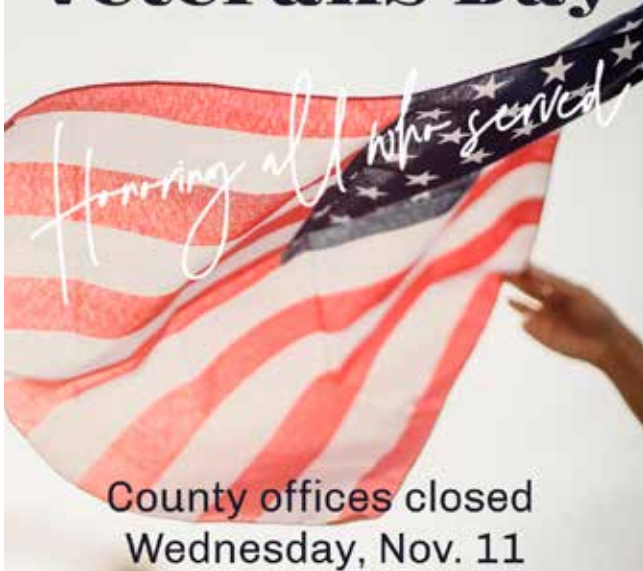

County offices closed

Funds available to help residents with rent, mortgage, utilities

Tierra Del Sol Housing, on behalf of Doña Ana County is now accepting assistance applications for the CARES Act Rental and Housing assistance program, through Nov. 30.

Doña Ana County applied for and received funding from the CARES Act Rental/Mortgage/ Utilities Relief Program to fund rental, mortgage and utilities assistance for County residents who lost their job or saw a substantial reduction in income, as a result of the COVID-19 health crisis.

All residents who rent or are homeowners and experienced a loss of a job or a reduction in income resulting from the coronavirus pandemic are invited to apply for assistance. Financial assistance may be up to \$4,000, per household.

To qualify, applicants must be 30 days or more past-due for rent or mortgage payment; have documented loss of income of at least 30 percent or loss of employment, after March 1.

The application is available from Tierra Del Sol Housing Corporation, or at www.donaanacounty.org. Once completed, all applications must be submitted to Tierra del Sol Housing Corporation, 210 E. Idaho Ave., Las Cruces, NM 88005.

Democrats prevail in county races, lose U.S. House seat

Editor's note: These results are based on unofficial returns from the New Mexico Secretary of State's office.

Democrat Ben Ray Lujan won the state's open U.S. Senate seat. But, in a rematch with former state legislator Yvette Herrell, an Alamogordo Republican, Democrat U.S. Rep. Xochitl Torres Small of Las Cruces lost the U.S. House seat she won two years ago.

In local legislative races, Republican Crystal Diamond of Elephant Butte won the New Mexico State Senate District 35 seat that includes parts of Luna,

Hidalgo, Sierra and Doña Ana counties. Democrat Noemi O. Martinez-Parra of Lordsburg defeated incumbent John Arthur Smith of Deming in the June primary, but lost to Diamond 58 percent-42 percent in the general. Martinez-Parra won in Doña Ana County, but Diamond won the other three counties. The seat has been represented by a Democrat from Deming for at least the last 64 years.

Incumbent Democrats Joseph Cervantes (District 31), Jeff Steinborn (District 36) and Bill Soules (District 37) were all re-elected. Democrat Carrie Hamblen received 62 percent of the vote in

the District 38 state Senate race, defeating Republican Charles Wendler. Hamblen defeated state Senate President Pro-Tem Mary Kay Papen in the June primary. All the winners are from Las Cruces. Incumbent Republican Ron Griggs of Alamogordo won the state Senate race in District 34, which includes two precincts in Doña Ana County.

On the House side, Republican Luis Terrazas of Silver City defeated incumbent Democrat Rudy Martinez, also of Silver City, in District 39, which includes parts of Grant, Sierra and Doña Ana counties.

Republican Ricky Little was ahead of incumbent

Democrat Willie Madrid in the state House District 53 race by seven votes out of more than 6,500 cast in the race, which likely will trigger an automatic recount under state law. The district includes parts of Doña Ana and Otero counties. Madrid defeated Little two years ago to win the seat. Little had defeated Madrid in 2016. Little has held the District 53 seat 2011-12 and 2015-18. Little and Madrid are both from Chaparral.

In a news release issued shortly before midnight Nov. 3, the Doña Ana County Clerk's office said there were still about 1,200 absentee ballots to be counted Wednesday morning, Nov. 4., along with "a

small number of Election Day write-in tabulation and hand tallying." If any outstanding ballots were cast in the House District 53 race, it could impact the results.

Democratic incumbent House members Micaela Lara Cadena (District 33), Ray Lara (District 34), Angelica Rubio (District 35), Nathan Small (District 36), Joanne Ferrary (District 37) and Doreen Gallegos (District 51) were re-elected. Cadena is from Mesilla, Lara is from La Mesa and the others are from Las Cruces.

In county races, incumbent Democrat Amanda Lopez Askin was elected to her first full term as county clerk and in-

cumbent Democrat Eric Rodriguez won a second four-year term as county treasurer. Democrats won all three county commission races on the ballot. Anthony Mayor Diana Murillo-Trujillo was unopposed in District 2. She defeated incumbent Ramon Gonzalez in the June primary. Former county magistrate judge Susana Chaparro defeated a Republican and a Libertarian to win the District 4 commission seat currently held by Republican Isabella Solis. Solis ran unsuccessfully for state House District 37 race instead of running for re-election to the commis-

RURAL EXTENSION FUNDS NOW AVAILABLE FROM CENTURYLINK

Rural New Mexico residential and small business customers located in developments of less than four units now have funds available to them through the **Rural Extension Fund (REF)** for Telephone Line Extensions. A Telephone Line Extension is necessary when CenturyLink (formerly Qwest) must construct new distribution cable in excess of 1,000 feet in order to supply primary telephone service at a street address where service was not previously available, and which would usually be charged to the customer.

When placing an order that includes Line Extension charges, eligible customers may receive a credit toward the construction of a line extension of up to \$25,000 per order. Charges in excess of the \$25,000 credit will be the responsibility of the customer placing the order.

Eligibility requirements are as follows:

- Credits from the Rural Extension Fund are available to new and existing customers residing in developments of less than four (4) units. (The developer will be responsible for facilities in developments with four or more units.)
- A line extension is necessary to provide primary telephone service at a street address where service was not previously available.
- No minimum Line Extension Charge.

sion. Incumbent Manuel Sanchez won the District 5 commission race.

The county also elected Democrat Gerald Byers as the new district attorney and Richard Jacquez as a new district judge. Both were unopposed in the general. The county's eight incumbent district judges all received more than the 57 percent voter approval needed to stay on the bench.

Democrats won both races for state Supreme Court and the three races for state Court of Appeals. Incumbent Court of Appeals Judge Jacqueline R. Medina was retained by voters.

Voters passed both

proposed constitutional amendments on the ballot. One would change the state Public Regulation Commission from a five-member elected body to a three-member governor-appointed body. The other would adjust the terms of some elected offices in the state to balance terms between presidential and non-presidential years.

Voters also passed all three statewide bond issues on the ballot.

The unofficial results show a record turnout in New Mexico, with 912,565 of 1,351,811 eligible voters — 67.507 percent — casting ballots in the general election. In Doña Ana County, the secretary of state's office said 81,815 of 128,777 eligible voters — 63.53 percent — voted early or on Election Day.

Check your Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) Grapppler mailing to confirm your regular day for trash pickup. For those affected by the change in their trash day, a notice will accompany the 2021 Grapppler schedule that will be sent out at the beginning of December.

Due to the growth of the city, and future anticipated growth, LCU will be changing routes for 24 percent of LCU Solid Waste residential customers effective January 2021. The Grapppler mailing will be sent out at the beginning of December.

LCU services roughly 38,000 residential and 2,100 commercial containers, Monday through Friday. There are currently nine residential routes and six

Your Trash Day May Change in January 2021: Watch for New Grapppler Schedule

Check your LCU Grapppler mailing in December. Some Las Cruces customers will have a new trash pick up day for both their solid waste and their recycling in January 2021.

commercial routes run daily. LCU predicts the Solid Waste customer base will potentially increase by 25% over the next five years. This information is based on the current permits and plan reviews for master planned subdivisions and the number of residential lots expected.

LCU enlisted a

consultant, Easy Route, a subsidiary of Routeware, LCU's on-board Solid Waste technology, to help analyze how routes operate in detail. The consultants discovered – thanks to data collected by the trucks over the last year – that some routes are overly burdened in comparison with others.

Robin Lawrence, LCU deputy director Solid Waste, explained that right now routes farther away from the transfer station take longer to complete and these are also the routes that have the most growth.

“We have other drivers that have fewer containers to service going to help their coworkers when their route is complete. Some routes have 616 containers, some have as high as 1,552,” Lawrence said. “Balancing the number of pickups on the routes will help spread the workload and will provide more efficient service that our customers see weekly.”

The title is president, not king, hero or savior

Americans love celebrity. That's why TV programs such as "Keeping up with the Kardashians," "Dancing with the Stars," and "Celebrity Apprentice" have such staying power. Celebrity has driven talk shows for generations.

We each have our own stories of a "brush with greatness" we love to tell.

Ask me about the six Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame members I've met over the years, and be prepared for an evening of tales.

Our U.S. president, however, should not be considered the same thing as a celebrity.

As I write this, the evening of Election Day, we have no clue who our president will be. Even when you read this, which is likely the morning of Friday, Nov. 6, it may not be certain.

We do know it will be either incumbent Donald Trump or challenger Joe Biden.

Many made their vote — whether it was for Biden or Trump — with the expectation their candidate would "save" America. And those who voted that way cannot conceive of how some of their fellow Americans could have the opposite

view. Many Trump supporters say a vote for Biden is a vote for socialism. Many Biden supporters say a vote for Trump is a vote for fascism.

Too many people view the presidency as an all-or-nothing proposition.

It didn't used to be that way.

The bold and daring revolutionaries who declared independence in 1776, and then won the war against the British to

achieve our cherished independence, did so because they no longer wanted one man — in this case England's King George III — to hold so much power over them.

Our first president, George Washington, was hesitant to wield too much power. The framers of the constitution expressly built in checks and balances (the House of Representatives, the Senate, the courts) to keep one man or one branch from having too much power.

Today, nearly 250 years later, America's lust for celebrity, and for magic quick-fix solutions, has us hoping each presidential candidate is "the one" who will make everything better.

At the same time, dozens of major propaganda outlets spend massive amounts of time, energy and money working

to demonize "the other one." That us-against-them approach, from both the left and the right, has left us in a situation where Americans no longer respect the office just because of the office.

The "president as celebrity" syndrome seemed to begin with John F. Kennedy who, not coincidentally, was the first president to be active entirely during the era of television. Kennedy was young, brash, attractive and charismatic. He had the added bonus of being a World War II hero.

Kennedy was a great leader. He was particularly a hero to young Americans. But I also maintain he was one of our most overrated presidents. His tragic death by assassination has frozen him in time, and made him a martyr of sorts.

YOU HAVE COME INTO CONTACT WITH A COVID-POSITIVE PERSON

Asymptomatic people who are close contacts or household members of New Mexico residents who have already tested positive for the coronavirus. "Close contact" means spending 3 minutes or longer within 6 feet of someone who is confirmed to have COVID-19 when that person was in their infectious period. Wearing a mask or cloth face covering does not affect the definition for close contact.

YOU LIVE OR WORK IN A COMMUNAL SETTING

Asymptomatic people who live or work in congregate settings such as detention centers and long-term care facilities.

YOU HAVE A SURGERY OR MEDICAL PROCEDURE SCHEDULED

Patients who are scheduled for surgery and whose provider has advised them to get tested before the procedure.

The code-breaking car-retrofitting home shops, the yahoo racers who seem to believe they will earn a role in the next Fast and Furious movie franchise, the pain and suffering of the drivers and their families and we who want peaceful sleep, unfortunately, we are all victims of those who flout

Access to food and water remains challenging in N.M.

There is nothing more basic to life than food and water. And, yet, in New Mexico we have among the highest rates of hunger in the country and communities that are without access to water.

It is hard to imagine in the 21st century that food and water insecurity continue to have such a profound impact on our state. That is why we must take decisive action during the upcoming legislative session to address the food and water needs of our communities.

Before the pandemic, one in four children and one in six adults experienced hunger in New Mexico, numbers that helped propel New Mexico to 50th in the nation for child well-being. Since March, the pandemic has strained our economy, food system and supply chains like never before, exposing vulnerabilities in vital support systems and exacerbating hunger.

At the height of the pandemic, agricultural producers were unable to get produce to markets. Food banks and grocery stores were unable to obtain essential goods. Food pantries and meal programs did not have sufficient PPE, staffing or resources

to meet demands. And the number of people seeking emergency food assistance soared. As a result, food insecurity has grown to one in three children in just months.

Throughout this time, New Mexicans have risen to the occasion. Neighbors have helped neighbors, grassroots and mutual aid organizations have stepped in and major investments have been made by nonprofit and philanthropic donors to help weather the storm. The state's five food banks and hundreds of sister agencies have mobilized on a massive scale, and farmers and ranchers have donated untold amounts of food.

State, federal and tribal aid has helped provide thousands of boxes of food and helped bring water to families without access. Efforts to bring trucked and bottled water have been especially crucial in Diné communities, where 30 percent of homes do not have running water across the Navajo Nation.

Mutual aid and nonprofit organizations further helped move food, water and other essential items to communities, and especially to elders and those most in need.

Through this massive statewide effort, hundreds of people affiliated with dozens of organizations, government agencies and businesses have come together nearly every week since March as part of our Food, Hunger and Agriculture Workgroup to help address these challenges and support

efforts on the ground. The workgroup initially came together last summer to work on policies to address structural issues in our food system that led to the export of over 90 percent of the food produced in our state, while our communities face systemic hunger.

Little did we know how critical this work would become. These relationships helped advance key initiatives during the last legislative session and have been crucial to helping coordinate and feed New Mexicans during the pandemic.

Along the way, we have learned and grown significantly — with hundreds more participating. Among the most important things we have learned is that, although our people are resilient, our food system is vulnerable.

To address the food,

hunger and water issues that are impacting our communities, we must take decisive action. That is why our workgroup is drafting a Food and Farm Bill for the upcoming legislative session, as it is essential to supporting the economic recovery of our farmers and addressing the basic food and water needs of our families.

Nothing is more fundamental to life, to culture, to our economy and to the well-being of our people than access to food and water. Please help us shape and support this critical legislation and support your local food banks and farmers.

To the editor:

This is a photo, taken Sunday, Oct. 25, of a large outdoor party at the Baptist church on North Sonoma Ranch Boulevard, between noon and 3 p.m. It included what appeared to be 100-200 people — few wearing masks — food, drink, a concert performance and even jumping castles.

This was shared with me as a physician who is trying very hard on a daily basis to protect

our cancer patients and our staff from becoming infected.

The utter disregard these individuals demonstrated for their fellow community members is soul-crushing. Even if we didn't have an explosion of cases this past weekend, one has to question the decency and logic of these individuals. This could turn into a super-spreader event. And our hospitals are at capacity. El Paso is under a curfew, and patients are being flown out of the city. Health care workers are exhausted and at least 12 locally were infected last week alone.

This is not a political debate despite how many

wish to make it so; it is a healthcare catastrophe. Dona Ana County residents should be ashamed we had the highest number of new cases of any county in the state, including Bernalillo County.

One also needs to recognize that folks with other health issues are at risk of not receiving the appropriate care if physicians and other providers can't order appropriate tests, imaging, surgeries, or, if necessary, even hospitalizations.

I implore all to reconsider their behaviors.

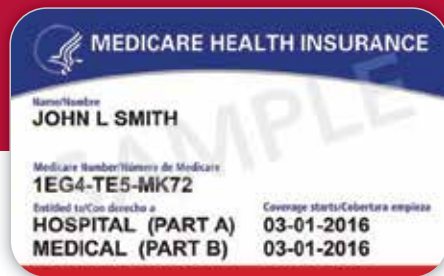

Conway trees

To the editor:

Thank you for reporting on the Conway trees public information meeting conducted Oct. 13. The meeting was on short notice with a limited area of notification. I and many others were unable to ask questions and give comments during the limited meeting time.

The issue is of interest to residents well beyond Conway Ave. Many city residents enjoy the Conway Canopy, including the neighborhood residents like myself. Most people moved to the Conway neighborhood because of the tree canopy.

I have concerns that some of the city statements reported in the article are misleading. The article reports "The city has no plans to significantly alter the canopy, Public Works Department (PWD) interim Director David Sedillo said at the meeting." I do not remember hearing that at the meeting. However, the city plans to cut 20 trees with no replant will significantly

alter the Conway canopy. Sedillo also said, "removal of any trees would take place with input and consensus from the community." However, on the Oct. 13 meeting, they said tree removal is scheduled within the next five weeks. So much for community input/consensus.

The city also said, "Additional plans for the area could include capital improvements like curbs, gutters, sidewalks and bike lanes in the corridor that runs down Conway." They also told us that possible improvement plans may or may not include trees and used this as their reason for not replanting. It appears to me that the possible capital improvements is an excuse not to replant trees. Has any Conway Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) been discussed, proposed, planned, approved and funded?

The city should only trim/prune selected dangerous tree limbs/branches until a comprehensive plan is in place.

Greater Las Cruces Chamber's Debbi Moore: Positive focus, moving business forward

Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce (GLCCC) President and CEO Debbi Moore is looking at her leadership role in the community differently since the onset of COVID-19.

New glasses have helped.

Moore, chamber director since May 2016, said she began experiencing vision issues after the pandemic started. Her eye doctor explained that it was "Zoom fatigue" and fitted her with specially designed computer glasses.

"That helps tremendously," said Moore, who recommended a visit to an optometrist for anyone who is having vision issues because of spending more time on a computer.

Participating in a dozen or so Zoom meetings a week, each lasting about an hour, Moore said she continues to focus on moving forward in a positive direction.

"We need to get businesses open," Moore said. "In the midst of all this negativity, we've got

to focus on businesses and move businesses forward."

Whatever the decisions made by Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham about the hours and capacity at which businesses in New Mexico can operate, and whether or not Moore agrees with them, "my focus is 'pivot, navigate, reset and move forward,'" she said.

That means businesses locally and statewide, because, in addition to GLCCC, Moore is chair of the New Mexico Chamber Executives Association board, which links 25-30 chambers of commerce across the state, she said. Moore also is one of 42 partici-

pants nationally in the Association of Chamber of Commerce Executives Association Economic Recovery Fellowship.

"My role is not only to represent Las Cruces, Doña Ana County and southern New Mexico, but also to lead our chambers around the state to be influential, to be supportive of business," she said.

Because so many issues impact the workforce, Moore said she is focused on for-profit businesses and nonprofit organizations, business owners and employees, children and adults.

Closing schools during the pandemic "has impacted the workforce more than anything I've ever seen," she said. Working from home, unemployment, childcare and increasing mental health issues and their impact on business mean Moore and other cham-

ber directors must help clients and communities figure out how to "navigate these new waters."

"My role as a leader in the community is to partner, to collaborate, be a point of information, make sure all of our partners in the community are on the same page," Moore said, "to really make sure those lines of communication with all of us stay open. Communication is happening and that is something that is very positive. We are a resilient community. We're going to shop locally, we're going to promote locally, we're going to help locally."

On a more personal level, "I rely on my faith a lot," Moore said. "There's always a light at the end of the tunnel and tomorrow's going to be a better day."

Moore said the isolation she has experienced from working from home

during the pandemic has meant revisiting the grief of losing her beloved husband, Bill, who died suddenly in 2018. And, like many others, Moore said she is also grieving the loss of "a normalcy, a way of life. Businesses will never be the same," she said. "I talk to a lot of business owners," she said, and many are both sad and angry.

"I try to calm the anger down," Moore said. "We may not agree, but we can be kind, be nice to each other, respect the journey each of us is on. It's a process. Eventually, we're going to find a new normalcy. We're taking it a day at a time."

Moore is a member of the Las Cruces Opens

Council for COVID-19 Recovery, vice chair of the Las Cruces Economic Recovery Council, chair of the Bridge of Southern New Mexico board and a member of the New Mexico State Workforce Board. She received the 2019 Governor's Distinguished Public Servant Award and the 2018 Small Business Administration New Mexico Legacy Award.

A native of Claremore, Oklahoma, Moore has lived in New Mexico since 1984. She has more than 30 years' experience with chambers of commerce. Moore has a blended family of six children, 14 grandchildren, 14 great-grandchildren and nine great-great-grandchildren.

Two new Virgin Galactic pilots coming to New Mexico

Virgin Galactic has two new pilots on staff, bringing the total to eight.

Jameel Janjua and Patrick Moran will be based at Spaceport America and are starting on extensive training programs before flying SpaceShipTwo.

While Janjua and Moran will initially operate in a test-pilot capacity, they -- along with their six colleagues -- will ultimately become the world's first commercial spaceship pilots, flying paid customers into space and back.

Each of them has flown in both military and commercial roles, involving training, operations and test flights, as well as flying passengers and managing crew.

Janjua has completed more than 4,000 flying hours in more than 45 different vehicles throughout his career, which spans more than 20 years in the Royal Canadian Air Force. He completed exchange tours for the Royal Air Force and the U.S. Air Force and is on the board of directors for the Society of Experimental Test Pilots (SETP).

"Helping to democratize space travel is a unique honor," Janjua said. "With society on the cusp of opening space to all humankind, I cannot think of a more privileged role than to be a small part of



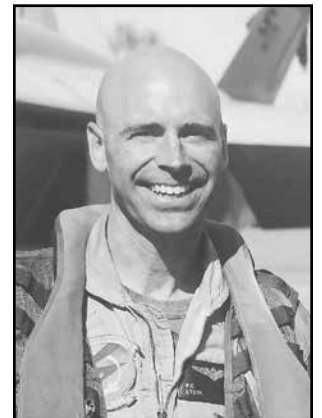

the amazing team guiding people to their dreams and beyond."

Moran served as a pilot in the U.S. Marine Corps for 20 years, including roles as a test pilot, test pilot school instructor and the lead government test pilot for U.S. Navy and Marine Corps versions of the F-35 Joint Strike Fighter. He then entered business aviation as a broker, consultant and charter pilot. He joins Virgin Galactic with more than 3,000 flight hours in 34 different aircraft.

"I'm excited to join this fantastic team of talented pioneers leading the charge for commercial space travel and now in the final stages of its flight test program," Moran said. "As a flight instructor, I loved to take people flying in the F/A-18 for the first time, to see their huge smiles as they climbed out of the cockpit. I can't wait to share the experience of going to space with our future astronauts and to

see their reactions as they step out of the spaceship and describe their views of Earth from space."

Both pilots will also train to fly the carrier aircraft VMS Eve. VMS Eve provides a way for the pilots to fly simulated parts of the SpaceShipTwo flight trajectory, gaining valuable hands-on training. Other assignments for the pilots will include flying other company support aircraft, working mission control, flight planning and support various detailed engineering and project roles across the company.

Lt. Gov. Howie Morales: 'Huge concern' about COVID-19

New Mexico Lt. Gov. Howie Morales said people were standing in long lines and expressing "huge concern" at COVID-19 mobile testing sites he visited recently in Sunland Park and Anthony, N.M.

New Mexicans are feeling "a lot of concern,

a lot of anxiety" about COVID-19, he said during a visit to the Las Cruces Bulletin, and that's part of the reason the mobile test sites are being set up and manned by officials from the New Mexico Department of Health, the U.S. Health and Human Services Department and the New Mexico National Guard.

The lieutenant governor said large gatherings are the major cause of the recent increase in COVID-19 cases around the state. He said Doña Ana County is also experiencing an increase in part because of its proximity to El Paso County, which is seeing an even bigger increase.

"We're at a critical point now," Morales said, because of increased hospitalizations around the state due to COVID. Healthcare workers are at the "breaking point," he said.

Morales said he spoke to Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham during his visit to southern New Mexico to discuss "solutions and strategies to keep New

Mexicans safe" during the pandemic. He said he is also staying in communication with community leaders about "what can be done."

Dealing with COVID-19 effectively goes beyond the borders of the state, Morales said, and he was pleased to hear that Las

Cruces Mayor Ken Miyagishima is in contact with El Paso Mayor Dee Margo and officials in Ciudad Juarez, Mexico about the virus.

"We want to be part of those solutions," Morales said.

The lieutenant governor also said dealing with

COVID-19 is an individual responsibility. New Mexico has previously been a model to the entire country about how to effectively reduce the spread of the virus, Morales said, and can do it again.

"We can get to that point, but it takes every one of us," he said.

State's poverty level shows little improvement for young children

Bulletin report

Data released by the U.S. Census Bureau show a significant improvement in the poverty rate in New Mexico between 2018 and 2019, New Mexico Voices for Children (NMVC) said in a news release.

That tracks with an increase in the median income during that time-frame. However, the data show little progress for children younger than 5, and inequities continue to persist along racial and ethnic lines, the news release said. The data released earlier this month show the state's poverty rate for all children ages 0-17 decreased



from 26.3 percent in 2018 to 24.9 percent in 2019.

“While it’s always great to see improvement, we know that the COVID-19 pandemic has likely wiped these gains away for many New Mexicans,” said NMVC Executive Director James Jimenez. “We know that the pandemic hasn’t hit every New Mexican in the same way. Families of color and immigrants often don’t have access to the same supports as other families in the state and are more likely

to have missed out on federal relief, and workers in service jobs who were earning low wages before the pandemic have suffered more under the recession than those in occupations where they’ve been able to work remotely.”

The total poverty rate — for New Mexicans of all ages — dropped from 19.5 percent in 2018 to 18.2 percent in 2019, the news release said. The 2019 data ranks New Mexico 48th in the nation in both overall and child poverty, ahead only of Louisiana and Mississippi. The 2018 data ranked New Mexico 49th for overall poverty and 48th for child poverty.

New Mexico’s median income increased by 10 percent, up from \$47,169 in 2018 to \$51,945 in 2019, NMVC said. While that is still well below the national average, the state’s median income increased at a higher rate than did the nation as a whole — which saw a six percent increase, rising from \$61,937 to \$65,712. New Mexico still ranks 50th in the nation for its poverty rate among people with a bachelor’s degree and ranks 48th in poverty among all people who work.

NMVC champions numerous public policies that can reduce poverty and ensure that families have the resources they

need to thrive, but said that those policies must be targeted correctly.

“We need to acknowledge the racial inequities in poverty, particularly as they’ve been exacerbated by COVID-19,” said Emily Wildau, who coordinates NMVC’s KIDS COUNT program, which tracks data on child well-being. “All policies that are designed to help families recover from the pandemic and to alleviate poverty must be centered on eliminating the inequities along racial lines.”

These policies include making sure families can meet basic needs, putting financial resources into the hands of New Mexico families who will spend

money quickly and locally and raising enough revenue so the state can make investments in the structures and services that create jobs, NMVC said, including education, health care, public safety and infrastructure.

Founded in 1987, NMVC is a nonpartisan nonprofit based in Albuquerque whose mission is “to improve the status, well-being and racial/ethnic equity of New Mexico’s children, families and communities in the areas of health, education and economic security by promoting public policies through credible research and effective advocacy,” according to www.nmvoices.org.

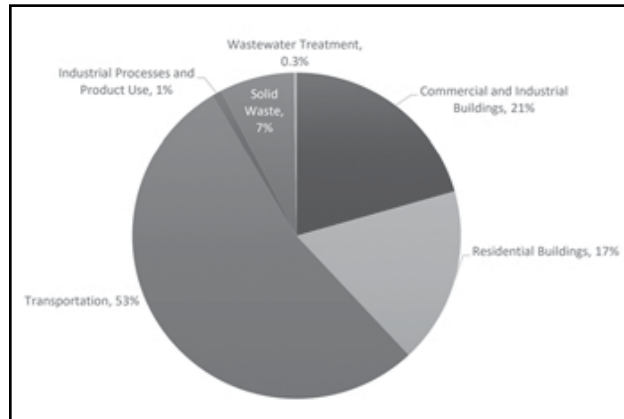
City council adopts climate action plan, affordable housing agreement

The Las Cruces City Council has adopted the city's first ever climate action plan.

The city began efforts to minimize its impact on climate change and identify greenhouse gas (GHG) emission mitigation strategies, the city said in the executive summary of the resolution.

The work included “developing the city’s first community-wide and municipal GHG emissions inventories, a strategic stakeholder engagement process to develop GHG reduction strategies and modeling the emissions reduction potential associated with the selected

strategies,” the executive summary said. “The result is an actionable and aggressive plan that guides the municipality and community to reduce its GHG emissions by 73 percent by 2050.”

The city’s sustainability office will work with other

city departments and stakeholders “to develop specific policies and actions that ensure an equitable climate transition.”

“You’ve really taken this and developed a fantastic department and I’m really proud of how you’ve been able

to do this,” Mayor Ken Miyagishima told city Sustainability Officer Lisa Larocque. “This is really very good stuff,” he said.

“I’ve studied climate change for a couple-three decades now,” said Councilor Gill Sorg, who recommended even more aggressive action by the city, including phasing out its use of natural gas and fossil-fuel-powered vehicles, using more electric busses and making city buildings more energy efficient.

“GHG inventories and climate action plans are considered an essential framework for reducing a jurisdiction’s climate impact,” said Larocque, who has been the city’s sustainability officer since August 2013. “For cities that have sustainability offices, I would say that the majority have plans or are in the process of developing them.” Larocque said Las Cruces “is also a member of Climate Mayors that have made a commitment to support the Paris Climate Agreement. The Climate Action Plan is an expression of that commitment.”

Las Cruces created the sustainability office in 2009.

Affordable housing

At the same meeting, the council approved a resolution establishing an affordable housing development agreement between the city and Tierra Del Sol Housing Corporation that is expected to lead to the construction of 32 affordable housing units on nearly 4.5 acres of land known as the Sierra Tract, just east and south of Sierra Middle School, the city said in a news release.

Construction of the estimated \$3.2 million project could begin as soon as February.

Construction will include eight single-family homes, 12 townhomes and 12 apartments, the city said. Amenities will include a walking path and a community garden. The council also asked for easy access to Sierra Middle School for children living in the subdivision and nearby neighborhood.

The city acquired the Sierra Tract property from Las Cruces Public

Schools in trade for a road improvement project on Bruins Lane.

Las Cruces has “a big shortage” of affordable housing available for rent and for purchase, said city Housing Development Coordinator Jan Lauterbach.

The resolution passed 6-1, with Miyagishima voting no.

“Tierra del Sol has always done a great job, and so my no vote wasn’t necessarily against them,” the mayor said in an email to the Bulletin. “I was of the impression this parcel of land was to be used for our senior residents who are having a difficult time finding a safe and functional place to live at an affordable price. It is true that we have a housing shortage, but these future tenants have one or sometimes two wage earners in the family as opposed to our seniors who are retired and living on a fixed income.”

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development defines affordable housing as housing that can be obtained for 30 percent or less of the resident’s income.

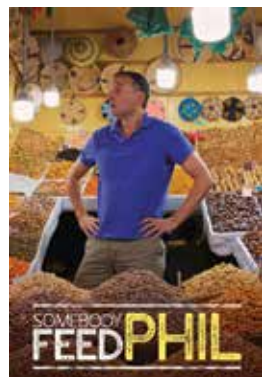

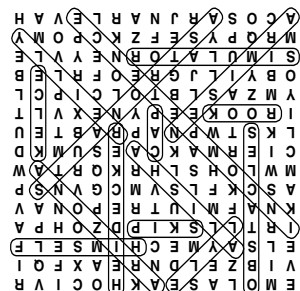

Österreich book looks back at first nuclear blast stories

The Atomic Age was officially brought to being in the desert of southern New Mexico where scientists with The Manhattan Project detonated the first atomic bomb on July 16, 1945, at what is known as the Trinity Site.

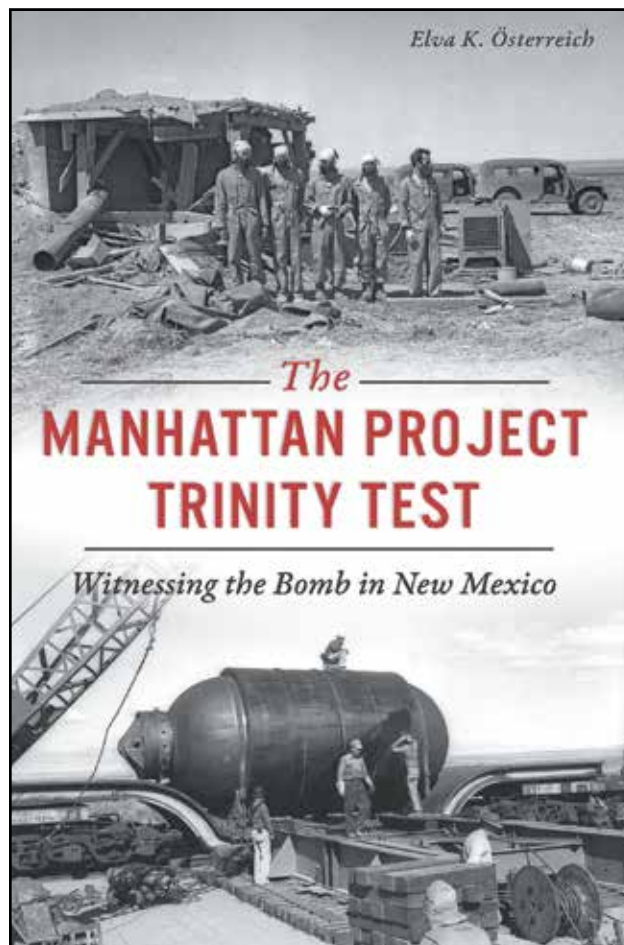
Much has been written about that capstone event, and The Bulletin's own Elva Österreich is the latest to offer up an angle that teems with personal stories of people who lived and died on ranches and in communities nearby.

"The Manhattan Project Trinity Test: Witnessing the Bomb in New Mexico," was officially released by Arcadia Publishing Monday, Nov. 2.

Growing up in New Mexico, Österreich said she first heard about the bomb during her teens, but it wasn't until she moved to Alamogordo years later that she began talking to people who remembered the day the Sun rose twice, bright above the desert floor.

She also visited the site in 2001 with her then-10-year-old son.

"I found it somewhat interesting, but not mind blowing or powerful in any way," she said. "A black obelisk, a few big metal things and a little bit of trinitite left around for folks to see. They do



have a table set up with docents sharing information and answering questions. The most exciting part of the trip for my son was being able to try a Geiger counter on several objects, including trinitite."

Trinitite is the name given to glass-like chunks of molten sand that resulted from the intense heat of the bomb blast.

Österreich said The Alamogordo Daily News set out to do a commemorative edition of the 60th

anniversary of the blast in 2005.

"The stories about that day and the possible repercussions for those in southern New Mexico made for some fascinating reading and some wonderful interviews completed by the staff at the paper at the time," Österreich said.

The seed of the book began with that series of interviews. Österreich said most of the material she'd read about the Trinity Site, the bomb and its history and aftermath re-

lied heavily on interviews with scientists and support personnel who either watched the blast from a safe distance or were involved in the project at some level. Österreich said she realized there were other, more personal stories waiting to be told.

There were sad stories of families ravaged by cancers through generations after the blast. There were funny stories about children told to hide under their beds while the armed adults went outside to see what the hell had just happened, and while hiding under the bed concocting ways they

could, if necessary, defend themselves by throwing fruits and nuts at any invaders.

And there were bizarre stories about inner-earth aliens disturbed by the blast. One of those was attributed to a man named Mark Harp.

"Mr. Harp believed there was a humanoid civilization living inside the earth. He believed the Trinity Site explosion shook the whole earth, and the humanoids were disturbed and concerned by the event," Österreich said. "They thought there might be some kind of danger approaching, so

they sent a team out of a hole at the North Pole in a flying ship to New Mexico to see what was going on. Unfortunately, their vehicle malfunctioned, and in July 1947, they crashed into the New Mexico desert northeast of Trinity Site, creating the alien confusion known as the Roswell Incident."

Österreich said that while the book recreates the chain of events that led up to the blast and the historic repercussions of the dawn of the Nuclear Age, her goal was to focus on what it all meant to the

The running time for "Tracer" is approximately

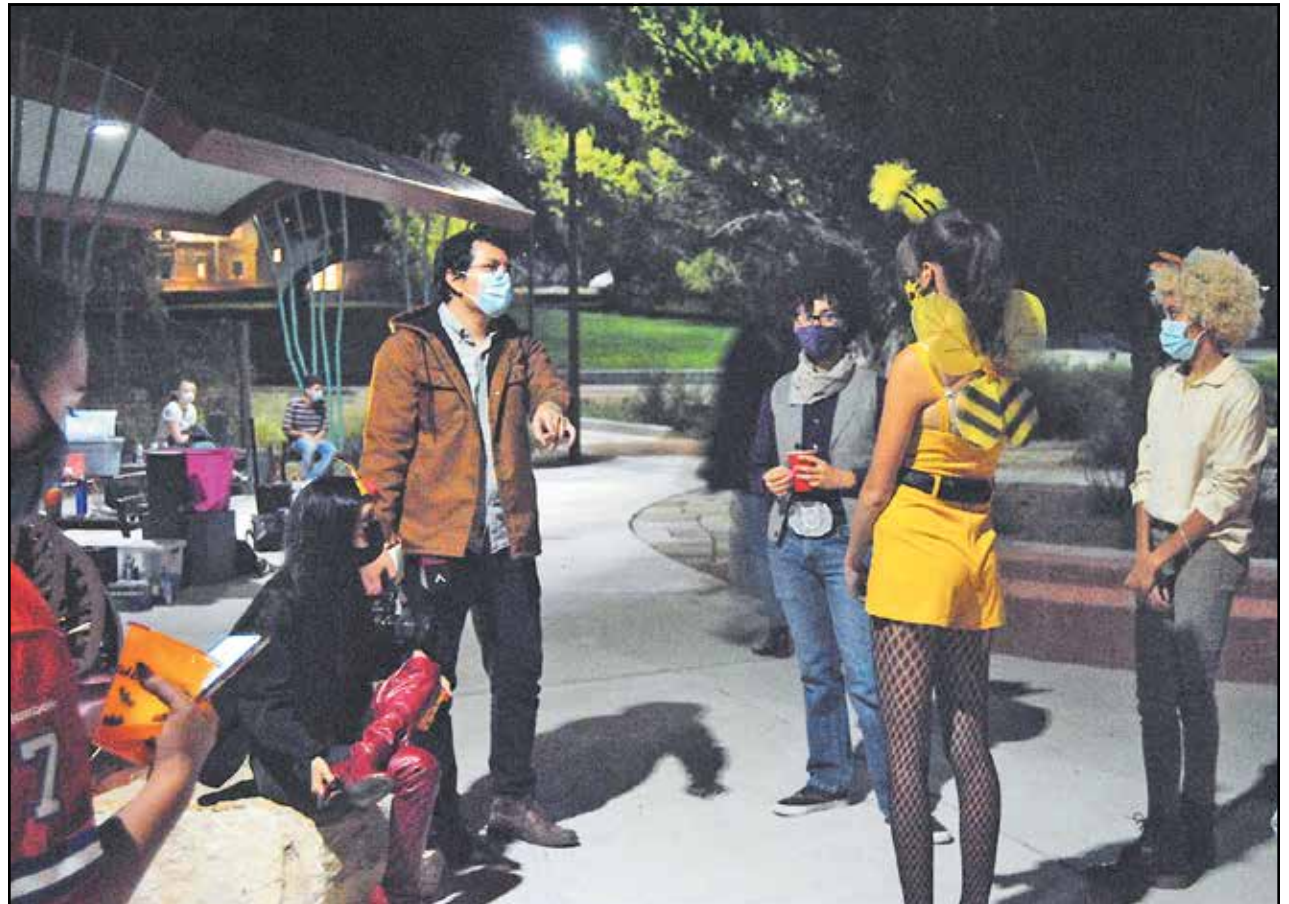

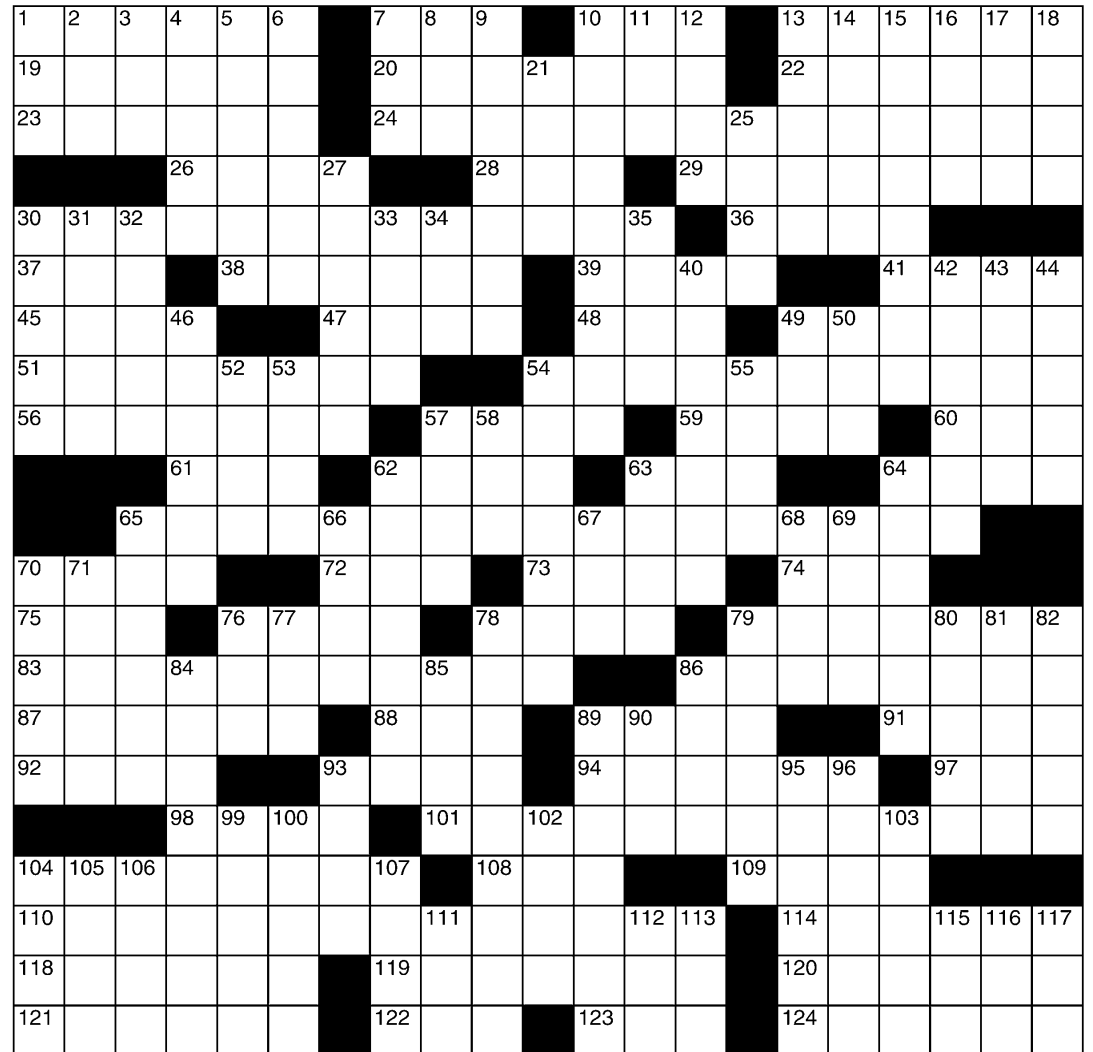

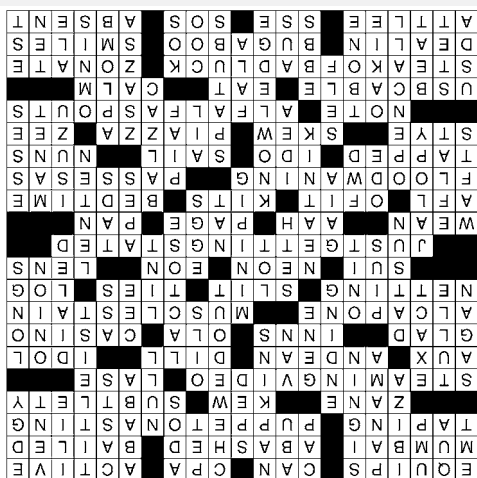

Vote your beliefs, and show empathy to others

The members of my family — locally and in a major city on the eastern seaboard — voted in person. It is our duty as American citizens.

It is, moreover, our responsibility as community members who care about the welfare of other community members, where community can mean our neighborhood, organizations (including religious congregations) to which we belong, our state, our nation and the entire human family.

I served as a rabbi in six states. I voted in all of them. I am still a student of the political scenes in every one of those

states. I have had the opportunity to meet and, in some cases, get to know congressional representatives, senators, governors and presidential candidates from both major political parties. Whether we agreed or not,

those ties created connections I valued.

I served on the Kansas State Holocaust Commission for 19 years (most as commission chair). Leaders of both major political parties shared a concern about educating people of all ages about the tragic events of the Holocaust, so that such cruelty would not happen again. Some values should, in fact, tran-

scend our differences.

One of the most impactful books I have read in recent years was written by Ariel Burger, who served as a teaching assistant at Boston University to Elie Wiesel, a renowned author, humanitarian, Nobel laureate and Holocaust survivor. In his book, “Witness: Lessons from Elie Wiesel’s Classroom,” Burger offered readers an opportunity to enter into the presence of Wiesel as a moral guide and spiritual mentor.

In one of my favorite passages in the book, Wiesel explained to his students how we can approach each other with respect and empathy: “To be human is to share a common origin. And if we

share a common origin, our destinies are entwined. What happens to me will eventually happen to you; what happened to my people is a foreshadowing of what will threaten the world...Therefore the most important biblical commandment is ‘Thou shall not stand idly by the shedding of the blood of thy fellow human being.’ ‘Fellow human being’ is universal. Anyone who is suffering, anyone who is threatened becomes your responsibility. If you can feel this and act with even a little bit more humanity, more sensitivity, as a result, that is the beginning. It is not the end — I do not know how to end hatred, I truly wish I did — but recognizing our shared humanity is a good

beginning.”

Hatred, dehumanization, demonization, blaming, bullying and abuse of power have not disappeared from the human family. The beliefs that one’s view is necessarily better than any other perspective, and that there is no room for other opinions, are still with us.

In contrast, the Talmud, the Jewish compendium of stories and legal discussions of rabbis who lived 1500-2000 years ago, preserved both majority and minority views expressed in their discussions and deliberations. The United States Supreme Court does the same with majority and minority opinions, so as not to lose the insights or wisdom coming from

either side.

I heard Ariel Burger speak about his book at a conference last December. One of his statements, based on Wiesel’s teachings, stuck with me: “Tragedy does not define us. Our response to tragedy defines us.”

We can properly respond to tragedy and other challenges when we come together based on empathy and a shared sense of responsibility.

That is a lesson for our time.

Fighting the good fight to save Christianity

Warren Farha opened Eighth Day Books in 1988. Eighth Day is an exemplary independent bookstore in Wichita.

Warren’s vision was both simple and profound: “We eschew the trendy, and do not carry books solely based on their saleability. Instead, we’re selective, offering an eccentric com-

munity of books based on this organizing principle: If a book (be it literary, scientific, historical or theological) sheds light on ultimate questions in an excellent way, then it’s a worthy candidate for inclusion in our catalog. Reality doesn’t divide itself into ‘religious’ and ‘literary’ and ‘secular’

spheres, so we don’t either. We’re convinced that all truths are related and every truth, if we pay attention rightly, directs our gaze toward God.” On this ground has grown an institution.

Twenty years ago, Erin Doom, who worked at Eighth Day, thought the bookstore’s vision could be turned into an institute to sponsor book-review groups, maybe even conferences, to attract

thoughtful people who were serious about their faith and their desire to “come further up and further in,” as C. S. Lewis ends *The Last Battle of the Narnia Chronicles*.

Eighth Day Institute (EDI) began in the Wichita area, but grew far wider, as well. EDI is committed to “the renewal of culture through faith and learning,” beginning with the individual, and all programs reflect that com-

mitment and hope. Erin remains director of the institute, whose board has dreamt up, encouraged or fostered these programs.

I was deeply honored to be one of two speakers at EDI’s Inklings Conference recently. My experience underscored my belief that we live in a civilization whose religion is secularism — separated from all else and focused on material ends — and thus we must prepare as

Christians to “fight the good fight,” and that has two arenas.

First, we begin inwardly with conviction and commitment. We need to make commitment, as individuals and as a community, to the historic marks of our faith: word and sacrament, prayer and fellowship. These are the marks of the church externally since earliest times (see

Big Tuna Pipe open and operating on west Amador Avenue

With a fabulous view of the Organ Mountains to the east, Big Tuna Pipe is open and operating on 13 acres at 1846 W. Amador Ave.

Big Tuna began production in Las Cruces in late March and expects to produce about 14 miles of pipe before the end of 2020, said Big Tuna Director of Operations Mike Watters. The property is fully graded and landscaped, with about 30,000 square-feet of building space currently in use.

Big Tuna uses five high-tech conveyer belts and a large number of shipping containers that the company bought in Santa Teresa to make its product.

The company "holds the exclusive rights to manufacture and distribute a high-density

pipe product patented by Australian-based Long Pipes Ltd.," the New Mexico Economic Development Department said in a news release when the company announced in January that it would open a manufacturing center in Las Cruces.

"The product has a significantly larger internal diameter and a higher pressure rating than current market solutions. The initial target market for the piping is the oil and gas industry for process water management systems."

Most of the pipe it produces in Las Cruces will be shipped to eastern New Mexico and west Texas, Watters said. But that could expand as Big Tuna moves into additional industries, he said, including mining and potable and non-potable water.

By year's end, Watters said Big Tuna should have 20 employees at work in Las Cruces. The company plans to expand to 70-100 employees as it increases capacity, which could reach 1,000 miles of pipe a year, he said.

Big Tuna produces 10-, 12-, 16- and 20-inch pipe that is extremely sturdy but surprisingly lightweight, weighing in at 7.5 pounds per foot, Watters said. Most of the pipe it produces and ships is in 50-foot lengths, he said.

Working with the Mesilla Valley Economic Development Alliance (MVEDA) and the City of

Las Cruces to find a home for Big Tuna in Las Cruces and begin production, "things have gone pretty smoothly," Watters said. Production has not been slowed by COVID-19, he said, except for occasional and brief shipping delays.

"We were excited to work with our partners at the State and MVEDA to recruit Big Tuna to Las Cruces," Mayor Ken Miyagishima said. "The City Council supported them by passing a LEDA agreement to help them pay for land, building, and infrastructure in exchange for 30 new jobs in our community. These

were higher than median wage jobs that will be open for local Las Cruces residents. This ribbon cutting event was another milestone for Big Tuna to hire and grow in our community and we are looking forward to the impact this will have to our overall economy."

"We see a very bright future with this company," Watters said at a January news conference in Las Cruces. The company is based in Wheatridge, Colorado.

Stampede Meats, Lescombes among JTIP recipients

The State of New Mexico's Job Training Incentive Program (JTIP) Board has awarded more than \$5.5 million to 18 companies across the state — including in Las Cruces and Deming — during September and October, in sup-

port of 803 new jobs, state Economic Development Dept. Sec. Alicia J. Keyes has announced.

The September awards totaled \$3.6 million for 672 trainees and one intern, with another \$1.9 million for 129 trainees and one intern awarded in October. Average salaries for trainees range from \$11.62 to

\$69.71 an hour.

The JTIP program is instrumental in attracting and retaining businesses in New Mexico. Its reimbursement for training new employees and employees who wish to improve their current job positions is a driving force for expansion of local employment, the news release

said.

"JTIP is supporting new jobs in timber, meat processing, energy, robotics, food manufacturing, software and satellites," Keyes said. "These are the diverse industries that are growing and expanding in New Mexico with help from JTIP and other economic incentives. This is one way

the state and lawmakers can help businesses grow and create jobs in uncertain economic times."

The awardees include:
• Stampede Meat, Inc., Sunland Park: 377 trainees. Stampede Meat is a leading provider of portion-controlled protein solutions. Its facility in Sunland Park is the largest of the Stam-

Service-dog training facility breaks ground in Las Cruces

Construction began Oct. 28 on what will become a 3,557 square-foot service dog breeding and training facility at 4280 Taurus Drive in Las Cruces, Four Paws and A Wake Up, Inc. nonprofit said in a news release.

Four Paws was established to provide trained service dogs to veterans at no cost. Its mission is to empower people with disabilities to achieve greater independence and enhanced quality of life through the services of specially trained dogs. Some of the future service dogs will be bred at the new facility, the news release said, while others

will be obtained through local the Animal Services Center of the Mesilla Valley and rescue organizations.

The name Four Paws and a Wake Up comes

from a military term referring to the “wake ups” a service member has before a new duty station, deployment, discharge or retirement. In this case, it is the “wake up” the

veteran will experience after receiving his or her service animal.

In many ways, the project began more than 20 years ago with North Carolina resident Faye Joseph’s dedication to helping service dog organizations from coast to coast, the news release said. Nearly two years ago, Four Paws CEO Andrea Joseph, who has benefited from having her own service dogs since 2007, took her mother’s dreams a step further and envisioned creating a facility upon her retirement from NMSU as a professor in criminal justice.

“There are no service dog training facilities in

southern New Mexico despite the presence of such a large veteran community,” Andrea Joseph said. “I owe my mother a debt of gratitude and intend to pay it forward by continuing a legacy of service to oth-

ers.”

The facility is scheduled to be completed in mid-2021.

"The approach aims to build inner wealth and resiliency by emphasizing an individual's agency to choose to give less energy and relationship to negative emotions, thought patterns and circumstances while investing more into their own

(and others') strengths and success.

"The third stand of Absolute Clarity guides this process by encouraging reflection and communication around perceptions, expectations and limits. As a result, NHA empowers children and adults to direct their emotional and intellectual intensity toward achievement and self-actualization."

"Howard Glasser cre-

ated NHA in the late 1990s as an intervention for children with intense behaviors," the website said. "Since its development, the approach has been adapted for and applied to homes, schools, residential treatment centers and other diverse community and institutional settings."

The cost of the training is \$50. A limited number of fee waivers are available for qualifying

DACC nursing program reaccredited through 2028

BULLETIN REPORT

Doña Ana Community College (DACC) has announced the continuing national accreditation of its nursing program from the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN).

The nursing program began the ACEN continuing accreditation process in January, then hosted the ACEN site visit team in March 2020, where the initial recommendation for continuing accreditation for eight years was given.

On June 2, the Evaluation Review Panel (ERP)

confirmed the ACEN site visit team recommendation for continuing accreditation to the ACEN Board of Commissions (BOC). Finally, in September, the BOC upheld the recommendation by the ERP for continuing accreditation.

"Our students are very well prepared to provide quality nursing services to communities in need. Meeting accreditation standards ensures our nursing graduates are equipped to meet the challenges of the profession," said Dr. Cynthia Olivas, DACC nursing program director.

According to ACEN, the accreditation process improves the quality of education that nursing schools provide. It ensures courses have the right content, instructors are using appropriate teaching methods and schools are meeting the needs of nursing students. The accreditation process also helps keep nursing school curricula up to date with professional standards.

The nursing program's accreditation was made possible thanks to the support of the DACC community, community partnerships, nursing

faculty and students, Olivas said.

"Accreditation works to encourage faculty engagement with the curriculum through a continuous improvement process, so the program is regularly evaluated and improved as needed," said Dr. Tara Roof, DACC's nursing clinical coordinator. "Students benefit, because we have developed a quality, up-to-date program that provides students with the education they need to succeed. Our community members also benefit, because they can be confident we graduate nurses who will provide

safe, quality care to them and their loved ones."

New Mexico has 31 of 33 counties reporting a nursing shortage, and Doña Ana County is included in the 31 counties (New Mexico Health Care Workforce Committee Report, 2019).

In a study published in the April 2010 issue of Health Services Research, Dr. Linda Aiken and colleagues found that lower patient-nurse ratios in hospital units had lower patient mortality rates. The study also finds that improving the nurse to community ratios improved community health

promotion and helped patients avoid admissions to hospitals for acute exacerbations, and medical and surgical units were associated with significantly lower patient mortality rates.

"The DACC Nursing program is proud to continue to meet the critical need of the community and state by providing quality education services to prepare entry level nurses to the nursing profession," Olivas said.

Amid COVID-19, flu shots highly recommended

The New Mexico Department of Health (NMDOH) and the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) recommend getting a flu shot and underscore it as particularly important this year because of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The importance of broad public immunization is particularly key for high-risk groups like seniors.

Although some studies have shown the high-dose flu shot, approved for

people age 65 and older, to be more effective at preventing flu and reducing hospital stays, the CDC has not expressed a preference for the high-dose shot over the regular adult vaccine in this age group.

NMDOH urges providers to recommend the adult flu shot for seniors rather than waiting for a high-dose shot.

“Some seniors have avoided getting a flu shot this year because they are unable to find the high-dose shot,” said

Acting Health Secretary Billy Jimenez. “We strongly recommend seniors get vaccinated. The regular adult flu shot is far more effective than getting no flu shot when it comes to protecting yourself and those around you.”

In addition, the CDC does not recommend getting a booster, or second dose, in a single flu season.

Ankle And Foot Pain

You spend an incredible amount of time using your feet every day, and if you are suffering from foot and ankle pain, your life can be greatly impacted. It can cause dread and agony when taking the stairs, walking even short distances, or driving your car. Foot and ankle pain can stem from a variety of different causes.

Your feet and your ankles are complex mechanical structures that must work together in harmony in order to function optimally. Your ankle joint consists of three bones that all must interact with one another correctly, along with the various connective tissues that hold the assembly of the joint together. The foot is even more complex, containing approximately two dozen bones, 30 joints, and over 100 muscles, tendons, and ligaments. An injury in this area can result in pain so severe that you can't put your weight down. This leaves you with only two options; hopping around, risking injury to your other foot, or worse, being stuck in a chair, unable to go anywhere and take care of yourself or others. Even mild pain can cause physical limitations to your daily life, and burden those around you.

What condition might be causing your foot or ankle pain?

Foot and ankle pain can occur suddenly due to an acute injury, or it can develop over time in relation to a chronic, underlying condition. There are several common causes of foot pain and ankle pain, including:

Strains and sprains: A strain occurs when a muscle or tendon is stretched. A sprain occurs when a ligament is stretched too far or torn.

Arthritis: Arthritis is a common inflammatory condition that affects the joints and results in pain; the most common types including osteoarthritis and rheumatoid arthritis. Both types of arthritis can greatly impact the foot and ankle joints.

Fractures: A fracture occurs from excessive force or trauma to the bone, causing it to crack or break entirely. A fracture to the foot or ankle can result in weeks of downtime to ensure proper healing.

Tendinitis: Tendinitis occurs from excessive overuse of the tendons, causing them to become inflamed for a long time.

Bursitis: Bursitis occurs when the tendons rub against the “bursae” or anti-friction sacs, causing them to become irritated and uncomfortable.

Fallen arches: When the tendons of the foot pull together properly, your foot will form a proper arch, providing an important mechanical system which is part of walking and running. When the tendons do not pull together properly, your foot will form a very small arch or no arch at all. This is referred to as “fallen arch” or “flat foot” and can cause pain or discomfort with time.

Plantar fasciitis: Plantar fasciitis is an inflammation in the connective tissue on the bottom of your foot. This can occur from aggravated overuse, such as constant standing, improper posture, or misalignment in the lower extremity.

Tarsal tunnel syndrome: Tarsal tunnel syndrome occurs when the tibial nerve, which runs from the ankle to the foot) becomes pinched and inflamed.

Barefoot Acupuncture: Moving healthcare's needle globally

Las Cruces can't claim to be the global hub of many worldwide movements, but Crossroads Community Supported Healthcare, doing business as Barefoot Acupuncture Movement (BAM) aims to change that.

The nonprofit is run by Executive Director Dr. Ryan Bemis, who answers to a board of directors and oversees a staff of two full-time and one part-time employee.

"We partner with underserved communities to build resiliency through acupuncture. Our clinic in Las Cruces serves as the center for our global movement. We walk in solidarity with communities affected by poverty, war and injustice, offering tools and resources to build resilience," Bemis said. "Our global team mobilizes disaster relief clinics to address trauma in humanitarian settings. We accompany local groups and lend sup-

port as they take control of their healthcare. We cultivate collective local leadership and help them develop sustainable models of care for behavioral health, humanitarian aid, and as a complement to primary care. Our goal is to use acupuncture as an agent for social and intrapersonal change, both during an immediate crisis and for long-term recovery. We do this through our Barefoot Schools, Barefoot Collective and Barefoot Clinics."

Bemis said the work began in 2011, in collabo-

ration with community projects in Juarez, training people how to offer acupuncture to those affected by violence.

"During the past decade," he said, "we've trained more than 400 health workers along the U.S./Mexico border and in Latin America. Our programs have provided more than 90,000 acupuncture treatments, primarily offered by volunteers at no cost to patients lacking access to basic healthcare."

BAM is based out of the Crossroads Acupuncture Clinic at Families

and Youth, Inc., 1320 S. Solano Drive, where, Bemis said, "we offer care for working-class and veterans in our region. Humanitarian aid projects we have started include a Refugee Care Program for migrants on the U.S./Mexico border, homeless programs at Mesilla Valley Community of Hope, survivors of the El Paso 2019 mass shooting and partnerships with indigenous programs throughout Latin America to address trauma, addiction and a variety of health issues."

Bemis said the COVID-19 pandemic has both complicated BAM's mission and shown the need

for it.

"The global disparities in accessible healthcare for people have only become exaggerated in light of COVID-19," he said.

Pandemic notwithstanding, Bemis said the potential for acupuncture "as a formidable remedy" remains largely untapped.

"To make acupuncture something effective and sustainable for humanitarian aid requires a conscious grassroots approach," he said. "We regularly field inquiries from students, health practitioners and community health groups asking for our expertise and leadership in the BAM model. These requests run the

gamut from state prison facilities, the Department of Veteran's Affairs and humanitarian aid workers."

He said Las Cruces has implemented strict measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

"We follow the highest standards of CDC, national, state and local guidelines," he said, "and we'll be doing so into the future. All treatments are offered in a disinfected, isolated room away from other patients. Our commitment is providing acupuncture for a variety of mental wellness and health problems."

Bemis said area residents can support the BAM global initiative in a number of ways, the most direct of which is to make a cash or in-kind donation or make an appointment to be treated. Payments for treatments, he said, go directly to support free clinics in underserved areas around the world.

"All donations can be made through our website, as well. If your school or community agency wants to integrate acupuncture into the services offered for patients, we can offer support," Bemis said. "Local health providers can jump into our online webinars designed for training on how to use acupuncture within any community program."

When the golfing is nice, be nice back

I've written in years past about my perspective that the good people who own and run golf courses have an unequivocal obligation to do so in the most professional and excellent manner possible. That means attention to members and customers, as well as attention to detail.

I also believe we golfers have an obligation, not only to the sport of golf, but to the golf courses we play on. If the owners, managers and head PGA pros are expected to maintain the highest standards possible, we golfers should be held to high standards as well.

Golf is supposedly a gentleman's game of honor, where golfers are bound to adhere to an en-

nobled and enlightened code of etiquette and rules. I've always believed that we golfers should step onto the golf course with the understanding that our behavior should be genteel and respectful.

These days, I don't see it happening quite like that. I'm providing a set of suggestions for all to consider as we enjoy the wonderful world of golf, which is still available to us in these hard times.

First, let's pick up our pace of play. Ready golf means exactly that. Don't dawdle. Get to your ball, pick your club, check your target, step up and swing. How hard can that be? We're not on tour playing for millions and convers-

ing with our caddies. Maybe we can also agree on a private group rule to spend no more than a minute looking for a lost ball.

Next, we need to be attentive to repairing ball marks on the greens. Not long ago, Golf Digest's research revealed that only about one-third of golfers who hit the green repaired their pitch marks. From what I've seen on our local greens that is still the case. We can do better.

While we're talking about caring for the golf course, how about replacing divots? A lot of people new to golf don't know about repairing the turf damage from clubs taking divots. Let's educate them. If we have an intact piece of turf (a "toupee") we can simply return it in the depression that our club made. If your course sup-

plies sand bottles, sprinkle some sand on the divot. If not, press the grass inward, making the divot smaller. Make every day a divot party.

As for golf carts, we all can do better with how responsibly we operate them and where we drive them. If we treated the club's carts like they were our own, we certainly would have better carts to drive. Keeping them out of the deserts and away from the greens is a must.

Now, for improving our golf course etiquette we all could stand to be more courteous and tolerant of our fellow golfers. This is a two-way street. We expect not to be hampered by hackers. But being more tolerant and understanding of beginners, including very young players and novice golfers,

seems to be an acquired taste.

There is no question it can be exasperating waiting for players who don't seem to know what they're doing. But life is short, and we probably need to relax a bit. And on the other side, slower golfers would do well by letting the faster group behind play through. Better yet, pick up the pace.

I see far too many beginner and high-handicap golfers out there taking far too many practice swings and spending far too much time on each shot. You're not on television trying to win the Open.

Here are a few other ideas for making golf more enjoyable for everyone. Let's show up for our tee times ahead of time, so we don't put the pro shop people in an

awkward position. Let's go to the 10th tee at the turn without delay. We expect the course marshals (aka "player ambassadors") to be nice to us, so let's be courteous to them. In fact, let's be extra polite to the kind folks who work at the golf course; and don't be stingy with tipping.

Lastly, we can be thankful that golf courses are up and running, when other operations are not so fortunate. We need to do our best to comply with the requirements to wear masks, maintain social distancing and adhere to group gathering restrictions.

Acts 2:42 and elsewhere).

These are, in fact, the only tools the church has from generation to generation to build itself up as a culture set apart, "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, that you may declare the wonderful deeds of him who called you out of darkness

into his marvelous light" (I Peter 2:9).

These are the basic tools to carve out space for ourselves in an increasingly hostile world. Commit to them, for in and through them you commit to Christ.

Secondly, Christianity stresses that the material and spiritual worlds are not separate but united. We accept that God (the spiritual) entered the human stream (the mate-

rial) in the figure of Jesus Christ.

To stress one without the other is a counsel of despair, because materialism means acquisition of a self without soul, whereas spiritualism means acquisition of a self without body. Unity of the material and the spiritual is the ground upon which all Christian art, philosophy and writing rests.

If we do not retrieve

this vision of unity, which gives us a solid center that is susceptible neither to materialism nor spiritualism, it will be too late. Nothing less is at stake in this retrieval than the health of our overall culture.
