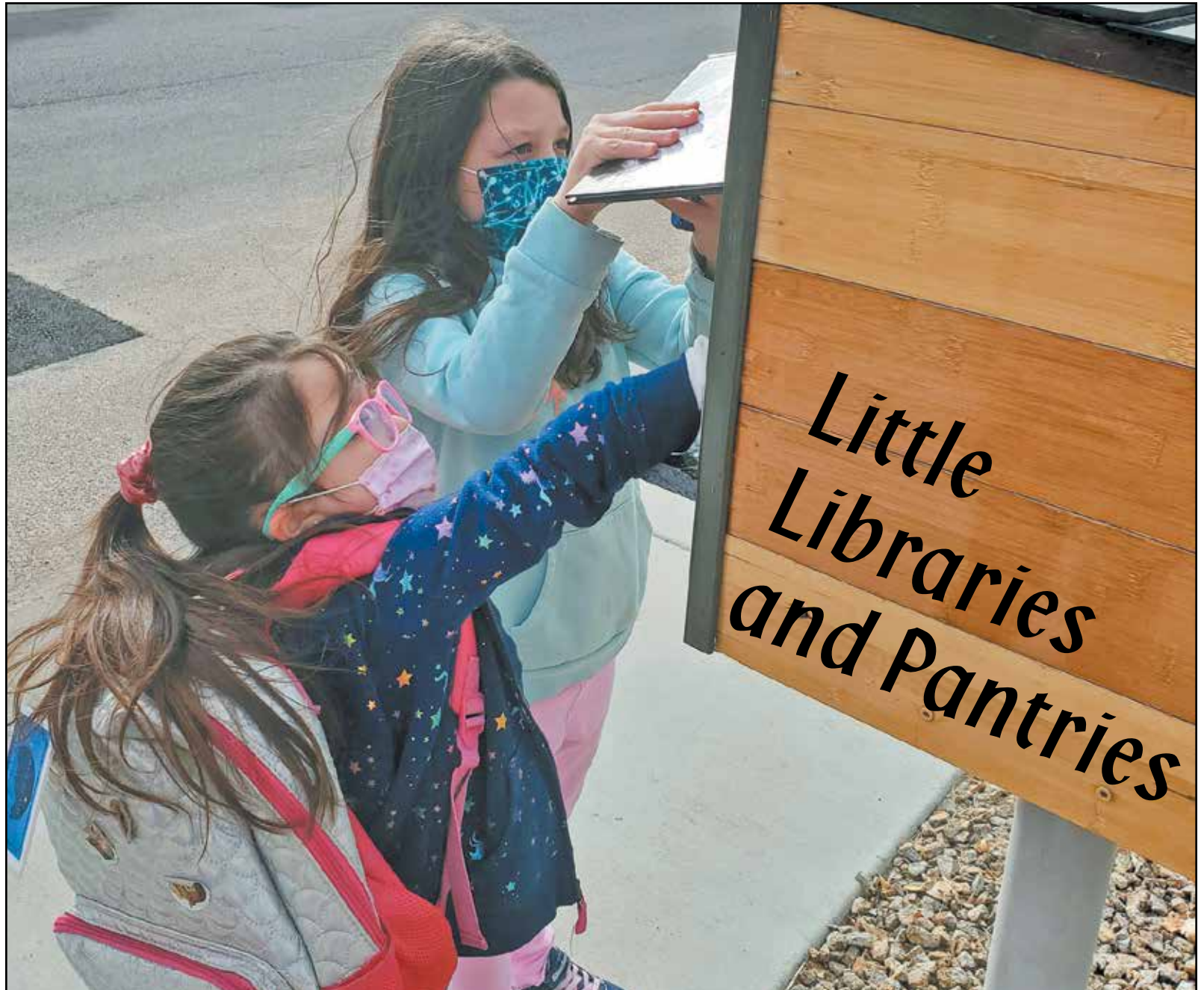

Doña Ana County receives \$9.3 million for rental and utilities relief for residents

Doña Ana County received a \$9.3 million grant from the U.S. Department of the Treasury, Emergency Rental Assistance (ERA) to assist local residents who have been impacted by COVID-19. This money is available for county residents including those within the municipalities of the cities of Las Cruces, Sunland Park and Anthony, the Village of Hatch and the Town of Mesilla. The grant covers rent and utility payments. It does not cover mortgage payments.

"We are grateful to the U.S. Treasury Department for providing Doña Ana County with this generous grant," said Manuel Sanchez, Chair of the Doña Ana County Board of County Commissioners. "This funding will allow the County to assist more families throughout our community during this difficult time. If you or someone you know needs this assistance, please go to www.donaanacounty.org/rent-utilities-assistance for information and application".

"The funds must be committed no later than September 30, 2021, the end of the federal fiscal year. Any funds not committed by that date must be returned to the federal government," said Fernando R. Macias, Doña Ana County Manager. "Both renters and landlords can take advantage of this grant. There are specific criteria for the funding. Households with an income that does not exceed 80% of area median income as defined by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) are eligible. That means \$43,900 annual income for a family of four."

Proof of financial hardship due directly or indirectly to the COVID-19 pandemic is also required. This could be proof of unemployment insurance or loss of income, or other financial hardship that threatens the household's ability to pay rent or utilities.

City bond projects moving ahead; completion date for all four is end of 2022

City of Las Cruces parks, trails, sports facilities, dog parks, a new fire station and a new Animal Services Center are among projects in various stages of construction and renovation thanks to four general obligation bond issues passed by city voters in 2018.

City Public Works Department Director David Sedillo said all projects should be completed by the end of calendar year 2022. They are being paid for with \$35.6 million in GO bond funds from the August 2018 all-mail election. About 15,000 votes were recorded for each of the four questions in

that election, all of which passed.

The four approved questions allocate \$16.9 million for Question 1) improvements to city parks and sports fields and two dog parks; Question 2) \$9.8 million to construct a new animal shelter; Question 3) \$6.2 million to build a new Fire Station No. 3; and Question 4) \$2.7 million to build and improve city walking, jogging and biking trails.

Specific project updates

are as follows:

- Question 1: Work on Hadley Recreation Complex began Oct. 7, 2020. Improvements are about 28 percent complete at Ralph Maag Park, 1700 E. Hadley Ave., including lighting, concession stands, restrooms and the crow's nest. The work should be finished by Feb. 19. Work also is underway on lighting at Jim Harty Ball Field and should be completed by May 31. Construction began Oct.

7 on rehabilitation work at Lions Park, 701 W. Picacho Ave. The work is about 30 percent complete and should be finished by the end of 2021. Improvements to Desert Trails Community Park, 3492 Sonora Springs, began Oct. 7 and should be completed by March 15. They include repairing a parking lot drain and erosion control. Drawings for work to be done at Unidad Park, 1500 E. Hadley Ave., are 90 percent complete. The project will include installation of a splash pad, showers and a recirculating water system. The city saved \$140,000 on the purchase of the splash pad and other equipment for the project, Sedillo said. Those funds will help pay

for the recirculating system. Drawings were due Feb. 5 for phase one work at East Mesa Recreation Complex, including soccer, football and multi-use fields, a baseball complex and pickleball courts, along with a 10-acre traditional park. The recreation complex is adjacent to the East Mesa Public Safety Complex, 550 N. Sonoma Ranch Blvd.

- Question 2: Construction of a new Animal Services Center, to be built adjacent to the existing center, 3551 Bataan Memorial West, could begin in February. The highest-ranked contractor for the project was selected Jan. 21. Construction of two dog parks will be incorporated with the project.

- Question 3: Construction of a new Fire Station No. 3, adjacent to the existing station at 390 N. Valley Drive, began Jan. 20 and should be completed this year. The existing Fire Station No. 3 was built in 1967 and is experiencing serious structural issues.

- Question 4: Notice to proceed with work on walking, jogging and biking trails is expected Feb. 5. The trails include Armijo Lateral, Southwest City Loop (Mesilla Drain) and Las Cruces Lateral.

Aid-in-dying bill clears House committee

LAS CRUCES - A bill that would allow health care providers to give aid in dying to terminally ill patients passed the New Mexico House Health and Human Services Committee after an emotional three-hour debate Friday, Jan. 29, in which legisla-

tors discussed their own personal stories of caring for friends and family in their final days.

House Bill 47 is named for Elizabeth Whitfield, a former district court judge who suffered through a lengthy battle with cancer over many years. She went to the Legislature in 2017 advocating for legislation allowing for aid in dying,

but died last year, before seeing that bill passed into law.

The new bill would require two different health care providers to confirm that the patient's condition is terminal, and s/he is expected to die within six months. Only one confirmation would be needed for patients already in hospice care, where the six-month

certification is already a requirement.

Health care providers would also have to certify that the patient is mentally competent and was making the decision without coercion. For patients with mental illness, an additional certification would be needed from a mental health professional.

Patients would be provided with a lethal prescription. It would then be up to the patient if and when to take it. Bill sponsor Debbie Armstrong, D-Albuquerque, said patients usually slip into a coma right away and then die a short time later.

The cause of death on

official documents would be listed as the underlying condition, not suicide.

Committee members Liz Thomson, D-Albuquerque, and Gail Armstrong, R-Magdalena, both talked emotionally about helping loved ones through their final days. For Thomson, it was a best friend dying from cancer. For Gail Armstrong, it was her mother, who she said died "a miserable death."

Republicans on the committee objected to a provision in the bill that requires health care workers who do not want to participate in assisted dying to refer patients to another provider. Debbie Armstrong argued that

it specifically states that those providers could not be held liable in either a criminal or civil court, but opponents of the bill said they could face professional discipline from the state medical board.

There were also concerns raised about a lack of specific training for physicians and the adequacy of protections against coercion.

The bill passed on a party-line vote and now moves to the House Judiciary Committee. A similar bill in 2019 died without getting a vote in the House.

LCPS board: Plan for more face-to-face instruction

During a Feb. 2 meeting of the Las Cruces Public Schools Board of Education, a presentation was

made that outlined a plan to open classrooms to hybrid learning beginning Feb. 22.

In a four-one vote, the board asked for a more detailed plan for consider-

ation at the board's Tuesday, Feb. 16 meeting.

After Superintendent Dr. Karen Trujillo presented a plan to return students to classrooms in a phased-in

approach, the board said it was not ready to commit to aggressive hybrid instruction. Instead, it authorized Trujillo to develop a plan for increased face-to-face

opportunities that prioritize students in need of support. The Feb. 16 meeting will begin at 4 p.m. at www.lcps.tv.

Whether the upcoming

plan will be sufficient to meet state requirements for participation in New Mexico Activities Association events is yet to be determined.

The City of Las Cruces is currently accepting applications to fill openings on a new committee named the Utility Customer Advisory Group (UCAG).

MEMBERSHIP: The Mayor with the advice and consent of the City Council will appoint five (5) members to the UCAG.

- **Member Eligibility: Appointee must:**
 - Be a registered voter and a customer/recipient of one or more of the Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) for at least one (1) year prior to appointment.
 - Not hold any elected or appointed public office or be a City employee.
 - Not be a contractor, consultant, or have a contractual relationship with the City for the benefit of the LCU.
- **Member Qualifications: To be qualified for appointment, appointees shall: Have a significant technical expertise in one or more of the following fields:**

DUTIES: The UCAG will function as a customer advisory committee with members participating in:

- All four (4) utility rate reviews before the Utilities Board on behalf of the City's various customer rate classes.
- The rate review process of selecting the consultant via the City's currently established Request for Proposal ("RFP") procurement process.
- Press releases, utility billing inserts, letters to the editor/guest editorials, and similar materials concerning rate reviews pending before the Utilities Board will be approved by the UCAG prior to release or publication:
 - Press releases approved by the UCAG will be submitted to and issued by the City's Public Information Office following standard procedures.
 - Utility billing inserts approved by the UCAG will be submitted to the assigned City staff at the Utilities Department and may be reformatted for consistency. The printing costs for billing inserts will be paid for by the Utilities Department.
- The UCAG will terminate upon completion of the duties set forth above upon notification by the Utilities Director to the City Clerk.

Personal responsibility: Another thing of the past

It was late on a Tuesday night in early December, so late it turned into Wednesday morning.

A person or persons decided, for whatever reason, the way to get in the holiday spirit in southern Doña Ana County would be to derail a train.

Now, maybe they didn't know their actions would actually derail a train. But even if they had been drinking or doing drugs, they still must have realized the possibility.

Regardless, they dragged railroad ties and laid them across the tracks outside Vado. Later, the train came along, struck the ties, and went off the rails. Literally.

Two locomotives and a dozen empty cars rolled off, and the

conductor and engineer were injured. The cost? Multiple millions of dollars in damage. It could have been much worse.

Luis Angel Rodriguez, 27, of La Mesa, was arrested in connection with the crime.

While there is no justifiable reason or explanation for this crime, it is a symptom of a larger issue in our society: the lack of personal responsibility.

I'd seen around several tracks in the region, railroad ties laying next to the rails in preparation for replacing the ties. I remember thinking, "That's a good idea. Get them all set up, so when they are ready to replace them, they can work efficiently." If I'd been more cynical, I might have real-

Risking it all for the Big Game

I'm not sure if the Super Bowl this Sunday is a testament to our persistence and ability to overcome challenges, or more evidence that our priorities are all screwed up.

I will admit I'm surprised they made it to the finish. When Major League Baseball stumbled out of the gate in July, with the Miami Marlins and St. Louis Cardinals both having to shut down in the first week, I didn't see much hope for the NFL being able to complete its season.

They didn't get here without paying a cost. According to USA Today, 262 players have tested positive since the NFL began testing Aug. 1.

As a football fan, I noticed a disturbing but predictable trend once the season started and positive tests were announced. Broadcasters and fans started treating a positive

COVID-19 test the same as an ankle injury. "How long will he be out?" was everybody's primary concern. The assumption was

the player would be asymptomatic, and it was only a question of how long he would have to remain in isolation.

That was usually the case, but not always.

Buffalo Bills tight end Tommy Sweeney developed myocarditis, an inflammation of the heart that can lead to heart attacks, strokes and death, and has been found in patients who have contracted COVID-19. Boston Red Sox pitcher Eduardo Rodriguez also developed the heart ailment after battling the virus.

Even players who returned to action were dealing with impacts we could not see. Former league MVP Lamar Jackson said he felt flu-like symptoms and lost his

sense of smell during his 10-day quarantine after testing positive. When he returned to action, the entire left side of his body cramped up during a play against the Cleveland Browns.

Browns defensive lineman Myles Garrett missed two games after testing positive and said when he returned to action his breathing was labored, he had severe coughing fits and felt as if he was being choked.

Raiders tackle Trent Brown was on the COVID-19 list twice and had to be rushed to the hospital prior to a game in Cleveland.

The long-term impacts for these players and others infected with the virus won't be known for several years.

I understand there are essential workers getting sick and dying every day who do not have the same access to testing and treatment as millionaire athletes. My sympathies

are with them and their loved ones.


Some of them will be rightly honored at the Big Game. The NFL has announced 7,500 vaccinated health care workers have been given free tickets to the game. All 32 teams will be able to select doctors and nurses from their community.

Which is terrific. But there will also be 14,500 additional fans in the stands at Raymond James Stadium. They won't necessarily be vaccinated and aren't as likely to strictly follow health protocols.

That seems like a super-spreader. And it doesn't seem all that essential.

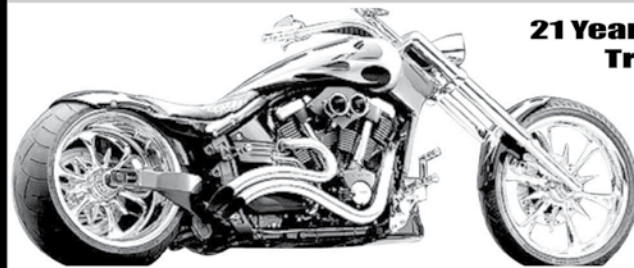

No divine presence encourages racism. I've never read a sacred text saying worshippers should segregate themselves by race. We've learned to attend churches in ways that maintain racial barriers.

To paraphrase President Biden, we must end this uncivil war in religion that pits black against white.

Being African Ameri-

can, I've attended many white congregations. In my 30s, I joined a White United Methodist Church in Fort Worth, Texas. The message was more important than the difference in my race.

I didn't receive a warm reception. Nor did I perceive members didn't want me there. You can say it was a lukewarm religious experience.

The people elected Vice President Kamala Harris with Joe Biden. She is biracial. Her leadership signals a break from the past that the country needs.

There's a breath of fresh air at the highest levels of national leadership.

I believe Biden wants an administration that mir-

rors the U.S. demographic landscape. Plus, people of color helped get him elected. I pray for the day when all Americans demand diverse leadership.

Can the U.S. government be a diversity model for people of faith? Absolutely. However, we must remember this: Multiculturalism requires intention.

White pastors and lay leaders must encourage racially diverse church services. Pastors can preach sermons about anti-racism. White church members can swing wide the doors to the church.

Pastors should preach racial unity among their members. That would empower White church

members to look at their attitudes about race. The work demands a long-term commitment.

White pastors should invite peers from other races to preach. For example, Black clergy should invite White clergy to their pulpits and vice versa. LatinX and Asian clergy must also model inclusion.

When parishioners witness their spiritual leaders modeling anti-racist leadership, it rubs off.

I speak as a Black pastor of a White church. The integration process is slow. Yet, I committed myself to help the church disrupt White supremacy culture.

Las Cruces' Unitarian Universalist church is striving to be more inclu-

sive. We've done a lot of social justice work and have attracted some people of color. We welcome everyone.

The City of Las Cruces has a multiracial mayor. Our city manager is a person of color. There are city councilors of color. There are leaders of color in the police and fire departments. Doña Ana County has commissioners of color. We need the same diversity in church pews.

Christians, Jews, Buddhists, Hindus, Eastern Orthodox, Pagans and all others must participate, too. They should intentionally reach out to people of color and welcome them. Likewise, churches of color must up their

game and welcome White folks.

The question remains: does all that religion change hearts and minds? It should. Sacred texts encourage unity. All faiths promote love. We can expect that same love and unity in the afterlife.

Let's begin now disrupting racial separation on Sunday mornings. Church folks must break down false barriers on Sunday mornings. It's the path to ending this "uncivil war."

There's no other way to become a beloved community.

Little libraries/pantries popping up around Las Cruces

Little libraries are popping up in neighborhoods around Las Cruces, and children and adults are taking, donating and reading books. Little food pantries will follow.

Tricia Heffelfinger and Cesia A. Otero started the project, called Doña Ana County Little Libraries and Pantries, as part of their longtime volunteer service to improve education and literacy in the community.

"I saw a post on a community Facebook page about a little library need-

ing books," Heffelfinger said. "I sent [Otero] the screenshot. She had the idea to create a map of all the libraries in our community. I created a post on a community Facebook page that same night, asking for locations of little libraries in town. The response was incredible – more than 350 likes and 200 comments. On Jan. 5, I created the Facebook page 'Doña Ana County Little Libraries and Pantries.' On Jan. 8, I picked up our first donation and visited my first little library. It has just taken off since then."

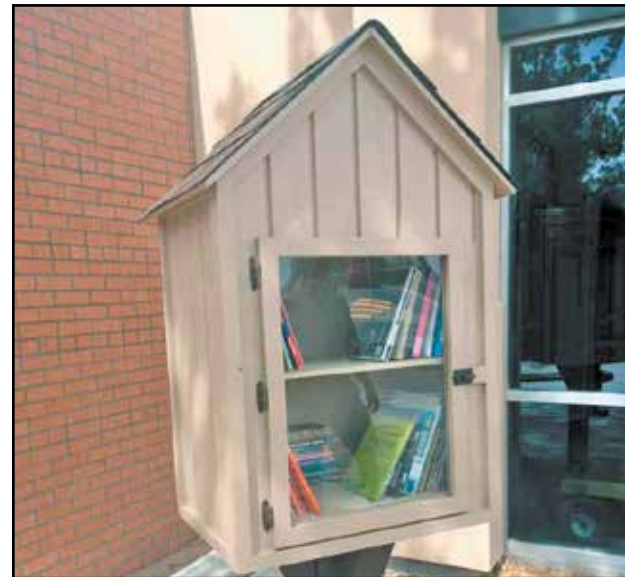
"It has been amazing to

watch how our community is coming together," Otero said. "I think a big part of it has to do with the fact that we are all looking for different ways to connect and contribute in any way we can."

Heffelfinger and Otero also plan to expand little libraries into locations in rural Doña Ana County. Iliana Perez is a volunteer working specifically on increasing libraries and pantries in the southern part of the county, Heffelfinger said.

"Part of our work is to ensure that our rural communities have the same opportunities as the Las Cruces areas," Otero said.

The little libraries and pantries are important for the community because they boost literacy, Heffelfinger said, and they "provide families with a fun, affordable way to obtain and trade books."

"As an educator and mom, I can think of so many other benefits and opportunities, like family and community engagement, connecting families to the resources they need through libraries, incorporating art, etc.," she said.

To get involved in the little libraries program, visit the Doña Ana County Little Libraries and Pantries Facebook page or donate books at any little library.

"We're looking for donations of supplies and

builders, in hopes of connecting them with those who want a little library but might not have the means to build it," Heffelfinger said.

And, if there are businesses or individuals in Doña Ana, Organ or anywhere in the southern part of Doña Ana County willing to have a library/pantry placed on their property, they also should contact Heffelfinger.

Another project partner is New Mexico Lions Operation KidSight, Inc., which is helping "by offering spare pairs of glasses for those in need and supplying books through Scholastic Book," said Program Manager Lion Brenda Dunn.

Lions clubs of Las Cruces (there are five) also are working on placing food pantries with little libraries.

"We are looking to have our first one placed at the Lions Club Community

and Resource Center at 1501 N. Solano Drive, sometime in February," Dunn said.

The Lions clubs will call their food pantries "Cali's Cupboard" in memory of Lions District Governor Carlos "Cali" Tellez from the La Mesa Lions Club, she said. Tellez, who died Jan. 20, 2016, "never wanted anyone to go hungry," Dunn said.

"The Lions are excited to be able to help the community in this way and other ways, such as getting them eye exams and glasses if they have no other means to obtain them," she said.

The community has clearly embraced the Little Libraries and Pantries program:

- "So excited of the positive impact this will have in our community! Thank you for bringing this up!" Pablo Garcia.

- "Thank you for sharing this. I started my Little Library about seven years ago in memory of my oldest daughter who had passed. She was a speech and language pathologist. Her passion was books and reading." Lupe Hidalgo.

- "I am inspired to find all those kids books I bought so I can put them in one of these!" Amy Rohr

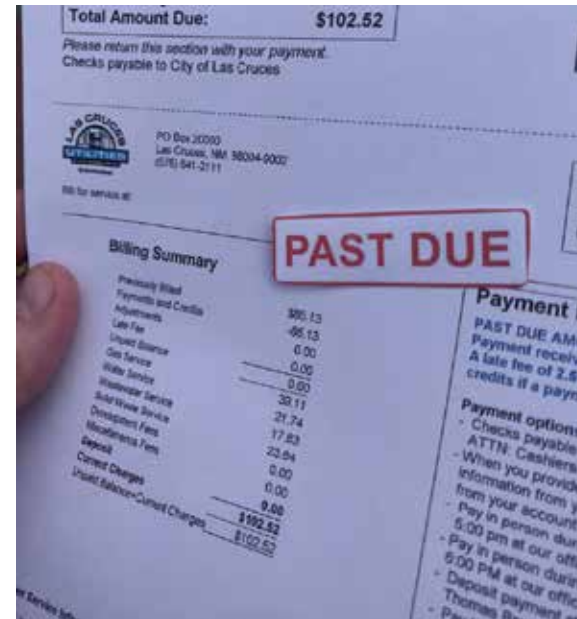


As residents in Las Cruces try to find a new normal, part of the recovery will include making sure any delayed utility bills are up to date and paid. While shut-offs of utility services have been halted by a mandate from City Council in March 2020, Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) wants to make sure that those who may need help due to long-term pandemic difficulties are not unprepared when shut-offs do resume.

A conversation with LCU customer central representatives can be the best place to start. Steven Valdez, LCU billing & receivables supervisor, explained there is still funding through the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, which was allocated by the state

to the City of Las Cruces (City). The City received over \$7 million dollars for COVID-19 response and relief efforts, part of which can be used to help residents who suffered a hardship due to the pandemic - such as job loss - between March 1, 2020, to December 30, 2020.

"Residents may be returning to their jobs but are needing to catch up on past

bills," Valdez said. "A conversation and possible documentation of the hardship may be used to help decrease the utility amount past due."

The best way to get help is to call LCU Customer Central at (575) 541-2111 and determine the best payment option for you.

pandemic," Valdez said. "It's first about figuring out where they are now and what they've been through. We want to help people get back on their feet."

"As LCU gets closer to a time when utility disconnections occur, it may be harder to navigate a payment process," Valdez said. "By either receiving assistance with their bills or requesting a 'Promise to Pay' for those who know money will be available in the near future, such as a stimulus payment or a job starting back up as restrictions ease."

Money will also be available for Doña Ana County (County) residents including those within the municipality of the city of Las Cruces, thanks to a \$9.3 million grant from the U.S. Department of the Treasury. Announced by the County at the end of January, the grant can help cover utility payments. The County will be announcing more details for the application process as soon as possible.

At NMSU, 'Black history is American history'

"Black history is American history. It did not start with slavery," said New Mexico State University Black Programs Interim Director Kimberly York.

Connecting black students and the community more directly with African American history is one of the goals of Black History Month programming presented throughout February by NMSU Black Programs and the NMSU Black Student Association (BSA).

All programs will be presented via Zoom and are free and open to the public, York said. This year's theme is "Honoring our Past, Rising to the Challenge, Empowering Our Future."

Events will include a wide range of topics — everything from music (West African drumming and dancing) to black health issues, the power of poetry, a movie and group discussion party and connections with NMSU faculty.

It's the first Black History Month for NMSU senior Kiara Holloway as BSA president. She said she's especially excited about the Black Style Showcase Feb. 19, which will include a panel discussion and feature styles from around the world.

York said Bey, who is a member of the Academy of American Poets, will present a powerful program Feb. 16.

"She's amazing," Hollo-



way said.

Many of the presentations are collaborations with UNM, which Holloway said has "opened many doors."

The Feb. 12 West African

Drum, Dance and Art Experience "will get us dancing," Holloway said. The event was popular during last year's Black History Month celebration, York said.

The month kicked off with Black Programs' weekly "Black Excellence in Higher Education" podcast featuring NMSU black faculty and staff and included NMSU General Counsel and Chief of Legal Affairs Roy Collins, York said.

One of the goals for the entire month's programming is to "broaden the significance of black history," she said, and make it more relatable to NMSU students and the entire community."

A "continuing thread" throughout the month will be the Black Lives Matter movement and national protests against police brutality and racially motivated violence, said York, who is a member of the New Mexico Gover-

nor's Council for Racial Justice.

In addition to highlighting icons of black history like Martin Luther King, Malcolm X and Rosa Parks, Black History Month also is "focused on lesser-known figures" of black culture who have made significant contributions in the arts, education and politics, said BSA Vice President Ignacio Alvarado.

Presenting the entire month's programming via Zoom because of the

pandemic has been a challenge, York said, but Black Programs "has not skipped a beat," she said. "I think it speaks volumes about collaboration."

Jubilee and her mother, Nora Brown, made bags of food and distributed them to people struggling with homelessness in Las Cruces in late 2020.

“Seeing their smiles, it very much changed my view of homeless people,” Jubilee said. Reaching out to the homeless also makes it impossible to ignore them, which is easy for most people to do, she said.

Jubilee has acted in several films and would like to become a screenwriter. She is taking voice lessons from Sara Neely and writing songs.

Singing and writing, working on her service projects, doing schoolwork, caring for two dogs and two cats, and redecorating her room have kept Jubilee busy during the pandemic.

Jubilee said her advice

to anyone who wants to help others is to not be overwhelmed by the need that exists.

“What’s best is to not look at these problems as numbers,” she said. Instead, “look at people living their lives. You can’t help everyone, but you can help some of them. In terms of human connection, you never know what other people are going through.”

“I think she's inspirational in the sense that she's making small changes where she can,” Brown said of her daughter. “What a neat world it would be if we all thought of small ways we could spread cheer during these strange times.”

has temporarily assumed the duties of battalion chief when needed.”

Palma has been an educator for LCFD and for EMT schools in the area, Williams said.

FROM THE CHAIR

Bataan 2021 to be a virtual event

The 32nd annual Bataan Memorial Death March will be hosted virtually for the first time in event history. Marchers will be able to participate anytime between April 9 and April 18, 2021.

The decision by White Sands Missile Range to host the event virtually allows leadership to keep COVID safety the top priority for participants, volunteers, staff and community supporters. It also gives participants the flexibility to choose a date and route that works best for them, while honoring the memory of World War II heroes.

On April 9, 1942 tens of thousands of American and Filipino soldiers were surrendered to Japanese forces and were forced to march more than 60 miles in the scorching heat through the Philippine jungles. Thousands died and those who survived faced the hardships of prisoner of war camps.

The Bataan Memorial Death March is a challenging and grueling march that tests both mental and physical abilities. For the 2021 virtual experience, marchers are encouraged to choose a challenging stretch of road or trail in honor of the historical march. Marchers can choose between the full 26.2 mile marathon length or a 14.2 mile honorary distance.

The March officially kicks off on April 9, 2021, and participants may choose any day between April 9 and April 18, 2021 to complete their mileage. The March must be completed in one day. Returning marchers will find they will only need to



select their distance for the 2021 March, as multiple categories are not necessary in a virtual environment. Event organizers still encourage participants to march in their own way, to include in uniform or with a "ruck" if desired and safe.

The registration fee includes a Bataan Marcher T-Shirt, Marcher Bib, Commemorative Dog Tag, and a Participation Medal. As with all virtual fitness events, the March is based on the honor system. Event organizers will not be tracking finishing times, instead focusing on the memorial aspect of the event.

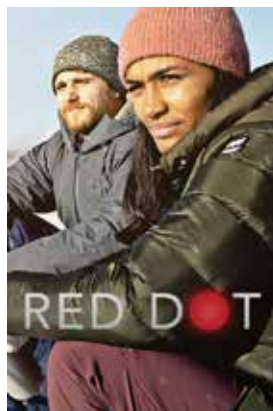

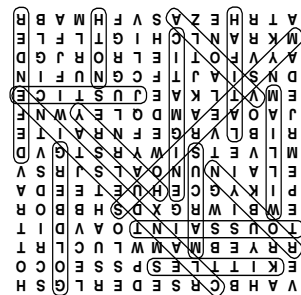

"Connections" is performed and directed by BBT owners Ceil and Peter Herman. The last time they were on stage together was performing "Love Letters" by A.R. Gurney in 2006. Since "Love Letters" was not available for streaming this year, the Hermans created their own entertaining and uplifting February show.

"In some ways, working on 'Connections' wasn't much of a change, since we work together daily," the Hermans said. "Being up on stage and actually moving around, as opposed to sitting at desks in 'Love Letters' was very different. The lack of an audience, other than the video crew, was a real change, however it allowed us to stop and re-do sections, if we messed up.

The new twist, compared to other staged readings, was that we didn't operate from scripts in our hands but rather with the script on a large-screen TV 'teleprompter.' The three plays in 'Connections' ranged from absurd to realistic, requiring differences in costumes and accents. It was definitely a very strange, but rewarding and fun experience."

In "The Illuminati in Drama Libre," published in 1921, the characters explore each other and run the gamut of human emotion in a three-minute time span. Two characters, He and She, are dressed absurdly in the most vivid colors. The two make a whirlwind entrance in front of the curtain.

"A Walk In The Park,"

published in 2018, is described as a romantic short play for seniors. In the play, Jack, an older man walking in the park, sees a woman on a bench who seems to be adjusting to being a senior. She looks familiar. Does he know her? Could it be the girl, Essie, who long, long ago helped him get over another who broke his heart?

in "A Pair of Lunatics," written in 1889 and first performed at the Drury Lane and Avenue Theatres in London, Dr. Adams hosts a ball at a mental institution. Two of his guests come across each other and each mistakes the other for a patient.

Mario Valencia served as videographer during the production, which

runs about 40 minutes total.

The Hermans each received an artist-relief grant from the Doña Ana Arts Council to help with the project.

BBT's theatre gallery hosts a number of local artists participating in a virtual exhibit themed "Connections" to accompany the production and in honor of February's For the Love of Art Month. The series began Jan. 27 with an online presentation by renowned New York-based artist Michael Waugh. Artist Abbey Hepner was featured Feb. 2.

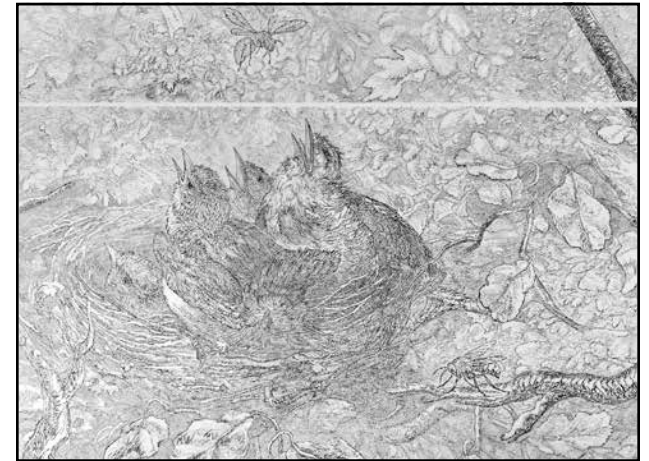

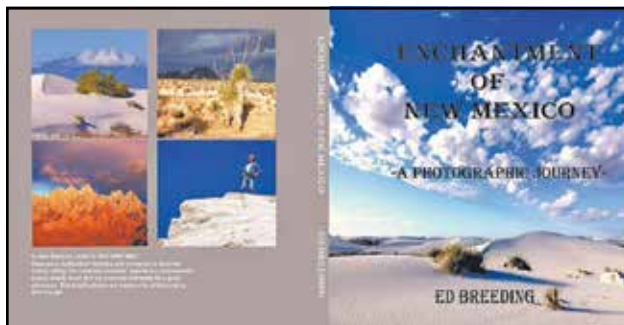

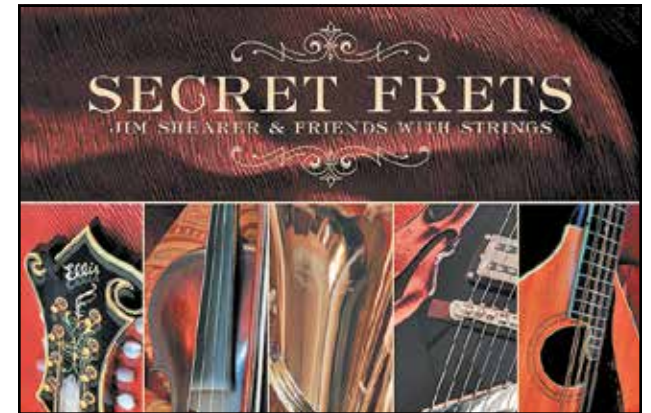

Shearer's wife, Celeste, also is a music educator and performer (horn and piano). She has a new Summit CD coming out this spring titled "Sultry & Eccentric: The Music of James Grant," which features Jim Shearer in a massive double concerto for horn, tuba and wind ensemble.

"During my schooling and my early career, I was thoroughly trained as an orchestral tubist," Shearer said. "I've always enjoyed orchestral playing, though it's never

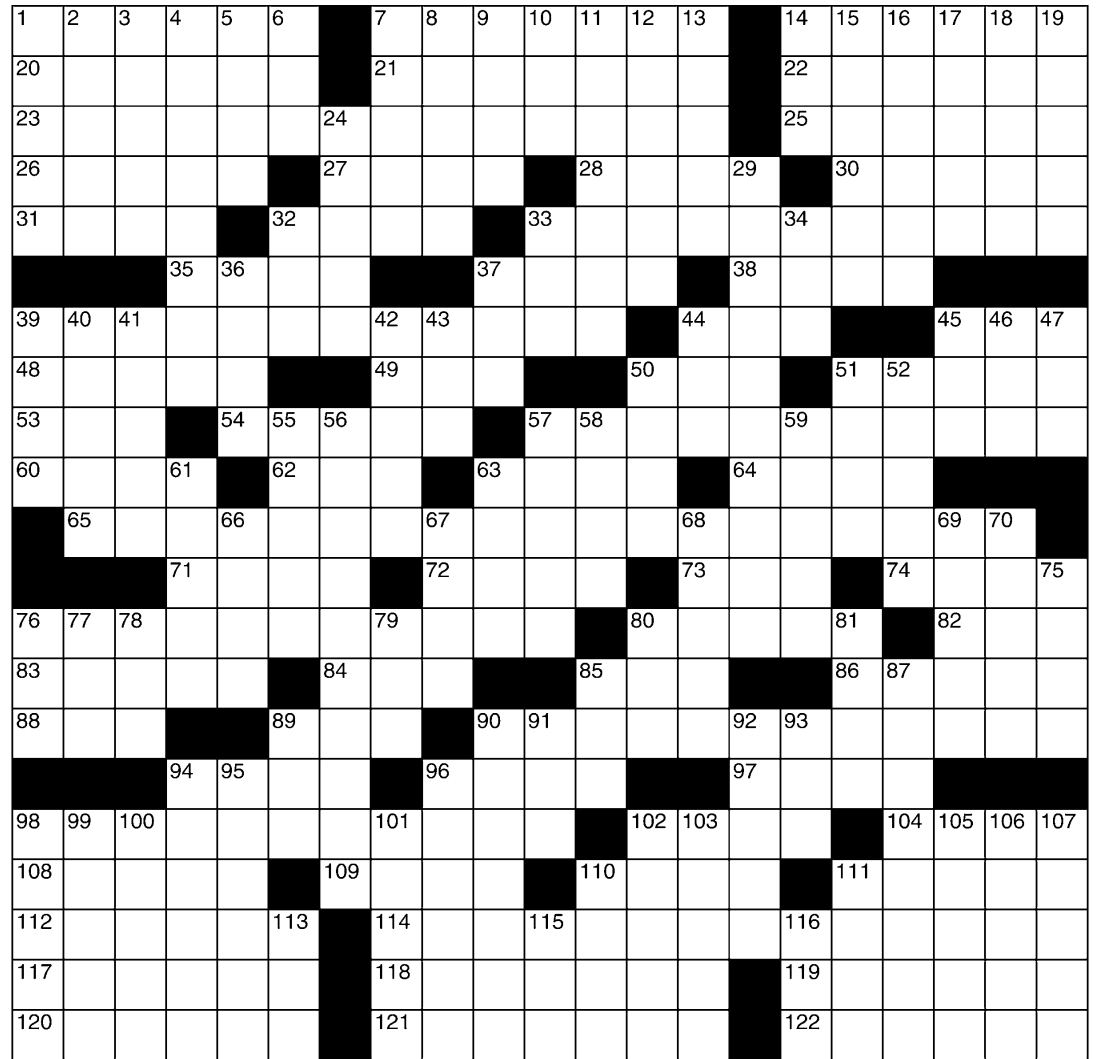

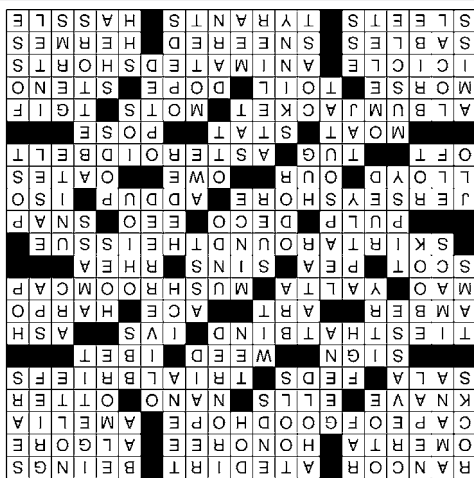

America's political morass requires us to have hope

Here we are with a new presidential term. Those who were in favor of change hope the new administration will fulfill their political agenda. Those who were in favor of the old regime think their hopes have been dashed.

Neither one of these scenarios will come to pass. Every presidential term is a mixed bag of legislation that pleases some and angers others. That's the way it has been since the beginning of the democracy. Remember that Ben Franklin is reputed to have said, "We have a republic... if we can keep it." This is the American experiment.

Here's the problem, from my perch: thinking our hopes for a better world will be fulfilled by political action. Even more problematic is thinking one particular political party, especially in America, is going to lay down a red carpet for all the

things you want changed — or maintained — in our society.

I said, "especially in America." I'm among friends when I say our two-party system has never been very successful at genuine compromise;

when you have a binary system, one side is going to lose and the other win. That's how it goes.

If there were a lot more significant players on the political scene, maybe we'd have a chance for collaborative governance. Such an option would be closer to the way reality presents itself, with far more positions than there are parties in these United States of America. Two of them cannot include all the wide range of political insights, aspirations and agenda.

But we've been stuck with this two-party thing with no viable alternatives. Some of your agenda

may be achieved by executive or judicial or congressional action, but chances are you'll be disappointed on more than a few occasions with action on some other items.

This leads me back to the idea of hope. To the secular observer, Christian hope is probably identified with the idea of life after death — and therefore dismissible as either a silly or mistaken belief.

Unfortunately, that may be true for many people who bear the Christian tag. But it is not the end of the matter. It's only the beginning. Hope brings us into the midst of life. It does not push us off the map into a "spiritual" realm.

In Christian faith, the hope of the resurrection to new life is not a counsel to abandon this life, but an invitation to dig in more fearlessly and courageously, knowing you'll face fierce opposition but that the ultimate battle with evil is over,

vanquished on the cross. That's our belief and what powers our hope.

Perhaps all hope arising from a faithful position offers us a standpoint to withhold full commitment to any political party in the knowledge that no earthly power is going to act in full accordance with our values.

This does not mean withdrawing from the political process; it means to keep your eyes on ultimate goals that can never be achieved but only approximated through any political process. Rather than withdrawing from the process, hope calls us to engage more fully where we are able to do so.

Knee-jerk responses must give way to sober deliberation. For some people, this may mean running for office. For others it may mean working for change through local community groups.

In all cases it will mean discerning how approximate the practical goals

you work for how to your ultimate values. And that, in turn, means that you have to be clear about your ultimate values. To achieve such clarity, you have to dig into the tradition and the texts of your

faith.

Get Your Balance On

Your physical therapist can play a big role in helping you maintain or improve your balance as you age. Unfortunately, falls are becoming increasingly common in adults age 65 and over. Just because they're common, doesn't mean they're inevitable though. Research shows that falls are caused by a variety of factors, and many of them can be improved. Let's take a look at some of them and some tips to help you get back into balance.



LOWER BODY WEAKNESS

As we age, without resistance training we lose muscle mass every year. Weakness in your lower body has been shown to increase your fall risk. A physical therapist can design an exercise program to help you strengthen your legs and lower body safely.

INACTIVITY

Another reason we lose muscle mass and our balance decreases is inactivity and deconditioning. People who have fallen in the past often have a fear of falling again, which leads them to do less. As their activity levels decrease, they get weaker and even more fearful of falling. This downward spiral can be stopped with balance training from a physical therapist to build your confidence on your feet and allow you to become more active. Group exercise classes are another great way to become more active, work on your balance and meet new friends at the same time. Ask your PT for recommendations for a class near you.



VISION PROBLEMS

Many people don't realize that your body uses your vision for balance. If you want to prove this to yourself, try standing with your feet together with your eyes open, then compare that to doing it with your eyes closed. Visual problems can also make you miss things like bumps and changes in the surface you're walking on, or objects that you could trip over. If you're having problems with your vision, see your eye doctor for an exam and recommendations on what can be done.



MEDICATIONS

Certain medications can increase your risk of falling and impact your balance by making you sleepy, slowing your reactions, or causing weakness. Some examples of medications that can increase fall risk are certain types of antidepressants, blood pressure medications, and water pills. Your physical therapist can help you work with your doctor or pharmacist to review your medications and consider changes to improve your balance and reduce your risk of falling.

When it comes to helping you improve your balance, and reduce your risk of falling, your physical therapist is an important part of the team. They can evaluate you to determine where your problem areas are, and design an individualized program for you. They can also refer you to other professionals who can help like your eye doctor and your pharmacist. If you're starting to feel out of balance, your PT can help you stop falls before they start.

Intel awards Electronic Caregiver grant to assist COVID-19 relief

With the goal to accelerate progress in confronting global challenges, Intel Corporation has selected Las Cruces-based Electronic Caregiver (EC) to receive grant funding for its "COVID to Home" (CTH) program, which reduces constraints on hospital capacity while providing care to recovering COVID-19 patients.

In April 2020, in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Intel committed \$50 million to fund a Pandemic Response Technology Initiative (PRTI) to support and accelerate point-of-patient-care solutions.

"We chose to support EC's project because of its scalable use of remote monitoring that leverages Intel technology to meet the needs of underserved communities in New Mexico," said Chris Gough, general manager of Intel Health and Life Sciences.

EC launched CTH in November 2020 in partnership with regional public health stakeholders. The program offers a solution to post-holiday surges of COVID-19 cases in Doña Ana County. With the region's hospitals and ICUs at 100 percent capacity and staff stretched thin, CTH helps alleviate capacity constraints and ensures COVID-19 patients receive proper care and

oversight while preventing further spread of the virus.

CTH is jointly funded by Doña Ana County and the City of Las Cruces at no cost to patients. Since the program rolled out at MountainView Regional Medical Center and Memorial Medical Center (MMC), more than 100 patients have received services and support through the program. Moreover, CTH has increased critical care capacity in the region by 30 percent.

"[CTH] has allowed us to maintain capacity in our hospitals, while providing effective community-based care to people recovering from COVID," said Jamie Michael, director of Health and Human Services for Doña Ana County. "It also allows providers to interact with patients safely and allows people to recover in their homes."

Under the program, patients are discharged to their homes or to a designated hotel with an EC Pro Health smart health hub — a voice-driven, easy-to-use cellular-connected console. The device allows patients to receive daily ability to assess COVID-19 symptoms, including vital signs input from a pulse oximeter, non-contact thermometer and a blood pressure cuff.

A combination of clinicians and clinical volunteers use a web portal

to assess patient results remotely and provide care as needed. Patients can also use the device for televisits with a doctor, medication reminders and 24/7 emergency response. EC's solution utilizes Intel technology both in on-site workstations and cloud-based servers from Amazon Web Services.

"The major impact of this program is the number of hospital beds it has freed up for patients that are really sick," said John Andazola, M.D., program director of the Southern New Mexico Family Medicine Residency Program at MMC. "It truly represents the best in local collaboration, and we are pleased to play a role."

The option to implement EC's CTH program exists throughout the state and the country.

NMSU business-development program recognized

The U.S. Small Business Administration has honored the New Mexico Federal and State Technology (NM FAST) Partnership Program — housed at New Mexico State University's Arrowhead Center — with the 2020 Tibbetts Award in recognition of the program's Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) and Small Business Technology Transfer (STTR) achievements.

The Tibbetts Award, named after SBIR program founder Roland Tibbetts, recognizes exemplary companies, organizations and individuals who demonstrate the goals of the SBIR/STTR programs to promote innovation, commercialization, technology transfer and cooperatives between small businesses and research institutions

and encourage diversity within innovation and entrepreneurship.

"The development, expansion and success of entrepreneurial and economic development ecosystems require several key fundamental elements," said NMSU Chancellor Dan Arvizu. "The NM FAST program

and its continued support of SBIR and STTR in New Mexico is one of those foundational elements. Arrowhead's work during the last six years to build this incredible program and resource — work that warrants national attention such as the Tibbetts Award — is a testament to the sustained effort by

all involved."

This year, 38 companies, seven organizations and 14 individuals were recognized for their accomplishments within the SBIR/STTR programs. NM FAST was one of seven organizations awarded.

"We are incredibly honored to receive this award," said Dana Catron, SBIR program director and director of strategic operations at Arrowhead. "During the last six years, and with the support of SBA FAST funding, our team has built an incredible program and resource for New Mexico's startup community and has gone above and beyond to ensure programming and assistance evolve to meet the unique challenges our clients face."

The establishment of NM FAST in 2015 created a space in New Mexico dedicated to guiding

small businesses through SBIR and STTR proposal-development programing and assistance, particularly focusing on serving first-time applicants.

The program's mission from the onset has been to provide support to underserved populations within the state. Twenty three percent of NM FAST's clients have been rural businesses, 36 percent are minority-owned, 31 percent are women-owned and 89 percent are first-time applicants.

In its five-year history, NM FAST has demonstrated its growth in capacity, serving 193 SBIR/STTR clients, assisting an average of 30 clients per quarter and providing nine new intakes per quarter. Across 70 outreach and assistance workshops and events throughout New Mexico, 12 communities have been reached, with 75 per-

cent of them being rural.

NM FAST has also awarded more than \$50,000 in up to \$2,000 micro-grants to clients during the life of the program for proposal-development assistance. Since 2015, New Mexico small businesses supported by NM FAST have received more than \$9.4 million in SBIR/STTR funding.

"For Arrowhead clients, more than 100 have submitted applications, and most say they would not have been able to get the proposals together without Arrowhead FAST assistance," said New Mexico Economic Development Department Secretary Alicia Keyes. "In 2020 alone, FAST clients received more than \$5.5 million of investment."

hatred."

It was during my years as rabbi of Temple Beth

Sholom in Topeka, Kansas, that I saw those hate-filled eyes.

In 1991, the Westboro Baptist Church, a small, mostly family-based

church led by the Rev. Fred Phelps, Sr., began its picketing campaign based in their belief that they alone were "God's elect." The initial messages on their signs and in fax/fliers they published were directed against the LGBTQ community. It didn't take long for racism and antisemitism to enter into their hate-filled declarations.

Their daily pickets throughout the city challenged anyone who spoke out against them, reflected in their appearance near my congregation before our weekly Sabbath services. Eventually, they picketed events in distant locations, appearing at funerals of members of the armed services, claiming that those who had died represented a nation mired in what their church considered to be ungodliness.

They attended city council meetings en masse

to speak out against anti-discrimination ordinances. I was among those who offered public comment in favor of the proposals at hand.

Over the last few years, two of the Phelps grandchildren have written accounts of their departure from the church and association with the family. Libby Phelps, in "Girl on a Wire," and Megan Phelps-Roper, in "Unfollow," told their stories about being members of the church and about how they exited a family/church system that came to oppress them.

In an interview by Riley Robinson in The Christian Science Monitor on Oct. 10, 2019, Megan described how her presence on Twitter began to facilitate a change in her soul: "100 percent of people who came to my page were angry and

hostile. But people could tell I was sincere about what I believed [then]. They started asking questions, and that changed the

dynamics. Then I started asking them questions and they'd say something about their day or their pets or their children. On Twitter, there was time and space to develop that rapport. It enabled me to empathize with the perspectives of

other people. That was a huge part of my ability to challenge what I had been taught and then eventually walk away from it."

She added: "If you can see... people [who harbor hateful views] ... as human beings and capable of

change, there is hope. We should be willing to reach out... There's so much power in seeing the possibility of change."

Having seen these young women on the picket line, and then reading their personal stories, I was en-

couraged at their willingness to honestly recount their experiences and what made them change.

It truly gave me hope, and still does, that hatred can give way to connection, and even love. May it ever be so.
