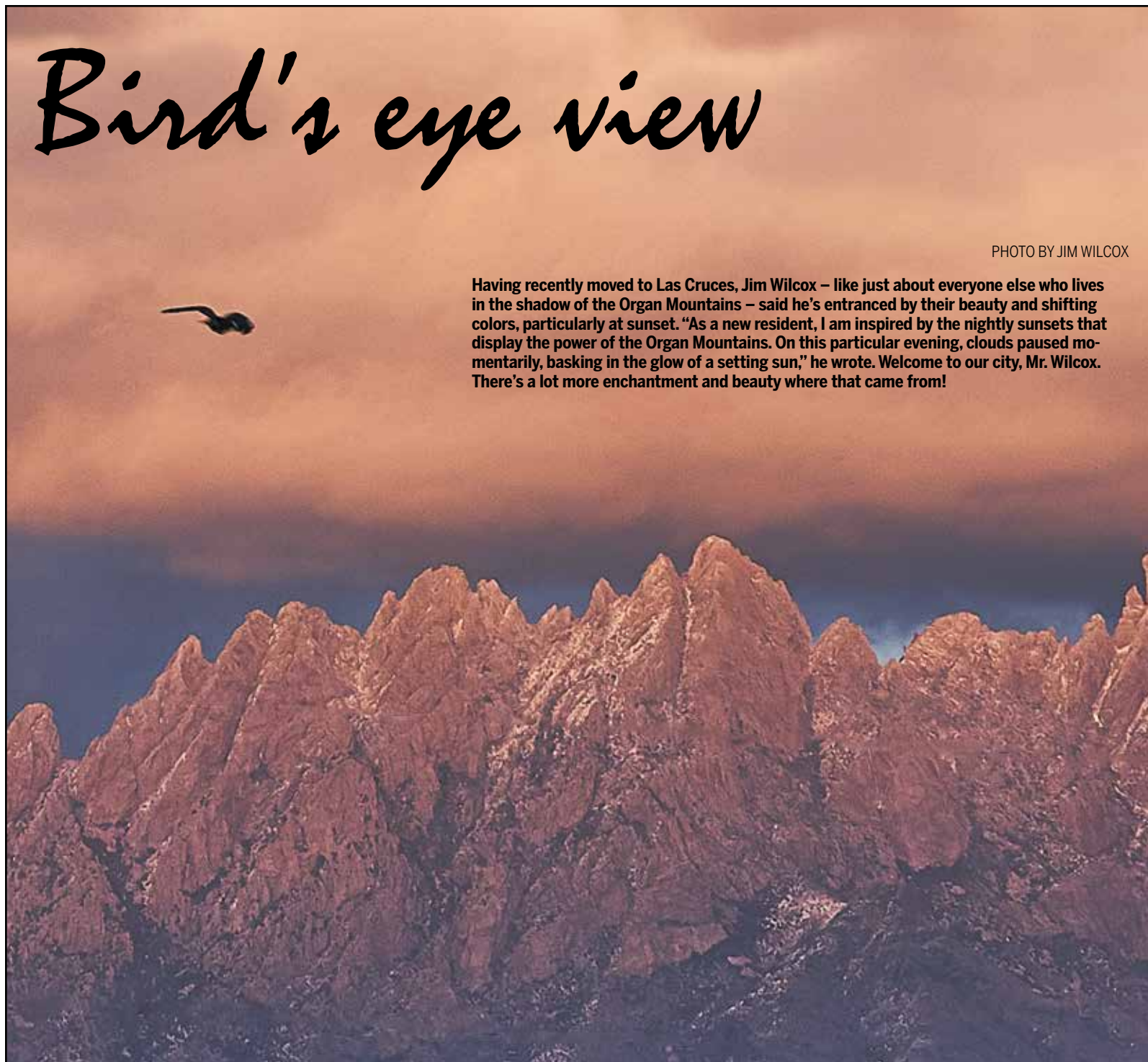

Chaparral fire station gets remodel

Doña Ana County Fire and Emergency Services Station #9 in Chaparral is getting a new kitchen and a fresh coat of paint. The remodel is part of the preparations to convert the station to a 24-hour, seven days a week operation.

"The County is committed to meeting the needs of each community with a faster-response, high quality services and dedicated personnel," said Doña Ana County Fire Chief Shannon Cherry. "As each area grows or changes, so do the residents' needs. We continuously monitor those changes and integrate them into our operational discussions, calibrating budgets, and timing into both the long- and short-term plans."

The Fire and Emergency Services Department will assign full-time firefighters to Station #9, ensuring firefighters are available in Chaparral, at all times.

"We very much appreciate and value our volunteer firefighters and they will continue to work at Station #9, along with full-time employees," Chief Cherry said. "We want to provide Chaparral, as well as the rest of the County residents, with the highest quality of service possible."

The remodel cost, nearly \$40,000 was budgeted by the County. It includes a full-service kitchen, cabinetry and a stocked pantry to ensure it accommodates personnel who will work there throughout the day and night.

Las Cruces remembers LCPS Superintendent Karen Trujillo

Las Cruces Public Schools Superintendent Karen Trujillo was struck by a vehicle on Edgewood Avenue in Las Cruces Thursday evening, Feb. 25, and died a short time later at Mountainview Regional Medical Center.

Trujillo, 50, was appointed interim superintendent in September 2019. The LCPS Board of Education made the appointment permanent in February 2020.

She won a contested Democratic primary in June 2018 and was elected to a four-year term on the Doña Ana County Commission in November 2018. Trujillo resigned that position in January 2019 when she was appointed secretary of the New Mexico Public Education Department, a position she until July 2019.

Trujillo grew up in Santa Fe and moved to Las Cruces at age 16. A graduate of Mayfield High School, she earned her bachelor's degree in secondary education, her master's degree in mathematics education and her doctorate in curriculum instruction, all from New Mexico State University.

Trujillo is survived by her husband, Ben, two daughters and a son. Her father is former County Commissioner Gilbert T. Apodaca.

The two dogs Trujillo was walking at the time

she was hit were seriously injured in the accident and were transported to a local veterinarian's office, the Las Cruces Police Department reported.

I knew her through theater, through having her kids in writing camp, through education activism and as the leader of the whole district. She was always kind and gracious and really did care about kids on every level." Trujillo was in the cast of "Belles," which Wheeler directed at Las Cruces Community Theatre in 2011. Trujillo "was brave to try a new thing like acting, and she did a great job," Wheeler said.

Haaland nears confirmation

Debra Anne “Deb” Haaland neared confirmation this week as the 54th secretary of the U.S. Department of the Interior (DOI), which oversees more than 500 million acres of public lands.

The U.S. Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee was expected to vote on Haaland’s nomination March 4. If the committee approved, as it was expected to do, the full Senate will then vote.

If confirmed, Haaland, an Albuquerque Democrat, would resign her New Mexico District 1

(NMO1) seat in the U.S. House of Representatives. New Mexico Secretary of State (NMSOS) Maggie Toulouse would then set the date for a special election to fill the vacancy.

Haaland, 60, is a native of Winslow, Arizona, and a member of Laguna Pueblo. She is the first Native American to head a federal cabinet agency and the third DOI secretary from New Mexico, joining former U.S. Sen. Albert Fall and former U.S. Rep. Manuel Lujan, Jr.

Haaland is a graduate of the University of New Mexico School of Law

and former chair of the New Mexico Democratic Party. She was elected to the U.S. House in 2018 and re-elected in 2020. Her replacement will join

New Mexico’s two other freshmen representatives in the House.

A special election will be held to fill her seat in Congress.

Chacon-Reitzel honored by Cattle Growers Association

New Mexico State University Regent Chair Dina Chacon-Reitzel is the 2020 recipient of the King Service Award, established by the New Mexico Cattle Growers Association in memory of former New Mexico Gov. Bruce King and his wife, Alice.

Raised on a cattle ranch in northern New Mexico,

with family roots dating back more than 400 years, Chacon-Reitzel attended earned her bachelor's degree in home economics in business and her master's degree in marketing and management, both from NMSU. Chacon-Reitzel now resides in Albuquerque with her husband, Jim, and their two children, Elizabeth and Matthew.

Since 1989, Chacon-Reitzel has worked with the New Mexico Beef Council. In 1991, she became executive director, responsible for the creation and implementation of beef research, promotion and consumer-information programs, in addition to the collection and compliance of the Beef Checkoff.

Chacon-Reitzel has held seats on several national beef industry committees and now serves on the

National Cattlemen's Beef Association Beef Safety Research Committee. She was appointed by NMSU to serve as one of three delegates to the U.S.D.A. Council for Agricultural Research, Extension and Teaching (CARET) as a "citizens' advocate."

As a delegate, Chacon-Reitzel advocates for federal funds in Washington, D.C. for the college. Since her nomination to CARET, Chacon-Reitzel has served

on the executive committee and became chair in 2016.

In 2015, Chacon-Reitzel was recognized by the NMSU Cooperative Extension Service with the Friend of Extension Award, as well as the Industry Partner Award in 2011 by the New Mexico Department of Agriculture.

Further, Chacon-Reitzel was selected to participate in Leadership New Mexico, completing the program

in 2007. She is the 1996 recipient of the Distinguished Alumni Award from NMSU's College of Agriculture and Home Economics.

Heavily involved in various other organizations at the state level, Chacon-Reitzel serves the New Mexico 4-H Foundation and is a past board member of the Saint Pius High School Foundation as well as the UNM Children's Hospital Foundation.

We can help continue their legacies

Last week, waves of shock rippled through Las Cruces as the community got word of the sudden death of Las Cruces Public Schools Superintendent Karen Trujillo.

We also learned of the rapidly failing health of Audrey Hardman-Hartley. Hardman-Hartley served the community in many capacities as director of nonprofit organizations and an enthusiastic volunteer for many causes.

An automobile-pedestrian accident claimed the life of Trujillo; disease is threatening the life of Hardman-Hartley.

As the community processes these grim situations, we are reminded of the fragility of life. We can't take for granted anything beyond the moment we have in our grasp right now.

If you're like me, you've been processing other calamities and struggles among your circle of

friends and family. For me, it's a close friend whose mother suffered a stroke and now is in hospice. For you, it could be a relative facing an illness, or a child suffering an injury.

For many, the struggles are not physical health, but mental or emotional.

On Friday, Feb. 26, the day after Trujillo's

death, LCPS held a news conference that felt more like a eulogy, as several people close to Trujillo spoke of what she meant to the community.

Perhaps the most powerful moment of the conference came during the remarks of Ben Trujillo, Karen's widower. Ben spoke eloquently of Karen's passion for her work, and what she meant to him and their children. Ben had to have been in shock to some degree. We all would be in that situation. Still, he found the strength to ask

listeners to pray for someone besides Karen and her family.

Ben asked people to keep prayers for the young man who drove the vehicle in the accident. When most people heard of the accident, the first reaction was shock, then sorrow for the family. The next thought, for many, was "I can't imagine what the driver must be feeling."

Almost all of us have had close calls with pedestrians, bicyclists, motorcyclists. Sometimes those close calls alone are enough to mess us up for a while. Being involved in an accident where someone dies has to be terribly difficult for the accident's survivors.

We should also take a lesson in the incident, to be more cautious with our own driving. Do we really need to run that red light? Can we look one more time in the opposite direction at the crosswalk? Can we take our foot off the gas a bit when

we're in neighborhoods with children and other pedestrians? And also increase caution as we walk or bicycle. Should our clothing be brighter? Are we on the correct side of the road? Are we taking into account the varying conditions such as weather and darkness?

Hardman-Hartley has touched countless lives with her charitable work. Trujillo spent her life working to improve the education of our young people.

The tragedy of these situations rests partly in the wondering of what more they still could have accomplished. We can help carry on their legacies in the very simple, human way of giving service to others.

Godspeed to all who have passed, all who are ailing and all who are struggling with loss.

And God help us all to appreciate who we have while we have them.

The City of Las Cruces is currently accepting applications to fill openings on a new committee named the Utility Customer Advisory Group (UCAG).

MEMBERSHIP: The Mayor with the advice and consent of the City Council will appoint five (5) members to the UCAG.

• Member Eligibility: Appointee must:

- Be a registered voter and a customer/recipient of one or more of the Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) for at least one (1) year prior to appointment.
- Not hold any elected or appointed public office or be a City employee.
- Not be a contractor, consultant, or have a contractual relationship with the City for the benefit of the LCU.

• Member Qualifications: To be qualified for appointment, appointees shall: Have a significant technical expertise in one or more of the following fields:

- Banking/Finance
- Business
- Economics
- Engineering
- Utility Rate Management, and/or
- Other skills or experience that may be of value to the rate making process.

Member Training: UCAG members will participate in training, provided by a third party consultant; along with the Board of Commissioners for the City of Las Cruces Utilities (Utilities Board) and staff covering the basics of ratemaking consistent with utility-based cost-of-service analysis as modified through the constraints of the Utilities Board's new By-Laws.

- Press releases, utility billing inserts, letters to the editor/guest editorials, and similar materials concerning rate reviews pending before the Utilities Board will be approved by the UCAG prior to release or publication:
 - Press releases approved by the UCAG will be submitted to and issued by the City's Public Information Office following standard procedures.
 - Utility billing inserts approved by the UCAG will be submitted to the assigned City staff at the Utilities Department and may be reformatted for consistency. The printing costs for billing inserts will be paid for by the Utilities Department.
- The UCAG will terminate upon completion of the duties set forth above upon notification by the Utilities Director to the City Clerk.



Mayor: Despite COVID-19, 'the state of our city is strong'

Because of the city council's "careful financial stewardship over many years; the focus, teamwork and dedication of city staff; and most of all to the courage and character of the people who live here, I can announce that the state of our city is strong," Mayor Ken Miyagishima said Feb. 24, as he delivered a 22-minute state of the city report – his 15th as mayor – on Las Cruces TV and the city website.

The speech included a moment of silence for "all those we have lost in the COVID pandemic this year, those who continue to suffer with health problems from the virus and all those who grieve for their family members, friends and neighbors," Miyagishima said.

About \$3 million in city funds has been authorized for COVID relief efforts in the city, the mayor said, as the city helped local nonprofits provide assistance to residents.

Miyagishima's remarks on other topics include the following:

- **Personal wealth:** The mayor asked the city Economic Development Department to include local wealth creation in the city's new strategic plan to help local entrepreneurs start or expand their businesses, to share financial literacy and wealth-building principles and to expand opportunities for home ownership. "We need to open the doors of prosperity to all of our residents, so that building

wealth is an activity of the many, not just a few," Miyagishima said.

- **Affordable housing.** "Nowhere are the barriers to personal and family security more visible than in the lack of quality housing options our residents can afford," the mayor said. The median price of a Las Cruces home is about \$250,000, which is "out of reach" for most city residents, he said, adding there also is a lack of affordable rental property in the city.

Toward that end, city-owned property on East Lohman Avenue will be developed as a mixed-use residential and commercial district that includes affordable housing, he said, adding mixed-income housing in the development in the El

Paseo Corridor and other infill areas also is possible.

Focusing on infill, along with "a revitalized downtown, vibrant city corridors, healthy and steadily renewing existing neighborhoods," is important because it will help maintain a strong city core as Las Cruces grows, he said.

- **Public safety.** As many communities deal with "a long-delayed acknowledgment of the personal and systematic mistreatment suffered by many of our neighbors," Miyagishima said, "much of the discussion nationally has focused on policing." Las Cruces is ahead of other cities on this issue, the mayor said, adding, "We can benefit greatly from a wide-ranging consideration of best practices

for modern public safety [and will] likely include the development of specialized roles and procedures better able to address behavioral health, addiction-related crises, domestic violence and our homeless and transient populations."

- **Sustainability.** The city has had a sustainability officer since 2010. "I'm hopeful that our sustainability officer [Lisa LaRocque since 2013] can use her experience and extended knowledge base to help our departments move forward with all due speed toward a low carbon, less costly future for the city and its residents."

"For all of these reasons and many others, the state of our city is strong," Miyagishima said.

it helps inform how the end plans are integrated for the benefit of all of its uses and users," Abu-Issa said.

Abeysiriwardana agreed, "I've seen it in books, calculated the designs, but getting up close with the primary clarifiers, particularly as they're being rehabilitated,

has given me an entirely different understanding, especially seeing the environment around it."

NMSU professor and Ed & Harold Foreman Endowed Chair Nirmala Khandan, Ph.D., P.E., explained that Abeysiriwardana and a second intern, Himali Delanka Pedige, were among

only 260 students selected by the National Science Foundation (NSF) for the INTERN Award, which includes six months of funding.

"The NMSU proposal in collaboration with LCU was based on our joint efforts over the past eight years in running a pilot-scale facility at the LCU's wastewater treatment facility and was viewed very favorably by NSF," Khandan said. "I believe this non-academic experience provided by LCU will add immense value to the educational and research experience that Himali and Isuru received during their graduate studies at NMSU."

Upgrades continue at Las Cruces Airport, more on the way

"I'm really excited about our future," Las Cruces International Airport Administrator Andy Hume said in a Feb. 19 interview.

The airport has focused on maintenance projects for the last couple of fiscal years, Hume said, and is

now moving forward into new development.

The airport completed installation of five miles of eight-foot perimeter fence in October and replaced the apron (parking lot) of the general aviation terminal, Hume said. It is also extending infrastructure (including utilities, lighting and taxiways) on the

east side of the airport — as far east as they can go — to support hangar development; resurfacing and restriping runways and taxiways; converting all airport lighting to LED; and improving other airport aprons. And, construction will soon begin on a new maintenance shop, he said.

Adding more hangars on the airport's west side is in the planning stages, Hume said. With its almost 5,000 acres, "there's considerable room to grow," he said. The airport currently has 40 box hangars, about a dozen T-hangars and two shade structures for planes.

The airport recently completed a master plan for landscaping, to create "a cohesive look" to connect the entire airport property and the nearby West Mesa Industrial Park, and create "a sense of arrival and an initial positive

view of Las Cruces" as visitors step off a plane, Hume said. Plans include a heritage park that will "honor Las Cruces aviation history," he said, and blend that history with the future.

Hume also wants to "incubate start-ups," providing development and support for aviation- and aerospace-related businesses like Immortal Data Incorporated that open at or re-locate to the airport.

A recent addition to airport businesses is a second location of Jim Bobs BBQ, open 6 a.m.-2 p.m.

Tuesday-Saturday.

Jim Bobs started in 2011, according to the back of the restaurant brochure, when a friend asked owner Jim Leon "Can you smoke a brisket and ribs for my birthday? Ever since I have been smoking meats and loving it," Leon said. The in-town location is at 1290 Foster Road (575-303-2685). Catering also is available.

"We're finally getting on the map," Hume said of the airport improvements and restaurant addition. "The word is getting out about us."

There is also "a lot of forward motion" in the airport's partnership with the industrial park, he said. As one example, Hume said, engineering and research and development businesses can locate at the in-

dustrial park and test their prototypes a short distance away at the airport.

"We're ready to grow," Hume said.

"I'm a witness," said Las Cruces pilot Sandy Urias. "I've only been here a year and a-half and I've seen it."

Because it doesn't rely on passenger service, Hume said Las Cruces Airport hasn't been hit as hard as many other airports by COVID-19, which has caused a reduction in air travel of more than 60 percent.

The return of commercial air travel could be in the city's future, he said. A recent study showed there is a demand for the service, as 12-15 percent of air trips out of El Paso come from Doña Ana County and the New Mexico counties that surround it. Phase two of that study is looking at potential providers, Hume said.

After five years of leading the development of downtown Las Cruces, Hume became airport administrator in late 2017. He is in his 20th year with the City of Las Cruces.

The second annual Little Black Dress Initiative is a social media-driven awareness and online fundraising campaign during which community advocates and JLLC members wear the same black outfit for five consecutive days with a button that says, "Ask me about my



little black dress" to spark conversations that allow advocates to share information with the community," JLLC said in news release.

"New Mexico consistently ranks 50th in economic well-being and 50th in education," the news release said. "Only one in 300 low-income children owns his or her own book, and 30 percent of New Mexico's children live in poverty, nearly double the

national rate. Because of this, 80 percent of fourth graders in New Mexico are not proficient in reading, which is 14 percent higher than the national rate."

This year, JLLC said it hopes to add a second school to the "A Book of My Own" program, eventually expanding to all schools in Doña Ana County.

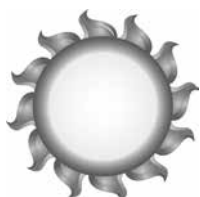

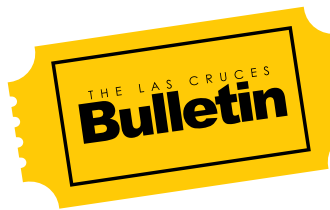

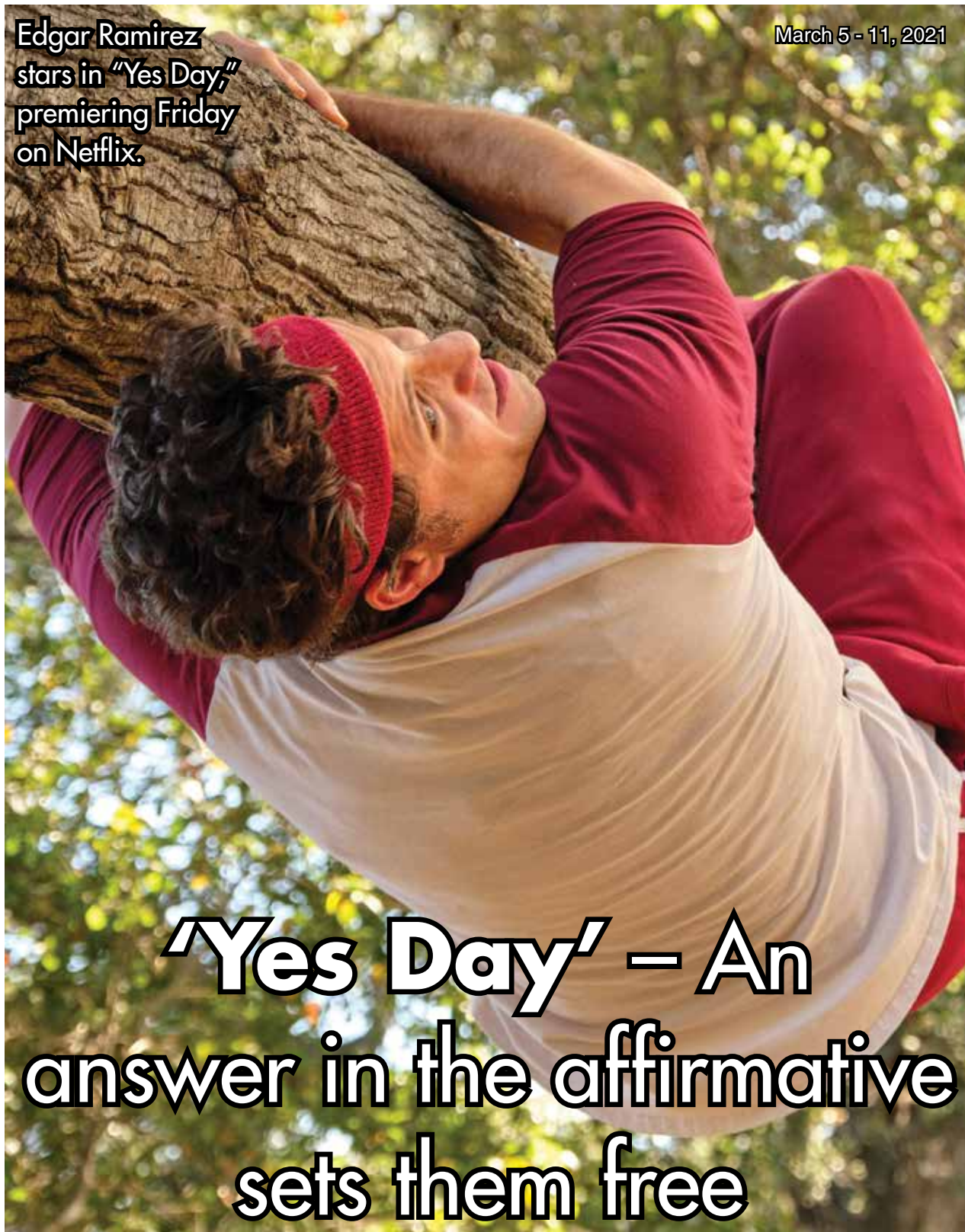

Chamber mourns loss of Trujillo

The Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce has lost an important champion.

Karen Trujillo, superintendent of Las Cruces Public Schools, who died in a Feb. 25 accident, was instrumental in working with the chamber in coordinating educational plans and projects. Her passion for students was always evident in her work.

"The loss of Dr. Trujillo is not just a loss for the chamber, but certainly for the entire greater Las Cruces area," said Jed Fanning, the chamber's board chair. "Our community is poorer with her passing."

Chamber President and

CEO Debbi Moore said, "Our whole city has been in a period of grief from all the different types of loss we've endured in the pandemic.

"Losing Karen reminds us

of how precious human life is, and the important impact people's work can have on other people as well as a community," Moore said.

Trujillo, 50, was appointed interim superintendent in September 2019 and the LCPS Board of Education made the appointment permanent in February 2020.

Trujillo grew up in Santa Fe and moved to Las Cruces at age 16. A graduate of Mayfield High School, she earned a BA in secondary education, a master's degree in mathematics education and a Ph.D. in curriculum instruction, all from New Mexico State University.

Trujillo began her teaching career in Las Cruces in 1993, according to her LCPS biography. She taught math at Las Cruces High School for two years. She served as the administrator at Las Cruces Catholic School 2006-10 and also worked at Alma d'Arte Charter High School. From 2010-18, Trujillo worked at NMSU in various capacities, teaching courses, working with educators, writing grants and conducting research. During that time, she started Educators Rising NM and the Southwest Outreach Academic Research Lab and served as the interim dean for research.

vide special grant funding to revive and promote tourism and hospitality in our state, allow bars and restaurants to deliver alcohol, give bars and restaurants a four-month gross receipts tax holiday and provide some regulatory relief and stimulus payments for low-income families.

We are also thankful for initiatives to restore funding to New Mexico Small Business Development Centers (which have and continue to play such a vital role in business recovery), workforce training funding and continued sup-

port of education from public to higher education.

Along with movement to address programs and funding needed for mental health concerns, we are thankful and 100 percent support all of these efforts.

As we navigate forward to restoration and recovery, it is imperative that we continue to have conversations and dialogue to provide long-term assistance to businesses.

During this 2021 legislative session, we face the real possibility that actions could be taken that would make life harder for business. The combined impact of these

pieces of legislation could considerably increase the cost of running a business to the point of ultimate closure. And, with closures, workers lose jobs and their ability to provide for their families. We are concerned that the unintended consequences of these pieces of legislation saddle businesses with much higher long-term costs and other burdens. This is unacceptable.

Other issues we continue to follow and have deep concern about are higher unemployment insurance rates, sweeping new rights to sue businesses and or industry regulators, higher workers'

compensation payments (caused by a presumption of workplace COVID transmission), and higher health-care premiums due to a new tax on health insurance plans (highest state tax rate in the nation).

In health care, we're looking at potential tax increases on doctors and allowing larger lawsuit awards against hospitals, physicians and other health care professionals. None of these actions would make it easier to attract and retain high-quality practitioners and health systems to a state that is des-

cial events, and committee meetings. Now seeing everyone looks a little different on a Zoom call, but I still love what being an Ambassador means, maybe now more than ever.

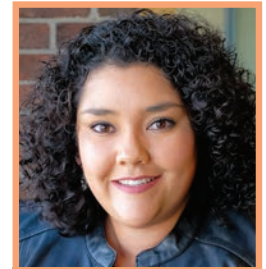

perately short of doctors, nurses and hospital beds.

With respect to energy, efforts continue to be made by lawmakers to curb oil and gas production, to encourage a proliferation of environmental lawsuits against energy producers and all sorts of manufacturers and to establish a patchwork of environmental standards across the state that are stricter than federal standards. All of these policies could potentially make New Mexico less competitive economically with our neighbors than we already are.

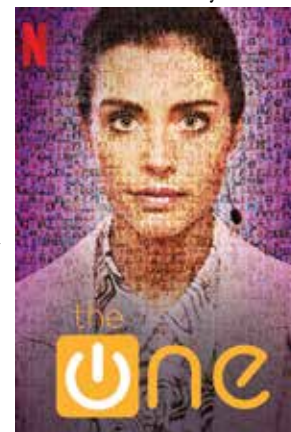

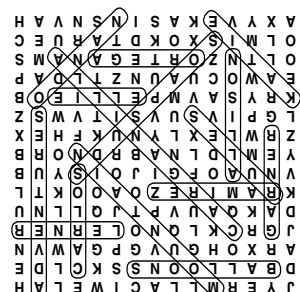

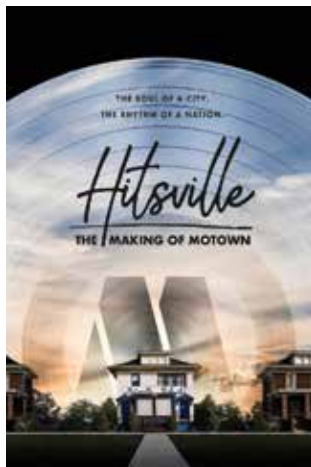
“Movie: Love by Accident”

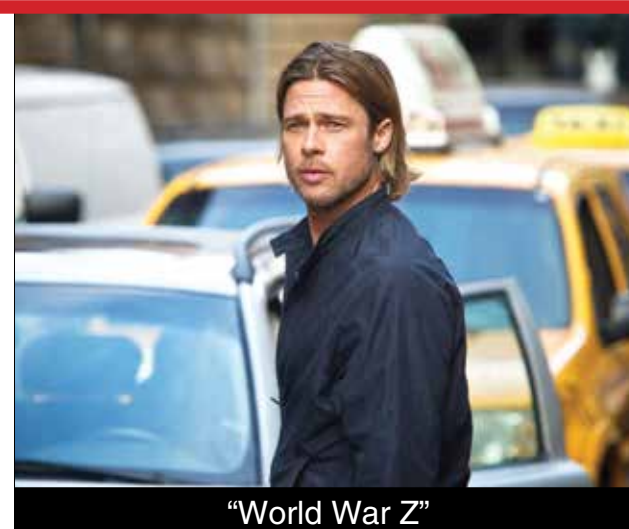

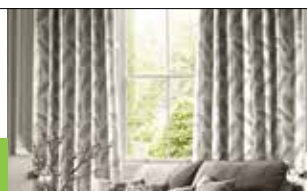

“It took me about a year to write and it took another year to shoot and edit,” Abdelmoula said. “It had no budget. It was nothing but passion, sweat and tears.”

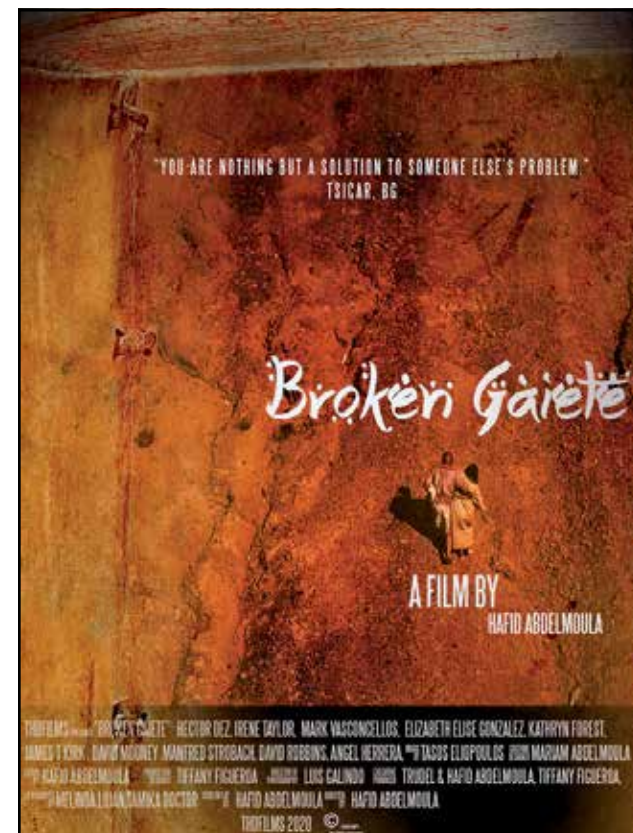
Hafid and Trudel Abdelmoula are the movie’s executive producers. Tiffany Figueroa was the production designer and Luis Galindo was director of photography.

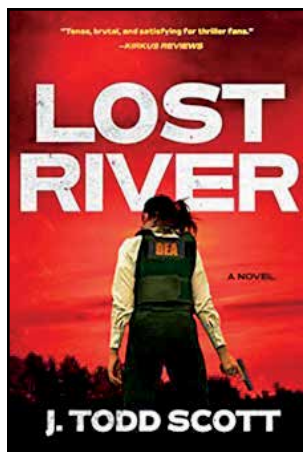
Author J. Todd Scott does March 11 Sage Library Zoom

to <https://jtoddscott.com>. His assignments took him all over the the world, “but a badge and gun never replaced his passion for books and writing,” the

website said.

“I was living out West when I wrote the majority of the Big Bend Trilogy. In fact, I was living in El Paso, and spent a lot of time in Las Cruces,” Scott said. “More recently, I’ve been relocated to my hometown of Louisville, Kentucky (a few hours from where ‘Lost River,’ is) set.”

Scott is special agent in charge of the Louisville Division of DEA, which includes Kentucky, Tennessee and West Virginia. He has been with the DEA 26 years.

“I think what people

need to know about my novels is, although they’re not about my career, they are definitely informed by my work as a federal agent,” Scott said. “I’d like to think there’s a lot of truth to the fiction I write.”

Scott calls “Lost River” a “blistering crime novel of the opioid epidemic and its cops, villains and victims.”

The book is set in Angel, Kentucky, “just another one of America’s forgotten places, where opportunities vanished long ago, and the opioid crisis has reached a fever pitch,” Scott’s website said.

“When this small town is rocked by the vicious killing of an entire infamous local crime family, the bloody aftermath brings together three people already struggling with Angel’s drug epidemic: a young medic-in-training with secrets, a DEA special agent and a former police chief who’s had to watch his own young wife succumb to addiction.”

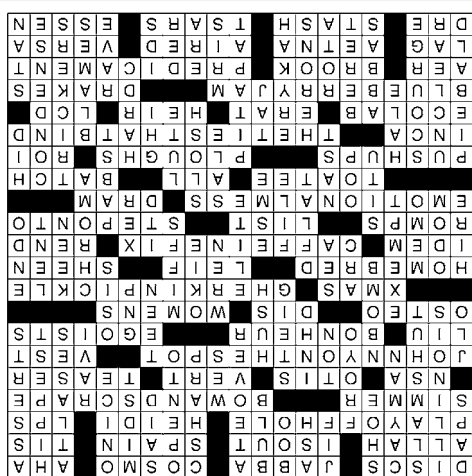

The first step is to pay attention

In eighth-grade science you took apart a flower and then labeled the parts: pistil, stamen, petal. But did the flower remain? You can stretch definitions and say, yes, the sum of these parts is the flower. It would not, however, be the single chrysanthemum of the corsage you gave the girl you took to the September junior prom. It did not have the same meaning in the lab that it had on the dance floor, where it was a sign to match her evening of beauty. In the lab, it was an object of dissection; on her gown, it was a sign of affection.

Theology is roughly analogous. Throughout history, there have been theologians who grindingly tried to define God down to every last thinkable thought, and the end result may be loss rather than gain.

In the 13th century, St. Thomas Aquinas, for all the great work he did in trying to comprehend every aspect of God in being and behavior, so to speak, reputedly said at the end of his life, "it was all straw." This does not mean that Aquinas is unworthy of study; many continue to study his work and the 20th century saw

a revival, called appropriately Neo-Thomism. For many students, however, Aquinas lacks one crucial approach in his work: wonder and awe.

On the other hand, look at St. Gregory of Nyssa, 4th century theologian whose take was different. For St. Gregory, God and beauty were intertwined. He was awed by God, and so his approach stressed mystery. For him, beauty and mystery were intertwined. This approach enabled him to realize that we could never comprehend God, never wrap our arms around a definition of God, because there is never an end to our appreciation of beauty.

If we approach God

through beauty, then we are always on an uphill path to see more and more of this beauty which is never-ending in this life and, who knows, might extend into any life beyond. In order to do so, however, we have to see beauty. And that requires additional steps.

This pathway to God by way of beauty may be seen in another group of theologians, who lived in Syria and other parts of the Near East in those early centuries. Their approach to theology was to write poetry. Ah!

For St. Ephraim of Syria, for example, the only way to get to God seems to be through metaphor, simile, image and

symbol. These people understood intuitively that God cannot be dissected, labeled and defined but must be approached through reverent contemplation. They saw the chrysanthemum, not its individual parts.

Evagrius of Pontus, one of those Eastern thinkers of the 4th century, said in his Treatise on Prayer, "If you are a theologian, you will pray truly. If you pray truly, you will be a theologian." Prayer? Beauty? What do these have to do with one another?

Only this: Recall the poetic approach of these thinkers. Poetry is a way to describe your world and yet remain in awe and wonder. At the heart of

this awe and wonder is the simple, yet profound, act of paying attention.

Poet Mary Oliver wrote, "I don't know what prayer is. I do know how to pay attention, how to fall down into the grass, how to kneel down in the grass." You can see the twinkle in her eye the same way you can see it in Ephraim the Syrian or Evagrius of Pontus. This is prayer. This is theology. Pay attention!

Music remains very much a part of our lives

During this last year, we have been able to listen to our favorite recordings as before.

The pandemic, however, has precluded the possibility of many in-person performances and gatherings in which music figures prominently.

While common online meeting platforms, such as Zoom, do not allow for real-time musical collaboration, we have seen dazzling videos created using innovative software

that merges individually recorded vocal or instrumental parts. They are not the same as sitting in a concert hall or in a worship space, but they have brought us close to the sound of live music we appreciate and even love.

I recently attended a virtual Jewish music conference (usually held in-person in St. Louis), attended by singers, performers, songwriters and song leaders. During song

sessions and worship, there were solo presentations, and a few live combinations of singers uniting their voices and instruments in the same room at their homes.

There were many inspirational moments. I believe songwriters shared their original compositions from a deeper place than usual, relying on their own voices and accompanying instruments to fashion a complete sound that moved us to hear and understand their messages.

On one Saturday night

each month, I join some of my Jewish music colleagues in presenting a Facebook Live sing-along of popular songs that fit into a theme which we choose. Usually, the final song of the session is one in which we each sing a verse and then pass it to the next person. It works!

Why are we trying so hard to keep the music flowing? We need music because it mirrors and expresses our collective emotions. We need music because it can engender enthusiasm and offer soothing

support during trying moments. We need music because it has a magical way of bringing us together, even when we are among people with diverse musical interests and tastes.

Consequently, congregational soloists and musicians are still providing a spiritual and soulful soundtrack to worship in virtual space. Musical performers are adding their talents to public events, whether in virtual space or, when possible and safe, in-person. Music brings joy, comfort and

hope.

In the music conference I attended, I took part in a two-part songwriting course led by a rabbinic colleague who is an accomplished singer/songwriter. At the end of the first session, he challenged us to set to music this passage from Psalm 77, which describes God paving the way for the Israelites to cross the sea, moving from slavery to freedom: "Your way was in the sea; Your paths in the churning waters,

Despite statewide decline, Santa Teresa keeps exports to Mexico high

Statistics compiled by the New Mexico International Business Accelerator (NMIBA) show the state’s exports were down in 2020, part of a statewide, nationwide and global downturn caused by the health pandemic. But it wasn’t all bad news.

“In spite of experiencing one of the worst economies in the history of our state and country, and in spite of our overall global exports being down 21 percent, New Mexico’s exports to Mexico were only down eight percent,” said NMIBA Executive Director Jerry Pacheco, president of the Border Industrial Association (BIA). “Our trade with Mexico was the reason



our overall exports didn’t go down even more. Because the Santa Teresa region accounts

for almost all of the state’s exports to Mexico, it is responsible for almost 60 percent of the state’s overall exports.”

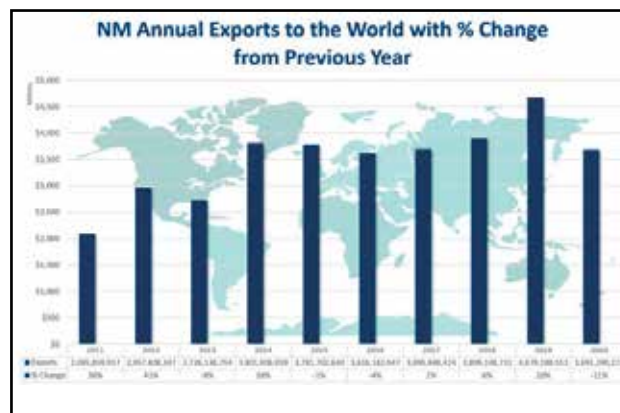
Both NMIBA and BIA are based in Santa Teresa, in southern Doña Ana County.

According to statistics compiled by Pacheco’s team at NMIBA, New Mexico in 2020:

- Exported \$3.7 billion worth of goods to the

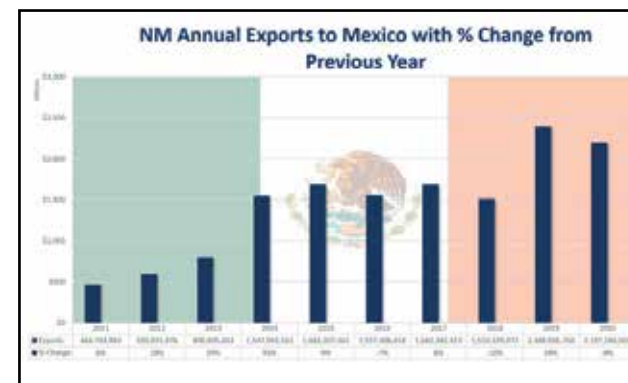


world, 21 percent below 2019’s \$4.7 billion, which was an all-time record.

- Exported \$2.2 billion worth of goods to Mexico, which is the state’s largest export destination, eight percent below 2019’s \$2.4 billion, which was another all-time record. Although down from 2019, 2020’s numbers are the second highest they’ve ever

been. As a comparison, 2020 New Mexico exports to Mexico were 45 percent higher than they were in 2018 and 373 percent higher than they were a decade earlier in 2011.

- Exported \$487 million worth of goods to China, which is the state’s second largest export destination, a 39 percent decline from 2019’s \$803 million. New Mexico exports to China made up 27 percent of all state exports in 2020. Apart from Mexico and

China, all other countries made up only 13 percent of New Mexico’s export destination profile in 2020. NMIBA is “a one-stop shop of resources for New

Mexican businesses and individuals wishing to introduce their product or service into the global market,” according to www.nmiba.com.

The dozen or so volunteers who run The Emporium have all received their second doses of the COVID-19 vaccine, and so The Emporium, 106 S. Water St., reopened Thursday, March 4, said long-time volunteer Heather Pollard.

lectibles and mint-condition furniture, Pollard said.

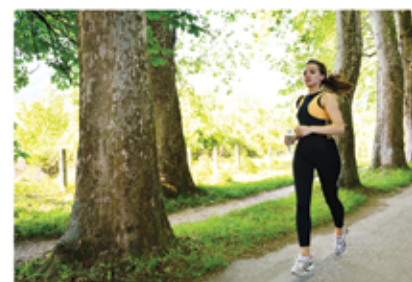

SPRING Into Movement: How PT Can Help

Now that spring is rapidly approaching, temperatures are starting to rise in many parts of the country. And that means the transition from heating our homes to cooling our homes is right around the corner. No matter what method you use to cool your home during the warm spring and summer months (central air conditioning, window units, or fans and dehumidifiers), each spring you cross your fingers that your approach still works. If not, you might be calling an expert for a tune-up, or in extreme circumstances, you might need a complete overhaul.

Just like an AC system that has probably been dormant for many months of the year, **a body that hasn't been physically engaged on a regular basis may have trouble getting started again.** And yet, this time of year, the warm temps draw many people to city and suburban streets, tracks and trails, ready to take that first run of the season. A good percentage of these spring runners haven't kept up their strides throughout the winter. It should come as no surprise that a 4-mile run for a previously inactive person is going to stir up a few aches and pains.



Especially as we age, our ability to move undergoes changes. But whether we're talking about a college student or a retiree, returning to an activity without proper planning is **a recipe for disaster.**

Golf in the wind requires adjustments, practice

We have officially entered the windy season in the high desert. For the next three months, when we head to the golf course in late morning, we are thinking, "Will this wind never end?" It will, just as the daytime temperatures soar.

Personally, I would rather deal with the wind than be frozen on the golf course at 8 a.m. Playing good golf on a windy day is an acquired skill. It requires patience, as well as awareness and adjustment.

The very first thing to realize is to keep the ball somewhat low when hitting into the wind. If you're a high ball hitter, you'll need to develop a swing to keep the ball down and under the wind. Hitting a driver into a stiff breeze, your best bet is to have the ball low and running hard on the ground in the short grass.

To do that simply de-loft the club by keeping the angle of attack close to the ground and somewhat to the inside. And the old

saying, "When it's breezy, swing easy" remains true. All too often, high-hand-

icappers try to take a vicious cut into a stiff wind, thinking they need to flail all-out to counter act the wind speed, only to watch the ball spin too high and sail wildly in the wrong direction. Cold air temperature, cloud cover and dampness also add to the difficulty.

Generally, a ball that spins too much into the wind will be trouble. Air moving into you, or even crosswise, at 20 to 30 mph will take a left-to-right spinning ball and send it offline as much as 100 yards.

A launch monitor will tell you whether your ball is going too high or spinning too much. Modifying your swing to lower the trajectory and reduce the spin means plenty of practice. Go to a practice range that is set up for you to hit into the prevailing wind. Hit enough balls, aiming at a very specific target, so

that you're confident in making a solid shot into a strong wind.

Essentially the same technique goes for iron shots as it does with the driver and fairway woods. In order to keep the ball down with irons, you can't take a full follow-through; rather, it is somewhat a "punch" shot with limited wrist release. Practice hitting your irons to exact targets so you can estimate how much more club you need in a stiff breeze. It could be two or three clubs more than a regular shot. Don't get caught underclubbing yourself.

With holes that go downwind, you must decide if you want to bomb it with a driver or play it safe with a shorter shot. Super-long drives with a helping wind can wind up landing and rolling in some terrible places. Consider your three wood to be your friend when it's blustery for almost every hole, regardless of the wind direction. Your chances of controlling a straight shot with a three wood should be better

than any other club in your bag. Practice it at the range.

Shots to par-three holes can be especially tricky on a day with strong winds. Regardless where the flag is located, going for the center of the green is the best bet. One of the most challenging holes on the PGA Tour is the 137-yard 17th hole at TPC Sawgrass, the island green, at the Players Championship, which will be played in mid-March this year.

At the 2007 Championship, with thousands of

spectators ringing the hole, more than 100 of the best players in the world, battling 35 m.p.h. winds coming in from the Atlantic, put 50 balls in the water one day.

Where putting on a blustery, windy day is concerned, awareness and caution are paramount. On a golf course with typically fast greens, it's a really good idea to avoid hitting shots that wind up long and above the hole.

Some downhill, down-grain, downwind putts are impossible to stop unless they go in the

hole. Wind will affect short putts as well. Putting uphill into the wind will require more stroke. There are usually gusty conditions on windy days, so be prepared to briefly wait out a strong gust if it doesn't slow things down too much. Lastly, it's important to keep your body balance stable, so practice with a wider stance to be comfortable.

higher place.

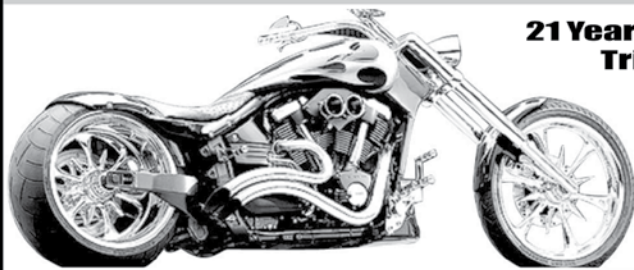
