# And they're off! Campaign signs popping up

As of Aug. 7, there are 88 days until the Tuesday, Nov. 3, General Election. Yard signs and billboards are allowed 90 days before an election, and they have already begun to appear.

There are 28 federal, statewide and local races on Doña Ana County ballots, including 59 candidates: 28 Democrats, 25 Republicans, four Libertarians, one Constitution Party candidate and one declined-to-state (DTS) candidate. There are eight incumbent local district judges and one state Supreme Court justice up for voter retention.
There also will be five ballot initiatives for vot-

ers to consider: two constitutional amendments and three statewide bond issues that would allocate $\$ 200$ million for senior centers, libraries, colleges and universities across the state.

Because state legislators and county commissioners are elected by districts, not everyone will see the same names on their ballots. Voters will choose from the same group of candidates for president, U.S. Senate and U.S. House New Mexico
district two, county clerk and treasurer and Third Judicial District attorney, and will vote up or down for statewide and local judicial retentions.

But depending on where they live, voters will see different candidates in the six state Senate and eight state House of Representatives races that include Doña Ana County. Three of five county commission seats are also on this year's ballot. The other two commission seats

- along with the county sheriff, assessor and probate judge - will be up in 2022.

Democrats are unopposed in one statewide and two local races: Court of Appeals position three, district attorney and county commission district two. Gerald Byers, who also had no primary opponent, will succeed Mark D'Antonio, who is retiring after two fouryear terms, as district attorney.

Anthony Mayor Diane Murillo-Trujillo defeated incumbent Ramon Gonzalez in the June county commission district two Primary and will become a member of the commission next January.

The four Libertarian
candidates are running for president, U.S. Senate, U.S. House, Court of Appeals position two (a write-in candidate whose status is being evaluated by the New Mexico Secretary of State's office) and county commission district four.

The lone Constitution Party candidate is running for president and the only DTS candidate is running for U.S. House district two.

There are 22 incumbents running: 21 Democrats hoping to hold U.S. House district two, two state Supreme Court and three Court of Appeals seats, four state Senate and eight state House seats, one county commission seat, county clerk
and county treasurer; and two Republicans, President Donald Trump and state Sen. Ron Griggs of Alamogordo, whose district includes two of Doña Ana County's 170 precincts.

Two long-time state Senate Democrats - John Arthur Smith (32 years) of Deming and Mary Kay Papen (20 years) of Las Cruces, lost in the Primary, along with County Commissioner Gonzalez. Another county commissioner, Isabella Solis, was elected to the commission as a Democrat in 2016, switched to Republican in 2019 and chose to run for state representative this year instead of running for re-election to the commission.

Seeds are popping up at the Thomas Branigan Memorial Library at the new Tierra Sagrada Seed Library (named after the mural in the library's amphitheater). This seed
library has been created to encourage Las Crucens to learn more about local food systems and regional community seed-saving projects. Library public programs manager Brita Sauer said she has been involved in seed libraries

both in Albuquerque and seed donation back to Santa Fe, and they have the seed library. Visit the been popular.
"It provides materials to the community," she said. "It provides a way to keep seeds in the community and develop traits for our environment."

The Tierra Sagrada Seed Library is available during curbside hours (between 9 a.m. and noon, Monday through Friday) throughout August and September, while supplies last, Sauer said.

Each library patron can check out five packets of seed per season on library cards. There is no return date this year, but patrons are encouraged to learn how to save seeds and eventually make a
library's webpage (www. las-cruces.org/1617/Library) and click on "Seed Library" for more information and a listing of available fall seeds.
"Right now, we have fall varieties and winter," Sauer said. "People can take those and start growing this fall. Our fall planting seeds include beets, carrots, lettuce and chard. A lot of the greens are good once the weather cools down. We also have some herbs."

Community members who are interested in donating seed are asked to fill out a donation form to provide information on seed provenance and cul-
tural history, she said. "It's important that we see what grows well here," Sauer said. "So the rest of the community can enjoy those. Food insecurity is becoming prevalent, and this is a small way for food security to grow in the community."

The hope is for the seed library to keep seeds in the hands of community members and make them a resource, she said.
"We view them the same as books - for sharing, using and learning from," she said. "We are hoping we will have a physical location inside the library in the spring. We hope to offer programming - workshops
related to seeds and gardening, how to get going, and I have materials for some sort of little demonstration garden."

While the nation deals with a looming invisible danger, another invisible service is managed by Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) every day. Colorless and only recognizable by an added sulfur smell, natural gas is an everyday useful part of residents' lives for heating and cooking. However, when leaks occur, natural gas can be dangerous.

Adam Valles, LCU gas leak surveyor, has a tool that allows him - crucially important nowadays - to keep his distance. The Remote Methane Leak Detector (RMLD) works from 30 to 100 feet away and lets Valles detect gas leaks from meters from the street or even from outside a fence; in case a gate is locked

or guard dogs are present.
"The RMLD sends out an infrared beam to the meter and if it hits a gas plume, it slows the electrical pulse that comes back to my detector," he said. "That allows me to know not only that there is a leak, but how large the leak might be."

Previously, each surveyor would need to get right next to the meter and spray soapy water onto the meter. Bubbles meant that there was a leak, but it's a process that would also take much longer. "Now I can walk through a neighborhood in about 20 minutes,"


Valles said. "It used to take me about half a day."

Valles said the machine does confuse residents as he walks the streets, scanning yards for any leaking pipes; the RMLD looks a bit like a speed detector and he wears special dark glasses to help read the RMLD. "But it's a critical tool for my job in keeping our gas service safe for residents," he said.

## Henson: a nice guy who finished first

A few years ago, a friend of mine who isn't a basketball fan asked me "Why is Lou Henson such a big deal? I mean, he and his wife are super nice and great in the community, but I don't know the history. Help me out."

Having been a college basketball fan since I was 8 , and having known about Henson's exploits for years (I even went to college with his daughter, Lisa, at Oklahoma State), I tried to figure out the best approach.

When I remembered my friend was a Dallas Cowboys fan, my path became clear.
"OK," I said. "Do you know who Tom Landry is?"
"Duh, of course I know who Tom Landry is," my friend replied.
"Well, think of Lou Henson as the Tom Landry of New Mexico State basketball," I said. "And think of the Final Four as the Super Bowl of col-
lege hoops."
"OK," my friend said. "That makes sense."

As Landry did with the Cowboys, Henson put NMSU Aggie basketball on the national map. Like Landry, Henson reinvented himself and his teams according to the talent and skills of the players. Like Landry,

Henson never had more than a couple of bad years in a row. Like Landry, Henson had the respect of his players.
Unlike the famously stoic Landry, however, Henson had a smile and a kind word for everyone, whether it was the opposing team, the media or the people selling popcorn at the concession stand.
After we learned of Coach Henson's passing last week, we ran a front-page photo, published several things about him on our website, and devoted two pages to him in this week's
edition, I hadn't planned on writing my column this week about Lou.

But I've read so much, remembered so much, and talked with so many people the past several days, I am appreciating anew all the things he did, and realizing how rare he was, a personality and heart we could sure use more of these days.
"Nice guys finish last," was the bitter - and inaccurate - mantra of longtime Major League Baseball manager Leo Durocher.
Lou Henson finished first many times during his long career, but before anyone mentions his 779 career victories, they consistently mention what a nice, kind and upbeat person he was.

The world today, including the sports world, is vastly different from the era of Henson and Landry.

At the end of his fourth season, in 1963, Landry's record as the only coach the expansion

Cowboys had ever had, was 13 -38. If any NFL coach these days went 13-38 over four years, well, they probably wouldn't have made it to a fifth year. The Cowboys' owner, however, signed Landry to a 10 -year contract extension. Ten years. That was unheard of then, and even more so now. Landry rewarded the confidence with 20 straight winning seasons, 13 division titles, 5 conference titles, and two Super Bowl victories.
Like Landry and the Cowboys' brain trust, Henson had an eye for talent, and not just for basketball.
When the Pan American Center opened in 1968, Henson recommended a young Barbara Hubbard to run the facility. It was a big job, the type not given to women in those days. If you've ever attended a concert at the Pan Am, however, you basically have "Mother Hubbard" to thank.

# Aggies, Lobos won't be cracking pads this year 

When Mario Moccia was named athletics director at New Mexico State University in 2014, he inherited a men's basketball program that, thanks in part to the legacy of Lou Henson, was a consistent conference champion and qualifier for the NCAA tournament.

That was the good news.

He also inherited a debt of several million dollars owed to the main campus; a football program that hadn't been to a bowl game since 1960, and, even worse, was without a confer-
ence; and facilities that were not up to the same standards as their opponents'.

Arizona Bowl. The basketball team has qualified for the NCAA tournament seven times in the last eight years. And, through increased sponsorships and fundraising - along with some tough decisions, like ending the equestrian program Moccia was able to chip away at the debt. Each
year, the athletic depart ment made payments to the main campus, while still working to upgrade facilities and salaries to keep the teams competitive.

Then, in this year's legislative session, the burden was lifted entirely when a provision added to the state budget by Sen. John Arthur Smith covered the debts owed by the athletic departments at both NMSU and the University of New Mexico. The millstone that had been hanging from Moccia's neck from the day he was hired was finally gone.

Lawmakers went into that session believing they had an $\$ 800$ million
surplus. That was before COVID-19.
Now the millstone is back, much bigger than before. First, the NCAA basketball tournament was cancelled. Then, all of the money games, where the football team earns millions by taking a beating from much larger and better teams, were also cancelled. UCLA was going to pay NMSU $\$ 1.2$ million, and Florida $\$ 1.5$ million.

Which may explain why NMSU and UNM officials recently floated the idea of switching their game to Aug. 29, the first week of the schedule, despite a request by Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham to cancel all in-
tercollegiate sports. They are keeping all their options open, Moccia said, harkening back to a day when there were options. All one needs to do is look at the sputtering start of Major League Baseball to see that there are no options for colle-

## giate football.

Within days after resuming play, the Miami Marlins had to shut down when 18 players tested positive. Days later, the St. Louis Cardinals had to shut down when at

to politicize the pandemic response. For her and other local Republicans to suggest that Democrats are purposely targeting restaurant owners, managers and workers is outrageous. In 1962, when interviewing for his first college head coaching job, in Abilene, Texas, Henson gave Hardin-Simmons

University an ultimatum: I won't take the job unless you agree to integrate the school and allow me to recruit Afri-can-American players. When he arrived at New Mexico State in 1966, he continued recruiting
black players, as well as Hispanics. When Henson hired his former Aggie player Rob Evans as an assistant coach in 1969, he was one of only a handful of black assistants in the country at the time.

In everything he did, it seemed, this coach from small-town Oklahoma was ahead of his time. Henson's first superstar was an inner-city player from Syracuse, New York: Jimmy Collins. Together, Henson,

Collins and some other great players made it all the way to the 1970 Final Four.

But what does Collins remember more than the basketball success? How Lou Henson helped him become a man.
"He was there when I needed him," Collins said. "We all have guardian angels, whether we recognize them or not. I was lucky enough to recognize my guardian angel, and it was Coach Henson."

## Exercise For Seniors

A recent consultation with a long-time client of ours leads me to this topic for today, and will lead me to related issues for the next several weeks. The other day "John" asked to speak with me about his exercise routine. He wants to make sure that he's using exercise properly to 'maintain balance,' speaking generally about his overall health. He described his current exercise routine to me, which was fairly decent considering he's in the 90+ age group.


While the conversation with John was refreshing, in that he was actively seeking advice for his benefit, I realized that there are many people who, unlike him, don't have an understanding that physical activity is an important part of healthy aging. One of the biggest challenges that we encounter in the physical therapy world is convincing people that exercise is medicine, and that consistency with an appropriate exercise routine goes a long way in improving and maintaining our health. Even if we can convince them, they often don't have a great understanding of (1) the specific benefits of exercise, (2) how to get started, (3) how setting goals will help with success, (4) what they might need to do if they have chronic conditions, and (5) what will help to keep them motivated. For the next several weeks, Ill be addressing each of those points, starting today with the benefits of exercise. Exercise and physical activity are good for just about everyone, including older adults. No matter your health and physical abilities, you can gain a lot by staying active. In fact, studies show that "taking it easy" is risky. Often, inactivity is more to blame than age when older people lose the ability to do things on their own. Lack of physical activity also can lead to more visits to the doctor, more hospitalizations, and more use of medicines for a variety of illnesses.

Exercise can benefit a wide range of areas of your life. Staying active can help you:

- Keep and improve your strength so you can stay independent
- Have more energy to do the things you want to do and reduce fatigue
- Improve your balance and lower risk of falls and injuries from falls
- Manage and prevent some diseases like arthritis, heart disease, stroke, type 2 diabetes, osteoporosis, and 8 types of cancer
- Reach or maintain a healthy weight and reduce risk of excessive weight gain
- Control your blood pressure

Physical activity also has emotional and cognitive benefits:

- Reduced feelings of depression,
stress, and anxiety, while improving your mood and overall emotional well-being
- Increase your energy level
- Improve sleep

Physical activity can empower you to feel more in control, and be more in control with better strength, balance, coordination, and activity tolerance. As we age, we must actively work to maintain our physical and mental condition, and exercise is a critical component of that effort.

# Congressman, meteorologist, scientist vie for historic New Mexico U.S. Senate seat

This year's New Mexico U.S. Senate race pits a Democrat with extensive government service against a Republican who is running for office for the first time. There's also a Libertarian in the race.
Democrat Ben Ray Lujan, 48, has represented the state's Third Congressional District in the U.S. House of Representatives for the past 11-plus years and is assistant speaker of the House. He served four years on the state Public Regulation Commission before being elected to Congress and is the son of Ben Lujan,
longtime speaker of the New Mexico House of Representatives. Lujan was born in Santa Fe and lives in Nambe.

Republican Mark Ronchetti, 46 , is a meteorologist and former television weatherman in Albuquerque. He defeated two other candidates, including Gavin Clarkson of Las Cruces, in the Republican Primary in June. Ronchetti was born in Shelburne, Vermont, and moved to New Mexico in 1998.
Libertarian Bob Walsh, 83, of Santa Fe, is a retired physicist and co-founder of Rocky Mountain EMS. He unsuccessfully ran for state representative,

District 48, in 2010 as a Libertarian.
The three are vying for New Mexico's Fall Senate seat, so named because former secretary of the U.S. Department of the Interior Albert B. Fall was the first person to hold it when the state's two U.S. Senate seats were created in March 1912, two months after New Mexico achieved statehood. Fall and the state's other first-ever U.S. senator, Thomas B. Catron, were appointed by the New Mexico Legislature, Most U.S. senators were chosen by state legislatures until after ratification of the 17th amendment to the U.S. Constitution in April

1913 that mandated their popular election.
Whoever wins the Fall seat will be the eighth man to hold it; no woman has ever held a U.S. Senate seat in New Mexico. Previous holders of the seat are Republicans Fall, Holm O. Bursum and Pete Domenici, who was in the Senate for 36 years before retiring in 2009; and Democrats Sam G. Bratton, Carl Hatch, Clinton P. Anderson (who had previously served as secretary of the U.S. Department of Agriculture during the Truman Administration) and incumbent Tom Udall, who is retiring after two six-year terms and is the only Democrat
in the country whose Senate seat is up in 2020 who is not running for reelection.

Only once in the 108year history of the seat has an incumbent lost, in 1924, when Bratton defeated Bursum. Bursum was the only Republican incumbent to lose a Senate seat that year. Bratton resigned the seat in 1933 to become a federal judge His son, Howard Bratton, was also a federal judge in New Mexico, including service on the bench in Las Cruces.

Although Fall's Tres Ritos Ranch was in the Tularosa Basin in southern New Mexico, no one from Las Cruces has ever
held the Fall seat. The only person from Las Cruces to hold a U.S. Senate seat in New Mexico was former state Rep. and Gov. Ed Mechem. He resigned as governor in 1962, a month before his term ended, and was appointed by new Gov. Tom Bolack to the Catron seat (currently held by Democrat Martin Heinrich), vacated by the Nov. 18, 1962 death of Democrat Dennis Chavez. Mechem ran for a full term in the Senate in 1964 but lost to Joseph Montoya.

# County awards Triage Center contract

"This really is a day to celebrate," Doña Ana County Health and Human Services Director Jamie Michael said Tuesday morning, Aug. 4., after the county commission voted to approve a contract to license and operate the county's Crisis Triage Center (CTC).
"Without a doubt, we are moving in the right direction," Michael said. "People in our community are going to get the services that they deserve. Now we have some heavy lifting to do, but we are definitely up to the challenge."

The contract is with


Recovery Innovations International (RI), a Phoe-nix-based nonprofit that offers behavioral health services in crisis, health, recovery and consulting, according to www.riinternational.com/.

The commission approved the contract by a vote of 4-1, with Commission Chair Lynn Ellins, Vice Chair Manuel Sanchez and members Isabella Solis and Ramon

Gonzalez voting yes and Commissioner Shannon Reynolds voting no.
The contract is for eight years and is renewable by the commission annually, Michael said. It provides payment to RI of $\$ 263,000$ from the beginning of the contract through June 30, 2021. Much of that time will be spent getting state licensing for the facility and its staff, as well as

CTC will operate on a "no wrong-door path," Michael said, which means individuals can show up at the facility to receive services, and no one will be turned away. She said the contract with RI mandates that at least 50 percent of CTC hires be local.
"We're looking for
people who are bilingual, who are familiar with the community," Michael said.

She said the contract also provides for a CTC community-based advisory group.

RI operates 12 other facilities similar to the triage center, Michael said. RI contracted with the county in February to produce a business plan to operate the CTC, which was "designed to provide a 23 -hour safe and secure environment for individuals with serious mental health illness introduced into the system through protective custody by law enforcement officials," according to the business plan,
which was submitted to the county June 1.
The plan provides guidance to the county on the operation of the triage center "as an integrated component of a behavioral health system that reduces the inefficient use of law enforcement, emergency room and detention facilities for individuals with severe mental health disorders."

Michael said the county has worked with several management companies since the triage center was built in 2013 but none of the contracts proved viable.

## Farmers Market hanging in there

Except for food vendors, the Farmers and Crafts Market of Las Cruces (FCMLC) was closed March 14-June 6 because of state public health orders in response to COVID-19, FCMLC Market Manager Tiffany Thompson told the Las Cruces City Council during its July 27 work session. Some craft vendors returned June 13, and the market is now occupying five blocks of Main Street downtown and is open 8:30 a.m.-1 p.m. each Saturday. It's operating at 25 percent capacity, Thompson said, with about 10 feet between vendors. Masks are required. Handwashing stations are available at the northeast corner of the downtown plaza. "We are definitely struggling with the COVID situation," Thompson told the council. She said the market is losing about \$4,500 a month. Pre-COVID, the market had about 135 permanent vendors, 100 temporary vendors, 41 musicians (including one-half of those under age 18), three to six child vendors, animal services and several rotating nonprofits. # School board votes to rename Oñate High School

The Las Cruces Public Schools Board of Educa tion voted unanimously at its Aug. 4 meeting to rename Oñate High School.

The new name will be Organ Mountain High School. The name change
will be effective with the beginning of the 2021-22 school year, public information officer Kelly Jameson said.

Don Juan de Oñate (1550-1626), for whom the school was named, was the first Spanish governor of New Mexico (1598-1606). An explorer and conquistador, he
led colonists north from Mexico into what would become the state of New Mexico in 1598, establishing the first European settlements in the Southwest.

Oñate is remembered for the Acoma Pueblo Massacre of 1599 in which an estimated 8001,000 Acoma were killed.

He also had Acoma warriors punished by cutting off part of one foot and putting them in servitude. The Spanish government found Oñate guilty of using excessive force against the Acomas.

Originally located at Sierra Middle School, beginning in 1988, Oñate

High got its own building at 5700 Mesa Grande Drive in 1993.
The move to rename the school came at the request of community members in June, after national and local protests following the murder of George Floyd, a black man, at the hands of Minneapolis police.

## New DAAC building

The Doña Ana Arts Council (DAAC) is moving back to downtown Las Cruces. As of Tuesday, Sept. 1., DAAC's offices and gallery will be officed in the old Bank of America building at 250 W. Amador Ave., said DAAC Executive Director Greg Smith. DAAC moved out of the Rio Grande Theatre to 1740 Calle de Mercado, in June 2017. "DAAC has enjoyed a

"I love using graffiti in a fine-art atmosphere," said Las Cruces artist Saba, who is opening a new studio and hoping to start a new Las Cruces art district on West Picacho Avenue.
Saba is opening his studio - Barricade Culture Hop - throughout the day Friday, Aug. 7, at 1175 W. Picacho Ave., at the intersection of Picacho and Fifth Street.
The opening will include selling $\$ 10$ raffle tickets for a donated Harley motorcycle. He's hoping to create a "trading-post mentality" at the location. During the grand opening, Saba, who is Navajo, said he will be collecting donations of unopened water to deliver to the Navajo Nation.
"Now it's time," he said. "This is what we need."
Saba, 37, calls his work arrow soul art, because
the arrow is used for hunting "to feed the soul," he said, and for defending.

Saba, 37 , is a native of Farmington who moved to Las Cruces with his wife in 2009.
"I love Las Cruces," Saba said. "People here learned to somewhat coexist together. Somewhere in time we got along, because I'm still here," he said. "All my life, I've been caught in the middle of two worlds going on at once."

Now is the time to expand the city's art community to include an outdoor art district on West Picacho Avenue, he said. "I've been talking about this for the past 10 years, at least."
"I hope other artists and small businesses take advantage of this opportunity," said Saba, who also encourages young Las Cruces entrepreneurs to explore the area.
Saba, who plans to make

an outdoor graffiti garden a part of his studio space, sees a lot of possibilities for West Picacho Avenue. There are already two restaurants nearby - JC Torta's Mexican Restaurant right across the street at 1196 W. Picacho Ave., and Nessa's Café, two blocks east at 901 W . Picacho Ave. And, he said, there's plenty of room for food trucks, as well. He hopes the area can also include temporary outdoor booth spaces for artists,
modeling on the success of the Farmers and Crafts Market of Las Cruces.
"People want to be outside to enjoy the view," he said, adding that West Picacho Avenue "has the best view" of the Organ Mountains.
"We can work together to make a pretty picture," he said.

is what we do as human beings. People have a "natural urge" to create, to make a mark and to "leave some direction for the future, a survival guide."

decals, a no-contact thermometer device and hospital-grade disinfectant products, she said. She and her staff donned masks and set up a Zoom camera to be fully in-person and online ready.

Beginning at the top of the hour, each dancer had her individual photo taken by professional photographer Jack Diven Kowalski said, then performed with her peers, each in her own "box." Dancers were then individually dismissed to have a photo taken with their teacher and receive flowers from parents. At the half-hour mark, "the entire place was disinfected to prepare for the next recital group," she said. "Wash, rinse and repeat."

Dancers didn't have to wear masks during the recitals, Kowalski said, because the public health order signed by Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham that mandated maskwearing even when exer-

cising didn't take effect until July 13.

When they return to the studio Aug. 3, "dancers will be wearing masks at all times," she said. Each dancer will have her own prop kit, water bottle, hand sanitizer and ballet barre wrap, Kowalski said, as the barre returns to the studio.
For the upcoming 2020-

21 year that begins this month, five dance classes filled up in a matter of two hours on registration day, she said.
"That sounds exciting, but a full class is five dancers," Kowalski said. Before COVID-19, five dancers had been the number used to declare a class open. "That was our minimum for break-
ing even," she said. "So, breaking even is what we hope to do this year to keep the business going." Kowalski said she and her staff have marked off the studio into six-foot squares to be visually clear for students to practice social distancing.

Kowalski conducting Kindermusik classes. In 2008, the company moved and added private lessons in piano, guitar, voice, violin and all band instruments. In 2011, it added "a beautiful floating dance floor," she said, and the name changed to Academy of Music \& Dance

The academy has five dance instructors offering ballet, tap, jazz, hip hop and pom, along with adult tap. Kowalski is preparing to teach Kindermusik on Zoom, she said, and using the same six-foot box system, hopes to soon bring the "musical toddlers and babies" back into the studio with their parents.

# Travel lends perspective to history, present 

My childhood summers were spent traveling around the country.
My parents wanted my brother and me to learn about and appreciate the country to which our grandparents had immigrated to create new lives for themselves and their children.

We visited many state capitals, entering some of the capitol buildings, and, at the United States Capitol, we sat in the Senate gallery on a day of relative quiet.
We explored the Rocky Mountains, ascended Mount Evans, and rode

across the precarious bridge over Royal Gorge. We visited Mesa Verde National Park, Santa Fe, Albuquerque, Carlsbad Caverns, El Paso and Juarez.

Most years, we traveled east. I remember President Abraham Lincoln's home in Springfield (and his tomb). We spent time at Gettysburg and Antietam to deepen our knowledge of major Civil War battles.

We saw the sites of the first battles of the Revolutionary War at Lexington, Concord and Bunker Hill. We toured President

George Washington's home, Mount Vernon, and President Thomas Jefferson's home, Monticello. We visited the Statue of Liberty, as well as the Liberty Bell at Independence Hall.

We went to the top of the Washington Monument, stood inside the Lincoln and Jefferson memorials and gazed at the memorial flame at the grave of President John F. Kennedy.
Rhonda and I took our son, Adam, to many places I had not yet visited, including the Grand Canyon, Ellis Island, the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame and the Pro Football Hall of Fame. Adam and I also toured the baseball and basketball
halls of fame.
The United States Holocaust Memorial Museum and the museum and memorial at the Murrah Federal Building in Oklahoma City challenged us to consider how to combat hatred in all its forms. Rhonda and I did the same at the 9/11 museum in New York City.

My rabbinic convention in 2017 took us to the National Center for Civil and Human Rights in Atlanta. We paid our respects at the graves of the Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. and Coretta Scott King. We sat in the original Ebenezer Baptist Church. We were welcomed at the center of the The Names Project/

AIDS Quilt.
Adam and I attended the 2004 dedication of the Brown v. Board of Education National Historic Site, commemorating the United States Supreme Court decision to end racial segregation in America's schools (a short distance from our home).
There are many places to explore locally and in our state that are integral to the American story, offering reminders to recognize narratives told from different perspectives, to which, I know, I need to listen.

I know, also, that I need to pray. These words conclude a prayer for our nation in the Reform Jew-
ish prayerbook, Mishkan T'filah: "Help us all to appreciate one another, and to respect the many ways that we may serve You. May our homes be safe from affliction and strife, and our country be sound in body and spirit."

May we truly appreciate one another, especially at this time of challenge, and may we add new and positive chapters to our shared story.

## Exceedingly difficult times require faith to get through them

We are living through exceedingly difficult times. The coronavirus is a Damocles sword hanging over people's heads, but there are more difficulties in our time than that. We've also been through an economic upheaval, and we have not yet seen the end of this disruption.
Then there's the social upheaval that has, to greater or lesser extent, depending on where one lives, exacerbated the other problems. Fuses are short everywhere, and the streets could erupt at any moment in protest and riot.
We are living at the extremes, or at least we are

seeing life at the extremes. No center seems to hold.
As W. B. Yeats so famously said, "Mere anarchy is loosed upon the world." Please note the significance of that two-word phrase: "mere anarchy" is what you get when civil discourse is no longer possible. In such circumstances, it becomes tempting to swing on a wide arc between extremes of right and left. We react to events and movements in our society, and it's all too easy for normally sensible people to overreact. In times of social and mental stress, our natural tendency is to hit back, which makes the situation worse. We see this
escalation around us in many ways.
These are exceedingly difficult times for me as a person of faith and a leader in a particular faith community. I see this overreaction in the very places where I usually look for balance, namely, in religious institutions and movements. Many of us are disgusted by the caving in to far-right agendas on the part of some churches. But there's no monopoly here: the far-left is more than adequately represented in religious groups, too. The point of both seems to be, "conform or get lost." The sycophants of extremism are everywhere.

I've been around long enough to see how this drift
into extremes happens. You have sincere and genuine concerns about what is happening or not happening in the social sphere. You look around to see who shares your concerns. They appear to be picked up by particular socialaction movements, and so you go along with that movement. Then suddenly you find yourself sucked in at a deeper level, and without time for thoughtful reflection on what's happening. Inauspicious beginnings can lead to unexpected consequences.

For those of us with deep spiritual commitments, the center should hold, however. We should look at social movements with a critical eye sharpened by the perspective of
faith. For many years, I've taught that the proper approach is to enter alliance rather than identification. I believe we can ally with the values of certain movements (e.g., Black Lives Matter, Pro Life) without embracing the overall agenda of such a movement. We don't want to
be identified by the movement. We want to be allies where we are needed. Only by such an approach can we keep our balance

# Magic and science combine to enchant, teach children

Las Cruces native Britton A. Goodwin has always been fascinated with science and magic performances, so he combined them to create Professor Bah-Boom Educational Entertainment.

As Professor BahBoom, his performance props are a lab coat, various chemicals and household items and a table, where he performs his act for whatever size audience books the gig. The goal behind the business,
he said, is "educating children about science and math through handson demonstrations and experiments.
"By using common supplies, I guide children on how to conduct scientific experiments in a safe environment," he said. "I then address the physics behind it all and further explain what we did to create each scientific reaction."

Equipped with a selfwritten "cookbook of about 100 experiments," Goodwin said he uses each one to bring to light
what he calls "the FUNdamentals of chemistry, physics and engineering."
"One example is mixing food dye, glue and laundry booster together to make colored slime," he said. "This helps demonstrate some basic principles of chemistry and the chemical bonding process. Once the slime is finished, the young scientist then has his or her very own sensory manipulative that they helped to create."

Before COVID-19,
Goodwin said he per
formed at birthday parties and other special events for $\$ 110$ an hour, which covered his prep time, performance time, supplies and tax.
"This allowed me to make enough profit to cover things such as travel expenses, insurance, advertising and living expenses," he said.

Then came COVID19, which forced him to develop web-based educational packages in a price range of $\$ 35$ to $\$ 90$. The goal, he said, is to

# Henson's life leaves lasting legacy

Lou Henson earned a spot in the College Basketball Hall of Fame for a coaching career that spanned 42 seasons and three universities, as well as two Final Four berths.
His death July 25 at age 88 sparked an outpouring from friends and fans all over the country.

He coached New Mexico State University to 289 basketball victories during two different stints (1966-75 and 1997-2005). In between, he coached the University of Illinois to 423 wins. Add that to the 66 victories at HardinSimmons, his first coaching job, and the total was

779.

Perhaps more than the victories, though, he and Mary, his wife of 65 years, were beloved for their engaged community service
in two different cities, Las Cruces and Champaign, Illinois.
"Our university and our entire community have lost a remarkable
man," said NMSU Chancellor Dan Arvizu. "I have such fond memories, when I was a student at NMSU, of watching Lou Henson lead the Aggies
all the way to the Final Four. I will always remember those games, and I will always remember how he cared about our community and about our people."
"Aggie Nation's hearts are heavy today," said NMS Athletics Director Mario Moccia. "We have lost an Aggie icon. Coach Henson may be gone, but the memories he provided us with and the legacy he created will last forever. He was responsible for almost 800 wins in the record book, and the most memorable event in our university's history of athletics: the trip to the 1970 Final Four. Coach Henson's legacy was equally felt off the court
in the lives he touched - those of his former players, people on this campus and friends in Las Cruces and around the state of New Mexico. We are all better for whatever time we were privileged to spend with Lou. Coach made everyone feel like a friend."
"Lou Henson was the epitome of class and a one-of-a-kind coach," said NMSU Head Men's Basketball Coach Chris Jans. "What he did for New Mexico State and the sport of college basketball is something that few before or since have accomplished. He is revered by two fan bases, which is extremely rare in our business."

# 'Actions of kindness': Players, colleagues, coaches recall a legend

"It's like losing a guardian angel," said Collins, a 6-2 guard from Syracuse,
who averaged 24.3 points a game for the 1969-70 Aggies. "It started back in 1966 and I'm sure it will continue until I leave this life.
"We didn't go long periods without talking. I'd call him or he'd call me. He seemed to have a sixth sense. Every time in life I would stumble, or I would have some turmoil, the phone would ring, and it would be him.
"'The last few years, I knew he was very ill, and
sometimes he wouldn't be able to talk. But I would talk with Mary, who was as much a part of developing our program as he was.
"There are things as a young man, that are minor conflicts, but as you get older, you realize those conflicts were positives that made me not only a better basketball player, but a better person.
"He pulled me back into basketball, working with
him at Illinois as an assis tant coach, and then helping me land the job at the University of Illinois-Chicago (where he was head coach for 14 seasons).
"I was raised by a single mom, with no father in the picture, and most of the things that guide me in my life, I got those ideas from him.

Perhaps it was a fitting day, the last conversation they had was on June 21.
"He called me on Father's Day and you
wouldn't have known he was ill. We had a great conversation.
"From now on, I know I will hear his voice in my head, with something to help me or show me a way to help others."

## BARBARA HUBBARD

" "Mother Hubbard"
" Longtime manager of Pan American Center
"I can't tell you how much the reign of Lou Henson meant to me," Hubbard said. "We started
on the ground floor with him at the Pan American Center.
"Lou and I started out together at Las Cruces High School. He was the basketball coach, and I ran the cheerleaders. And when he came back to coach NMSU, Lou and I stayed together all the way through. I also ran the NMSU cheerleaders for about 20 years.
"When they opened the

new arena, Lou called me over to run the Pan Am, and I became the first woman business manager on campus."

She went on to earn an international reputation for landing and booking musical and entertainment acts to play the Pan Am. Despite all the celebrities who befriended her and called her "Mother Hubbard," she always cherished those early Pan Am basketball days.
"Lou was one of the winningest coaches of all time, and I was so proud to go to the Final Four in 1970 with the team and the cheerleaders. Getting to ride that glory with him has been a part of my life ever since.
"And now I'm going to be making a donation to the Boys and Girls Club of Las Cruces for him and Mary."

"He was a class act," said Keys, who played under Henson at NMSU. "He was pure, he was honest and he was a genius when you talk about Xs and Os. The thing was, he kept things simple. "When I retired from my professional career and he found out I wanted to get into coaching, he said, 'Who can I call? Let's go to breakfast.' And so we went to breakfast at Burger Time and he got napkins out and started drawing up plays."

## WILLIAM BENJAMIN

» NMSU all-century team
» Aggie player from 1988-92
» Current head coach, Las Cruces High School boys' basketball

Though he did not play for Coach Henson or even know him that well, Benjamin had several positive interactions with the coach.
"I remember all of his actions were actions of
kindness," Benjamin said "He invited me and my family one year to join him and his wife at their table at the Boys and Girls Club Breakfast. They were both so attentive and gracious. And when we won the state championship in 2013, I called him and asked if he would come and speak at our banquet, and he did so without hesitation."
That 2013 title was the first Las Cruces High School boys state championship since 1976, when Lou Henson Jr. was a standout player on back-to-back Bulldawg state title teams. Previously, Lou Henson Sr. had coached LCHS to three consecutive state titles, 1959-61. LCHS won again this year, meaning if Benjamin coaches the Bulldawgs to another state title, he will tie Henson for the school record for most titles as a coach.

"I met him just as they opened the Pan Am. It was the 'House that Henson Built.' He was a special guy. Everybody loved him, he was so sincere and genuine and he and his wife, Mary, were such contributors to the community. I can't think of a better example than him of what it means to be a great Aggie.
"There are very few icons in New Mexico, and even fewer in Las Cruces, but one was Lou Henson. And he had such a wonderful sense of humor.
"When I applied to be president of NMSU, Lou Henson essentially decided to be my campaign manager. He took it upon himself to call people and speak on my behalf. When the regents met to decide, the vote was $3-2$ in my favor over Dan Howard, who became our provost.
"I knew Coach Henson often met for breakfast with friends at Burger Time. So shortly after the vote I went to Burger Time and, sure enough,
he came in. I said, 'Coach, I came here to fire you as my campaign manager. With your campaigning, I only got the vote by 3-2.' Then Lou looked at me and said, ‘Well, it was 0-5 when I started.'
"He's one of the most magnificent persons I've ever met."

## RUS BRADBURD

» Former NMSU assistant coach
" Author and current associate professor of creative writing at NMSU
"Nearly everyone as successful as Lou innately has a big ego," Bradburd said. "I think Lou believed he was a good coach, but he would never say that. He was very much a bigpicture guy and was very interested in how people were going to be in the long run.
"Lou accomplished enough to be called a legend, but he didn't want to set himself up that way. He was more of an every man, 'We're all in this together in building the program.'
"He never said to his team, ‘Don't swear.' But his players didn't swear
because that was his lead.
"When he went to coach at Illinois, he helped turn the program around with an idea that shouldn't have been novel. He said, 'We're at Illinois. Let's recruit Illinois kids.'
"Watching him after all those years of being a decent human, I think we can all take strength from his humility and his grace."

## JACK NIXON

" Longtime radio voice of the Aggies
» Member, Aggie Hall of Fame
"Of course, he knew a lot about basketball and won a lot of games and went to the Final Four and all that, but the things that come to mind first when I think about Coach is how kind he was and how positive he was," Nixon said. "He enjoyed having fun with life, and when we were traveling, he was light-hearted. He took winning very seriously, but he didn't let a loss eat at him. He was so positive and good-hearted, you just felt really good around him."
