Early voting sites identified for 2020 general election

The Doña Ana County Clerk's Office identified in-person, early voting locations for the 2020 general election.

"Early voting and absentee voting options are essential opportunities for voter participation during the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic," Doña Ana County Clerk Amanda López Askin said. "Our top priority is working to ensure every eligible voter is able to safely and securely cast a ballot in the general election."

Voting at the Doña Ana County Government Center will begin on October 6, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday and continue through Friday, October 30. This location will also be open on Saturday, October 31, from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., but will be closed for voting on October 12, in observance of Indigenous People's Day.

Early voting at Alternate Early Voting locations will begin at 11 a.m. on Saturday, October 17 and will remain open Tuesday through Saturday from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. through October 31.

Same-day registration will be available at all alternate early voting locations and the Doña Ana County Government Center while early voting is taking place. Qualified electors may register to vote or update their existing registration information before they vote.

Absentee ballots may be returned by voters, voters' immediate family members, or voters' caregivers at any early voting site or at the Doña Ana County Clerk's Office.

LCHS grad nears goal of becoming a Naval officer

Naval Officer Candidate Leonard Thurman, a Las Cruces native and 2007 graduate of Las Cruces High School, is enrolled in Officer Candidate School in Newport, Rhode Island.

Thurman describes the process as “a grueling 13-week program” deigned to put him and his classmates to the test morally, mentally and physically. He said he’ll find out this month whether he will graduate from the program.

If he passes, he’ll be commissioned as an ensign. Eventually, he said, he hopes to advance from the enlisted ranks to become a Naval aviator.

A former ballroom dancing champion, Thurman said he joined the Navy to push his limits and join a cause greater than himself. He answered a series of questions from The Bulletin.

Bulletin: When did you leave Las Cruces to go to training camp?

Thurman: I left Las Cruces well before I joined the Navy. I’m 31 years old, and I enlisted in the Navy as an Aviation Electronics Technician just last year. The first time I left Las Cruces was prior to graduating from New Mexico State University. I lived and studied Chinese

language in Shijiazhuang, China, under the Confucius Institute for a year. The second and more permanent time I left was upon being hired as a staff instructor at Colorado Dancesport, arguably the top ballroom dance school in North America. I left Denver to enlist in the Navy in 2019 and left my first command in California in May of this year. I miss both my Colorado Dancesport and Big Red families.

Bulletin: What are the three things you miss most about Las Cruces?

Thurman: New Mexican food for sure. If anyone has not tried green chile from Hatch — and only from Hatch — they don’t know why the New

Mexico staple is so legendary. The beauty of the area. Between the type of desert, the smell of mesquite bushes after a rainstorm, the Organ Mountains and White Sands, there’s no place like it. Most of all, I miss my community that brought me up to make

me the person I am today. I couldn’t do it without them. I owe a lot of my success and experiences to my Las Cruces family.

Bulletin: What do you like best about the training camp?

Thurman: As a senior

student in the training pipeline, I have found that all the lessons that I have learned, consciously or unconsciously, are making themselves clear, and I am able to reflect on them to better prepare me for the challenges of enacting my duty as a Naval officer. The staff are exceptional and offer mentorship, which I have found extremely rewarding. The hundred years of experience the staff brings to the table further enhances the

learning experience. Their mentorship is a priceless gift that I appreciate wholeheartedly.

Bulletin: What do you like least about it?

Thurman: Indoctri-

nation phase. I do not think you will find one candidate who enjoys that phase of three long weeks. I also got the pleasure to do it twice. Glad to have the experience, literally

got the shirt. Never again.

Bulletin: How is COVID-19 affecting your training experience?

Thurman: It's hard to say because I have only experienced it in a COVID-19 environment. I have also grown used to the mask wearing and social distancing. It feels like a part of normal life after several weeks of practicing the safety procedures. The Navy prioritizes safety over everything else, so we follow strict measures in order to ensure a COVID-19 free safety environment.

Bulletin: Do you have any opportunities to do ballroom dancing during off hours?

Thurman: Unfortunately, no. The beauty of ballroom and Latin dancing is that the art needs a partnership to execute,

and I am unaware of any other candidate who has the ability. I would also need the means to play music, which is not the focus of training, so there's really no opportunity. Upon graduation, due to COVID-19 there is also little opportunity to dance due to social distancing.

Bulletin: Has anyone teased you about your dancing? If so, how do you respond?

Thurman: No. I think to some candidates that it registers that dancing was my profession for many years and they're more interested and curious about my experience and ability as a dancer. Even if there was negative feedback, I have never let anything like that discourage me. I loved every minute of my time as a professional dancer, and

it is still a cherished part of me. Oh, and I'm still a great dancer and dance instructor.

Bulletin: What are your ultimate Naval ambitions, and how do you plan to achieve them?

Thurman: I'm not sure yet. When I decided to join the Navy, I knew I wanted to join but didn't really have a specific goal. As I was going to "A" School in Pensacola, the Blue Angels frequently practiced right over our heads. From when I first saw them, I was immediately inspired to fly among their ranks. With extreme focus after getting to my first command, I worked extremely hard to demonstrate that I was a top performer and to finish the OCS Application

process in three-months time. Currently, I'm in the pipeline for Naval flight officer. I was disqualified due to eyesight, but I plan to correct my vision and hopefully prove to the Navy again that I am a sailor they want flying jets when the opportunity comes and then rush for a spot on the Blue Angel Team. As specific and inspiring that is for me, really the most important "ambition" is to be a great leader and a positive influence to everyone around me. Everything else will fall into place. Come find me in about 14 years and ask me how flying the Blue and Gold colors feels.

Bulletin: Do you recommend enlistment to other Las Cruces graduates who are searching for work? Why or why not?

Thurman: Absolutely. I have had many great experiences in my life, and the Navy is definitely one of them. There's nothing like serving in our country's armed forces. I think more Americans should join the service. You grow so much as a person, and you have the best of us around you.

It's a family. As much as I loved being a dancer, the Navy is the best job I have ever had.

Bulletin: What's the first thing you want to do when you get to come back to Las Cruces?

Thurman: Enjoy the three things I miss: New Mexican cuisine, the unique landscape and my people back home.

Bulletin: What else should our readers know about you?

Thurman: Whenever I consider a life-altering commitment, I contemplate the potential decision for a long time. The Navy is one of those commitments, just like marriage or moving to a different country or starting a family. After enough reflection, I know in my heart to make the right decision almost all the time. My grandfather always told me that I could do anything if I set my mind to it, and I 110 percent believe that. If you want it and take the necessary steps and do the hard work required, you'll make it someday. I would say from enlisting last year February to commissioning a year and a half later, my grandfather is an extremely wise man.

Avocado Rustlers

Catching avocado rustlers is sort of a cross between the COVID-19 virus, wildfires, exchange students bearing addictive goodies and racoon hunting.

"All right, come down outta that tree and drop that avocado. Frisk him, Ken, and don't forget to check for lemons."

In the southern California county of Ventura you will find the occasionally fractious comingling of densely populated residential areas and intensive orchard and truck farming. I'm sure there was a time when farmers gladly supplied their

neighbors with enough lemons, strawberries and avocados to keep 'em in guacamole and shortcake each growing season.

But as urban pressure increased, uninvited pickers began to take advantage. "I'm only takin' two or three. They'll never be missed." Unfortunately, it eventually became, "I'm only takin' 1,200 pounds. They can grow more."

Farmers complained. They reported their losses, but by the time it got to court the evidence had turned black and the district attorney's office had bigger fish to fry. "Ladies and gentlemen

of the jury, my client, the defendant, is accused of stealing 12 avocados. He was having a party, wearin' masks, of course. Safeway was 10 miles away and it was two o'clock in the morning! C'mon get serious. We're letting felonious shoplifters out on the street!"

The Farm Bureau organized, and by working with the Sheriff's department, was finally able to convince the proper politicians that the once minor shoplifting of an avocado had grown into a thriving black market and was causing significant losses.

First, they passed laws with teeth. Stealing avocados can be a felony punishable by up to one

year in prison or a \$5,000 fine.

They implemented a chain-of-evidence procedure that established a value on the stolen goods immediately, so the avocados did not have to sit in the evidence room until the time of trial.

Farmers signed up with the National Property Registration Service. It enabled them to report a theft at 3 a.m. The sheriff's office punched in their number, which had been expanded to include explicit directions to any of the farmer's groves. Reflective numbered markers, like street signs, were posted at the exact locations. Sheriff's deputies, in-

Athletes can only draw attention to the problem

Jackie Robinson broke the color barrier in Major League Baseball in 1947, but change came slower to Birmingham, Alabama.

The minor league Birmingham Barons played in the Southern Association, which had just one black player in its history. Nat Peeples played in two games for the Atlanta Crackers in 1954. The Southern Association went under in 1961. After two years without baseball, the Barons were ready to make their return, but there was a problem.

All the leagues by then were integrated. In Birmingham, segregation was more than just tradition. It was the law. The so-called “checkers law” made it a crime for blacks and whites to compete against each other.

If the good people of Birmingham wanted to see the Barons return, they would have to change their laws. On opening day for the 1964 season, the Barons' lineup included a young pitcher named John "Blue Moon" Odom, who would go on to star for the Oakland A's. Black fans were allowed to sit in the

same section as whites at Rickwood Field for the first time.

When it comes to race relations, sports has long been ahead of society in general. The 1964 Barons are one example where that made a tangible difference.

Lou Henson is another. When he took the head coaching job at Hardin Simmons University in 1962, Henson insisted that they include black players for the first time.

Last week, the Milwaukee Bucks refused to play their scheduled NBA play-off game after seeing the video of Jacob Blake being shot seven times in the back by police in Kenosha, Wisconsin.

All of the other NBA teams joined with the Bucks, and the playoffs were stopped. Teams and players in other sports united in solidarity, and for a couple of days they brought most of the sports world to a halt.

The show of strength and unity was impressive. But they are making a demand that can't be met: no more black lives ended at the hands of police.

For their part, Bucks players said they were frustrated by inaction in the Wisconsin Legislature, and they did have some success at that level. It's a start.

Part of the legend of Jackie Robinson was that he was selected by former

Brooklyn Dodgers owner Branch Rickey to be the first black player in Major League Baseball, in part, for his strength to not fight back in the face of racial slurs and abuse. That is undoubtedly why he is universally held in such high esteem today. We ven-

erate passive black resistance to white brutality.

Athletes like Tommie Smith, John Carlos and Colin Kaepernick haven't fared as well in our collective memories, even though their protests were

Supports Ferrary

To the editor:

Voters will be deciding whether to re-elect Rep. Joanne Ferrary on Nov. 3. I've been impressed with her ability to identify a problem and work on it until it gets solved. A good example is the work she did on increasing the mini-

mum wage in New Mexico.

Joanne has wanted to help working families for a long time. She believes that a person who works full-time should earn enough money to live a decent life. She knows that if the minimum wage had kept up with inflation, it would be \$10.75 per hour and, if it had kept up with

worker's productivity, it would be \$18.67 per hour.

In 2013, Joanne began working on increasing the minimum wage as an advocate for the Communities in Action and Faith (CAFÉ). She collaborated with other organizations in developing a well-coordinated campaign. She also helped Las Cruces

city council members in their successful effort to increase the minimum wage.

Joanne was elected to the legislature in 2016. She immediately began working with fellow legislators on the minimum wage. They were successful in getting a bill passed, but it was vetoed by then-Gov.

Susana Martinez. She and her colleagues didn't give up. In 2018, the legislature again passed a bill and it was signed into law by Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham. The minimum wage in New Mexico is now \$9.35 per hour and incrementally increasing to \$12 per hour in 2023.

When Joanne sees a

problem that needs fixing, she goes after it with grit, determination and wisdom. She joins with other people, creates an effective coalition and persists until it gets solved. That's the kind of person I want representing me in Santa Fe.

cluding their canine corps and helicopter could then converge on the location in a matter of minutes.

With the thumping helicopter overhead lighting the area, and snarling dogs in hot pursuit, the midnight thieves soon found themselves treed, tried and trundled off to San Quentin.

Results have been better than expected. Theft is down substantially, and the Farm Bureau and Sheriff's office have established a mutually beneficial relationship.

It strikes me that Ven-

tura's example might be inspiration for other counties around the country where people think 'pick yer own' applies to them. Midnight sweet-corn thieves, watermelon felons or protesting pilferers

would think twice.

After I visited Oklahoma in early May, I quar-

NMSU grad working toward COVID-19 vaccine

Not long after the onset of COVID-19 in March, Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center (Fred Hutch) in Seattle switched gears to host the largest publicly funded organization in the United States working on a COVID-19 vaccine.

Helping to guide outreach and education as part of Fred Hutch's COVID-19 Prevention Network is New Mexico State University graduate Francisco E. "Frankie" Rentas.

Rentas, 38, and his colleagues connect remotely from different states and countries to put together

studies — some involving tens of thousands of people from across the country and around the world — “focused on the science of protecting people from COVID,” Rentas said.

His HIV Vaccine Trials Network (HVTN)/COVID-19 Prevention Network (CoVPN) Social Behavioral Sciences & Community Engagement team takes the lead in commu-

nity engagement, educating people about the virus “in a culturally responsible way” and recruiting participants in COVID-19

studies in the search for an effective vaccine.

The 11-member team is “the bridge between the science and the people

we need to move the science forward,” Rentas said. “Our main mission is to make that science relatable to educate our community and to build partnerships and trust within those communities so we can recruit the people we need to be part of our studies.”

The CoVPN is partnering with the federal government and pharmaceutical companies on multiple studies to find the vaccine, Rentas said. If the first study is successful, he said, a vaccine could be available within months. If not, other studies “are coming through the pipeline right behind

it,” he said, with each potentially being the one that produces the vaccine that works.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is already stockpiling millions of doses of study vaccines, Rentas said, so when the one that works is found, the FDA “is ready to go” with its production.

“We know that there is the urgency and we know that people want this now because they want life to go back to normal and they’re worried about themselves and their families,” Rentas said.

But, while the process of finding a vaccine is “moving much faster than normal,” he said, “you

don’t do it so fast that you’re not fully testing the safety. You don’t skip any steps to determine that. We want the vaccine as fast as everyone else does, but those safety measures for any vaccine study are still in place for our COVID vaccine studies.”

Each study vaccine begins with laboratory tests, he said, then moves on to studies involving animals, including mice. If it continues to show promise, the study vaccine moves on to multiple phases of human study. The first couple are done in small groups of about 100 people each, Rentas said, adding that researchers monitor the study vaccine’s safety and side effects, determine the proper dosage and ensure that it produces an immune response in the body.

With data from the smaller group studies, researchers then move on to “large-scale, phase III efficacy studies,” Rentas said. For these, he said, CoVPN will “bring in thousands of people from a diverse geographic area, from the U.S. and internationally.”

These groups must be diverse in terms of age, health, gender and ethnicity, Rentas said.

In phase III, half of each study group receives the actual study vaccine, while the other half gets a placebo. That’s necessary, Rentas said, because there is no earlier vaccine to which the study product can be compared.

“It’s out of the phase III studies that we get to see, does the study vaccine work?” Rentas said. “Does it actually prevent coronavirus infection?”

After phase III success, the FDA can make the vaccine publicly available.

“Our first phase III study started in July,” Rentas said, and is at nearly one-half of its full 30,000-participant enrollment. “That’s fast,” Rentas said. But, “there’s no telling when we’re going to get end-point data. We’ll just have to wait and see. We’ve got multiple phase III studies happening, one right behind the other,” he said, most with about 30,000 participants and one with 60,000.

“That’s a lot of people entering these studies compared to other vaccine studies. It’s never been done this way this quickly,” Rentas said.

Fred Hutch and the HVTN were a smart choice to lead the COVID-

19 vaccine studies, Rentas said, because they could quickly assemble a new collaboration which became the CoVPN. The infrastructure was already in place from cancer and infectious diseases research dating to the 1970s and the search for an HIV vaccine that began nearly 20 years ago.

Rentas graduated from NMSU with a degree in theatre in 2005, moved to Seattle in 2007, earned a master’s degree in teaching from the University of Washington and discovered in 2011 that the HVTN at Fred Hutch was conducting HIV-vaccine trials.

“I was very intrigued,” Rentas said. “I live in Seattle, a city where all this cutting-edge stuff is happening.”

Rentas signed up for

one of HVTN’s studies, and “that is what opened my world to scientific research,” he said. “That’s where I want to be,” Rentas realized, so he applied for a job.

Rentas was hired by Fred Hutch in 2012 as a cancer information specialist and tobacco cessation counselor. He moved up to project coordinator for the Geographic Management of Cancer Health Disparities program before finally landing a job at the HVTN as a program assistant. In August, Rentas was promoted to project manager for Fred Hutch’s HVTN/CoVPN Social Behavioral Sciences & Community Engagement team.

From our Control Centers we use state of the art technology to continuously monitor the operation of our pipelines 24 hours each day, seven days a week. Our pipelines are designed, installed, tested, operated and maintained in accordance with all applicable Federal and State requirements. The City of Las Cruces maintains our safe, compliant and efficient pipelines by routine inspections, corrosion protection, maintenance and testing programs, employee training, and public education. Public education includes educational meetings with excavating contractors, emergency response officials and other appropriate public officials and distribution of these informational flyers.

Tuberías en su Comunidad La Ciudad de Las Cruces está comprometida en la operación segura de sus tuberías en su comunidad. Desde nuestros Centros de Control usamos tecnología de punta para monitorear continuamente la operación de nuestras tuberías, las 24 horas del día, los siete días de la semana. Nuestras tuberías están diseñadas, instaladas, probadas, operadas y mantenidas de acuerdo con todos los requisitos Federales y Estatales aplicables. How To Work Around Our Pipeline

We need your help in preventing pipeline emergencies. The number one cause of pipeline leaks is damage from earth-moving and construction equipment and tools owned by parties other than the pipeline company. If you plan to dig or do any type of excavation or construction work, call New Mexico One Call (NMOC) toll free at 811. A City of Las Cruces representative will locate and mark the underground gas lines at no cost to you. Call at least 48 hours (excluding weekends and holidays) before you dig. Even if you haven't provided advance notification, please contact us immediately if you dig and hit or touch a pipeline – even if you should cause what seems to be only minor damage to the pipeline – contact us immediately. A gouge, dent, crease, or scrape may cause a future safety problem.

Cómo Trabajar Alrededor De Nuestra Tubería

Necesitamos de su ayuda para evitar emergencias en las tuberías. La causa número uno de las fugas en las tuberías es el daño provocado por el movimiento de la tierra y el equipo y herramientas de construcción propiedad de otras partes diferentes a la compañía de la tubería. Si usted tiene planes para cavar o hacer cualquier tipo de excavación o trabajo de construcción, llame al Centro de Una Llamada de Nuevo Mexico gratuitamente al 811. Un representante de la Ciudad de Las Cruces localizará y marcará las líneas de gas subterráneas sin costo para usted. Llame por lo menos 48 horas (excluir los fines de semana y los días de descanso) antes de excavar. Aunque no haya enviado una notificación por adelantado, por favor comuníquese con nosotros inmediatamente si excava y golpea o toca una tubería – aunque cause lo que parezca un daño menor a la tubería – comuníquese con nosotros inmediatamente. Una abolladura, pliegue o rayadura puede causar un futuro problema de seguridad.

The City of Las Cruces cares about your safety. We design, install, test, operate, and maintain our pipelines to meet or exceed regulatory standards. Our employees are thoroughly trained to operate and maintain the system safely. We want you to be aware of our pipeline. We ask for your help in preventing accidental damage to it.

How To Identify Where The Pipeline Is Located

Since pipelines are buried underground, line markers are sometimes used to indicate the approximate – not exact – location of the pipeline. Line markers can be found where the pipeline intersects a street, highway, or railroad. However, they cannot be relied upon to indicate the exact position of the pipeline. The pipeline may not follow a straight course between markers, which provide no information on the depth or number of pipelines in the vicinity. Don't try to guess the pipeline's location or route by the marker's placement. Call New Mexico One Call (NMOC) at 811.

Cómo Identificar Dónde Está Ubicada La Línea De Tubería

Ya que las líneas de tubería se encuentran bajo tierra, a veces se usan marcas para indicar de manera aproximada –no exacta– la localización de la línea. Los marcadores de las líneas pueden ser encontrados en donde la línea de la tubería intersecta a una calle, carretera o vía del ferrocarril. Sin embargo, no son confiables para indicar la posición exacta de la línea de la tubería. La tubería puede no seguir un curso derecho entre dos marcas, lo cual no proporciona información de la profundidad o el número de líneas en la vecindad. No trate de adivinar la localización de la línea o ruta por la ubicación del marcador de las líneas de la tubería, llame al Centro de Una Llamada de Nuevo Mexico 811.

If you are a public safety official...

...you know to take whatever steps you deem necessary to safeguard the public in the event of a pipeline emergency.

The following suggestions are offered as a guide:

- Secure the area around the leak to a safe distance. This could include the evacuation of people from homes, businesses, schools, and other locations, as well as the erection of barricades to control access to the emergency site and similar precautions.
- If the pipeline leak is not burning, take steps to prevent ignition. This includes prohibiting smoking, rerouting traffic, and shutting off the electricity.
- If the pipeline leak is burning, try to prevent the spread of fire but do not attempt to extinguish it. Burning petroleum products will not explode. If the fire is extinguished, gas or vapor will collect and could explode when reignited by secondary fires.
- Contact the pipeline company as quickly as possible. Pipeline marker signs show the pipeline company's name, emergency telephone number, and pipeline contents.

Si Usted Es Un Oficial De Seguridad Publica...

...sabe que debe tomar las medidas necesarias para proteger al público en caso de una emergencia relacionada a una tubería.

Le ofrecemos las siguiente sugerencias como guía.

- Asegure el área alrededor del escape hasta una distancia segura. Esto podría incluir la evacuación de la gente de los hogares, los negocios, las escuelas, y otros lugares, también la instalación de barreras para controlar el acceso a la zona de emergencia y otras precauciones similares.
- Si el escape de la tubería no esta ardiendo, tome las medidas necesarias para evitar la combustión. Esto incluye prohibir fumar, desviar el tránsito y cortar las fuentes de electricidad.
- Si el escape de la tubería esta ardiendo, trate de prevenir la propagación del fuego pero no trate de extinguirlo. Los productos del petróleo en combustión no explotan. Si se extingue el fuego, puede haber una acumulación de gas o vapor y estos pueden explotar si un fuego secundario causara su combustión.
- Comuníquese con la compañía operadora de la tubería lo antes posible. Los marcadores de las tuberías muestran el nombre de la compañía, el teléfono de emergencia, y el contenido de la tubería.

What To Do In A Pipeline Emergency

- Immediately leave the area – on foot – in an upwind direction.
- Avoid making contact with escaping vapors.
- Avoid potential ignition sources.
- Turn off and abandon all equipment being used in the area.
- DO NOT light a match, start an engine or automobile, use a telephone, or switch on/off an electric light or appliance, or use a cell phone.
- Warn others to stay away from the area.
- DO NOT try to operate any pipeline valves yourself.
- From a distant phone, call the City of Las Cruces emergency number 526-0500 and call 911 or your local fire, police, or sheriff's office.

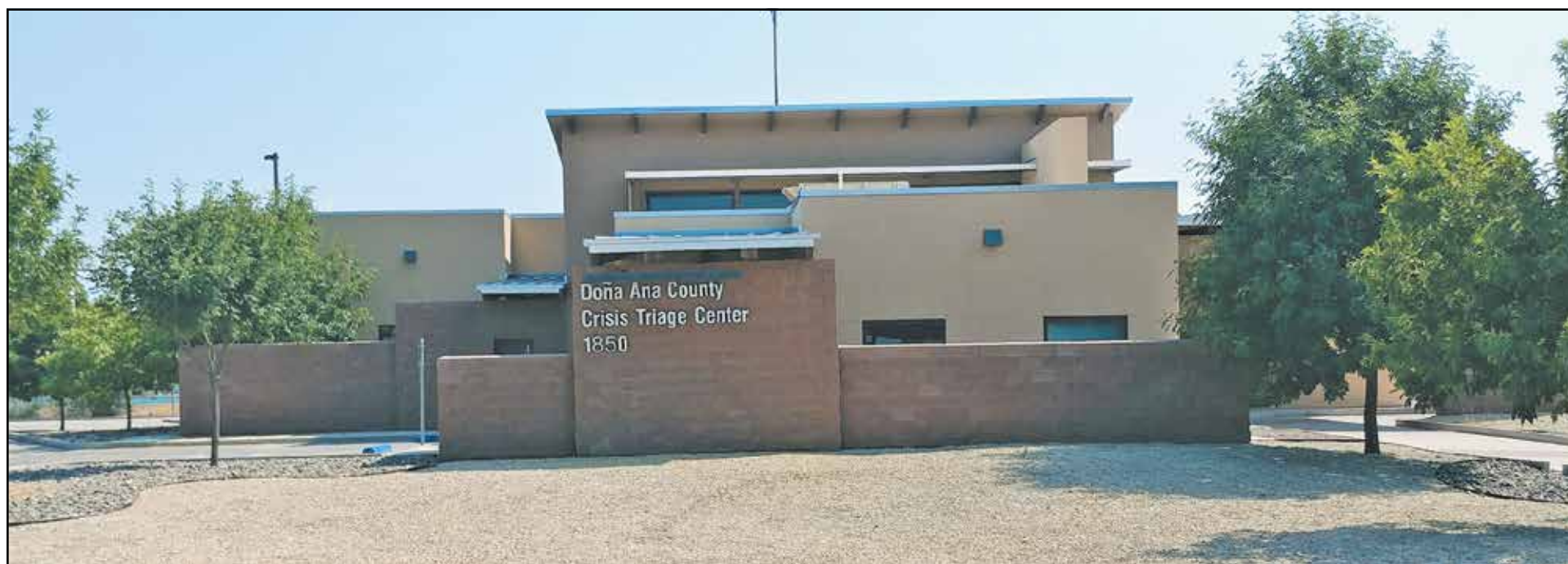

Opening Crisis Triage Center means closing a long-standing gap in services

The Doña Ana County Crisis Triage Center (CTC) is not a hospital or a jail. As the name implies, the CTC will be a place where people in crisis can go to find guest recliners and client rooms instead of hospital beds or jail cells.

Visitors will be called guests (as suggested by National Alliance on Mental Illness board member Micah Pearson of Las Cruces) rather than patients or inmates.

County Manager Fernando Macias and Health and Human Services Department Director Jaime Michael lauded the county commission for its August vote to hire Recovery Innovations International (RI) to license and operate the CTC, which has stood

vacant since construction was completed in 2013.

RI, a Phoenix-based nonprofit, offers behavioral health services in crisis, health, recovery and consulting, according to <https://riinternational.com/>. RI operates a dozen facilities across the country that are similar to the CTC, Macias said, and has “a history of getting these operations up off the ground.”

The commission’s vote “has allowed all this to happen,” said Michael, who also praised Macias for “the credibility he brings to this issue.”

“We finally had a county commission that made this call,” said Macias. The commission decided to “stop talking and make the hard decision,” he said.

Macias said opening the CTC will be “life chang-

ing” and “life-saving.”

A former Doña Ana County commissioner, state senator and district court judge who is in his second stint as county manager, Macias said the absence of a triage center “gnaws at me. I’ve seen the consequences of not having the right services available.”

Macias and Michael said county staff, behavioral health advocates and people with what Michael calls “lived experience,” have also been vital to the collaboration that will make the CTC’s opening within the next few months possible.

Macias said important changes have taken place in the past 18 months that allow the county to move forward with opening the CTC, including the state’s licensing process for the facility and allowing the

use of federal Medicaid dollars to pay for CTC services.

Without the changes, Macias said, the county could not have operated the facility in a fiscally sustainable way. The county’s cost to run the CTC, previously estimated at \$1.4 million annually, will be \$263,500 for the 10 months of the first year of its contract with RI, he said.

Macias said the application to license the facility was expected to be filed by Aug. 31, which was the timeframe RI had initially outlined.

Some who come to the CTC will need immediate basic services like a meal (from the kitchen at the nearby county Detention Center), a shower or a place to wash clothes. Or, he or she may need a quiet place to sit, Michael said.

Macias and Michael said the average stay at facilities like the CTC is five-seven hours. A guest will be able to stay a maximum of 23 hours, but can’t remain overnight. The CTC will open initially for 16-hour days and then expand to 24-7 service, Michael said.

She said RI’s study of local needs indicates that a “12-recliner” capacity for the CTC will be ade-

quate for the local population. The center will serve more than 12 people at one time, Macias said, because not all the guests will have the same level of crisis.

The staff hired at the CTC will include local residents and peer support, according to the RI contract, and will be “reflective of our community,” Michael said, so that “people of every color feel welcome here.”

Assisted living facilities opening to visits

Doña Ana County is one of 25 counties in the state in which long-term care facilities are being allowed to expand COVID-safe visitation options. Eight counties remain ineligible based on COVID-19 positivity rates.

The new guidelines announced by the New

Mexico Department of Health (NMDOH) allow once-monthly, by-appointment, open-window visits or visits using a plexiglass barrier between a single family member and a COVID-negative resident. During the visit, all participants will be masked unless the resident has a medical condition that prohibits masking, in which case 12-foot dis-

tancing will be enforced. Facilities can also create outdoor visitation stations.

Long-term care facilities have been instructed by the NMDOH to ensure visitation spaces are thoroughly cleaned before and after use.

For the safety of residents and visitors, visitation will be discontinued if there is a new positive

or an outbreak within a facility. These new visitation options can resume once the facility has gone two weeks without a new positive and if the county meets eligibility criteria. Visitation guidelines could change based on the positivity rate of the county.

Eligibility criteria for the counties as well as the guidelines will be posted

at cv.nmhealth.org at the end of every month.

Closed-window, virtual and telephonic visitation may continue and is encouraged. Compassionate-care visits for residents at end-of-life and those with declining health are also still permitted. All screening measures must be maintained, and the state's operative emergency public health order

remains in effect in all settings. No staff member or visitor who is sick or feeling unwell should be allowed in the facility or participate in visitations.

Three Las Cruces schools receive national Special Olympics recognition

Mayfield High School, Picacho Middle School, Sierra Middle School and Valley View Elementary — all Special Olympics Unified Champion Schools (SOUCS) within Las Cruces Public Schools — are receiving national banner recognition for their efforts to provide inclusive sports and activities for students with and without disabilities.

The schools are receiving this honor as a result of meeting national standards of excellence in the areas of inclusion, advocacy and respect, Special Olympics New Mexico (SONM) announced in a



news release.

Mayfield, Picacho, Sierra and Valley View will be among a select number of schools to receive the recognition. Each school will receive a banner and will be included on a national list of schools that have achieved this distinguished status. This is the third year of recognition for Picacho and Sierra, the second year for Valley View and the first

for Mayfield.

“Going into these schools, you see a definite difference in their attitudes about inclusion compared to when they started,” SONM Program Manager for SOUCS Rebecca Whitlock said in the news release. “In all of these schools, inclusion and disability acceptance is just part of the culture now.”

SOUCS is a strategy that intentionally promotes meaningful social inclusion by bringing together students with and without intellectual disabilities to create accepting school environments in all grade levels. About 40 schools are participating in SOUCS program-

ming in New Mexico, as part of more than 7,500 schools across the country engaged in the program. SOUCS aims to expand to 10,000 schools by the end of the 2023-24 school year.

The SOUCS model is supported by the U.S. Department of Education’s Office of Special Education. This model has been proven, through research, to be an effective and replicable means of providing students with and without disabilities the opportunity to form positive social relationships and promote a socially inclusive school climate, the news release said.

In an evaluation con-

ducted by the Center for Social Development and Education at the University of Massachusetts, Boston, 94 percent of teachers/school staff said SOUCS increases opportunities for students with and without intellectual disabilities to work together, 98 percent

of involved teachers believe participation in the program has increased the confidence of students with disabilities and 92 percent credit SOUCS with reducing bullying, teasing and offensive language, the news release said.

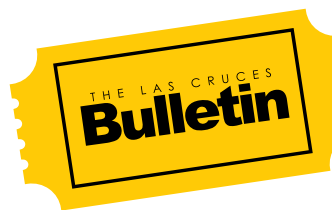

Downtown Las Cruces: A destination for determination

For those who have taken a recent evening drive down Main Street, the energy and atmosphere cannot go unnoticed. The New Mexican flag flying in front of Organ Mountain Outfitters, the doors of Dwell Yoga open wide after a class, the racks of books on the sidewalk in front of COAS, the beautifully decorated windows of Mew & Co., the patios full of diners at the Bone Yard Cantina, Little Toad Creek, and the Amador project, all whisper the “new normal” isn’t so different from the old. But underneath the surface of the active downtown, lies an iceberg of determination, resilience, community strength, hard work, and creative and collaborative problem solving.

Not only on Main Street, but also

district-wide, the small businesses of downtown quickly adapted and pivoted to what seemed like an impossible set of circumstances. Beck’s Coffee returned to their roots of bagged coffee delivery, Life in Balance Studio posted their Pilates classes on YouTube, woman-owned maker’s spaces Sol Y Luna and Mew & Co. teamed up with other woman-owned business to create at-home crafting and learning nights on Instagram, and countless other businesses changed their hours, business models, and means of delivering goods and services safely to customers.

When asked about her COVID-19 strategy, Teresa Dahl-Bredine, owner of Little Toad Creek stated, “We feel very fortunate to pivot quickly and get our lovely back

patio open and start canning our beers and ready to drink cocktails.” Little Toad Creek, like other downtown breweries and restaurants have expanded their patios to accommodate more diners, in addition to their expanded to-go and curbside offerings. Retail, too, has emerged more resilient on the other side of quarantine, Patricia Gamez Torres, owner of Sol Y Luna summed up a district-wide attitude: “these tough times have made us stronger,” she said.

After a summer spent planning and preparing, New Mexico State University welcomed more than 1,900 resident students, thousands more commuter and online students, our outstanding faculty, and a limited support workforce back to the university last week for the start of the Fall 2020 semester. Every fall, our university brings thousands of new residents to the Las Cruces community, where they contribute to our local economy and become involved with organizations and programs. Many of our students find their long-term home here in our city, joining our

workforce and raising their families here.

Our campus community and our city have always been closely connected, and our efforts to reduce the spread of COVID-19 are intertwined. The city of Las Cruces, the Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce and NMSU share the same goal: to keep ourselves, each other and our shared community as healthy and safe as possible during this crisis.

The leaders of our university and our city are in frequent communication on these efforts, sharing

information and ideas that benefit both organizations. We continue to explore opportunities to share innovations our researchers are developing in the areas of contact tracing, wastewater testing and increasing the COVID-19 test processing capacity for our region.

Our city created the Las Cruces Safe Promise, which asks residents to commit to showing we care about our community by remembering the actions we must take to reduce the spread, such as behaving as though we are carrying the virus,

wearing a mask in public, maintaining appropriate distance from one another, and washing our hands frequently. Importantly, it also asks that we practice compassion, empathy and respect for one another, and continue to patronize local business that are also following these guidelines.

Similarly, NMSU created our Crimson Safety Commitment, an education and training program that everyone on campus - not just students - is required to take, so we are all aware of how we can help protect our community from COVID-19. We've established new rules on campus that everyone is expected to follow, and these mirror the actions outlined in the Las Cru-

ces Safe Promise.

As NMSU's Chief COVID-19 Officer, I signed the Las Cruces Safe Promise, and I'm asking our campus community to do the same. While we're confident the majority of our students will continue to behave responsibly both on and off campus, we commit to work with you, our business and community partners, to ensure our students are complying with public health orders, meeting the expectations that we've set for them and ourselves, and respecting the guidelines you have in place for your businesses.

We're all members of the greater community, and it takes the participation and commitment of everyone to reduce the risk of COVID-19 to

Las Cruces and our local economy. Celebrating the 75th anniversary of WSMR

During the past 75 years, White Sands Missile Range has earned a reputation as a secret military installation with thousands of missile launches and weapons tests that we rarely hear about. But here is another secret -- living amongst us in Las Cruces are THOUSANDS of current and retired missile range employees. They rent apartments, buy homes, raise families, send their kids to school here, family members work in our businesses, teach in our schools, they volunteer in dozens of organizations and have served in the community as city councilors and mayors. These well-paid employees have helped make Las Cruces into the modern city it is today.

Known at first as White Sands Proving Ground, it was established on paper on July 9, 1945. Following almost three months of hectic construction, the

commanding officer, Lt. Col. Harold Turner, christened the facility with the first flag raising at noon on Sept. 29. The public was invited to attend and Las Cruces residents got their first look at what would eventually become one of the leading military test ranges in the world.

The very next month, WAC Corporal rockets made by the Jet Propulsion Laboratory in California were being fired and U.S. Highway 70 was being blocked for the first time. Suddenly we could send weather instruments straight up over 40 miles. German V-2 rock-

ets followed in the spring 1946 and mankind was able to touch the edges of space with payloads reaching 100 miles.

Simultaneously, defensive weapon systems began testing at White Sands. Most of the missiles developed at the range were never used in conflict but they gave our country the technological edge needed in the long Cold War. The Nike Ajax and Nike Hercules anti-aircraft missiles were tested and perfected at White Sands in the 1950s and 60s. They were then deployed to protect cities and bases all over Amer-

ica giving us a solid deterrent to Soviet aggression.

When LTC Turner commanded White Sands, the workforce was a few hundred soldiers. It quickly became apparent that more personnel were needed in the sciences, engineering, math and other specialties. In the 1950s and 60s, the workforce quickly evolved and added the required civilians and contractors. By 1961 the White Sands workforce totaled over 11,000 people. The breakdown was: 4,100 military, 5,100 civilians and 2,200 contractors. Today, the workforce is almost totally civilian gov-

ernment employees and contractor employees.

Initially most employees were fairly evenly split between Las Cruces and El Paso. In the past few decades that distribution has shifted in favor of the Las Cruces area with more than half living in the Mesilla Valley. It is impossible to estimate the exact economic impact White Sands has had on Las Cruces, but just looking at salaries and contracts, the total over the past 75 years must be in the hundreds of millions of dollars.

Although White Sands is a "missile range," the

longest-running program has been the non-stop work of space exploration. In the 1960s White Sands supported NASA's manned space programs and has continued to do so through all of the space shuttle missions to the tests being conducted today on the next American space launch vehicles. On March 30, 1982, the space shuttle Columbia landed on White Sands after traveling 3.3 million miles during its mission. And just last year, in December, Boeing's Starliner spacecraft landed at White Sands after its attempt to rendezvous with the International Space Station.

The people who have worked at White Sands Missile Range have made tremendous contributions to our country's defense and in discovering what is above the thin layer of atmosphere we call home. Just as importantly, they and their families are now a rock-solid, constructive part of our community.

Ozzy Osbourne lives a life off the rails in A&E 'Biography'

on tap

In doing a profile of his rock star father, Jack Osbourne wanted at all costs to avoid doing a fluff piece.

No, in "Biography: The Nine Lives of Ozzy Osbourne," premiering Monday, Sept. 7, on A&E Network, the focus is on the many ups and downs in the life and career of the self-proclaimed Prince of Darkness, from his rise to superstardom with Black Sabbath and his own solo work, to his many bouts with substance abuse and addiction, brushes with the law and health scares.

Along the way, archival footage and interviews with those who knew him best, including family, friends, bandmates and others, paint a picture of a decent man beset by personal demons, who has lived a lifetime of experiences many times over.

Jack Osbourne, an executive producer on the film, had no trouble getting his father on board for another profile after they did 2011's "God Bless Ozzy Osbourne." But he says the real person who needed convincing was his mother, Sharon, who is also an executive producer here with her husband.

"Her only comment was, 'Don't make it this easy for him to watch Let's get honest,'" he explains. "And that's kind of what we set out to do, is like we didn't want to just have a giant Ozzy Osbourne wankfest. We've all seen those. ... And so we decided like, 'Let's get really brutally honest and talk about his many faults as well as his many amazing attributes.'"

Ozzy is quite candid himself in talking about his life's low points, which included getting fired from Black Sabbath as his addiction spiraled out of control in the late '70s, the death of his guitarist Randy Rhoads, his arrest at the Alamo for public urination, the infamous dove and bat incidents (and subsequent rabies shots) and his attempted murder of his wife while in a drug- and alcohol-induced haze in 1989.

But to Jack, that was Ozzy Osbourne, rock star, not the man he grew up with and saw as a loving father and "dude on the couch," as he says in the film, when he wasn't out on the road.

"If I'm totally honest, I think the person I grew up with is more John Osbourne than Ozzy Osbourne," he says, referring to his father's birth name. "Ozzy Osbourne is the man onstage for two hours and doing interviews here and there. And John Osbourne is kind of relatively shy and keeps to himself and does his artwork and likes watching World War II documentaries and likes hanging out with Pomeranians."

Ultimately, Jack Osbourne wanted to put a human face to the man behind the persona and show him as he sees him.

"My dad's story I think is remarkable and he's a genuinely unique person," he says. "You know, he's really not like anyone else for better or for worse, and I think there are so many components of my dad's life that people will be able to relate to."

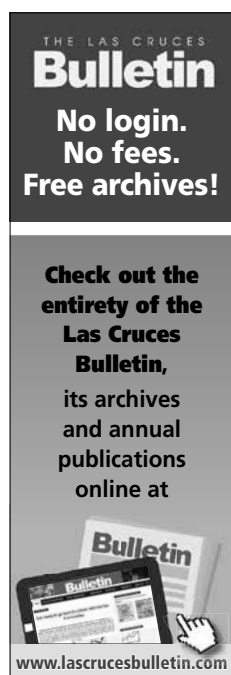

Laughter is the best medicine, and Dr. Stichter makes house calls

Las Cruces is a long way from Burbank, but what Johnny Carson and Jay Leno did for national TV, local host Sam Stichter is working to do for viewers here.

Stichter said the show has built an audience of about 25,000 viewers since debuting April 18. He agreed to answer some questions about it.

Bulletin: What was the motivation to start the show?

Stichter: My producer, Chris Soular, who is also the owner and operator of the Las Cruces Channel, was looking to do a uniquely local late-night TV show using a "Tonight Show" style format that features an opening monologue, interviews with guests on the couch and entertainment segments on each show, including local musicians/bands, magicians and artists.

Bulletin: When did the show start, and how do you keep it going?

Stichter: The first show aired Saturday, April 18. We keep it going by building awareness of the show on Facebook, Twitter, YouTube, Comcast/Xfinity Channel 98 and by word of mouth. Each show has grown in viewership. Our Aug. 15, 2020 was our most-viewed show with more than 25,000 viewers!

Bulletin: Who has been, in your opinion, the best guest you've had on so far, and why?

Stichter: While all our guests have been great, I truly enjoyed having country singer Frank Ray on the show. He was very willing to do an interview segment, sing several songs and even participate in a "skit" that featured him singing a song. Just an all-around nice guy who, although he's had some major success in the country music industry, is still very humble and wants to entertain the people of Las Cruces.

Bulletin: Who would you like to have on who has not agreed?

Stichter: While most everyone we have contacted has agreed to be on the show, we are still working on getting former WBA Light Middle Weight Champion boxer Austin "No Doubt" Trout. We are hoping to have him on the show to promote his next fight. We would also like

to have Las Cruces country singer Bri Bagwell on the show.

Bulletin: What are your criteria when choosing your guests?

Stichter: We look for a variety of people. Some are known in the Las Cruces area as entertainers, politicians, business owners, etc. Some are people who have a great story or an interesting profession. Our main criteria is that when viewers tune into the show, they will be entertained by the guests on the show.

Bulletin: What's your job history?

Stichter: From 1993 - 2002, I hosted a TV show in Reading, Pennsylvania (my original hometown), called "Community Calendar." It featured local guests from the city and county who were promoting events that were coming into the area, such as the Shriner's Circus, sporting events, fairs and carnivals, etc. In 2000, I received my certification in

education. I taught for two years in Reading, Pennsylvania, as an elementary school teacher while continuing to host my TV show. In 2004, I moved to Las Cruces to teach at Las Cruces Public Schools. Today, I'm a computer science teacher at Lynn Middle School. I received my Ph.D. in curriculum and instruction from NMSU in 2019. I have taught at NMSU in the past as an adjunct instructor.

Bulletin: What are some typical questions you ask your guests?

Stichter: Some typical questions include: What is your connection to Las Cruces? Were you born in Las Cruces? How long have you been (acting, singing, performing, etc.)? When and where are you going to performing next? What got you into (politics, magic, business, etc.)? Where are some of the places you (worked, performed, visited, etc.)? What is your motivation?

Bulletin: What's the craziest thing that's happened on the show since it started airing?

Stichter: When we first started planning the show in February, the plan was for me to have a sidekick. Then COVID-19 hit and we realized that we couldn't have somebody on the show next to me due to social-distancing protocols. As we were getting ready to air our first show in April, everyone in the community was rushing to the stores to get toilet paper, hand sanitizer, etc. I decided that I was going to bring a roll of toilet paper on the show with me as a joke. My wife, Bonnie, said, in reference to the toilet paper, "Is that your sidekick?" I grabbed a Sharpie and drew a "happy face" on the side of the roll of toilet paper and gave him the name Scott. "Scott" now appears with me on every show and the guests often talk to him.

Bulletin: What platforms and/or cable providers do people need to watch the show?

Stichter: Facebook, Twitter, YouTube (Search for Las Cruces Channel). Also on Comcast/Xfinity Channel 98. New shows air Saturday nights at 9 p.m.

Bulletin: What are your top three goals in doing the show?

Stichter: To continue to feature the "movers and shakers" of Las Cruces on each show, to offer a variety of entertainment segments each week (avoid being stale and predictable) and to entertain the great people of Las Cruces during a time that entertainment choices in the area are extremely limited.

Bulletin: What else should our readers know?

Stichter: I write my own opening monologue, including my own jokes, which can be very challenging, and all of the interview questions. I sometimes ad-lib based on the guests and their reactions to certain questions. I have been asked to sing along with guests and dance, I give it my best, but I don't do either well. My students at Lynn Middle School think it's pretty cool when I show them clips from the show.

Historic hearse delivered to Farm & Ranch Museum

The New Mexico Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum (NMFRHM) is the new — and perhaps final — home of a historic hearse that was used in Las Cruces from 1894-1912.

The horse-drawn wagon is known by many as “the Pat Garrett hearse” or “Pat Garrett’s Last Ride,” because it likely delivered the famous lawman to his Las Cruces grave in 1908.

The late local historian Cal Traylor purchased the hearse from a museum in Piños Altos and donated it to the Doña Ana County Sheriff’s Department Historical Museum of Lawmen in 2012. At the direction of Sheriff Kim Stewart, the small museum has closed, and its artifacts have been dispersed to various agencies for preservation. The Sheriff’s Department delivered the hearse to NMFRHM Wednesday, Aug. 26.

NMFRHM, which is temporarily closed due

to the COVID-19 pandemic, is well equipped to preserve the artifact and showcase it to the public, adding it to the museum’s large collection of wagons, carriages and buggies.

“We are happy to have it as part of our collection,”

said NMFRHM Curator of Collections Holly Radke.

Garrett was probably one of many prominent Las Cruces that the hearse carried. Garrett, best known for killing Billy the Kid in 1881 when he was sheriff of Lincoln County, later became

sheriff of Doña Ana County. He was shot to death east of Las Cruces in 1908.

According to NMFRHM Curator of History Leah Tookey, the women’s Improvement Association (WIA) of Las Cruces purchased the wagon

in 1894. When the WIA was still in its infancy, members decided there should be a more dignified way of conveying the recently departed to their final resting places (previously an ice wagon was used for this task), so they purchased an old horse-drawn wagon they found on a ranch near Las Cruces.

It was painted gray and the cab had been removed. Chickens were roosting in the cargo bed. The ladies of the WIA had the hearse shipped by rail into the city where it was restored by Jack Fountain.

The hearse could be rented for use by anyone who lived in Las Cruces for the price of \$10, \$5 of which went to the local livery stable to pay for the horse, driver, feed, etc. There is no doubt that many famous Las Cruces residents took their final rides in the hearse, as it was the only one available until 1912 when Thomas Graham purchased a new horseless hearse for use at his funeral home.

Later, the hearse was purchased by the Amador

family and even later a rancher named Ollie Isaacks. He took the cab off the wagon again and used it as a farm wagon during World War II when gasoline was expensive and hard to get.

Later Bob Stepp bought the wagon and intended to put it in his museum of southwestern New Mexico history. When Stepp’s plans for a museum fell through, he sold the wagon to Frank Tatsch, who put the hearse back together, reinstalled the glass windows, velvet curtains and decorative corner posts and replaced the rubber that covered the steel-rimmed wheels. NMFRHM, 4100 Dripping Springs Road in Las Cruces, preserves and tells the story of 4,000 years of growing food in this region. Its mission not only includes farming and ranching, but also rural life. The Museum is part of the New Mexico Department of Cultural Affairs.

"Dineh", the iconic Native American sculpture created by artist Peter Wolf Toth and located in Apodaca Park on the corner of Main Street and Madrid Avenue, received its annual preservation treatment Aug. 26, just in time for its 34th birthday, the City of Las Cruces Parks and Recreation Department reported in a news release. "Each year, park staff clean, stain and seal the monumental landmark with a protective wood coating to protect it from the desert sun and weathering," the news release said. "The wooden sculpture was carved from a pine log as one of 67 monuments in his series of "Trail of the Whispering Giants" and was dedicated Aug. 23, 1986. Dineh, which means "human beings" in Navajo and Apache, is the 57th statue made by Toth and honors Native Americans of New Mexico. 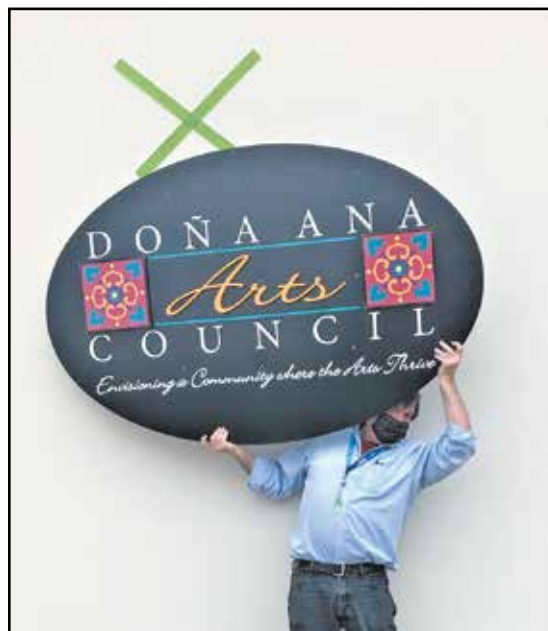

Recipe for a Lush Life: jazz band comes together

After performing in area rock group 91 Proof, George Jacobs (bass) and Eugene Sartor (guitar) decided they wanted to return to their jazz roots and start another group.

“Gene and I actually are in a rock band together although we both are primarily jazz play-

ers,” Jacobs said. “We always wanted to start a little jazz thing. So right around the holidays last year, we had some down time with the rock band and thought we would put out some feelers and started trying out some singers.”

So, Jacobs and Sartor, thinking they would form a trio, posted their need for a jazz singer on

Craig’s List. In Los Angeles, Danika Toscano found the ad. The life-long California resident was thinking about moving to Las Cruces to join her boyfriend after a 10-month, long-distance relationship and was checking the city out.

“We tried out a lot of people,” Jacobs said. “[Toscano] was the first who actually knew a lot of the songs. These were really popular jazz songs. As far as familiarity with the genre, she was definitely right on it.”

“I really wanted to get out and see what else is out in life,” Toscano said. “When I was a little girl, I really loved jazz.”

She said her father would see her listening to music and say, “Are you ok, Dani?” and she would say, “Yes.”

“You’re just over here listening to that suicide music,” her dad said.

“Because it’s very sad,” Toscano said. “I told him, ‘no’ and ‘I love it,’ but I always knew that jazz was just like a part of me. Whenever I would sing on my own or I would improvise, I always naturally used jazz progressions. I was just born that way. The way that my mind wants to put the notes, that’s in jazz progressions.”

Toscano was trained in school with choir and was reading music since a second grade. In junior high and high school, she was in band for five years, playing several different instruments, including clarinet.

Naming some of her favorites, she said she loves to sing Frank Sina-

tra tunes because she can hear him as she sings.

“So, we do ‘Fly me to the Moon,’ because it’s just one of those things which I listen to a lot — the Frank Sinatra version,” she said. “‘Black Coffee’ I think is my favorite, just because I have a personal connection with it. It’s a song I enjoyed singing as karaoke back home. By Sara Vaughn, it’s actually a blues song but we do it in a jazz way.”

The group began practicing as a trio — guitar, bass and vocals — but a couple of things started happening, Jacobs said.

“Dani has a penchant for slow tempos and when a tempo gets slow and you don’t have a percussionist, it gets really challenging,” he said. “Especially for the bass, but also for

the guitarist to keep the dynamism there. But the conception was, we don’t want to be a loud band.”

They needed a drummer but not a full drum set, not only because they didn’t want to be a loud band, but also because many possible local venues simply did not have the room for full drums.

“We thought if we can bring in a hand percussionist, it will keep with mellow nature of what we are doing and keep the volume down,” Jacobs said.

So, they found Johnny Aviña for hand percussion, and he fills in the percussion gaps with mastery and a solo here and there. He also plays guitar and ukulele as needed.

Farm & Ranch takes education to the children

As part of the New Mexico Department of Cultural Affairs (DCA) Camp-in-a-Box program, two educators at the New Mexico Farm & Ranch Heritage Museum in Las Cruces created and distributed 800 summer camp kits, including more than 600 locally, the museum said in a news release.

While temporarily closed to the public, the museums, historic sites and cultural institutions of DCA brought their resources and activities to

homes and schools around the state this summer.

Museum educators LuAnn Kilday and Michaela McBurrows created an "All About Sheep" kit of information and activities, and a "Desert Flora" kit. Booker T. Washington Community School and Doña Ana Elementary School were the local schools to request and receive the kits.

The Desert Flora kit included worksheets on plant structures, ways plants adapt in this region and how we use them. There were also many interactive activity sheets

such as a crossword, an outdoor activity where students are encouraged to observe native desert flora and a cactus craft activity. The All About Sheep kits featured a wool felting activity with supplies as well as sheep cut-out activity.

In June, the educators also conducted online camps for kids, featuring a weaving activity, nature photography and story time book readings.

Wanting another soloist, Jacobs said a saxophone would be a common jazz choice, but the sax is a naturally loud instrument.

"In a trumpet you have more dynamic control," he said. "I used to play low brass, and there is a reedy edge to a sax that mellows out in a brass instrument, which segues in nicely to what we are trying to do."

One day in passing, Jacobs asked a woman at his bank if she knew any trumpet players, and she said, "As a matter of fact I do."

Las Cruces native Michael Martinez is a Mayfield High School graduate with a music degree from New Mexico

State University.

"I used to do jam sessions at Mom's Coffee every Tuesday," Martinez said. "I had to learn

how to play the trumpet a lot quieter because it's such a small place. Once a month sitting this far away from the audience, I

don't want to give them a haircut, so I had to learn how to play quietly."

"He is extremely talented," Toscano said. "As

far as switching through the notes and the amount of pressure that he has to put through the instrument, he can get all the different note changes going on off of one slow stream of steady air. It sounds beautiful. If I had known it could be played like that, I would have chosen the trumpet over the clarinet."

The quintet, called Lush Life, officially started playing local venues in July.

"It has been really nice how everything trickled in," Toscano said. "It was a natural, organic way for somebody to join the band. It's been one of the things that kept me in here."

"We get along really well," Toscano said. "Musically we are attuned to each other, and it's just really enjoyable. There is

an absence of a lot of the usual band drama, and it's really cool."

In addition to jazz standards, Jacobs said, "We throw in some curve balls. We have taken some songs, like blues tunes and a Spanish rock classic, and turned them into jazz."

They have also been getting out, playing at outdoor venues and are well received. He said they have been welcomed by audiences who have been craving opportunities to get out and do something.

Canine companions, like Jeeves, add richness to everyday life

Our sweet little dog, Jeeves, died at home recently after a five-week bout with incurable cancer and heart disease. He responded well to the treatment we gave to make him comfortable. He was lively and upbeat until the end. My wife, so special, scoured a lot of web sites on various treatments for canine cancer, and we dosed him daily with a cocktail based on her research and with medicines prescribed by our wonderful veterinarian.

In the end, Jeeves died under the dining room table, one of his favorite

hangouts in the house.

We think he came out of another favorite place to say goodbye because he knew the end was near. That would have been consistent with his personality.

We discovered that he had left

us when we were going to give him supper. Between greeting us and leaving us was no more than half an hour. His brave heart gave out and he simply slipped away. Quietly. Peacefully. Painlessly. Near his family. We could not have asked for a better end, despite the overwhelming and sudden sadness it

brought.

Jeeves was a fluffy Corgi. He had all the mannerisms of a Corgi, but he also had long hair and a swell tail in his prime and he probably had some Sheltie in him. We got him as a rescue when he was four, and our fourth Keshond, Annie, had just died.

“Rescue” is the wrong word, really, because he was a loved dog before we got him, and his previous owner only gave him up on a technicality. We remained in contact with his original owner until the end. Jeeves was with us almost nine years.

All dogs are unique, but Jeeves was special. That’s not just my own

take; many people commented on his special nature. Jeeves was boundlessly happy and welcoming whenever you came home. Didn’t matter if you were gone five minutes or five weeks, you would be treated to a lavish welcome when you returned home.

He was always overjoyed to see his friends among the visitors both domestic and commercial to our house. After one visit you were a fast friend. In his last weeks, some of those friends made a special trip to visit him. We’re grateful.

In a world that is so often uncaring and in which you easily feel out

of sorts or out of place, our pets shower us with unconditional love and offer us at least a portion of the stability we need. If only all people were as kind and giving and loving as our animals, we would be in a better place. Indeed, the world would be a better place.

A few friends, one a priest and one a monk, refer to their dogs as their spiritual directors. They teach you to pay attention to what’s right in front of you, to smell the roses. They lead you on a straight path, forging a trail when you walk with them. They are mentors who teach you to approach things without rancor or

judgment: everything is capable of being appreciated. They also demonstrate loyalty, fidelity and a sense of community, since they are pack animals. They are quick to forgive your mistakes. Even if you should step on a tail, there is little feedback.

I won’t go as far as other friends who say they prefer the company of their dogs to that of people, but I see their point. Dogs are like God; they love you unconditionally, as did Jeeves.

Ethical foundations can help us navigate uncertainty

“They shall all sit under their own vines, and under their own fig trees, with none to make them afraid.”

This verse from Chapter 4 of the biblical book of Micah follows a familiar passage that also appears in the book of Isaiah: “They shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nature, nor shall they learn war anymore.”

Tanakh Study group

(Tanakh is an acronym for the three divisions of the Hebrew Scriptures: Torah, Prophets and Writings) is studying the book of Micah. This group has engaged in discussion of selected biblical

books for the last 12 years. Father Gabriel Rochelle of St. Anthony of the Desert Orthodox Christian Mission, and several of his members, along with Temple Beth-El congregants (including me), participate.

The famous passage from Micah about safety and security, often quoted by President George Washington in speeches and letters, followed chapters of pronouncements against the leadership and the people of the kingdom of Israel and the kingdom of Judah for failing to follow the right path in their behavior.

Judges took bribes, undermining the integrity of their decisions. Community prophets (other than Micah) said what the people wanted to hear. Priests, the religious leaders of the

time, offered service and instruction only if it led to personal gain.

Most societies face times when people lose their moral bearings, leaving them wondering if they can ever find their way back.

There are rituals of all types in which individuals might engage to facilitate their own return to where they want to be.

In my tradition, the Jewish New Year, Rosh Hashanah, and the Day of Atonement, Yom Kippur, bookend a 10-day period of introspection that can en-

able individuals and communities to reinforce the ethical foundation that has engendered compassion and continuity for generations.

Prayers of confession of wrongdoing, stated in the plural, remind worshippers that they are human, that they are not alone and that they can support each other in their attempts to do better in the future.

Those prayers are echoed in the saying of Rabbi Nachman of Bratslav: “All the world is a narrow bridge; what is most important is not to be

afraid.”

Our feelings of connection with family members, friends and neighbors are supposed to help us to overcome fear by creating partnerships based on mutual respect and understanding. The admission that we sometimes err in judgment and action necessarily instills humility in each of us. In a synagogue, at this time of year, that humility leads to empathy and patience towards others.

New Mexico State University's Arrowhead Center recently hosted a five-week virtual, cohort-based venture builder for New Mexico innovators in agriculture. The cohort's participants saw successes for their businesses which could go on to bolster the economic impact of different agricultural industries throughout the state.

"Over the five weeks, we saw an impressive amount of progress in the companies that participated," said Dana Catron, director of strategic operations at Arrowhead Center. "They were able to strategically analyze where they want to go with their business, and more importantly, identify what they were missing to move forward. Arrowhead Center was and will continue to be available to help fill those gaps."

Sponsored by the New Mexico Gas Company, an Emera Company, AgSprint allowed for customer discovery and product/service fit while providing structure, guidance, and access to resources. "The goal is to focus on the early stages of a product or service de-

velopment, before a business invests significant time and money," said Catron.

"Under the AgSprint program guidance, we have met with several hemp farm producers in Las Cruces," said Geoffrey P. Lewis, co-founder and CEO of HempNotics, LLC. "I am proud to announce that we have partnered with a local Las Cruces farmer and we are in the process of producing CBD-infused animal products for them. They also plan to wholesale purchase our CBD isolate once the extraction part of the business is in full operation."

During the spring, participants had access to:

- Pre-recorded curriculum, allowing them to learn at their pace and come to the class prepared for a group discussion.

- The Arrowhead Innovation Network (AIN) Enterprise Advisors (EA's), a network of experts in accounting, intellectual property, marketing, funding, strategy, among others.
- 1-on-1 assistance with Arrowhead staff on a weekly basis.
- Micro-grants to address immediate needs.
- Access to NMSU resources (e.g. introductions with faculty within the NMSU system).
- Up to \$25,000 in Amazon Web Service credits.

Curriculum includes topics like investigating product uniqueness, customers and competition, market fit, pivots and tailoring your product, funding and venture capital, the commercialization of technology, digital marketing and specific agricultural marketing.

Industry experts were also invited as speakers at each week's session. For the 2020 cohort, AgSprint hosted a representative from the New Mexico Department of Agriculture (NMDA) to talk about the USDA Small Business Innovation Research program; an expert in commercializing technology for the consumer goods sector; a representative from NMDA; an expert in Agricultural Business & Marketing; representatives of the New Mexico Bioscience Authority; an entrepreneur and expert in robotics and automation; and a venture capitalist focused on innovation in agriculture.

"At AgSprint's recommendation we met with Jeff Witte, director of NMDA; Brad Lewis, NMDA Agricultural and

or organization, leaders are at their best when they apply the depth of their wisdom to their service, and when they are able to recognize their missteps and offer repair and restoration.

Some leaders may be afraid to acknowledge when they chose a path that was unwise. In most cases, honesty and a sense of responsibility will allow them to demonstrate how personal improvement can model, on a larger scale, positive societal

change.

Change is something that we know all too well during these last few months. There may be fear, but there can also be compassion, support and generosity that can bolster a shared sense of optimism. May we truly unite in mind and heart, so that nothing will make us afraid.

Fed adopts policy that can help poor/minorities

The Fed has adopted changes to its policy, which might seem small but in fact have important implications for New Mexicans.

The Fed announced that it will no longer preemptively increase interest rates when unemployment falls, but will keep rates low until inflation picks up. Second, the Fed announced that the 2 percent inflation rate target is no longer a cap; instead, the Fed will seek to achieve an average 2 percent inflation rate. This means that inflation can climb above 2 percent for substantial periods of time before the Fed takes action.

Together, these two announcements mean that interest rates are likely to remain lower going forward than otherwise would have been expected. And it means that

inflation rates will also be higher, perhaps double the average of 1.4 percent we have experienced the last five years.

Economists have long assumed a trade-off between inflation and unemployment, a relationship referred

to as the Phillips Curve after A. W. Phillips, who first identified it. The idea is simple. Lower unemployment makes it harder for businesses to find workers, so wages go up. The higher wages are passed on to consumers as higher prices, causing inflation.

The Fed uses the Phillips Curve to help control inflation in that low unemployment has been interpreted as a signal of future inflation, triggering rate hikes to short circuit that inflation. But the implication of this policy is that unemployment is deliberately kept high to

keep wages in check.

The problem with this Fed's policy is that it has contributed to racial inequality. Unemployment rates among blacks and Hispanics are higher than among whites. During the second quarter that ended June 30, for example, the black unemployment rate was 16.1 percent, for Hispanics 16.7 percent. Among white workers, the unemployment rate was 12.0 percent. While these rates are elevated due to COVID, they make clear a persistent pattern of high unemployment among minorities.

Under the old policy, as the overall unemployment fell toward, say, 5 percent — implying a rate among blacks and Hispanics of near 10 percent and among whites of 3 percent — the old Fed policy would be to put the brakes on, to shift the policy focus from unemployment to inflation. Continuing high unemployment among minori-

ties was not a priority.

The irony of this is that inflation is primarily a rich person's problem. Inflation erodes the value of savings. Poor people don't have savings. This exacerbates the income inequality that has become a corrosive factor in U.S. society.

If you want to lift a person out of poverty, the best way is to give them a job. If you want to protect wealth, fight inflation. The old Fed policy favored wealth over the poor and minorities. The new policy flips that, focusing on jobs not inflation.

The effect of the Fed's new policy will be slow

and long term but the outcome, over decades, should be less poverty and to help lift people into the middle class. This will help minorities. Here in New Mexico, a low-income state that is minority majority, the impact should be positive.

NMSU researcher studies zinc transporters to help inhibit antibiotic-resistant bacteria

A 2019 CDC report estimates more 2.8 million cases of antibiotic resistant infections and 35,000 deaths happen in the U.S. every year. New Mexico State University professor Erik Yukl hopes his research into zinc transporter mechanisms may lead to novel antibiotics that can target resistant bacteria thanks to a grant of just under \$1.3 million from the National Institutes of Health (NIH).

"We are studying the structures of bacterial zinc transporter pro-

teins," said Yukl, an associate professor in NMSU's Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry. "This helps us determine how they function, and how

we can build molecules that will disrupt that function to treat bacterial infections. This is especially important as a number of bacteria have become resistant to all or nearly all currently available antibiotics."

In the human body, zinc is scarce. Bacteria need zinc to survive. They transport these essential metals across the cell membrane, and to do this they require protein transporters. If the zinc transport systems of disease-causing bacteria can be disrupted, they will no longer be able to establish an infection.

Yukl's NIH grant is a four-year ROI grant, among the most prized grants provided by the agency, since it supports virtually all costs associated with medically relevant research projects that are conducted over a 3-5 year timeframe.

"Since June 1, we've been back in the lab working in shifts of three," Yukl said. "This required that we submit a plan to the university detailing how we would be practicing social distancing, wearing face coverings and following enhanced decontamination procedures. Students

working with me in the lab this summer include a postdoc, three graduate students and one undergraduate. The undergrad is working on a summer project funded through an administrative supplement to the R01 grant."

Students working with Yukl on this research were grateful to be back in the lab this summer.

"I missed the thrill of doing experiments and thinking critically to find answers," said Ady Melendez Molina, a graduate student. "Being in the laboratory makes me happy because I learn from my advisor and

colleagues and use my energy for something beneficial."

Yukl and his team are working to find ways to use these zinc transporter inhibitors to create new antibiotics to stop resistant bacteria.

"We are also hopeful that we can make these antibiotics more specific, as most bacteria in the human body are helpful and have a dramatic impact on overall health," Yukl said. "The impact of such a development would be significant, given the large and increasing numbers antibiotic-resistant infections."

Exercise For Seniors Part 5

We're continuing this week to talk about exercise in the presence of chronic conditions. Again, remember that you should be sure to talk with your doctor about how your health condition might affect your ability to exercise.

Try some strengthening and balance exercises, too, to help avoid falls, which could cause a broken bone. Doing these exercises is good for bone health for people with osteoporosis and for those who want to prevent it.

Physical Activity and COPD (Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease)

The challenge with COPD is that you get short of breath with activity, and so the tendency is to reduce your level of activity. But with reduced activity, you become weaker and are less tolerant of activity. The right level of exercise will help you to slowly build your strength, so that you are more tolerant of activity in the presence of lung disease. For many people, it is difficult to manage the right level of exercise, so participating in a pulmonary rehabilitation program may be necessary. In such a program, you will learn some exercises to help your arms and legs get stronger while you develop your activity tolerance. If you're interested in pulmonary rehabilitation, speak to your physician. We have a pulmonary rehab program at Atrium Physical Therapy, and we're happy to help you with this.

Exercising with Type 2 Diabetes

For people with diabetes, exercise and physical activity can help manage the disease and help you stay healthy longer. Walking and other forms of daily exercise can help improve glucose levels in older people with diabetes. Set a goal to be more active most days of the week, and create a plan for being physically active that fits into your life and that you can follow. Your healthcare team can help.

Exercising with Osteoporosis

Weight-bearing exercises, which force you to work against gravity, such as walking, jogging, or dancing three to four times a week, are best for building muscle and strengthening bones.

Exercising with Chronic Pain

Most people living with chronic pain can exercise safely, and it can assist with pain management. In fact, being inactive can sometimes lead to a cycle of more pain and loss of function. Talk to your doctor or physical therapist about what exercises might be right for you. Each type of exercise—endurance, strength, balance, and flexibility—has its own benefits, so a combination may be best.



Exercise can help you maintain a healthy body weight, which may relieve knee, hip pain, or low back pain. Putting on extra weight can slow healing and make some pain worse. Remember to listen to your body when exercising and participating in physical activities. Avoid over-exercising on "good days." If you have pain, swelling, or inflammation in a specific joint area, you may need to focus on another area for a day or two. If something doesn't feel right or hurts, seek medical advice right away, and if chronic pain substantially limits your ability to exercise, you may need the assistance of a physical therapist to find the most appropriate exercise.

Are pro golfers driving the ball too far? Seems like it

In early February, just six weeks prior to the country's shut-down due to the COVID-19 pandemic, golf's major ruling entities reported a number of key findings from their ongoing Distance Insights Project (DIP).

The preliminary findings (now online) consist of 56 documents and thousands of pages of text. The potential for this endeavor to create monumental changes in the game of golf as we know it is huge, even though the

research is barely underway. Jack Nicklaus, who has preached for years that the ball goes too far, is ecstatic.

Driving distance has increased significantly in the past 30 years, particularly for pro golfers. That

translates to longer golf courses that are going to continue to get longer, making some obsolete. The United States Golf Association (USGA) has concluded that "golf will best thrive over the next decades and beyond if

this continuing cycle of ever-increasing hitting distances and golf course lengths is brought to an end."

To put the distance issue into perspective, the keepers of the game have been discussing distance for more than a century. From 1900 to 1930, elite golfers were driving the ball 220 to 260 yards. Heck, my late father made a hole-in-one in 1934 on a 250-yard hole at Lakeshore Country Club in Cleveland, Ohio, with his trusty Kroydon driver.

By 1995, the tour average driving distance was

263 yards. By 2003, it was 286 yards, and by the end of 2019 the 20 longest tour players averaged 310 yards.

Fast-forward: We're now seeing pros like Bryson DeChambeau, Dustin Johnson, Rory McIlroy, Tony Finau and Cameron Champ driving the ball up to 360 yards, sometimes setting up a nine iron for their second shots to the green on par-5 holes. It's getting ridiculous.

By comparison, in 2019, male golfers with a handicap higher than 20 (nearly half the players nation-

ally) had an average driving distance of 177 yards. Female golfers, similarly skilled, had an average of 141 yards. There is talk of changing golf club specs and rolling back the ball to a bygone era.

The fact remains that a distance rollback, especially involving balls and clubs, applied as a blanket restriction to everyone, would dramatically hurt the average short-hitting recreational golfer. The DIP report actually states that average players don't hit their drives long enough for the tees they are playing, and that, at

most courses, even the shortest tees are too long for the shortest hitters. Is the furor over distance an overreaction to what's happening in the pro ranks?

If, on the other hand, distance reducing measures were to be imposed to professional and elite golfers only, that would raise the even bigger controversy of bifurcation. Stay tuned.
