Doña Ana County Crisis Triage Center receives Operator's License

The New Mexico Department of Health issued an operator's license to Recovery Innovations, Inc, d.b.a. RI International for the operation of the Doña Ana County Crisis Triage Center, 1850 Copper Loop in Las Cruces.

"Las Cruces has struggled to serve individuals who are in mental health crisis and create a system to address this concern. It has been challenging; and something that county government had to achieve. The opening of the Crisis Triage Center will provide these individuals with the immediate help they need," said Commissioner Lynn Ellins, Chair of the Doña Ana County Board of Commissioners.

RI International, a company that runs 12 other crisis triage centers throughout the country, provided a model and business plan that will address this challenge. "The Department of Health Secretary issued the license through the Division of Health Improvement, Program Operations Bureau," said Wayne Lindstorm, RI International administrator.

"This action opens the door to a fully operational crisis triage center," said County Manager Fernando Macias. "It is truly a historic moment to have this facility finally licensed. We have the added tasks of establishing the Medicaid reimbursement rate through the NM Department of Human Services and staffing the facility before direct services can be provided."

"The center will help to alleviate the strain on healthcare and law enforcement systems by specifically assisting individuals experiencing mental health crisis. It will also mark the creation of a system that addresses mental health with more efficacy and compassion," said Jamie Michael, Director of Health and Human Services for Doña Ana County. "Many people are working to improve the behavioral health system, licensing of the center marks progress in that transformational effort."

Ellins added "This is a positive step forward for our community; and this supports the fast-track approach we have pursued."

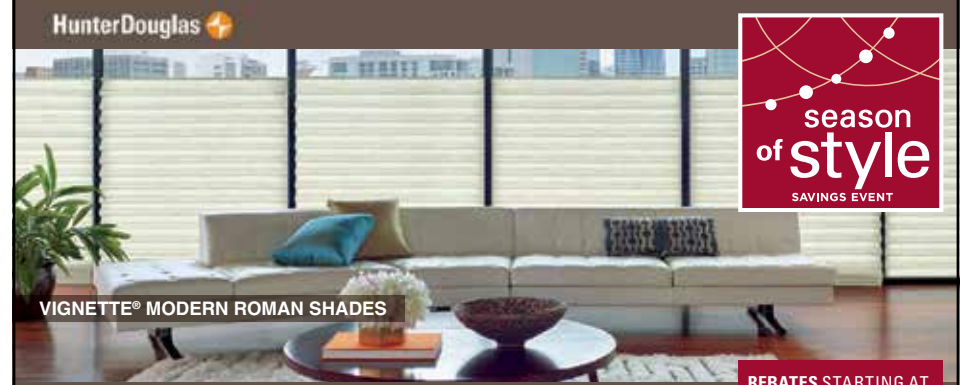

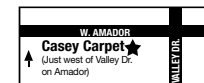

Fall Planting Ideas at Las Cruces Utilities Demonstration Garden

With a good five more weeks of fall, it might still be time to get some hands dirty to beautify gardens throughout Las Cruces this spring. Selecting the right type of plant that not only creates shade, beauty, and conserves water can be daunting, but that's where ideas growing in the Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) Demonstration Garden, at 680 N. Motel Boulevard, come in.

The garden has been recently updated with a trellis to plant vines that do well in our area. Rhonda Diaz, LCU water conservation program coordinator, explained that sometimes input on what to grow comes from residents.

"This is a garden for the community,

so when people ask what kind of vines I can grow in Las Cruces, we listen and add plants like grape vines, Virginia creeper, and trumpet vine, all of which do well in our climate," Diaz said.

With less wind and heat, fall is a great time to plant. LCU has taken advantage of that and planted several new trees in the open ponding area at the Utilities Administration building next to the Demonstration Garden. Diaz said, "And since LCU works closely with NMSU on many projects, it was only natural to plant a new Mesa Glow maple tree in the garden, propagated by Dr. Rolston St. Hilaire."

"Some people think that we are not

conserving water by planting trees, and while growing trees does require water, trees provide shade, reducing temperatures, and requires a different

watering method in comparison to say turf," Diaz said.

Diaz explained that the root zone for turf is 4 to 6 inches requiring more frequent watering. However, the beneficial root zone for trees is 18 to 36 inches, which provides the opportunity to water less often using drip irrigation instead of overhead spray.

"Drip irrigation is applied in gallons per hour and is the most efficient type of irrigation," Diaz said.

Go Aggies: A cautious return to sports

Sports have always been a great pastime for Americans.

Many of us love to play sports, and even more love to watch. Most of us have a favorite team, and some of us take it very seriously.

If you live in a college town, going to the local games becomes a social event for casual and die-hard fans alike.

But just as it has disrupted so many things in our lives, the Coronavirus has messed up our sports.

The New Mexico boys state high school basketball championship March 14 in Albuquerque was, as far as I can tell, the last state title game played in the country last spring. Our own Las Cruces High School Bulldawgs, played that final game, winning the 5A title, in front of no fans at the empty

Pit at the University of New Mexico campus.

A couple of days before, our

New Mexico State University Aggie men's basketball team was already in Las Vegas for the Western Athletic Conference tournament, when the tournament was canceled.

The whole world then shut down.

After a few months, sports tip-toed back into the water, led by the NBA, which created its "bubble" in Orlando in July, with 22 teams quarantining to finish out the season. The league did one of the best jobs of any organization keeping COVID-19 at bay, and things ended happily for fans of the Los Angeles Lakers, who won the championship Oct. 11.

Major League Baseball also resumed in July, with less suc-

cess. Nationwide travel and less restrictions led to several team-wide COVID-19 outbreaks. The season eventually concluded, again with a happy ending for Angelenos, whose L.A. Dodgers won their first World Series since 1988.

I watched part of a pro football game Sunday. Based on that, the NFL has returned pretty much to normal, in that for the 30 minutes I watched, 15 were spent waiting on instant replay reviews. But there are also pockets of COVID-19 in the league.

College football returned with mixed results. Some leagues started late, some canceled fall football, and for the colleges playing, there have been many postponements of games due to COVID-19.

Amid the mixed news of rising Coronavirus numbers and a potential vaccine, many

college conferences are looking at resuming activity in 2021. Just last week, the New Mexico State University Aggies announced the WAC's updated conference schedules for men's and women's basketball, women's soccer and women's volleyball.

Basketball slated a Jan. 8 return; volleyball, Jan. 25; soccer, Feb. 18.

Aggie football will kick off a spring season with a Feb. 20 home game against Tarleton State and two weeks later will host Dixie State. If you're like me, you might not have heard of Dixie State. Well, the school, whose nickname is the Trailblazers, was established in 1911 in St. George, Utah. The Trailblazers this year moved up to Division I in NCAA athletics and is the latest member of the

A return to blissful, maddening normalcy

More than 160 million Americans voted this year. While we may not have all had joy in our hearts, it was a peaceful process. And, in two months we will have a non-violent transition of power.

Whatever the motivation, the turnout this year was impressive. And on both sides. This wasn't a blue wave or a red wave. It was a concerned wave. And it has left us with a split government in which both sides will have to temper their expectations for the next two years.

Spending too much time on cable news chan-

nels or social media can lead us to believe that more people agree with us than really do. Elections force us to recalibrate.

I was once among those who believed President Donald Trump was so unpopular that

Democrats could run their most progressive candidate and still win. I don't think that now.

Of all the 29 candidates for the Democratic nomination, Joe Biden may have been the least aspirational. But he gave Democrats the best chance to beat Trump.

Those in Iowa and New Hampshire didn't recog-

nize that, but more pragmatic voters in South Carolina did.

The victory by Yvette Herrell also forced me to recalibrate my beliefs about the Second Congressional District. It is more solidly conservative than I thought.

Democratic leaders in the Legislature said they plan to change that when district boundaries are redrawn following this year's Census. But that's going to take some pretty creative gerrymandering in a state as geographically large as New Mexico with just three districts.

And, while I'm sorry to see Xochitl Torres Small lose her seat, it's prob-

ably not a bad thing for New Mexico that one of our five congressional delegates will be a Republican. It's probably more reflective of our state's political makeup.

Every newly elected president claims to have a mandate. In his victory speech Saturday, held in a parking lot instead of some glamorous hotel ballroom because of the coronavirus, Biden said his mandate from the voters is to cooperate with Republicans.

He won't have much choice, should the two Senate seats in Georgia remain in Republican hands after the upcoming special election, as is expected.

In his first few days, Biden will establish a national strategy to deal with the pandemic and rescind many of Trump's most harmful executive orders. But to accomplish his own agenda, he'll have to go through Mitch McConnell.

That will mean a return to the frustrating, maddening, gridlocked federal government we had in place before Trump blew into town. Or, as they say in Congress, business as usual.

It will be a bitter pill for Trump supporters, but also for those progressives who remained united behind Biden this year in a way that

they did not for Hillary Clinton in 2016. I suspect there may be a difference in how those two groups handle their frustration.

Progressives are motivated by ideals, not persona. And they're accustomed to setbacks. They will stay engaged and keep fighting.

Many of Trump's supporters never voted until he came along. They don't trust the government. Many don't trust the Republican Party. They trust Trump. Will they stay involved after he is gone? And if they don't, what will that mean for the party?

Leaders for both par-

WAC. Anyway, it will be a new experience to watch Aggie football in February and March, as long as it's not during one of our nasty spring windstorms.

A big question, though,

is how well prepared can our Aggies be? Right now, there are more than 340 Division I sports programs in America.

Of those, only two are prohibited from full practices right now. Those two are NMSU and UNM. Our state's non-Division I college sports programs

are also prohibited from practicing due to our state's health protocols.

That's what prompted a group of athletes from NMSU, UNM, Western New Mexico University in Silver City, Eastern New Mexico University in Portales, and New Mexico Highlands University in

Las Vegas, to send a letter to Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham, asking her to allow them to practice and play, given their commitment to do so safely.

Currently, all those schools' programs are under strict COVID-19 precaution guidelines and have incidence rates

lower than New Mexico's general population.

First human spaceflight in New Mexico scheduled this month

Michael Colglazier, chief executive officer of Virgin Galactic, has announced USS Unity will head into space with humans on board from Spaceport America in southern New Mexico between Nov. 19 and 23.

The rocket-powered test flight with two pilots will substantially complete the final FFA verification and validation elements licensing requirements, he said, adding that the flight also will generate revenue from NASA payloads.

“This is the first ever human spaceflight to depart from the state of New Mexico,” Colglazier said. “This is a huge milestone for the people of New Mexico.”

He said two additional flights are scheduled in the first quarter of 2021, the first with four company employees, including the pilots, make final checks before boarding

passengers, including Virgin Galactic founder Sir Richard Branson and others.

“At this stage, we’re on track for these three flights,” Colglazier said. “It will take a number of activities to complete, and weather could affect this plan.”

Bringing the plan to fruition in 2020 during COVID-19 has been a

challenge, he said.

“Building spaceships during a pandemic is materially less efficient than normal,” he said. “But our team members have stepped up to continue progress on our key initiatives while working under stringent COVID-19 protocols. While many tasks involved in building the spaceship involve close-quarters work, this

type of work is still progressing, although slower than expected.”

Not only is SpaceShipTwo VSS Unity ready to go to space, a second SpaceShipTwo is well on the way to being completed, Colglazier said.

“The first chapter was a difficult task,” he said. “The next chapter is to use this system to bring

thousands of people to space and deliver our purpose of opening space to change the world for good.”

He said the goal is to take passengers to space not once a month or once a week but up to 400 flights a year.

“The approaches we are taking suggest we could generate meaningful revenues of a billion

dollars a year per spaceport,” he said. “And a fully utilized spaceport can create an incredibly powerful economic engine, first to New Mexico and then with great appeal in other locations across the world.”

Following Branson’s flight, passenger ticket sales will open up once more. There are already 600 “future astronauts” who have purchased space experiences, paying \$250,000 each, and an additional 300 who have indicated an interest in being next. Those 300 will be contacted first.

“During my first three months at the company, I have been continually impressed with the team and the tremendous work that has gone into making the dream of commercial spaceflight a reality,” Colglazier said. “I’m excited and confident in our ability to execute our vision and provide transformative experiences to people around the world.”

Smith: Legislature's collegiality, frugality at risk

Progressives have sent the state's legislative power base back to Santa Fe and Albuquerque, State Sen. John Arthur Smith of Deming said, as he ponders life outside the political arena.

Smith, who has represented state Senate District 35 (Luna, Hidalgo, Sierra and Doña Ana counties) for 32 years and is chair of the Senate Finance Committee, lost in the June Democratic primary. So did state Senate President Pro-Tem Mary Kay Papen of Las Cruces, who has held the District 38 (Doña Ana County) Senate seat for 20 years.

The losses mean the

leadership positions Smith and Papen hold likely will go to senators from northern New Mexico, said Smith, who is the longest-serving Democrat and second most senior member of the legislature. Funding for projects in southern New Mexico will also decline as a result of the loss of seniority, he said, and the legislature will lose some of its insti-

tutional memory on the state budget, the state lottery, workers' compensation and other issues.

Smith said he and other conservative Democrats who are leaving the legislature are concerned the Senate's bipartisanship may not continue.

"The New Mexico State Senate has been a pretty pleasant place to serve," Smith said. "The system is based on trust. We had a lot of trust with each other. We communicated."

Smith led the Senate Finance Committee through the most difficult financial times "the state has ever seen," he said.

"I've guarded the Permanent Fund," Smith said, referring to the Land Grant Permanent Fund

established when New Mexico became a state in 1912 and has grown into one of the largest funds of its kind in the country. The \$20-plus billion fund generated \$784.2 million for public schools, universities and other beneficiaries in FY20, according to the State Investment Council.

"We're sent up there to make the system work," Smith said, "and you've got to pay for it."

Calling himself "a fiscally responsible Democrat," Smith said he hasn't always been popular, even in his own party, because of some of his budget decisions. "Sometimes you have to

say ‘no,’” he said.

Thanks to budget cuts made during the June 2020 special session, next year’s legislature will have more than \$2 billion in reserves to help deal with state budget shortfalls resulting from the pandemic, Smith said.

Smith said he is concerned because of New Mexico’s continued de-

pendence on oil and gas revenues, which make up about 40 percent of the state’s general fund.

“We’ve got to come up with a more reliable revenue stream,” Smith said.

Oil and gas production has dropped because of COVID-19, he said, and won’t recover “until the airlines start flying.” It could be further reduced if fracking on federal lands is phased out, Smith said, and, likely will decline as the country

moves away from fossil fuels.

Smith said the legislature also “has got to protect local businesses” as the pandemic continues. “Retail is dying,” he said, and that will impact local governments reliant on gross receipts tax generated by local business to pay for emergency services, law enforcement and other services.

“The public wants it,” Smith said about recreational marijuana, adding

that if the legislature legalizes it in 2021, it might generate \$30 million for the state, at most.

“Let’s see what the feds are going to do,” Smith said, noting that recreational marijuana use remains prohibited by the federal government. Smith said he continues to be concerned about the health implications of medical marijuana use, which is legal in New Mexico.

Smith said the things

he’s most proud of during his service in the Senate include sponsoring full-day kindergarten in New Mexico, serving on the state’s workers’ compensation reform committee and helping to create the state’s Early Childhood Trust Fund.

Among the things he will miss most, Smith included his friends in Santa Fe and especially the “young, bright staff at the Legislative Finance Committee.”

Smith said he is proud that he only missed one day of service — he was attending a funeral in Deming — during the

more than 30 regular and special sessions he attended throughout his Senate career.

“That record goes unmatched,” he said.

Smith said he never left the Senate floor to avoid a vote on any issue.

“If I wasn’t there, I was excused,” Smith said, often to work on the state budget. Smith said he was, however, careful not to vote on legislation affecting property appraisals, because that is his profession.

“I voted my convictions,” Smith said, “not what polled well vs. what did not poll well.”

Las Cruces High School and New Mexico State University graduate David Acosta is a licensed surveyor, co-owner of a respected Las Cruces-based surveying company

He also is personally committed to increasing diversity in the surveying

profession and educating the community about the important work surveyors do and the high-paying jobs that are available to them.

As NMPS president in 2016, Acosta helped save NMSU's Geomatics and Surveying Engineering (GSE) program from elimination. Has since become a teacher and mentor to students in the program, helping them learn about the research, construction-site and other field work, connection with clients and governmental entities and

hands-on experience with cutting-edge technology like ground-penetrating radar, drones and 3D laser scanners that are part of the surveying profession.

"The value of a surveyor has never been higher," said Acosta, 39, "and technology has created ways to be more valuable."

The industry offers a "nice balance" of between time spent in the office and working outside, and because there aren't a lot of licensed surveyors available, "there's a lot

Howie Morales may become New Mexico's 33rd governor

With President-Elect Joe Biden considering adding Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham to his cabinet, Lt. Gov. Howie Morales may soon move up a notch.

Lujan Grisham, who was on Biden's list of potential vice presidents, is co-chair of the president-elect's transition team, and, according to the Washington Post and other media, is being considered as a cabinet secretary. With her background in state government, the appointment likely would be as secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

Morales, a Silver City

native and former state senator and Grant County clerk, will turn 48 Jan. 5. He and Lujan Grisham are both Democrats.

Morales would be the state's 33rd governor and the first to succeed to the governorship from the office of lieutenant governor since Tom Bolack in late 1962.

Bolack, a Farmington Republican, served as lieutenant governor under Edwin L. Mechem, the former Las Cruces district attorney and state representative, during Mechem's fourth and last two-year term as governor. Mechem (1912-2002) lost his bid for re-election

Nov. 6, 1962 and resigned to be appointed to the U.S. Senate by Bolack 24 days later. He succeeded U.S. Dennis Chavez, D-N.M. (1888-1962), who died Nov. 18 in Washington, D.C.

Bolack (1918-98) served the remainder of Mechem's gubernatorial term, which ended Jan. 1, 1963, when former New Mexico House Speaker Jack Campbell (1916-99), an Albuquerque Democrat, became governor.

Bolack had served as mayor of Farmington and as a state representative in the late 1950s. He ran unsuccessfully for the U.S. House of Representatives

against then lieutenant governor and future U.S. senator Joseph Montoya in a special election in 1957.

The New Mexico Constitution was amended in 2008 to allow the governor to nominate a replacement if there is a vacancy in the lieutenant governor's office. The nominee has to be approved by a majority vote of the state Senate. That appointee would complete the previous lieutenant governor's unexpired term.

One of the lieutenant governor's primary duties is to preside over the state Senate when the legislature is in session. In the absence of a lieutenant governor, the president

pro-tem of the state Senate presides. The 2021 session of the New Mexico Legislature convenes Jan. 19, and Biden becomes president Jan. 20. So, if Lujan Grisham is named to the cabinet, there could be a vacancy in the lieutenant governor's office during the 60-day session.

The state constitution says a governor can be elected to only two consecutive four-year terms, but it does not address partial terms. So, Morales likely could run for re-election as governor in 2022, and, if he wins, again in 2026.

Only one New Mexico lieutenant governor, Ezequiel Cabeza de Baca (1864-1917), has been elected governor in his

own right. A native of Las Vegas, New Mexico, de Baca was the state's first lieutenant governor, serving with Gov. William C. McDonald, 1912-17. He defeated Republican Holm O. Bursum in the 1916 General Election but served only 48 days before dying.

After the lieutenant governor, the line of succession is the secretary of state, followed by the state Senate president pro-tem and the speaker of the state House of Representatives. That's a reversal of the presidential line of succession, where the vice president is followed by the speaker of the House, then the president pro-tem of the Senate and the secretary of state.

After returning to Indiana, she became determined to move west, young woman, move west. She did so in the winter of 1995, arriving in Billings, Montana, with only a careful of belongings and a strong desire to have a new beginning.

Sarah worked briefly for the Billings school system

and at the St. Labre Indian School in Ashland, Mont., before accepting a teaching position in the Santa Fe, N.M. school system.

After several years in Santa Fe, she moved to California, teaching in Watsonville, before moving to Las Cruces, N.M., where she taught for several years before retiring with a gentle sigh of relief. On Jan. 2, 1999, she married Jeff in Watsonville.

Her retirement in Santa Fe was well spent, loving her husband, her home and four critters, all animal shelter adoptees, who all loved her deeply.

Happy 108th Birthday: Frances Shutt

Frances Shutt is a life-long educator, author and World War II veteran who will celebrate her 108th birthday on < 11-12-2020 >.

On her 100th birthday, she was recognized on NBC's "Today Show."

Frances tells about her military training in her autobiography: "While living in Albuquerque during the attack on Pearl Harbor, I wanted to find out how I could help, so I took flying lessons and training at Sandia Base to become a Women's Aviation Service Pilot

(WASP)." Frances was employed as a teacher, so her days started pre-dawn. She began her day with flight training, then returned home to prepare breakfast for her husband and young son, then went to school for her day of teaching students.

She was certified in Special Education and specialized in teaching homebound and hospitalized students. She authored the "First-Grade Guide" that became the core text for primary-grade teachers.

Through her family's foreign missionary work, she became interested in teaching students from around the world. Over

four decades, she taught ESL (English as a Second Language) to students from 46 countries at First Baptist Church, Las Cruces, in the International Department.

Frances enjoyed teaching students from around the world and tells the story of a circle of friends.

For two years, four young ladies in her ESL class became good friends. They were from Iraq, Iran, Egypt and Israel. Frances and her students had luncheons, parties, trips to Mexico, and went shopping together. The students asked why their countries couldn't learn to be friends like they were.

Frances has maintained contact with her former students world-wide and cherishes the boxes of postcards and letters from her students.

back to Las Cruces to join John Gallegos at Construction Survey Technology, Inc., the company he co-owns, which he said is one of the top surveying companies in the state, working throughout New Mexico and in west Texas.

Four years ago, Acosta and other NMPS members worked with NMSU to ensure the continuation of GSE within the College of Engineering. Because of low student enrollment, Acosta said, the university had targeted it for elimination.

After meeting with

college officials, he and other NMPS members “accepted the challenge” of helping to save the program, including raising \$300,000 during the next three years. PNM donated \$200,000, and surveyors raised the rest.

The near elimination of GSE might have been “a blessing in disguise,” Acosta said, because it renewed surveyors’ interest and participation and helped make the program better. It’s now accredited by the national Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology, Inc., has stronger ties with Doña Ana Community College and “enrollment’s steadily going up,” Acosta

said.

His personal involvement with GSE has included reaching out to middle- and high school students to “let them know what a surveyor does, who we are,” Acosta said, and to stimulate their interest in pursuing engineering degrees and attending Doña Ana Community College and NMSU. (NMPS has both an NMSU chapter and a young surveyors committee.)

Acosta said he never imagined being a college instructor, although he comes by it naturally: His mother had a 37-year career as a teacher.

“It was part of who I

am and what I was meant to do,” Acosta said.

“I found David’s interest in introducing and encouraging students to consider a career in surveying to be an excellent example of how the private and public sectors can work together to enable young people to develop much needed skills in our community,” said Steve Litts, a retired Las Cruces educator.

In addition to his knowledge and experience of surveying, Acosta shares his own personal struggles with his students.

“I overcame a lot,” he said. “I didn’t give up. I kept fighting.”

Elementary school students draw themselves as president

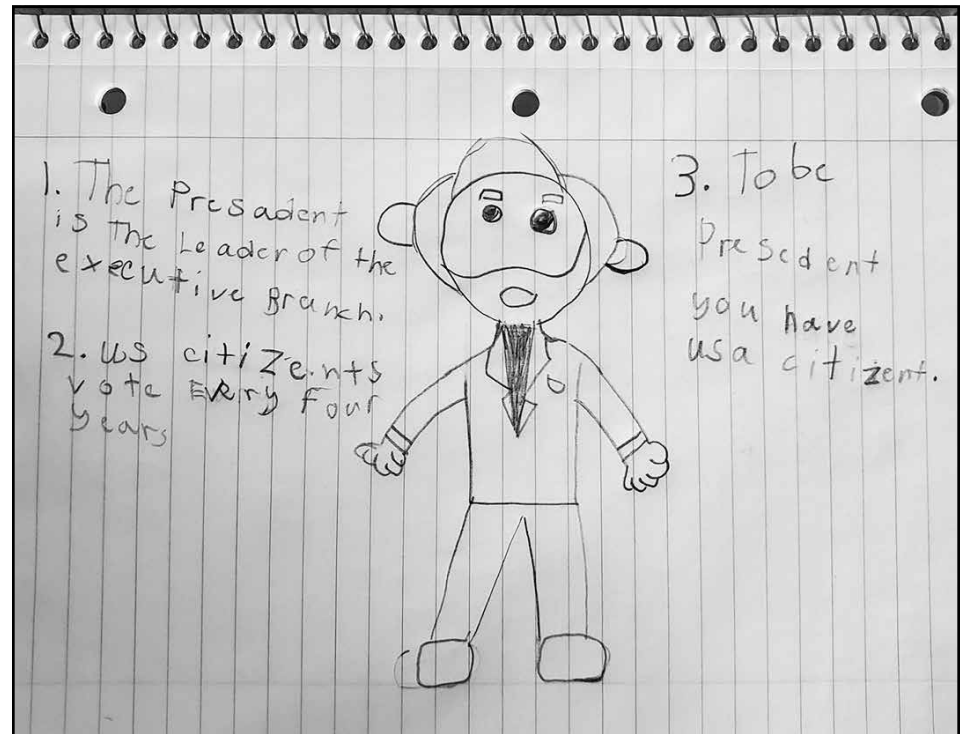
Doña Ana Elementary School Principal Cherie Love: 'Art has relevance to every area of study'

including one- to three things they learned about the presidency in class. Students could also draw a poster, make a flyer or record a commercial on video encouraging everyone they know to vote, Alston said.

"Teachers and students are experiencing a shared journey through online learning," Alston said. "We are often trying to find creative ways to have students engaged and express themselves. Art has become empowering for young students to draw connections from what they have learned in the classroom transitioning into creative assignments,

where students are allowed creative freedom to display emotions as well as opinions. Adding art into my fourth-grade social studies assignments has shown me as an instructor that students are very aware of life around them, and their art spoke loudly when encouraging others to vote or envisioning themselves as the president."

Here are some of the responses Alston received from DAES fourth graders to this question: What message did you want to get across with your art?

Nathan Ornelas: "It is important to vote with how things are going in

the country."

Anthony Barelas: "There are requirements to become president and I want to be a leader."

Nycholas Holguin: "You should vote because it is your right as an American."

Kyara Sains: "My art shows it's a beautiful day to vote."

"I believe that art has relevance to every area of study," said DAES Principal Cherie Love. "It's a reflection of our history, culture and ideas. This year, DAES's focus has been on ways to engage students while they are

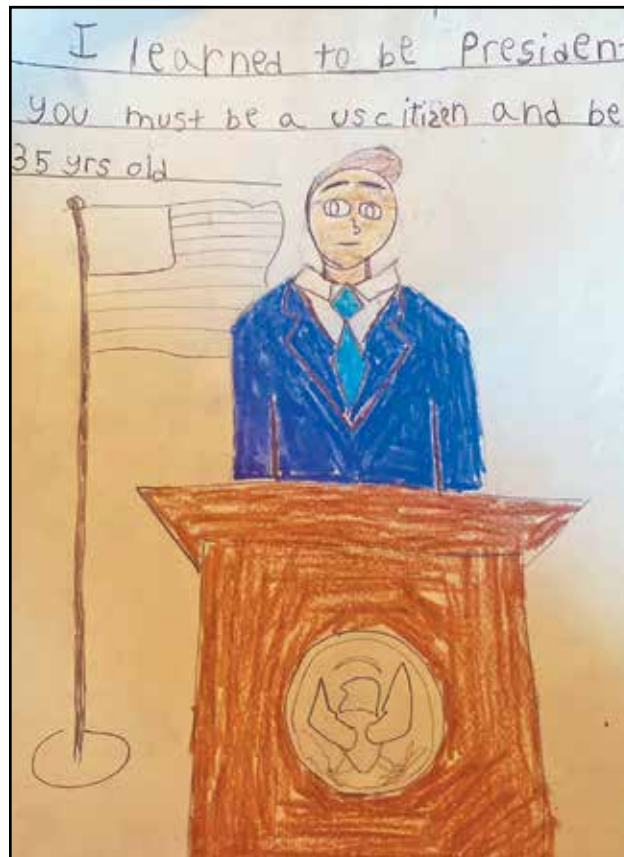

learning fully online. As we pop into our teacher's Canvas (course management program) shells, we have observed great lessons integrating visual arts, plays, movement and music into reading, math, science and social studies. Art integration increases the depth of students' learning, improves critical thinking and problem-solving skills, develops creativity and imagination and enhances social emotional growth.

"Parent Involvement has been essential as students learn fully on-line," Love said. "We have found that our parents have been more supportive when students are excited about their learning and want to engage in the lessons and assignments. When students use creative ways to demonstrate their understanding of a topic, the whole family often gets involved in the project."

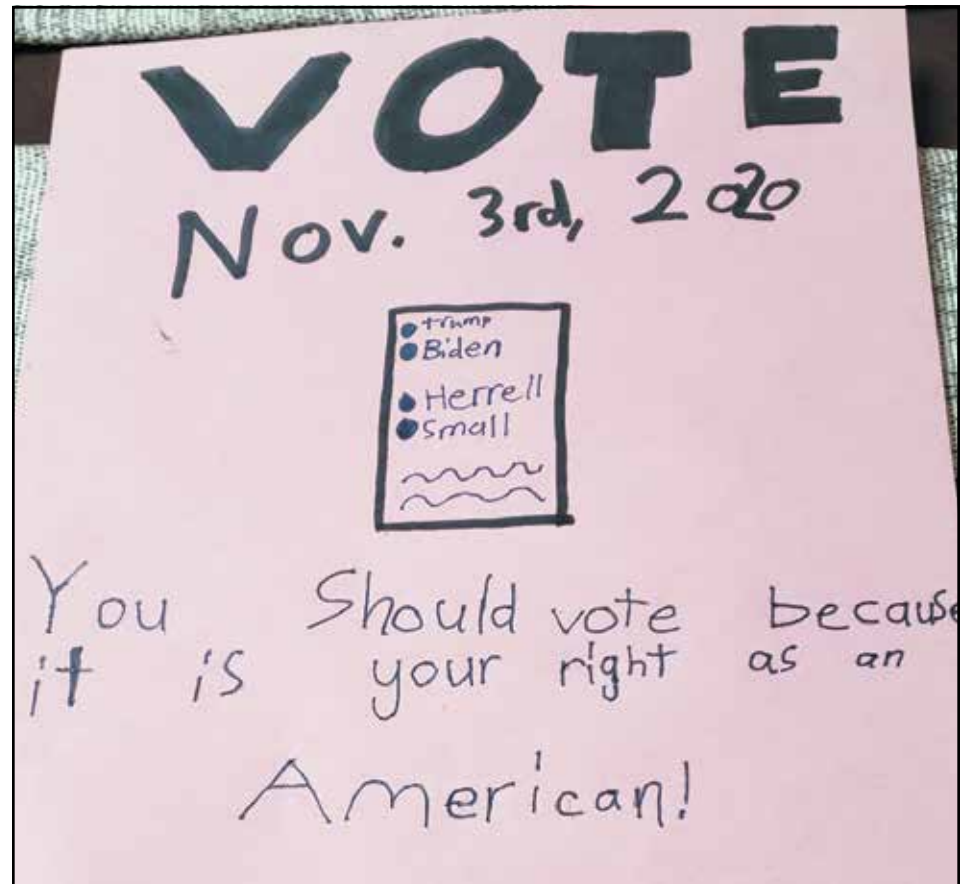
Love said Emily Bennett has been DAES' art teacher for many years. Bennett also teaches art at Hillrise Elementary

The city Museum of Nature & Science (MONAS) will host Apache Point Observatory astronomer Dr. Russet McMillan and the Apache Point Observatory Lunar Laser-ranging Operation (APOLLO) for a virtual presentation Thursday, Nov. 19, that will include a live firing (weather permitting) of

the laser from a 3.5m telescope, the City of Las Cruces said in a news release.

The event will be held through a Zoom webinar beginning at 4:30 p.m. Nov. 19.

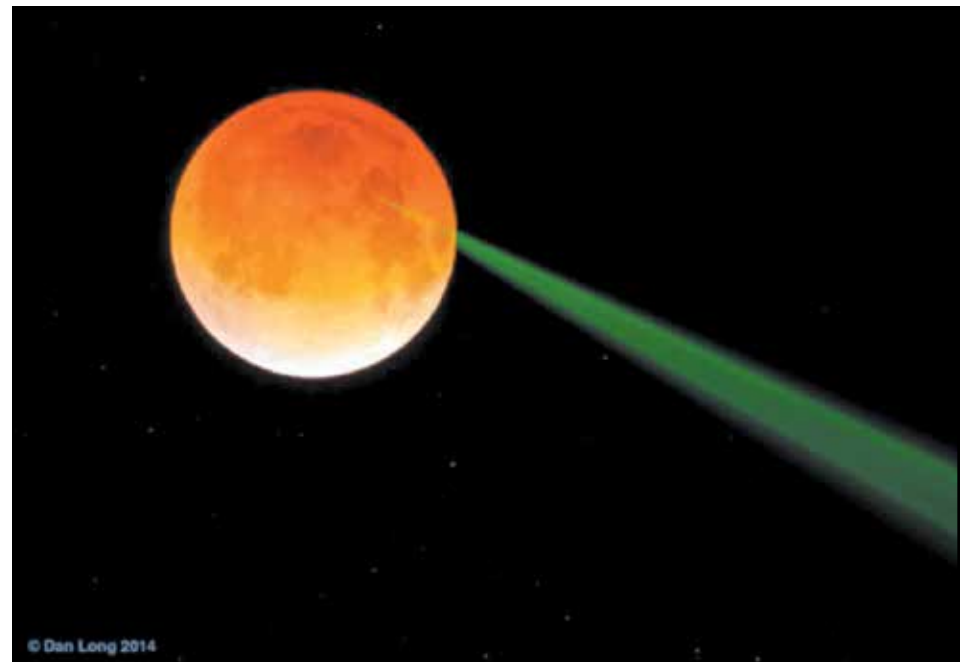
APOLLO is an experiment using the Astrophysical Research Consortium

3.5m telescope located at Apache Point Observatory in Sunspot, N.M., according to the news release.

This experiment has been running since 2005, led by Dr. Tom Murphy of the University of California San Diego.

The objective of APOLLO is to repeatedly measure the distance from Earth to the Moon to an accuracy of a millimeter, which yields information about the Moon's orbit and orientation as it tests Einstein's Theory of General Relativity.

"This project continues a 50-year campaign which relies on mirror arrays left on the surface of the moon by the astronauts of NASA's Apollo 11, 14 and 15 missions," the news re-

lease said.

The Nov. 19 presentation will explore the science behind the experi-

ment and will conduct the live firing of the laser to the mirrors on the Moon.

State museum puts fossil, biological specimens online

The New Mexico Museum of Natural History & Science (NMMNHS) has opened the door to more than 110,000 fossil and biological specimens. Thanks to an anonymous gift, the museum's collection records are now publicly available through Arctos, an online database, at www.nmnaturalhistory.org/search-collections/search-collections.

Arctos provides research-grade data to scientists and facilitates public access to the data and images.

NMMNHS curators and collections staff will continue adding to the database, with photographs, 3D links to specimen models, research and discoveries. It is managed by a consortium of organizations and museums with data from natural and cul-

tural history collections. "The transition to Arctos will make the museum's collection data available to the world, creating opportunities for anyone, anywhere to learn from and add to the scientific infrastructure of New Mexico," said NMMNHS Bioscience Curator Jason Malaney. "We are excited to share

the collection information and related research, and we hope this

resource will open new doors for collaboration, develop novel educa-

tional opportunities and better engage with the public."

NMMNHS is a division of the New Mexico Department of Cultural Affairs. NMMNHS was established in 1986 with a mission to preserve and interpret the distinctive natural and scientific heritage of New Mexico through extraordinary collections, research, exhibits and programs designed to ignite a passion for lifelong learning.

NMMNHS offers exhibitions, programs and workshops in geoscience, including paleontology and mineralogy, bioscience and space science. It is the Southwest's largest repository for fossils and includes a planetarium and a large-format 3D DynaTheater.

'Making Love' broke new ground in 1982

EDITOR'S NOTE: This is another in the Bulletin staff's series of reviews of movies available on various streaming services.

Long before Ellen Degeneres or "Will & Grace," there was very little openly gay content on television or in movie theaters.

In 1982, director Arthur Hiller and Twentieth Century Fox took a leap of faith on a movie starring Harry Hamlin, Michael Ontkean and Kate Jackson. The movie was titled "Making Love," and it caused a stir based not only on the gay content,

but the intimate scenes shared by Hamlin and Ontkean.

The story line is fairly straight-forward (see what I did there?) with Ontkean's and Jackson's characters (Zack and Claire, respectively) walking through life blissfully in love with one another in what appears to be an ideal marriage. But Zack is struggling with his sexuality, going to gay bars on his lunch hour and giving rides to attractive men, all without ever actually following through with a sexual encounter.

Enter Hamlin's character (Bart), an openly gay writer who arrives at Zack's clinic for a medical checkup. They end up

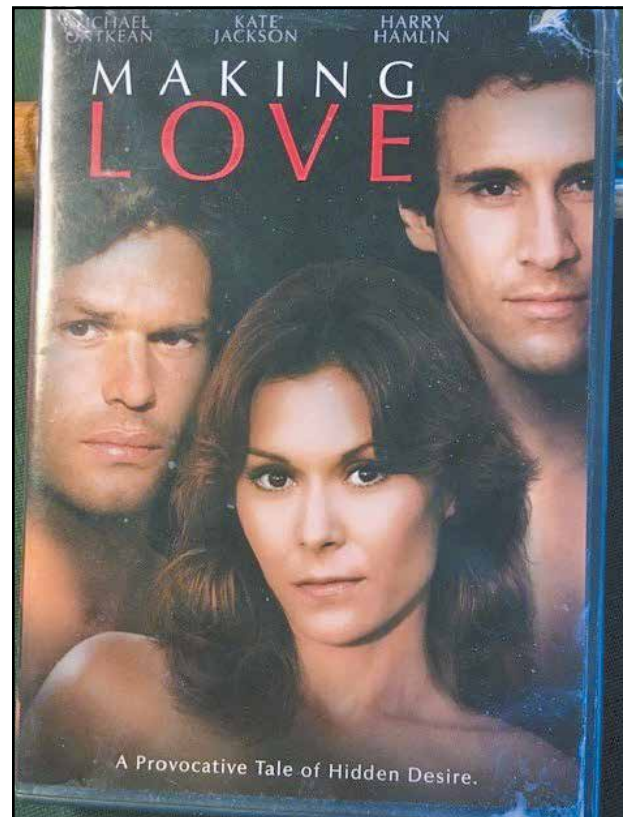
going to lunch. The lunch date leads to a dinner date, about which Zack lies to Claire, telling her he has to work late.

After dinner, Bart lures Zack to bed, and Zack uncharacteristically agrees, leading to his first same-sex physical intimacy. He asks Bart to let him stay the night, but Bart refuses, although they later agree to spend a weekend together.

Claire begins noticing Zack pulling away and making excuses for his time away. Thinking she needs to work on the marriage, she asks her employer for a year's leave of absence, but her boss throws a wrench in the works by instead offering her a hefty promotion requiring frequent travel out of state.

Zack takes advantage of her trips away to grow his relationship with Bart, and eventually tells Bart he loves him.

Bart – never one for relationships, and more

of a bar-circuit, one-night-stand kind of guy – knows he can't give Zack the level of commitment he seeks. That tension spills over into arguments and shouting matches about Zack's closeted life and inability to be honest with himself or others.

After leaving Bart's

house for the last time, Zack waits for Claire to come home, and he tells her the truth, which she briefly accepts as a discussion topic before the enormity of his confession sinks in, and they both navigate the reality of letting go of their dreams of a life together as parents and partners.

They divorce, and Zack takes a job in a New York City cancer clinic.

Through it all, they both maintain a strong bond to a former neighbor, an elderly woman named Winnie (played by Wendy Hiller). Years after their divorce, news comes that Winnie has died, and they meet one another once again at the funeral.

They discuss their new

lives and partners, and Zack agrees to come to her new home to meet her husband and son. The son is named Rupert, which is the name Zack and Claire had agreed would be the name of their first son.

The film ends with Zack driving away from Claire's house, having promised to stay in closer touch, and as the credits begin to roll, Roberta Flack launches into the song that shares the movie's name.

The acting throughout the film is raw and honest, and each of the characters is well-developed and nuanced.

I remember seeing the movie the weekend it came out (I did it again!) with my boyfriend at the time, Dave. We were two of maybe 20 people in the theater, most of them men. He insisted we sit with an open seat between us, which I still find both sad and ironic.

After the movie, we went to his place and relived it all scene by scene for hours, because we both found it so remarkable at so many levels. It was a watershed event in the lives of two young men navigating our own feelings for one another.

I've long since lost track of Dave, but "Making Love" is in my collection, and I revisit it periodically, which always makes me think of him. I wonder if a funeral for a mutual friend may someday bring us back together. It's as good an ending (or a new beginning) as any.

Streaming No String Theatre Company's (Black Box Theatre) current production of "The Majestic Kid," my heart ached because I miss Mark Medoff and because I want so badly to be back in a theatre seat, surrounded by other people in a full house watching live theatre. But, mostly, I enjoyed the show.

This talented cast and crew understand the single most important rule of good theatre: No matter what the challenges or difficulties you face, find a way to entertain your audience.

because of a pandemic? Keep your actors a safe distance apart as much as you can, use some clever lighting, simple but effective sets and costumes and let the actors stand and tell the excellent story created by Medoff and first produced at New Mexico State University just a year after "Children of a Lesser God" won three Tony awards on Broad-

way. The script and the story have aged like a fine wine over 40 years, with classic lines like: "The hero never bites anybody." "You don't share the load, partner, you carry it alone." "The code of the West. What West are you talking about?" "Stop talking about cowboy movies. This is my real life." "I am not the sidekick." "I want

to be someone who helps people without hurting other people." "I don't know if I want to live in a world where the good guys are the same as the bad guys." (One advantage of reviewing via streaming is that you can stop, rewind and write down a whole quote you would never have been able to remember.)

This is a simple story of good vs. evil, East vs. West, murder, gunplay, death threats, friendship, growing up and finding true love.

Idealists Aaron Weiss (Luz Resendez) and AJ Pollard (Rachel Thomas Chappell) fight for the Apache Tribal Council's right to the land as they

square off against Magistrate Judge William Finlay (Scott Brocato), who wants the land for a toxic waste dump. Lisa Belmondo (Debbie Jo Felix) is a secretary, gourmet cook, student and double love interest; and the Laredo Kid (Joshua Taulbee) is Weiss' singing, guitar-strumming, six-gun toting, cliché-spouting alter ego.

This is an ensemble cast with strong performances all around – five gold stars. I genuinely enjoyed their work as they sparkled on stage and on screen. Kudos also to Nikka Ziemer for the original music she wrote for the show, and to the creative and thoughtful crew:

director Ceil Herman, scenic and light designer Peter Herman, costume designer Robert "Bobcat" Young and projectionist and board operator Bekah Taulbee.

The show is wonderful and the last scene is, well, majestic.

Streaming of "The Majestic Kid" continues Fridays, Nov. 13, 20 and 27; Saturdays, Nov. 14, 21 and 28; and Sunday, Nov. 29. Each performance begins at 7 p.m., and a \$10 ticket gives you access to the performance for the ensuing 24 hours.

Thinking of adopting a cat or kitten? Want to volunteer, foster, donate?

Make a 'feline' to The Cat's Meow

Editor's note: This story was written Oct. 29, National Cat Day.

Michelle Corella and other volunteers at The Cat's Meow Adoption Center have found homes for more than 500 cats and kittens since the facility opened in October 2014 at 2211 N. Mesquite St., a bit south of the intersection of Mesquite Street and east Madrid Avenue.

There are at least 50 cats and kittens on site, waiting to find their forever homes, Corella said. There are an additional 60 or so cats in foster care

who also are looking to be adopted.

There are also opportunities to volunteer at the center, to foster cats and/or to donate to The Cat's Meow. And Corella said help is needed now more than ever.

She said 2020 has been the most difficult year she has experienced in two decades as a community cat

advocate and activist.

"I've never seen so many cats needing homes," she said, adding that she often gets 10 or more calls a day, seven days a week, about unwanted cats and litters of kittens.

"It never gets better," she said.

"The sheer volume of cats, and especially un-

wanted kittens, means the center must, unfortunately, turn away some felines in need of help," Corella said. That's especially true for adult cats, who don't always get along with one other, unlike kittens who can live and play together.

Corella described three

cats hoping to find permanent homes: "Charlie and Chaos are a pair of bonded brothers, about 18 months old. They are beautiful, sleek, black kitties who are loveable, playful and energetic. Tanzi is a sweet little tortoiseshell kitty, about 11 months old, who came to us with five little kittens. She nursed not only her own kittens, but several others who needed a mama. Now she needs a loving home of her own. Tanzi enjoys human attention, but also can keep herself entertained, playing with toys and running about."

Finding good homes for cats is what The Cat's Meow is all about, Corella said. But that is only part of the solution to a cat overpopulation problem that can only be effectively addressed by a communitywide spay-neuter program.

"We need a philosophi-

cal change in the community," she said. "We need to do something other than hand off strays and unwanted cats and kittens to the shelter."

The most important step would be for the City of Las Cruces and Doña Ana County to enact and provide at least partial funding for a trap-neuter-return (TNR) program, Corella said, noting that a single adult female cat can begin having kittens at eight months and can have up to four litters of kittens a year.

A change in city ordinance is also needed to make it easier for people to manage colonies of community cats all over the city, she said. Without colony managers, TNR is not possible, Corella said. And, without TNR, the Animal Services Center of the Mesilla Valley will never reach no-kill status.

APA moves to new, larger facility

ACTion Programs for Animals (APA) adoption center is moving to 537 N. Solano Drive, the former Solano Animal Clinic. The adoption center will open at the new location Tuesday, Nov. 17. The APA adoption center was

previously located at 800 W. Picacho Ave.

APA Executive Director Michel Meunier said the larger facility was much needed in order to rescue more animals.

“After years of tireless work from a very small facility, we are making the move to a larger

building with the hopes of being able to rescue more animals from the municipal shelter,” Meunier said. “The new building will allow for new, bigger dog kennels to rescue larger dogs, as well as feline rooms with outdoor ‘catios,’ which are cat patios. We also

plan to create a space to engage with the public and for humans and pets to fall in love. Our staff and volunteers have been working hard painting, cleaning and setting up the new kennels. This move into a new and improved building was made possible by a generous bequest from a former dog adopter.”

Details regarding a virtual grand opening in December will be announced soon, Meunier said.

APA is a progressive

animal welfare organization seeking to improve the quality of life for companion animals in Doña Ana County and greatly reduce the number of unwanted animals impounded and euthanized at the Animal Services Center of the Mesilla Valley (ASCMV).

Since May 2012, more than 4,800 animals have been rescued, APA said. The majority have been dogs and cats/kittens pulled from the ASCMV. APA’s work is made possible through the vol-

unteer work of rescue/foster coordinators, foster families, weekend adoptions and donations.

New hours for adoptions will be 11 a.m.-3 p.m. Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays or by appointment. Pet food bank hours will be 2-4 p.m. Sundays.

“It’s an endless cycle until you get to the root of the problem,” she said. “I wish people could understand that and get behind it. The city’s investment in a TNR program “will only enrich our community,” Corella said. “Cats are part of the landscape.”

The Cat’s Meow is adhering to all COVID-19 safety protocols, she said, including limiting the number of visitors allowed inside the center at any one time. The center is usually open to visitors Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday afternoons, but it is a good idea to call ahead and make sure the center is open or to set an appointment to visit.

The Cat’s Meow charges



\$50 per adoption.

“It’s a real bargain,” Corella said, because the fee includes spay-neuter, all the necessary shots and the implanting of a microchip.

The center has about 20 volunteers who staff the property seven days a week, Corella said. But more volunteers would be welcome, and so would individuals or families who would like to provide temporary (foster) homes for one or more cats for a

few days to a few weeks at a time.

Cash donations are also welcome. They allow The Cat’s Meow staff to buy the food and other supplies they need.

“We never say no to any donations,” Corella said.

City council approves funds for aerial-inspection company expansion

The Las Cruces City Council voted unanimously Nov. 2 to approve \$400,000 in Local Economic Development Act (LEDA) funds for LaSen, Inc., a Las Cruces company that specializes in aerial inspection and mapping services.

The State of New Mexico will invest \$750,000 in LEDA funds in the expansion.

In exchange for the state and city support, LaSen promised to reach employment of 75 full-time positions by Dec. 31, 2026, with a total payroll of more than \$4.85 million per year. The company's

average annual salary is \$61,000.

LaSen President Tim Goolsby said the company has outgrown the office on Telshor Boulevard it has occupied since opening in 1989 and will move to a larger facility on West Amador Avenue, in the Burn Lake area. The company has doubled the number of employees and revenue since Goolsby joined the company three years ago, he said, and will hire locally as it expands.

"We focus really heavily on recruiting local talent for our technicians," Goolsby said.

Using laser technology, the company's primary function is to look for gas leaks on pipelines in the United States and Canada,

Goolsby said. The company has inspected more than 500,000 miles of gas lines since it expanded into the gas- and leak-detection field in 2005, he said. Last year, LaSen inspections prevented the escape of 65 billion tons of methane gas into the environment, Goolsby said.

The company plans to move into electric power-line patrol, the UAV market and other industries, he said. The company owns and operates five helicopters across the country, Goolsby said.

The new facility is expected to be operational in October 2021.

The expansion of LaSen means high-paying,

technology-related jobs in Las Cruces, Mesilla Valley Economic Development Alliance (MVEDA) President and CEO Davin Lopez said. "We want to grow aerospace," Lopez said, telling Goolsby, "We love to see you growing here."

"You guys have been very, very helpful to us," Goolsby said to Lopez. "We couldn't have done it without you."

MVEDA helped secure the state and local investment in LaSen's expansion.

"We're very proud of your success and we've glad to see your business expanding," Mayor Ken Miyagishima said.

Her daily programming also includes Mexican music, including Latin rhythms, salsa, merengue and more, Bada said.

In addition to 96.7 on the FM dial, you can find "Ruby Bada Al Aire" HD on Magic 104.9, Bada said. Choose channel two.

District upgrades COVID-19 screening transparency

Las Cruces Public Schools unveiled a new comprehensive dashboard on its website that reports positive COVID-19 cases within the district and illustrates how LCPS tracks staff wellness. Visitors to the page can view a cumulative list of which schools have reported positive test results and what health criteria are used to screen staff prior to entering school buildings.

“Our district is one of the largest employers in Doña Ana County,” noted Dr. Karen Trujillo, superintendent at LCPS. “Just as the Department of Health

provides information, our district has a responsibility to report how this virus is affecting our schools, and ultimately our community.”

Only personnel who report to physical buildings within the district are required to submit to daily wellness screenings. A confirmation email is sent to each employee who is cleared to enter a building, which includes a link to a form which documents any meaningful contact a staff member had throughout the day. Meaningful contact is defined as any interaction with another person for more than three minutes and in proximity of less than six feet,

regardless of whether face coverings or other PPE are in use.

“These documents are essential in the event there is a positive case reported and contact tracing is required,” said Trujillo.

Information related to sanitation protocols also can be found on the new dashboard, as well as community resources, technology and tutoring assistance, food distribution schedules and other information related to the current remote learning plan.

Report shows overdose problems remain in N.M.

The New Mexico Department of Health (NMDOH) reports prescription opioid overdose deaths went down last year, but illicit substance overdose deaths went up.

Overdose deaths caused by prescription opioids other than fentanyl decreased from 193 to 177 in 2019. However, total overdose deaths among New Mexicans rose 13 percent from 537 in 2018 to 605 in 2019. This exceeds the previous high of 540 deaths in 2014.

The increase last year is attributed to the use of illicit substances, including methamphetamine, fentanyl and heroin. Methamphetamine was involved in 44 percent of all drug overdose deaths in 2019. The percentage of overdose deaths that involved fentanyl was 21 percent in 2019, up from 13 percent in 2018.

"The battle to fight drug misuse in New Mexico remains a priority," said NMDOH interim Sec. Billy Jimenez. "The numbers are disheartening. The department will continue to work closely with our partners to decrease death by overdose and will adapt to the changing nature of the drug epidemic to address the threat of illegal street drugs, including methamphetamine, fentanyl and heroin, but more education, awareness and

treatment needs to be done."

The increased use of the Prescription Monitoring Program (PMP) by prescribers and the adoption of prescription guidelines correlates with the decline in prescription opioid overdose deaths, other than fentanyl. It also reflects the push to use naloxone, an opioid overdose reversal drug.

The NMDOH and New Mexico Human Services

Department have been working together to increase the availability of naloxone. More than 94,000 doses of naloxone were dispensed or distributed in 2019, representing an increase of 95 percent from 2018. In addition, there were more than 4,000 overdose reversals reported throughout the state.

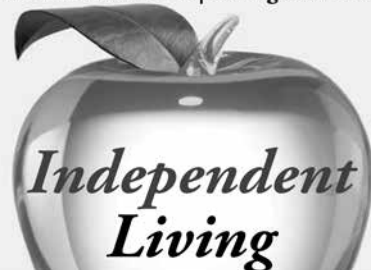

Some thought on golf gambling and mental coaching

Just like masks, shuttered store fronts and being homebound seems to be the new normal, PGA Tour golf betting also is becoming normal.

When two years ago the Supreme Court struck down a 1992 federal law that effectively banned sports gambling in most states, betting sites popped up like weeds. Maybe it was bound to happen. Some 23 states have either passed bills or legalized sports wagering. California, Florida, New York and Texas have yet to do so, but it's only a matter of time.

The PGA Tour has positioned itself in the market through high-profile partnerships with BetMGM, PointsBet, FanDuel and DraftKings. If you were watching the final round of the CJ Cup at Shadow Creek CC in Las Vegas, you saw winner Jason Kokrak posing for the media sporting a BetMGM cap. He was worth a whole lot of cash to those who believed in him before the tournament.

"The focus of our sports betting partnerships is to engage fans in new and creative ways," said Norb Gambuzza, senior VP of media and gaming for the PGA Tour.

Lest you misunderstand, that doesn't mean attracting more folks to tee it up at their local municipal course. It does mean a whopping revenue stream for the tour coffers. Also, if you were watching the CJ Cup, you couldn't help but notice the betting odds that appeared on-screen as the tournament was being played. It's doubtful anyone on the golf course was relaying that information to players or caddies, but that could happen in the future.

Personally, I am in the rather large group that does not approve of wagering on the outcomes of professional golf competitions. I have always believed golf to be quite above that pedestrian greed.

As early as 1956, the USA issued a public

statement that golf's governing body "disapproves of gambling in connection with golf tournaments because of the harm it can do to the best interests of the game."

They have evidently not changed that position. Even though there is a new wrinkle for the Masters telecast with "personally curated featured groups," meaning choose your own groups to watch on your slick iPad, golf fans should not expect live betting odds on the CBS broadcast.

Is mental coaching just a hoax, or can it mean the difference between winning and losing? Before addressing such a telling question, I feel obligated to first refer to the opening lines of a piece written by Alan Shipnuck on Nov. 1 for golf.com. Shipnuck is the author of the 2003 book "Blood, Sweat and Tees: Rich Beem's Walk on the Wild Side of the PGA Tour," just one year after Beem's 2002 win of the PGA Championship at Hazeltine, where he bested Tiger Woods by one shot.

Here's the opening:

"Collin Morikawa arrived on the PGA Tour fully formed, or so it seemed. How does a player so young (23!) exude such self-possession? Plenty of credit goes to his parents, Blaine and Debbie, as well as his coaches, teammates and professors at Cal Berkeley. But the biggest influence in Morikawa's maturation into a precocious major champion is his lifelong mentor, Rick Sessinghaus, whose mind-body teachings transcend the usual driving-range talk."

It was Sessinghaus who coached Morikawa on

how to calm his nerves, thereby permitting him to step up to the moment on the 70th hole of the PGA Championship at Harding Park in San Francisco in August, and smash a cut driver to the reachable par 4 which came to rest seven feet from the hole. The ensuing putt meant victory.

That shot will rank as one of the greatest shots in major championship history. Sessinghaus, with a doctorate in applied sport psychology, has become the high priest of what he calls "flow state," which is sometimes re-

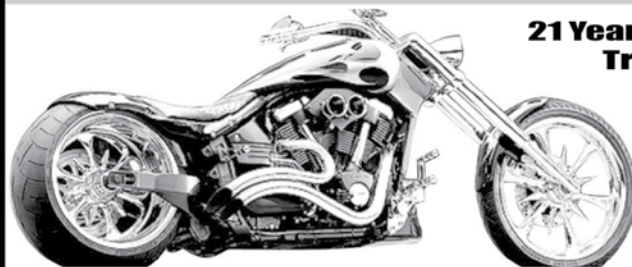
ferred to as the "zone."

In the simplest terms, flow is "the natural, effortless unfolding of our life (and actions) in a way that moves us toward wholeness and harmony" (from *The Power of Flow* by Belitz and Lundstrom). With the help of his coach, Morikawa tapped into the power of flow/zone on one magical afternoon in August. The power of flow is there for all.

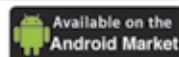
