County Roads Initiative shows results

Almost 18 years ago, the first section of Berry Patch Avenue on the East Mesa near Butterfield was paved. At the time, funding to complete the last mile of the road was unavailable.

“When I was elected Commissioner of District 4, residents of Berry Patch Avenue told me about the terrible condition of their road,” Commissioner Isabella Solis said. “I went to Berry Patch Avenue to see for myself and it was awful. It became very important to me to help these residents and in

2018 the Board of County Commissioners funded a roads initiative that appropriated monies to repair, widen and pave 33 roads in Doña Ana County, including Berry Patch Avenue. The roads initiative provided \$10.2 million to repair and resurface county and private roads.”

Rene Molina, Engineer Supervisor for Doña Ana County Engineering and Roads Department designed the new section of Berry Patch Avenue. “Completing pavement of Berry Patch Avenue means residents now have more efficient access to West Side Recycling, the Las Cruces East Mesa Public Health Office, schools and other goods and services,” Molina said.

Before the repairs were made, residents had to drive more than one and a half miles east to reach the Brahman Road interchange, then double back to reach the City of Las Cruces. Now, when driving to town, they drive west to the Weisner Road interchange and access Interstate-70.

Fernando Tovar, a local resident near Berry Patch Avenue said, “We are very happy and thank Commis-

sioner Solis for her help in getting this road paved because she talked with us in advance about the project. Accessing the highway quicker has made a big difference on our commute time.”

Roman Rodriguez, a long-time County resident said he recalls when the road’s first section was paved, around 2002. He described how tough it was to drive on the unpaved road, as many very deep potholes would form during the rainy season. “The road was absolutely needed,” Rodriguez said. “Driving on it was nearly impossible before and it felt as

though one might tip over.”

Beyond COVID-19: Las Cruces could have a bright future

“We don’t need to re-invent ourselves,” The Bridge of Southern New Mexico President and CEO Tracey Bryan said, as Las Cruces deals with COVID-19. “We just have to build on what we have and connect people with the opportunities that here for employment and entrepreneurship.”

The community is “asset rich,” Bryan, with opportunities that include commercial space travel, sustainable agriculture, film and television production, healthcare technology and international trade.

“If Las Cruces really proactively positions itself

for its assets and we start to articulate our story super well, it could be a very bright future,” Bryan said.

Even with the economic impact of COVID-19 since Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham closed non-essential businesses statewide in mid-March, the City of Las Cruces ended FY2020 (July 1, 2019-June 30, 2020) with a four-percent increase over the budget, said city Economic Development Department (LCEDD) Director Griselda Martinez, Ph.D. And, the city’s gross receipts tax (which provides about three-quarters of

the city’s general fund) in July 2020 was 2.25 percent higher than in July 2019, Martinez said.

City data show declines in new and renewing business registrations, she said. In the first five months of 2020, there were 164 new business registrations and 883 business registration renewals, compared to 194 new and 1,009 renewal registrations during the same period in 2019.

“The economy is already seeing a decline given the

uncertainty and the restrictions,” Martinez said, “however, the negative impact has been reduced through the stimulus funding and other support programs available to community members through the several federal, state and local programs. Our department is focused on establishing programming and partnerships that will allow our community to shorten the recovery period,” she said, adding that the city is conducting a survey of the business community “to understand their needs


and the impact of current restrictions.”

“Local businesses represent a vital job source for our community,” Martinez said. “Our goal is to put forth programs that will translate into job retention among all sectors, especially those that have been heavily impacted.

From the job seekers’

perspective, we are seeking solutions to support the most vulnerable populations, including workers that have been recently displaced. We are also placing emphasis on our entrepreneurial sector to create new opportunities that ensure growth,

especially given the tremendous talent within the community,” she said. “The work we do in the coming months will benefit the community and mitigate, in some degree, the negative effects of the current situation.”

The federally designated Las Cruces Metropolitan Statistical Area encompasses the rest of Doña Ana County, and that includes Santa Teresa, which has the fifth busiest port of entry on the U.S. Mexico border.

“I think that Santa Teresa is uniquely positioned to take advantage of the reshoring and nearshoring (U.S. manufacturing returning to the U.S. or closer to the U.S. from

overseas), especially now that we are going to have another 500,000 square feet of industrial space coming on line soon,” said Border Industrial Association President Jerry Pacheco. “The reshoring/nearshoring is being sped up by the COVID crisis. That bodes well for us,” he said.

On a visit to Las Cruces in late July, New Mexico Department of Workforce Solutions (NMDWS) Sec. Bill McCamley said he saw “businesses being safe,” with people wearing masks and grocery stores enforcing social distancing and one-way aisles.

“That the sort of stuff that works,” said McCamley, a former Las Cruces legislator and Doña Ana County commissioner.

“The biggest positive trend

City has programs in place to assist businesses amid COVID-19

ONGOING LAS CRUCES ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT INITIATIVES TO ASSIST BUSINESSES IN THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC:

- An eight-week business accelerator program for local businesses to find new markets and transition their business model to e-commerce. This is in partnership with NMSU’s Arrowhead Center. Thirty businesses from Las Cruces will participate.
- A technical assistance program for access to microloans has been launched this week in partnership with the Lift Fund. The technical assistance will be crucial for businesses to be loan ready and have the resources to not only pay back their loans but continue to expand.
- Application for the New Mexico Small Business Continuity Grant for \$10 million to be deployed in the form of grants for local businesses. The application period is expected to begin soon.
- Leads on businesses interested in relocating in Las Cruces, in particular the West Mesa Industrial Park (WMIP) and the Las Cruces International Airport (LRU). A WMIP master plan update is underway, to be followed by a marketing plan for LRU and WMIP.
- For Las Cruces international Airport: Full apron reconstruction, landscaping master plan and ongoing maintenance projects are underway; perimeter fencing and security-gate replacement have been completed, along with restriping for taxi lanes, taxiways and runways.
- Downtown: Request for proposals to be published for Amador Hotel selective demolition, along with RFPs for mixed-used redevelopment; a parking garage feasibility study is underway; shade structures for Plaza de Las Cruces are in development.
- These are the discussion items being considered by the Las Cruces Economic Recovery Ad Hoc Board, which began meeting in May: New Mexico Safe Promise program, public transportation protection during COVID-19, workers’ support and protections, New Mexico Department of Workforce Connections resources for workers, NMSU Arrowhead Center Resources for entrepreneurs, COVID-19 public health data updates and inclusive economic recovery framework, workforce scholarships for re-tooling and re-training, increased effort in the distribution of PPEs and Service Corps employment.

for us is when employers are making sure their workplaces are safe.”

“The main focus has to be knocking down the threat of the virus right now. When you get that virus under control, you can look at opening the economy,” he said. That’s the only way “we’re going to have sustainable economic growth.”

Martinez agrees. “We need to work together to decrease the number of cases in our county, so restrictions can be eased, thus stimulating a more active economy,” she said.

In early August, the state was providing unemployment payments to about 135,000 people, McCamley said, which is 93 percent of those eligible.

“We passed the \$1.5

billion mark for dollars provided to new Mexicans through standard unemployment and other benefits,” he said. “People have got to have money to get through this.”

McCamley said he has personally processed about 4,000 claims since mid-March. Many times, he said, “they just want to talk to somebody. They’re terrified. They just want someone to tell them that it’s going to be okay. Our goal has been to help people get the resources they need.”

“We are starting to look at what the economy might be and how can we start the process to meet these new situations and do it together,” McCamley said. “How do we work with private-sector partners, education, our apprentice partners? Those are really important.”

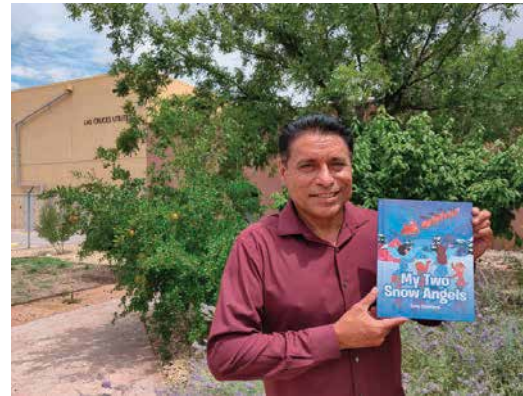

Don't overlook big picture regarding oil, gas exec

If every New Mexican, overnight, quit driving motor vehicles, and if the state eliminated all diesel trucks, and shut down all oil and gas activity, what would be the impact on global carbon emissions?

We have such a small population, the impact would be less than negligible; it would be imperceptible.

In that same scenario, what would be the impact on the state of New Mexico?

Without vehicles, our economy as we know it would shut down. Without trucks, none of our stores and businesses could be supplied. And without the oil and gas activity?

To quote someone in the know: "Here in southern New Mexico, we know that if we shut down oil and gas today, we'll have to shut down our schools tomorrow."

That person in the know is Xochitl Torres Small, the U.S. Representative in Congress for

our District 2.

That's probably not the way the Democratic playbook would have wanted Torres Small, a Democrat, to have worded that quote.

Historically, Republicans, especially in New Mexico, are all in when it comes to oil and gas. Democrats more often lean the other way and, especially with talk of

the "new green deal," are becoming more aggressive about it. The growing number of independents in New Mexico are harder to pin down.

But the quote accurately reflects the reality in New Mexico, particularly in District 2.

As you may know, District 2 is geographically gigantic, going from the Texas border in the east to the Arizona border in the west and, basically, everything south of Interstate 40 in New Mexico. A district that large is, almost by definition, diverse. But the biggest economic driver in the dis-

trict and, in fact, the entire state, is the oil activity on the east side of the state, mostly in Lea, Eddy and Chaves counties.

There's been a political dust-up lately – no surprise during a campaign season of an important general election. However, the target of the dust is an unexpected one.

He's not a candidate but the head of an oil and gas advocacy group. He's Ryan Flynn, executive director of the New Mexico Oil and Gas Association. Maybe it's not unexpected he would be the target as much as the group doing the targeting: New Mexico Republicans, who are accurately portrayed as big supporters of the oil and gas industry.

The Republicans who criticized Flynn are no small potatoes: Former longtime District 2 U.S. Rep. and current New Mexico Republican Party chair Steve Pearce, current minority state Senate Leader Stuart Ingle of Portales, and current minority House Leader James Townsend

of Artesia.

Their criticism came after Flynn was quoted describing Torres Small as a strong advocate for the oil and gas industry and said she "stood up to those in her party who want to completely ban fracking." Flynn has also made – justifiably so – favorable comments about the work of Yvette Herrell, a former state representative and Torres Small's opponent in the upcoming election.

I've got no problem with the Republicans' criticisms of Torres Small. In the case of Pearce, that's literally his job, to build up the case for Republican candidates like Herrell.

However, I think criticism of Flynn overlooks the importance and value of the work he has done in New Mexico. He came on as NMOGA's head in 2016, after serving in Gov. Susana Martinez's Republican administration as the Secretary of Environment

Hard truth: N.M. economic recovery must come second

Can we have a recovery before we find a cure to the sickness?

Debbi Moore, president and CEO of the Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce, was recently selected for a national group formed by the Association of Chamber of Commerce Executives.

According to the press release announcing the new Fellowship for Economic Recovery, it will give chamber professionals “education and tools to improve the post-COVID-19 pandemic outcomes in the communities they serve.”

Post-COVID-19? I hope that information will become useful at some point in the future, and I guess we should be planning ahead for when it does. But the press release made it sound like the time for post-COVID-19 outcomes is now.

The numbers tell a different story.

As of Monday, the state’s Department of Health reported 22,315 people in New Mexico have tested positive, and 685 have died from the virus. We haven’t seen the same kind of spike that other states have, but both infections and deaths have climbed steadily throughout the summer.

Locally, a new Economic Recovery Board has been established to help business owners get the train-

ing they need to address the pandemic. Businesses that complete the training and adhere to the standards set by the New Mexico Safe Certified program can earn a seal from the state to post in their front window.

Those standards include mandatory facemasks, hand washing, sanitizing surfaces and social distancing — all the things we’ve been told to do since March.

The goal is to restore the confidence of consumers that they can go out safely, explained Christopher Schaljo, chairman of the Economic Recovery Board.

I applaud the effort. And, I certainly agree with the protective measures they are promoting. I would probably be more likely to shop at a store that has the decal showing its participation in the Safe Certified program.

But it’s going to take a lot more than that to restore my confidence, especially when it comes to unnecessary activities, like eating out.


I do give the local group credit for acknowledging reality and working within the system to promote economic recovery. The same cannot be said for business owners from

LANDSCAPING WITH RECYCLED GLASS

The staff at **South Central Solid Waste Authority (SCSWA)** was delighted to hear of Mr. Fred Fletcher’s “glass-caping” experience, we had to share it with you.

Mr. Fletcher is an avid cyclist, recycler, and landscaper who moved to Las Cruces 25 years ago. For the past seven years, he has been picking-up glass “cullet” (about 450 buckets) from the **Las Cruces Recycling Center**. Glass cullet is derived from crushing recycled glass bottles and jars into small chunks of colored glass. If the color he is looking for is not there, it only takes a few weeks for it to appear.

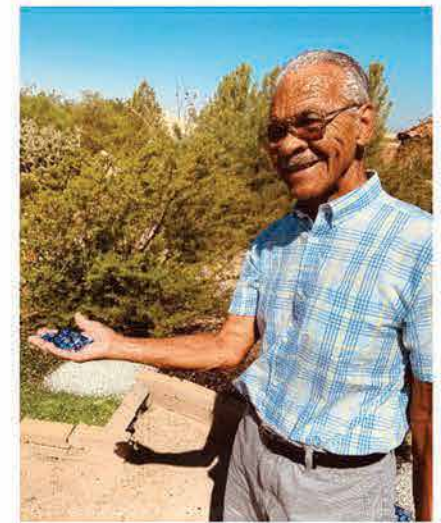


Blue glass-scaping surrounds Nopal Cactus plant.

Mr. Fletcher enjoys working with glass and says, “it’s fun to work with and love finding new ways to decorate by combining different colors”. He finds working with glass to be, “therapeutic and a wonderful way to complement our southwest landscape”. He collects a variety of glass colors ranging from coarse to fine green, amber, white, and blue. “Glass works great for erosion control, it stays well, and does not erode nor fade”, Fletcher says.

throughout New Mexico who have sued the state for lost business caused by the pandemic.

“Your mother always said that if you break it, you bought it,” attorney Blair Dunn said in explaining the legal theory behind the cases. “We’re not arguing if the governor should or shouldn’t have broken these businesses, but they have to pay for it.”

So the governor may have been justified, but the state’s taxpayers have

to pay up anyway? One of the businesses filing a lawsuit is Perez Enterprises of Las Cruces. They own a large facility used for concerts or rented out for big events, and say that the ban on mass gatherings has greatly reduced their income.

This follows an equally unhelpful lawsuit filed by the state Restaurant Association, challenging the authority of the governor and making the legal argument that profits come before public health.

I understand the desire to begin the economic recovery now. Thousands

of workers have lost jobs through no fault of their own, and they’ve seen their short-term unemployment benefits expire as Congress is too locked in partisan squabbles to be of any help.

But those job losses weren’t caused by an economic problem, and they won’t be fixed with economic solutions. We can’t have an economic recovery until we gain control over the virus. Steps to reopen too soon will only hamper that process.

and Natural Resources Trustee. The NMOGA board thinks enough of his work they recently extended his contract through 2024.

I've been in New Mexico newspapers since 1995, and not until Flynn's leadership did I ever hear from NMOGA. About

three years ago, the group opened conversations with the Bulletin and other media outlets as part of its statewide outreach. Flynn was making a particular effort to educate and inform New Mexico residents who live outside the traditional oil and gas producing regions at opposite corners of the state. People in Las Cruces don't have a lot of opportunity or, frankly, a lot of reason

to understand oil and gas. But as home to New Mexico State University and a vibrant public and private education community, we all understand the value of schools. Flynn believes it is critical for the average resident to understand the taxes generated by oil and gas activity fund our state's education to the tune of about \$1.3 billion, more than a third of the total, not to men-

tion the \$3.1 billion (39 percent) going toward the state's general fund. The industry also creates a ton of well-paying jobs in our state, many of which are enhanced by NMSU degrees.

Flynn believes, accurately I think, there are many New Mexicans who aren't fully aware of those numbers and what they mean regarding our children's education and

other aspects of our state, namely that we couldn't function without that funding. That bothers some people, who say, "We need to diversify!" Well, of course we do, but industries that can contribute more than \$4 billion to your state aren't simply waiting around every corner.

If you've ever been in a room with Flynn, I think you'd agree his presentation is apolitical. That

enables him to be very approachable for people from all segments of the political spectrum.

Many in Flynn's position would be out preaching to the converted. However, he has focused on enlightening people, particularly those less aware, of just how critical oil and gas is to our state. To paraphrase Torres Small, if we shut down oil and gas, New Mexico is closed for business.

Spaceship cabin focuses on comfort-centered experience

Virgin Galactic has revealed the cabin de-

sign of VSS Unity, the spaceship slated to take individuals to the edge of space, where they can see the earth as they float through the non-gravity experience. The company has already booked more than 600 paying customers for launch from southern New Mexico's Spaceport America.

During a virtual press conference July 28, Virgin Group founder Sir Richard Branson said the

cabin is special, because "while it has been created to integrate seamlessly with every other, it is also the design centerpiece."

"It is a cabin designed specifically to allow thousands of people to achieve their dreams of space flight safely and to maximize every aspect of that fabulous journey," he said. "We started Virgin 50 years ago with a clear purpose – to transform customer experience and

to make business a force for good. [In this cabin], we started with what we believed would be an optimal customer experience and then we built the spaceship around it, and we will continue with that ethos as we expand our fleet."

While Virgin Galactic's "future astronauts" are not allowed cameras on the flight, having photos and videos of their space-flight experience to share

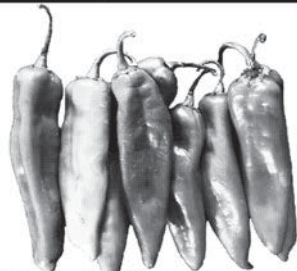
is of paramount importance, he said. The output from 16 cabin cameras, plus those in the cockpit and mounted externally, will generate high definition images and video to provide everything from the first Instagram posts, to a professionally edited and historically significant personal movie.

"This cabin has been designed specifically to

allow thousands of people like you and me to achieve the dream of spaceflight safely — and that is incredibly exciting,” Branson said.

Chief Astronaut Instructor Beth Moses also spoke during the live-stream reveal event. She was onsite at Spaceport America as she talked about her experience on VSS Unity as it completed its 26-minute mission on Feb. 22, 2019.

Moses said she was there to ensure the core aspects of the customer journey. She was covered in sensors, making ratings after checking to ensure everything was going right and to see what else was needed.

VSS Unity cabin design driven by astronaut experience:

- Individually sized, reclining seats for G-force management and float zone volume;
- Automated mood lighting harmonizes with each flight phase;
- Personal seat back screens connect astronauts to live flight data;
- Cabin architecture facilitates effortless movement in weightlessness;
- 16 cameras provide high definition footage and stills;
- 12 cabin windows for astronauts to gaze at Earth from;
- Largest mirror in a spaceship cabin – mirror reflects the real-time astronaut experience.

“But more importantly, I was testing the procedures and the cabin so we could learn how to train the customers,” she said. “I got out of the seat two ways, moved about the cabin, tested out the halo window frames and was able wave at myself in a

mirror at back in order to understand that experience.”

Before she worked with Virgin Galactic, Moses was an extreme environment test expert with NASA.

“I went to a point in the cabin to most dramati-

Libertarians hold convoy to protest exclusion of their candidate from presidential debates

More than a dozen vehicles participated in a Saturday morning, Aug. 8, protest convoy organized by Libertarians from Las Cruces and Doña Ana County.

With participants from the Las Cruces area and El Paso, the convoy was organized to protest the exclusion of Libertarian

presidential candidate Jo Jorgensen from upcoming presidential debates, Marcy Shoberg said in an email to the Bulletin. The convoy was one of more than 100 similar protests

scheduled to be held nationwide, according to local Libertarian activists.

Jorgensen was the Libertarian party candidate for vice president in 1996. She also ran for Congress as a

Libertarian in South Carolina in 1992.

Also on the New Mexico ballot for president is Constitution Party candidate Sheila "Small" Tittle, 57, a native of El Paso who now lives in Virginia. The national Constitution Party nominated Don Blankenship of West Virginia for president, but the New Mexico party chose Tittle. The Constitution Party was founded in 1992 as the

U.S. Taxpayers party. Its name was changed in 1999.

Howie Hawkins, 67, of New York, is the presidential nominee of the Green and Socialist parties but did not make the ballot in New Mexico. Hawkins is a co-founder of the Green Party, a trade unionist and environmental activist. He has run for governor and U.S. Senate in New York.

In the 2016 presidential election, Libertarian can-

didate (and former New Mexico governor) Gary Johnson earned almost 4.5 million votes, equal to 3.28 percent of the total. Green Party candidate Jill Stein received almost 1.46 million votes, or 1.07 percent, while Constitution Party candidate Darrell Castle received 203,000 votes, or 0.15 percent.

New opportunities emerging because of COVID-19 will likely include more people working permanently at home and connecting via Zoom, McCamley said. And that will mean looking at issues like computer skills and broadband access.

"Looking at the economy (through) a 21st Century lens, you've seen a lot of trends that were happening anyway supercharged by this pandemic," McCamley said.

Local unemployment was about 11,000 in early

August, Bryan said, including some people who "have never been unemployed before," but now find themselves without jobs "through no fault of their own."

"There's a lot of people who are thinking right now about their futures," she said. "It breaks my heart for our businesses who have served this community well and who hire people. Especially our restaurants; they've been very innovative and creative. We want them to survive."

"How could we think differently about this (without) undervaluing the enormity of the crisis,"

Bryan asked. "How do we help the people who are here acquire whatever they need to be able to be financially strong for themselves and their community? That's the work The Bridge has been doing."

New Mexico True Talent (www.newmexicotruetalent.org/), an initiative of The Bridge, was created to overcome the barrier of "knowing where to go and who to talk to," she said, and includes a guide to COVID-19 recovery.

The website includes interviews with people about "subjects that are really relevant," Bryan said. It can help workers find jobs

now and can direct businesses to the employees they need and help them manage social distancing and other COVID-19 safe practices.

People changing jobs need "education or training to get there," Bryan said. "We are fortunate in our community that this is not hard for us," with resources that include New Mexico State University and Doña Ana Community College.

Many displaced workers can take advantage of the increase in online education, which makes transportation and child-care less impactful, she said. Employers "can get

training for their employees through DAAC now," Bryan said.

Other organizations providing guidance and assistance during COVID-19 include the Mesilla Valley Economic Development Alliance (MVEDA), the city and county and the Border Industrial Association, Bryan said.

"There's a lot of challenges, a lot of fear of the unknown," Bryan said. "We've got to help people recover and we've got to help our community. The idea is, how do we come out stronger? There are opportunities here. There's an amazing quality of life here."

The challenge, she said, is to "create opportunities for people, helping companies tap into new opportunities. COVID threw us a curveball," she said. "We have to do it faster. It's more urgent."

"The greatest asset we have is to collaborate on solutions to overcome problems. We are uniquely positioned to recover from COVID faster ... if we continue to operate with everybody bringing their best to the table. We've never gone through this before, everybody's trying to figure it out," Bryan said. "That's a challenge but it's also an opportunity for leadership."

Torres Small, Herrell U.S. House race is 2018 rematch

The race for New Mexico U.S. House of Representatives District 2 is a rematch between Democrat Xochitl Torres Small of Las Cruces and Republican Yvette Herrell of Alamogordo. Steve Jones of Ruidoso qualified as a write-in candidate in the race.

Incumbent Torres Small defeated Herrell by a little more than 3,700 votes out of more than 199,000 cast in 2018. Torres Small is the first person from Las Cruces to hold the seat since Ed Foreman won it more than 50 years ago.

New Mexico created congressional districts 1 and 2 in 1968 — the state's members of Congress had been elected at large before that — and Republicans Foreman and Manuel Lujan defeated incumbent Democrats E.S. “Johnny” Walker and Thomas E. Morris respectively to

win the seats. The state didn't get a third U.S. House district until 1982.

Herrell, 56, was born in Ruidoso and is a real estate investor. She served eight years in the New Mexico House of Representatives before giving up the seat to run for Congress. She won the 2018 and 2020 Republican Primaries by wide margins.

Torres Small, 35, was born in Portland, Oregon, and raised in Las Cruces. She is an attorney specializing in water issues. Torres Small is married to state Rep. Nathan Small, D-Doña Ana, who served eight years on the Las Cruces City Council before being elected to the New Mexico House in 2016. Torres Small easily won the 2018 Democratic Primary

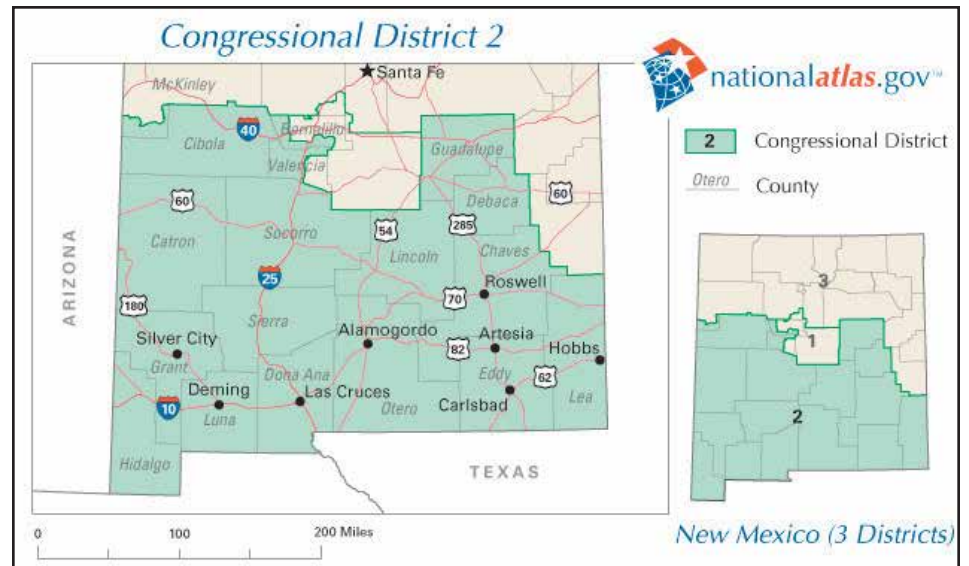

and had no opponent in this year's Primary.

Jones, 74, is a retired CPA and energy consultant. He was born in Cisco, Texas.

Foreman held the seat for two years before losing to Democrat Harold Runnels of Lovington in 1970. Runnels was in Congress for 10 years before dying in August 1980. Picacho rancher Joe Skeen, a Republican, won the seat that year as a write-in candidate (one of a about a dozen candidates to win a U.S. House or Senate seat by write-in in American history) and held it for a record 22 years before retiring in 2002.

Republican Steve Pearce of Hobbs won the seat in 2002, gave it up to run

unsuccessfully for the U.S. Senate in 2008 and won it back in 2010. Democrat Harry Teague, also of Hobbs, won the seat in 2008, but lost it to Pearce after one term. Pearce retired from the U.S. House in 2018 to run unsuccessfully for governor.

The district contains all or part of 19 of New Mexico's 33 counties — including all of Doña Ana County — and is the larg-

est congressional district in the country that isn't an entire state. The district contains about 700,000 people, according to www.census.gov, with a median household income of about \$41,500 and a poverty rate of 17.6 percent. Almost 81 percent of the population over age 25 has a high school diploma or higher, and almost 21 percent has a bachelor's degree or higher. Health

care and social assistance jobs have the highest annual payroll in the district, followed by mining/oil and gas extraction, retail trade, construction and accommodation and food services.

'Trash Buddies' pitch in to clean up city

Keep Las Cruces Beautiful (KLCB) now has help from the community (despite COVID-19 and the public health restrictions associated with the pandemic) as community groups and individuals have stepped up to fill the gap to help clean up Las Cruces.

One such group is the Sonoma Ranch North Trash Buddies, an ad-hoc, all-volunteer cleanup group organized in January to do monthly neighborhood trash pickups. Trash Buddies is the invention/creation of Laraine Jansen, who has had some experience with trash pickup events and water restoration projects in her hometown of Venice, Florida.

This was a group project encouraged by the City

of Las Cruces' Neighborhood Leadership Academy as a resident-driven activity to benefit the community.

"I noticed that the wind was blowing trash into my neighborhood here in Sonoma Ranch North, mostly from construction areas and from the school parking lot area nearby," Jansen said. "I spoke to neighbors and found

out others were picking up trash, for example, when they walked their dogs. So, I asked several neighbors if they would be interested in picking up the trash as a group once a month."

The Sonoma Ranch North Trash Buddies was born.

The group meets at 8 a.m. on the third Saturday of each month and works

anywhere from 30 minutes to more than an hour.

"Any time anyone can spare to pick up trash is appreciated," Jansen said, adding that Trash Buddies events take place in the Sonoma Ranch North area, including along streets and sidewalks, the arroyos and a couple of empty lots. Sometimes they will clean up the empty commercial lots along Northrise Drive and Sonoma Ranch Boulevard.

Trash Buddies follows pandemic safety mandates in place by wearing masks and maintaining social distancing by not working as a group.

"We go off on our own," Jansen said, "but I like to make sure that we are within sight of at least one other worker."

The group tracks volunteer hours and has accumulated 62.75 hours since January. Sometimes volunteers will do clean ups at other times on their

own and send Jansen their hours.

"Trash Buddies is a wonderful example of how community members can self-organize to benefit everyone in Las Cruces," said city Community Engagement Manager Jamey Rickman, facilitator for the City's Neighborhood Leadership Academy.

Rickman said she encourages anyone who might have an idea about helping the community to contact clcengage@las-cruces.org.

"We're always open to how the city can support these community efforts as a partnership," Rickman said.

Anyone is welcome to join in the Trash Buddies clean-up efforts. "I carry paper and pen with me when cleaning up so I can sign people up," Jansen said. "We have a lovely neighborhood, and no one likes to see trash. Trash is

one of my pet peeves."

KLCB wants to help community members in their volunteer efforts to clean up areas of the community. KLCB can supply trash bags, gloves, safety vests and pickup tools free of charge to anyone planning a voluntary cleanup. Supplies are available 8-10 a.m. Monday, Wednesday and Friday at Frank O'Brien Papen Community Center, 304 Bell Ave., near the corner of Bell and Linden avenues. Look for the KLCB canopy.

Marin said. "We exist to bring relief for those in need."

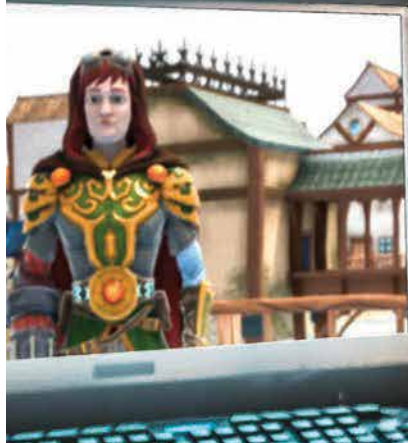

NMSU art student's work to be featured in national exhibit

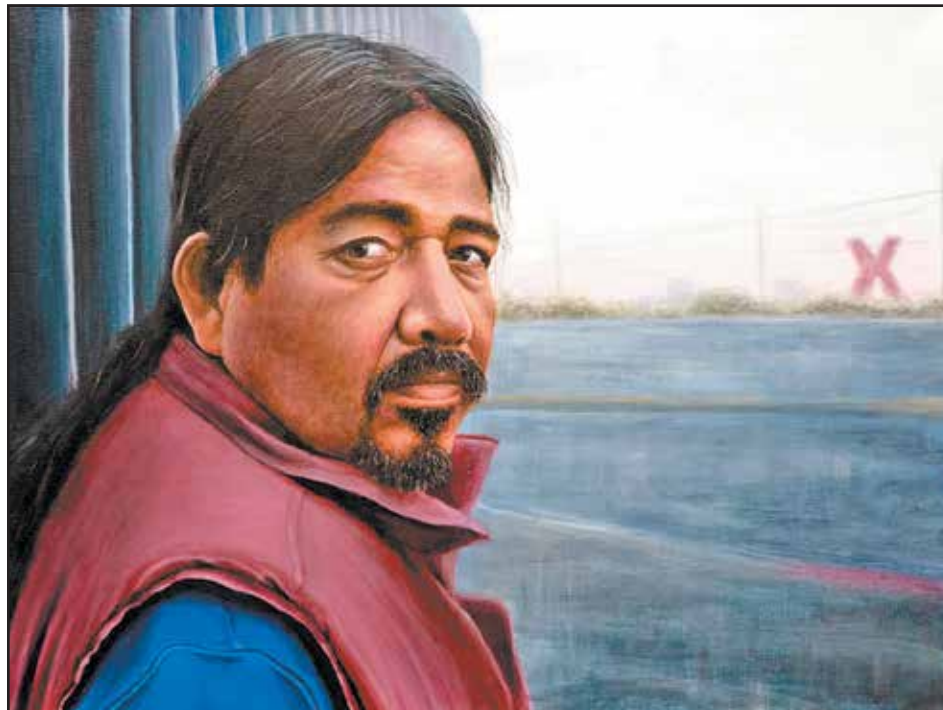
New Mexico State University art student Analinda Gonzalez has turned one of the hardest experiences of her life into an impactful piece of art. Inspired by her father's deportation at a young age, her painting "Separated" has been selected as one of 40 finalists for this year's AXA Art Prize competition.

More than 400 submissions from 125 different schools were reviewed by regional jurors of the Strategic Advisory Board's 34 major art schools and programs across the country, including the Rhode Island School of Design and Columbia University School of Arts.

Gonzalez's artwork will be exhibited virtually and in-person at the New York Academy of Art in November. The 40 finalists are also in the running to be considered for a first prize of \$10,000 and second prize of \$5,000 to be selected by a panel of artists.

Born in Los Angeles, Gonzalez moved to El Paso after her father was deported when she was 4 years old.

"Much of my work expresses the personal impact of socio-political issues, specifically immi-

gration," Gonzalez said. "This piece expresses the pain and perseverance caused by my father's deportation. Understanding how controversial this topic is, I choose not to comment on the underlying structural issue of our immigration system, but rather shed light on my father's story. The image of my father depicts his initial stoicism that belies a deep sadness expressed in his eyes."

The AXA Art Prize, launched in 2017, is considered one of the premier student art competitions in the U.S. The

event is open to figurative paintings, drawings and prints made by undergraduate and graduate students enrolled in art programs across the country.

The 40 finalists are a diverse group of young artists from 27 different schools. 60 percent of this year's finalists are women.

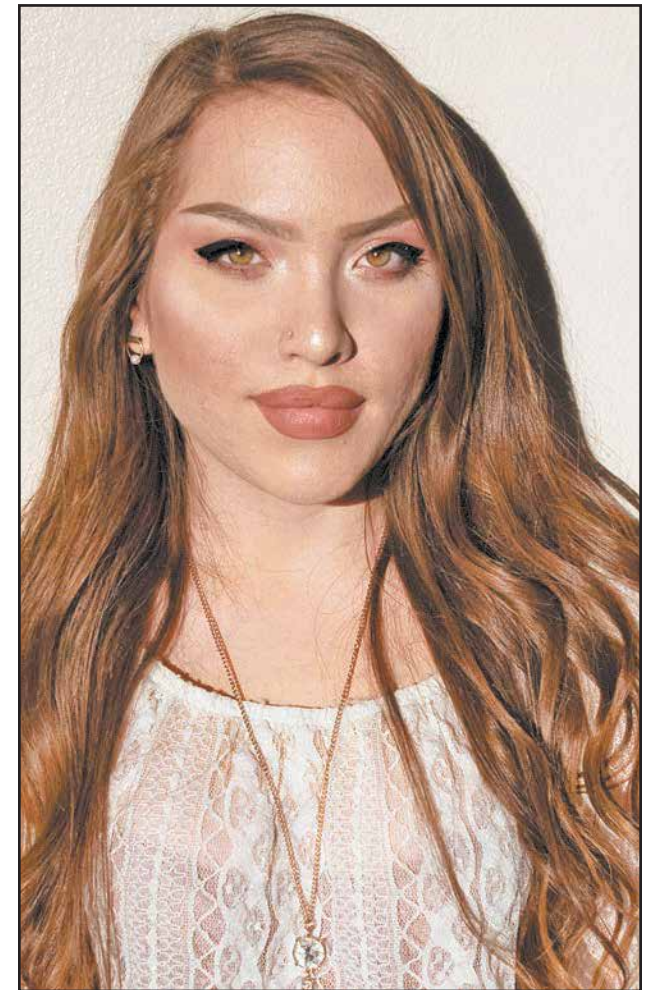
Supported by her mentor, Craig Cully, NMSU associate professor of painting and drawing in the College of Arts and Sciences, Gonzalez submitted her painting to be considered for the prize.

After three months of

waiting, Gonzalez was surprised by the news.

"My initial reaction was confusion because I was unable to believe that one of my paintings was going to be exhibited in New York City, the art capital of the world," Gonzalez said. "I am truly honored and look forward to representing my school in this show. This is a great opportunity for me to receive exposure and engage with the broader discourse of art."

Sometimes Gonzalez paints for up to six hours a day in the art studio. After transferring to

NMSU from El Paso Community College, Gonzalez has been in NMSU's program for one year.

"Craig Cully has shown so much dedication in providing his students with great opportunities. I admire his strong work ethic and am inspired by his meticulous, realistic style," she said.

Gonzalez will graduate

next spring.

"I am working toward becoming a forensics artist because I want my art to make a positive impact on people's lives," she said. "Much of my work is victim driven, and I want to help those in desperate situations by utilizing my passion for art."

The Pride of New Mexico Marching Band will be able to play while masked thanks to Katelyn Zuments, uniform manager for the Pride of New Mexico and a sophomore mechanical engineering student at NMSU, who designed face masks that allow band members to play their instruments while remaining COVID-19 safe. One mask design for flute players features a horizontal hole with a flap, while the second mask design for brass and woodwind instruments features an offset vertical hole. Both masks are kept sealed to the instruments with the help of magnets. During practice, band members remain six feet apart.

The inventor

Katelyn Zuments, uniform manager for the Pride of New Mexico and a sophomore mechanical engineering student at NMSU, designed the masks that will allow the band to play this marching season. Pride Band Director and NMSU Associate Director of Bands Steven Smyth said the mask designs, produced by The Print Guys in Las Cruces, are now being used at universities and high schools nationwide, and have raised \$12,000 for music scholarships at NMSU. While the band's performance schedule this semester remains uncertain, the main priority for the band, Smyth said, is to keep students playing.

A national drive is afoot to save community theatre, and Las Cruces is in on the action.

"It is vital that we save theatres as, to me, they are a beacon of culture and communication and a means that we can use to restore connections in our country during a time where divisiveness seems to sadly be so commonplace," said New Mexico State University Theatre Department Head Wil Kilroy.



Kilroy signed and forwarded to New Mexico's congressional delegation an online petition supporting the Save Our Stages Act, which would provide \$10 billion in grant funds to small theatre venues across the United States. The act is before Congress.

"The theatre is where we can create stories to discover our com-

monality, and engender conversations amidst audience members that can educate, enlighten and unite," Kilroy said. "Right now, we have original presentations planned for our NMSU Theatre Arts

fall season, which may be virtual as required, but will give us the opportunity to address crucial issues with direct student involvement in their creation."

"Goodness knows this is a difficult time for all live theatres, and hopefully the Save Our Stages Act, if passed, could help keep us all around once live theatres are allowed

to re-open," said Las Cruces Community Theatre Board President Janet Beatty-Payne.

"It's estimated that without the support, 90 percent of small (500 seats or less), independent performance venues will go out of business over the next six months," said Kathleen McDonald, publicist for the Spencer Theater for the Performing

Arts in Alto, New Mexico.

The trade publication Pollstar was quoted on www.nivassoc.org as saying venues are forecast to lose up nearly \$9 billion in revenue if they remain dark throughout the rest of 2020.

Santa Teresa border crossings increase in July

The Aug. 5 Santa Teresa Customs and Border Protection virtual meeting showed increases in commercial, private and pedestrian traffic at the Santa Teresa Port of Entry (STPOE), Border Industrial Association (BIA) President Jerry Pacheco said.

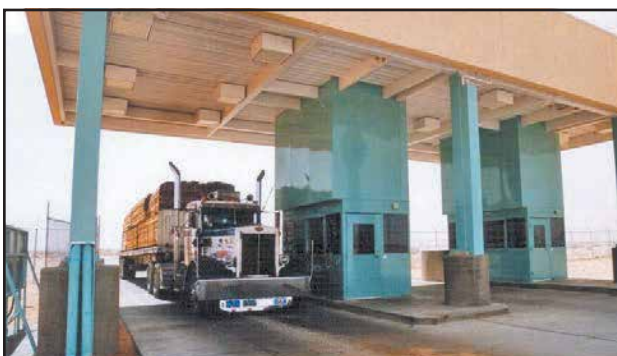
Pacheco reported these highlights from the meeting:

- Commercial traffic reached 13,402 trucks in July, an 11.75 percent increase over June. “This



is an all-time, record high for truck crossings at STPOE,” Pacheco said. The previous record was May 2019, with 13,221 commercial crossings, he said.

“STPOE only has to average 9,000 commercial crossings in August and September to surpass the entire 2019 total for commercial crossings,” Pacheco said. “It’s amazing that during the current pandemic, we are seeing

commercial crossings at STPOE rise substantially. We are building momentum to surpass the port of entry at Hidalgo, Texas, which would make STPOE the fourth largest

port by volume on the entire U.S.-Mexico border.”

- Privately-operated vehicle crossings increased 12.21 percent in July compared to June.
- Pedestrian crossings

increased 14 percent in July compared to June. Pacheco founded BIA in 2009. It is an advocacy group that represents the Santa Teresa Industrial base. Since its founding,

BIA has successfully lobbied for more than \$50 million in infrastructure funding for the port region.

Message to legislature: this crisis is like no other

The ongoing recession is a crisis like no other. GDP fell 9.5 percent in the third quarter, the sharpest decline on record. Here in New Mexico, employment is down by 8.3 percent since the onset of the pandemic. Add to this the sharp drop in oil prices. All this illustrates what we already

know: This is easily the deepest, sharpest recession in our lifetimes.

The impact of the pandemic on the economy is profound, affecting both supply and demand. The supply effect arises because the pandemic exposes people who are at work to the virus. People react to

this risk by avoiding the workplace.

The d-side effect arises because consumption activities, like going to a restaurant or shopping at the mall, also expose people to the virus. People react by reducing consumption.

Working in tandem, these supply and demand effects generate a large and persistent recession. Government containment activities, as necessary as they might be, add to the negative economy.

This raises the question

of what state government can do to mitigate the impact of the recession.

First, state policy should aim to maintain small and medium businesses as going concerns. Doing so will allow these businesses to rapidly ramp up when, as will eventually happen, the pandemic is brought under control and the economy begins to expand again.

In this regard, maintaining existing employer/employee relationships is key. Having experienced

personnel in place will make reopening easier. To the extent that businesses permanently close, workers will have to search for new employers, and this will slow the recovery.

The state has already implemented a program, administered through the New Mexico Financial Authority, that provides low-interest loans to local businesses. Another measure is strategic regulatory forbearance. Care needs to be taken not to impose undue risk or economic costs on the public. But in the current circumstances, reducing regulatory burden can help some businesses to survive.

The second goal of state policy should be to maintain consumer spending. Consumption accounts for two-thirds of GDP, so consumers are critical in preventing a worsening of the recession and for the ultimate recovery. In New Mexico how the state deals with its \$1 billion expected revenue shortfall next year is critical.

To the extent possible, government layoffs should be avoided. Tax increases

are better than program cuts, although neither is pleasant, and spending down any remaining reserves is preferable to either spending cuts or tax increases.

One idea would be to eliminate loopholes in the gross-receipt tax, perhaps even converting the GRT to a true value-added tax. Help for local governments is also important to avoid layoffs or cut programs.

In any case, in balancing the budget, the legislature should take care to continue to provide services to those who, through no fault of their own, find themselves thrown out of a job or forced to close a business because of the pandemic. The burden should be put on those of us who still have jobs and incomes despite these troubling times.

A \$38 Million class action settlement has been reached on behalf of beneficiaries of deceased pediatric cancer patients who received treatment for Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia (also known as "ALL") at the University of New Mexico Health Sciences Center or Hospital between January 1, 1977, and March 31, 1997

This notice is authorized by the Court to inform you about an agreement to settle a class action lawsuit that may affect you. The lawsuit alleges that the University of New Mexico failed to administer proper treatment protocols to pediatric Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia patients treated at the University of New Mexico Health Sciences Center or Hospital ("UNM") between January 1, 1977, and March 31, 1997. The settlement covers pediatric cancer patients who died as recently as December 1, 2019.

The Defendant UNM says that it has done nothing wrong. The Court has not decided who is right because the parties agreed to a settlement. The Court has given preliminary approval to this settlement. The Court will have a hearing to decide whether to finally approve the settlement on **July 28, 2020 at 9:00 a.m.**

Who is included in the settlement? You may be a Class Member if you are a family member or beneficiary of a deceased pediatric cancer patient diagnosed with ALL who was treated at UNM between January 1, 1977 and March 31, 1997 and who died on or before December 1, 2019. This lawsuit is principally about whether pediatric cancer patients who were treated for ALL at the UNM between January 1, 1977, and March 31, 1997, were given proper care.

What does the settlement provide? The University of New Mexico has agreed to create a fund of \$38,050,000.00 to be divided among all Class members. The Settlement Agreement, available at the website below, describes all the details of the proposed settlement.

Your share of the fund will depend on the number of valid claims that are submitted by eligible Decedent Class Members, whether a deceased pediatric cancer patient has more than one statutory beneficiary entitled to compensation, the total amount of claims administration expenses, taxes, service awards to the named Plaintiffs in the case, and attorneys' fees and expenses.

Nursery rhymes teach the lessons of history

Remember singing songs about plague, taxes and religious persecution when you were a little kid? Probably not. We think of nursery rhymes as silly little songs that entertain small children, but they are also tantalizing glimpses into folk history. These catchy tunes stay with us while their secret message is almost completely lost.

There are good reasons culture retains these ditties. According to child development experts Sue Palmer and Ros Bayley, nursery rhymes significantly aid a child’s mental

development and spatial reasoning.

There also are hidden messages, says Seth Lerer, dean of arts and humanities at the University of California.

“Nursery rhymes are part of long-standing traditions of parody and a popular political resistance to high culture and royalty. At a time when to

caricature royalty or politicians was punishable by death, nursery rhymes proved a potent way to smuggle in coded or thinly veiled messages in the guise of children’s entertainment. In largely illiterate societies, the catchy sing-song melodies helped people remember the stories and, crucially,

pass them on to the next generation. Whatever else they may be, nursery rhymes are a triumph of the power of oral history,” Lerer said.

Ring Around the Rosie refers to the 1665 Great Plague of London, the “rosie” being the malodorous rash that developed on the skin of bubonic plague sufferers, the stench of which then needed concealing with a “pocket full of posies.” The bubonic plague killed 15 percent of Britain’s population, hence “atishoo, atishoo” (sneezing) or ashes, ashes (burning the dead bodies), we all fall down (dead).”

Baa Baa Black Sheep refers to the toll on the working class during the reign of King Edward

in the 13th century. The wool tax was a heavy burden requiring that one third of the price of a sack of wool went to the king, another went to the church and the last was left to the farmer. (In the original version, nothing was left for the little shepherd boy who lives down the lane.) Black sheep were considered bad luck because their fleeces, unable to be dyed, were less lucrative for the farmer.

By some accounts, Rock-a-bye Baby refers to events preceding the Glorious Revolution of 1688. The baby in question is the son of King James II of England. The boy was widely believed to be another man’s child, smuggled into the birthing room to ensure a Roman Catholic heir. The rhyme

is laced with connotation: the “wind” represents Protestant forces blowing in from the Netherlands; the doomed “cradle” represents the royal House of Stuart. The earliest version recorded in print added, “This may serve as a warning to the Proud and Ambitious, who climb so high that they generally fall at last.”

Mary, Mary Quite Contrary also known as Bloody Mary, daughter of King Henry VIII, ordered the torture and murder of Protestants. Queen Mary’s “garden” is an allusion to the graveyards filling with Protestant martyrs. The “silver bells” were thumbscrews; while “cockleshells” are believed to be instruments of torture, which were attached to male

genitals.

The French Reign of Terror is told in the story of Jack and Jill. King Louis XVI (Jack) was beheaded (lost his crown) and Marie Antoinette (Jill) followed. Later, an additional section was added during the Victorian era to make it “more acceptable for children.”

With the current penchant for memes and Tik Tok, one can only wonder how our era will be immortalized.

Exercise For Seniors Part 2

Last week I wrote about the benefits of exercise, specifically focusing on the importance of exercise for seniors. Deciding to become physically active can be one of the best things you can do for your health. Exercise and physical activity are not only great for your mental and physical health, but they can help keep you independent as you age. Now, let's talk about getting started.

How Much Activity Do Older Adults Need?

According to the Physical Activity Guidelines for Americans, published at health.gov, you should do at least 150 minutes (2 ½ hours) a week of moderate-intensity aerobic exercise, like brisk walking or fast dancing. Being active at least 3 days a week is best, but doing anything is better than doing nothing at all. You should also do muscle-strengthening activities, like lifting weights or doing sit-ups, at least 2 days a week. The Physical Activity Guidelines also recommend that as part of your weekly physical activity you combine multiple components of exercises. For example, try balance training as well as aerobic and muscle-strengthening activities.



Here are a few things you may want to keep in mind when beginning to exercise.

Start Slowly When Beginning Exercise

The key to being successful and safe when beginning a physical activity routine is to build slowly from your current fitness level. Over-exercising can cause injury, which may lead to quitting.

A steady rate of progress is the best approach. To have a better idea of your current level, track your normal activity levels for a few days. For a couple of weekdays and a weekend, make a log down how much time you are physically active (for example, walking, gardening, playing a sport, dancing, lifting weights). Once you have an understanding of the amount of time you are physical active, you can increase the amount of time by small amounts for a few weeks. As you increase the time, pay attention to how you feel - do you have muscle soreness or stiffness, or are you fatigued? This will help you understand your current fitness level, and will be useful as you start to add exercises to your routine.

To play it safe and reduce your risk of injury:

Begin your exercise program slowly with low-intensity exercises

- Warm up before exercising and cool down afterward
- Pay attention to your surroundings when exercising outdoors
- Drink water before, during, and after your workout session, even if you don't feel thirsty
- Wear appropriate fitness clothes and shoes for your activity.

If you have specific health conditions, discuss your exercise and physical activity plan with your health care provider. Be sure and ask:

- are there exercises or activities that you should avoid?
- is your preventive care up to date? For example, women over age 65 should be checked regularly for osteoporosis.
- how does your health condition - including medications - affect your ability to exercise?

As you get started with your exercise program, it will be important to set some goals and to have a plan. That's what I'll present next week. In the mean time, get started today by making your activity log, and start to increase your activity a bit and see how you feel.

I’ve known Coach Henson since I was in the third grade. He only lived one block away, and my closest classmate was his next door neighbor. He would let me and a few friends

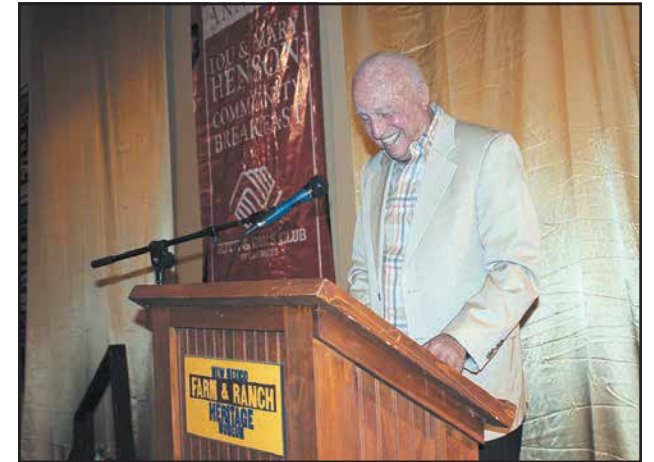

1. *Cuadrilatero* (the ring) is the ring in which *luchadores* and *luchadoras* fight in.
2. *Exoticos* are male wrestlers fighting/performing in drag.
3. Salvador Lutteroth is a Mexican promoter who is credited for making *lucha libre* the cultural phenomenon it is today.
4. *El Murcielago* (The Bat) was one of the first *luchadores* who wore a mask in the ring. His mask was made out of leather.
5. *Plancha* is a *lucha libre* move referring to a crossbody wrestling move
6. *Rudos* (Bad guys) are the bad *luchadores* who often cheat, are deceitful, and use brute force in order to win.
7. *Técnicos* (Good guys) are good *luchadores* who uphold social values, and use honesty and merit to win.
8. *Nacho Libre* is a fictional character based on a real *luchador* who was a friar and supported an orphanage for 23 years.
9. *El Santo* (The Saint) was a film star and iconic figure in *lucha libre*.
10. *Lucha Social* (Social Fight) is term used to describe people who take on the *luchador/luchadora* persona in order to bring light to and fight for social justice issues.
