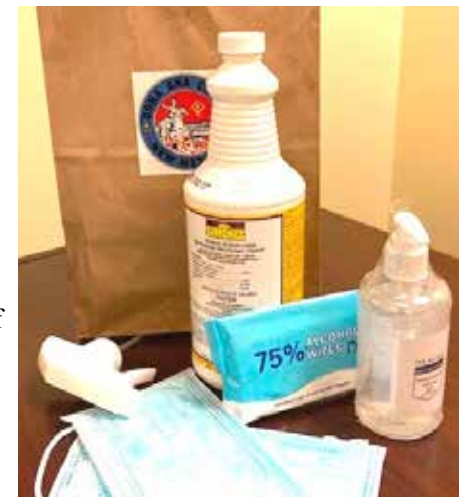

"We don't leave any veteran behind," said William "Bill" Garcia, commander of Disabled American Veterans (DAV) Chapter 10 – Mesilla Valley.

DAV Chapter 10 and Chapter 38 – Las Cruces, are joining the nationwide and international celebration of DAV's 100th birthday on Friday, Sept. 25.

"We take the city," Chapter 10 Adjutant Jerry Hernandez said, while Chapter 38 "has the outskirts."

The DAV helps local veterans get rides to medical appointments in Las Cruces and El Paso, file benefit claims and can

sometimes even provide financial assistance when a vet needs help paying a bill. The organization can also provide referrals to

a wide range of medical, behavioral and other services.

The local DAV chapters also participate in area



events, including parades. Chapter 10 members work with Las Colcheras Quilt Guild of Las Cruces to provide handmade quilts to veterans, fill and distribute holiday baskets and work closely with other local veterans' organizations like the VFW, the American Legion and Vietnam Veterans of America (VVA), said Hernandez, Bill Garcia and DAV Chapter 10 First Junior Vice President Tony Garcia.

The organization also conducts regular fund-

raisers to help veterans, and it supports the annual Bataan Death March at White Sands Missile Range, operating a watering station.

Hernandez is a veteran of the U.S. Navy and saw duty "all over the world," including the Panama Canal and the Gulf of

Tonkin. Hernandez served two years of active duty, along with four years in the Naval Reserve.

"In 1972, while I was aboard the USS Inchon LPH-12 serving outside Singapore, those ships that were in the immedi-

## BULLETIN REPORT

The Las Cruces Public Schools Board of Education voted unanimously at its Tuesday, Sept. 15, meeting to continue LCPD education exclusively online during the fall semester of the 2020-21 school year.

All five board members, President Terrie Dallman, Vice President Maria Flores and members Ray



Jaramillo, Teresa Tenorio and Carol Cooper, voted to continue remote education except for small groups of students who require in-person learn-

ing, LCPS said.

Before that vote, Tenorio had made a motion for LCPS to use a hybrid education model, but the motion failed for lack of a second.

Continuing with remote learning during the fall semester was the recommendation the board received from LCPS administration.

Oct. 23, at 5:30 p.m., Saturday, Oct. 24, at 9:30 a.m., Saturday, Oct. 24, at 1 p.m. and Monday, Nov. 2, at 5:30 p.m.

Pre-register at [elections@donaanacounty.org](mailto:elections@donaanacounty.org), and note that Bureau of Elections' staff will monitor attendance.

Election officials will receive training in opening and closing the polls, setting up voting equipment and issuing ballots. Information on safety precautions, the use of personal protective equipment and social distancing protocols will also be included in the training.

Back in March, change happened quickly for everyone. At Las Cruces Utilities (LCU), the exception was that the services the staff provides to residents – gas, water, and trash disposal – was an essential function to keep the city running. There were no plans to shut down, but there were plans to keep both staff and residents throughout the city safe.

“We needed to quickly wrap our minds around keeping the shifts going but trying to minimize the risks as much as possible,” said Ramiro Pereyra, LCU Gas systems inspection supervisor. “Most of our crews come together at the very beginning of the day when they clock in

and receive their assignments.”

LCU came in with different solutions for various areas that need to operate smoothly. Some crews shifted their times to come in at half hour intervals. Some, like the crew for Gas, came into work in their car or truck and went directly to their work truck, their office on wheels for the day.

“The supervisors are the only ones who would come into the building and plot

their assignments for their crew for the day,” Pereyra said. “We were able to minimize contact, but nothing changed on how we handled the work that we needed to do to keep gas flowing safely for residents.”

Interim LCU Director Delilah Walsh agreed, “We provide a continuation of services at all times.” She explained that they adjusted to embrace needed flexibility with staff

and with customers. “There was overtime and also for those staff who needed to quarantine, we managed to make it work with extraordinary leave and rescheduled others,” she said. Walsh explained that LCU for just March to June, spent \$43,000 for personal protective equipment and sanitation. “The safety of associates is key to the success of the entire utilities,” she said. “Their ability to be on call even in the most stressful of times shows the strength of our entire department.”

# Lots of ways to make your voice heard

Wednesday, Sept. 30, is the deadline for two pretty cool things.

First and foremost, it's the deadline for filling out the census. President Trump, the Census Bureau and Congress have volleyed the deadline back and forth since April, when Trump agreed with the Census Bureau that Congress needed to give an extension of at least 120 days to the original July 31 deadline.

"They have to give it," Trump said of a Congressional extension in light of the coronavirus. "I think 120 days isn't nearly enough."

However, Congress has still not given an extension. The administration came up with an Oct. 31 extension, and then rescinded

that, revising it to the Sept. 30 deadline. And, of course, there are two federal lawsuits against the administration regarding moving the deadline up again.

It is all so very 2020.

However, everyone should adhere to the Sept. 30 deadline, especially when it only takes a few minutes at [www.census.gov](http://www.census.gov) to fill it out.

We in New Mexico need to have everyone who lives here fill out the form. Every decade, we fall short of our anticipated numbers, which costs our already struggling state millions of dollars. Billions of dollars if you add up what can be lost over a decade.

An undercount in New Mexico means lost money for many im-

portant services, disproportionately affecting people in the rural areas of the state, and others already disadvantaged.

Even if you've already filled yours out, make sure your friends, family and neighbors get theirs done as well. When I did mine, back in the spring, it took me less than five minutes.

So, get that census done.

**BULLETIN'S BEST**

Sept. 30 is also the deadline to nominate candidates in Bulletin's Best, the Las Cruces Bulletin's contest to claim the best in more than 300 categories.

The negative consequences of nonparticipation in Bulletin's Best are not nearly as dire as those for a Census undercount. Unlike the census, though, you can participate multiple times in

Bulletin's Best, and you should, if you want your nominees to make it to the voting round.

In each of the categories, the five candidates with the most nominations will move on to the live voting round, which begins Oct. 1 and will last through the month.

In some categories, moving to the voting round is a shoo-in. The other day, I checked a few random categories. For example, in best off-road vehicle dealer, there were only two nominees. Las Cruces Motorsports had 59 nominations, and The Power Center had 29.

Other categories are a different story.

In the Life is Good in Las Cruces division, the best red chile

# Torres Small has a chance to settle in

In 2002, Steve Pearce beat John Arthur Smith in what I believe was the most important election in southern New Mexico of the past two decades.

The seat in Congress that both men were running for was open for the first time since 1980. That was the year Harold Runnels died three months before the election. Runnels was so firmly entrenched that Republicans hadn't even planned to contest him.

Joe Skeen launched a write-in campaign to win the seat, then went on to hold it for 11 terms. Runnels, a Democrat, and Skeen, a Republican, combined to hold the seat from 1971 until the January following the 2002 election. It seemed clear that voters in the district were more loyal to the person than the party.

I figured whoever won that year would be able to settle in. Pearce served for eight terms and would probably be the incumbent today if not for his ambition for other offices.

With a win this year, Democrat Xochitl Torres Small may also be able to settle in.

Torres Small defeated Yvette Herrell as part of the blue wave election of 2018, when Democrats flipped 41 seats in the House. The race was so close that it wasn't decided until absentee ballots in Doña Ana County were counted the day after the election.

This year's election will be a rematch. Herrell is coming off a bruising primary campaign against Claire Chase that seemed to be a contest as to which was more unquestioningly loyal to the president.

Both Torres Small and Democratic presidential candidate Joe Biden are now facing the same accusation: they might not be radical socialists, but they are under the control of more powerful forces in the Democratic Party who are.

Which is probably why you can't turn on your TV these days without seeing a commercial of Torres Small shooting up the desert (in an environmentally responsible way, I'm sure) to demonstrate her support for gun rights. Or crawling across an oil rig to demonstrate her support for fracking.

I'm not suggesting that those commercials are disingenuous. They're not. But, like all political ads, they're incomplete. Yes, you oppose a ban on fracking, but what about produced water? And climate change? Yes, you support gun rights, but what about bump stocks?

Torres Small's voting

record her first term was that of a centrist. That's probably best reflected by her split votes on the two gun-safety bills passed by the House and stalled in the Senate. She voted for the bill to require background checks for weapons sales online and at gun shows, but she was one of seven Democrats to vote against a bill that would have expanded the time allowed for background checks from three days to 10.

That bill was introduced by Rep. Jim Clyburn in honor of the nine people killed in a Charleston, South Carolina AME church. The FBI should have stopped the purchase of one of the guns used in that slaughter but did not complete its background check within the required three days.

For many Democrats who worked hard to help Torres Small get elected, that vote was disappoint-

ing. And the split vote did nothing to win support from Republicans or the NRA, which has given her a "D" rating.

Political extremists promise instant results and dramatic change, which is why they are much more exciting. But only for one side.

Centrists can be frustrating for both sides. I suppose that's the whole idea.

It also should be noted that congressional district maps are redrawn after each Census, so whichever party rules the legislature next year will have a crack at making the Second Congressional District more competitive for their party.

# LWV: No matter if by mail or in person, VOTE!

The League of Women Voters of Southern New Mexico (LWVSNM) supports broad access to voting, and absentee ballots are one option to vote safely this year. Due to the pandemic, the 2020 general election process was modified by the New Mexico Legislature to allow county clerks the option to mail applications for absentee ballots to registered voters with recently confirmed addresses.

In Doña Ana County, those applications were mailed beginning Sept. 14. An application for

an absentee ballot can be submitted online at [www.nmvote.org](http://www.nmvote.org) no later than Oct. 20. Registered voters may also call the County Clerk's office (575-647-7421) to request a paper application for an absentee ballot.

Absentee ballots have a long history, originating in the United States during the Civil War so that soldiers on both sides could vote from the battlefield. At the federal level, voting by absentee ballots expanded during World War II, so that soldiers stationed overseas could vote.

Among the states, ab-

sentee ballots provided civilians who would be away from home on Election Day or were seriously ill a way to vote beginning in the late 1800s. New Mexico has offered absentee ballots without requiring an excuse since 1993.

Once you have applied for a ballot, your application and ballot can also be tracked at [www.nmvote.org](http://www.nmvote.org). The U.S. Postal Service has indicated that New Mexico's deadlines for absentee ballots do not pose a delivery problem. But instead of using the mail, voters may return ballots in person to the Clerk's office (845 N.

Motel Blvd.) or to an alternative voting location (Oct. 17-31).

In-person voting at the Clerk's Office begins Oct. 6. No matter how you plan to vote, please do it early! No one wants to stand in long lines on Nov. 3, but all citizens deserve to vote safely and to have their voices heard.

There are many reasons to be assured that our votes in New Mexico will be counted as intended. With paper ballots, votes can be recounted and not lost in a machine error. The vote-count system is not connected to the Internet, so it cannot be hacked.

Post-election audits in selected precincts have regularly been conducted since 2008 to confirm accuracy. The Secretary of State's Office has its own information technology team aimed at preventing interference.

In addition, the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) Election Lab evaluates states for election performance. In the 2018 election, New Mexico ranked ninth in the nation. Factors considered include voter turnout, voter registration rate, data completeness, registration/absentee ballot problems and required

post-election audits.

Voting is one of the most important rights and responsibilities of citizenship in our democracy. Information about candidates, in their own words, is available through the LWVSNM website [www.VOTE411.org](http://www.VOTE411.org), and through the printed Voter Guide, available the second week of October.

Your vote is your voice. VOTE EARLY!

### Our heroes

To the editor:

I am not a veteran, but I come from a military family starting with the Civil War to the war in Afghanistan. It has been my privilege to work with the veterans in Las Cruces for the past 20 years. I have seen the pain in the faces of the parents and my own relatives who lost their loved ones in Vietnam, Iraq and Afghanistan. Now, according to The Atlantic magazine, President Trump is telling them their loved ones killed in action were “losers” and “suckers,” and he doesn’t even recognize how much more pain he is causing to the Gold

Star families with those unkind words.

I serve as chair of the Veterans Memorial Wall Committee. From the Civil War to Iraq and Afghanistan, we have 8,018 men and women from Doña Ana County listed on the wall at Veterans Park who have served our country. The breakdowns with the highest numbers are WWII with 2,666 and Vietnam with 2,530. We have a total of 28 prisoners of war — these are the ones their Commander in Chief reported to the world he doesn’t like because they were captured. 204 were killed in action from WWI to Iraq/Afghanistan. The 204th was our most recent hero, Sgt.

First Class Antonio Rey Rodriguez, killed in action in Afghanistan on February 8, 2020. From New Mexico, we have 398 killed in action in Vietnam.

In 2014, my daughters and I were privileged to visit the Normandy American Cemetery, 172 acres where 100,000 soldiers are resting. Among them are two from the Mesquite Historic District, Julian D. Melendrez and Leonardo C. Rodriguez.

Regardless of where they served or where they died, they are called our heroes, not “suckers” and “losers.”

### No to wind farms

To the editor:

Have you driven into Los Angeles on Interstate 10 lately? After passing Palm Springs, you begin to see the massive wind farms along the Interstate. For the first time viewer, it's an impressive sight: huge structures with huge blades turning. But the next time I

viewed this, I began to feel a little dismayed at the adverse effect, visually, to the landscape.

Know that even with these massive wind facilities and numerous solar farms, California could not keep up with the electricity demand this summer. California must now start building massive capacity battery banks to store the

solar energy through the night. But the bulk of the raw materials needed are usually mined and produced in China and is not a pollution-free endeavor. Think rare-earth metals used in magnets.

Midwest states are more and more rejecting these farms because of the negative impacts such as unacceptably high visual impact, tour-

ism, lowered property values, impact to birds and raptors and a flawed public participation process. The flawed public participation process is especially salient to New Mexico, where the N.M. Energy Transition Act was hashed out with lobbyists who stand to gain on green energy projects, with the oil and gas industry virtually shut out

of the process. According to Power the Future, New Mexico's Energy secretary, Sarah Propst, encouraged multiple eco-groups to review the bill's language as it was being written. In one instance, she allowed the group who employed her just months before, a renewable energy trade group called Interwest, to influence the bill.

The point is that the average New Mexican's seat at the policy table has been crowded out by Democrat politicians, who pander to outsiders to gain political points. Every southern N.M. House and Senate incumbent voted for this in the 2019 Legislature (SB489).

# New America School to open a daycare center

As New America School (NAS) looks forward to its 10th anniversary in Las Cruces, the state-chartered high school is adding a new daycare center so young parents, and especially new mothers, can spend time with their children while they attend school.

“We are beyond excited,” said NAS Principal Margarita Porter.

After the school’s governing board narrowed the list of possible names to three, NAS’ young parents selected the name New Beginnings in a Sept. 21 online vote, Porter said.

The daycare center is supported by the New Mexico Public Education Department’s (NMPED) GRADS (Graduation, Reality and Dual-role Skills) in-school program for expectant and parenting teens. GRADS helps high school students who are new parents identify barriers to success, “overcome the cycle of poverty by achieving a high school education and employability skills (and) develop positive parenting and healthy relationship skills,” according to <https://webnew.ped.state.nm.us>.

“Once again, NAS-LC is making a difference in our community,” Porter said. “We will be the only charter school in southern New Mexico (and possibly in the state) to have a childcare center for students,” she said. “We hope

this will encourage them to graduate. We are also hoping this program will encourage other young parents who have dropped out to return to school.”

Because NAS is conducting all its classes online at present and is uncertain when on-campus learning will resume because of the health pandemic, the school plans to

open the daycare center to students next January, Porter said. NAS staff will follow all NMPED and New Mexico Department of Health guidelines to ensure the health and safety of students and children in the daycare center and throughout NAS, NAS GRADS teacher Lorynn Guerrero said.

Both Guerrero and her



fellow NAS-LC GRADS teacher, Crystal Bridges, were teen parents who benefitted from the Las Cruces Public Schools GRADS program, they said.

Among its 200 students, NAS has about a dozen teen parents enrolled at present, with a couple of additional new babies expected in late summer/early fall, Guerrero said. That includes some of the 10 girls who had been attending NAS last school year who didn’t return to classes after their children were born but have come back to take online courses at NAS. The staff expects their return to campus with their young

children when the daycare center opens.

In August, NAS began renovating a 765-square-foot room on its first floor to use as the daycare center.

NAS will add to its 30-member staff with the hiring of a daycare director and assistant, Porter said. And, NAS will offer a new elective course to students who want to work in the daycare center.

The best way for the community to support the NAS daycare center is to contribute to the school’s community baby shower, Guerrero said. Donations of items like cribs, rocking chairs, bouncers, diapers, baby toys and other items would be welcome, Porter, Guerrero and

Bridges said.

ABC Carpet of Las Cruces is providing the carpeting for the daycare center, and the state GRADS program is helping provide furniture.

The daycare center is “one more reason NAS is doing great things and helping students succeed,” Porter said.

New America School is located at 207 S. Main St. downtown.

# New Mexico State Police: reaching out, helping out in Doña Ana County

The New Mexico State Police (NMSP) are more than a highway patrol — much more.

“We’re not just issuing tickets,” said NMSP Officer Jacquelin Hernandez.

The four officers who comprise NMSP’s community engagement team in Doña Ana County (DAC) also visit schools — students can tour their the NMSP mobile command post on site, and they’re getting ready to relaunch the Police Explorers Academy.

They frequently participate at the Farmers and Crafts Market of Las Cruces; participate in local events across the county,

including parades, festivals, Special Olympics, softball tournaments and other athletic events; and they reach out to the residents of Las Cruces and other communities to pro-

vide a wide range of skills and services.

Hernandez and the other team members, Sgt. Ricardo J. Rodriguez and Officers Justin Coburn and Brian De la O, have

combined law enforcement service of almost 80 years. And it’s more than a job and a paycheck to all of them, Rodriguez, Hernandez and Coburn said during a visit to the Bulletin. They all live here with their families and are part of the community they serve.

“We’re very invested in this county,” Rodriguez said.

Because NMSP is “a full-service law enforcement agency,” he said, its officers patrol highways,

provide backup to the Las Cruces Police Department (LCPD) and the Doña Ana County Sheriff’s Office (DASO) and other law-enforcement agencies are involved in every type of law enforcement-related call and investigation. In addition to community engagement, there are NMSP units serving DAC that deal with drug interdiction, street crimes, traffic enforcement and DWI prevention. There’s also a tactical team.

And, even though most people who need assistance call 911, which connects them with Mesilla Valley Regional Dispatch Authority and LCPD, DASO or the Las Cruces Fire Department, they also have the option of calling NMSP dispatch to deal with a traffic accident, property crime, crimes against persons and other calls.

In the wake of the George Floyd murder, NMSP have stepped up their public outreach across the county and the state to build trust and

open channels of communication, Rodriguez said.

“We’re trying to get back to the grass roots,” the sergeant said. Community policing traces its origins to the cop on the beat, who had personal relationships with communities and neighborhoods, he said.

And, while acknowledging that recruiting new officers is more difficult in “the current climate,” Rodriguez said the county is “very supportive of local law enforcement. We are really blessed. We really do appreciate it,” he said.

A great majority of the businesses NMSP officers visit throughout the county are “happy for us to be around,” Coburn said. “They are really glad to see us. That says a lot about the communities in our county.”

NMSP have strong leadership and “a very good chain of command here in Las Cruces,” Rodriguez said, that is “very

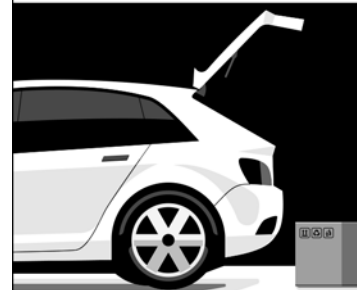

## State makes loans available for businesses

### BULLETIN REPORT

Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham's Economic Recovery Council is urging small businesses that have been hard hit by the COVID-19 public health emergency to apply for an emergency loan program now available through the New Mexico Finance Authority.

The Small Business Recovery Act of 2020 set aside \$400 million from the New Mexico's Severance Tax Permanent

Fund to provide loans to New Mexico businesses and nonprofits that have experienced financial hardship during the pandemic.

"This is a great opportunity for businesses to get some critical help that could make the difference in being able to navigate through this very difficult period," said Economic Recovery Council Chairwoman Christina Campos. "It's so important for our recovery that our state's

small businesses get through this."

"This is a program that is especially beneficial for small businesses that may not have been able to access federal relief or who need more flexibility. We'd love to see more businesses take advantage of what is available," added Councilmember Jason Sandel.

Businesses may be eligible for loans of up to \$75,000. The loans do not

## Fall Prevention

Every September during National Falls Prevention Week (Sept. 21-25, 2020), physical therapists join other medical professions across the country in reminding Americans that falls are not just common among older Americans. They're often debilitating, costly and even deadly.

Falls present a real public health problem among older adults, but so often they are caused by things that are easy to identify and fix. Balance and strength issues, trip hazards in the home, poor vision, and even certain prescription medications can increase someone's chance of falling. These are all things that can and should be addressed as people enter their golden years, before they experience a fall.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimate that one in four Americans 65 and older experience a fall each year. Less than half actually report the incident to a doctor or loved one. Of those falls, about one in every five result in a serious injury (i.e., a broken bone or head injury), leading to more than 3 million emergency room visits and 800,000 hospitalizations each year. In 2015, these treatments and hospitalizations cost a total of about \$50 billion, three-fourths of which was paid for through Medicare and Medicaid.

We like to shine a spotlight on this critical issue because it's one that we can improve with a more preventive mindset. One of the ways we can do this is by setting the record straight about some common myths older people have about falling.

**The following beliefs are either incorrect, misleading, or both:**

**"Falling is just a part of getting older."** Wrong! Falling does not have to be a part of aging. As already discussed, the most common causes of falls are easy to identify and fix before a fall happens.

**"I won't fall if I just stay home and limit my activities."** First off, more than half of all falls take place in the home. It's true, and it's likely because our guards are most often down when we're home. Home is also where we spend most of our time, including moments when we're not always the most alert (i.e., mornings, middle of the night, etc.). As for reducing activity, this can actually increase your chances of falling. When you become more sedentary, you begin to lose muscle mass, flexibility, and range of motion, which can drastically affect your balance. Declining strength and flexibility are inevitable. Yes, it's true that the body tends to become weaker and less flexible as we age, but most older adults can recoup and maintain a lot of this through **regular exercise and activity**. It's never too late to improve your strength, flexibility and balance.

**"Using walking aids make me less independent."**

Some older adults can benefit from the use of a cane or walker, and there's no shame in this.

# Complete census by Sept. 30

Wednesday, Sept. 30, is the last day of the self-response phase of the 2020 Census.

The U.S. Census Bureau said New Mexico's self-response rate was 57.3 percent as of Sept. 21. That's almost nine points below the national average of 66.1 percent. Minnesota has the highest response rate at 74.6 percent. Only Alaska and West Virginia had worse self-report rates than New Mexico, according to <https://2020census.gov/en/response-rates/nrfu.html>.

## United States Census 2020

A University of New Mexico study showed New Mexico with the second-worst response rate in the 2010 Census. If the state undercounts again in 2020, it could result in a loss of hundreds of millions of dollars in the next 10 years. The state will lose about \$3,000 a year for every person not counted.

"The 2020 Census will determine congressional representation, inform

hundreds of billions in federal funding every year, and provide data that will impact communities for the next decade," according to the Census Bureau website.

"Federal dollars for sidewalks, Section Eight housing, school lunches, Pell grants — these are just a few of more than 60 different programs your census count brings us," said Las Cruces Mayor Ken Miyagishima. "Please complete your census today. Our community is counting on you."

"Nonresponse follow up," during which census takers will visit the homes of people who haven't

responded, will continue through Saturday, Oct. 31.

The 2020 Census count began Jan. 21, when the Census Bureau started counting people in the rural village of Toksook Bay, Alaska. In mid-March, the bureau mailed information nationwide on how to complete the census online, by phone or by mail. In mid-April it mailed paper questionnaires to homes that had not yet responded online or by phone.

In December, the Census Bureau will deliver apportionment counts to the president and Congress. By March 31, 2021, the Census Bureau will

send redistricting counts to the states. This information is used to redraw legislative districts based on population changes.

Forecasters are already projecting that up to 10 states could lose a U.S. House of Representatives seat as a result of the final 2020 Census count, and seven states — including Texas and Colorado — could gain seats. New Mexico is likely to keep its three seats.

The Census Bureau reported that 132 programs used Census Bureau data to distribute more than \$675 billion in funds during FY2015. Recipients included medical, childcare,

school lunch, housing, education (including Head Start), food and small business development programs.

The Project On Government Oversight (POGO) a nonpartisan independent watchdog ([www.pogo.org](http://www.pogo.org)), said in March that 316 federal programs will distribute \$1.5 billion based on 2020 Census results.

POGO said New Mexico received nearly \$11 billion in census-guided federal spending in FY2017. The amounts to almost 13.1 percent of personal income, ranking New Mexico fifth nationally.

supportive of all of the officers.” NMSP have “a strong partnership with our local communities,” he said. “People can reach out to us with confidence.”

Rodriguez, a native of El Paso, comes from a

military family — his father served in World War II — and knew from an early age that he wanted a career centered around public service. “Law enforcement and military service were going to be my call,” he said. Rodriguez has 28 years combined law enforcement service and has been a NMSP sergeant for the

past 11 years.

“He’s a great sergeant,” said both Hernandez and Coburn.

During his NMSP service, “I’ve had a few people die in my arms,” Rodriguez said. He remembers a traffic accident about 10 years ago in which a retired military veteran was trapped inside a vehicle.

“We couldn’t find a way to extricate him,” he said. So, Rodriguez crawled through the passenger side of the vehicle and “stayed with him until he took his last breath.”

The sergeant also remembers a fellow officer — a “co-worker and friend” — dying of cardiac arrest at the scene of a vehicle accident in 2012.

Hernandez, a native of El Paso who was raised in Las Cruces, has been with NMSP for eight years. Some of her most painful memories include a traffic fatality in Chaparral and a plane crash.

Coburn, a native of Estancia, New Mexico, has almost 20 years NMSP service. He has distinct memories of the first

vehicle accident he was called to that involved the death of a child. On New Mexico Highway 28, he said, a driver ran a red light and struck another vehicle, killing the woman driving and her daughter. EMTs worked on the child “on the side of the road” for an hour and a half, Coburn said, but could not save her.

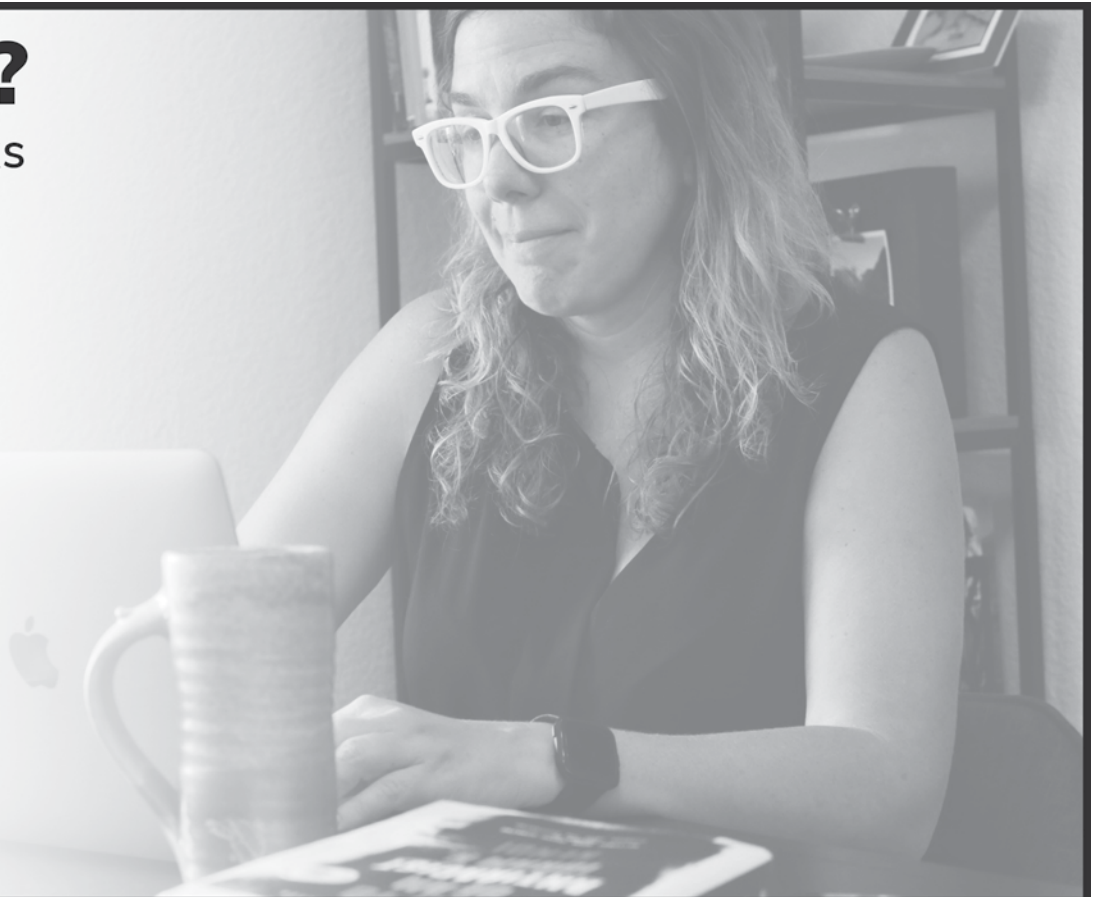

be part of this show."

Hernandez worked professionally for the national DAV for 16 years, coordinating a wide range of services to veterans in Las Cruces and throughout this part of the state.

Now retired, Hernandez continues to donate much of his time to helping veterans connect with the care and services they need.

"I still help people from all over the world," he said.

Hernandez welcomes the occasional ream or paper or ink cartridge for his printer but doesn't charge for his services.

Bill Garcia was a radar repairman in the U.S. Army, where he served for three years, along with one year in the Army Re-

serve. His first assignment was at Fort Bliss. With his Army training, Garcia became an electrical engineer, earning his master's degree in electrical engineering from NMSU. He worked for the U.S. Department of Defense for 35 years before retiring.

"I got the background with the (Army) radar system," he said. "It became a career."

Both Garcia's sons are electrical engineers, he said, and his oldest is pursuing a doctorate degree.

Bill Garcia is in his second year as DAV Chapter 10 commander. He also served seven years as president of the VVA State Council.

Tony Garcia served 23 years in the U.S. Army and saw combat in Kuwait

## The DAV was created to serve veterans after World War I

More than 4.7 million Americans served in World War I (Jul 28, 1914 – Nov 11, 1918), and 53,500 died in combat. Accidents and illnesses, mostly the Spanish Flu, took the lives of another 63,000. 204,000 Americans in uniform were wounded during the war. In less than six months, half of the four million Americans in uniform were released from military service.

The post-war national economy was already deeply stressed, but the flood of war veterans looking for jobs or needing medical care made it terribly worse. By 1919, four million Americans were jobless. For the next two years, recession and widespread unemployment crippled the American economy.

In 1919, Congress cut job programs by 80 percent. Veterans had to fend for themselves, as there was no single government program like today's Department of Veterans Affairs.

Though the DAV had existed for several months prior to Sept. 25, 1920, that day is considered the birth of the organization. The Cincinnati, Ohio group called a national caucus on that date that was attended by some 250 disabled veterans from self-help groups across the U.S. who federated into a national body.

The caucus held the new organization's first national convention the following June in Detroit.

The nonprofit DAV provides more than 600,000 rides to veterans attending medical appointments and assists veterans with more than 200,000 benefit claims. In 2019, DAV helped veterans receive more than \$21 billion in earned benefits. DAV's services are offered at no cost to all generations of veterans, their families and survivors.

DAV has nearly 1,300 chapters and more than one million members in the U.S.

DAV was chartered by an act of Congress June 17, 1932.

during Operation Desert Storm. He is now retired. He's played Santa Claus for a number of local holiday celebrations, Garcia said.

"We're here to help veterans," Hernandez said, noting that a vet doesn't have to have a disability to ask the DAV for help. "We're open to any veteran," he said. "A veteran's a veteran. All veterans are hurting."

Pandemic permitting, DAV Chapter 10 meets at 6 p.m. the third Thursday of

each month. DAV Chapter 38 meets in the morning on the third Saturday of each month, Hernandez said.

Life membership in the DAV is \$300 and is free to any veterans age 80 and older.

## Politics collide with justice in Showtime's 'The Comey Rule'

A crackling script and a talented cast brings the extraordinary story of the 2016 U.S. presidential election to life in a two-part event series upcoming on Showtime.

"The Comey Rule," airing Sunday and Monday, Sept. 27 and 28, gives an immersive account of the events leading up to and following the election of Donald Trump as president, looking at the early days of the Russia investigation, the FBI's investigation of Hillary Clinton's emails and their impact on the election, as well as the stark political divide that has resulted.

It also focuses on the tempestuous relationship of two men – FBI Director James Comey (Jeff Daniels, "The Newsroom") and Trump (Brendan Gleeson, "Mr. Mercedes") – whose initial uncomfortable alliance turned to rancor following Trump's abrupt firing of Comey in 2017.

The able cast also includes Holly Hunter ("The Piano") as acting Attorney General Sally Yates; Michael Kelly ("House of Cards") as former FBI Director Andrew McCabe; Scoot McNairy ("Halt and Catch Fire") as former Deputy Attorney General Rod Rosenstein; Oona Chaplin ("Game of Thrones") as former FBI lawyer Lisa Page; and Steven Pasquale ("Rescue Me") as former FBI agent Peter Strzok.

Comedy's book "A Higher Loyalty" served as the basis for the story, which was adapted for television by director

and Oscar-nominated screenwriter Billy Ray ("Captain Phillips"), and was augmented by interviews with several of the key players. Thus, there is information here that doesn't appear in the book.

What comes through is the selflessness of those who serve their country and in Comey's case, his unwavering devotion to the mission and ideals of the FBI.

"Comey is a relentlessly optimistic man," says Ray, who had unlimited access to Comey. "... The day after Trump was elected, Comey said to his family, 'He has an opportunity to lead from the center in a lot of really interesting ways. And that office changes people. He's going to grow.' Even after his first few meetings with Trump, which were so unsettling, Comey was still giving Trump the benefit of the doubt, looking for ways to help Trump do his job better. ...

"Until the day Comey was fired, he considered himself a subordinate of the president," he continues, "whose job it was to support the president in every legal and ethical way possible – and that was a dynamic I found dramatically captivating."

As Trump, the Irish actor Gleeson fairly disappears into the hair and skin of the 45th president, getting his voice, intonations, expressions and mouth movements to a tee. And Daniels deftly captures Comey's idealism and dedication to what he believes is the greater good.

## Artist Richard Harris: 'Watercolors and birds keep calling me back'

Birds “connect the earth and the heavens,” Las Cruces artist Richard Harris said. “I watch and observe and love them. They watch and observe and teach me.”

While his watercolors are accurate in detail, what he calls his “bird studies” have evolved, Harris said, and he said he often uses unusual colors for the birds he paints, as in his multi-hued “Pop Art Owl.”

As a “fanatic ornithologist,” Harris said he is fascinated by birds’ resourcefulness: hummingbirds and doves washing off under a sprinkler; the intelligence of hawks, crows, eagles, owls and other hunting birds;

Las Cruces artist Richard Harris’ solo show, “Wing Whispers, Avian Life Lessons,” is at the Doña Arts Council (DAAC), opening Monday, Oct. 5, and continuing through Friday, Oct. 30.

The show includes 50 pieces of Harris’ art in a variety of sizes. This is his first show for DAAC. All his pieces will be for sale, and “reasonably priced,” Harris said.

DAAC is located at 250 W. Amador Ave., at the corner of Amador and Alameda Boulevard.

Hours are 9 a.m.-5 p.m. Monday-Friday, with a special second-Saturday opening, noon-5 p.m. Oct. 10.

the loyal and protective natures of most species: watching the leader change in a flying vee and seeing two healthy birds following an injured bird to the ground and staying with it until dies.

“They are spiritual

messengers,” he said.

“I’ve painted since I was a boy,” said Harris, who was born in the Chelsea district of southwest London in 1954. He said his love for birds began around age 10, when his parents gave him a book about British birds. At age 12, Harris moved with his parents to a 16th-century farmhouse in Coventry, where he was surrounded by ponds, meadows and nature.

“That was how I connected to both myself and the world around me,” he said. “I wanted to get a closer look at the miracles that were happening all around me.”

Harris said he remembers as a child catching a blue tit and holding it in his hands before releasing it.

“I wanted desperately to capture the essence of

that bird and interpret it in my own way,” he said.

Harris moved to the United States with his first wife, an American citizen who wanted to come home, and their twins in 1982, settling in Illinois for five years be-

fore moving to Connecticut, where he lived and worked as a landscape designer for 30 years. After retiring in 2016, Harris and his second wife moved to Las Cruces.

“We like the Southwest a lot,” Harris said. “We’ve

been coming here for years.”

In retirement, Harris has renewed his interest in painting. And, although he paints the occasional rabbit or fox

and uses different media, “watercolors and birds keep calling me back,” he said.

Harris had a solo show at MAS Art in Las Cruces and has been part of group shows at Branigan Cultural Center, Café de Mesilla and Phillips Gallery. He is a new member of the New Mexico Watercolor Society, and the former president of the Middletown Art Guild in Connecticut.

In Las Cruces, Harris said he has learned from other local artists, especially Julie Ford Oliver and Nancy Begin. And, while he has found the birds of the Southwest different from those in his native England and other

parts of the U.S., he said his connection to them is the same.

Birds, he said, “are speaking to us loudly at this moment.” They have the same five senses as humans, and the same four-chambered heart. But their metabolism is different, and they are “feeling and sensing what’s out there at a much higher frequency,” he said.

About a third of the world’s bird population — some three billion birds — have been lost since 1970, Harris said, because of issues like climate change, loss of habitat and pesticide use.

“They are a signal for us that something is drastically wrong,” he said. “I believe the canary in the coal mine is screaming, ‘Enough!’”

# Arts Council's 'Feed Your Mind' art courses underway

## BULLETIN REPORT

The Doña Ana Arts Council (DAAC) has announced four new online art courses for the fall of 2020 that began in mid-September.

"We were hoping to get back to in-person classes this fall," said DAAC Executive Director Greg Smith, "but unfortunately, we'll have to postpone that a while longer and continue with online offerings."

The four DAAC "Feed Your Mind" courses will be: World Art, Part 1; The Renaissance World; Spanish Colonial Art; and Travels in Mexico.

All courses will be offered online via Zoom. Registration is online at



[www.daarts.org/classes-workshops/](http://www.daarts.org/classes-workshops/) or by calling the DAAC office at 575-523-6403.

All classes are free of charge for DAAC members who have invested at the Heart for Art level or higher, at \$101 per year or more. Otherwise, each class is \$5 for non-members. All classes will be recorded and emailed to students after each class. The recordings give students a chance to make up missed sessions or to start the course after the initial start date.

Kathleen Key, DAAC's resident art historian,

will teach two courses: World Art, Part 1, 5:30-7 p.m. on Mondays through Dec. 14; and The Renaissance World, 1:30-3 p.m. Tuesdays through Nov. 24.

In addition to teaching many DAAC art history seminars, Key is a professor of art history at the University of Texas at El Paso (UTEP) and its OLLI Continuing Education Program.

World Art, Part 1 course description, from Key: "We will cover not only European art and art in North America from prehistoric times to the Baroque era, but the art of China, Japan, Islam, Africa, Oceania and Native America."

Key said she will follow the art history book

"Gardner's Art through the Ages," edited by Richard G. Tansey and Fred S. Kleiner. While not a requirement for the course, students may want to obtain a used copy of the book locally or online. World Art, Parts 2 and 3 will be offered in the spring and summer of 2021 and will cover art history up to the present day.

The Renaissance World course description, from Key: "We will cover the art and architecture as well as the theater and costumes from 1400-1600 in Italy, Belgium, the Netherlands, Germany, France, Spain and England."

Spanish Colonial Art

will be Nicholas Dahle's third course at DAAC after teaching two courses last summer. Dahle is an art historian who, like Key, teaches at UTEP's OLLI Continuing Education Program. "The arrival of the Spanish in the Americas resulted in the meeting of many cultures and ideas," Dahle said. "European and Pre-Colombian art styles combined into what is classified as Spanish colonial art. When Spain ruled New Mexico, santeiros crafted vibrant furniture, statues and retablos that exhibit the mixing of both Pueblo and Spanish styles."

The Spanish Colonial Art course consists of

13 classes, 5:30-7 p.m. Wednesdays through Dec. 9.

The fourth course is shorter, only three classes, and will be taught by UTEP/OLLI instructor Brad Roe. Travels in Mexico will explore the art, architecture, food and culture in the cities of Guanajuato and Oaxaca, plus the state of Chiapas. Travels in Mexico will be offered 1:30-3 p.m. Wednesdays through Sept. 30.

# Project in Motion Circus Camp returns Sept. 28

Project in Motion (PIM), Las Cruces' modern and aerial dance company, will host Circus Camp Monday, Sept. 28-Saturday, Oct. 3, "with a variety of options to keep you safe" during the COVID-19 pandemic, PIM said on its website.



The cost is \$15 for one day online (three classes) and \$40 for four days online (12 classes) One-hour private lessons are \$30 for a single student and

\$75 for three students. Or, pay \$50 for four days online and one private lesson or \$90 for four days online and three private lessons.

Online classes will be 30-45 minutes each, with three classes offered each day. They will include circus conditioning/flexibility, hula-hoop flow art, stunt falls/safety rolls

and beginner and intermediate juggling. In-person, one-hour private lessons will be the student's choice of juggling, pins/rings, lyra (aerial hopes) or Cyr wheel.

PIM will soon begin to offer classes and auditions, said PIM Artistic Director Hillary McDaniel-Douglas. Currently, small groups of private

lessons are offered.

PIM was founded in 1999 and moved to 430 N. Compress Road in 2011. Its home is a privately owned circa-1940s cotton gin in the city's "former agricultural industrial area" about seven blocks west of downtown, McDaniel-Douglas said. Using 7,500 square feet of the building, PIM danc-

ers have performed in front of local audiences of up to 240 people, she said. PIM dancers have also performed in Santa Fe, Albuquerque, New York and other venues.

# Downtown calls for artists for artist-in-residence program

The Downtown Las Cruces Partnership (DLCP) and the Las Cruces Arts and Cultural District (ACD) have created an artist-in-residence program and are issuing a call for artists.

The program is a series of events for six individual artists which culminates in a collective show to be held in June 2021 and hosted by DLCP and ACD, DLCP said in a news release.

Unlike a traditional artist-in-residence (AIR) program that brings an artist to a place or space to create, the DLCP/LCACD AIR “is designed to showcase and celebrate

the artists already creating in our district,” the news release said.

“Through an open call and selection process, DLCP and ACD will promote six artists who live and/or work in the ACD district. The pilot program will highlight makers, creators and artists who draw inspiration from the unique history, culture and atmosphere of the original town site.”

The program will be open to artists working in all genres and mediums, the news release said, including but not limited to culinary art, fine art, literary arts, music and textile arts.

As part of the program, DLCP/ACD will host an in-person or virtual (de-

pending on state public health orders) event for each artist, December 2020-May 2021, and the Las Cruces Bulletin will publish a story about the artist and his or her artwork. At the end of the season, on Friday, June 4, 2021, DLCP/ACD will host collaborative show, featuring the work of all six artists.

To apply for the DLCP/ACD AIR program, an artist must: 1) be at least 18 years old; 2) create or reside within the ACD; 3) have content of original work which is not subject to outside copyright or licensing; 4) draw inspiration for his or her art from the people, culture and atmosphere of the ACD; and 5) make him- or

herself available after the event for the Bulletin interview and attend the individual promotional June 4, 2021 collaborative show.

To apply, artists should submit three electronic examples of their original work. Files must be openable through Adobe Acrobat or Windows programs, and each file should be named with the artist’s first initial, last name and example number, i.e., JSmith1.jpeg.

Each artist should complete and submit the

AIR application, which includes a personal narrative of up to 250 words about the artist’s work and how he or she draws inspiration from the ACD, along with a narrative of up to 100 words about each submitted piece.

Complete the form at <https://docs.google.com/forms/d/e/1FAIpQLSdGxKHvvyOznIVDrBtJJ5bmDLLGMHisG8UhNji1IbUvXEa89w/viewform>. Examples of artwork should be submitted to [assistat@dlcp.org](mailto:assistat@dlcp.org).

The deadline for applications and submissions of work is 11:59 p.m. on Thursday, Oct. 8.

Artwork submitted for consideration must be appropriate for publication on social and traditional

media. If the work is collaborative, all participating artists must give written consent for its submission.

All qualifying submitted works will be considered by a jury comprised of ACD subcommittee members. A scoring system will be used to evaluate the submissions based on artistic quality, diversity of medium and creative connection to the ACD. Artists will retain 100 percent of the proceeds from sales of their work promoted by the DLCP/ACD AIR program.

## Subscription box company launches in Las Cruces

Heather Salopek of Legacy Pecans decided there had to be a way to help businesses and her community survive during the COVID-19 pandemic.

“I saw firsthand the impact that COVID-19 was having on my retail business,” Salopek said. “I knew I was not the only small business experiencing this detrimental downturn in sales due to loss of customer traffic and especially, in my case, traffic from tourists.”

Tourism accounts for a large portion of most specialty retail sales in smaller boutique communities such as Mesilla, where Salopek’s store is

Salopek said she’s taking the “boxes for survival” concept seriously by also becoming a major sponsor of the Las Cruces nonprofit Revolution 120’s “No One Goes Hungry In Our Community” program. The program provides more than 10,000 food boxes and 40,000 free meals to the Las Cruces community.

“Everything we do in our company is focused on our community and the people in it surviving this pandemic,” Salopek said.

to Las Cruces, he has focused on capturing light and shadow, along with design and composition, MVFAG said.

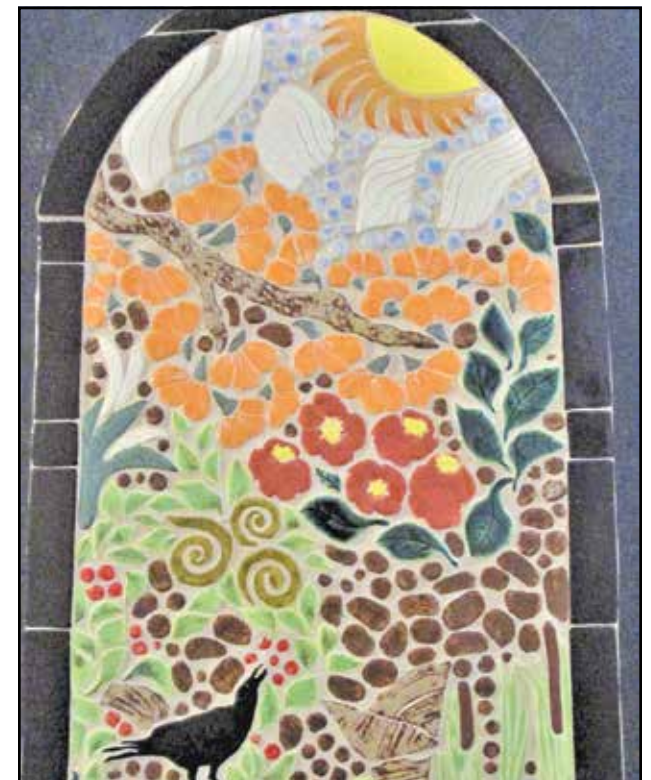

# It's important to discern news vs. narrative

What do you do when news isn't news anymore, but narrative? How can you know what's true and what's not? How can we understand the issues we face and work together on solutions, if the information we receive is presented in a way that drives us to emotional reactions or drives us apart, rather than encouraging us to think critically together about the issues we face?

That, sadly, is the condition we are in as a society. When news becomes narrative or opinion and is intended to make us feel or think a certain way, it prevents us from understanding all of the facts and coming to well-informed, well-reasoned opinions.

Back in the day, when I studied journalism in high school and through four years of college, this was called "editorializing." The writer was highly discouraged from looking at a set of facts and expressing an opinion about them. Editorializing cost us a letter grade.

Facts were of top priority. What? When? Where? Why? How? Like the old line from Dragnet, "Just the facts, ma'am." The way we were trained to report the news focused solely on the factual elements of a story in answer to these questions. And if we got any of our facts wrong, even misspelling a name, we failed the assignment.

As we see, those stan-

dards are under fire. The news industry has changed, perhaps driven by the seismic shift away from print news that has closed news outlets and displaced news people across the country, as well as cable news' impact on the big three networks.

The whole economic model of news has been turned on its head, as the morning and evening news was replaced by on-demand delivery of news 24/7 on cable and through our phones and computers.

Narrative is replacing news. It gets more clicks, more shares and can "go viral" to be seen by far more people than could have ever been reached before. Headlines, not stories, drive those clicks. If all we read is a headline expressing a narrative, readers

can be content to accept narrative as fact without ever diving into the rest of a story to evaluate the trustworthiness of the headline.

So, how can we become better consumers of news that is news and not narrative? Let me, from my journalism training, offer some suggestions.

First, read or view the whole story. You don't have to read every story top to bottom, but you should fully understand the ones that are important to you, because they impact your life in some way.

Second, find trustworthy sources of news. There are a lot of different ways to consume news. Don't look only for those that present narratives you agree with. Look for those that seem to lay out only

the facts and/or give you the tools to dig deeper into the information to learn more about the stories that interest you. Then you are equipped to fully understand issues and what they mean to you.

Third, steer clear of stories built on "anonymous sources." If someone's willing to put their name to a fact, then they are willing to be challenged on it. No one can challenge the veracity of an anonymous source.

Finally, ask yourself this: "What's the motive of the writer/deliverer of this story?" Is it to deliver information or compel you to a conclusion? News informs. Narrative shapes opinions. It's critical to know the difference.

Having said all of that, I want to thank the journalists of our community for

keeping us informed about what's happening in our communities, our county, our state and our nation. It's fully understanding the news that helps guide us in our efforts to improve, to innovate and to understand what works and what doesn't.

News can keep us connected, and it's those connections that propel us forward in the work we do today to impact the change we seek for tomorrow. Today's news is tomorrow's history, and we want that history to show exactly what we did together to change our community's future.

## Docent program coming to national monument

Friends of Organ Mountains-Desert Peaks (FOMDP) has announced the launch of a new initiative to upgrade the visitor experience at Dripping Springs Nature Area, where visitor days have gone up from 23,143 in 2014 to 115,360 last year.

According to Patrick Nolan, executive director of FOMDP, the docent program centered at Drip-

ping Springs “will provide visitors with knowledge of the history, wildlife, plant life and geology of a

truly one-of-a-kind area. Docents will be available to lead hikes for students and families, as well as answer questions for visitors before and after they hit the trails. Most importantly, the docents will teach visitors how we can best protect our cherished landscapes and public lands.”

U.S. District 2 Congresswoman Xochitl Torres-Small, D-N.M., said she’s in support of the new program.

“I applaud the partnership between FOMDP and the Bureau of Land Management to establish a docent program at Dripping Springs,” Torres-Small said. “Our docents will help preserve the area’s strong heritage and pass down generations of knowledge, in addition to sharing our public lands with New Mexicans and those visiting from across the country,”

Nolan said that through the end of the year,

FOMDP will begin the process of recruiting docent instructors and volunteers to serve as the first class of docents.

“The first class will be working by summer 2021,” he said. “Instructors will receive a stipend for their time.”

## When the water goes, the desert moves back in

Paonia, a small town in western Colorado, with a handful of mesas rising above it, wouldn’t green-up without water diverted from a river or mountain springs. The lively water travels through irrigation ditches for miles to gardens and small farms below. But this summer, irrigation ditches were going dry, and one, the Minnesota Canal and Reservoir Company, stopped sending water down to its 100-plus customers as early as July 13.

Drought was hitting the state and much of the West hard, but a local cause was surprising:

Water theft.

Longtime residents who gather inside Paonia’s hub of information trading, Reedy’s Service Station, have a wealth of stories about water theft. It’s not unusual, they say, that a rock just happens to dam a ditch, steering water toward a homeowner’s field. Sometimes, says farmer Jim Gillespie, 89, that rock even develops feet and crosses a road.

Once the ditch company called for its water, only holders of patented water rights could legally touch the creek. Yet during three trips to the creek’s beginning, starting in mid-June, and then in mid-July, I noticed that two ranches – without

water rights -- were harvesting bumper crops of hay. How could that have

happened unless they’d illegally diverted water to their fields?

At first, no one would talk about the early-drying ditch except to hint

broadly that this wasn’t

normal. Then one man stepped up: Dick Kendall, a longtime board member of the Minnesota Canal Company, and manager of its reservoir. “On July 5,” he told me, “I saw water diverted from the creek onto a rancher’s land. And I wasn’t quiet about it.”

Kendall reported what he saw to Commissioner Luke Reschke, who oversees the area’s 600 springs, ditches and canals. Reschke dismissed it, saying, “The rumor mill is something else on Minnesota Creek. The only people who give me trouble are the new peo-

ple who don’t know how the system works.”

But people pointed out that four years back, Reschke’s predecessor, Steve Tuck, investigated when locals complained.

Though it may not be neighborly, stopping any illegal diversion is important, said Bob Reedy, owner of Reedy’s Station. “Without water, you’ve got nothing around here.” Annual rainfall is just 15 inches per year, and without water flowing into irrigation canals from the 10,000-foot mountains around town, much of the land would look like what it truly is — high desert.

But it’s not just a couple of high-elevation ranchers dipping into the creek. The West Elk Coal Mine

runs large pumps that supply water for its methane drilling and venting operations in the Minnesota Creek watershed.

Mine spokesperson Kathy Welt says the diversion is legal, and that they only take early-season water when the creek water isn’t on call. That flood water, however, is what begins to fill the Minnesota ditch’s reservoir.

There are about 400 ditch companies in Colorado like the one managing Paonia’s water. Add another 386 in Idaho, 700 in New Mexico and more than 1,100 in Utah and you get an idea of how testy things can get in time of drought.

The town of Jal, New

Mexico is in a fight with Denver-based Intrepid Potash and Tulsa’s NGL Energy Partners. The two companies spent \$146 million to buy ranchland to set up a fracking operation.

Jal argues that if fracking operations are allowed to dramatically increase their supply of fresh water, it would totally deplete the town’s only source of water. It also points out that the “state closed the Jal Basin to new permits years ago.” (Santa Fe New Mexican).

In Nevada, litigation be-

tween farmers, ranchers and mining companies is in court. Ranchers downstream have senior rights, but the water is first depleted by the gold-mining operations. The lawyers for Nevada Gold Mines warn that if the ranchers with senior rights get their way, it “could impact mining in the Humboldt River Basin.” (Nevada News Group).

For the entire West, warming temperatures brought about by climate change could be the real challenge. What we are seeing now is almost certain to get worse.

Water — so precious to grow chile, cotton, onions, pecans, grapes, hay, organic vegetables and grass-fed beef, and to keep the desert at bay — had vanished early on Lamborn Mesa above Paonia. Farmer Gillespie summed it up, “There’s just no low-snow anymore — and it’s not coming back.”

# 'Run Then Wine' event goes virtual for 2020

Sonia Gonzales is passionate about running and wine, so she combined the two in 2014 to create "Run Then Wine," an event that encourages runners to compete against one another and then relax afterward at a local winery.

In addition to being a runner, Gonzales calls herself "an NMSU grad, an inventor and a cost controller" who was born and raised in New Mexico, but has traveled the world.

Through the BizSprint program at Arrowhead Center, she's working to develop a new baby-bottle system, but she's also coordinating the 2020 virtual Run Then Wine event.

Because of COVID-19, all sign-ups for the event are

being processed by email, and runners can choose their own routes anywhere in the world, she said, adding that "they can even break the run into sections if they would like, or run it on a treadmill."

Gonzales said she's working with the New Mexico Wine Association to bring in wineries as sponsors of the event, with the goal of getting up to six to participate. To date, only Luna Rossa wineries in Las Cruces and Deming have confirmed their participation.

Although it hasn't been an annual event, Gonzales said that in the years it's been put together, it's drawn a good crowd, including the inaugural year, which drew 600 runners. By the time spectators, volunteers and vendors were

added in, she estimated total participation by about 1,200 people.

The idea to connect the run with wineries, she said, came naturally.

"I'm a runner and my sister, Sylvia, owns Luna Rossa Winery & Pizzeria," she said. "I thought, 'Wouldn't it be great to coordinate an event in which we could combine the two? People could run and start and end at the winery.'"

Gonzales said entry fees vary depending on what kind of shirt participants want in their goody bag, because cotton shirts are cheaper than those made with moisture-wicking material. The entry fees, she said, are either \$35 or \$45 per distance chosen, depending on the shirt preference.

Gonzales said there are

three distances for which participants can register, and if someone registers for all three, the fee is \$80. All shirts are printed with the distance of the chosen event.

And while she admits there's a profit motive in staging the event, Gonzales also said she has pledged a portion of the proceeds to Camp Hope.

Because the event is virtual, Gonzales said participants have a lot more flexibility than in a normal running event.

"People who are running and wanting to enjoy their glass of wine at the end would have to time it during the participating wineries' hours of operation," she said. "Otherwise, they can run it anytime/anywhere between Oct. 17 and Nov. 7."

Looking forward to 2021, Gonzales said she hopes the run can come back to a more traditional format. But her real goal, she said, is to get people moving.

"According the United Health Foundation, 32 percent of New Mexicans are obese," she said "It would be nice if people just participated for the sake of their own health. Regardless of age or weight, the run could benefit anyone, young and old alike."

Getting the wineries involved this year, she said, is designed to help them weather the COVID-19 pandemic.

"Since this has been a rough year for the wineries, since they were shut all summer long, this will get people in," she said. "Hopefully, the runners will make additional purchases

once they are in the winery redeeming their vouchers."

Gonzales said that in addition to organizing the event, she'll be participating, and she knows where she'll be running.

"I do most of my runs in Mesilla," she said. "The pecan trees are amazing. I get to enjoy some of New Mexico's awesome culture. On my runs, I see vineyards, pecan orchards, farmers working their fields, adobe style homes, green chile sales, pottery sales, sunflowers and the irrigation canals. Although I don't expect to get the same kind of interest as a physical event, this event can still be worthwhile and fun."

# Golf requires mental toughness and sharp focus

Most of the golf played by serious golfers at local golf courses is match play.

You are individually playing against someone else, or perhaps a twosome against another twosome. Therefore, it's not about total score; usually it's about winning or losing. Whoever wins the most holes wins the match. That's the way the Scots did it many years ago. In my group, we play without handicaps, and the winners buy the drinks. Thank you.

You may not be playing your absolute best, but you can still win. Every player has a chance, and a snowman on a hole won't melt your prospects. While the fun is in the competition and the rivalry, and the stakes may not be sky high,

matches can get intense.

In previous columns about match play golf we've dealt with a few variables, such as knowing the rules and using them, awareness of what everybody is doing, gamesmanship and staying confident. Now, let's talk pressure.

Lee Trevino used to say that pressure is playing for \$10 when you've only got \$5 in your pocket. But even rich country club types feel the pressure for a \$2 Nassau. Pressure may be what psyches out golfers the most. In front of onlookers, pressure is what makes grown, burly men whiff on the first tee.

Whether it's the idea of social embarrassment, or the pressure of needing

to win, either way it spells "ego." Ego is what gets in our way. Sometimes feeling we absolutely cannot stand to lose; feeling we have to show the other guy up; feeling that we have to perform better than we ever have before.

When coaches tell players "just get out of your own way," they are talking about leaving their egos at the door — but just until the game is over. You have to have a strong ego — a powerful sense of self — to set important goals and achieve anything great in our western culture. Yet, an overly zealous sense of self-importance won't help sink the crucial putt. Tiger Woods has a big ego, but he humbly says, "Golf doesn't owe me a thing."

Sometimes you're challenged to perform outside your comfort zone, maybe

in sports or in business, and you're going to feel pressure. Performance pressure is what folks describe when they are forced, reluctantly, to speak before an audience.

Think of when you felt a similar sense of trepidation. Perhaps it was on the first tee. Maybe it was your "putt-to-win-the-open" moment with your buddies. As you face your scary task, you are enveloped by a soupy fog of terror, confusion, worry, dread and alarm. Your mind becomes numb, while insidious waves of fear flood over you and become increas-

ingly unnerving and distracting.

You now become more preoccupied with what suddenly has overwhelmed your senses, rather than focused on the actual task at hand. Subconsciously, you interpret your most urgent need as simply to vanish — to run — and escape the grip of shame and failure. In this "flight or fight" scenario fleeing usually rules. It's a low-level panic attack, and you feel out of control.

Handling pressure is really about keeping panic at bay. I have coached numerous athletes who

have struggled with anxiety attacks by instructing them to always consciously breathe deep and evenly. When under pressure I try my best to smile, because outwardly expressing a happy emotion contributes to some inner comfort and calm. Remember, being mentally tough isn't ignoring fear and pressure, it's courageously doing what you must in the face of it.

## Las Cruces Railroad Museum

The Las Cruces Railroad Museum at 351 N. Mesilla St. is housed in the 1910 Atchison Topeka and Santa Fe train depot. This Mission Revival Style building replaced the original, smaller wooden depot. The railroad first came to Las Cruces in 1881 and it changed Las Cruces forever. The railroad brought new businesses and products, including name-brand items such as soap and sewing machines, and larger items that were too bulky to move in wagons. In addition, farmers had much wider markets in which to sell their products – especially with the introduction of refrigerated cars.

The arrival of the railroad also changed the physical appearance of Las Cruces. The first paved street, Depot Street (now Las Cruces Avenue) led passengers off the train into downtown. More businesses filled out and shaped downtown – hotels, restaurants, general stores, and freight companies. Also with the railroad came new architectural ideas and materials which can still be seen in the varied houses in the adjacent Alameda-Depot Historic District neighborhood. Train passenger service continued in Las Cruces until 1968 and freight service ended in 1988.
