

The CARES Act Relief Fund makes funding available to local governments to provide grants to small businesses impacted by COVID-19. The Cities of Anthony and Sunland Park, the Town of Mesilla and the Village of Hatch are all partnering with Doña Ana

representation from each municipality of the county and of the Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce will facilitate the process.

"We are requesting \$7 million from the 2020 CARES Act Relief Fund to support an estimated 1,600 small businesses within the county municipalities and outside the City of Las Cruces," said Fernando Macias, Doña Ana County Manager. "These businesses are a vital contributor to the economic stability of Doña Ana County."

The awards allotted to qualifying small businesses

will be based on their ability to demonstrate need. Grants are capped at \$10,000, unless the business provides supportive documentation of greater need. "More

information about the grants will be available, in the very near future," said Debbi Moore, CEO of the Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce.

Mano y Mano program back to full strength

With participants wearing facemasks and maintaining social distance, the City of Las Cruces Mano y Mano day-labor program has returned to full strength, as Las Crucens who are struggling with homelessness and near homelessness assist the city Parks and Recreation Department with local cleanup and beautification.

The program began in March 2018 and had expanded to two crews of 10 people each, but then cut back to five-member crews after the onset of COVID-19, said city Parks Director Franco Granillo and Mesilla Valley Community of Hope (MVCH) Executive Director Nicole Martinez. The program has returned to full strength with safety measures in place, Granillo and Martinez said.

"The Mano y Mano program means a lot to me," said Carl Mead, who was a participant in the program before being hired by the city as a Mano y Mano supervisor. "Four times I would not have been able to pay my electricity bill. And at least twice I would not have been able to pay my rent. And it is because of this program that I now have full-time employment as a Mano y Mano supervisor."

"In a time of economic uncertainty, Mano y Mano has provided an opportunity to those who are familiar with hard work to make ends meet," Martinez said. "We are grateful that Mano y Mano provides consistent work,

beautifies our community and connects people with services to help prevent and end homelessness." MVCH includes Camp Hope tent city.

The Mano y Mano crews work throughout

State's early education system ranked in top 25

BULLETIN REPORT

New Mexico's early education system is ranked 21st among all states and the District of Columbia in a survey by the personal finance website WalletHub.

For the study. WalletHub compared the 50 states and D.C. using 12 key metrics, including

share of school districts (New Mexico has 89) that offer a state pre-K program, number of pre-K quality benchmarks met and total reported spending per child enrolled in pre-K.

With a total overall score of 53.55 out of a possible 100, New Mexico was ninth in accessibility, 38th in quality and 25th in

resources and economic support.

D.C. was ranked first with a score of 75.41, followed by Nebraska, Maryland, West Virginia and Arkansas. The bottom five were Massachusetts. Arizona, North Dakota, Missouri and Indiana, which

had a last-place score of 24.2.

"A study by the National Institute for Early **Education Research** showed that students enrolled in full-day pre-K programs do better on math and literacy tests than their peers who at-

tend only partial-day preschool," WalletHub said. "In addition, those who attend pre-K programs have been shown to have less risk of future crime than those who do not. Plus. early education programs may generate billions of dollars for the economy

over a few decades, due to lessening the need for social services and creating more productive citizens."



City of Las Cruces

Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) hosted a Virtual Stop of the American Public Gas Association (APGA) on August 13th. During the meeting, the organization was able to share new best practices in the gas industry that have been helpful to its members throughout the county during the pandemic.

APGA is a not-forprofit nationwide association for public and communityowned natural gas utilities and has over 700 members in 37 states. Due to concerns related to COVID-19, the membership tour with senior staff transitioned to a virtual tour that will include over 25 regional/state visits with APGA members nationwide.

American Public Gas Association Shares COVID Tips with Virtual Tour

Meetings lasted for approximately 90 minutes with topicbased presentations and an openended discussion roundtable for municipal natural gas employees to learn and engage with APGA staff about the operational, regulatory, and legislative issues at the federal level important to

municipal natural gas utilities.

"Plenty of professional development conferences have been canceled or gone online during the pandemic," said Lucio Garcia, LCU deputy director Gas. "But collaboration and learning from other gas workers is still helpful, such as hearing what

others are doing to continue to provide gas services while keeping workers and customers safe from COVID."

"Many of our members are getting creative with how they can help keep their employees and customers safe," said Erin Kurilla, APGA vice president for Operations and Pipeline Safety. She explained that staggered shifts - like what LCU has been doing - can minimize foot traffic within the office. There was also a shift in splitting up larger crews so that if self-quarantining was needed, less of the active crew would be affected.

"LCU has implemented the truck-to-truck system for its crew, where the supervisor meets associates at their trucks every morning to assign their work for that day," said Garcia. "We can show that these methods and procedures, that we started very early in the pandemic, still allowed us to serve our customers while keeping everyone safe as much as possible."



LCU can be reached at 575-528-3500 from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. LCU provides services to approximately 100,000 Las Cruces residents and businesses.

City leaders, staff need to get on same page

This is why we can't have nice things.

That was essentially the claim made by local developer Randy

McMillan after
plans fell through
for a special tax
district to fund an
upscale project on
the old Las Cruces Country Club
property off Main
Street.



Then, 18 months into planning, city leaders began making insulting accusations, causing Weigert to reconsider plans to develop here, McMillan said.

"There are communities that are business friendly and embrace people like Zach, and that's where he will go," McMillan said during a recent radio interview. "And frankly, it's that attitude that is why this state is 49th or 50th in every good category and first or second in every bad category."

TIDDs are a way to spark growth in designated areas by allowing tax money generated in that area to remain there. A TIDD for downtown Las Cruces was used to help fund construction of Plaza de Las Cruces and the conversion of Church and Water streets.

Those were public proj-

ects. This proposal was to use money generated by the TIDD to benefit a private development.

> I'm not sure that's what the TIDD was intended for, and I think it's probably a good thing that this one was stopped. But, it's not a good thing

if city staff are pitching proposals that city leaders don't support or understand.

Mayor Ken Miyagishima said he only recently learned that the TIDD would include bonds. Council members Kansandra Gandara and Gill Sorg also said that issue was never made clear to them. Weigert said bonds were always part of the proposal.

Weigert said he's not sure what to do now. He said the plans aren't economically feasible without the TIDD, which seems odd if it's true that the city came to them with the idea first. Certainly, plans must have been feasible without the TIDD at one time.

The problem, Weigert

said, is that rents are too low in Las Cruces for the kind of upscale project he envisions.

For most of us, low rent is a good thing. If that is a prohibitive problem for your project, then your project was probably never right for us in the first place.

Weigert said one of his options now is to just sit on the land.

It's been nearly nine years since the last duffer cursed a sliced tee shot at the old country club. What was a large, lush greenspace in the heart of town became overtaken by weeds during the ensuing years when the property was neglected.

When the country club shut down, several residents wanted the city to buy the land and convert it into a park. We were told that wasn't economically feasible.


Then a developer from Nebraska comes along and wants to build upscale apartments that are more expensive than most of us can afford. That, apparently, isn't going to be eco-


"They need that money in order to have the Post Office work so it can take all of these millions and millions of ballots," he whined.



Grant continues juvenile diversion, development program

Earlier this month, the Las Cruces City Council approved a grant of almost \$309,000 from the New Mexico Children, Youth & Families Department (CYFD) to the city Parks and Recreation Depart-



ment to continue the city's Juvenile Citation program (JCP). The city's matching funds for the program exceed \$123,500.

The diversion and development program for at-risk youth ages 11-17 began in Las Cruces in 2003, said City Youth Services Administrator Robert Nuñez, who works in the city's Parks and Recreation Department.

Program staff work with school districts, law enforcement and other agencies in Las Cruces and throughout Doña Ana County, including expanding the program in Hatch, Nuñez said, to assist young people who have "hit a speed bump" and need guidance and direction in their lives.

JCP's six full-time and two part-time staff work with youth at three levels. he said. Dealing with truants and runaways, minors who have been cited for allowing themselves to be served alcohol and similar issues comprise the program's first level of service, Nuñez said. Staff and volunteers work with youth on the choices they make and help them learn about "making those right decisions," he said.

JCPS's level-two and level-three programming is gender-specific, Nuñez said, as staff and volunteers work with youth on personal issues like pride and respect, having a positive body image, communicating well with others, avoiding self-harm and developing healthy relationships. Again, he said, the underlying goal

is to help youth "make better choices as they move forward."

Other issues addressed in the program include adolescent mental health, alcohol/drug use, abuse and prevention, bullying, civic responsibility, conflict resolution, leadership, self-esteem and teen dating violence, according to the JCP website.

The public health pandemic "did slow us down a little bit," Nuñez said, but the program was still able to serve 175 youth last fiscal year, he said. In a normal year, it serves more than 250. Staff continue to provide virtual classes and other services to the youth they serve and their families.

"Staff has done a tremendous job in coming up with alternatives to families and youth that need our assistance," Nuñez said.

Volunteer to speak

Public outreach is an important part of JCP, he said, because guest speakers from various businesses, agencies, organizations and nonprofits are invited to present to vouth in the program. These professionals talk about the challenges they faced growing up, and they help youth "create something positive for themselves and their families." Nuñez said. They also help them create a "positive impact for our community here in Las Cruces and countywide and make those right choices for the future." he said.

Guest speakers also talk about job opportunities, education, hobbies and personal interests and other ways to help youth "get on track," Nuñez said.



From our Control Centers we use state of the art technology to continuously monitor the operation of our pipelines 24 hours each day, seven days a week. Our pipelines are designed, installed, tested, operated and maintained in accordance with all applicable Federal and State requirements. The City of Las Cruces maintains our safe, compliant and efficient pipelines by routine inspections, corrosion protection, maintenance and testing programs, employee training, and public education. Public education includes educational meetings with excavating contractors, emergency response officials and other appropriate public officials and distribution of these informational flyers.

Tuberias en su Comunidad La Ciudad de Las Cruces está comprometida en la operación segura de sus tuberías en su comunidad. Desde nuestros Centros de Control usamos tecnología de punta para monitorear continuamente la operación de nuestras tuberías, las 24 horas del día, los siete días de la semana. If you plan to dig or do any type of excavation or construction work, call New Mexico One Call (NMOC) toll free at 811. A City of Las Cruces representative will locate and mark the underground gas lines at no cost to you. Call at least 48 hours (excluding weekends and holidays) before you dig. Even if you haven't provided advance notification, please contact us immediately if you dig and hit or touch a pipeline – even if you should cause what seems to be only minor damage to the pipeline – contact us immediately. A gouge, dent, crease, or scrape may cause a future safety problem.

Cómo Trabajar Alrededor De Nuestra Tubería

Necesitamos de su ayuda para evitar emergencias en las tuberías. La causa número uno de las fugas en las tuberías es el daño provocado por el movimiento de la tierra y el equipo y herramientas de construcción propiedad de otras partes diferentes a la compañía de la tubería. Si usted tiene planes para cavar o hacer cualquier tipo de excavación o trabajo de construcción, llame al Centro de Una Llamada de Nuevo Mexico gratuitamente al 811. Aunque no haya enviado una notificación por adelantado, por favor comuníquese con nosotros immediatamente si excava y golpea o toca una tubería – aunque cause lo que parezca un daño menor a la tubería – comuníquese con nosotros inmediatamente. Una abolladura, pliegue o rayadura puede causar un futuro problema de seduridad.

How To Identify Where The Pipeline Is Located

Since pipelines are buried underground, line markers are sometimes used to indicate the approximate – not exact – location of the pipeline. Line markers can be found where the pipeline intersects a street, highway, or railroad. However, they cannot be relied upon to indicate the exact position of the pipeline. The pipeline may not follow a straight course between markers, which provide no information on the depth or number of pipelines in the vicinity. Don't try to guess the pipeline's location or route by the marker's placement. Call New Mexico One Call (NMOC) at 811.

Cómo Identificar Dónde Está Ubicada La Línea De Tubería

Ya que las líneas de tubería se encuentran bajo tierra, a veces se usan marcas para indicar de manera aproximada –no exacta- la localización de la línea. Los marcadores de las líneas pueden ser encontrados en donde la línea de la tubería intersecta a una calle, carretera of via del forrocarril. Sin embargo, no son confiables para indicar la posición exacta de la línea de la tubería. La tubería puede no seguir un curso derecho entre dos marcas, lo cual no proporciona información de la profundidad o el número de líneas en la vecindad. No trate de adivinar la localización de la línea o ruta por la ubicación del marcador de las líneas de la tubería, llame al Centro de Una Llamada de Nuevo Mexico 811.

If you are a public safety official... ...you know to take whatever steps you deem necessary to safeguard

...you know to take whatever steps you deem necessary to safeguard the public in the event of a pipeline emergency.

The following suggestions are offered as a guide:

- Secure the area around the leak to a safe distance. This could include the evacuation of people from homes, businesses, schools, and other locations, as well as the erection of barricades to control access to the emergency site and similar precautions.
- If the pipeline leak is not burning, take steps to prevent ignition. This includes prohibiting smoking, rerouting traffic, and shutting off the electricity.
- If the pipeline leak is burning, try to prevent the spread of fire but do not attempt to extinguish it. Burning petroleum products will not explode. If the fire is extinguished, gas or vapor will collect and could explode when reignited by secondary fires.
- Contact the pipeline company as quickly as possible. Pipeline marker signs show the pipeline company's name, emergency telephone number, and pipeline contents.

Si Usted Es Un Oficial De Seguridad Publica...

...sabe que debe tomar las medidas necesarias para proteger al público en caso de una emergencia relacionada a una tubería.

Le ofrecemos las siguiente sugerencias como guía.

- Asegure el área alrededor del escape hasta una distancia segura. Esto podría incluir la evacuación de la gente de los hogares, los negocios, las escuelas, y otros lugares, también la instalación de barreras para controlar el acceso a la zona de emergencia y otras precauciones similares.
- Si el escape de la tubería no esta ardiendo, tome las medidas necesarias para evitar la combustión. Esto
 incluve prohibir fumar, desviar el transito y cortar las fuentes de electricidad.
- Si el escape de la tubería esta ardiendo, trate de prevenir la propagación del fuego pero no trate de extinguirlo. Los productos del petróleo en combustión no explotan. Si se extingue el fuego, puede haber una acumulación de gas o vapor y estos pueden explotar si un fuego secundario causara su combustión.
- Comuníquese con la compañía operadora de la tubería lo antes posible. Los marcadores de las tuberías muestran el nombre de la compañía, el teléfono de emergencia, y el contenido de la tubería.

Elegant demoiselle cranes deftly navigate a treacherous pass through the Himalayas en route to India in the new episode "Asia and Australia," which gives viewers a bird's-eye view of both those continents. Among other highlights, vultures circle above a streak of tigers on the hunt, hoping eventually the big cats will leave behind a nice meal for them. Pigeons serve as unlikely but unerring guides to the greatest gatherings of camels on Earth, while in the Australian outback,

white cockatoos swirl by the thousands. David Tennant narrates.

Parks Department is glyphosate free

A year after the Las Cruces City Council voted to ban the use of the herbicide glyphosate for pest control on city property, city Parks and Recreation Department staff are finding other ways to control weeds.

Glyphosate, the principal ingredient in Roundup, has been linked to cancer and other health issues in a number of studies.

"We went cold turkey on it," said City Parks Director Franco Granillo. "Prevention is the best method."

"We're still using our pre-emergent to really control the weed growth," Granillo said. "Our main goal is prevention, then spot spraying with an herbicide."

Sometimes, he said, using staff and day-labor participants to physically pull weeds also helps.

Since the glyphosate ban, "Franco's team has done a really good job of looking at what other types of chemicals to use," said Parks and Recreation Department Director Sonya Delgado.

She said Parks and Rec staff are working with weed management specialists in New Mexico State University's College of Agricultural, Consumer and Environmental Sciences to develop the most effective weed-control strategies for the city.

"They have done a great job of trying to find other alternatives," Delgado said.

Parks and Rec staff are also working with the city's Integrated Pest Management (IPM) ad hoc committee to develop an IPM policy for the city.


Retired New Mexico State University professor Frank Thayer has published a new novel, "The Vampire of San Vicente," which is available at amazon.com and Kindle. Soon, it will also be available at COAS bookstores, he said.

Here is a synopsis of "The Vampire of San Vicente," in Thayer's own words:

"It is rumored in 1994 that a long series of attacks and unexplained deaths in the southern New Mexico town of San Vicente may be associated with an old man who has been there almost since the town was founded. It was almost by accident that water utilities engineer Ferris Taylor began to assemble the evidence after his unrequited high school love dies without reason.

"Taylor finds himself in hot water when he leaves his wife and ends up in an affair with a sultry college student. The inevitable collision of Taylor with his own failings and what may be a true vampire leads to an underground horror. He is supported by lifelong friends who share in his discovery and the final conflict with the undead."

"It seems I have an appetite for writing beyond that of my 30-year career as a journalism professor at NMSU," Thayer said. "I am dedicated to defending the incredible reality of the flying saucer that crashed and was recovered outside of Aztec, New Mexico in March 1948. My fiction writing follows the classic supernatural horror themes as explored by Edgar Allan Poe and H.P. Lovecraft. 'The Vampire of San Vicente' is my longest work to date, and its social dynamic is strangely affected, not only by Lovecraft, but by master novelist John




LeCarré, whose flawed characters come to life through his verisimilitude."

Thayer's other books are "The Whispering Darkness," a 2018 novel; "Terror Tales of the Southwest," a 2017 shortstory anthology; "The Aztec UFO Incident," co-authored with Scott and Suzanne Ramsey, published in 2015 by New Page Books, it is the nonfiction story of a flying saucer crash and recovery; "Cobston Trilogy: The Ontario Horror," a novel of undead evil in a Canadian town across

three generations published by Sun Cross Books in 2015; "Magic in the Desert," co-written with Mike Waldner for their departed NMSU roommate and credited to Dan Perry, it tells the story of the Aggies' 1960 undefeated football team; and "The Aztec Incident: Recovery at Hart Canyon," co-written with Scott and Suzanne Ramsev and Frank Warren, Aztec.48 Productions, 2011, it is "the first book exposing the reality of the Aztec flying saucer," Thaver said.

Thayer said he has loved horror stories since

his childhood in Grant County, New Mexico, just south of Mogollon. Thayer spent years exploring Mogollon, Silver City, Hillsboro and nearby Chino Mines and other places that would feature in his novels and short stories.


"Almost every story has a hook from real experience," Thayer said, and many of his characters are based at least in part on real people.

Thayer's teaching career included 11 years in Canada, which ended in 1977 when he began missing the desert and

returned to New Mexico. Thayer worked for Silver Consolidated Schools in Silver City for four years before coming to Las Cruces to teach and complete his master's and doctoral degrees at NMSU. He retired in 2012 but remains on the university's teaching faculty as a journalism professor emeritus.

One of his abiding principals as a writer of both fiction and nonfiction, Thayer said, is that "mysteries are not made to be solved. They're made to be experienced."


Las Cruces author

She worked for the New Mexico Department of Transportation in Santa Fe for 12 years before moving to Las Cruces to return to school and earn her masters' degree in public history with an emphasis in architectural history at NMSU. Marshall co-authored "Historic Architectural Styles, Las Cruces, N.M.: Celebrating 150 Years," with John R. Versluis, which was published in 2000.


"Rose is caught up in the intrigues of the Revolu-







Downtown businesses open, keeping customers safe

Downtown Las Cruces is open for business.

That's the message from Jennifer Garcia Kozlowski, executive director of Downtown Las Cruces Partnership (DLCP), who said downtown businesses are working together to find ways of "hanging in there" during the pandemic and to thrive once the health emergency is over.

"We have a sense of community," she said of



the nearly 250 businesses that comprise downtown, including those directly east and west of Main Street.

DLCP is collaborating with the City of Las Cruces, including its Arts and Cultural District, the Downtown Tax Increment Development District and MainStreet Las Cruces to develop collaborations designed to benefit all of downtown.

An example from earlier this month is a \$12,000 grant DLCP received from the American Association of Retired People (AARP) to provide safe bicycle storage and shade structures in the city's Arts and Cultural District.

"Downtown Las Cruces wants to be a hub of community activity," Kozlowski said about the grant.

Kozlowski said downtown merchants "take the health crisis seriously," and are enforcing social distancing and mask wearing to create a truly safe environment rather than "a fake safe."

Because of COVID-19 restrictions, she said, downtown businesses "have really opened up their eyes and their minds to re-establishment of their business plans."

"I'm proud of these businesses," Kozlowski said. Their tenacity is "keeping their doors open and keeping people employed."

In addition to more than 20 restaurants, downtown Las Cruces includes anchors like COAS
Bookstore and Organ
Mountain Outfitters, yoga
studios (continuing to operate with online classes),
art galleries, theatres,
professional services
and one of the nation's
most popular farmers and crafts markets.
Downtown's restaurants
are maximizing every opportunity for safe outdoor
dining, curbside service
and delivery, she said.

Plans are in the works to revive downtown events as COVID-19 restrictions are eased, and to feature the unique works of downtown artists.

No one would dispute that this is the strangest start to a school year ever, and it will impact everyone in our collective set of educational institutions.

Just how big is the digital divide in Doña Ana County? Thanks to the great work of the Center for Community Analysis (CCA) at New Mexico State University, we have a pretty good idea.

The CCA mapped access

This digital cultural shift (or lack thereof) to both broadband and devices for each of our county's three school districts. The website (www.cca.nmsu. edu/interactive-datadashboards/access-to-technology-within-nm/) breaks down according to:

- · Devices (computer and mobile)
- · Internet subscriptions
- Cellular plans

Like the rest of the state. families in our rural districts (Hatch and Gadsden) have larger access gaps than Las Cruces.

Families with no internet subscription:

- 25 percent in Las Cruces
- · 41 percent in Gadsden
- 54 percent in Hatch

The data also shows households earning less than \$20,000 are the most likely to not have Internet access in all three districts.

Households with com-

puting devices varied by district, as well:

- 87 percent in Las Cruces
- 78 percent in Hatch
- 66 percent in Gadsden

This shows the Herculean task our educators have faced head-on and worked all summer to overcome to ensure the students of our community can keep learning and growing in their education.

The Las Cruces district alone provided thousands of computers and devices, as well as purchasing hundreds of hot spots for those who lacked the ability to access the Internet through other means.

Doña Ana Community College has provided several hundred devices for students who met financial aid thresholds. New Mexico State University, as the state's land grant institution, has put its facilities

statewide to work on this issue, creating hot spots at county extension offices and offering wi-fi that extends into the parking lots of its facilities.

They really are all to be applauded for both listening to the needs of students and families and mobilizing resources, so this year could start as smoothly as possible in a fully virtual environment.

Thanks to their efforts, our community will see a bonus benefit: helping our families recover economically, too, by increasing their ability to technology and access it for reemployment and reskilling.

As of August 10, 10,675 people in our county are unemployed because of COVID-19. Re-employment and reskilling for new and different types of jobs are highly dependent upon dig-

ital access to online college and career courses, virtual job fairs, virtual job interviews, job searches, and remote work for those whose jobs have transitioned to a digital environment.

Equal access (to computers, pads, mobile technology and the internet) helps everyone in our community access equal opportunities to learn and work. Thanks to the combined efforts of our education leaders, we are well positioned to take advantage of every opportunity to advance our community's academic progress and economic recovery, hopefully reemerging from COVID-19 stronger than before.

Exercise For Seniors Part 4

We've been talking about starting an exercise program, particularly for our older adults. Last week we focused on writing goals and making a plan. I hope that you've started into your exercise program, and that you're already seeing some benefit. Today and next week, I'm going to write about exercise in the presence of some chronic conditions. Almost anyone, at any age, can do some type of physical activity. You can still exercise even if you have a health condition like heart disease, arthritis, chronic pain, high blood pressure, or diabetes. In fact, physical activity may help. You should be sure to talk with your doctor about how your health condition might affect your ability to exercise.

Staying Physically Active: **Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementias**

Researchers are assessing the benefit of exercise to delay mild cognitive impairment (MCI) in older adults and to improve brain function in older adults who may be at risk for developing Alzheimer's disease. Older adults with MCI may be able to safely do more vigorous forms of exercise, similar to older adults without MCI, provided there are no other underlying health concerns. Being active and getting exercise may help people with Alzheimer's or another dementia feel better and can help them maintain a healthy weight and have regular toilet and sleep habits.

Tips for helping a person with dementia stay active

- · Take a walk together each day. Exercise is good for caregivers, too!
- · Use exercise videos.
- · Dance to music.
- · Pay attention to the time: several short "mini-workouts" may be best.
- · Make sure he or she wears comfortable clothes and shoes that fit well.
- · Make sure he or she drinks water or juice after exercise.







· Even if the person has trouble walking, they may be able to:

- -Do simple tasks around the home, such as sweeping and dusting.
- -Use a stationary bike.
- -Use soft rubber exercise balls or balloons for stretching or throwing back and forth.
- -Use stretching bands.
- -Lift weights or household items such as soup cans.

Exercising with Arthritis


For people with arthritis, exercise can reduce joint pain and stiffness. It can also help with losing weight, which reduces stress on the joints.

- · Flexibility exercises such as upperand lower-body stretching and tai chi can help keep joints moving, relieve stiffness, and give you more freedom of movement for everyday activities.
- · Strengthening exercises, such as overhead arm raises, will help you maintain or add to your muscle strength to support and protect your joints.
- · Endurance exercises make the heart and arteries healthier and may lessen swelling in some joints. Try activities that don't require a lot of weight on your joints, such as swimming and biking.



If you have arthritis, you may need to avoid some types of activity when joints are swollen or inflamed. If you have pain in a specific joint area, for example, you may need to focus on another area for a day or two.

Choosing the right golf ball can help your game

The turn of the last century — the start of the 1900s — saw the growing use of the early wound

golf ball, called the "Haskell" ball. Oct. 11, 2000, saw the introduction of the Titleist Pro V1 ball. which changed everything. The new ball featured a solid core, thin (but durable) elastomer cover and higher ball speed to pros and rec-

reational golfers.

Billy Andrade won the Invensys Classic to be the first PGA pro to win with the new Titleist Pro V1. The following March, the Pro V1 became the best-selling ball in the marketplace. It continues

to be today. The Pro V1 has been the winning ball in 39 professional majors. as well as countless other

> championship tournaments. But nowadays golfers have lots of options.

There are more than 100 USGAconforming golf balls to choose from, including different models

from a couple of dozen manufacturers. TV ads don't help the consumer make the right choice.

The three main variables that determine how a golf ball performs are "power" (meaning distance), "feel" (meaning touch around the greens)

and "spin" (meaning the difference between a hard and soft ball).

Balls can be up to five pieces in construction, depending on how many layers are involved. The outer covers are either inexpensive Surlyn or higher-priced urethane. Premium balls with urethane covers often fly longer and spin more but become unplayable faster and cost more.

An extremely important aspect of choosing the right ball is to know your swing characteristics, your skill level and the parts of your game. For example, if you're a fairly high handicapper, with a low clubhead speed (say 80 mph and below), you're

not going to gain anything with an expensive, soft over, premium golf ball, except maybe a show of prestige among your golfing friends.

If, however, you are a long hitter, even with an average handicap, who generates a clubhead speed of 95 to 115, and has reasonable control of your ball flight, you will need a ball that spins less off the driver and spins more on approach shots and around the greens. Thus, the faster you swing the club, and the more expert your game is, the more you can benefit from a high-premium, high-compression golf ball.

Let's return to spin. If you strike the ball

squarely in the center of the clubface while swinging right down the target line, you may be able to impart almost all backspin with very little sidespin. However, most higher-handicap recreational golfers are slicers; they swipe the ball off the clubface. For right-handed folks, that means the ball often peels off to the right, high and short. Playing with a soft-cover ball is going to exaggerate your slice, since it's the sidespin that determines the result of your shot.

Golfers are often puzzled about balls that they may pull out of a pond. They're not good if they are discolored in any way. And bear in mind that

balls become unsuitable after eight days underwater. And be careful of recycled balls, which are just re-glossed. It's a good idea to clean your ball at every opportunity, take a cut or damaged ball out of play and change balls every nine holes.

If you prize finding decent golf balls on the golf course, just remember this ageless advice from Mark Twain: "It's good sportsmanship not to pick up lost balls while they are still rolling."

USIBWC announces 2020-21 bird hunting areas

The United States Section of the International **Boundary and Water** Commission (USIBWC) has released information regarding migratory and game bird hunting areas on USIBWC lands along the Rio Grande in Doña Ana and Sierra counties for the 2020-21 bird hunting season, starting with dove season Sept. 1.

Hunting must be conducted in compliance with all local, county and state hunting rules and regulations. Hunting regulations

and the USIBWC prohibit hunting where people could be endangered, such as near homes, businesses, bridges, ports of entry and areas where people are recreating.

In New Mexico, the USIBWC authorizes bird hunting in three different areas, totaling approximately 18 miles along the Rio Grande. The hunting areas remain the same as last vear.

In New Mexico, the USIBWC levee gates in the authorized hunting areas

will remain closed during bird-hunting season. Vehicle access is prohibited on the levee in areas where there are levee gates. Vehicles should not block levee gates. In Doña Ana County, the Sheriff's Department will enforce towing of any abandoned or unauthorized vehicles.

Hunters are responsible for identifying legal access points to reach hunting areas and must respect private property as well as all municipal, state and federal properties of agencies other than the USIBWC. Do not damage vegetation in the floodplain. Remove your trash, including any shell casings, to avoid future hunting restrictions. No alcoholic beverages.

Do not discharge firearms within 600 feet of homes or businesses or toward other people. Hunters on USIBWC lands hunt at their own risk. In areas where no vehicles. are allowed, hunters must access hunting areas in non-motorized transport.

Hunters must have any applicable hunting license, follow state hunting laws and use appropriate firearms. New Mexico game wardens will enforce state hunting laws on USIBWC lands. Only migratory and bird hunting is allowed. No other hunting or target practice is permitted.

Hunters must abide by all COVID-19 safety procedures and government property rules, to include proper social distancing and mask-wearing,


Greetings from the Library

- 1. Color and decorate your finger puppets. Do you have scraps of cloth? Wrapping paper? Markers? Buttons? Glue? Bits of colored paper? How can you make your characters unique?
- 2. Cut them out. Wrap the base around your finger till the ends meet. Secure with tape or glue.
- 3. Now create a story. Where are your characters located? Can you make a backdrop for your characters? Are they in the jungle? At a park? In outer space? Use blankets, cardboard, puzzle boxes, etc. to create the setting.
- 4. Think about how your characters talk. Do they sound like a person you've met before? A celebrity? Do they have an accent like Harry Potter?
- 5. Now you're ready to create the script. What will your characters say to one another? You can write this out on a sheet of paper, or you can just play pretend.
- 6. If you get stuck on a story idea, think of a family story and retell it using the puppets in place of real people. See if you can tell the story accurately and with lots of detail.
- 7. Another idea is to use a story you have heard before, but this time change the ending. What could your characters do differently than the story?
