewed 480 Hispanic parents of children 18 years or younger, according to [www.latinodecisions.com](http://www.latinodecisions.com). It conducted online surveys, as well as live landline and cell telephone interviews.

The survey has a 4.4 percent margin of error, said Gabriel Sanchez, Ph.D., lead researcher for Latino Decisions, adding that 165 of survey respondents were immigrants.

Here are other survey results:

- 38 percent said they had used up all or most of their savings during the pandemic; 24 percent said they had postponed or cut back on health-related expenses during COVID-19; 24 percent said they had skipped a car, rent or mortgage

- 23 percent have lost employer-provided health insurance, and 26 percent of the children of

- 44 percent have experienced much higher internet and/or cell phone bills because more people in their homes are working and/or going to school online.
- 71 percent reported either receiving a \$1,200 payment for a single person (40 percent), or a \$2,400 payment for a two-person household (31 percent). 29 percent did not receive any payment from the CARES Act and 40 percent did not receive any additional payments for their children.
- 67 percent did not receive any unemployment benefits. 36 percent said they were ineligible for benefits; 27 percent did not apply for personal reasons; 13 percent tried to apply but could not get through to submit an application; 11

# City economic recovery board explores reopening

During a June meeting via Zoom, Las Cruces Economic Recovery Ad Hoc board (LCERAHB) members discussed ways to build public confidence in frequenting local businesses as the city economy continues to reopen amid the COVID-19 pandemic.

LCERAHB was established by the city council to make recommendations to help guide safe reopening. It will dissolve when the economy is fully reopened.

Visit Las Cruces Marketing Director Paul Dahlgren made a presentation about the New



Mexico Safe Promise program, which was unveiled recently by the New Mexico Hospitality Association, as “an initiative open to all businesses and individuals in New Mexico who want to demonstrate their personal commitment to following COVID-safe practices.”

Individuals and businesses can take the New Mexico Safe Promise pledge at [www.nmsafepromise.org](http://www.nmsafepromise.org). Dahlgren said the program can help rebuild consumer confidence and will expand to include additional industries and

will build a directory of certified businesses.

“Take the pledge and spread the word,” Dahlgren said.

LCERAHB member Jolene Martinez, clinical director for Families and Youth, Inc., said the city should consider a local version of New Mexico Safe Promise to recognize local businesses and nonprofits “that are willing to commit to practices that still serve vulnerable families.”

“How do we continue to protect people as we re-emerge?” she asked.

Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce President and CEO Debbi Moore, LCERAHB vice chair, suggested that

businesses post their cleaning schedules. She also supported a local marketing campaign to build consumer confidence during COVID-19.

Board member George Miller said following New Mexico Department of Health recommendations is essential in re-opening businesses.

Some type of city-sponsored certification of businesses following COVID-19 safe practices is needed as part of a “big campaign” about what the city, businesses and nonprofits are doing to be safe, said board member Sharon Thomas, a former city councilor.

The focus needs to be, “You can feel comfort-

able and this is why,” said LCERAHB chair Christopher Schaljo, co-owner of Salud! de Mesilla.

Part of building public confidence is making local consumers aware that the percentages of Doña Ana County residents not infected with COVID-19 and the recovery rate of those who are infected are both very high, board member Doug Cowan said. That’s part of the board’s mission to maximize local success in dealing with COVID-19 while not minimizing the risk, said Cowan, of Cornerstone Baptist Church/Cornerstone Christian Academy, who represents nonprofits on the board.

City Business Development Administrator Mandy Guss made a presentation about the city’s micro-loan program to assist businesses, and LCERAHB member Jo Ann Garay said Doña Ana Community College’s Small Business Development Center is providing training and consultations to help new and existing businesses during COVID. She can be reached at 575-527-7676.





# Paws and reflect: It's Smokey THE Bear, thank you very much

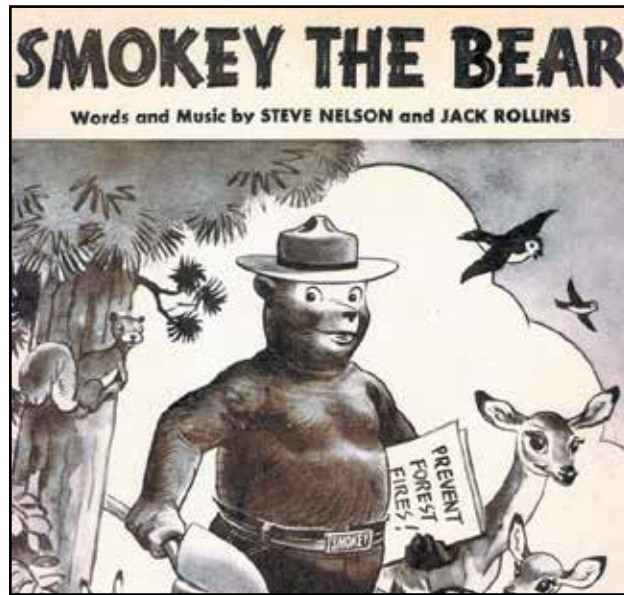
I finally know why Smokey Bear doesn't have a middle name ... anymore.

When I was growing up, it was always Smokey THE Bear. Then, mysteriously, Smokey's middle name began to disappear, becoming a sort of now-you-see-it, now-you-don't ex-the. The only explanation was, "You don't say, 'Santa THE Claus' or 'Easter THE Bunny.'"

Oh, yeah? Tell that to Winnie Pooh and Jack Ripper.

It turns out, the "the" came about in 1952 when Steve Nelson and Jack Rollins wrote a song called "Smokey the Bear." (Nelson and Rollins also wrote "Frosty the Snowman.")

At last, the vital detail: The ex-the is all about getting the meter right in a

song lyric!

Here's the chorus:  
"Smokey the Bear,

Smokey the Bear  
Prowlin' and a-growlin'  
and a sniffin' the air

He can find a fire before  
it starts to flame

That's why they call

him Smokey,

That was how he got his  
name."

Listen to Eddie Arnold's 1952 recording at [www.youtube.com/watch?v=Myz93sXW66Y](http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Myz93sXW66Y) and just try to sing along without the ex-the; it's unbearable.

The song was part of the nonprofit Advertising Council's public service program to prevent forest fires — apparently the longest running PSA series in the Ad Council's 78-year history. Bambi was the first character featured on a fire-prevention poster, replaced by a bear named Smokey in August 1944.

A small black bear was discovered with burned paws clinging to a dead tree after the Capitan Gap wildfire that started May 4, 1950, in the Lincoln

National Forest northeast and two counties away from Las Cruces. The fire destroyed 17,000 acres and orphaned the bear, who was rescued by a forest ranger, who named him Smokey. The little bear was flown to the National Zoo in Washington, D.C. to become the living symbol of fire prevention. Before he died Nov. 9, 1976, Smokey received so much fan mail that he was given his own zip code.

Smokey also became one of New Mexico's most enduring icons, along with RALF (Roswell Alien Life Form) and Billy THE Kid. He (the bear) is buried in Smokey Bear (grrrr!) Historical Park in Capitan. Alas, even his grave marker omits the

ex-the.

"Smokey the Bear (sic) Lyrics and Music" is the title of the website with the Smokey song sheet music ([www.nal.usda.gov/exhibits/speccoll/items/show/8214?collection=15](http://www.nal.usda.gov/exhibits/speccoll/items/show/8214?collection=15)). The sic obviously refers to the ex-the. Sigh.

What's the grammar lesson here? Simply — and sadly — that the ex-the in Smokey THE Bear exists only in song. Saying it is like using a turn signal: polite but no longer considered necessary.

For me, the ex-the is simply an article of faith.

In any case, the world's most famous bear likely would have turned 70 years old in 2020. Happy the birthday, Smokey!

# Volunteers doing their part to clean county

It's easy to drive by and shake your head when you see glass bottles poking through the desert sands or a stray plastic bag hanging off a thorny shrub. However, a small group of locals have stepped up to be the ones who stop and pick up that trash.

"Personally, I am driven by respect for the environment and a desire to do something to protect the surrounding desert and wildlife," said group member Elaine Stachera Simon. "There are tangible problems we solve by picking up trash, like preventing

wild animals from getting their heads stuck in cans and other containers."

The group calls itself the Badass Litter Pickers (BLiPS), and includes writer Stachera Simon and her husband, Dominic Simon; Dr. Michaela Buenemann, associate professor of geography at NMSU; Trish Cutler; and Raena Cota, program manager at NMSU. They connected online.

"It started when Trish Cutler posted an offhand comment about visiting the UK and finding so much less litter than in the U.S.," said Stachera Simon. "In the course of this thread, we found that we shared a lot of

frustration and anger about places getting trashed and decided to do something about it."

They've gone out every week for the past few months for about an hour at a time, depending on the heat of the day. They typically fill one to two bags per person, take the trash to the South Central Solid Waste Authority (SCSWA) Transfer Station, drop off the glass for recycling and donate aluminum cans to Cat's Meow Adoption Center, which recycles cans for cash to help with veterinary costs.

Recently, they've picked up free fresh yellow reflective vests from

Doña Ana County to help increase their visibility on the sides of the road.

"It feels so disrespectful when a cactus is shrouded in a big old plastic bag. The cactus deserves better," said Stachera Simon. "When I pick up trash, I think to myself, that's one less thing that could hurt an animal."

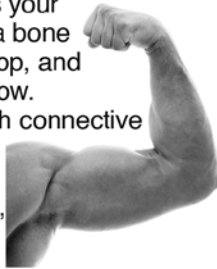
## Biceps Tendinitis

One of the things that happens in our office is something I call “the rule of 3’s. When we have a new client come in with a particular type of problem, we can be sure that two more will quickly follow! It’s really quite odd, because even when someone comes in with a very obscure problem, it won’t be long before two more come in with the same problem. It almost never fails.

Then there are things that we see all the time. Shoulder pain and low back pain are two things that we see on a daily basis. Today, I’d like to write about one common cause of shoulder pain: biceps tendonitis.

The biceps tendon connects the biceps muscle (that’s your ‘Popeye’ muscle) to a bone in your shoulder on top, and to a bone in your elbow.

The tendon is a tough connective tissue, like a really strong cable. When the muscle contracts, it pulls on the tendon, which pulls on the bone to which it’s connected, and the arm moves. If the tendon gets irritated and inflamed, we call it biceps tendinitis.



Some of the causes of biceps tendinitis include:

- a fall that injures the shoulder
- excessive weight lifting
- overuse from recreational and sports-related activities
- repetitive activities at home and work

If you have biceps tendinitis, you might experience:

1. Pain at the front of the shoulder joint that extends down the front of the arm
2. Weakness in the shoulder when trying to lift a weight while bending the elbow



3. Decreased range of motion of the shoulder joint
4. A visible change in the shape and appearance of the front of the arm (this could reflect one consequence of chronic biceps tendonitis - a biceps tendon rupture)

Prevention might be as simple as reducing the intensity or number of repetitions that you are doing. Maybe it’s pulling weeds in the garden, or spending all day Saturday cleaning those high closet shelves. If you are doing these kinds of activities, plan to take a break periodically to give your muscles and tendons a break.

What if it doesn’t get better? It’s not a good idea to just live with it. Continuing to use a weakened, inflamed tendon could result in tendon rupture. Medical treatment may involve the use of over-the-counter anti-inflammatory medication. A physician may recommend prescription pain killers or injections. In extreme cases, surgery may be required. Before it goes that far, physical therapy is almost always part of the treatment plan.

A physical therapist will evaluate your problem and develop a customized treatment plan to get you back to full function. Your physical therapist will teach you to avoid motions and positions that cause pain, while using treatment techniques to reduce and eliminate the pain. Once the pain subsides, therapeutic exercises and activities begin to restore full function.

## County notified of PILT allocation

The federal government’s Department of the Interior has released its annual Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILT) funding to a number of western states that have large, non-taxed federal land holdings.

Thirty two New Mexico counties received a total of \$41,357,054, of which Doña Ana County’s share is \$3,334,673. Eddy County received the highest allocation at \$3,735,551, while

Quay County received only \$5,077.

Doña Ana County’s manager of media and public communications, Catherine Zaharko, said the bulk of the funds will be used for road improvement projects, but allocations also will be targeted toward spay/neuter programs, food-resiliency services, child/youth violence-prevention services and the county’s annual contribution to the Mesilla Valley



Economic Development Alliance.

She said PILT funding has increased slightly each of the past three fiscal years,

with the 2020 allocation up about \$76,000 from 2019 and up \$145,088 from what was received in 2018.

She said all revenue is appreciated during the COVID-19 pandemic, and the county has yet to see whether gross-receipts tax revenue will see significant adverse effects in the long haul.

percent applied but were denied benefits; 17 percent did not know about unemployment benefits; and 11 percent said they did not know how to apply for benefits or the application process was too confusing to use.

- 31 percent of respondents work in health-

care; 20 percent are first responders; 17 percent work in a restaurant or grocery store; 14 percent work in retail; 11 percent in food and agriculture production; 10 percent in government, five percent in education and five percent in transportation.

- 82 percent said their employer provides them with protective equipment like gloves, masks

and sanitizer, and 88 percent said they feel safe performing their jobs.

- 89 percent said they agree that “Hispanic families feel the pain/frustration of the African American community due to shared experiences.” 82 percent said they have used the George Floyd video as an opportunity to speak with their children about racism.

# 'Domestic violence is a community issue,' says long-time local advocate, national award winner

"One of the things we need to understand, domestic violence is a community issue," said Pat Acosta, support services director for La Casa, Inc. domestic violence program, where she oversees the offenders' program, legal/immigration services, children's services, community education and awareness and La Casa's satellite office in Anthony, N.M.

She's also a survivor of domestic violence and has won a national award for her advocacy on behalf of other victims.

Changing the narrative about domestic violence, Acosta said, "takes a community, a vision, a philosophy."

"I've been doing this work for 34 years. I've seen women, men and children get killed," she said. Successful intervention includes working not only with victims but also with abusers, law enforcement, the courts and the public, Acosta said.

"La Casa cannot start to dent anything in domestic violence unless we work with the district attorney's office and the courts," she said. "We have to get better as a state. We need to start getting involved with voting and legislation, pointing out what's not working, how to get

better. We need to treat domestic violence like COVID. It is fatal."

While holding offenders accountable for their actions is essential, Acosta said, incarceration, especially on the first offense, is not the solution.

"Jail is not going to change these men, these women," Acosta said. "With domestic violence, they're a very special type of offender, and they need a specialized intervention."

She said appropriate intervention may include help dealing with mental health issues, substance abuse, income and employment, infidelity and more. State COVID-19-related public health stay-at-home orders have also increased domestic violence, Acosta said.

"All of these come with factors of honesty," she said. "Some of these guys (most abusers are men) don't know how to com-



municate. They don't understand the importance of growing up in the relationship."

And if the offender doesn't recognize he's got a problem, rehabilitation efforts don't work, Acosta said. "Get him to understand that his behavior is unacceptable."

Acosta reminds the men she counsels at La Casa that their victims "are the women you love, raising your children. Don't tell me you didn't know what you were doing. Oh, yes, you did."

And the spouse or significant other often isn't the only victim when domestic violence occurs, she said. Children may not suffer physical abuse, but they see what is happening between their parents. "It only takes one incident that can traumatize them," Acosta said. Pets also can be victims.

"Witnessing violence in the home is the strongest risk factor for transmitting violent behavior from one generation to the next," according to the La Casa website.

"I know what it is to be stabbed, to have your teeth broken," said Acosta, who was raised by a single mother and raised four daughters on her own.

## Needs at La Casa, Inc. domestic violence program include hygiene products, toys

La Casa, Inc. domestic violence program clients are "always in need of hygiene products," said La Casa Director of Support Services Pat Acosta.

Also needed, Acosta said, are items for La Casa's children's program, including games, toys and drawing/coloring materials. Older children enjoy gift cards and art crafts, including jewelry- and ribbon-making.

Acosta was born in El Paso. She spent the first 12 years of her life in Ciudad Juarez before her family returned to El Paso. Acosta has a bachelor's degree in social work from New Mexico State University and

certifications in public housing, parenting and teaching curriculums of intimate partner violence. Acosta was one of 16 recipients from among 3,800 nominated to receive the President's Service Award in 1997.

# County commission may award triage center contract

The Doña Ana County Commission could vote as early as July 14 on a proposal to operate the crisis triage center (CTC), County Commission Chair Lynn Ellins said as he concluded a July 1 special meeting.

During the meeting, held in commission chambers at the Doña Ana County Government Center, with some speakers participating via Zoom, the commission heard public input about a proposed business plan to operate the CTC that was submitted by Recovery Innovations International (RI), a Phoenix-based nonprofit that offers behavioral health services in crisis, health, recovery and consulting, according to the corporate website.

The commission could choose to award the management contract to RI without following the normal state procurement process because it is “such a specialized



search,” county Health and Human Services Director Jamie Michael said. Michael said the county has worked with several management companies since CTC was built in 2013, but none of the contracts proved viable.

County Manager Fernando Macias said the critical first step “to get the CTC up and operating” is for the county to have a licensed facility and operator. Currently, Macias said, the state’s only functioning triage center is in Bernalillo County. He said Santa Fe and Grant counties are licensed for facilities but don’t have them.

Once Doña Ana County has a licensed CTC, Macias said, it can begin to discuss what services the center would provide, including a mobile crisis unit, for which Commissioners Shannon Reynolds and Manuel Sanchez

expressed support during the special meeting.

“We need to get a license to get started,” Commissioner Isabella Solis said.

“Right now, we need to establish that triage center,” said Commissioner Ramon Gonzalez. “The mobile will come next. First thing first, let’s address the triage center.

The CTC business plan under consideration “talks about continuum of care,” Sanchez said, and that should include a mobile crisis unit to provide service “to the county as a whole.”

“We may be forced to implement something like a mobile crisis unit to meet the needs that we have,” Reynolds said. The unit, he said, could provide “the right services at the point where these

situations occur.”

Awarding a contract to RI would exclude local companies from consideration, said former county treasurer Mary Martinez White, who is retired from the New Mexico Administrative Office of the Courts, where she served as statewide magistrate DWI drug court coordinator.

Las Cruces attorney Peter Goodman also said he has “concerns about the process” and whether the county is legally entitled to go forward without issuing an RFP.

Speaking by phone, state Rep. Joanne Ferrary, D-Doña Ana, said she doesn’t favor a sole-source contract and said the county should issue an RFP for CTC management. “I don’t trust another company from out of state,” Ferrary said.

David Velasquez of iNetMed Rx<sup>2</sup> Inc., a clinical psychology, psychiatric services and behavioral medicine management company in Las Cruces, said awarding the contract to RI is favoritism.

“I think the business plan (proposed by RI) falls short,” said Dr. Jo Velasquez, also of iNetMed. Dr. Velasquez said she also has concerns about CTC staffing and costs under the proposed plan. “It’s just unrealistic in so many ways,” she said.

Vasquez told a May Zoom meeting of the LC3 behavioral health collaborative that iNetMed is working with City of Las Cruces officials on a plan to address mental illness in Las Cruces.

Micah Pearson, a member of the board of the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI), said RI represents the “industry standard,” and was asked to put together the CTC business plan “based on work they’ve already done.” He said NAMI locally and nationally support the plan. “It covers the needs of the clientele,” Pearson said, “and goes into treating the crisis of the moment, which is what we asked them to do.”

“One indicator of a

thriving community is the ability to meet its members’ behavioral health crises needs through teamwork, trust and sustainability,” LC3 behavioral health collaborative Co-Chair John Burch said in an email. The CTC has the potential to meet these needs for Doña Ana County and it reflects our renewed commitment toward behavioral health crisis care.”

“I think the plan is adequate,” said Dr. Ernest Flores of Las Cruces. But Flores said RI’s proposed operational costs “sound high,” and he stressed the need for hiring local residents as CTC staff.

RI Vice President for Western Region Mental Health Systems and System Development Wayne Lindstrom said RI has a reputation for being transparent and trustworthy.

La Clinica de Familia Chief Health Officer Jaime Olivas said the RI business plan “can close some gaps in services. The need is great.”

## Community of Hope COVID-safe practices: no positive tests to date

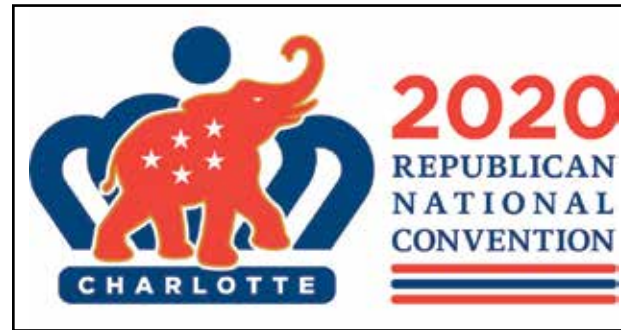


Selected by the Republicans are County Commissioner Isabella Solis and Paul Smith.

# Rep. Gallegos receives Albuquerque chamber award

State Rep. Doreen Gallegos, D-Doña Ana, has been awarded the Excellence in Education Award by the Albuquerque Chamber of Commerce.

The award recognized Gallegos for carrying the bill that created the state Early Childhood Education Endowment Fund during the 2020 legislative session. The fund is the first of its kind in the nation. Its initial \$300 million in funding will be allocated to New Mexico Pre-K, home visitation and

childcare services.

The Albuquerque chamber also recognized state Sen. John Arthur Smith, D-Luna, Hidalgo, Sierra, Doña Ana, for sponsoring the bill creating the endowment fund in the state Senate.

"I'm a small-business advocate in the legislature, and I wanted to serve in the legislature to advocate for children's issues," said Gallegos, who represents District 52 in the House. "We are planting seeds for generations of New Mex-

ico children."

Gallegos was first elected in 2012 and is a candidate for reelection to her fifth two-year term in the House this November.

She was unopposed in the June Democratic Primary. She serves as House majority whip and is the only Democrat from southern New Mexico chosen by her colleagues to serve in a leadership position.

"Prekindergarten improves the odds a New Mexico student will graduate from high school,

especially if

that child is learning English or is low income," the New Mexico Legislature's Legislative Finance Committee (LFC) said in its June newsletter.

In a report called Pre-kindergarten Quality and Educational Outcomes, LFC staff reported that "the inaugural New Mexico prekindergarten cohort, which graduated last year, had a four-year high school graduation rate of 80.2 percent, 6.5 percentage points higher than students who did not attend prekindergarten.

"Gains in graduation

rates are even higher — 11 percentage points — for English learners and lower-income children who attended prekindergarten," LFC staff said.

"Additionally, pre-kindergarten reduces chronic absenteeism and the chance a child will be retained a grade and improves the odds a child will exit special education services," the LFC said.

The report also said New Mexico gets almost \$6 back on every dollar it invests in prekindergarten through tax revenue on the higher earnings of participants and reduced

social costs.

"The early years of a child's life are very important for later health and development," the national Centers for Disease Control said on its website ([www.cdc.gov/ncbddd/childdevelopment/early-brain-development.html](http://www.cdc.gov/ncbddd/childdevelopment/early-brain-development.html)). "One of the main reasons is how fast the brain grows starting before birth and continuing into early childhood. Although the brain continues to develop and change into adulthood, the first eight years can build a foundation for future learning, health and life success."

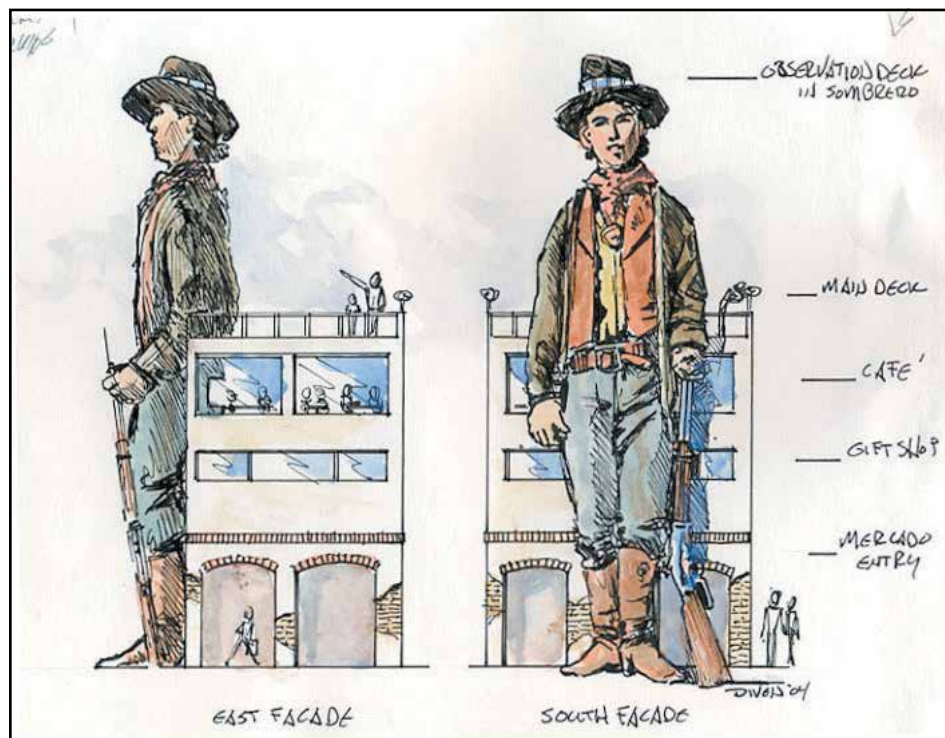

## Artist Bob Diven prepares Kid sculpture for museum exhibit

My sculpture of Billy the Kid began as a joke some 20 years ago: Pat Beckett, (founder of COAS Books in downtown Las Cruces) and I were talking about the plight of our blighted downtown. Pat said a "city father" asked him how to "get people downtown." To which Pat replied: "You really want to get people downtown? Build a hundred-foot tall Billy the Kid and put a restaurant in his sombrero!" We both laughed. But the more I thought about it, the more brilliant I decided the concept was.

So, my sculpture was created to become a one-hundred-foot-tall fiberglass tourist attraction attached to a faux-historic



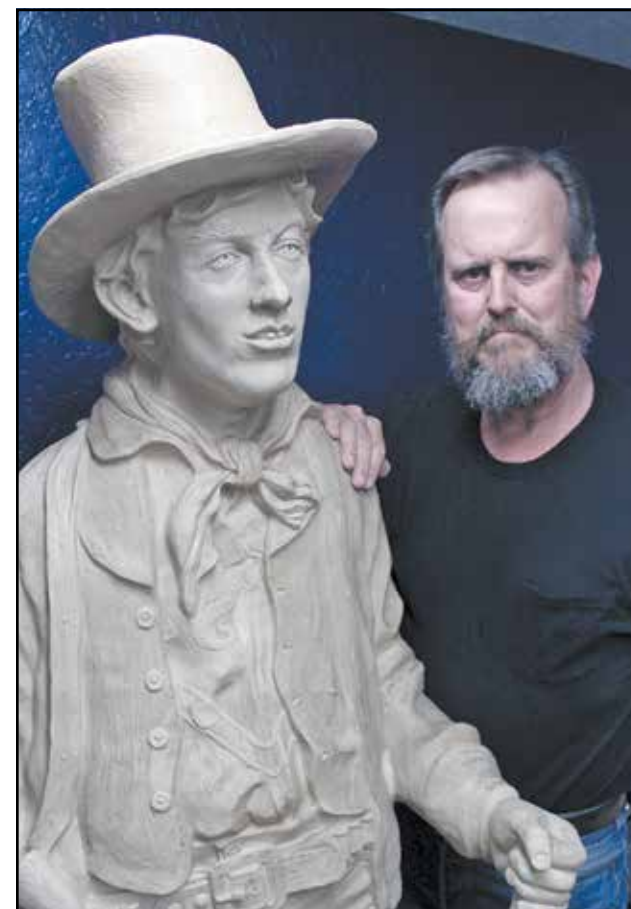
Bob Diven's drawing of the original plan for a 100-foot Billy the Kid statue in downtown Las Cruces.

commercial building at the corner of Las Cruces Avenue and Main Street.

To prepare for this grand project, I set to work creating a life-size

sculpture of Billy the Kid. I purchased a high-resolution image of the famous tintype of Billy from The Museum of New Mexico.

Standing in his iconic pose, Colt revolver in its holster, Winchester in his left hand. The high-resolution image allowed me to suss out telling details, such as the embroidered pattern on his shirt, the gambler's ring on his left hand and the sense that one of the reasons his jaw looked so odd was that he had probably spoken while holding his pose for the photographer in Fort Sumner, causing portions of his face to be blurred a bit in the image.

I welded up a steel armature to support the clay sculpture and ordered a couple hundred pounds of oil clay.

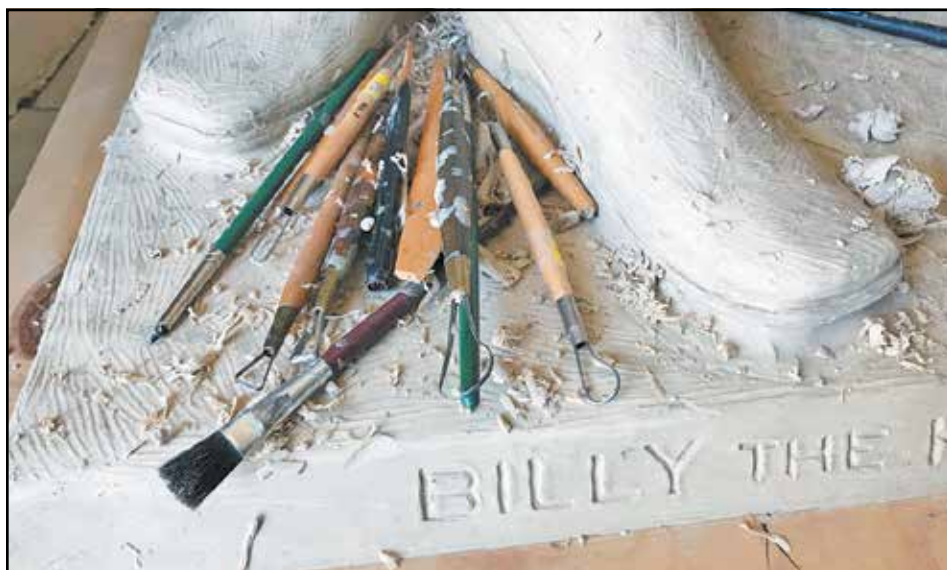
I completed the sculpture in 2013, thinking I would sell a few bronze casts of the work. There was some interest from a few quarters, but no subscribers. And so, Billy stood in the corner of my studio for years.

This year I got an inquiry from New Mexico Farm and Ranch Heritage

Museum about utilizing Billy in an exhibit on the Lincoln County Wars.

Since the clay original was too delicate to move and display, I took it as an opportunity to use my bit of mold-making and resin-casting experience to create resin casts of the sculpture for the museum and other Billy the Kid aficionados.

I am now in the process of working out the pro-

# Did Billy the Kid really kill 21 men?

*Editor's note: Pat Garrett served as sheriff in both Lincoln and Doña Ana counties. He shot and killed Billy the Kid in Fort Sumner, N.M., at about midnight Thursday, July 14, 1881, 139 years ago next Tuesday. Billy the Kid is buried in Fort Sumner. Garrett is buried in Las Cruces.*

Archaeological excavations were conducted at the Alexander MacSween House ruins in Lincoln State Historical Monument 1986-88 by Human Systems Research, Inc. A public education program was included that focused on the reality versus the myths associated with Billy the Kid.

One of the most common questions asked by the site visitors was "Did Billy the Kid really kill 21 men?" The answer appears to be no.

He was involved in killing nine men, four by himself and five as a group member. On Aug. 17, 1877, he shot Frank

"Windy" Cahill in the stomach when Cahill bullied him physically and verbally at Camp Grant, Arizona.

The second was Jan. 10, 1880, when Joe Grant challenged him, saying, "He would kill a man today before you do," and then tried to shoot Billy. The third event was the escape from the Lincoln County Court House when on April 28, 1881, he shot James Bell and Robert Olinger during his escape from the second-story jail.

On March 1, 1878, Billy and several regulators captured Billy Morton, Frank Baker and William McClosky, members of the sheriff's posse that killed John Tunstall on Feb. 18, 1878. These three were killed trying to escape after leaving John Chisum's ranch.

The second group killing involved the assassination of Sheriff William Brady and Deputy George Hindman. On April 1, 1878, as the sheriff and his deputies (Billy Mathews, George Hindman, George Pepper and Jack Long) walked down

a Lincoln, N.M., street toward the courthouse, Billy the Kid, Jim French, John Middleton, Fred Waite, Henry Brown and Frank McNab fired on the sheriff and his deputies from behind an adobe wall associated with the Tunstall store.

In the exchange of gun fire, Billy was wounded in the thigh as he tried to get Brady's rifle, but he was able to escape. It is not known if any of his bullets actually caused the deaths.

So how did the 21-men myth begin and continue to be perpetuated?

The "Santa Fe Weekly Democrat" published his obituary on July 21, 1881, and included the following statement: "Billy Bonny [Bonney], alias Billy the Kid, the 21-year old desperado, who is known to have killed 16 men, and who boasted that he had killed a man for every year of his life, will no longer take de-

liberate aim at his fellow man and kill him, just to keep in practice."

Billy the Kid would probably have been another unknown individual, footnoted in history books and articles except for the publication of "The Saga of Billy the Kid" by Walter Noble Burns.

The book, selected for the December 1926 Book of the Month Club, was widely read. Who knows how many people received it as a Christmas gift? Burns portrayed Billy as a persecuted youth who was noble, courageous and handsome but was forced to violence.

The original song of "Billy the Kid" was written by Rev. Andrew Jenkins on Jan. 20, 1927, and sung by Vernon Dalhart. The fourth verse is, "On the very same night when poor Billie died, he said to his friends, 'I am not satisfied. There were

twenty-one men I have put bullets through, And Sheriff Pat Garrett must make twenty-two."

Versions of the song have been sung by Burl Ives, Marty Robbins and others. The wildly inaccurate song "Ballad of Billy the Kid" was released by

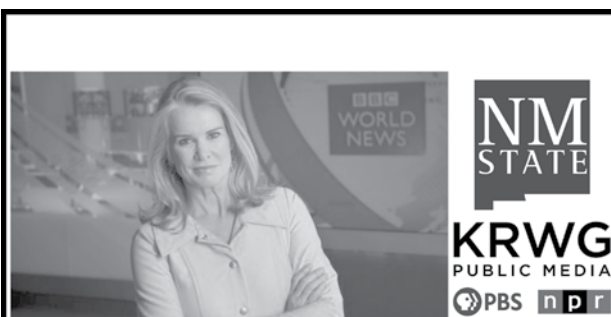

# Las Cruces author pens definitive Pat Garrett history

“Killing Pat Garrett, The Wild West’s Most Famous Lawman - Murder or Self-Defense?” tells the historic and tragic history of Patrick Floyd Jarvis Garrett, who was born June 5, 1850 in Chambers County, Alabama.

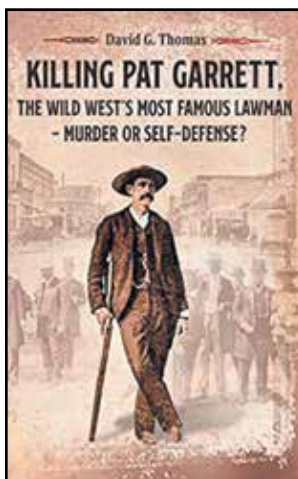
The book was written by Las Cruces author David G. Thomas and published last October about the one-time sheriff of both Lincoln County and of Doña Ana

County (1896-1900), who shot and killed Billy the Kid July 14, 1881 in Fort Sumner, New Mexico.

As the book details, Garrett was shot and killed by Wayne Brazel Feb. 29, 1908 just north of Las Cruces. You can find a historic marker at the spot just south of U.S. Highway 70 near Oñate High School, where Garrett was killed, and you

can find his grave in the Masonic Cemetery on Brown Road in Las Cruces.

Thomas is the author of las-crucesblog.com, cofounder of Friends of Pat Garrett, a filmmaker, screenwriter, author, historian and travel writer.

Garrett packed a lot of living into his 57 years, as detailed in Thomas’ excellent book. It has a full account of Garrett’s personal life, his family and his terms as sheriff, including his involvement in the 1899 arrest and trial of the men accused of killing Henry Fountain, the 8-year-old son of legendary Judge Albert J. Fountain.

Garrett also served four years as collector of customs in El Paso, as appointed by President Theodore Roosevelt. Garrett’s daughter, Elizabeth (1885-1947), wrote the state song, “O Fair New Mexico,” in 1915.

Thomas is also the editor of “The Stolen Pinkerton Reports of the Colonel Albert J. Fountain Murder Investigation,” published in 2020, as well as “Billy the Kid’s Grave – A History of the Wild West’s Most Famous Death Marker.”

Thomas won the Doña

Ana County Historical Society’s 2020 Pasajero del Camino Real Award for the Pat Garrett book. Thomas won the same award in 2015 and 2017 for other books he has written.

His first three books were about La Posta restaurant, Giovanni Maria de Agostini and movie theaters in Las Cruces.

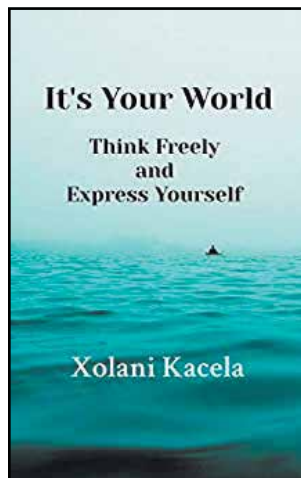
over Niagara Falls," he said. "I was a different person back then,"

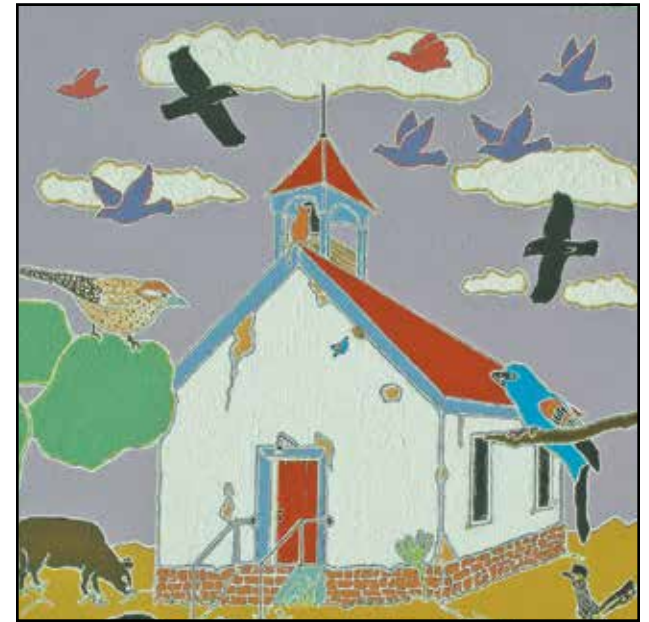

## Las Cruces Academy keeps educating amid COVID-19

With public schools trying to plan a way to open safely amid the COVID-19 pandemic, non-profit Las Cruces Academy (LCA) is up and running, molding young minds in the era of social distancing and distance learning.

LCA's board of trustees is chaired by Dr. Vincent P. Gutschick, and the board employs Lou Ellen Kay as its sole employee, whose title is head of school.

In addition to Kay, the academy sports five paid teachers, one custodian and two full-time volunteers. Gutschick,

a former NMSU biology professor, is one of the teachers.

Gutschick said the academy's core function as a private, non-profit school is "early kindergarten through grade eight education."

Incorporated in March 2007 and beginning operations in August 2009, LCA operated seamlessly for 11 years — and then came the pandemic.

Gutschick said initial social distancing and sanitizing gave way to

distance education, "provided by our tech-savvy teachers and small-group access to the school for mathematics testing to assure student progress, book exchanges and science equipment loans."

When classes resume

in August, Gutschick said the school will practice social distancing at all times, wearing masks and temperature and symptom scanning of all people entering the building amid what he calls "a major revision of the aca-

demic schedule with full 180 days of instruction, selected Zoom classes and sanitizing."

Despite the challenges, Gutschick said he remains proud of the product.

"We're a small school, with enrollment in the 40s in a safe and socially rich environment and a top-ranked academic program," he said. "We plan to offer 180 full days of teaching to all students, enabled by our spacious building and detailed planning to meet all state mandates."

# Mediation: an alternative to court proceedings

When a dispute arises that can't be worked out between the parties, many turn to mediation as a way to seek compromise.

Conflict and Dispute Resolutions of the Southwest (CDRS) is owned and managed by Ted Ramirez, who said his team focuses on mediation, arbitration, negotiation, ombudsman-ship and alternative dis-

pute resolution (ADR).

"We also train workplace teams through 'Leadership in Team Dysfunction,' thereby improving productivity and profits," he said.

First opened in 2016, CDRS has offices in both Mesilla and El Paso.

While the COVID-19 pandemic has hurt many small businesses, Ramirez said CDRS has weathered the storm fairly well.

"We're extremely for-

tunate to hold national contract agreements with the federal, state and certain [number of] local governments and judicial interests in four states, including New Mexico," he said. "Our business model has included a larger proportion of video-conference services. Where needed, we have performed services under strict health guidelines of our entities and customers. We also provide services through the Better Business Bureau of El Paso."

Ramirez said the services CDRS offers can save people time, money and stress.

"Mediation is much

better than court right now, because courts are closed," he said. When opened, it is expected that jury trials will take priority over other issues. Why wait while the legal meter runs or you wait for a judge to decide the outcome? Take control of an outcome that can create win-win."

He said the process "saves anxiety, time and money by reaching a mediated settlement agreement that can become a binding agreement if both parties agree."


Ramirez said an important factor in successful dispute resolution is often the skill of the mediator and the tool set s/he

brings to the negotiating table.

"We don't take sides and are not influenced by attorneys who try to negotiate an agreement," he said, adding that the opposing parties ultimately decide the outcome.

"What is agreed to or not is in your hands, not an attorney with a vested interest in the outcome," Ramirez said. "In a courtroom, the final binding decision is made by a judge, even if neither party is particularly happy with the outcome."

# Santa Teresa scores fed \$\$

## BULLETIN REPORT

The U.S. House of Representatives voted to include Congresswoman Xochitl Torres Small's amendment to H.R. 2 that dedicates \$100 million to improvement projects at land ports of entry (POE) like Santa Teresa POE. As the House crafted H.R. 2, an infrastructure package that puts Americans back to work, Torres Small advocated for the needs of border and trade dependent communities, like those in southern New Mexico.

"Our country's ports of entry are critical to our trade economy and border security. Despite being one of the largest ports in America, Santa Teresa's infrastructure hasn't been updated since the late 1990s. We need to invest in its outdated infrastructure so it can meet today's demand and prepare for the increase in trade and attract more businesses to its industrial base. By investing in land ports of entry like Santa Teresa, we can create jobs that put New Mexicans to work while making us all

safer by helping stop illegal drug trafficking," said Torres Small.

Torres Small's amendment would authorize \$100 million for infrastructure improvement projects at land ports of entry with at least a 5 percent in trade growth in 2019. About a dozen land POEs nationwide would qualify for this funding, including the Santa Teresa POE. Last year alone, the Santa Teresa POE experienced a 17.4 percent increase in total trade, totaling \$30.5 billion in exported and

imported goods. This increase rocketed the port to fourth in total trade for all land ports of entry on the U.S.-Mexico border, and sixth in total trade for all land ports of entry in the country.

In December 2019, Torres Small, chairwoman of the Homeland Security Oversight, Management and Accountability Subcommittee, hosted a congressional visit to the Santa Teresa POE and convened a hearing to learn more about the port's infrastructure and border security needs.

# Amid challenging times, reading provides an outlet

Zoey, 5, had her focus on the table as she clung shyly to her mother. Her two-year old sister kept pointing to a story about bears. Both were soon clutching new books. “Can we really keep them?”

a Dr. Seuss book and a Spanish-speaking family was delighted to find bilingual titles from which to choose. On this particular day, Children’s Reading Alliance (CRA) provided

Nearby, Carlos chose books at a kindergar-

ten registration event sponsored by Las Cruces Public Schools (LCPS) and the National Education Association.

Getting books to children this summer requires finding new partners to reach the children who need them. Boys and Girls Club and Families and Youth Inc. are distributing books at summer lunch sites. Kids Can and Thriving Kids programs are taking books to Sunland Park, Anthony, Chaparral and Hatch. We are still seeking more partners.

To continue to serve our most vulnerable families, CRA is adjusting to changing reality. This fall, we will offer parents two choices for First Teacher/Primer Maestro (FT/PM) classes. In areas where families have access to technology, our classes will be offered through interactive video classes.

For families without Internet service, CRA

will offer small classes in large rooms. We already have commitments from five community schools and New Mexico pre-k programs to offer FT/PM parent classes, and LCPS will provide computers and internet access. Registration is starting for a pilot project at Raices Del Saber Community School.

As the COVID-19 pandemic progresses, the burden on already stressed families intensifies and will continue to wreak havoc in the uncertain economic times to come. Family reading at home offers unique safety valves for children and adults.

Reading relieves stress. Neuroscience researchers at both Emory University and University of Sussex County found that just six minutes of reading lowers heart rate and muscle tension. A bedtime reading routine helps the body wind down, which improves sleep.

There is evidence that dads who read to their children receive added benefits of greater skill acquisition, confidence, self-esteem, better father-child relationships and increased engagement in learning, according to Rob Kemp, author of “The New Dad’s Survival Guide.”

Furthermore, reading fiction tricks the mind into thinking we are part of the story and builds capacity for empathy for others. At a neurological level, the empathy we feel for the characters in a story wires our brains to have the same sensitivity toward real people.

According to Harvard mindfulness researcher Ellen Langer, “Mindfulness is a mental state achieved by focusing one’s awareness on the present moment. Resilience and well-being can be learned.”

Books provide momentary escape from stress, can transport us to other worlds and provide our

imaginations with alternative ways of coping.

Along with challenging times come new opportunities. Creating safe learning space in homes must become a priority. At CRA we are developing a three-year plan to make sure that the current interruptions to school do not permanently interfere with the literacy gains our children need for success. # Alongside Woods, black golfers have impacted golf, part 1

For most Americans, sports fans or not, there is one professional golfer they can name — Tiger Woods. Having amassed a mind-boggling record of 82 Professional Golfers Association of America (PGA) Tour wins, including 15 majors, Woods is generally regarded as the most talented golfer ever to play the game. Woods is African American, and one of only four black players on the tour, alongside Harold Varner III, Cameron Champ and Joseph Bramley.

Even though blacks have been denied fair access to golf over the years — and still today — there is a rich and fascinating history of black golfers, dating all

the way back to 1896. That was the year John Shippen, whose father was African American and whose mother was Shinnecock Indian, played in the second U.S. Open at Shinnecock Hills on Long Island, N.Y., where he worked as a 17-year-old caddie.

Some of the professional players threatened to boycott, but USGA President Theodore Havemayer insisted he could play. Shippen tied for sixth, won \$10, and went on to play five more U.S. Opens. It wasn't until 1948 that Ted Rhodes became the second African American to play in the U.S. Open.

Back in 1934 the PGA put had a “caucasian

only” clause in its by-laws. After a campaign by black golfer Charlie Sifford, the clause was removed in 1961 on orders from a California judge. Sifford got his playing card in 1961 and went on to win the Greater Hartford Open Invitational in 1967, the Los Angeles Open in 1969 and the 1970 San Diego Open. Yet, none of those three wins was sufficient to get him an invitation to the Masters in Augusta.

In 2007, Sifford received the Old Tom Morris Award, the highest honor bestowed by the Golf Superintendents Association of America. Sifford's 1992 autobiography is titled, “Just Let Me Play: The Story of Charlie Sifford, the First Black PGA Golfer.” Tiger Woods named his son

Charlie after Sifford.

Lee Elder was the golf pro who broke the color line at the Masters in 1975. Elder was invited to the tournament after he won the Monsanto Open in 1974. As a teen, Elder worked in locker rooms and pro shops and caddied. By age 16, his game had developed sufficiently for him to do some golf hustling.

Elder's golf career basically started after playing a match with famous boxer Joe Louis, and that led to Louis's golf instructor, Ted Rhodes, taking Elder under his wing for three years, until he began playing tournaments. After raising enough money to play in the PGA Tour Q school, he got his tour card in 1968.

In 1971 Elder played several tournaments in

South Africa at Gary Player's invitation, even though the country still had apartheid policies. After Monsanto, Elder's other wins came at the Houston Open in 1976, the Greater Milwaukee Open in 1978 (winning a playoff against El Paso's Lee Trevino) and the American Express Westchester Class in 1978.

At age 50, Elder became the first black player to qualify and play in the Ryder Cup in 1984. From 1984 to 1988, Elder won eight times on the Senior PGA Tour.

Jim Dent grew up in the golf mecca of Augusta, Georgia, where he caddied at Augusta National as well as Augusta Country Club. When young, he worked very hard at his game where he could and turned pro in 1966 at age 27. Dent

won the Florida PGA Championship three times: 1976, 1977, 1978. He never won on the regular PGA Tour, but when he turned 50, he became a mainstay on the Senior Tour (now known as the PGA Tour Champions). At 6'3” and 224 pounds, Dent was one of the longest hitters out there. Throughout the 1990s, he won 12 times as a senior.

# Schools announce return-to-play guidelines

The superintendent and Athletics Department at Las Cruces Public Schools has extended the return-to-play guidelines for summer workouts.

The district-wide safety

protocols have been in place since June 22 for football, soccer, volleyball and cross country. Following the latest information from the governor's office to mitigate the spread of COVID-19, the addition of indoor sports, along with opening indoor weight

rooms, has been pushed back to July 13.

“The safety of our athletes remains our focus,” said LCPS Executive Director of Athletics Ernie Viramontes.

A target date to resume middle school sports has not been announced.

The following guidelines remain in effect:

- No students will be allowed indoors. Outdoor restroom facilities will be available for students to access during practice.
- Coaches and student athletes will have their

temperature checked daily.

- No practices will be scheduled between noon and 5 p.m. to avoid peak summertime heat.
- Prescreening and practice sessions will not exceed 90 minutes per session.

- No spectators will be allowed at practice or on the fields at any time.
- The following facilities remain closed under the Phase 1 extension: locker rooms, athletic trainers' offices/workspace and weight rooms.
